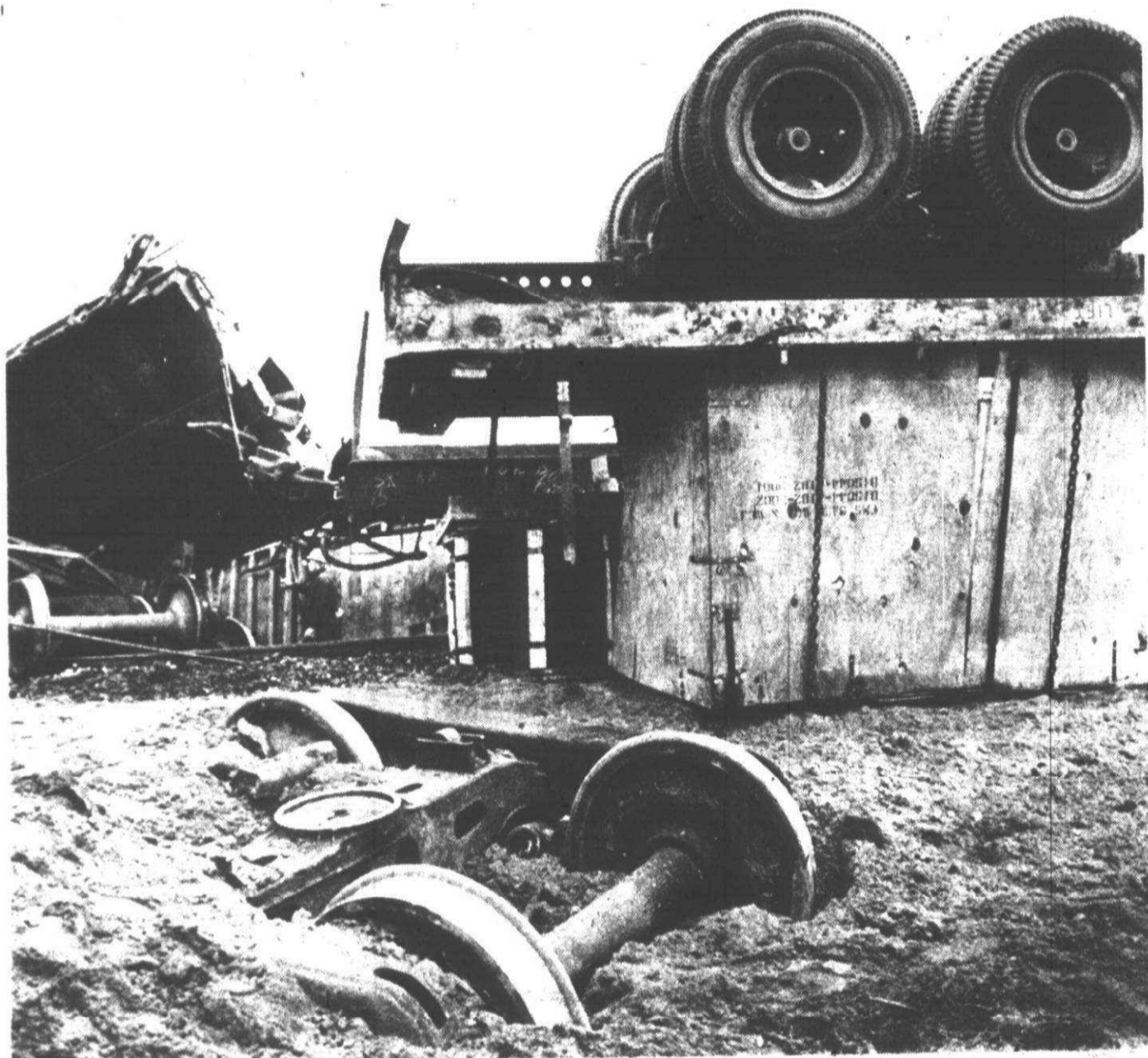

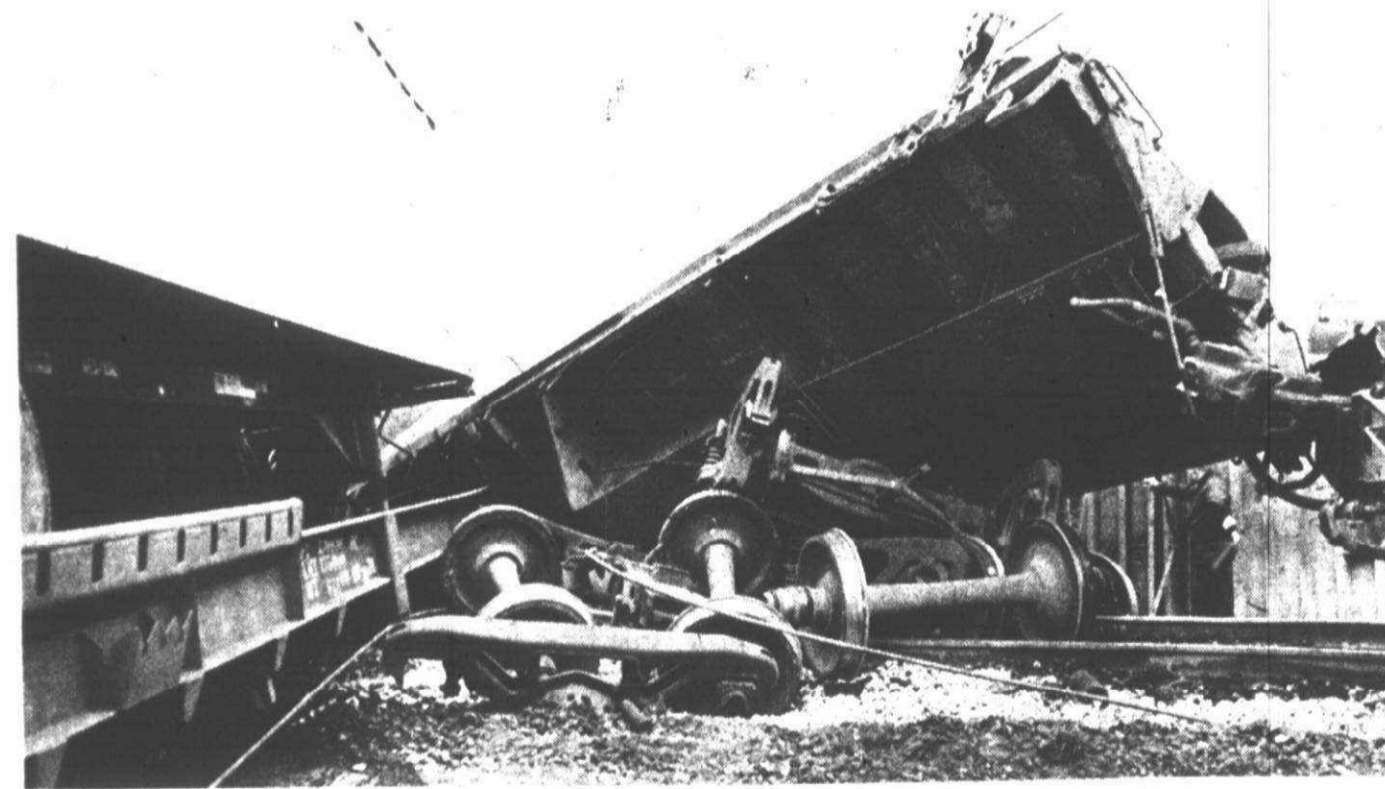

C&O train derailment in Canton forces evacuation of apartments



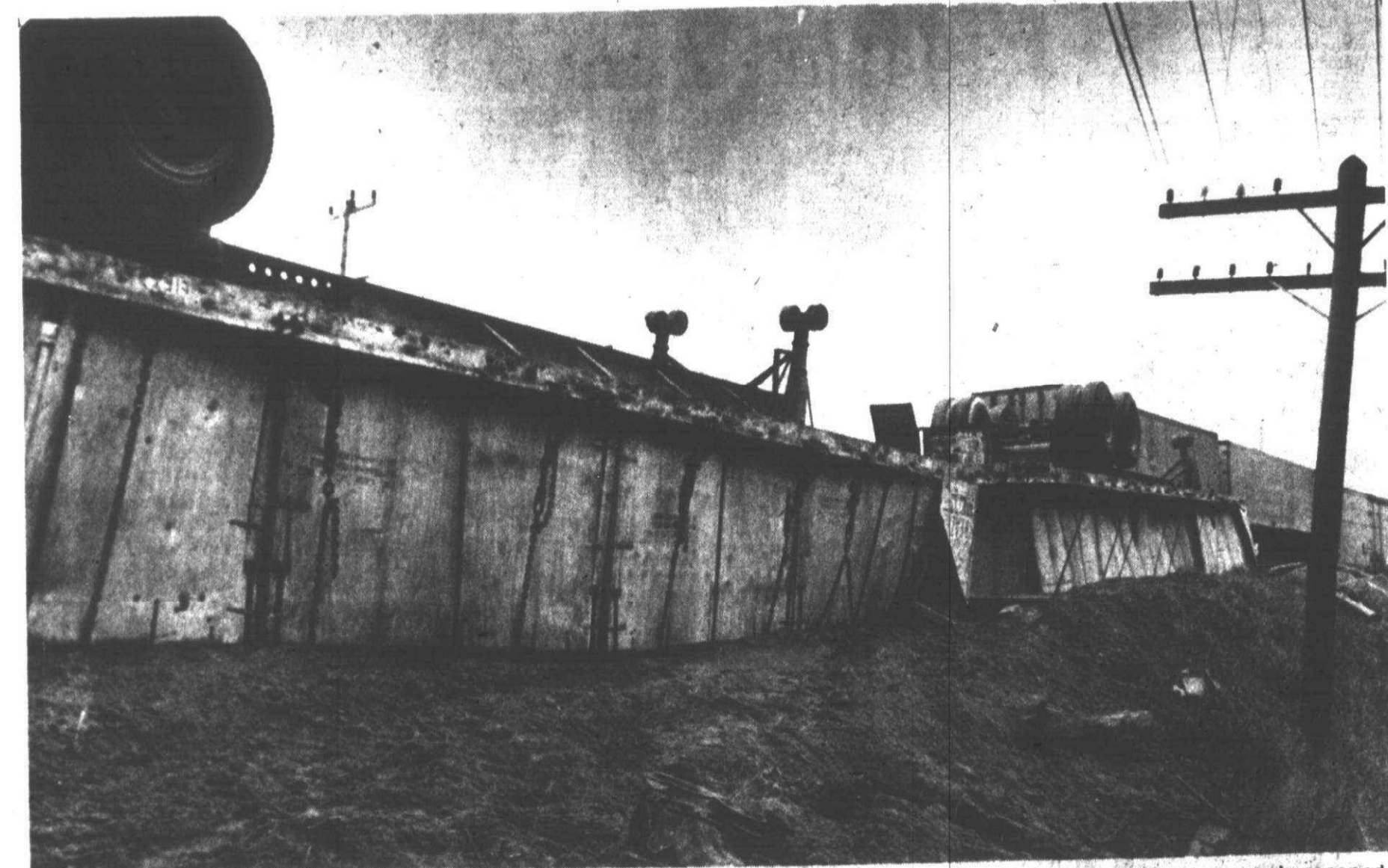
Firemen from Plymouth and Canton townships immediately arrived on the scene when a train derailment punctured a petroleum line

spilling large quantities of gasoline with fumes blowing towards Stonybrook Apartments.



Seven cars derailed Friday morning in Canton Township, bringing out crews of fire-

fighters and auxiliary help which remained on duty until well into Friday evening.



The derailment of seven train cars caused a lot of physical damage but there were no reports of human injury, although

Plymouth Township Fire Chief James Gignac narrowly escaped serious harm.

An outboard motor on the tracks was thought to be the cause of a train derailment that brought about a state of emergency in Canton Township and the evacuation of 496 families in Stonybrook apartment complex on Joy Road.

Seven cars of a southbound 70-car freight train jumped the tracks southeast of the intersection of Joy and Haggerty roads.

A derailed car ruptured a pipeline, spewing an estimated 42,000 gallons of gasoline along the tracks. The north-west wind carried the highly flammable fumes in the direction of the apartments. Canton Fire Chief Mel Paulun decided to evacuate the residents as a precautionary measure.

The pipeline belongs to the Buckeye Pipeline Co. and carries gasoline, crude oil or kerosene from Ohio to Bay City, Flint and Saginaw.

BY EARLY AFTERNOON the area was cleared.

Canton firefighters were at the scene of the derailment. A Plymouth Township fire truck and four firefighters were in position west of the apartment buildings as Canton Township employees checked every unit to make sure the evacuation was complete.

Only persons remaining were a bed-ridden retired minister, Rev. Orman Faulkner, his wife and daughter. A Plymouth Township rescue truck stood at the front door with the motor running to ensure immediate escape if the feared fire erupted.

With crews working on clearing the toppled trains, not one person watched the operation from living room windows. A lone black and white cat was the only observer.

Wayne County Sheriff's personnel manned road blocks in the area. Canton Supervisor Robert Greenstein and DPW Director Jake Dingledey were on the scene all afternoon and evening coordinating the effort.

Greenstein was attending a senior citizens' luncheon when he heard of the crisis. Radio contact was maintained between all Canton personnel in the area. Arrangements were made for high school students from Stonybrook to stay in Plymouth Salem High School until picked up by parents on until an all clear was announced.

ELEMENTARY school children were to be kept in Fiegel Elementary School, 39750 Joy Road.

Five Canton Township office workers—Carol Quinn, Nancy Fogarty, Pam Philips, Debbie Schmitt and Diane Conrad—went to Fiegel to look after the children. By 5 p.m. only one child was left in their care.

Later arrangements were made for the Red Cross to set up overnight quarters in the school for those who needed shelter.

Salem Principal Bill Brown said

about 15 students stayed at the school, but he thought several had gone on the bus just to see what was going on.

About 40 minutes after school he had six students waiting in his office. The word that poison gas was leaking from one overturned car had been broadcast by a radio station and the Stonybrook students were frightened.

"Did they evacuate the pets?" asked a girl with tears in her eyes.

"She had a dog at home," explained a friend.

The few Canton employees left at township hall were glued to the radio and busy answering calls from residents.

Hearing both ends of the radio conversations was more informative than

the one-sided version at the scene of the evacuation.

DORIS KELLEY allowed us to listen to the base radio:

3:55 p.m.—"They're trying to get another bite on it." (Al Thompson, Canton electrical inspector's voice, referring to the effort to lift a boxcar off the track).

4 p.m.—"They're just beginning to move things off the tracks." "We're getting calls from people wanting to know when they can go back in." "Tell them the fire chief has to give the all-clear."

4:02 p.m.—"Have someone take a

The station will broadcast live play-by-play of all home football and basketball games of Plymouth Salem and Plymouth Canton high schools.

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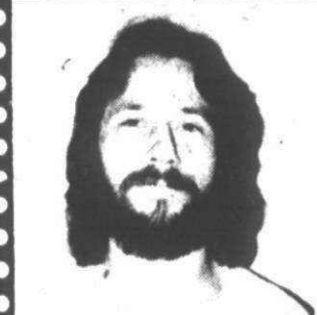
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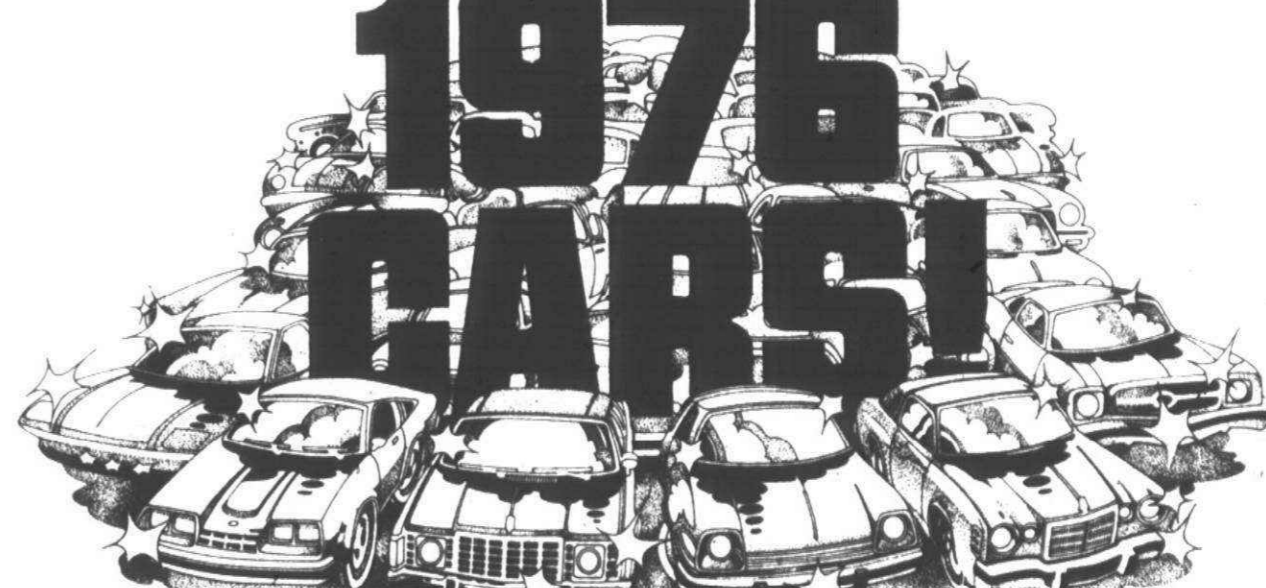

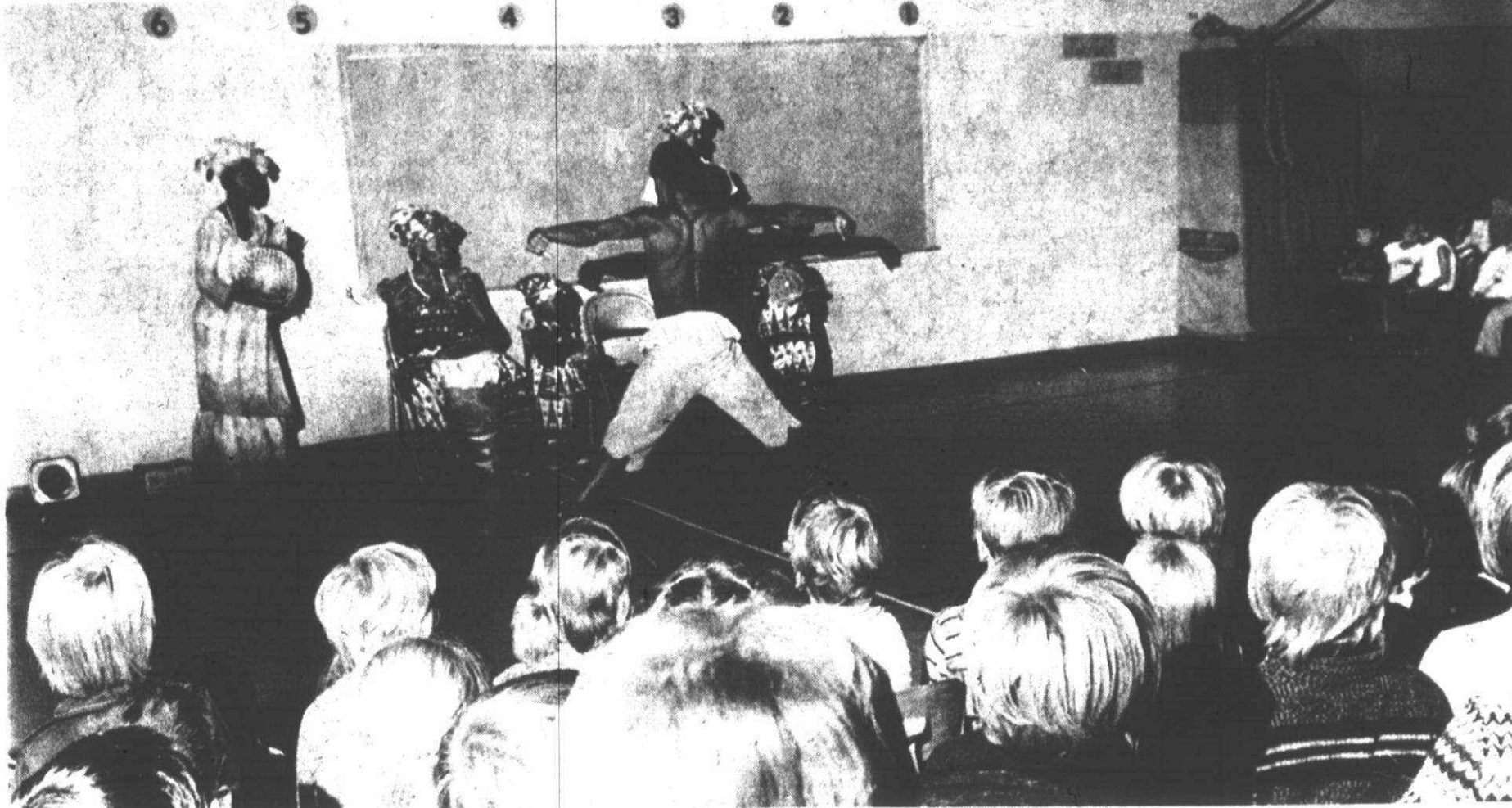

African dancers entrance pupils in Plymouth

Students at Starkweather and West Middle schools embarked on a journey to Africa last week, but the sights they saw were not of the "Tarzan" variety.

Perched at the edge of their chairs in their school multi-purpose rooms, the pupils clapped and squirmed to the throbbing beats of African drums and village-made instruments and viewed the pulsating muscles of black-skinned dancers.

Women, swathed in blue-printed cloth, swayed to African melodies and transported bundles of clothing to imaginary streams, where they taught children the tasks of wash day.

THE ISHANGI FAMILY, a six-person West African dance group, last week stopped in Plymouth for the performances, offered through the Plymouth Community Arts Council, the Michigan Council for the Arts and the Detroit Youththeatre Show on the Road, an agency of the Detroit Institute of Arts.

The group, composed of Ishangi Razak and his wife, two sisters and two children, has performed the African music and dance steps on tours of the Caribbean, the United States, Africa and Europe.

The performances, designed to offer an insight into African culture and dispel myths about the diversified continent, have won worldwide acclaim, including a special award in the New York World's Fair.

"We do not play the 'talking' drum the way they do in the Tarzan movies," Razak told the students, who eagerly absorbed every word.

"Tarzan is a phoney. There never has been a Tarzan in Africa. Can you imagine a white man running around Africa with a miniskirt on? With a monkey as a personal secretary?"

"And the Africans—you know the ooga-booga people! We don't know where they found those people. No one could understand them—the way they talk on television. Running around with a Kentucky Fried Chicken bone stuck in their noses!"

"We do live in villages, though, and we do have our dances," Razak told the pupils. "But the man who created Tarzan—Edgar Rice Burroughs—was an American who never was in Africa!"

AFRICANS, THE GROUP leader said, have three languages—the spoken word, the dance step and the "talking" drum. Every dance step is symbolic and conveys a message to its viewers.

"This is what we call another person's culture," he said. "We hope if you understand another person's culture, all the fighting will stop so we can have peace."

A highlight of the performance, in the eyes of spellbound pupils, came with the finale of the day—the Dance

of the High Ancestors. A 12-foot man, masked in African garb atop legs of lengthy stils, leaped across the room to the sounds of throbbing drums and performed ceremonial dance steps.

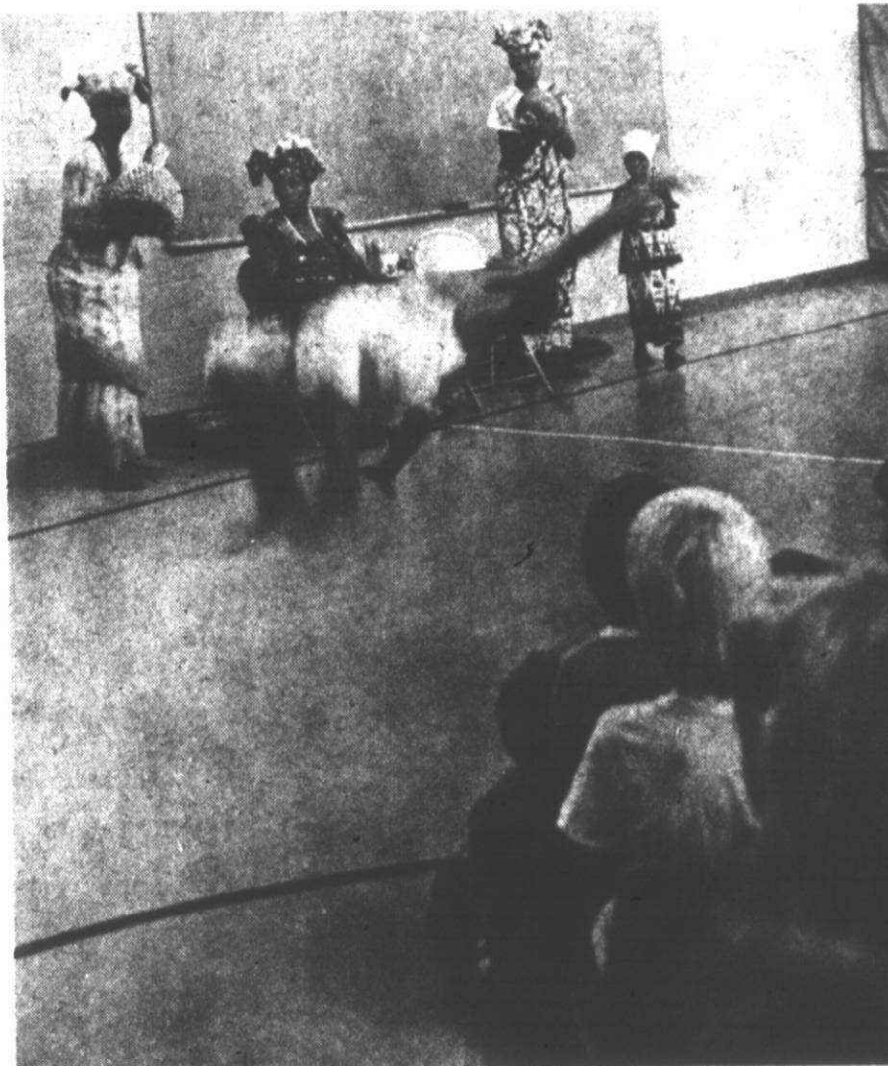
"They were good," said Doug Bancroft, a third grader at Starkweather Elementary. "I liked the little girl and the great big monster. I didn't know that much about Africa before."

Third grader Michelle Eddleman liked the whole performance. "I thought the dancers and their dress were really nice. All their equipment was nice. They taught that little girl so young!"

The dancers' agility and calisthenics stumped a few of the young spectators.

"I thought it was neat," said third grader Bobby Gizowski. "I don't know how they did it!"

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
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
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School officials discuss teacher strike issues

Teacher strikes, local autonomy, and state aid to education were three issues that preoccupied delegates to a joint convention of the Michigan Association of School Administrators (MASA) and Michigan Association of

School Boards (MASB) in Cobo Hall Sept. 24-26.

Delegates to the MASB supported a resolution urging state school boards to prohibit teacher union dues "check-offs" that they claim would be used "for subsequent implementation of an automatic deduction of teacher strike fund assessments."

What the MASB was saying, in effect, was it would not make it convenient for teachers to raise funds that could eventually be used to finance teacher strikes.

At the same time, the MASB approved a trust fund to be used by boards to fight teacher strikes.

The MASB "Legal Trust Fund and Consortium" would help local districts "in pursuing important litigation matters which have statewide significance."

According to Earl Gabriel, MASB president, the consortium could be used to finance court battles during teacher strikes. About 100 districts already have contributed to the fund, Gabriel said.

STRIKES, SUCH AS those which occurred last year in Garden City and Crestwood, undoubtedly would have "statewide significance," but in order for a district to draw on the fund, it

would have to contribute to it.

The Michigan Education Association, the teachers union, recently began a drive to obtain \$75 from each of its members to provide funds to aid former Crestwood School District teachers who were fired by the Crestwood Board of Education.

The MASB has been receiving about \$300 from each school board participating in the legal trust fund consortium.

The MASB set up a task force to study revisions in Public Act 379 (Public Employees Relations Act). The law forbids public employees, such as teachers, from striking. The task force is to help the MASB find "new alternatives to resolving public school employe labor disputes."

Two other matters received the attention of delegates, according to Leonard VanHoven, MASA president.

VAN HOVEN said the MASA was overwhelmingly in favor of maintaining the present system of local control of schools. The "local control concept" would keep the responsibility for financing schools and handling labor disputes in the hands of local boards.

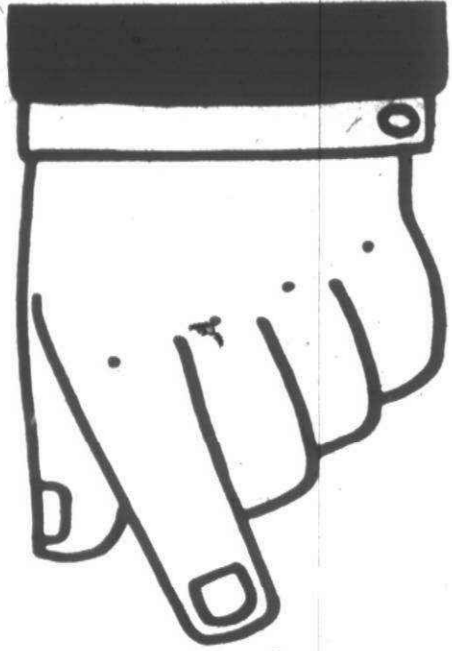
Don Elliott, deputy executive director of the MASB and a lobbyist for the MASA-MASB in Lansing, says he will try to persuade Gov. William Milliken not to reduce state aid to education by executive order, expected to occur within the next two weeks.

Elliott said "utter chaos" would result if the Governor goes ahead with his proposed cut of state aid. The cut is expected to be no less than two-tenths of one per cent, but no more than one per cent of the total aid package.

Elliott conceded he is not optimistic about his chances of dissuading the Governor.

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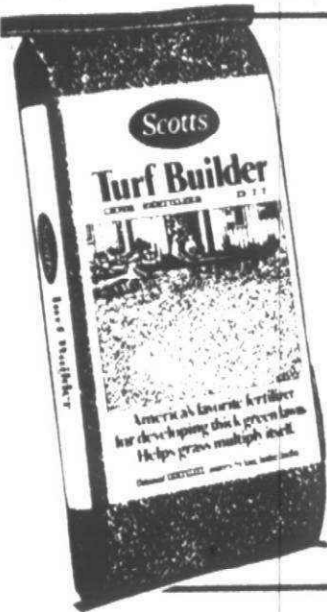
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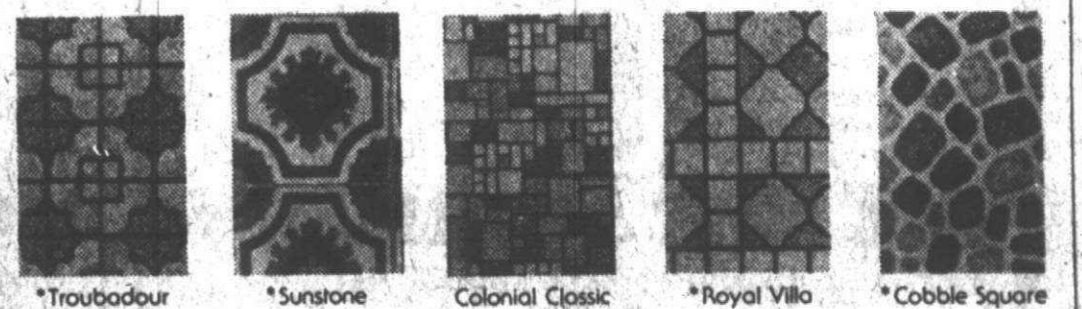
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Canton weighs how best to attract industry following PCDC demise

The demise of the Plymouth-Canton Development Commission (PCDC), an agency charged with attracting industry to the Plymouth-Canton area for years, will not mean the end of the fight for Canton industry, if several township officials and residents have their way.

Township officials have allocated \$6,200 for industrial development in Canton's 1976 proposed budget, formulated before the PCDC's fate was decided. Another \$2,500, Canton's share

of the PCDC's residual funds, is expected to return to township coffers after the PCDC is dissolved. Several township residents and officials hope to increase the amount earmarked for industrial development.

TRUSTEE BRIAN SCHWALL, who serves as the township's representative on the PCDC, asked board members last week to allocate the \$2,500 in PCDC residual funds to the Canton Chamber of Commerce.

Chamber officials, according to Schwall's suggestion, would use the money on a contractual basis to help pull industry to the township until another arrangement could be established.

Supervisor Robert Greenstein says a professional industrial coordinator, paid through township funds, should eventually replace the PCDC in Canton Township.

"I think an industrial coordinator would certainly be the way to go in the future," Schwall said. "In the interim, the chamber is the best agency we have for the encouragement of industry."

The chamber could perform numerous tasks to attract industry to the township, Schwall says, such as the publication of fact sheets about the township.

Board members postponed action on Schwall's recommendation pending further study.

BART BERG, president of the Canton Chamber of Commerce and a member of the township planning commission, said the chamber's executive

board would have to discuss and approve the contractual arrangement, if approved by township officials.

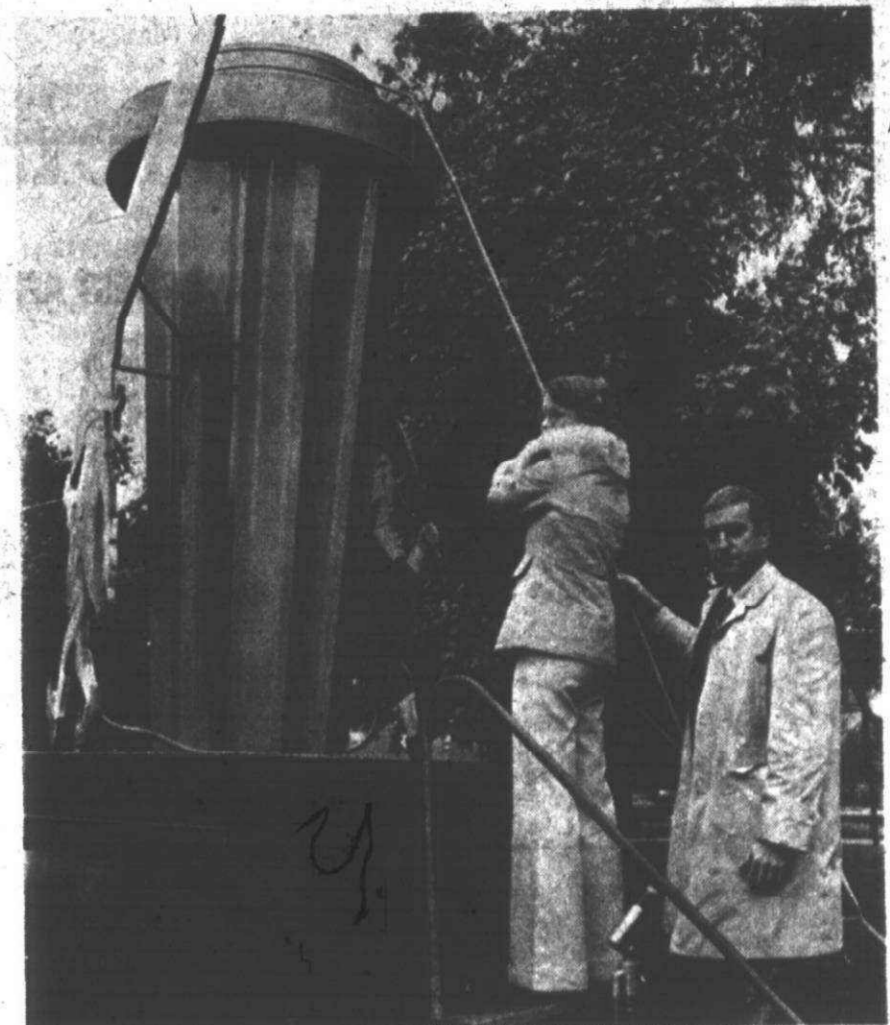
"I don't think there would be a problem, depending on the chore that would have to be done," Berg said. "I'm in favor of anything to promote the township in the direction of a balanced tax base. We don't have that now. When it gets out of line, then the residents will start to scream."

The chamber, Berg said, has already performed some tasks to help attract industry. A township board resolution, designed to give expanding industries a tax break, was published in a Michigan Chamber of Commerce newsletter.

At last week's budgetary public hearing, Berg protested the allocation of \$6,200 for industrial development in the township's 1976 proposed budget.

"I would like to encourage the trustees to seriously consider making the industrial budget \$20,000," Berg said.

Greenstein answered: "I agree. We might want to add \$12,000 or \$16,000 to the present allocation and hire an industrial coordinator for Canton."

Goals discussed at 1st CAC meeting

Canton Township's Citizens Advisory Council (CAC) has finally lifted off the ground after months of delay.

Seven of the 11 persons appointed to the group last week met with Supervisor Robert Greenstein to outline the CAC's directions and goals.

THE FIRST priority of the group, according to members' discussion last week and the township board of trustees' resolution establishing the group, is the study of additional representation needed on the CAC.

Although the original membership is primarily composed of representatives from organized homeowner associations, condominium groups and the Chamber of Commerce, members will determine areas of the township not represented on the CAC and recommend additional representation to the board.

BETTY HANANN, temporary chairperson of the new group, said CAC members will study membership expansion needs in the area of "lifestyle" as well as geographic residence.

CAC members, for example, may discover the need for additional senior citizen representation.

Greenstein, who arranged the CAC's first meeting, listed areas he would like the CAC to research—the possibilities of fire, safety and recreational millage approvals and a farmers market.

The CAC, as approved by township board members last May, is charged with the study of township problems and issues assigned to it by the board.

CAC members set their meetings for the first Tuesday of the month at 6 p.m. and the third Saturday of the month at 9 a.m. Members elected Ms. Hamann as provisional chairperson and Hilda Matzo as provisional secretary.

Hydrant law to fine vandals

Canton Fire Chief Mel Paulin wants to insure the safety of the township's fire hydrants.

Although no person has tampered with the hydrants to date, Paulin wants an ordinance to discourage hydrant vandalism and punish any violators.

At Paulin's prompting, Supervisor Robert Greenstein introduced such an ordinance last week. Township board members postponed publishing and approval of the ordinance until they receive copies of the proposed law.

Under the proposed ordinance, taken from a Plymouth Township law, tampering with a fire hydrant is a misdemeanor. No person should open a hydrant without permission, except to extinguish a fire.

Violation of the ordinance is punishable by 90 days in jail or a \$100 fine.

The law's "tampering" definition would not include hydrant painting and decorating activities—a project suggested by Paulin and supervised by the Canton Bicentennial Commission.

Street names may change

Some Canton residents may soon have to change their address.

At the prompting of Fire Chief Mel Paulin, township board members have unanimously approved name changes for three courts.

The board's recommendation will go to the Wayne County Road Commission for final action.

Paulin is urging the name changes because of the fire department's confusion on emergency runs. The courts currently hold the same names as streets in the locality.

Names suggested by the Wayne County Road Commission and approved by the township board are: Majestic Court for the currently-named Royal Court, located in Cherry Hill Orchards Subdivision, out of Cherry Hill and west of Lilley; London Court for Emerson Court, located in Willow Creek Subdivision No. 1, south of Warren and west of Lilley; and Kingsbridge Court for Foxhorn Court, located in Windsor Park Subdivision No. 4, north of Warren and west of Lilley.

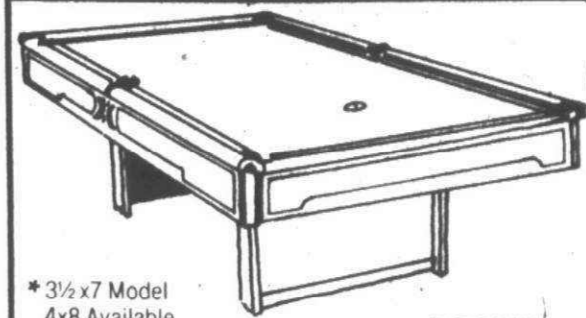

Justice has been obtained, but loose ends are disturbing

"What alarms me," said one city father, "is the availability of hard drugs, stolen guns and ammunition, with evidently no questions asked."

The conversation concerned the January shooting of Terry Buchman in Canton and the outcome of the trials of the three young adults accused of his murder.

In many instances, when the shooting is discussed, parents have a sympathy for the parents of the dead youth and a nagging empathy for the parents of the accused.

The whole thing struck too close to home. Teachers recall the participants as elementary and high school students. Schoolmates, who have been away at college, say, "I can't believe it. I had classes with him."

Will everyone rest more easily now that justice

has been done, that they have had their day in court?

It is the unfinished business—the loose ends—that have a disturbing effect.

There were the witnesses who were afraid to testify—actually, afraid for the safety of themselves and their families.

There was the bombing threat to the family of one of the witnesses who did testify.

There were the obscene and threatening telephone calls to those involved and on the perimeter of the case.

The old adage "kids will be kids" isn't heard any more.

It went out with the advent of the new obscene vocabulary and the sale of hard drugs in Kellogg Park.

Recreation is area challenge

The concept of a recreation authority for the area served by the Plymouth Community School District brings to mind exciting possibilities.

Weeks of groundwork and study came to naught in 1973 when the city of Plymouth representative was the lone dissenter in the projected plan.

THE AUTHORITY now reports to its parent organization, the Intergovernmental Committee, with the charge that:

"The past problems encountered in a joint recreation exploration would be set aside and a new positive approach would be the focus."

The task is in the hands of Gerald Burke, Plymouth Township; Brian Schwall, Canton Township; Kay Williams, Superior Township; Joe Bida, City of Plymouth; Thomas Yack, Plymouth Community School District; and Richard Gornick, Intergovernmental Committee representative.

For Schwall and Burke, who worked on the initial attempt for an integrated plan, it is difficult to forget all that went before. The facts, figures, and surveys gleaned from past experience should play a vital part in planning a joint, long-range approach to recreation.

AN ASSESSMENT of what each community has to throw into the kitty shows each group needs the other.

Township-surrounded, the City of Plymouth has

playgrounds and tot lots. It has provided its residents and the surrounding community with a Cultural Center which attracts skaters, bridge players, painters craft students and many others from a wide area.

The city spawned the school system which serves the entire community. In earlier days it took care of students from the east, until the new City of Livonia was able to take over its own.

School buildings scattered over the entire area with their tennis courts and playing fields are used for everything from crochet classes to touch football games by all the people.

Canton and Plymouth Townships have not neglected their own.

Plymouth Township has a golf course and an area set aside for recreation with lighted baseball diamonds.

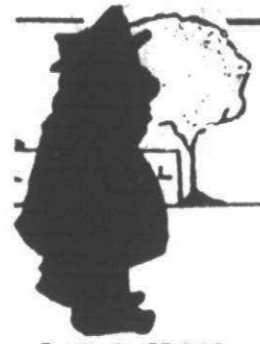
Canton has a recreation hall and land for recreation use.

THE KEY WORD here is "land." The townships have acreage available for bike trails, cross-country skiing, nature trails, outdoor pools and skating rinks.

The city and the schools complement the townships in recreation facilities.

It would be in the best interests of all to reach a meeting of the minds before it is too late.

Our crazy economy

Looking out over the dining room that was filled to capacity and the long line of customers awaiting admittance, The Stroller's favorite innkeeper up on the river remarked, "If this is a depression, I hope it never ends."

He had been acting as the host for several hours and admitted the line never seemed to shorten and that the present season was the best he ever has had.

"I read in the paper every day," he said, "that inflation and the depression have combined to get the economy out of joint, but there is no sign of it around here."

Then he added, as an afterthought, "This is a crazy world in which we live."

It was an unusual statement. But the more a person looks about, the more he becomes convinced that he wasn't very far wrong.

All you have to do is scan the public prints and you'll find all sorts of things to tell you that the economy is way out of balance.

FOR INSTANCE on the front pages you'll read of the doom and gloom, the unemployment that still runs into the thousands, the increase in the welfare lines, and starving of many others.

Then turn to the sports pages and you'll see such surprising items as 92,000 persons attending a football

game at the University of Michigan on the same day that more than 60,000 watched Michigan State against what was supposed to be a minor opponent.

And just as surprising was the fact that close to a capacity gathering of 80,000 battled traffic and muddy roads to watch the Lions in a practice game (one that meant nothing) in their new stadium in Pontiac.

Comparing the two items, one can't help feeling that they don't make sense. But the turnstiles don't lie.

It is even more surprising when one learns that some of the big games have been sold out for months—even at high prices—and that the Lions sold more than 35,000 season tickets when no one knew what kind of a team they would be.

That's what caused the innkeeper to shrug his shoulders in wonderment as he added, "Even high prices don't stop them. In our case, here in the dining room, the higher prices we have been forced to charge have had no effect. They just flock here in big numbers."

THE STROLLER had noticed for some time that the higher cost of dining out didn't seem to effect customers. And in many cases they chose the highest priced dishes on the menu.

Doing a bit of research, The Stroller

found the same thing applied to other lines.

Speaking to one of the leading automobile dealers, he learned that the folks one would think were looking for bargains, or the cheapest type of car for their needs, want all of the extras, often regardless of cost.

"This automobile business sure has become puzzling," he said, "especially when we are supposed to be in a depression with the welfare rolls swelling and we still have thousands out of work."

While talking with the up-river innkeeper The Stroller noted that the prices on his menu were not designed to lure customers. They are what has become known as "Detroit prices" with steaks close to \$10 and lobster isn't even priced on the menu.

This seafood delicacy is the most fluctuating thing in the dining areas. The price changes almost from meal to meal, and the only way one learns the cost is by asking as he sits down to the table.

DURING HIS life span, The Stroller has lived through what were called panics, then recessions, then depressions, then economic adjustments and what-not. But he never has seen anything like we have today.

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Spartans stay perfect, blank Farmington

Livonia Stevenson needed some big breaks to beat Farmington High, 10-0, Friday in the Inter Lakes League opener for both teams. And Farmington seemed more than willing to oblige the Spartans.

Stevenson got the only break it needed on the first series of downs. Farmington quarterback Dave Cleland threw an interception into the arms of John Lokar. Stevenson had the ball at midfield.

Spartan QB Jim Dalmatsch then tossed to flanker Bill Rowley, the play gaining 30 yards and setting up the only touchdown of the game—a 10-yard pass play from Dalmatsch to Lokar. Rowley kicked the extra point.

Farmington's defense got tough after that. For example, defensive end Marty Popp sacked quarterback Dalmatsch four times in the game, including one for a 15-yard loss which spoiled a Spartan drive.

But coach Jack Reardon's Stevenson club didn't need another touch-

down. The Spartans were doing quite well with ball control, making their lead stand up. Farmington had the ball for just 10 plays in the second half.

Stevenson's offense also started to move after halftime. In the first half, Farmington held the winners to just 37 yards on the ground. After intermission, the Spartans rolled up 112 yards.

"IT WAS A well-played game on both sides," Reardon said. "We moved the ball a lot better in the second half, and I was glad to see that. We needed that after having minus four yards against Livonia Franklin."

Lokar, an explosive runner, amassed 102 yards in 20 carries. Spartan fullback Chuck Demarco followed with 42 yards in 19 tries. Farmington's leading ground gainer was halfback Bert Herzog with 34 yards in six carries.

Farmington's offense produced 83 yards on the ground and 20 more through the air on five of eight pass completions.

"We beat ourselves in the first half," said Farmington coach Hal Beardsley. "We gave them good field position and a lot of breaks."

STILL, BEARDSLEY'S squad showed a lot of spunk on defense. In the second quarter, Herzog ripped off an 18-yard gainer and gave Farm-

ington the ball on the Stevenson seven. But on the next play, a Falcon runner fumbled and Stevenson recovered.

Stevenson was unable to move the ball and Farmington got it back after the punt.

Again in the fourth quarter, the Falcon defense showed its worth. Steven-

son had the ball on the Farmington 10. Lokar carried to the seven and then to the five. Then Lokar carried up the middle for what looked like a first down on the two. But he was just short, and Farmington took over on downs.

With time running out, Farmington moved the ball out to the 20 before

the drive sputtered and the Falcons had to punt.

Stevenson, now 3-0 overall, plays next on Friday, Oct. 3, at Waterford Mott. Farmington, now 1-2, plays Friday at Walled Lake Central. Both games begin at 8 p.m.

WHITE IMMEDIATELY went 12 yards, and, on the next play, Hodges hit Mike Robbins for the touchdown. The conversion put the Bulldogs on top 7-0 with 4:54 remaining in the quarter.

But it was all downhill from there.

Dearborn defense, errors kill RU

Redford Union fell prey to its own mistakes Friday and dropped a 27-0 Suburban Eight football match to Dearborn.

The John Glenn Rockets, led by a tenacious defense and senior tailback Fred Shoemaker, stopped a tough Thurston team 22-12 Friday night, in the Northwest Suburban League opener for both teams.

The Glenn defense, despite being victimized by two long passes, allowed Thurston only 140 yards total offense, and a mere 15 on the ground.

Shoemaker was the workhorse for the Rockets, as he ran for over 100 yards for the third straight game.

Although both the defense and Shoemaker were outstanding, both coaches

agree the difference in the game was a fake punt play by Glenn that resulted in a 39-yard touchdown for the Rockets. On the play everyone was fooled, with the possible exception of Jeff Couturior, who took off around left end and went untouched into the end zone.

Thurston opened the scoring when quarterback Roy Piligian found Dennis Kuschel behind the Glenn defense for a 68 yard touchdown pass. The kick failed and the Eagles led 6-0 midway through the first quarter.

GLENN CAME right back and mounted a 58-yard, 11-play drive, that

was capped by a 19-yard touchdown pass from Todd DeLuca to slotback Rick Bonk. DeLuca's extra point attempt was no good.

Neither team could move the ball on its next series. On Thurston's next set of downs, they went to the pass and were foiled by the Glenn defense. They punted on fourth down and John Stafford wormed his way 70 yards down the field to give the Rockets excellent field position on the Thurston 26.

With the aid of a pass interference call on the Eagles, Glenn needed only two plays to get in for the score. This

time it was Shoemaker going over from 18 yards out. DeLuca's kick was good, and the Rockets led 13-6, with 6:51 left in the half.

Thurston again could not move the ball, and Mark Coulston returned the punt for a touchdown; only to have it called back because of a clipping penalty.

Glenn was undaunted, however, and marched the ball down to the Thurston 39 before Couturior pulled his cup.

The first half ended with Thurston scoring once again on a long pass. This time, Gary Abundis took a

screen pass and raced 48 yards for a Thurston touchdown. Thurston coach Don Riehl felt Abundis was the outstanding player for his team, Friday night.

In the second half, both defenses stiffened, and neither team could move the ball effectively.

Glenn did mount one drive. At the beginning of the fourth quarter, they moved from their own 36 to the Eagles' 15, where they had to settle for a 32 yard field goal attempt from DeLuca. His kick was wide and Thurston took over on the 20.

The Rockets concluded the scoring, when Thurston's center snapped the

ball over the punter's head, and out of the end zone for a safety.

Glenn rolled up 250 yards on the ground, and coach Lloyd Carr praised his offensive line, saying, "they played a hell of a game, even though they were outweighed by an average of 30 pounds."

Glenn is now 3-0 and takes on North Farmington this Saturday at North Carr. Carr feels this will be a big game for his team, and hopes the momentum of a 3-0 record will help.

Thurston's record now stands a 0-3 and they play Garden City East at home, this Saturday, at 3:00 p.m.

Unyielding defense carries Tigers past Riverside

Garden City West's rugged defensive crew deserves most of the credit for Friday night's 20-0 Tri-River League conquest of Dearborn Heights Riverside.

Coach Charley Elmquist's offense was supposed to be the experienced part of his ballclub, but the defense has carried the team the last two games against Southgate and Riverside.

Against Riverside's Rebels, the defensive unit was outstanding, holding the visitors to only 37 yards rushing in 28 carries. It recovered three fumbles, which it jarred loose from Rebel

However, the defense was hitting with such intensity, that Riverside coughed up the ball on the next play at the 18-yard line and defensive halfback Dale Stupryra, who played outstanding defense

as well as punting long all night, recovered the ball.

Underwood, who finished with 50 yards gained in 15 carries, rushed four straight times to move the pigskin to the four. Tom Poole followed fullback Greg Shinsky and the right side of his offensive line through a hole for the four-yard touchdown.

John Stupryra added the point and West led, 14-0, with 2:22 left in the third period. Riverside's defensive wall was superb the entire game, hold-

ing West's running attack to 86 net yards and Poole's aerial game to 3 of 7 for 25 yards. Halfback Terry Bradley gained 47 yards in 11 first half carries but didn't carry any in the second half.

West's offense was stopped by a determined Riverside team which held the Tigers to 86 net running yards in 30 carries and a total offense of 111 net yards for the game.

Defensive coaches Chuck Howton and Bill Parker saw their fired-up

crew hold Riverside to 37 yards on the ground and 48 through the air for a net of 85 yards. Each team had six first downs in the battle of the trenches.

Other defensive stars for West were Rick Smitt, Matt Dunnigan and Greg Shinsky, who also ran back the opening kickoff 50 yards.

West, now 2-0 in trying to win the Tri-River League title outright after a three-way tie last year, hosts Inkster Cherry Hill at 7:30 p.m. Friday night.

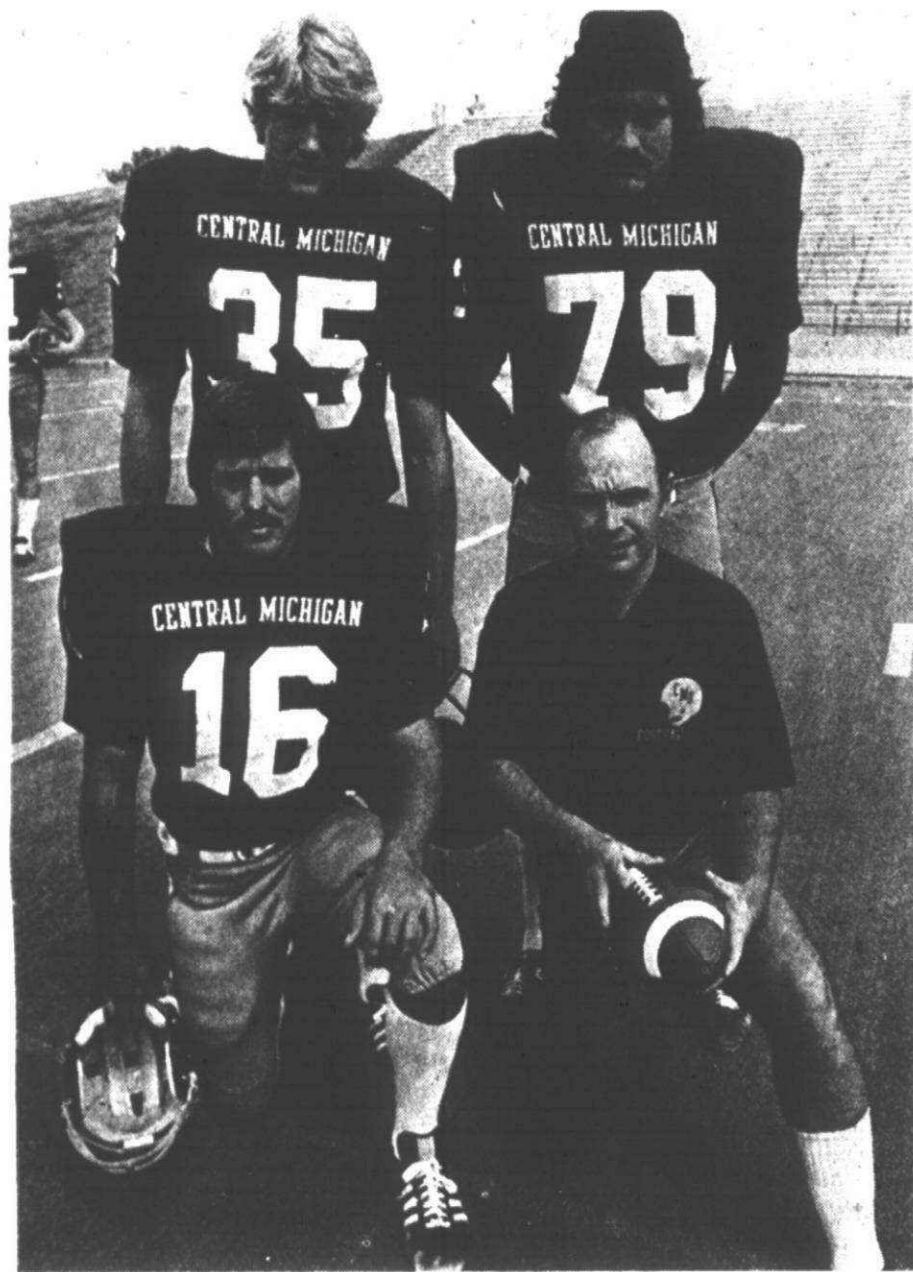
After Annapolis came back to tie it, Rob Reed went off tackle for nine yards to put the Trojans back on top.

Derek Kerr topped the school loop with a 190 and 154 for 344 while Gary Vanderwill topped the junior house loop with a 244 in 611.

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

Bicentennial astronauts come from Plymouth

Audrey Cunningham of North Territorial Road is test marketing a new product. With a family of four grown and away from home, she's in the cookie business—cookie cutter business, that is.

Mrs. Cunningham has a design patent on an astronaut cookie cutter. The baked cookie requires only one dab of frosting for the face and there it is—unmistakably, an astronaut ready for a moon walk.

The new venture is the result of an idea she had been tossing around for three years.

"Our family was never the gingerbread man type," she said. "We just didn't care for gingerbread."

She had a favorite rolled cookie recipe she'd used for 25 years. What could be a more suitable shape for the white sugar cookie than a white-suited astronaut. And with everyone's sense of history more keenly attuned by the nation's bicentennial observance, the time was right for a commemorative cookie cutter.

EARLY THIS YEAR, in February, she began working on the design. With some coaching from her husband, Chester, and neighbor, Paul Emrich, the first cutters were ready by the end of May.

They are manufactured of tin-washed steel by a Pennsylvania company.

Embossing the cutter with a metal stamp bearing "1776...1976 THE MOON 7-20-69, PAT. PEND." proved to be a major problem. A mighty whack with a hammer made no impression on the steel.

Emrich, with his tool and die knowledge, designed an apparatus that made the embossing possible without a great expenditure of strength.

Folding boxes for the bicentennial issue are red and blue on a white background. On the underside of the box is Audrey's rolled cookie recipe. On the front, an astronaut gazes at the planet Earth. Manufacture of the bicentennial issue is limited to 1,976 cutters.

"I DECIDED TO SEND all my friends Christmas presents in July," said Mrs. Cunningham. The cutters were mailed out and she received responses from all over the country.

To learn about the ways of marketing she attended a Service Corps of Retired Executives (SCORE) seminar in Detroit. Sponsored by the Small Business Association, SCORE lecturers give private counseling after the seminar.

The cutters were placed in shops in Ann Arbor, the Panhandler in Plymouth, Et Cetera Shop in Northville, Kitchen Glamor in Redford Township, Trifles and Treasures in West Bloomfield, and the museum gift shop in Greenfield Village.

She received a letter from a lady in New York who had one of her cutters. A niece had picked one up in Ann Arbor. As a member of a cookie club and collector, she asked for all the background data on the astronaut cutter.

"I feel I am not retail, I am a wholesaler," said Mrs. Cunningham. "After the bicentennial issue I would like to put it in the right hands to facilitate distribution."

As she used a paint brush to frost some small round cookies, she advised, "If you just dab the blue and white frosting, it looks fine when it dries."

And it did—just like the planet earth, as the astronauts have seen it.

Hyperactivity is pediatrician's topic

How artificial food coloring and flavoring relate to the hyperactive child will be the topic of a talk by Dr. Ben Feingold, pediatrician and allergist, Thursday, Oct. 2 at 7:30 p.m.

Author of numerous publications and articles in the field of allergy and basic immunology, Dr. Feingold recently wrote a book, "Why Your Child is Hyperactive," published by Random House.

them that is free of synthetic food coloring and flavoring.

In an article in the American Journal of Nursing, he reported rapid improvement in the behavior and learning abilities in hyperactive children who follow a diet that eliminates foods with certain additives.

"With the thousands of food chemicals in the environment, it seems remarkable that their influences on behavior has not been suspected sooner," he wrote.

"No great imagination is required to visualize how this critical medical and social problem will be compounded within the not too distant future, unless recognition is given to the important causative role of additives."

Leaves... what to do with them...

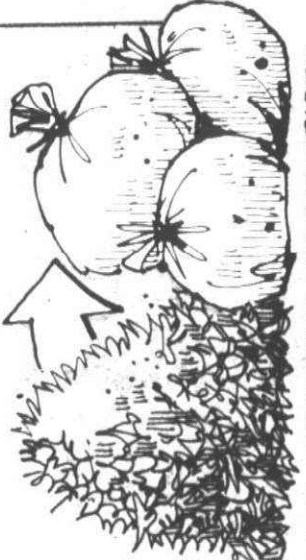
Many people regard leaves as a necessary evil and the penalty for having nice trees around the yard. The back-breaking job of raking up the leaves does not appeal to most people, but with the fine collection of leaf removal equipment offered by Yard-Man, leaf removal does not have to be a back-breaking job. But the problem always remains of what to do with the leaves.

BURNING

Burning leaves is the least desirable means of getting rid of them. In fact a constantly growing number of communities are banning the burning of leaves. Not only does burning pose a potential fire hazard, but releases unpleasant smoke and pollutants into the air. There are better methods of disposing of leaves.

BAGGING

Collect your leaves, put them in plastic trash or leaf bags, seal them with a twist tie and put them out for the garbage collectors. Shredding of leaves will greatly reduce the number of bags. However, if you're going to shred them, consider making a compost pile.

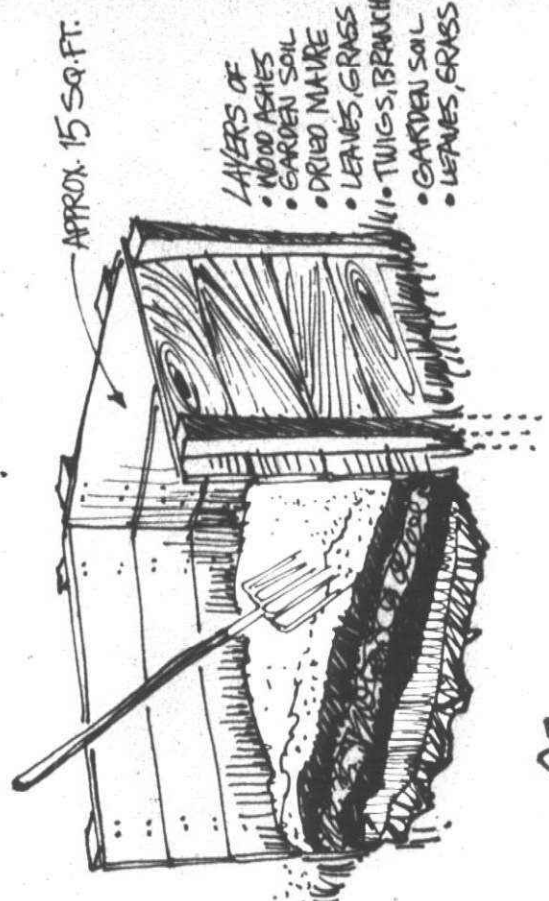


MAKING A COMPOST PILE

Composting is a way to recycle waste and organic material and add beauty to our environment. Compost can be used to enrich the soil for vegetable and flower gardens, top dress the lawns and is an excellent mulch for flower beds, trees and shrubs.

A compost can be made of leaves, grass clippings and even garbage. It is desirable to utilize some means of containing the compost pile for both ease of maintenance and to keep undesirable animals away. A simple fence of wire, logs, cement blocks or old lumber can be used. Digging a hole in the ground will increase holding capacity.

Spread a layer of the material to be composted 2-6 inches thick. This may be leaves, grass clippings, pine needles or other organic material. Note, shredded leaves will decompose more rapidly. Cover the first layer of compost with 1/2 - 2 inch of topsoil. Sub-surface soil will work, but will take longer to work as it does not contain as many micro-organisms as top-soil. Repeating these steps are all that are technically necessary to create a compost pile, but the process can be hastened by taking other steps. Decomposition can be hastened by adding approximately 1/2 pound of lime to each 6 inch layer of compost in

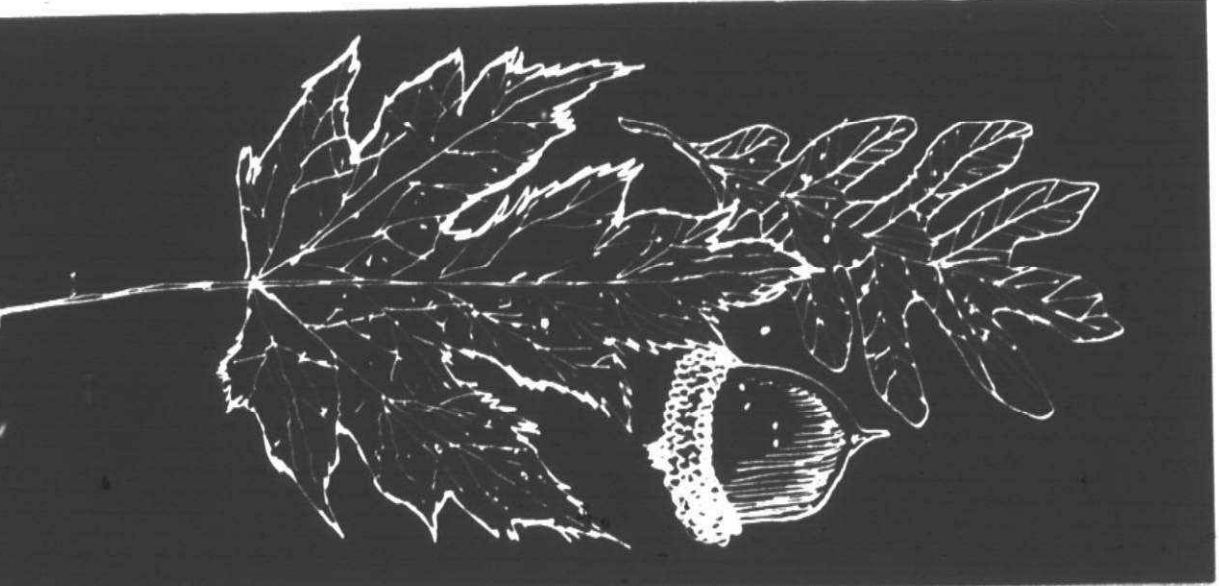

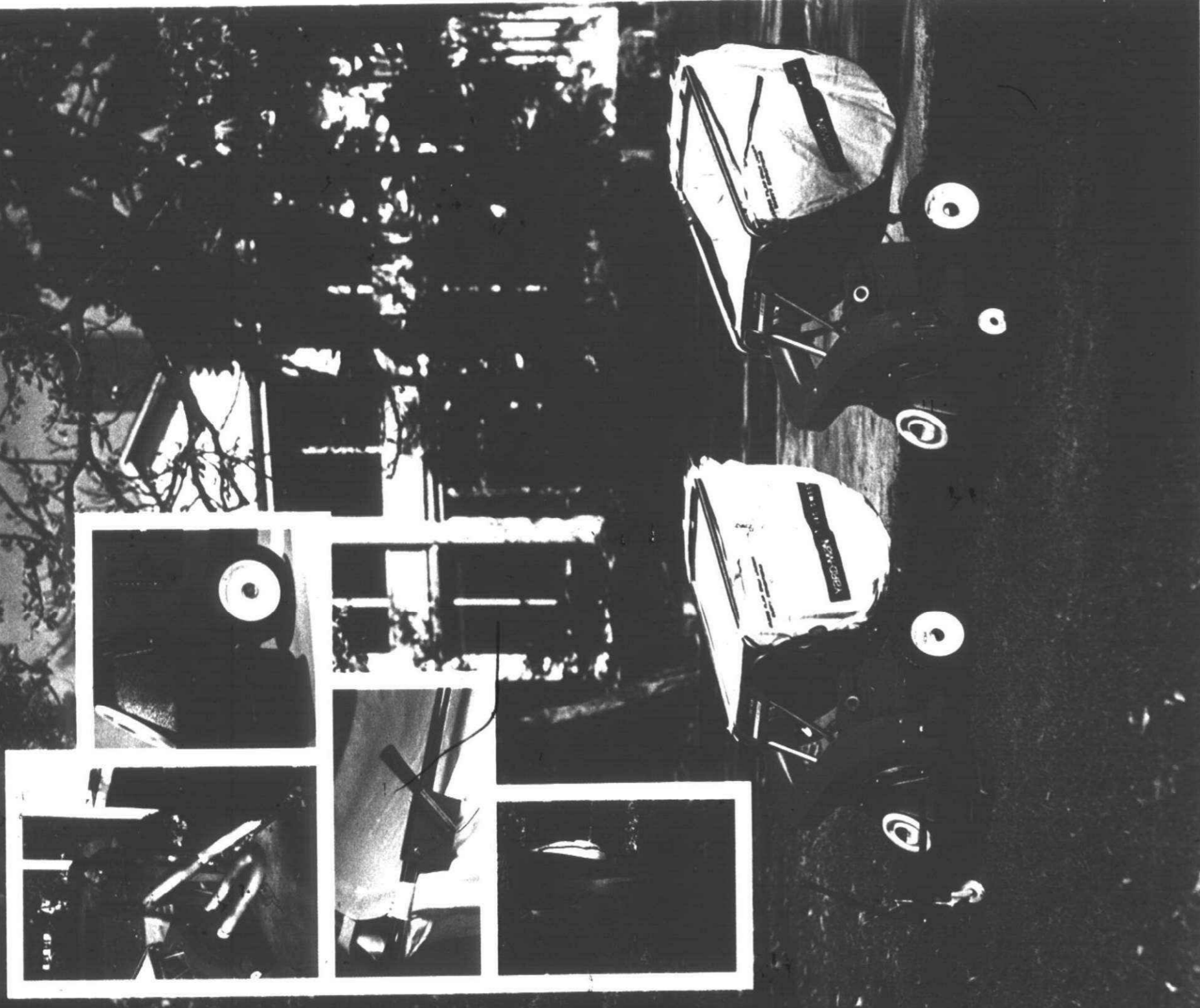

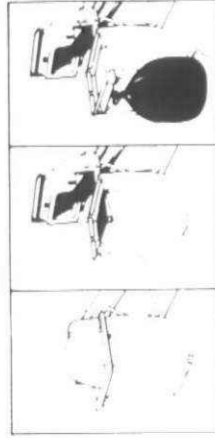

Ready the lawn for winter

Fall can be one of the more important times in your lawn's life. Following a few simple operations can help your lawn come through the rigors of winter in fine style and get a head start for Spring.

In September de-thatch your lawn using a lawn groom rake, a de-thatching attachment for your lawn mower or rent a power rake. Thatch is the build-up of undecomposed clippings, stems, roots, leaves, etc. just above the soil line. Some thatch is beneficial especially during the hot month— as it helps keep the soil cool and moist.

Too much thatch acts as a barrier to the grass plants' nutrition and provides a haven for grass fungi and diseases. De-thatching in the Fall is

too much top growth in the Fall, but will expend a great deal of energy building up a strong root system and growing denser.

In the latter part of October, or the first part of November, feed with a winter green or survival lawn food that has low nitrate, high phosphorus and potash. Gypsum can also be applied during these months which will help prevent salt damage, discourage winter disease and dog damage. If your lawn is due for liming, this is the time to do it using dolomitic lime.

Don't let your lawn go into winter with a long top. Keep on mowing as long as it grows. Make your final cut before winter at approximately 2".

Winter insurance

Early Fall is the time to plant spring flowering bulbs, particularly crocus and narcissus. Tulips may be planted later on in the Fall.

About the middle of October is the time to dig up bulbs and perennials to be forced for early blooming. Store the potted plants in a cold frame and water moderately until foliage dies naturally. Then move indoors to a hothouse.

Mulching will do much to provide winter insurance for your gardens. It's insulating effect prevents wide

fluctuations in soil temperature and reduce the chance of frost heaving doing root damage. Mulches also assist the soil in retaining vital moisture.

Rosebushes require extra attention. Pile soil about 8" high around the bush, then completely surround with straw.

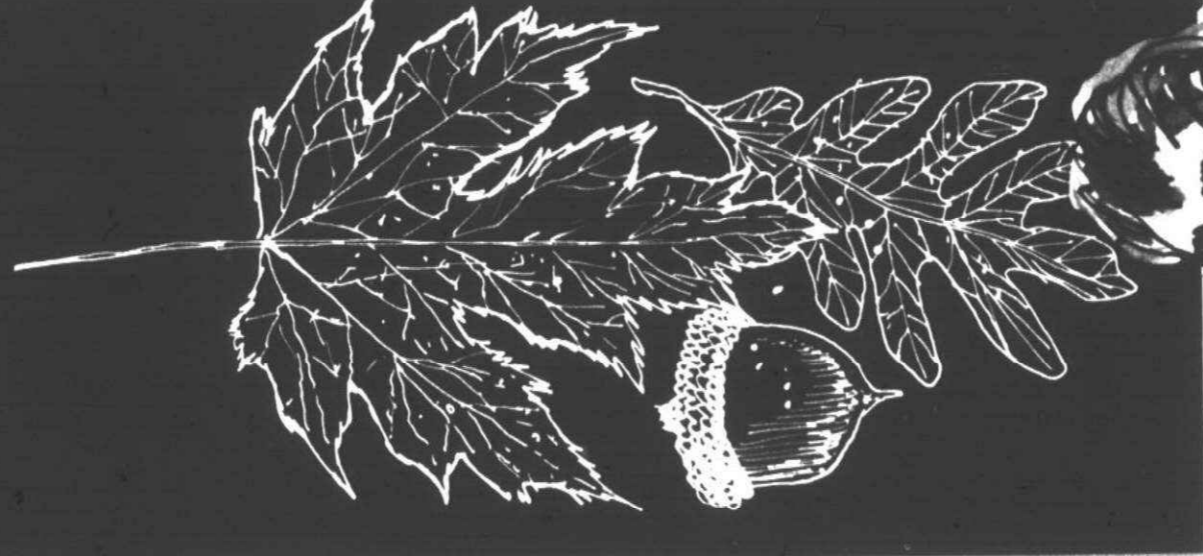
Young or recently planted trees should be insulated around root area with mulch after the ground is frozen. They should also be staked and guy-wired to prevent loosening

of the roots by high winds.

Wrapping the trunks with burlap or other suitable material will prevent bark damage from alternate freezing and thawing damage.

Broadleaf or other evergreens in windy exposures can be protected from drying by windscreens constructed of burlap, corrugated cardboard, snow fence or other available material. Do not use polyethylene or other plastic sheeting.
