Stein brings cops in to impound ballots

A dramatic showdown unfolded Friday night at township hall when Supervisor-elect Harold Stein and Trustee-elect Gene Daley showed up with a court order, a host of Wayne County sheriffs, and a pair of state troopers demanding that Canton's ballots be placed in the protective custody of the Michigan State Police to avoid vote tampering.

Canton's board of canvassers did not certify the election Thursday night as expected because of what one canvasser described as "questions concerning possible improprieties in the absentee ballot precinct." Stein said the board of canvassers has no authority to withhold certification over questions of propriety.

Their job is only to canvass the election and make sure the numbers on the machines match the tally book numbers." Greenstein greeted his serious guests with flabbergasted and "incredulous" laughter.

The sheriffs deputies and state troopers asked for a key to the room where the locked ballot canisters are being kept. According to Doris Kelley, secretary for Clerk John Flodin, her boss left town Thursday night for Buffalo where he is attending a dog show. Mrs. Kelley said she did not have a copy of the key to the room and did not know who had a duplicate.

When it became apparent that no key to open the door would be provided, Stein's attorney Stephen Hitchcock contacted Wayne County Circuit Judge James Canham who had previously signed the preliminary injunction and restraining order.

According to both Hitchcock and Greenstein, Canham told the group that since the room was locked and the windows were equipped with a burglar alarm they did not have the right to break down the door to confiscate the ballots.

Canham told Stein's attorney that if he wanted to, he could put a padlock on the door, but that they could not damage property by forcing the door open.

Wayne County Sheriff's patrolmen G. McKeon and D. Goodish left after hearing the judge's phone decision.

"We're not going to commit property damage," said Stein. "But they've been warned. If they do anything, or if anyone

enters that room before Flodin gets back, the judge will come down hard."

"The court order has been written," Stein said. "We're satisfied that that in itself should be sufficient. We just want to protect the ballots."

Stein said he became concerned that there could be problems with vote tampering after the board of canvassers refused to certify the election the Thursday night.

The four members of the board of canvassers are Vern Rorabacher, captain of the Canton Fire Department; Jack Blumenshine, secretary of the Greenstein-affiliated Democratic Club of Canton; Floyd

outside the supervisor's office amid a group of people.

Assembled in the small office pool area were Pam Phillips, Bruce Phillips and Doris Kelley, all township employees; George Bradley, president of the Stein-affiliated United Democratic Club of Canton; a multitude of various policemen, an attorney, and two newsmen from the Canton Observer.

Greenstein said later that night that he is convinced that the Wayne County Sheriff's Department was attempting to "stick their nose in Canton's politics again."

"My quotable quote is that this was a plot by Jamil Ahktar (president of the Wayne County Sheriff's union) to get his hands on those ballots. The court order originally asked that the Wayne County

Sheriffs impound the ballots. I think Jamil Ahktar tried to grab off the absentee ballots from the people of Canton Township."

Stein responded saying that his attorney "inadvertently" put the sheriffs down on the injunction request. "I instructed him to strike that, so that any impounding would be done by the state police because I know Greenstein has attacked Ahktar and the sheriffs unjustly in the past. I realized that and that's why I made my attorney strike that out of the court order."

After all, the attorney is working for me."

Greenstein calls Stein's explanation "lies" and points out that Ahktar was sitting in a car in the parking lot while Stein, the troopers and the sheriffs were inside township hall.

"I'm tired of Greenstein taking cheap shots at Ahktar," Stein said. "I don't why he was there. He could've been there as an interested party. That's a familiar trick of Greenstein. The best defense is a good offense."

Fulford and Bill Heinzmann, a Greenstein supporter.

STEIN SAID he decided to initiate legal action after hearing reports that people "wandered in and out of the office where those ballots were being stored."

"I wonder if you realize just how many people are walking around the township offices that aren't even employed there," Stein said. "Flodin was not at work today but a girl was in that office all day and that door was open. It's strange that the door can't be opened when we're there."

"Why are they trying to hold those ballots and hold up certification?" Stein asked.

The board of canvassers is scheduled to meet at 7 p.m. tonight (Monday) in township hall to consider certifying the election. The board has 15 days to do the certification, but is not authorized to open the sealed canisters because the ballots are not just township ballots, but include state and national election results.

GREENSTEIN and Stein traded barbs

a visibly unimpressed Stein. "Pardon me while I go throw up."

Greenstein told Stein that if it would make him feel any better he would be willing to help Stein install a padlock or bolt lock on the door to the room where the ballots were stored. Meanwhile, State Trooper John Hix went outside with a flashlight to look in the windows of the room. He came back and said the canisters could be observed from the window.

Later on in the evening both Stein and Greenstein had something to say about the confrontation.

"I still would have liked to see those ballots impounded," Stein said. "I've got to worry when I see Greenstein's brother, Gary, helping people vote right inside the booth on election day. He's not even registered to vote in Canton Township and he had to be removed by a state election official."

"Greenstein is not able to call for a recount since he's not a certified candidate on the ballot," Stein said. "He may try to get to James Poole and pressure him into calling for a recount. I just don't want the board of canvassers meeting Monday night

School district renaming might recognize Canton

A public hearing will be held tonight on whether to change the name of the Plymouth Community School District to reflect the significance of Canton in the district.

The hearing will begin at 7 p.m. in the cafeteria of Plymouth Canton High School, 8415 Canton Center, south of Joy. Later, on the regular meeting agenda, the school board will have second reading of a proposed policy change to rename the district to the Plymouth-Canton Community School District.

The school board hopes to receive public input from residents on the advisability of the name change and is open to suggestions.

In other action, the school board may select a principal for Tanger Elementary and will discuss providing a crossing guard at Sheldon and Ann Arbor Trail.

THE RENAMING of the school district had been discussed by trustees for some time informally but became an agenda item a few weeks ago on a motion made by Trustee Tom Yack.

Behind the consideration is to recognize the identity of Canton (which has expe-

rienced major population growth in recent years. As a result, the three newest schools in the district have been built in Canton Township.

The population has reached the point where the Canton vote can determine the outcome of an election, for millage or for candidates. It was the Canton yes vote which resulted in millage passage last September. Of the seven members of the Plymouth Board of Education, Yack, Flossie Tonda and George Lawton live in Canton.

Another factor is that this year, for the first time, Canton contributes more in local revenue to the school district than Plymouth or Plymouth Township.

A majority of Canton residents are in the Plymouth Community School District, although a few are in the Wayne-Westland District.

THE BOARD WILL discuss whether to provide a crossing guard at Sheldon, and Ann Arbor Trail, as requested by the West Middle School PTO and supported by Bird Elementary and the district safety committee.

The board's reaction is unsure as it would be a deviation from policy to provide crossing guards for middle school pedestrian traffic.

On the request by a parents group to appoint a principal at Tanger, the central administration recommends that a principal not be appointed until at least the end of the current semester.

In the meantime, the district would continue its pilot project of having two schools served by one principal. The administration feels that Tanger, because of its increasing student population, will need a fulltime principal at least by school year 1977-78.

Handicapped horizons expanded by Corrieri

The Kiwanis Club of Colonial Plymouth will sponsor a lecture on the Mobility Awareness Team concept, which is designed to expand the horizons of the physically handicapped, on Nov. 11 at noon in the Miles Standish Room of the Mayflower Hotel.

Angie Corrieri will be the speaker. She is a Canton resident who was paralyzed from the waist down in an automobile accident five years ago.

"Since that time," said Ms. Corrieri, "I have been involved with activities for the handicapped."

Part of those activities has been the Mobility Awareness Team, a group of handicapped people who get involved in community activities and make people aware of

the problems that face the handicapped. "We are just every day people who you see at the store," Ms. Corrieri continued. "But we have problems that everyone else doesn't have. The Mobility Team is to let others know what those problems are."

In addition to her involvement with the Mobility Team, Ms. Corrieri helped organize the Ms. Wheelchair Michigan Pageant. She is employed as a computer programmer by the Chevrolet division of General Motors.

The public is invited to attend. Those wishing to have lunch should come at noon. There is a \$4 charge for the meal.

For those not wishing to eat, the 12:30 p.m. lecture is free.

Just kid stuff?

Fire, stabbing link probed

Detectives from two police agencies speculate that a stabbing incident and a rash of fires at Deer Creek Apartments on Joy Road in Canton Township are related, but police spokesmen say they have no definite suspect in the crimes.

Thursday night's knife attack on a Deer Creek security guard was the last of a series of incidents that are under investigation by the Wayne County Sheriff Department, the Michigan State Police and the Canton Township Fire Department.

Between Oct. 30 and Nov. 3, the Canton Fire Department has responded to five fire alarms in the complex. And on Thursday night when Neuelle Allen, a security guard employed by Deer Creek, challenged a man with a ski mask pulled over his face, the man attacked him and stabbed him in the left arm and side.

According to Mel Paulun, Canton Township Fire Chief, the township rescue squad took the injured man to Wayne County General Hospital for treatment.

Greg Rose, a spokesman for Deer Creek, said Allen was treated, released and returned to work that same night.

The Michigan State Police, headquartered in Northville, were called in on the stabbing and they in turn requested a police dog from Flat Rock.

"We gave the dog a scent, and he ran right for a car parked on the street. But the guy who owns the car had an alibi, so right now we have no definite suspect," state police Sergeant Sauer said.

"Of course it is just speculation at this point, but there is reason to believe that all the fires and stabbing are connected," he continued.

OCT. 30 WAS the first of a rash of fires that included two in the same day in the general complex area. Fire Chief Paulun suspects arson.

"We seem to have isolated a pattern involving these fires," Paulun said. "They usually happen between the hours of 7 and 10 p.m."

The Canton Fire Department responded to a call that a garbage dumpster was on fire on Oct. 30. On Oct. 31, they were called to another fire, at 8160 Fawn Circle.

"That was a strange one," says Paulun. "Apparently someone lit some paper on fire and slipped it under the apartment door."

That same day (Oct. 31), the fire department was notified of a fire in a mailbox at 8210 Fawn Circle.

On Nov. 3, the department was again called in twice. The first time was in response to a call notifying them that an electric utility room at the corner of one of the buildings was on fire.

The second call, later that night, was in response to an alarm that a section of fence and grass area at the end of Deer Creek Lane was ablaze.

"The utility room and grass fires were definitely set," Paulun said. "In fact there is evidence that gasoline was poured on the fence and the ground and then ignited."

WAYNE COUNTY SHERIFFS handling the case take a different point of view about the number of people involved.

"There is no way—not in the wildest stretch of the imagination—that these fires are the work of one guy," said Lt. Terry Shenk.

"My guess is that this is the work of kids. No one has seen anything, and the type of fire just indicates that it's kid stuff."

Shenk added there was no suspect in the fires. "It is almost impossible to do anything unless you have an actual witness, someone who will step forward and offer identification. Until that happens, there is nothing we can do," he said.

"I would tell the residents of the complex to keep their eyes open, and if anyone sees anything unusual to notify the police right away."

According to the description given to the state police, the man who stabbed the security guard was six feet tall and was wearing a green army jacket. He had a red ski mask covering his face.

I-275 open Wednesday

Suburban motorists will be able to cut their driving time to and from western Wayne and Oakland Counties next Wednesday morning when a five mile stretch of the I-275 freeway is scheduled to open.

The Michigan Highway Commission, the Livonia Chamber of Commerce and officials from Livonia, Farmington Hills and Novi will co-sponsor the ceremonial opening of the freeway at 11 a.m. at the Eight Mile interchange.

The freeway is now open from Ford to Schoolcraft interchange with the I-96 and I-696 freeway in Farmington Hills.

The newest stretch costs \$48.5 million, the highway department said. Ultimately, the road will stretch 37 miles from I-75 near Monroe north to the Farmington Hills interchange.

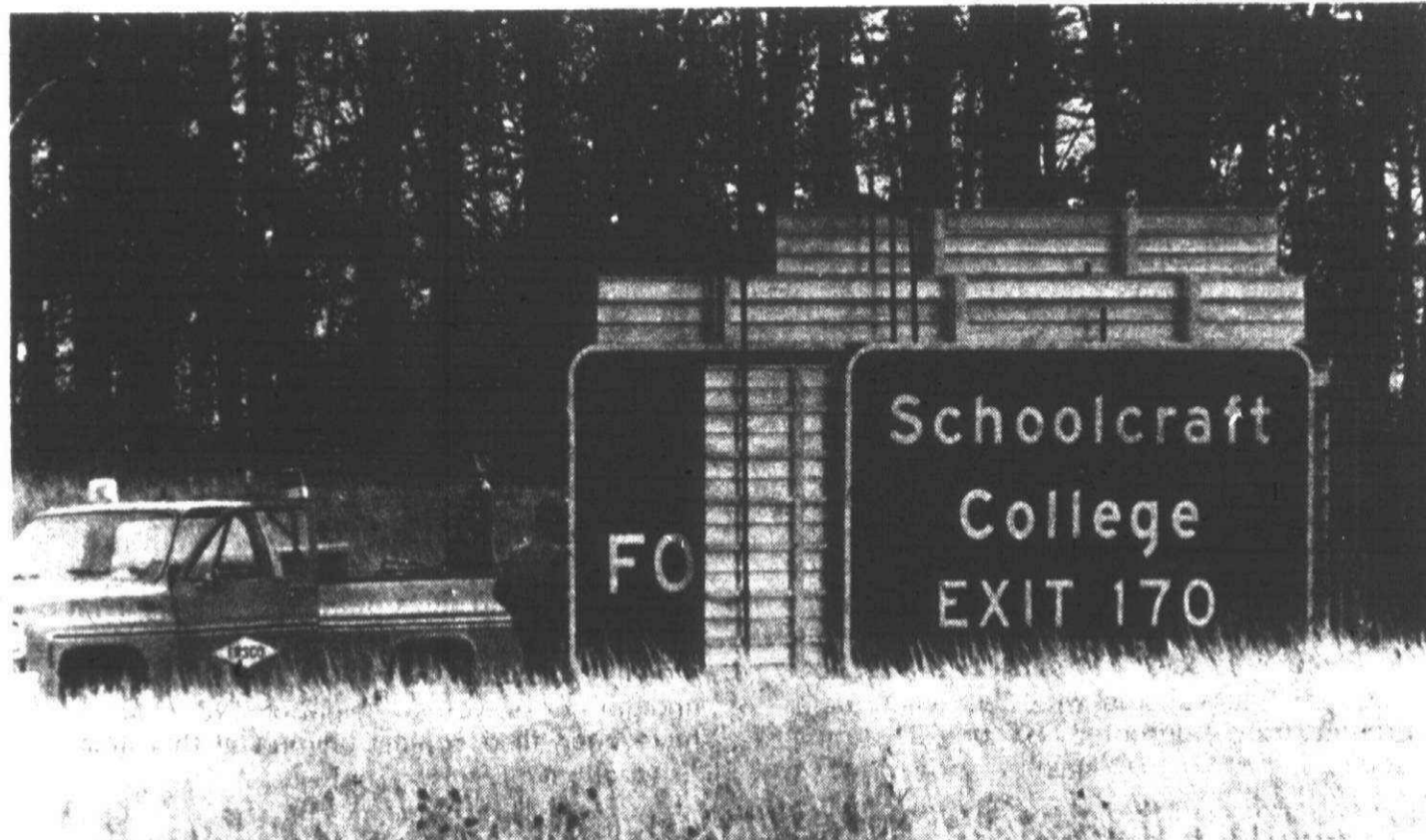
TAKING PART in the opening will be the mayors of Livonia, Farmington Hills and Novi, Miss Michigan Transpo, Miss Farmington (Holly Ann Schmidt) and Livonia chamber President James Stewart, master of ceremonies, and Peter Fletcher, highway commission chairman.

A commission spokesman said dozens of

other public officials, including congressmen, state senators and representatives, county commissioners and city leaders have been invited to the ceremony, open to the general public.

The eight-lane freeway includes an eight-foot wide bike path which stretches from Nine Mile to Meadowbrook. Eventually, the path will be part of the full 37-mile freeway.

The ceremony will be at the Eight Mile interchange because it touches Livonia, Farmington Hills and Novi, a commission spokesman said.

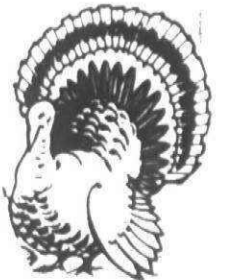

Write-in committee refuses to die despite loss

A spokesman for the Committee to Reelect the Greenstein Team says the committee members will not disband their political organization, despite the defeat of their candidates last week.

Co-chairman Jim Donahue said the 350-member committee will continue fighting for programs launched by the Greenstein administration, despite the absence of the committee's political choices from Canton's board of trustees.

The committee, Donahue said, supports the township's sign and berm ordinance as well as the police reserves, stands opposed by supervisor-elect Harold Stein.

The people's reason for getting involved in this was not just because they

thought Greenstein was a swell man," he said. "They believed in what he was doing. We're a committee of people who want to see our homeowner rights continued."

THE COMMITTEE, organized last August after incumbents Greenstein, Treasurer Carl Parsell, Trustee Gerald Cheske and trustee candidate Joyce Willis lost their bids for the Democratic nomination, launched an intensive write-in campaign and urged many residents to vote by absentee ballot.

Donahue attributes defeat of his political choices to the voting machine and write-in method.

"If everyone who wanted to vote for us had been able to vote with the ease with which people voted for Mr. Stein, we would've

won," he said. "We did not lose to Mr. Stein. We lost to the (voting) machine."

Donahue claims that 563 write-in ballots were spoiled, because voters placed the adhesive nametags of the write-in candidates on the wrong lines.

According to the unofficial vote totals tallied early Wednesday morning, Greenstein lost the supervisor's post to Stein by 554 votes.

Furthermore, Donahue added, the township board of canvassers Thursday refused to certify the election results because of "irregularities" in precinct 10, the precinct reserved for absentee ballots. The board of canvassers is scheduled to meet again tonight (Monday).

"Until the certification is final, we're not sure of the final results," Donahue said.

"I'm not saying it will change the results of the election. I don't think it will. I just think it will bring the election closer."

Donahue said his committee will request a recount of the vote totals, if the number of canvassers discover a substantial number of additional votes for Greenstein or his teammates.

Other members of the Greenstein team lagged farther behind their political opponents than did the incumbent supervisor.

According to the unofficial vote totals, more than 1,000 votes separate Parsell from Treasurer-elect Anne Bradley, while 879 votes separate the incumbent from Bert Berg, who placed second in the treasurer's race.

In the race for two trustee seats, Charles and Mrs. Willis received 2,736 and 2,748 votes respectively—almost 1,500 fewer votes than top vote-getter Lynne Goldsmith received and almost 900 votes less than second-place winner Eugene Daley.

BUT DESPITE THE APPARENT defeat of Greenstein and his teammates at the polls last Tuesday, Donahue and Thom Carman, co-chairman of the write-in committee, applauded the efforts of the committee's members, who, they say, put their full efforts into the campaign.

"We did this for ourselves," Carman explained election night. "To make Canton a well-thought-of place depends on the supervisor."

Details of the birth, evolution and proceedings of the Committee to Reelect the Greenstein Team was kept secret until election night.

Carman explained, "We did not publicize, because we wanted to force the other two candidates to come out with positive statements on what they'd do for the township instead of just attacking the Greenstein team. We also did not want to subject ourselves to the dirty tricks that went on in the primary."

According to Carman and Donahue, supporters of Greenstein and his teammates organized a meeting in mid-August without knowledge of the candidates, defeated in the August primary.

The 85 residents who attended the initial meeting were given assignments and membership numbers, the committee chairmen explained. No person was to be given information over the write-in committee's telephone line without first identifying himself by first name and membership number.

Committee members conducted a door-to-door petition drive throughout the township and gathered signatures of more than 4,000 residents who pledged to support Greenstein and his teammates through a write-in effort.

It was then, Carman and Donahue said, that Greenstein and his teammates were contacted about the write-in campaign. The committee's membership subsequently swelled to about 350.

Fire fighter union hot over pension questions

Canton Township's fire fighters, still reeling from the news that their civil service system is invalid, are now wondering about the status of the employees' pension fund.

On Friday, George Borgelt, attorney for the fire fighters threatened to file an anti-labor practice suit against Canton administrators if a meeting is not scheduled which includes him, the union officers, township administrators, representatives of the old pension insurance carrier, Manufacturers' Lites and the new insurance firm, began last month John Hancock.

Outgoing trustee James Poole has criticized the new pension plan for allegedly containing "diminishing rights to employees" in three areas.

Poole believes the new plan provides less coverage when it states that trustees are exempt from the ordinance.

Poole quotes from a letter written to Carl Parsell by Walter Guth, an attorney hired by the township.

Poole claims that in the new plan township employees are eligible for full retirement benefits (or vestment rights) only after they've been in the plan for 20 months, not after 20 months employment as it was in the old plan.

Poole emphasized the fact that he believes the new pension plan is far superior to the old one providing 8.45 per cent interest, as opposed to the previous plan's maximum 5.5 per cent. But Poole says he is concerned that the township pension fund could be declared invalid because of what he feels are "diminishing benefits in three instances."

The third instance, according to Poole, is Guth's argument that Burnham and

Flowers, the agents for the old Manufacturer's Life policy, are only willing to transfer \$248,130 over to the new carrier while Guth claims the fund's actual value is \$283,064.92.

Poole says he's worried that if the pension money is diminished when transferred, township taxpayers will end up paying the \$35,000 penalty cost to Burnham and Flowers and then have to turn around and add another \$35,000 to the new plan because of laws prohibiting diminishing an employee's benefits.

CARL PARSELL, Canton lame duck treasurer believes there is no danger of that ever happening and accuses Poole of "going out before the election and getting the firemen all shook up."

Parsell said there are three ways to tackle the possibility of a 13 per cent penalty levy.

"It wouldn't be the township's decision," Parsell said. "It will be the employees."

"First, we could and may very likely sue Burnham and Flowers to get exact figures and stop them from imposing this phoney 13 per cent penalty. I don't think their position would stand up in court and the attorney, Guth, said he didn't feel they could establish legal justification. So that's one avenue.

Secondly we could let the employees keep the money in the old Burnham and Flowers account. When they retired, quit or died, the pension money would come from two different sources. One would be earning 4 per cent interest and the other would be earning 8.45 per cent interest. So you leave the money right where it's at. If that's what the employees want, I say fine. I believe they're being ill-advised if they do it, but it's not my decision."

"You know it's funny," said Parsell,

"we're fighting what the township used to do and trying to get the figures for the employees on the pension and then it comes out like Parsell is trying to screw the workers."

PARSELL DISAGREES with Poole's contention that the vestment rights are inferior in the new contract.

"Full benefits. It takes maybe a month or so to go through all this paper work, so I don't see what problem Mr. Poole sees in that."

Parsell also maintains that the trustees were not covered in the old policy, despite Guth's argument that states that not allowing trustees to be covered by the pension could violate internal revenue code.

"If they were supposed to be covered in the old plan, then they're covered in this one," Parsell said. "But I always thought that when trustees get their \$25 per meeting—I guess it's \$40 now—then that's it. I never heard anything about pension."

Poole counters, saying he thinks Parsell made all these decisions without bothering to ask members of the township board what they felt.

Poole maintains that the changes in the plan and an amendment to the previous policy which rolled back the entry time for 14 employees should have been voted on by the entire township board.

"It's the same principle I used when I objected to hiring part-time people without board authorization," Poole said. Parsell doesn't decide to exclude trustees or change the terms of the pension, the board has the authority.

"I know Parsell is hollering that this is just a political ploy, but that's the chance I had to take to get this information out still early. As long as nobody's talking, nothing's being done."

Forget soupline picture, Canton's seniors satisfied

If you're 60 years or older and live in Canton Township, you can eat hot, well-balanced meals for less than grocery store prices without any of the bother and fuss. After the meal you can read a book or get involved in a serious game of euchre.

The Wayne County Office on Aging last week implemented a hot meal program at Canton's recreation center, located at 4427 Michigan near Sheldon, to make sure the township's senior citizens are well fed.

The hot, cafeteria-style meal, which includes meat, potatoes, vegetables, dessert, coffee, tea or milk, is served Monday through Thursday at noon and Friday at 11:30 a.m.

A donation of 50 cents is requested, but "you don't have to pay if you don't have the money," stresses township recreation director Brenda Pollack, coordinator of the hot lunch program.

"I THINK IT'S HARD for someone living alone to get out three pans just to cook a well-balanced meal for themselves," Mrs. Pollack explained. "That's the reason for this program. We want senior citizens to get well-balanced meals."

Senior citizens who plan to eat the recreation center are urged to reserve a place in the serving line at least 24 hours in advance by calling the township recreation department at 397-2777.

But so far, participation in the program is less than what Mrs. Pollack had hoped. "Some days we have a good crowd, but some days we don't," Mrs. Pollack said. "We're not getting as many people as we had wished."

"People who envision a soupline atmosphere will be pleasantly surprised."

Senior citizens may stay in the recreation center until 2 p.m. after eating their lunch, the recreation director continued, to take advantage of other senior citizen programs offered by Wayne County, including legal assistance, nutrition education, senior adult education and health screening services.

On Wednesdays, Canton senior citizen Anne Featherstone offers free arts and crafts instruction to after-lunch stragglers. Senior citizens, Mrs. Pollack said, are learning to make Christmas decorations from such reusable containers as coffee cans and egg cartons.

During the first week of the hot lunch program, many senior citizens stayed in the recreation center to socialize or play a friendly game of cards.

MRS. POLLACK SAID township officials this fall learned of Wayne County's decision to implement the hot meal program in Canton. Township Treasurer Carl Parsell had submitted a request for the program about a year ago.

Besides providing hot meals to the township's senior citizens, the program has provided jobs to members of the township's senior set.

The Wayne County Office on Aging has hired township resident Marie Napier to serve as manager of the program. Resident Bernice Cummings, the program's assistant manager, serves food to senior citizens. Township officials have hired senior citizen Alex Michalak to ready the recreation center each morning for the mid-day meal.

Township officials are currently planning other programs and activities for Canton's senior citizens.

On order are four vans, financed with federal block grant funds, to provide dial-a-ride service for senior citizens. Mrs. Pollack reminds seniors of other transportation services, available until the vans arrive.

"Those services include 'Plymouth Fish' for residents who had Plymouth mailing addresses before Canton's zip code was implemented. The seven-day service, available by calling 453-1110, will pick up residents at their homes, as will 'Belleville Fish,' available by calling 326-6151.

Defeated officials plan their future

Incumbent Canton officials who last week lost bids for reelection are mapping out a return to their private lives.

Tuesday's election unseated four members of the present township board—incumbent Supervisor Robert Greenstein, Treasurer Carl Parsell, Trustee Gerald Cheske and Trustee Jim Poole, the only defeated incumbent who was not a member of the write-in team.

Greenstein, who continued practicing law at his Livonia law firm on a part-time basis while he held the supervisor's post, said he may move his law practice to Canton.

The supervisor, who must move out of township hall later this month, appears nonchalant about his defeat.

"For me personally, I'm better off outside the office," he said. "Being a supervisor can be the easiest job in the world or the toughest. It was terribly hard on me both physically and emotionally. The problem with me is that I like to get a job done."

Before the votes were tabulated early Wednesday morning and the victory of supervisor-elect Harold Stein was still unknown, Greenstein said he would like to stay on as police chief of the township—but not under Stein.

"I think it would be impossible to serve under Stein," he said. "As chief, I'm obligated to be loyal to the administration. I'm not prepared to follow Stein's orders."

Referring to Peter Bundarin, the defeated Republican candidate for the supervisor's post, Greenstein continued, "I think I could probably find middle ground with

Greenstein said he has no plans to seek township office or any other political post again.

PARSELL, EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR of the Police Officers Association of Michigan (POAM), a statewide police union, said he will devote his full time and attention to the POAM and his family when his term as treasurer expires later this month.

"I think it was a very healthy experience and a challenge," the treasurer said of his two-year term in office. "Needless to say, we only half completed what we had planned to do."

Asked whether he will seek township office again, Parsell added, "I don't think a person can look at something today and say what they'll do six months or six years from now. At this point, I honestly can't say."

Cheske, a defeated trustee candidate on the write-in team, voiced similar feelings. "For the present, I'm just going to relax and finish my term in office," said the incumbent, who works as a contributing editor for AAA Motor News. "As far as the near future is concerned, I plan to be as active as I can in township government."

"But I'd be surprised and shocked if the new board asked any service of me," he continued. "If they asked, I'd serve, but I doubt if they will."

Cheske said any decision to run for township office in the future will depend on the functioning and ability of the new township board.

SAT scores go down every year

Anyone who believes that kids are getting smarter all the time should take a look at Scholastic Aptitude Test scores for high school seniors over the past 10 years. Scores have been plummeting steadily on both the mathematical and verbal sections of the test, which is taken every year by college-bound seniors.
The scores have declined at a slower rate on the mathematical portion of the SAT than on the verbal section. In 1967, the average mathematical score was 492, compared to 472 in 1976. Verbal scores dropped even more, from 466 in 1967 to 431 in 1976.

SAT DATA also shows that women, traditionally scoring lower on the mathematical section than on the verbal, are now doing just the reverse. In 1967, the average verbal SAT score for women was 468, the average math score 467. The gap between the two categories has widened considerably. In 1976, female high school seniors scored 446 in math, 430 in verbal.
Male high school seniors have always scored higher in the math section of the SAT. In 1967, the average score for males was 463 in verbal, 514 in math. In 1976, males scored 433 in verbal, and 497 in math.

THE DECLINE in SAT scores for college-bound seniors is modest compared to the decline for all tests taken.
Data collected from average test scores for all tests taken since 1957 (which includes scores for sophomores, juniors, seniors and for students who took the test more than once in a year) show a total decline of 4 points in verbal and 32 in math.
The overall scores dropped from 473 in verbal, 46 in math in 1957, to 429 in verbal and 470 in math for 1976.

The remaining funds will be used to construct a storage building for the patrol and investigation division, to house vehicles, marine division boats and equipment.
The addition to the garage will house the metro narcotics, criminal intelligence and youth bureaus. It will relieve overcrowding in the rest of the road patrol's offices.

Our township does not need two years of strife by the opposing factions. The township has been split apart long enough, and it's time for all of us to start working together to reach mutually agreeable solutions to the immense problems which face us. We will accomplish nothing by persons mounting recall campaigns and by the politicians having to spend their time fighting these efforts.

Surprising Chiefs upset East

For the second season in a row, Plymouth Canton has made the unexpected a reality at the expense of Garden City East. Friday evening the Chiefs struck for first and third quarter touchdowns, while manhandling the Panthers in a bruising battle, and holding East to a mere 89 yards total offense.

It was a bigger team the Chiefs had to contend with on offense, but Canton coach Dave Schuele utilized a ball control game plan to perfection.

"We ran the power offense against them, and it worked. We needed to control the ball on offense and we did," said Schuele.

One year ago Canton stunned a heavily-favored Panther squad 27-13.

Jerry Simons carried the bulk of the offensive attack on his shoulders, carrying the pigskin 23 times, rambling for 164 yards. The Chiefs offensive output for the evening consisted of 216 yards on the ground, while East accumulated 89 yards with 64 coming through the air.

The opening quarter moved slowly as penalties were called on eight of the first 11 plays. Infractions were the Panthers' bane, and at one point it took them three attempts to punt without a penalty. The third try misfired on a high snap and Canton regained possession on the East 42-yard line.

Simons took a pitch from quarterback Doug Smith and rolled for 13 yards to the 3. Five carries later he prolonged the

drive by converting a fourth-and-one situation.

On fourth down and goal at the one-yard line, Simons got the call and bulled his way into the end zone for the Chiefs' first score. Brent Eckler's conversion was good and Canton led 7-0.

Garden City responded with a drive of its own on the 24-yard line. A penalty against Canton, and a quarterback sneak, both on fourth downs placed the Panthers deep in Chief territory for the first time in the contest.

Bob Davis hooked up with Nick Mancini for a 17-yard completion to the Canton 28. But Davis' next aerial was picked off by Chief defensive back Tom Powell on the two-yard line.

"We had a fine week of practice after

losing five games in a row," Shuele said, savoring the Chiefs second victory of the season. "The coaching staff the team that if it worked hard enough it would eventually be rewarded, and tonight we were."

In the third quarter, the Chiefs gobbled up 42 yards of real estate in eight downs to ice the contest.

A pair of big gains by Simons and Mark Hutton set up Powell's touchdown scamper.

On fourth down and one yard to go at the East 20, Powell popped through a gap on the right side of the line and sprinted past the secondary for paydirt. The 20-yard burst made the score 13-0.

The Panther's deepest penetration of the game occurred in the final stanza. Davis directed his club by finding Dave Patton and

Mancini open in the flat for short passes. With first down on the Chief 12-yard line, a penalty and four errant passes dismembered the final offensive effort of the night for the Panthers.

The secondary held in the clutch for Canton as Scott Gray and Dave McIntosh were Johnny-on-the-spot to breakup several passes during the game.

"Our offensive line has trouble in the past with indecision. Our kids just blocked with confidence when they saw the size of their opponents," commented Schuele.

Canton is now 2-6 on the year, as is East. The Chiefs have the unenviable task of playing Dearborn this Friday at home starting at 8 p.m. The Panthers will prepare this week for their yearly encounter with Garden City West.

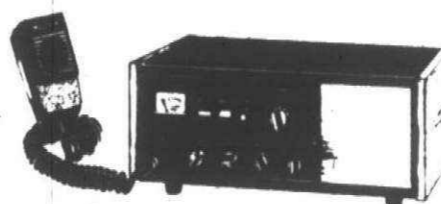

Lori Hogan was the lone double winner in the 200 and 500 free races. She swam a 2:26.3 in the 200 and 6:32.4 in the 500. Gotschalk placed third in the 500 race.

Schelansky took two second place finishes in the 200 individual medley and 100 back. Anderson also was second in the 100 free sprint.

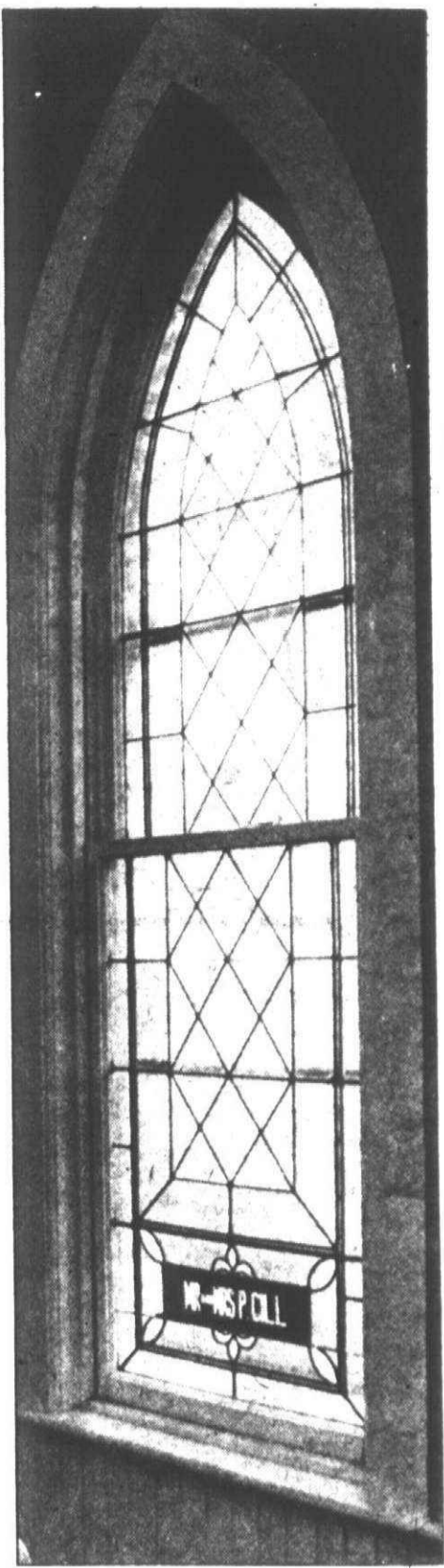

Tradition goes on at Cherry Hill church

Bazaar day started early for members of the Women's Society of Cherry Hill Methodist Church.

Months of preparation had gone into the making of items for the bazaar which was scheduled to open at 2 p.m. Baking for the smorgasbord dinner which would start at 5:30 had been under way since before daylight.

It was mid-morning when Helen Antis arrived at the church. Frances Tipper, Dorothy West and Madeline Bastien already were hard at work.

And Mrs. Antis needed assistance in unloading her car and carrying her contributions to the kitchen in the basement of the church hall.

There were two apple pies, a mince pie and two dozen cupcakes—she had started baking at 6 a.m. There were individual molds of fruit and jello salads, two large Virginia hams prepared for baking, and a turkey, stuffed and ready for the oven. She also had a carton containing the makings for a tossed salad. Another was full of stuffed calico Christmas tree ornaments for the bazaar.

THE MENU for the dinner included roast turkey, baked ham, potatoes, salads, relishes, spaghetti, vegetables, desserts and beverages.

The tables were ready in the church hall—blue and white place mats on the white paper covering that is traditional for church suppers.

Madeline Bastien, chairwoman of the event, had arranged the centerpieces. Multi-colored strawflowers had been placed in an interesting assortment of containers—all of them antiques.

There was a cowbell, a crock, pig scraper, coffee grinder, brass scales, butter strainer, shoe last and a stoneware inkwell.

"That's a rare old inkwell," she explained. "It belonged to Mrs. Allen Bordine. I have never seen another one like it."

Dorothy West said they could seat 80 persons at one time. By the time the dinner ended at 7:30 p.m., the tables would be filled many times.

THE BIG OLD gas cooking range in the kitchen had been purchased in 1882.

Its ovens awaited the hams and, after a final rubbing with salt, the turkeys were judged ready for roasting.

"We're going to redo this kitchen with some of the money we make today," said Mrs. Bastien. "We'll have steel sinks and we need a dumbwaiter."

All the handiwork for the bazaar had not been turned in by 10:30 a.m. But the collection was growing in the rooms next to the kitchen.

Tables were piled with Christmas decorations and cartons filled with handicrafts were ready for display.

Duane Bastien who teaches pottery making at the University of Toledo had sent home some of his creations for the sale.

"That's the way he pays his church dues," said his mother.

Bastien had donated several pieces of ragu pottery, with the coppery tinged glaze which results from the Japanese method of firing the clay.

Plates with a picture of the church on the front and its history on the underside would sell for \$3 each.

THE OLD CHURCH on Ridge Road in Canton Township has witnessed many church suppers and bazaars.

The present brick building was built in 1882. First Methodist minister preached in the area in 1834. It was not until 1848 that the first wooden church was built.

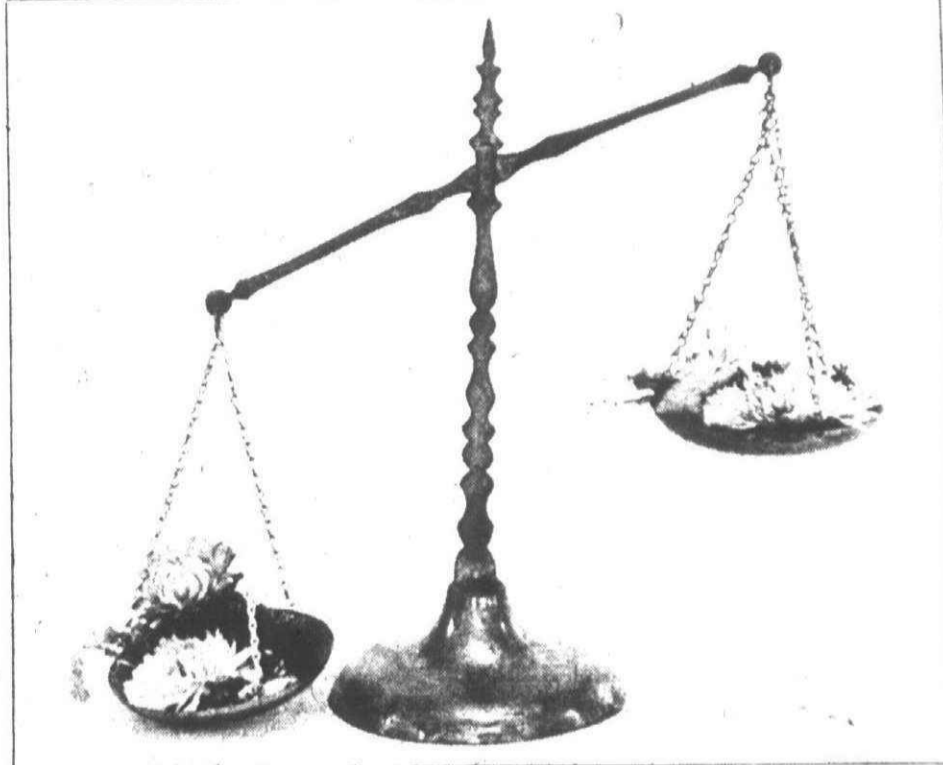
Among the early settlers in the Cherry Hill-Ridge Road district were the Gills and Bordines.

"Peter Gill came in 1834," said Dorothy West, "the Wests didn't get here until 1900."

Windows in the church bear the names of some of the oldest families.

Although the road in front of the church now is paved and members of the Women's Society drive to their meetings in late-model cars, the rural atmosphere remains. Farmland still surrounds the building and adjoining cemetery.

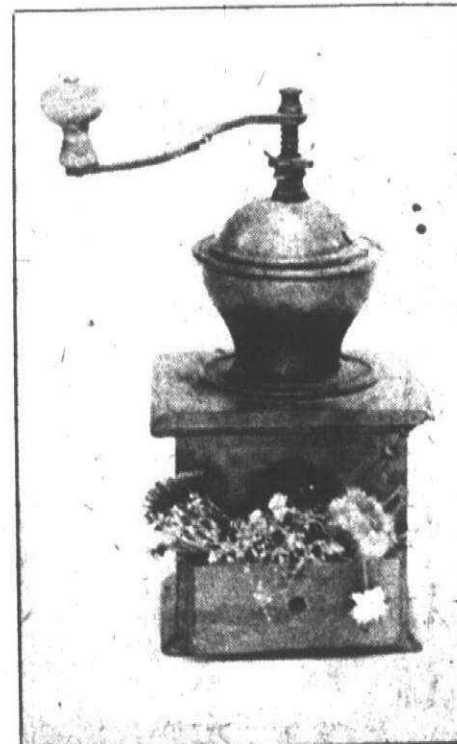
And the ladies of the church still work together with the spirit and vigor of their predecessors.

"Customer acceptance of the 1977 Oldsmobile continues to be excellent," said J.F. Mattox, divisional general sales manager.

Oldsmobile's Cutlass is the best selling car in the country. During the Oct. 21-31 sales period, Cutlass outsold other Oldsmobile cars by 3-1.

Strike hurts Ford income

The United Auto Worker's strike against Ford Motor Co. cut the automobile maker's third-quarter income by about one-fourth.

Ford officials said the strike reduced production by 423,000 units in the quarter. Net income was \$42 million or 45 cents a share, compared to \$56 million or 60 cents per share in the third quarter of 1975. The strike, Ford officials said, will also affect fourth quarter production.

Despite the strike-affected second half of 1976, Ford officials are predicting further economic recovery in 1977. Major economic factors pointing to an economic upswing include rising industrial production, employment, personal income and savings while interest rates are unexpectedly low. The factors suggest increases in business spending, residential construction and sales of consumer durables, including cars and trucks.

Ford predicts the auto industry will sell 13.4 million units, compared to 11.1 million the year before. In 1977, deliveries in the U.S. could near the record 14.6 million cars and trucks sold in 1973.

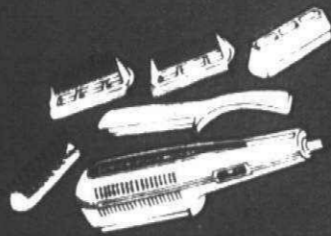

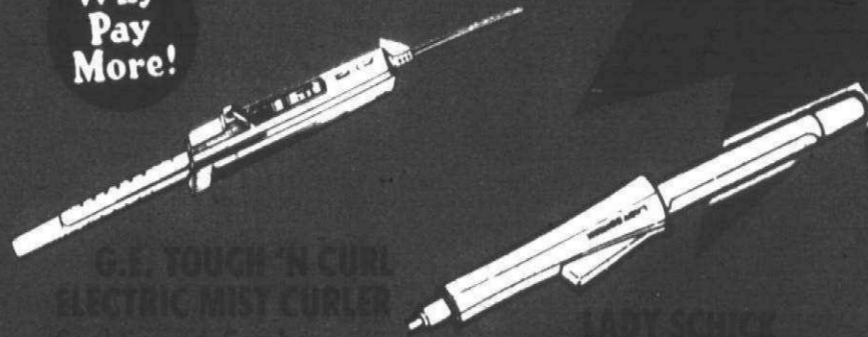

FOR WHAT.. The number three killer in this country—diabetes. You could have it and not know it! ANYONE at any age can become diabetic. Those most likely to get it, however, are relatives of diabetics, and people over 40 or overweight.

WHAT IS DIABETES.. The sugars and starches in the food we eat are converted to glucose. With the aid of insulin, a natural hormone, the blood stream distributes the glucose to the body cells for ready energy. With diabetes, the body fails to produce enough insulin or insulin which is unable to perform its work.

THE EARLIER diabetes is discovered and proper control is established, the better the diabetic's chances are of living a normal life. Diet and exercise are the first essentials of treatment. Often they are all that is required. There are some medicines taken by mouth and, if necessary, injections of insulin which the body lacks.

WARNING SIGNALS OF DIABETES

Juvenile-Onset Diabetes, most frequent in adolescents and young adults, is characterized by the sudden appearance of:

- Constant urination
 - Abnormal thirst
 - Unusual hunger
 - The rapid loss of weight
 - Irritability
 - Obvious weakness and fatigue
 - Nausea and vomiting
- According to the American Diabetes Association, the symptoms appear suddenly and signal the need for prompt treatment.

Adult-Onset Diabetes, most frequent between the ages of 35 and 60, may include any of the signs of juvenile diabetes, or:

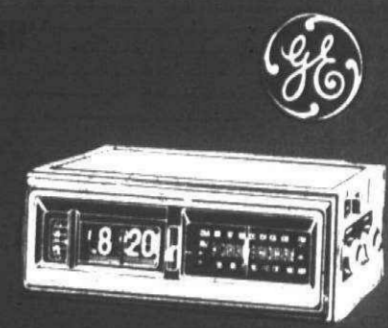
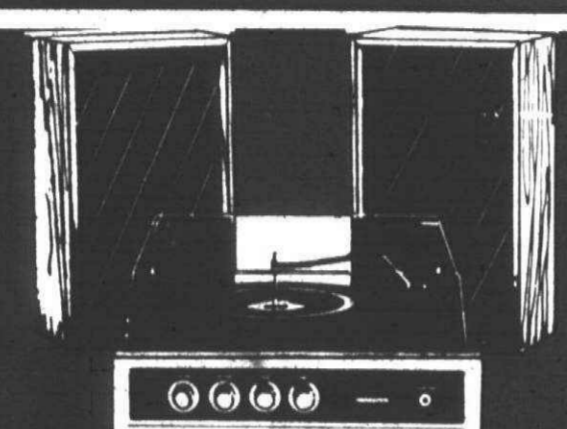
