## Miller precinct put 'YES' over top

# Record turnout OK's school tax

The millage for Plymouth schools passed by 386 votes Thursday with a record 11,370 residents turning out to vote.

The unofficial vote was 5,853 yes, 5,467 no, with about 50 spoiled ballots. With the 386-vote margin, the outcome likely won't be changed when the official vote is certified by the board of canvassers.

The millage was carried by Miller School, precinct nine, which approved it by an overwhelmingly 2-1 margin—1,258 yes, 616 no. Other precincts giving a majority of yes votes to the millage were Gallimore, West Middle and Fiegl. West Middle was the only Plymouth precinct with a majority vote for the millage.

The 11,370 residents voting Thursday was 4,000 higher than the previous record turnout last June of more than 7,000. Thursday's turnout was 44 per cent of the total 26,000 registered voters in the Plymouth Community School District, compared to 27 per cent last June.

The financial result of the outcome will be a levy of 4.75 additional mills for operation for five years.

SUPT. JOHN M. Hoben commented that he was "relaxed" at the turnout.

"The outcome indicates the citizens want to maintain the quality of educational programs—at least a majority of citizens did. I am very pleased the millage carried and pledge we will do our best to maintain the quality of programs residents desire."

Joe Gray, president of the board of education, added, "I'm just very happy the millage passed. The election certainly caught the interest of the community. Now it's up to the school board to show that things will work out."

Flossie Tonda, board secretary, commented, "This shows we can always count

on the citizens of this school district to come through. It's happened in the past where a millage issue has failed but passed on the second try. When the chips are down our citizens come through."

Equally pleased after the final tally was completed was Florence Beier, community relations director who coordinated the campaign for the school district. "I am very pleased and really think the citizens election committee did a marvelous job in getting out the vote. It was a person-to-person campaign and it worked. Tonight's vote shows how many people realized that every vote counts."

THE AUDIENCE gathered at the board of education offices was jubilant after the final precinct—by-precinct—reporting with its votes, although it became apparent that the millage was most likely to pass when the vote from Central Middle was reported.

A no vote was expected from Central precinct one, but most poll-watchers anticipated it would be defeated by a wide margin. When the vote came in 680 no to 504 yes, the outcome seemed sewed in. There was little real doubt when Gallimore came in at 824 yes, 64 no.

The vote at each precinct was proportionately close to last June's millage election, with the exception of Miller. In June only three of nine precincts gave a majority of yes votes in the millage. Thursday four of the nine had a majority of yes votes with the West Middle precinct joining the no-millage side.

West Middle precinct six, turned down the millage 470-460 in June but approved it Thursday by 707-696. In June, Miller approved the millage 576-355 compared to Thursday's 2-1 margin.

Every precinct had a much larger turnout than in June. Those precincts with turn-

## Rush order is placed for ballots to accommodate surprise turnout

School election workers were anticipating a large turnout for Thursday's millage election but had to hustle to keep up with the large numbers who showed up to cast ballots.

When plans were made for the election, the administration ordered 1,500 absentee ballots and 9,500 regular paper ballots for a total of 11,000. That seemed to be an ample number of ballots based on the 7,000 residents who voted in last June's election.

As things turned out, however, there would have been a shortage of about 370 ballots if the administration hadn't taken prompt and decisive action mid-day on Thursday.

As voters were coming in on the voter turnout between 7 a.m. and noon, it became apparent to election workers that there was a real possibility that there might not be enough paper ballots available to meet the demand by the end of the day.

Because large numbers went to the polls during the first five to six hours of balloting, the early indications were that the voter turnout might be 60 to 65 per cent or from 13,000 to 17,000 voters.

THE FIRST thing that was done was a phone call to the state election commission in Lansing to get proper instructions on what to do.

"When we first learned we might be short of ballots, we immediately called the state election commission and talked to James Chapman, deputy commissioner," explained Florence Beier, campaign coordinator. "He gave us specific instructions on how to properly obtain additional legal ballots. After getting instructions from Lansing, we called the printers and put in the order."

About 2 p.m. Thursday, Mrs. Beier placed a phone call to Chuck Hellie of Graphic Communications, a printing firm

which operations on Junction Street in Plymouth. She asked how soon 8,000 paper ballots could be printed. He promised that at least half could be delivered by 4 p.m. On that basis, the order was placed.

"But they did even better," says Mrs. Beier. "The 8,000 ballots were printed in less than two hours. Graphic Communications really did a great service to the school district and the community."

After placing the rush printing order, the immediate problem was to figure out a fast way to number each ballot. After a few phone calls, the school administration rounded up enough rubber stamps so they could place individual numbers on each ballot.

The additional ballots were rushed out to precincts which were running short, and a near disaster was averted by quick action by the school administration, local printers, and election workers in the board offices.

IN SPITE OF THE large turnout and use of paper ballot instead of voting machines, there were very few problems reported during the day Thursday.

Fifty ballots were spoiled and couldn't be counted, either because they were folded wrong or an X mark wasn't used. The remaining 11,320 paper ballots were counted and reported to the school board offices in less than four hours.

There was a stream of voters at all nine school precincts at Central, Gallimore and Starkweather.

The 11,370 residents voting by far smashed all previous turnouts for school elections. The previous high was last June when a few more than 7,000 voted. The 44 per cent voter turnout Thursday is considered high for any school election, especially a special election with a millage vote the only issue on the ballot.

## Construction started on McIntyre Sewer

Septic tank problems of McIntyre Manor subdivision residents are almost a memory of the past.

Residents of the subdivision near Sheldon and Ford may soon fill their problem-ridden septic tanks with sand and connect their homes to a long fought-for sanitary sewer.

According to Canton Clerk John Flodin, workers began construction work on the sewer project about two weeks ago. If all goes according to schedule, McIntyre residents should enjoy conveniences of the sewer sometime this fall.

The McIntyre project is part of a larger

sanitary sewer project, financed by an \$850,000 bond issue. The sewer, when complete, will connect sewage systems in the northern and northern parts of the township. It runs from Morton Taylor to Sheldon along Cherry Hill and north to McIntyre subdivision along Sheldon.

To McIntyre residents, who are financing 40 per cent of the estimated \$25,000 sewer construction costs in their subdivision, the system represents the end of a long battle with the township.

McIntyre residents began requesting construction of the sewer several years ago when septic tanks and drain fields in their

neighborhood began to malfunction. Raw sewage rose to the surface of homeowners' yards during summer months, and some residents feared an outbreak of hepatitis.

But, despite residents' repeated demands for the system, obstacle after obstacle stalled start of construction.

A previous township administration originally approved the project as part of a multi-million bond issue under the Canton-Van Buren Sewer and Water Authority.

But a new administration, headed by township Supervisor Robert Greenstein, re-examined the entire sewer issue. The

new board pared the McIntyre project to serve only current residents of the subdivision and exclude unoccupied lots.

Because the new plan was to serve only occupied lots, the sewer was routed across several lawns instead of the street. The failure of township officials to obtain two of the necessary easements from homeowners further delayed construction of the project and forced a change in the sewer's design.

Township officials finally approved the sewer's construction in January and floated the necessary bonds in July.

Plans are being made to provide working demonstrations by club members of their various craft skills during the 1977 Fall Festival.

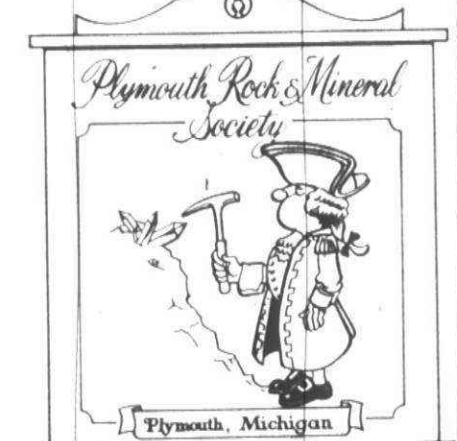

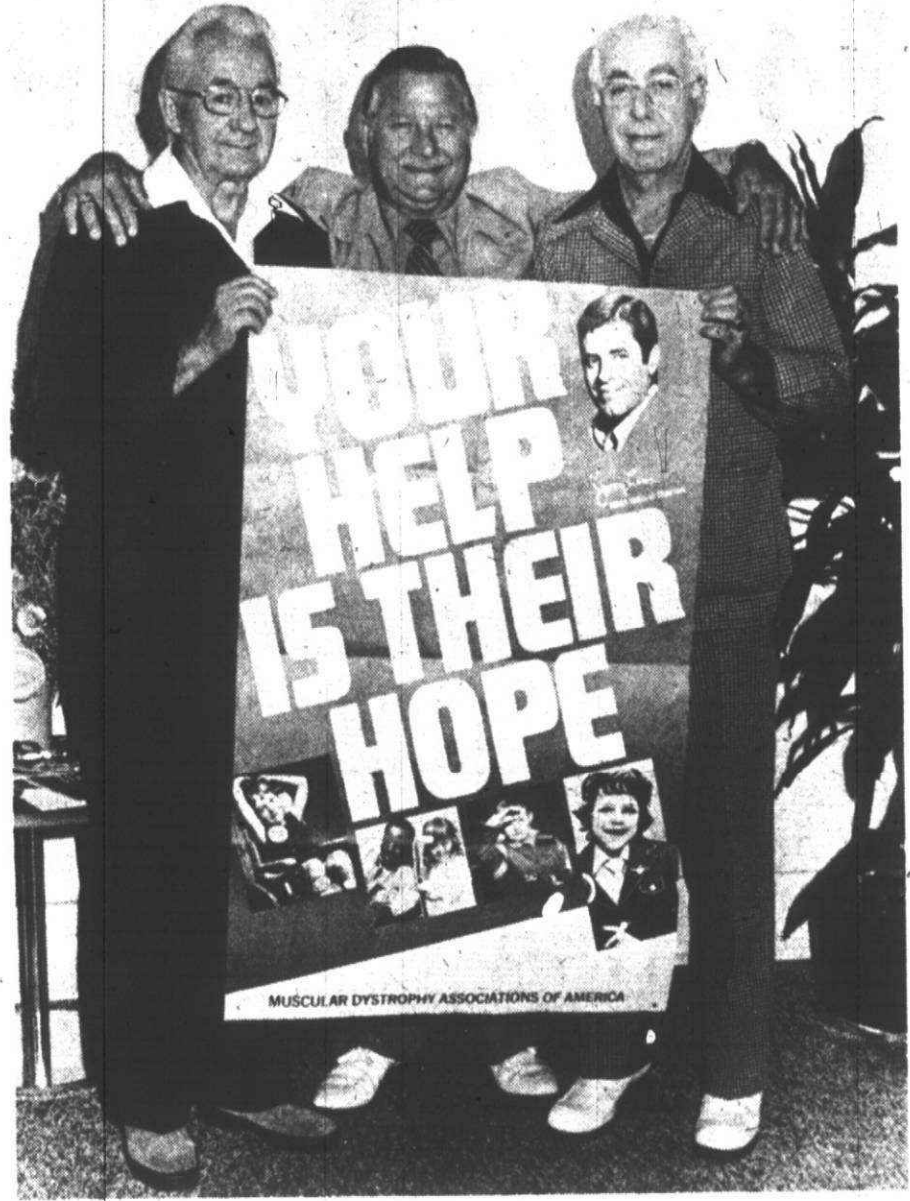

# Padget clan is nourished by Canton soil

Last Thursday was James "Malcolm" Padget's 71st birthday; so a friend of his

named Willie Yeats dropped by to drink a birthday toast to Malcolm and attempt to beat him at a few games of euchre. It was also Yeats' birthday, so Malcolm

toasted his friend in turn.

Malcolm Padget of 48185 Geddes, Canton Township, has reason to celebrate this week. His farmland, which is also owned by his brother and sister-in-law, Fred and Marion Padget of 48182 Geddes (across the street), has just been declared a Michigan Centennial Farm. The certificates are displayed proudly and a historical marker to be placed on the front lawn, will arrive shortly.

Four generations of Padgets lived in the old wooden house, located just west of Beck Road. Three generations of Padgets were born in the 135-year-old house which is a testament to the rich rural heritage of Canton.

Malcolm and Fred's grandfather, John C. Padget purchased the house and 80 acres of land on Jan. 12, 1869 from William and Lucy Winter. But he was not the first Padget to settle in Canton. Back in 1833, before Michigan was a state, George Padget settled in Canton at the southeast corner of Beck and Geddes. And today many Padgets and relations can be found around the Geddes-Beck roads area.

FIVE GENERATIONS of Padgets attended school at Palmer School-District No. Five, a one-room schoolhouse which housed kindergartners through eighth-graders.

The old bell tower which used to be on the roof of the schoolhouse can still be found, in deteriorated condition, at the rear of Padget's property.

"The teacher was everything from principal to janitor," said Fred Padget, an old alumni of the schoolhouse. "In later years the school building was used as a meeting hall for a motorcycle club. From what I

gather, there was an argument that broke out and the schoolhouse burned up."

Most of the 80 acres of farm property is rented out to Alfred "Fritz" Lobbstaal at the present time. But up until just a few years ago Malcolm tilled the land by himself. Unlike his brother, Fred, who went to work for Ford Motor Co., Malcolm has been a farmer all his life.

The farm featured agriculture and livestock.

"We generally had both crops and animals," said Malcolm. "At one time we had 25 head of steer and three or four milk cows. The hogs would run in back, right behind the cattle. We sold the cream and gave the skim milk to the hogs. We also raised field corn, wheat, oats, and, in later years, soybeans, a lot of soybeans."

Malcolm remembers when he relinquished the reins of a team of plow horses and began driving a 1939 Fordson tractor which was made in England.

Malcolm takes visitors back to the shed to show off that same tractor and says,

"Look at those gum-dipped tires—they're the originals."

The magneto is missing along with a governor cable, but Malcolm turned the crank a couple times to demonstrate that the engine still held its compression. The Padgets plan on restoring the tractor to working order.

Looking at the tractor caused Malcolm to reminisce about the old annual threshing bees that used to take place among neighbors. Some of his helping neighbors were Albert Lee Newton and Harry Wheatley who lived on the Alban Farm.

Today, Malcolm tends a good-sized garden behind his house.

"I've got a pretty good crop in spite of the dry weather," he said. "My tomato vines are just loaded. Right over there are Irish Cobbler early potatoes. They always say Good Friday is a good time to plant the early potatoes."

Stepping over a row of beets, Malcolm said he no longer cans his vegetables, but remembers when his mother, Edna, did. "She was a great cook," he said. "She'd can chili sauce and all the other things,

but my favorite was those bread-and-butter pickles. Boy I like those things. She'd bake pumpkin pies, apple pies and I kind of miss all that."

According to Fred Padget, their mother died in 1961, eight years after her husband died.

To qualify for the designation of Michigan Centennial Farm a farm must be in the continuous possession of the same family for 100 years or more. This applies to the farm land and not the buildings which can be extensively remodeled or new. But in the case of the Padgets, the home has not been changed in the 108 years the Padgets have lived there.

Much of the genealogy research was done by Robert M. Padget, Jr. The findings and application for designation as a centennial farm were mailed to "Centennial Farm Program, Division of Michigan History, Michigan Department of State, Lansing, Mich. 48918."

The Padgets have already received their certificate from the state, but are waiting for the large metal landmark marker paid for by Detroit Edison Co.

outs twice as heavy as June included Miller, Starkweather, Isbister, and Gallimore.

Most of the 11,370 voters cast their ballots before 2 p.m. based on early reports from precincts. At mid-afternoon, the indications were a turnout of 60-65 per cent might be in the making.

Election workers' strategy had been that a large turnout would result in a successful vote on the tax question. There was optimism, therefore, among millage supporters by the time the polls closed.

There were no reported problems of difficulties experienced at the precincts. The estimate Thursday night was that there were about 50 spoiled ballots, or less than one-half of one per cent. Use of paper ballots did delay the final count, but the vote was tallied earlier than in June when voting machines were used.

WITH THE PASSAGE of the tax question, the schools will open with the same level of programs as last year.

Seventy teachers who have been laid off since June will be recalled, and a full day scheduled at all levels. More information

on starting times will be announced in Thursday's edition of the Observer & Eccentric.

A number of volunteers and staff members have been working over Labor Day weekend at the Centennial Educational Park to re-do class schedules of every high school student for a full day class-load.

All the budget cuts which will now be restored with passage of the millage amount to \$2 million.

ALTHOUGH THE millage passed Thursday by 386 votes, compared to a defeat by one vote in June, it remained true that the outcome of either election isn't a mandate.

While school supporters were happy Thursday night, the fact remained that 5,467 residents voted against the property tax increase, or 2,033 more no votes than in June. Thus the no votes increased by 75 per cent from June. On the yes side of the ledger, there was a gain of 2,420 votes.

So school board members and administrators are aware that although the millage passed there is still a sharp division in the community on the need for the additional revenue.

## Voter flow is a torrent

At the start of Thursday's millage election, the key to a yes victory was the voter turnout. The heavier the turnout, the better chance the millage had of passing, thought yes proponents.

Fearful of a shortage, 8,000 additional ballots were ordered at 2:30 p.m., the result of an unexpected amount of early voting traffic.

By 2 p.m., the Starkweather precinct had already surpassed the total number of votes cast in the June 14 election.

"We haven't had time to think," said chairperson Irene Berridge. "From the moment we opened the doors at 7 a.m., we've had a consistent flow of voters."

The Fiegel, West and Central precincts each reported increased voting patterns compared to the June 14 election. Central received 200 absentee ballots, up 175 from the previous millage attempt.

One reason for the heavy turnout was the margin of defeat in the June election—one vote. Of the voters interviewed who failed to vote in June, all said they checked off a yes on Thursday's ballot.

PAPER BALLOTS were used instead of the normal machines, causing some problems. Elizabeth Phillips of the Central precinct said voters were experiencing difficulties properly folding and tearing the ballots.

"Getting people in and out of the booths didn't pose any problems," Ms. Phillips said. "But we're having a terrible time getting them to properly deposit the ballot. People seem to have forgotten how to use a paper ballot and we have to re-educate them."

Many voters felt the paper ballots were "easier and simpler," said Phyllis Comstock of Plymouth Township. "It (voting) was real easy. I didn't think it was much different than normal, but I wouldn't want to use paper with more than one issue on the ballot."

Chairperson Janet Brass of the Fiegel precinct said, "We're having few problems with the paper ballots. People are taking to it really well. With the possible exception of folding problems and a slower count, things couldn't have been planned better."

With temperatures reaching the low 80s and no threat of rain, the daytime turnout was much higher than expected. Each precinct contacted reported a sizeable increase over the previous election.

Ms. Brass said, "It's been steady since 7 a.m. We haven't had a break in voting yet and don't anticipate one until closing."

"IT'S BEEN STEADY all day," Ms. Phillips said. "We had a mild rush between 11 a.m. and 1 p.m., but other than that it's been consistent."

Of the precincts visited during the day, none had lines stretching outside voting rooms. The consistent pace seemed to evenly distribute the number of residents voting throughout the day as few cases of overcrowdedness were reported.

# Dem women stand behind successful men

Women didn't reign at the recent Democratic state convention, but they often played political king-makers.

With three state supreme court and eight education posts to fill for the Nov. 2 ballot, the Women's Caucus backed three women candidates. Only one won.

But women played important roles in pushing the candidacies of males.

The only successful woman candidate was Dauris Jackson, who with incumbent George Edwards III was nominated without opposition for the Wayne State University Board of Governors.

ANNETTA MILLER of Huntington Woods said the Women's Caucus approached former U.S. Rep. Martha Griffiths, now retired in Farmington Hills, to run for the State Supreme Court. Mrs. Griffiths declined.

Marilyn Jean Kelly, who at 38 is retiring from politics after two terms on the State Board of Education, gave the nominating address for John Watanen, an English professor at Northern Michigan University.

Watanen defeated Dr. Wilfred Webb, retiring superintendent of Hazel Park schools, 2,477 to 460, for the first state board nomination.

A TWO-BALLOT battle erupted for the second state board post.

Joan Pettipren, of Westland, of the Eastern Michigan University staff, gave the nominating address for a male candidate, Dr. Gumecindo Salas, director for minority programs at Wayne State University. Mrs. Pettipren, who twice had unsuccessfully sought state education nominations from her party, declined to try again this year.

"The Latino minority is not represented on the Democratic ticket," Mrs. Pettipren told the delegates.

The Women's Caucus candidate was Dr. Gladys Beckwith, associate professor of American thought and language at Michigan State University.

Dr. Salas won on the second ballot, 1,724 to 1,289. He had majorities in the suburban 2d, 12th, 15th and 17th districts; Dr. Beckwith carried the 18th and 19th.

NO WOMEN entered the race for University of Michigan regents, and incumbents Robert Nederlander and Gerald Dunn were nominated for new terms by acclamation.

Nederlander is a Birmingham attorney, and Dunn is a lobbyist for Livonia and several western Wayne County school districts.

The Women's Caucus took no position on the U-M race.

"My own commitment to open up the system for women and minorities has found a willing ally in Bob Nederlander," said incumbent U-M Regent Sarah Power in the nominating speech she never got to deliver.

She credited Nederlander with helping increase representation of women on university committees and with supporting active recruitment of women into all departments.

ANOTHER DISAPPOINTMENT to the women came when Carole Lick, a junior high teacher from the Kalamazoo suburb of Portage, was defeated by Michael Smudra, a law student from Lansing. Hurting Mrs. Lick's effort was the campaign of another woman, Adeline Griener, recently retired as administrative assist-

ant to the dean of instruction at North-western Michigan Community College in Traverse City.

The Women's Caucus came within five votes of endorsing Zolton Ferency for a two-year supreme court nomination. Ferency bolted the Democratic Party during the Vietnam war years to help found the Human Rights Party. Some Democrats had asked him to seek a Democratic court nomination as a method of wooing back the HRP. Ferency lost by a 3-1 margin to Wayne County Circuit Judge Charles Kaufman.

That tactic may have hurt the Women's Caucus more than it helped. "The Ferency thing drove some people right up the wall," said Liz Giese, a 19th District activist and spokesperson for the caucus.

SO ANGRY were some union leaders at the teachers and women for their support of Ferency, said Mrs. Giese, that one "just went off his bean and was determined to punish us."

"This was a low point in party politics, but sometimes there has to be a setback before you break through."

"The votes were unbelievably close in

the Lick and Beckwith defeats, in spite of the great pressure against us.

"Our major position was to endorse one woman for each board, and this was a reasonable position."

At present, there are 32 statewide education posts in Michigan—eight each on the state board and the boards of U-M, MSU and Wayne. Of the 24 seats held by Democrats, only five are occupied by women, and one of those is Ms. Kelly, who is leaving.

Some Democratic women leaders were strongly opposed to Ferency's candidacy. Oakland County Chairperson Betty Howe of Rochester said, "Zolton was a fine candidate for governor in 1966, but that was another day. Perhaps we didn't support him well enough then, but we can't support him in his capricious politics today. He's not the quality we want on the supreme court."

Susan Moisevic, of Southfield, a candidate for Oakland County commissioner and a member of the Women's Caucus, said, "I resent his candidacy."

# SC ratifies union contracts

New three-year contracts between Schoolcraft College and the International Union of Operating Engineers, Local 547, AFL-CIO have been ratified by the college's board of trustees.

The two contracts will apply to food service and physical plant employees.

Provisions common to both contracts include:

- The reduction of 5 cents an hour from shift differential pay to help cover the increased costs of maintaining present health insurance coverage.

- Educational benefits providing full tuition for employees and 50 per cent of tuition for spouse and dependents.

- Increased uniform allowance during the contracts' second and third years.

- New overtime provisions including equal distribution of assignment only for those wishing them.

- Provision that the cost of arbitration will be borne by the non-prevailing party (previously it had been a joint expense).

The contracts also contained a provision that they would be automatically continued on an annual basis unless the unions notify the college within 90 days of expiration that they wish to renegotiate.

The 14 food service employees at the college will receive a wage increase of 25 cents an hour for each year of the contract. Hourly pay rates the first year will range from \$2.75 to \$3.83, hiring level, and \$2.95 to \$4.22, experienced level, depending on job classification.

The employees will receive no minimum overtime guarantee, but the contract provides that except when an employee continues work beyond regular hours into a special event, the regular events rate (\$3.50 an hour) will be paid rather than overtime.

The 42 physical plant employees' contract also provides for a raise. The employ-

ees will be given a wage increase of 34 cents an hour the first year, 30 cents the second and 26 cents the third. Hourly pay rates will range from \$3.93 to \$6.03, hiring level, and \$4.60 to \$6.75, experienced level, depending on job classification.

The contract also calls for a reduction to three hours overtime, and eliminates student employees from the contract. The number of full-time students to be employed at any given time has been reduced to six.

## Bicentennial packet available

Michigan residents can purchase an unusual bicentennial memento packet from the U.S. Postal Service.

The \$2 packet includes three full-color prints 11 by 14 inches, suitable for framing, and a bicentennial souvenir sheet.

Included in the prints are a biting letter from Benjamin Franklin to a member of the British Parliament, and Patrick Henry's ringing "give me liberty or give me death" speech. Several historic stamp designs appear on the prints.

The six by eight inch souvenir sheet reproduced John Trumbull's famous painting "The Declaration of Independence", and bears five 18-cent stamps and a bullseye cancellation from Philadelphia dated July 4, 1976.

Mail orders may be placed by sending \$2 to Bicentennial Prints, P.O. Box 764, Washington, D.C. 20044. For an additional \$1, a philatelic passport may be purchased to collect stamps at historic sites throughout the country. This offer is limited.

## CBers join posse to safeguard roads

In the good old days, when people joined a posse they jumped on a horse and rode off after the sheriff. Today, good citizens can jump in their car and put on their "ears" as part of the American Federation of Police's CB National Radio Posse.

Chief Robert Ferguson, president of the federation (and known as "Smoky Bear 1 in CB circles), invites all Citizen Band operators to help form the posse as auxiliary members of the AFP.

"The purpose is simple. There are millions of citizens who now have inexpensive means to report accidents, crimes, problems in their own community. If we can get volunteers to act as an extension of our eyes and ears we can catch criminals in the act," Ferguson says.

According to Ferguson, who heads the Bath Township Police in Ohio, as well as

holding the AFP presidency, licensed CB operators who participate will be issued a special ID card with their call letters, name, and "handle." An emblem for the back of the car will show they are a member of the posse and have agreed to follow certain rules of membership.

The most important rule of all might be distressing to some CBers. The rule states, "Members must pledge to obey all traffic rules and conduct themselves as an example to other CB operators."

The members must also pledge:

- To report to any local Smokey station in your area, any criminal activity in progress and to observe that action until the police arrive. Posse members are never to attempt to apprehend a criminal unless asked to do so by a police officer.

- To assist motorists in distress and to report any accident when aid is needed. Each member must pledge to carry in the car a first aid kit, flags and warning flares and a hand fire extinguisher in case of an emergency.

"We feel that a CB Radio Posse member will help us reduce crime because the main problem is manpower. Each member will get a training manual and our magazine and that will keep the member in touch with law enforcement problems and rebuild an institution that we knew in the days of the old west. That's why we selected the handle 'Posse' member," Ferguson adds. Head 'em off at the pass boys.

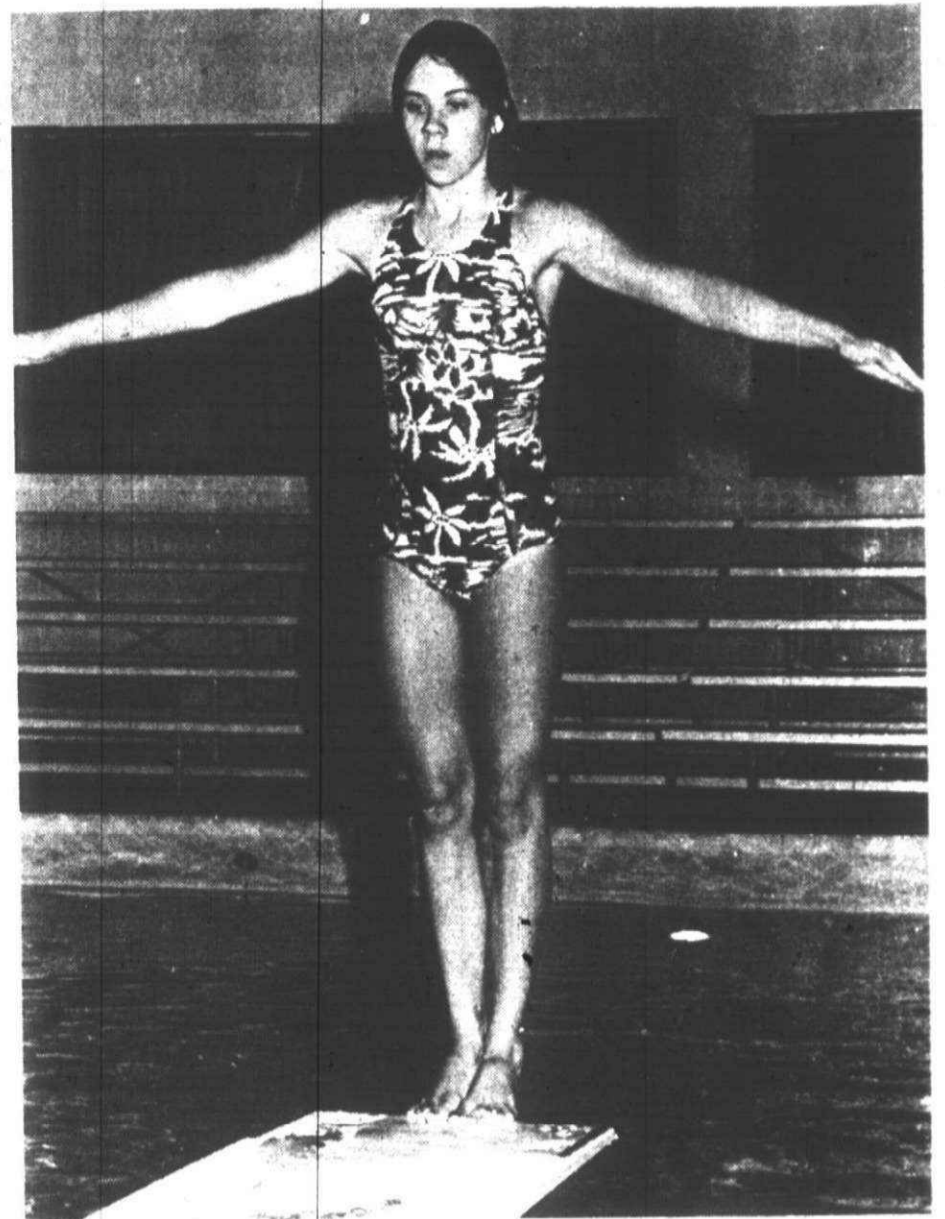
Annette Piethe is a transfer student from Thurston who has also had swimming experience.

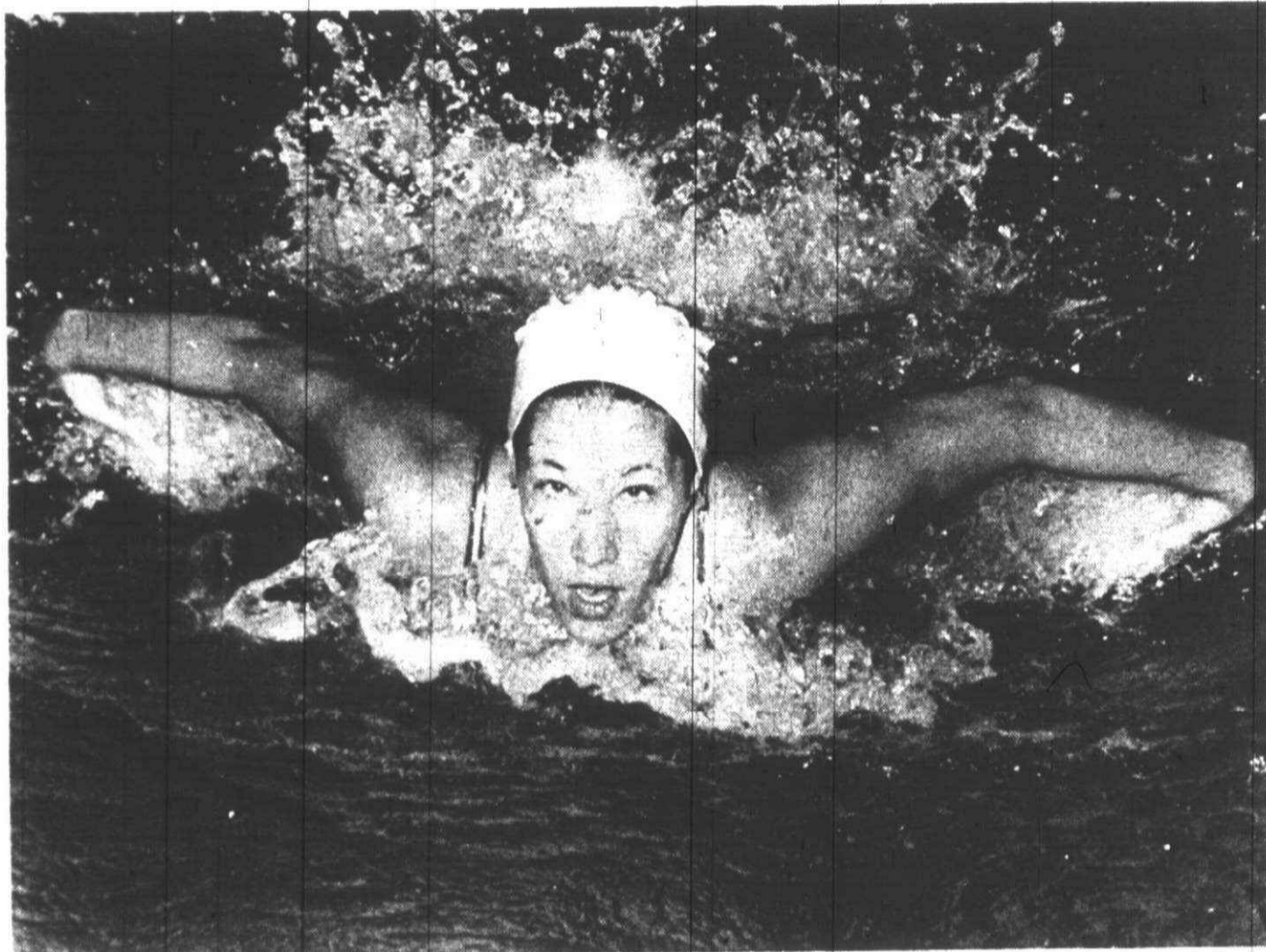
Massey credits the number of incoming freshmen to the development of the middle school program over the past two years.

# Golfers strive again

The continuing cycle of good golf talent stays with the Salem linkmen again this fall, as the Rocks plan for another winning season.

Bob Waters started as Salem coach four years ago. His 1973 squad won the Class A state championship and the 1974 team finished 11th with a regional title. In the last three years, Salem has won two Suburban Eight League championships and finished second last season to Dearborn. The Rocks were the only squad in the conference to beat Dearborn in a dual meet in the 1975 competition.

Waters credits many reasons his former students' success. He says Plymouth has had a history of fine golfers under a solid program when John Sandmann, the present athletic director, was coach.

The number of kids that have tried out for golf has been tremendous. Over 100 kids from Salem showed interest last season and 30 have already tried out this year with more expected after school starts.

"There has been a great emphasis on individual sports and kids are aware that golfing is something they can do the rest of their lives," Waters said. "Kids do some recruiting on their own when they tell their friends what a good experience it is."

"The biggest and most difficult decision to make is keeping eight or 10 kids for the team when all of them are nice and want to play."

Lost from last year's squad are the Rocks number one and two players in 1975, Dave Pierce and John Beems. The other senior lost to graduation is Dan Hafley. Although Waters is losing these experienced players, he doesn't feel this is a year to rebuild," he said. "You can't rebuild a team when there is only four years of high school. You have to do what you have. Saying you're going to rebuild is a good excuse for saying you're going to be crummy this year and good next year."

**SENIOR CAPTAIN MIKE** Mullen is one of two returning seniors. Mullen has attended many summer camps over the past months that have added to his experience.

Mike Wickham, a transfer student from Bentley, has been with the Rocks for two years and Waters thinks he will be one of the best fifth or sixth men in the area.

A vastly improved returning junior is Ted Kuhns who might be the Rocks' biggest surprise on the course. Junior Jim Ross is another improved player with a lot of experience.

Mullen, Kuhns and Ross have played in every junior event in the Detroit area this summer.

"For experience, there is none better than that," Waters said. "They are fundamentally sound."

A junior that has worked extremely hard on his game this past summer is Jim Van

Boven. He didn't make the team last season but has been a surprise to waters. Craig Stevens, a good-looking freshman a year ago, returns this season looking for an outstanding sophomore year.

Dearborn is favored again this season in the Sub-8 along with Trenton and Plymouth.

But despite this strong conference competition, Waters doesn't seem too concerned for he feels his teams' attitude is better than ever.

Salem plays all its home matches on the Brae Burn Golf Course on Five Mile and Napier roads. Waters says the course is in the best shape ever. He feels his squads' top foursome can shoot an average of 162-164.

The Rocks will host the Suburban Eight League match, and co-host the regional competition with Plymouth Canton at Brae Burn.

Both the Chiefs and the Rocks also co-host the annual Plymouth Best Ball tournament at Brae Burn on Tuesday, Sept. 28. Nearly 30 golf teams from around the area will participate in this tourney.

The Rocks begin action with the Brighton Quadrangular meet on Monday, Sept. 13.

The Canton Chiefs start their season Thursday, Sept. 9 at home against Redford Union in a nonleague match.

# Stanwood twins star for Salem girl tankers

The swimming twins, Marion and Sue Stanwood, once again are expected to pace the attack of the Plymouth Salem girls' swim team for the fall season.

But the biggest obstacle that faces the Rocks this season is an outstanding number of teams in the Suburban Eight League. Dearborn, Belleville, Edsel Ford and league champion Bentley are all expected to have respectable talent for the upcoming season.

"It's going to be tough," new coach Chuck Olson said about the conference. "Our times will get better as the season goes on but a lot depends on the freshmen developing so they can fill the gaps."

Olson, the assistant boys and girls swim coach at Salem for the past three years, replaces Faith Ransom who resigned from her teaching position over the summer.

Although the talented Stanwood twins return as the core of the Rocks this season, Olson finds that his squad has lost some key personnel. Captains Chris LeClair and Pat Marks have both graduated along with three-year varsity member Kathy Lewelling. Sprinter Tamie Crespo and Diane Miller are lost to the tennis team. Both Crespo and LeClair were members of a state qualifying relay team of a year ago.

**DESPITE THESE LOSSES** the Stanwood twins, both juniors, along with fellow classmate Jill McCann, should go against the opponents best competition and win their fair share of events.

Marion is by far the squad's most impressive freestyler, especially in the 200 and 500-yard events. As a sophomore Marion won the league title in both races, swimming times of 2:03.4 in the 200 and 5:38.5 in the 500. She was also a member of the 100-yard free relay with sister Sue. Marion was equally impressive in the state meet as she was the only bright spot for the Chiefs in the competition. Marion improved both her times, finishing sixth in the 500 with a 5:26.3 clocking and ninth in the 200 with a 2:01.4 mark.

Sue is also a good freestyler, but she excels in all strokes. Despite a poor showing in the state meet, Sue finished second in the 200-yard individual medley league competition with a 2:25.7 clocking. She also finished fourth in the 100 butterfly with a 1:06.9 timing. Both twins should easily qualify for state again this year.

Jill McCann is another strong swimmer who returns to the Rocks. She was a member of last year's record-setting 200 medley relay combination and also finished third in the Sub-8 in the back stroke with a 1:10.9.

Another experienced portion of the Rock squad this season is the diving dual of Amy McClumphia and Lisa Lukens. Both girls are juniors. Lukens finished as the

fourth best diver in the conference last year and McClumphia ended eighth. She also qualified for state competition. Julie John and Nadalie McClumphia, Amy's younger sister, add to the depth of the diving core.

**BEYOND THIS CREW** the Rocks must depend on many new incoming freshmen to plug the holes. "We're returning without much experience," Olson said. "We will be weak in the sprint races but we have depth in our freestylers."

Only three returning seniors are on Salem's squad. Martha Shearer, Ilona Schmidt and Julie Prechlik are the veterans that will help in the fly, back and freestyle races. Returning sophomores are Madaline Lakatos and Laura Perplch.

Impressive freshmen that should help the Rocks in all strokes are Sharon Ross and Sue Evans, both from the middle school program.

Other freshmen swimmers include breaststroker Dawn Cummings, freestyler Lynne Kohler, diver and swimmer Renee Lakatos, Suzanne Schmidt, Diane Prechlik and Lisa Siebert.

"We've got the people who know the strokes, now it's a matter of getting them into competition," Olson said.

The Rocks start their regular season with a non-league meet against Ypsilanti at 7 p.m., Tuesday, Sept. 21 at the Salem High School pool.







## Key word is cooperation at Plymouth Nursery

The little red school house on the corner of Warren and Haggerty roads is the home of the Plymouth Children's Nursery which will mark its 15th anniversary in March 1977.

Preschoolers are eased gently into their first step toward kindergarten in the old Hough School building where, in the early 1900s, the three Rs were dispensed with a strong hand.

This fall, there are openings in the Monday-Wednesday afternoon sessions for 4-year-olds. Interested parents may call 455-4088 for further information.

**PLYMOUTH NURSERY** is cooperative. Each child's mother shares his first important outside experience and his entrance into the new environment.

According to the philosophy of the school, "Family feelings carry over into the cooperative, giving the child a strong sense of warmth and belonging in the new setting and a sense of intimacy with it.

Because of its homelike atmosphere, the parent cooperative also serves as a bridge between life at home and the more formal atmosphere of the 'real' school a few years later."

The teacher represents continuity for she is there every day.

"Through her, the child will learn to develop emotional independence and physical skills. She will help him channel his emotions and accept the rules and limits that

promote good social relations."

**THE COOPERATIVE** offers advantages to the parents, for either father or mother can attend sessions with their child.

Those involved in the nursery have observed many benefits.

Eating, sleeping and sibling rivalry problems have been solved or alleviated. These problems are not attacked directly, but a lessening of tension or frustration helps.

Both mother and child deal with home situations with more maturity and effectiveness.

Mothers have a little more free time to devote to other children and interests. Parents have a chance to see their child more objectively and realize problems and situations are common to their age group. It also gives the mother a chance to become involved with an organization that is both challenging and stimulating; an interest outside the home for the child, but an excellent release because it is on an adult level.

**PLYMOUTH NURSERY** has been in its present location since September 1963. It was in March 1961 that eight interested mothers met to discuss the possibilities of a cooperative nursery in Plymouth. Mimi Settles was the first president and Doris Spensler was the teacher.

A year later, Mrs. Settles found housing for the group in the basement of the Salvation Army building. There were 21 mem-

ber families and classes were held Mondays, Wednesdays and Thursdays.

After 10 weeks, sessions had to be dropped and their license was denied because the fire marshal found the facilities below standard. But the constitution had been accepted and signed by the charter members who had unanimously voted to join the Huron Valley Council of Cooperative Nurseries.

Equipment had been borrowed, donated or handmade. But a Brighton nursery disbanded and its effects were divided among nurseries in the council.

**THE PLYMOUTH** group inherited an indoor metal climber, a teeter-totter board and triangles, a clothes rack and a basic record library.

The city gave them permission to use the community building on the corner of Union and Church with the stipulation nursery members be responsible for bringing it up to code.

The city supplied the paint and materials and the member families the manpower.

Empty beer cases were covered and painted to serve as storage for small toys and seats for the children.

The quarters also were used as a pistol range and before each session the mothers swept up the gun powder and casings. At the end of the day, all the nursery equipment had to be stored on dollies in a corner.

The Sponsors moved away and Carol Guregian was hired as the new teacher. In January 1963, a Tuesday-Thursday session was added with Jan Lucchetti as teacher. The Senior Citizens of Plymouth made stools for the children, costumes and doll clothes.

**THE SEARCH** FOR a new building was on again. President Ev Olson and her board discussed the possibility of renting the house vacated by Lee's Nursery School but they had to admit they could not afford it.

It was Jeanette Hopkins, who had been hired as teacher of the Tuesday-Thursday group, who suggested looking for an old country school house. Finally, an agreement was reached. Hough School, which was used for storage, was leased to the nursery.

Everybody went to work.

Ev Olson painted the front door and

## Early films are saluted

Orson Welles, Jimmy Stewart, Henry Fonda and Geraldine Fitzgerald head the cast of Henry Ford Museum's final curtain of a salute to American films.

Finishing the series, "America—Its History and Life on Film" will be movies tracing American life from the turn of the century to World War II.

"The Magnificent Ambersons," leads off the series on Sept. 12. The movie was written, produced and directed by Welles. Released in 1942, it tells the story of the decline of one segment of American aristocracy in the late 19th century and stars Tim Holt, Joseph Cotten and Dolores Costello.

The 1945 production of "Wilson" depicts the life of America's 28th president from his years at Princeton through his terms as chief executive. Alexander Knox is in the title role; Geraldine Fitzgerald plays his wife.

JAMES CAGNEY, Humphrey Bogart and Jeffrey Lynn star as three soldiers returning from World War I to find themselves in "The Roaring Twenties" on Sept. 26. The 1939 film captures the violence and rackets of the Prohibition era.

"Grapes of Wrath," starring Fonda, John Carradine and Jane Darwell is shown Oct. 10. The film chronicles the westward movement by persons driven from Oklahoma by dust storms and mechanization.

Stewart plays the sincere young man who wants to marry the daughter of a family of eccentrics in "You Can't Take It With You" to be aired Oct. 17. The film which won an Academy Award for best picture in 1938 stars Jean Arthur and Lionel Barrymore.

"Above and Beyond," the Oct. 24 offering, is the story of Col. Paul W. Tibbitts Jr., the man selected to lead the first atomic bomb strike against Hiroshima. Robert Taylor and Eleanor Parker portray the Tibbitts' in the 1952 production.

"The Best Years of Our Lives" completes the film series on Nov. 7. Winner of nine Academy Awards, the film centers on the frustrations of three servicemen who return from World War II. It stars Fredric March, Dana Andrews and Harold Russell.

All movies are shown at 2 and 4 p.m. except "The Best Years of Our Lives" which will be shown only at 2 p.m.

There is no additional charge for films above the \$3 museum admission for adults and \$1.25 for children six through 12 years. Youngsters under six are admitted free.

## Cars to wheeze at event

The wheezing coughs of America's earliest horseless carriages will be music to the ears of antique car lovers attending the 26th annual Greenfield Village Old Car Festival on Sept. 11 and 12.

The Old Car Festival is one of the few meets in the nation that still features cars from the late 1890s to 1925 beginning with the early one-cylinder pioneers and continuing through each stage of refinement in gas, electric and steam models.

The festival in Dearborn is also famous for its field events that include driving contests and judging of cars dating 1917 to 1925 on Saturday, late 1890s to 1916 on Sunday.

Each day's program begins at 12:30 p.m. with a parade of antique cars, highwheel

bicycles and a Dixieland band through the streets of the village. Following opening ceremonies on the Village Activities Field each day, festival participants will drive their cars at the Activities Field in such events as cranking, and balloon and potato stabbing contests.

THROUGHOUT THE weekend, cars will be exhibited on the Village Green and antique bicycles will be shown near the Mack Avenue Plant.

At 2:15 each afternoon, members of the Wheelmen, a national organization of antique bicycle collectors, whose members will travel from several states for this event, will demonstrate the riding of 1880s highwheel bicycles. During Saturday's

demonstration, the 23 riders who completed a 750-mile bicentennial highwheel bicycle tour that left Henry Ford Museum on July 4 and arrived in Philadelphia, Pa., on July 16, will receive recognition medals.

Another highlight on the Activities Field will be a race against the clock by the Canadian Model T Assembly Team which will convert a pile of parts into an operating Model T Ford in minutes.

Each day of the festival special guests will be honored by the Greenfield Village and Henry Ford Museum. On Saturday, Richard A. Teague, vice-president of automotive styling for American Motors Corp., and recipient of the 1976 Automotive Industries Magazine Career Achievement Award, will be honored. Among his many styling triumphs is the Pacer.

On Sunday, in observance of the 50th anniversary of the Pontiac automobile, Alex C. Mair, general manager Pontiac Motor Division and vice-president, General Motors Corp., will accept the recognition of the village and museum.

Throughout the weekend, 1926 Pontiac No. 1, a 1909 Oakland forerunner of the Pontiac, a 1932 Pontiac V-8 and a 1975 Pacer will be on exhibit in the center of the Activities Field.

ALSO AT THE Activities Field will be displays of porcelain license plates, auto emblems, motor meters, hub caps, spark plugs and Pontiac memorabilia and a demonstration of the craft of making wooden automobile wheels.

There is no additional charge for the Old Car Festival beyond the regular village admission price.

Here's the last chance for a summer-time weekend on Detroit's riverfront, to munch a bunch of different ethnic foods, and to enjoy the special added attraction on Sept. 17 of 17 pretty faces.

Opening ceremonies of this year's International Ethnic Festival will be held at the ethnic festival site on the riverfront behind Cobo Hall, starting at 6:30 p.m. An impartial panel of judges will select the 1976 International Ethnic Festival Queen from among 17 ethnic festival queens.

The 1976 International Ethnic Festival Queen will receive a fur stole, a \$100 savings account and an array of bicentennial mementos in honor of the nation's 200th birthday. A key to the city will be presented by a Detroit councilman.

The first runner-up will be named Miss Pitch-In and will be crowned by Les Freidinger of Stroh Brewery Co., who serves as chairman of the Clean Detroit Committee responsible for the central business district area. Miss Pitch-In will receive a tape recorder and AM/FM radio, a \$50 savings bond, a variety of bicentennial gifts, and also a key to the city.

THE 1976 International Ethnic Festival Queen will reign through the 1976-77 year at various city functions, helping to promote the goodwill of the city and encourage visitors through the greater metro-

politan area to attend the ethnic festivals.

Miss Pitch-In will help personify objectives of the Clean Detroit Committee in its continuing campaign to get Detroiters to "pitch in and keep our city clean."

Vic Caputo from WJBK-TV, Channel 2, will act as host for the opening ceremonies. Guests of honor will include members of Detroit City Council, Gov. William G. Milliken or his representative may attend.

Music will be provided by the Detroit Federation of Musicians, plus a selection of tunes from "Showboat" performed by Carol Upshaw, soloist, and Joe Maniscalco, artist and pop piano selections played by Marion B. Held.

Sept. 18 and 19 will complete the 1976 Ethnic Festival season, with a wide variety of entertainment at the festival site including Philippine folk dancing and fashion show, a jazz group called People, Russian folk dancing, an appearance by the Windsor/Detroit Spanish Dance Club, Polynesian Dancers, the Hix & Chix Square Dancers, and several performances each day by Hachig Kazarian and his belly dancers. Saturday and Sunday's events will be emceed by George Young.

And like every ethnic festival, only more varied, there will be ethnic food from egg rolls to kielbasi, imported beer and American pop, ice cream and All-American cotton candy—and a hot dog or two.

## You, too, can swat electrical gremlins

Electrical problems probably perplex motorists more than any other cause of breakdowns. However, most operating troubles are minor. Loose battery connections are more likely to cause start-up problems than a battery failure.

If an engine cranks but won't start, check for a loose ignition wire. You don't have to be a mechanic to spot some of the problems listed by Ford engineers.

**LOOSE WIRING**—Loose or disconnected wires cause most electrical failures on late model cars.

If the engine won't crank in the morning or suddenly stalls on the highway, check under the hood for a loose wire in any wire. Make sure the cables that attach to the terminals on top of the battery are connected tightly.

In the winter, moisture can freeze and separate loosely connected battery cables or other wiring.

**CORROSION**—Battery corrosion can cut off electricity to key engine components.

Look for a crusty mold around the battery terminals. It can be scraped off easily with a pen-knife—a baking soda solution will do a thorough cleaning job.

If your engine won't crank, you may have a corroded starter switch. Turning the starter on and off several times may clean the contact points enough to start the engine to take your car in for service.

**POWER LOSS**—If your headlights gradually go dim or brightness varies with engine speed, the battery probably isn't being recharged properly. If you can't see anything wrong, but you've heard a squealing sound coming from the engine, the alternator belt may be loose or worn. Tighten or replace the belt.

**IGNITION TROUBLE**—If the engine pings, becomes more and more difficult to start or has sluggish pickup, a tune-up may be in order. A gradual drop in mileage is another sign of ignition trouble. While this may be the carburetor, it may be the electrical system.

**SHORT CIRCUITS**—Some electrical systems are protected by circuit breakers. If the headlights or windshield wipers go off and on, you have a short circuit.

If the radio, cigarette lighter, dome light or heater-defroster don't work, suspect a burned-out fuse in the panel under the dashboard.

# Festival has had its crisis

But there were others. There was the year a former chief of police closed down the Plymouth High School Rockettes' booth for gambling. There they were—left with all their prizes—the most innocent group of miscreants one could imagine.

**DURING THE FESTIVAL**, the traditional foot of the whistle on an antique threshing machine engine spreads the word that another batch of corn is steamed and ready for eating. The old steam engine is an integral part of the festival, but is has caused problems.

Once a last-minute welding job was required to repair a leak in the boiler. And once it was almost closed down by the Environmental Protection Agency.

It was the year of the great ecology movement, when for the first time, many persons became aware of their environment.

The old engine was reported as a menace, polluting the air. "It took a lot of talking before representatives of the agency were persuaded," recalls Tony Flum, manager of the festival for seven years. The steam engine was allowed to operate, but only after some anxious moments.

**THE ROTARY** Club used have a group of Detroit House of Correction inmates help cook the chickens for the Sunday barbecue. They worked on a buddy system, each Rotarian being responsible for his DeHoCo assistant. It was a friendly arrangement; it lessened the workload for the club

members while the DeHoCo people enjoyed the freedom and the food.

Finally, it happened. One of the Rotarian buddies was missing. A quick search showed he was nowhere in the barbecue pit area, and he wasn't in the crowd.

There was still consternation when he was spotted on the stage of the bandstand, microphone in hand. The general reaction was, "Good grief! What will he say to a family audience?"

It turned out he was a professional night club entertainer and gave one of the best performances of the festival. With a big smile, and to a resounding ovation, he returned to barbecuing chickens.

**KELLOGG PARK** has undergone drastic improvements since the first fall festival. And those improvements caused a few crises.

First it was the grass. It was decided the new green sod would not survive the trampling of fall festival crowds.

By changing the positions of the tables and giving the lawn a good sprinkling each night, no great damage was done. Within a few weeks the grass was back in shape. Then there were the names on the brick walks.

Persons who donated money to purchase the bricks were recognized by having their names engraved on red stone slabs. These were laid among the bricks as a lasting memorial. Covering these names with fall festival booths was deemed almost heresy

in some quarters. There were some ruffled feelings that year.

Now that Main Street is closed for the entire festival, the booths are on streets and sidewalks are for walking—and reading.

**GROUPS HAVE REFUSED** to perform because the piano was out of show. But they were persuaded the show must go on and none but the most discerning knew the difference.

The bright orange vests worn by the festival manager and his assistant were made by Betty Pint several years ago. The manager's vest is lettered inside and out. The inside lettering must have been because of Mrs. Pint's fine handiwork—they couldn't tell wrong side from right.

At the time it was a crisis. It wasn't discovered until the last minute and the event was under way before the sporting goods company put the printing on the right side.

**FOR ALMOST 20** years, fall festival boards, managers, and non-profit organizations have worked together, handling the problems as they arose.

Some say the four-day winding has outgrown itself. It is too big. It has lost the small-town atmosphere where you could go uptown and meet friends and neighbors.

It has become a super festival, attracting crowds from miles around. But when any event provides the attractions that result in raising \$25,000 to \$35,000 for non-profit organizations, it has to be a success.

Especially when all that money comes back to the community.

# The festival:

## A glorious kaleidoscope

Plymouth Fall Festival—a glorious kaleidoscope of color, people, sounds, smells and tastes—is the result of community involvement.

Although it has grown to become the largest single fund-raiser for non-profit organizations of the area, the feeling of fellowship and cooperation is as American as an old-fashioned husking bee.

It is a true festival. There is music, dancing and entertainment; costumes of another era, and the camaraderie of many families eating together at long tables in the park.

There are signs of a bountiful harvest in Sunday's produce show. Great stacks of melons, squash, pumpkins, and other vegetables can be admired with the fruit and flowers. And towering over them all will be the tallest sunflower in the community.

**HOMEMADE BAKED** goods, the best local cooks can produce, are available in the booths and stalls. And a few steps from Kellogg Park on Union Street, is the old Grange Hall where visitors can buy a full luncheon or hot fried cake. For many no festival is complete without Grange cookies or a piece of their delicious apple or pumpkin pies.

The people cooking the pancakes, chickens, ribs, fish and spaghetti are our local doctors, lawyers, dentists and businessmen. The people selling their wares in the booths represent our schools, churches and service clubs. They're the folks next door.

Follow the guide in the centerfold of this special Fall Festival issue. It will tell you what's going on, when and where. You wouldn't want to miss anything.

At last year's festival, about \$49,000 was realized by participating groups, after they paid their expenses and gave 25 per cent of their net profits to the Fall Festival Board. The board spends more than \$22,000 on each festival.

It's a lot of work, and it takes a lot of planning. But when you consider the \$49,000 came right back to the community, Plymouth Fall Festival is pretty fantastic.

### Spaghetti dinner opens festival

First major event of the Plymouth Fall Festival will be the spaghetti dinner. Members of the Colonial Kiwanis Club of Plymouth will begin serving at noon, Thursday, Sept. 9. Serving will close at 8 p.m.

The club is the latest to join in the Big-5 major eating events of the festival—Lions Club fish dinner, evening Kiwanis Club pancake festival, Jaycee rib dinner, and the Rotary Club chicken barbecue.

The spaghetti dinner will replace the Business and Professional superlatives.

Woman's Club's German dinner which was a favorite for so many years. Menu for the Italian dinner will include spaghetti, sauce, Parmesan cheese, tossed salad, roll with butter, beverage and ice cream.


Chairman of the dinner is L.D. Evans. Serving on his committee are Jim Jabara, Bob Evans, Doug Blunk and Dick Rhinehart.

According to Doug Blunk, chairman of the Fall Festival Board of Directors, the recipe for the sauce is a secret, but it can be described "only in superlatives."

Last year the Jaycees served their rib dinners to 2,500 satisfied customers.

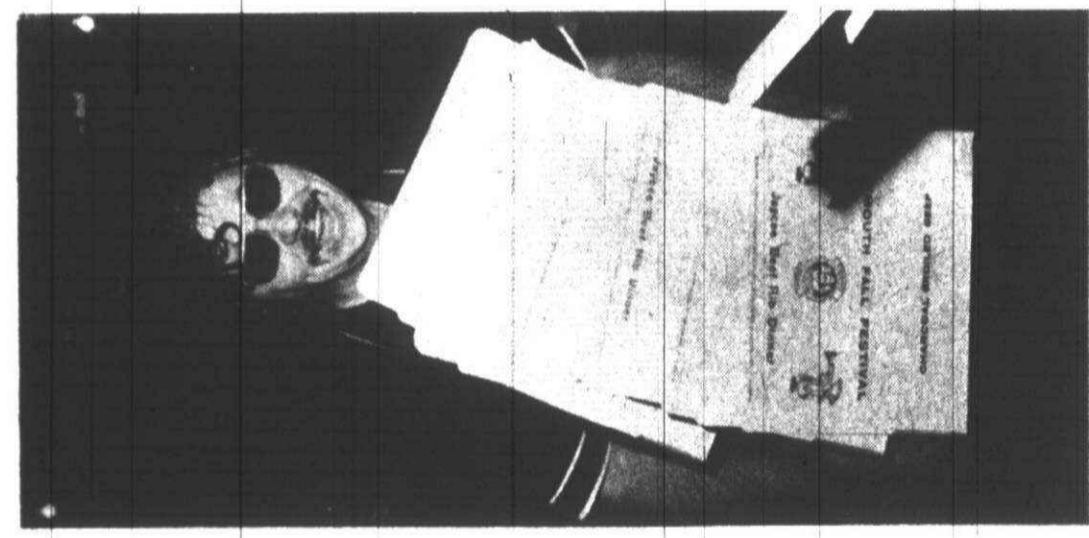
**SATURDAY IS** a long day for club members and their Jaycette auxiliary.

"The guys do the cooking and we work on the serving line," said Vickie Soper, whose husband Phil is president of the club.

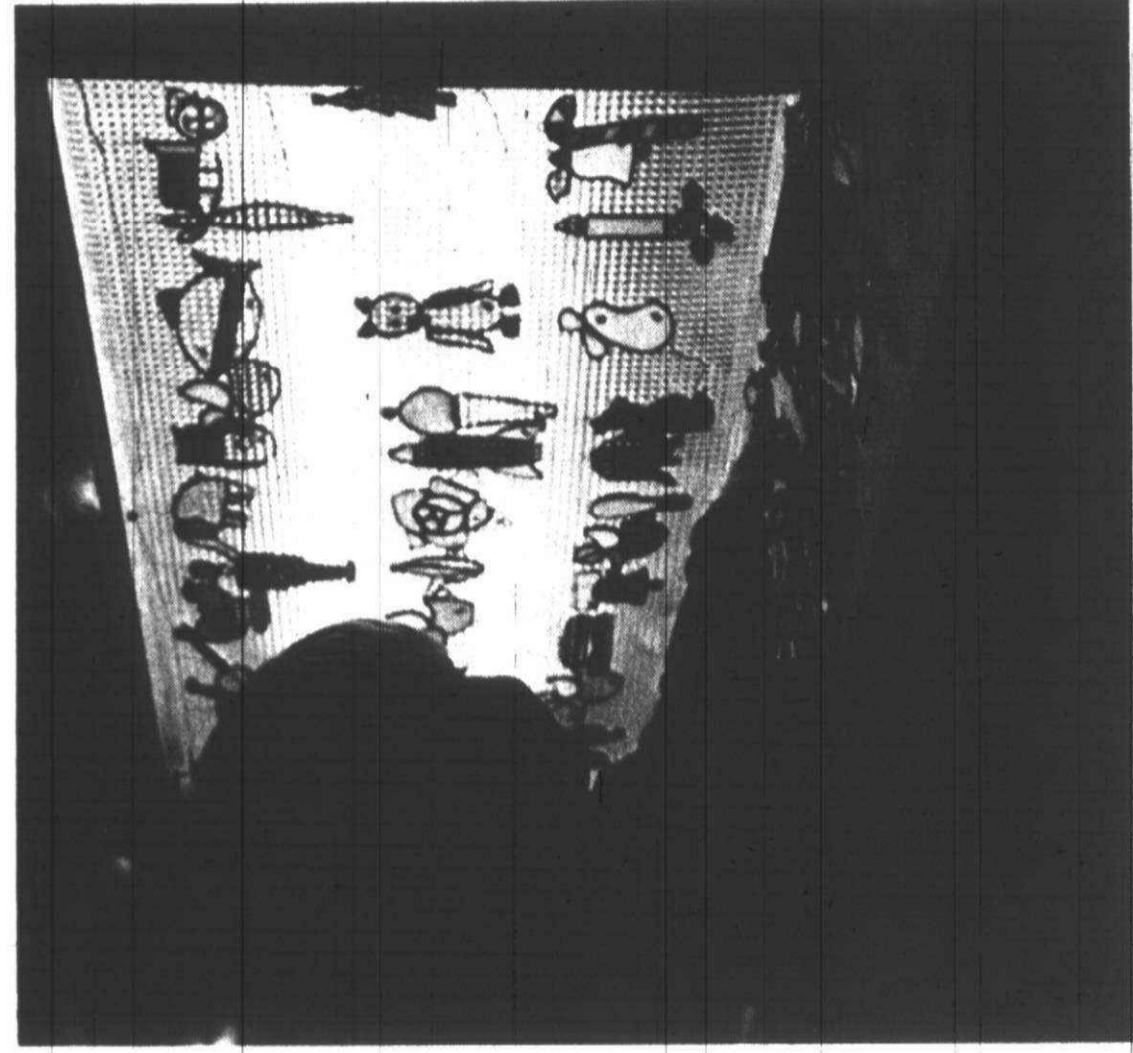

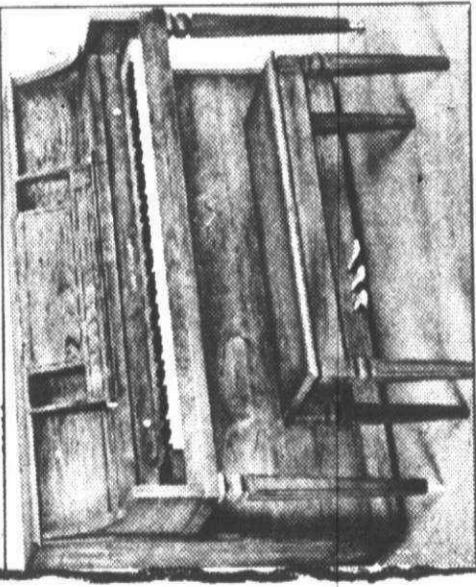
and put the food in the boxes at the serving lines.

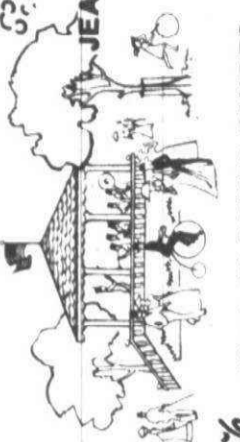

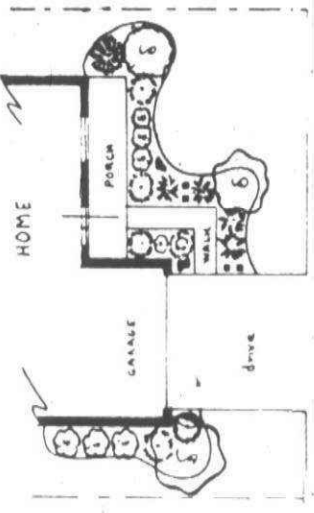

# Ford, GM square off at barbecue

The rivalry between General Motors and Ford Motor Co. that has been prevalent in the automobile industry for years now has found its way into the Rotary Club's chicken barbecue.

Whether he realized it or not, the rivalry was sparked when the Rotary president and his board named Jack Selle, the Buick dealer, to captain the Gold Pit of the barbecue, and Leo Calhoun, the Ford dealer to command the Blue Pit.

"This is going to be fun," Selle said, "because this is the only time Leo and I will be rivals. We are neighbors and long-time friends. But for the barbecue we will be commanding rival pits for the first time."

**EACH OF THEM** will have a team that is experienced in the art of barbecuing chicken. Selle will have a team composed of Paul VanHull, Ed Davis, Jerry Hazlett, John Thomas, Jim Thomas, Ken Keller, Jerry Lankenau, Don Morgan and Dr. Robert Petersen.

They will be working opposite Cal-

houn's squad that includes John Gibson, Dr. James Carney, Norman Detrich, Mike Hoben, Kal Jabara, Don Kennedy, Rev. Leonard Koeningger, Dr. E.J. McClendon and Ed Sawusch.

These two groups will be turning the flaming pits and fighting the heat and smoke. But if Selle has his way it may be the last barbecue over a charcoal fire.

"I'd like to try gas heat for a change," he said. "It will give us a more even heat, eliminate all the smoke and I think it can be done a great deal cheaper."

Charcoal has been used since the inception of the barbecue years ago when it was held on a playground as a means of raising money for playground equipment.

With the growth of the barbecue, the fire to cook the 16,000 chicken dinners has created a demand for five tons of charcoal.

"I don't know the cost of charcoal at the moment," Selle admitted, "but I think gas will do the job a cheaper and give us a greater fund with which to do the Rotary's charity work."
