

Master plan goes on ballot May 18

Township residents will have a chance to speak at the ballot box May 18 on the proposed master land use plan.

By a vote of 4-3 with trustees Brian Schwall, Jim Poole and Bob Myers dissenting, the board approved putting the proposed master land use plan on the presidential primary ballot as an advisory question.

While all the board members favored using an advisory ballot, the cause for much debate and the dissenting votes concerned how to word the question.

Residents will be asked if they approve of an older plan drafted in 1974 and dropped following a public hearing two years ago, or if they approve of the plan

proposed recently by Supervisor Robert Greenstein.

The older plan provides for full urbanization of the township with a total population of 205,000.

The new plan provides for "half-urbanization." Land west of Canton Center will be retained for farming, and urban densities in the east will be reduced, with far fewer multiple housing units.

SCHWALL ARGUED that the ballot would be biased if the voters were given the choice between the two plans because philosophically voters would agree with the more recent plan.

"Just because it was completed in 1976,

the voters are going to assume it is more progressive," the trustee said.

Greenstein responded that the voters need a full choice, and that presentation of both plans on the ballot would give a broader choice.

"If they vote no on both plans," he said, "they will be saying they don't want either. They don't have to make a choice for one or the other."

Peter Bundarin, a Canton attorney, asked if there could be a third alternative on the ballot so the electorate would not be forced to choose between one plan or the other.

Greenstein responded that there is no al-

ternative. "It's a black and white matter," the supervisor said. "Either you have full urbanization in the township, or you have half. If you open the west up, it will be fully developed. There is no middle ground."

But Canton farmer Fritz Loebenthal disagreed. "Asking the people to vote on these two plans is like asking me 'Fritz, are you still beating your wife?' I lose if I answer yes and I lose if I answer no."

Schwall said the heart of the matter was the wording of the ballot. "Words make all the difference in the world," he said.

He added "The question is not if they want full urbanization, the question is do

they want this plan. We shouldn't be concerned with the old plan."

BART BERG, chamber of commerce president, agreed with Schwall. "You can't revive the old plan unless you inform the public on it. It's two years old and unless you hold a public hearing on it the people are not going to be able to vote intelligently on it."

Poole concurred with Schwall. "The only question is do we support this plan."

Trustee Gerald Cheske responded "Everyone agrees we should put the issue before the people and now we say they are incapable of deciding and we have to limit the choice.

Cheske added that putting both plans on the ballot would offer a choice voters rarely have the chance to make. "They can decide the road this township will travel down in the future," he said.

Myers said a third choice should be available on the ballot. "Give a third spot to say no preference," he said.

Schwall said if both plans have to be on the ballot, rather than offering a third choice saying no preference, put a third choice saying neither of the plans.

The actual wording and descriptions of both plans to be placed on the ballot will be decided next Monday, March 29 at 7 p.m. at the township firehall at a special meeting of the board.

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120 teachers 'pink slipped'

Those teachers who haven't yet earned tenure, except for special education staffers, will receive within the next few days a pink piece of paper notifying them their services will no longer be needed.

The Plymouth Board of Education voted 7-0 Monday night to authorize the administration to notify all teachers on probation that their contracts won't be renewed at the end of the school year.

The board voted to exclude from the list to receive layoff notices those special education teachers who are still on probation.

THE STEP was taken now to leave the school district flexibility to act in the future if the financial picture actually becomes as bleak as projections now indicate.

State law and contract provisions with the teachers' union (Plymouth Education Association) require that faculty members being laid off must receive notice before the end of the school year.

The "pink-slipping" procedure is taken to make sure the district is able to reduce staff next fall if finances dictate. If the budget improves, some or all of those pink-slipped may be called back to work.

Ed Page, director of special education, told the board that if all probationary teachers were laid off, the special education department would lose 21 individuals and that would devastate a number of programs.

He pointed out that the district received a classload deviation from the state because of demands for learning disabled placement, and next year must find five additional classrooms for the learning disabled. Page added that special education programs are funded 65 to 70 per cent by state and federal monies and the funding would be endangered by any major staff cutbacks.

SUPT. JOHN M. Hoben told the board that although it's possible state aid might rise some in 1976-77, revenue generated from local taxes will decline because of monies lost through the Single Business Tax.

The Single Business Tax limits reimbursements to schools to six per cent over last year's tax base, Hoben explained, which is hardly sufficient to cover inflation.

The net increase in total revenue expected for 1976-77, Hoben added, is about \$1.3 million. Early budget projections show a need for \$21 million revenue if staffing ratios remains the same, if money is included for capital outlay, a 1 1/2 per cent contingency fund and allowance of one per cent of total budget for inservice. A \$21

million budget would require 5.3 additional operating mills. The current operating budget is \$18.4 million.

Next fall, Hoben said, the district expects 800 more students and plans to open four new buildings—the three new elementary and the physical education-music wings of Plymouth Canton High. The added cost for opening the four buildings, he added, will be about \$400,000 or the equivalent of one mill. The \$400,000 taken away in state aid so far this year also is equivalent to one mill.

"The problem is not unique to Plymouth," said the superintendent. "School districts across the state are facing the prospect of having to cut their programs and expenditures to the tune of three mills because of revenues taken away by the state. Michigan was faced with a \$550 million deficit and the schools have been hurt hard in the effort to balance the state budget."

Hoben noted the tax base is now \$478 million. The district estimates new growth in the district will add about \$30 million to the tax base, but this gain will be offset by a \$50 million loss because of the Single Business Tax.

THERE ARE possibilities the current proposed formulas for state aid might be changed, and that the Single Business Tax might be amended.

"But we must protect our district in case additional money isn't available," said Norm Kee, assistant superintendent for personnel.

The motion that letters be prepared for all probationary teachers, except special education, notifying them their services will be terminated at the end of this school year was made by Tom Yack and supported by Marcia Borowski.

"It is with a great deal of regret that we even consider this," said Ms. Borowski, "and it is my personal hope that when budget cuts are made, that we make cuts in a number of other areas before we actually reduce teaching staff, which is the core of our educational program."

"We are following the procedure required by the Michigan Tenure Act and the master contract with the PEA, but, in fact, we will need more teachers next fall."

E.J. McClendon commented: "We must face this issue head on. And we shouldn't commit ourselves now on what we will do when, and if, the time comes to make the cuts that seem necessary now."

Although no specific numbers were mentioned Monday night, it is believed that about 100 instructors will be receiving layoff notices.

Special meeting set for Monday

Faced with an April 1 deadline, members of the township board agreed Tuesday night to hold a special meeting March 29 at 7 p.m. in the township firehall to consider placing two questions on the May 18 presidential primary ballot, and to discuss revision of the township's water and sewer rate structure.

Members of the board will consider placing a fire millage question on the ballot,

and an advisory question on the master land use plan.

Board members will also consider recommendations made by the accounting firm of Seidman and Seidman to completely restructure the township's present water and sewer rate system in the wake of a substantial sewer rate increase by Detroit last year, and a 39 per cent proposed water rate increase this year.

Bob Wire of Seidman and Seidman explained the need for a change in the rate system, commenting that present rates are inequitable.

A report prepared by his firm is available for public inspection at the township business offices, 44508 Geddes Road, and at the township firehall at the corner of Cherry Hill and Canton Center. Action on the report was delayed so the

public could read the recommendations and respond Monday.

THE FIRE MILLAGE issue, currently being studied by the township's Citizen Advisory Council (CAC) is almost complete and the CAC is awaiting two reports on the fire department from Fire Chief's Association of Michigan and the Insurance Services Office of Michigan.

If those reports are available on Monday, the CAC may recommend the board place the extra levy on the ballot. An earlier report by the CAC suggested a one-mill levy over 10 years would be sufficient to staff a second station and eventually build and staff a third.

Also on Monday, the board will vote on the exact wording of an advisory question on the master land use plan.

Planner Mike Manore has been directed to draft a description of the two plans (see related article above) for the advisory question.

Both ballot questions must be in the hands of the township clerk no later than March 30 and must be turned over by him to the Wayne County clerk no later than April 1 to be on the May ballot.

New Bell switching complex completed

If identity makes a community stronger, Canton should soon be the Samson of Wayne County.

Not only are Cantonites due for their own Zip Code and postal designation in the near future, but soon township residents will have their own phone exchange and central switching complex.

Michigan Bell announced earlier this week that technicians are testing the electronic switching equipment at its recently completed central office building in Canton.

Haze Wilson, local manager for Michigan Bell, said the modern one-story building, constructed on Sheldon just south of Cherry Hill, will provide service for about 6,000 Canton Township telephone custom-

ers now serviced by parts of Michigan Bell's Plymouth, Wayne and Ypsilanti exchanges.

Wilson said the complex is expected to begin operation on April 5, and at that time 6,000 customers will be transferred to the new office, resulting new phone numbers for all of them.

"IN FACT," Wilson commented, "business customers were told what their new numbers would be last April, and by the end of August all residential customers were notified as to what their new numbers would be."

Wilson added, "When this ESS (electronic switching system) becomes operational in the Canton area, telephone customers in

the township will have the most up-to-date communications system the industry can provide."

The new electronic switching system, called a No.1ESS, was developed by Bell Laboratories, research arm of the Bell System.

What made electronic switching a reality, Wilson said, was the burgeoning family of semiconductor devices spawned by the transistor—and the development of an economical magnetic memory large enough to handle the enormous store of information needed to control the switching function.

The result is a totally new family of switching systems that require less space and are much easier to maintain.

"In spite of its sophistication, the electronic central office serves the same purpose as that of any other central office—to connect the right wires so that people can call and talk to each other," Wilson said.

Numbers to change

All of the phone numbers to the Canton Township business offices and fire department will change as of April 4.

Township officials are requesting that all residents learn the following new numbers:

For the first few months of operation, the old emergency number at the fire department (453-4114) will remain in operation.

After the emergency is over, the caller will be notified of the new number.

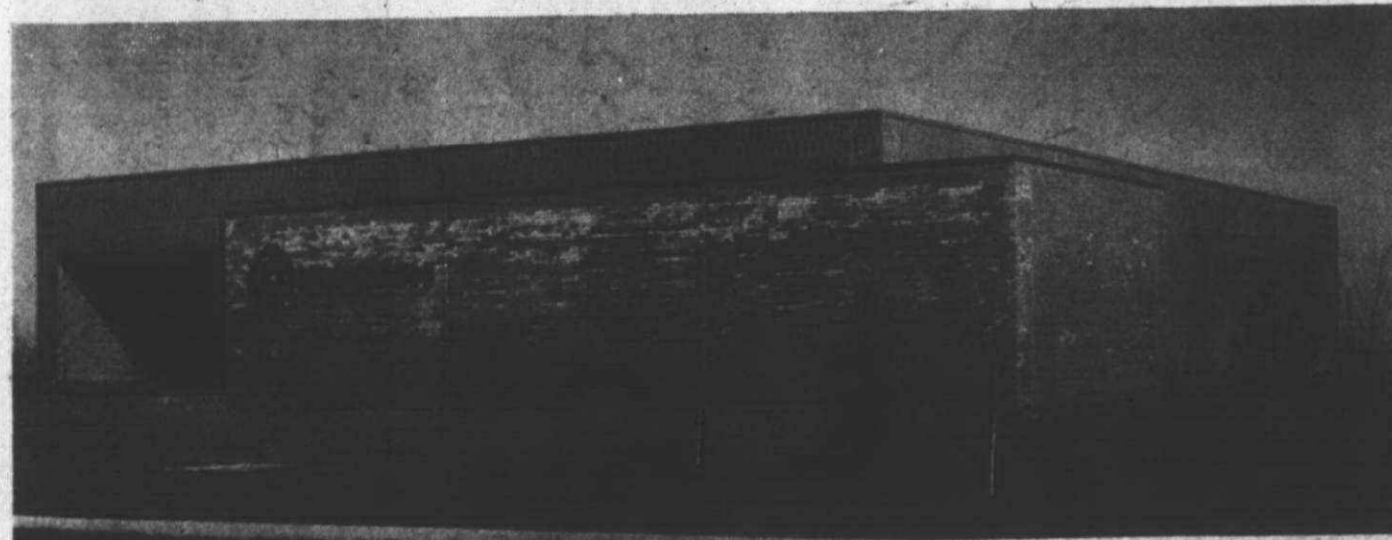
Records will be kept as to how many people are calling the old number, and once the amount is minimal, the old line will be disconnected. Callers using the old

number then will receive the recording advising them of the new number.

The new Michigan Bell complex at Cherry Hill and Sheldon will begin operation early next month. (Staff photo by Gary Caskey)

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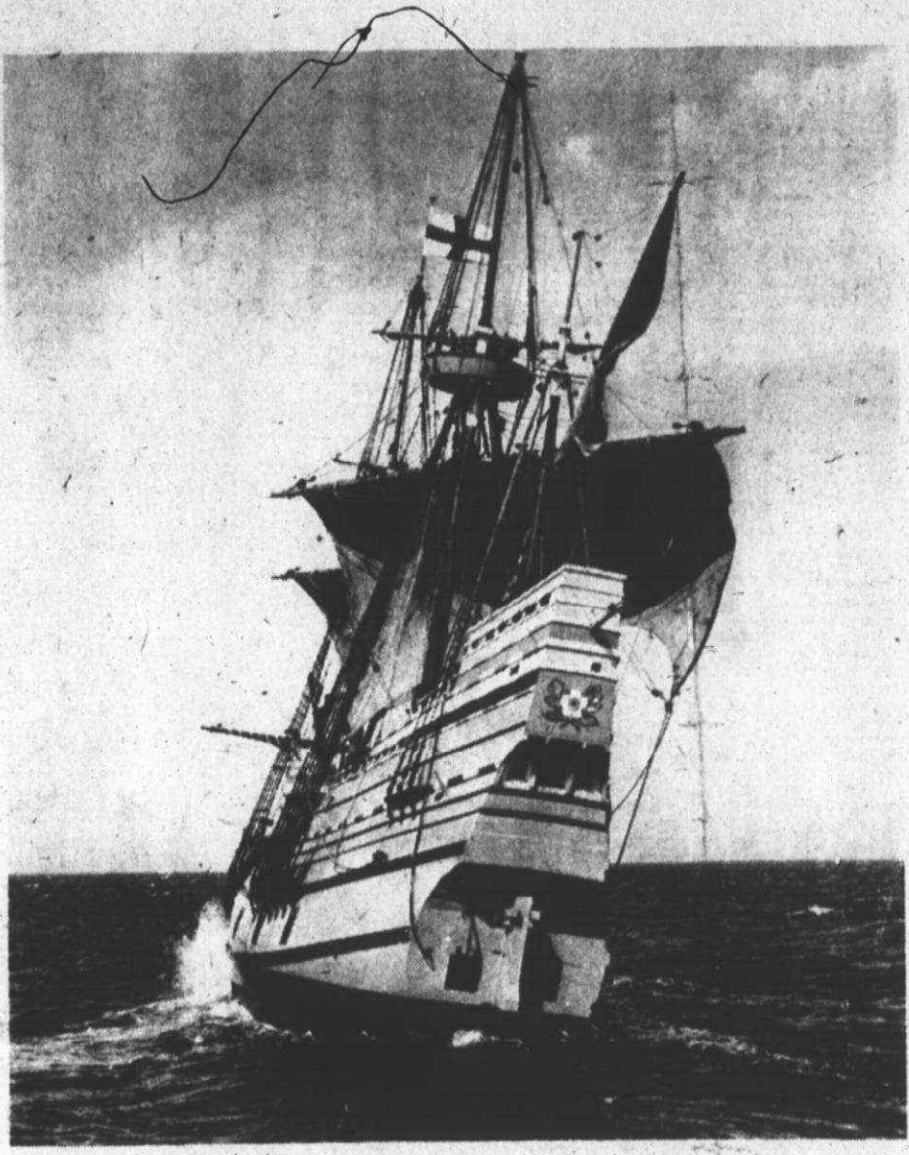
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Plymouth adopted by 'Bay Colony'

Plymouth residents have been "adopted" by the community of Plymouth, Mass., as part of the official bicentennial observance of the historic Bay Colony area.

"We wish to share our joy and patriotic jubilation with the citizens of Plymouth, Mich.," states a proclamation sent to Mayor Joe Bida from David F. Tarantino, chairman of the Plymouth, Mass., Board of Selectmen.

The proclamation declares that "every good citizen of Plymouth, Michigan, is an honorary citizen of Plymouth, Massachusetts, for and during the Bicentennial Year 1976.

Plymouth, Mass., "America's Hometown," was settled and incorporated in 1620 by the Pilgrims after a hazardous 66-day voyage from England on the Mayflower. At the State Pier on the waterfront is the colorful Mayflower II, a full-scale reproduction of the type of vessel which brought the English settlers to Plymouth Rock.

Pilgrim costumed guides at the Rock tell the story of the Pilgrim adventure and the first settlement, which is reproduced in Plymouth Plantation—a living fullscale recreation of the village as it appeared in 1627.

The Pilgrim Hall Museum and the Plymouth Antiquarian House will present a major exhibition on the role of women in the American Revolutionary era. Entitled "Remember the Ladies—Women in America 1750-1815," it will open June 29 and remain in Plymouth, Mass. for three months. Of special interest will be possessions of Abigail Adams, Martha Washington, Dolly Madison and Mercy Otis Warren.

A program of special events started with a bicentennial musical entitled "Let Freedom Ring" on March 14. There will be a bicentennial parade on July 4, as there

will be in Plymouth, Mich., and a special Thanksgiving Day parade. Information on activities and exhibits may be obtained by writing the Plymouth Chamber of Commerce, 85 Samoset Street, Plymouth, Mass. 02360.

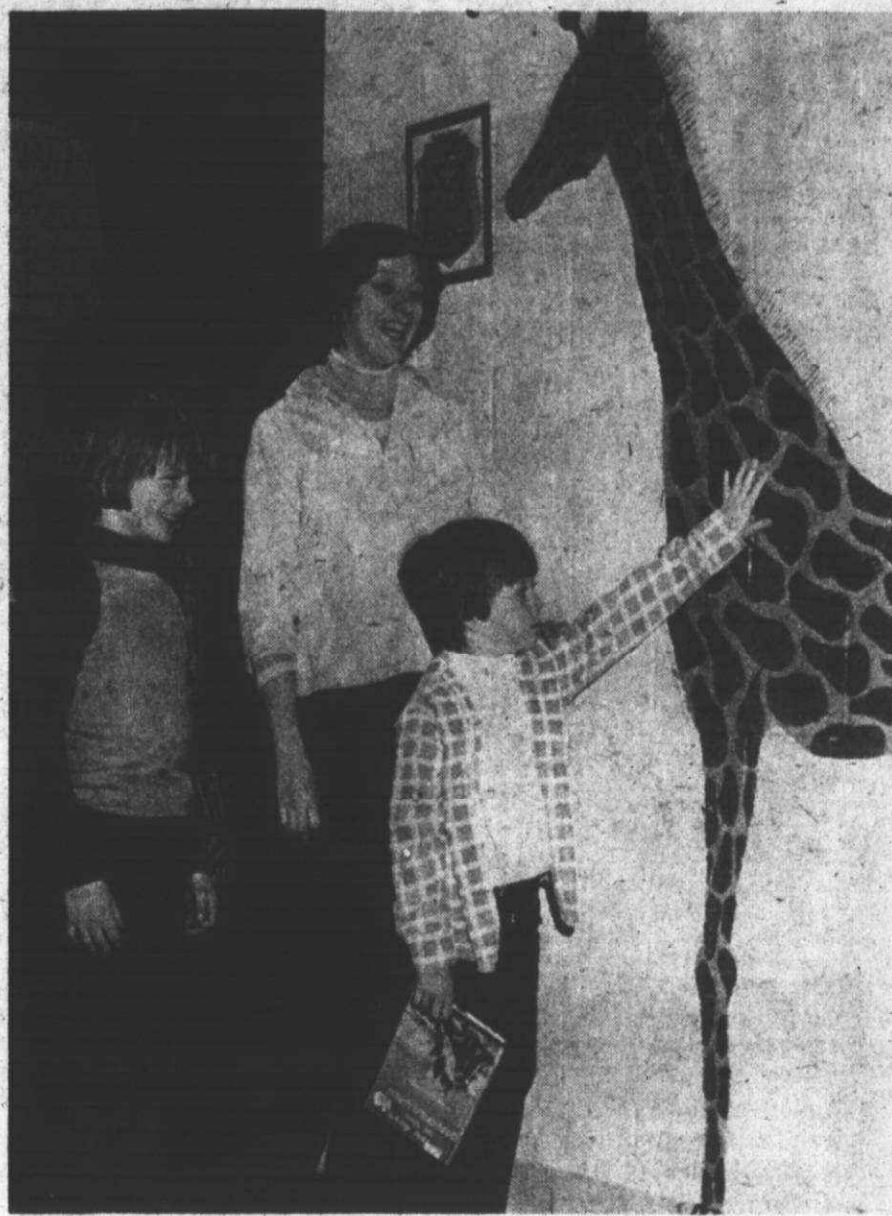

Kids' love for zoo sparks 'adopt-o-rama'

A goat, a sheep or a skink lizard? Which will it be?

Third graders in Sharon Danforth's class at Fiegel Elementary School have their choices narrowed down to those three. If they earned enough money (\$40) at last Friday's bake sale, they will be able to feed a goat, a sheep or a skink lizard at the Detroit zoo for one year.

The students have been reading about the animals and the final decision will be made by democratic process. Student teacher Deanna Seavitt of Eastern Michigan University is responsible for their interest in the project. The class is one of several groups in area elementary schools which are helping the zoo through a financial crisis.

AT GALLIMORE, the entire school is involved in raising \$500 to feed a reticulated giraffe for one year. A large thermometer-type chart was painted on a wall in the hallway by four students in Mary Kroes' fifth grade class so everyone can keep track of the fund.

Art teacher Betty Jo Terry painted a tall giraffe on a wall as a reminder of the real one at the zoo. Children are earning

money by doing chores at home. Some are selling popcorn and others are selling seed packets.

FARRAND SCHOOL has achieved its goal of raising \$240 to feed Polly Penguin for one year. Third, fourth and fifth graders sold flower and vegetable seeds to put the fund drive over the top.

Ron Beier, fourth grade teacher, started the movement, and Marjorie O'Callaghan was parent coordinator of the project.

Principal Anne Welch said it was a little disconcerting to discover Polly was a male after they all had been referring to their bird as "her" for a long time.

THE 25 STUDENTS in Gloria Smith's fourth and fifth grades at Miller School already have contributed \$40 to feed two macaque monkeys. Margo Drallos started the project when she was a student teacher in the class.

"The children earned \$20 at a cupcake sale," said Mrs. Smith. "Then Margo and I each added \$10 so we could feed two. Both of us are fond of animals."

What are macaque monkeys? Any one of Mrs. Smith's students can explain. They are very small monkeys with caps, bonnets or manes. Most familiar

types come from India or Japan.

Students at Smith School are just under the halfway mark in their effort to raise \$400 to feed a chimpanzee for one year.

During the recent 25th birthday party at the school, students had a table set up in the main hallway where they were asking for donations toward the project.

WHEN A TRIP to the zoo is planned, children from the Plymouth-Canton area have one destination in mind—the Detroit Zoological Park in Royal Oak. They have been there on family outings or school bus trips. For many, the annual visit to the zoo is an integral part of summer vacation.

With the adoption of the "feed an animal" program, many students will have a proprietary interest in the zoo. There will be small plaques on display, telling who paid the grocery bill for which animal.

Joe Morgan, deputy director of the zoo, said the schools' participation has been greatly appreciated.

He reminded area families that the zoo is open year-round, Wednesdays through Sundays. For the first time, the zoo is having an Easter egg hunt on Saturday, April 17, between 4 and 7 p.m. There also will be an Easter parade on Sunday with prizes awarded to families in traditional finery.

762 multiples chopped

"It wasn't bad for one night's work." That was the way Treasurer Carl Parsell, the township board's representative on the planning commission, characterized the commission's work last week.

In a single meeting, the commission, with the consent of several builders, eliminated more than 760 multiple units and one 40-acre regional shopping center.

All of the changes were made in Planned Unit Development (PUD), projects that are protected by contracts between the township and the builder.

They are not subject to normal planning procedures and zoning ordinances.

"That was the beauty of it," Parsell explained. "We couldn't legally force them to get rid of the multiples, but the administration and our planner Mike Manore have been working with the builders for quite some time and we finally arranged to be rid of these multiples."

PUDs AFFECTED by the change include Windsor Park 7, Brookside Village, and Carriage Hills.

In Windsor Park 7, proposed multiples were reduced by 192 units on 15 acres, and an additional two acres of commercial use were eliminated.

They will be replaced by 75 single-family homes.

In Brookside, at Cherry Hill and Lotz roads, 26 acres and 270 multiple units were involved. They will be replaced by 90 single family homes.

In Carriage Hills, at Warren and Canton Center, a proposed 40-acre shopping site surrounded by 300 units of multiples will be replaced by 185 single-family homes.

"I realize that we are in need of expanded commercial tax base," Parsell commented, "but not within residential areas that are already, in some instances, too densely populated."

Parsell said the single most important change was elimination of the regional-type shopping center on Canton Center at Warren.

"IT'S OF MAJOR significance because this area was used as an example of why Canton Center should be strip-zoned commercial. Instead the area will be developed as a quiet residential subdivision."

Under the proposed master land use plan, Canton Center would be zoned residential for the most part between Ford and Warren.

Parsell added that if it weren't for current housing market conditions, builders might not have consented to the change. He added that "Some of these builders are big enough so that they could sit on the property if they wanted to and wait until the market turns around."

"And with the PUD agreements, they had the perfect right to. We couldn't have touched them."

Parsell said the change was significant because most of the areas affected had developed as single family subdivisions.

"REALLY, ONE of the best reasons for zoning multiple is to act as a buffer between commercial and single family homes. But when you get rid of the commercial, you also get rid of the need for

'Oklahoma' on the boards at Wayne Memorial

Backstage at Wayne Memorial High auditorium: sounds of Coke bottles fizzing and chairs scraping all but drown out the strains of "O What A Beautiful Morning" heard from the stage.

The turmoil is typical of a musical rehearsal, and John Glenn High's production of "Oklahoma," set for this weekend, is no exception. With all the fine arts departments participating, the production is "one big team effort," according to Lois Tobin, drama director of the musical and dramatics teacher at John Glenn.

Other faculty members involved in the musical include Bruce Graden as the vocal music director and Norm Logan as orchestra director. Jerry Thomas, a dramatics teacher in stagecraft and mime, is considered the producer and looks the part, cradling a stopwatch and wearing a nervous frown.

The art and graphics departments under the direction of Roy Hocking have made tickets and programs as well as advertising tents and T-shirts emblazoned with "Oklahoma," worn by many of the cast during rehearsal.

Much of the credit for the extensive publicity including radio spots goes to student teacher Jim Szabo.

The majority of the student cast comes from drama or music classes, including band and choir. Some are younger brothers or sisters of past John Glenn students who are carrying on the family musical tradition.

THE ENTIRE CAST will sing and dance, breaking a custom of separate choruses.

"There's less confusion on the stage which makes a better show," explains Dolores Newsom, who plays Ado Annie. Mar-

garette Woods, dance teacher at John Glenn, is the choreographer of the show.

Although the drops are rented, all the scenery and props have been made by students with one exception. "The surrey, which was our biggest problem," says Diann Urbaniak, student stage manager, "had to be taken apart and rebuilt on stage to get into the auditorium." Last summer, Carl Holston, a Westland fireman, rebuilt the surrey for the production.

Mrs. Tobin is enthusiastic about the smokehouse set designed by students Mark Norwick and Leo Minot. "It wasn't easy finding a police calendar (a pin-up circa 1890)," adds Mrs. Tobin.

The students seemed to enjoy working at a frenetic pace while packing as much fun as possible into rehearsals. "Besides being able to express my talents, I get to meet a lot of people I never knew in school," says Leo Minot, Father Carnes.

Dolores Newsom adds: "It brings the fine arts departments closer together and brings pride in your school."

SOMEWHAT DEFENSIVE about the production, the students believe it is just as important as athletics. They must sell enough tickets to break even and pay for other plays produced throughout the year.

Chester Jacques, in the lead as Curly, refers to himself as "a drama jock," and Pam Wallace, Aunt Eller, likes to perform "for myself and pride in my school."

"No one ever says they have the greatest fine arts department instead of the greatest football team," says Warren Fuller, Jud, "but we think we do. In a production like this you learn to take constructive criticism and work with other people together."

Bicentennial exhibit to open

Pioneer Middle and Smith Elementary are the first schools in Plymouth Community School District to be featured in the "Spotlight on School Bicentennials" exhibits in the Plymouth Historical Museum.

During the 10-week display series, schools will share some of their American heritage projects with the community through exhibits in the historical museum on S. Main at Church streets.

Displays by Pioneer and Smith schools may be seen in the museum from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. today (Thursday) and on Saturday, March 27, and from 1-5 p.m. Sunday, March 28.

During this spotlight week, students from the display schools will have free admission to the museum when accompanied by a paying adult.

BICENTENNIAL projects have been a unifying theme for study and school activities at both schools throughout this anniversary year.

Each hall at Pioneer features laminated pictures of different themes from U.S. history. Two barnwood bulletin boards constructed in the halls are being covered with antique utensils and tools from rural Michigan, Ohio and West Virginia.

One study, stressing Indians as "The First Americans," uses a simulation game called "Discovery" to emphasize the hardships of early settlers, by trying colonial metal crafts and soap making, rug hooking and macramé, and by preparing and sampling early American food.

THE PIONEER Education Fair in May will have a bicentennial theme, and gifts to the learning resource center have expanded the school's collection of American history books.

Daily public address announcements and student "radio programs" include historical events. A large hall calendar depicts historical happenings.

Students have viewed the film "1776" and have listened to a bicentennial choral group. A "colonial dinner" was held, featuring food, costumes and games from the past. The spring courtyard contest will include old-fashioned flower and rock ar-

rangements as colonial displays. And to advertise patriotic school spirit—and earn some project money—the student council is selling bicentennial bumper stickers with Pioneer's name.

SMITH ELEMENTARY also has made the bicentennial a daily part of learning.

As students enter the building, they walk down Independence Way and branch off into Yorktown Tollroad, Lexington Turnpike, Valley Forge Trail and Bunker Hill Lane—heritage names now given to school hallways. Each classroom also has chosen an historical name ranging from Fanuel Hall to Prescott Place.

School activities include a monthly estimation contest: guess the number of cherries in the jar, guess the weight of the tea in the old Boston ship, etc. The fifth grade "radio station" reports each morning from the past, featuring bicentennial news and songs.

Smith also is trying to light 200 candles on a giant bicentennial birthday cake outside the media center. Each pupil who contributes a paperback book to the center's collection places a candle with his name on the cake.

Individual class projects are featured in the museum display. Second graders have built a Liberty Bell from pennies and one dollar, and a pom pon wall hanging honoring Smith's 25th anniversary; fifth graders have made a rug with a U.S. map woven in yarn; third graders have created Revolutionary era dioramas, reconstructed historical sites from cardboard and made life-size self portraits of themselves as Minute Men; fourth graders have made bicentennial mobiles and dioramas of famous Americans; first graders drew pictures as they listened to "Yankee Doodle"; and kindergartners talked about the different Revolutionary War flags and then made flags for display.

FUTURE PROJECTS include colonial stitching, completion of several bicentennial wall hangings, and quilting with each child making one square. The "Spotlight on School Bicentennials"

is being coordinated by the Community Bicentennial Commission, Plymouth Historical Museum and administration of Plymouth

Community School District. Members of the Plymouth Newcomers Club are helping transport and set up the displays.

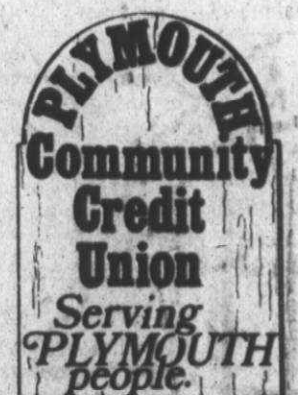

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MEA wants variable tax to guarantee school funds

The Michigan Education Association, the union which represents 84 per cent of the state's public school teachers, wants the state to have authority to raise or lower the personal income tax in mid-year in

order to guarantee funding to local school districts.

MEA's proposal would require the legislature to grant tax rate adjustment authority to the governor's bureau of the budget and management.

The proposal is designed to correct recession-year problems in which state revenues fall short of projections and budgets have to be cut.

THE PLAN was unveiled Tuesday by MEA executive Herman Coleman at the Detroit Press Club.

Coleman said the guarantee would apply only to the education portion of the state budget. He took "no position" on whether other services should be given similar guarantees.

The process would work like this: State policy would be that "the state income tax rate shall be adjusted during the fiscal year to assure that the educational appropriations passed by the state legislature shall be paid in full."

"Procedurally, the bureau of budget and management in consultation with the state treasurer, each 60 days, would determine if revenue forecasts were accurate and if education funds appropriated could be paid in full and on schedule.

"In the event they could not, the bureau would notify the treasurer what the adjusted income tax rate for the current year would be, and collections would increase 60 days thereafter to insure prompt and full payment of educational appropriations for the balance of that year."

COLEMAN SAID the system would protect schools from serious errors in the

budgeting process, protect college students from mid-year tuition increases, and protect property owners from "unexpected but necessary and repeated efforts to raise local millage rates."

No bill to implement such a system has been introduced in the legislature, and Coleman ruefully admitted MEA's batting average on legislative proposals has been slipping in recent years, despite the growing numbers of former educators among the ranks of lawmakers.

He said Florida has begun to take such a step, but the change is otherwise unprecedented.

AMONG TAX ECONOMISTS, the idea of adjusting tax rates in mid-year is far from novel. It has long been advocated as a method for allowing government to adjust quickly to problems of recession and inflation.

The chief reason the system has never been adopted at either federal or state levels, however, is that it involves the legislature's giving the executive some leeway in adjusting tax rates without legislative approval. Legislative bodies are traditionally jealous of their authority to change tax rates.

MEA's plan is different from the usual ideas because it suggests the legislature place no limits on the executive's authority to adjust tax rates — only that the legislative appropriation be funded in full.

What guarantee would there be that the legislature wouldn't appropriate to the skies and stick the governor with the dirty job of levying the appropriate tax rate? Coleman responded: "The governor has a veto power."

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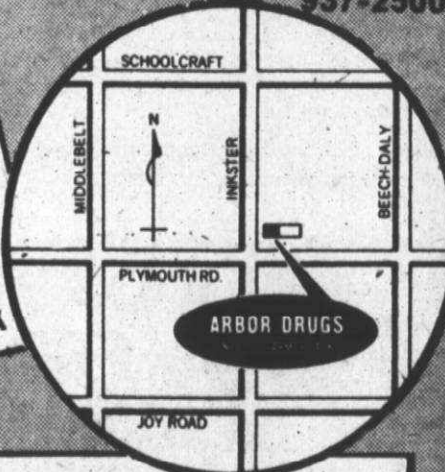

The Stroller

Bring back old campaigns

Never one to yearn for a return to what folks refer to as the good old days, The Stroller is beginning to weaken.

No, he doesn't want to return to such things as a Saturday night bath in a wooden tub in the kitchen. And he would be horror-stricken at the very thought of returning to the days before we enjoyed indoor plumbing.

But after looking and listening to the various presidential candidates on the tube for the past month, he'd like to have the politicians go back to the practice of "stumping" the various sections of the country by speaking from the rear platforms of the passenger trains along the line.

THOSE WERE THE days when folks flocked to the railroad sidings in their home towns and stood, sometimes for hours, awaiting the moment when the candidate appeared in person and delivered his message.

There was something dramatic about those appearances. As the train usually backed into the railroad siding, there was a straining of necks and eyes before the shout went up: "There he is!"

And when the candidate did appear in the flesh—whether Democrat or Republican—a loud cheer rent the air.

No matter what sort of message he delivered, the townspeople went away happy in the thought that they had seen him in person. And the very sight of him was a memory that carried through the years.

ALL THIS IS lost in the present campaign as the candidates appear on the screen. There is something about seeing the candidate, regardless of the quality of the TV picture, that makes it like looking at a movie. After looking and listening almost every night, the "movie" seems more or less like a re-run. As they go through their gesutres, a fellow is inclined to say to himself, "I've seen this before," then turn off the set and retire to something else. There are no lasting memories.

It was different when the Stroller was a lad in the Pennsylvania Dutch country. Presidential elections were taken in the same light as the big tent shows. We couldn't wait until they came to our town.

Though it was quite a while ago, it seems like only yesterday that The Stroller stood for more than an hour in the old Central railroad yard waiting for the train to come so he could get a good look at Teddy Roosevelt.

At the time the man whose first claim to fame was his historic charge up San Juan

hill in the Spanish-American War was trying to regain the presidency he had given to William Howard Taft.

Irked at the way things had been going, Teddy launched what he called the Bull Moose Party. Back and forth across the country, he travelled by train (there were no planes in those days) and he seemed to stir the people to new heights with his oratory and his cry to "speak softly but use a big stick."

He was a sight to behold. Wearing what we knew as "nose pinchers," he waved his arms and shouted. The picture of him has lived through the years.

He didn't win. But he kept Taft from another term in the White House, and we got the scholarly Woodrow Wilson, who led the nation through World War I.

These are the types of memories you don't get on TV today. You don't see the candidate in the flesh, and looking at him on the screen night after night is like looking at an old movie.

That's why The Stroller is weakening. He's like a return to the old days—just for presidential elections.

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Gifted should be grouped together

Bright and gifted children should be permitted to begin school earlier, skip grades and enter college at age 16 if they are qualified, a University of Michigan educator maintains.
 "We've got to break the educational lock-

step," says education Prof. Warren A. Ketcham, "that groups youngsters according to age instead of learning ability."
 "We have basically the finest educational system ever created," Ketcham contends. "But for the gifted, it is in danger of becoming too rigid and bureaucratic. The schools must incorporate more flexibility, diversity and choice."
 "The challenge, however, begins at home. Even as an infant, the gifted child will be larger and stronger than others in

his age group. He will walk and talk earlier, ask and notice more about his surroundings, act more independent and need less rest."

PARENTS CAN provide a stimulating home environment at little or no cost, Ketcham says. "Many things a family discards can be tools in the hands of a gifted child: old clocks and radios, wood scraps, dress-up clothing, and picture magazines, such as National Geographic and Look."

The U-M professor favors the simplest toys: paper, scissors, crayons and paste. "In general, the more expensive and elaborate a toy is, the less educational it is," he believes. "The creativity and challenge is taken out of it."

"Gifted children are probably the most appropriate candidates for preschool education. We have tended toward the opposite view, creating programs for slow learners and youngsters from deprived environments. But at an early age, the gifted have the need and capacity to expand their world beyond the home and family."

KETCHAM BELIEVES bright children should be allowed to skip a grade or two in order to associate with students who are their intellectual equals. "Among all the programs that have been proposed for the gifted, acceleration requires no changes in curriculum or teaching methods, no extra cost, and the effects are immediate."

He urges, however, that secondary school curriculums be made more flexible.

"For example, one Michigan high school has split the traditional sophomore-junior-senior English classes into 29 electives; literary criticism, speech, mass media, reading skills, theater arts. All youngsters need choice and diversity, but especially the gifted."

"Most experts agree that the gifted child is capable of self-determination at 12 or 13—six to 10 years earlier than the average person. All too many youngsters become frustrated with the system by this point, and hit the open road. The basis of a sound home and school environment must be laid during the first 10 years; after that point, it may be too late."

BRIGHT AND gifted children represent two to five per cent of the population, Ketcham says. Why should such a tiny minority rate special attention?

"Because these are the people who are going to contribute a very important category of ideas—not just technological inventions, but social and scientific philosophy that will give our culture a sense of purpose. They are the Einsteins, the Edisons, the Emersons."

"Through their own intellectual strength, they will follow their own destinies. But in a world as large and complex as this one, we cannot leave this to chance."

"When you are talking about only two to five per cent of the population," Ketcham says, "think what it means to lose just one?"

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Resident helped Ford build Village

(Part I)
Few Greenfield Village visitors are aware that Plymouth's connection with the international attraction goes beyond the two buildings Henry Ford purchased here

and relocated in Dearborn. The man who proposed the idea of the village to Ford; who supervised the dismantling, moving and restoration of every historic building in the Village; and who was a "partner" with Ford in making Greenfield Village the most extensive exhibit of Americana in Michigan, was a well-known Plymouth resident until his death here in 1961.



EDWARD J. CUTLER moved to Plymouth, from what is now Westland, in 1937.

He and his wife, Winifred, and their five children lived in a two-story brick home at 8969 Ridge Road near the corner of Joy. A native of London, Ont., Cutler never attended high school but he did further his education at art academies in Cincinnati and Chicago. His goal was to design stained glass

windows. He was in that business for six years in Ontario and in Vancouver, B.C.

In 1915, Cutler took a job as a "roustabout" at Ford's Highland Park plant. One day his talent with glass was revealed when he took over from some workmen who were having difficulty cutting and fitting a plate glass window. It wasn't long before he was chief of glass maintenance of the Ford Motor Company.

Later, Cutler was transferred to the drafting department. While in that department, he drew wiring diagrams and cut-away drawings for Ford's Model T. He designed safety fenders for the Fordson tractor. He designed the interior of an airplane built by Ford's Stout Metal Airplane Company for Charles A. Lindbergh. His work even extended to the movie field; he did the tiling and retouching for the motion picture company Ford owned from 1919 to 1922.

IN 1923, Cutler was moved to the Dearborn plant. About that time, Henry Ford wanted an old wooden windmill restored. It stood on his parent's estate at the corner of Ford Road and Greenfield.

Ford was directed to Cutler who did the work for him. They got along so well together that from then on Cutler worked personally for Ford until the automotive tycoon died in 1947.

"I had been brought up in several different trades and I guess I had what Ford wanted," Cutler told a reporter in 1960. "He was my best friend. Oh, we fought, yes, but we understood each other."

Ford hated long, written explanations of things. We hit it off because, instead of writing things out, I would sit down with him on the ground and draw a sketch in the sand of what I was trying to do.

During Cutler's early days with Ford, he supervised the repair and restoration of antiques, including tools, equipment and output of artisans of the past. Cutler's office was in a corner of the old tractor building in Dearborn. The structure was then being used by Ford to house his growing collec-

tion of ancient artifacts.

The only heat in Cutler's office was from a round baseburner. There was no telephone. Ford visited Cutler almost every day, either to talk about projects Cutler was working on, or merely to hide.

"Ford would put his feet up on the baseburner, tip his chair back, and just chew the fat," recalled Mr. Cutler.

It was during one of Ford's daily sessions with Cutler, around the baseburner, that the idea for Greenfield Village was born. Cutler, acutely aware that the building would soon be flooded with old equipment coming in from all parts of the country, asked Ford:

"Hadden't we better find another place to put these things? In another month or two we won't have any space left to sit down in."

Ford conceded that something should be done and began talking of the kind of building they would need. Cutler, who had something else in mind, said:

"Don't put them in a building. Put them in a natural setting."

"What do you mean," asked Ford.

"In a village," replied Cutler. Ford immediately liked the idea and told Cutler to begin looking for a site.

AFTER A WEEK'S search a place was agreed on.

"It was just an old field, mostly flat and crossed by a dirt road," Cutler told a National Geographic writer in 1958. "But Ford was already re-creating it in his mind's eye. We'll put a church on this little knoll, and the town hall over there, and the school along the edge of the green..."

Cutler immediately drew a quick sketch of the village on a photo of the airport which once stood on the field; it was from that sketch that Greenfield Village eventually took shape.

Ford began to acquire old buildings representative of America of the past. As each building was acquired, it was Cutler who supervised the dismantling of it and the reconstruction of it at Dearborn.

Only after the building was completely reconstructed at the Village would Ford make up his mind where he wanted it placed. Cutler never tried to second-guess his boss on that score. On one occasion, he recalled, Ford had made a contractor in Saline move a building 40 feet after it was on its foundation.

MSU offers program

High school juniors who excel in science have a chance to tackle high-level courses on the Michigan State University campus this summer, in MSU's High School Honors Science Program.

Students will have a chance to conduct research in biology, biochemistry, computer science, engineering or physics.

"The program is sponsored by the National Science Foundation with colleges in most states," said Charles Peebles, director of the program. "MSU's program appeals to students because it offers both lecture classes and a chance for laboratory research."

The program will run from June 20 to July 29. Students will attend morning lectures in various areas of science. They will spend afternoons and evenings working with MSU faculty on research projects in campus labs.

Students may work on a faculty member's established research project, or may develop their own research topics.

"Last year, the students worked on everything from the water quality manage-

ment project, to nuclear research and computer graphics, Peebles said.

"The purpose of our program is enrichment," he added. "We try to present new and unique experiences and not repeat material normally presented in the senior year of high school."

After completing the program, many of the students return to their home schools and work on science curriculum development or as teaching assistants.

Cost for students is \$420 for the six-week program. Additional funds are provided by the National Science Foundation.

Students demonstrating need may qualify for financial assistance.

To be eligible, a student should be a high school junior in the top 10 per cent of high school classes, and have completed three years of work in high school mathematics and two courses in science.

Interested students should contact Peebles at the Science and Mathematics Teaching Center, E-37-McDonell Hall, Michigan State University, East Lansing 48824. All applications for admission must be postmarked by April 1 to be given full consideration.

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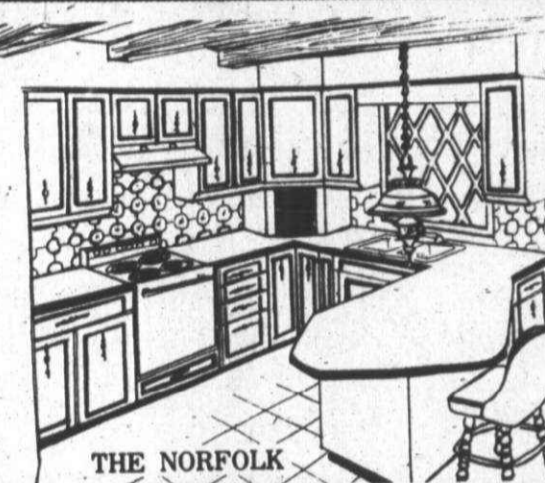
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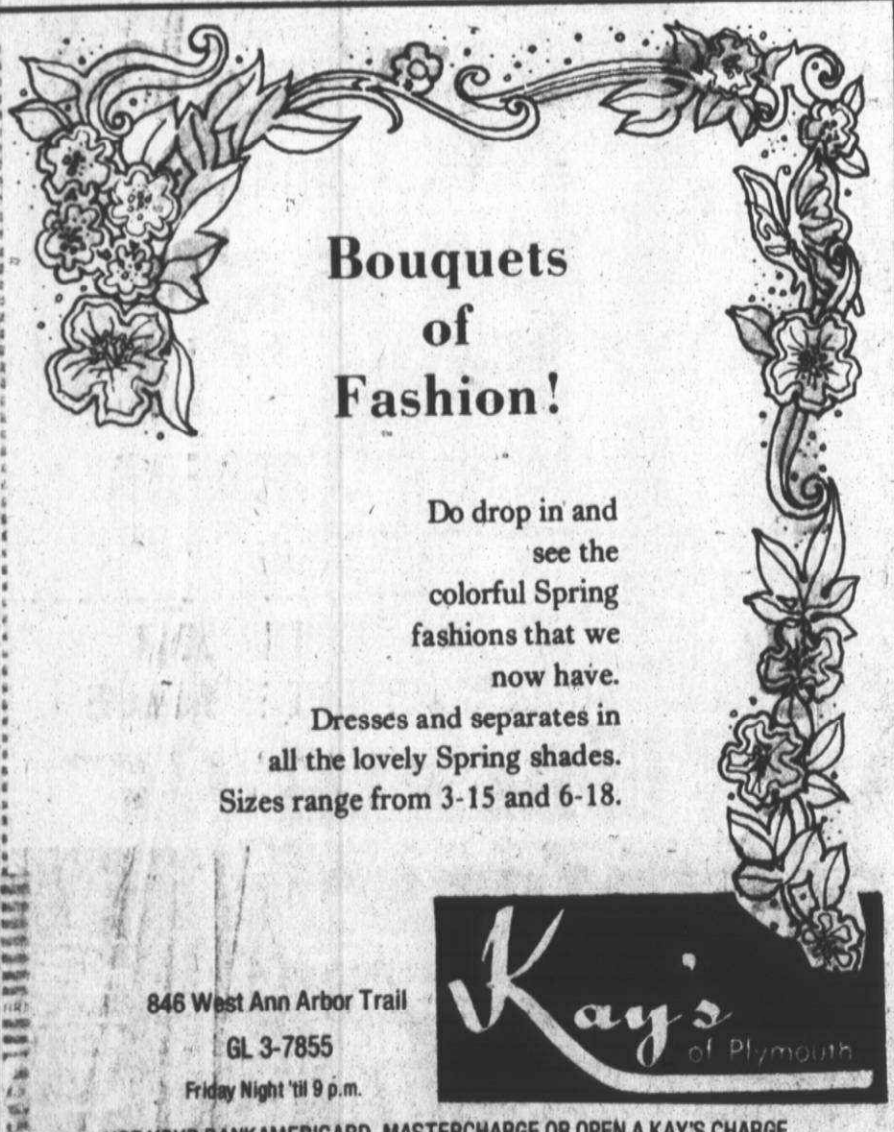
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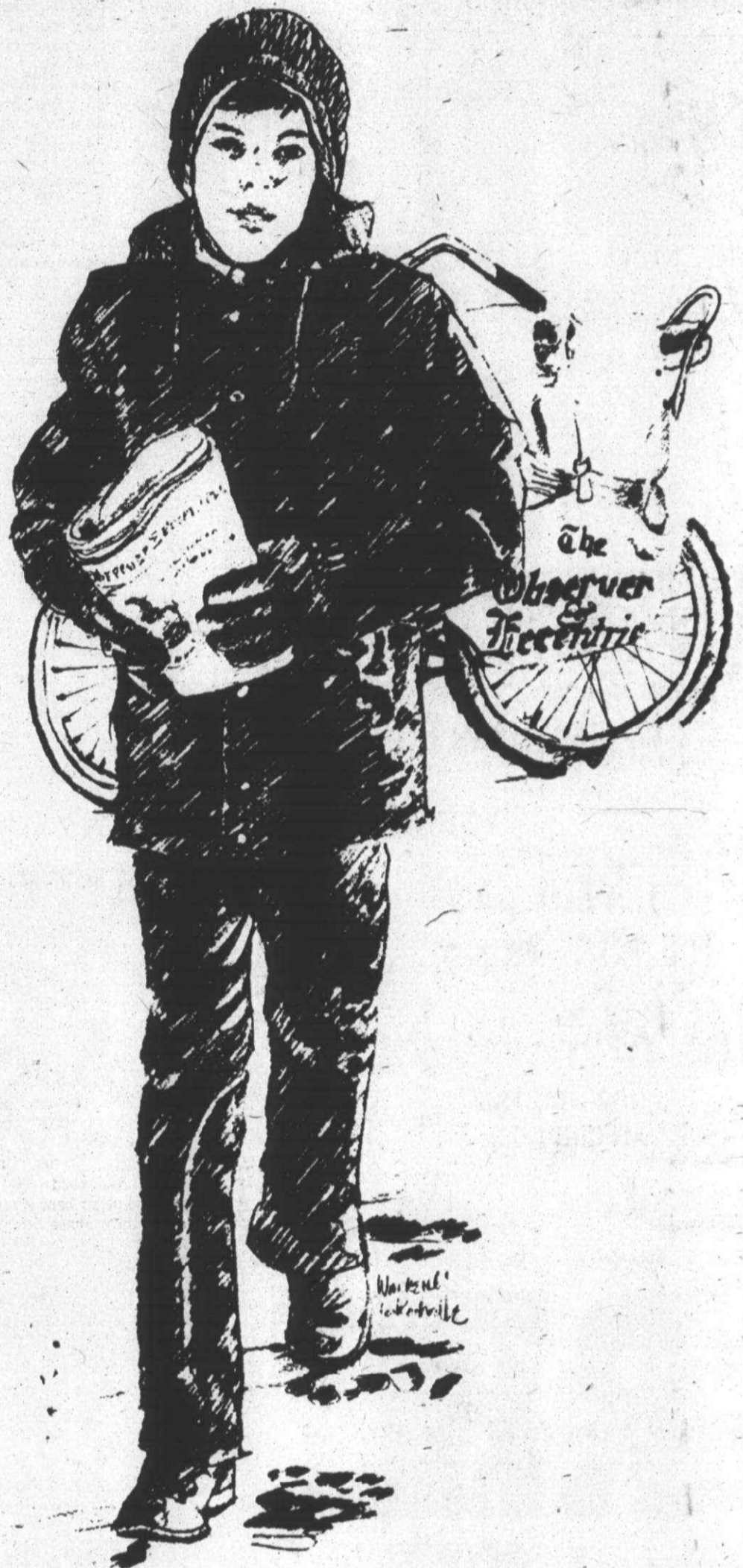
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Are you interested in information about solar energy and don't know where to turn?

Ask Consumers Power Company, suggests James P. Thomas, division manager for the utility. He says homeowners, businessmen and industrialists who want to learn how solar energy might help meet their heating and cooling needs can contact the West Wayne Division's energy consulting services department.

If there is information the local representative can't provide, he can turn to the company's full-time solar energy expert at the utility's headquarters in Jackson.

"Consumers Power is both a gas and an electric company. The use of solar energy to supplement space-heating needs may someday help relieve limited natural gas supplies for applications better suited to gas. Solar energy can supplement electricity and someday might help level our peak loads. That's why we're interested," Thomas said.

Eugene J. Yehl, a Consumers' general power service engineer with 25 years at the company, is assigned to keep abreast of solar energy developments in Michigan, the nation and abroad. Yehl has been providing detailed information on solar energy to each of the company's 15 consulting services departments since October.

Can solar energy ever be used effectively in Southeastern Michigan, given Michigan's climate and long winters?

Yehl energy is a diluted form of energy for Michigan much of the year," he says. "But while we at Consumers Power recognize its limitations here, we think that it will be an important part of our total energy supply in the future."

To help gather data on solar energy, the company is testing a small solar heat collector built by one of its Flint area employees. Consumers Power also is interested in the performance of other solar energy installations in three Michigan homes and six commercial and educational establishments.

Here is what Yehl sees as the evolution of solar energy in Michigan:

"First, we will have very small, relatively inexpensive units sold by retail stores or made by home handymen to tie in with existing home heating systems to boost hot water systems and pool heating—probably in the next five years.

"Then, perhaps within 10 years, there will be applications for space heating, with solar energy used as a partial input either into conventional systems or into heat pumps. These will be in residential, commercial and industrial buildings."

As an example of commercial or industrial use, Yehl mentions a building proposed for Denver, Colo., in which three concentric domes will be used, with the middle dome like a membrane that can either reflect or absorb the sun's heat. The membrane would be pumped up by air in the summer to reflect sunlight off the top dome, and lowered in winter to allow sunlight to heat air beneath the top dome.

"The third phase, around the year 2000, would be in the generation of energy for central power," Yehl continues. "With what we know now, however, it isn't reasonable that something like this will work in Michigan. But there really is so little we know now."

Another future use in Michigan might be in solar cells, Yehl says. Photovoltaic cells convert sunlight directly to electricity. "The technology is developing," Yehl

says, "but we are quite far away from anything usable." Again he mentions the year 2000.

A solar cell now costs about \$30,000 for each kilowatt of electricity it can generate, about 25 times the cost of electricity generated with conventional systems. And solar cells are about only one-fourth as efficient as steam generation of electricity. "The federal government doesn't see any cost breakthrough before 1985," Yehl says.

Far in the future is a solar collector in orbit, with sunlight converted to electricity and transmitted to earth by laser, according to Yehl.

Solar energy may also be used someday for air conditioning and refrigeration, Yehl notes, but higher temperatures must first be achieved with solar energy collectors.

"Estimates are that solar energy, as a supplement to heating systems in Michigan, could amount to approximately 25 percent of total annual heating requirements. The current state of the art, however, is such as to make this economically unattractive. It is in the area of equipment costs and installation that a breakthrough is needed and research, we hope, can pay off," says another consumers researcher.

Solar energy has already drawn the attention of tradesmen and contractors in Michigan. Yehl will give a presentation on solar energy at the Annual Conference of the Plumbing Inspectors Association of Michigan April 22-24 in Lansing.

Thomas concludes, "Homeowners, businessmen, industrialists and tradesmen who

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There is a 3rd alternative on land-use plan

The Canton Township Board is to be commended for its decision to put the master land use plan before voters May 18 ballot as an advisory question.

Much has been assumed about popular support of this plan, and little been proven.

While government should not be in the business of polling the electorate every time it is faced with a controversial issue, here is a case where more public input is needed.

If the public hearing conducted March 1 can be considered evidence, it would be fair to say the farmers, almost without exception, vehemently oppose the plan, which would leave the western half of the township agricultural. They would prefer to sell their land for the higher dollar development will bring and move on.

BUT WHAT OF homeowners in the eastern half of the township?

Up to now, it seems that the administration which has so strongly supported this plan has assumed subdivision dwellers favor it, too, because it would provide open space and a rural atmosphere close to their homes.

But where that belief comes from is unclear.

Possibly the township's mid-decade census can be cited as evidence to back such an assumption.

More than 95 per cent of those who answered the optional part of the census favored retention of agricultural land.

And why not? The census might as well have asked whether Cantonites favor apple pie and motherhood. How many people would say they prefer asphalt and smog to clean air and open space?

What the census failed to ask is how dearly the people prefer to save agricultural land. At what price and how strongly do they endorse such a goal?

SIMPLY PUT, the language of any survey or advisory ballot can easily determine the outcome of the vote.

On Tuesday night, after much debate, the township board decided to put two plans before the

voters in the advisory ballot.

The people will be asked whether they approve of a plan formulated in 1974 that would provide for full urbanization of the township, or whether they approve of the new plan which would provide for "half urbanization" of the township, leaving land west of Canton Center undeveloped for continued farming.

The people will have a choice of answering yes or no on both plans; the inference is that if they say no to both, it will mean they disapprove of both.

Supervisor Robert Greenstein says such a ballot is fair because there is no middle ground between the two plans.

He says the western half of Canton will either be fully developed or not at all.

WHAT MUST BE MADE clear to voters is that they endorsing a particular plan—not a vague concept—if they vote yes.

The difference between the plans is a philosophical one; because someone favors retention of agricultural land, it does not mean that person favors all details of the new plan.

When voters go to the polls, they should remember what the cost of the new plan is going to be. Many farmers are going to be hurt.

Thus, there is a third alternative: Let the people pay for the agricultural land and buy the development rights now.

The land will never be cheaper. Developers have estimated the value of land in the west at \$3,000 to \$7,000 an acre when it is developable.

More than 6,000 acres will be retained for commercial farming under the new plan.

Why not ask the voters on the advisory ballot a third question: Would they be willing to pay the difference between what the land would be worth as development property and farmland? A rough estimate would be that it would cost the people in the township three mills over 10-15 years.

This would avoid having the farmers shoulder the burden of the new plan if it is approved by the sheer numbers of those living in the subdivisions.

City, suburbs: chances to cooperate

Detroit's Mayor Coleman Young spoke last Sunday to all the suburbs. Although his speech was delivered only to some 200 parishioners of Birmingham Unitarian Church, his words and the attitude behind them should be read and pondered by every thinking suburbanite.

His plea was for understanding, conciliation, cooperation. His method was to examine the model by which relations between the core city and the suburbs is usually described, as a doughnut in which a ring of mostly white and rich suburbs surround the squalor of a mostly black and poor Detroit.

Young's words rejected this notion in soaring language: "There is no way in hell or in heaven that the outer rim of suburbs can survive with any viability or health while a vacuum exists at the core. If the heart stops, the body dies. If the roots wither, the tree will fall.

"I'm speaking to you today from the roots. My future is your future, and yours is mine. The more we recognize that, the better we'll move forward together."

MAYOR YOUNG has not always taken this position.

Almost a year ago he attacked the suburbs bitterly in a speech to the Detroit Central Business District Association, demanding that the suburbs "get the hell out of the way" and let Detroit start a rapid transit system, and he roasted suburban developers for leading "raiding parties" to snatch tenants from downtown office buildings.

But last Sunday Young was prepared to admit that he himself has in the past been a source of conflict between the suburbs and the city.

"A sort of parent-child, love-hate element illustrates the relationship between the city and suburbs," Young said, comparing the relationship between the suburbs and Detroit to that between the 13 original colonies, loosely linked by the Articles of Confederation which reflected "the jealousy

and suspicion that has characterized some city-suburban relationships 200 years later."

In short, Mayor Young was making the old American argument that if we don't hang together, we'll surely all hang separately.

WHAT IS SIGNIFICANT about Young's speech is that it sets forth a new and constructive attitude on the part of Detroit.

What is needed now is some reciprocity from the suburbs. A number of possible areas exist.

First, suburban leaders and politicians can start saying openly what most of them really believe—that continued conflict between the suburbs and Detroit is in nobody's interest.

Birmingham's Mayor David Breck made a good start in introducing Young. "I have enough experience to know how effective government is when close to the people. Yet there is need for regional cooperation in water, air pollution, transportation and similar services. We must have a change of attitude. We must share. We must care."

This will not be easy. There are many vitally important issues on which the interests of Detroit and the suburbs are deeply at odds. The non-resident income tax on suburbanites working in Detroit is one; the rates, procedures and attitudes in the Detroit Water Board have become another.

But many suburban politicians have found in the past that a good way to get a good press in suburban newspapers is to blast Detroit at any op-

portunity. Cheap shots, however, are no substitute for reasoned leadership.

SECOND, there needs to be a deeper and wider recognition in both the suburbs and in the core city that there are important areas where their separate interests coincide. Nobody, for example, wants full-blown regional government, and everybody realizes that the entire metropolitan area needs a rapid transit system desperately.

Third, both sides must realize that although development of a spirit of cooperation is important, it will be nothing more than a vacuous platitude unless followed up with concrete results.

Given that a climate of suspicion does exist and that the realities of the issues separating the suburbs from the city are hard, concrete results will be difficult to obtain.

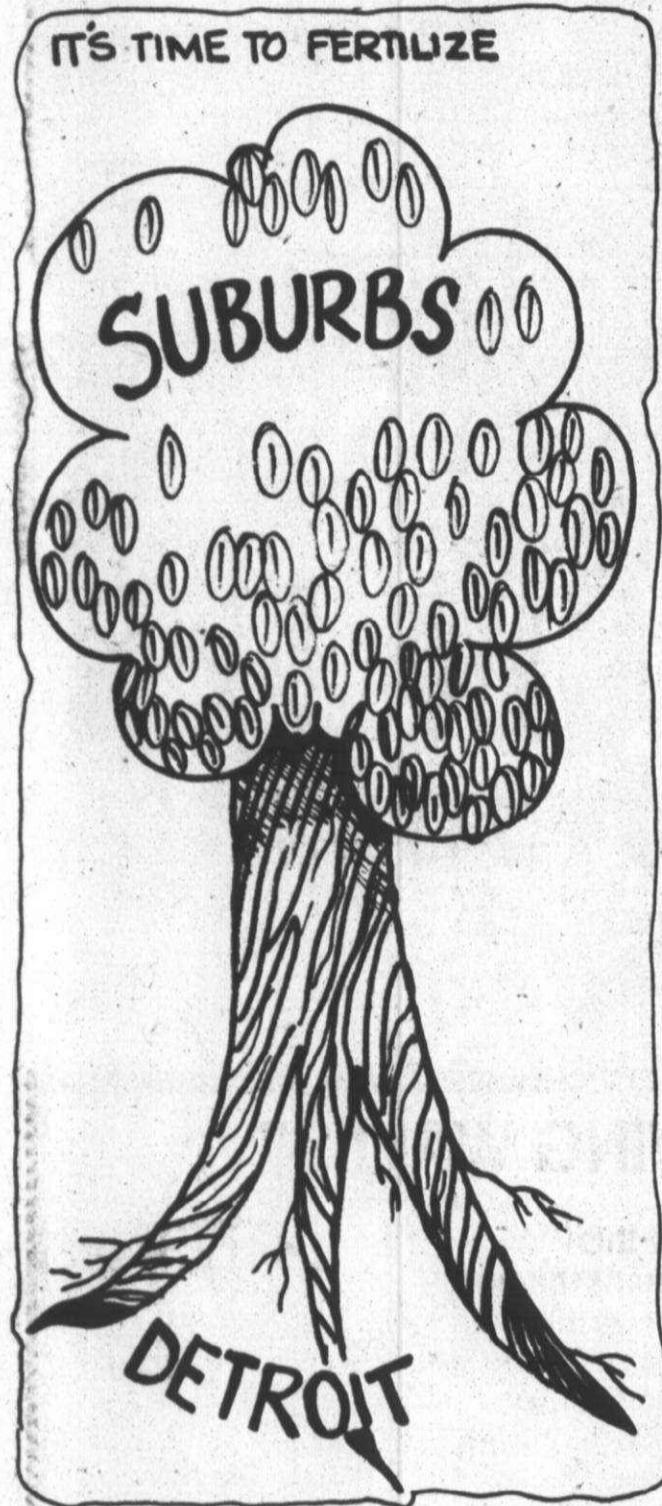
But a start can be made on some points where agreement should be within reach, such as suburban support for the Detroit Institute of Arts and the Detroit Zoo, which are heavily used by suburbanites but get their tax support from the City of Detroit.

Who knows? With a little courage and a lot of hard work, the suburbs and the city just might start to work together, which certainly would be a change for the better.

If you seek clean industry, help promote state tourism

In the state of Michigan, the automotive industry is the No. 1 job and revenue producer. Travel and tourism is No. 2.

The gross annual value of conferences, travel and tourism in Michigan is \$2.3 billion.

Approximately 400,000 jobs are directly related to travel and tourism, with additional jobs in allied categories.

TOURISTS—travelers, visitors, conference delegates—take no money out of the county, city, township or village. They bring it in, and for every \$12,000 they bring in, one new job is created in our state.

Tourism is a "clean" industry—no smoke stacks—requiring no social or welfare aid of any kind. Dollars brought into an economy by these visitors turn over approximately seven times.

When a conference is held, each delegate spends approximately \$137 in the area, in addition to conference dues and fees.

According to the National Delegate Expenditure Survey conducted by the International Association of Convention Bureaus, here's how an average visitor spends his or her money:

- Hotels, rooms and incidentals, \$33.50.
- Food in hotel restaurants, \$12.90.
- Food in other restaurants, \$12.60.
- Retail purchases, \$11.90.
- Beverages, \$5.59.
- Theaters, \$1.03.
- Local transportation, \$4.09.
- Sightseeing, \$1.50.
- Nightclubbing and sports activities, \$4.98.
- Auto service, gasoline and oil, \$6.
- Miscellaneous, \$5.98.

THERE ARE ABOUT 5,000 national and regional conferences scheduled each year, but the decisions on where to go are made two, three or even five years ahead.

Michigan's economy is based primarily on a cyclical industry, the automotive industry, which has its good years and its bad years.

Everyone concerned with the economy of the state has been trying to attract more stable industries, yet we have one right at our doorstep that brings in revenue without the need to expand police protection, schools, sewer and water systems, and so forth.

Everyone in the state and in our own area should be on the lookout for potential conventions that could be brought into the area. We have convention bureaus which can assist in the planning of conferences, in Detroit for the metropolitan area and in Pontiac for Oakland County.

If we were to become tourist ambassadors, we could help relieve the pressures on the need for increased taxes in the state.

The politics of transit: suburbs face a monolith

They're at it again in Lansing, playing games with the board apportionment of the Southeastern Michigan Transportation Authority.

Even though the new substitute bill by Sen. David Plawecki (D-Deerborn Heights) to "restructure" the SEMTA board repairs some of the damage Oakland County leaders had squawked about, the new version is still bad.

The issue is important to Oakland County.

The SEMTA board is going to decide whether a rapid transit system will go from downtown Detroit to some spot in the suburbs—such as Mount Clemens or Pontiac—or whether there will be three legs, all in downtown Detroit and stretching little further than Grand Boulevard.

PLAWECKI'S NEWEST gem would expand the SEMTA board from the present nine members to 15, and on a "one person, one vote" basis.

The way his formula works, Detroit would get five members, suburban Wayne County four, Oakland three, Macomb two and the smaller counties one. But the catch is in how the board members would be appointed.

Detroit's five members would be selected this way:

- 1) By the mayor of Detroit.
- 2) By the mayor of Detroit.
- 3) By the mayor of Detroit.
- 4) By the mayor of Detroit.
- 5) By the mayor of Detroit.

Oakland County's four members would be selected by this formula:

- 1) By the county board of commissioners.
- 2) By the governor.
- 3) By the Southeast Michigan Council of Governments.

In other words, the mayor of Detroit would have direct, 100 per cent control of Detroit's SEMTA board seats, but Oakland County would have direct, 100 per cent control over only one of its seats.

There's yet another flaw. While Detroit's chief executive has an exclusive role in picking SEMTA members, the Oakland County executive—whose job is analogous to a mayor's—is entirely ignored by Plawecki's bill.

If Oakland County gets bad treatment, subur-

ban Wayne County gets worse. Its first seat would be filled by the Wayne County Board of Commissioners, which has a majority of Detroit members; the second and fourth seats by SEMCOG; the third by the governor.

THE EFFECT of Plawecki's bill is to allow Detroit to present a solid, if not monolithic, political front; suburban strength would be diffused.

Moreover, Detroit would have the capability of filling vacancies much faster than the suburbs would.

The present formula for SEMTA representation is that six seats are filled by SEMCOG, a regional planning agency whose voting members are local elected officials, and three by the governor. There's really nothing wrong with that system.

In fact, it's an excellent system because it assures that SEMCOG—the agency charged by law with regional planning—has the clout to pick people who will implement its plans.

If SEMCOG is stripped of its power to pick SEMTA board members, SEMCOG could draft a regional plan that is fair to everyone, but a SEMTA board dominated by one city could toss the plan out the 16th floor window of its downtown office building and build an expensive subway that serves only Detroit, but which all of us will have the pleasure of paying for.

Oakland County's state senators and representatives had better be on the lookout for the new Plawecki bill. The senate leadership is trying to pass it by sneaking it through a tame committee. There's an awful lot at stake.

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1/2 -mill jail tax set for May 18 ballot

Wayne County voters will decide May 18 whether they will finance a new county jail with a proposed half-mill tax or force county commissioners to find other financial resources.

Judge Baum upholds county appointments

Wayne County Republicans won a battle in Lansing but lost a bigger one in circuit court.

After Republican Gov. William Milliken March 18 vetoed a legislative bill that would have allowed the Wayne County Board of Commissioners to make appointments to fill vacancies, Circuit Judge Victor Baum ruled that appointments are all right after all.

The GOP contended that state law requires that appointments made more than 180 days prior to a regular election be subject to a special election.

BAUM RULED March 19 that the statute gives commissioners the option of filling vacancies by appointment or by special election.

He turned down the request of Ernest C. Fackler, Wayne County Republican chairman, that the county be ordered to hold special elections to fill three vacancies.

The Wayne County board has filled all vacancies by appointment since the board of commissioners system became law in 1968.

"This is a victory for prudence and responsibility," declared Commissioner John Barr (D-Dearborn Heights), vice chairman of the board of commissioners.

THE BILL vetoed by Milliken would have clarified the point of controversy by allowing the county board clear authority to make appointments to fill vacancies.

Mitchell to speak to Sierra Club

Edward J. Mitchell, professor of business economics at the University of Michigan, will be the featured speaker at the March 31 general membership meeting of the Sierra Club's Detroit Group.

Legislative and outing reports will begin the meeting at 7 p.m. in the Science Museum auditorium of Cranbrook Institute of Science on Lone Pine Road in Bloomfield Hills.

The meeting is open to the public. Mitchell will speak at 8 p.m. on "United States Energy Policy: Is there One?—The Hard Facts and Fragile Realities." He is the author of books on U.S. energy policy.

If approved, the half-mill levy (50 cents per \$1,000 state equalized valuation of property) will cost the owner of a \$30,000 home about \$7.50 annually. The board resolution asking for the ballot proposal points out that the "pay as you go program would be in the best inter-

ests of Wayne County taxpayers," because of the additional interest cost that would be imposed by an alternate bond plan.

WHILE THE MILLAGE would generate about \$35 million over five years, the resolution contends a bond program would cost considerably in excess of \$50 million if financed on the long-term basis that would be necessary.

Commissioners unanimously approved the ballot proposal March 18 following a public hearing a day earlier when speakers said they would support a millage campaign for a new jail.

GRANT HUCKABONE, assistant director of administration of the county board, said commissioners are studying two alternatives to building a 400-prisoner detention facility within walking distance of the present jail.

"One plan calls for construction of a brand new facility; the other calls for renovation of the J.L. Hudson warehouse," said Huckabone. "There may also be another alternative—using county-owned land in Westland to build a new facility."

Huckabone said Westland representatives are against that alternative.

A "blue ribbon" citizens committee, appointed by former board Chairman Roscoe Bobo, will recommend one of the alternatives to the board by April 1.

PUBLIC REACTION at the hearing indicated citizens would allocate money for construction of a new jail rather than remodel a warehouse "constructed to store goods—not people."

Irate citizens, all from Detroit, told commissioners to "cut the rhetoric and get on with constructing a badly needed jail." "I am appalled and disgusted with pub-

lic officials of a city of this size," said Albert Abercrombe. "Nobody wants to build a jail, but everyone admits we need one. How else would we get the money other than a millage?"

Lonnie Peak, board chairman of the Concerned Citizens Council, asked commissioners if tax revenues would go toward building a new secure jail downtown or toward renovating a warehouse that, he said, "constructed to 'store goods—not people.'"

COMMISSIONER GEORGE Killeen (D-Detroit) questioned the idea of building a jail, saying that a new jail may not direct itself to rehabilitation.

"By building a jail, are we saying to society that our justice system is creating more criminals?" asked Killeen.

He explained that the overpopulation problem in Wayne County Jail can be temporarily solved by housing those arrested in local jails—providing they were not arrested for a violent crime.

Noting that a jail is a detention facility for those unable to post bond, speakers expressed concern for adequate humane treatment in the jails. "Until proven guilty, innocent people should be treated humanely," said Nadine Brown.

With excess prisoners now housed in Dehoco (Detroit House of Correction), building a new jail is a priority for Jean Washington.

A member of the Wayne County Jail task force, Mrs. Washington said that housing people in Dehoco is as bad as housing them in the overcrowded county jail.

"If you're going to ask me to buy an additional millage to build a new jail, then yes, I will pay for something that is going to last, but not for a remodeled warehouse," said Mrs. Washington.

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
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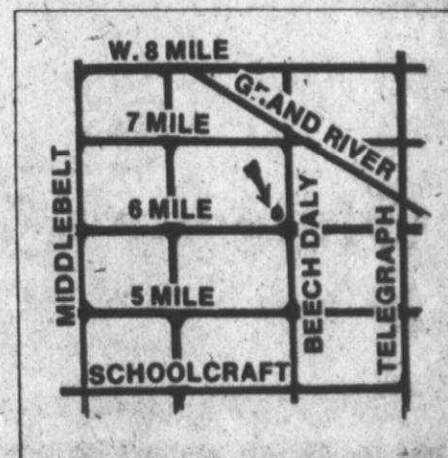
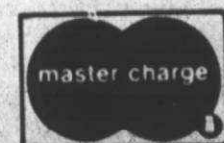
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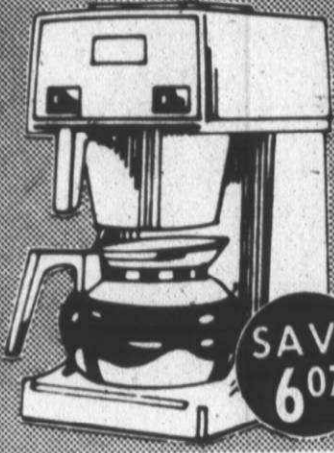
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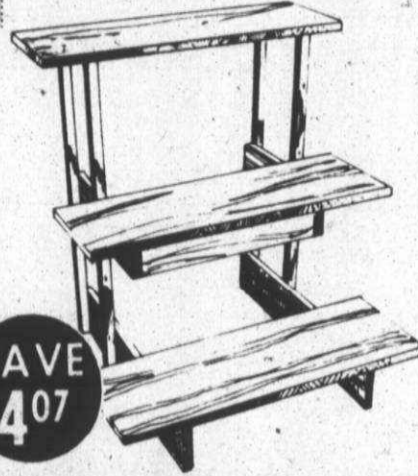
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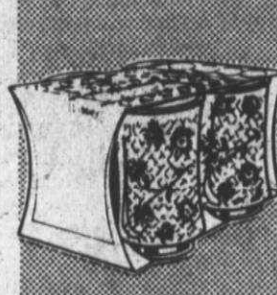
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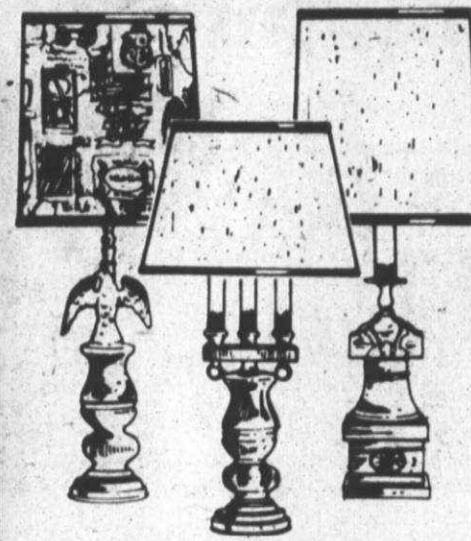
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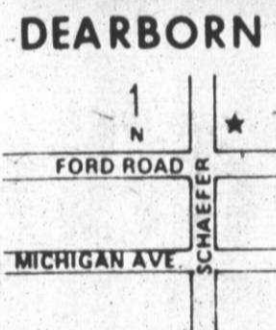
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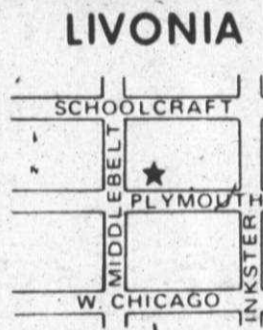
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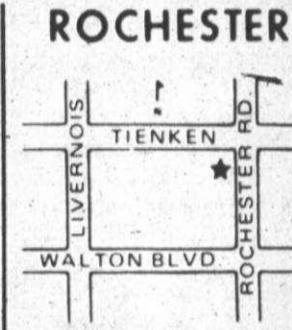

Rex Reed asks

'Where are the women in the movies today?'

Rex Reed, who views about 10 movies a week, claims that even with a spyglass "you can't find a woman in them these days."

To a predominantly female Livonia Town Hall audience he decried the fact that "today women are selling real estate, robbing banks, busting broncs and finding their way into positions of power everywhere but in movies."

The women who do turn up on celluloid are in Reed's opinion "whores, bird brains, emotional cripples or sex starved Lolitas."

And the visiting film critic had an explanation for the problem he had noted.

"Men who make films," he said, "are confused about society and the changing female roles, so they make buddy films defining men in macho terms and casting women as fantasy images."

He added: "The men in Hollywood are keeping women dependent on them for employment, and the women are fighting for scraps."

"When I was growing up, half the players were women. Whatever kind of woman you wanted to see, they were there. So I am tired of seeing only half the human

race in current films, so I watch them instead on the late show."

Reed regretted that movies portraying women in a realistic way have not been supported by women at the box office. Some of those which have been ignored, but which Reed found good, were "Happy Ending" with Jean Simmons, "Play It As It Lays" with Tuesday Weld, and "Up the Sandbox" with Barbara Streisand.

He observed that when film writer Eleanor Perry was asked to write a western, they called in a man to write the rape scene "because women don't know anything about rape."

He characterized Joanne Woodward as a fine actress looking for a job, and added that Shirley MacLaine is having heavy going trying to raise money for a movie about a woman flyer, Amelia Earhart.

"Hollywood is treating women so badly they are having to develop their own films," he commented. "No one is giving them a chance. Only three per cent of those in the industry are women. I'm tired of women being kept around just to keep the sheets warm."

Clearly, the movie industry was not in Reed's good graces that day for he added "the movie industry is falling apart."

He noted: "Someone makes a film and then disappears forever. The industry is in chaos. Films are made so that so many people are killed off, so many heads shot off. There is no character development. We never know why they are fighting each other."

"Where there was once romance, there is now only sex and violence. I am surfeited with films that do nothing but lower values."

He confessed to turning more and more to TV for the kinds of films he wanted to see, and was applauded when he mentioned his fondness for "Rich Man, Poor Man."

REVIEWING FILMS is not all Reed does. He also, in a sense, reviews film stars and other celebrities. Actually it is called an interviewing, but so intent is he on not passing on the legend that they are gods and goddesses that he makes a point of describing them as he finds them.

"Barbra Streisand didn't speak to me for five years," he said. And no wonder when you consider what he wrote about her in the New York Times.

He described an incident he witnessed in a Philadelphia museum where Streisand was taping a TV show, reading comic books and eating "everything that wasn't nailed down."

Late in the evening a knock came on the heavily guarded door. Behold, children had arrived to bring their idol some chick-

NOW president tells how lib helps women help each other

Since the founding of the Mid-Western Wayne County chapter of National Organization for Women (NOW) last March, Nan Frost Welmers, as president, has been giving an average of 36 hours a week to the feminist cause.

"Sisterhood is a nice word, though it's overused," Ms. Welmers told a Henry Ford Community College audience, "but we really do have to work for each other."

"What's In It For Me?" was the question she answered as she concentrated on the goals and achievements of NOW's action-oriented program and why Wayne County residents "from 18 to 65" are joining.

"One woman lost her job because they eliminated all the women in the police force of her community, and she turned to us," Ms. Welmers said.

A major priority of the local chapter is to stand behind women who complain about credit practices, she added. One member used the local chapter to pressure a firm that was not complying with recent credit laws, when they refused her credit because she signed her own name instead of her husband's.

Although she believes "consciousness-raising can be non-productive," Ms. Welmers also emphasizes the friendship and

support members receive from each other.

THE CHAPTER has dozens of task forces, each concentrating on a specific area affecting the women's movement, such as legislation, child-care, university compliance, credit, minority women, rape, and problems of older women. The membership of each chapter votes on priorities and doesn't necessarily follow the national lead.

Advertising has always been a special interest for NOW, she said.

"Those ring-around-the-collar ads are absurd," said Ms. Welmers. "He's got the ring and everyone looks at her." The public may regard advertising as a trivial concern, she said, but the NOW philosophy is that "attitudes will change only when behavior changes."

Putting pressure on advertisers to de-stereotype their commercials is one way to change images, especially television ads to which children are exposed.

Another NOW concern is women in industry. "There's a lot of tokenism in corporations," she stated. Illustrating her stand against misleading statistics, she says, "If a corporation has no women and they hire one, they declare a 100 per cent increase."

THE LOCAL chapter did an extensive

survey on abortion clinics in their area and "put the bad ones out of business because women were able to utilize our information," the speaker said.

NOW is especially proud of the work done on passing Michigan's precedent-setting rape law," she said, because "we want to be able to walk safely on city streets." She mentioned a rape outbreak of rapes in London, England, which parliament wanted to impose a 11 p.m. curfew for women. Feminist groups protested punishment of the innocent and wanted a curfew for men instead.

"We see real progress," said Ms. Welmers. "Women can finally get together. Hey, I'm not going to take it anymore."

MS. WELMERS and her husband of six years, Anthony, live in Dearborn with their two cats, Theodore and Jerry. She regards herself as a conservative in the movement and speaks of her job as a law-awards for North Central, along with some reluctance.

"People assume service employment is contradictory to feminism, but I enjoy my job and don't face too many conflicts." She's been seriously involved in the women's movement since 1968, once trying her hand at politics when she ran for Democratic primary to Lucille, though in

the Michigan House of Representatives election last fall.

Though she won't dismiss any political ambitions, in NOW she finds "leadership potential and a chance for self-reliance." She is involved in planning the national conference for April 1977 to be held at Cobo Hall in Detroit.

The national NOW has established the lesbian issue as their 77 priority. Recognizing that this issue frightens people, Ms. Welmers hopes local chapters will support lesbian feminists in their struggle for equal rights.

"There are women who are going through this alone," she explains, "and we have to ask ourselves if we can help them."

NOW CONSISTS of 700 chapters nationally with 80,000 members, Michigan chapters numbering 20. They have a paid lobbyist in Washington and hold a national conference every 18 months.

The Mid-Western Wayne County chapter holds meeting on the first Saturday of every month in the YWCA of Western Wayne County, 26729 Michigan, Inkster.

"Non-members are welcome," she said. "Feminists who are non-joiners can get the Metropolitan newsletter that covers six chapters for \$3 a month and keep in touch with what's going on."

In a response to a question at the Plymouth Meetinghouse luncheon and afterward, he won a number of hearts and minds when he put thumbs down on the movie, "Shampoo."

"I seem to be in the minority on this," he said. "I hated it. It was a phony and empty picture, and after I rapped it, Warren Beatty didn't speak to me."

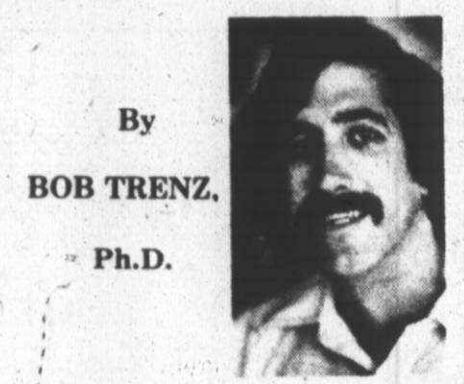
Cushioning the shock of divorce

Most married people are aware of the legal and social mechanics of a divorce. In fact that's what they usually think of when they consider divorce: incomprehensible legal papers, property settlements and custody disputes. But hardly anyone recognizes just how secondary these are to the real challenge of the splitting process: the emotional shock.

The trauma of sudden life changes, coping with new and challenging circumstances, a crisis a day, all come at a time when the divorcee's personal resiliency is at a low ebb. To the divorcing individual, even routine tasks seem more demanding. Getting through a day can be exhausting.

Yet, despite the inevitability and intensity of the traumatic emotional reaction to divorce, few anticipate it. Most are ill-prepared for the rawness and exhaustion that accompany breaking up, and thus a lot of added pain is caused by inadvertently over-taxing a strained mind.

FOR THE SAKE of financial convenience, for example, a divorcing couple might elect to live together as "room-mates" during the divorce, each going his own way as though each already were single.

While such an arrangement makes practical sense, it ignores the fact that emotional bonds are not swept aside so easily.

A painfully-explosive situation thus is set up, in which each is being devastated by the "single" actions of his or her partner, but neither can admit the hurt because it seems so irrational. Both are trapped and unnecessarily hurt because they ignore the increased emotional vulnerability that goes with the trauma of divorce.

This could hardly be more wrong. Divorce is a time of great emotional crisis, a time when personal feelings need more attention than usual. Instead of bullying his emotions with practical and logical concerns, the divorcing individual should give his needs for support, love, and solace more weight than ever.

He should treat himself as though he is suffering a temporary emotional emergency. He needs to take care of his tender wounds, to nurse himself back to emotional stability.

Divorcing individuals should reach out to their friends and family with their needs for tenderness. They should rely on the strength of these supporters, as it is offered. This is not the time for blind independence. It is a time of special need.

WITH A LITTLE extra care, in fact, many of the sources of divorce strain can even be minimized. When dealt with honestly, many creditors, for example, are willing to make special payment arrangements and thereby reduce some of the financial pressure. Child-care and home-maintenance help can often be obtained from family and friends, and that can provide much-needed relief from usual pressures.

Best of all, partners in a civilized divorce can be a great asset to each other by helping to prepare their spouse for their forthcoming self-reliance. Prospective ex-husbands can be taught to cook. Wives can be assisted in their efforts to become more employable.

REGARDLESS of the state of their marriage, divorcing partners must realize that they are still emotionally-intertwined and sensitive to each other.

Conducting the emotional divorce is like transplanting tender plants. Great care and gentleness is required to untangle roots where they have become enmeshed with the roots of neighboring plants.

If both partners are to be saved from unnecessary emotional damage, they need to carry out the untangling process with a lot of mutual consideration—perhaps even more than they were able to muster in their marriage.

A good general rule for minimizing the trauma of divorce is to proceed slowly with drastic life changes. Avoid a sudden uprooting of yourself and your kids. Much of the shock of divorce changes can be reduced to a manageable level when the changes are taken in phases. It also helps to keep at least one important part of your life stable. Don't change everything at once.

Finally, it's important to try as hard as you can to make your divorce the beginning of a better life. There is much to be learned from the mistakes your marriage and even from surviving the trauma of the divorce. This can be a very productive time for self-examination and for considering new directions.

Thinking about a divorce as a strictly negative event is one sure way to make it so. Surviving a divorce with a minimum of

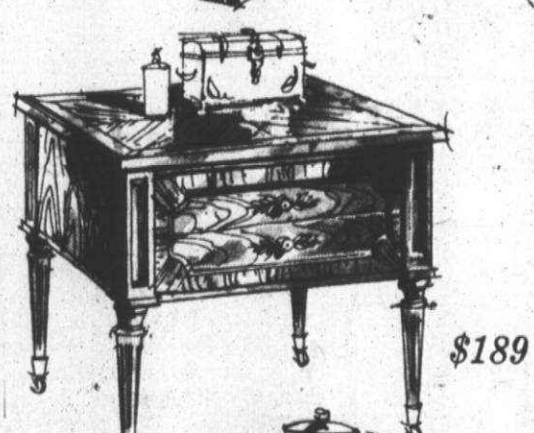
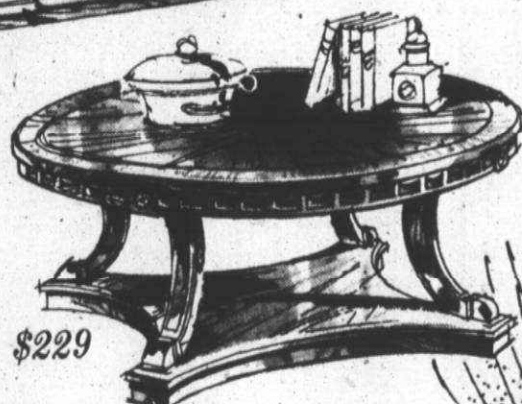
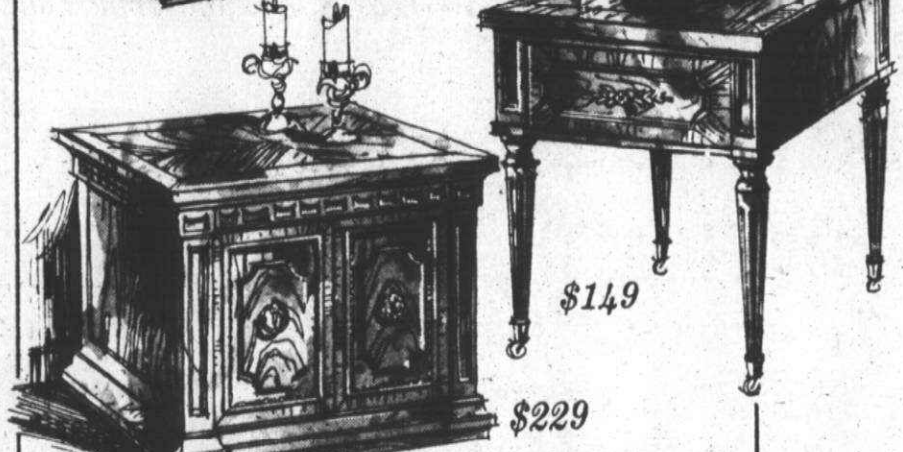
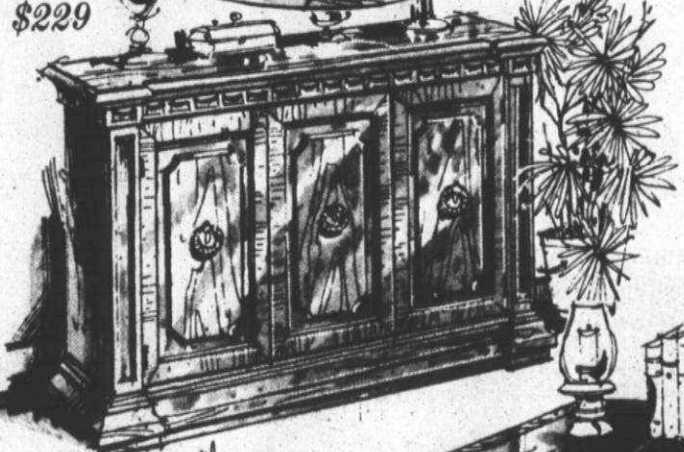
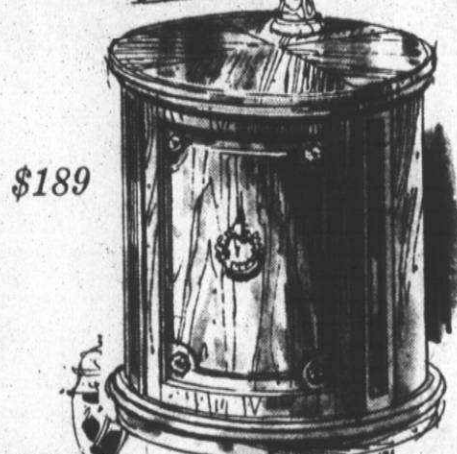
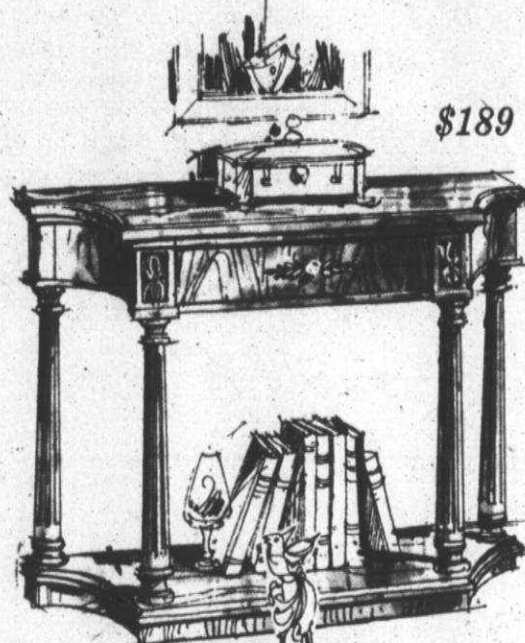
hurt feelings requires that divorcing individuals take an active part in influencing their future. It means promising to give

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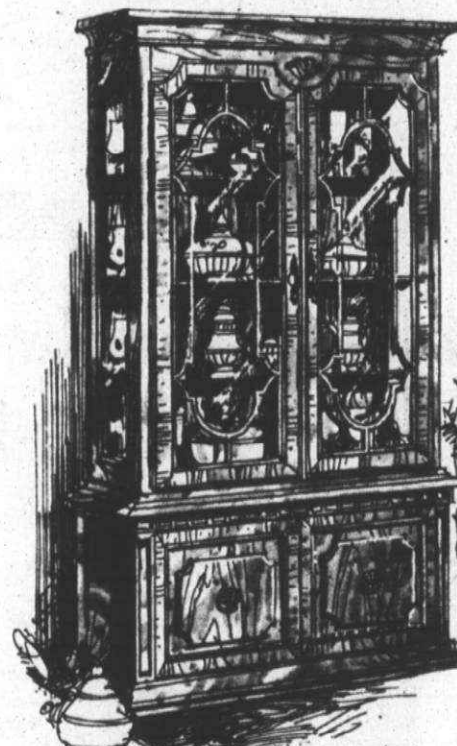
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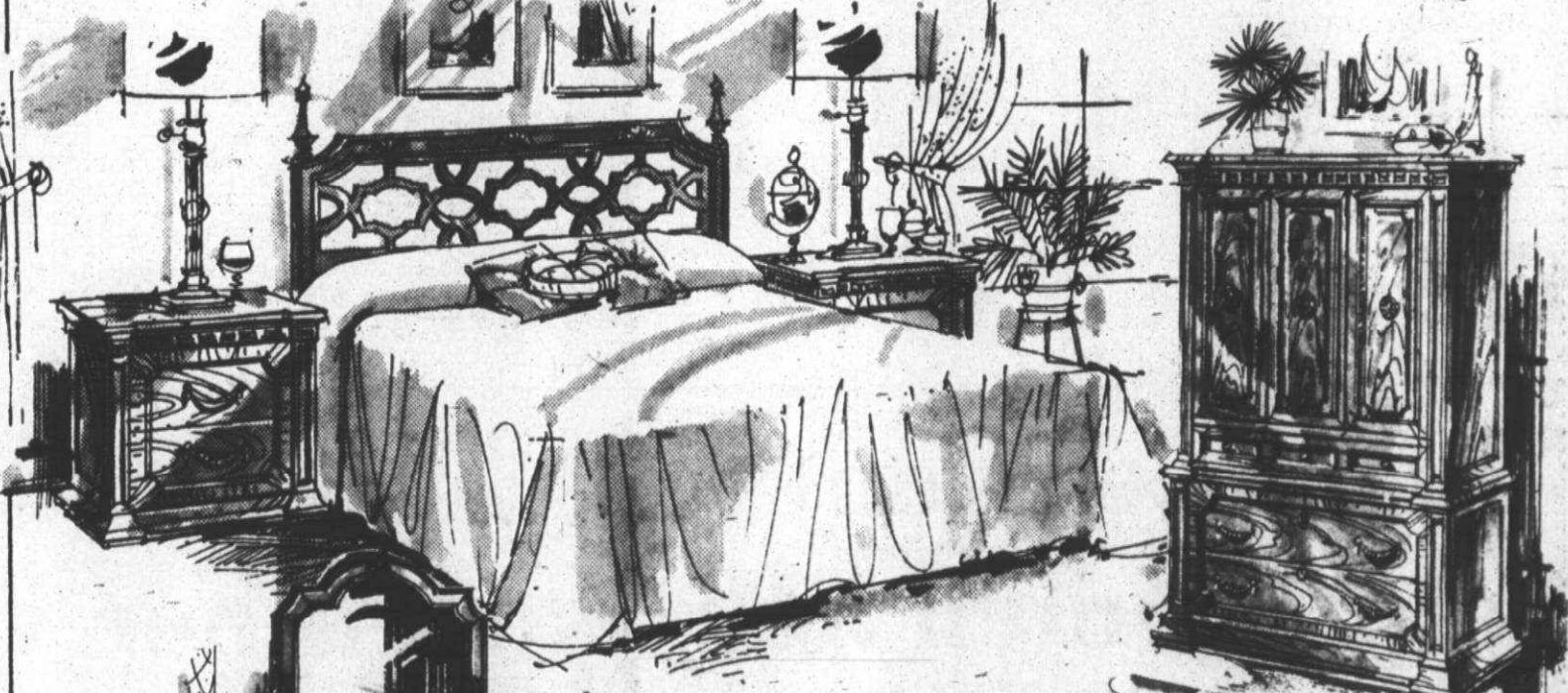
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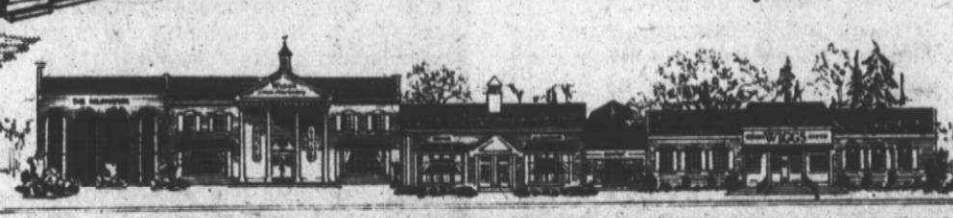
Woman vets urged to file VA pay claims

VA officials explained the deadline for filing at the VA regional offices is July 1, 1976. The retroactive payment to an individual may be as much as \$1,000 in some cases.

Proof of marriage while in training must be furnished in connection with the claim.

St. Agatha deacon

His prayers are on records

Joe Dailey, a deacon at St. Agatha Catholic Church in Redford Township, is making his final moves toward priesthood with a lot of help from the music in his soul.

Rev. Dailey started writing songs while he was studying at St. John Provincial Seminary in Plymouth last year and, in collaboration with several friends, put them into an album of happy religious music.

He went on writing while spending last summer in Our Lady of Sorrows parish in Farmington and as he completed his final term at St. John and began his tenure as a deacon at St. Agatha.

Now he's still writing songs, incorporating his music into some of the services he leads in the Redford parish.

"WRITING MUSIC is my own kind of prayer," said the young priest-in-training who uses a guitar to accompany his songs in and out of the church sanctuary.

He elaborated on that idea in words that appear on the jacket of his first album, "Happy Are the Children of the Lord."

His statement explained that he wrote "both because of a need to express my own prayer in song and to share that song and faith with the community."

That album was published last year by Alba House, a religious publishing firm in Detroit, which now is completing work on a second Dailey album, "Speak to Your People, O Lord."

Both, said this musician, feature a rock kind of beat and express the joy to be found in the Christian faith.

REV. DAILEY'S career as a writer of religious song started with a minimum of difficulty.

"What happened," he said, "is that I sat down one day and thought I'd write a song, and it turned out to be the title song for my first album."

He explained that "Happy Are the Children of the Lord" is his interpretation of the Sermon on the Mount. "I've grown to cherish that part of the Bible as the basis for the lived Christian experience," he added.

That song was followed by several others, and then heads of the Alba House heard some of the young student's music.

With their encouragement, Rev. Dailey and his friends began to record some of the songs they had been doing for church and school meetings.

Others who appear on the first album include two fellow students at St. John: Steve Krupa, now a deacon at Immaculate Heart of Mary in Detroit, and Bernie Hall, interning in a Grand Rapids parish.

Appearing also are two young women who formerly lived in Plymouth: Karen Klepack, a cancer researcher, and Pam Conn, a writer.

"We had known each other while singing with the University of Michigan Choral Union," Rev. Dailey said, "and we started to get together to sing and put on programs."

The group is pretty well scattered now, but did get together, with several instrumentalists, to do the necessary recording for the second album.

"We hope that will be out this summer," Rev. Dailey said.

THIS MUSICIAN is a native of Toledo who grew up in Detroit, attending Christ the King grade school, Catholic Central High School and Sacred Heart Seminary before entering St. John. His family now lives in Indianapolis.

He had lessons on organ and piano and started playing the organ for mass in his home parish, but his guitar playing is strictly self-taught.

He has found music a very important part of his life while he works with the Rev. Joseph Romano, co-pastor of St. Agatha, in a "getting-the-feet-wet" stage of learning to be a parish priest.

"I decided to train for the priesthood because I felt a call to serve and to minister," he said. And at this stage, he says he still hasn't "made a firm commitment, but it's coming more and more clear."

"I GUESS some self-searching is part of the calling now," Rev. Dailey went on.

"Priesthood is a difficult challenge to accept. My year here is finding out what it's all about, and I realize more and more

that the models in this profession are changing a great deal.

"It's not as clearly defined as it used to be. Priests are beginning to strike out on their own in finding ways to minister."

For Deacon Dailey, music has to be part of forging new ways.

"Music definitely can be part of my ministry," he said. "It's a good way to draw people together and help them express their own prayers."

The record, "Happy Are the Children of the Lord," is available from Alba House, 7060 Pinehurst, Detroit, and costs \$6. Its songs also are available in a book, complete with guitar chords, for \$1.

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Easter eggs are symbols of love

Last week, this column dealt with talismans of all sorts. One talisman always believed to have powerful mana is the decorated egg.

The egg, which is a symbol of spring, rebirth and life, is important in the religions of many civilizations, both ancient and modern.

Long before Christianity adopted them as symbols of Easter, eggs were decorated by pagan peoples and exchanged as gifts of love in many countries.

Some of the most beautifully decorated eggs in the world are the traditional Ukrainian Easter eggs called pysanky. In the Ukraine, girls presented their sweethearts with these lovely tokens. Each girl tried hard to make her eggs the most beautiful in the village. Popular young men vied to outdo each other in the number of these beautiful talismans they received.

The preparation of these eggs is a fine art and is handed down from generation to generation.

A stylus called a kitska is used to apply heated beeswax to the shell of the raw egg. This tool is used as a pen, letting the wax cover the parts of the egg that are to remain white. The egg is then submerged in yellow dye.

Next, wax is applied with the kitska to all the parts of the egg that are to remain yellow, and the egg is then dyed orange. The same procedure is used again with

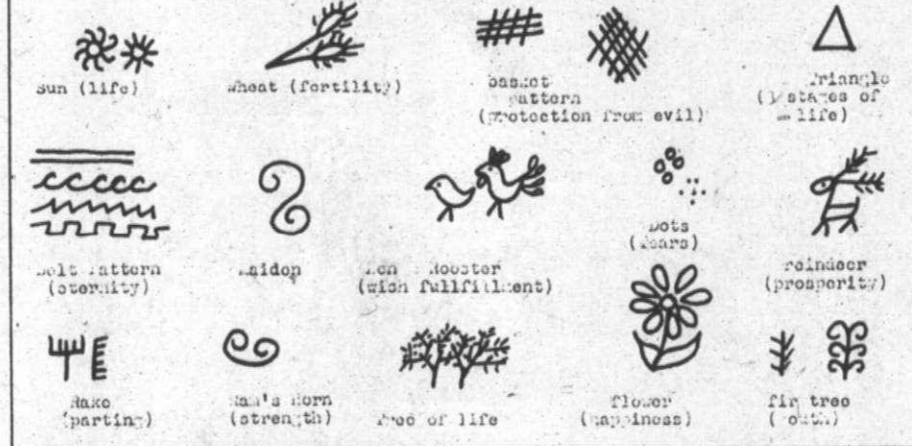


red and black dyes until the egg is finished.

Then all of the wax is removed, revealing the intricate designs in all their lovely colors. The finished pysanka is then lacquered and, when it is dry, presented as a gift of love to a very special person.

Ukrainian Easter egg symbols



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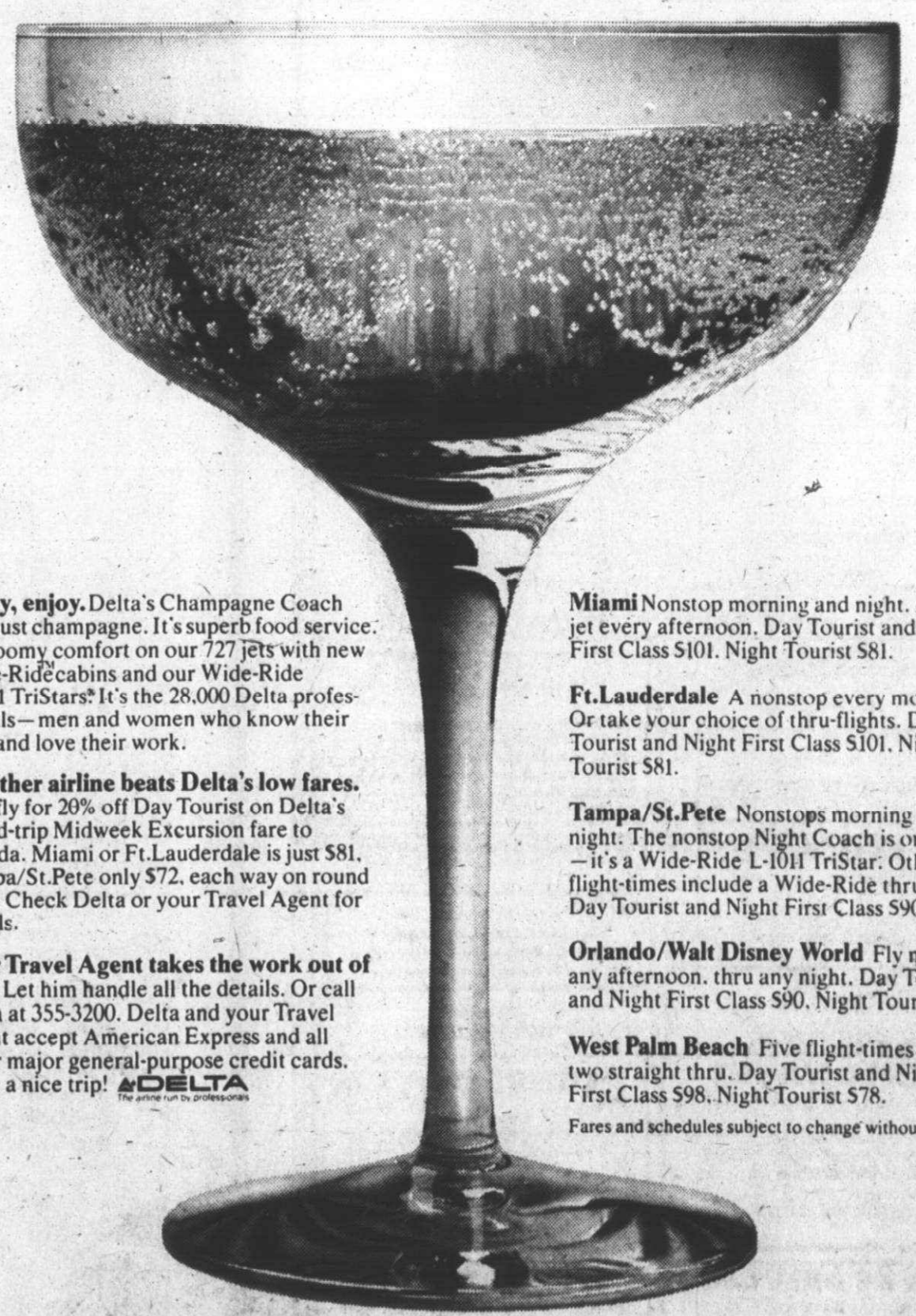

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Screens to open at 'The Movies'

The Movies will become one of the largest theater chains in the Detroit metropolitan area with the scheduled opening of 11 new screens at three major locations and planned future expansion.

A joint enterprise of Taubman Theaters and United Artists Theaters, The Movies were initiated in regional retail developments built by The Taubman Company Inc., which is headquartered in Southfield.

Announcement of the new Detroit-area theaters was made by Salah M. Hassanein, executive vice president of United Artists Theaters Inc. He said operation of five theaters in the new Fairlane Town Center in Dearborn and four at Lakeside in Sterling Heights will begin simultaneously Wednesday.

This will be followed with the June opening of two theaters in the Prudential Town Center in Southfield. The three complexes will total nearly 4,500 seats.

IN MICHIGAN, the chain previously operated only four theaters in the Briarwood development in Ann Arbor and three in Woodland in Grand Rapids. A future multi-screen complex is slated for a new regional retail development being built by The Taubman Company in Novi.

Two-day open houses, from 10 a.m. to 7 p.m., Monday and Tuesday will give visitors a look at behind-the-scenes operation of the Fairlane Town Center and Lakeside theaters.

They will be shown how a single operator in an automated projection room controls screenings in all theaters. With film fed into projectors from flat rotating platters, a touch of a button for a selected theater dims the house lights and UATC-patented "Light Curtain," fades out the intermission music and starts the film rolling. The film automatically rewinds itself in reverse ready for the next showing.

The Light Curtain, developed by Joseph J. Kelly, director of projection and sound for United Artists Theaters Circuit, works on a principle of polarized light. A separate unit in the projection room casts a series of subtly colored light changes across the motion picture screen creating a surrealistic effect as the hues change constantly.

Keyed to the intermission music, the concept is designed to provide an entertaining and contemporary departure from the familiar screen curtain it replaces.

Wearing ethnic looks, folk dancers practice

Some dancers are in American folk costume (jeans, slacks or even minis). Others appear to have followed a directive of make-yourself-an-ethnic-outfit: Embroidered shirts and blouses with trousers and mid-length skirts, low-slung rope belts, boots.

One girl wears her hair in braids under a bandana kerchief. A few dancers have found the perfect shoes, with curled-up toes, that look like they want to dance by themselves.

"They're made in Yugoslavia," a dancer explains. "But I ordered mine from New Jersey."

Recorded music plays, by turns exotic, vibrant, soulful, but always lively.

The dancers follow the leader at the head of the line, which snakes around the gymnasium floor. They join in a large circle that gets larger as the evening progresses and more dancers arrive.

Everyone seems to be laughing and in good spirits.

LOTS OF QUICK steps, hops and stamps make up the foot movements.

A few dancers practice together in smaller circles. Two chubby children run around the outside of the circle or dance with their mother on the sidelines.

This is the weekly meeting of the Detroit Folkdance Club, each Friday starting at 7:30 p.m. at Brookside School Cranbrook in Bloomfield Hills.

The first half of the evening is devoted to learning new dances, the second half to request dancing. About 60 persons come to dance each week, up to 100 on party nights once a month.

Leader Ben Chang is slight and nimble. His feet move soft and light.

Chang's wife Sylvia minds their two children, daughter Melissa, 3, and son Aubin, 20 months. She joins Chang to demonstrate a new dance which is done with partners.

The Changs, who live in Troy, first met at the International Institute in Detroit at the folkdance club. He is an engineer for Fisher Body, and she is a librarian.

CHANG WAS born in Shanghai, China, and came to the U.S. in 1950, to attend graduate school at the University of Michigan.

He participated in folk dancing at the International Institute, first as a student and then as an instructor for club members' classes and its performing group.

Dance nights were held for 10 years at the Northern YMCA in Highland Park, until last year when the club moved its meeting place to Brookside School.

About a third of the dancers are from Detroit, others from suburban areas, and some from as far away as Toledo and Ann Arbor.

Ages range from 16 to 60 and, surprisingly perhaps, most of the dancers are enthusiastic young people who want to share

the heritage of other cultures.

"DANCING IS very good exercise," Chang said. "People can dance all night without getting tired."

Mrs. Chang explained, "The folk dancing we're doing is the recreational type. You don't have to know the partner or person. Most dances are done in a circle, or with a partner, mixing. In square dancing, you have to have a partner."

The club doesn't keep the same dancers at a time; generally, the proportion is two-thirds old dancers to one-third new dancers. There is also a performing group, ranging anywhere from four to 10 couples in size, which dances for local festivities.

Nationalities represented by the dances include German, Austrian, Grecian, Romanian, Polish, Israeli, Hungarian, Yugoslavian, Bulgarian, South American, Czech, Irish, French, Portuguese, Spanish—the list could go on and on.

A smiling guy walks by wearing a T-shirt that reads, "Folk dancers have more fun." He's probably right.

15 chosen for all-area basketball teams

With area basketball teams winning championships in four conferences this season, it was most difficult for coaches to select Observer & Eccentric all-area teams.

In fact, even after three teams had been selected, so many outstanding players were left that the honorable mention roll is probably longer this year than it has ever been.

Area coaches nominated all the players for honors and voted for the respective teams by secret ballot. We salute all the players who were selected for the first three teams, those receiving honorable mention, and everyone who participated and made the past season one of the best ever in the area.

First Team

JIM ELLINGHAUSEN, Plymouth Salem, 6-8, 195 pounds, senior. He was one of two unanimous first-team selections. An all-Suburban Eight choice three years in a row, Ellinghausen broke the Salem career scoring record during his tenure with the Rocks.

Last year, the big center-forward averaged 28.9 points per game, hauled down 273 rebounds and blocked 107 shots over 22 contests. Ellinghausen shot at a rate of 54 per cent from the field and 82 per cent from the free throw line. He has an abundance of college offers.

DAVE NILES, Garden City West, 6-4, 175 pounds, senior. He was the only other unanimous first-team selection and, like Ellinghausen, rewrote his school's career scoring book with 1,163 points.

Niles last season shot at a 49 per cent clip from the field and 83 per cent from the line, averaging 27.6 points per game. Although specializing in long bombs from outside, he also grabbed 199 rebounds and had 128 assists. Many colleges are also wooing Niles.

GREG EMERY, Garden City East, 6-4, 195 pounds, senior. He was the leading scorer and rebounder for the Panthers this season, counting 21.2 points and 11.8 rebounds per contest.

An all-Northwest Suburban choice for three seasons, Emery hit the cords at 45 and 61 per cent clips from the field and free throw line, respectively. He also plays football and baseball for East, demonstrating his skills as one of the area's all-around athletes.

TOM SWEENEY, Redford Union, 6-8, 210 pounds, senior. Captain of the Panthers, the center averaged 14 points per

contest in racking up 275 during the season. Sweeney connected from the field at a rate of 54 per cent, led the team in assists with 90, and blocked 102 shots.

RU coach Carl Andrews described his captain as "an excellent leader and an outstanding student." Sweeney also led the Panthers in rebounding this year, hauling down 295.

SAM WILLIAMS, Livonia Franklin, 6-4, 200 pounds, senior. He averaged 12.8 points and nine rebounds per game, shooting at an even 50 per cent clip from the field.

What made Williams so valuable to the Patriots was his defensive work. Coach Robert Visser always assigned him to the opponent's best big man, and Williams responded by counting 86 recoveries during the year. He also was a standout on Franklin's championship football team.

Second Team

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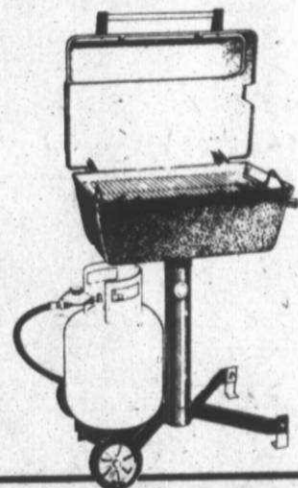

"I was pretty nervous in the first round and it was pretty close to even," he stated. "He (opponent Joe Manley) started to tire out and I was in better shape. I had him in the second and third rounds."

Marderosian won all three three-minute rounds for the crown.

Marderosian, with a name which conjures memories of such great ones as Graziano and Marciano, while boxing for only five years is not exactly without a fair share of honors at this stage of his career.

He won the Class D Golden Gloves championship last year and fought his way to the 1973-74 Michigan AAU junior olympics title.

Marderosian fancies himself to be a defensive fighter, a slow-starter who prefers to work for his openings rather than brawl it out with a foe.

"I rely on straights and jabs," he said. "I try to win on jabs because I don't like to mix it up. I always come out slow in the first round, but I always catch up in the second and third."

Marderosian said his most effective punches are the left straight and a left cross to the body and a right hook to the head.

The success of the conscientious boxer has not come without hard work. Marderosian can be counted on to work out two to three hours per day at the Detroit Crowell Community Center, Herman Gardens, or on the equipment set up in his garage.

While Marderosian has no ambition to enter the pro ranks, he said he is aiming for a spot on the U.S. Olympic Team this summer as a flyweight.
