## Greenstein wants 1.5-mill limit on fire levy

Supervisor Robert Greenstein said he will ask the township board Tuesday to set a 1.5-mill limit on the fire levy should voters pass a special assessment district at the ballot box May 18.

The district, which will contain the entire township, is being put before the voters so that Canton might begin construction of a second station, at Warren and Haggerty, this year.

Rather than ask for a specific millage, the township board decided March 29 to go for a special assessment district. Exact amount of millage needed could be determined later when most or all of the facts were in, officials said.

Greenstein said Friday "I intend to ask

the board to pass a binding promise to the taxpayers of the township that under no circumstances will the board levy more than 1.5 mills this year for the building, staffing and purchase of equipment for a second fire station."

Greenstein's notice of intention to ask for the limit came less than two weeks after the Citizen's Advisory Committee handed in its final report on the second fire station.

That report, like one turned in earlier by the Michigan Fire Chiefs' Association, said the township needed a second fire station.

CAC members said one to 1.5 mills over five years would be sufficient to build, equip and staff a second fire station.

"AFTER A THOROUGH study of the CAC report, the recommendations and its sources, I think we can safely determine that we don't need more than 1.5 mills," Greenstein said.

"I think we probably need more than one mill, but under no circumstances do I see the need to exceed 1.5," the supervisor commented.

Under Public Act 33 of 1961, the act that provides for the special assessment district for fire protection, the board will determine by resolution the final amount of millage levied after two public hearings.

Each year, the matter is reviewed and the levy is set by the board. The maximum levy is 10 mills.

Board members were reluctant to ask for a specific millage in March, the deadline for placing the issue on the ballot, because they had only received the fire chiefs' report and a preliminary report from the CAC.

But Treasurer Carl Parsell said if the district were passed May 18, construction could begin on the second station immediately and the money could be recouped at the end of the year with the additional levy.

Placing a proposal on the August primary ballot, he said, could be too late to get the millage on the tax rolls for 1976, in which case the station could not be constructed this year.

GREENSTEIN SAID in two or three years, there is a good possibility that the levy could be reduced to one mill or lower.

"Once we get the building and equipment, I see no reason why the millage couldn't be reduced, because all we'll be doing then is paying for the staffing, unless it is determined that it would be wise to purchase a third site at that time for future development."

Greenstein added that while he could only ask the board for a promise not to exceed 1.5 mills for this year, he doubted the limit would ever be raised.

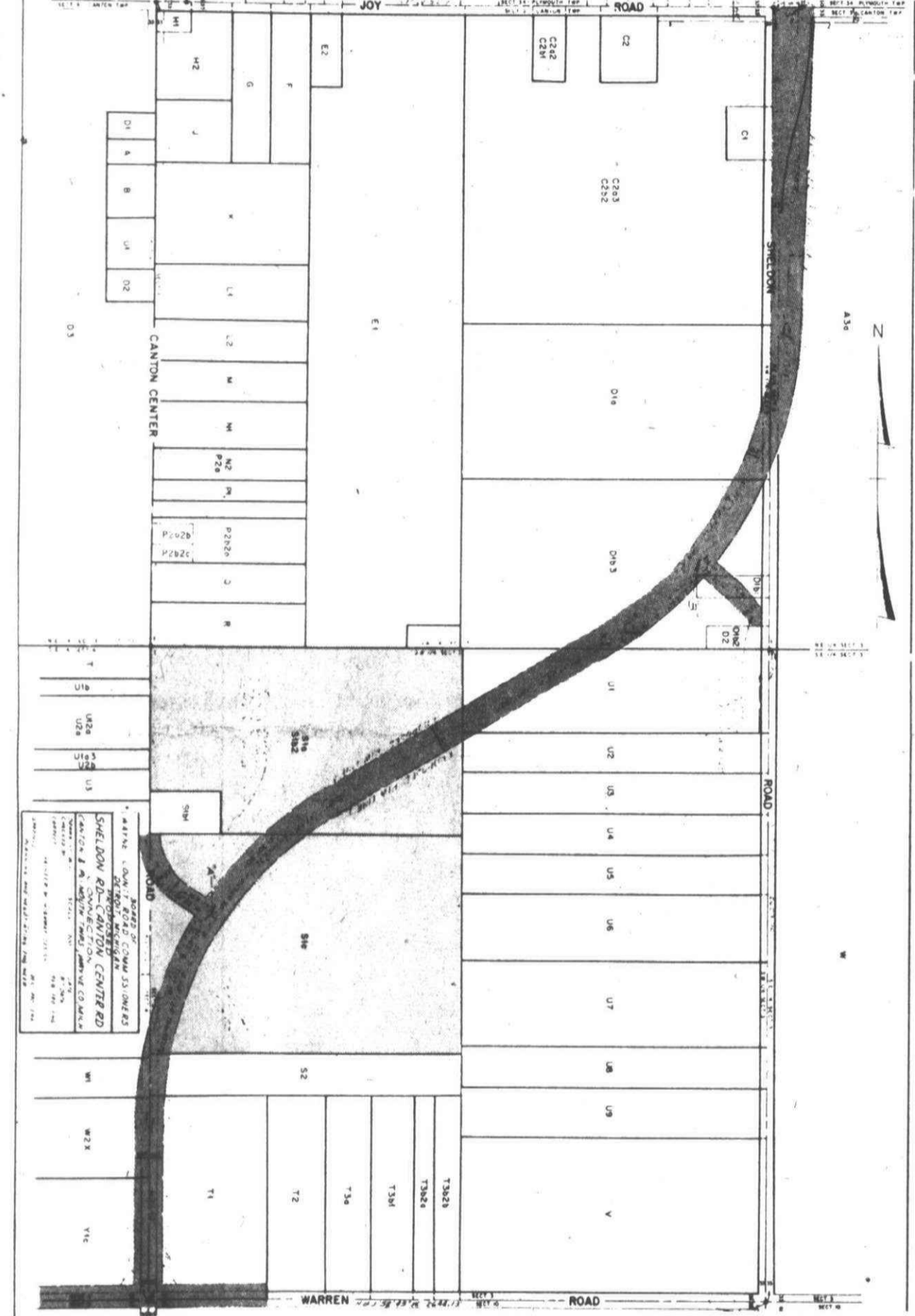
"I can't make promises for a board I'm not part of, but I can't conceive of anyone passing a millage they can't justify.

"Look at Redford. They levied a half a mill and now they're embroiled in a recall campaign. You just can't ask for money without the consent of the people—there's just no way."

Township officials are hoping that a third report, from the Office of Michigan Insurance Services, will be available before the May 18 vote.

That report may show that a second station will reduce the township's insurance rating and save residents money on fire insurance.

The study is presently under way, and officials say they may be able to get a preliminary report before the May 18 vote.



In order for the cutoff to become a reality, rights-of-way must be obtained for the colored lots (S1a and S1c) the Dembs-Sakwa property, and lot U1, the Trapp parcel. Rights-of-way have been dedicated for properties A3a (the old Mocer project) and from Brookeville Associates in lots C2a3 and B1b3.

## Canton Center-Sheldon cutoff fate is uncertain

The future of the long-awaited Canton Center-Sheldon Road cutoff is even more uncertain in the wake of township Supervisor Robert Greenstein's admission that Canton officials have been unable to negotiate for the right-of-ways needed to construct the road.

Greenstein said the matter was in the hands of the Wayne County Road Commission and he added that it was his hope the road commission would act quickly to condemn the necessary properties to get the cutoff under way.

The cutoff, an S-shaped road, first proposed by the county seven years ago, is designed to improve traffic flow throughout the township and aid in auto safety.

Running from Sheldon Road and Joy to Canton Center just north of Warren, the cutoff will redirect traffic to avoid the Centennial Education Park and the hazardous double-T intersection at Canton Center and Joy.

The cutoff will also help to put more traffic on Canton Center and reduce the load on Sheldon which like Lilley is not paved the full length of the township as is Canton Center.

The major stumbling block to initiating construction of the road has been the inability of Canton officials to negotiate for a right-of-way with two developers, Nelson Dembs and Dave Sakwa.

struct what they have clearly stated to be a necessary project."

Greenstein said one avenue available to the county and not the township is the "quick take" method of condemnation where the land can be condemned immediately and the money for the land can be argued later.

"If they went about it that way, construction could conceivably begin this year," the supervisor said.

"But I have my doubts about that. I imagine it will take longer and they will go the conventional route."

ROAD COMMISSION officials, however, are not so eager to condemn the property.

Mitchell Zolik, deputy managing director of the road commission, said the matter would have to be reappraised.

"We'll have to sit down and look at the problem and see what possibilities and priorities there are."

"A lot of it will depend on the development between Sheldon and Canton Center. There's a lot of land involved because it's 120-foot right of way and if we can't get it dedicated there's a substantial cost not counted on if we buy it outright or condemn it."

Zolik said there were no immediate plans to condemn the properties and that while the road commission was interested in building the cutoff it could be more than five years before the project gets under way.

"It's not a top priority project," he said.

tempts to get the land deeded to the county for the road is a long one, starting well before the present administration entered the picture.

According to Greenstein, in 1972 Dembs and Sakwa agreed with the planning commission to deed the right of ways in return for a rezoning to multiple.

The planning commission recommended the property be rezoned and it was, the supervisor said but then "they refused to honor the commitment and convey the right of way."

In the meantime, the new administration assumed office and a solution was reached with Brookeville Associates for one right of way on property fronting on Sheldon in January 1975.

Later that year, the Mocer consent decree was reached. In that judgment, right of ways were provided for land needed on the eastern side of Sheldon for the cutoff.

In early 1975, Greenstein said he began meeting with Dembs and Sakwa and got nowhere.

"After we met and they refused us the right of way, I went to the planning commission and asked that we rezone back to single family residential because they had received the multiple rezoning under false pretenses."

The planning commission agreed and voted to recommend that the land be rezoned back to residential.

The matter was turned over to the township board and forwarded to the county as

DEMBS AND Sakwa own 40 acres of property that front on Canton Center, a large portion of which will be divided by the proposed cutoff.

Rights of way have been obtained on two other critical parcels of land, but a third piece, not considered significant by Greenstein, remains to be dealt with.

That piece, called the Trapp parcel, is marginally affected by the cutoff. According to Greenstein, the major stumbling block has been the Dembs-Sakwa piece.

"It's really the only failure I've had since assuming office," Greenstein said of his inability to negotiate for the right of way. "We spent a lot of time, effort and expense trying to get it, and were treated very shoddily. It's a shame."

Greenstein said the matter has been turned over to the Wayne County Road Commission and he expects they will attempt to condemn the property.

"We believe it is the road commission's responsibility to condemn the remaining two parcels at their expense so as to con-

## WSU Study endorses CEP scheduling

A 76-page evaluation on modular scheduling at the Plymouth Centennial Educational Park (CEP) is now in the hands of members of the Plymouth Board of Education.

The in-depth study was performed by a research team from Wayne State University. The team started its study last January and, after completing personal observations at the CEP, interviewing students and staff, and completing other analysis, the researchers presented their recommendations to the board last week.

School board members met in a work-study session Saturday morning, April 24, to discuss the recommendations. Making the presentation to the board were Dr. Roger DeMont and Dr. John Childs, the two who directed the WSU study.

cussed the problems they saw at the two schools. They did not, in other words, blindly support all areas of the school program because the positive outweighed the negative."

IN ITS REPORT, the research team listed more than one recommendation for consideration by the board.

When alternatives seemed reasonable, the researchers made recommended alternatives (the choice of the consultants), acceptable alternatives (possible and preferred by some staff members and students), and alternatives not recommended because they would be detrimental to the educational program. The recommendations are:

- Modular programming should be maintained as a part of the educational program of the two schools.
- "Because of the highly beneficial results reported by the majority of both students and staff, we see no other alternative recommendation which seems both reasonable and educationally beneficial."
- The number of ninth grade students on traditional scheduling should greatly increase so that modular scheduling is an exception rather than a rule at the ninth grade level.
- Not recommended: The district should not extend modular scheduling into the middle schools and should not eliminate modular scheduling at grade nine.
- Students presently on traditional scheduling as ninth graders should continue on it unless they have demonstrated to the staff that they are ready for modular scheduling. Other students should continue with the same type of schedule they have this year.

Not recommended: the ending of modular scheduling altogether during the 1976-77 school year.

"Attendance is probably the most serious problem at the schools. We caution, however, that it must be viewed as a serious problem nationwide. It is our belief that while a serious problem should involve the entire staff, major responsibility

must be limited for effective action. We fully realize that past attendance, attempts led to the decentralized policy. In some cases, the decentralized policy has worked well—however, the weaknesses indicate that changes should be made."

## UAW hall is site for planning meeting

Canton residents who plan to cast their ballots on township planning questions May 18 may gain some insight into the township's new master land use plan at an informational hearing slated for next week.

The hearing, scheduled for 7:30 p.m. Wednesday, May 5 in the Local 735 UAW Hall, 48065 Michigan west of Canton Center, is designed to help residents vote on an advisory question concerning township planning.

The question asks residents to select one of two planning concepts. One would maintain rural land in the western portion of the township and allow the township to reach an eventual population of about 100,000. The other would allow full development of the township with a population of about 200,000.

The township's new master land use plan, approved by the planning commission last week, would maintain almost 6,000 acres of farmland in the western half of the township. Township board members must eventually approve a zoning ordinance, if the plan is to be implemented and enforced.

Supervisor Robert Greenstein, a major advocate of the master land use plan, has vowed to listen to the voice of voters on May 18.

Expected to staff next week's informational hearing are Greenstein; Canton planners and engineers; Prof. Robert Hotelling of Michigan State University; and county agricultural extension agent Don Juchartz.

Township officials will explain the plan during the first half of the hearing and answer questions during the second half.

# Get out of trailer, ZBA tells bank

It may appear to be business as usual at Bank of the Commonwealth temporary quarters in Canton at Sheldon and Warren, but it may take a court order to keep the bank operating in its trailer.

Two weeks ago, by a vote of 3-0, the township zoning board of appeals refused to grant the bank a six-month extension on its temporary occupancy permit.

The bank has since filed an appeal of the action in Wayne Circuit Court and, according to a bank spokesman, will stay open until the court hands down a ruling.

The bank filed a site plan for a permanent structure on the same site with the township planning commission Tuesday, and that plan has been referred to the township engineers and planners.

Supervisor Robert Greenstein, who serves on the ZBA with Joyce Willis and Bob Miller, chairman of the planning commission, explained the denial.

"THE IMPLICIT reason for the act is that it's time the laws and ordinances of the township be respected. They've been long flaunted, and it's now time for us to be respected like a city. Our ordinances are just as legal as city ordinances."

Greenstein said the bank had already received a ZBA variance for a six-month extension of occupancy in the trailer in August, and that it was one and a half years ago that they first asked for the permit to locate the trailer at its present site.

"They got the OK for a year then and they did absolutely nothing."

"I think they may have applied too soon to the township and were held up by the state because I think other banks in the area filed objections."

"Just as the year expired they came to us and asked for the six-month extension after they got the go ahead from the state."

"They said they'd have the building in 120 days give or take a few weeks and we told them we weren't too crazy about giving them the variance, but we did."

"Then they didn't do anything and at the time of the ZBA meeting they hadn't even submitted any plans. They hadn't done anything."

"I CAN only assume they want to keep money flowing through the bank without paying the higher overhead or taxes for a permanent building."

"They had been warned, so it is not as if they didn't know in advance that we wanted a permanent structure there."

The bank also has a branch office at Haggerty and Ann Arbor Road and apparently it has not endeared itself to Plymouth Township officials either.

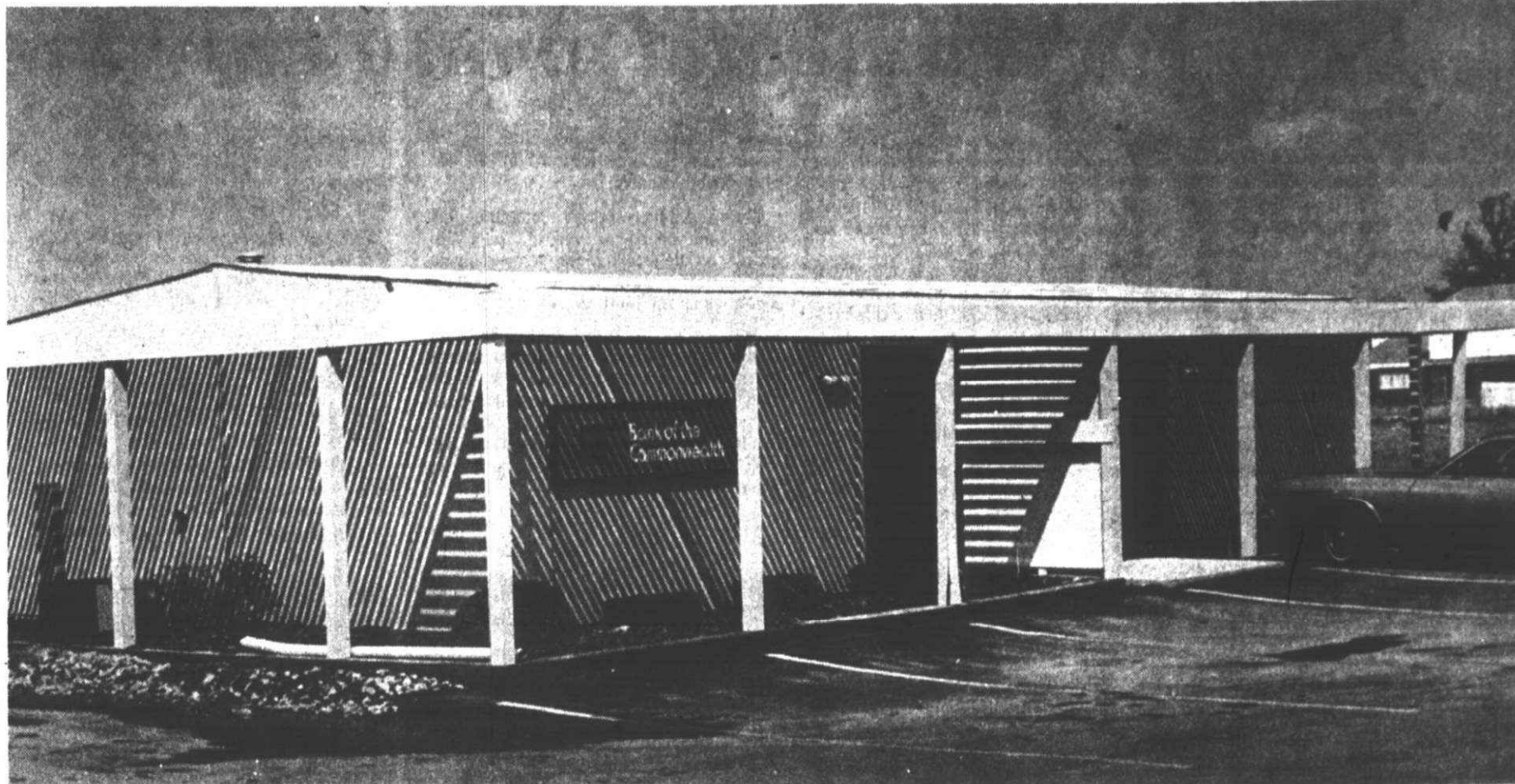
That branch, although a "permanent structure," has not impressed some Plymouth Township officials.

"THEY CALL it a permanent structure, but I don't see how," said Clerk Helen Richardson of the trailer-like facility.

"But we can't really argue. We didn't have site plan approvals in 1966 when they came here and there's nothing in the township board minutes about a permanent or temporary structure."

"There haven't been any fights between the township and the bank because really we don't have a leg to stand on."

"But it would be nice if they went to a more permanent-type structure—the building they have there now certainly isn't like other banks or what is coming in here now."

# Do schools make kids antisocial?

Schools are seldom at a loss for critics but censure from inside the ranks isn't all that common.

Ezra Foner of the special education department in Southfield schools aimed his

criticism at the secondary level's treatment of children who are learning disabled or emotionally impaired.

"We make terrible things and call them schools," he told his audience of 20 at a meeting of the Wayne-Westland chapter of the Michigan Association for Children with Learning Disabilities (MACLD).

"You have to understand that we as school people and parents set up the kids to become delinquent."

As a junior high teacher and counselor of the learning disabled and emotionally impaired, a social worker and volunteer officer of the Southfield police department, as well as director of the psycho-educational unit of a private mental health clinic, Foner draws on his experiences working with children to illustrate his arguments.

FONER BELIEVES that schools don't intentionally attempt to make kids antisocial.

"We set up being good as being good in academic subjects or working in large groups. Our failure is to provide each child with a task the child can do."

Most children who are learning disabled cannot conform to a normal school structure. According to Foner, these children fail to achieve value goals and either blame themselves and withdraw — socially isolating themselves — or blame their teachers or parents and become delinquent by refusing to accept society's values.

"Either reaction isn't healthy," says Foner. "For the children who fail quietly, blaming themselves, love gets mixed up with approval and the ultimate internal blame is suicide."

"If you give the child the message

"Don't be, he will accommodate you and kill himself," Foner warns. "There are four suicides that I know of in Southfield and there may be eight more that have been hushed-up."

"I wish you could love me for me and not for what I can do," is the message these children are trying to tell their parents.

THE CHILDREN who become delinquent, who blame teachers, schools, and parents, are the more visible problem. Selling drugs, beating other children, smashing windows are some of the ways they release their aggression.

These kids have a higher rate of emotional problems because of the stress of having trouble academically," Foner contends. He blames schools for increasing that aggression.

"When schools close, delinquency rates drop," he says. "In Detroit when the schools were closed (because of the 1973 strike), they thought they'd have a terrible crime rate. The delinquent behavior rate went up when the kids were back in school."

Foner maintains delinquency rates increase because during the school year children are more aware of their failures and the secondary schools track the poorer students, putting them together in classes, where they are isolated from other students, values and situations.

"WHAT HAPPENS is that we make martyrs out of teachers instead of getting these kids the special help they need."

"In Southfield we have 5,000 kids in high school, no less than 500 should be learning

disabled statistically but we have zero. You know there's a problem but you do nothing to correct it. We do things for our comfort not for the kids' benefit."

"Basically the kid who is delinquent is a child whose parents and schools have been giving a lot of 'don't do' messages. Schools and parents become external policemen. What we need is training that gives a verbal ability to communicate with a child; you want to avoid the 'don't do' or 'ought to' messages and learn the 'how to' message."

"You as parents are the first and last lines of defense," Foner advised his audience. "You have to know when to step in and when not to step in."

IF A CHILD CAN'T bring home good grades to get attention from parents, he's likely to bring home trouble of some kind that will get him attention. Parents have to help their children deal realistically with problems, Foner maintains.

One way to cope with problems is to request an EPPC, an educational planning and placement committee, in which parents and teachers plan goals and guidelines for a particular child. A member of the Wayne-Westland chapter of MACLD will accompany parents to the EPPC to familiarize them with procedures. Knowing your legal rights is also important, said Foner.

"We got a message from somewhere—maybe it came over on the Mayflower—you ought to. I don't have to tell anybody what's wrong with them; they know. We set up the game so the kid is going to lose and then we walk away."

# Muneio affair to continue

Another meeting between the Plymouth Canton football coaching staff and school board will follow tonight's (Monday) regular meeting of the Plymouth Board of Education.

The coaching staff and board will meet in secret session following the regular meeting to discuss specific charges made by parents against the football program at Plymouth Canton.

The coaching staff has temporarily withdrawn their resignations pending a full investigation and future action by the board.

TO BE DISCUSSED will be a list of formal charges and complaints compiled by Trustee Joe Gray from a meeting held with parents and others disenchanted with coach Jim Muneio and his staff.

Among the allegations made by Gray, on behalf of parents and fans, are: lack of

leadership on the game field and for the overall football program; lack of participation by players and inconsistency in disciplining athletes; bad judgment in interpersonal relationships with players and failure to communicate enthusiasm; lack of concern with safety and improper handling of injuries; poor handling of clerical details and follow-up and poor public relations with athletic parents and boosters.

Those allegations have been reduced to writing by Gray in a report to board members, and backed up by supportive material. It is expected Muneio and his staff will respond to those criticisms during tonight's session with the board.

DURING THE regular meeting, which begins at 7:30 p.m. in Plymouth Canton High cafeteria, the board will discuss release to the public of information spelling

out the need for five mills the district is seeking in the June 14 election.

The latest information from Lansing is that the current state aid formula under consideration could, if passed, result in a loss to Plymouth Community Schools of \$203,000.

The district also expects to lose another \$220,000 as a result of the state extending its fiscal year to help the state balance its budget. School administrators are now certain that the total tax base for the district is \$465 million.

In other business, the board is expected to select a labor attorney for the current round of negotiations with teachers and other employee groups.

The board will discuss proposed policies, including statements covering soliciting in the schools, school attendance areas or assignments and commencement exercises.

tion on attendance should be centralized. The centralization can consist of an attendance office or a counselor-area coordinator team.

Acceptable alternative: retain present policy and increase efforts toward teacher participation in attendance matters.

Not recommended: The school may maintain present policy and effort.

"The school should focus its energy and attention on the new ninth grade class and establish an effective attendance system for this group of students."

"Unfortunately, attendance problems and modular scheduling go hand-in-hand. The acceptance of the modular program dictates the necessity for spending much more time in attendance. Even in traditional schools, many assistant principals report spending 50 per cent of their time in attendance."

"Students, teachers, and administrators all noted some 'discipline' problems. We are convinced discipline is a universal problem that has existed and will exist for a long time. In contrast, the serious attendance problems in today's high school is a relatively recent phenomenon."

"The school should, if it seeks to improve student behavior, focus its energies on a set of behaviors—such as disruptive behavior in a learning area, or on a particular place (i.e., the entrances to the two schools)."

"The energies of the school personnel can quickly be dissipated if all-out campaigns on both attendance and discipline are launched. We consider attendance to be the more important problem."

"Each area coordinator should be teamed with a counselor, and this team should follow a group of students for their four years in school. Whether the area coordinators adopt the present counselor's schedule, or the reverse, is of lesser importance."

"Operating costs of the total program at Centennial Educational Park should be reviewed by the principals, personnel director, assistant superintendent for business, and the superintendent and deputy superintendent for potential expenditure changes yielding improved programming semi-annually."

"Computer scheduling be continued using the Westinghaus Learning Corp. System."

Acceptable alternative: Use of the Wayne County scheduling system, if a reduced schedule with more limited choice

for students becomes economically necessary.

General suggestions made by Childs and DeMont were: in-service training for support staff in which their problems are clarified and plans for resolution are developed; regularly scheduled with mandatory attendance homeroom periods as a possible improvement in communication with students; resolution to the satisfaction of teachers and administrators the question as to when a student should be dropped for non-attendance; and, periodically scheduled open labs and individual conferences for ninth-grade students who elect and are placed on the modular schedule.

Based on interviews, the researchers believe ninth graders have an inability to function with the amount of freedom given them and don't take advantages of opportunities because of this lack of acceptance of responsibility by the younger students.

In a cost analysis, the report states the CEP expense per pupil is within the

middle range of school districts in Wayne, Oakland and Macomb counties. The costs of 1974-75 staffing at Canton-Salem are below the average high school costs in the metropolitan area, the report states.

On a unit cost basis, the cost per pupil at Canton-Salem is \$1,065 compared to \$1,095 per pupil at traditional schools. "The review of personnel assignments and direct scheduling costs did not indicate any possible savings by converting to an alternate method of scheduling."

"The cost analysis reveals that this range of options is being purchased by the Plymouth Community Schools at no greater cost than the average metropolitan area general school costs. Equally detailed financial audits of several smaller area high schools (1,500-2,000 students) have shown costs per pupil 1 1/2 to 1 1/2 times those found at Canton-Salem."

"In summary, the consultants are convinced that the overall costs are justifiable."

# Intergovernmental group may increase its scope

The Intergovernmental Committee is considering adding a dimension to its basic function of seeking governmental cooperation on matters of common interest among City of Plymouth, Canton, Plymouth, Salem, Superior and Northville townships.

"We are coming to a critical period which will decide the direction the group is going to take next year," explains Tom Yack, Plymouth Board of Education member and chairman of the Intergovernmental Committee.

At last Wednesday's meeting a discussion ensued on whether the group should function as an information-gathering agency on critical issues in an attempt for governmental units to reach consensus on those matters.

THE IDEA was broached Wednesday night by Norb Battermann, Plymouth city commissioner. Support also came from Canton Trustee Gerald Cheske who didn't attend the meeting but communicated his views by telephone to Yack.

Battermann and Cheske believe the committee should schedule information forums on important issues, and then decide on a course of action to gather additional information and data.

The information, once collected and compiled in report form, would then be forwarded to the governmental units to aid them in taking a stand on a particular issue.

Examples of issues to be explored at information forums would be the "super sewer" presently being debated or the water rate increase imposed by the Detroit Water Board.

The Intergovernmental Committee last year experienced a type of "pilot program" on the effectiveness of the information forum approach when it arranged meetings on the Mettetal Airport issue.

At that time, the Intergovernmental Committee called in aviation officials and experts and conducted open forums on the question of whether Mettetal should be converted into a public airport. After intensive study, the governments involved took a stand against a public airport being located at Mettetal.

SINCE THAT TIME the Inter-

governmental Committee has lost its momentum, some members feel, and needs to become involved if the larger issues which have greater public interest.

The thinking expressed Wednesday night was that the information forums would be open to the public with resource persons and local government officials invited. One possibility would be for a position paper to be issued following the public forum, and another alternative would be for the "white paper" reports to be issued to governmental units which would then take a position.

ALTHOUGH THE committee is considering going the route of information forums, that move, if made, would not diminish the committee's role of striving for

more cooperation between communities. "We will still be looking for areas of possible cooperation," says Yack, "but will add to this purpose of function of gathering information."

"The forum approach would be quite similar to our role on the airport issue. Some members feel there is a need for this group to reach closure on some issues and demonstrate progress."

"But the exploration of areas of cooperation is still needed for areas in which immediate closure isn't possible," concludes Yack. "The concerns about health care in this area, for instance, will take some time to resolve and require continued investigation and inquiries."

Representatives on the Inter-

governmental Committee are: Yack, chairman, Plymouth Community Schools; Battermann, City of Plymouth; Cheske, Canton Township; Richard Gornick, Plymouth Township; Richard Innes, Superior Township; and Harvey Barkley, Salem Township.

(Continued from page 1A) are all rezoning requests for the county's recommendations.

The board decided to let the matter be handled in the new master land use plan.

At that time, Greenstein said the Wayne County planning commission agreed to intervene to "attempt an amicable decision."

"In the fall of 1975 they obtained what I thought was a final agreement where Dembs and Sakwa promised the right of way. But when it got time to sign, they refused," Greenstein said.

"They wanted guaranteed zoning which we obviously couldn't give them and they wanted concessions on curb cuts on to the cutoff which we agreed to, and they want-

ed special treatment on sewers, on water. We told them to go fly a kite.

"Out of desperation a few weeks ago I contacted Zolik the number two man at the road commission and asked him to set up one more meeting. We had a meeting set for April 26."

Last Tuesday, however, the planning commission approved a new master land use plan that will when implemented change the zoning of the land back to single-family residential.

Treasurer Carl Parsell, the board's representative on the planning commission, asked that the 40 acres be excluded from the plan so the cutoff might be negotiated, but the commission overruled his request and the plan was passed.

Following passage of the plan, Dembs and Sakwa cancelled the meeting, Greenstein said.

"If the commission had excluded those 40 acres from the plan, we might have had a little leverage negotiating with them," Greenstein said.

"But as far as we're concerned now, it's all single-family residential and it's up to the road commission."

## Officials learn about lamps

Members of Canton's administration hope to know all about street lighting—including the best kind for the township's streets—by the end of the week.

Canton Supervisor Robert Greenstein and Clerk John Flodin will embark on a plane to Hendersonville, N. C., this Wednesday to attend a two-day street-lighting seminar at the General Electric Roadway Lighting Institute.

Attendance at the seminar, expected to cost taxpayers \$13 to \$26, will give Canton officials an understanding of the best and most economical street lighting available, according to the supervisor.

# County locks up jail decision; financing is up to taxpayers

Wayne County commissioners have voted unanimously to build a new jail on the old recorder's court site in Detroit—whether or not taxpayers on May 18 pass the proposed half-mill tax to finance construction.

The 19-0 vote came April 21—five years after five jail inmates filed suit against county officials for maintaining an overcrowded jail. Commissioner Richard Manning (D-Redford) was absent.

Expanded jail capacity became mandatory when a three-judge circuit court panel ordered a limit of 720 prisoners at the present county jail.

Because of a conflict between advocates of a new facility and those of a Grossman and Co. proposal to renovate a downtown J.L. Hudson Co. warehouse, commissioners asked various citizens' groups and governmental agencies to recommend the best alternative.

But the final vote reaffirmed the board's previous support of a new jail. The vote, however, did not settle the question of jail financing.

"THE REAL task now is public education on the importance of millage passage," said Sheriff William Lucas, who supported the new jail. "People have to be informed on what they are voting for."

He indicated that many people—particularly those in the suburbs—do not understand the significant role the millage plays.

"Passage of the half-mill will raise \$20

million over five years, whereas a bond issue will cost taxpayers \$68 million over 25 years," the sheriff said.

A citizens' committee will meet at 5 p.m., April 26 in conference room A on the seventh floor of the City-County Building in Detroit to discuss swaying public sentiment toward support of the millage.

BOARD CHAIRMAN John Barr (D-Dearborn Heights) said \$1.3 million previously approved for final jail construction drawings will be available before the millage is approved.

"The millage is not to determine whether or not we will construct a new jail," said Barr. "We are mandated to build a new jail. The millage will only decide how the jail is financed."

Barr explained that approval of the half-mill tax will save taxpayers about \$40 million in the long run. "Support of the millage will cost taxpayers about \$5 a year for five years. A bond issue will cost \$68 million over a 25-year period."

A supporter of the new jail facility, Barr said: "We're doing what we must do. Now it's up to the taxpayers to decide how we will finance it."

COMMISSIONER MARY Dumas, who first abstained and then changed her vote in favor of the new jail, declared her disappointment in the handling of the jail question.

"The controversy of which alternative plan to implement created a division in the community before approval of the millage," she said.

Explaining her abstention, Mrs. Dumas said she received a number of calls from community members who, after reading task force reports, felt warehouse renovation was the most feasible option.

She said constituents realized a new jail may take four years to complete, with a chance of overrunning costs by 50 per cent.

COMMISSIONER THOMAS Presnell (D-Westland), explained his vote in favor of the new jail by saying that warehouse renovation would not have allowed exterior wall cells with windows to be built.

He said that state jail standards call for cells on exterior walls with natural light. If this requirement is not met, jails cannot qualify for federal funding.

"If the millage is not approved, we may have to ask for federal funds," said Presnell, whose district includes Garden City.

The new commissioner added that despite reports that claimed 120 prisoners could be housed 10 months after the beginning of construction, inmates could not be housed during construction and the "quick solution" was not really an advantage over building a new jail.

During the meeting, commissioners cited pro-warehouse advocates as those who "want to get rid of a white elephant at the expense of the county."

"Renovating the warehouse would have taken a \$15,000 taxable building off the tax rolls," Presnell explained.

COMMISSIONER ROYCE E. Smith (D-Belleville) said many groups, including the UAW, were pressing support of the new jail because it could be expected to have a 25-30-year life expectancy advantage over the renovated building.

Smith, whose district includes Plymouth and Canton, said pressures to make a decision have been put on commissioners and county officials since the inception of the jail proposal.

"The public has been criticizing commissioners for not acting sooner to alleviate the jail problem. We decided what alternative to take," Smith said. "Now, let's see if the public is going to support our decision."

## MSU small animal day is May 1

Old McDonald would feel right at home on Michigan State University's campus May 1.

That's because May 1 is Small Animal Day at the university. Visitors are invited on campus to see baby chicks, ducklings, calves, colts, piglets and young mink. With supervision, children may hold and pet some of these animals.

The event has been sponsored annually by the MSU College of Agriculture and National Resources Student Senate since 1957. Small Animal Day is student-planned and student-directed.

"Anyone who might be interested, from preschoolers to senior citizens, is welcome to join the tours. We would like senior citizens to arrive as early as possible so they can take their time enjoying the animals," says Laura Mang, project coordinator.

"The tour glimpses American agriculture at its grass roots. It shows part of the yearly renewal of life found each year throughout livestock agriculture," she says.

More than 100 student volunteers, many of them working part-time at the barns, will work on the project as tour guides. There will be free tours of dairy, sheep, poultry, horse, swine and beef facilities on campus from 9 a.m. to 2 p.m.

MSU buses will take visitors from the campus commuter parking lot at Mt. Hope and Farm Lane to the farm facilities. No private vehicles will be permitted at the farms during the day.

# Rocks split again

After a brilliant display of offensive fireworks in the first game of a twinbill with Wayne Friday, Salem's mighty sticks went to sleep and the pitching soured, forcing the Rocks to split with the Zebras.

A 17-hit Salem attack in the opener should have taken all the spark out of the Zebras, as the Rocks humbled Wayne 16-4 behind another strong mound performance by ace Brian Wolcott, with Dave Nidsgorski in relief.

But the Zebras struck back in the nightcap with nine hits, which, combined with a weak defensive and pitching effort by the Rocks, allowed Wayne to walk away with the contest, 9-1.

Coach Brian Gilles again sang the blues about his lack of depth in the mound corps. "It's the same thing as the other day. We started off strong and folded. We just don't have a strong second pitcher."

True to form, however, the Rocks unchained the bats in the first contest, with Wolcott, Charlie Johnson, Howard Inch,

Mitch Symonds and Ben Wilcox pacing the attack.

Wolcott connected for three hits and drove in two runs, while Johnson had a field day on Zebra pitching, unloading three hits and collecting five RBIs.

The Rocks started slowly, and trailed 2-0 after the first two innings.

But then the fireworks came. In the the

third, Rock bats came to life as five runs crossed the plate, with Johnson connecting for a single with the bases loaded to produce two runs.

In the fourth and fifth, it was more of the same, as the Rocks collected three runs and then seven, with Johnson again providing the big hit in the seventh—this time a double with the bags loaded to drive in two more.

Game two was less of an artistic success for Salem as the hometown pitching was ripped for nine hits and nine runs, with Mike Primeau taking the loss.

Rock fielders committed three errors, two more than in the first contest, and the Zebras led all the way, breezing to the win.

Wayne scored three in the first, one in the third, two in the fifth and three in the sixth to ice the win.

The Rocks managed one run in the fourth on an Inch single, a fielder's choice and a single by Bob Smith.

**THE SPLIT** with Wayne came on the heels of strong performance Wednesday by Salem, as the Rocks dropped Northville 2-1 in a rain-shortened five-inning contest. Bruce Gearish picked up the win in his first outing of the season.

"He kept the ball low and mixed his stuff well," explained Gilles. "It was a solid job for his first start."

Salem scored both its runs in the third on a Smith single, a Pat McKendrie sacrifice, a Gearish hit and a double by Dave Pierce.

The Rocks are now 6-2 on the season and 3-0 in Sub-8 action.

# Plymouth, Canton to host Special Olympics

"Let me win, but if I cannot win, let me be brave in the attempt."

More than 1,500 mentally retarded young boys and girls of Wayne County will lift their voices in that oath this weekend when they begin competition in the area's fourth annual Special Olympics under the local sponsorships of the Plymouth, Livonia and Wayne Civitan clubs.

The facilities of Plymouth's Salem and Canton high schools, which share the Centennial Educational Park area at Joy and Canton Center, will be used for track and field events, gymnastics, floor hockey, basketball, and swimming. Bowling will be conducted in the Westland Bowl at Ford and Wayne Roads.

**PRELIMINARY COMPETITION** will get under way at 9 a.m. Saturday, May 1, and will continue through much of the day. Finals are slated for Friday, May 7, with medal winners advancing to the state Special Olympics' championships to be held the first week of June at Central Michigan University in Mount Pleasant.

General chairman of the undertaking is Dick Clark of the Wayne Civitan Club, while Delese Green of the Plymouth Center for Human Development is area chairman. Volunteers who would like to help

staff the program on either day are asked to contact Leonard Dybas, 366 Pacific, Plymouth (453-3644).

**THE SPECIAL OLYMPICS** program is a creation of the Joseph P. Kennedy Jr. Foundation and has become the largest year-round sports organization for the retarded in the world, involving more than 500,000 retarded youth and 150,000 volunteers. There are organized chapters in every state and a growing number of foreign countries.

The Kennedy Foundation was established in 1946 and its two main objectives are to seek the prevention of mental retardation by identifying its causes and to improve the means by which society deals with its citizens who are already retarded.

The first Special Olympic Games were held in the summer of 1968 when more than 1,000 mentally retarded children from all over America traveled to Soldier Field in Chicago to take part in what then was considered a daring experiment. Since then the program has mushroomed with fantastic success.

Eunice Kennedy Shriver, president of Special Olympics, Inc., told of what she called "a new kind of job" in this message to all local sponsoring groups in the nation:

"Col. Red Blaik, coach of so many great Army football teams, devised a play featur-

ing the 'lonesome end.' When the team huddled, the lonesome end stood near the sidelines. As the teams lined up he remained isolated and almost unnoticed from the rest of the formation. When the ball was snapped he would be downfield and ready for a pass, frequently catching the opposition by surprise.

"The mentally retarded are the lonesome ends of our society. At home, in school, in the community they are always near the sidelines. Watching the action. Never allowed in the huddle.

"Sadly the ball is never thrown to them, even though, with great willingness, they are ready to do their best. Simply because society regards them as different, the mentally retarded have traditionally been kept out of the game.

"The Special Olympics program was developed to give these 'lonesome ends' a chance to belong and to make a contribution.

"First, it gives them the chance to develop and test their strength and coordination—to learn skills, to follow rules, to stretch the outside limits of their capabilities, physical, social and intellectual.

"Second, it provides an opportunity for individual competition and for team play. It offers vital experience in winning and in losing—but most of all in trying.

"Third, it develops confidence and self-

esteem not only among the Special Olympics athletes but in parents, brothers and sisters, friends and neighbors.

"In the Special Olympics everybody wins. The Special Olympics is a shining example for all who believe that a just and good society is one which cares for those who may be less able, but who are in no sense less worthy.

"The lonesome end was the hero of many football games. The mentally retarded, if allowed to get onto the field, have much to contribute. Loyalty, devotion, determination, joy. As part of the Special Olympics, you, too, will know joy by transforming a lonely outsider into an active contributing member of the community."

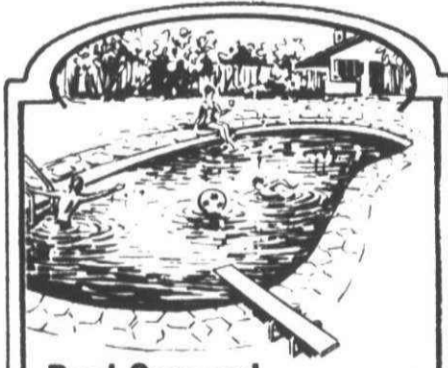

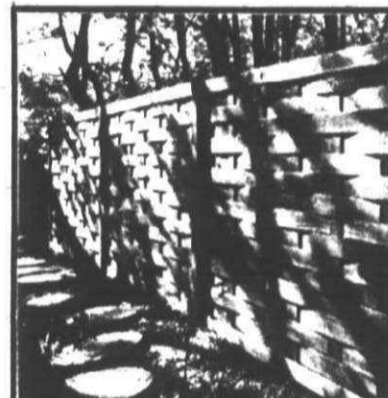

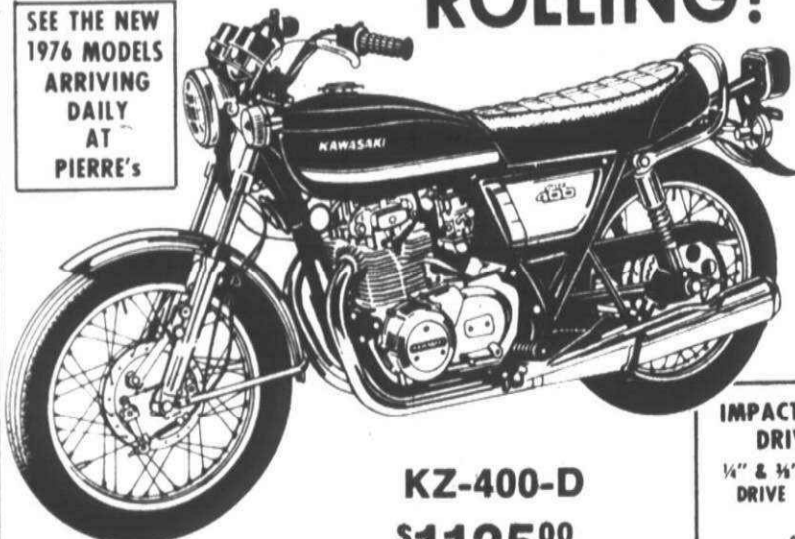

# Commissioners vary on county jail options

A proposed half-mill tax for construction of a Wayne County jail is slated to appear on the May 18 presidential primary ballot, and local county commissioners expect the millage to be passed—raising \$35 million over five years.

But commissioners have mixed views concerning alternative jail plans.

According to Commissioner Royce E. Smith (D-Belleville), a "blue-ribbon" citizens' committee was to submit recommendations by April 10 on two alternatives—construction of a new jail or renovation of a J.L. Hudson warehouse.

But because of conflicting views regarding the number of guards the two plans require, the committee asked the National Clearing House for Criminal Justice Planning and Architecture to determine which plan would require the least amount of staffing.

Until their evaluation is completed, commissioners say they can only speculate from previous task force reports on which alternative is best.

"I DON'T want to commit myself before I read the committee's recommendation," said Smith. "I want to look at the plans with an open mind, concerning the financial cost to the county."

Smith said if renovation of the warehouse saves the county \$20 million, there would be no choice. His district includes part of Westland, Plymouth and Canton.

"In about 180 days, a section of the warehouse can be constructed to house 120 prisoners. This would be the quickest solution to the problem as long as further renovations continue," said Smith.

"The warehouse would be stripped down to its frames," said Manning, "and rebuilt specifically as a detention facility. It's what is inside that counts."

Speaking of the possibility of a third alternative—Building M at the county hospital in Westland—Manning said it may be in his constituents' best interest to construct a facility in the area.

"It would save the local taxpayers a lot of money if an out-county detention facility were built," said Manning, whose district also includes part of Livonia.

"My concern is that we get the best value for our money. Our goal is to have a clean, safe, humane environment to house prisoners. I am not interested in building a hotel," he declared.

**COMMISSIONER THOMAS** Presnell (D-Westland) supports the idea of an out-county jail and renovation of the warehouse, seeing both as quick permanent solutions.

"Building a new jail will take four years and when completed, will only house 400 people," said Presnell whose district also includes Garden City.

"Meanwhile, our efforts will be hit-and-miss temporary solutions for a permanent problem."

Presnell explained that the objective behind securing an out-county jail facility is to provide better police protection in the out-county area.

"Establishing out-county jails and courtrooms will allow officers to work in a specific area, relieving them from unnecessary driving all around the county," said Presnell. "This, in turn, saves taxpayers money."

tions that without their support the millage may also be rejected May 18.

"Regardless of which alternative is decided upon, additional millage will be needed to build and operate the facility because bonding is precluded at the present time by a court case challenging the legality of the state bonding act and because the county is broke," she said.

Mrs. Dumas explained that if the millage is not approved, there is a real possibility criminals who should be behind bars might be freed on bond.

"We do not want people to be subjected in their homes and businesses to the danger of being victimized by criminals who are let go by the courts instead of being incarcerated while awaiting trial on crimes," said Mrs. Dumas.

**COMMISSIONER JOHN** Barr (D-Dearborn Heights) stressed that the millage only costs taxpayers two packs of cigarettes a year, which if passed, would solve a "jail crisis."

"This is a serious problem to municipalities and public safety even at its controversial stage," said Barr, whose district includes part of Westland.

Explaining that the wording on the ballot does not mention the specific jail plan, Barr indicated that if passed, the tax will probably not go toward developing a temporary facility.

"Right now it is premature to conclude which is the best alternative. Once we get recommendations from the citizens' committee, the task force and the board of auditors, we'll know what plan to execute," said Barr.



What if you held an election and nobody voted?

That seems to be a slight possibility for the May 18 presidential primary. At least, early indications are that there is very little local interest on whether Ford will outpace Reagan or whether Carter, Jackson, Wallace or Udall will top the Democrats.

Usually the number of new registrations for an election is an indication of the degree of interest. If this were the only yardstick, the interest in the May 18 balloting is quite low.

The Plymouth City Clerk's office, for instance, held a special registration Saturday, April 16, and during nine hours only two residents showed up to register.

The clerk's office also agreed to deputize students to be used as registrars for a special voter registration at Schoolcraft College April 12, 13, 14. But only one student came in to be deputized and as of April 19 no reports of the registration results had been received.

**THE LOW** registration turnouts backs up the arguments made by local clerks that the presidential primary should be paid for by the state.

Paul Brumfield, city clerk, and Helen Richardson, township clerk, both believe the state should pick up the tab because there are no local proposals on the ballot. Because there will be no local benefits from the primary, they reason, and because the primary is the creation of the state, the expense should be paid totally

by the state and not be shared by local municipalities.

That's a pretty convincing argument, but that doesn't mean logic will prevail. The state did pay for the 1972 primary—the first held in Michigan—but it could afford to then. Now the state, like local governments, is in bad financial shape and hesitates to spend its money on a presidential primary which really doesn't have much direct benefit for the state either. And because the state has the final political clout on this issue, chances are slim the state will pick up the entire tab unless the courts so order.

**THE PRIMARY** would be more meaningful if it were nationwide and a single winner from each party emerged by direct vote of the people.

Some would argue that the presidential preference primary in May is better than having political hacks making the decisions in conventions without benefit of any opinions from the people. Which is to say that it's preferable to do it half-wrong than to do it right. There are no insurmountable barriers I know of to prevent direct primaries. As things now stand, the choice is made at the conventions and the primaries are really superfluous.

If a candidate is clearly a front-runner after the primaries are concluded, chances are he will get the nomination at the convention—even though many primaries are mere beauty contests. But without primaries, a candidate can get a campaign organized and line up enough delegate support to win the nomination in spite of the wishes of the party regulars. The difference between the two methods of winning a nomination is slim.

Given these conditions, it is understandable why local residents aren't stirred up about the May 18 presidential primary. Ford seems to have his nomination locked up and the Democratic choice will be decided at the convention regardless of the Michigan outcome. Maybe we should get excited about the presidential primary, but then maybe our vote should count for something other than being just one number in a statewide public opinion poll.

Familiarity breeds art appreciation

Although it may not be too obvious in everyday behavior, those fifth graders who will be entering middle schools next September have acquired a certain cultural polish. It may take a visit to an art museum to bring it out, but given the opportunity, they'll be able to point out a Van Gogh or a Renoir and discuss the difference in their techniques.

A youngster who has completed the first six years of his education in the Plymouth schools is familiar with more than 200 famous paintings, thanks to the Plymouth Community Arts Council's visual art program.

Missionaries in the field of art have been the picture ladies, a group of volunteers who visit the classrooms the first week in each month. Portfolios in hand, they spend 20 minutes in each class, discussing five or six reproductions which will remain in the school for a whole month.

THE PICTURE ladies gear their presentation to the age level.

First graders are interested in color and what they can find in the picture. By the time they reach fifth grade, they are interested in the biography of the artist, and how and why the picture was painted.

Each portfolio has a theme, such as animals, sports, women artists, celebrations,

Canadian artists, etc. with the prints chosen to appeal to the children.

At the end of the visit, the volunteer leaves a picture in each classroom for the children to "live with" for a week. At the end of each week the prints are rotated.

"The picture lady program" is entirely dependent upon volunteers," said Barb Church, chairman of the project. "Without their enthusiasm, the program would never be the success it is."

"THESE ARE NOT women who have vast knowledge or experience in the arts; they are women who enjoy children and like to participate in the education of the children in the community."

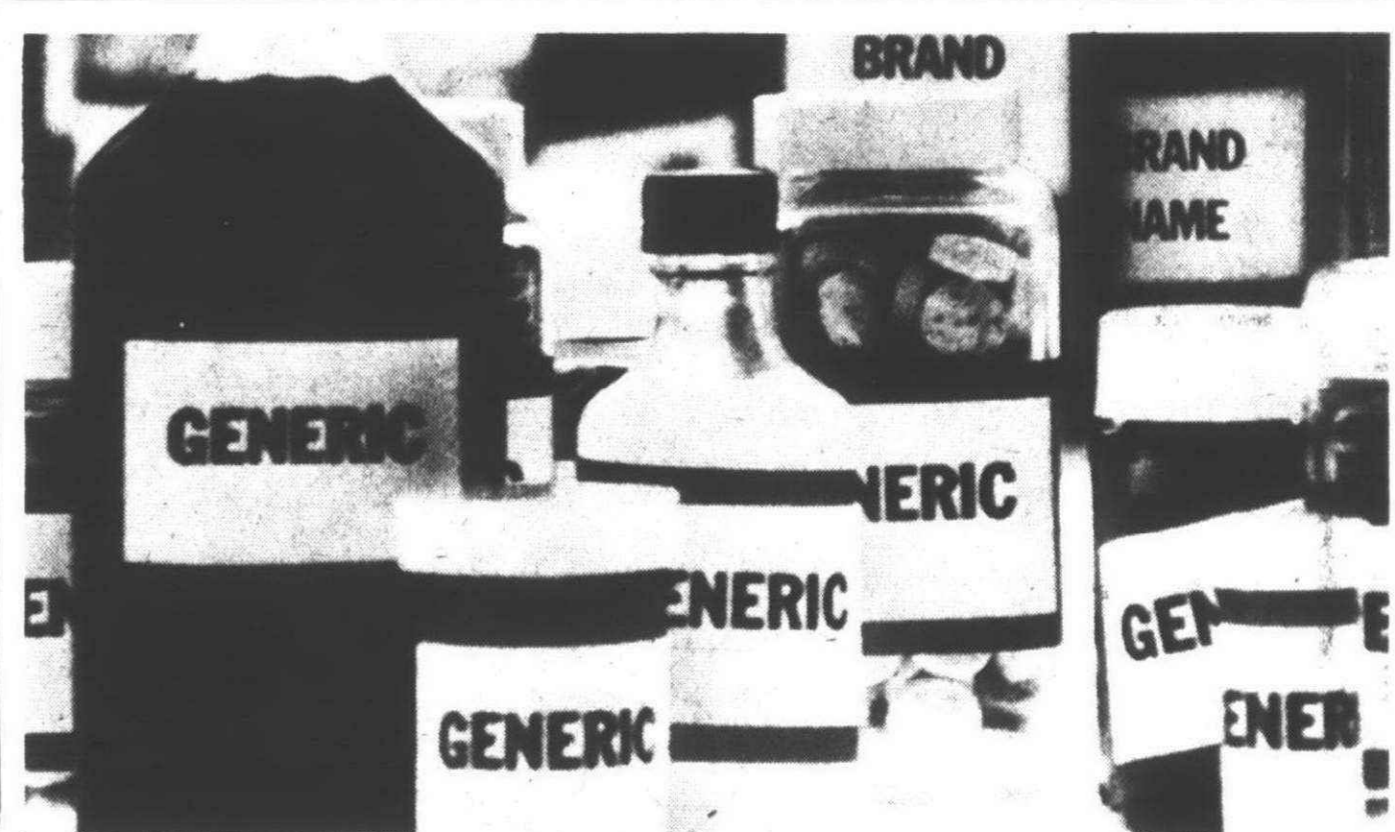
Volunteers are given special training and guidance and may be assigned to schools of their choice. Anyone wishing more information is asked to contact their school chairman or the arts council.

"WE have 68 picture ladies currently, serve 15 schools and use 73 portfolios. These numbers will be increased by fall," said Mrs. Church.

The program was started in 1969 by Margaret Moon. Judy Lewis was chairman from 1971 to 1975. With three new elementary schools opening in September, Mrs. Church is hoping to recruit more picture ladies to serve the expanding classrooms.

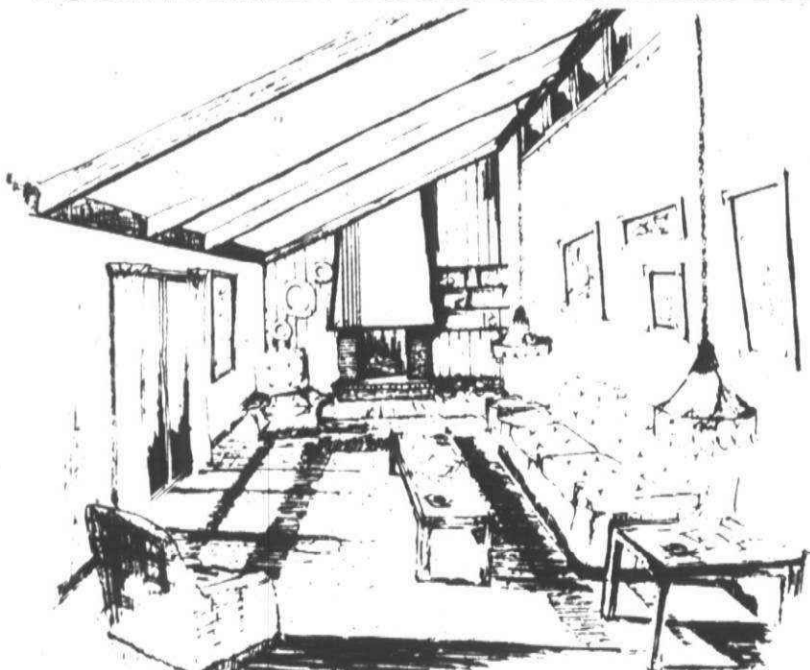

"IDEALLY," said Lynn Culotta, president of the Plymouth branch, "we would like to see a resident of the Plymouth Community School District receive the money, but none applied this year. We know there must be local women who could use the scholarship and hope some will apply this time."

"Scholarship recipients are chosen primarily on the basis of personal interview and need," said Pat Wolfe of the U-M Center for Continuing Education of Women.

**Tour Ford Rouge plant**

Free public tours have resumed at Ford Motor Co.'s Rouge manufacturing complex in Dearborn. The two-hour bus tours begin at 10 a.m., 11 a.m., 1:30 p.m. and 2:30 p.m. each Monday through Friday from the Ford Guest Center, on Village Road across from the entrance to Greenfield Village and the Henry Ford Museum. From June 1 through Sept. 3, tours will begin every half-hour from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m. This is the 52nd year Ford has sponsored tours of "the Rouge," a complex of plants covering 1,200 acres and employing 33,500 men and women.

Approximately 200,000 visitors from all over the world are expected to tour the Rouge this year. Highlights of the tour are the Dearborn Assembly Plant, where the Mustang II is assembled and the new hot strip mill operation where the company produces about half the steel used in its manufacturing operations. The Rouge has 110 miles of railroad track and 30 miles of paved roads.
