## Kelley to address chamber on land use

Members of the Canton Chamber of Commerce have to be smiling a little bit more these days with word that Attorney General Frank Kelley will be addressing their annual dinner meeting March 25.

Kelley responded to the chamber's request Wednesday morning by phone, agreeing to talk about land use and zoning. "I can't tell you how pleased we are

about his willingness to come down here and talk to us," said chamber president Bart Berg.

"We thought about asking him for several weeks and finally we just decided to get on with it. We didn't really think we registered that high up there, but we certainly are gratified that he will speak."

On March 3, Berg sent the request to Kelley saying, "Of particular concern to our

membership is future land use in the township and we would very much appreciate your talking to our group on the topic of land use in the community."

Berg said the idea was prompted when he read about a speech Kelley had given to a group of planning consultants in Detroit.

"I THINK HIS speech will be very appropriate for what is going on in Canton.

There is a lot of concern about future land use in the township."

Berg said he offered to send a copy of Canton's proposed master land use plan to Kelley, but as yet he said Kelley has not requested it.

"We're expecting formal acceptance of the speaking engagement by mail this week," Berg said, "and perhaps then he will ask for it."

Berg added, however, that he expected Kelley would give a general speech on land use and zoning. "If that is the case, I don't imagine we'll ask specific questions about Canton's proposed plan," Berg explained.

"We expect he will talk about environment and the preservation of natural resources."

The annual meeting will be held at 6:30 p.m. in Vittorio's Restaurant, 33201

Plymouth Road at Farmington in Livonia. Tickets at \$8.50 per person still are available, Berg said.

# Is one mill enough? CAC report says yes

The cost of building and staffing a second fire station in Canton may be cheaper than expected, if a preliminary report by the citizens advisory council (CAC) is found correct.

According to a CAC report released recently, an additional one-mill levy over the next 10 years could be sufficient to staff a second fire station and eventually a third.

The report, compiled by Ron Berglund, vice-president of the Willow Homes Association, makes several assumptions about the expansion of the township tax base based on figures supplied by Canton Treasurer Carl Parsell.

Berglund's figures are based on:

- A five per cent increase in the SEV of the township.
- A constant growth of at least 1,000 new homes per year.
- Average price of new homes will be \$40,000.

With one mill representing one tax dollar collected per \$1,000 of assessed value, Berglund estimated that one mill would

bring in an additional \$196,000 upon collection in 1977.

That figure would increase, he said, based upon his assumptions, to more than \$382,000 in 1985.

**THE FIRST YEAR'S** collections would cover the estimated \$185,000 construction costs of a second station, while in later years, the additional revenue provided by the levy would go to paying for a staff of 12 men in the second station.

According to Berglund's figures, cost of staffing—which he estimates at \$264,000 for the second station—would exceed revenue provided by the extra mill until the fourth year of the levy.

At that time it is estimated the additional mill would generate \$287,000.

Currently, the full cost per man with all benefits averages \$22,000 for the four-year firefighter. Captains, lieutenants and the chief, however, make more—and there is still a new contract to be negotiated. None of the money raised by the addi-

tional mill would go for equipping the second station.

"As the township would have the necessary equipment revenues beginning in 1977, the costs of equipping fire station two and three have been eliminated."

**BERGLUND SAID** that at the end of the seventh year of the millage, the township would have "sufficient funds to build a third station and begin to staff it."

"Starting in the eighth year, we could finance a total of 22 firefighters and without capital expenses from this one mill level."

"Equipment costs, services, etc. have been omitted as it is my belief that related township revenues resulting from these new homes (1,000 per year minimum) can meet those expenses," Berglund continued.

He terms his estimates of increased tax base in the township "conservative" because he makes no provisions for commercial and industrial growth.

He also proposed the township charge one per cent as a collection fee and put that money aside for land acquisition for later station sites.

According to his estimates, after 10 years, the additional collection fee—one per cent of one mill—would raise a total of \$36,000.

Berglund added, "Bearing in mind that the projected 76 revenue will be payable in 1977, we could, nevertheless, have the station well in progress before Jan. 1, 1977 and staffed during 1977."

**"THIS COULD COME** about because our township treasurer, Mr. Parsell, could defer some of the capital account expenditures for 1976 to allow the building of the second fire station as soon as the millage is passed."

Parsell, however, was somewhat unsure of Berglund's calculations.

"His assumptions say go ahead and build, but I am not sure I agree with what he has said. Right now, I'm just not sure."

Parsell added he was uncertain the millage could be sold to the public, even though it is two mills cheaper than proposals that failed in August and November 1974.

"I'd like to wait and see what the fire chiefs say, and I want to wait for the insurance report."

## Township Republicans organizing

"There is a lot of enthusiasm in Canton," Fackler said, "and good government begins at the local level with qualified and concerned people getting involved and working hard."

"With Canton's tremendous recent growth, the potential is extremely high for successful participation by individual residents."

Poole, acting chairman of the group and elected delegate from the fourth precinct, is joined by other precinct delegates on the organizational committee.

They are Louis Stein, former Canton supervisor and presently the elected second precinct delegate; Richard Wolfe, former township trustee and presently elected first precinct delegate; Peter Bundarin

from the third precinct; James Walaskey from the fourth precinct; William Mast, elected delegate from the fifth precinct, and Diane Hamernick from the seventh precinct.

Stein, a lifelong resident of the township, commented, "I am concerned with the apparent increasing lack of interest exhibited

## Open-meeting forum is scheduled by TCP

Residents of Canton and neighboring communities are invited to a forum March 24 on open-meeting legislation, pertaining to governments which conduct "secret, closed-door meetings" to transact public business.

Total Citizens' Power of Canton will conduct the forum which will begin at 8 p.m. Wednesday, March 24, in the cafeteria of Plymouth Canton High.

Discussed will be three bills now before the Michigan Legislature dealing with requirements of governments to conduct their business openly before the public.

Bruce Young and Frank McMurray of TCP urged residents to attend and learn of methods used by governments to conduct public business in secret and what remedies are available.

"Every resident will be given a chance to tell why they object to our governing bodies' performing public transactions be-

hind closed doors, or why they should continue keeping such business secret from the citizens," said Young.

Some of the discussion will center on legislation enacted in Florida—popularly known as the Florida Sunshine Law—which requires any gathering of government officials to be open to the public.

"The citizens want to know not only who office-holders are but, more importantly, what they stand for," added McMurray. "The citizen has a right to know the truths publicly, for there is nothing better to separate myth from truth than beautiful 'sunshine.'"

This will be the second public forum conducted by TCP. The first was held to air the proposed master land-use plan for Canton Township. TCP describes itself as a citizens' lobbying group operating locally in Canton much as Common Cause operates on the state and national levels.

## WSDP will broadcast school board meetings

The first broadcast of a meeting of the Plymouth Board of Education will be aired Monday, March 22, by the student-operated radio station at Plymouth Salem.

Broadcast of the school board meeting will begin at 7:30 p.m. on WSDP-fm, 89.3 on the dial. The station has picked a significant meeting to launch its initial broadcast of board meetings because March 22 is the date the trustees are expected to make a decision on school attendance boundaries for 1976-77.

Thus many residents may want to tune in to hear what decision the board makes, particularly if weather is bad. Or, for those who had trouble hearing at the March 8 public hearing on boundaries when some 200 packed the Plymouth Canton cafeteria, residents may want to attend the meeting with transistors and earphones.

**THE PLYMOUTH** Board of Education is believed to be the first school board in

Wayne County to have its meetings broadcast.

School meetings are broadcast in Warren and Bloomfield, and some commercial stations air school board meetings on-state.

The idea of broadcasting board meetings first came up about two years ago, but received serious thought for the past year. During the past six months, students and station advisors went to the drawing boards to come up with a plan for the remote broadcast of meetings in Plymouth Canton cafeteria from Plymouth Salem High.

When the plan was devised, the station discovered the cost would be quite low. For the first year, the initial cost will be about \$100 with the expense being much cheaper in future years.

The board already has been using microphones tied in with a public address system for its meetings. To broadcast, WSDP purchased a remote "telephone" piece of equipment which will be tied into the present PA system. An engineer in the Salem studio will monitor the sound, make adjustments when necessary, and handle the sign-in, sign-off announcements.

Engineer for the first broadcast will be Gary Sieber. Setting up the equipment in the Plymouth Canton cafeteria will be Mark Sieber and Brian Czaplak—students from Jim Kaiser's electronics classes. The two presently hook up and operate the PA system used for board meetings.

**ON MARCH 22** Gary Sieber will go on the air at 6 p.m. with a music show and will switch to the board meeting as soon as chairman Marda Benson calls the meeting to order.

The meeting will be on the air continuously until adjournment, at which time Sieber will return with music. There aren't

any plans now for any "announcing," analysis or commentary before or after the meetings.

In case meetings run unusually long, the broadcast will end at 11 p.m. Because the station is operated by students, WSDP doesn't broadcast beyond 11 p.m. If there is a recess in the middle of a meeting for any reason, there will be a musical interlude until the trustees are ready to resume.

"We plan to let the meeting speak for itself," says Jeff Cardinal, coordinator of WSDP. "We have no plans for announcers now. And there won't be any commentary after the meeting is over."

Cardinal said the station would like to broadcast meetings of other governmental units in the future which might be holding a meeting at either high school of interest to the community. "If the governmental unit gives permission, if there is enough interest from the public, and if the meeting is held at the Centennial Educational Park, WSDP will certainly consider broadcasting it. We would appreciate any suggestions from the public on what we could broadcast for them as a community service."

**JOHN SEIDELMAN**, general manager and advisor of WSDP, stresses that the broadcast is being done to meet the station's aim of serving the public interest.

"Although it is sometimes difficult to know for sure what the public wants, this is something we hope the community wants and something that will be of service."

Cardinal said he doesn't expect that broadcasting will have any immediate effect on the meetings themselves. Those stations who do broadcast meetings, he adds, have found that as more listeners become aware and tune in, the board members are

# Associations honor Selle

Jack Selle, the Buick dealer who played a leading role in pioneering the business section of Ann Arbor Road, has climbed another important notch in the auto industry.

He recently has been named to the board of directors of the Detroit Auto Dealers Association. And at the same time he was given the added honor of a place on the board of the Michigan auto dealers.

While being named to both positions was not a precedent, it has happened very seldom and gives Selle an important place in the association doings in all parts of the state.

Serving on the board of a dealers association is nothing new for Jack, who likes to get away every now and then to hunt wild game in Africa.

Through the years he has held every office in the Buick Dealers Association and served a three-year term as president. In his new role with the Detroit dealers

he will take an active part in staging the annual Detroit Auto Show, now ranked among the best in the world.

"The show this year broke a record for attendance, and it made me feel good," he confided, "as it was my first venture into this side of the Detroit activity."

AS HE SAT IN his nicely furnished office with photos of his wild game ventures on the wall, Selle recalled his start, and claimed he just couldn't believe that 23 years have passed since he began.

In the early 50s, he ventured into the auto collision business and spent most of his time supervising the rehabilitation of wrecked cars.

"I was doing fine," he recalled, "but I heard that Carl Shear, one of the pioneer auto dealers in Plymouth, was willing to sell his dealership on Starkweather."

"I contacted him and made the deal, and I was then in the auto dealership in a big way."

Eager to make a good showing, he built a new building on Ann Arbor Road.

Looking out of the window of his showroom, Jack recalled that there was little activity on the road at that time, and many thought it was a gamble. But, with a smile, he admitted that he has prospered.

Several years ago, his establishment was struck by fire. But he never lost a 'lav's business.

WITH THE SAME determination that guided his hunting career from shooting ducks on Saginaw Bay to the wilds of mid-Africa, he rebuilt and took a more active interest in the association work.

As he looked back over his years in business, one of the most humorous incidents of his sales career came to mind.

One morning, he recalled, a tall man walked into the show room and said he was interested in a "two-and-a-quarter with ice." At first, neither Jack nor his salesmen realized what the potential customer wanted.

## West bands to hold 24-hour 'Playathon'

All band and orchestra students and teachers at West Middle School will be involved in a 24-hour continuous session of performing and rehearsing music on Friday, March 19.

The "Playathon" will begin at 4 p.m. Friday and end at 4 p.m. Saturday, March 20. Each of the West Middle School performing groups will rehearse and perform on a rotating schedule with each student involved for a total of about four hours.

Each student is obtaining sponsors to pledge 10 cents per hour, or a possible \$2.40 total contribution if the Playathon runs the full 24 hours.

The sponsors are required to attend the Playathon session sometime during the 24 hours to help provide an audience for the performers.

Continuous music will be provided with time allotted for changing of the groups. There are seven large musical groups at West and numerous smaller string, wind and percussion ensembles.

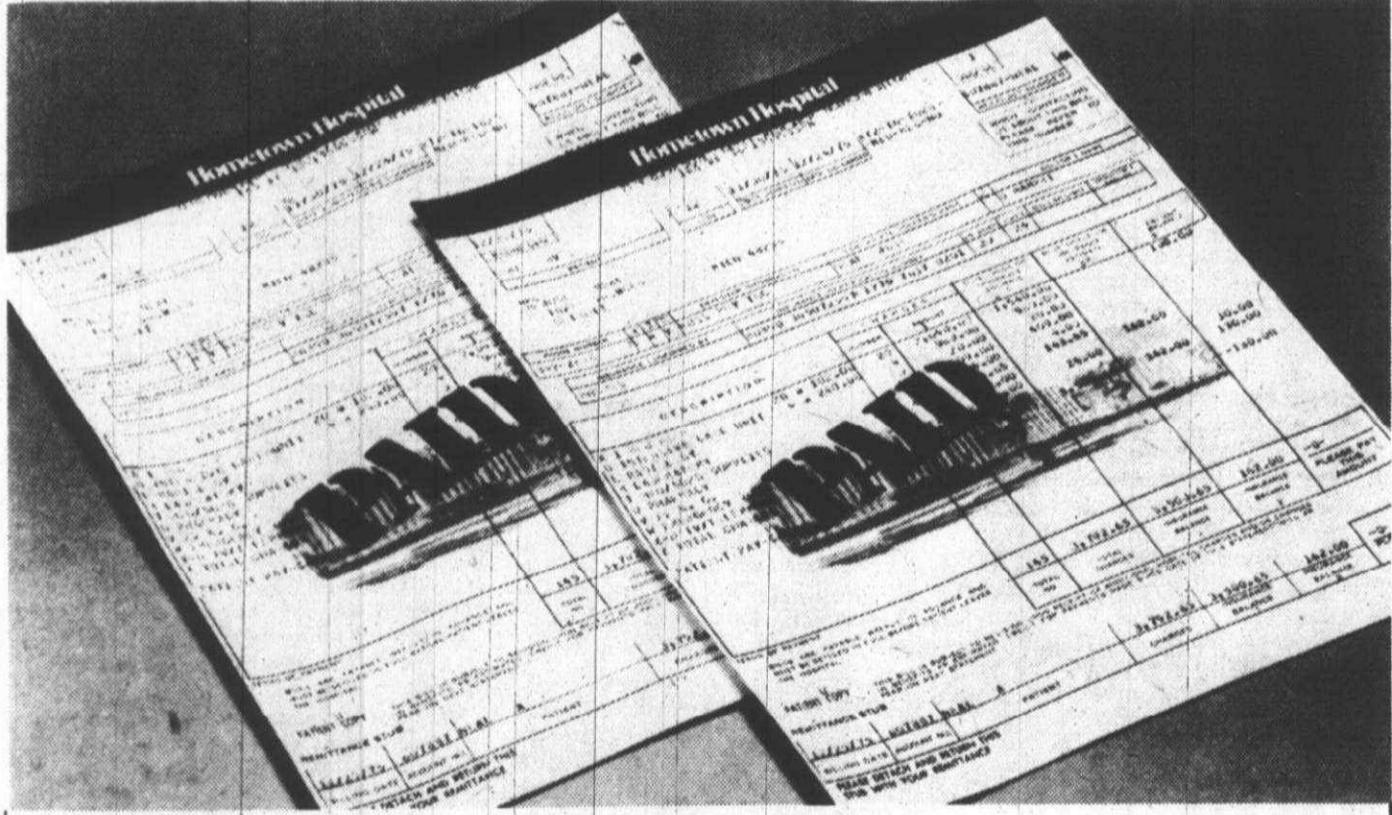
THE PROPOSED schedule for groups to perform is:

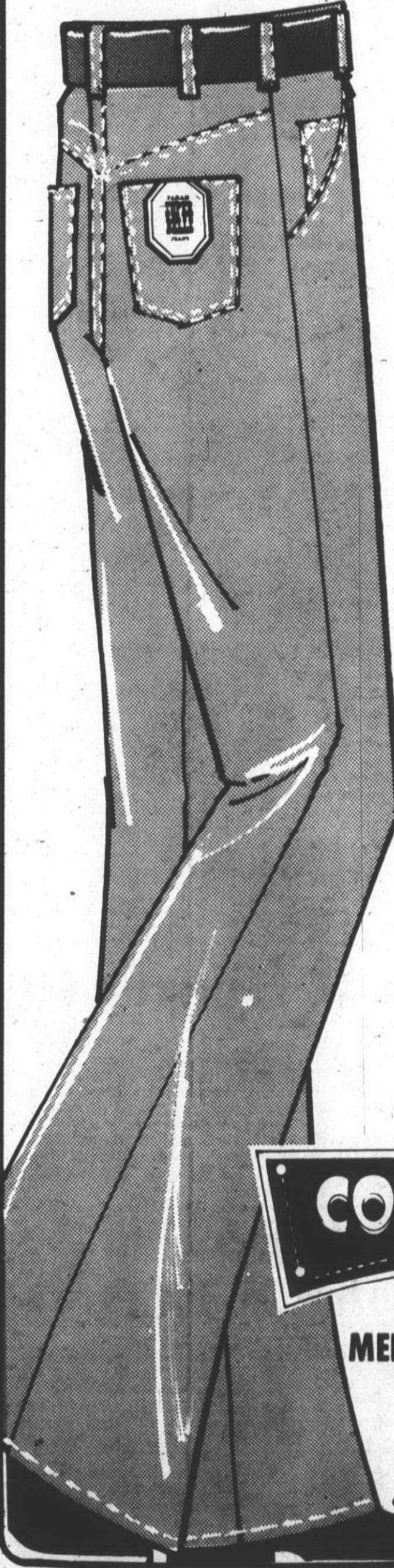

# Informational packets spark hot debate

Packets with supportive information on agenda items before the township board will soon be available for Canton residents at the township firehall and the township business offices.

On Tuesday night, by a vote of 4-2 with Clerk John Flodin and Supervisor Robert Greenstein dissenting, the board approved a motion to supply one packet to each location. Treasurer Carl Parsell was absent.

Although the resolution to supply a packet to each location was approved, the extent and content of the packets will be determined at the next regularly scheduled board meeting March 23.

Flodin approached the topic, noting he had received a request from Total Citizen's Power (TCP) for a packet. He asked the board for a policy decision on the matter which, in turn, sparked lengthy and heated debate.

"AS FAR AS I am concerned, this topic is resolved," said Supervisor Robert Green-

stein. "We have told them 334 times that we don't intend to give them a packet or we'll have every group in the township asking for one."

Trustee Bob Myers responded that while no group should be granted special consideration, the public does have a right to see what is in the packets the board members receive.

"The citizens have a right to know, and I suggest we place a packet at the township offices and the firehall."

Trustee Brian Schwall added, "It's a valid suggestion, and I don't think it's asking too much."

Greenstein said he wanted to know what a packet entailed. "Is it going to be the same packet we get with all the maps, or will there be exceptions?"

"If we give them an incomplete packet, TCP will be yelling and screaming that we didn't give them something, and we can't Xerox the maps we get."

Myers said all items relevant to the

agenda should be included in the packet, adding, "If it takes too much time, I will be glad to Xerox my stuff at the township offices."

Schwall said he would leave any maps or site plans received in his packet at the township meeting hall for the public to see.

**FLODIN COMMENTED.** "I brought this item up for your attention, and I think in view of the controversy and the hour we should consider it at a later date. There are some serious questions about what should be included in a packet."

Trustee Gerald Cheske agreed with Flodin. "The burden is on John to prepare

these packets, and if John's sentiment is to wait on this, I think it's fair."

Cheske moved to table the matter, but with Trustees Jim Poole, Myers and Schwall voting against it, the motion failed.

Schwall suggested the board approve supplying the packets at both locations but wait until the following week to decide what would be in the packets.

"Those who are against it will be against it in two weeks, so we might as well resolve it now," Greenstein responded.

"But, I'll tell you, TCP at no time has asked me to see my packet, and they've

never been told, by me they couldn't see it."

As TCP member Bruce Young began to reply, Greenstein cut him off telling him he was out of order.

Schwall said, "You can't attack someone and then not let him respond."

Myers added, "I think the people have a right to know what their elected officials are doing."

Greenstein replied, "This is all baloney! It's a bunch of political maneuvering by a political group."

Schwall replied, "No, it's a monologue. You can't attack people like that and then tell them they can't respond. Once again

you have reverted to imputing motives. This is not political—it's being politically responsible."

"The people have a right to know what we are doing," Myers said, "and since you are always talking about being innovative—there's nothing more innovative than meeting the desires of the people."

Greenstein said the matter would be handled better if it were put before the whole board.

Schwall, referring to Parsell's absence, said, "All you want is your fourth vote."

Following the vote to approve supplying a packet to each location, the board agreed to determine the contents of the packet at the next meeting.

## Aid on the way for W-W facility?

Wayne-Westland school officials are hoping their "major legislative victory" will result in a major vocational education facility for the district.

Supt. Timothy Dyer Monday announced the district's ability to convince legislators to pass a vocational education bill favorable to smaller school districts like Wayne-Westland.

"At the present time, there is a law in which the state provides funding for 50 percent of a vocational facility and 100 percent of vocational education equipment for districts with an enrollment of 30,000 or more," Dyer said.

"Right now, that applies to only four school districts—Detroit, Flint, Grand Rapids and Livonia.

"We've managed to convince legislators to roll back the attendance requirements to 18,000 students. This bill has passed both the Senate and House, and we are waiting for it to be delivered to the governor for his signature."

**DYER SAID** he hoped to travel to Lansing to meet with Milliken to help secure the governor's approval.

"The Department of Education had opposed this bill, but we overcame them. Now we need to have the governor on our side."

At least three school districts would qualify for state-funded vocational education if the bill is signed into law. Along with Wayne-Westland, Taylor and Ann Arbor would qualify.

**A MILLIKEN SIGNATURE** would change the district's outlook for a third try at a bond issue election.

"We would reduce our bond issue if we decide to go for it," Dyer told the W-W Board of Education.

Following the district's second bond elec-

tion loss in December, school officials spoke of a third try. The news of the vocational education legislation follows on the heels of the district's biggest millage election victory last Monday, when voters overwhelmingly granted a 21-mill renewal.

But Dyer was cautious in predicting any bond election plans.

"I would think that we might have a firm proposal within three weeks," Dyer said after the meeting. "Right now we don't want to piggy-back any of the elections that are coming up."

He referred to the amount of time law requires voting machines to go unused before and after an election.

**IN RELATION TO** Dyer's announcement, Trustee Fred Warmbier questioned whether suburban districts were victims of reverse discrimination as a result of the state's agreeing to fund portions of four new vocational education centers to be built in Detroit in accordance with Federal Judge Robert DeMascio's desegregation order.

"They're giving vocational education to Detroit. That's something that we'd like to have," Warmbier said.

While Dyer said he was not sure how the state funding was arranged with Detroit, he said Wayne-Westland wouldn't be affected.

"Discriminatory' is perhaps too strong a word," Dyer said. "The key word is 'discretionary' as with the state aid cutbacks. The legislature has discretionary authority to make such cuts."

"And it's been that way for years. At the most, this former vocational education bill benefitted four districts."

"If Milliken signs the new bill, at the most 10 will qualify. Even that bill is discretionary."

"In this case we would be in a favored group. And it's our job to get in as many favored groups as possible."

## He's Rev. C. Ronald Phelps

# 35th District Court has new probation director

When the Reverend C. Ronald Phelps of Plymouth became the director of the 35th District Court's Department of Probation on March 1 of this year, it marked the meeting of two lines which had been running parallel for many years.

Rev. Phelps' history of working with troubled people is a long one. He brought his family to Plymouth in the fall of 1964 from a training position with the Federal Bureau of Prisons in Fort Worth, Texas.

He spent almost two years as a chaplain at the now closed Wayne County Child Development Center before moving on to the Allen Park Veterans Administration Hospital where he has been the Presbyterian chaplain since July 1966.

Chaplain Phelps' association with the probation department began in the summer of 1968 when he served, with Judge Dunbar Davis and Lt. Rodney Cannon (then the juvenile officer) on a committee which explored the possibility of instituting a citizen participation probation system in Plymouth.

And though the system was an attractive prospect from the beginning, Rev. Phelps was pulled away from the project by a personal project which also arose at that time. He and his family moved from Ross Street to their present home at 4645 W. Ann Arbor Trail.

**THE TWO PROJECTS** added up to too many demands on a man who was already working a long-houred job in a distant city. Thus, Rev. Phelps faded out of the probation picture for the time being.

However, eight years later, another residential move brought him right back in. When Ken Jacobs, director of probation since September 1973, moved to Howell, the strain of long distance commuting, added to his ever-increasing duties as assistant principal at Plymouth Canton High School, required that he resign his probationary post.

To fill the vacancy, Judge Davis said he sought a man who, among his other qualifications, "could be firm but sensitive."

He had to look no further than the borders of his memory to find such a man. And this time Rev. Phelps was settled enough to take on another project. But just how demanding the job will be remains to be seen.

"They told me it would take about five hours a week," Rev. Phelps said. Then, waiting until his wife, Audrey was out of hearing range, he added, "but it looks to me like it'll probably be closer to 10."

If Mrs. Phelps received such information

with a heavy sigh it would be understandable. For her husband is a man who is constantly giving of himself and his time. He is a man who, while holding a job with never-ending hours and serving as a volunteer fireman, takes on another job which can only promise more demands on his time and energy.

"I see my role as one of an overseer and coordinator," Rev. Phelps said of his new duties. "I'm responsible for reviewing all the pre-sentence recommendations, probation violations, investigations and expenditures and for supervising all the various probationary functions."

**ANOTHER OF** Rev. Phelps' directorial duties will be to select the volunteer probation officers. He said he will be looking

for people who "can make commitments and keep them, be firm but warm" and "have a good sense of personal identity."

Commenting on sponsor/probationer activities, Rev. Phelps said, "The object is to do what's best for the probationer. Most people who get into trouble have either been deprived of or have suffered breakdowns in their inter-personal relationships."

"The sponsor can help them by offering them a solid relationship, based on trust and respect. The means to this end can be as varied as going to a ball game or working on some community project."

As for initiating any major changes in the system, Rev. Phelps has no such plans. "The program is running so well now, I'd just like to see it continue that way."

# Our Schools Today


(The following column is written by Florence Beier, administrative assistant for community relations of the Plymouth Community School District. Anyone with questions for the column may call her at 453-0200.)  
 What is the purpose of school? How we answer that question makes a big difference in what happens in the Plymouth Community School District.  
 In "Our Schools Today" early in Febru-

ary we asked that question, giving readers an opportunity to send in their answers.  
 The newspaper quiz wasn't aimed at finding out what a cross-section of the community thought about schools, for very few people feel motivated enough to mark up a newspaper and mail it.  
 Although the questions were designed more as thought-starters than research, the responses which came back to this office were informative. Thirteen clippings

were returned, almost all with comments. Three letters were included.  
**THE READERS** tended to fall into two groups, about evenly divided. Because many questions could have more than one answer marked, there is really no way to give a number of answers or "count votes."  
 One group of respondents emphasized the purpose of school as providing saleable skills. They wanted high standards in reading and writing, with those who fail having to repeat grades. They would have required classes in U.S. government and history, regular recitation of the Pledge of Allegiance, strict discipline and competition. These people mostly thought school is primarily for acquiring knowledge.  
 Others like the idea of individualized progress, with each student working at his own speed and rated on his own achievement. They preferred democratic organiza-

tion of each school with a student voice in decisions. They thought students should be given the opportunity to develop their own system of values. These respondents usually thought that school should be worthwhile in itself and as pleasant as possible.  
 There were many views on community involvement in schools. These answers did not line up with either the competition-discipline or the individualization groups. Most people answered either "The more parent and volunteer involvement the better" or "Decisions should always include committees and groups like the PTO."  
**WITHOUT REPRINTING** the entire multiple choice quiz, it is impossible to go into more detail on summarizing the responses. Anyone who would like to look at the answers or have a copy of the quiz may do so by seeing Florence Beier at 454 S. Harvey, any week day between 8 a.m. and 5 p.m.  
 Some of the comments were:  
 "There may come a time when you can't tell education from living." Amen!  
 Kids have to learn right from the start to try to do better than the next person. Institute spelling bees, essay contests etc.  
 The schools' responsibility is merely to introduce students to various vocations.  
 You do us, the community, a valuable service when you ask us to voice our feelings and wishes on specific issues.

## W-W looks at safety

A Farmington School District tragedy in which a 13-year-old student was electrocuted while using a defective buffing machine in shop class, has prompted Wayne-Westland school officials to reevaluate "safety in the schools."  
 The faulty buffer was one of many defective pieces of equipment found in the Farmington district, where the Michigan Department of Labor uncovered 25 state code violations and fined the district \$558 in civil penalties.  
 According to various Wayne-Westland school officials, there has always been precautionary safety measures in the schools, but the Farmington incident "triggered some action to conduct extra inspections of our own," said John Harrison, principal of John Glenn High School.  
 According to Tom Blacklock, deputy su-


perintendent for operations in Wayne-Westland schools, an annual check-list inspection is conducted by the building principals and head custodians before every new school year.

"WE CONDUCT OUR inspections along the lines of MIOSHA (Michigan Occupational Safety and Health Act) and have periodic inspections by the fire marshal, the Michigan Health Department and the Department of Education," said Blacklock.  
 He explained that whenever any new construction projects are proposed, they must be submitted for approval through various regional agencies such as the Michigan Department of Health Education and Welfare.

"There is a checks and balance system along the state level," said Blacklock. "where the state acts as the checker, after certified architects review any proposed construction for the buildings."  
**WAYNE-WESTLAND** vocational education supervisor, Bill Murphy, hopes that district officials are not reacting to the Farmington incident in such a way that they become concerned for a while and then forget about safety measures within the schools.  
 "Safety is an ongoing program, rather than something to just react to," said Murphy. "It's something too many people tolerate without backing it up with some action."  
 Murphy added that this year's contract provided for a lower number of students in each vocational education class, which would allow a "workable" number of students in class receiving the proper instruction, without an overload on the teacher.  
 "The instructors teach safety along with the general procedures of making bookshelves," Murphy said. "It's the principal's and the instructor's primary responsibility to check the equipment in the classroom making sure everything is in proper working order."  
**SPOT CHECKS** throughout the year are made in the Wayne-Westland schools, checking everything from the sewing machines in the home-economics classes to the soldering irons in the art classes. If any of the equipment proves faulty or does

not meet underwriter's requirements, they are immediately repaired or put out of order until safe enough to use even by the experts, Murphy said.  
 The type of accident that cannot be avoided no matter how stringent the safety rules, are the freak accidents that happen about once in everyone's lifetime, Murphy added.  
 "We had a case where a boy was hammering a nail and the tip of the nail flew off and hit him in the eye," said Murphy. "That is really the type of accident that can't be prevented no matter how safe you are."  
 Safety glasses and hard hats are required of the students in the vocational construction projects—on the field training—but as Murphy said, sometimes preventing one accident can cause another.  
 "In the case of safety glasses, they have a side shield which cuts down the ability to see to the side," said Murphy.

**BECAUSE MIOSHA** and OSHA (federal Occupational Safety and Health Act) are primarily concerned with the employees, Harrison held a John Glenn staff meeting where he invited the district's assistant personnel director, who is a former practicing attorney, to speak on the problem of liability within the classroom.  
 "I wanted our teachers to be aware of the safety procedure they should enforce in the classroom and their end of the responsibilities," said Harrison.  
 After the Farmington accident, the assistant principal, the head custodian and the shop teachers of John Glenn conducted in "intense" inspection of the shop and metal class equipment.  
 "I think we have gone above and beyond our call of duty to make sure that our electrical power is properly turned off in places where there is no need for it," said Harrison.

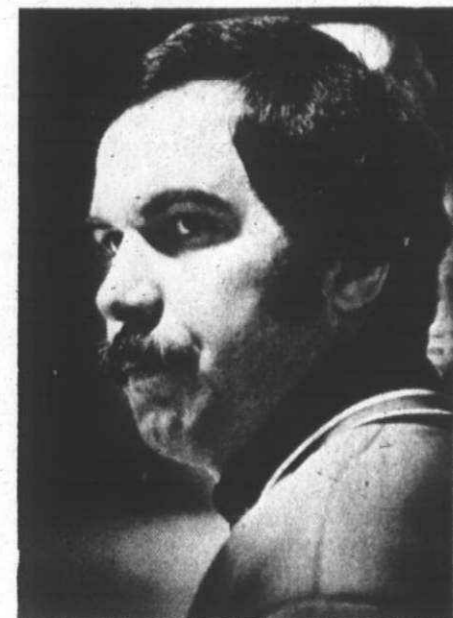

# Girls exhibit hockey prowess

The puck is dropped and the two teams go at each other, skating, passing, checking, shooting and scoring. There wouldn't seem to be anything unusual, except in this case, the protagonists are young ladies.

Sugar and spice and everything nice? "They're slower than boys, generally speaking, but they're just as rough in terms of checking," said Cal Strom, general manager of the Livonia All-Stars.

The girls, ranging in age from eight to 13, recently concluded their inaugural season in the girls' Inter-City Hockey League. The All-Stars played better than 500 hockey while competing against established teams from Garden City, Plymouth and downriver communities.

The All-Stars' story began late last summer, when Livonia's Junior B team phased out. The boys' hard luck turned out to be the girls' biggest break.

"We found out that Livonia girls were playing for other cities," explained Strom. "A couple of us parents talked about starting our own team, but due to the extensive boys' program, we couldn't get ice time."

"When the Junior B team folded," Strom continued, "we decided that maybe it was time to approach the Livonia Parks

and Recreation Department and the Livonia Hockey Association for sponsorship.

The recreation department finally heard our call and agreed to give us what backing they could and ice time that was available. We started recruiting in August and early September, and by late September, we were on the ice."

Many prospective pucksters answered the tryout call, and after several had dropped out for a variety of reasons, 16 girls crystallized to form the team.

Why would a young girl even want to play the rough game of hockey in the first place? After all, isn't figure skating more glamorous as evidenced by recent competition at the olympic games?

"Our girls figured it (hockey) was a good means of exercise and sport," responded Strom. "They're interested in skating and conditioning."

"We want to have fun," coach Chuck Sirola stated, "but the league we're in is quite competitive, so it's not too much different than boys' hockey. It's surprisingly rough."

Jesse Miller, at eight years old the youngest member of the team, explained that she acquired her interest in hockey

from older brothers. That pattern holds true for many of the All-Stars.

Jesse suggested that she most enjoys the competitive aspect of the sport. "I like to play and I like it when we score a lot," she stated.

Since the recently-concluded campaign was the first for many of the girls in organized hockey, Sirola said he emphasized fundamentals during workouts. "He concentrated on skating, body checking, shooting and positioning," the coach said.

"Our biggest problem was balance—blending together girls of different ages."

"Some girls had a lack of confidence in their own skating abilities when we started," Strom stated. "Now, they're all capable skaters."

Sirola, who had previous experience coaching boys' hockey clubs, said he actually enjoys working with the All-Stars more than with the guys. "Not everybody has a girls' team," he said. "Besides, the girls are cuter," he laughingly added.

"Seriously, the girls are still learning and they're not afraid to ask questions. This particular group seems outspoken. They're not embarrassed or afraid to ask questions like a boy may be."

A highlight of the All-Stars' season was

a weekend trip to Missauga, Ont., where the girls stayed at the homes of their hosts.

Sirola said that several girls on the team developed outstanding individual skills over the past campaign. "Carrie Sirola was our leading scorer, averaging about two goals a game," the coach, modestly stated.

"Karen Spindler was our second leading scorer and we had a super goalie in Judy Amster. She would rank with most boys her age. She had several shutouts."

"Our older girls did a tremendous job on defense," Sirola added. "Shiela Horgan was outstanding and Marge Strom would run into a brick wall if it would save a goal."

The All-Stars' coach also said that parental support was a big factor in the team's success this year. "They were as much so or more involved than those with boys teams," Sirola stated.

# Loop championships highlight cage campaign

The 1975-76 basketball season crept up on almost everyone with an early start last Nov. 28, and with teams falling by the wayside in the one-loss tournament elimination, the campaign closed for most with equal suddenness.

Four quintets—Garden City West, Plymouth Salem, Livonia Churchill and Livonia Franklin—won outright conference championships, while Livonia Stevenson finished second in its league.

1975-76 was the year of the big shooter, with West's Dave Niles, a 6-4 guard tearing up the Tri-River League and Jim Ellinghausen, Salem's pivot, wrecking havoc in the Suburban Eight loop. Garden City East's Greg Emery performed in a similar vein in Northwest Suburban competition.

Both Niles and Ellinghausen established new career scoring records at their respective schools during the year.

The recently-concluded campaign also had its share of teams which showed a more balanced attack. The Churchill frontline trio of Tom Bay, Dave Clare and Matt Foster is illustrative.

So, too, is the Stevenson threesome of Dave Haberman, Ron Colone and Rob Rose.

Garden City West, paced by Niles and center Mike Susko, was the only area squad to complete its season with a perfect 20-0 record. Although the Tri-River League was not as strong as it has been in previous years, the Tigers proved they had the mettle of any metro squad by disposing of all their scheduled opponents.

Supporting the two big guns of Chris Babler's crew were Tom Poole, Terry Bradley and Jeff Summers.

Plymouth Salem had everything a state-ranked team should possess—speed, height, team play and the ability to put the ball in the basket.

Fred Thomann's troops overcame every obstacle on their schedule except one, suf-

fering a six-point loss to Belleville. Nevertheless, the Rocks, spearheaded by Brian Wolcott, Mike Primeau, Ellinghausen and others, captured their third straight league championship with a 13-1 mark.

Livonia Franklin showed one of the most amazing turnabouts in recent memory during its campaign. After dropping all five of their games before the holiday break, the Patriots came out like storm troopers, winning 13 of their last 15 regular season contests including a streak of eight in a row.

Dennis Wesley, Sam Williams and Dan Pederson led Franklin to an impressive Northwest Suburban title by a two-game margin over runner-up North Farmington.

"I'm proud of this team, and they should be proud of themselves," stated coach Robert Visser.

The turning point in Livonia Churchill's season, a championship effort in the Western Six League, was the Chargers' ability to weather a consecutive seven-game road swing after the tough Salem Christmas Tournament.

Coach Pat Montagano's charges won five of the seven, including a six-point verdict over Farmington Harrison, to pick up steam for the title run. Churchill later bested Harrison at home to insure league laurels.

The Chargers were able to win on their speed and inside shooting. Churchill made a complete turnaround this year after finishing in the conference cellar last season.

Livonia Stevenson, after putting up a good fight against Salem in the Christmas Tournament, lost only three contests the rest of the regular season—two to Pontiac Northern, and a double-overtime thriller to Franklin.

The Spartans finished behind Northern for second-spot honors in the Inter-Lakes League, and with several starters returning next year, figure to make a run for the championship once again.

Redford Bishop Borgess and Livonia Clarendeville were teams which struggled over much of the season but finished with a flourish.

Borgess, with a coaching change in early February, won four of its last five regular season games and came within a pair of dumping Ferndale in the district tournament.

The Spartans will lose only one starter to graduation, Garry Mulka, but his loss will be a big one since he quarterbacked the offense. Those expected to return and who sparked Borgess this year are Dave Priebe and Dave and Dan DeCoster.

Robert Wolf's Clarendeville contingent, spearheaded by senior George Scholes and sophomore Bill Peterson, roared to victory in its last four regular-season games, ousted Detroit Holy Redeemer from the

tourney and lost to sixth-ranked Detroit Lutheran West by two points.

The key to the Trojans' late-season success was their ability to jump out to big first-quarter leads.

Garden City East, with a 12-8 record, was an in and out team much of the year. With Ken Tomaszewski out with injuries and illness much of the first-half of the schedule, the Panthers' offensive punch was provided by Emery and Jim Riley.

A look at East's losing margins over the year—six points, four, five, two, three, eight, seven and 11—illustrates that Billy Joe Young's Panthers' were never really blown off the court.

Redford Union and Livonia Bentley butted heads with the powers of the Suburban Eight League, and while the Panthers had some success, the Bulldogs ran into a peck of trouble.

RU, paced by Tom Sweeney and Steve Schultz, placed behind league powers Salem, Belleville and Trenton, while Larry Jackson's cagers, led by Clay Carlson, Craig Fuelling and Jim Rhodes, tied with Allen Park for last place.

Redford Thurston and Westland John Glenn, a pair of Northwest Suburban rivals, showed a lot of spirit but not many victories over the 1975-76 campaign.

However, the foes did generate one of the area's best battles back on Jan. 30, when the Eagles took a 58-54 decision in a game that went three overtimes.

Thurston standouts included Randy Rodriguez, Dave Beebe and Brian Garber. The Rockets, beset by injuries and the flu over their last several outings, dropped their final seven games in succession. Glenn sparkplugs included Dan Diadiun, Todd Deluca and George Roberts.

Redford St. Agatha, after losing its first 11 games, won three of the last five to show some promise of better things to come next season.

Steve Clor and Steve Peck were the Aggies' leaders during what coach Harvey Heitman described as a rebuilding campaign.

And each evening, as he sits there, The Stroller keeps hoping that he will be shown some scenes out of the past, especially about how our people lived back then.

He isn't anxious to have the present generation know of the hardships, the life in log cabins and the like, when all the foods and harvests were placed in a common storehouse and only those who put something in were allowed to take anything out.

The Stroller would be delighted and he hopes the younger generation would be, too, if only they could see the old-time apothecary with its bottles of red and blue

water, the tell-tale symbols of the business.

He would also like to see the old-time organ grinder with the weather beaten face and the ever present monkey passing his cup, helping the grinder eke out a living.

And how do you suppose the present generation would feel about seeing an old-time shoe shine boy at the main corner hawking his wares?

ANOTHER SCENE that would portray life in our country only a half century ago, would be the never to be forgotten "hucksters" who used to roam up and down the streets of the small towns selling vegetables fresh from the farm.

These are just a few of the things that would prove interesting in pointing out how it was even less than 200 years ago.

The Stroller always has had a warm place in his heart for the old time apothecary and for a good reason. It was there in our little town that the only soda fountain was located.

This was an unusual type of fountain in that it had a big glass bubble on the top with a continuous spray of water cascading over a small statue. The sodas were made without ice cream. They used cream and "soda" water.

Inasmuch as the famed "blue laws" were in effect in Pennsylvania, the apothecary was one of the few places allowed to do business on Sundays. It became a tradition to attend church on Sunday evening and then take your "date" on a walk down the main street to the apothecary for a soda. The memory of those trips and the sodas always will remain green.

It was much the same with the shoe shine boy. It was a tradition when a fellow

was going on a date, to visit the shoe shine boy and have his foot gear polished, just to help make an impression.

TODAY THE SHOE shine boy is almost a vanished breed. They are found occasionally in barber shops and in the men's rooms of the major hotels.

Anyone who ever lived in a small town before the days of the chain stores and super markets, will always remember the "hucksters" who made the rounds once or twice each week selling fresh farm vegetables. Some of the more energetic also sold live chickens.

Each of them had his own way of attracting attention. The chant of the old fellow who travelled our town with his team of horses was one of the most colorful.

In season you could hear him a block away shouting, "raspberries, raspberries for pie." On special days, particularly on Fridays, when folks shopped for their Sunday dinner, you could hear him shouting, "chickens and chickens' husbands" (meaning roosters).

That's what it was like when the Stroller was growing up.

As he strolls along now visiting historical museums and the like he keeps looking for the red and blue water bottles of the old apothecary and the old time soda fountain. But his hunt is in vain. That's why he would enjoy seeing some of those scenes portrayed again in the bicentennial year.

Then the celebrities could show us and say, "That's the way it was."



### Stempien runs for Congress

Marvin Stempien, former six-year state legislator, is on the verge of becoming a candidate for the Second Congressional District open seat to be vacated by Rep. Marvin Esch, Republican Senate candidate.

The bill, HB6057, states if the assessment of a county is determined to be more or less than the true cash value of the county and is then equalized by the board, then that county cannot be reviewed again until all other counties in the state are reviewed.

**Michigan auto survey predicts normalcy**

Twice as many Michigan drivers should buy 1976 model cars as compared with the previous model year, and most motorists dislike the clean air and safety measures proposed by government agencies and consumer advocates, according to Automobile Club of Michigan's latest membership survey.

Twenty per cent of the 7,000 persons who responded to a questionnaire published last November said they will buy a 1976 car. Seven per cent were undecided, indicating a "return to normalcy" in new car showrooms.

Results of the survey were published in the February Motor News magazine in an article entitled "Members Speak Out." A similar survey was made last year and only 10 per cent of the respondents at that time said they would buy a new car.

with those over 64 least likely, survey results indicate.

Forty-five per cent of all those responding said they would buy a car smaller than the one they now own because of the energy shortage.

However, the full-size car era is far from over since 51 per cent of the 30- to 49-year-old respondents said they did not want a smaller car. And 53 per cent of those 19 to 22 years old said their next car would not be smaller.

The article states, "Motorists do not think that Washington, Lansing or Ralph Nader know better than the auto companies what should be built into cars."

THREE OF FOUR respondents want the Clean Air Act's emission standards for autos frozen for five years, and some indicated that they would like those standards frozen permanently.

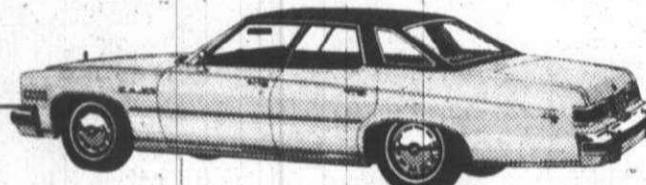

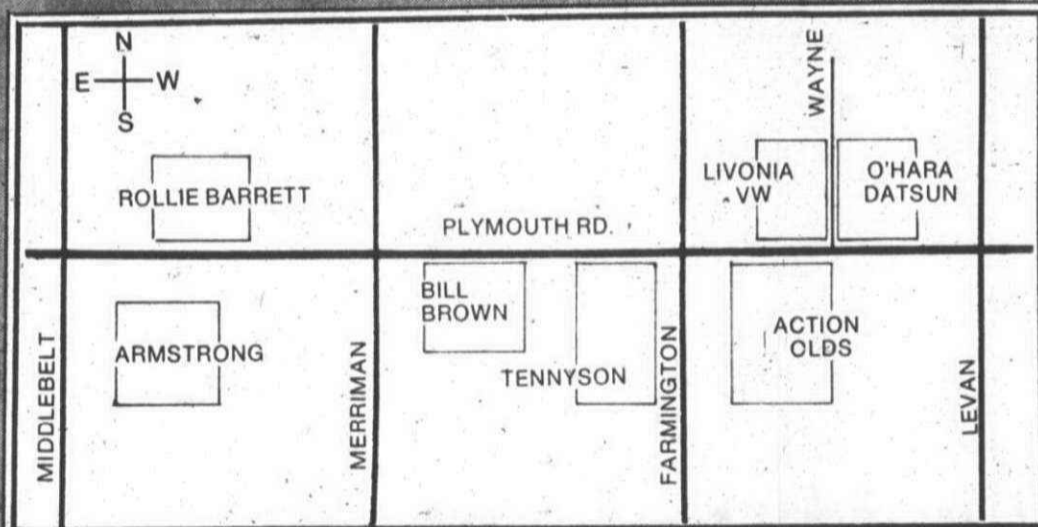

# These dogs yield fine wool

Bob and Frances Cook of Essex County, England timed their first visit to the United States so they could take in the dog show at Cobo Hall. They are staying in Plymouth with their old friends, Trevor and Betty Norton.

Although they will go to Greenfield Village and Niagara Falls, they admit the dog show was at the top of their list of attractions.

The Cooks were particularly interested in one breed of dog, the Pyreneese, as they

are called here, or the Pyrenean Mountain dogs, as they are known in Europe.

Cook said the American breed is smaller than the 195-pound bouncers at home. They have seven of them, including the grand champion of Great Britain. They also have three Labradors which are familiar to television viewers in the United Kingdom.

Cook and his Labs appear on nationwide TV while he extolls the virtues of Pedigree Chum pet foods, the leading dog food over there. "It's made by an American company," Cook added.

THE PYRENEAN Mountain dogs shed once a year and they are carefully combed. The Cooks discovered an old lady on the Isle of Wight who spins and weaves the wool into fabric.

Frances Cook's white suit which is made from the fabric is as soft, and warm, as mink.

How much does it cost to keep three Labradors and seven Pyreneans? Bob Cook says about 90 British pounds a week pays for food and kennel care.

"That would be \$180 a week in American money," he explained.

He said the American breeders hope increase the size of the breed over here.

"I was offered \$700 for one of my pups by one of the breeders I met at the show," he said. "That is too high; I wouldn't ask that much."

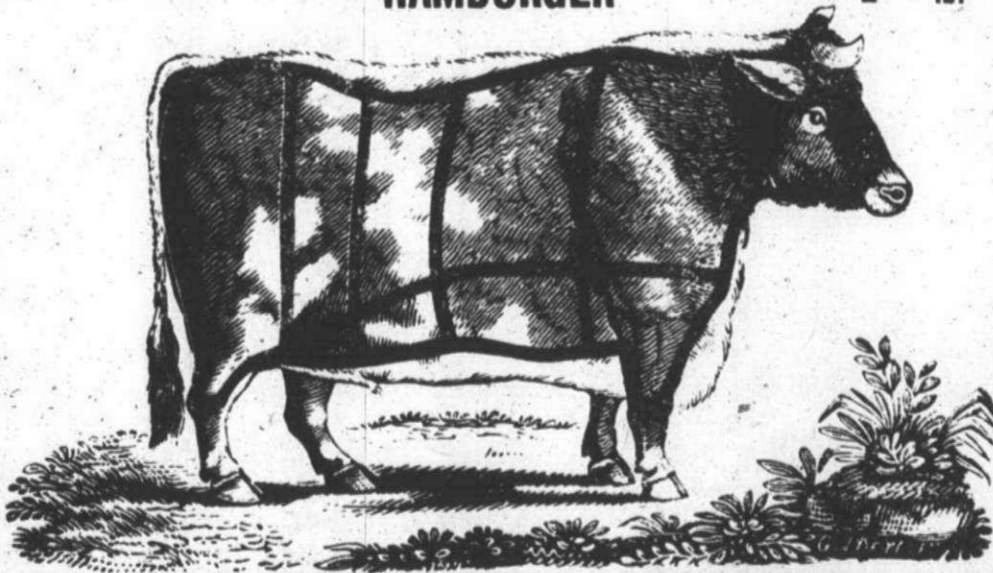

OWNERS and staff of the store, located at 33221 Plymouth, will go to their neighbor in the Sheldon Center, Vittorio's Restaurant, for the parade of spring outfits scheduled at 7:30 p.m. Thursday and 2 p.m. Saturday.

Proceeds from the \$2 tickets they sell for the shows will be donated to the Cystic Fibrosis Foundation for research.

The show, titled "Create-a-Style '76," is really a pulling together of a project that's been an annual one in the store that sells fabrics and patterns and teaches a patented dressmaking process.

"OUR GIRLS make all these lovely outfits every spring," said Mrs. Anne Berry of Redford Township, owner of the franchise for about half of its five years in Livonia.

"We wear them while in the store, but we get thinking that people who come in never get to see more than a couple of the costumes."

"We wanted to try the show to display them all at once and let people see what great things you can do with our patterns."

THE DECISION to have proceeds go to cystic fibrosis research was made because the Berrys lost a daughter to that disease.

"She died just before her 19th birthday," Mrs. Berry said, "but she had lived 10 1/2

years longer than they had predicted. "So we want to aid any new treatment that new research can offer, and we do as much as we can for the foundation."

THE FASHION SHOW will involve the store's entire staff because all are experts in the Stretch & Sew method.

"We don't call our girls salespeople," said Mrs. Berry. "We call them fashion coordinators, because, when they are on the floor, that's what they are doing."

All staff people have taken the basic eight lessons offered by the firm, she said, and new employees are the ones recommended by the instructors as outstanding in the classes. Any new instructors for the full schedule of classes at the store are selected from the coordinators on the staff.

Recent legislation has made it possible for individuals and self-employed persons to establish their own retirement plan through a special savings account called an Individual Retirement Account. We asked DETROIT BANK-er Robert K. Smith to explain this new service.

**Who is eligible for an I.R.A.?**

"An Individual Retirement Account, or I.R.A., may be opened by any employed or self-employed person not currently covered by any other retirement plan. Even if you are already enrolled in a retirement plan, but have a working spouse who is not, he or she is eligible."

**How does an I.R.A. differ from a regular savings account?**

"There are important differences. First, all contributions to your I.R.A. are fully tax deductible. What's more, even the interest earned on this account is exempt from income tax until it is withdrawn. And when you finally begin making withdrawals, you pay taxes only on the amount you withdraw each year. Like

savings accounts, however, I.R.A.'s offer a range of plans: paying annual interest rates from 5-1/2 to 7-1/2 percent and are insured to \$40,000 by the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation. Incidentally, these are the highest interest rates that any bank can pay."

**Are there special regulations for I.R.A.'s?**

"Yes. Regulations only permit you to save a maximum of \$1,500 a year, or 15% of your annual wages, whichever is less. You can open an Individual Retirement Account with just \$25, then it's up to you when and how much you want to deposit, in amounts of \$25 or more, up to your maximum each year. You can add to your account each payday and when your savings reach \$1,000 or more, you can convert them to 6-year 7-1/2% Investment Certificates; or if you make your annual deposit in one lump sum, you can put it into 6-year 7-1/2% Investment Certificates at that time. The money must remain on deposit at least until you reach age 59-1/2, unless you become permanently disabled.

Should you withdraw prior to that, Federal regulations for Investment Certificates require that you pay substantial penalties on the amount withdrawn, and I.R.A. regulations impose further penalties for premature withdrawals."

**Being tax-sheltered, savings in an I.R.A. should accumulate much faster, right?**

"Exactly so. In fact, here is a chart which shows how you could accumulate if you invested \$1,500, before taxes, at the beginning of each year. The first column shows how your interest accumulated with the help of a tax-sheltered I.R.A., the second shows how your interest accumulated without the help of a tax-sheltered I.R.A. and the third shows the difference."


