Schools fret over state aid reduction

Plymouth Community School District stands to lose about \$130,000 with the stroke of a pen.

That's the amount the district expects to lose in state funding when Gov. Milliken signs the new state aid bill for 1975-76.

The bill has passed the House and Senate, with differences ironed out in conference, and is expected to be signed anytime now by the governor.

JOHN M. HOBEN, superintendent, says he won't know for sure how much will be lost in state aid until school opens, but present estimates are about \$130,000.

This won't result in any drastic program reductions, or teacher layoffs, he stressed. "I feel comfortable that we are fiscally sound and will be able to present the school board a balanced budget with very little curtailment, if any, in programs."

Before more accurate figures are obtained, the administration must first get more final information concerning: the actual student headcount (officially taken the fourth Friday after school opens); the local state equalized tax base; the local tax rate to be levied; the actual loss from state aid; and the tax rate allocated to the district by the Wayne County Tax Allocation Board.

The exact state aid loss cannot be determined at this point because, among other factors, the governor has authority to eliminate any single category within the educational budget statewide.

Because the governor is constitutionally mandated to balance the budget, he can "redline" (eliminate entirely, but not reduce the figure) any single item in the state education budget.

Because the Legislature didn't present a balanced education budget to the governor for approval, Milliken must trim some \$705,000 before signing the state aid bill.

THE FEATURE in the state aid formula which affects Plymouth most is a provision calling for a reduction of the top of sixth-tenths of one per cent of the total state aid and local tax base.

This factor, alone, will reduce general state aid to Plymouth by about \$95,000.

The Legislature, in its attempt to cut \$14 million from the education budget, also changed aid formulas for transportation, special education, and some other categorical areas. The transportation cut means a loss of about \$25,000 in the operating budget for Plymouth.

Based on an expected total loss of \$130,000, Plymouth Community School District hopes to spend about \$1,190 per student. The final budget will be near the \$14 million mark.

ONE CONCERN of the district is final student enrollment.

The state aid formula was based, explained Hoben, on the assumption that enrollment statewide would decline by 1.3 per cent.

Plymouth won't suffer an enrollment decline but will probably gain fewer new students than anticipated earlier. The district had projected a gain of 800 students, but now expects to gain 500 new students.

This will mean a drop in state aid, which is keyed on enrollment and local tax effort, from what had been forecast locally when an 800-student increase was projected. Right now, Hoben hopes the study body will climb to 13,100 by the time school opens in September.

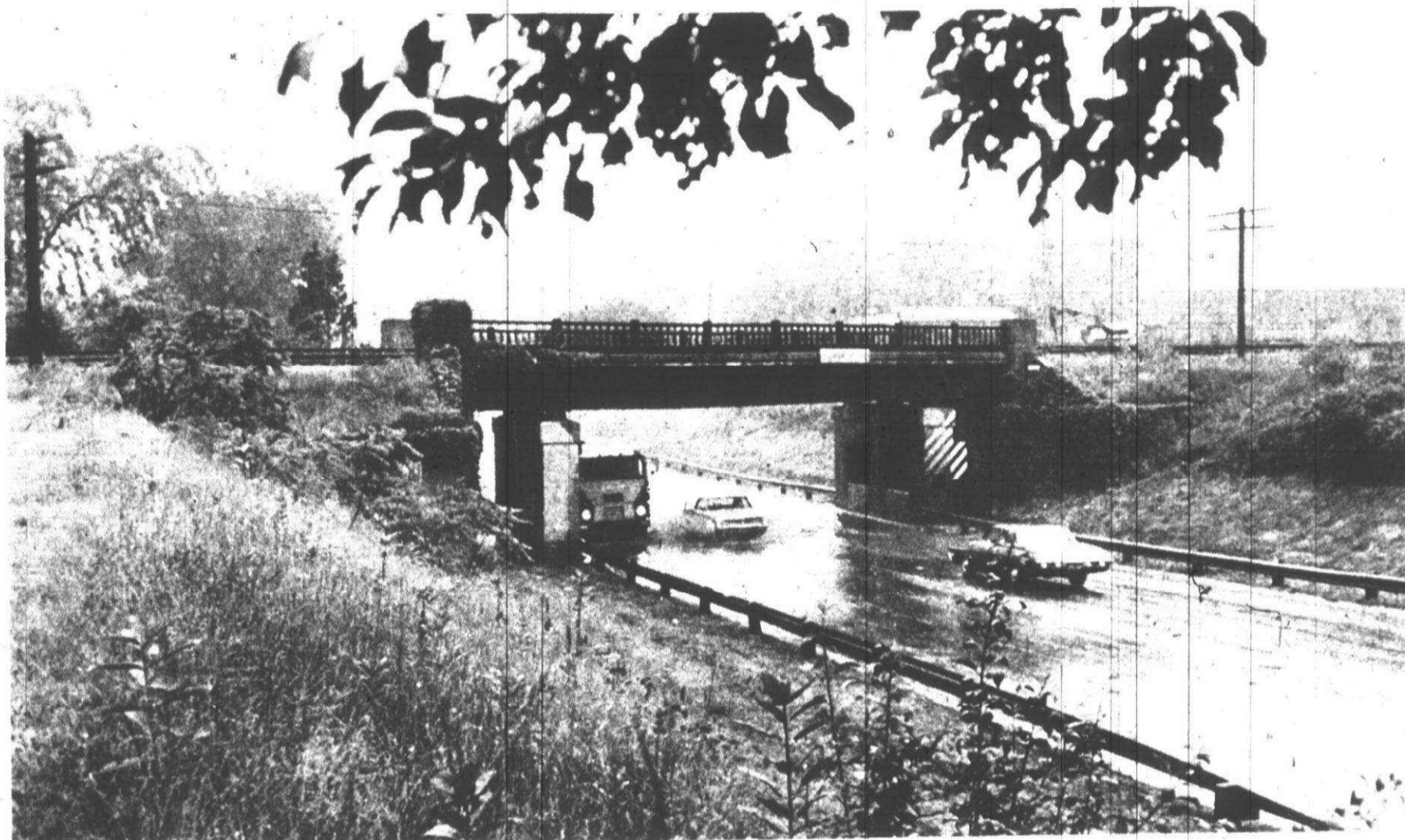
"It's really important right now that new residents moving into Plymouth-Canton register at their local school building as soon as possible. Parents of new kindergarteners should also sign up quickly," Hoben stresses. "Once our headcount is more firm, we can proceed toward finalizing the budget."

Another unknown, which worries administrators and board members, is what will happen to utility costs this winter. Last year, the district budgeted for utilities at cost plus seven per cent for an unexpected increase. Utility expenses jumped by 23 per cent.

"I don't know if the same kind of jump in utilities will occur this winter," says Hoben, "but I'm counting on an increase of more than seven per cent. In all my years in education, I have never seen utilities jump by 23 per cent in one year."

Still another expense factor will be cost of salaries as the district enters the second year on its contract with teachers. With salaries consisting of about 85 per cent of the total budget.

Citizens Power faces a setback

Total Citizens Power of Canton Township, a new citizens group aimed at educating residents and investigating issues, drew fewer than 25 persons at its second organizational meeting last week, despite extensive advance press coverage of the event.

Bruce Young, president and founder of the new group, noted the absence of some of the group's registered members and voiced disappointment in the small turnout.

"I'm mainly concerned for the people not here tonight," Young said. "It lets you know of the apathy among us. There are so many people we must arouse. I don't know what it will take except you here tonight. We need all the aid we can get."

PURPOSE OF the new group, according to its newly adopted constitution, is to restore the confidence of citizens in governmental institutions, provide open communication systems for residents, prepare citizens to make an intelligent choice without prejudice, and force government to respect and respond to the majority citizen viewpoint.

Although officers of Total Citizens Power stress the nonpolitical nature of the new group, township Supervisor Robert Greenstein feels the real purpose of the group is aimed against his administration and notes there are avenues for residents' input at township hall and meetings.

"These people claim they don't

have input, but many of them never come to a meeting," Greenstein said. "We've never even had a letter from most of them. These people have never asked for anything. They never say anything and then bang."

"What are they reacting to? Obviously to something we're doing. But what? Bringing Canton out of the dark ages? These people don't have a bitch. They've never called."

Young initially said the group was to investigate government and then he toned down," Greenstein said. "His first thing was to get unelected people to show the government how to run itself. That was the original idea."

OFFICERS OF Total Citizens Power, which include Young, chairperson Betty Hamann, vice president William Dillon, Secretary Russell Sturdevant and Treasurer James Blanchard, say the group is geared toward educating citizens and better relations between residents and the government.

"One of our most important functions is to promote dialogue between the government and the citizens for mutual understanding," Ms. Hamann told residents at last week's meeting.

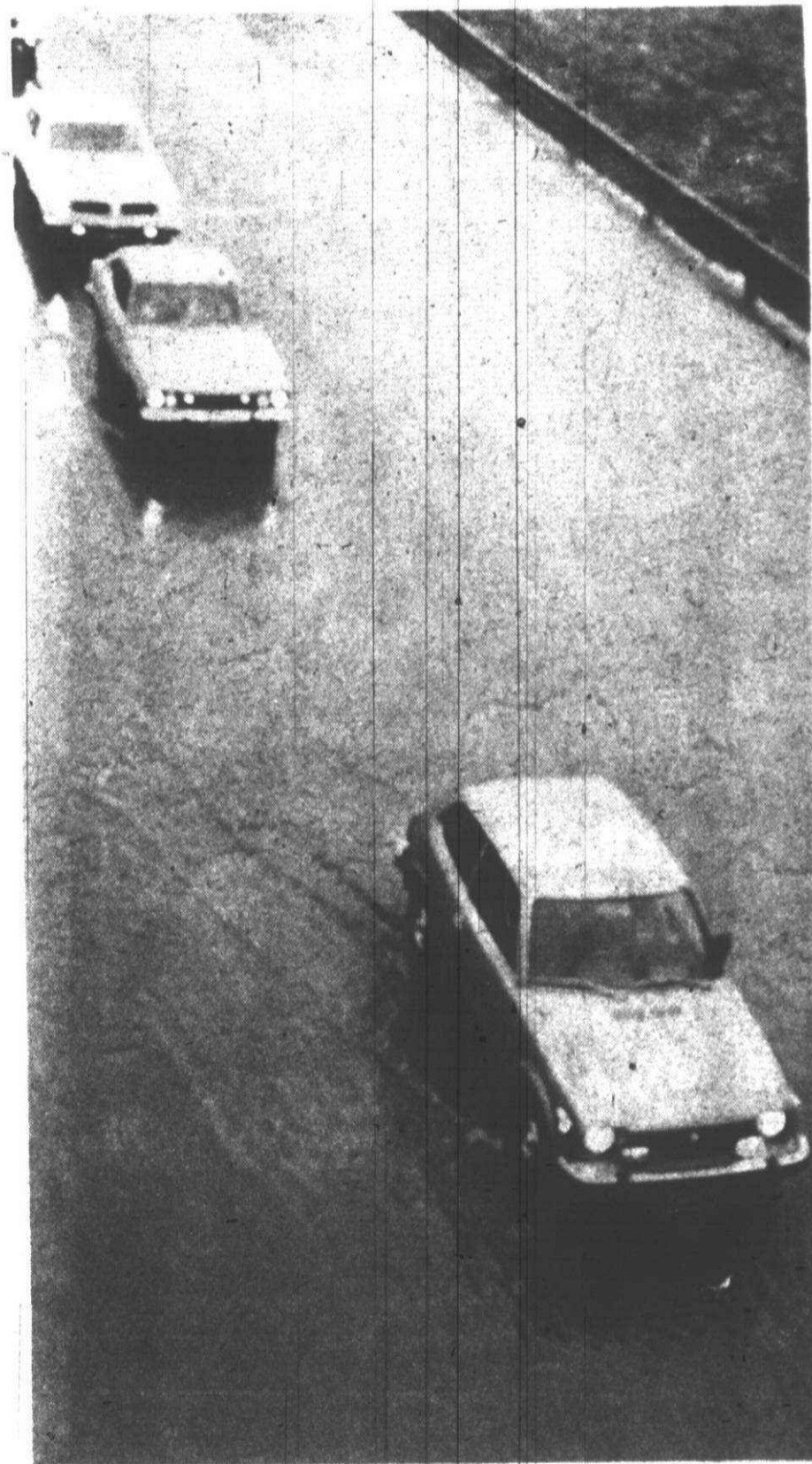
Young explained his reasons for founding the group.

"I suddenly realized that in all these years since World War II, I've sat as an inactive citizen," he said. "I realized we're willing to give our lives

Provow trial may end today

Defendant Barry Provow, 27, is expected to take the stand today (Monday) before Circuit Court Judge Thomas J. Roumell in Detroit.

Provow is charged with first degree murder in the Jan. 28 shooting of Terry Buchman, 22, in Canton Township.

As the trial enters its eighth day, it is expected that a medical witness will be called to give evidence to support the defense plea of temporary insanity.

Usually, in such cases, the prosecution calls its own medical witness to give testimony relative to the condition of the defendant at the time of the alleged act.

OBSERVERS expect the case to be concluded Monday afternoon or Tuesday.

After conference with counsel last Wednesday, Judge Roumell announced the case would be adjourned until Monday morning because of his involvement in other legal matters. Mrs. Maimie Provow, mother of the

defendant, was on the stand late Wednesday afternoon. She described her son's illnesses and problems since birth.

She said he had joined the U.S. Marine Corps at age 16 and been hospitalized because of frequent illnesses. He received a 30 per cent medical disability discharge.

THE DEFENDANT'S sister, Phyllis Nadvornik of Westland, followed her mother to the stand and described various behavioral problems Provow had as a youth.

Provow's attorney had been granted a separate, non-jury trial for his client. Also charged with first degree murder in the Buchman shooting are Provow's wife, Leslie, 18, and Robert Umney, 23, both local residents. Their trial by jury before Roumell is expected to begin later this week.

Contrary to an earlier report in this newspaper, the rifle allegedly used in the shooting has not been produced as evidence.

"It's not good for communities such as ours, with a high volume of students."

The improvements for wages and fringes of all employees are expected to add \$1 million to operating expenses.

"But right now, I'd like to know what our final headcount will be. This is important because for each 100 students we fall short of the 500-increase projected, we lose an additional \$100,000 in state aid."

"It is true that our expenses go down if we have fewer students to educate, but the two don't balance. There isn't cause for great concern because we have been staffing based on the actual, ongoing headcount and not on our projected count."

"What I am concerned about," Hoben concluded, "is the process and future of funding from state aid. If this will be all, it won't be too bad. But last year, by executive order, the district lost \$104,000 in state aid in the middle of the year. I certainly hope there won't be any mid-year cuts this year."

New Canton bank to open Thursday

A new Bank of the Commonwealth branch office will open Thursday, Aug. 28 at Warren and Sheldon Roads in Canton Township.

A 1,200-square-foot modular building will house the branch until a permanent structure is completed in 1976. The temporary bank building will contain four teller stations, one drive-in window, and a 24-hour depository.

August W. Miller III has been named manager. He had served as acting manager of the Bank of the Commonwealth branch at Ford and Newburgh Roads in Westland just prior to his current appointment.

Miller joined the bank in March 1971 as an assistant cashier in the Master Charge department. He was named head of the bank's savings department in January 1974. He had been affiliated with National Bank of Detroit at its Birmingham-Bloomfield branch. He is a graduate of Eastern Michigan University and lives in Garden City.

"We are pleased to be opening a new branch in one of Michigan's fastest growing areas," says Arthur F.F. Snyder, president and chief executive officer of the bank.

"Our entire staff is looking forward

"The bill doesn't reflect the difficulties involved in running our system financially."

ESSENTIALLY, the bill (HB4814) provides \$42.40 in state funds for the first 20 mills levied by a district and \$38.25 for the next seven mills.

Wayne-Westland, the highest taxed district in the state and the district with the highest student population, approaches 40 mills.

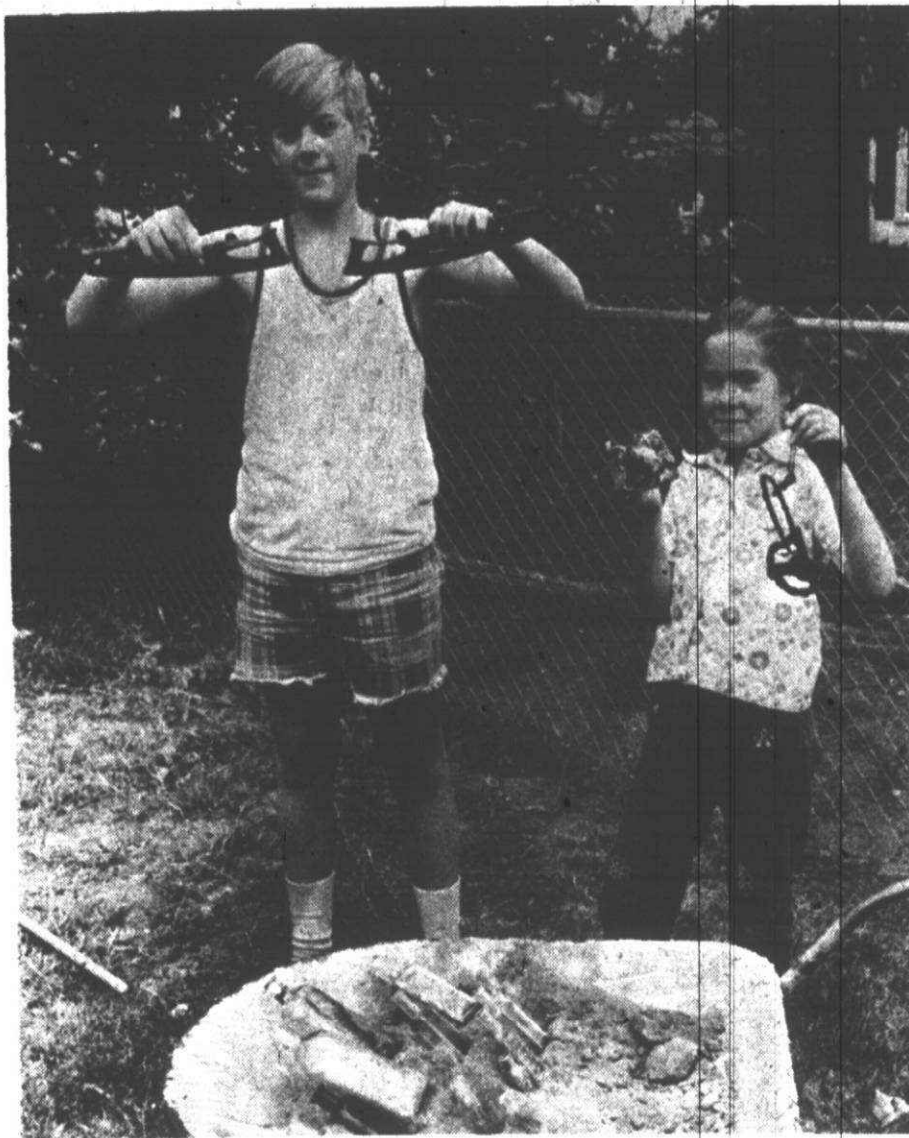
"We get nothing in state aid for the millage over and above 27 mills," adds Dyer.

MUCH OF Wayne-Westland's student enrollment growth is attributable to the residential growth in Canton Township south of Cherry Hill.

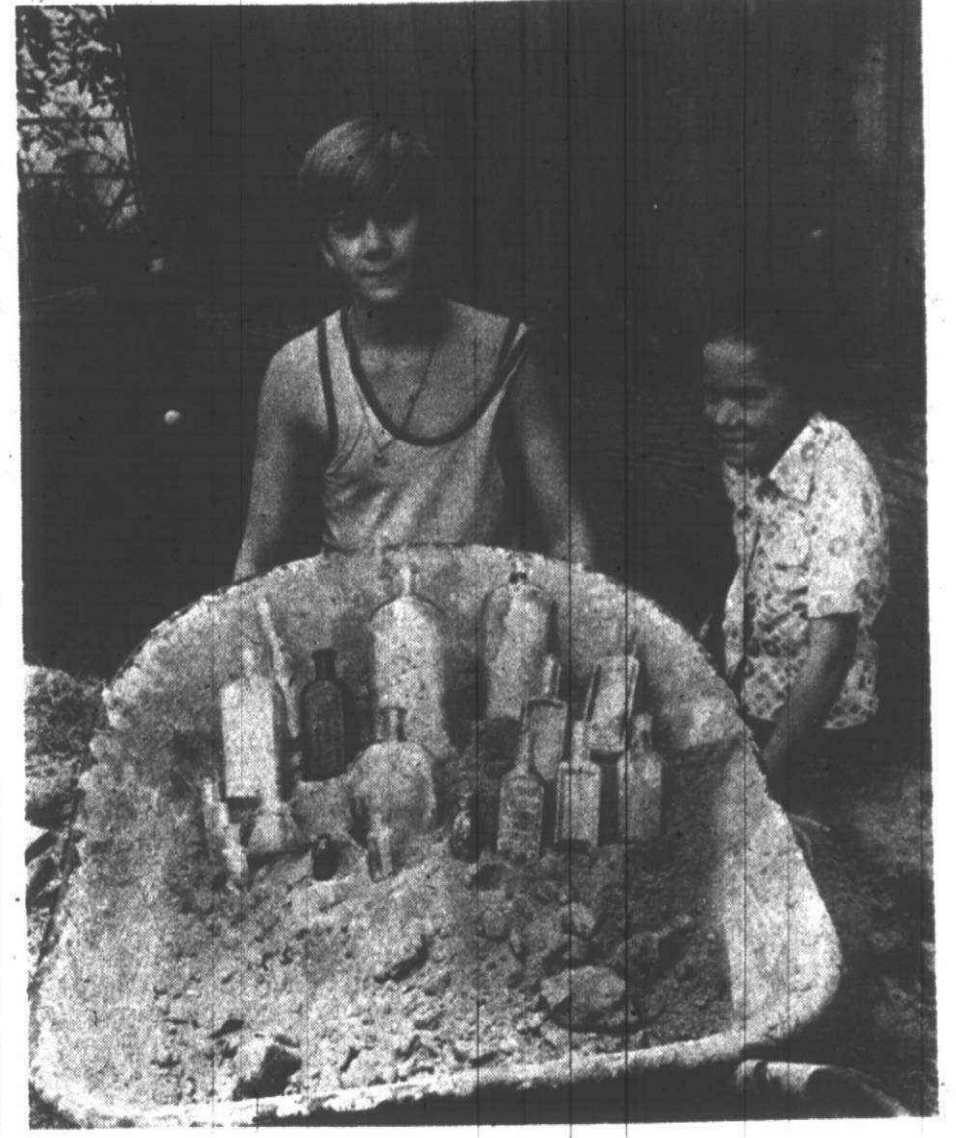
Wayne-Westland has a total operation budget of about \$30 million, of which some \$12 million comes from state aid — both general and categorical. The district also receives about \$3 million in federal grants to operate enrichment programs.

The Plymouth Community School District, which serves a large portion of Canton Township, levies 29 mills with a total budget of about \$14 million. It receives about \$2.5 million in state aid and less than \$1 million in federal money.

Plymouth district is also experiencing enrollment growth because of residential growth in Canton. This year, Plymouth has become the sixth largest school district in the metropolitan Detroit area and is soon expected to surpass Dearborn School District. It has climbed from the 25th to the 23rd largest district in the state this year.

Old pill bottles

Youngsters discover treasure

What started out to be a fort-building project turned into an archaeological dig for Ken Kops, 13, and his sister Rose, 9. And they didn't have to travel far to unearth these remnants of another era. The excavation was in their own backyard at 366 W. Ann Arbor Trail, Plymouth.

A casual wish that they might find a dinosaur bone was voiced by Rose as they started shoveling the light sandy soil.

At a depth of about one foot they hit what must have been an old trash pile or dump.

Pieces of broken bottles that glowed with a luster of pink, green, purple and gold were unearthed. A few cut fingers and Band-aids later, they decided to use a little hand cultivator to rake out the assortment.

THEIR PARENTS, Mr. and Mrs. Clayton Kops, became interested in the youngsters' discoveries. They knew their big farmhouse, with its hand-hewn beam and square nails, dated back to Civil War days. They had found an old flatiron when digging in the garden several years ago.

Ken and Rose found a pair of rusted ice skates—single runner clamps, a rusted small animal trap and a bent tin cup.

But the intact bottles with lettering were most interesting. Some were colored glass. Those of clear glass were clouded and lustered, or imperfect with hundreds of little bubbles.

Among them were: "Sperm Sewing

Machine Oil," "Dr. D. Zimmerman & Co. Druggist, Wayne, Mich.," "Elegant Flavoring & Extracts," and "C.A. Pinckney, Plymouth."

When Mrs. Kops took a turn at the dig she found a Lydia E. Pinkham bottle. "Wouldn't you know I'd find that one," she said.

KOPS CALLED the Wayne Historical Society and was told Dr. David Zimmerman operated a drugstore in Wayne from 1878 to 1888. The "& Co." had been his brother.

C.A. Pinckney had been in Plymouth in 1906. Kops is doing more research on him.

Ken, an eighth grader at Central Middle School, is also a carrier for the Plymouth Observer & Eccentric. He is continuing with the dig.

When asked if this would influence him to become an archeologist, he replied: "This is a lot of fun, but I still want to be a baseball player."

Plans OK'd for church, court club

Residents of the Plymouth-Canton area may soon jump and run on paddleball and racquetball courts close to their homes.

The Canton Township Planning Commission last week unanimously agreed to recommend site plan approval of the Canton Court Club, proposed for a site on Joy west of Lilley, to the board of trustees.

In other action, the planning com-

mission unanimously agreed to recommend site plan approval for the Geneva Presbyterian Church, proposed for a site on Sheldon north of Ford. A spokesman for the church said construction will start as soon as possible.

A spokesman for the Chicago-based development company of Bronner & Bronner envisions the racquet facility

as a private membership club, similar to clubs the firm has developed in the Chicago area.

The approximate 14,500-square-foot building will house 10 racquetball and paddleball courts, men's and women's locker rooms, saunas, whirlpool baths, a lounge area with a fireplace and an outdoor patio overlooking a wooded area.

for our country, but, strangely enough, we're not willing to act as citizens to save ourselves from our own decay.

"We can't solve issues, unless we join hands. So many of us ignore doing our parts. I feel this can be the start of a grass roots organization—that we could eventually aid others in other townships to start their own organization."

THE GROUP, as envisioned by Young, will investigate all aspects of township issues and residents' concerns and present both sides of the issues to members. The group will sponsor public hearings and present its findings to the board of trustees.

According to the group's constitution, drafted by Canton attorney and resident Peter B. Bundarin, any township resident age 18 or older is eligible for membership status.

Township officials and nonresidents with business or other vested interests in the township may serve as associate members. Nonmembers may cast votes at group-sponsored public hearings.

An elected, nine-member board of directors, a chairperson appointed by the board, and four officers elected at-large will head the organization, according to the constitution.

Members of the board of directors will represent designated areas within the township, including: agricultural; single family subdivisions north of Ford; single family subdivisions south of Ford; single family houses not located in subdivisions; mobile home parks; businesses in the township; condominiums; apartments; and rented houses.

Bundarin explained, "It would be too easy for the subdivisions to take control of the organization. The township has an agricultural section and other areas. We want those sections represented on our board."

MEMBERS WILL be asked to make a \$5 donation.

"We will not use your money to take sides one way or another on political issues," Bundarin stressed. "To gain support of the citizens, we'll gather the facts and hold public hearings. We don't want to fall in the rut of just another special interest group."

Although officers stressed the non-political, unbiased nature of the organization, some residents at last week's meeting voiced feelings against the township administration.

"Get leaders back in the township instead of dictators, one resident said, while another pushed for direct pressure on township hall.

Townships will get more funds

The Legislature has approved this year's state revenue sharing bill (HB4641) with an adjusted formula which will result in increased funds for almost all local units of government.

Canton Township will receive \$271,447 and Plymouth Township \$173,182, according to Rep. Thomas H. Brown (D-Westland) whose 37th District includes Canton.

"The bill will provide much needed financial relief for local units of government who are badly in need of help," said Brown, once mayor of Westland and supervisor of Nankin Township.

"In the past, the state has required local governments to perform many functions and has also placed several restrictions on, and made many regulations for, the services which these units must perform. It is only fair that the state bear some of the financial burden for the programs and regulations which it has mandated.

last week's meeting indicates residents' support their local government.

"I have to see the meeting as an answer from the people of Canton Township," Greenstein said. "The poor turnout shows the people are satisfied with the administration and don't like the idea of 'total power.'"

"With all the headlines and publicity about the meeting, if you knock out the people sitting on the board and their wives, you have practically no one left in the group. If I could get that type of publicity for a Democratic club meeting, I'd fill Canton High School with 300 people."

State Sen. William Faust (D-Westland) was scheduled to speak at last week's citizen group meeting but was unable to attend.

"Perhaps the most important feature in this year's bill," Brown continued, "is that a mechanism has been built into the system for determining rapid growth. The 'special census' provision will be of great benefit to fast growing communities such as Canton Township."

Canton has already completed a local mid-decade census to take advantage of this provision in the revenue-sharing bill.

Overall, the bill will increase state payments to local units by about \$33 million.

"The most significant aspect of the act is that the distribution of funds over the years has been changed from a straight per capita formula," Brown concludes, "to one that recognizes the differences among local governments in the need, or demand, for public services and in their ability to finance these services."

WC executive may go on ballot

Wayne County voters may be given a chance next year to decide whether they want an executive form of government, with the board of commis-

sioners acting as a legislative branch. Two area commissioners, Mary E. Dumas (R-Livonia) and Richard E. Manning (D-Redford), have co-sponsored a resolution asking the State

Legislature to amend existing law to allow a referendum in August 1976.

The resolution asks the Legislature to permit choices on the ballot proposition. State law now permits only one question.

Suggested alternatives include making the office of the chief executive either an elective or appointive post. If voters chose to make the job appointive, the county board would make the selection.

Mrs. Dumas said she assumed voters also would be given the choice of retaining the status quo—a commission without a chief executive.

The Manning-Dumas resolution also would include the primary election of candidates for the executive post. The two top vote-getters would be on the November general election ballot if voters agree to elect the chief executive.

Before the resolution is sent to the Legislature, it must be approved by the general government committee chaired by Manning, the board's ways and means committee, and the full board.

Bargaining both with department heads and employees becomes "confusingly impossible without a strong chief executive who has the complete authority to back up board decisions."

"The chairman of the board has only those limited powers delegated him by the board of commissioners," she explained.

Manning said Wayne County's many and varied responsibilities for crime control, drug abuse, health and environmental programs, mental health and medical institutions, general assistance programs and employe relations have become too complex to be handled by the present form of government.

MRS. DUMAS, who introduced a similar resolution in 1974, said the effort to get the question on next year's ballot was initiated now because county commissioners must study the question thoroughly, and the state needs time to change the law.

Among reasons her resolution failed last year, Mrs. Dumas said, were claims that there was insufficient time for study by the county board and the Legislature, and for candidates to file nomination petitions.

"There can be no alibis or excuses this time," she said. "They have a year to study the question and for people who might run to become aware."

THE DECISION to seek a chief executive came to a head, Mrs. Dumas said, because of the "weeks of charges and countercharges by the county auditors and county board as to who was responsible for the (\$7 million-\$10 million) deficit" which the county faces this year.

"Amidst all the talk on the budget, it was virtually impossible for 27 commissioners, with their varying constituencies and ideas of management, to establish priorities for services, appropriate money and make sure of living within a budget," she went on.

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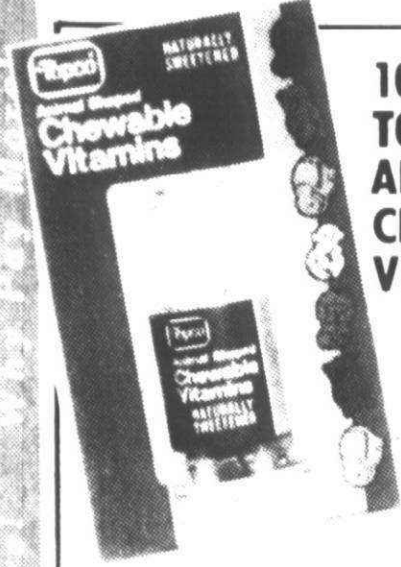
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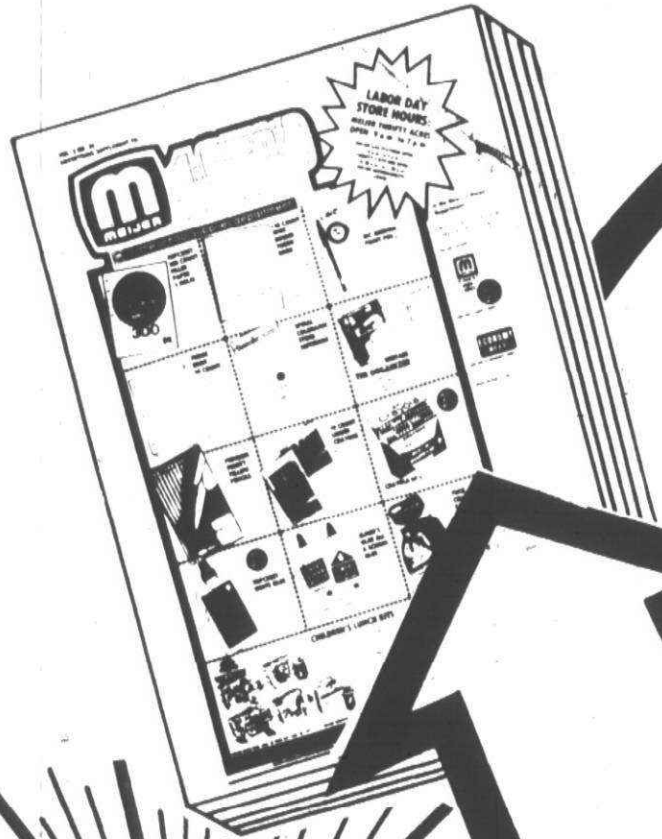

MARGIE PETITE CHERRY CHEESE CAKE

Mrs. S. L. LeMessurier

1 cup vanilla wafer crumbs
 2 teaspoons lemon juice
 ½ teaspoon vanilla
 3 to 4 tablespoons melted butter
 1 (8-ounce) package cream cheese (softened)
 ½ cup sugar
 1 egg

Line 12 muffin cups with paper baking cups.

Combine cookie crumbs and melted butter; mix well. Spoon about 12 tablespoons crumb mixture into bottom of each cup and press. Beat cream

cheese until fluffy. Add ½ cup sugar, egg, lemon, vanilla and beat until smooth. Spoon evenly into cups. Bake in preheated oven 375 degrees for 15 minutes. Cool thoroughly.

 Concentrated orange juice, thawed
 Pie shell, baked (plain or crumb)
 ½ cup coconut

Into cooled pie shell, put a layer of softened ice cream and pour on 3 tablespoons orange juice concentrate. Repeat 2 more times. Toast coconut in oven, stirring often to brown evenly. Put on top of pie. Freeze 1 hour or more.

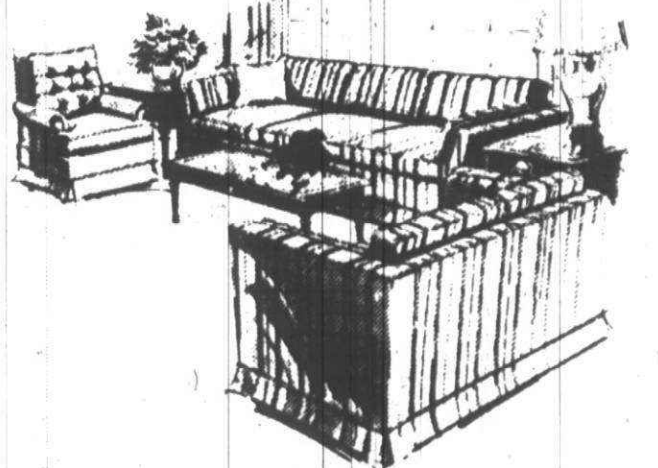

Beware of gypsies in bicentennial garb

The gypsy promoters have already hit this area, seeking to make a quick buck from the bicentennial celebration.

Bicentennial planners had anticipated that fly-by-night operators would enter Plymouth, sell their wares or collect funds and leave just as quickly. Telephone reports to this newspaper indicate the gypsies have started to arrive.

ALL RESIDENTS will want to join in celebrating our nation's birthday. But most, if not all, will want to join that observance by supporting bicentennial projects generated by Plymouth community organizations.

The Community Bicentennial Commission—representing the City of Plymouth, Plymouth and Canton townships, and the Plymouth Community School District—is concerned that the public not be overwhelmed with commercial exploitation of this patriotic celebration. We share this concern.

While the commission encourages community projects which celebrate our nation's 200th anniversary, the group carefully screens projects before granting official endorsement. Solicitation of funds is endorsed, on a limited basis only, for those projects which will benefit the entire community.

TO DATE, three projects have asked for approval and been endorsed by the commission:

The Plymouth Fife and Drum Corps has been authorized to seek funding assistance for appearances promoting the bicentennial throughout Michigan.

The American Association of University Women (AAUW) has been endorsed, but requested no authorization to seek funds within the community for its video tape project.

The Dunning-Hough Library oral history and the Plymouth Community Arts Council (PCAC) heritage picture projects have been endorsed and authorized to seek funds only from local civic service clubs.

ANY ORGANIZATION in the Plymouth-Canton area planning bicentennial activities is urged to contact the commission so it may become part of the community's coordinated observance effort.

If appropriate, the group can fill out forms for official endorsement. The Bicentennial Commission office is at 859 S. Main and is open from 9 a.m. to noon, Tuesday through Friday.

Residents approached for donations related to bicentennial projects should check the endorsement by calling the commission office at 459-3620.

If you wait long enough, some institution or agency will release a scientific report to back up your life-long fear of something which, without science, seemed silly before.

That happened to me this week when the mail included a release from the U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission about a study bureaucratically entitled: "A Systematic Program to Reduce the Incidence and Severity of Bathtub and Shower Area Injuries" — research conducted by Abt Associates, Inc. social research organization.

IT WAS REASSURING that social scientists also recognize the danger of taking showers in bathtubs because this has been a phobia of mine for years.

I steadfastly refuse to take a shower in a bathtub because of a great personal fear of falling and cracking my head open on the porcelain. And there is little comfort that modern bathtubs aren't made of porcelain anymore, but are stainless steel painted white to look like porcelain.

My wife insists that showering in a tub is completely safe, especially with the rubber mats. I have no logical response, just a gut fear. After all, I

have never fallen in a tub. Then again, I have never stood up in a tub — choosing instead to carefully crawl over the side and slide up into a sitting position.

IT IS AN unfortunate fear because I love to shower and much prefer this method of bathing.

I was born in a rural area near Saginaw and lived some 15 years in a house without inside plumbing. At first, we took baths in a galvanized tub in the kitchen. It was filled with hot water, heated on the stove, and us kids would bathe first. After us kids went to bed, mom and dad would bathe.

As we began to get older, though, the galvanized tub had to go, so dad built a shower in the basement with a safe wooden frame to stand on.

It wasn't until I was 15 that we moved to this area, into a house which had a bathroom with tub and other restroom apparatus. By this time, my fears were so deep, there was no way I was ever going to stand up in a tub and take a shower.

You could line the entire tub with rubber, or hang a swing from the ceiling with seatbelts attached, but no-how, no-way will I shower in a tub.

THAT WAS a behavior I readily admitted was irrational — until opening last week's mail.

This fine report noted, to my satisfaction, that there are 110,000 bathtub and shower-related accidents in the U.S. each year.

The study identified three major hazards associated with tubs and showers: slips and falls, burns, and drownings. I must admit, though, I have never given any thought to drowning or getting burned in the tub. That might be worth reflecting upon.

My social scientists point out that slips and falls are the most frequent type of accident in tubs and showers. I read that with great interest, and skipped over the 70 deaths each year caused by burns and 100 tub drownings annually.

And then the report shot my ego to pieces. It turned its attention to consumer education to protect "children" and said "reliance on parental education" was particularly important. It's me that needs the education, not my kids.

But that's government for you. The safety commission will now proceed to spend thousands of dollars to educate kids about how to safely take a shower in a bathtub when it's me that needs the help.

compulsive overexpansion and resulting empty stores does damage to the business community as well as to the community as a whole.

Certainly, I agree that "Canton is no longer a quiet rural area of only farmland and a few scattered homes." Yet Canton is no longer in the infant stage but has grown to a child. Yes, we are growing. Hopefully, we are thriving. Nevertheless, you would not abandon a child to find for itself, offer it no guidelines and expect a mature, responsible adult.

Likewise, we cannot abandon Canton to find for itself and thus grow into a mature, responsible "adult" community. Of course, I realize growth, per se, will never "age" this community. Nor does innovation merely for the sake of innovation contribute to the "growth process." It is only by all segments of our community, i.e., business, homeowners, etc., working together that Canton can achieve its adulthood and become a community in which we live by choice rather than by necessity.

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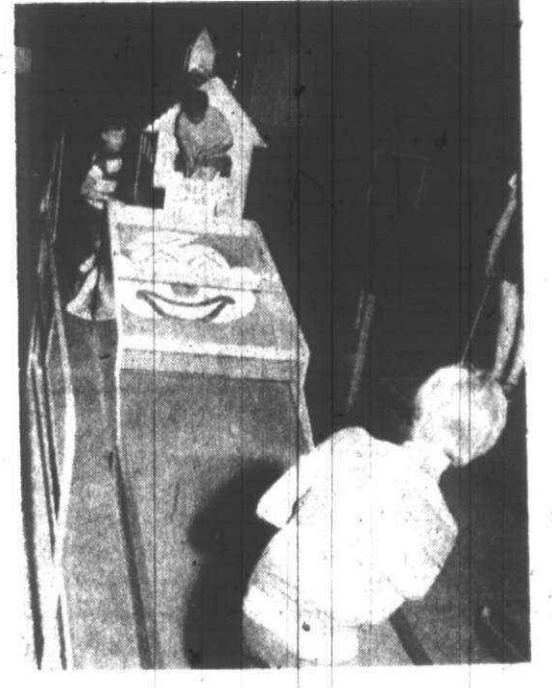

Still, Atkins repeated that the statement was not an indictment of the league. Rather, he said, he was "looking for a new challenge."

"I've been successful here, and now it's time to move on. Every once in a while you need something new. I'm just looking forward to building a good team next year," Atkins said.

Meanwhile, Atkins praised his team that was eliminated from the tournament by the champion Little Caesars team as "the toughest group of kids I've ever coached."

"They came back from all sorts of adversity," said Atkins. His team lost seven of its first 10 games this year.

"But they never gave up. A lot of times, it would have been very easy to throw in the towel. I just can't say enough about them," he said.

Tyler has used garden bark and lava rock as ground cover.

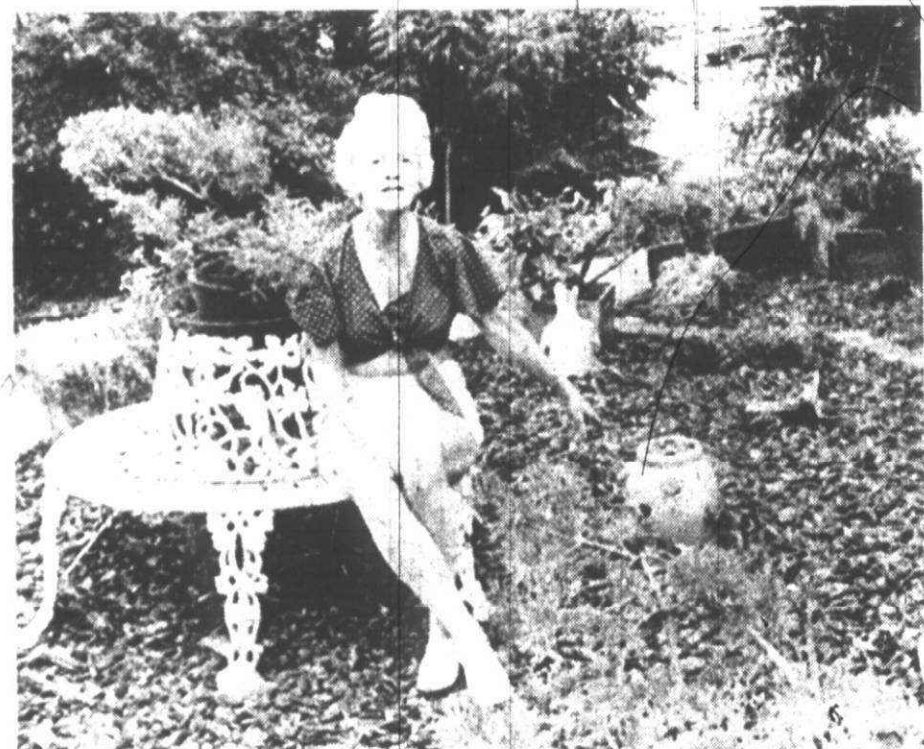

The Tylers have lived there eight years and they say the potted plants winter well. Before the frost comes, they collect the plants in one area and cover them with black plastic.

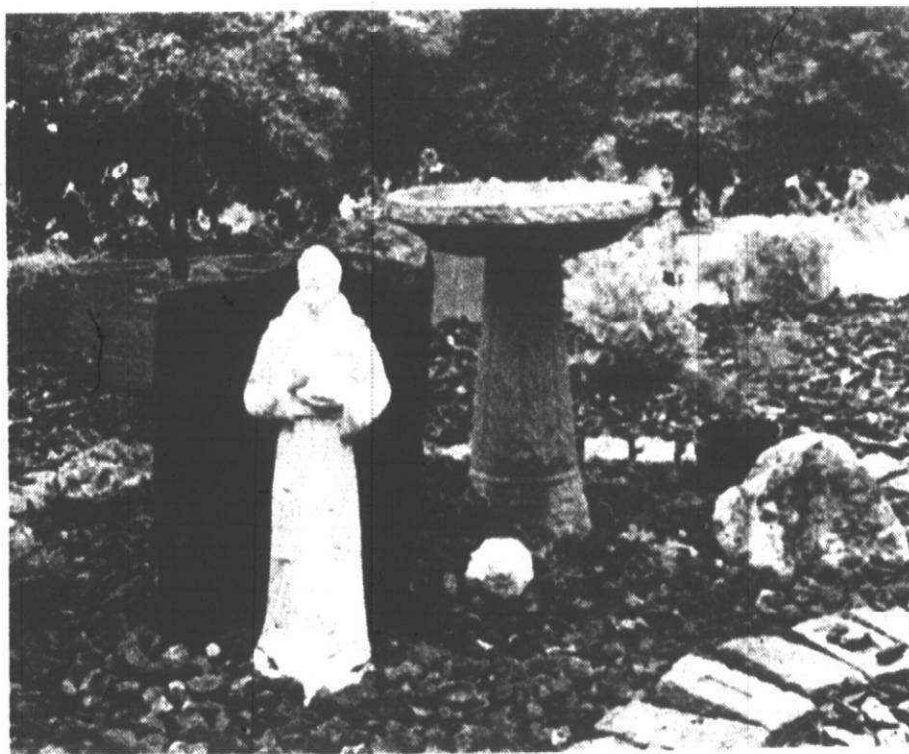
Tyler says his next project is to build a small shed at the end of the deck for winter storage of deck furniture and his gardening tools.

At Plymouth post

Trooper Brown, first of her kind

"It's going to take a while to be completely accepted, but I feel it is just a matter of time."

This is the feeling expressed by Michigan State Police Trooper Dorothy Brown who just over a month ago completed her training and was assigned to the post in Plymouth.

The 24-year-old Bay City woman, is the first of a new breed in the ranks of the Michigan State Police.

There have been women in the ranks before this, but Miss Brown is one of the first to be recruited with the understanding she would be assigned to a patrol car.

LA William Tomczyk, post commander, said this is a new move on the part of the state police.

"Up to now, women have been assigned mainly to desk work. This is no longer so. Any woman who qualifies and completes the 17-week course can be assigned to road work," the lieutenant said.

MISS BROWN has been with the state police since 1973. She worked as a radio operator out of the Flint post after graduating from Michigan State University with a degree in criminal justice.

Last March she entered the MSP academy in Lansing where she began an intensive course along with some 80 other recruits, only two of them women.

"Having worked for the state police, I knew in advance what I was in for when I entered the academy," she smiled. "There was absolutely no favoritism shown me because I'm a female."

She said the course was a tough one. By graduation time, the class had dwindled to 44 men and the two women.

"The defensive tactics course gives the recruits a real training. I had to meet all the requirements the men did including the swimming and boxing."

Miss Brown said she boxed with the men and was able to give a good account of herself.

We had to run an 11 mile course as part of the training and fortunately I was able to make it," she laughed.

Asked how she was accepted at the academy, she replied:

"THE GUYS played some practical jokes on us, some, I know, didn't think girls could complete the course. This in itself was a challenge."

Miss Brown decided she wanted to make a career of law enforcement while in college.

"I guess I come from a career family," she said. I have five sisters and one brother, all in various careers. Two of my sisters are registered nurses, one is a radiologist."

Her parents, Mr. and Mrs. Ross W. Brown of Bay City, had no qualms about her becoming a police officer, she said.

"They have let us choose our own careers and they knew this is what I wanted to do."

The state police now have other women on the road, but they were not hired originally for that type job. They had held other positions before being assigned to patrol work.

Miss Brown enjoys her work, taking good-naturedly from her fellow officers the kidding. She works the various shifts, riding the patrol car around the Plymouth and Canton township areas.

"I HAVEN'T run into any dangerous situations as yet, but I'm sure I can handle myself."

She takes her turn driving the patrol car and functions in the same way her male counterparts do.

As she said, it may take a while for women troopers to be acknowledged. Some of the men are taking a "wait and see" attitude, some are a bit skeptical that a woman can perform under fire as a man does.

"I know I have to prove myself as do other female officers," she said.
