## 120 Plymouth teachers face layoffs

Faced with a worsening financial situation, the administration will recommend that 120 probationary teachers be laid off. The Plymouth Board of Education will be asked Monday night to approve the suggestion.

Commonly known as "pink slipping," the action would involve notifying the 120 teachers yet to earn tenure that their services won't be needed next fall.

In the past, the "pink slips" sent to teachers explain that a return to teaching duties would be possible in the fall if the district's financial situation improves.

The 120 probationary teachers who would be laid off if the board approves the recommendation comprise about 20 percent of the district's approximately 600 teachers.

ALTHOUGH THE NAMES of those teachers to be pink-slipped haven't been released, it is expected the highest concentration of probationary teachers is in the elementary grades because the district has been hiring elementary instructors to meet rising enrollments in elementary buildings. This is particularly true in Canton Town-

ship where fast-rising population has led to the construction this year of three new elementary schools.

Last summer and fall, though, 20 of the new hires were special education personnel required by the Special Education Mandatory Education Act.

When and if the board votes to pink-slip teachers, those to be laid off will be called in by their individual building principals and notified personally.

AMONG THE documentation to be presented to the school board on the financial

difficulties facing the district will be a letter sent to all state legislators by Gene Caser.

That letter to legislators suggests that statewide, with just a few exceptions, school districts would have to levy three mills more in 1976-77 just to maintain programs of the current year because of state cutbacks in funding.

The Plymouth Community School District has had its state funding cut back \$400,000 this year, with the bulk having to be cut from expenses in the second semester.

"We will be gaining a projected 800 new students next fall," explains Supt. John M. Hoben, "and will be opening four new buildings. This isn't a scare tactic at all but is being candidly realistic."

The recommendation to pink-slip follows administrative staff budget sessions looking at next year's operating funds. The district's current projections indicate revenue for 1976-77 will be almost \$18.1 million total, which will require reduction of expenses equivalent to 120 teachers to balance the budget.

If the present staff ratio were main-

tained, the operating budget for next year would have to climb to \$21 million—an increase in dollars equivalent to 5.3 mills.

"If we don't decrease staff, and want to put back some of the cuts made this year in capital outlay and maintenance, plus have some provision for a contingency, our operating budget would be more than \$3 million short for next year," added Hoben.

The superintendent said he will discuss at tonight's board meeting some specific figures and the impact on programs the layoffs would have.

## Water rates will rise

Regardless of any action the Detroit Water Board may take, the majority of residents in Canton will be faced with water rate hikes in the near future.

The question is how much, and that will have to be decided by the township board, possibly tomorrow night (Tuesday).

On Friday, Treasurer Carl Parsell received the results of an intensive study of the township's water and sewer department by the accounting firm of Seidman and Seidman.

While the report indicates that current charges are inequitable, the recommendations and solutions to the problem are many, says Parsell.

"We have 53 pages of rationale and 20 pages of suggestions in the report, but really there are no concrete figures."

"The board will have to look at the whole report and study it before it makes any decisions on this—there's a lot of ways to go about it," Parsell said.

While the entire water rate structure will be overhauled, assuming the board takes action, downward adjustments in the sewer rates will probably be made simultaneously, making the net effect of the overhaul less severe.

"I WISH WE could say how much the

rates will go up," said Parsell, "and I'm not trying to be evasive, but there are a lot of ways to go about this."

"Aside from the question of Detroit, we have to look at the various users, residential and commercial."

"We have to look at the quantities being used, and we intend to look at the minimum rates."

"We also have to decide if we are going to have the present users pay for all the depreciation of the system or if we are going to depreciate it more slowly so that future users will also be paying off part of the system."

In a letter to the township board two weeks ago, in which Parsell promised to distribute the report, he told board members, "Research for the study has disclosed that many customers, using large amounts of water, were and are, actually paying less per gallon than Canton is paying Detroit."

"This includes apartment complexes and multiples."

"The public will accept and understand that they have to pay their fair share. They will never understand apartments and multiples being subsidized. Neither will I."

PARSELL EXPLAINED part of the current problem is that the township did not increase rates when Detroit last raised its rates, a move he called "politically expedient, but as always, financially disastrous."

"The main thing," the treasurer commented, "is to make the rates as equitable as possible."

"The biggest users of the system should pay more, and those that use it the least, should pay the least."

"Minimum rates should be reduced from 10,000 gallons to 5,000 per quarter for small users, and those that use more should be charged more."

Parsell said that the rate change will be probably be different for different volume users because the current rate structure is based on quantity usage.

Under one recommendation made by Seidman and Seidman, residents using about 25,000 per quarter would pay 17 percent more with the new rate structure, an increase of about \$4.

Those using 10,000 gallons per quarter would be faced with a three per cent increase under the same recommendation, excluding any action Detroit takes.

"The net effect of the increase will be (Continued on page 4A)

It may be too early to tell yet, but when car owners take their vehicles in for servicing, they may well be in for a rude shock.

The cost of auto repair will go up—at least that is what local mechanics and service managers say.

The culprit is a recently passed Michigan car repair law that stipulates, among other things, that a full and detailed estimate must be made in advance of any work over \$20, and if the work exceeds the original estimate by more than 10%, the owner must be notified.

The Michigan Citizen's Lobby, a Southfield-based group, spearheaded the drive for the legislation, reasoning that annual repair costs would go down because customers would get satisfaction their first time around, instead of paying again and again for the same work.

But Plymouth and Canton mechanics disagree, for the most part, and they say the administrative costs of the new law will prove costly for consumers.

"IT'S DEFINITELY going to cost me and the consumer more," said Paul Alberts, manager of Old Village Standard at 400 N. Main in Plymouth.

"A lot of time is going to be involved in estimates, and we'll have to charge for those estimates. If someone has the work done here, then we'll refund the cost of the advance estimate; but if he's just shopping, we can't afford to take 15-20 minutes just to write an estimate."

Although Alberts disagreed with the law's provisions about estimates, he was in favor of licensing for mechanics, a portion of the law that must be in effect no later than 1981.

"I think the licensing part is good. It'll add some professionalism to this business, and that's something we all can use. But there is an element of hassle involved in it."

Bill Brown, owner of Bill Brown Auto Clinic at 8240 Lilley in Canton, was in Lansing last week trying to find out more about the new law.

But according to his employees, everyone in the shop was disgusted with the legislation.

"The law is an insult," said David Northmore, an employee of Brown's for almost four years. "It makes us all look like crooks. But I'll tell you something: You don't stay in business for over 20 years like Bill has unless you're doing something right."

"But they're trying to make us all look like rip-off artists."

While Northmore objected to the paper work involved in the new law, he said that in the past his shop had provided estimates and always contacted the owners when the work was going to cost more than originally anticipated.

Tim Wing, of Tim Wing Service at 307 Starkweather in Plymouth, said the law would have little effect on his business.

"Really, all it amounts to is that we'll have to write two work orders. That'll take more time, but a guy doesn't walk in here in the first place and say, 'Hey, go ahead and fix my car.'"

"He wants to know how much it's going to cost in advance, so we've always been doing estimates anyway."

LYNN YORKE, service manager at Don Massey Cadillac on Ann Arbor Road in Plymouth, disagreed.

He said the new law would do little to put the "criminal repair shops" out of business.

"There are problems, and this law won't cure them. This law says you have to show the customer the old parts if you replace them. Well, I've got a million old parts from 1974 lying around here."

"If I was dishonest, all I'd have to do would be to put them in a plastic bag and tell some guy they came out of his car. He isn't going to know the difference."

"Suppose he comes in and his transmission isn't shifting. I look under the hood and see all it is is a vacuum hose. Before, all I had to do was hook it back up, and that was it. It cost the customer maybe \$5, if anything."

"Now I have to write out an estimate, and the first thing it's going to say is \$20 for diagnosis."

"Suppose, while we're working on it, we find something else wrong. Now I have to have the guy come back in and sign another estimate, even if it's only \$15 more."

"The law says you can have him okay it over the phone, but that's not going to stand up in court."

"And we're not about to get sued twice the amount for something a customer says over the phone."

Yorke said his shop gets customers from as far away as Ohio, and it will be a severe discomfort for them to drive in to sign a second estimate.

Although the law does provide for a waiver of estimate, Yorke said he's not going to ask customers to waive their right to a complete estimate.

"We can't solicit for a waiver. I suppose we could read the law to them."

Yorke added that the licensing provision of the law will force repair costs up, especially on warranty work where most dealers agree the mechanics are underpaid.

"The mechanic will be like a plumber or an electrician. It'll be the same as all the skilled trades, and he's going to be asking for more money."

"He's going to say to himself, 'Hey I've got a license. I think I deserve more money.'"

ONE MAN COMPLETELY in favor of the new law, however, was Dennis Dearing.

He's service manager for Don Marino's Plymouth and Chrysler dealership at the corner of Lilley and Ann Arbor Road.

"I'm in favor of it," he said. "Now a man knows what he's going to pay—he's got no gripe when he goes to the window."

"It takes up a little more time writing the estimate, and in the long run it may increase costs some. But in the past we always had to do estimates anyway, and if we found something else wrong we'd call the customer back."

Dearing added, "As for licensing, that's okay too. A good licensed mechanic is worth his weight, even if he does cost more."

"Where else are you going to find some-

one who can fix all this stuff they make today."

"This business shouldn't be any different from any other skilled trade, and they have licenses. This trade is long overdue for some upgrading."

Other mechanics said the law would be more costly for the consumer. Dan Brace, of Gil's Mobil on the corner of Warren and Sheldon in Canton, said he had to give the highest price on estimates so he wouldn't constantly be calling customers back.

"These estimates are going to take a lot of time. We're going to have to call the auto parts places for prices on parts we

don't have in stock, and overall, it's just going to cost the consumer more," Brace explained.

Brace said he thought estimates would take 20-30 minutes.

"Part of the problem is that you don't know what the problems are until you start working on a car," said Brace. "It's hard just to walk out and say it's going to cost this much."

Basic requirements under the law are:

- All automobile repair facilities must be registered with the state.
- Written estimates must be prepared for the customer if the cost is expected to exceed \$20.

• The owner's permission is needed if the actual costs go over the written estimate by 10 per cent or \$10, whichever is less.

• After repairs are completed, the service agency must provide an extensive invoice on the cost of work done, including an itemization of replaced parts indicating which are new, used, rebuilt, or reconditioned.

• The facility must also provide certification that the work was completed or a detailed explanation of why it wasn't done.

• The name or names of the mechanics who estimated the repairs and did the

## Fire department studied

Canton firefighters wanting to know how their rate on a statewide basis should have that information in hand by the end of this week, if a report by the Michigan Fire Chiefs Association is completed on time.

Following a request by the township for a survey by the chief's association some months ago, Canton's department was run through a series of tests and questions last week.

Two chiefs, Dick Nunley from Birmingham and Frank Belhoff from Avon Township, completed the survey.

"Basically they came in here and asked

a lot of questions," explained Canton chief Mel Paulin.

"They checked out our water mains and our equipment and talked to the men to see how well versed they were in their work."

"They spent part of the time riding around the township, and we showed them the most heavily populated areas of Canton."

Under the test, the township firefighters also staged a pair of mock runs to the Royal Holiday Mobile Home Park at Warren just west of Hix, at the east boundary of the township.

The first run was from the present fire station at Cherry Hill and Canton Center and the other run was staged from the proposed site for a second fire station at Warren and Haggerty.

The first run took 7½ minutes and the second took two minutes.

According to Paulin, it takes about eight minutes for a mobile home to burn to the ground.

"You can imagine what our results would be if this were for real."

"Obviously, the quicker you get there

# Plymouth battles plant fire

The Chevrolet bumper and spring plant is expected to return to normal operations today (Monday) following a raging fire which damaged equipment, a section of the roof and injured two employees.

The workers didn't suffer serious injuries and were treated by a company doctor in the plant late Friday night and early Saturday morning.

A Chevrolet division spokesman said a dollar figure on the estimate would not be completed until the plant officials determine how much work has to be done and what has to be replaced or repaired.

The fire started about 10:47 p.m. in the stack of a heat-treating machine which cools the red-hot coil springs going through a tumbler.

A plant official said one spring apparently was out of position and part of it ignited grease accumulated in the stack, which is connected to others and leading to the roof.

The spokesman said there is an automatic dry chemical fire fighting system in the stacks which "does the job" in most fires.

Friday night's fire, however, was apparently "too much" for the system, and the fire-fighting brigade and security employees had to battle the blaze.

Livonia's department responded with 20 men, a new aerial platform ladder truck being used for the first time, four pumps and a rescue truck.

Pipefitter Art Martin, a member of the brigade, suffered hand and facial burns from falling debris and was treated by a company doctor in the plant.

A second worker, Rick Dufour, suffered smoke inhalation.

A security officer, Sgt. C. E. Martin, said there was a similar fire of a minor nature from the same type of machine at 5:22 p.m. earlier in the day.

ANOTHER FIRE official at the plant

said the fire moving through the stacks ignited tar on the roof and burned a large part of the roof over department 54 in the plant.

Chief Bunk said there was a similar roof fire at the plant a year ago.

He added that strong winds hampered firemen's efforts in fighting the blaze on the roof.

One fire brigade member said the staff did a "real good job" in putting out the fire on the ground with its pumper.

A Chevrolet division spokesman couldn't give a dollar estimate of the damage until

there is a check of the 18 stacks on the roof over which the fire took place.

All the stacks have motors and some had wiring damaged, he said, but all have to be tested to see if they are still functioning.

He said a 60-by-40 foot section of the roof was burned, but the blaze didn't go through the roof.

He stressed that the damages don't represent "a substantial amount," probably under \$100,000, but that a specific figure wouldn't be available until the division determines what work has to be done.

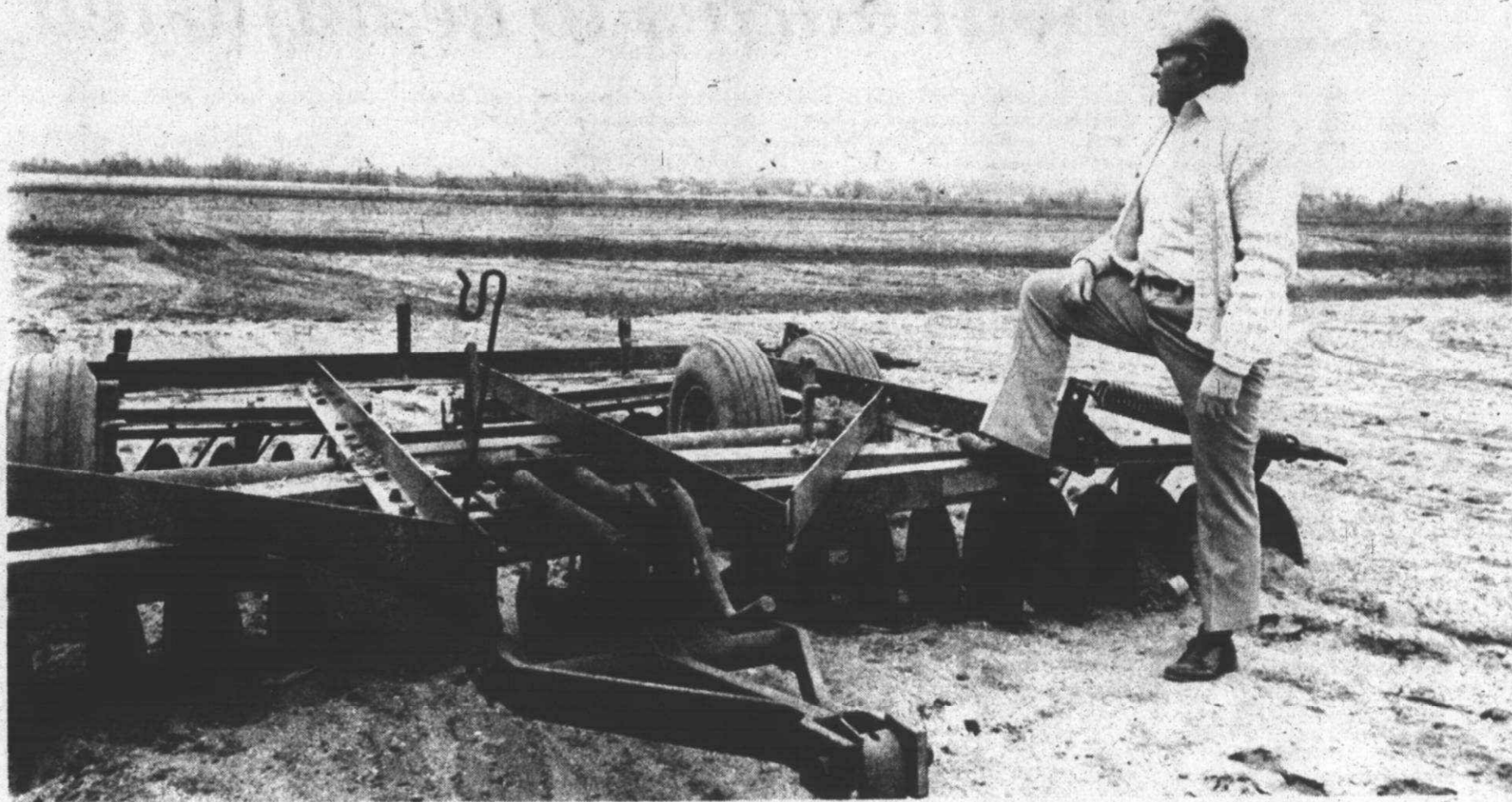

## ...Ask Ross Hauk, he'll tell you

Standing on the porch of his home on the old farm that is now one of the largest left in Canton Township, Ross Hauk looked across the wind swept acreage and remarked, "Things sure have changed."

Then, turning back the pages of the history of the land, he said he was born in the old farm house still occupied by his mother who is past 90 years of age, and has seen the passing of the old "Cherry Hill" he knew as a boy.

"This was the Cherry Hill community," he said, "and it was a great place to be when the dairy farmers brought their milk up to the dairy each night."

"But the place has changed. The community is expanding and with the development come higher taxes until it is difficult to continue farming."

He recalled that the same thing happened to his father, Henry, more than half a century ago when the exploding population caused him to move from Garden City.

"Yes," he said, "Dad bought 140 acres right here for about \$120,000, and now, with the developers moving in on the old farms it would sell for about \$3,000 an acre."

With the move on to the suburbs and the fact that Canton is now one of the fastest growing communities in the state, farming, he says, is decreasing.

"MOST OF THE old families are selling while the price is high and we have only about four left in the area—Bob Schultz, Russ and Richard Palmer and the Jorgensens."

While he didn't mention taxes as a problem of the present, Ross pointed out that he had to increase his land holdings over the years and his dad's original 140 acres turned into the 330 acres he now owns.

"But that isn't all," he said, "I own 330 acres in Deerfield and all told, work about 1,150 acres."

Like most of the farmers in the area, he specializes in sweet corn, melons, soy beans and wheat, but it is not like it used to be.

He pointed out, as his eyes swept across the acreage, that the area was once known as the "sweet corn capital of the world," and that more corn was raised per acre than is raised in Iowa, made famous in song and story.

"It was the capital up to about 15 years ago," he said, "then with the passing of the farms because of higher taxes and the inroads of the exploding population, it changed."

With wife Lillian at his side, Ross figured that, in good years, he can raise about 200 bags to the acre and that there are about 60 ears in a bag. "That's a lot of corn," he said.

All the while he scanned the country side, he recalled what it used to be like.

"We used to have a creamery right here, a general store on the corner and the old Cherry Hill one room school house, along with the old United Methodist Church and cemetery."

"IT ALWAYS was fun," he added, "when the farmers came up in the evening with their milk and then sat around in the general store. It was the only entertainment they had."

But, one by one, the farms have vanished and there is no telling when the rest of them will go.

"Even our work here has changed. We used to have 50 milk cows. Now we have none. When the old cow barn burned about five years ago, we didn't bother to rebuild it."

"Would you believe it," he went on, "we used to have dairy farmers almost every mile down the road. Now, they're gone."

That isn't the only thing that has changed in what he has known as his home over the years.

"I was 20 years old," he said, "before I ever heard of a theft. Now you have to have everything nailed down."

With the appearance of his aged mother, who still is spry despite her 90 years, Ross recalled that the old homestead is about 80 years old. His mother lives there alone.

Nineteen years ago, Ross built a modern home along side the old homestead. There he and his wife are raising six children.

The old farms are becoming scarce because of the onrush from the urban areas and with the newcomers comes a demand for more services and the resultant higher taxes that threaten the farms.

This is one of the reasons Ross and his wife have become interested in the land use plan in the township. He would hate to see the work of years being forced to move on—just as his father did from Garden City back in 1919.

(Continued from page 1A) work must also be included. The customer may demand the return of all replaced parts.

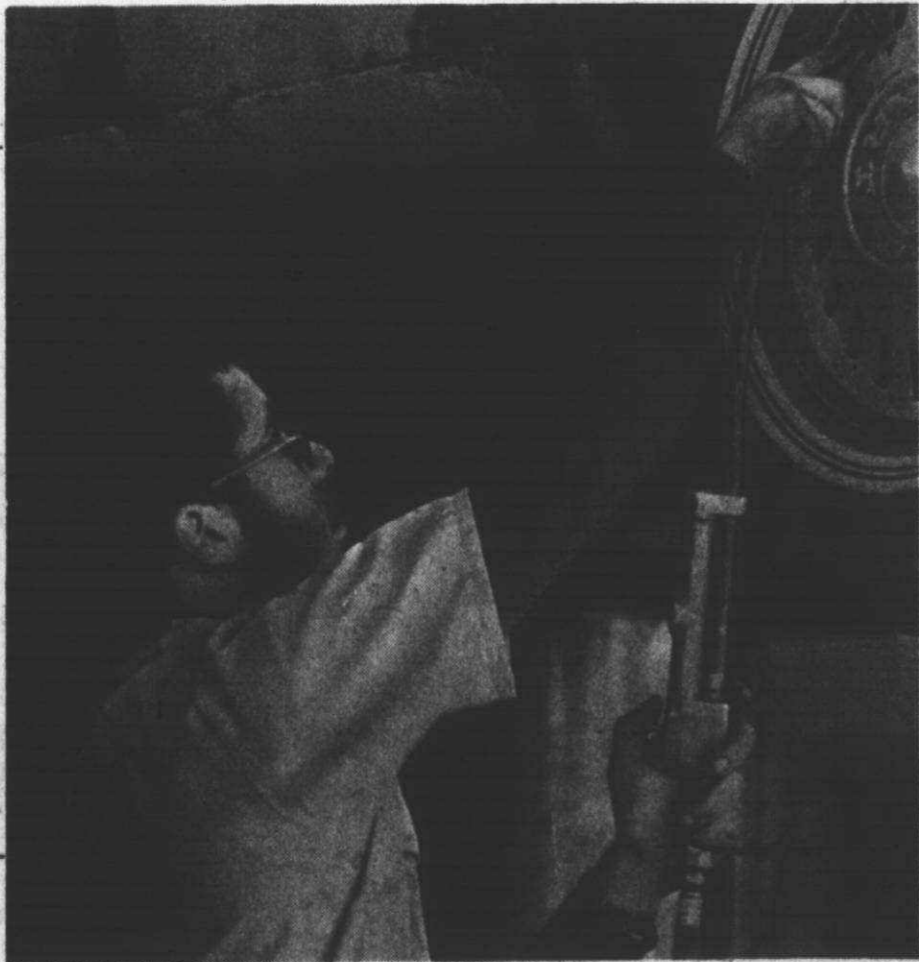
If a customer is dissatisfied with repair

work and cannot receive satisfaction from the agency, the secretary of state's office has the authority to intervene and resolve complaints.

The law requires mandatory certifica-

tion of mechanics by 1981. Customers have the right under the law to waive their rights to the written estimate or set a maximum on the costs of the work to be done.

# Boundaries to be adjusted

Some changes are expected to be made in proposed school boundaries at tonight's (Monday) meeting of the Plymouth School Board of Education.

The attendance and boundary committee will recommend some changes, based on requests from parents during the March 8 public hearing.

Other possible changes will be discussed during a workshop meeting, open to the public, between the school board and the attendance and boundary committee from 6-7 p.m. in the cafeteria of Plymouth Canton High prior to tonight's meeting. A regular meeting will begin at 7:30 p.m.

Marda Benson, board president, says much of the discussion during the pre-meeting workshop session will center on proposed boundaries for the middle schools for school year 1976-77.

INDICATIONS ARE that the board will vote to approve elementary school boundaries at tonight's meeting and defer action on the middle schools until a future meeting, depending on what is accomplished during the workshop session.

There remains a possibility, though, that a decision on middle school boundaries will be made tonight. Supt. John M. Hoben, explaining the purpose of the pre-meeting workshop, says: "The express purpose of the workshop is to review, once again, the changes made in the elementary boundaries and attempt to come to

some closure on the middle school boundaries.

"If this closure cannot be accomplished Monday night, we will seek approval of the elementary attendance areas as a separate issue and follow the direction given by the board as to the resolution of the middle school boundaries."

THE ATTENDANCE and boundary committee, in sessions held following the public hearing, has some changes to recommend to the school board.

The committee will recommend approval of a request from parents in the Napier Court area, a dead-end lane on the west side of Napier about a block from Ann Arbor Road, that their children be included in the boundaries of Pioneer Middle School. It also will recommend that students on the southern end of Napier Road attend Pioneer Middle School.

A request from Sharon Ann Vonkas for busing in Canton's Windsor Park subdivision to the new Hulsing Elementary for kindergarten, and/or for establishing crossing guards at Brandywyne and Arlington Streets, is recommended for denial by the committee.

Recommended for approval is a request from Mrs. Keith Rosol that students living on Weed Road south of North Territorial Road attend Geer Elementary School.

Also recommended is the requested transfer of PLUS, a preschool program, to the former Truesdell Elementary School in Canton. Truesdell won't be used for classes next fall because of the new elementary opening in Canton.

The committee recommends denial of a request from parents living on Amherst Court, Beck and Powell roads.

THE COMMITTEE reaffirms its original recommendation to continue 45-15 year-round school scheduling for a second year at Miller Elementary School.

At the March 8 meeting, the board had deferred action until March 22 to study public input and to ask for a recommendation from the administration.

The administration is expected to recommend approval of the elementary boundaries as proposed and amended by the attendance and boundary committee. The administration plans to withhold recommendation on middle school boundaries until at least after the public workshop session tonight.

the better; but 7½ minutes is quite a long run," Paulun explained.

According to Nunley, the report should be in township officials' hands this Wednesday.

A second study of the fire department, by the Insurance Services of Michigan, is expected later this month.

Paulun said he hopes that study is completed by the end of March. "I expect they'll do more of the same," said Paulun.

"They'll time our runs, and check our equipment and water mains."

It is expected that the results of both surveys will have a strong effect on whether or not the township board goes to the voters a third time in two years for additional monies to build and staff a second fire station in Canton.

Two earlier attempts, in August and November of 1974, were defeated by voters, and the board presently has the Citizen's Advisory Committee studying the problem.

They have already issued a preliminary report saying one mill over 10 years would be sufficient to staff a second, and eventually a third, station in the township.

## Sophomore's specialty: goals!

The biggest of the three is only 5-8 and 140 pounds, and besides that, all three were only sophomores competing in a sport where bulk and experience usually pay dividends—hockey.

But how can the line score points—186 to be exact on 71 goals and 115 assists. The Detroit Red Wings of old had the Production Line and the Buffalo Sabres currently sport the French Connection threesome.

However, as far as prep hockey is concerned, perhaps no line anywhere can match the accomplishments of Livonia Stevenson's sophomore sensations, Frank Finn, Dave Stewart and Ken Morrell.

Finn, a left wing, bested his brother's single-season goal scoring mark this year by blasting 43 shots into opponents' nets. Twenty of those markers occurred while the Spartans had a man advantage.

Stewart, a center, shattered Don Finn's single-season assist mark of 38 by a hefty six and hit the 20-goal plateau himself. Morrell, a right wing, accounted for eight goals and 31 assists.

The line was formed by Stevenson coach Dave Felker the first day of practice, and the Spartans' coach has never regretted that decision. "I don't think there has ever been three sophomores together who got as much ice time. They've surprised a lot of people."

Curiously, two of the three played together many years in a Detroit league and another pairing frequently talked, in their younger years, of playing for Stevenson.

Stewart and Finn were teammates

through the squirt and pee wee ranks, while Morrell and Finn, who lived fairly close to each other, often played "what-if" and wondered what it would be like to be teammates at Stevenson when they were bigger.

There's no need to wonder anymore. "They all have the knack of breaking out fast, setting up in front of the goal and getting in the prime scoring area," Felker stated. "They pass well because they play well together. We seldom just shoot the puck into the offensive zone—that's not our style.

"They're at their best when they're breaking down the ice three on two," Felker said. "They're pretty much patterned after the Russian team, and generally, they're pretty successful."

Stewart usually carries the puck up the ice when the sophomores attack, and the center said, "When I do something, they'll react. It's kind of a sensing thing." His two linemates nodded agreement.

Finn, who scored from all over the rink, said his favorite shot is a combination slap-wrist attempt. Morrell said he feels most comfortable with a wrist shot from the slot or the edge of the circle.

Stewart, always the magician with the puck, prefers to skate in on goal, deke the netminder out of position, then slip the disk past the sprawled goalie.

All three hope to continue playing hockey through the college level, and Felker believes each has a good chance at reaching their goal. "If they continue to improve, I don't see how they could miss," the coach stated.

In fact, Finn has been playing such good hockey, that he is seriously considering a

return to the Detroit leagues or perhaps attempt Junior A hockey, which is generally recognized as keener competition.

"There would be more publicity if I stayed at Stevenson next year," Finn said, "but the Detroit leagues and Junior A offer better competition and more scouts." Finn said he'll definitely make up his mind about where he'll play next winter during the summer.

Stewart, a former teammate of Finn's in Detroit competition, said he doesn't know whether or not he would follow Finn if the winger decided to shift affiliations. Morrell said he plans to return to Stevenson next year and hopes both Finn and Stewart will be on hand to keep the line together.

While the sophomores go about their primary business of scoring goals, Felker said they definitely are not one-way players.

"Our first-line, Jeff Bond, Gary Zilch and Larry Mullin is a more defensive line. These guys (pointing to Finn, Stewart and Morrell) back check too."

As the season moved along, opposing players, aware that the three were sophomores and not especially physically imposing, began to lay-on the muscle against the trio and shadow Finn.

However, the three said they never let that bother them and Felker added that when Finn was tailed, other Spartans usually enjoyed banner scoring games. "They were hit and continued to play, so they must be hockey players," Felker stated.

Finn, in addition to his hockey skills, also plays football and baseball for Stevenson, while Morrell this spring is trying to learn the intricacies of pole vaulting.

The trademarks of the Finn-Stewart-

Morrell line were speed and teamwork, and not many teams had one line as proficient at scoring as this crew, let alone all three being only sophomores.


"At the beginning of the year, their objectives were to make the team and play," Felker smilingly said. "They've surpassed all expectations."

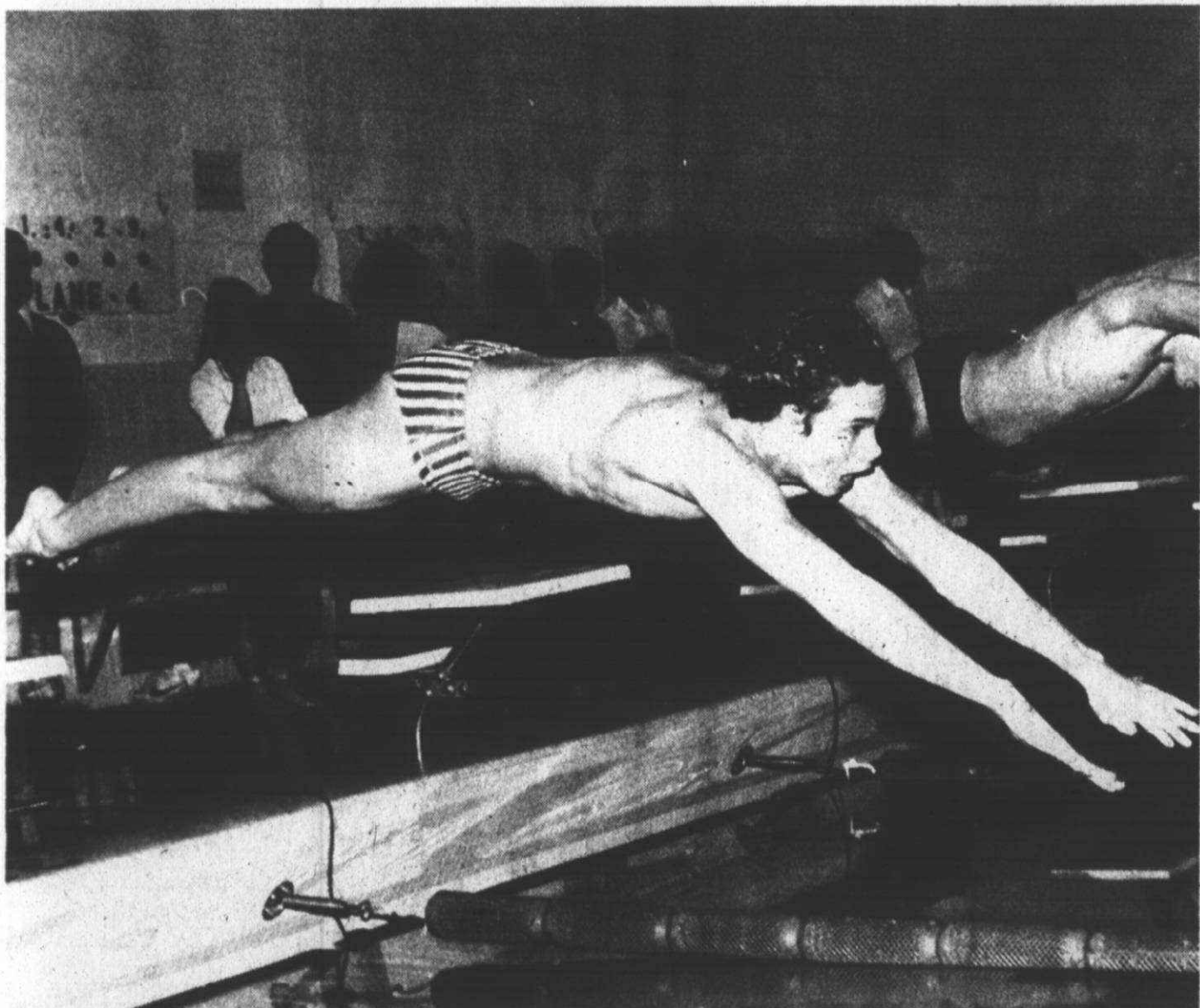

## Glenn runners strong

Basel said he expects improvement in the field events, especially in the pole vault. The non-running portion of Glenn's track effort was the weak link in the chain last season.

"This is kind of a veteran team, so the sophomores won't show for a while yet," Basel stated. "We hope to find one or two sophomores who can come through for us,

and we probably will, but it's too early to tell yet."

The Rockets' coach said he believes Livonia Franklin will put up the greatest challenge for the conference title. "They should have a fine team, too," stated Basel.

The Rockets have an abundance of relays and invitational engagements on their schedule, because, as Basel states, "Relay meets build dual meet teams."

## Stream spearing season opens soon

The newest nature study gem in our region's park system is at Oakwoods Metropolitan six miles south of Metropolitan Airport.

The nature study building and nature trails are open all year.

In the nature study building, naturalists are on duty to answer questions during regular visiting hours—10 a.m. to 5 p.m. on weekends and 1-5 p.m. weekdays. (Mornings are reserved for school groups during the school year.)

Four nature trails range from 700 feet to two miles in length. They are labelled for self-guided hikes. Trail hours are 9 a.m. to 5 p.m.

Visitors should not collect flowers or rocks. Family pets and picnicking are not

permitted in the nature study area, but there is a designated picnic site nearby.

A TWO-MONTH spearing season runs from April 1 to May 31 during which you may spear such "rough fish" as suckers, carp, dogfish and gar pike in non-trout streams in southern lower Michigan.

The Great Lakes, Lake St. Clair, and the St. Clair, St. Marys and Detroit Rivers are open to spearfishing all year for suckers, carp, sheepshead, whitefish, cisco, bullheads, dogfish and gar.

**THE U.S. FISH and Wildlife Service** is surveying 2,000 sportsmen from Michigan by telephone about their hunting and fishing activities.

Altogether, 100,000 American sportsmen will be surveyed on the frequency of their outdoors pursuits to how much they spend annually on sporting equipment.

The survey is designed to assist state and federal officials in resources management decision-making and has the endorsement of the state Department of Natural Resources.

**THE MICHIGAN NATURE Association** celebrated its 25th Anniversary yesterday (Sunday) with a special program on state endangered plants.

MNA is a non-profit group which raises money to purchase natural areas for permanent preservation of Michigan's flora and fauna. Since 1960, MNA says it has saved 2,010 acres of choice natural lands in 37 projects.

Among the sites are: 245 acres in Timberland Swamp 10 miles west of Pontiac; Gull Island and Bird Island in Thunder Bay, Alpena County; a half-mile of Lake Superior frontage and 380 acres of backland in Chippewa County; the 110-acre Newaygo Prairie plant preserve north of Grand Rapids; and a White Pigeon River sanctuary in St. Joseph County near the Indiana border.

# Attitudes, not scheduling, lead to achievement

**Editor:**  
I have recently become aware of the community's reaction against modular scheduling in our high schools. As a 1975 Plymouth Salem graduate and a current freshman at Wheaton College in Illinois, I have seen value in the present system and feel it has assisted me in adjusting to the academic situation in college.

The primary reason for replacing the modular system is the lack of motivation and performance among many students. Under the system, lack of motivation is more visible, but those who favor reinstatement of a traditional program must ask themselves whether the modular system actually feeds this problem or whether it merely causes it to be noticed more readily.

In other words, will forcing a student to attend classes in a more rigid structure actually increase a student's motivation? Scheduling cannot change attitudes. Those who desire to learn will take advantage of any system; those who don't will abuse any system, without the system itself playing a major role.

Modular scheduling provides positive opportunities for students in academic, technical and vocational areas. Motivated students use labs, resource centers, and additional classroom opportunities to their advantage.

The variety of course offerings and class structure under the modular system is a tremendous advantage which few persons outside of the schools realize. Independent study programs are taken advantage of by many students during unstructured time. For those who desire to learn,

modular scheduling is extremely advantageous.

In conclusion, the question this community must ask itself is whether to gear an educational program toward equipping motivated students or to sacrifice some of their benefits in attempting to force knowledge on undisciplined students. The system itself, though it may need revision, is not the cause of the problem—it is attitudes.

## SC trustee responds

In the interest of fairness and clarity, I am responding to an article which appeared in the Feb. 5 issue of the Observer & Eccentric headed, "SC names bargaining team," and which dealt with the Schoolcraft College negotiating advisory council.

Trustee Bennett is quoted as saying, "Ironically, the amount Mrs. Raymond wanted to yield was \$50,000; and at the Jan. 28 meeting, she voted against a tuition increase that would yield \$41,000 and balance the budget."

Now on the surface this does sound incongruous. I agree. However, two major points must be clarified:

- No reference whatsoever was made by the trustee relative to his opposition to my serving on the negotiating advisory council (which I have done since 1972) in any public meeting.

- Nowhere in the public record is there any reference to any action that could point to "my willingness to yield" any \$50,000.

Now then, when and where did the press gather this information? Was it in the hall outside of the conference room? The men's room? Over the phone? In any event, I question the propriety of the giving, receiving and using, of this kind of information. Here, obviously, there is no opportunity

for agreement, refutation, or debate, and that's what our open meetings are really all about.

As for my not voting for a tuition increase, that is a matter of philosophy. I adhere to the school of thought that maintains the Community College should make education available at the lowest possible cost to those who could benefit from it. And this was one of the criteria upon which our college was established.

I have previously made reference relative to where the \$41,000 needed to balance the budget could come from. There were options outside of a tuition increase.

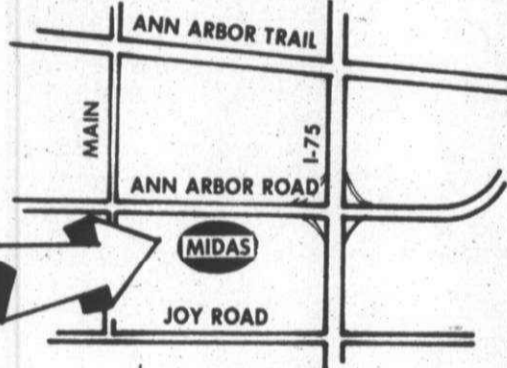

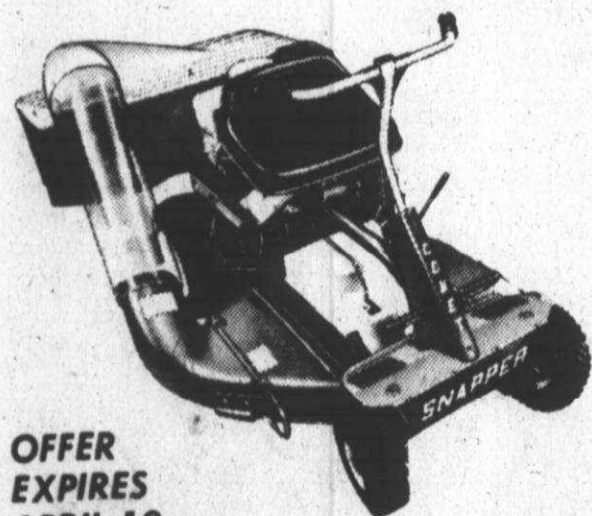

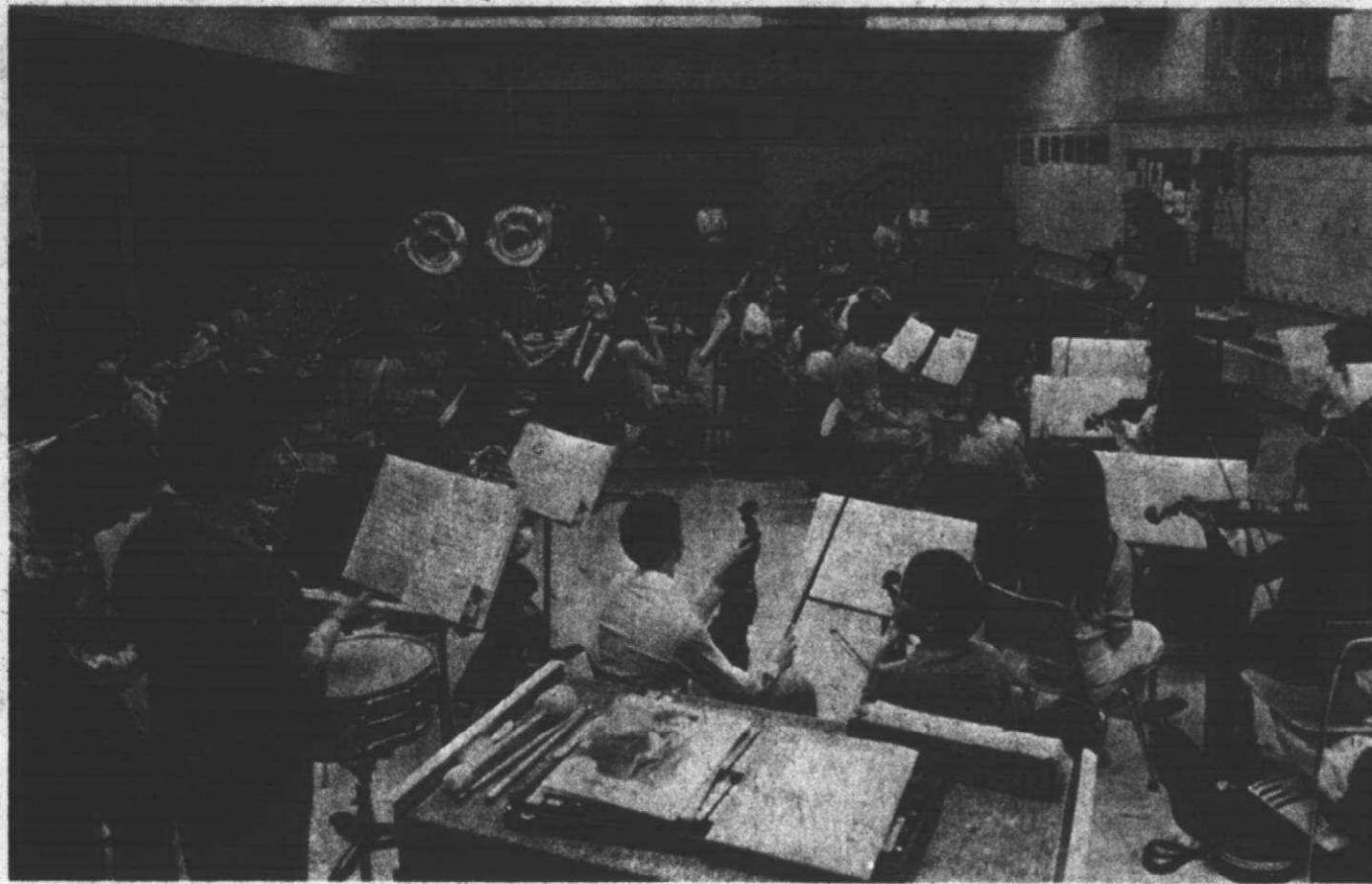

The board of commissioners recently agreed to house prisoners for 90 days at Dehoco as an emergency measure and to renovate M Building at Wayne County General Hospital. M Building is intended to service as a major jail annex until a new jail facility can be built, a project that would take at least three years.

Roscoe Bobo (D-Ecorse), chairman of the board of commissioners, said the \$6 million estimated cost for the temporary facilities has forced the commissioners to resort to deficit spending. "The spending is likely to result in sharp cutbacks in public services later this year," he said.

"Just doing a little quick arithmetic would tell me that spending \$6 million to keep 250 inmates for one year would run in the neighborhood of \$24,000 per prisoner, per year. That's a lot of money to lay on the Wayne County taxpayer," Smith (D-Belleville) said.

"I further understand there is a serious question of whether the accreditation of the hospital could be put in jeopardy by the existence of a jail facility in the same complex," Smith added.

# The Stroller

## The passing of a friend

There is an old saying that when one strolls along life's path, he develops a lot of acquaintances, but makes very few real friends.

And when one of them moves on to the Great Beyond, he leaves a void that is difficult to fill.

That's why there is a lot of sadness in The Stroller's heart these days. He has lost a tried and true friend in the death of Ray Grimm, the pioneering farmer with whom he spent many hours on the commission that wrote the charter for the City of Livonia and later sat across the table from

him on the first city council.

Ray was an unusual individual. Raised on a farm, he became an expert on raising tomatoes and melons and worked very close with Michigan State University when it was an agricultural school.

Despite his lack of "book learning" in his younger days, he had a deep philosophy and a rare sense of humor that endeared him to all with whom he came in contact.

Even during his last days, when he knew that he was not long for this world, he sat at the Rotary Club luncheon table and told his fellow diners how interesting it was to sit in his living room in Plymouth Township and watch nature go through its deteriorating process. Never once did he mention the excruciating pain he was suffering.

WHEN NEWS of his death finally came the other morning, The Stroller couldn't help recalling their first meeting little more than 25 years ago. He had been called to the Livonia township hall to join a committee that was to study possible incorporation of 36 square miles.

On his arrival, the late Jess Zeigler, township supervisor, introduced him to a short, leathery-faced fellow, attired in blue denims but wearing a broad smile, and said, "Here's a fellow you are going to like."

That fellow was Ray Grimm. From that moment there developed a bond of friendship, much like that of a brother, that lasted until he lost his long battle with cancer.

Ray was always a most interesting fellow to watch. Knowing that he represented the farmers, he came to all incorporation meetings in his farmer's work clothes. He spoke to his fellow tillers of the soil with a philosophy that comes to those who live close to the earth. He was generally credited with playing a leading role in the founding of the city.

Never one to take a back seat in any discussion, The Stroller recalls one council meeting when, during a heated debate before a crowded council chamber, Ray changed his thinking several times.

"Why don't you make up your mind," The Stroller called across the table. "You change it every five minutes."

With a broad grin Ray shot back: "Every five minutes I get smarter."

ALL THE WHILE he was growing tired of the political bickering, he feared the influx of newcomers who started major residential developments on farm lands.

"Do you realize," he said one evening, "we are building something that these new people are going to take away from us." That's exactly what happened.

Ray didn't ask the people for a second term. Instead, he moved out to Plymouth Township. When The Stroller asked why, Ray gave him a typical answer. "I was raised in the mud and am going back to it."

Even in his retirement from the vegetable farm in Livonia, our bond of friendship remained strong. Ray developed a liking to search the western mountains for rare rocks, and he was forever showing The Stroller the jewels he extracted from them. His basement was filled with his handiwork.

Even in his new home, which he built himself to relieve boredom, he constructed a fireplace that contained at least one stone from most every state in the union and took pride in pointing out the various jewels in them.

"Why are you building such a large home with a fireplace that would be the pride of many?" he was asked.

"The Good Lord gave me the ability to do it," he answered. "I am enjoying building it. It will be something that will bring joy to others. A fellow is supposed to leave something behind when he is called, and this is it."

It was a joy to know Ray Grimm and have him as a friend. The memory of him will forever remain green.

Andrew Wyeth's "Ground Hog Day" will go for \$54, and Shuptrine's "Apple Plenty" for \$60.

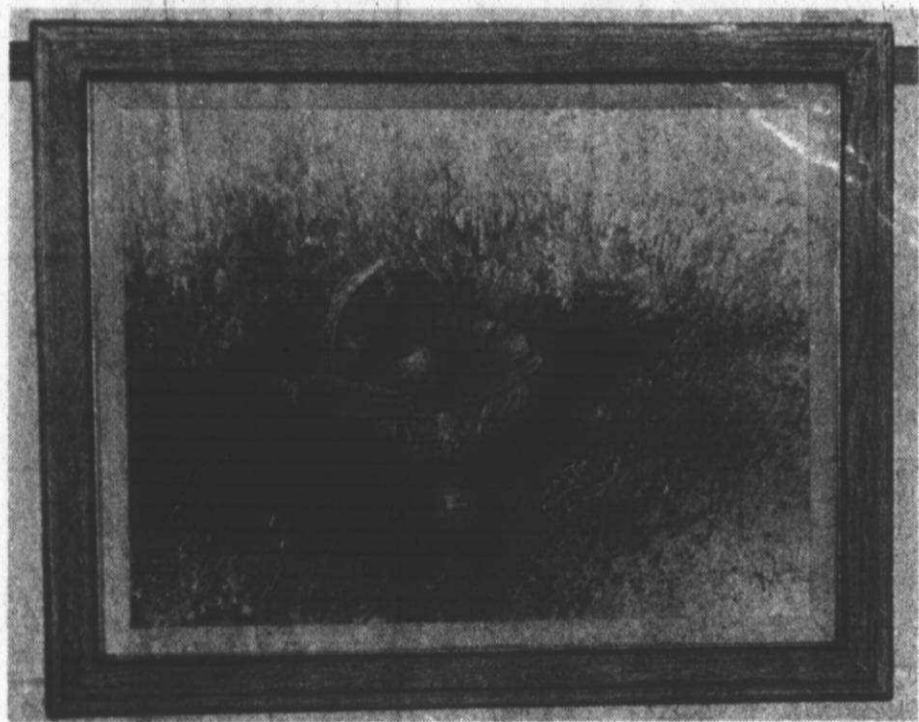
"We are happy to announce a change in policy for our second year," said Mrs. Foust. "All reproductions will be available for purchase with past rental fees credited to the selling price."

# Grandpa Pratz visits co-op

By ELINOR GRAHAM

The Monday morning visit of Matt Murphy's grandfather to Emily Sparling's group at the Plymouth Co-op Nursery caused no big stir among the children. Grandpa Pratz made nice music on his violin, and many had never had the opportunity to examine the instrument at such close quarters.

But for musicians in the United States, Canada and Europe, a casual visit from Albert Pratz would be a cherished experience. A program of the duMaurier Family Pops concert presented by the Toronto Symphony Orchestra contains the following data:

**"CONDUCTOR—ALBERT PRATZ**  
Toronto-born Albert Pratz has been concertmaster of the Toronto Symphony since January 1971. His distinguished career includes three years as concertmaster with the Buffalo Philharmonic; professor at the University of Music at Brandon, Manitoba for two years and six years as concertmaster with the CBC Orchestra. He is also a former member of the NBC Orchestra under Toscanini.

"Mr. Pratz was with the Toronto Symphony in the 1930s and music director of CBC studios in Winnipeg from 1940 to 1942. He has studied with, among others, Luigi von Kunitz, the Toronto Symphony's first conductor.

"Mr. Pratz has been conducting since 1929 and has conducted the Buffalo Philharmonic, among others, on numerous occasions. He is currently associated and work-

ing with a trio which includes cellist, Vladimir Orloff and pianist, Pierre Souvairan. He also devotes his time and energy to coaching the violin and viola sections of the newly-formed Toronto Symphony Youth Orchestra.

"A number of years ago, as a conductor, Mr. Pratz introduced Agostini's 'Serenade for Alto zute and Orchestra' with the Buffalo Philharmonic. He also recorded the first performance of this work for international service for the CBC.

"He has several recordings on Columbia, Decca and London labels and recently recorded a newly discovered violin concerto for the CBC in Toronto. While on tour with the Toronto Symphony in Europe last year, he discovered the violin part for Bruch's 'Concerto No. 3.' His recording of this concerto was the first North American performance of this work."

**LORNE GREEN** of "Bonanza" fame was the announcer on Pratz' "Stardust" solo programs which ran for nine years over the Canadian Broadcasting Corporation. He performed as soloist in Turin and Rome, Italy; for the British Broadcasting Corporation in London, England; and at the World's Fair in Brussels.

Jack Benny was one of his pupils. Benny was slated for a three-week stay in Toronto. He asked Isaac Stern to recommend a violin teacher in that area. Stern suggested Pratz and Benny had three-hour lessons each day from the maestro.

They became good friends and each year, when Benny gave a benefit show in Florida, Pratz was included on the program.

**THE STORY** of Pratz' search for German composer Max Bruch's third violin concerto justified his persistence. For nearly 40 years he had insisted there was a third concerto while everyone else in the musical world knew there were only two.

Wherever he traveled, he searched music shops, hoping it would turn up. An article by Toronto Star music critic William Littler described the end of the search: "All that changed last spring when the Toronto Symphony visited Vienna during its European tour. Still playing Sherlock Holmes, Pratz sent his Dr. Watson, fellow symphony violinist Stanley Kolt to Doblinger's, the city's legendary music store, and an excited Kolt reported back that he had found the concert concerto. "It wasn't the complete score, only a piano reduction with the solo violin part, but it was enough for Pratz not only to prove his point but to fall in love with the music."

**NOT ALL THE** visitors to the Plymouth Co-op Nursery have the background of three-year-old Matthew's grandfather.

Mr. and Mrs. Pratz just happened to be in town for a weekend visit with their son-in-law and daughter, Mr. and Mrs. Ken Murphy of Plymouth Township.

The school at Haggerty and Warren roads offers many interesting experiences for preschoolers. The next time Mrs. Sparling's charges hear the background music to Canadian Tourist Bureau commercials on television, they can say, "That is Mr. Pratz. He played for us at nursery school."

## CB theft: an unsolved problem

Citizen Band (CB) radios are being stolen from automobiles in great numbers these days, despite the fact that car buyers have purchased over \$1 billion worth of anti-theft devices on their new cars since 1969.

This alarming fact has prompted the Affiliated League of Emergency Radio Teams (ALERT) in Washington, D.C., to issue an advisory describing how some CB'ers protect against such thefts.

Some independent CB Radio groups for a fee are putting their own coding concealed inside the radio. ALERT President Bob Thompson says this would work "if everyone knew where to look and what to look for."

Some are using serial numbers on the backs of their CB sets. "This would be a good idea, but not all of the manufacturers stamp in the serial numbers, they simply use a label which can be easily removed," Thompson said.

Some organizations ask CB'ers to list their sets with them for a fee and they would in turn give them some "goodies." However, Thompson "cannot see this being of any real help in protecting your CB set."

Police departments are encouraging CB'ers to engrave a code number on the back of their sets. Some are using drivers' license numbers, others are using social security numbers. Thompson prefers the drivers' license numbers because "it is almost impossible to get information from the Social Security Commission."

THE REAL problem, according to

Thompson, is "no one...has tried to put together a unified system" for protecting this kind of auto equipment. Consequently, no matter where the sets end up—the police or CB dealer—"neither will know what all these marks mean."

ALERT advises that all CB teams work with their local police departments to put pressure on manufacturers to stamp on serial numbers on all new CB sets.

The police should also develop a document that could be used like a car title or bill of sale that's transferable to the new set owner. The idea is that if there were no bill of sale during the purchasing transaction, chances are a stolen radio is involved.

THERE SHOULD also be a similar system developed for new radios tied straight to the warranty card. "This would increase the amount of warranty cards going back to the manufacturer, and would give you (CB'er) a bill of sale," Thompson explained. "There should also be a spot on the card for transfer to new owner."

The CB'er might reduce his chance of a theft by taking off his radio antenna when entering a large parking area. Thompson said some antenna manufacturers are working on a CB antenna that looks just like the normal car antenna. Some CB makers are working on sets that will fit into the dash as part of the car's AM-FM radio.

Solving these multiple thefts of CB Radio sets is all up to the CB'ers themselves, Thompson says, urging them to group together and tell the manufacturer what they want and settle for nothing less.
