What have they done to denigrate turkeys?

When you sit down to dinner on Thanksgiving Day and cast your eyes on the big brown main entrée in the center of the table, some thoughts should be given to the organizing of a Benevolent Society for the Return of the Turkey to Its Deserving Place in Society.

No bird has been more maligned than the turkey down through the years and it may be surprising to learn that, contrary to what many have been led to believe, there was no turkey on the first Thanksgiving Day feast enjoyed by the Pilgrims away back in 1620.

The turkey didn't make its appearance as a symbol of the day until two years later when the Indians brought four of the long legged, spindly looking things to the feast.

They were offered only as a side dish to the venison and the corn and other products raised on the Indian land around Plymouth, Mass.

It wasn't long after that the turkey was dealt its first real blow in the race for prestige when Benjamin Franklin lost his plea to have the turkey made a symbol of the new land instead of the bald eagle.

According to the yellowed pages of American history Franklin is quoted as saying, "I wish the Bald Eagle had not been chosen as the representative of our country; he is a bird of bad moral character; like those among men who live by sharpening and robbing—he is generally poor and very lousy. The turkey is the much respectable bird."

That was the start of casting the turkey aside and it has been treated horribly ever since—even to the point of losing its love life because of the glutton's demand for more white meat.

The turkey, as we know it today, according to history, is not an American bird, but was domesticated from its wild stage in Mexico. In the development it became a

bird of some beauty with "eyed" tail feathers branched out into six species, the most popular of which became the bronze, red and white.

In the development the Spaniards took the birds to Europe and in time they arrived in England. From there the later groups of Pilgrims brought them to America. Even then, they were not given a high place in the scheme of things, aside from being the bird that was eaten on Thanksgiving Day.

In fact so little was thought of it at the time that there was no Thanksgiving Day in the Pilgrims second year over here and only a small feast in 1623. It wasn't until October 3, 1963—240 years later—that President Abraham Lincoln issued the proclamation making Thanksgiving a national holiday.

Even then the turkey wasn't given a high place—except in the center of the festive board—and about 20 years ago it was dealt the severest blow.

"We found that the white turkey—and there were few of them—had fewer pin feathers and pins than the other varieties. It also had a bigger breast. That meant there was more white meat and we began to develop the white turkey by cross breeding," says Lloyd Sharland.

Once that was under way the bronze and red turkeys were bred out of existence and there are a preponderance of white turkeys today.

"But the real change came when we found that the breast became so large that the hen couldn't sit on the nest properly for mating.

"We had to turn to artificial insemination and rob the entire flock of its love life. Even the gobbler was caught in the new scheme of things.

Naturally, a strutter, the gobbler's snood (the long pink finger-like decoration that winds around its beak) lengthened when he strutted in front of the hens—or people. To eliminate the strutting and the possible danger to the sitting hens, the snood is

now cut off in many cases at birth. "I have only one bird out there with a snood," Sharland commented.

Despite all this change in his love life the gobbler still manages to get close enough to the hen to start clawing. When this happens Sharland races over, grabs the gobbler by the neck and tosses him aside.

"I don't want those big breasts on the hens all clawed up and scratched," he said. "I'd have to sell them as seconds and I don't want anything like that."

When told that was unkind to the birds, he countered by saying that he has a lot invested in each bird—possibly about 100 pounds of feed—and "I don't want to sell damaged birds."

So, if you follow the history of the turkey it has been cast aside and maligned through the centuries. First, it was taken from its native haunts, domesticated in a foreign country—Mexico—and then crossbred until only one or two of the original members of the family still remain.

To top it all off, the hens and the gobblers are kept apart—just because the American people have a great desire for white meat on our Thanksgiving Day.

When apprised of this unkind treatment that denied the turkey the role of the symbol of our country in favor of the Bald Eagle and made of it a downhearted, discontented bird that isn't smart enough to fly back into the yard after flying over the fence to get out Sharland smiled. "Who would want to eat an eagle on Thanksgiving Day?"

Maybe so. But when one ponders the fate of the turkey through the years, it is about time that we form the Benevolent Society for the Return of the Turkey to a Higher Place in Society.

We have a Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals so the time is here to come to the aid of the maligned turkey and make of it more than the favorite of the gluttons who feast only on white meat at holiday time.

Yesterday

The turkey was a proud bird, dark colored, and he walked with a haughty air about him. The once-proud turkey inspired Benjamin Franklin

to nominate him for the national symbol. He lost out to the Bald Eagle and, according to W.W. Edgar, he lost out to hybridization techniques.

Canton's Calvary Baptist Academy annex coming

Officials at Canton's Calvary Baptist Church plan to house elementary school children enrolled in the newly-established Plymouth Christian Academy in their own school building come next fall.

With groundbreaking ceremonies held last Sunday, church officials hope to start construction of the \$1.6 million addition to the church at 43065 Joy near Main St. by the end of November.

When complete, the addition will include facilities for Plymouth Christian Academy students, now housed in the Northville School District's Main Street School on a temporary basis. The addition will also include a 1,750-seat auditorium and new nursery facilities for church members' children.

The brick 56,000 square-foot addition, according to architect Thomas E. Hansz, will include 14 classrooms for Plymouth Christian Academy students as well as a 2,000 square-foot library, a teachers' lounge, new kitchen facilities and an enclosed, terrace-like playground for kindergartners and first graders.

The existing church gymnasium will serve as the students' cafeteria and multipurpose room and hook the school to the existing church. A playground, baseball diamond and football field are planned for older students.

HARRY GUESS, the academy's administrator, is eagerly awaiting completion of the new school building and believes the structure will help beef up the academy's second-year enrollment.

Guess and the Rev. G. Douglas Routledge, pastor of Calvary Baptist Church, see the new school building as phase one of the infant academy's development. They hope to start construction of a high school on a nearby site within the next five or six years.

The academy, began this September as an elementary school for kindergarten through sixth grades this September, was established to integrate a literal interpretation of the Bible with academic excellence, a traditional mode of teaching and parental participation, according to Guess.

He explained, "We have a two-fold thrust—solid strong academics with a strong spiritual thrust. We want to be an extension of the home and assist the parents. There's a strong emphasis on integrating subject matter with the Bible."

Religious instruction, is not limited to the half-hour Bible instruction students receive each day, Guess said.

"When we approach science, for example, we'll approach it from a Biblical standpoint, but say there are other points of view. We'll say the Bible says God created man. In opposition, we'll say men of science believe in evolution. We'll discuss it, and we'll stress how to deal with the other views."

ALTHOUGH THE ACADEMY is inter-

denominational, Guess said all of its students come from churches with an evangelical point of view. About 50 per cent of the academy's current enrollment of 65 students are Calvary Baptist Church members, and about 85 per cent are residents of the Plymouth-Canton community.

Faculty members are certified teachers and committed to Biblical and traditional modes of teaching.

With only 65 kindergarten through sixth graders enrolled in the academy this year, the pupil-teacher ratio is extremely low—about 12 to 17 students per teacher.

As the academy's enrollment grows and more grade levels are added, Guess expects the pupil-teacher ratio to average about 25 students per teacher. The ratio, he adds, will never exceed 30.

Eventually, Guess and the Rev. Routledge hope the academy will include grades one through 12. Church officials plan to add grades seven through eight to the school next year and one grade each year thereafter. The addition to Calvary Baptist Church will house high school students, until a high school can be constructed.

So far, parental feedback on the acad-

emy's curriculum has been good, Guess says.

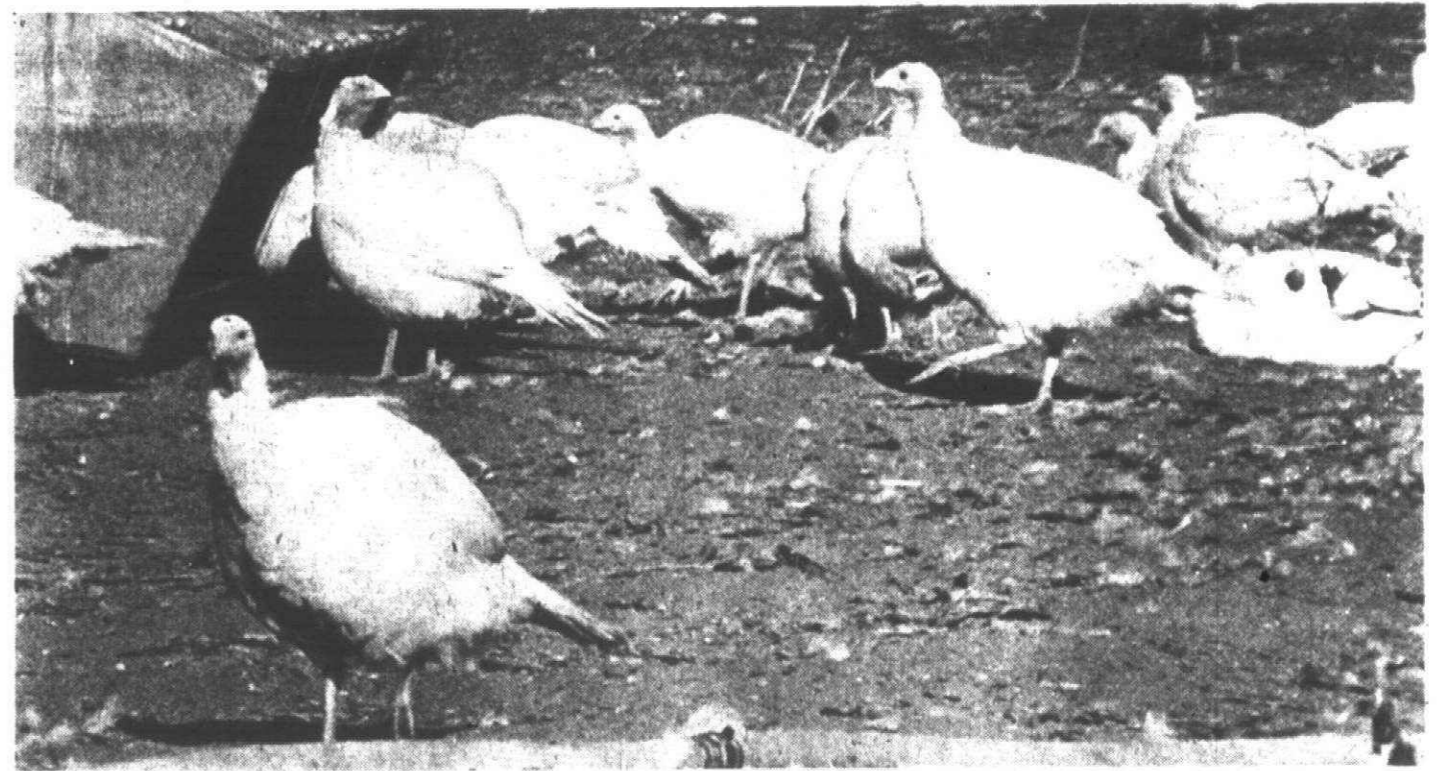
"The parents have been very positive," the 30-year-old administrator said. "I'm convinced they'll be a major factor selling the school next year."

GUESS BELIEVES the new school building will help attract numerous new students from the Plymouth-Canton community. Transportation problems and the location of the academy in Northville this year detracted from enrollment figures, he said.

"I'm convinced that when we get back here, it won't be a question of where we get our students, but rather who do we have to turn away. I don't see any other school doing what we're doing in this area."

Parents interested in obtaining more information about the academy may attend an open house Sunday, Nov. 21, from 3 to 5 p.m. at Northville's Main Street School, 501 W. Main.

The Plymouth Christian Academy is affiliated with the National Christian Schools Education Association, the Michigan Association of Christian Schools and the American Association of Christian Schools.

New swine flu date is set

The Plymouth Community School District, in cooperation with the school nurses will sponsor a swine flu vaccination clinic

on Nov. 29 in the Plymouth Salem High School cafeteria between from 3 and 8 p.m.

Working with the school nurses will be the Plymouth Registered Nurses Association and the high school Future Nurses Club. In addition, Senior Nurse Virginia Gibson said she hoped one of the community service clubs would provide a few volunteers.

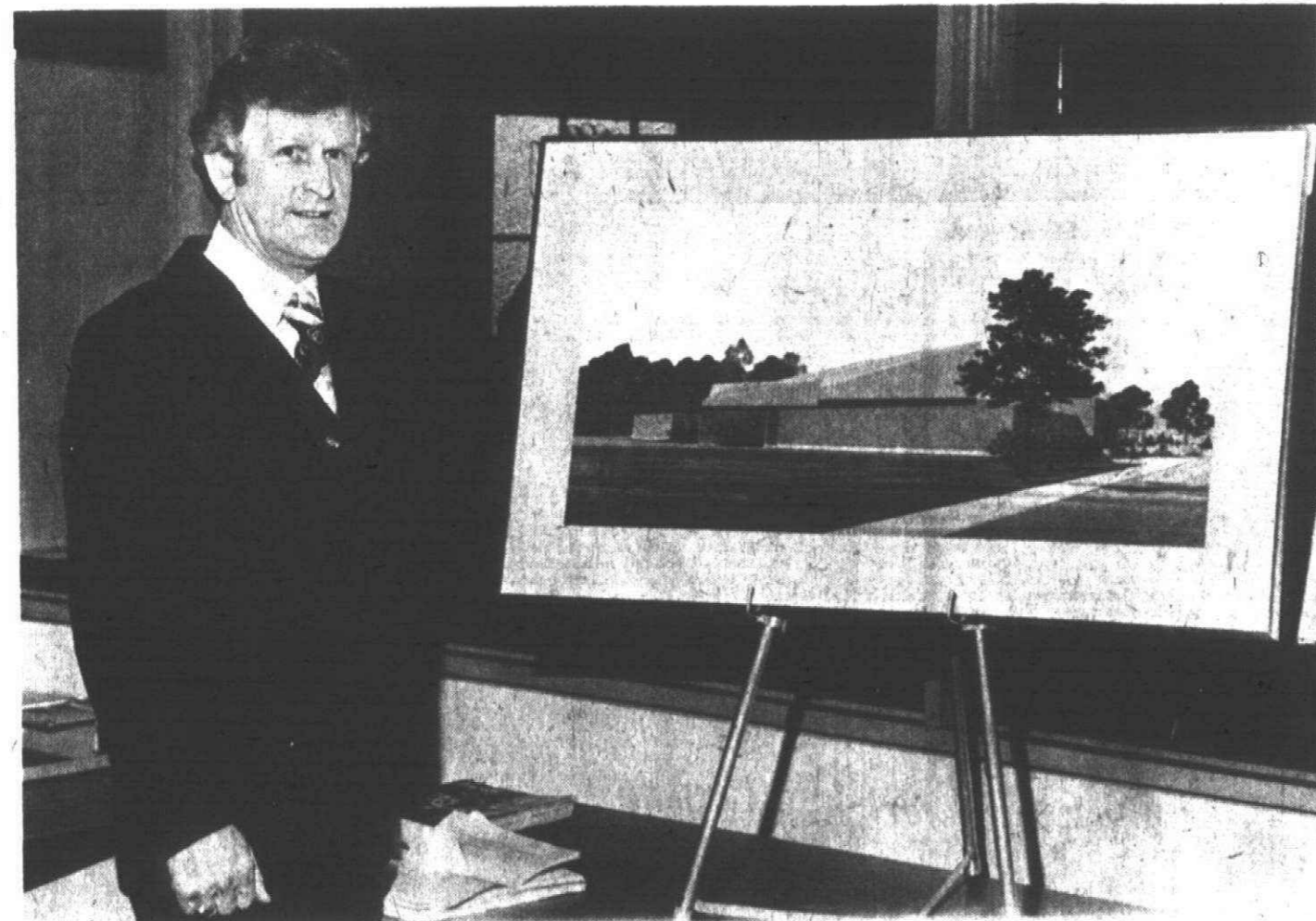
"We will be able to handle everything in the clinic," Ms. Gibson stated, "but we will need some help with traffic control and parking, and that's where I hope a civic group will come through."

The vaccination serum will be supplied by the Wayne County Health Department, and both monovalent and bivalent vaccines will be available.

The monovalent shot is only for swine flu, and it will be given to anybody between the ages of 18 and 59. Bivalent is a mixture of swine flu and "A" Victoria flu serums. It will be available to persons 60 years of age and older and to those 18 years of age and older who suffer from a chronic illness, such as heart disease, respiratory ailments, or kidney infection.

Children less than 18 years old who have no chronic illness will not be inoculated.

IN ADDITION to Ms. Gibson, there are three other school nurses who have helped arrange the clinic and who have volunteered their services. They are: Shirley Cunningham, the nurse at Canton High School and Darlene Huyck and Marcella Dodes, who share the nursing duties for all the elementary schools and junior highs.

Holiday festivities starting on Friday

Wonderland extravaganza

Parade maker keeps the excitement just rolling along

Everyone loves a parade—especially Arthur Wright, director of what some believe to be the world's best parade—the Hudson's Thanksgiving Day Parade.

Every December, Wright, a Troy resident and director of Hudson's special events department, begins work on the 45-minute, 2 1/2-mile extravaganza that always delights observers.

And it takes the full 12 months to produce the spectacular parade.

Wright's been on the job since 1946, but the years haven't dulled the twinkle in his eye, the spark of his mind or pleasure of his job.

"There's a lot of work and a lot of trauma," he said. "But I love it."

Besides, Wright confesses, he's still a kid at heart.

"I decided when I came here in 1946 to do more spectacular kinds of floats, to do fun things by way of mechanization." But he never gave in to the trend to put movie stars, politicians and celebrities in the parade—he kept it geared for the kids.

Probably, things would have changed without Wright, but he sped up the process.

He figured if the method of pulling floats improved—from horses to men to tractors—the floats themselves had to be more sophisticated. No more would it suffice to have a giant animal that didn't do anything.

Wright demanded action, and he got it—sometimes more than he wanted, but always with results that awed floats began having moving parts and fancier designs—which didn't always combine well.

"One rainy Thanksgiving morning we were all lined up. We had made this beautiful giant bird," he recalled. "Its wings flapped, its head moved up and down, its eyes rolled."

"Well, we were using a new material on it, it was three dimensional in that it really did look like feathers."

"WE GLUED IT ON with weatherproof cement. And when we got out there, we started it, the wings started to flap, the head rolled—and the skin just slid down to

the ground. All we had left was the metal frame."

The emergency repair crew, which always waits nearby for those kinds of disasters, quickly dug up some copper wire and skillfully put the skin back in place.

"Not too many people commented," sighed Wright.

"You know, it's a one-shot show, and you work on it all year. When the time comes, you move heaven and earth to get it right."

Wright recalled other mishaps—the fellow who lost all his eyebrows from the flash powder on a cannon, the time a giant nest came crashing down from atop a float, the flat tires, the broken wheels, the dragon.

"That thing (the dragon) was a buster from the start," he said. "You can't see anything under there. By the end of the parade, everyone had made slits in the side, and as it rolled down the street, you could see all these arms hanging out and waving. They always came out from under there saying, 'Never again.'"

The dragon now moves without human

feet, so that problem is solved.

But, said Wright, "Something's bound to happen."

"The beauty of it is that most people don't know what's supposed to be there."

ALSO AMONG Wright's memories are some special floats and ideas that have contributed to the parade all these years.

The bulldogs that drive those crazy little go-karts were Wright's idea.

"I really thought it would be fun to see the head of a great big bulldog sitting on one of those little go-karts," he said.

Everyone who watched agreed. "I can't remember all of (the floats)," he said. "A lot of them were pretty fine and sophisticated."

One, however, remains the same, and to this day Wright admits it's his favorite—Santa Claus, of course.

FOR ALL ITS hoopla and fantasy, the Thanksgiving Day parade is much more.

All year long, a crew of four or five workers man the Hudson warehouse on Fort and Twelfth streets in Detroit.

Inside, floats await a final coat of paint. Others are finished and stored under yards of plastic.

Children could go wild-eyed in the warehouse, which seems a land of make-believe.

For the men, it is all very real. And, as the big day approaches and there's still work to be done, a sort of panic sets in.

"These men, you see, are not the elf's one might imagine. They simply work as hard at perfecting everything down to the last blade of grass on an Indian float or the lump of coal that makes the snowman's eye."

It is a giant task but, when it is over, "It's a darn good feeling," said Don Mette, a float maker for the last 18 years.

"It's an achievement to think that you've done all this. Millions of people are watching. There is no trial run, no trying it out before hand. It has to work."

Mette, Wright and other Hudsonians work together to create the story book floats.

"We build strictly from concept," said Wright. "There are no drawings. We will



decide on the scale and start to develop it. There must be action in each float, some way or another.

"It's a super challenge. And it takes the participation of the entire staff. Without their knowledge, the whole thing wouldn't happen."

"No one person can say that he personally did it all."

IN FACT, all of them toss an idea or two into the pot. "We keep them (the floats) in the kids category, the parade is for them," Mette said. "Some of these other parades have celebrities in them, but the kids don't know who they are."

Wright couldn't agree more and upholds that philosophy by inviting Detroit's schoolchildren to enter a float design contest.

Every year, there's a winner and a float to prove it. And even if a youngster's idea doesn't win, the entries help Wright determine what kind of floats the children want to see.

"We use all of them as a guide," he said. "When we went to the moon, 90 per cent of the drawings were about going to the moon. And there are always about 10 per cent of the kids who have Little Red Riding Hood or other tales. There's always a percentage of everything, a Flintstone, a dragon, Dracula."

THIS YEAR, there will be a Burger King float (a paddle boat with a French fry and tomato paddle wheel), McDonald's (Ronald's land including doe-eyed hamburgers and golden arches), and other company-sponsored floats.

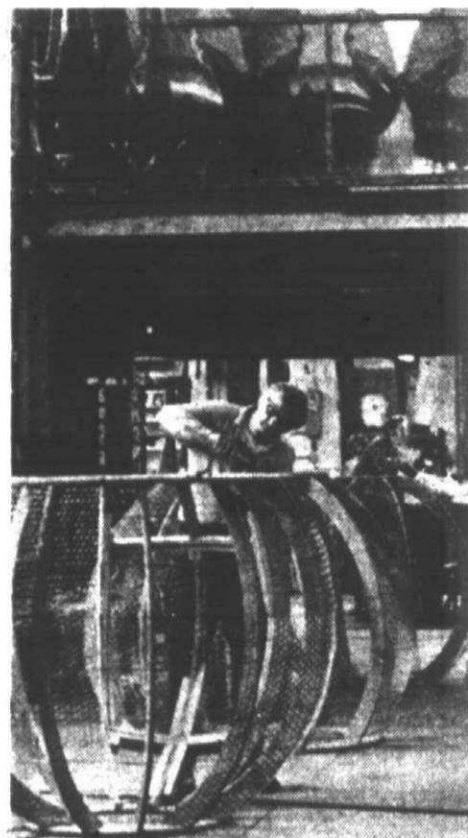
"Prices have skyrocketed," said Wright of parade costs. "Lumber, plastic have gone up as much as 50 to 100 per cent. Sponsored floats help defray costs."

ALTHOUGH WRIGHT has handled the parade for the past 31 years, it dates back further than that.

It began 50 years ago with a quiet rambling of horse-drawn, flower-covered floats. The most action in those days was the the cantor of the horse or a wave of the hand.

This year, roller skaters will glide across a moving winter wonderland. Gymnasts will jump for joy on a giant bed ("The parents will love us for that one"). The familiar dragon will snake along, and all the characters from the parade's past will dance around a special 50th anniversary float.

Pulitzer-winner chides profession

The press was not the hero of Watergate, according to Seymour Hersh, chief investigative reporter for the New York Times. In fact, he said, media complicity could be responsible for many governmental wrongdoings.

His remarks were made Wednesday afternoon before a small group at the University of Michigan-Dearborn campus. Sy Hersh made national impact by

covering the My Lai massacre. He was one of the first people to write stories about the secret bombing raids that had been going on in Cambodia. Recently he has scored scoops which pinned down domestic spying by the CIA and documented CIA complicity in the overthrow of the late Chilean President Salvador Allende.

During the Watergate investigation, Hersh was competing heavily with Washington Post reporters Carl Bernstein and Bob Woodward. He underplays his role by

calling himself the New York Times's "catch-up man."

In spite of these scoops, Hersh said, people must realize that the press uncovered many of these scandals one, two, three and four years "after the fact and after the 1972 election."

"NO GROUP IS more overrated right now than the press," Hersh said. "There's a great hoopla being raised right now with the movie, 'All the Presidents Men,' which I'm sure you've all seen. The investigative reporter is glorified. But people must realize that news isn't manipulated what it seems to be; news is easily manipulated by people, and just because the facts in a story are correct, it doesn't mean that you're hearing the truth from the people quoted. Facts and truth are not the same thing."

Wiretaps, break-ins, illegal bombing missions all went unchecked and unmentioned by the press during most of the first four years of President Richard Nixon's administration, said Hersh.

"Things started to break when two police reporters from the Washington Post followed through on a story," Hersh said. "But remember that their stories didn't affect the election. Nixon was elected by one of the biggest majorities ever. It wasn't

until the spring of '73 when (James) McCord started to crack and the Justice Department decided to take a little more active role that things started to crumble for Nixon."

"People ask why didn't Nixon deny the tapes. My theory is that he didn't believe he'd ever be caught. He'd got away with so much for so long."

"The press was not the saviour of Watergate. We helped, but it was really incidental. And the good reporting that was done must be viewed in the light of the fact that we failed so utterly in the first Nixon administration."

"But, I'll bet if Carter wants to pull some of the same stunts, he'll probably get away with it. That's why it makes me nervous when people think we're doing a better job than we are."

"If a social revolution happens in this country it will not be led by the press. That's not our job, and we probably won't know about it for six months."

Hersh worked as a Washington correspondent for the Associated Press during the '60s. He maneuvered his way into covering the Pentagon because, he said, he felt that writing about the military and the war would make him famous.

At the Pentagon, Hersh said, he soon

learned that anyone with more than one star in the military hierarchy held the view that to "lie for your country" was in its best interest.

"I can't remember how many times I've written stories and before they're published the editor gets a call from some high-ranking admiral or general saying that if the story is published there will be serious national security implications," explained Hersh.

"We'd ruin the story anyway, and I'll be an S of a B—the Russians never once attacked San Francisco by the sea."

Hersh is not a bitter man, but his barbs are sharp. He made the following capsule comments on various public figures and institutions:

ON HENRY KISSINGER: "Kissinger has proven himself to be a congenial liar. . . . The press has never taken Kissinger far enough. The general attitude is 'Well, he's doing a good job in the SALT talks and in the Mideast, so let's lay off him.' The stories about him wiretapping members of his own staff end up on page 16A."

ON THE CIA: My solution for dealing with people like E. Howard and other CIA agents is to go to the back lots of MGM or Paramount pictures and get a couple B-

52s, paint them black, or 'sterile' as the CIA puts it, and fly a bunch of these guys out to Norway once a year. They could land in the north where few people are living and let 'em blow up bridges, burn down a few houses, and go through the drawers in another empty house. It would be good therapy—it'd get rid of all their excess energy."

ON DANIEL ELLSBERG: Members of the White House plumbers unit broke into Ellsberg's psychiatrist office with a crowbar after the Mexican cleaning woman noticed the tape that they had placed over the door lock. It's the same trick that failed later on at Watergate when Frank Wills, the security guard, saw the tape and called the police. What did they find in the psychiatrist's files? Probably a couple notices that Ellsberg had not yet paid his bill. But the assumption of Hunt and Liddy was that under a psychiatric tracer Ellsberg would reveal all the names of the Russian KGB agents they thought he was working with. And I'm sure they had this vision of the psychiatrist as a guy with a beard who snorts cocaine. You wonder if they expected the psychiatrist to take down the proper spelling of all these Russian names that Ellsberg was supposed to be naming.

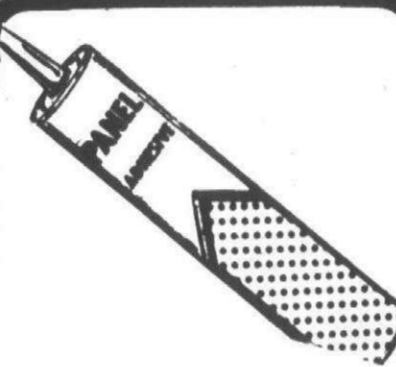

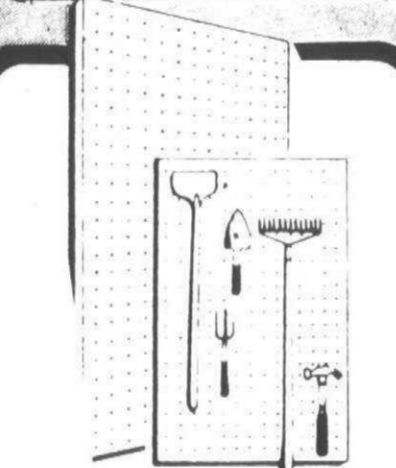

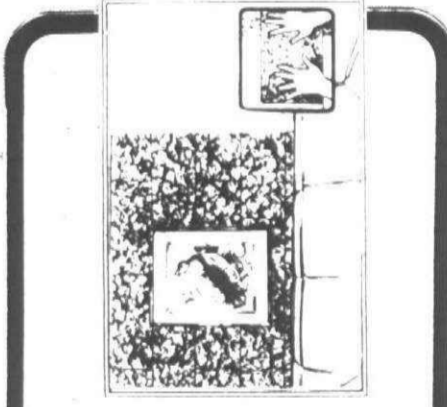

Publishers to refund for 'books'

Publisher Center Inc. of Grosse Pointe will refund pre-payments that were made on several multi-volume sets of books that were never published, according to State Atty. Gen. Frank Kelley.

"We received many complaints from citizens and libraries who had paid for the books and never received them," Kelley said.

The company had said that the following books had been published, Kelly said, when in fact they had not been:

- 20-volume "Encyclopedia of the USA"
- 50-volume "50 State Who's Who"
- 52-volume "50 State Who's Who"
- 10-volume "10 City Who's Who"
- 2-volume "Library of Congress Books on Religion: 1898-1974"
- Several other encyclopedia and multi-volume works.

The attorney general's office will notify all those who have complained that they can receive a refund by providing proof of payment. Anyone else who believes he is also eligible for a refund from Publishing Center Inc. should write the attorney general. That letter should include a copy of proof of payment, such as a receipt, cancelled check or other document.

Residents can hear city tapes

Home rule cities in Michigan must allow the public to hear tape recordings of city council meetings used to prepare minutes of the meetings if those tapes have not been destroyed, according to a recent ruling by the state attorney general.

In an opinion requested by State Sen. Joseph Snyder (D-St. Clair Shores), Atty. Gen. Frank Kelley said, "The tape recording in question is subject to public disclosure. The law pertaining to home rule cities reads that all sessions of the legislative body and all records of the municipality shall be public."

"What public bodies do in open meetings is the public's business," Kelley said. "It follows that records of any type made during those meetings should be open to public scrutiny."

Snyder raised the question following the refusal of the City of East Detroit to allow a resident of that city to listen to a tape recording of a city council meeting. The city offered the resident the printed minutes of the meeting but refused his request to listen to a tape recording that had been used in preparing those minutes.

The East Detroit city attorney said the minutes, not the tape records, were the public record of the meeting. Kelley disagreed, citing a court decision involving the Board of Pharmacy of Michigan. In that case, the judge ruled that information used to prepare the formal minutes of a meeting is part of the public record.

Tax relief bill signed

Complaining that the state legislature needs to correct "vague and complicated assessment provisions," Governor William Milliken has signed into law an act that will provide tax relief for property owners who add value to their property through routine repair and maintenance.

"I signed the bill because of the overriding desirability of providing property tax relief and stimulating upkeep of property," the governor said.

The new law tells assessors to disregard a specific list of projects in determining the true value of property. The list includes exterior painting, repair of sidewalks and driveways, replacement of furnaces, new plumbing and lighting, and new gutters and roofs.

Milliken said the bill needed some clarification.

"One area that needs to be cleared up is the length of time that a disregard of increased value as the result of repairs and maintenance will be in effect."

"I believe the legislature should seriously review the question of whether the property tax assessment process provides the best approach of granting relief from tax increases that result from these forms of normal maintenance."

Milliken said he preferred a more direct approach, such as an income tax credit.

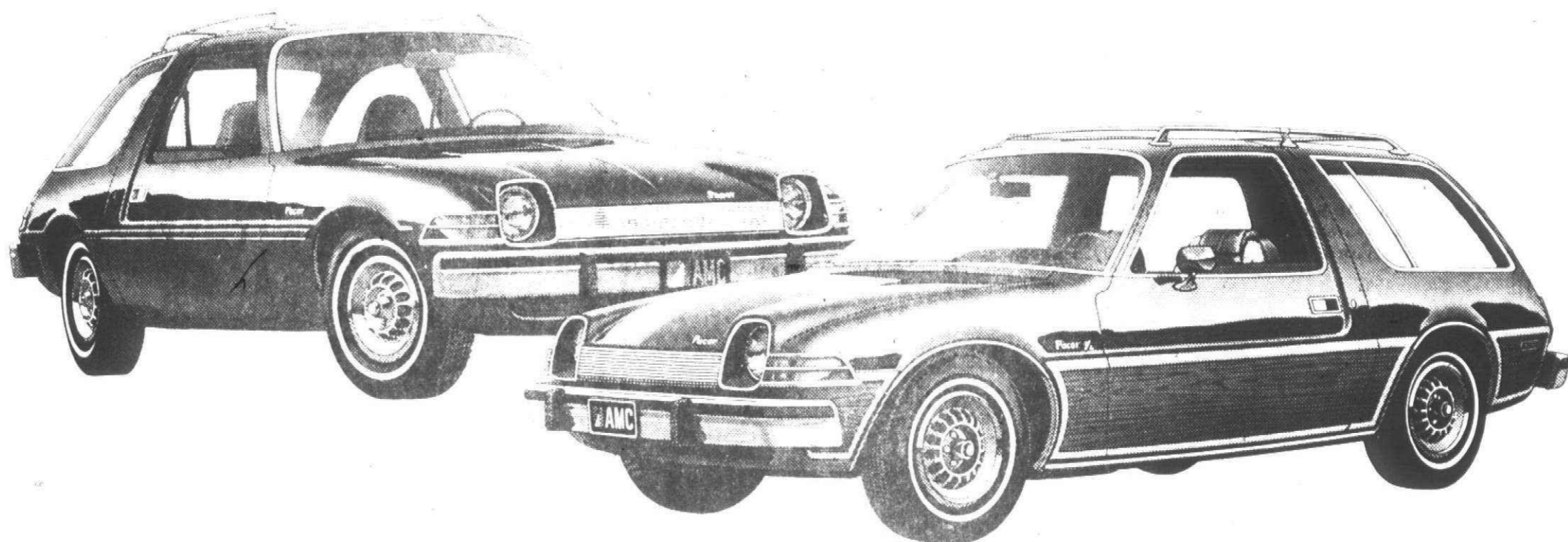

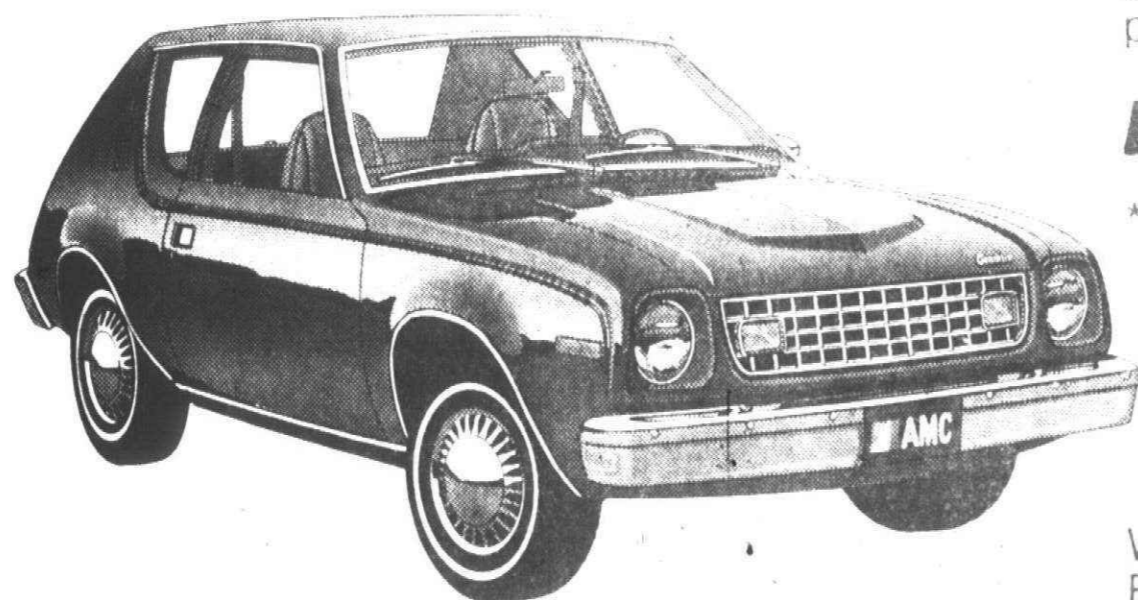

Pierce ponders recount

Election's certified, Pursell is official winner

State Sen. Carl Pursell, Plymouth Republican, is one big step closer to gaining the 2d Congressional district seat following formal canvassing of the Nov. 2 election figures by the Washtenaw County Clerk's office.

The three counties in the district to certify its results after numerous previous tallies were completed with a different total after each one. The Washtenaw election canvass late Wednesday afternoon came one day after the county clerks in Wayne and Monroe

formally certified their election figures. Pursell, whose senate district includes Plymouth, Livonia and Redford Township, now leads by a narrow 344 votes—only 18-thousandths of a percentage point of the 190,450 votes cast.

Pursell, who was behind by only 72 votes in the first 36 hours after the polls closed, expressed confidence last week his narrow lead would stand up and even attended a briefing in Washington for freshmen congressmen.

In the county clerks' figures, Pursell, 43, a state senator for six years, finished with 95,397, compared to Pierce's 95,053. On a county breakdown, Pursell had a 65-35 percentage edge over Pierce in Wayne County with a tally of 39,600 to 21,336 for the Democrat. The situation was nearly reversed in Pierce's home base of Washtenaw County where he compiled a 57-43 lead over Pursell: 51,998 to 38,933. In Monroe, Pierce also had the edge

over Pursell, 21,719 to 16,864, or a lead of 56-44. Pursell's apparent victory won't be a reality until he presents his credentials to the House of Representatives in early January and is given the oath of office for the two-year term.

Rep. Marvin L. Esch, of Ann Arbor, represented the district for five two-year terms. He gave up a chance for a sixth term to run for the U.S. Senate seat now held by Philip A. Hart, a Democrat completing his third, six-year term. Esch lost to Democrat Donald Riegle Nov. 2.

IF PURSELL is seated in the House, it will mean that a Republican will continue to represent the 2d District for a sixth consecutive term.

The Pursell-Pierce margin was the closest in Michigan's congressional history and the tightest in this year's House races across the country, Pursell said earlier.

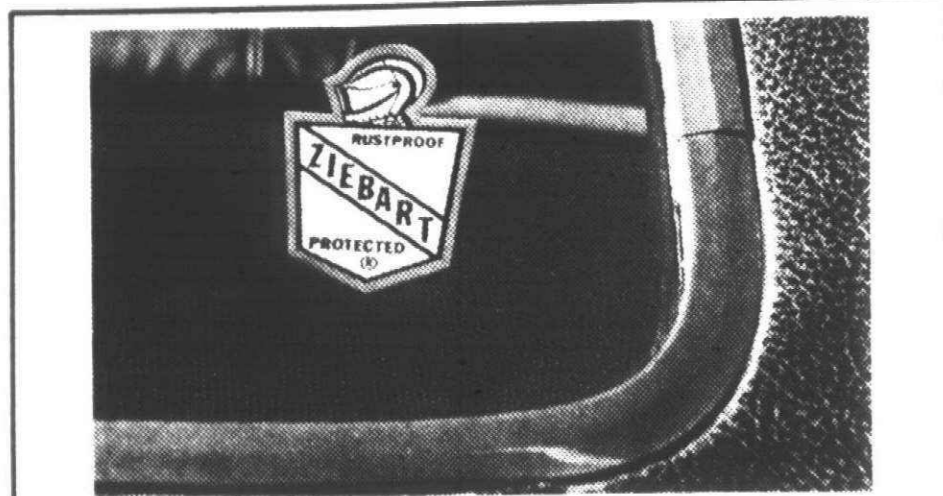

Although some election officials feel that the law doesn't allow for a recount in a congressional general election, Pierce and his supporters may have a chance within the next 10 days when the state board of canvassers must certify the election figures from all of Michigan's counties.

Grote's pay scales mark of \$43,000

The Schoolcraft College board has plugged a dollar figure into the four-year contract it awarded President C. Nelson Grote some weeks ago.

The new salary is a 9.7 per cent increase over Grote's 1975-76 salary of \$40,000. He became SC president in May 1971.

'No smoking' at Schoolcraft board meetings

Tobacco has been dealt another blow, this time by the Schoolcraft College board of trustees.

The board, citing the ventilation problems with the administration building where the meetings take place, voted 6-0, Nov. 17 to ban smoking at board meetings.

Vice-chairperson Rosina Raymond led the fight: "It is hard to raise consciousness on this issue. Smokers are infringing on my right to breathe clean air. The smoke on the burning end of the cigarette is potentially more harmful; it hurts not only the smoker but the person next to him."

Mrs. Raymond added that persons attending board meetings either because they were elected or had to, and so they were unable to avoid the smoke voluntarily.

The anti-smoking resolution was voted on late February but was defeated by a 4-3 vote. The smoking members of the board have indicated that will smoke only outside the meeting room.

Trustee Gerald Cox compared the board's meeting room to a Detroit elevator, remarking that both rooms have a lack of ventilation. It is unlawful to smoke in a Detroit elevator.

Trustee Leroy Bennett agreed, saying, "Educational buildings are not designed for smoking."

Absent were trustees Ron Cowden and Arch Vallier.

A bumper sticker hanging on the wall of the trustees meeting room seemed to summarize the feelings of the board: "Your smoking is hazardous to My health."

Coverage is biased against the Chiefs

Editor:

Throughout the girls' basketball season, the Observer has appeared to be prejudiced towards the Canton team opposed

to the Salem team.

The Observer has referred to the Chiefs as an "eighth grade team," while labeling the Rocks a "powerhouse." Salem has received top priority in news coverage and

photographs, while Canton is ending up with articles of low opinion on the second or third page of the sports section.

"Chiefs slop past Farmington" (Nov. 4) is an article that stands out in particular as an example of this bias. Canton defeated Farmington by a score of 51-30, and according to the Observer "it looked as if the squad was tangled in a duel of eighth grade teams." The article also stated that the team played sloppily, poorly executed plays and shots, and concluded that the team would have to play better in future games. Further in the article was a report on the 51-43 Salem victory over Garden City East. It was noted that "the result was the same" (victory), and referred to the team as a "veritable powerhouse." One question is raised; Canton won their game by 21 points, Salem by 11 (a 10-point difference)—why then is Salem praised and Canton kicked in the teeth?

True, the Rocks are currently undefeated with a record of 17-0, while Canton stands at 13-5, and this is definitely having an effect on the amount of news coverage each team receives. Should this be the criteria to judge a team by—the number of victories? In our opinion, no. Both teams put forth time and effort, and because the Observer is a newspaper representing the Plymouth-Canton area, both teams should receive equal coverage.

Not only is there an emphasis towards the Salem girls' basketball team, but towards all Salem teams. Canton teams are often receiving smaller articles, less photographs, and are frequently being criticized. The Nov. 11 Observer is an excellent example of this. The front page of the sports section contained five articles, all concerning Salem teams. When Canton was finally mentioned on the second page, the Chiefs were criticized for their football efforts.

We suggest that the Observer guard against this bias in the future, and support both schools equally.

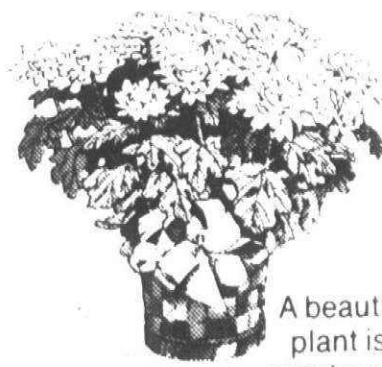

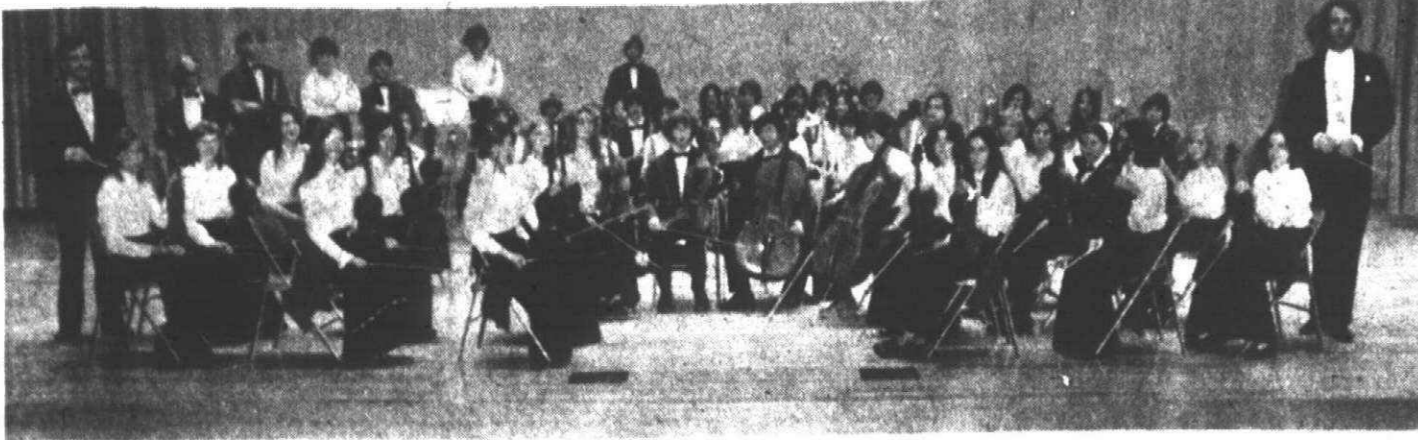

Canton cagers have high hopes

Quickness, defense and that all important "winning attitude" make Plymouth Canton cage coach Casey Cavell an excited young man as his squad begins the long basketball season tomorrow night at Dearborn.

With the season opener only one day away, the Chiefs have yet to find students who will come out for the team at the 165, 178 and 191 weight classes.

"It's kind of discouraging," said Chrenko. "We can win a dual meet easily (match for match) but get beat because of forfeits in the upper weights."

"I'd be optimistic enough to talk about the Western Six League title, but when you're down 18-0 before the meet starts it's hard to win."

CHRENKO HAS a predominately a junior

team, which is the result of two previous building seasons. Most of the varsity wrestlers went through tough times the past two years, but now enter this season with the needed experience to be winners.

One of the few varsity seniors is captain Bill Heedum whose name is known around the league as a top candidate for loop honors this season at the 105 weight class. He finished second last year, competing at 98.

"Bill is a worker and will be a good captain for this individual sport because he leads by example," Chrenko said. This is the first season the Chief grapplers have named a captain.

Entering his fourth season, Heedum holds most of Canton's school records and is likely to set a few more. He finished last year with a 16-8 mark.

One of the big surprises in the Chiefs' lineup last season was 145-pound Scott Collins, who at one point, won eight matches in a row. Now a junior, Collins is expected

to carry his load of victories in aiding Canton's hopes.

"Scott is a natural wrestler with super coordination," Chrenko said.

Another of those third-year returning juniors is 112-pound Craig Lee who was 500 as a sophomore. Mark Bartlett heads the 119 pound list, returning for a third season after a 10-12 mark last year.

JEFF REY is next in line. He faced the toughest competition against Canton last year.

Competing for the 98-pound slot are three members from last year's successful junior varsity team coached by Dan Riggs. Dave Durkin, Matt Major and Jay Lee are vying for that position.

Jerry Clifton is another junior varsity member of a year ago who plans to move up to the varsity level at 138 pounds. Kyle Heaton, Dave March, Steve Cencich and Dennis Howell make up the bulk of the 155-pound class.

New grapplers who have moved into the community are Steve Varney and John

McCarthy, both in the lower weight classes.

Chrenko is still urging Canton students interested in wrestling to try out for the squad—especially those in the upper weight classes.

Walled Lake Western is again favored to win another league title. Harrison and Churchill should be tough, while the Chiefs strive for that first winning season in the school's history and a possible upper division finish in the conference.

Chiefs sink to bottom

It's quite an oddity when a swim team fails to win one event in a league meet but still ends up conference champions.

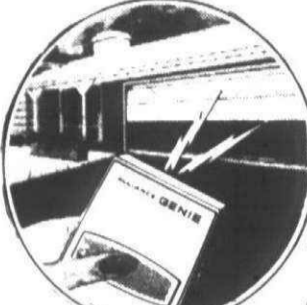

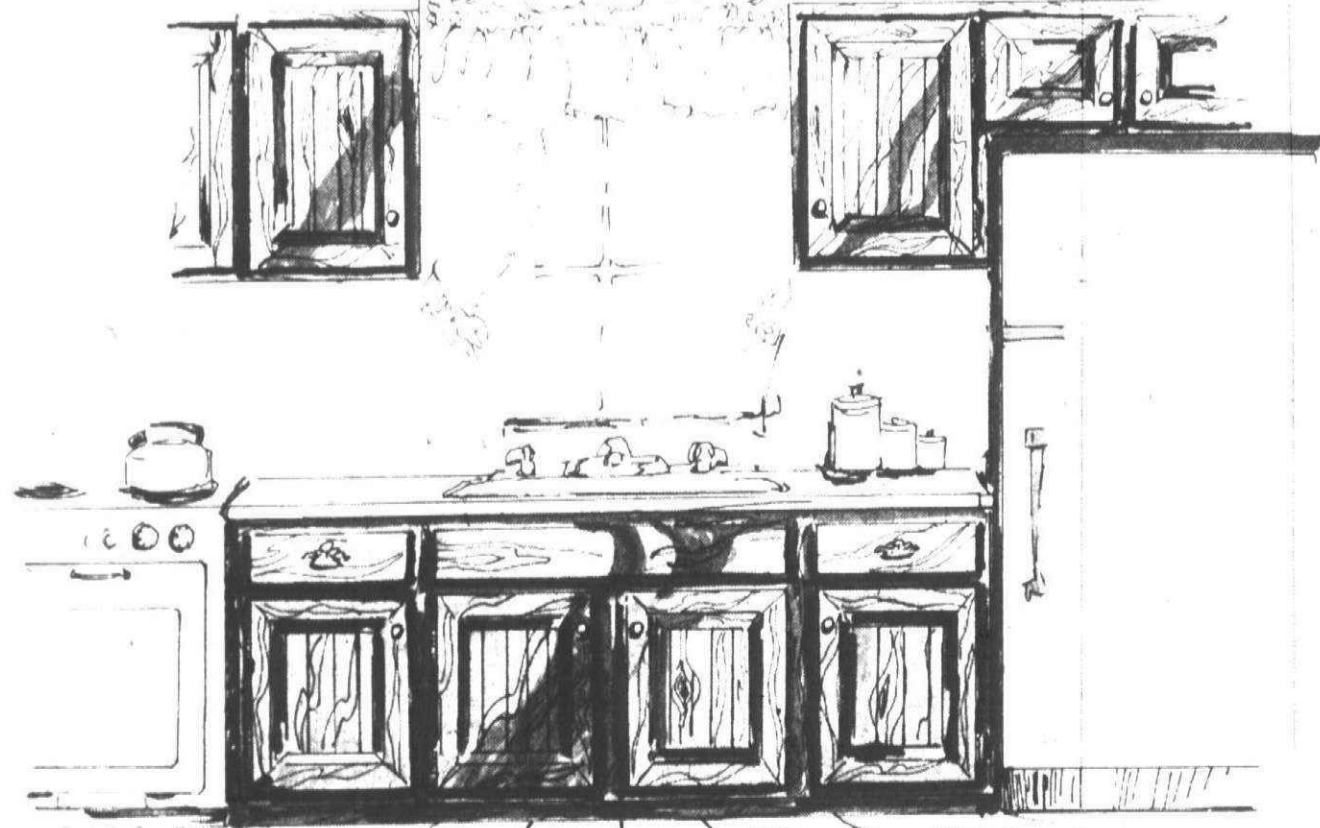

Can Rock cagers win 4th Sub-8 title?

Quite without fanfare, and from the blind side, the high school basketball season has moved on stage. Tuesday night, a Plymouth Salem team whose predecessors have lost only one of their last 29 home games over a stretch of three seasons will try to enrich that record another notch at the expense of Walled Lake Central.

There's no question but what Coach Fred Thomann's troops are in the hot seat as they go in quest of an unprecedented fourth straight Suburban Eight League championship.

As he starts his fifth season at the helm of the Rocks, Thomann calls his 13-man varsity "the best balanced squad from top to bottom that I've had here."

Even though Thomann lists Trenton, Livonia Bentley and Dearborn as the likely Sub-8 title favorites, that statement means the Rocks aren't going to relinquish their crown without putting up one whale of a fight. And that's what may make the 1976-

77 campaign one of the most interesting of all after Salem posted 15-6, 21-3, 22-3 and 20-2 records the last four years.

GONE ARE SUCH stars as all-stater Jim Ellinghausen, who holds just about every Salem scoring and rebounding record in the book, Brian Wolcott, Mike Primeau, Mark Gothard, Bob Evans and Rick Gladstone.

But from these names will come a new team which will do its best to carry on the winning heritage which has made Plymouth Salem one of the recognized powers in Michigan schoolboy basketball.

Seniors Chris DeBear, 6-3 forward; Bruce Gerish, 6-6 center; Kevin Roose, 6-2 forward; and Pat McKendry, 5-11 guard.

Juniors Tom Ellinghausen, 6-4 forward; Mike Christie, 6-0 guard; John Broderick, 6-3 forward; Steve Horton, 6-7 center; Doug Agnew, 6-2 guard; Bob Hissom, 6-3 forward; and Dave Monk, 6-2 guard.

Sophomores Rich Hewlett, 6-1 guard, and Matt Etienne, 5-10 guard.

"WE'LL BE ONE of the smallest teams in the league," said Thomann. "Trenton, Dearborn, Bentley and Edsel Ford all will average at least 6-6 across the front."

"I honestly think it's the toughest league in western Wayne County and maybe the toughest in the entire Detroit suburban area. Even though we're small, we will rely on quickness, smartness and competitive desire to come home a winner. Our kids are excellent ball handlers, the passing game will be strong, and we have some pretty good shooters."

"We know they'll all be gunning for us after winning the league three seasons in a row, but these kids won't back down from anybody. The league race may be so tight this winter that a team might win the title with three, maybe even four losses."

In Plymouth's own title years, the Rocks went 13-1, 12-2 and 13-1 again in wrapping up the 1974, 1975 and 1976 championships.

Thomann said he hopes to use all 13 members of his varsity squad in every game.

The first eight, maybe even more than that, figure to be interchangeable—that's the kind of balance of which he speaks.

"No one person dominates this squad," said the coach. Even the bottom five should get into every half for at least a minute or two as a unit. I'll try to utilize the total personnel in every game."

THERE IS ONE phase of the game in

which the lack of height of which Thomann spoke may cause a problem. Unless the Rocks have springs in their ankles, fighting for the rebounds off the offensive board may prove this team's Achilles heel—which, while it may be a terrible metaphor, may be Plymouth's major problem.

Who will Thomann start? He isn't quite ready to say. Besides, the personnel on the floor at any given time will depend on the type of attack or defense that seems to fit the demand. This is a 13-man team, not just five.

The Thomann offense is geared to movement and good, crisp passing with minimal dribbling. The theory is that men who are constantly in motion—away from the ball—make defensive anticipation extremely difficult. Thomann's four-year record at Salem of 78 victories against 14 losses indicates the theory must have some basis in fact.

Passing, cutting and screening and sharp passes on the fly are the essentials in getting the ball to the hoop, and after testing this philosophy against Walled Lake Tuesday the Rocks will invade Livonia Franklin a week hence (Nov. 30) for another non-leaguer.

Then the rugged Sub 8 scramble will start Friday, Dec. 3 with Dearborn as the foe here in Plymouth. First thing you know, all that March Madness stuff of the state tournament will be here again.

Everything—to the hard candy on the parlor table—was planned to be in keeping with the late 19th century furnishings of the room.

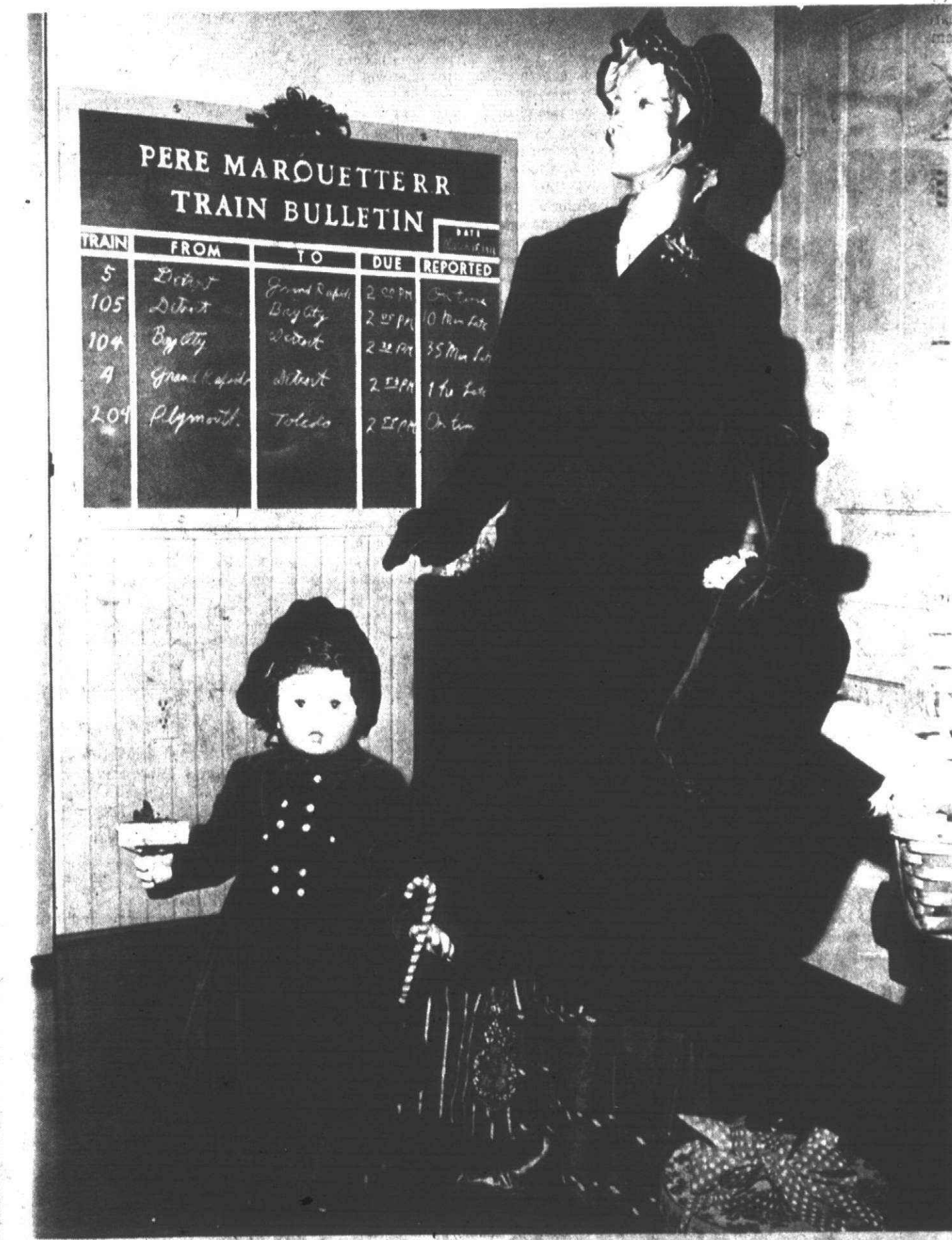

The religious display of nativity sets, toys, dolls and other religious artifacts will be on the lower level of the museum.

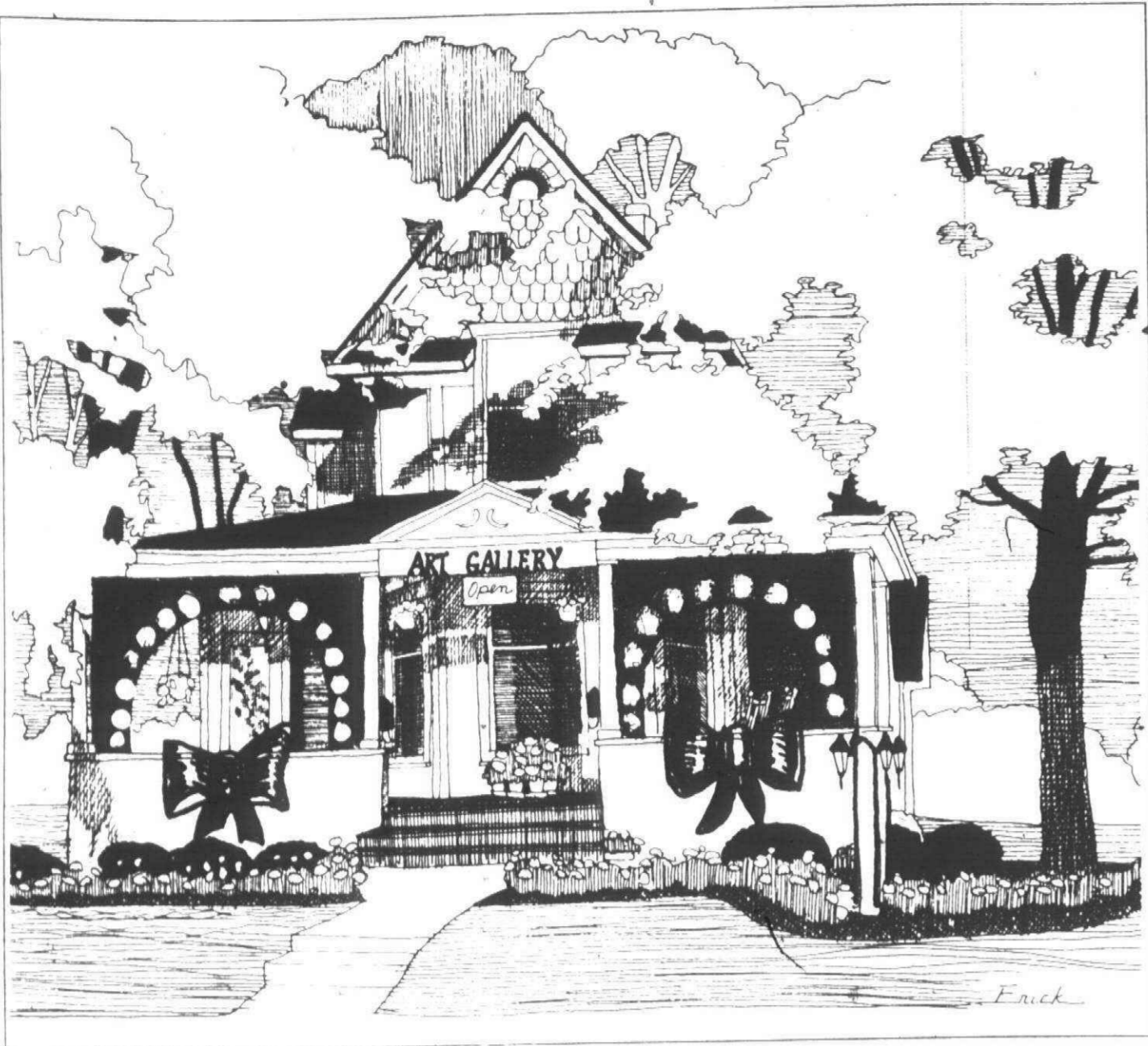


Mrs. Bruce Scott shows Mrs. Marvin VanHeest and Mrs. Robert Schwartz a sugar-frosted cluster of fruit.

PCAC aids in survey

The Plymouth Community Arts Council is assisting the Michigan Council for the Arts in a major effort to discover Michigan's artists.

Directed by the Institute for Social Research of the University of Michigan, the study involves inquiry forms that have been sent to 25,000 persons across the state. Persons engaged in music, dance, theater as well as the visual arts are being contacted.

The expected response will, for the first time, make it possible to know the artists, where they live and work, and their fields of art. The major benefit of this survey will be the establishment of a roster of artists who can be reached regularly with information which is important to them and their work.

Publication of the summary of the survey findings is expected by mid-1977. Information about the size and diversity of the arts community will be available to Michigan residents for the first time. It also will give some indication of the importance of the arts to the economic health of the state.

Since the processing of returns has started, it is urgent that persons who have received inquiries and haven't returned them do so immediately.

Persons who wish to participate but have not received the form can obtain one by contacting: Arts Survey, Plymouth Community Arts Council, 332 S. Main St., Plymouth 48170, or 455-5260.

Since its formation more than six years ago, the local arts council has brought a wide range of artists to the community. Students in the Plymouth Community School District have been exposed to culture in the form of paintings, dance, puppets, classical music and mime.

He is everywhere: giving directions to Paul Revere, George Washington, Davy Crockett, Teddy Roosevelt and is even fighting World Wars I and II. Magoo's adventures cover more than three centuries of American history—from Leif Erickson's voyage to the astronauts trip to the moon. And, while the facts as Magoo presents them may be stretched out of shape a bit, there's no doubt that the film's emphasis is on fun for the whole family.

"Uncle Sam Magoo" will be shown at 2 and 4 p.m. Nov. 26, 27 and 28 in the Museum Theater.

Rock band will play

The Lynrd Skynrd rock band will appear in Detroit at Ford Auditorium on Dec. 7.

Skyndrd will be performing essentially the same set the band recorded live at Atlanta's Fox Theatre last July, released as a two-record set on MCA titled "One More from the Road."

The "guitar army" of Skyndrd has been bolstered by the addition of Steve Gaines to the already heavy artillery of Allen Collins and Gary Rossington, who is performing on the current tour while recovering from injuries suffered in an automobile accident over Labor Day weekend.
