

Canton receives 11 liquor licenses

Beer, wine, and liquor by the glass should be available to Canton residents at more locations in the coming months as a result of the 1975 special mid-decade census.

According to township clerk John Flodin, 11 new licenses have been allotted to the township by the Michigan Liquor Control Commission.

All 11 licenses are Class C and allow the licensee to serve the full

gamut of alcoholic beverages.

Licenses are issued on the basis of one per 1,500 persons or major fraction thereof. Canton's mid-decade census, completed last July and verified by the Secretary of State last fall, approximates the township population between 26,000-27,000.

The federal census of 1970 accounted for about 11,000 people in the township.

ALTHOUGH NONE of the new li-

censes have been issued, Flodin said numerous applications have been made for them.

"We've had all kinds of applications for the licenses," he explained, "but I think its the position of the township board that these licenses be used to encourage construction of non-residential taxbase.

"It seems to be the feeling of the board that we use these licenses to encourage major developments, like hotels or restaurants to locate here, in-

stead of fast food places."

Flodin said development of major projects in Canton would aid the township, but would benefit the schools most.

"You figure if a person spends half a million on a restaurant, we can add about \$250,000 to the tax rolls," he said. All we can tax is five mills, the schools will be the big beneficiaries."

Plymouth schools currently levy 29.01 mills, Wayne-Westland levies 44.65 mills.

PRESENTLY, there are five liquor licenses in use in Canton; three on Michigan Avenue, one on Ford Road, and one at the Fellows Creek Golf Course.

Two more were allocated by the previous township board late last year, one to a prospective motel owner, and another to a prospective bowling alley owner.

Neither has started construction on the projects—and the licenses are currently unused.

"Both had trouble with respect to financing," explained Flodin. "After we committed ourselves to giving them the licenses, the interest rates started to climb. But we are given to understand the bowling alley may have the necessary financing to start."

The bowling alley will be located on the north side of Ford, just east of Canton Center. The Tucker Motel is supposed to be built on a site at Lotz and Ford.

As expected

Aid cut \$270,000

Local school districts have received the news about how much state aid will be taken from them to help the state balance its budget.

And for Plymouth Community School District the news contained no surprises. It was as bad as expected, according to Supt. John M. Hoben.

State aid to Plymouth is being reduced by \$270,750 or 17 per cent of the \$2,044,446 which the district was due to receive.

Last August the state reduced general state aid to Plymouth by \$95,580 in an attempt to avoid a deficit.

Thus far for the 1975-76 school fiscal year, the district's general state aid has been reduced by \$366,330 or 2.3 per cent. Last year, Plymouth lost \$104,210 in general state aid for a two-year reduction exceeding half a million dollars.

THE LATEST cuts aren't formal until approved by the appropriations committee and sent to Gov. Milliken for signature.

But the executive order which balances the state budget has passed the Senate and House and is expected to reach the governor in its present form and be signed.

Plymouth administrators received the bad news Thursday when Dr. Earl Hogan, deputy superintendent, returned from a meeting of the Michigan Association for Improved School Legislation (MAISL).

Jerry Dunn, MAISL's fulltime lobbyist, had provided member-districts with computer printouts detailing each local district's state aid loss based on formulas in the latest executive order.

The formula states the reduction will be 2.3 per cent of the sum of state aid due the district in September plus local property tax revenue. The 2.3 per cent reduction in December thus

includes the 0.6 per cent—\$95,580—slice taken in August.

Plymouth has joined other school districts in a lawsuit against the State of Michigan for using this formula for state aid reductions.

Hoben and other superintendents argue that including local property tax revenues in the formula to cut state aid penalizes those districts which rely more heavily for support on local taxes.

For instance, the Wayne-Westland School District—with one of the highest tax rates in the state—will lose \$517,985 in state aid because of the December executive order.

Losses in nearby districts include: Livonia, \$725,185; Garden City, \$210,020; and Redford Union, \$172,215.

WHAT CONCERNS Hoben is that the December reduction may not be the final one for this fiscal year, which runs until June 30.

In a statement made Dec. 9 when the executive order went to the appropriations committee, Gov. Milliken acknowledged it was tough trimming the \$123 million from the state budget but added "We are only part of the way there to avoid the projected deficit."

Hoben is concerned about the governor's comment that the state is only "part of the way" towards achieving its goal of heading off the deficit.

"Here we are half-way through the school year and the state takes out of our budget \$270,750 in state aid, after taking \$95,580 in August. If that's not bad enough, now it's suggested there might something further awaiting us."

The August state aid loss was absorbed by a series of expense reductions reached during a number of budget workshops and public hearings before the 1975-76 budget was approved.

Anticipating the second executive order reduction, the school board has asked the administration to produce a list of possible areas of expense to be further trimmed which would total two per cent.

The district won't have to reduce its operating budget by two per cent, however—at least, not yet.

The December state aid reduction is 1.7 per cent. The 0.6 per cent loss in August has been absorbed in the current budget.

The current budget totals almost \$17.5 million, of which 16 per cent—\$2.8 million—comes from state sources, including general state aid plus categorical aid such as transportation and special education reimbursement.

As things now stand, without any reductions having been made, the December state aid cut wipes out the district's reserve for contingencies of \$83,500 leaving a fund imbalance of \$187,250.

Young artist takes after father

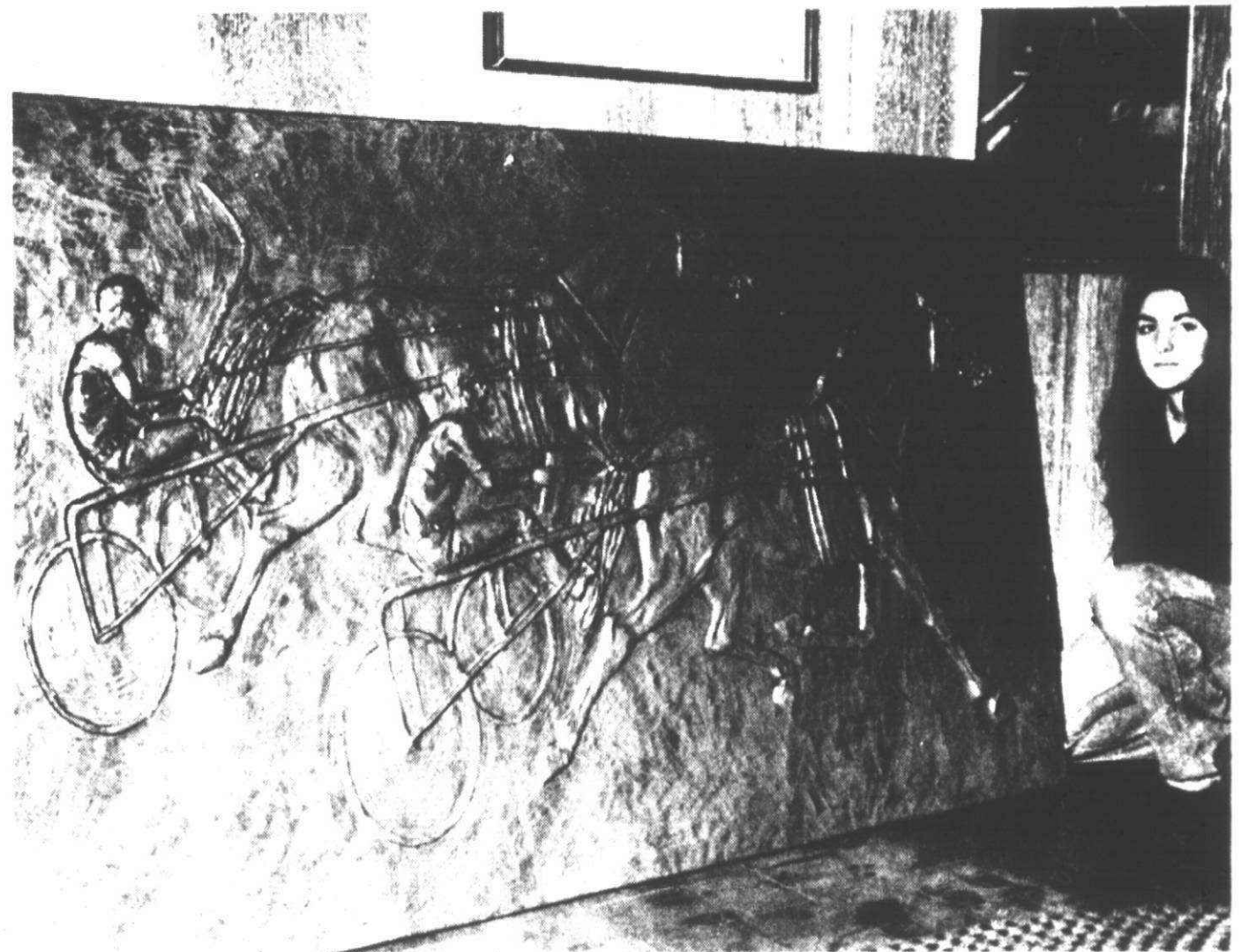

Like father, like daughter. An old saying, but in the case of Kathy DeLauro, a senior at Plymouth Salem High School, it is true.

Kathy, 17, has been interested in art "as long as I can remember."

"I can even remember some of the drawings I did in kindergarten," she smiled.

Her interest in art, she admits, is the influence of her father, Prof. Jo-

seph N. DeLauro, who is head of and started the fine arts classes at the University of Windsor in Ontario.

After doing art work all her life, her big thrill came recently when she received her first commission to do a job for a new restaurant in Windsor.

The owner asked her father if he knew anyone who could do a bronze-type art work of horses drawing sulkeys. The owner was seeking decoration for his restaurant which is near the Windsor Raceway.

"My father said he had confidence in me and gave me the job," Kathy said.

The 3½ by 8 foot picture took her about three weeks to complete.

"The work was first done in clay, then cast in plaster to make the mold. I then molded the entire work on a bronze-like material which gives it a bronze appearance without being as heavy as real bronze," Kathy explained.

WHILE DECLINING to say how much she received for the art work, she did admit the money she receives will be applied toward her college tuition.

"I hope to go to Eastern Michigan University next year and major in art."

Kathy eventually hopes to become a medical illustrator. This she said, requires four years at EMU and then a course at the University of Michigan.

"I had thought of being a veterinarian at one time, but I'm no good in math. Since I like science and art, I decided to forget math and get into something where I can use science and art."

She admits medical illustration is a tough field to get into, but with the eagerness of youth, she has set her sights on that type work.

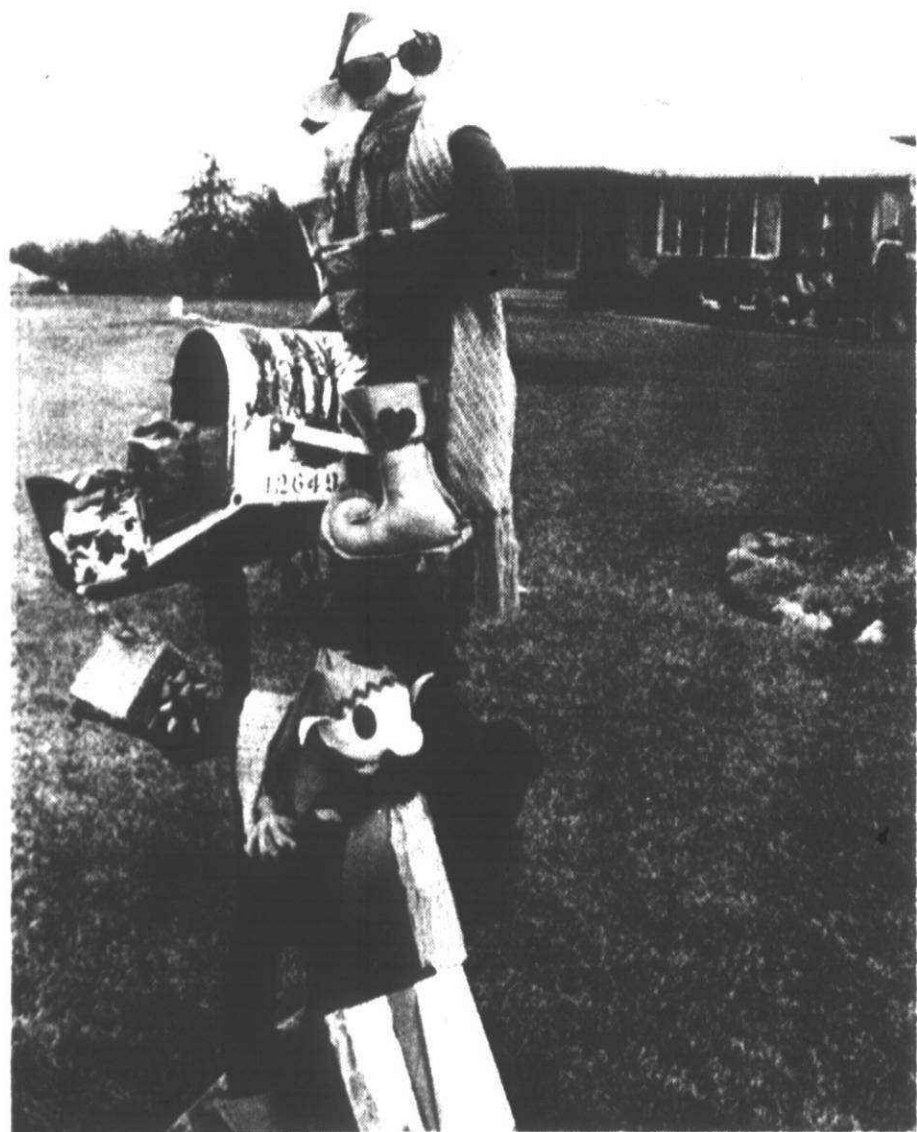
This is the first commission job she has received but Kathy said she would like to get more.

"I'D LIKE TO get some more jobs to help pay for my college," she said. "I'd feel a lot better if I could pay for my education on my own."

There are other artists in her family. Her mother, Dorothy, does drawings and is taking an art course at U of M. A brother, Greg, is taking an art course at Eastern.

"I just couldn't help being interested in art. I was raised with it. And my father, being an artist, encouraged me. He has been my inspiration."

Kathy said she does a lot of work in clay as well as drawing and painting. With her visible ability in the art field as well as her eagerness, it is a good bet Kathy will make her mark in the art world, one way or the other.

Another chapter in the continuing fight to get sewers in McIntyre Manor subdivision was written last week when two residents of the subdivision told township board members they would not grant easements necessary for the sewer.

One man, Charles Hudson, had been asked for two easements across his property. Although he was willing to grant one easement, he was unwilling to grant the second.

On Tuesday last week, following a story in the Canton Observer & Eccentric that quoted Supervisor Robert Greenstein as saying fellow residents should apply pressure to Hudson to grant the second easements, Hudson told the board he would under no conditions grant either easement.

"I DON'T WANT to be pushed," Hudson said. "As far as I am concerned, this sewer is a downfall, not a benefit to the community."

"Nobody's going to put pressure on me to give those easements. The harder they push, the less I will feel like giving them."

Residents in McIntyre have been asking for sanitary sewers for several years now, because septic systems and drain fields in the subdivision are no longer operating properly.

The fields are saturated, and during the summer, effluence rises to the surface in the subdivision.

Some residents have said they fear an outbreak of hepatitis in the community. Almost all subdivision residents agree the sewers are necessary.

THE PREVIOUS township board accepted a \$500,000 package for McIn-

tyre that would have serviced all lots in the subdivision, but the present administration rejected that plan and opted, instead, for a cheaper one.

The current plan offers sewer service to all occupied homes in the subdivision, but does not service all the lots.

When the board agreed to the plan, which costs about \$225,000, it stipulated that before any pipe was laid in the ground, all necessary easements would have to be granted.

All easements were received with the exception of Hudson's and a neighbor of his.

Greenstein explained the board's point of view. "We are trying to provide the sewer at the cheapest cost. We want to service everyone in McIntyre, and we tried to set it up as fairly as possible. Even with special assessments, the people in McIntyre won't be footing 10 per cent of the cost of the sewer. The rest of the people in the township will be."

The current plan calls for the sewers to run through lawns and between houses, rather than along the road, so it can be constructed at less expense.

Although there are many vacant lots in the subdivision, no building is currently allowed in McIntyre.

The subdivision lies in an area designated by the federal government as a flood plain, and until the flood plain is specifically defined, no building can take place.

Township officials say it will be at least another six months before they know what is the exact boundaries of the flood area.

Trustees, concerned parents meet

The meeting of 11 representatives of Concerned Parents and four Plymouth Community School District trustees ended on a note of mutual respect and plans for future discussions. After 2½ hours of conversation, the initial wariness disappeared. The two groups agreed it had been a "very healthy" exchange and had alleviated fears on both sides. George Merchant, spokesman for

Concerned Parents, gave a resume of his group's findings since it was organized in September. He said its survey had responses from the parents of half the students at the Centennial Educational Park (CEP). "Most people are dissatisfied about something," said Merchant. He said 68 per cent favored returning to traditional scheduling while 38 per cent wanted to stay with modular.

"We want to know if the board thinks everything is A-OK at the Park."

SCHOOL BOARD President Marda Benson said the board was not dragging its feet on the issue. "The resolution that we tried to get together will be elaborated on and sent to the universities."

"We feel there is a legitimate problem," said Joyce Merchant of the parents' group, "put them back in the classrooms."

"We are not advocating complete abolishment of modular scheduling," Merchant added.

"We're just asking for a choice," said Barbara Olson. "Hundreds of parents say, 'We want the choice.' It seems to me it could be done."

"How do you feel about the attendance policy?" asked Ernest Moran.

The parent group rated attendance policy at the top of their list of concerns. This was followed by unstructured free-time atmosphere, ease of entrance and disrespect for teachers.

Ms. Benson said she had no problem with her two children at the Park and Moran said he has no problems with the one he had there.

ROSINA KAZA asked, "Did they have this attendance problem when they had traditional scheduling?"

Merchant said a coordinator had told him his biggest job is trying to follow up and find students.

Trustee Gary Mirto said teacher bargaining units had resisted taking attendance.

"It's a better teaching situation when you have just the students who want to be there," commented Trustee Joe Gray.

Joan Brown asked, "When a child goes at 7 a.m. and doesn't have a class 'til 10:30, what does he do? What does he see?"

Ms. Benson said a comparison of attendance with traditional scheduling attendance could be acquired.

"The CEP takes more of our time than all the rest of the school district together," said Mirto. "I agree with Marda. Get a valid comparison."

"I would like informed people answering the survey."

PARTICIPANTS found CEP terminology was familiar to both groups when the discussion turned to unstructured time. There are the freaks commons, jocks commons and the norms.

"I like 'country club' better than 'zoo' or 'jungle,'" said Merchant. "We want their time structured."

Mrs. Olson said, "Is modular scheduling working anywhere in the State of Michigan?"

Gray said that in private schools the free-time was structured.

"What happened to the original plan?" asked Frankie Johnson.

Merchant said this was the largest school it had been tried with and in his opinion it was a dismal failure.

"It's impossible to administrate," added Moran.

THE PROPOSED study by a state university was questioned by some members of the parents' group. "Is the board making this study because it feels we speak for only part of the people?" asked Alice Horstead.

"Would you be opposed to a board survey to all parents of students at the park?" asked Merchant.

Ms. Benson said she would like "informed people answering the survey."

She explained that after the university study results were revealed she believed the board would be willing to make a survey.

"Not take the results of a survey of just parents," added Trustee Tom Yack.

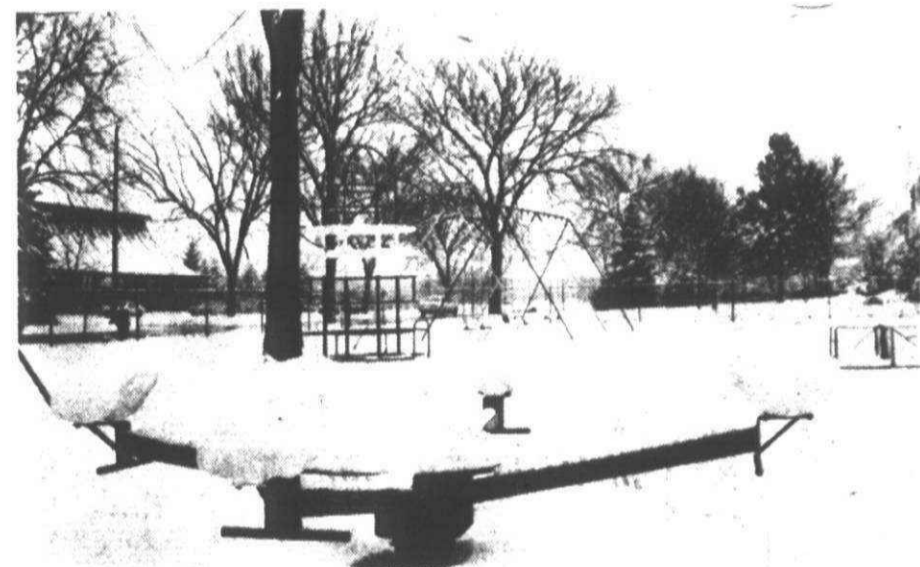

Township awaits response from Edison

Although Clerk John Flodin has requested them from Detroit Edison, the matter of street lights for six subdivisions in the township remains in the dark.

Flodin, at the request of the township board three weeks ago, sent a letter to Detroit Edison asking that more than 100 lights be installed in Windsor Park four, five and six, and Carriage Hills four, five and six.

As yet, no response has arrived from Edison.

"The letter asked them for some numbers on how much it would cost. Although we are committed to putting in the lights," Flodin explained, "we'd like to know in advance how much they are going to cost. We have to wait for their response before we can proceed."

UNDER THE Subdivision Control Ordinance, (Ordinance 32) the town-

ship is required to provide residential street lighting.

The lights, which are estimated to cost anywhere from \$1,500 to \$2,000 a piece for installation, will be paid for by the township.

In turn, the township will be credited \$180 a year per light by Edison until the full sum is recovered.

According to township treasurer Carl Parsell, a ruling by the Michigan Public Service Commission is expected before the end of the year that will change that credit arrangement.

The new arrangement, he explained, will only allow for two years credit on each light.

In previous years, Edison had paid for the lights in advance, but financial problems in recent years have forced the electric company to alter the policy.

Parsell said the money for the lights, no more than \$200,000, could be

taken from a surplus in the water and sewer fund.

Subdivision residents that receive the lights would be assessed for the cost of the lights, interest on the money fronted by the township, and for the power, the same as in past

years. Parsell said the billing procedure would not be altered at all.

FLODIN HAS ALSO requested that Edison draw up schemes for lighting in other subdivisions nearing completion. The clerk said he has requested plans for several subdivisions

over the past year and has received no response from Edison.

"I know we asked for a plan in Pickwick and Willow Creek three and four," said the clerk, "and probably in some others. But there's been so many subdivisions put in recently that

I don't remember which ones I asked for schemes on. Right now there are any number in the township that are ready for lights."

When the plans are received from Edison, the township can proceed on lights for those subdivisions as well.

Growth Works offers variety of help

A possible drug overdose, family fight or suicide threat cannot be dealt with through an appointment a week from today. When you need immediate help, there is Our House Crisis Center.

Located at 185 S. Harvey, Our House provided more than 2,850 persons with the services of some 75 professional and para-professional counselors in crisis intervention last year.

The highly trained staff is comprised mostly of volunteers whose service hours totalled more than 8,000, divided among several programs.

THE "HOT-LINE," 455-4900, and walk-in center at 185 S. Harvey, offer crisis counseling in areas ranging from boy-girl, marital and family problems to drug identification and overdose aid. The staff also handles "non-emergency" information and referrals.

On-going counseling, by appointment with professional staff, generally focuses on family and marital problems, depression and other psychological concerns.

A medical clinic, open from 7-9 p.m. Monday at the Center, offers pregnancy testing, VD testing and treatment, and birth control counseling to persons 18 and older. (Younger inquirers are referred to private physicians).

A medical doctor and/or registered nurse staffs the clinic, with patient advocates accompanying each client for support and counseling. Our House, the staff notes, has malpractice insurance coverage.

THE PROGRAM incorporates a wide variety of volunteer staff to serve the broad spectrum of clients.

For example, among the 30 volunteers active last summer, the age range was from 16 (the minimum accepted) to 40-plus. They included industrial workers, business and professional persons, ministers, teachers, high school and college students.

The volunteers undergo a 40-hour counselor training program taught by social workers, teachers, clergy and others. The training program involves listening skills, transactional analysis theory, drug pharmacology, use of referral information, plus the certified, Red Cross program in first-aid and overdose aid.

Besides counseling clients, many volunteers take part in the Our House speakers bureau which offers community information in such areas as drug pharmacology, values clarification and contemporary issues for schools, church groups and other organizations.

MANY OF the Our House staff and volunteers also are active in Plymouth Youth, Inc., located at 271 S. Main. It also has provided services

for more than 2,000 area residents through various local programs.

The major activity of the Young Center is focused on drop-in participation, such as ping pong, pool and art activities.

Youth Inc. operates a job referral program, placing mostly 14 to 18-year-olds in domestic, light industrial and commercial jobs within the community. It handles applications for both the employer and the employee. The Young Center also operates Kwik & Kwik Plant Store and the Fish Gallery—aimed at offering new work experiences for the participating young people.

The center organized a food co-op where participants estimate they save from 25 to 60 per cent of food items by "eliminating the middle-man." The group also operated a summer garden co-op.

Finally, the Youth Center offers its facilities for free seminars, organized and conducted by the participants, on subjects ranging from prisons to plant care, from drug control to the year 2,000.

The program possibilities at Our House Crisis Center and Plymouth Youth Inc. appear limitless.

Water rate fight looming

The Metropolitan Detroit Water Board rate increase melodrama may be recreated this winter.

The board is scheduled to act today (Monday) on a proposed water rate boost of more than 30 per cent—and the opposition is already in gear for another battle.

If the rate proposed by the water department staff is eventually approved by the water board and Detroit City Council, the suburbs will again fight the increase, similar to last spring and summer's controversy.

DURING THAT time, Mayor Edward McNamara of Livonia led the suburban communities who get water from Detroit in fighting off the increase proposed fast spring and later rescinded.

The controversy, during which McNamara was a member of the water board, led to his dismissal Oct. 1 from that agency by Mayor Coleman Young of Detroit.

Although he isn't on the board anymore, McNamara said he is still aware of what's going on and has drafted a letter to the 97 customers of the Detroit water department to invite them to a meeting if the rate boost is approved.

McNamara said he wants the 97 communities to commit themselves to the hiring of an attorney to fight the proposed increase and also ask for a "full discovery" of the water department's financial condition.

The proposed increase would mean residents would pay about \$3 per quarter for a typical water consumption.

The mayor feels the flat percentage rate boost proposed by the depart-

ment is unfair to the water customers outside of Detroit since their wholesale rates charged by Detroit are higher than that charged to customers inside Detroit.

THE WATER rate issue last summer resulted in several actions taken by Detroit and state agencies.

Mayor Young's administration eventually agreed to a suburban demand that an outside auditor be retained to go over the department's financial records.

In addition, the state House of Representatives formed a special study committee to look into the department's operations and see if a rate boost was necessary or justified.

Exam date set for Lee

Carl Lee, 25, a Plymouth resident who was accused in the death of his bridegroom brother only hours after a wedding ceremony Thanksgiving Day, faces a pre-trial examination Dec. 22 before 18th District Judge Michael Bradley.

Lee was arrested by Westland police after neighbors complained about a noisy wedding reception in the clubhouse of a Westland apartment complex.

Police indicated that when Robert Lee, 22, tried to interrupt a dispute between Carl and another brother, Carl allegedly hit Robert, who bumped his head on a porch support post. He was pronounced dead at Wayne County General Hospital.

Lee stood mute at his arraignment Nov. 28 before 18th District Judge Thomas Smith on a charge of manslaughter.

Lee's attorney is Dale Jurcisin of the Garden City firm of Bokos, Jones and Plakas. Lee is free on \$2,500 surety bond.

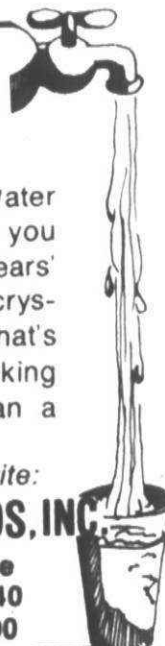

Clark survives wilderness trip

Joel Clark of Plymouth recently fought his way through the weeds and reeds of a chest-deep swamp, skinned

a rabbit to cook for lunch, and signaled a "rescue" plane during a recent survival class field trip.

The day-long field trip at the Rose Lake Wildlife Reserve, about 14 miles northeast of Lansing, was under the supervision of Prof. Paul Risk—instructor of the wilderness survival course at Michigan State University.

CLARK, son of Mr. and Mrs. Edward R. Clark of Danbridge Court, is a 1975 graduate of Plymouth Salem High. He is a freshman majoring in business at MSU.

"This isn't an actual survival trip," Risk explains, "it is a field experience for students to practice survival skills they have learned in class."

When the course started years ago, the emphasis was on unique survival techniques used by pioneers and American Indians. The course was initially designed for park and recreation resource majors who would be able to use this information during talks as park naturalists and tour guides.

At present, however, many students are taking the course for the practical skills it offers. "A former student of mine was stranded for a week in the northern Canadian wilderness, and he certainly found the survival skills useful," says Risk.

Shifflet wins ROTC scholarship

In return, Shifflet will undergo military training, including three summer cruises, and will be commissioned a Navy ensign or Marine Corps second lieutenant upon graduation.

Clark named sales manager

John F. Clark, of Livonia, has been appointed sales manager-grocery products division of Marks & Georgens, Inc., a Southfield-based food brokerage company.

Clark joined the firm as an account executive after spending 13 years with Proctor and Gamble. In his new position, he will be responsible for grocery product sales in eastern Michigan.

THE ROSE LAKE field trip begins with tramping through the swamp to increase students' confidence about an area usually considered hostile.

"The swamp smells and it's muddy, but it isn't hostile," adds Risk. "And after the students come out soaking wet they find it much more meaningful to build a campfire."

For lunch, the students prepare a rabbit—unless the student is a vegetarian. Risk says this lesson is often somewhat traumatic for participants, but is a lesson in reality, pointing to the fact that meat doesn't appear in a supermarket as a result of spontaneous generation.

Working in groups of six, students build campfires and establish campsites. Each group builds a partial shelter—partial so as not to destroy the area.

Clark had to create tools such as fishing lines from twisted bark, fishing hooks from thorns and splinters, and traps and snares with carved wooden triggers. The traps aren't used, however.

Sometime during the day a plane flies overhead, and the student must quickly ignite signal fires using the green branches and twigs they have gathered. If the pilot is able to spot the smoke, he "rescues" the students by dropping a "care package."

Farms offer wide range of Yule trees and prices

Begin the bicentennial celebration early and relive a part of Michigan history by cutting your own Christmas tree at one of the "choose and cut" farms.

The farms on Auto Club's accompanying map sell several types of trees with prices ranging from 50 cents for Scotch pines, to \$20 for blue spruce and Douglas firs.

Many sell by cost-per-foot, varying from 75 cents to \$3.50 per foot for trees up to six feet. Some farms feature trees up to 20 feet in height for churches and other groups.

As their popularity grows, an increasing number of farms each year offer free wagon or sleigh rides to and from the trees, plus popcorn balls, beverages and candy for children and even visits by Santa Clause on weekends.

IF YOU'RE planning to cut your own tree this Christmas remember to:

- Bring a saw if going on a weekend. Although most farms listed lend saws, they may run out. Don't bring an axe, as they are not allowed on most farms.

- Be sure of your choice before cutting, then saw close to the ground. The longer the trunk, the easier it is to mount in a stand.

- While many growers will bail your tree to protect it for the ride home, always bring a rope for tying it in place. Remember to place the tree's base at the front of your car when putting it on the roof to prevent wind-broken branches.

- Store your tree by placing it in a bucket of water in a covered area

warm enough so the water does not freeze.

- Even if you've just cut your tree, remove an inch or two of the trunk before placing it in a stand so it will absorb water readily.

- Always keep the stand filled with water. Don't mix in sugar, as it may crystallize and keep moisture from the tree. Good substitutes for sugar are several commercial varieties of liquid tree food.

- Place your tree away from heat

- Place ducts and open flames.

- Check your tree lights for frayed

- Check as well, and don't overload your home's electrical system.

Rocks pound Trenton to keep record perfect

Ever-mighty Dearborn Fordson, a past state Class A basketball champion and a semifinalist at East Lansing last March, will find Plymouth Salem's cage troops ready and waiting Tuesday night when the Tractors invade the lair of the Rocks for one of Michigan's major pre-Christmas high school basketball showdowns.

Salem, too, got to the Class A semifinals nine months ago only to lose to Flint Northwestern in the same double-header in which Highland Park, the eventual state champion, eliminated Fordson.

The Rocks have had few opportunities, such as awaits them Tuesday night, to convince those who conduct prep popularity polls that this hotbed of basketball interest possesses another potential state title contender—the Fordson reputation which has been well-merited over the years being the key.

Salem warmed to its chance with a convincing 79-61 triumph Friday over Suburban Eight rival Trenton, the 20th straight home court victory for the Rocks over a three-season span dating back to Christmas week 1973 when they were upended by Livonia Stevenson.

JIM ELLINGHAUSEN not only staked his usual claim to game scoring honors with 35 points against Trenton, but awed visiting coaches from the University of Alabama, University

of Michigan, University of Virginia and Western Michigan University by also grabbing 11 rebounds, blocking four Trojan shots and setting up passes that gave him credit for seven official assists.

As the season has progressed through four successive Salem victories, it was only an average evening for the 6-8 kid with the build of a two-iron. His point total now reads 135 for four outings, an unheard of average of 33½ points per contest in which he has sat out most of at least one quarter in every game.

For the second game in a row, Ellinghausen's little brother—the 6-3 sophomore Tom Ellinghausen—also scored in double figures with 12 points. Last week his key was in making eight out of eight from the free throw line, and Friday it was with six shots from the floor. Either way it propounds an imponderable for the wary foe.

BRIAN WOLCOTT, Plymouth's super guard who canned eight field goals against Trenton for 16 points, and Mike Primeau, a 6-2 senior forward, contributed toward making the victory over Trenton the most impressive team performance yet.

Wolcott, the floor general, and Primeau's rebounding, plus nine assists from Bob Evans, plus five more assists and six points from fifth starter Mark Gothard, enhanced Ellinghausen's personal acrobatics.

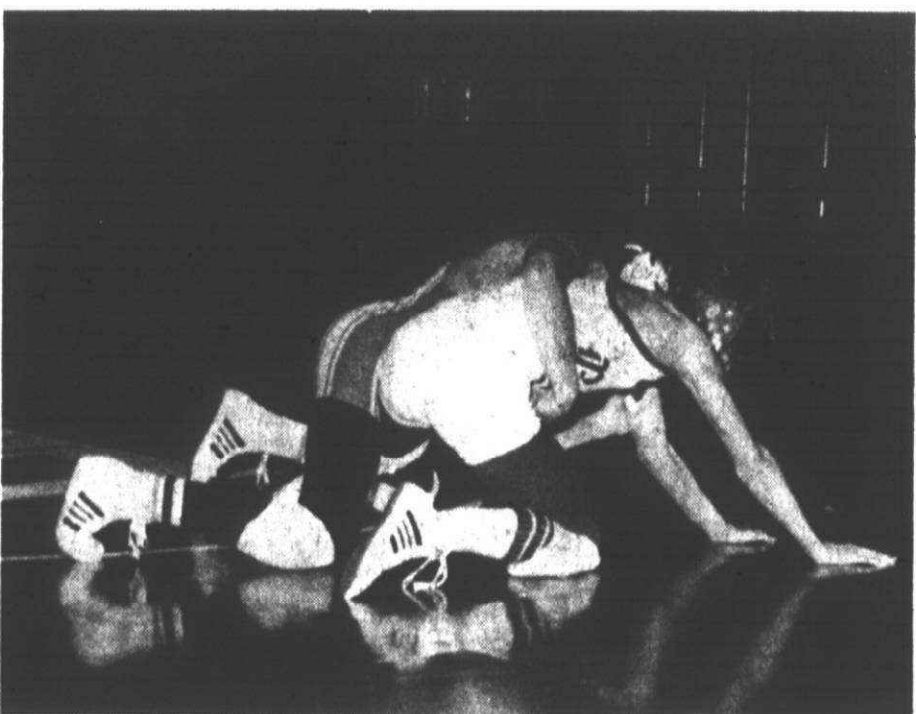

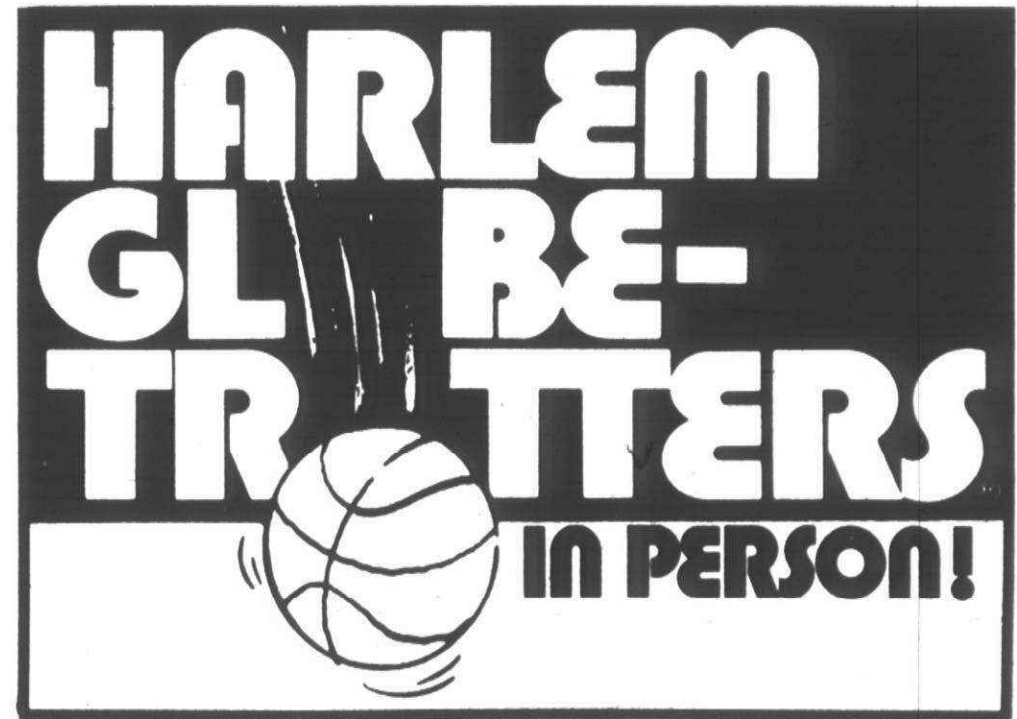

'Bad game defensively'—Cavell

Canton falls to Chargers, 68-53

When the Plymouth Canton Chiefs combine two consistent halves of basketball, they're going to win their share of games. But until that time comes, Canton will continue to suffer the consequences of poor shooting.

Friday night the Chiefs opened their league schedule against Western Six foe Livonia Churchill. The Chargers mounted a 20-point halftime bulge from which Canton couldn't come back, as Churchill rolled to victory over Canton, 68-53.

"Our offense played fairly well tonight, but our defense wasn't good enough," said Canton coach Casey Cavell. Churchill moved out to a 19-11 lead after the opening period even though guards Mike Streicher and Scott Shephard exited from the contest with minor injuries.

Churchill stretched its advantage by outscoring the Chiefs in the second stanza, 19-7, to hold a 38-18 halftime lead. "The ballgame was turned around in the second quarter for us because Canton wasn't shooting well," said Churchill coach Pat Montagan.

The Chiefs fought back early in the third quarter by slicing the Churchill

lead to nine, 38-29, when they reeled off 10 points while holding Churchill scoreless in the opening moments.

Churchill regained its shooting form and increased its lead to 12 after the Canton spurt to keep a safe distance ahead of the resurgent Chiefs.

It was a very physical contest with 47 fouls called. Both clubs shot for about the same percentage from the free throw line, Canton sinking 15 of 22 attempts while Churchill hit on 18

of 30.

Plymouth outscored Livonia, 35-30, in the second half but the margin its opponent had mustered in the first half was insurmountable.

For Canton it was their fourth setback in as many outings, while Churchill evened its overall mark at 2-2. Other winners in Western Six action were Farmington Harrison and Waterford Mott.

"I don't feel we've come together as a unit—we lack cohesiveness at this point of the season," said Cavell. He added, "I think as time goes on we'll be playing much better basketball."

Canton continues its league schedule tomorrow night when the Chiefs face the Northville Mustangs at Northville. Churchill will be away this Friday at Waterford Mott.

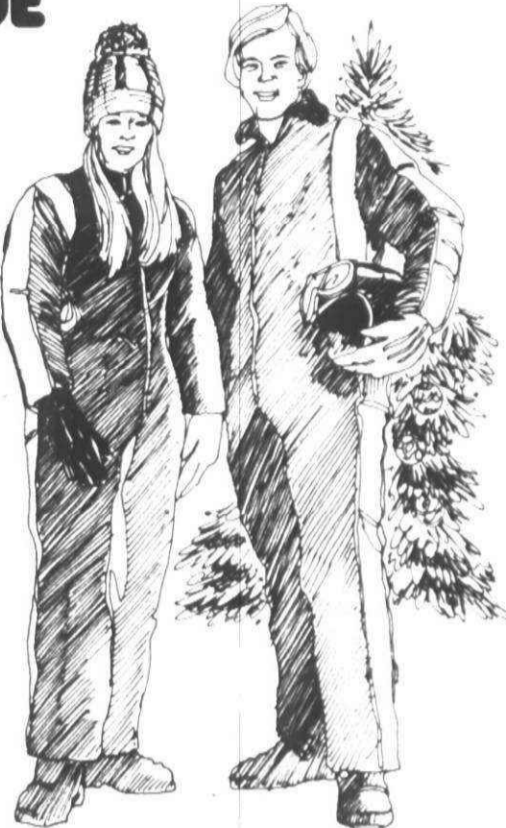

Who is telling the truth in the slaughterhouse suit?

Truth can be hard to find. Like a greased pig at a carnival, it can be an elusive quantity, hard to latch on to.

Libertarian theory, that grand old foundation of the free press, tells us that the truth can be found only after conflicting ideas collide with one another like crazed bull elk. Somehow, after conflicting notions bounce off one another, the truth is arrived at.

Our courts are predicated on a similar notion.

IN A RECENT instance, conflicting reports, claims, and ideas surfaced over a slaughterhouse in Canton—and the truth was not immediately apparent.

The owner of the slaughterhouse, Dale Risinger, was cited by the township for two violations and was acquitted 10 days ago of those charges in the 35th District Court.

The township had charged him with expanding his business operation and plant in an area zoned so that it was illegal for him to do so.

The man was found innocent by a six-member jury.

What was interesting about the case was the conflicting reports originating from Supervisor Robert Greenstein's office and the slaughterhouse owner.

The owner said he had never bothered a neighbor, had never violated any health codes, had received a building permit from the township to expand his plant, and was innocent of both charges.

He said the supervisor had visited his plant on several occasions for free bones before starting the litigation against him.

He said the previous owner of the slaughterhouse had run the plant at full tilt often and had contracts with a nearby hospital and DeHoCo.

THE REPORTS coming out of the township office, however, were almost diametrically opposed to Risinger's story.

According to the supervisor, the slaughterhouse poses a health hazard, and one neighbor has already complained of blood in her basement.

He said the building permit was issued in error after a letter was sent to Risinger explaining that non-conforming uses of property cannot be expanded. The permit was retracted, he explained.

He further claimed that the permit was not even requested until construction was completed.

Greenstein said he had never visited the slaughterhouse until he went to inspect it and had never accepted any bones from the owner.

He said the previous owner of the slaughterhouse used to butcher only neighborhood pigs and cows twice a week—unlike the present owner, who slaughters more than 100 horses a week.

THE OWNER responded that there never was blood in any neighbor's basement. It was, rather, drainage from a blocked drain tile. Risinger said the county health inspectors would verify that.

He added that he was not filling the swamp behind the plant with horsehide and horse entrails, as the supervisor had said, and that he has a full-time health inspector who watches the

plant every minute it is in operation.

As I said, the truth is hard to ascertain. Perhaps it lies in a gray area between the conflicting statements—and perhaps both men are exaggerating.

Perhaps one is even telling a falsehood.

I don't know and I would not be willing to point a finger at either township officials pursuing the matter, or Risinger.

There are, however, some clear realities. The township is pursuing the issue in circuit court as a civil matter (and asking for abatement of use). An appeal of the jury's decision in the 35th District Court is under consideration.

One thing is also clear. Risinger is paying for his court costs, the taxpayers are footing the township action.

IF THE TOWNSHIP wins either the circuit court case or appeals the district court decision and wins, it appears Risinger will be either out of business or hurt enough to make it economically worth while to quit.

More simply, his ability to earn his living in these parts would be at an end. He said everything he owns is in his business and that if it is closed down, he too is dead meat.

I hope the township realizes this. Preventing a man from pursuing his livelihood is a grave matter.

If the slaughterhouse is to be shut down, township officials had better be able to prove, beyond a shadow of a doubt, that it is a detriment to the health and welfare of the community.

A touch of history

Editor:

The changing identity of Canton Township from a rich farm land to a fast-growing population expanse is posing a problem in postal mailing.

Some old residents wish to remain faithful to traditional Plymouth, Wayne, Belleville, or Ypsilanti post offices. To supplement this tradition are new residents who also would rather be listed under these prestigious cities.

With a city soon mushrooming in Canton, it is inevitable that the township decide now to resolve the problem according to the wishes of the people. A separate zip code number for Canton is a convenient necessity, but whether the residents want to keep the name of Canton is debatable.

An interesting background at this moment would be to review the history of Canton and its neighbors.

In what was called "a dismal swamp" because of the overflowing of the Rouge River and creeks like the Topquish and Fellows—this was Canton Township. Through this territory, the Sauk Indian Trail, later called the Chicago Turnpike, the Pulaski Memorial Highway and now known as Michigan Avenue, wound its way from Dearborn to Chicago.

Canton, being the southern section of Plymouth Township, was proclaimed a separate territory by an Act of Congress on March 7, 1834.

The name Canton was suggested by a federal agent to honor the City of Canton, China. The object was to pick a name no other city had in the United States.

However, today there are several Cantons, one being not far away—Canton, Ohio. Therefore, in view of this, the "name not found elsewhere in the United States" idea is null and void.

The name Peking was suggested for what is now Plymouth, but, William Bartow, then a member of the territorial council appointed by Governor Cass, proposed the name of Plymouth as a more historical and patriotic title. The citizens further east

changed their Chinese name to what is now Dearborn. Part of Nankin Township became Westland.

The question arises: If Canton residents are not happy about the obscure name of Canton, why not change it to a more suitable name? Now is the time to act before the post office arrives.

Because Canton originally was part of Plymouth, it is proper to be so included. Using Plymouth as a prefix and "ville" from Belleville as a suffix would make Plymouthville. But who wants to be called a "Plymouthvillian?" Plymouthvill would be more proper. Voters can decide the name at a future election.

Hearings planned

County eyes end to drug treatment

A committee of the Wayne County Board of Commissioners studying a proposal to end methadone treatment for drug addicts will hold a series of public hearings on the plan.

All the hearings will be conducted by the board's human resources committee. The hearings will be held throughout the county and will include neighborhoods that encompass methadone treatment centers.

Jarrette Simmons, committee chairman, said, "We consider this such a serious issue that the committee decided we want some input from the public before deciding on what to recommend to the full board."

"As of right now, the committee does not have a consensus opinion, and we are hoping to attract enough of the public to give us some direction."

"We think we already know most of the popular professional opinion—that is available in plenty of literature—but it is the voice of the general citizen that we want to hear."

THE COMMITTEE is studying a

proposal submitted by Commissioner George F. Killeen which calls for a six-month phase out of methadone programs. His plan would apply to treatment of drug-addicted persons enrolled in all programs under the County Advisory Council on Substance Abuse Services.

Killeen proposed to cease methadone treatment on the basis of a position paper from the council's subcommittee on methadone maintenance and detoxification. The subcommittee urges that funds now used for methadone should instead be used for public education.

"According to the subcommittee report," said Killeen, "we need a new approach based on prevention and early diagnosis, but this is impossible now because most of our drug money is spent on methadone maintenance."

HE POINTED OUT that five to 10 per cent of the clients in these programs have used methadone for more than two years and added that, "We seem to be allowing the use of methadone as a permanent crutch instead

of the temporary means for withdrawal from heroin as it was originally intended.

"I consider two years to be too long a period for withdrawal, and I am afraid that we may be creating as many addicts as we cure."

He noted that the subcommittee report said that "there are no agreed upon measures to evaluate the effectiveness of methadone programs" and that it is questionable whether methadone, which is also addictive, is a treatment.

New law prompts voter sign-up

Based on the first month's success with the new voter registration-driver license law, more than half a million additional voter registrations will be processed in Michigan before the 1976 election.

"The number of voter registration applications being received in Secretary of State field offices is exceeding our expectations," Secretary of State Richard Austin said. "The people statewide appear to welcome the ease and convenience with which they can update their voter registrations or apply for new registrations at our driver license offices throughout Michigan."

A total of 35,678 voter applications, in close proportion to population distribution, were received in the first month of the program which began Oct. 1. Of these, about half (17,449) were for new voters and half (18,299) were for changes of address. These registrations do not include regular

year around registration activities of election clerks in their own offices.

Registrations totaled 6,327 in Oakland County and 5,426 in Wayne County.

New voter registrations include people moving into Michigan from other states, as well as other residents not previously registered. The change of address category includes persons who renew registrations which have lapsed, as well as persons who simply have moved within the state and are transferring a current registration from one election jurisdiction to another.

Another major element of the program involves providing election clerks with the names of persons of voting age who have moved out of the state. Since the new system has gone into operation, the Secretary of State's office has identified more than 45,000 such individuals whose voter registrations should be cancelled in Michigan. According to Austin, every three months the names and address of persons who have moved out of Michigan will be purged from the rolls.

Austin reported that "excellent cooperation from election officials is making the job easier for all. The new system complements the tasks of the clerks by providing additional convenient registration application facilities, while continuing their full responsibilities for the voter registration process. Our efforts help them clean out deadwood in their files as well as update live registrations," Austin said.

This new addition to Michigan's voter registration system is an important step toward encouraging greater citizen participation in the political process, Austin said.

LANDSAT needs manager

The appointment of a state LANDSAT manager to help coordinate the providers and users of remotely sensed data in the LANDSAT system was proposed by U.S. Rep. Marvin L. Esch (R-Ann Arbor).

Although most Michigan residents would not be aware of or understand this program, Esch remarked, LANDSAT technology will provide major scientific applications and programs for Michigan in the decade ahead.

Esch spoke to Michigan members of the American Institute of Aeronautics and Astronautics attending a one-day symposium on "Application of Remotely Sensed Data in North Central United States."

LANDSAT could include a comprehensive system of earth resources monitoring by satellite to deliver advanced technology in the areas of water and air quality, agriculture and meteorology, and ice and water resource data, Esch said.

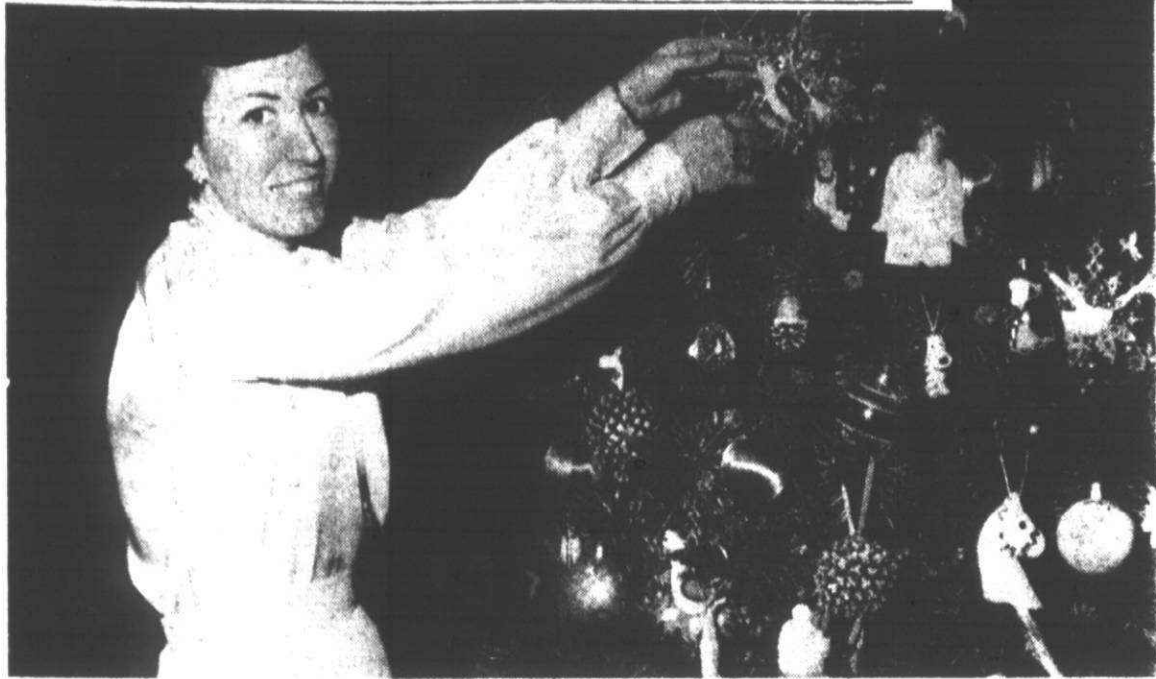

Simmer sugar, water and spices about 10 minutes. Let set for awhile before removing cinnamon sticks. Add orange and cranberry juices and heat. The recipe makes 34 half-cup servings. Mrs. Richard says they floated orange slices in the hot, spicy brew.

LEMON DAINTIES

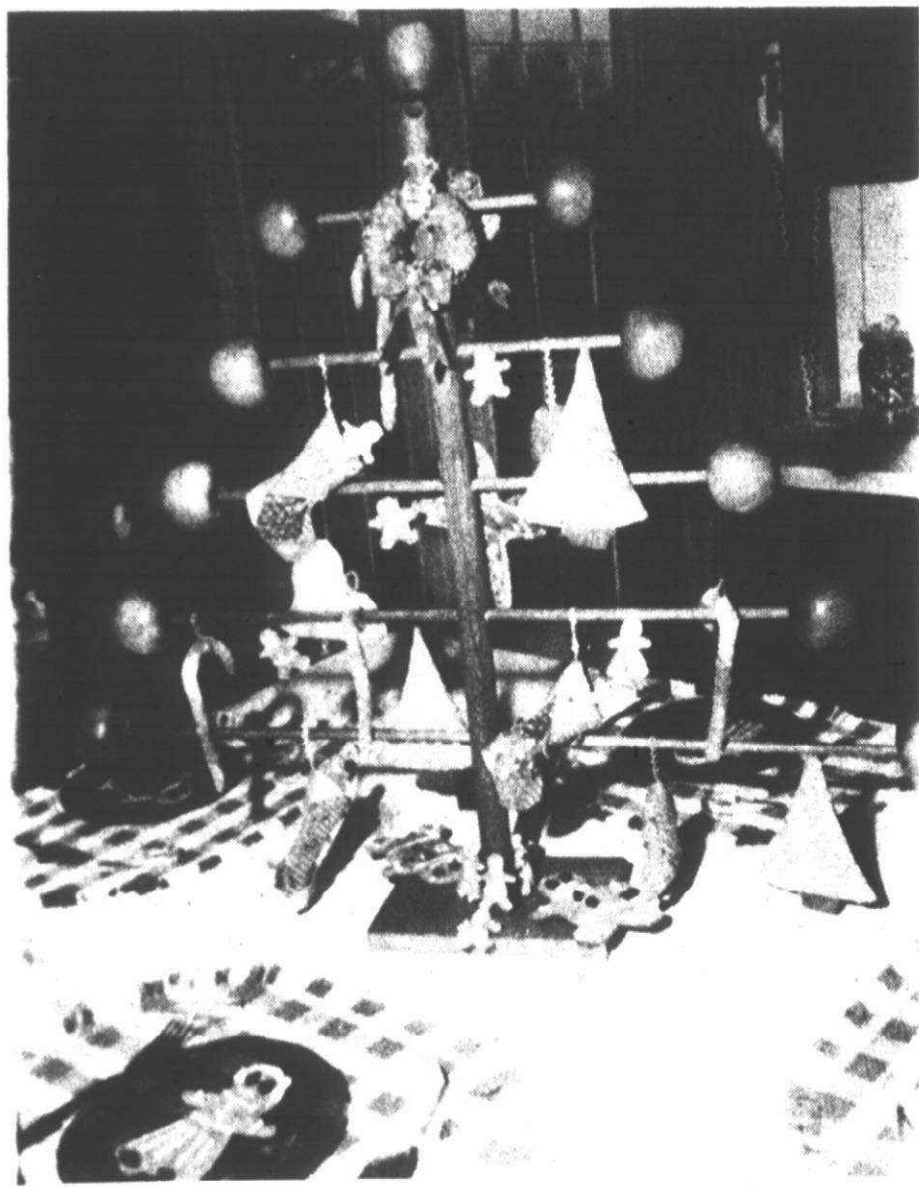
- ½ cup butter
- ½ cup margarine
- ½ cup confectioners sugar
- Lemon extract
- ¾ cup cornstarch
- 1¼ cup flour

Mix all together using a small amount of lemon extract to flavor. Form into small balls and flatten. Bake on ungreased cookie sheets in 350-degree oven for about 10 or 12 minutes—don't brown, the cookie is like a shortbread. When cool, frost with a butter frosting flavored with lemon.

Keep common sense in Christmas, urges new Post etiquette book

Don't expect a Christmas card from Elizabeth Post this year.

America's leading expert on etiquette says the growing custom of sending cards to "everyone and anyone with whom you have a nodding acquaintance" is getting out of hand.

"For many people, it's become a contest to see how many cards they can display on their mantel," the granddaughter-in-law of the legendary Emily notes disapprovingly. "That's not the spirit of Christmas!"

Holiday cards should be sent to people you really wish to greet, but who are "not quite close enough to you to exchange gifts," Mrs. Post

writes in the latest edition of "The New Emily Post's Etiquette," a hefty volume (978 pages, Funk & Wagnalls, \$11.95 or \$12.95 thumb-indexed) that carries on the tradition of Emily's original 1922 book.

During an interview in her New York City apartment-office to which she commutes from her Vermont farm every few weeks, she also offered advice on seasonal gift-giving and entertaining.

SELECT PRESENTS with common sense, she counsels. "Limit them to close friends and relatives—and to what you can afford. If you're an aunt or a grandmother, ask the child's par-

ents what he or she wants, or consult the child yourself." Mrs. Post, 54, has three grandsons.

Hand-written thank-you notes for holiday gifts are no longer necessary, she says (although they remain "obligatory" for wedding presents). "You can say thanks in person or on the phone, but it is never wrong to send a note in addition."

But do try to remember who sent what, so you can avoid a social faux pas such as the one Mrs. Post once made:

"A couple who are close friends of ours gave us a box of assorted cheeses for Christmas one year, and I forgot about it," she related.

"We entertained them during the holidays and I remarked: 'Honestly, I can't understand people who would give cheese as a gift. What could possibly show less imagination?' They burst out laughing...and they've sent cheese to us every year since!"

ELIZABETH POST'S idea of a good holiday party is one to which children

of all ages are invited. "I think there's nothing nicer than a dinner where you get out your best glasses and china and let the whole family see what a lovely table can look like."

Open house parties also get the Post approval. "With so much seasonal entertaining, they give guests a chance to come and go when they like. And you can accommodate all your friends. Serve a buffet with turkey and ham and side dishes—or simply cakes and cookies with an eggnog and a hot mulled cider punch."

If your budget is really tight, you might consider a B.Y.O. party, she says—one where guests bring their own food and drink. "But most hosts will want to provide for their guests at holiday time."

All this would seem to call for much advance planning. "I like to think I get ready for Christmas in August or September, and I do try to get ahead with catalogue-ordering," says Mrs. Post. "But actually," she laughs, "I'm frantic around December 15th!"

Her quilts can chase the chill

Mrs. Smith returned to her summer cabin for a fall weekend and found her bed so cold she shivered all night. Mrs. Jones, on the other hand, slept in her cottage warm as a kitten, for she was covered by a goose-down quilt.

These are pictures that Mrs. Jean Gould of Oak Park would like to paint for all to see. That is because she is in the business of selling goose and duck down quilts.

Somewhere someone must be raising droves of ducks and geese because the use of their down has reemerged as the best way to sleep warm on top of Mount Everest, or even through a Michigan winter.

And while some stuff their down into sleeping bags, Mrs. Gould uses hers to fill quilts.

"IT ALL BEGAN when my husband and I spent some time in England," reported Mrs. Gould. "During the winter our place was very damp. A gale-like wind blew through the stone walls of the room in which we were sleeping. We were literally awake all night trying to keep warm."

By luck the Goulds had slept under a goose-down quilt earlier in a bed and breakfast lodging while traveling in the country. So when Mrs. Gould found one of these quilts in a Liverpool store, she pounced on it and had a toasty winter.

"The British use them to save energy," she said. "People can turn off the heat in the bedroom at night and reduce fuel consumption." After she returned home she decided to go into a business that would bring comfortable winter nights into the lives of everyone. She claims one of her quilts equals four blankets and one bedspread and weighs one-fourth as much.

"THE QUILTS are made in five, seven or nine-inch channels which run the direction of the bed," she explained. "You can adapt it to the temperature by shaking the down toward the foot of the bed on warmer nights. "With these channels going lengthwise, the quilt is molded to your body and you avoid wind tunnels that can often occur under blankets. The down has room to expand."

Mrs. Gould suggested that the bed need only a bottom sheet and perhaps a top sheet, and that the down quilt be covered by a washable coverslip. She carries these too, in her newly-opened Midwest Duvet company. Her brand comes from England, but she said housewives could make their own. A goose-down quilt, without a coverlet, for a single bed costs \$116. One for a queen-sized bed goes for \$168 and for a king-sized bed, \$195. A duck down quilt for a queen-sized bed is \$145.

Compute income tax now

Does it make any sense to compute income taxes in December, with the year not yet over and the tax return deadline still four months away?

The Michigan Association of Certified Public Accountants (MACPA) thinks so, and offers a number of reasons, all of which have to do with saving tax dollars next April.

CPAs do not suggest that you completely fill out your Federal Income Tax Form 1040 at this early date — merely that you get a good idea of your income, exemptions, deductions and probable tax obligation so that you may take certain tax-minimizing steps which may be necessary while you have the chance.

For example, if a quick computation indicates your taxes have been underwithheld, there is still time to ask your employer to hold back enough from your last several paychecks to meet the withholding requirements.

Or, if you are eligible for a tax credit for buying a new home, and the credit is greater than the taxes you owe, you will not want to see part of that credit go unused; perhaps you can bring some of next year's income into 1975, so it can be offset by credit.

Or, say you have just had a very good year; your 1975 income promises

to be well above what you expect to make next year. How about trying to delay some of your earnings until after the first of the year, or pre-paying some of next year's deductible expenses now?

MACPA advises that not all bills may be prepaid with Internal Revenue blessing, but among those that can are certain state and local taxes, charitable contributions and some interest payments made no more than a year in advance.

Most medical bills can not be prepaid, but there is nothing to prevent you from paying now every penny of medical expense you presently owe, and CPAs recommend that you do so, especially if those expenses exceed the excludable first three per cent of adjusted gross income.

After roughly assessing their tax situation, taxpayers with investments in securities may be prompted to make changes in their portfolios to balance out capital gains and losses. CPAs believe wise investors avoid buying or selling for tax reasons alone; sound investment considerations should also support such a move. And, they add, do not forget that a purchase or sale of a security takes five working days to carry out and if you wait too long


the transaction may occur in 1976 rather than 1975.

HOW ABOUT those Individual Retirement Accounts, into which persons not already covered by a pension or profit-sharing plan may put aside part of their income and pay no taxes on it until it is withdrawn? If you are eligible, consider establishing an IRA at once, for in the closing days of the year you can set aside the full amount permitted for 1975.

The same is true of gifts to your children or others. There is a \$3,000 annual limit on the amount that can be given without paying taxes, and if you don't make the 1975 gift this month, the tax break for the year is lost.

Incidentally, if you do make the gift now, make sure your check is cashed this year. To avoid having to ask the recipient to hurry to his bank, just have the check certified; that causes it to be debited to your account at once.

Those are just a few of the reasons for looking into your tax situation now, according to the Michigan Association of CPAs. Painful as the process may be, it can pay big dividends.

Driving costs up 10 per cent in 1974

The cost of driving for Michigan motorists has increased nearly 10 percent in the last year, according to Automobile Club of Michigan.

"It now costs state motorists 18.3 cents a mile to operate their cars compared to 16.6 cents per mile in 1974."

Data on the expenses of operating a motor vehicle is based on driving a 1975 intermediate-size Chevelle, an eight-cylinder Malibu Classic hardtop with standard equipment and an automatic transmission.

"The major reasons for this year's increased costs are that the average price of new, American-made cars has risen over last year and gasoline costs are up about six cents a gallon from 1974," said Joseph Ratke of the Auto Club.

DURING A four-year period from 1969 to 1973, operating costs rose just 14 percent with most of that increase coming in 1973 as gasoline prices went up 10 to 15 cents per gallon. In the last two years, operating costs have risen approximately 25 percent.

"For the motorist who drives 10,000 miles annually, operating expenses in 1976 will be \$1,831—a \$169 increase over costs for an intermediate-size auto last year," Ratke said.

An auto driven 20,000 miles will cost \$2,636, or about 13.2 cents per mile. The reason for the lower cents-per-mile figure at 20,000 miles is that fixed costs (insurance, depreciation and license fee) remains about the same as for 10,000 miles.

For every 10 cents per gallon increase in gas price, the per-mile cost of running a car rises one cent based on 10 miles per gallon, or one-half cent for 20 miles per gallon.

THE AAA pamphlet, "Your Driving Costs", pointed out that the 18.3-cent figure is computed on 6.45 cents a mile for variable costs (gas, oil and maintenance) and 11.85 cents a mile for fixed costs.

The recently released booklet also compares operating costs for various sized cars in both low-cost (rural) and high-cost (urban) areas.

Based on annual mileage of 10,000, it costs 12.8 cents per mile to operate a compact, six-cylinder model car in a low-cost area and 17.3 cents a mile to drive the same vehicle in a high-cost location, such as Detroit.

Motorists should figure an additional 20-cents-per-day increase in operating costs for air conditioning.
