Greenstein lowers boom on builders

Telling builders operating in Canton to get tough on their own kind "ripping off" the homebuyer, township Supervisor Robert Greenstein, in effect, put a stop on all residential building in Canton Thursday.

Meeting with a large contingent of builders, the supervisor told them the problem of building complaints had snowballed to the point where all township inspectors would be reassigned to handle backed up complaints.

Until Thursday, the building department had assigned one man full-time to handle complaints with part-time help from two other inspectors.

The reassignment of inspectors will have the effect of stopping all residential building because builders will not be able to get inspections to continue working on homes.

As soon as a builder needs a permit, or an inspector to verify work, he will be stopped.

Although builders can legally start work again in 48 hours if no inspector from the township arrives, Greenstein warned those considering such a move to be careful.

"You better not miss one nail in one stud, because we'll be looking at your houses very carefully," he said. "Instead of trying to get around this, try to work with this to solve the problem."

BUILDERS HAD met with Greenstein about two months ago when the problem began to worsen, and at that time the supervisor suggested a new inspection policy

that would cost the builders \$15 per complaint inspection.

The builders rejected the idea, Greenstein said, instead opting for internal management of the complaint problem.

But the problem continued to the point where it is out of hand, Greenstein said as he imposed the building ban.

The supervisor, responding to pleas from builders, especially those who had no complaints lodged against them, said he would attempt to see that all complaints were logged and verified by Tuesday evening, so inspections could begin once again.

"I'm afraid though, that once we start going door-to-door investigating the complaints we have, we'll get more," Greenstein said.

The supervisor said he wouldn't be surprised to see the total, presently hovering around 250, to double.

"This is just a reaction," Greenstein told the builders. "We didn't make the problems and we didn't build the houses. Most of you seem more interested in future income instead of spending money backwords for repairs."

"The job is not being done, either internally or through your association—we have no alternative."

"IT'S A SORRY situation," the supervisor said, "because there are some good guys out there, aside from the bad offenders and you've earned better treatment."

"Maybe now the good guys will look after the bad guys so it doesn't happen again."

Construction stopped

Greenstein said the inspection reassignment wouldn't affect commercial buildings or homes where the new buyers are ready to move in.

Irving Yackness, spokesman for the builder's association asked for a less severe measure. "There must be some other way to do this," he appealed to Greenstein.

"Most of these men have been building all over this area and this has never happened before. Most of the builders take care of their complaints. I'm not going to say there aren't any complaints, but we try to make the corrections—it's not an overnight matter."

Yackness said about 1,000 homes were delivered in the last year and he thought it unfair to make all builders suffer because of "alleged complaints against a few builders."

Greenstein replied that complaints were on file against 24 builders, some of whom were serious offenders.

"You've abused your privilege. You can go to court or do what you want, but it stops now. We aren't going to be hassled because you aren't doing your job. People shouldn't have to work up an ulcer after spending their last buck because you won't take care of their complaints."

YACKNESS RESPONDED. "It's absolutely unconscionable to hurt the good

cases the builders brought against the township.

"You have the power of life and death over these men."

Greenstein repeatedly pointed to several builders as serious offenders, including Crescendo, Starlight, and in particular Dembs building, operating in the Stonegate subdivision.

After his name was mentioned several times, Manny Dembs stood up, shaking, and spoke.

"Don't divide up the builders association. I'm the only one with guts to stand

up and talk and you can put me out of business if you want to."

The builder then charged that Greenstein's building stoppage was a political move and that he was attempting to divide the builders.

"I've dedicated my life to this association and you're trying to break it up. You're jeopardizing the free enterprise system. Why don't you use normal channels instead of shutting us all down. There are

Board hopefuls offer wide range of choices

Voters have quite a variety of backgrounds to choose from among the six candidates seeking election to the Plymouth Board of Education June 14.

There are three women candidates and three men with ages ranging from the mid-30s to the mid-40s. The field includes a businessman, law enforcement officer, college instructors, and residents active in community affairs.

Just as there is a variety in occupational backgrounds and community involvement, so there is a mixture of educational philosophies which voters will be able to discern as the campaign nears June 14.

The incumbents—Marda Benson and Flossie Tonda—are being challenged by Richard Arlen, William Brown, Elizabeth Hamann and Stephen Harper. Of the six, Mrs. Tonda and Ms. Hamann are from Canton, Ms. Benson and Arlen from the City of Plymouth, and Brown and Harper from Plymouth Township.

Two will be elected for terms of four years. Ms. Benson is seeking re-election after serving a full term while Mrs. Tonda is running for election for the first time, having been appointed to fill out a vacancy left by the resignation of Gary Mirto.

ARLEN HAS lived in Plymouth since 1946 and is presently an accounting instructor at Schoolcraft Community College and a leader of the Faculty Forum, the teacher's union at the college.

Arlen, 1441 Hartsough, graduated from Plymouth High in 1948 and then spent four years in the U.S. Navy. He attended Eastern Michigan University where he earned a BA in accounting and an MBA in management.

Arlen worked as a manager of cost accounting at Massey Ferguson and Ex-Cell-O Corp. before joining the staff at Schoolcraft. He is active in Republican politics and was elected a delegate to the county convention in the May 18 primary.

BROWN, 42, of 44478 Albert Drive, is a shift sergeant for the Michigan State Police post in Ypsilanti and has lived in Plymouth Township for the past three years.

He graduated from high school in 1951 and earned a BS in criminal justice in 1972 from Michigan State University. Brown has been a member of the state police for

20 years, serving in Flat Rock, Trenton, East Tawas and East Lansing before coming to Ypsilanti.

Brown was a member of the school district's Citizens Advisory Committee (CAC) work group on scheduling for grades eight to 12, a member of the Washtenaw County Law Enforcement and Industrial Security Association, and a member of St. Peter Lutheran Church in Plymouth which he served as chairman of its board for education for the church's day school.

Brown said his interest in running for the school board started with a concern about modular scheduling at the high schools. His other concerns are the three new elementary schools which Brown believes were designed for open classrooms without sufficient citizen input and continuation of 45-15 year-round school at Miller without adequate resident input.

Brown also feels school trustees should be given information with agenda packets at least 24 hours before a meeting so they aren't unduly influenced by the administration.

MRS. TONDA, of 39846 John Dr., was appointed to the school board in January 1976.

She is secretary of the Canton Township Planning Commission, term to expire this year, and past president of the Plymouth Community School Council.

Mrs. Tonda also is a member of the Camp Fire Girls Detroit Area Council, the League of Women Voters and Plymouth Chapter 115 Order of Eastern Star. This year she organized the Plymouth School District clothing bank for the needy.

"I am a candidate for the school board because I am very interested in kids and have always felt that children are our most precious gift," she explains.

"After serving on the school board these past four months, I still see the imperative of maintaining the basic educational opportunities so badly needed today. All students aren't college bound and educational opportunities have to be available to ensure these students they are equipped to join the mainstream work force after graduation."

MS. HAMANN, 29 of 42316 Saxony Dr., earned a BA in English from the University of South Florida in 1971 and lives

in the legal assistant program at Madonna College where she also studied public administration and accounting.

She has maintained regular attendance at school board meetings and workshops. She is a volunteer teacher aide at East elementary and chairman of the classroom organization committee. Ms. Hamann is a former president of the Canton Citizens Advisory Council, former chairman of the Windsor Park Civic Association, member of the League of Women Voters, and a member of the 1975-76 millage committee.

"Because education is increasingly a question of what the community can afford," she says, "Plymouth faces a reassessment of its priorities as mandated by

Work on Edison lease begins

Members of the Canton Board of Trustees last week took a first step toward acquisition of recreational land for township residents.

Members of the board unanimously agreed to empower the township's administration to negotiate a lease agreement with Detroit Edison Co. for the township's recreational use of the nine-mile Edison corridor, a T-shaped strip of land running parallel to Cherry Hill east and west and parallel to Morton Taylor from Cherry Hill to the township's southern line.

In addition, board members authorized the administration to investigate the purchase of a 28-acre parcel, owned by De-

troit Edison and located north of Cherry Hill near the extended Morton Taylor line.

Detroit Edison will sell the parcel for \$149,000 cash or on five-year land contract terms with 30 per cent down and 9 1/2 per cent interest.

Canton Clerk John Flodin said the township would probably use the parcel for recreational purposes, if board members decide to buy it.

TOWNSHIP OFFICIALS have tried to obtain use of the nine-mile strip of land beneath Detroit Edison tower lines for more than a year now. Officials have discussed

construction of bicycle or bridle paths on the land.

Three Detroit Edison representatives last week presented township officials with a sample lease agreement for the land, identical to an agreement negotiated between the utility company and the Sterling Heights.

Under the five-year lease, Sterling Heights pays a rent equal to Detroit Edison's liability insurance on the land. Edison officials must approve all improvements proposed by the city for the land.

Recreational use of the area, according to the lease, is limited to softball playing fields, swings, picnic areas, horseshoe

courts and other activities approved by Detroit Edison. The operation of snowmobiles and motorcycles is prohibited as well as the flying of kites or model airplanes.

Sterling Heights must finance the approximate \$160-per-unit cost for installation of anti-climbing devices on some of the electrical towers, according to the lease agreement.

All recreational equipment and liability for use of the land is the city's, not Detroit Edison's, the lease says.

The city must relocate recreational equipment within 90 days of a written order, if Detroit Edison workers must perform maintenance work on the power lines. The city must restore the corridor to its original appearance, if the lease is not renewed.

THE LEASE agreement with Sterling Heights is the first negotiated with a municipality, a Detroit Edison official told Canton board members.

"The concept of a recreational lease for our corridors is relatively new," he said. "Certainly, there's going to be some problems we'll have to work out."

Canton Supervisor Robert Greenstein objected to the length of a five-year lease. The township, he said, would not want to invest money for bicycle paths and anti-climbing devices for so short a period.

Some residents at last week's meeting expressed concern about farmland abutting the Detroit Edison corridor.

"Will the township police this land to keep people off the farmland?" one resident asked. "That's real important. People ride horses and motorcycles through my field now. I think it's fine to be concerned about recreational areas, but the township

Poole to run for trustee position

Incumbent trustee Jim Poole, the only Republican now serving on the Canton Township Board of Trustees, announced Thursday he will seek re-election.

Poole, an unsuccessful candidate for supervisor in 1974, is 46, and a retired Air Force major.

A Canton resident since 1971, Poole is a real estate salesman.

Running alone, despite offers to run as a member of several tickets, the trustee said he only recently made up his mind to seek re-election.

Citing health problems, which are now solved, and possible trouble concerning scheduling of classes he is taking to get a masters in political science, the incumbent said all possible obstacles have been removed, and he would like to serve on the board again.

"I THINK THE master land use plan will be the biggest issue this year," he said. "I've been quiet on the plan so far, because I didn't think it was appropriate to comment until the planning commission voted on it, and I am going to wait until we hear from Wayne County before making any comprehensive statement."

"But I have a lot of things to say about it, and as soon as it comes back from Wayne County."

While the trustee declined to comment on the problems he has with the plan, he said he wanted to be a member of the board when a plan is finally implemented.

"There's no question we need a master plan, and I would like to see this whole thing out," Poole said.

Poole added, however, that the township was going to have to do something to slow down present growth rates. He suggested investigating procedures like the Petaluma Plan, in which building permits are restricted to slow growth.

"In four years, we could very well exceed our sewer authorization," he said.

Poole said the township has been granted sewer capacity for only 35,900 people, although, physically, the township's sewers are capable of much more. Citing the fact that 28,000 people already live in Canton, he said unless the township slows its growth, capacity will have to be purchased from other municipalities.

THE TRUSTEE said a second big issue of the 1976 campaign would be fiscal responsibility. "I think we should have a \$500 limitation on expenditures without board approval. There's no limit now, and the bidding procedure we have doesn't take care of the problem."

"We spent \$800 for furniture in the supervisor's office without bids; \$2,300 without bids for a public address system in the meeting hall; \$1,700 for gravel without bids—it's just too easy to go astray."

As the campaign progresses, Poole said,

A financial history

What led to millage request?

The request for 4.75 mills on the June 14 ballot has been the result of a financial history over the past two years—particularly the current school year—as the Plymouth

Community School District copes with rising enrollment and proportionately declining state aid.

The need for the 4.75 mills (\$4.75 per \$1,000 state equalized evaluation) can be better understood by examining what has happened to the district financially during 1975-76.

THE SCHOOL BOARD approved the 75-76 operating budget in October, 1975, with revenues expected to be \$17.45 million. By the end of the year, revenues had dropped by some \$401,850.

The district lost revenue because of: the governor's executive order cutbacks in state aid, \$270,867; reduced Wayne County funding for special education, \$111,000; reduced interest from short term notes, \$60,400; and, reduced state funding of special education, \$35,133. These revenue losses totalled \$477,400.

The income loss was offset slightly by revenue gained from unexpected sources, such as: two federal grant programs, \$30,000; state vocational education programs, \$23,000; City of Plymouth contribution for crossing guards, \$10,400; special state grant for the high school Student Service Center pilot program, \$5,750; tuition from neighboring school districts for use of vocational education facilities, \$5,000; and, increased gate receipts from

athletic events, \$1,400. These offsetting gains totalled \$75,550.

Faced with a net loss in income approaching half a million dollars, the district made these expense reductions: teaching supplies, trimmed by \$103,886; maintenance and cleaning, \$76,200; driver education program, \$11,000; special education, \$10,000; elimination of some teacher aides, \$10,000; athletics cutback, \$6,000; health services, \$5,000; and miscellaneous items less than \$5,000 each, \$93,671. The total expenses cut was \$315,759.

Coupled with the income loss and budget reductions, the board was also faced with unexpected cost increases of \$100,000 for utilities and \$63,666 for special funded state and federal programs.

"As a result, we will end the present fiscal year 'in the red' by an estimated \$166,260," says Ray Hoedell, asst. supt. for business. "The money will come from the small surplus we had left over at the end of last year and put into a contingency account for unforeseen emergency. We will 'balance' the budget this year, but our deficit will almost completely wipe out the contingency account and leave the district in a precarious position next year unless the millage passes."

THE MILLAGE campaign committee reminds residents that because the Plymouth Community School District has a high local tax base, compared to districts statewide, the district depends very heavily upon local revenue.

Of this year's \$17 million operating budget, \$14 million is generated by local sources, \$2½ million from state sources, \$148,000 from federal sources, and \$217,000 from county sources.

The local income of \$14 million includes \$13.9 million from property taxes (29.01 mills) and \$287,655 from athletic gate receipts. The \$2½ million from the state includes \$1.7 million from general state aid, \$117,000 for vocational education, \$210,000 for transportation, \$423,000 special education, \$40,000 reading program, and \$25,000 for driver education. The major source of county revenue is \$212,000 from the county special education tax.

This year, some \$12 million of the total budget was spent for instruction with \$4 million for elementary, \$6 million secondary, \$844,730 for special education, \$154,710 for adult education, and \$8,311 for summer school. Other major expenditures were: central administration, \$56,320; transportation, \$704,935; plant operation, \$1.35 million; utilities, \$843,575; fixed charges (i.e. insurance), \$962,600; capital outlay, \$61,540; community services, \$33,000; and, athletics, \$135,300.

The budget for the next school year, 1976-77, shows these estimated expenses are expected to increase as follows: elementary instruction, up 13.8 per cent; secondary, 12.7 per cent; special education,

32.6 per cent; summer school, 19 per cent; and adult education, 19.6 per cent increase.

Projected expense increases for non-instruction areas are: central administration, 8.2 per cent; health services, 11.3 per cent; transportation, 18.9 per cent; utilities, 28.8 per cent; plant operation, 17 per cent; plant maintenance, 48.8 per cent; fixed charges, 45.5 per cent; capital outlay, 17.7 per cent; community services, 14.8 per cent; and athletics, 14.9 per cent.

The instructional budget projects an increase of \$2 million or 17.2 with non-instruction expenses expected to increase by a total of \$1.5 million or 29 per cent for a total budget increase of 3½ million or 20 per cent.

The Plymouth Salem High School choir and orchestra will bring the musical school year to a close with a concert beginning at 7:30 p.m. June 3.

Two works by the Italian master, Antonio Vivaldi, will be presented. The choir, featured soloists, and orchestra will perform "Gloria," "Fall" from Vivaldi's Orchestral Cycle, and "The Seasons" which will feature marimba soloist Bill Sweeney. Seventeenth-century vocal chamber music will be sung by the Madrigal Singers. The Triple-Trios will sing familiar popular music.

H. Michael Endres will conduct the orchestra and Fred Nelson will direct the vocal music. The public is welcome to attend the performance in the Little Theatre of Plymouth Canton High School. Admission is free.

Training dogs an increasing specialization

With each passing day trained police dogs are playing a more important part in the apprehension of criminals and thus make a major contribution in the fight to control crime across the land.

In the past 30 years their number has increased from only four known trained animals to more than 25,000.

"And we have just begun to scratch the surface," Charles "Chuck" Art, well-known Plymouth trainer, said as he told of vast number now working with law enforcement agencies.

"The larger number is not only because of the increased crime rate, but because, like anything else, we have come to an age of specialization."

IN THE 1940s and early '50s the dog was just trained to work with the police, mostly to do the average job of seeking out criminals.

"Now, according to Art, there are at least a dozen different specialties. As an example he pointed out that there dogs trained for nothing but to detect drugs, others to detect bombs, and some for body recovery. There are dogs taught to search out guns, and others for what Art termed 'hard surface tracking.'"

Aside from these specialties Art is now working with the agricultural department for special assignments.

ASKED HOW much time is required to train a dog, Art replied that he could train a dog and have him on the street in 12 days.

And the most important feature is the fact that, contrary to popular belief, he will not take a vicious dog to train.

"I want a dog that has been in a family with children. That type of dog becomes a pet, but more important he learns to communicate. It will play with the children, roll on the floor with them, and more important, respond to their requests. That type of dog makes the best dog for our work."

While he hesitates to admit it, Art was the pioneer in training dogs for detecting bombs, guns and what is termed a "hard dry" animal. And his services are always in demand to provide protection for national civic, business and political leaders.

How fast will the dogs work?

"If we are called in time our dogs can bring results in a half hour," he answered. "This is especially true in cases of rape, arson, armed robbery and murders."

Then, with a bit of pride, he confided, "Our dogs have never missed on identification."

Aside from the fact that he won't attempt to train a vicious dog, Art demands that all police officers assigned to the dog division must have experience in handling dogs.

ART IS the fourth generation of dog trainers in his family. He has known nothing else since he was a child.

The training skill was handed down from family to family. But, Art tells you that his father died when he was very young and his grandfather worked with him most of the time.

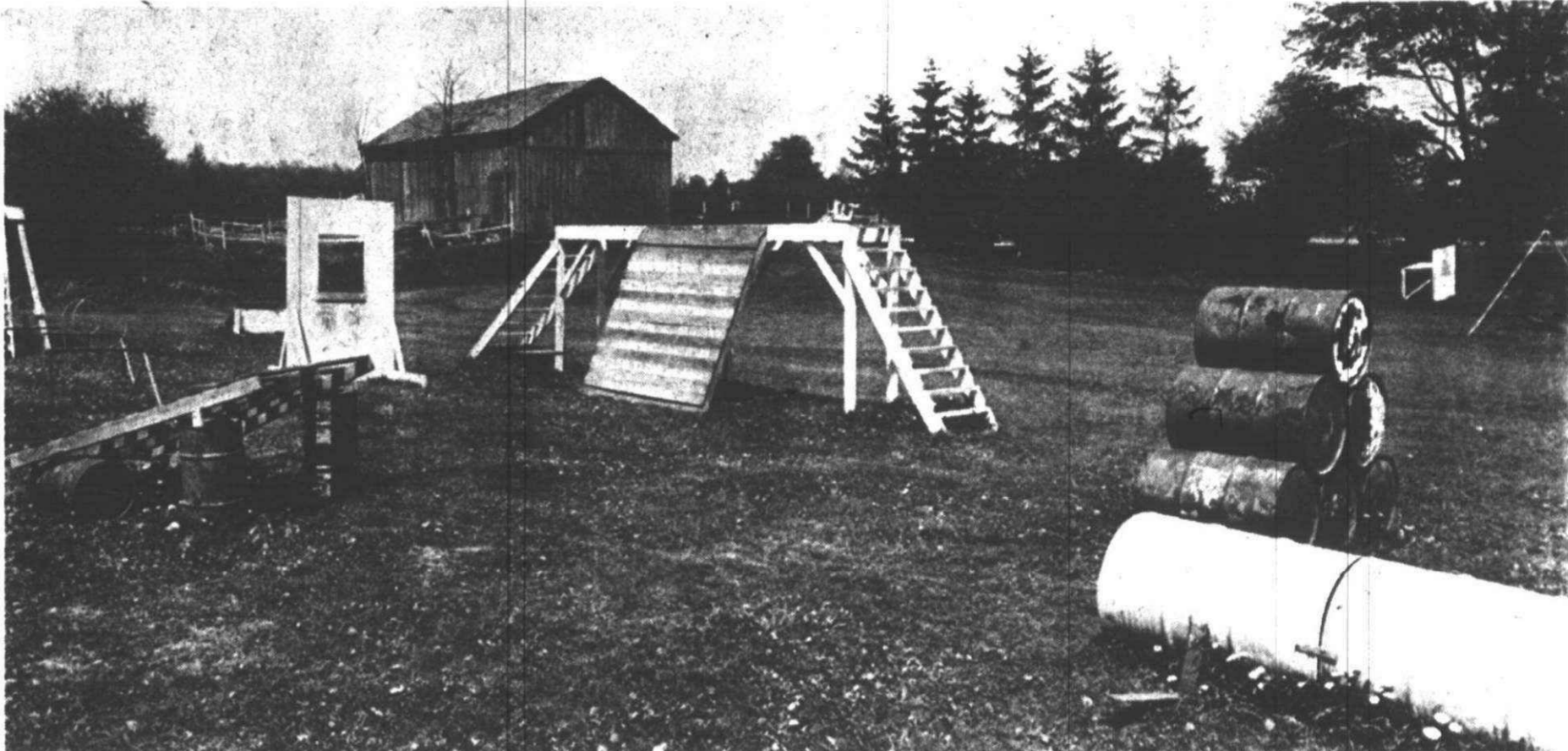
Over the years Art has conducted kennels in Farmington and Wayne before settling in Plymouth 11 years ago.

While he does most of his training on special grounds one the outskirts of town he quite often brings a few into the city to take special training in places like Kellogg Park and the vacated corner of Stark-weather and Main Street.

If by chance you should see them don't become alarmed. They are not in search of a criminal at those sites. They are just being trained by a fellow who has known nothing else all his life.

But his work has been such that he was the subject of featured articles in national magazines such as Readers' Digest and he has shown his finely-trained animals on television.

He is the pioneer in special training for dogs. He feels with the advances now being made in all lines, his greatest work lies ahead.

(Continued from Page 1A) licenses and you can go to Lansing to stop this if you want to.

"I've got two full-time repair people working now and it's costing me \$700 a week—there's only so much profit in a house. We're trying."

Greenstein replied that he was not attempting to break up the association.

"IT'S EASY TO look at Bob Greenstein and say it's him—he's causing the problem. But I'm just reacting. Why don't you try getting damn tough on your own group. You're not known as a namby-pamby group. Take the offenders out behind a house shake them up. Do something, even the big outfits like Crescendo and Republic will respond to peer pressure."

Several builders answered that the association doesn't have any enforcement powers.

A spokesman for Bonadeo builders added, "As a legal person, I'm sure you have some sense of justice. I've been building houses for 30 years and there are always complaints. But it's never reached a point such as this. Some of the problem lies with your government. You should just shut down the bad guys, not everyone. I've never had a complaint here."

Greenstein replied that when all the complaints are compiled, only the builders without outstanding complaints will get inspections.

Those that still have complaints won't get inspections until all the problems are settled, he said.

Bert Benson, spokesman for Smokler said he hadn't even been building in Canton in the recent past and was not guilty of any complaints.

"I don't want you to think that we are challenging Canton but we will continue to build after the 48-hour waiting period."

"That's your legal right," Greenstein

said, "but you better do it right. We're not a goon squad, but I wish you'd try to cooperate instead of getting around us."

(Continued from Page 1A) he expects the reserve police to become a topical matter.

"They started out as an auxiliary to augment local authorities at carnivals and high school games; now they are going to wear campaign hats, drive pursuit cars and carry .357 magnums."

"Some of them may even be riding alone."

Pooler said the issue of the reserves' carrying guns would have to be determined by the function the auxiliaries will serve.

"IT'S A QUESTION of concepts. Are we augmenting current services, building our own department or someone's private army. Certainly, if I was wearing the uniform, I'd want to be able to carry a gun."

Pooler added the sheriff currently is reluctant to ticket violators of township ordinances. He suggested better communication is needed between the township, its attorneys, and the sheriff.

He said it was a problem of the sheriff's being unaware of present ordinances and whether or not they had the backing of the township's legal arm.

Pooler also said positive steps are needed to attract more "tax-plus" tax base to the township.

"Massey is only an example of what has happened. A lot of people have turned away from Canton because of some of the restrictions."

"We have to create an atmosphere where businesses and industry want to locate; and I think the first step is to hire an

"But if push comes to shove, I can tell you, it will be you guys getting hurt, not us."

industrial coordinator. If he's worth a damn, he'll tell us that we'll have to make some changes in berm requirements and the sign ordinance.

"Some changes have to be made—and that doesn't mean we'll end up looking like Garden City and Westland."

"If we don't make changes, it will get to the point where we won't be able to afford the taxes to live here."

The incumbent said that while there were other good candidates for trustee, he felt he understood the workings of government better after four years on the board, and he added, "I'd like to think I offer a bit of stabilization."

"I think I am sort of a counter-measure, because I offer alternative thinking on the board."

Simmons gives resignation

"It is crucial that we resolve these concerns as we re-evaluate our priorities. At the same time we must guard against an over-reaction. Because of my background, I believe I can be an affirmative force in directing this re-evaluation."

HARPER, of 11835 Appletree, has been employed since 1967 in the car engineering group of Ford Motor Co. as a financial analyst and computer applications engineer. He also has held various positions in the group controller's office and the engineering computer center.

A resident of Plymouth Township for three years, Harper served this year as chairperson of the general curriculum work group of the CAC. He is a member of the Citizens' Steering Committee for the

1976 millage election. As co-chairperson of the publicity subcommittee, Harper prepared the information kit now being used by millage campaign workers.

Resignation official

The last chapter of the Plymouth Canton football coaching incident was written very quietly Monday night when the Plymouth school board, unanimously and without comment, accepted the resignation of Jim Muneio and three assistants.

The controversy surrounding the coach and his staff started almost two months ago, when Muneio, pressured by school board trustee Joe Gray and a group of parents, announced his intention to quit. Muneio cited the pressure of parents, Gray, and the inability to create a strong program in such an atmosphere as the reasons for his resignation.

Parents listed a host of charges against the coach, suggesting that he lacked the leadership qualities necessary to coach young athletes.

Although Muneio, the only head football coach in the three-year history of the program, posted records of 3-6, 2-7, and 3-6, critics said winning was not the crux of the matter. They charged the coach had used bad judgement in dealing with players.

After a series of closed-door hearings, however, school board members virtually vindicated the beleaguered coach, saying there was no reason to take any action against him.

Board members said Muneio could remain if he chose, but the coach said he preferred to resign.

"Hopefully, with my resignation, a new coach can be hired, and he can begin his program without interference. Perhaps the negative contingent can refrain from its subversive activities and allow the program to thrive."

Resigning with Muneio were varsity assistants Dan Chrenko, Jim Jarvey and Gary Grady; junior varsity coaches Tom Garrett, and Russ Carlson, and freshman coaches Sam Daas and John Campbell, all of whom supported Muneio's program.

Canton site suggested

SC eyes 2nd off-campus center

Schoolcraft College trustees are considering a second off-campus center, this time in Canton Township. The two-year community college has its main campus in Livonia and a Garden City center.

An administrative committee recommended phasing out small instructional centers at 6701 Harrison in Garden City and at Livonia Churchill and Northville Cook schools.

Ideal site for the Canton Center, said the committee, would be at or near the Plymouth School District's Centennial Education Park at the southwest corner of Joy and Canton Center roads. It would have its own director and a building for about 500 students.

TRUSTEES RECEIVED the report Wednesday and decided to devote an entire study session to it at some unspecified future date.

The Committee for the Study of Long Range Plans Concerning Off-Campus Instructional Centers included: Clay Fechter, director of the Garden City Center; Barbara Geil, director of admissions; Ronald Griffith, dean of community services; W. Kenneth Lindner, vice-president for administration; and Larry Ordowski, director of liberal arts.

The committee found that Schoolcraft's enrollment, particularly in the evening, will continue to grow; the main campus at 18600 Haggerty, Livonia, is full Monday through Thursday evenings; and a few strong off-campus centers would provide better service than scattered small centers.

"BY 1985, THE ideal arrangement of full-time centers would form a geographic triangle. The apex would be the main campus with a center in each end of the base—one in Garden City and one in Canton Township," the report said.

"The general administration, technology classes, laboratories and most of the liberal arts would be located on the main campus.

"To the southeast, in Garden City, the Harrison center would house some of the most popular laboratory courses and a moderate library, but primarily lecture courses.

"To the southwest, in Canton, where the population is expected to surpass Livonia, there would be a full-time center housing programs similar to those in Garden City. The triangle should be complemented by a number of part-time centers developed as the needs of the community are identified.

"BECAUSE OF ITS proximity to the main campus, there is no long term benefit in maintaining a full time center in Northville. . . . The center at Northville Cooke should be phased out as soon as possible and alternative plans for conducting the programs now housed there should be developed immediately.

"We will still need a part-time center in Northville for evening classes. But renovation and operation of the Cooke Center would pose an unnecessary financial burden on the college. It would just make

more sense to lease the necessary number of rooms in the local high school.

"The lease at the Garden City Manor (an industrial building) should be phased out over the next few years with the climate systems program being brought to the main campus as soon as suitable space becomes available.

"The part-time center now located at Livonia Churchill High School should continue to be utilized during the 1976-77 fiscal year. This part-time activity should then be relocated in another center in the Canton Township area by September 1977.

"WITH REGARD TO Canton Township, our proposal is two-fold.

"First, since there is no building available for a full time center, steps should be taken in the very near future to acquire land for a permanent facility and plans begun for a building.

"Second, steps should be taken immediately to lease space for a part-time center to open by the fall of 1977. Probably the best location for this would be the Centennial Educational Park, where the Plymouth district's two high schools are located."

The Canton Center would generate 4,000 credit hours. If an average student takes eight credit hours, then 500 persons could be accommodated.

The Stroller On Memorial Day

As sometimes happens, The Stroller slumped down in his easy chair the other evening, dozed off a bit, and had one of the most enjoyable dreams he has had in quite a while.

While he could hear the blaring of the bands and then the muffled drums, he dreamed he was back home on Memorial Day, standing on the curb watching his grandfather, "The Colonel," commander of the Grand Army Post, leading the parade on an old black horse and conducting the solemn ceremony of placing flowers on the graves in the cemetery.

When he awakened, The Stroller had to smile at the recollection of "The Colonel" strutting his stuff. It was the one day in the year to which he looked forward with great pride. It was his day, and proudly wearing the his army blues with the black fedora hat and the gold braid, he made the most of it.

MEMORIAL DAY ceremonies have changed a great deal in the past decade or two. Today, in many communities, there is a short parade, a small gathering in the city park to listen to some politician delivering a patriotic speech, and then the disbursement to the golf courses, picnic grounds, auto races, baseball field and horse parks.

It wasn't like that in the old days when we still had the veterans of the Civil War

with us. We turned the whole day over to them.

There would be the usual parade, back home, then a walk over the bridge, stopping a while to drop flowers into the Le-high River to pay tribute to the sailors who gave their lives in the war between the states, and then on to the cemetery for the main tribute.

IT WAS AT THE chapel in the cemetery on the hill overlooking our little town, that "The Colonel" really put on a show. He handled the ceremonies masterfully while one of the school children, winner of an oratorical contest, recited Lincoln's Gettys-burg Address. Following that, he showed the way while placing flowers on the graves—row on row—of his departed com-rades.

Few in the gathering ever realized it, but there was a bit of jealousy between "The Colonel" and his predecessor, Capt. Joseph Matchette, a kindly old gent with a long, white beard, and "The Colonel" used this day to enrich his ego.

It seems that when Capt. Matchette was elevated in rank, he was in a hospital recuperating from wounds. And The Stroller's grandfather, never one to mince words, claimed that the wounded man never had been on the firing line.

For that reason, "Grandpa" designated himself a "Colonel," and he nursed the riv-ality until the day he died.

The dispute reached a peak one year when he defeated Capt. Matchette for the office of post commander, thus earning the right to lead the Memorial Day parade.

For years, Capt. Matchette had led the parade on a prancing white horse. That year, however, when "The Colonel" reported at the riding stable expecting to get the white horse, he was told that it was the property of Capt. Matchette. Moreover, he was told, the only horse available was a forlorn looking black one. He protested and protested, but to no avail.

So it happened the route of the parade called for a left turn off the main street on to the bridge and then on to the cemetery. On this particular day, as he was making the turn on the old black horse, he looked back and saw Capt. Matchette and his white horse stumble.

To the amazement of all, and The Strol-ler in particular, "The Colonel" thumbed his nose at the captain and then rode on. It was an unusual moment, and the memory of it has lived through the years.

Now the veterans of the Grand Army of the Republic are gone. With their passing, Memorial Day seems to have changed. Veterans of our later wars—World War I and World War II—don't put as much empha-sis on Memorial Day ceremonies. It's too bad, for it was a rare privilege to have walked and talked with the veterans of the GAR, the men who fought to save the Union.

Canton drops WLW with early outburst

Plymouth Canton made another advance toward winning its second consecutive Western Six baseball championship last Wednesday afternoon, using some outstanding defensive plays, a stout hitting attack and the stingy pitching of Bill Parson to stop Walled Lake Western, 5-2.

"This was the best effort the players have shown all year," said Canton Coach Fred Crissey. "We scored four runs in the second inning and stayed on top of them. When we had to make a play, we did."

Canton ran its mark in the Western Six Conference to 6-3, with one game remaining on its league schedule against Livonia Churchill at 9 p.m. tomorrow afternoon at Central Middle School. The Chargers de-

feated the Chiefs 5-0 in their previous meeting.

Parson, now 7-1 on the season, struck out seven and walked two. He was tagged for two runs in Western's first trip to the plate on two singles, two errors, and a walk.

The Chiefs assumed an advantage in their half of the second inning that the Warriors would never overcome. Dave Pink ignited the rally with a double, Kevin Randazzo walked, and when Steve Dugan drew another free pass off of Western hurler Fred Hadden, the bases were jammed for Scott Collins.

Collins cracked a single to centerfield which was mishandled by the infielder,

allowing two runs to score. Collins placed himself in scoring position by stealing second base on the following pitch.

With runners on second and third, Mike Sochacki laid down a two-strike squeeze bunt that befuddled the Western infield, scoring two runs to put the Chiefs up 4-2.

The Chiefs scored once more in the fifth inning when Randazzo drove home Pink on a single to left center. Pink had reached base on his third hit of the day as he went three-for-three at the plate while playing, "flawless third base," in the words of Crissey.

The sparkling defensive performance of the day for Canton occurred in the bottom half of the fifth, after they had padded the lead to three runs.

Western threatened by loading the bases on singles by Jean Hampel, Terry Soma and John Mussen with no outs. Armand Hammer belted a line drive to deep centerfield.

Rob Mandle chased the ball down and made a diving catch, jump up and fired to Randazzo covering at second base to double up the runner.

From that point on, the game was elementary as Parson and Hadden retired the sides in order in the final two innings.

The line score in the game showed Canton with five runs on six hits and two errors, while Western compiled two runs on seven hits and two errors.

The league standings have Canton leading the pack with a 6-3 mark, Churchill at 5-4, Northville at 5-4, Farmington Harrison at 4-5, Walled Lake Western at 4-5, and Waterford Mott at 3-6.

The Chiefs must win their contest with Churchill to claim an out-right championship. Mark Perkins (4-1) is expected to get the call to pitch against the Chargers.

The Western Six baseball crown has never been worn by the same school for more than one year.

On the eve of its showdown for the league title, Canton stands at 14-8 on the year pending the outcome of yesterday's regional contest against Livonia Franklin.

Preschoolers approve green eggs and ham

Preschoolers in the PLUS program at Farrand Elementary School, with one exception, said they were delicious. The fact that they had cracked, seasoned, scrambled the eggs and had a hand in cooking them may have accounted for the clean plates.

A small amount of green food coloring was added to the egg mixture and the oil in which the precooked ham slices were heated. The pale green eggs actually looked appetizing. The aroma of the sizzling ham was tempting but the appearance was not.

Although Mary Fritz, project director of PLUS, reminded the children that food coloring had not changed the taste of their dyed Easter eggs, one small girl stoutly refused to even taste green eggs and ham.

The rest required no pep talk.

PUPILS LEARNING Useful Skills (PLUS) is a preschool Title I program

sponsored by the the Plymouth Community School District.

The school-based division serves 64 child-parent combinations. The children attend a session once a week at school. A parent meets at the same time with a teacher in an adjoining room. The child's work at school is continued at home under the direction of the parent.

Home-based division accommodates 60 child-parent combinations. The youngsters attend a preschool program three times a month in neighborhood homes. Sessions are led by volunteer mothers. Children and parents attend a concurrent session at school once a month.

The program is open to all 4-year-old preschoolers and their parents in an attendance area encompassed by the three Title I schools—Isbister, Central and Starkweather. Children are tested and screened through orientation sessions in the fall of the year before kindergarten entrance. Based on screening results, 124 child-parent combinations are selected.

KATHY BAGLEY, 4, of Canton Township will attend the new Mildred Field Elementary School kindergarten in the fall. As she was being post-tested by teacher

Sue Steele, she quickly responded to all the questions. Whatever her skills at the beginning of her exposure to the PLUS program, there was no hesitation as to which was her right hand, left hand, right foot or left foot.

She knew all her colors and, following instructions, drew a complete kindergarten.

Kathy was obviously ready for kindergarten.

The preschool curriculum fosters both cognitive and affective skills. It deals with language, listening, auditory, visual-motor and gross motor control and coordination, as well as emotional, self-care, self-concept and social behavior.

PARENTS OBSERVE and work with children, gaining insight into child development. They share problems and successes, individually and as a group.

Sessions are aimed at nutrition, child management, home safety and family living. A fringe benefit is that the sibilings of the child profit from the learning-centered atmosphere in the home and from sensitive parental attitude toward the school.

Two classrooms are provided at Farrand school and children and parents from the whole school district meet there.

"No," she said, then confessed: "The hardest is English because if you forget the words, you can't fake it."

If you don't know the violin, let's just say the feat ranks with throwing 10 straight strikes beat high off the inside of the plate in baseball: the average pitcher can do it a couple of times but keeping it up demands breath taking control.

The enjoyment was mutual as guest conductor Ernest A. Jones provided crisp readings of the first movement of Schubert's "Unfinished" symphony and Sousa's "Washington Post March" and DiBlasi soloed in LeRoy Anderson's lovable "Trumpeter's Lullaby."

Chevy offers new camper

Chevrolet's new recreational, the Blazer Chalet, combines the rugged highway and off-road capabilities of the Blazer with a mounted camper which can accommodate up to four people.

"Our Blazer Chalet will offer the recreational vehicle prospect the versatility of a rugged, streamlined four-wheel drive camper unit at a time when the number of outdoor enthusiasts seeking this type of vehicle is on a sharp increase," said James T. Riley, Chevrolet sales manager for trucks.

Featuring new softer riding suspension with four-wheel drive, the Blazer Chalet initially will be a limited production model with approximately 6,000 units estimated to be built during the first 12 months. The Blazer Chalet is being produced at the Chevrolet Truck Assembly Plant in Flint.

IT MARKS a "first" for Chevrolet by providing a total recreational vehicle package. In all other cases, Chevrolet supplies only the base vehicle, while camper and motorhome bodies are installed by RV manufacturers and the total unit merchandised by them as well.

The Blazer Chalet is equipped with power steering, oversized blackwall tires, front bucket seats, deluxe chromed front and rear bumpers, front mounted spare tire carrier and standard 350-cubic inch four-barrel V8 engine. A 400-cubic inch four-barrel V8 is also available.

The Blazer Chalet is being offered through dealers in four suggested versions or packages. The manufacturer's suggested retail price of the base unit is \$9,426.

THE BASIC camper body includes reinforced plastic shell with steel cage and pop-up roof, convertible seat/bunks with sleeping accommodations for two people, Formica counters, stainless steel sink and drain, two burner LPG stove with five-gallon LPG tank and vent hood, ice box and spice rack, demountable dinette table, color-keyed curtains and drapes, tinted camper windows and ample storage.

Floor and overhead area are covered with in-door/outdoor carpeting. Walls are padded vinyl. The occupants can move directly from the cab to the living quarters.

The second version includes all the items of the first package with the addition of a 5,000 BTU heater.

A third package includes all items of the first two except that the ice box is replaced with a three-way refrigerator. A battery and AC/DC power hookup kit is provided along with a LPG refrigerator hookup.

The fourth version includes everything offered in the first three plus overhead bunks to sleep two more adults.
