Contract negotiations drag on with DPW, firemen, inspectors

Despite months of negotiations, the long wait for Canton firefighters, Department of Public Works (DPW) employes and building inspectors will continue—as all await a contract offer from the township.

All three groups of employes have been at the bargaining table for some time now, and none of the bargaining units has yet to reach accord with township negotiators.

All three groups are awaiting their first union contract. They are currently working under a non-union operating agreement with the township.

"I have negotiated with these people as far as I can go," explained Clerk John Flodin, the township's chief bargaining agent, "and now it's up to the board. I have presented all the negotiated facts to the board members, and it's time for the board to ratify an agreement or make a counter offer."

Flodin, who has been assisted at times in his bargaining duties by Treasurer Carl Parsell, Trustee Bob Myers, and Supervisor Robert Greenstein, said most of the language of the three contracts had been ironed out. What remained was the "nitty gritty over wages and fringe benefits."

"I think things have moved fairly smoothly," said the clerk. "We've some substantial agreement and disagreement, but progress has been made. Some people may think the negotiations haven't moved fast enough."

EMPLOYEES IN the DPW voted to

join the American Federation of State, County and Municipal Employees (AFSCME) in May 1974. They began bargaining for a union contract in October 1974.

"We've suffered quite a few delays," said union president Bob Farrell of Council 23 (Canton's local). "Meetings have been postponed and we've even had a mediator, but that didn't seem to work out."

"We've suggested maybe getting into binding arbitration, but we haven't had a response. With binding arbitration, the board wouldn't have to worry about the final decision."

"Right now we seem to be at a standstill, they don't seem to want to make any decisions."

According to Farrell, the DPW employes haven't received much in the way of salary adjustments since they started bargaining 15 months ago.

"We got a little raise in October 1974 retroactive to June 1974, but other than that, we haven't gotten anything."

The DPW contract will affect eight township employes. Five are in the union and three will join when the contract is ratified.

"The heart of the matter is 'economics,'" said Farrell.

"The wording can be worked out. I think it's money and fringes. It just seems like an awful long time to be bargaining."

"The office girls (who turned down AFSCME in a vote last spring) got 10 per cent in January, and the fire department got 10 per cent for 1975," explained Farrell. "We don't want to be hard, we just want to get on the ball and get this thing over with."

Farrell said township negotiators indicated a greater willingness to get the contract wrapped up at the last session and that on Jan. 12 most of the board would be present to "at least work out the wording of the contract."

THREE DAYS LATER, board members are scheduled to meet with the union representatives from the building department.

"We're supposed to meet so they can present a proposal," explained union steward Don Tillman. "They're supposed to have a package on wages and fringes. As of now we've had no offers and we've really done very little talking."

Building inspectors voted to join AFSCME the same time office workers turned down the union in May

1975. According to Tillman, the inspectors made an offer a short time later and have yet to see a counter proposal.

"We gave them a proposal several months ago and they haven't come back with anything," said Tillman. Tillman said township negotiators had balked at some of the language in their proposal terming the text "too thick, with too much language." "It's a simple contract if you ask me," said Tillman. "I think the issue will be money and fringes."

Tillman added that although the contract would be for 1976, the terms of it would be retroactive to 1975. "Raises were due at the start of this year, and we didn't get anything," he explained.

Four members of the building department will be affected by the contract.

LIKE THE DPW employes and the building inspectors, firefighters are awaiting their first union contract with the township.

Unionized as local 2289 of the International Association of Firefighters, AFL-CIO, 1½ years ago, Canton firemen have been at the bargaining table since October trying to reach agreement for 1976.

They received a six per cent salary hike for the first half of 1975 late in the summer and then an additional four per cent raise for the rest of 1975.

"The way it stands now, we're waiting for Flodin to get together with the

It's time to pay taxes

The holiday season is a grin-and-bear-it time for adults with long lines at shopping centers, traffic jams, hunting for the Christmas tree and more. If that isn't bad enough, it's the time of year local units of government want to thin the old bulge in the wallet.

It's tax collection time, and Canton Treasurer Carl Parsell says all the tax bills are now in the mail. This year's little reminder of indebtedness to the county, the township and the schools has no new tricks, according to the treasurer.

Processing of the bills, however, should be quicker, explained Parsell.

"We have a new mini-computer by Victor and it should save us the weeks of work it used to take to separate the different funds."

"The computer will not only be able to keep all of the money straight, but it will give a duplicate receipt outlining each charge, date and time."

and also which clerk handled the transaction and a daily sub-total.

"This will make sure the school districts receive the correct amount of money in time to help the schools when they need it most," the treasurer added.

PROPERTY TAXES are based on a millage system where one mill represents a dollar for every \$1,000 of assessed value.

The assessed value of property is one half the total appraised cash worth of the property.

Total tax bills for property owners will be the total millage rate multiplied by the assessed value of the property.

Depending on where they live, residents in the township will receive one of three tax bills.

Residents in the Plymouth Community School District will be paying a total of 50.89 mills. The first 35.6 mills will go to the schools, five mills will go to Canton, 2.13 will go to Schoolcraft Community College, 1.09 to Wayne County Intermediate Schools (special education) and 7.07 will go to Wayne County.

Residents living in the Wayne-Westland School District will pay even more. Their bills will be the same for the township, county and special education, but they will pay more for the schools and less for the community college.

Wayne-Westland residents will pay 44.65 mills for the schools and .73 mills for Wayne County Community College. Their total millage rate will be 58.54.

Residents living in the Van Buren School District pay least of all. They pay all the same charges as residents in the Wayne-Westland district except instead of paying 44.65 mills for the schools, they are levied 28.98 mills for the schools. Their total millage rate is 42.87.

ALL BILLS WILL have an additional one per cent charge that will go to the township for administration costs of preparing and collecting the tax.

Some township residents will have

Holiday deadlines

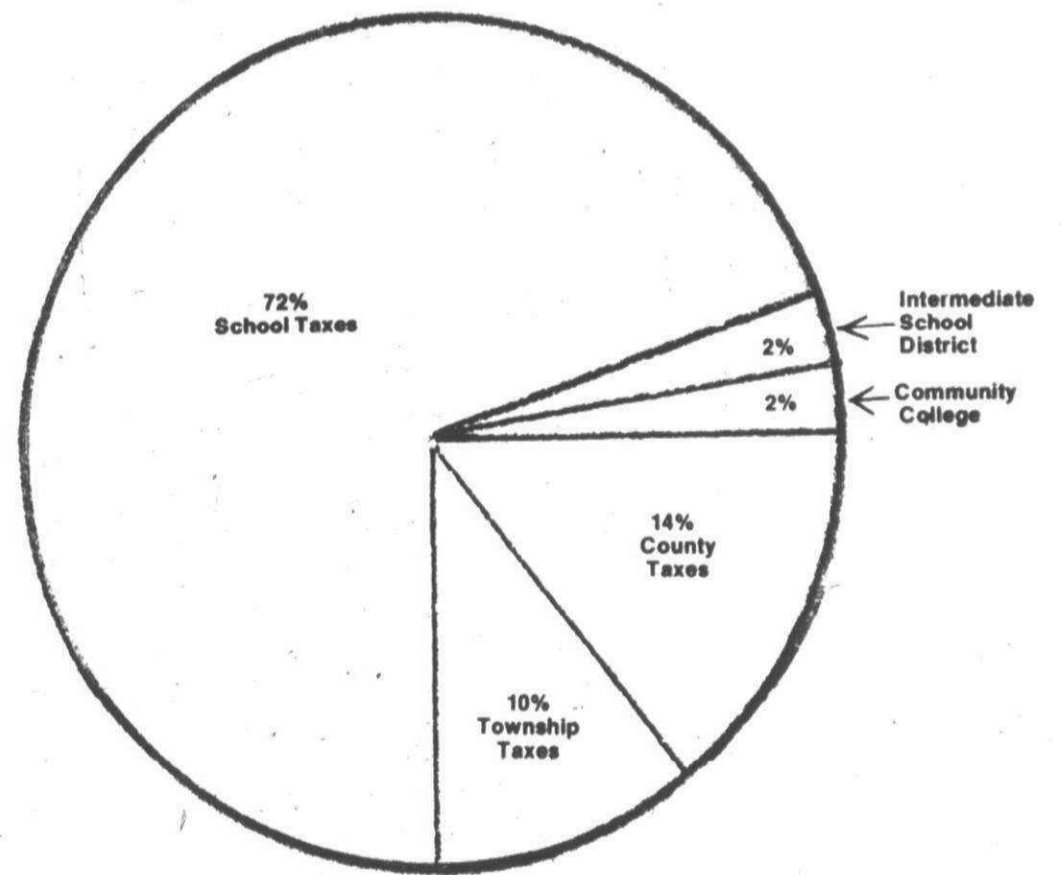
For the next two holiday weeks delivery and deadlines for the Observer & Eccentric will be changed to allow employes to spend Christmas and New Year's Day with their families.

Clothing bank help needed

The idea of a clothing bank in the schools of the Plymouth Community School District is still in the planning stages but can become a reality if enough interested persons volunteer their time to assist in the effort.

Flossie Tonda wants to establish a clothing bank in school buildings to provide clothing to children and families in the district.

CLOTHING WHICH other people have outgrown, but aren't worn out, would be donated to various buildings for the clothing banks. Anyone in need would then make a request to the building principal who would grant approval and take them to the clothing bank to be outfitted.

Mrs. Tonda says civic clubs and organizations also can become involved and provide shoes or other items unlikely to be donated by residents.

Senior citizens also can become involved, she adds, by volunteering their time to mend clothes or knit items with materials possibly being provided.

Anyone who wants more information, or would volunteer their time, are urged to call Mrs. Tony Tonda at 39846 John Drive, Plymouth.

CLOTHING BANKS have been established in school buildings in the Livonia and Wayne-Westland school districts. Wayne-Westland, which serves part of Canton, last year clothed some 800 families.

"We do have a great need in the Plymouth Community School District," says Mrs. Tonda. "The Salvation Army helps a number of families but they don't have the resources to serve the numbers which need help."

"We aren't asking for money from anyone—just some of their time. We need enthusiastic people who feel the need and are interested enough to get involved."

Mrs. Tonda hopes to take interested persons to school buildings in nearby districts, such as Wayne-Westland, so they can see how the clothing banks work and hear an explanation from those involved in the project.

Chase ends in shooting death

An Ypsilanti man was killed Friday in Canton Township after leading Wayne County Sheriff deputies and Wayne Police in a wild chase at speeds of more than 100 m.p.h. on Michigan Avenue.

A sheriff's department spokesman said Kenneth Vincent Callabs, 25, was shot when he tried to run down police as they cornered him at Michigan Avenue west of Belleville Road.

The spokesman said a sheriff's car was at Michigan and Hannan roads when he saw three Wayne police cars giving chase to a speeding car. At the same time, the deputy received a radio call informing him of the chase.

The car and the occupant matched the description of a man who had tried to hold up a store in the 1800 block of Joy road in Detroit.

According to the sheriff's department, the suspect raced west on Michigan, running red lights while heading toward Washtenaw County. He then headed east on Michigan and turned into the Mobile Lounge parking lot near Belleville Road where police at-

tempted to stop the car.

Police said the suspect rammed two Wayne police cars, putting them out of commission. He then attempted to head west on east bound Michigan Avenue. As a Wayne officer jumped onto the car, the officer fired at the suspect.

In the parking lot, the suspect tried to run over a deputy who fired a carbine at the vehicle which then ram-

med into a storage shed. Police found the victim lying on the front seat of the car apparently still alive.

Callabs died shortly after he was transported to Wayne County General Hospital.

Police are still investigating the incident with Detroit police to try to determine if the victim was the holdup suspect.

NOW pickets 'sexist' toys

Members of the Mid-Western Wayne County Chapter of National Organization for Women (NOW) picketed Garden City K-mart Dec. 14 protesting K-mart's selling of "sexist" toys. Ten marchers gathered from 11 a.m. until noon Sunday in front of the store on Ford Road just west of Middle Belt urging parents not to purchase toys sexist in nature or packaging during this holiday buying season.

Heading the protest was Christine Novak, secretary of the mid-western chapter, which includes Garden City, Westland and Canton Township.

"This protest is part of a national action," explained Ms. Novak, as she marched with a sign that read: "Ken-

ner-Bah Humbug." "We selected this time because Christmas is the heaviest time for buying season of the year and because mothers purchase the majority of toys."

Ms. Novak added the group was especially concerned with the Kenner Toy Co., a division of General Mills.

"Not only are Kenner toys sexist in nature, Kenner doesn't pay its women directors the same as its men directors," said Ms. Novak. "The company has been ordered to remedy the situation but as of yet hasn't complied with the government's order."

Ms. Novak, who has two children, said NOW is against all Kenner toys, and in particular, the "Family Tree House," in which the mother wears a permanent apron and stays at home while the father goes off to work.

ARLENE VANDERLEUN of West-

land, a member of Sunday's protest, said NOW selected the Garden City K-mart because "it is the original K-mart built by the parent company S.S. Kresge in Troy."

Nan Frost Welmers, president of the NOW chapter, said the protest was not against K-mart but against the sexist toys it sells.

Several children were part of Sunday's picket. Diana Volpini brought her niece, Dana along and pushed her in a stroller along with a sign that read: "Don't program me. Do I grow up like Skipper?"

Mid-Western Wayne County NOW said one of the most offensive toys is the Mattel Toy Co.'s "Growing Up Skipper" doll, in which breasts appear by twisting the doll's arms.

Several members carried signs Sunday that read: "NOW says down with Skipper," "Don't buy sexist toys,"

and "Ban sexist toys—crayons are more fun than toy vacuum cleaners or guns."

One youngster pushed an inflated Santa Claus bearing a sign which said: "I won't deliver sexist toys."

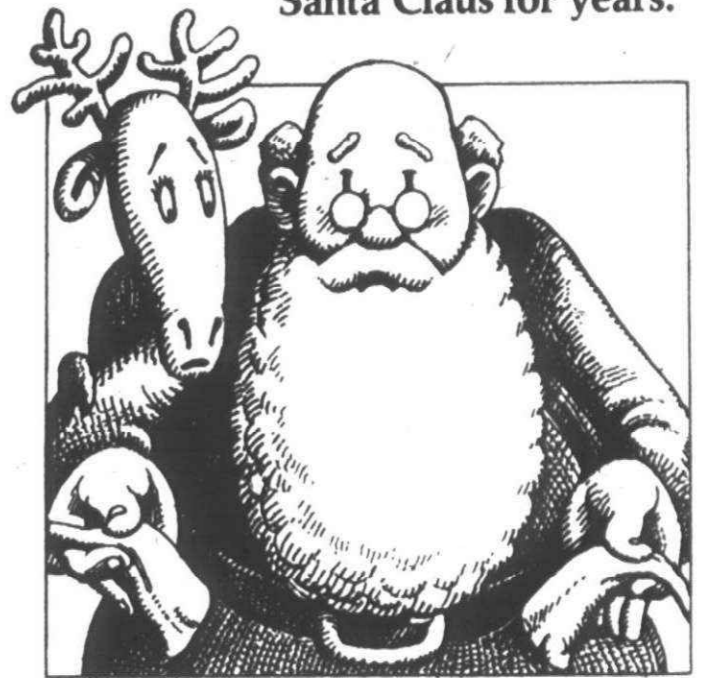
Janet Aniline carried a sign which read: "Toys shape values."

"I have two children, and packages and toys do the same things to program a youngster," said Ms. Aniline.

Several marchers who said they didn't have children simply state they were against sexism in anything, including children's toys and playthings.

Besides carrying signs the group passed out flyers explaining their protest to customers entering and leaving the K-mart store. The flyers asked shoppers not "to shove your child into a sexual slot because a toy manufacturer does."

other board members and find out what they feel," said union president Dave Hamilton.

"All we've done so far is get the nomenclature down and explain what we're asking for. Flodin just relays that information. The whole board has to act on it."

Hamilton said negotiations were going slower than hoped. "We're just waiting for their reaction to our demands," the president explained. "It's been more than a month."

Hamilton said all procedures had been followed so that if necessary, the firefighters would be ready to go into binding arbitration. "We've followed the state procedures right down to the wire," he explained.

"Last year we didn't and we got left holding the stick. This year we're making sure we cover ourselves. We hope it is not necessary, but if we have to, we're ready."

Other firefighters said they expected the negotiations would end up in binding arbitration.

"As it see it, our major concern is the bottom line," said Flodin. "We have to look at it and see what it costs. We also have to make sure there is substantial consistency between all three contracts over fringes and wages. We have to inter-relate the offers."

"I'd have to say they're asking for more than what I consider reasonable."

Flodin said he hoped agreement could be reached for a two-year contract.

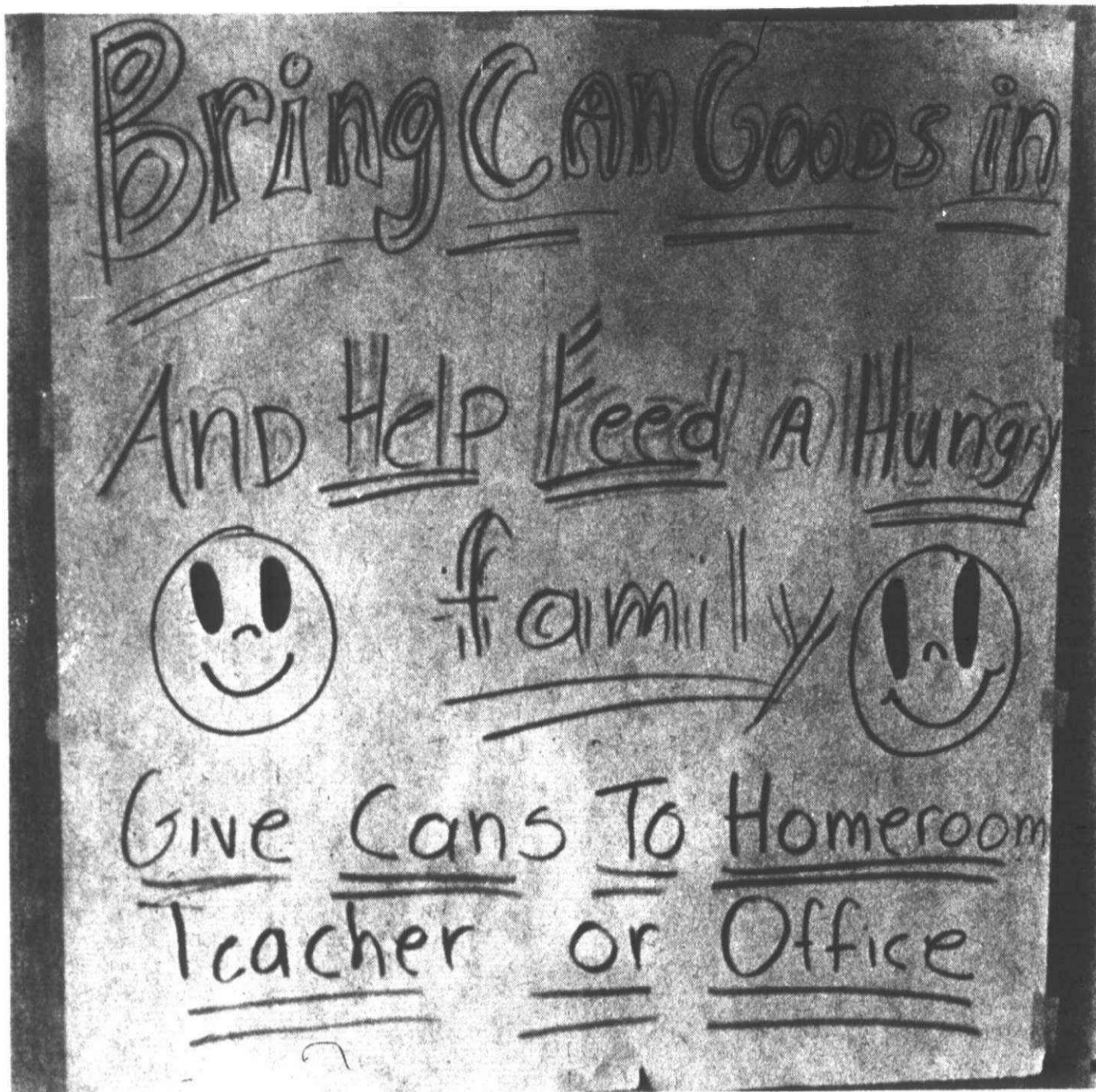

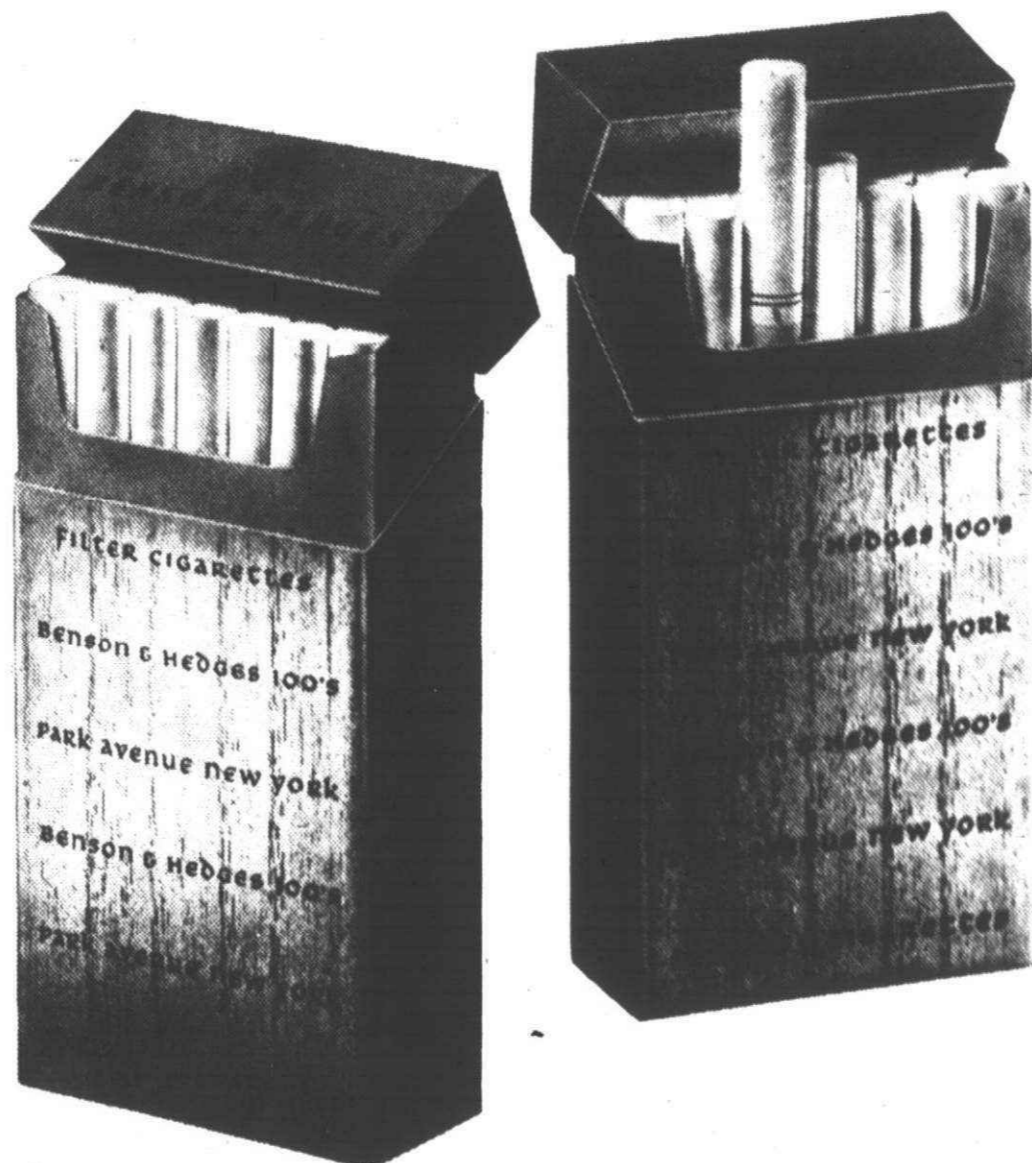

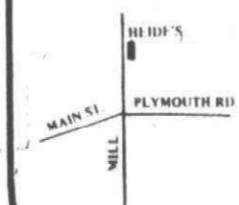

Chief cagers notch 1st victory, 68-59

After waiting a month for their first cage victory, the Plymouth Canton Chiefs finally broke into the win column by virtue of a 68-59 conquest of the Northville Mustangs in a Western Six League match.

"We did everything we were supposed to be doing tonight," said Canton coach Casey Cavell after the game.

Canton trailed the Mustangs, 15-14, at the end of the opening session, but the Chiefs made the big stride towards their initial win in the second quarter by outscoring Northville, 26-6.

Plymouth applied a press which forced numerous turnovers by its opponent, and capitalized when they had the ball on offense. "It was almost a perfect quarter. On offense, if we had the fast break we'd use it, if not, we would work setup patterns," said Cavell.

Canton's leading scorer on the evening was junior guard Rob Mandel, who poured in 22 from the field, including the 12 points he contributed in the second quarter.

"Rob came in when Bill Parson and Tom Close were in foul trouble. He and Keith Osborne controlled the ball very well on offense, while doing a tremendous defensive job on (Northville's) Armada brothers," said coach Cavell.

Northville's brother combination

could garner only six points in the first half. That combination has accounted for almost half of the Mustangs scoring this season.

Just before the half ended, Canton put some extra polish on an already sparkling quarter when Rob Mandel took an inbounds pass in his own end, and heaved a shot three-fourths the length of the court.

The buzzer sounded while the ball was in midair, and when it came down, the sphere fell cleanly through

the cylinder to put the Chiefs up at the intermission, 40-21.

The tempo of the game had been established for Northville, which just could not carve into the deficit they had spotted Canton in the first half.

Canton shot 60 per cent in the second half although they scored 12 fewer points. "We controlled the ball on offense, and didn't get a lot of shots," said Cavell.

For the first time this season, the Chiefs shot over 45 per cent from the

field as they hit for 54 per cent of their field goal attempts Friday night. They were also 12 for 15 from the free throw line.

"I think it's nice to go into the vacation after playing together like this," the Canton mentor added. "I'm very proud of the team."

The Chiefs are now 14 overall, and sport a 1-1 mark in the Western Six standings.

Their next game will be Jan. 6 at Livonia Franklin.

Once again it was 6-8 Jim Ellinghausen who led the scoring parade for Salem, the lanky senior getting 28 points to give him possession of the school's career scoring record with no less than 15 games yet to go this winter.

Perhaps more important, however, was still another record which he es-

tablished by hauling in 21 rebounds as the Rocks dominated the boards, 54-31. No other Plymouth player ever pocketed that many caroms in one game, and despite the overall ragged play Friday it led Rock Coach Fred Thomann to extol the defensive spark his team showed.

Bentley Coach Larry Jackson found the 13-point scoring touch of Rick Ehrst, a 6-1 junior who came off the bench as a replacement at guard, to be the one bright light in the Bulldogs' losing effort.

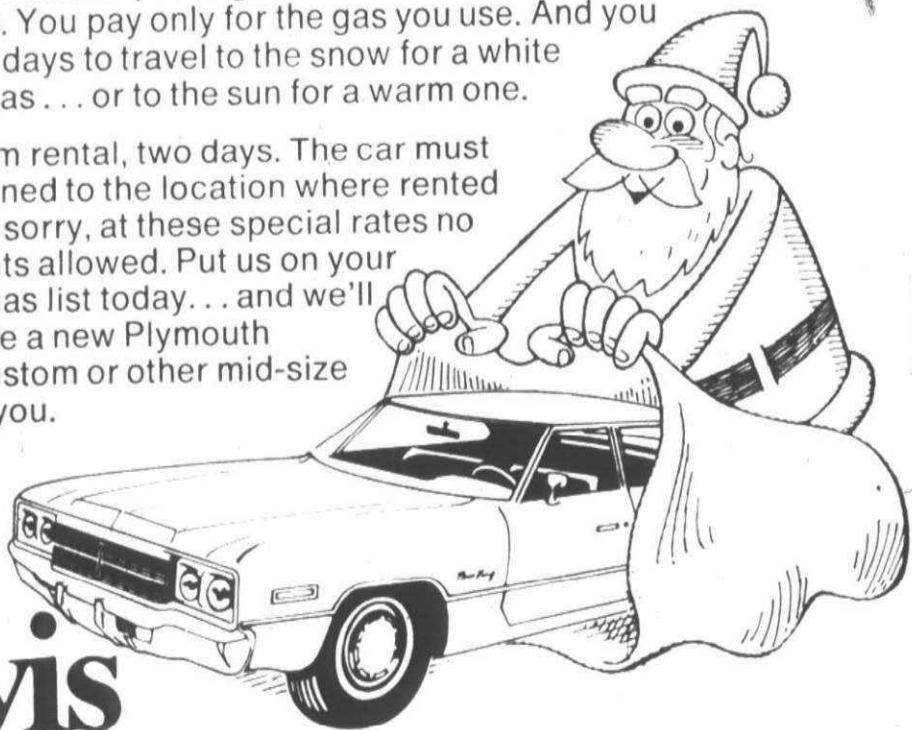

State handcuffs schools with inequitable legislation

Although recent state aid cuts have damaged the Plymouth Community School District budget, it appears the worst may be yet to come. Plymouth schools have suffered a loss of \$365,000 in promised state aid in a budget that started with little fat.

Less than \$100,000 of the \$17 million operating budget for this fiscal year was considered a contingency fund, and rising utility costs have already erased that surplus.

Even worse, administrators and school board members fear another cut, perhaps as late as April—a point at which they would have almost no time to cut so as to avoid an operating deficit.

At the start of this year, the schools had a \$359,000 total surplus or fund equity—but that now appears to be in jeopardy.

Reports emanating from the school board offices are bleak, and it appears the entire fund equity may be eliminated by the end of the fiscal year.

Realignment of the budget has become a top priority item with administrators and the school board, and they have precious little to work with.

Only 15 per cent of the budget is not tied up in salaries, and that 15 per cent is where most of the cuts will certainly come from.

Quite simply, that means educational programs are going to suffer.

Cutting staff is a possibility, but the payment of unemployment compensation by the schools to laid-off workers reduces the net gain to the district and makes the idea less palatable.

BUT THE WORST is yet to come. Projections for next year are dire. The state has made up some of this year's deficit with several one-shot measures that can't be repeated.

Money has been borrowed from the veterans trust fund and the uninsured motorists fund and the fiscal year will likely be extended through October. If the deficit is nearly as bad next year, more of the burden will fall on the schools in 1976-77.

The kicker is that the state legislature has arrived at a formula that not only provides little incentive for generating more local income, but discourages it.

Almost all the money schools operate is a result of local property taxes and state aid.

Next year, as a result of the new single business tax, the state has promised to provide more aid so that districts will be operating with 106 per cent of this year's money per student.

Although the state "guarantees" this increase, if cuts are needed they will be made again, and the money will not find its way here.

If the 106 per cent does not meet the needs of the district, the school board's hands are tied.

Any extra money, up to a point, merely replaces the state aid.

FOR PLYMOUTH schools, the latest figures indicate that if an additional operating levy were sought next year, the first 2.3 mills would replace state aid.

It would not be until the district levied an additional 2.4 mills that a single extra cent would be gained.

With four new buildings opening next year, continued inflation, a six per cent rise in enrollment projected, and a teacher's contract to renegotiate, the odds that costs will outrun income are sizeable.

But local legislators are handcuffed when it comes to trying to raise more money. As one school board member put it, "If we can sell our voters on a millage, we should have that outlet."

Another said, "We should have the option of programming our schools to the level our people are willing to support."

We agree. But right now, the schools really don't have that option—because it seems out-state pressures in Lansing don't want it that way.

The answer? The out-state pressures would say cut the expense side of the ledger. We say apply pressure to local senators and representatives to overcome those out-state pressures.

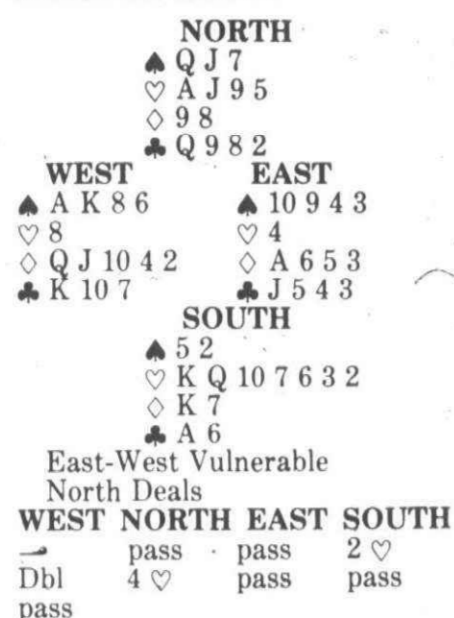

How you can save those aching feet while shopping

What do shoppers think about at this time of year? Holiday gifts and budgets, to be sure, along with crowds and traffic jams. What often gets overlooked until it happens, however, is the problem of aching feet — an obstacle even the hardest shopper may not overcome.

The Better Business Bureau points out that Christmas shopping keeps people standing or walking for longer periods than any other annual event. After checking with the American Podiatry Association on how to keep "foot happy" during the holiday season, the BBB offers the following suggestions:

- Shoppers should keep their feet warm and dry — a factor of special importance to the elderly, and to anyone living in extremely cold or damp climates. If feet do become wet, shoes and hose should be changed at the earliest opportunity.

- What's on feet also has much to do with how they feel. Women should avoid wearing dress shoes while shopping, or the popular platform kind, and instead opt for the casual, low-heeled styles. If shoes must be slipped off periodically, it's obvious that they do not fit properly. In snowy areas, shoeboots are easier on the feet than boots or galoshes over shoes.

- Hose comfort is as important as

the fit of the shoes, and if socks are too short they will bunch the toes together. The resulting friction can cause a painful blister, callus or corn to develop.

- Waiting in line is one of shopping's most annoying situations, and the principal cause of foot fatigue. It's best to keep moving in such situations, shifting weight from one foot to the other, or taking a few steps to the side of the line. This promotes circulation, and relieves the numbness and strain of overworked feet.

- Shoppers who perspire freely must take extra pains with foot hygiene. This includes regular cleansing of the feet, followed by the application of a medicated foot powder. This regimen not only promotes comfort, but also assists in combating fungus infections.

- Injuries, unfortunately, are also a shopping fact of life. They may be caused by frostbite, slips and trips, or the heel of a determined fellow shopper. Such problems should receive immediate professional attention before infections or other aggravations set in.

Shoppers who have "happy feet" are more likely to enjoy holiday shopping and to make fewer purchasing mistakes. Being able to give more

thought to gift selections is a way to avoid going back after Christmas to make exchanges or obtain refunds — subjecting your poor feet to it all over again.

Booklet says ERA can be rescinded

A booklet prepared by the Michigan Stop ERA Committee and several professors of constitutional law and history from Michigan universities says "Yes...We Can Rescind ERA."

The booklet maintains that the 1973 opinion issued by Attorney General Frank Kelley on the matter of rescinding, or reversing, Michigan's vote in favor of the federal Equal Rights Amendment, is not binding on the legislature.

Alfred H. Kelly, professor of constitutional history and dean of graduate studies at Wayne State University, notes that many of the precedents cited by the attorney general in his opinion seemed to be "of very little value."

He added: "I do not think the Michigan legislature is bound, on a constitutional question, to refrain from a crucial public decision merely on an attorney general's opinion."

Judge Audrey Stroia of the Michigan District Court urged all Michigan legislators to reconsider the federal ERA, for the sake of the women who will be most affected by it.

Mrs. Elaine Donnelly, Michigan chairman of the Stop ERA committee, called for the "setting aside of the unnecessary barriers which have inhibited free discussion of the ERA in the past."

She urged women of the state to write their state representatives and senators asking them for immediate reconsideration of Michigan's 1972 vote for ERA.

"The women of Michigan deserve the most careful and thoughtful consideration of the lawmakers of this state," she said.

ERA requires ratification by 38 states to become part of the U.S. Constitution. Thirty-four states have ratified to date, but Nebraska and Tennessee rescinded their votes in 1973 and 1974.

savings accounts, however, I.R.A.'s offer a range of plans paying annual interest rates from 5-1/2 to 7-1/2 percent and are insured to \$40,000 by the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation. Incidentally, these are the highest interest rates that any bank can pay."

Are there special regulations for I.R.A.'s?

"Yes. Regulations only permit you to save a maximum of \$1,500 a year, or 15% of your annual wages, whichever is less. You can open an Individual Retirement Account with just \$25, then it's up to you when and how much you want to deposit, in amounts of \$25 or more, up to your maximum each year. You can add to your account each payday and when your savings reach \$1,000 or more, you can convert them to 6-year 7-1/2% Investment Certificates; or if you make your annual deposit in one lump sum, you can put it into 6-year 7-1/2% Investment Certificates at that time. The money must remain on deposit at least until you reach age 59-1/2, unless you become permanently disabled.

Should you withdraw prior to that, Federal regulations for Investment Certificates require that you pay substantial penalties on the amount withdrawn, and I.R.A. regulations impose further penalties for premature withdrawals."

Being tax-sheltered, savings in an I.R.A. should accumulate much faster, right?

"Amazingly so. In fact, here is a chart which shows what you could accumulate if you invested \$1,500, before taxes, at the beginning of each year.* The first column shows how your interest accumulates with the help of a tax-sheltered I.R.A., the second shows how your interest accumulates without the help of a tax-sheltered I.R.A. and the third shows the difference."

tarial review course has been updated to include two sessions on data processing.

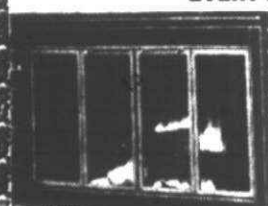

Abolish tax agency, urges Smith

State Rep. Roy Smith (R-Ann Arbor), whose district includes Plymouth, feels the State Tax Commission has failed to do its job and has introduced legislation to abolish the commission.

The tax commission was created to carry out the mandate in the 1963 Constitution requiring uniform tax assessing practices throughout the state, including the provision that all property be assessed at 50 per cent of its true market value.

THE CONSTITUTION mandated the legislature to provide for the uniform general ad valorem taxation of real and tangible personal property not exempt by law.

The constitution further states that the legislature shall provide for the determination of true cash value of such property; the proportion of true cash value at which the property shall be uniformly assessed, which shall not after Jan. 1, 1966 exceed 50 per cent; and provide for a system of equalization of assessments.

With these mandates, explains Smith, the legislature passed a law requiring all property be assessed at 50 per cent of true cash value and created the State Tax Commission to see that this job was done.

NEARLY A DECADE later, with a staff of 106 and a 1975-76 budget of slightly more than \$2 million, Smith stresses, the tax commission still exists and so do unequal assessments throughout the state.

Smith points to examples taken from four counties in Michigan that reflect some of the unconstitutional and non-uniform assessing practices in the state at the present time.

After the equalization factor was applied to the assessments of a local unit of government in Emmet County, for example, commercial property assessments rose to an unconstitutional level of 111.82 per cent of true cash value while agricultural property stood at 33.09 per cent and residential property at 43.42 per cent.

Another unit in Washtenaw County was assessing all classes of property except residential above the 50 per cent level.

The City of Dearborn was found to be assessing residential property at 14.46 per cent while commercial and industrial were assessed at slightly more than 33 per cent.

Smith points to a report of the new Michigan Tax Tribunal which indicates that in 1974 only 725 governmental units out of about 1,477 units were at a level of 50 per cent with an equalization factor of 1.00.

"This kind of evidence shows me that the State Tax Commission hasn't been very successful in carrying out the constitutional and legislative mandate to equalize assessments throughout the state."
