

Board, chamber start to resolve differences

A positive attitude and better lines of communication between Canton Township and Chamber of Commerce officials should attract more commercial and industrial developments to the township, if Canton officials and Chamber of Commerce members have their way.

Criticizing the chamber's "negative" attitude toward township government and ordinances concerning the business community, township officials attempted "to clear the air" between the chamber and township board at a chamber-sponsored breakfast meeting last week.

Several board members stressed the township's positive attitude toward the business community and suggested the formation of a chamber committee to discuss concerns with the township's administration.

Chamber members reacted favor-

ably toward officials' viewpoints and the committee idea.

"A group of business people will get together to form this committee, and we'll sit down with you," promised chamber president Bart Berg. "I'm extremely happy we've hit upon a thread where we can start building together."

DURING THE PAST year, chamber officials have criticized what they call "a veritable flood of legislation directly affecting commerce in the community."

Township officials said the chamber's attitude discourages businessmen from locating in the community.

"I think we need more of what I think a true chamber should be," township Treasurer Carl Parsell told chamber members. "A chamber should be a promotional group—part

public relations and part services.

"The chamber here relates how bad things are in Canton. How long is the chamber going to promote a 'bad' name? How long before you promote a 'good' name? I would like the chamber to be a booster for this community."

The township's sign ordinance and proposed consumer protection and business licensing ordinances are not anti-business, township officials maintained.

"There's been a lot of ugly rumors, most generated by chamber members, concerning the board's and my attitude toward business," Supervisor Robert Greenstein said.

"That's stupid. It's patently ridiculous to believe any political administration could ever be against business. You have to be in favor of business, because it services the community.

Very often the people who supply the businesses are the backbone of the community.

"Everything we've done has not been anti-business but pro-business," the supervisor said. "Your businesses have been protected because of this legislation. The owner of a restaurant doesn't have to worry about a 'quickie' business coming in and taking away his livelihood."

TOWNSHIP LEGISLATION such as berm requirements and the sign ordinance, are working to create a "special" atmosphere for Canton Township, according to Greenstein.

"We're trying to create a 'texture' for the township, so people from other communities will feel like doing business here. We want people to know you're there, but we don't want the texture of this township to look like

Garden City. We're trying hard to make Canton different."

Other board members took the opportunity to air their views toward the chamber, and business community. The meeting, the last in a series of three, was scheduled to hear the attitudes of township officials.

Trustee Robert Myers criticized the chamber's opposition to a proposed consumer protection agency but cited a need to protect the small businessman. Township officials, he said, should review proposed ordinances and their impact on the small businessman.

"I'm concerned we do not over-regulate Canton to the degree that the small businessman can't come into Canton and prosper," Myers said over a round of applause. "The small store serves a purpose in our community.

"But we must protect the entire

27,000 residents who live in Canton. This board has moved Canton from the 19th to the 20th century. I suggest the chamber bring itself out of the 19th century.

"This can only be done through cooperation between the chamber and the board," Myers said. "The gap between us can heal. No longer should we have bickering."

TRUSTEES JIM POOLE and Gerald Cheske struck similar notes.

"The main reason I came here was to promote a better relationship," said Cheske. "Any good, progressive community has a strong chamber that works with the administration. I think our community is very progressive. To make it stronger, I'd like to see us work together."

Township battles with slaughterhouse

A battle between the township administration and the owner of a slaughterhouse located on Geddes Road between Beck and Canton Center wound up in Judge Dunbar Davis' 35th District Court last week, following the issuance of two tickets by township employees.

Dale Risinger, owner of the Red Meat Dog and Cat Food Inc., has been charged with illegally expanding the operation of his slaughterhouse as well as expanding the slaughterhouse facilities.

Risinger, who purchased the business at 46800 Geddes almost three years ago, claims he has followed all township procedures and is innocent of both charges.

"I'm not ashamed of the way I run

this business, or anything about it. I run it 100 per cent legitimate."

The problem, according to Canton Supervisor Robert Greenstein, began late last year when Risinger appeared before the township zoning board of appeals.

"Risinger came in Dec. 18 last year and asked for a permit to increase the use of the of the slaughterhouse so he could kill 17 animals a week. We tabled the matter because Dr. Clifford McClumpha wasn't there, and we set another date so he could come back when we were all here."

"He didn't come back on the second date. On Sept. 14, I drove by the place and I saw about 125 horses in the corral, and that the building had doubled. I was absolutely astounded.

"IT'S IN A residentially zoned area, and as such it's a non-conforming use. You can't expand a non-conforming use."

According to Greenstein, the previous owner of the slaughterhouse and the man Risinger bought it from, Bernard Russell, used it just to butcher "one or two cows and pigs twice a week."

"It was neighborhood thing," said the supervisor. "He would just kill the animals for himself or his neighbors."

"Now, unbeknownst to all, Risinger is killing horses there—it's a whole different set of standards between slaughtering for edible (food for people) and inedible (pet food)."

Risinger said before he bought the plant he checked with the township, at the advice of his attorney, and followed all procedures.

"I'm licensed by the federal government and inspected by them. There's an inspector here 40 hours a week from the Michigan Department of Agriculture. I don't think I'm hurting anyone. I'm a small businessman just trying to get on my feet."

"I've never had anyone complain about me, and I run an immaculately clean plant. I keep the place up to state standards for edible even though

I'm licensed for inedible. "If I lose this court fight, everything I've got goes. I've invested everything I've saved and some I've borrowed.

IT'S UP TO the courts now, and I'll abide by what they say. But I don't get it. I'm here for two years, and then suddenly something's wrong."

According to Greenstein, the plant was expanded and the construction completed before Risinger applied for a permit. Greenstein said the request was turned down by building inspector Chuck Thompson and a letter was sent to Risinger explaining that a non-conforming business or building could not be expanded. Sometime thereafter, according to the supervisor, the permit was issued through a red-tape error.

Risinger said, "I got the permit, and the construction only covers the refuse. It's a form of fly control—that's all."

Greenstein said Risinger appeared before the ZBA Sept. 25 and asked to kill 150 horses per week. "We turned him down cold, 3-0," said the supervisor.

"Apparently he has a big contract with Kal Kan. After we turned him down, he kept on killing the horses. So on Oct. 10 Bruce Phillips, the township ordinance officer, issued him a ticket for expanded use, and the building department gave him a ticket for expanding the building."

The court action, a trial by jury, began last Monday, and was scheduled to resume on Saturday, Nov. 22.

"I realize that I can't stay where I am forever," said Risinger. "The area is growing and eventually it will be impossible to operate here. I'm willing to move when the time comes. "But if they make me move now, I'll lose everything I've got. That includes \$90,000 I've already invested, and the income from the business. I couldn't even get my money back on the land, if I were forced to sell now."

After intergovernmental dinner

Northville Twp. joins council

A seventh unit of government has joined the Intergovernmental Committee in efforts to strengthen the group's bid for areawide cooperation and goals.

Representatives of Northville Township, invited to join the committee when it was formed about a year ago, last week cast their lots with the Intergovernmental Committee after attending a dinner meeting, sponsored by the group.

Northville Township Supervisor Betty Lennox said she will begin attending intergovernmental meetings to strengthen her township's relationship with other governmental units within the Plymouth Community School District.

Intergovernmental members, representing the Plymouth School District, the City of Plymouth and Canton, Plymouth, Salem and Superior townships, say the new member will strengthen their group.

"The absence of Northville Township has created somewhat of a void in the past," said intergovernmental member Richard Gornick, a Plymouth Township trustee. "I'm glad they've decided to return to the fold."

SOME ISSUES, such as possible establishment of an areawide sanitation authority, needs input from Northville representatives, Gornick says.

Mrs. Lennox said group discussions at last week's intergovernmental din-

ner convinced her of the need for membership in the Intergovernmental Committee.

"I think there are things we can work toward together," she said. "I think there are things we can accomplish."

Doubt about the Intergovernmental Committee's potential delayed Northville Township's decision to join the group, added Mrs. Lennox.

A change in the township's administration further delayed the decision to join.

Mrs. Lennox, the former township

clerk, took over the supervisor's chair in August, when former Supervisor Lawrence Wright resigned because of health reasons.

INTERGOVERNMENTAL members welcomed Northville to the group.

"Northville Township is a good neighbor," said Canton Supervisor Robert Greenstein. "Any added member has got to add strength to the Intergovernmental Committee. It just means that many more people we're representing.

Brown warns deficit too big

The ship of state is headed for a dire fate, if the predictions of Sen. Thomas Brown (D-Westland) come to pass.

Brown believes the state's budget

deficit will approach a half billion dollars in 1976.

"In the past, the state kept painting the picture so that it would appear bleak, but this time they have not faced up to the fact that it really is going to be short," Brown said in a telephone interview.

"Projections are for a \$300 million deficit, but I think it will be closer to a half billion dollars."

The latest estimates by the Milliken Administration place the deficit at about \$300 million.

BROWN ATTRIBUTED the large deficit to unexpectedly low revenues from the state sales and income taxes. With more persons out of work, Brown contended, fewer persons pay income tax or buy goods taxable by the state.

The recently passed "single business tax" will not be sufficient to bail

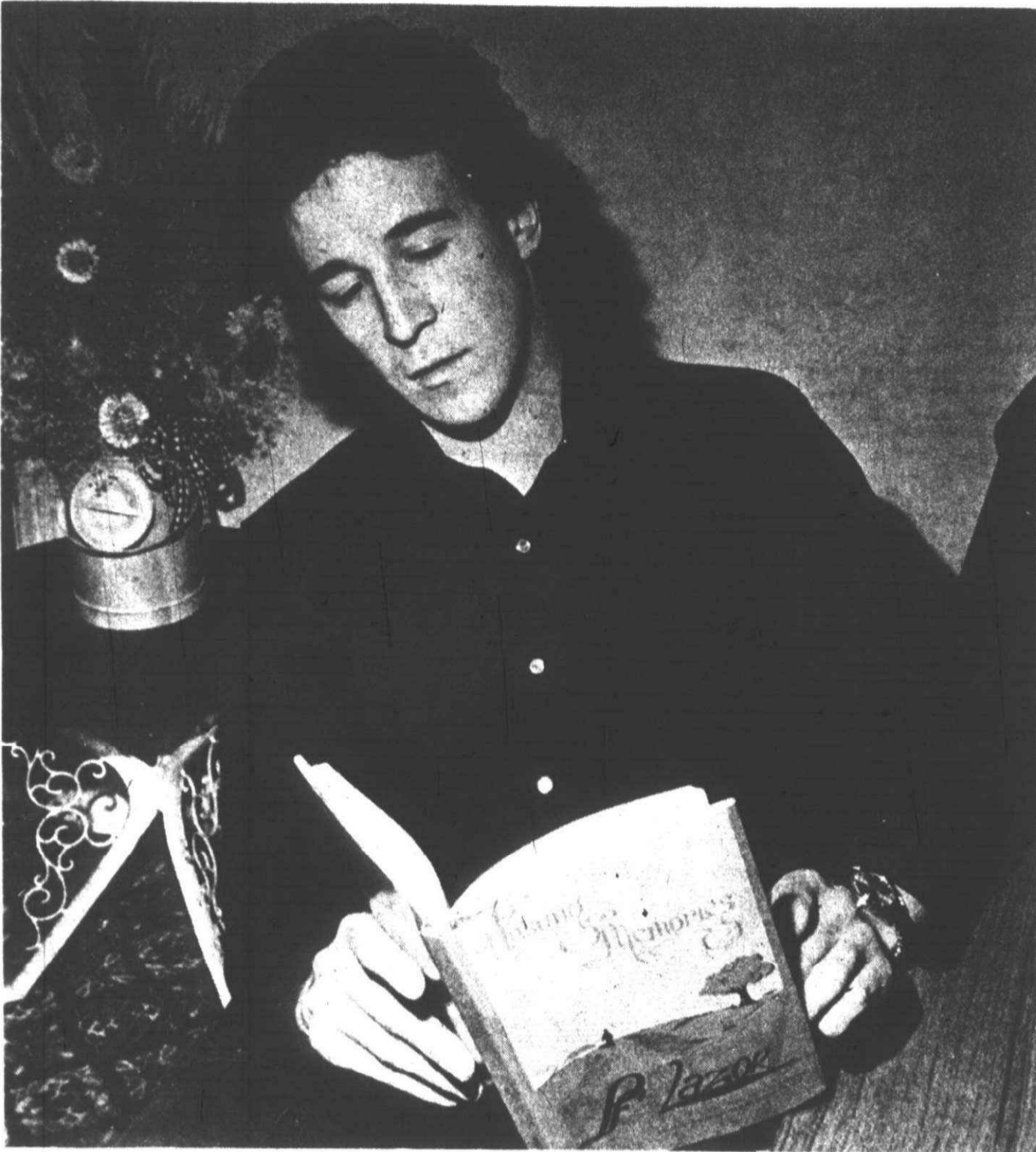

With new book Plymouth poet returns

The poet's phrase and the artist's palette are familiar tools of PF Lazor, a kind of "renaissance" man in the 1970s.

Lazor, an on-again, off-again Plymouth resident who whips into town between trips across the country, has packed creative accomplishments into his 21 years.

MOST RECENT is a fuchsia-bound edition of "Unsung Memories," a collection of Lazor's thoughts and feelings translated into poetry form.

"It's a very sensitive view of a lot of experiences," Lazor says of his recently-published book. "I did this, because it's part of me. I've spent a lot of time alone, and it really shows in this."

Lazor says much of his poetry describes universal experiences—love, memories of interpersonal relationships and quiet experiences with nature.

"I'm a student of nature," explained Lazor, who has traveled throughout the United States and Canada since his graduation from high school. "Nature is the only true teacher. College would do me good, but not as much good as what I'm doing right now."

Although Lazor plans to continue writing poetry and hopes to publish another book within the coming year, the words and phrases of poetry are not the only tools he uses to express his innermost thoughts.

THE SALEM Township native is currently poring over an orchestrated musical score in efforts to create a record album.

A photography buff, Lazor is working on a movie between designing logos for private companies and organizations.

Lazor designed the fuchsia cover of his poetry book, set the type and performed most the editing tasks. Other interests including fencing, sky diving and acting.

"These are all interrelated," Lazor said of his interests. "When I was young, I always drew and painted. There came a time in my life when a brush and palette weren't available, but I could write."

Lazor plans to move to San Francisco within the next few weeks and continue his creative endeavors on the coast.

"It would be nice to become a well-known poet," said Lazor, as he leafed through his recently-published book. "I'd really like that. I don't like commercialism as such, but I would like to get people exposed to my work."

"If people turn it down, that's fine. But I think my problems are going to be very beautiful to a lot of people."

Students laud educational improvements, supplements

Wayne-Westland educators paid tribute to National Education Week Thursday at Seit's Restaurant, but they let education speak for itself.

Deborah Fredericks, a student at John Glenn High School, and Adrienne Clark, of Wayne Memorial High School, were selected by their schools to speak to the group of about 50 persons representing the Wayne-Westland Education Association (WWEA); the W-W School Board and administration; and area service clubs.

Debbie pointed out that education had graduated from the days when only a limited amount of instructional materials were available, to the present system, relying heavily on supplemental aids, such as films, slides, records, and the mimeograph machine.

"Teachers used to have only the 'Primer,' but today they have an over-choice of materials," said Debbie.

"Teachers take into account psychological and sociological factors today, whereas they used to only be concerned with repression (of students), the Puritan 'work ethic' and constant drilling."

"Today's teacher encourages initiative and sometimes even permits students to share in the planning of classes.

"Instead of discipline, teachers seek experimentation and permit students to think," she said.

The educational system has gone from the hickory stick on the hand, to golf clubs on the moon," said Debbie.

ADRIENNE TOLD the group: "Education is a state of mind, nurtured by parents and reflecting attitudes learned in high school.

"Education gives you compassion and justice and allows you to become what you are today and what you will be tomorrow," said Adrienne.

Debbie was selected to speak after she took first place in an American Education Week speech contest at Glenn.

About one hundred students from two speech classes and two composition classes participated, narrowing the competition down to five finalists—Debbie, Bridget Macika, Jan Nowak, Cathy Nowak and Jim Colwell.

Adrienne was selected by the Wayne Memorial staff because of her "attitudes, scholastic achievement

and ideals exemplifying the best of what education has to offer the world."

DEBBIE AND ADRIENNE were each awarded a \$25 savings bond by the WWEA.

American Education Week was begun by the American Legion's Americanism Committee and the National Education Association in 1921 to "launch a campaign to correct deficiencies, to combat illiteracy and promote physical fitness."

The week also promotes the nation's schools and what they are doing; an estimated 30 million persons will visit classrooms during the week.

The WWEA, which has 1,150 members, hosted the meeting at Seit's. It said it wanted to show its appreciation of the entire educational community "for the support and involvement we have received from you over the Education Week observance."

WWEA President Bill Reece appealed to those present to vote on the bond issue question Dec. 1.

"We (the WWEA) strongly support proposals A and B," said Reece. The bonding proposals would add special education and vocational education programs, provide funds for school building repairs and (proposal B) build two swimming pools.

The head table was shared by School Supt. Timothy Dyer; School Board President Thomas Barrett; Reece; WWEA Executive Director Hugh Ryan; and WWEA Public Affairs Council Chairperson Len Gregory.

Orchestra amends concert program

The Plymouth Symphony Orchestra will perform the tunes of Christmas and works of American composers at its holiday concert, scheduled for Sunday, Dec. 7 at 4 p.m. in the Plymouth Salem auditorium.

The first half of the concert will follow an amended program and feature two guest soloists from Bowling Green State University at Bowling Green, Ohio.

Plymouth Symphony Society members have discarded earlier plans, slating the appearance of the Opera Association of Western Michigan in a performance of Menotti's "Amahl and the Night Visitors," because of cost factors.

Directed by guest conductor Emil Raab, the orchestra will perform

works by Chadwick, Barber, Copland, Mozart and Gershwin instead of the Menotti opera.

Soprano Virginia Starr will perform Mozart's "Exultate Jubilate," and pianist David Pope will perform Gershwin's "Rhapsody in Blue."

Other works on the Dec. 7 program include Chadwick's "Jubilee and Noel" from "Symphonic Sketches"; Barber's "Die Natali" from "Chorale Prelude for Christmas"; four dances from Copland's "Rodeo"; and the introduction, march and shepherd's dance from "Amahl and the Night Visitors."

The second half of the program will include Christmas works by Mozart, Leroy Anderson, Robert Shaw and Robert Russell Bennett.

out the state, he said. "The single business tax is based on sales and fringes, just like the income tax. It's untried and we don't really know how much revenue it will bring," he said.

BROWN POINTED OUT that members of the Milliken Administration had predicted the current fiscal crisis based on the slow rate of economic turnaround for about a year.

"Yet it appears that Milliken and Marvin Miller (his budget advisor) had their ears closed to these warnings."

Brown cited a report of the Manpower Division of the Michigan Labor Department. It projected no reductions in unemployment, but instead predicted a slight increase during the last quarter of 1975.

"It's too bad the Governor and Miller did not listen to their own people. Perhaps we could have avoided some of the fiscal mess we find ourselves in today, and not be forced to cut human services programs and raise taxes, which is what I think will be the end result," said Brown.

He said the Michigan Legislature is studying a proposal now, to help the state's financial condition. "But I can't divulge that now," he said.

Area governmental leaders break bread, share concerns

Although the Plymouth Area Intergovernmental Committee has not proved to be a panacea for all the shared concerns of the Plymouth School Board, the city, Plymouth, Canton, and Northville townships, members of the committee are pleased with the progress it has made in the past year. Formed almost a year ago, representatives from the various member communities of the intergovernmental council, met informally Wednesday night at Plymouth-Salem High. While most of the officials present at the dinner-workshop affair were excited by the first year results of the committee, some expressed reserved enthusiasm for the future. Plymouth City Commissioner Norb Batterman explained his reservations. "I see it (the committee) as a dream area where maybe it will be helpful for one out of three ideas that could profitably be brought to fruition. I think it could develop into something, but I think it is too early to be specific. "Certainly though, it can provide a strong voice for the united communities and it may be helpful in the area of senior citizens, purchasing and possibly getting the area a hospital." Batterman said some significant projects, such as the area bicentennial committee, and joint purchasing agreements had already been started by the committee, and that similar accomplishments in the upcoming year were hoped for.

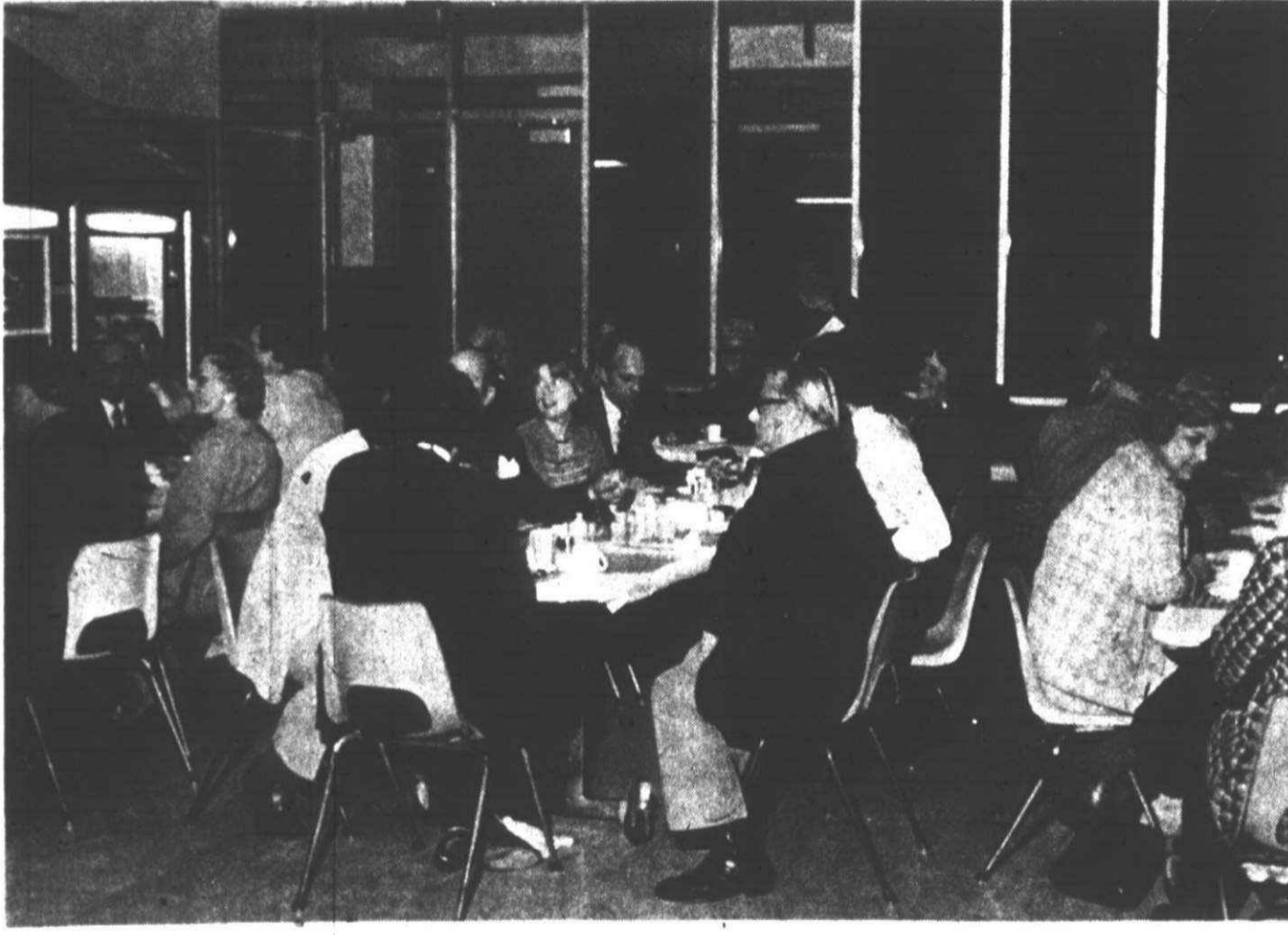
"I think getting a clinic or hospital out here would be something we are all interested in and is something the committee should address itself to." He added, "But mainly, I see the committee as a way to get together and a way to build up trust and communication." ROBERT GREENSTEIN, Canton Township Supervisor, was more positive about the committee. "I'm a great believer in the idea of intergovernmental cooperation. All too often things don't get done because there isn't proper communication because we don't have enough time. This committee forces us to sit down and discuss our mutual problems. "I think the response of the officials has been tremendous and everyone has been supportive of the idea." Greenstein said the committee could be helpful in arranging a joint garbage disposal system throughout the various communities, and could be used to make all zoning classifications uniform throughout the neighboring communities. "Any area where governments might work together has potential for this committee," he explained. "It's the best forum to bring our problems

to one another's attention." Like Greenstein, Plymouth Township trustee Dick Gornick was high on the idea that the committee might be able to bring an emergency clinic and eventually a hospital to area. He also said the committee might be able to construct a unified non-returnable container ordinance, a common waste or garbage authority, and a viable recreation authority that could prevent duplication of facilities, and enhance use of existing sites. "I THINK THE most significant thing we did in the past was stop the airport proposed by the Wayne County Road Commission. It was foreign to the thinking of everyone in the area and we made it clear to the state that there was no support out this way. As a result, they backed off." "I think the committee also has potential as a clearing house for information. It can serve an educative function where we can share our insights as well as providing a forum where people can think 'globally' instead of just about their individual problems." Although not discouraged, perhaps least satisfied with the first year results of the committee was its chairperson and President of the school

board, Marda Benson. "I'm an optimist," she explained. "And I thought we'd sit down and solve all the problems we have. I had hoped we might have accomplished more, but I am not discouraged. I don't think the committee has done all I hoped it might. "I would like to have seen everyone so enthusiastic that they would want to sit down right away and have an all-day seminar." BUT BENSON was pleased with the results of the dinner. "I think we all got acquainted, and I am happy with the interaction. It's a positive sign that Northville Township is joining." Like Greenstein and Gornick, she too was interested in working on the non-returnable container ban and getting a hospital to locate in one of the communities. "I think we could also get more out of the recreation authority, and we should consider common land use planning." Benson said she was interested in creating an area-wide day care center, and in jointly hiring someone to research federal funding and grant programs.



Brenda Richardson, Robert Bowen tops in their fields

The news that guides are in training for the Plymouth Historical Museum, and the Plymouth Community Chorus is prepared to sing at its opening, lends hope to area residents that the museum soon may open its doors to the public.

Robert N. Bowen says it will be the best historical museum in the state, and Bob Bowen knows what he is talking about.

For when the discussion turns to museums, curators and directors, two homegrown products naturally come to mind, Bob Bowen and Brenda Richardson. Both have impressive backgrounds in their professions.

Bowen is director and curator of anthropology at the Cranbrook Institute of Science. Miss Richardson is curator of painting and sculpture at the Baltimore Museum of Arts. Both are graduates of Plymouth High School.

AFTER GRADUATION from high school in 1951, Bowen attended the University of Michigan where he earned a BS degree in zoology. He received a masters degree in anthropology from the University of Hawaii in 1961.

The son of Mr. and Mrs. Neal Bowen of Penniman Avenue, he attributes his choice of career to early summers spent in Northern Michigan and an interest in living creatures.

The years in Hawaii, instructing and at the Bishop museum, gave him an opportunity to do extensive field work.

In 1956 there was the Alahaka Burial Cave survey with the detailed examination of four Hawaiian burial caves in the City of Refuge, National Historical Park. Next year it was the excavation of 88 pre-European Hawaiian burials on Mokapu Peninsula, Oahu.

He was responsible for the physical examination of skeletal material excavated at the City of Refuge for the National Park Service.

HE SURVEYED the Koloa Burial Ground on Kauai in 1964 and made recommendations for future excavations.

From 1960-66 he was responsible for the excavation of about 200 pre-European and historic burials at various sites on the Island of Oahu for the Bishop Museum.

His studies led him to Africa in 1967. In Addis Ababa, Ethiopia, he did an ethnographic investigation of beggars. This study of beggars was for the U.S. Department of Education and Northwestern University. Two years ago he visited the site and researched Anasazi culture in the southwestern United States.

"Sense of Pride: North American Indian Art Yesterday and Today," is one of two planned bi-centennial exhibits at the Cranbrook Institute of Science. "Sense of Pride" opened last month and will be open to the public until May 1976.

The exhibition showcases a superb private collection of Indian artifacts, primarily from the Plains and Northwest Coast cultural areas. The institute received the collection a year ago from the Urschel family of Toledo. Most of the material was acquired by General and Mrs. Romeyn Kellogg, ancestors of the Urschels.

BOWEN, ASSISTED by consultants from five other anthropological museums, has identified and catalogued the 107 items in the collection, ranging from a Kipwa beaded buckskin dress to a Navajo ceremonial wedding basket.

The institute is sponsoring an African wildlife safari—a three-week photography and art expedition to Kenya and Tanzania. Bowen will leave with the group Feb. 28 and return March 20. Ray Harm, wildlife artist, Adrian Luckhurst, guide, and Bowen will head the safari. The trip is limited to 40 participants and \$2,350 includes all expenses and a pre-trip orientation session.

BRENDA RICHARDSON graduated from PHS in 1960. She went to U-M with the intention of becoming a lawyer. At the end of the first year she changed her mind and graduated summa cum laude in 1964 with a degree in art history.

Her parents, Mr. and Mrs. Robert B. Richardson, admit they were surprised when she changed her major. They had not considered Brenda a talented artist. But, she explained she wanted to write about art and artists, not become an artist herself.

She received her masters degree from the University of California at Berkeley and spent 10 years in the Bay area.

Her writing and curatorial work at Berkeley resulted in her being elected to Who's Who of American Women in January 1974. In 1973 she was named Distinguished Alumni Lectureship, University of California at Berkeley.

Besides being art critic for the San Francisco Tribune and contributing editor to Arts Magazine, she authored "Hundertwasser," 1969; "Free," 1970; "William T. Wiley," 1971; "Joseph Raffael: Water Paintings" 1973; "Terry Fox," 1973; and "Joan Brown," 1974.

She conceived and organized many exhibitions at the university where she was in charge of curatorial activities with a special interest in the new, modern artists.

ON FEB. 1 she assumed the duties of curator of painting and sculpture at the Baltimore Museum of Arts, Maryland. In announcing her appointment, the museum director said, "Brenda Richardson combines a number of unique qualities and comes to the Baltimore museum with an impressive curatorial background, with particular emphasis on 20th century painting and sculpture.

"In California, she has been deeply involved with the artists of that region—especially some of the younger ones. In addition to organizing a number of major exhibitions which have had a tremendous impact in the San Francisco Bay area, Miss Richardson has a broad background in museum work, including experience in all levels of curatorial work."

And Miss Richardson has made quite an impact on the Baltimore Museum. Her Andy Warhol exhibition was covered in Time Magazine. The modern artists' works will be displayed in a new atmosphere. At her suggestion, windows are being sealed and drab, grey walls are being painted white.

Last Wednesday, Nov. 19, the Women's Committee of the museum honored Miss Richardson and "her important program of exhibitions centering around the artists and works of the past 15 years." The committee devoted Members Day to an exploration of the ideas and movements "which have literally succeeded in changing the face of America," quoting the invitations issued for the program.

Robert Bowen and Brenda Richardson are leaders in their fields, each opening new horizons for the established institutions which they serve.

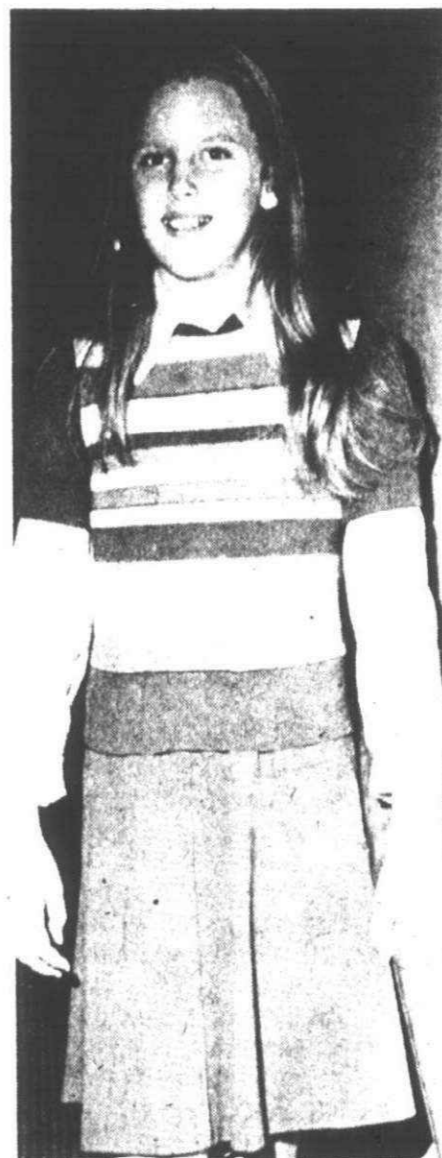

Dental care provided

The Red Cross, the Salvation Army, Boy and Girl Scouts, and the YMCA are part of a mammoth national organization which magnifies the services they perform at the local level.

Then there's the Plymouth Dental Fund, a locally conceived project with no central administrators in Washington, no national advertising campaign and no brochures.

It exists solely to subsidize dental care for children of low income families in the city and Plymouth Township.

This school year, 82 children were provided with fluoride treatments, fillings and braces by 11 local dentists, according to Virginia Gibson, nurse at Plymouth Salem High School.

"All referrals are made and investigated by the school nurses," she explains, "and every cent allocated to the fund is spent on dental work on a reduced pay scale."

Bad teeth can be embarrassing as well as painful, Ms. Gibson points out. "The Plymouth Dental Fund helps many children to feel more socially acceptable and thus do better school work. Ultimately they become better citizens and increase their chances for success in life."

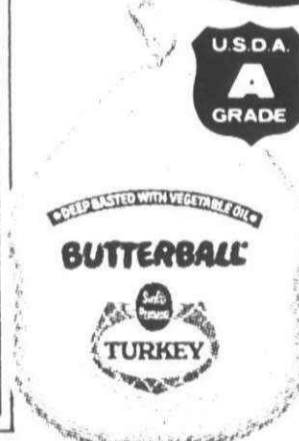

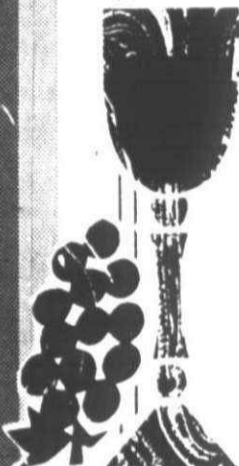

Feydeau wrote 39 plays including "A Flea in Her Ear" and "Cat Among the Pigeons," both of which have been done by the Hilberry. (In 1969, the Hilberry won an American

College theatre Award for "A Flea in Her Ear.")

Feydeau has been called "The greatest French comic dramatist after Moliere" by Marcel Achard and "possibly the greatest writer of farce of any country at any time" by Eric Bentley. He wrote his plays in one draft, and usually at one sitting.

"The Lady from Maxim's" is about a normally sober doctor who awakens one morning with two things he brought home from Maxim's—a hangover and a lady of the evening. The ensuing confusion is further com-

plicated by a case of mistaken identity, a host of relatives, generals, wives, and friends, and a curious anesthetizing machine.

JAN LEWIS GIST is the lady and John Michael Hosking is the doctor in the Hilberry production. Harper Jane McAdoo plays the wife, Wayne S. Turney is the faithful friend and partner, and Hilberry newcomer Bruce Matley is the servant. Michael Rothhaar and Rex M. Ellis will share the role of the General.

Also in the production are Michael

Tylo, Jerry A. Confer, Michael A. Pardy, Douglas E. Stark, David Sederholm, Diana Lanza and Colby Schneider.

Offered to apartment dwellers

Uncut movies on your TV screen

How would you like to kick off your shoes, settle down in your favorite lounge chairs and find the Marx Brothers or "Auntie Mame" in your own apartment?

Mark Greenstone, 28, and Jeff Roberts, 27, partners in TeleView of Michigan, based in Southfield, can't offer Groucho or Lucille Ball in person. But they can bring major motion pictures on closed circuit television into your own living room, den or bedroom.

Greenstone and Roberts, who have been best buddies for more than 20 years, call the TeleView in-home movie channel "a revolution in entertainment" and a first for the State of Michigan.

The service was introduced at North Park Towers and North Park Place where a number of tenants signed up for the \$12 a month system. Diplomat and Embassy Towers are also offering uncut, unedited, uninterrupted movies "in the most comfortable theater in the world—your own apartment."

"THE MOVIES are current, but not first run," Roberts explained. "Some never made it to the Detroit area. We bid on them after they've appeared in theaters across the country but they've never been on TV before."

Two new movies, alternating every other day, are shown each week at 2 p.m., 8 p.m. and 11 p.m., said Greenstone. "If you fall asleep before the end of the Tuesday night show, you can see it again Wednesday," he observed.

The partners mail brochures to apartment owners and managers saying "Dear TeleView Channel, Please Plug Me In." Here's how it works. Apartment developers are contacted and advised TeleView is an amenity that can be installed at no cost to them.

"Our engineers survey the property to determine the feasibility and expense of piping films through existing master antenna lines to converts of the individual subscribers," Greenstone explained. "Non-subscribers see what looks like scrambled eggs on the closed circuit station."

The TeleView channel is a small electronic selector which can be installed in individual apartment units

in a few minutes. The selector is child-proof, Greenstone said, as it may be locked to control what is viewed by youngsters.

THREE VIDEO cassette players are placed in the office of the apartment manager for distribution of films to each apartment. Subscribers are billed at the beginning of each month and receive a program of scheduled movies for the coming

month. A one-time, fully refundable security deposit of \$23 is charged to cover the cost of the selector.

"No more love scenes or high intrigue butchered by the latest solutions to those great American problems of dental breath and stopped drains," the TeleView brochure reads.

Besides elimination of commercials and editing, other advantages, said Roberts, are you don't have to drive,

park or stand in line, buy dinner or expensive treats or pay a babysitter and you can dress "come as you are."

"We don't get X-rated movies like the ones shown in hotels in Toronto because we want to please a wide audience," Roberts said. "The response, so far, has been excellent. One subscriber in North Park Towers gave a dinner party Saturday night with built-in entertainment."

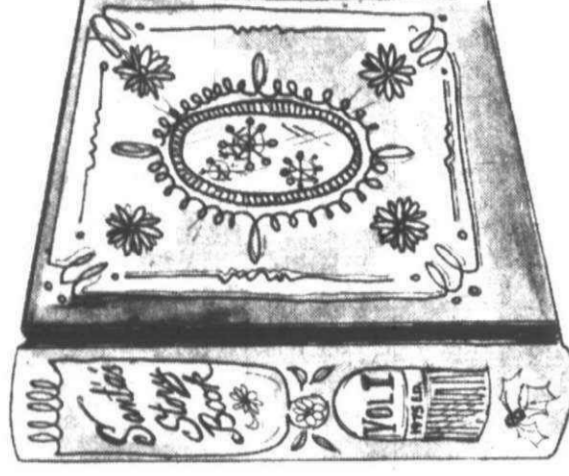
WILL SANTA SIT IN WORLD'S LARGEST BOOK?

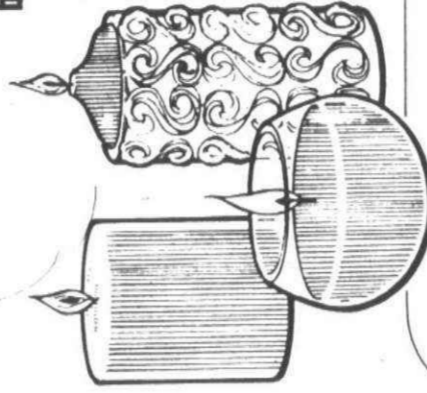

Patriot's dream season capped by Cinderella 21-7 title triumph

How gloriously fitting that the Patriots of Livonia Franklin should reign as state football Class A champions in this bicentennial celebration year.

Coach Armand Vigna's rugged warriors found their place in the football sun on sun-drenched Western Michigan University Stadium field Saturday as they crunched Traverse City, 21-7, before 5,506 fans.

Now no one in the state will have trouble identifying who really deserves to be number one in the state. The fighting Patriots came up with five key defensive plays that stopped two Trojan touchdown threats and sparked Franklin's three scores.

Glenn Miller's band sang "I've got a gal in Kalamazoo" back in the big band era and now Franklin's Patriots can sing about winning a title in Kalamazoo.

It may not be as melodic, but it sure is a sweet sound.

In winning the inaugural state championship football game, Franklin scored two quick touchdowns and then came up with key plays all day, including four pass interceptions to wreck Traverse City's perfect season and give both teams a 10-1 record for the year.

The Patriots have lived by their defense all year long and it was no different Saturday as the tradition-rich Livonia football power continued to come up with big plays.

TRaverse City was averaging 34 points a game until the big wrecking crew from Joy Road threw up a brick wall, shutting down the big Trojan scoring machine—except for one touchdown march in the second period. But it took an all-out defensive effort to preserve the one touchdown lead in the second quarter.

Both teams were jittery in the early going, with Franklin taking the opening kickoff and moving right down the field from its own 48-yard line as halfback Jim Casey and fullback Tim Hollandsworth alternated on almost every play.

However, the drive was stopped when Hollandsworth fumbled on the Traverse City 20 yard line. The Patriots got the ball back just two plays later when Trojan fullback Bruce McLachlan had the ball jarred loose by a Franklin tackler.

EVER ALERT cornerback Cuck Hench recovered for the Livonia team and quarterback Dave Wilson guided the underdogs 51 yards in 10 plays for the go-ahead touchdown.

Franklin's drive bogged down on the Traverse City 18-yard line and Sam Williams attempted a 30-yard field goal. The snap was a little off and holder Dennis Smith, the second string quarterback, bobbled the ball, but he alertly scrambled to his feet and fired a bullet to tight end Rick Lee who was wide open on the five. Lee bulled his way through a defender to score. Williams added the PAT and Franklin led, 7-0, with 1:54 left in the first quarter.

THE SECOND BIG defensive play came on the next Traverse City series. The Trojans had fourth-and-two on Franklin's 46 when quarterback Kim Tezak was caught for a five-yard loss.

The Patriots' offense promptly

moved 51 yards in seven plays to take a stunning 14-0 lead. Casey, who cruised for 103 yards in 26 carries, capped the drive with a four-yard burst off left tackle.

Two key plays in the drive were a 20-yard pass from QB Wilson to Lee on a third-and-six situation on the Trojan 45, and a 15-yard burst up the middle by fullback Hollandsworth from the 19 to the four yard line.

Stung by the two quick Franklin TDs, Traverse City retaliated by driving 73 yards in 12 plays, alternating talented halfback Rick Waters and McLachlan to move the ball.

The Trojans were aided in the touchdown drive by two 15-yard penalties called against the Patriots on pass plays, both on third-and-five situations.

McLachlan lunged two yards for the only Traverse City score of the day, but threatened on two later marches.

An onside kick caught Franklin napping and the Trojans recovered on the Patriot 49. They showed the same explosive offensive power as on the previous drive, marching in 11 plays to Franklin's eight yard line with first and goal to go.

However, Safety Jim Casey came up with the big play again for the red and blue team with his 10th pass interception of the year in the endzone to stop the drive and keep Franklin ahead, 14-7, at halftime.

TRaverse City received the second half kickoff and, after an exchange of punts, moved deep into Franklin territory. With Waters, who gained 85 yards in 19 rushes, doing heavy duty, the Trojans moved to Franklin's 13 yard line where they had a first down.

Here is where the Franklin defense again rose up and smashed back the machine from the north as linebacker Sam Williams batted down a fourth down pass in the endzone.

Still clinging precariously to its 14-7

"This was our worst game of the season," Hatcher lamented after the shellacking. The Rocks conclude the 1975 campaign with an overall 15-3 record.

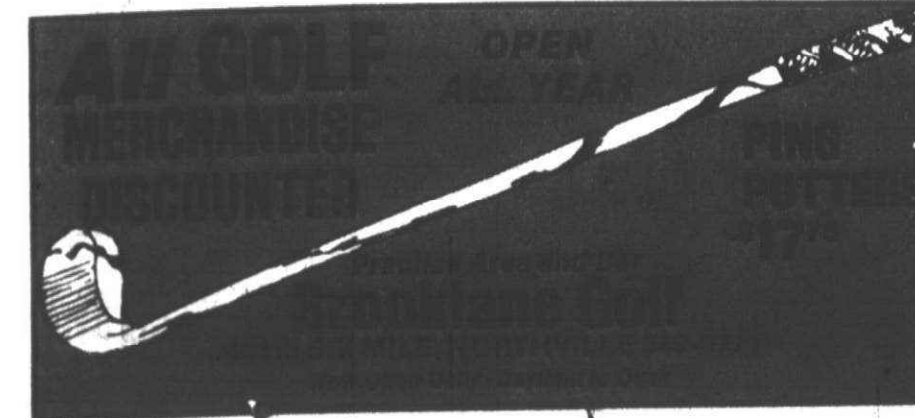

Tom Zaibek would come into the office faithfully every Monday with stories on the junior varsity and ninth grade football teams. Tom is a real great football fan who has been following the varsity teams for years. He realizes the importance of the JV and freshmen teams in teaching the fundamentals of the sport and preparing young men for a chance on the varsity if they so choose. Tom's knowledge of football showed in the stories he wrote because he knows the rules, the vocabulary and the plays. You did a fine job, Tom, and I appreciate it.

So thanks Joe, Anne, Jerry, Bill, Tom and Robin. You are all different ages with different backgrounds and interests. Although you never met each other, you worked as a team. I know the sports fans in the Plymouth and Canton community are grateful for your efforts, and I want to acknowledge publicly that my acquaintance with you, and our working relationship, has enriched my life. It's been a good fall, team, and with that said, let's get on to winter.

To speak of their faithfulness is almost understating the case. In my book, they were outstanding, and I personally salute them and hope it was a valuable experience for them. It certainly was for me.

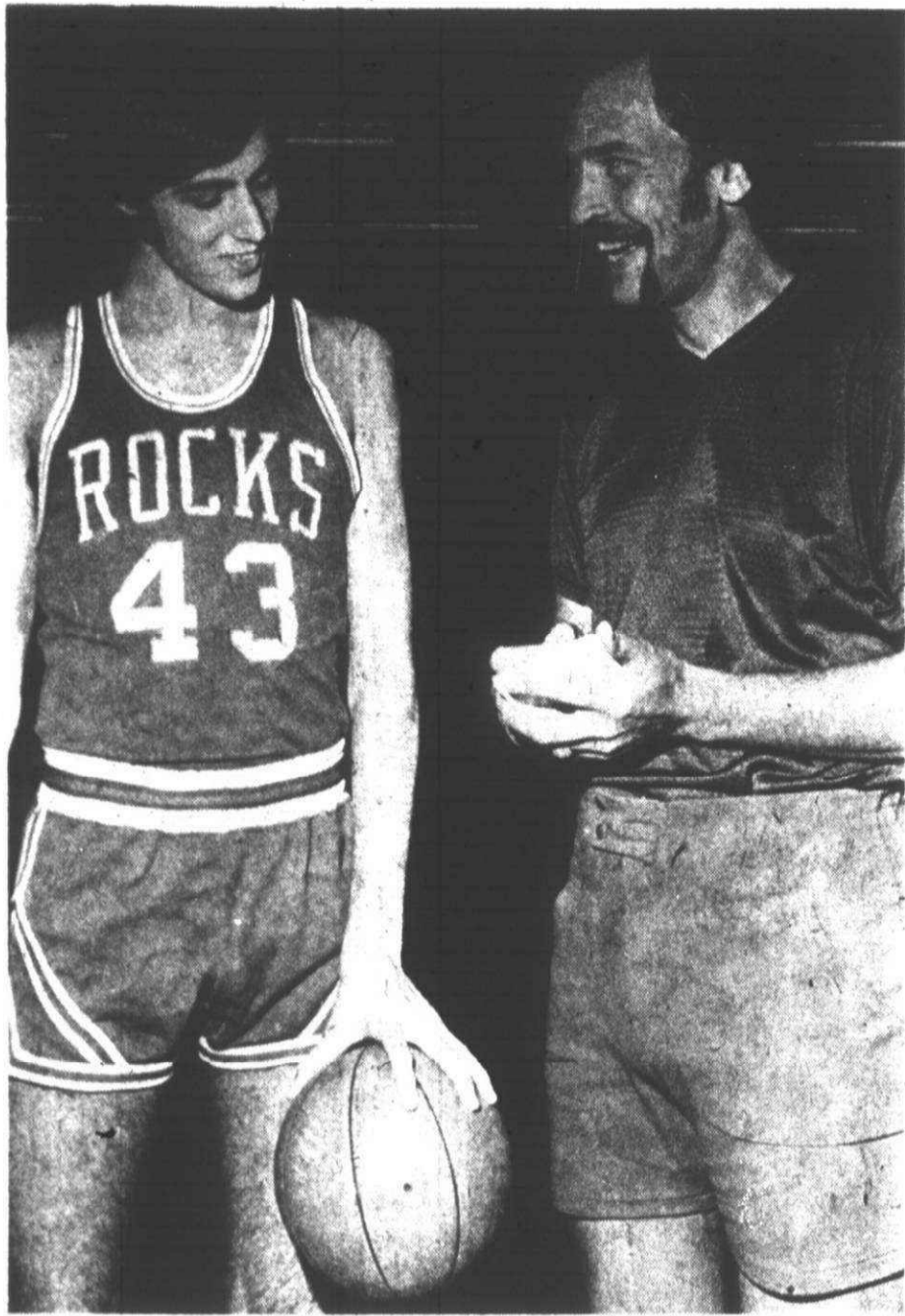

At the guards will be Brian Wolcott, an adept dribbler and floorleader, and either by Mark Gothard or Howard Inch. The mainstays of the frontcourt will be 6-3 seniors Bob Evans, Mike Primeau, and Rick Gladstone.

Meanwhile, across the campus, Casey Cavell will be aiming for Plymouth Canton's first conference title in its brief history.

Snow tire tops radial

Many motorists who have new cars equipped with radial tires are now asking whether they need to put on snow tires this winter. The answer is that radial tires are no substitute for snow tires, according to new findings by the National Safety Council.

Tests conducted by the Council's Committee on Winter Driving Hazards show that snow tires provide more traction over a reasonably wide range of

snow-covered road conditions than conventional radial tires that do not have a snow tread.

These tests also indicated that the range of performance of the radial tires was quite broad, in some cases exceeding but in some cases even poorer than some conventional highway tires.

In these tests, seven brands of radial tires were compared with bias-belted highway tires and bias-belted snow tires. Both peak and spinning traction were measured with the vehicle standing still and also moving forward at a speed of 5 m.p.h.

SNOW CONDITIONS ranged from approximately one inch of medium-packed snow to as much as eight inches of loose snow.

In an earlier test program, the committee found that radial tires offered no advantage over conventional tires in either stopping, traction or cornering performance on glare ice.

The current snow tests were undertaken to help municipalities decide whether to modify their snow ordinances to permit radial tires in lieu of snow tires.

"Considering the outcome of these tests and earlier findings by the council, it is obvious that conventional radial tires (without a snow tread) are not a substitute for snow tires," a council spokesman concluded.

"Motorists should still be advised to use snow tires for mild-to-medium snow and ice conditions and to use reinforced tire chains for severe snow and ice conditions," he said.

SUMMARIZING the council's previous test findings: conventional snow tires provide only a small improvement in pulling ability on glare ice although they produce half again as much pulling ability as regular tires in loosely packed snow. Studded tires are appreciably more effective on ice, giving about three times the pull of regular tires. And reinforced tire chains provide from four to seven times the pulling ability of regular tires on snow and ice.

The Tire Industry Safety Council points out that it is unsafe to have radials on the front wheels and any other type construction tire on the rear wheels.

"The handling of a car can be severely affected by such mixing, according to government and industry warnings," a council spokesman said.

So, if a motorist with radials on the front is going to put on snow tires this winter, they should be radial snow tires for safety's sake.
