Board acts to shore up sagging civil service law

First steps toward re-enacting a valid civil service ordinance for Canton Township employees were taken Tuesday night when Trustee Eugene Daley introduced an ordinance to replace the law which was found invalid last year.

The proposed ordinance, which township board members unanimously tabled until attorney George Ward meets with them next week provides for the hiring, firing and promotion of all regular full-time employees who are not elected officials or the single assistant of an elected official.

Daley said portions of the ordinance were taken from the Michigan civil service statute, the Livonia civil service ordinance and a proposed merit system ordinance drafted by Ward.

ALTHOUGH THE PROPOSED ordinance was officially introduced to board members Tuesday night, Clerk John Flodin expects the law will not go into effect until next year. Final wording of the document must be worked out, and voters must approve the proposed ordinance at the polls, Flodin said it probably won't ap-

pear on the ballot until next August when the township's primary election is scheduled.

"For something like this, we want to make sure we have a good voter turnout," the clerk said.

Once the ordinance is approved, township employees will work under a valid civil service law for the first time since 1972.

The 1972 ordinance was assumed valid until last October, when Wayne Circuit Judge Joseph B. Sullivan dismissed a lawsuit regarding the township's reserve police. In dismissing a motion to place all members of the reserve department under civil service, Sullivan noted that the 1972 civil service ballot question referred to the wrong section of the Michigan Constitution.

Attorney Ward issued a similar opinion: "Instead of voters passing a specific civil service ordinance, they only voted on an advisory question as to whether or not the township should have a merit system," he said.

At the time, township board members promised to retain the merit system improperly established by the 1972 vote. Last June, board members voted to use the employee testing services offered by the Michigan Municipal League until a valid civil service ordinance is adopted.

UNDER THE PROPOSED ordinance, all applicants seeking civil service jobs with the township are required to take competitive examinations. Testing is also used in the promotion of employees.

Full-time police officers are required to score high marks on competitive examinations as well as psychological and physical fitness tests.

The proposed ordinance creates a three-member merit system commission to oversee the hiring, promotion and discipline of township employees. The commission would have the power to approve, modify or revoke an order from the township administration to fire a worker.

The township supervisor would appoint one member of the commission with township board approval. Paid full-time employees would appoint the second member, while the first two members of the commission would appoint a third member.

Flodin believes establishment of civil service procedures is particularly important for a municipality where the administration can change every two years.

"I think the ordinance should protect employees from the volatility of the political scene," he said. "I wouldn't want any new administration to come in and fire all the employees."

County certifies results of recall

The Wayne County Board of Commissioners Tuesday certified the results of Canton's recall election without changing any of the vote totals.

The certified results of Saturday's election show 2,119 residents voted to keep Supervisor Harold Stein in office, while 2,020 voted to oust him. Treasurer Anne Bradley received a vote of confidence from 2,086 residents and a recall vote from 2,020. Only 2,030 residents voted in favor of Trustee Eugene Daley, while 2,015 cast votes against him.

An addition error on election night showed Stein received only 2,010 recall votes, according to township Clerk John Flodin. Actually, Stein remains in office by a 99-vote margin—not the 109-vote margin previously reported.

According to Joe Martina, Wayne County director of elections, no one had filed a petition for a recount of the election results by Tuesday.

Under state law, residents must file a recount petition by Monday—within six days of the election's certification.

Recall leader Lynn LaBell said she "doubted" whether her group would file a recount petition. If it does, only a recount of Daley's vote would be requested.

"Mr. Daley won by just 15 votes, but we don't know if we want to put everyone through a recount," she said. "We're not poor losers. We don't feel any hanky-panky went on in the election, and we don't want to create any more disturbances for the township."

Under state law, the township board of canvassers must certify the results of Saturday's proposition to establish a special assessment district for police. The issue passed by a 73-vote margin.

Canton Clerk John Flodin expected the township board of canvassers to meet Wednesday.

EMU's power boost will bump CEP radio station

If you plan on listening to a high school football game or a school board meeting on WSDP this fall, you might run into some problems finding the station.

That's because the student-operated radio station at the Centennial Educational Park is changing FM frequencies and will not begin broadcasting until early October.

The reason for the inconvenience is a move made by Eastern Michigan University to boost its power output. Eastern's radio station, WEMU, is moving from 88.1 to 89.5 on the FM dial to accommodate a power increase to 15,000 watts.

Ever since its beginning in 1972, WSDP has maintained its spot at 89.3 on the FM dial. WEMU's new frequency, however, is so close to WSDP's (89.5 and 89.3) that the CEP radio station would be unable to overcome the interference.

So at EMU's request, WSDP will move to its new location at 88.1 on the FM dial, which was WEMU's old frequency. The local radio station's output will remain at 10 watts.

"THE MOVE IS a little inconvenient for us because we will miss most of the football season," said Jeff Cardinal, school coordinator of WSDP. "But this will in no way hurt our chances of receiving federal funds although we'll be at the end of the FM dial."

Cardinal has set a target date of Oct. 3 for WSDP's first broadcast, two weeks behind its normal mid-September start. If the radio station is unable to begin by early October, "then we'll go on our old frequency," Cardinal said.

The reason for the delay is shipping problems with the RCA and official paperwork that must be filed with the Federal Communications Commission.

To complete the switch in frequencies, WSDP needs its transmitter returned, along with a new crystal and antenna. These parts normally take 2-3 months to deliver, Cardinal said, but they have top priority at RCA and should be sent within the next month.

EMU is financing the cost of the frequency transition to WSDP, Cardinal said. He expects the final tab to run "just over \$4,000." The price tag includes equipment, promotional costs and printing charges for new stationery.

"THIS MEANS WE'RE going to have to run a rather large promotional campaign to let people know we're changing frequencies. Along with that, we'd like to get the community involved in our programming and encourage more public input," Cardinal said.

The restrictions in power engineering that handcuffed WEMU at 88.1 will not affect WSDP, Cardinal said. "At our new frequency, there's still room to grow. I checked into it engineering-wise and found we're not locked in at 10 watts forever."

Most precincts opted for recall

If the electoral college method of counting ballots was used in local elections, Canton Supervisor Harold Stein, Treasurer Anne Bradley and Trustee Eugene Daley would have been ousted in last Saturday's recall election.

Although the Stein slate squeaked in by a slim majority, only seven of the township's 17 precincts—including absentees—voted to support the slate's continued tenure in office.

Much of the slate's support came from precincts two and 15, located in the predominately rural southern third of the township where Stein lives. The few subdivision precincts that voted against the recall opted for Stein, Bradley and Daley in last November's election.

Most of the precincts that sided with the recall movement were subdivision strongholds of anti-Stein sentiment in last November's supervisory election.

WITH ONLY 28 1/2 per cent of the township's registered voters showing up at the polls last Saturday, the election results support a contention of the recall committee that Stein and his teammates lack a clear voter mandate from the majority of township residents.

Last November, Stein captured the supervisor's seat from incumbent Robert Greenstein and Republican Peter Bundarin by winning only 38 per cent of the total votes cast.

Bradley won the treasurer's job by garnering 40 per cent of the vote, and Daley beat incumbent Jim Poole for a trustee's seat by only 11 votes.

Saturday, a majority of only 99 residents voted to keep Stein in office. Bradley kept her job by a 66-vote margin, while Daley held onto his trustee seat by only 15 votes.

An examination of Saturday's precinct-by-precinct election results

shows that Stein failed to win the support of residential areas that opted for Greenstein or Bundarin last November.

Strong recall sentiment came from precincts seven and 12, bounded by Joy, Warren, Lilley and Sheldon, where Greenstein won almost twice as many votes as Stein last November.

Voters in precincts four and 13, bounded by Warren, Ford, Lilley and Sheldon, gave a substantial victory to Bundarin last fall. The majority of those voters sided with the recall movement.

FOR THE MOST part, subdivision residents opted for the slate's recall.

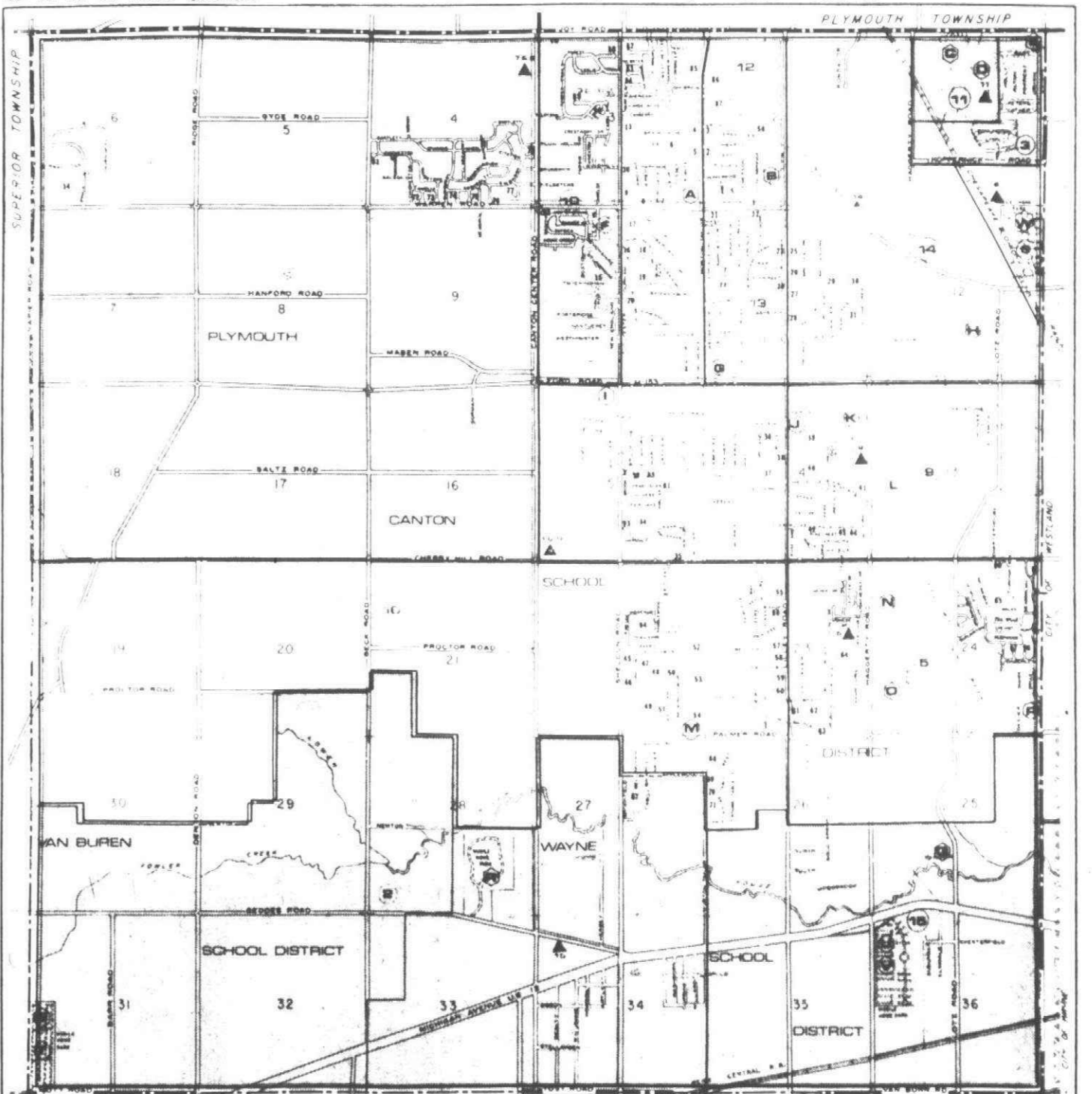
Exceptions were Holiday Park Subdivision and nearby apartments at the township's northeastern corner, Royal Holiday Mobile Home Park and the residential area between Joy, Ford, Canton Center and Sheldon. Those precincts chose the Stein slate over other candidates last fall. Three of the four precincts have a small number of registered voters.

In the predominately rural precinct eight, the recall vote was a draw. Residents opted to keep Stein but out Bradley and Daley. Votes from Sunflower Village Subdivision, where recall leader Lynn LaBell lives apparently balanced the pro-Stein votes from rural residents.

The same is apparently true of precinct 16, where rural and subdivision votes gave a narrow edge to the recall drive.

Some of Stein's support came from absentee ballots. About 73 per cent of the total 276 votes cast said Stein should stay in office.

Although the slate took only seven of the township's 17 precincts, voter turnout in the pro-Stein areas was not greater than in areas favoring the recall drive.

Plymouth's puzzle

How to grow when there's no room

If you ever have wondered how a city could get along with no room for residential growth or industrial expansion and a city commission that was concerned about high-rise buildings, you would have to look no further than the City of Plymouth for an answer.

Locked in a two-square mile area there is little room to move with the result that only four new homes were built within the city limits in the year ending July 1.

There possibly are no other cities with so low a rate of new residential growth. Sure, if you saunter out into the township you'll note all sorts of

residential construction. There seems to be no end to it. But in the city—virtually nothing.

It is the same with industry. There is no room for expansion and there are rumors that some of the industries now within the city limits are pondering a decision to move.

What then is happening?

DURING THE PAST year along with the four new homes, there was a considerable amount of renovating of old buildings. Penniman Avenue and Ann Arbor Trail are fine examples.

Around the city 10 units were rehabilitated and alterations were made

on 100 others in the residential sector. In the commercial sector about 100 units were improved along with 14 in the industrial areas.

With this meager residential growth and no room for industry to bolster the tax base, how does the city get along financially to meet its current budget of nearly \$2.8 million?

The answer is found of all places, in the business area with the city's hotel—the Mayflower—and Hendrie's Convalescent Center.

These two have joined the list of the 10 largest taxpayers in the city. And the improvements planned for them will lift them high up on the list. Here are the top 10 at the moment:

Western Electric Corporation—\$4,829,110.

Packaging Corporation of America—\$2,381,980.

Bathery Manufacturing Company—\$1,583,160.

Dunn Steel Products Div—\$1,508,780.

Stahl Manufacturing Company—\$1,008,460.

Detroit Edison Co.—\$972,680.

Ralph and Mabel Lorenz (Mayflower properties)—\$921,950.

Hendrie Convalescent Center—\$787,970.

Consumers Power Company—\$775,030.

Adstra Corporation—\$753,900.

The rise of two commercial establishments to a place among the top 10 taxpayers is unusual. Traditionally, it is industry that furnishes the greater part of the tax base for the cost of city government and schools.

And if the trend of some of the industries to move continues, the two commercial contributors, The Mayflower and Hendrie's—could jump to fifth and sixth place, or even higher.

And if the planned condominium for the downtown section is approved it certainly will be among the top 10 on the tax rolls.

Ordinarily when such crowded conditions as exist in Plymouth are met the government would bow to the old theory "there is no place to go but up."

But not in Plymouth. Several high-rise projects have been voted down and there once was a rule on the books that no building could be higher than 1½ times the width of the street it faced.

With the absence of room for growth and the frowning on high-rise buildings, the burden on the taxpayers becomes heavier and heavier. That's why if you wonder what happens in a city with no room for expansion—either residential or industrial—you couldn't find a better example than the City of Plymouth.

Schoolcraft labor talks deadlocked

A state mediator will be on hand between the Schoolcraft College Association of Office Personnel (SCOAP) and the college.

Leo Cadwell of the Michigan Department of Labor Employee Relations of fee will act as mediator. Cadwell has had no previous contact with either party.

The members of the office personnel group have been working without a contract since June 1. They had threatened a job action had no progress been made by Aug. 25. That day both sides agreed to bring in the mediator.

According to David Heinzman, a spokesman for the five-district community college, the deadlock still hinges on the salary issue and health insurance provisions.

The Schoolcraft College negotiating team maintains that it is offering a 14 per cent package over two years. They said the SCOAP team is demanding a 24 per cent package over two years. SCOAP representatives, however, said the college is only offering what amounts to a two per cent increase in each of the two years.

The college is offering wage step increases in excess of seven per cent, up from present five per cent increase levels.

The college is also asking the group's members to share the cost of health insurance by paying 25 per cent of each annual premium. The school would pay the remainder.

SCOAP officials said they are

among lowest paid Schoolcraft employees and that they could not afford the added expense. The group also complained that they would be the only campus bargaining group to share the health insurance expense.

Schoolcraft College officials said, however, that health insurance premiums will be bargaining topics when the other groups' contracts come up for negotiation.

Labor begins on Sept. 6

Plymouth-Canton school board members will get right back to work the day after Labor Day with a workshop at 7:30 p.m. Tuesday evening, Sept. 6.

In a public meeting in the board offices at 454 S. Harcoy, trustees will tackle four topics of immediate concern to Plymouth-Canton Community Schools. The workshop will be in the second floor board room.

On the agenda for the study meeting are disposition of school property, high school graduation requirements, free musical instruments for sixth graders, and special problems of education.

The board and school administration are seeking ways to meet the needs of students whose education could be furthered by some form of special assistance. A number of different approaches are being investigated and may be discussed at the workshop.

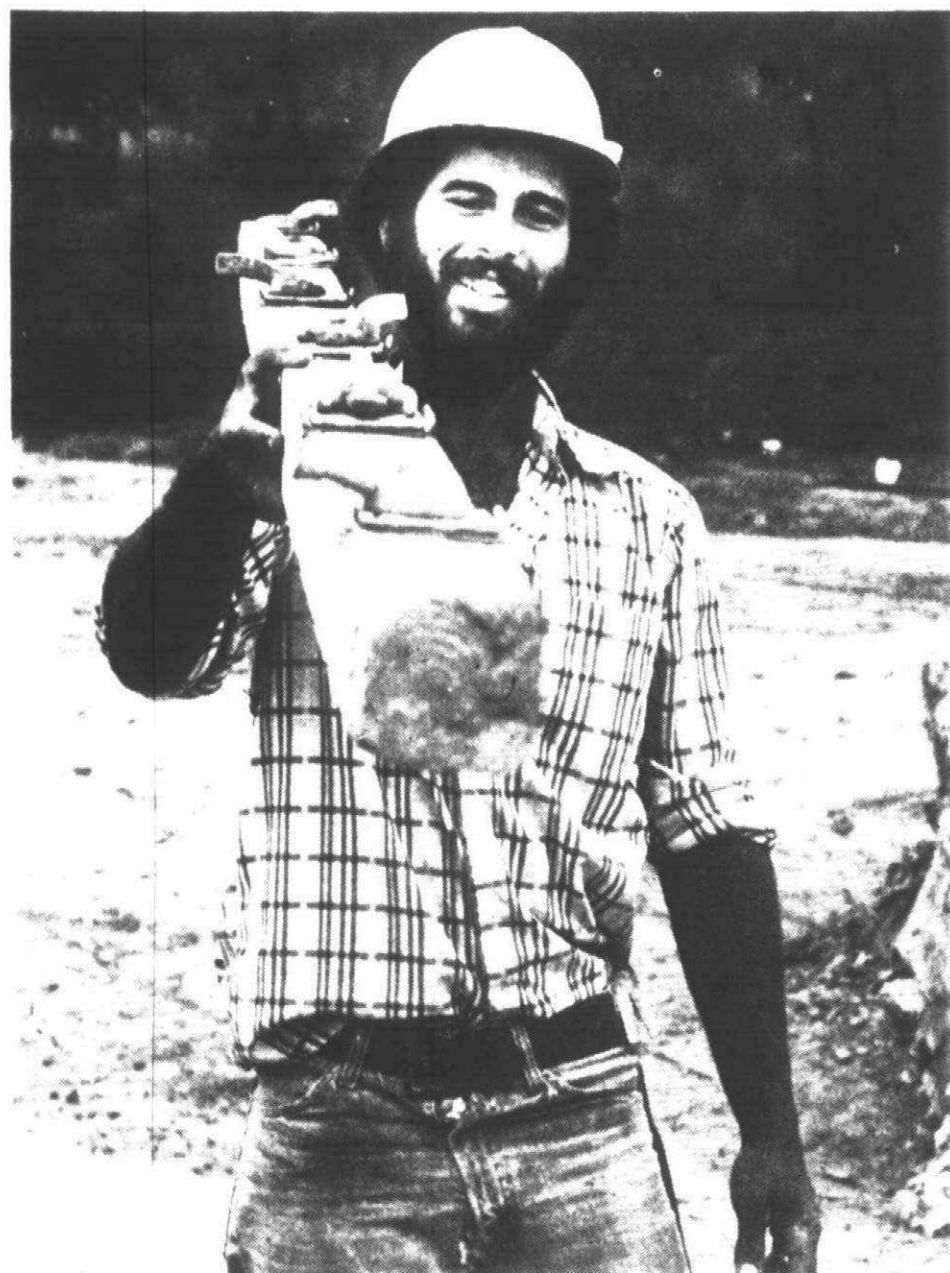

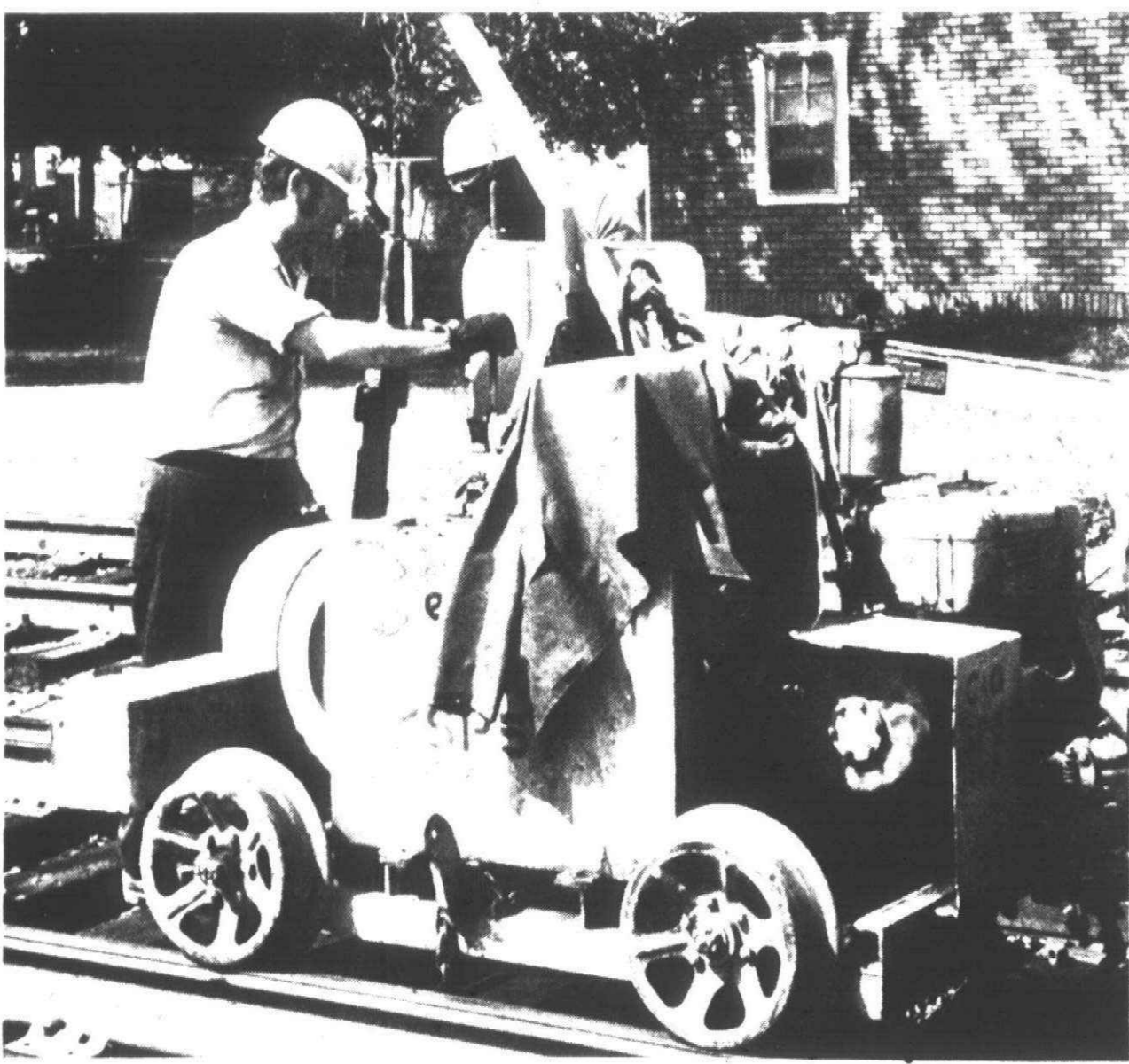

Davis chosen as board member

Carol Davis was sworn-in Tuesday as the newest member of the Plymouth-Canton Board of Education—an anti-climatic, official ceremony following the previous night's balloting.

It took four ballots Monday night before the six school trustees chose Mrs. Davis as the replacement for Marcia Borowski, who resigned and moved to Atlanta, Ga., where her husband has accepted a faculty position with Emory University.

Some 12 persons had applied for the vacancy and were interviewed by the board prior to Monday night's special meeting. Nominated for the post were Elaine Kirchgatter, Barbara Leffler, Barbara Olson, Lynn Cole and Mrs. Davis.

Mrs. Davis won on the fourth ballot with a 4-2 vote. Voting for her were Tom Yaek, Joe Gray, Richard Arlen and Steve Harper. Flossie Tonda and George Lawton voted for Mrs. Kirchgatter.

MRS. DAVIS of 11750 Parkview Drive, Plymouth, earned her bachelor's degree from Adrian College and taught high school English and drama in Northlake, Ill., before moving here.

"When I became a parent, I became a volunteer interested in education," she said.

She has served Plymouth-Canton Community Schools as a member of the Curriculum Coordinating Committee (CCC), Citizen's Advisory Committee (CAC), millage election committees, and as an alternate to the safety committee. At the time of her selection, Mrs. Davis was a member of the steering committee for the gifted.

She also is a school communicator representing Allen Elementary. In Allen, she is a member of the PTO

Board, a volunteer library mother, and a picture lady. During the past school year, she wrote the school newsletter for Allen.

"I have discovered in serving on these various committees that I enjoy working with members of the administration and in learning more about our school district," Mrs. Davis told the trustees.

"I can contribute to the board by being a member who is available for meetings and who has time to read all the information board members receive. I have experience as a board member and understand how a board works."

"I appreciate the opportunity to serve the school district as a board member and help set policies which will make our schools great places for children to be."

BEFORE THE BALLOTING, Yaek, as acting board president expressed his appreciation to the 12 persons who had applied for the position.

"The community and board are

gratified with the response we had to the board seat vacated by Marcia Borowski. I for one, can rest assured that whoever is named will be a well-qualified individual whom the electorate can trust."

Yaek then opened the floor for nominations. Each trustee could make a nomination and votes were cast until one candidate received a majority of four votes.

Arlen opened the proceedings by nominating Mrs. Leffler. Gray nominated Mrs. Davis and Lawton nominated Mrs. Kirchgatter. Mrs. Tonda nominated Lynn Cole and Arlen nominated Mrs. Olson. In the first vote Mrs. Davis drew votes from Gray, Yaek and Harper with Mrs. Tonda and Lawton voting for Mrs. Kirchgatter, Arlen voted for Mrs. Leffler.

On the second ballot, Tonda nominated Kirchgatter. Gray nominated Davis, and Arlen nominated Olson. Harper, Yaek, Gray voted for Davis, Lawton-Tonda for Kirchgatter, and Arlen for Olson.

On the third ballot, Lawton nomi-

nated Kirchgatter. Gray nominated Davis, and Tonda nominated Leffler. The vote was 3-3 with Lawton, Harper, Tonda for Kirchgatter and Gray, Yaek, Arlen for Davis.

The fourth ballot told the story with Tonda nominating Kirchgatter, and Gray nominating Davis. Lawton, Tonda stuck with Kirchgatter but the other four voted for Davis. She won with Harper switching his vote from the third ballot along with Arlen's vote who hadn't opted for either of the two front-runners until the third ballot.

The appointment is effective immediately.

"I'd like to thank all of the candidates for showing interest and hope we have this kind of interest come our next school board election in June," concluded Yaek.

The board will reorganize at the Sept. 12 meeting when the seven trustees will select a board president. Ms. Borowski had been elected board president at the organizational meeting last July.

Despite millage OK Time needed to expand P.D.

The need for immediate funds and testing of patrolmen may block expansion of the now part-time Canton Police Department into a 24-hour force until sometime this fall or winter.

Although voters Saturday approved a proposition to establish a special assessment district for police, Chief Walter MacGregor says township officials need time to start the expansion process.

The tax levy and budget for an expanded police department must first be set, and salaries for full-time patrolmen have to be determined. The Michigan Municipal League must screen and test all applicants for the full-time jobs before any hiring can begin.

"To positively tell you that everything will go zip, zip, zip, would be preposterous of me," MacGregor said. "It's possible that it will be Jan. 1 before we can go full-time."

TOWNSHIP BOARD members Tuesday took the first step toward expanding the police department by scheduling the first of two public hearings on the police millage for 7:30 p.m. on Tuesday, Sept. 13 in the township firehall.

Board members cannot set the tax rate for police until both public hearings are held.

Although officials can legally levy up to 10 mills for police, board members have already placed a two-mill ceiling (\$2 per \$1000 of state equalized value) on the first-year tax levy.

MacGregor has used the two-mill figure—or the \$20,000 two mills will raise—to formulate a proposed budget for the 24-hour department. The budget would finance the chief's \$21,000 salary as well as salaries for three sergeants and a yet undetermined number of patrolmen.

"Suppose people at the public hearings say they don't want two mills, and all we can get is one mill," MacGregor said. "Then my budget has to be torn up, and I have to start all over again."

ALTHOUGH MONEY from the police millage will not materialize until tax bills are sent out Dec. 1, Clerk John Flodin says township officials could expand the police department at an earlier date by borrowing money from the general fund or selling tax anticipation notes.

"But the first thing we have to do is study what direction we're going with the department," Flodin said.

"This is a very important step. I'm all for getting a 24-hour police department as quickly as possible as long as we think the whole thing out first."

Canton woman is found dead

The nude and battered body of a woman found last Saturday on the grounds of a Detroit elementary school was identified Monday as Judith G. Wing, 27, of Canton.

Detroit Police refused to divulge any information about the specifics of her death. Sgt. Roy Awe, who is assigned to the case, said they had a suspect and hoped to obtain a warrant soon. He also said he was investigating the possibility that the woman was sexually assaulted.

According to Wayne County Sheriff's deputies, Ms. Wing was reported

missing by her mother last Saturday.

Her body was found at 11:10 a.m. Saturday at Marsh Elementary School on the west side of Detroit. Cause of death was reportedly several blows to the head with a blunt object. She was identified by her fingerprints, police said.

Funeral services for Ms. Wing were held Wednesday at the Harry J. Will Funeral Home in Redford. She was buried in Glen Eden Cemetery in Livonia.

Ms. Wing was divorced and the mother of two young children.

Job skills for adults offered

Special emphasis on career education for adults is being built into the fall program of the continuing and community education department of Plymouth-Canton Community Schools.

The Real Estate class begins Sept. 20 for 15 weeks (total 60 hours) for a fee of \$50 in Canton Room 120 from 6:30-8:30 p.m. Tuesdays-Thursdays.

These one semester credit courses are designed to allow for a concentrated effort during one evening per week: Auto body, Canton V.06, 6:30-10:30 p.m. Wednesdays, \$42; welding, Mondays, 6:30-10:30 p.m., \$42.

Also scheduled this fall is a full schedule of classes for persons wanting to obtain their high school diploma. The offerings include auto body, bookkeeping, communication, family living, reading improvement, shorthand, auto body, small gas engines,

typing, welding, auto mechanics, English, government, minorities, international relations, psychology, American history, GED prep, math, speed reading and comprehension, wood-working, literature appreciation and machine shop.

RUNNING INTO SOME car trouble, the other couple arrived 20 minutes late.

Monge, not wanting to miss the first couple of innings, hurried down to the stadium where he found all the gates but one closed.

"I was starting to get mad," said Monge. "Every time we got into one line, they'd start pushing us towards Gate 11. By that time I gave up on seeing the first few innings."

Monge proceeded to get in line at Gate 11, trying to figure out why all the other gates were closed.

Reaching the gate, Monge handed the usher his four tickets, whereupon a man in a business suit quickly collared them and began congratulating the dumbfounded Monge.

"I didn't know what was going on," Monge said. "All I knew was that I had three people with me and some guy just grabbed my tickets. And all this guy does is start congratulating me for being the one-millionth fan for 1977. Then he hands me \$20 for my tickets and says he has better seats for me. Hell, I didn't trust him. I told my buddy to keep an eye on him."

Monge says the man then took them to "fantastic box seats" right over the dugout and asked Monge to accompany him up to his office.

"I still didn't trust this guy," laughed Monge. "He knew it too. So he hands me this letter and says 'if you don't believe me, Joe, maybe this will help convince you.' The letter said 'congratulations, you are the one-millionth fan at Tiger Stadium for 1977 and you have been awarded a portable TV, an AM-FM radio and two season tickets for the 1978 season.' I couldn't believe it. Nothing like that had ever happened to me. To top it off, he brings me out a box of souve-

nirs. Autographed balls, bats, pennants, just everything. It was a hell of a deal."

MONGE WAS THEN told he should listen for a PA announcement right after the third inning.

"When it came on it was unreal," said Monge. "People were yelling and applauding me when I stood up. It was just weird hearing it over the PA. I'm not a shy guy, just a sort of take-the-money-and-run kind of person."

The surprises were not over for Monge.

When he went downstairs with his wife to get a beer, a man came up and offered to buy him a beer for "the kid on the way."

The Monges are awaiting the arrival of their first child.

"I kept telling him no, trying not to create a scene," Monge said. "But he kept insisting. So he walks right up to the counter and orders four beers. Now right away I know this guy is somebody important, because the rules say you're only allowed to draw two beers. We thanked him, and that was it."

Healthy eyes most vital need for back to school

Getting the kids ready for school seems like a never ending schedule of shopping trips and appointments. New shoes, haircuts, dentists and physicals. Time is often short in this busy autumn season and some of these appointments end up being postponed or ignored.

One appointment that usually is not even included is the complete visual analysis or eye examination by a vision specialist.

And that one, says a Farmington Hills optometrist, really should not be ignored.

Most families follow the practice of having regular dental and physical examinations, and if such appointments are neglected, an ache or pain usually warns us that something is wrong, pointed out Dr. Ronald C. Gluskin.

"Eyes seldom complain, but they do change, especially young eyes," added the specialist in the field of pediatric vision care. "Today eye care is more important than ever before, because many of today's activities require close range vision from eyes that were created for distance seeing."

NINETY PER CENT of what our children learn in school is accomplished through the use of their eyes, according to Dr. Gluskin.

"If these two most necessary school supplies are not in good working order all school work could and often does suffer," he went on.

Dr. Gluskin, who has been an optometrist for 20 years, said the most often heard cry from parents who bring their children to him with specific complaints is "But I did get their eyes examined!"

However, after the pre-exam history is taken, it becomes obvious that what the well-meaning parents thought was a complete eye examination was actually only a screening done by a board of health technician or the not-too-reliable Snellen Chart used in routine physical examinations.

Dr. Gluskin agrees that each of these procedures is fine as far as it goes. He maintains, however, that the danger lies in the assumption that passing these simple tests indicates that those who take them have healthy eyes and good vision.

All too often people with different

degrees of near-sightedness, far-sightedness, astigmatism, or amblyopia (lazy eye) can pass these screenings. Only through complete visual analysis can many of these defects be discovered and corrected.

POOR GRADES can be an indication of vision problems, Dr. Gluskin said. He finds that a large percentage of the children in his practice who are low achievers and many of these who are labeled "troublemakers" improve markedly in school after correction of vision problems with glasses or contact lenses.

"Children who cannot see properly are easily bored, distracted and discouraged by poor performance in school," he went on.

"Children should have complete eye examinations at least once a year throughout their school years. We would not expect them to start school without books, or paper or pencils.

"Yet we unintentionally 'blindfold' our children and send them off to school without the most important of school supplies, two healthy eyes in good working order."

Boats along Rouge may be banned

A prohibition on motorboating on the Middle Rouge River chain of lakes is a step closer to reality.

The rules, proposed by Wayne County Marine Officer Fred Reiman Jr., got support Tuesday in a public hearing attended by a representative of the Michigan United Conservation Clubs and a state legislator.

Roger L. Wood, hearings executive for the state Department of Natural Resources, estimated it would take three to four months for the rules to complete the rest of their legal hurdles—approval by a joint legislative committee, the governor and the Wayne County Board of Commissioners.

THE OUTLAWING of motorboating would apply to Phoenix, Wilcox, Newburgh and Nankin lakes in Plymouth, Livonia and Westland.

It would not apply, however, to Waterford Pond, upstream in Northville Township. "That lake has little usage

because it's in private ownership, and the owner has no plans to develop it," said Lt. Reiman.

George Thompson, the MUCC representative, said the conservation club had no objection to the rules.

Thompson's questioning brought out that the rules would apply not only to gasoline-powered inboards and outboards but to small, electric, trolling motors as well.

Allowing electric motors, said Wood, "would invite difficulty—such as prop damage to swimmers."

STATE REP. Tom Brown (D-Westland) noted that none of the one to five annual drownings on the Rouge chain had been attributable to motorboats. But he supported the rules anyway, saying, "It should have been prohibited a long time ago."

Lt. Reiman and Edwin Mika of the Wayne County parks department said there is little motorboat activity on the lakes—so far. But they expect more interest as the lakes are cleaned

up and as high gasoline prices prompt boaters to seek recreation closer to home.

Already the lakes—particularly Newburgh, the largest—are attracting sailboaters, they said.

Mika could not be specific, however, about when further recreation development might take place.

Newburgh Lake has a new fishing dock, and there has been some minor channeling on Phoenix. But the efforts of former State Sen. (now Congressman) Carl Pursell to get a \$1 million dredging and cleanup were stymied by recession budget cuts and the lack of any Rouge-area legislators on appropriations committees in Lansing.

MIKA SAID the parks department supported the proposed rules because "the lakes are small, they're not good for body contact (swimming, wading, water skiing), and motors would cause wave action which would erode the shoreline."

Reiman said that while it is widely

assumed motorboats are prohibited, his search of legal rules showed that "as it stands we have nothing to prohibit a 75-horsepower motorboat."

The rule could be waived for such special uses as biological researchers and water samplers. A waiver would have to be granted by both the DNR Lt. Reiman (on behalf of Wayne County) because those agencies share jurisdiction of the Rouge.

Tuesday's one-hour hearing in Westland City Hall was lightly attended—two MUCC members, Rep. Brown, a DNR officer, Reiman's wife and one working newsman.

Wood said the record would be kept open 10 days for additional written testimony either for or against the rules as proposed. If any amendments are written, another local hearing would be conducted, he said.

Death stirs up tandem-trailer rig controversy

The crash and explosion of a double-bottom tanker in Southfield has stirred a long-smoldering controversy over the safety of the gargantuan vehicles.

The death of 23-year-old Mary Rish in a blaze which sent flames streaming 300 feet into the night sky has focused new light on the giant tandem-trailer rigs and the competency of their drivers.

Although this was one of the more spectacular incidents, accidents involving double-bottoms and other tankers are not uncommon. Between September, 1976 and February, 1977 there were more than 30 tanker accidents in Michigan, according to the latest statistics available. Seventeen were directly attributable to vehicle defects

or driving error, said a spokesman for the Automobile Club of Michigan.

The tandem-tankers are valued for their tight-cornering capabilities and excellent maneuverability in tight spaces.

The Michigan Trucking Association maintains the accident rate for the big double-bottoms is "no better or no worse" than for other trucks which ply the state's roads. Nevertheless, governmental plans are in the works to improve the competency of the drivers. Others have talked of making the vehicles themselves safer.

"They're top heavy. Once you put weight above a certain point they become prone to tipping over," said the AAA spokesman. He added that the two trailers are very hard to control in "panic situations."

Guidelines drawn up by the Michigan Public Service Commission (PSC) and recently forwarded to the state legislature, have focused on improving the caliber of drivers. "The question of our authority boils down to the quality of those people who are going to operate the vehicles," said Hugh Roach, director of PSC staff services.

UNDER PRESENT POLICY, any one who can obtain a chauffeur's license is eligible to drive a double-bottom tanker. The guidelines which are being reviewed by the legislative bureaucracy specifies several marked changes.

Tanker drivers would have to be at least 21 years of age and would have to have a minimum of 3,000 hours of experience driving commercial vehicles weighing more than 40,000 pounds.

Prospective drivers would also be required to complete an additional 60 hours of on-the-road training in a double-bottom tanker.

The AAA spokesman said several drivers involved in the 30 tanker accidents had had their licenses suspended at some time in their careers and that a number had also accumulated between 14 and 27 driving points in a five-year period.

"Only two drivers did not receive a traffic citation in the past five years," he said.

"This is not to say," he added, "that all drivers are untrained. But there was a great deal of driver error—improper lane usage, for example—involved in the accidents."

SOME PUBLIC OFFICIALS say that the PSC-proposed regulations fail to go far enough and have hinted that they would like to see the lumbering tandem rigs banned from Michigan's roads, altogether.

Thirty-five states allow the double-bottoms to roll on their roads. Jack McNamara, director of the Michigan Trucking Association, said that even

though some states are putting up legislative roadblocks, there has never been a state which has allowed the tandems to roll and then rescinded the privilege.

Democratic Floor Leader Joseph Forbes (D-Oak Park) wrote to one of his constituents that he was pursuing "all expeditious action to get double-bottom tankers off the highways."

House Speaker Bobby Crim (D-Davison) said, "I know they're unsafe. Other states have made them do things, all kinds of things to improve safety. I don't know whether it means stricter rules or whether it means taking them off the road."

The PSC guidelines, which supposedly have been in preparation since the legislature voted the commission that authority in 1974, have also been referred to a special house subcommittee headed by Rep. Francis Spaniola (D-Corunna). Brandv Eskelson, assistant to the subcommittee, said a number of committee members, including Spaniola, felt the regulations failed to go far enough.

She said Spaniola will introduce a bill to require inspection of new and used trailers at time of purchase and the creation of code which will identify the tanker's contents.

This would aid fire fighters and would help police evacuate nearby persons if a tanker should ever collide, overturn or spill, she said.

Ms. Eskelson added that the subcommittee was also considering recommending banning the tandem-tanker rigs from freeways during peak traffic hours. It had abandoned notions of barring them from expressways altogether, because it felt was safer to have them there than on the state's secondary roads.

IN THE WAKE OF a rash of tanker accidents, critics have chided the legislature for neglecting the problem. However, in 1973 the legislature gave that responsibility to the PSC. Only four years later have the guidelines been forthcoming.

Crim, who has campaigned for the regulations, said, "Why it has taken the PSC more than 3½ from the time the legislature gave them the authority to issue the guidelines is a diffi-

cult thing for me to understand."

After several inquiries to the commission, Crim said he had been assured of expeditious action. "I began to wonder about the 'expeditious' action," he concluded.

Roach, one of the persons who helped draft the PSC guidelines,

blamed "governmental lethargy" for the commission's lack of action. He

added that no one associated with the project could explain why it took so long to get the wheel turning because they had all been hired on recently to complete several "high priority" projects.

Canton resident dies in shootout

Canton resident Norbert Szczygiel, a 29-year-old Dearborn policeman, died Saturday from a gunshot wound he received Aug. 24 in a shootout outside a Dearborn bar.

Mushin Hussin, 53, of 15771 Iliad, Detroit, will be charged with first degree murder in the shooting death, according to Dearborn police.

Hussin, who was shot in the abdomen during the shootout, was arraigned in his hospital room on four counts of assault to commit murder prior to Cpl. Szczygiel's death.

Hussin stood mute to the charges, and 19th District Judge Virginia Sobotka set bond at \$500,000.

ACCORDING TO police, Szczygiel was shot in the forehead about 12:30 a.m. Aug. 24 while reporting details of a shootout outside the Schaefer Bar, 6905 Schaefer, over the radio of his unmarked patrol car.

Szczygiel and his partner, Cpl. Eugene Bright, had arrived at the scene

in the midst of a reported shootout between two other police officers and Hussin.

A patron of the Schaefer Bar had called police after Hussin reportedly brandished a gun inside the bar. Plainclothes policemen spotted Hussin crossing Schaefer and identified themselves as police officers before Hussin reportedly opened fire.

After apprehending Hussin, police discovered the wounded Szczygiel in the front seat of his patrol car. He was rushed to Oakwood Hospital where neural surgery was performed. The seven-year veteran of the force died three days later.

Szczygiel, who has lived in Canton the last two years, is survived by his wife Carolyn, and two children, ages 2 and 4.

Funeral services for Szczygiel were held Wednesday at Sajewski Funeral Home in Detroit. He was buried in Holy Sepulchre Cemetery in Southfield.

American amateur sports in trouble?

American amateur sports are in trouble because of a lack of centralization and money, according to Bill Cameron, who recently returned from a three week tour of the Soviet Union's physical education programs.

Cameron, a former Livonia Family Y executive director and tennis instructor, said the Soviet government encourages and finances sports programs and puts athletics and physical fitness on a high priority.

He said amateur athletic groups in the U.S. are "all fighting and there is no central control of sports."

Parents in this country often experience a financial drain, he explained, just for wanting their children to take part in athletic programs.

In the Soviet Union, Cameron said, many athletes spend as much as 1,000 hours a year in training, including physiology and psychological research.

Soviet athletes are guaranteed better education, a college training, better housing and better jobs and travel opportunities through their specialties, he said.

He talked about his trip last week to members of the Livonia Rotary Club at their luncheon in the Livonia Elks Lodge on Plymouth Road near Merri man. He expanded on the talk in an interview.

Cameron was among 75 Americans and Canadians on the trip sponsored by the Institute of Comparative Physical Education, located at Concordia University in Montreal.

AN EXAMPLE of the importance the Soviet Union places on physical education and athletics—compared to American schools dropping or reducing sports programs because of mileage defeats—is the gymnastics program.

Cameron said he saw one class for 150 students with 20 coaches, three choreographers and four piano players.

There are also numerous sports clubs for youngsters and adults and the annual price for a family is "the same as two packs of cigarettes."

"You've got it made if you're an athlete," Cameron said of the advantages the government gives those students.

"They have a fantastic physical education program," Cameron said. "We can learn a lot."

There are no professional sports, like privately owned teams in this country, all amateur athletics are controlled by the government, he continued.

A promising youngster is spotted and encouraged to enroll in a special

sports school, Cameron said, where he or she continues to get the traditional education with an emphasis on athletics.

For the extra-skilled youngsters, there are boarding schools with the students spending their weekends with their parents. Physical education majors in college receive a monthly income from the government and are guaranteed a job after graduation, he added.

"All Soviet students are exposed to physical education from nursery, which starts at the age of two, through college," he said.

The sports clubs used by families are well used, Cameron said.

He displayed slides of one club which has seven swimming pools, five enclosed and two outside.

CAMERON WAS also critical of the level of American sports training for coaches.

"Most U.S. coaches wouldn't qualify in the Soviet Union—they don't have the training."

He said every physical education instructor in the Soviet Union is a "talent scout" and recommends students for the special athletic schools.

Cameron said the country's high priority on sports has been going on since the 1920's but has been stepped up recently to prepare for the 1980 Moscow Olympics.

IN GENERAL comments about his trip, Cameron said he plans to bring along extra pairs of blue jeans if he returns to the Soviet Union.

The reason, he said, is a heavy blackmarket trade in that product with jeans selling for \$100 a pair.

Socially, the nation has many of the same problems as America, according to Cameron, including divorce, alcoholism (many people drink straight vodka) and birth control. The abortion rate there is high, he said, because there are no birth control pills or fam-

Eye bank sets sights on more eyes

Last year was a memorable one for about 250 Michigan citizens, not because of the bicentennial, but because their sight was restored.

These formerly blind or visually-handicapped men, women and children received corneal transplants, made possible by the Michigan Eye-Bank, which supplies, free of charge, the eye tissue used in such sight-restorative surgery.

The eye-bank is a joint project of the Lions Clubs of Michigan and the medical centers of the University of Michigan and Wayne State University, with the assistance of other organizations and individuals.

"But the compassionate people who request that their eyes be used, after death, to help restore sight to others are the ones who merit special recognition," Lawrence D. Wyman of Clare, president of the Michigan Eye-Bank, said. "Without those generous acts, the eye-bank could not exist."

"It is our goal to obtain pledges of eyes and supporting funds to help everyone who can be helped to see again," Wyman added.

More information may be obtained from your local Lions Club or from the eye-bank divisions at the University of Michigan and Wayne State University.

ily planning methods used.

There is a larceny problem, he said, an example of which is that Soviet drivers keep their windshield wipers and outside view mirrors inside their cars until they need them to avoid having them stolen.

"When it starts raining, there are big traffic jams when everyone stops and installs their windshield wipers."

"The Soviets have the same interests we do—peace and the good things

in life, such as a car and television," he said.

But in sharp contrast to American cities, Moscow, with more than seven million persons, has only apartments and no single-family houses.

But there are some economic advantages, he added.

There have been no rent increases for apartments for nearly 50 years and food prices have remained stable for 10 years.





The silent poisons

Editor: Media responses to the silent poisons in Michigan are mounting. PBB, labeled by the FDA (Food and Drug Administration) as "an economic poison," is the sly fox of the chase and it has attacked us in a most thorough and pre-emptive way.

Does dislike of the poor reflect the middle class' self doubt?

Americans dislike poor people. They cost money, threaten the work ethic and—perhaps most significantly—challenge the comforting notion that individuals have control over their lives.

That belief is especially held dear by the upper middle class, according to University of Michigan social work Prof. John E. Tropman.

"If the poor were not to blame for their own predicament—through laziness, lack of ambition, or the like—it would have to follow that the non-poor are not responsible for their success," he explains.

"This conflicts with an important American value. Most people assume that status is determined by personal effort, not by external conditions or chance. Poverty is linked to moral

failure; wealth is associated with virtue."

This line of reasoning pays off in two ways, Tropman says. It keeps most Americans from feeling guilty about the poor, and convinces them that it is unlikely that they will ever become poor themselves. If by some quirk of fate they become poor, they are confident that through virtue and resourcefulness, they can get out.

Why is one of the world's wealthiest countries so hostile toward its poor? Tropman sought the answer in a series of in-depth interviews with 192 residents of Boston and Kansas City.

The respondents drew a distinction between the "next to lowest class," which they identified as the "working poor," and the "lowest class," which they described as "those on welfare."

About 45 per cent of those interviewed mentioned welfare and lack of education as characteristics of the "lowest class."

Here welfare means more than just program enrollment," Tropman notes. "To the public it seems to indicate the difference between those who have given up, and those who are still trying."

"Education has long been associated with upward mobility in this country," he continues. "Especially in recent times it has been considered the necessary, and often sufficient, condition for getting ahead."

Work problems were mentioned less frequently than welfare and education in connection with the lowest class, Tropman reports. But of the total respondents, one-third made some comment indicating that it was the poor's fault that they were poor, often citing lack of ambition, laziness and unwillingness to get a job.

While about 17 per cent of those interviewed associated mental or physical illness with the "lowest class," less than five per cent mentioned family disorganization or old age. Only one per cent made a reference to ethnic groups, immigrants or women.

"Perhaps most surprising of all of the findings was the low proportion—five per cent—who identified race as a characteristic of the 'lowest class,'" states Tropman.

"This result confounds those who would see class prejudice as a cover for race prejudice. Insofar as these data are concerned, it would appear that the general public makes a distinction between race and class."

"In summary, it appears that people see the poor as those who are for the most part uneducated, unemployed and dependent on welfare—traits which they believe the poor are capable of changing. In contrast, they make little reference to such fixed characteristics as race, age, sex, or ethnic heritage."

"This view is not realistic," Tropman believes. "What we know about the macro-economic system indicates that society itself creates difficulties

which people cannot easily surmount."

Tropman feels it is not accurate to equate being poor with being on welfare. Less than half of the nation's individuals and families whose earnings fall below poverty level receive welfare dollars.

And while the poor do have less education than the non-poor, the connection—especially for blacks—is far from perfect. Tropman notes. Studies on the correlations between education and later income confirm that education is important, but not sufficient for later success. And it clearly does not prevent failure.

But getting an education and getting a job are crucial to the American goal of doing better. Tropman explains. The pilgrims came to this country to improve their lot. The settlers moved west for the same reason.

Thus, people are hostile toward the poor because they have appeared to have given up, and giving up runs contrary to the American tradition.

It is equivalent to rejecting our value system," he concludes. That is why people hold a much higher regard for the working poor. They at least are still trying.

Tropman plans to expand his research with a national survey of public attitudes toward the poor. The growing welfare rolls indicate that the stigma is decreasing among low income groups, he says, but it is not decreasing among the general public.

"The public's image of the poor is less based on fact," he says, "however, it is a reflection of our image of ourselves."

"External status and self-esteem are worth, this assumption is very important to the American character. Tropman maintains. If poor people were not morally at fault for their status, then the non-poor would have to question whether they can take credit for their own success.

"Worse, they would have to question how much control they have over their own lives, including the possibility of ever falling into poverty themselves."

Fish price boost seen in wake of 200-mile limit

Higher prices for ocean fish can be expected as a result of the new 200-mile legal limit on American coastal waters, according to an international authority on world food needs.

Georg Borgstrom, Michigan State University professor of geography and food science, and author of several books on ocean fisheries, said the higher prices will result from the increased cost of patrolling coastal waters—probably an indirect cost via taxes—and the updating of American fishing fleets. If the fleets are not updated, the catch is apt to be smaller and therefore costlier to consumers.

Foreign fleets, "almost armadas or cities on the ocean," which fished American waters have been so sophisticated that they have been able, electronically, to follow the schools of fish. They have established fish-processing factories at sea, and have been selling their products from the Pacific and Atlantic to world markets, including the United States.

Under the new law, says Borgstrom, the foreign fleet must obtain U.S. licenses, but already some Soviet and Japanese have sailed round the obligation by forming joint companies with American firms. At least two such companies have been fishing in

north Pacific and Atlantic waters, he added, with the bulk of the catches, however, headed for markets outside the U.S.

The 200-mile limit, Borgstrom said, was devised primarily as protection for American tuna and shrimp fishermen.

Foreign fleets from the Soviet Union, Japan, Poland, East Germany, and South Korea have also fished the Atlantic for haddock, herring, hake, cod, halibut and mackerel. Americans have been the biggest buyers from the fleets of Europe and Japan and although less well known, from the Russian and Rumanian fleets.

In addition, Borgstrom said, catches of fish meal in ocean waters off Africa and Peru have been going to "already well-fed parts of the world" for use as animal feed.

Another set of continuing problems related to fish availability and consumption are untouched by the new law, Borgstrom said. One major problem is the imbalance of food supplies going to the have and have-not nations. Additionally, there is the continued onslaught by industrial pollution of fresh lakes and rivers and the ocean waters.





Across giant field, only total silence

Across the giant field of the Algiers Drive-In in Westland, about 450 cars were parked in total silence one recent night.

On the huge screen, maybe half a mile away from cars parked in the more secluded corners, a movie called "The Deep" was showing Jacqueline Bisset had herself in quite a mess, confronted by a shark in the cramped confines of a sunken ship.

Inside the projection booth, huge reels of film—big enough to turn 24 frames of celluloid a second for more than hour—turned slowly, while the powerful beam of a xenon bulb passed through.

Forty or 50 feet away from the projector, a spider came settling slowly on its web, dropping in from nowhere. In the light of the projector, it shone blue-white. Its web glowed like a falling star.

Meanwhile, inside the concession stand hot dogs turned on spits below light bulbs and the crowds gathered.

Jack Dziewit, 17, was saying, "I like drive-ins. I try to get out as often

as I can. I like them better than theaters, but it depends if you've got any ladies with you."

"Yeah, no nosy people," said his cousin, Robert Kosciuch, visiting from Toronto.

There were no ladies with them that night, however, and what they were doing inside the concession stand while Jacqueline Bisset faced what seemed to be certain death out on the screen was looking for some.

Theresa Kalinowski, 14, and her 16-year-old sister, Anita, arrived about a minute after Dziewit and Kosciuch left. They're both drive-in fans, too.

"You can relax in the car and stuff," explained Anita. "I mostly go with my boyfriend, but he isn't here tonight. We go about twice a week."

Drew Hunter, 19, a Westland resident, wandered in and bought: two hot dogs, two slices of pizza, two bags of potato chips and one pop.

"You can sit in your car (at drive-ins). It's better. Take out your chick and be alone," Hunter tersely explained.

Jo Press, a Westland resident, was at a drive-in "for the first time in, oh, 14 years. I guess I heard 'Fun with Dick and Jane' (the second half of the double feature) was a good movie."

Kathy Jones, 19, of Plymouth and Bill Glover, a 20-year-old Ann Arbor resident, came in because "We're giving the people in the front seat a little time," Glover explained.

Glover and Miss Jones were double-dating with another couple.

Barry Arnold, area supervisor for the theater chain that owns the Algiers, explained a little background on how the Westland drive-in, and others work.

First, you've got to get down the jargon. "Hardtop" refers to an indoor theater. A "house" is a theater of any kind. The parking lot of a drive-in is a "field."

Arnold estimated there were 400 to 500 cars in the field that night, each car averaging "two, two point three" persons.

"We get on pictures like 'The

Cheerleaders.'" and word gets around, and we get a lot of singles, you know," Arnold explained.

Family-oriented pictures tend to draw higher average occupancies per car, he said, but for films like "The Cheerleaders," the average sometimes dips below two people per car, the result of people going alone.

Arnold, incidentally, has his own built-in movie critic—the concession stand.

"You can tell the acceptance of a picture by the concession stand," Arnold explained. "On a good picture, you won't see anybody in here until the intermission."

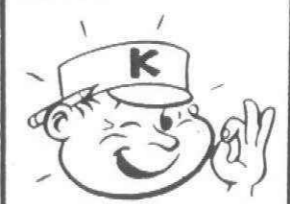
Which doesn't seem to say much for "The Deep."

Caretakers of the young must exercise care now

With the opening of school this week, it is a good time to remind ourselves that defensive driving includes keeping an eye out for pedestrians as well as other vehicles.

Farewell to retiring warrior

Another era has begun for the Plymouth-Canton Board of Education.

The end of an era is marked by the recent resignation of Marcia Borowski, who has moved out-of-state. Just Monday the seat on the board was filled by Carol Davis of Plymouth Township.

The shift marks quite a change in personnel over the past three years. First, Gary Mirto resigned for reasons of health, then Marda Benson was replaced by the electorate, E.J. McClendon decided against seeking re-election, and finally Ms. Borowski leaves when her husband takes a position with Emory University. These departures leave only George Lawton remaining on the board from that era, with Tom Yack next in seniority.

When each of those trustees left, a gap opened on the board which cannot be filled solely by electing or appointing a replacement. Each person brings to a board unique personal qualities, abilities, insights and dedication—attributes which vary from person to person.

For Marcia, the attribute which stands out is her dedication to the job. She read through her board communications from cover to cover. She was on the phone constantly asking questions of administrators, faculty or parents. She was around town often, on foot, on bicycle or in car. When it came time to a vote, hers was always an informed decision.

Marcia also will be remembered for her dedication to education. For her, good education is pursued by attempting to maximize the options available to students and by involving parents, students and educators in the decision-making process.

Many disagreed with Ms. Borowski's decisions, her stands on issues, and some of her mannerisms. But few can seriously question her dedication to the job and commitment to education. Those two qualities we all will miss.

The return to school means thousands of youngsters walking down sidewalks, crossing streets, and getting on and off school buses. Unless we are extra careful, an avoidable accident could occur.

We especially need to be careful for the young tykes going to school for the first time. They haven't had safety lessons in class or movies or filmstrips on how to cross the street. Some are prepared because they attended Safety Town last summer, but many didn't enroll. They may not know to look both ways, or may forget. Our eyes need to be their eyes.

Even older students, with a lot of things on their minds, may forget the common rules of safety. And we should be careful to make sure one lapse of memory isn't the last. At all times, our eyes should function also for pedestrians who may not think to look both ways, who may not see us as well as we see them.

An important change on the roads this week is the appearance of school buses and vans. They have been absent all summer and conceivably we might have forgotten two very essential rules—never pass a bus on the right side, and always stop when the bus's flasher is on—regardless of what side of the road you are on.

Because of numbers alone, the greatest probability for tragedy is when a school bus stops to pick up children or let them off. As adults, we must remind ourselves that when it comes to school buses, "yellow" means more than caution—it signals the potential of great human tragedy and demands the exercise of extreme caution.

Another "signal" which demands extreme caution is white perpendicular stripes across roadways. We recognize these stripes as a designated area for a pedestrian crossing. Sometimes there are crossing guards at crosswalks, but not always. We should remember this and watch out for kids at all times. And we should be aware that youngsters may not know as much about white stripes as we, or may forget.

And when all is said and done, we simply should be aware that the school doors are open again. Children are children and adults are adults—the difference places on us the responsibility as drivers to be caretakers for the young. That's a responsibility none of us can afford to shirk.



In America, Labor Day is a middle-class festival

In America, Labor Day is laced with ironies, if you appreciate that form of humor.

In western Europe, to which most of us trace our roots, the labor holiday is May 1, or May Day.

May Day originated in pre-history as a celebration of the arrival of new vegetation and a collective toast to fertility. The character we have come to know as Robin Hood of medieval England is actually the king-for-a-day of such a festival.

St. Paul advised the early Christian church to weave its customs around established customs to point up the similarities between the new religion and the old, and thus to win converts. So May Day became a Christian holiday. And in turn, the labor movement borrowed it from the church.

THE KNIGHTS of Labor, here in the United States, inaugurated a Labor Day parade in 1882, and some of the early observances occurred in spring.

But in time, the states of the union gradually drifted to the first Monday in September for their days of designated marches. Why? We can't read men's minds, but we suspect the American labor movement wanted to avoid the taint of socialism that marked the European movement. For better or worse, the American movement has been more concerned with protecting jobs and a middle-class standard of living and less concerned with social ideology than the European.

SO WE BUMP into another nice irony of America's Labor Day—the fact that it occurs during the harvest.

Most societies have a harvest festival during September. Indeed, the feast attributed to the Pilgrims of Plymouth colony was most likely the English Harvest Home festival of September.

Historically, a day of thanksgiving is a religious observance in which a homogeneous community thanks the Almighty for deliverance from a war, a plague or other calamity. A sumptuous feast.

The Postal Service

Unbusinesslike non-utility

Not too many years ago, the post office was a department of the United States government. It was considered a national utility. Congress set rates and decided what services it should perform.

So that there could be a national communications system if the post office didn't cover its costs, Congress appropriated the difference.

Postmasters were selected on a basis of political patronage not necessarily on merit. Mailing a letter across the country was inexpensive and service was relatively good. Postmen were not particularly well paid but they had the security of a government pension plan, could retire early and had a respectable job.

THEN THE CARRIERS were unionized, the system grew and costs escalated. Congress started to rebel against the higher costs and demanded a more efficiently run department.

There was a general feeling throughout the country that the post office was so immersed in bureaucracy that it would never again be efficient if it remained a government department.

So Congress decided it should be run as a business and created an autonomous agency called the U. S. Postal Service with the goal of being financially self-sufficient.

Everyone had high hopes but they never were realized.

A new team of management took over the postal service and tried to modernize the institution. They brought in modern machines and cut the work force to try to balance the budget.

But they were doomed to failure because the middle management bureaucracy remained, with many of the same old regulations. Union work rules that protected jobs limited efficiency. And Congress still legislated special privileges for special groups of mail users and prohibited the service from taking such economy steps as closing small post offices and discontinuing expensive services.

The result was that the postal service never freed itself of politics or had the opportunity to perform as a private business.

AS COSTS continued to escalate, postal rate increases were necessary because Congress and the

watching of professional athletics and the beginning of the Christmas glut of advertising are not what most of the world knows as a day of thanksgiving. And when you think about it, the end of November is an odd time to celebrate the harvest.

President Lincoln in 1863 designated the final Thursday of November as Thanksgiving Day (changed by Congress in 1941 to the fourth Thursday). So we actually had need of some kind of September harvest festival, and in the closing days of the 19th century, along came the Knights of Labor and their Labor Day.

A PURIST COULD bemoan what has happened to Labor Day in America in general and metropolitan Detroit in particular.

There used to be parades. Then it became a Democratic Party tradition to open the presidential campaign in Detroit on Labor Day, giving the candidate an unobstructed shot at what was supposed to be his most stalwart constituency.

For the last half-generation, Labor Day has been a middle class day off—a long weekend, to be celebrated with the odor of grilled meat rather than sweat, with the buzz of motorboats rather than political rhetoric.

To be sure, in recent years we have had some concern whether the "new kids" in the labor movement—the school teachers—would ratify their contracts in time to be in class the next day.

LABOR DAY in America, then, is what a September holiday should be—a harvest festival. It is a day when many Americans quietly give thanks for their prosperity and working conditions, but it's not a day of heavy religiosity.

Bishops and presidents, Congresses and labor leaders may designate holidays as they wish, but it is the people who celebrate them and make them what they are.

The plain folk in America have made Labor Day a harvesttime feast day. So be it.



The Stroller

Political blacksmiths

One bitter cold winter many years ago when The Stroller was breaking his home ties to begin the long stroll along the river of printer's ink, his mother gave him a final embrace and then, with her hand on his shoulder said as her parting words:

"If you ever want your watch fixed, don't take it to a blacksmith."

With those words ringing in his ear, he was off to the west, not knowing just what might be lying ahead.

But as the "Black Diamond" pride of the Lehigh Valley Railroad, sped through the night, he kept wondering, "Just what did she mean?"

Then, in the wee hours of the night, on that long train ride, it suddenly dawned on The Stroller that she meant if he ever was in trouble or in a quandary, he should go to someone who knew what it was all about and not rely on someone he didn't know.

MEMORY OF THAT eventful night in his life comes back to The Stroller now as we enter another set of municipal political campaigns. As he reads the claims of the candidates and listens to some of their pleas, he can't help but wonder how many of them are "blacksmiths trying to fix watches."

Delving into their claims, The Stroller keeps asking himself how many of them are really qualified to hold the offices they are seeking. Sure, they may be fine fellows or well-respected women. But how many of them have the experience necessary to hold down the office in a manner that would be beneficial to the taxpayers?

For instance, how many candidates running for city councils or commissions in our area have ever had to meet a payroll? Possibly none of them. Yet they are aspiring to seats where they

will be acting on the spending of millions of dollars.

To The Stroller, this is rather odd. Along his journey through life, he has had to prepare himself for any position he ever held. Even as an apprentice in a machine shop years ago, he had to sit by the hour and chip burrs from cast gears before he was allowed to operate a machine. Even then, he had to spend four years as an apprentice before he could hire out as a qualified machinist.

In one stage of his life, he was a short-order cook. But he had to learn to open oysters and clams before he could stand at the stove and make an oyster stew to order.

IT WAS THE SAME when he started in journalism, even on the little four-page paper back home. He had to write one-paragraph articles before he was given the privilege of writing a longer story.

Even in his fraternal activities, he didn't get to be the head of his lodge until he had "gone through the chairs."

And later in life when he was in a position to own an automobile, he had to pass a test before he was granted a driver's license.

Yet when he ran for public office, no one questioned him so long as he had a sufficient number of signatures on a petition or the \$50 that was necessary to get his name on the ballot.

Perhaps we should change the rules a bit. Perhaps we should have a fourth service academy—an academy to train ambassadors just as we train soldiers, sailors and airmen. If we had such an academy, perhaps we wouldn't be at odds in many places throughout the world over foreign policy.

And we should have other training grounds on a lower level so that we wouldn't have so many blacksmiths trying to fix watches.

How to tell you're 'burning out'

A recent phenomenon in top management circles is labelled by psychologists as "Executive Burn-Out."

By that, they mean a series of characteristic behaviors of top managers which may include many if not all of the following:

- Ever-increasing rigidity.
- Resistance to new ideas, concepts and programs.
- An inflexibility to change even when the benefits are clearly evident.
- Fault-finding, complaining, cynicism and general irritability.
- Longer and longer hours on the job, but with less and less being accomplished.
- More frequent and longer-lasting periods of depression.
- More frequent sleepless nights.
- Decreasing interest in maintaining friendly work and social relationships.
- Withdrawal from the family hearth to the family study where mountains of reports are pursued because "there wasn't enough time to finish them at the office."
- Sternness, seriousness and loss of humor.

YOU WOULD FIND it difficult to prove the victims of burn-out have lost their self-motivation, dedication

or company loyalty. On the contrary, their behavior speaks more of super loyalty, dedication, motivation and super commitment to the job.

The burn-out victim and the potential burn-out have a rather classic flaw in perception—they assume that by work alone can man find fulfillment.

Work is the arena where one proves his or her ultimate worth. The aggrandizement and recognition they crave is satisfied only on the job; family, friends, and community are alien environments where the best you can do is "hold your own."

They have swallowed hook, line, and sinker the Puritan work ethic which suggests that hard work is the only route to success and salvation. Each New Year's resolution is the same—to work harder to achieve success (whatever the latter means).

THE PURITAN WORK ETHIC is reinforced by a whole series of old sayings which are venerated as classical values and have become part of our work subculture:

- Hard work never killed anyone. (While it may not be listed as the cause of death, it certainly has been a contributing factor).
- Dirty hands make clean minds.
- Work like a mule so you can eat like a horse.
- Work is its own reward.

- Perspiration is inspiration.
- Good, better, best; never let it rest until your good is better and your better is best.

WHAT CAN WE DO about burn-out?

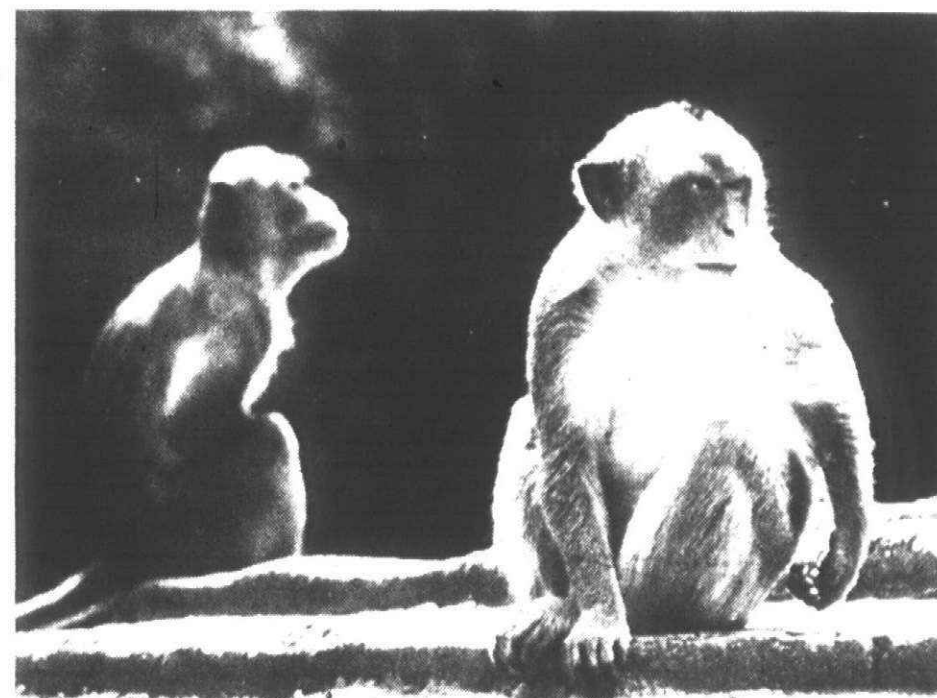
Well let's at least see it for what it is—an almost devotional reliance on one human value to the exclusion of all others. It's a life out of balance, it's a barrier to full-dimensional personal growth, it's someone who needs help, not finger-pointing or "kaying it on the line" to the victim.

The best form of help is to let victims know their anguish isn't one they suffer alone nor a sign of weakness or failure. Most of us have or will have to confront the work ethic's single-value theory of success and salvation—"work harder."

Perhaps a better but equally short philosophy would be: "work smarter but not harder," or "as you walk through the valley of life, make sure you stop long enough to smell the flowers."

No one seems to care except the individual family and that's their tough luck.

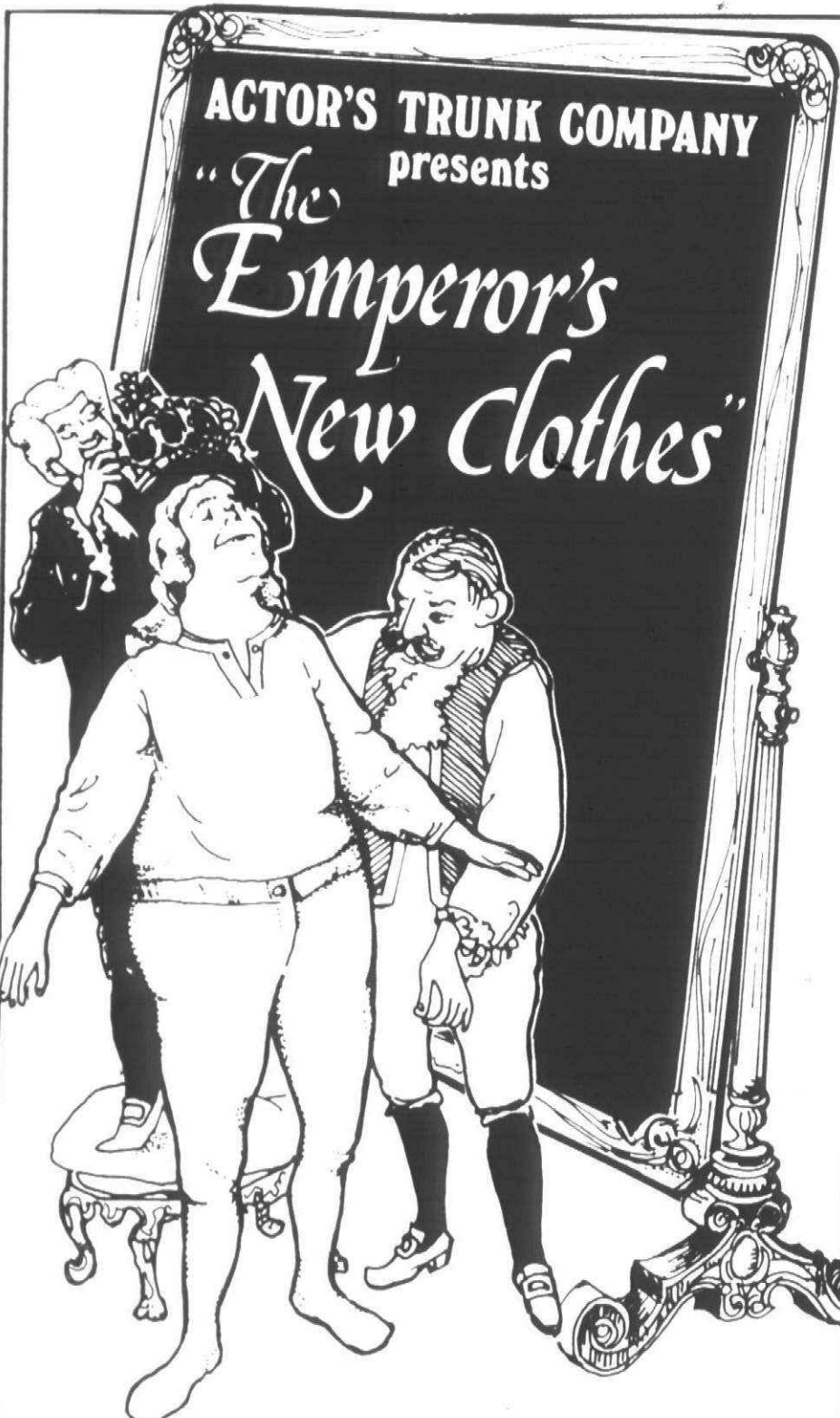

Marion Kehrl, BPW president, said she couldn't come close to naming all the delicious types of cookies that were in the making.

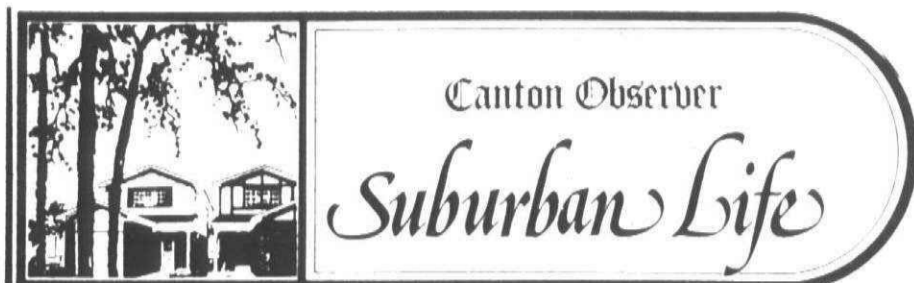

75 years ago

McGregor harassed by impudent rabbit

Plymouth area youngsters will join children from all over the world in the celebration of Peter Rabbit's 75th birthday. The local party will begin at 10 a.m. Sept. 10 in Plymouth Book World in the Forest Place Mall.

There will be balloons, coloring books, Peter Rabbit bookmarks, coloring contests and surprises.

The party marks the 75th anniversary of the publication of Beatrix Potter's story about Flopsy, Mopsy, Cottontail and brother Peter's adventures in Mr. McGregor's garden.

The author insisted that the price of the first edition be within the price range of children's pocketbooks. They sold for just one shilling. According to a rare books dealer, one of those first

editions now would sell for more than \$1,000—"if you could get your hands on one."

THE STORY of Peter Rabbit was first written Sept. 4, 1893 as a story letter to a sick child.

Beatrix Potter illustrated the letter—and later the book—using her pet rabbit Peter as a model. By the time the book was published in 1902, Peter had died.

Miss Potter wrote to her publisher, Frederick Warne & Co., in May of that year: "Peter died at 9 years old, just before I began the (new) drawings and now when they are finished I have got another rabbit, and the drawings look wrong."

Publishing companies were initially uninterested in her story. It was only after she decided to pay to have it published that the Warne Co. accepted her script and illustrations. By the end of 1902, over 28,000 copies had been printed, and in two years the number had risen to over 86,000.

AN ADVANCE copy of "The Tale of Peter Rabbit" in French was ready in May 1913 but it wasn't until 1921 that "Pierre Lapin" was published.

Since then, Peter Rabbit has become cosmopolitan, appearing in Afrikaans (1929), Spanish (1931), Welsh (1932), German (1934 and 1972), Swedish (1948 and 1972), Italian (1941), Dutch again (1968), Japanese (1971), Norwegian (1972), Danish (1972), and even Latin (1982). Peter also can be read in Braille.

In the privately printed copies of the "The Tale of Peter Rabbit," Beatrix Potter wrote, "In affectionate remembrance of poor old Peter Rabbit who died on Jan. 26, 1901 at the end of his ninth year. He was bought at a very tender age in the Uxbridge Road, Shepherds Bush, for the exorbitant sum of four shillings, sixpence. Whatever the limitations of his intellect or outward shortcomings of his fur, and his ears and toes, his disposition was uniformly amiable and his temper unfailingly sweet. An affectionate companion and a quiet friend."

HAZEL GIBSON of Plymouth Book World hopes to have umbrella tables outside the store on Forest Street for the birthday party.

The publishing company has prepared special coloring books for the 75th anniversary. Children will be separated into three groups for the coloring contest—up to 6, 7 and 8, and 9 and 10.

There also is a new book, "The History of Peter Rabbit," which includes the original picture letter, the privately published book, the first drafts and pictures, and correspondence between Ms. Potter and her publisher.

The 75th anniversary bookmarks include the titles of all 23 of Beatrix Potter's animal stories. The well-known characters are recalled: Benjamin Bunny, Squirrel Nutkin, Mrs. Tiggy-Winkle, Jemima Puddle-Duck and all the rest.

Madonna plans courses

Among the many classes to be offered at Madonna College this fall are television production and advanced photography. Also to be taught are courses aimed at improving communication skills such as grammar and vocabulary, basic writing skills, developmental reading and newspaper reporting. The classes are open to the public.

No knowledge of television techniques is required for the production and direct programs suitable for educational and industrial use. They will also learn floor management, lighting, and camera operation in Madonna's four-camera studio.

The class will meet each Monday from 6:30-9:30 p.m., and will tour a commercial television studio.

Photography students will learn advanced creative techniques of black and white photography, as well as to develop their own color slides. Students must own adjustable cameras and have previous darkroom experience. The class meets on Saturday from 9 a.m. to noon.

These two four-credit courses will be taught by Charles D. Derry, director at WXYZ-TV, a member of the Professional Photographers of Amer-

ica and the Director's Guild.

Tuition at Madonna is \$37 per credit plus fees. These courses may also be taken for no credit.

Grammar and vocabulary, offered from 4-6 p.m. Monday, is directed toward improving basic vocabulary and grammatical structure. Two semester-hours of credit may be gained through the course, which has been developed for deaf and hearing-impaired students.

Basic writing skills will meet from 6-8 p.m. Tuesday. It concentrates on writing such as usage, vocabulary and comprehension. It carries two credit hours, but may not be applied toward an English major.

Developmental reading concentrates on increasing vocabulary, reading speed and comprehension. Study skills and note-taking will also be presented. The class meets 9-11 a.m. Monday or 7-9 p.m. Thursday and offers two credit hours.

Newspaper reporting provides background and experience in news and editorial writing. The four-credit course will cover the organization of the modern newspaper, news values and news sources.



Waisting Aweigh

Salvation seldom in fad diets

All dieters, at one time or another, read about and will usually try a fad diet.

Fad diets are exactly what they imply—a fad. They are here today, gone tomorrow, a passing whim. Dieters, it seems, will try anything once. They get desperate. Maybe, they think, the latest fad diet is the one which will become their salvation from eternal obesity.

The most recent "white knight" of diets supposed to be the one which can do it for you rapidly, safely, and permanently, is correctly referred to as the "protein-sparing weight reduction program." Most people call it the liquid protein diet. Many think of it as the liquid miracle.

THE APPEAL LIES in the fact that the liquid protein method is purported to be a guaranteed, permanent weight loss. Who of us, afflicted with com-

pulsive eating habits, isn't looking for this kind of miracle?

How this particular diet arrived on the American scene is an interesting story. The protein-sparing method of weight reduction had been under study and experimentation since 1967.

A physician in the East had a patient in desperate need of heart surgery. If the heart surgery were not performed, the patient didn't have a promising outlook for survival. However, there was a grave stumbling block preventing the surgery. The patient was severely obese. It was decided that before the risks of surgery could be undertaken, the patient must lose a great deal of weight quickly. Otherwise, surgery would mean almost certain death.

The patient agreed to the regimen and the first liquid protein diet was administered. A great weight loss ensued, thereby permitting the necessary surgery.

THE METHOD IS essentially a way of mobilizing your body to lose body fat, rather than losing weight off of lean body tissue, your muscles.

The protein that you drink supplements your muscles, preventing your body from cannibalizing those muscle tissues. You eat absolutely nothing. You must drink plenty of water (a requirement), are allowed to drink diet beverages, coffee and tea. You also



must take potassium, folic acid, vitamins, and anything else deemed necessary by your physician.

An integral part of the modified fasting program is the necessity to change your eating habits. (*Reader's Digest* reports on a study that reflects a 70 per cent failure rate of the liquid diet, unless you change your eating habits.) Your old habits, which caused you to gain, must be discarded and replaced with habits that are sound and sensible. In essence, while you are losing weight, you also are being re-taught to eat.

THIS IS HOW the claim is justified that the weight loss is permanent. Behavioral modification techniques, when learned and practiced for a lifetime, offer the patient ways to keep off his eight permanently.

The use of protein sparing method of weight reduction continued to increase in medical circles, but only under the close medical supervision in hospital obesity clinics throughout the United States.

I sort the clothes. They jump into the piles of dirty linens with squeals of delight, carefully blending the darks with the lights. I think the object of the games is to lose as many of daddy's socks as possible without actually leaving the "safety zone" which, oddly enough, happens to be located between the laundry basket and the washing machine. I trip a lot.

Then I load the dryer. I open the dryer door. My two-year-old closes it. I grab a handful of wet clothes, open the drier, and my one-year-old closes it. We repeat this ritual 10 or 15 times with the boys usually winning each round of "Let's Get That Dryer Closed Before Mom Can Get Anything In It."

I think it's the trip back upstairs that usually converts me from a gentle loving Mama into a "Scream-



ing Meanie." With the one-year-old in one arm, and two tons of folded clothes in the other, I walk up the basement stairs behind my two-year-old—slowly—ever so s-l-o-w-l-y. He takes a step. He stops. Something on the railing requires his attention. By the time we finally get to the top, my arms are breaking, my heart is pounding from exertion and I have generally lost my cool. He says "Go downstairs and get my balloon." I screech. "No!" just loudly enough to be heard in Toledo.

NOW I KNOW that Dr. Spock would frown on my behavior at this point.

According to all the books, Mama-Nancy is supposed to be filled with endless patience so her kids can grow up with nary a neurosis to their names. But I sometimes get the feeling that the multitude of experts who endlessly spew forth volumes on "child-rearing" have had very little

experience in the actual rearing of a child. It is an impossibility to organize, categorize or rationalize the behavior of a two-year-old.

Oh, I, too, used to be a believer. I would devour each bit of wisdom passed on to neophyte mothers via the "Women's Section." When Dr. Blumenquack would report that raising your voice to a child between the hours of 13 in the afternoon could lead to an unhealthy fear of taking vitamins, or some such rot, I would nod my head in agreement and vow never, ever to resort to such crass measures of disciplining. I yearn to read a book written by someone who is actually surrounded by toddlers for 14 hours a day. After a week or so, if that person can still type, let alone think, then maybe I'll heed whatever advice they have to offer.

Meanwhile, my boys keep coming up with little goodies that continually challenge my patience and test my stamina. Anybody know how to get 52 playing cards out of a heating duct?

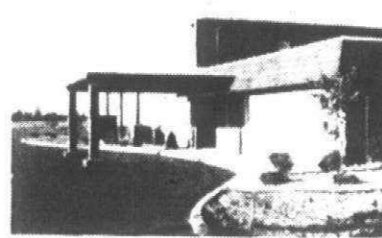

Nanette Pawlak, a 17-year-old Plymouth Salem High School senior is looking ahead to the 1980 Olympics.

Roller skating will be included as an Olympic sport for the first time and Nanette's coach Penny Money, believes her star pupil is medal material.

Summer competitions were encouraging.

Nanette won the Michigan state championship in the sophomore ladies singles division on June 17. She took second place at the United States regional championships July 3 in Harps Rollerdom, Cincinnati.

She came in third in the United States Amateur Roller Skating Championships Aug. 10 in Will Roger Coliseum, Fort Worth Texas.

"IT WILL BE three more years of skating. After the Olympics I'll turn pro." Then she grinned and added, "Three years and \$1,000 later, I'll turn pro."

She wants to maintain her amateur status and the rules are stringent.

On Labor Day she will skate in a Jerry Lewis Muscular Dystrophy telethon at the Northland Roller Rink. Segments of the show will be taped and some may appear on television.

Her appearance had to be sanctioned by the Roller Skating Rink Operators of America (RSROA) in Lincoln, Neb. She can coach younger skaters but she cannot receive pay of any kind. This summer she has been working at The Clock Restaurant on Main Street as a waitress.

Before the 1980 Moscow Olympics, Nanette will have an opportunity to test her talent in 1979 at the Pan-American Games in Puerto Rico.

NANETTE BEGAN roller skating when she was 9. Now she practices 30 hours a week.

Her teacher at the Northland Roller Skating Club, Penny Money, was a four-time senior pairs world champion.

"She's world-renowned," said Nanette.

She quit skating for 18 months. "I started again in February. And I was ready." She said she needed the rest and when she returned she could "express myself better." She has two pairs of skates—one for freestyle and one for figures. "The freestyle skates have regular American wheels. The figure skates must be more free-wheeling. They have German bearings and Webber wheels."

Has she ever taken any bad falls? "I've been off several times with stitches and a concussion, but I'm lucky. I've never had any broken bones. I guess I'm very determined. When I fall, I always get back up and keep going."

In competition, the skaters must prepare a four minute presentation. "That's a long time to be out there," Nanette said. She said she enjoyed choosing and then interpreting the music.

She is the daughter of Jeanette and Richard Pawlak of Heritage Drive Plymouth. The youngest of six children, she is the only girl with five older brothers. "And none of them skate."

The Pawlaks moved to Plymouth from Redford Township and still go back to Redford Lutheran Church.

"I'd gone to Lutheran schools all my life and wanted to go to a Lutheran high school. I didn't think I'd like it here but I have adjusted."

She was a three-time winner of the amateur baseball award when she

played for the Redford Lutheran team. "I love to play baseball," she added.

With the Pan-Am Games and the Olympics coming up, Nanette faces a busy schedule of practice, graduation

from high school and then Schoolcraft College.

"I want to take some psychology courses. I believe they would help me with my skating, meeting people and planning my routines."

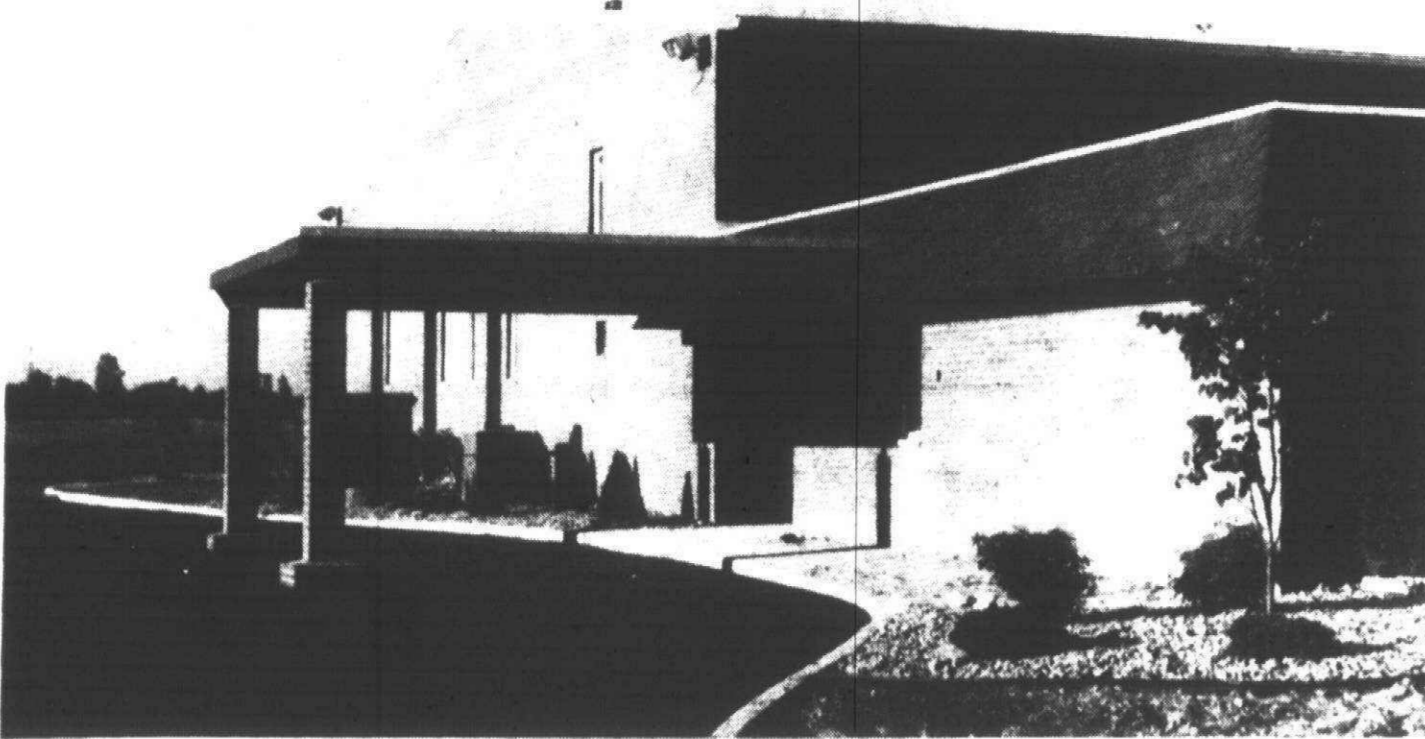

Alaska beckoned three area high school students this summer, and they responded.

Dave Wardell and Larry Clay of Garden City, joined with Wendy Wheeler of Livonia, along a missions outreach work team, and spent six weeks at Auke Bay on the Alaskan southern coast, enjoying the sights of seals, hawks, moose and other interesting fauna.

While the view of distant snow-capped mountains also caught their attention, the high school students knew they were in the upper 49th for reasons other than sightseeing.

Quotes from their letters reveals something of their activities.

"I have KP today. I have time in between washer loads of clothes. When you have KP, you do not go to the work site."

"Monday we started with our goal to build two cabins by pouring cement into one of the cabins which was not finished."

"You won't believe all the work we did in one day. A couple of days ago, a few of us had to work over-time to finish cementing the footers. When I get home, I'll be the strongest one there."

WENDY, LARRY and Dave are members of the Berean Bible Church in Livonia. When they heard that Missions Outreach was interested in sending young people to work at the Echo Ranch Bible Camp, near Juneau, Alaska, the wheels began turning in their minds.

They realized that they each had to earn \$700 to pay the cost of training and transporting them to the camp, to say nothing of feeding them once they arrived.

"I felt called to go," said Larry. "But I had a job at Sign of the Beekeeper, and I had just bought a car, and it looked as though there was no way for me to go."

"My parents told me to pray. I went in and talked to my manager, and he told me he'd give me back my job in the fall."

But that was only the beginning. The three had to contact friends and relatives for donations. Together with the teenagers at the Berean Church, they held a car wash. They mowed lawns, washed windows, painted a house. Finally, their goal was reached.

Then it was off for a week of training at Bethany, Mo. Wood was cut, cement was laid and other crafts were mastered. Then, joined by 16 other young people from all over the country, they hit the road by bus for the biggest state in the union.

Motoring north on the Alcan highway, they enjoyed the sights. But before long, Wendy was measuring cement and smoothing it down for the two needed cabins for the Bible camp that serves the people of Juneau, a number of them Tlingit Indians.

DAVE WAS BUSILY learning how

to construct walls and now thinks he could put up a cabin himself if he had to. Larry was pouring a cement floor putting in a special ingredient so it wouldn't crack in the cold Alaskan winters.

"It was beautiful," said Larry. "It was always my dream to go there. On clear days, you could see the mountains in the distance."

"Each morning we saw about seven or eight eagles right near the bay," said Dave. "We watched them fly away."

"It was the experience of a lifetime," added Wendy.

Every Wednesday night, the newcomers put on skits for the campers. Dave offered the reminder, "The sun set at midnight."

He liked the idea of the summer light, but wasn't so sure he would enjoy only five hours of daylight in

the winter.

"At a nearby church we sang and gave testimony about what we had learned at the ranch," mentioned Wendy. "The members gave our leaders some money to buy something for us. So they bought us each a wooden totem pole."

"The high point for me was the feeling of fellowship with people in different churches. It was fun, too, going to a different environment and working with kids from other states."

"Religion is not spread around enough. That's why they have these missions to send kids out to share the gospel of Christ with other kids."

Would she like to return another summer?

"I'll wait to see what the Lord wants me to do," she replied. "If doors open up and money comes in, I'll know."

34-mile bike route is scenic and close

A 34-mile asphalt and concrete bike trail along I-275 in southeast Michigan has the possibility of becoming one of the more popular bikeways when it opens officially in 1978.

The trail runs across mostly flat land from Novi in southern Oakland County to intersect with I-75, five miles north of Monroe in Monroe County. Much of the pathway is completed.

The \$5.9 million route has exit and entrance points at nearly every I-275 overpass and interchange, offering a chance to explore nearby towns or ride along little-traveled country roads past farms and fields.

The route passes through part of the Middle Rouge Parkway (Hines Park) and is within easy cycling distance of Willow Metro Park. Two state rest areas along the route are under construction.

There are, however, no campgrounds en route, but there is a good selection of restaurants and motels.

At the northern end of the route is Meadowbrook Road. Bikers travel south only three miles before exiting west at Eight Mile, where a detour into Northville is topped by a visit to Parmenter's Cider Mill, which has been squeezing apples into cider since 1872.

Take Eight Mile back to the bikeway and head south past numerous small tool factories. Bikers leave I-275 and head west along the M-14 freeway to the Middle Rouge Parkway. Here, a portion of a county bikeway can be followed along Edward N. Hines Drive.

By taking southbound Northville Road from eastbound Hines, cyclists will soon find the city of Plymouth.

Settled in the early 1800s, downtown Plymouth maintains a small-town atmosphere barely 20 miles from Detroit. For a break, ice cream cones await bikers at Cloverdale Farms Dairy, a city fixture since 1932. There also is the Box Bar, the Side Street Pub and, if a trek is planned for Sept. 8-11, the Plymouth Fall Festival would be a certain highlight.

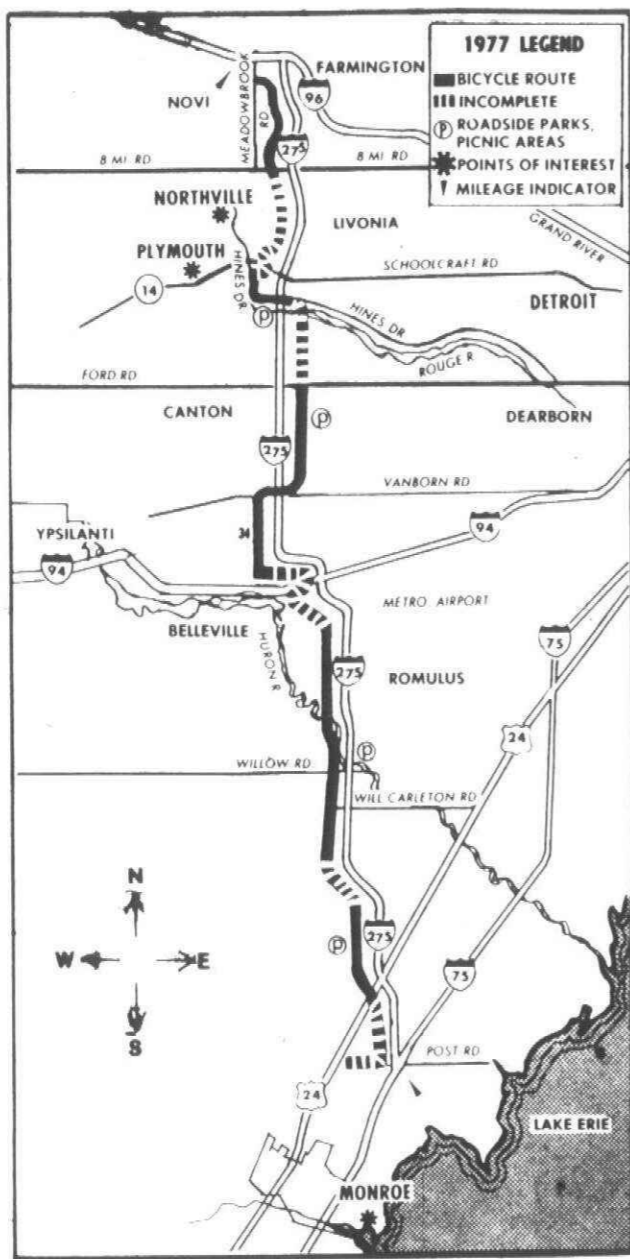
From Plymouth, cyclists can backtrack to Rouge Park and re-enter I-275 past Haggerty Road to parallel the freeway's northbound lanes. One of two state rest areas on the freeway is two miles south of Ford Road and picnic and restroom facilities will be available.

The path switches to the southbound side at Van Born Road, four miles south of the rest area.

The bikeway leaves the freeway just north of the I-94 interchange and rejoins I-275 two miles later at North Lane Road.

Five miles below Detroit Metropolitan Airport, the bikeway crosses the 127-mile-long Huron River via a bikers' bridge. From there, a two-mile stretch will find the cyclists at Willow Road, where cyclists can exit and pedal a mile east to Willow Metropark.

One of 10 such parks around, the 1,500-acre park has an Olympic-sized swimming pool, scenic



drives and refreshment stands where cyclists can rest or picnic.

Two miles south of Willow Road, the pathway enters Monroe County at Will Carleton Road.

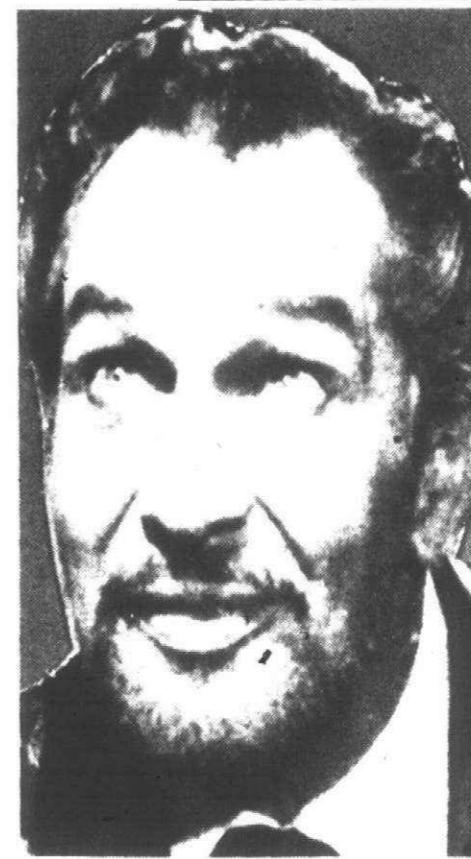
The route's second state rest area is three miles south of the county line. From here, if cyclists are so inclined, a view of the 800-foot twin smokestacks of Detroit Edison Co.'s Monroe Power Plant can be had. Also nearby is the construction site of the Enrico Fermi II nuclear power plant along Lake Erie's shoreline.

From the rest area, it's a four-mile ride to Post Road and journey's end.

Cyclists should pace themselves according to ability. The League of American Wheelmen estimates the average cyclist can cover 35 to 50 miles a day with ease. Cards and pamphlets with bicycle safety tips are available free at all Automobile Club of Michigan offices.

Roster filled with seniors

Salem knee-deep in grid talent

Can this be the "Year of the Rocks"?

With 46 varsity players, 28 of whom are seniors, head coach Tom Moshimer and his staff see a lot of talent and depth which may lead Plymouth Salem gridders to a very successful season.

The only thing which might interfere with such anticipations is another tough schedule, including includes Suburban Eight League favorites Dearborn and Dearborn Edsel Ford, plus the addition of an inspired Livonia Franklin squad, which should prove an exciting non-league opponent.

"We are a senior ball club, and when you see a good team, it's usually full of seniors," Moshimer said.

The Salem grid coach enters his 11th year at Plymouth this fall with more depth than any of his previous 10 teams.

"This is the first year since I've been here that we have as many potential quality players," he said. "In most places we are too deep, but it's a nice problem to have."

"We're trying to bring all the players along so we can freely substitute. If we can do this, we will be just as effective in the fourth quarter as in the beginning of the game—without weakening our football team."

HEADING THE list of talented players are the Rocks' two senior co-captains Doug Agnew and Bob Dasher,

along with junior quarterback Rich Hewlett, the spark of Salem's offensive attack.

Termed by Moshimer as a "double threat," Hewlett has both the running and passing ability that will give the Rocks' wishbone offense attack even more effectiveness.

"We are going to have a balanced attack—running first and mixing in the passing game—which should enhance our offense," Moshimer said. "But we are not a passing team because of the wishbone."

Agnew is the most versatile back on Salem's squad. The 6-2, 185-pound all-Observer and all-Sub-8 selection last year as a junior is the backbone of the Salem defense, calling the signals from his linebacker position.

But Agnew also has the ability to play halfback, fullback and quarterback on offense which should aid the attack.

Dasher is the foundation of both offensive and defensive lines. A first-team Observer selection last year, Dasher, a huge 6-3, 235-pound center and defensive tackle, is a definite major college recruit, according to Moshimer.

THE ROCKS lose key players like Tim Lillev, Steve Maisner and Ben Wicox in the backfield, and Dave Champion and Reid Albert on the interior line because of graduation. But a host of anxious players are all battling for positions.

In the offensive backfield, junior Paul Dillon should be a strong backup quarterback for Hewlett. Fullback Doug Rowe is the front of the wishbone backfield with halfbacks Bob Waite, Chris Ritchey, New Mexico transfer Dave Booker and Agnew fighting for offensive spots.

Juniors fullbacks Jim Thomas and Ken Price, and halfbacks Sam Merrill and Bill Bourmias add to the backfield depth.

Guards Kevin Keeskes and Bob Doherty surround Dasher with backup strength from John Lewelling and Duane Barsony. Tackles Tony Vitale and Bruce Piper look strong at their posts, along with Romulus transfer Wally Brown, Dan Smith, Tom Alterman, Pat Cavanaugh, Brian Waterhouse and Dave Wilcox.

John Broderick and Mike Genrich are at tight end, while Curt Lewis heads a sure-handed group of four at split end. Scott Kappler, Dennis Ogden and Dave Casler are all capable split ends behind Lewis.

Defensively, Hewlett and Rowe support Agnew at linebacker, Chris Kappler and Bourmias are reserves.

Brown, Price, Keeskes and Wilcox are at noseguard, while Piper, Dasher, and Doherty head a list of tackles.

Broderick and Vitale are strong defensive ends, with Lewelling and Tom Carl waiting in the wings.

The defense backfield shows a dogfight for hatchet (monster) and corner positions between Waite and Genrich, and Mike Skone and Jim Daratony, respectively.

Scott Kappler and Lewis return to safety and halfback positions with

help from Dillon, Mike Campbell and Ritchey.

LAST YEAR'S Sub-8 co-champions Dearborn Edsel Ford and Dearborn are once again strong favorites to win the league title. Moshimer considers his squad a very strong contender for the likes of Trenton, Belleville and Bentley.

With new triple-option offense

'Better football' pledged at Canton

A new triple-option offense is what Plymouth Canton football fans have to look forward to this fall, as the Chiefs try to improve on last year's 2-7 record which put them at the bottom of the Western Six League.

Chief head coach Dave Schuele enters his second season at the helm and is excited about employing the option offense into Canton's system.

"I've always wanted to run the option, but I didn't know what kind of kids I had when I came here last year," Schuele said. "We ran a mobile-type offense last year and switched to a little option toward the end."

"I've got kids who can handle the option. We've got people with better football knowledge and more experience."

"We're ahead of last year's pace. We're crisp, we're sure of our calls, and the attitude is much better."

The major graduation losses on the interior line are Tom Powell and John Young. Scott Gray and Leo Durocher are important backfield players who also graduated.

But lineman Mike Nyhus and halfback Jerry Simons should help fill the missing spots, serving as senior co-captains and major parts of the Chiefs' winning chances.

DOUG SMITH, who started the last half of the 1976 Chiefs' season as a junior, returns to his quarterback position. Improving sophomore Fred Hallway and junior Jav McKinley are other quarterback possibilities who have the task of generating the option.

But unlike most option teams, Schuele says he counts on his quarterbacks to throw the ball quite a bit.

Junior fullback Rusty Mandie was very impressive in the Chiefs' recent intersquad scrimmage. The 6-1, 184-pound Mandie is quick and runs with power.

"We call Mandie a horse," Schuele said with delight.

Simons, Darryl Ramseur and shifty sophomore John Tarr are the strong halfbacks. Tarr is a transfer from New York.

Beyond Nyhus, a strong 6-2, 206-pound guard, the Chiefs are small and inexperienced on the offensive and defensive interior lines. They will have to rely on quickness for success.

Wes Craig, Dave Tanner and Russ Shuman are battling at offensive center. Seniors Pat Farden and Pete Hewlett are the guards. Charlie Nyhus, Cliff Campeau and Kyle Heaton play tackle.

Tight ends Dave March and Mark Miller both show excellent receiving abilities, along with returning split end Randy Rienas.

Defensively, Heaton and Frank Kellogg are at the ends. McKinley and Kentucky transfer Bill VanHoose are other possibilities.

Mike Nyhus will be joined at tackle by either Lee Waid or Mike Kieffer. Campeau, Craig, Charlie Nyhus and River Rouge transfer Jim Koch battle for the nose guard position.

Canton's linebackers should be one of the team's strong points with Simons returning for a third year at that position. Tanner was the other regular at linebacker for Canton last year as a sophomore. Joel Mallare and Greg Santilli are the reserves.

In the backfield, Dennis Howell and Fred Hallway compete at the wolfman spot. Hallway played part of last year as a varsity freshman at this position.

Rienas returns to his safety spot with Russ Svopa and Tarr backing him up. Ramseur, Mandie, Miller and Darryl Goldsmith are all deep halfback possibilities.

Schuele admits his interior line is the main question mark this season, but also thinks that "with a few breaks" his team may surprise some people.

Livonia Churchill is favored to win the Western-Six, according to Schuele.

with Farmington Harrison's winning tradition and Waterford Mott's strength not far behind.

But as far as the Chiefs are concerned, the only team they are getting ready for right now is Livonia Bentley—Canton's first opponent on Friday, Sept. 9 on the Chiefs' home field.

We now see football pre-season training and conditioning starting six weeks before the season begins. Boys' baseball and girls' and boys' basketball are now year-round activities, to name just a few.

And weight training has become the major part of all sport activities at the high school level.

But since I'm dealing with high school athletics, it's my philosophy that every team should and does get equal opportunity for coverage whether it wins or loses.

And I will be the first person to compliment a losing team if I feel it gives its best to win. And by the same token, I will be the first to speak up if a winning team doesn't perform up to its capabilities.

LET'S REMEMBER what prep athletics should represent to young students. Winning can't be considered the most important element of high school athletics.

achieve personal and team excellence is what the goal players and coaches should strive for all season long. And if players and coaches truly feel they've done the best job then it doesn't matter which side wins.

I'm really not against the growing sophistication of high school athletic programs. Because with this sophistication, coaches give all athletes the best possible program and opportunity to achieve enjoyment and satisfaction.

But remember high school athletics isn't "big business."
