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School mill renewal hangs on voters' will

Voters in the Plymouth-Canton school district will decide a week from today whether to approve a 6.5 mill renewal for local schools.

And the election committee for the Plymouth-Canton schools is spreading the message that an affirmative vote won't change the present tax rate for

school district taxpayers, according to Florence Beier, a member of the 19-person committee that reported to the school board Monday evening.

Polls will be open from 7 a.m. to 8 p.m. Jan. 18. The deadline for absentee ballots is Jan. 13, and they are available from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. tomorrow

and 9 a.m. to 2 p.m. Saturday at the Board of Education office, 454 S. Harvey in Plymouth.

The proposed five-year renewal represents about 13 per cent of the annual operating funds of the district, Ms. Beier said.

However, committee members said the renewal alone will not be enough to maintain the district's present programs. Renewal, according to members, only permits timely planning for next year's budget.

Decisions on additional millage requests have been delayed by the lack of information on the effects of the Headlee tax-cutting amendment, student population growth, state aid and State Equalized Value (SEV) for next year, according to the committee's newsletters.

ACCORDING TO MS. BEIER, the committee's news activities are geared to providing information rather than influencing votes.

Activities engaged in thus far to get the millage word out include meeting with Parent-Teacher Organizations; family meetings at individual meetings; a letter going out tomorrow to parents and employees of the district; voting reminders in paycheck envelopes; voting reminders to parents; voter registration information and a control to make sure expenditures for fund-raising is eliminated from the committee's efforts.

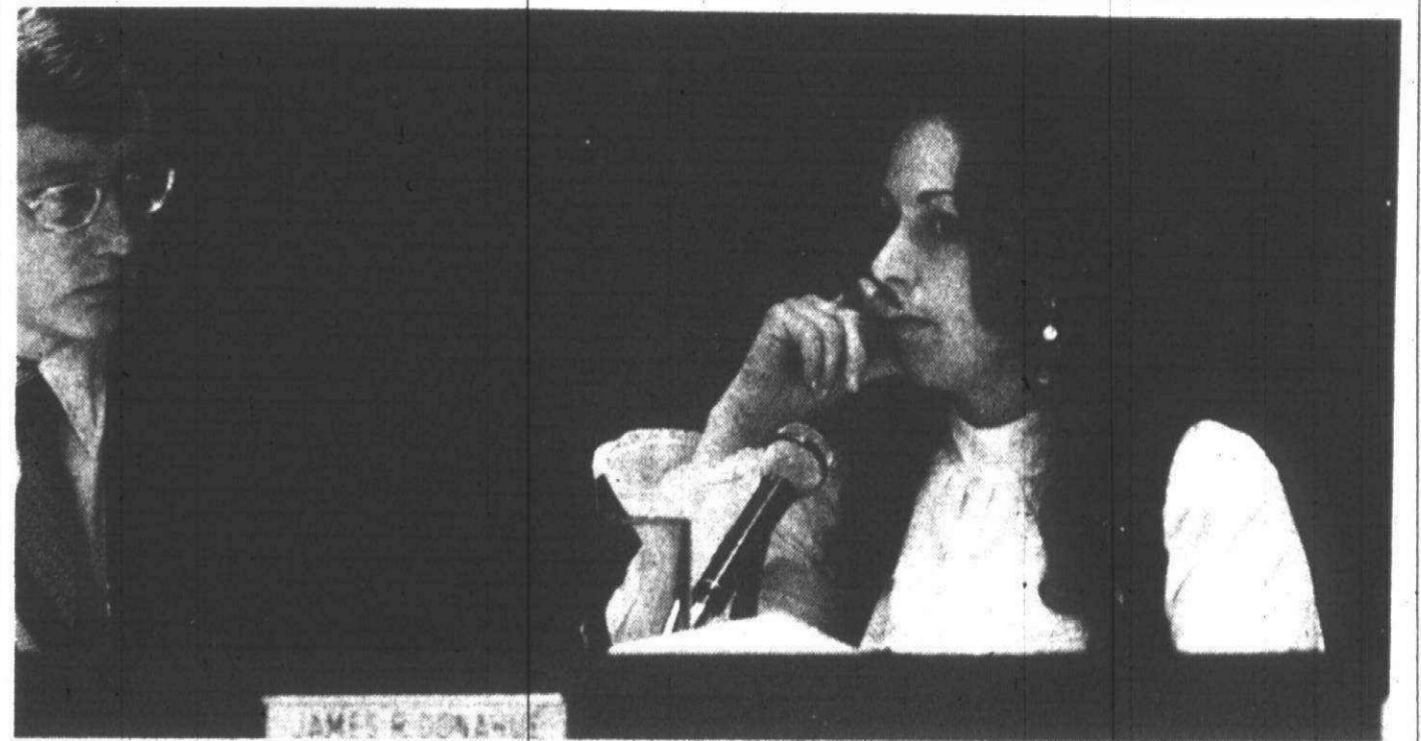

Potential conflicts stall shopping center plans

The developer of a proposed shopping center at Sheldon and Joy was left hanging in uncertainty Wednesday afternoon when the Canton board indicated it would deny site plans and a rezoning for the project but tabled the matter instead.

Cal Jabara of J & P Properties asked the board to rezone a 13-acre parcel at the intersection's southwest corner

from office to commercial and approve site plans for the center.

Jabara hopes to build a shopping center which would include a 30,000 square-foot supermarket, a drug store and a bank on the land that is part of the Forest Trails planned unit development (PUD).

BOARD MEMBERS said they were

pleased with the colored renderings Jabara submitted of the proposed project.

But because of a possible conflict with another shopping center that may be eventually built at Joy and Morton Taylor and questions concerning the Forest Trails PUD, board members voted to table the matter.

The action came after earlier mo-

Accuracy of property assessments questioned after tax mistake found

A wide gap in the assessments of three land parcels at the intersection of Lilley and Cherry Hill Roads has aroused the suspicions of Supervisor Noel Culbert that Canton's commercial property assessments are out of whack.

Culbert has directed Deputy Treasurer Maria Falkiewicz to evaluate the assessments of all non-residential property in the township and ask the Wayne County Bureau of Taxation to make necessary adjustments.

BUT CULBERT suspects that many businesspersons and landowners may be paying inaccurate tax bills because of unfair property assessments.

His suspicions were piqued by a complaint of William Kloote who owns vacant land at the southeast corner of Lilley and Cherry Hill Roads.

According to a spokesman for the Wayne County Bureau of Taxation, property assessments in the area were adjusted because of the complaint.

Culbert said Kloote's property, which is zoned for restricted office use, was assessed at \$7,500 an acre prior to the recent adjustment.

Identically-zoned property at the northwest corner of Lilley and Cherry Hill, where a Downriver Federal Savings office is located, was assessed at \$5,000 an acre. Commercial property at the southwest corner was assessed at only \$1,800 an acre.

"It's rather discriminatory. There's no question about it," Culbert said. "It

tells me that something is wrong."

But Frank Queenan, the county appraiser who adjusted assessments at the Lilley and Cherry Hill intersection, maintains that the assessment error was only an isolated case.

After receiving Kloote's complaint, Queenan said he lowered Kloote's prop-

erty assessment while increasing the assessment of identically-zoned land across the street. The \$1,800 assessment of the commercial property was increased substantially, Queenan said.

Assessments, which are used to compute property taxes, should equal approximately 50 per cent of market value.

THE ADJUSTMENT has not alleviated Culbert's concerns that some property owners may be paying unfair tax bills, however.

He noted the recent discovery of township officials that a commercially-zoned parcel near Warren and Morton Taylor Roads was assessed at \$100 as a homeowners' association park.

The error was attributed to an inaccurate assumption of a Wayne County tax assessor who saw the name of the adjacent subdivision—Windsor Park—stamped over the land in the county's plat book.

Culbert also suspects that some residential property may be assessed inaccurately.

"We're still going to pursue the issue," Culbert said of possible assessment errors. "We feel it's our duty to check it out."

George McEachran, director of the Wayne County Bureau of Taxation, said his agency will research any allegations of property assessment discrepancies.

According to Queenan, the agency is now reviewing some property assessments in the township. Appraisers adjust the assessments of all land that has been rezoned, divided or changed in any other way at this time each year.

The agency will reassess all land and buildings in a municipality at the request of municipality officials. All assessments in Canton were last revised in 1971.

Shell considers car service bay to win rezoning

A Shell Oil Co. representative has pledged to ask his corporation to build an almost obsolete business in Canton Township—a full-service gasoline station with auto repair facilities.

The pledge came after Canton board members indicated they would deny a Shell Oil request to rezone the northwest corner of Ford and Haggerty to accommodate a gasoline-only service station.

Board members indicated their opposition to the rezoning because gasoline stations that repair cars are practically non-existent in Canton Township.

Al Erwin, a Shell Oil representative, said his firm's Houston office had vetoed original plans to build a station

with repair facilities on the site because it has found that such stations are not competitive.

But board members insisted that any gasoline station constructed on the site near the I-275 exit ramp should include facilities for the repair of cars.

"Who does it finally fall upon to service cars?" asked Trustee Carol Bodenmiller. "I think it's a sad state of affairs to have your car break down on a freeway and be unable to find anyone to help you."

After Erwin indicated his plans to approach his firm with other plans for a full-service station, board members voted 4-1 to table Shell's request to rezone the land from C-3 to C-2.

Short takes

FROSTY weather means frosty windows for many people. No matter how well glazed a window might be, chilly nights can build up frost both inside and outside the window. It's a temporary condition, but it can also mean that it's impossible to open a window if it's necessary to make a quick exit in the advent of a fire. Maria Falkiewicz, Canton's deputy treasurer, said that problem worried her, so she tried going over the windows with a blow dryer. She said it works like a charm, and windows stay frost free for quite some time.

WORD has it that Moonies—officially known as members of the Unification Church—have been soliciting for contributions in the Canton area. The Unification Church is controlled by charismatic South Korean Rev. Moon and has been under fire for allegedly brainwashing members and drawing new disciples from the ranks of impressionable young people. There are no reports of trouble connected with the solicitation thus far.

FARMS are dwindling in number throughout the state, says the Michigan Department of Agriculture. The agency estimates the number of farming operations in Michigan for 1979 at 63,000, down 2,000 from 1978. In the past five years, farm numbers dropped 10 per cent, while total land in state farms fell eight per cent. The result is fewer, but larger farms. The average size of a Michigan farm is 168 acres, but those who hope to make a profit at the venture usually need a much larger plot of land.

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Decision yet unmade

Value of school survey doubted

Plymouth-Canton School Board members failed to resolve a question of whether to continue a survey of families leaving the school district.

Although Trustee Flossie Tonda called for a written (rather than phone) survey and continuation, board members voted to accept the survey report without further follow-up at Monday night's meeting.

Board president Tom Yack indicated that continuation of the survey could be discussed during plans for 1979-80 education objectives.

The survey, which was instituted by the board's 1978-79 objectives, revealed that the change from modular to traditional scheduling at the high schools prompted one family to turn to private schools.

But new homes and jobs were behind the move for the majority of the 55 families leaving the district, the survey concludes. Of the 89 per cent contacted, 71 per cent left for new jobs or homes.

Seventy-three per cent of those questioned expressed satisfaction with the school district, while 25 per cent had no comment. Only one respondent expressed dissatisfaction.

THOSE in charge of the survey believe, however, that the results do not merit the time expended and recommend discontinuation.

"We concluded that it did not seem to be as useful as the time expended would justify," said Florence Beier, administrative assistant for community relations.

David Rodwell, consultant for research and evaluation services, analyzed the computations, she indicated.

Ms. Beier suggested that a survey of families remaining in the district might be more useful, however Mrs. Tonda disagreed.

"I'm dissatisfied with the survey done by telephone," she said, adding that a phone survey is not as reliable as those in which the respondents have a chance to sit down and answer questions at their leisure.

Several board members took issue with that stand, indicating that a phone survey gets better results in terms of number of respondents.

The survey involved 12 to 15 hours each of planning for Ms. Beier and Rodwell, along with one-half to two hours of training for the school secre-

taries who conducted the survey.

The secretaries spent between zero and two hours attempting to contact parents and interviewing, the survey results show.

"I don't think our secretaries have time to be involved with this," Ms. Tonda maintained.

Trustee Richard Arlen disagreed with Ms. Beier's contention that the survey should be discontinued based on the fact that the survey was only con-

ducted for one month and lacks comparative figures.

Trustee Joe Gray suggested running the survey for a few months, while Trustee Carol Davis suggested mailing the surveys to see what percentage of response could be obtained.

Ms. Tonda also suggested reviewing some of the questions.

Treasurer Stephen Harper moved to accept the report, adding that he would like to see the survey continued.

Careless shovelers target of new law

Anyone who hasn't cleaned their sidewalks within 24 hours of a snowfall may have the chore performed for them—with a charge.

Kenneth Vogras, director of the City of Plymouth Department of Public Works, reminds homeowners that sidewalks must be cleaned within 24 hours after the snow has fallen. "If not, the city is authorized to do so and charge the property owners."

Vogras also said the city will be enforcing a new state law which bans dumping of snow on roadways or shoulders or piling it so high at driveway entrances that it obstructs the vision of motorists.

The ban applies to business owners as well as residents.

Under the law, enacted last spring, snow, ice or slush may not be removed from a driveway or other property and placed across a roadway or its shoulders.

Snow piled near a driveway entrance must not obstruct the view of a motorist entering the roadway.

Pushing snow from a driveway to the opposite side of the road also is prohibited by the new law.

Driveways and parking lots are usually cleared after the DPW crews have cleared the roadways and shoulders, explained Vogras. The snow spread across the roadway makes a slippery spot which is hazardous and could cause an accident, he added.

Violation of the new law is a misdemeanor. Both property owners and persons hired to remove snow are responsible for any illegal snow-removal activities. In addition, any accidents caused by illegal snow removal will leave violators open to lawsuits for public liability and property damage.

Officials from the Michigan Highways and Transportation Department recommend that snow be pushed away from the roadway and to the sides of the driveway for its full length. Large businesses may find it necessary to truck snow from their parking lots, state officials add.

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Physical fitness means a superior way of life

Less than three years ago, there was 60 pounds more of Mary Gaglead than there is now.

And the Livonia woman found just a little exercise wore her out. What's more, thyroid operations had rendered her vocal cords almost useless, so she could hardly speak above a whisper.

All of these factors contributed to making her a shy, withdrawn woman for whom life was just a bit of a drag.

All that is turned around now, and Mary, now 50, spells the difference with a seven-letter word, F-I-T-N-E-S-S.

She goes four times a week to the Livonia Family Y to effect these changes. Her friends, Ruth Stoddart and Peggy Harless of Livonia and Florence DeSempelaere of Canton, agree it's the way to go.

"Fitness is now a way of life," is the way Shirley Ritter, physical education director at the Livonia Y, put it. "And I happen to feel that the YMCA's cardiovascular health program, which is going on all over the country, is one of the best ways to achieve fitness.

"It's Mary's way of life now, and it has made her feel good. She is more healthy, and through her associations here at the Y she has changed socially."

Over at the Wayne-Westland Family Y, similar ideas come from fitness director Carmen Keay.

"Total fitness is what we stress in the Y program," she stated. "I feel it is important for all to be fit emotionally as well as physically. This is not just an exercise program. We treat each person as an individual, and we treat the mind as well as the body."

THE CARDIOVASCULAR health program as defined by the national YMCA is beginning a new term with registration next week in both the Livonia Y, Stark north of Schoolcraft, and the new Westland branch, 827 S. Wayne.

The procedure involves a screening—scheduled Saturday, Jan. 13, in Livonia and by appointment in Westland—to check four commonly accepted risk areas, smoking, cholesterol, blood pressure and percentage of body fat. These results are submitted to the participant's physician.

Following screening there is a fitness evaluation, including tests of cardiorespiratory endurance, body composition, flexibility and muscular strength and endurance.

Then those who would be more fit sign up for classes in designed to build cardiovascular endurance, at least three a week, said Mrs. Ritter.

These include, at the Livonia branch, men's and women's fitness, dynamic aerobics and senior citizen's fitness. There are 15 times a week that they are offered.

In Westland, there are such offerings as Dancefit, slymnastics, body toning and adult fitness, a coeducational evening exercise program.

In addition, participants are encouraged to get into some sports like racketball, tennis, jogging or swimming. And while they are doing all the exercising, they can work in special nutrition programs to cut calories and make the most of the food they eat.

WHILE BOTH Y branches prepared for their new terms—the Westland branch will introduce its classes with an open house 2-5 p.m. Sunday—Mary-Gaglead talked about how she started toward cardiovascular fitness.

"I had seen a picture in the Observer of a couple of women getting an evaluation," she began in a voice that is still husky but now well above a whisper.

"Well, really it was my husband, Larry, who saw it, and he said he thought I should begin exercising at the Y."

She decided to try the program, but the going was pretty difficult at first after her evaluation.

"At first I couldn't keep up with the class more than five minutes," she related. "But I kept trying and keeping track, and now I can go the 20 minutes." (Mrs. Ritter explained that the fitness classes involve warmup, then 20 minutes of non-stop exercise, and then a cooldown.)

Mary was just getting started on the fitness routine when her friend Ruth Stoddart talked her into going jogging regularly. "I had thought I had to lose the weight first because I expected breathing problems," Mary said. "But now I can even talk while I jog."

She also started playing racquet ball.

And now the regular routine for Mary—and Ruth and Florence and Peggy, who is back in fitness classes a year after undergoing back surgery—is two miles of jogging four times a week, followed by a fitness class and racquetball.

"Then we all go out to lunch—salads if Tora is with us," Mary said.

TORA DUNN is the Livonia Y's fitness coordinator, and it is she who works closely with participants, making regular evaluations and setting up nutritional programs.

Mary has checked her progress every six months for the three years she's been working on better fitness.

"We check pulse rates before and after exercise," she said. "At first participants work up to 70 per cent of their maximum capacity, and gradually get up to 85 per cent. Mary's at 80 per cent now."

"I've saved the charts, and I like to check them to see my progress," Mary said.

The weight is down now and the fitness rating definitely up, but Mary Gaglead has no plans to change her routine.

"I feel great now, and I know I need to keep on. There are days when I don't really feel like exercising, but then I get to class and get going and I find I am having fun.

"I see a lot of heavy people come here and try the program but then drop out. I'd like them to know how good it is if you stay with it. Now, even when I'm on vacation, I do my exercises so I won't get stiff."

And the added dividend has been the improvement in her voice. Her speech therapist, Dale Friels of the St. Mary Hospital staff, has been amazed at the difference regular exercise made, she said.

SHIRLEY RITTER would like to see many more men and women and young people added to the fitness program rolls.

"This is the time of year when people hopefully will step back and evaluate," she said.

"Fitness involving regular exercising and sensible eating is really the new way of life. Dieting alone will only reduce weight, and exercise alone will only turn fat into heavier muscle. You need both, and the best way to fitness is total involvement in a program like ours."

How to cook an ostrich

Ever wonder how to cook an ostrich? For my son, that's almost blasphemous because Big Bird of Sesame Street fame looks suspiciously like an ostrich.

So I didn't talk to my wife in front of Lyle about the recipe I saw this week on cooking an ostrich.

And the ostrich recipe isn't all that grabbed my interest as I read through the 1979 edition of The Old Farmer's Almanac from Dublin, N.H. It's amazing how much information you can pick up by investing a buck at the newsstands.

ON ONE PAGE, for instance, I found a handy listing of insults which you may find occasion to use. Here is a sampling:

•He makes you wish birth control would be made retroactive.

•She says that whenever she's down in the dumps she gets a new hat. Obviously that's where she gets them.

•He's so dull, he can't even entertain a doubt.

•It's useless to ask him to act like a human being. He doesn't do imitations.

•Let's play horse. I'll be the front end. You just be yourself.

•Don't ever change—I want to forget you exactly as you are.

ARE YOU READY now for instructions on how to cook Big Bird?

The instructions begin by suggesting you should pick out an ostrich from 60 to 100 pounds and place him or her (presumably dead) in a tub.

Then slice six pounds of onions, five pounds of carrots, gather three bunches of parsley, add a quarter pound of whole black pepper, 24 bay leaves, 30 cloves, 12 whole allspice, three crushed garlic, four quarts claret, two quarts amontillado sherry, one quart vinegar, one pint good brandy, two pounds brown sugar, one-fourth pound juniper berries. Mix.

Put the tub in a cool place, cover tightly for four or five days. Then put in the dressing and put the bird in a pan with about six quarts of water. Bake four to six hours, basting occasionally on all sides.

HAVING PASSED on that very useful piece of information, I now will offer just a few (certainly not exhaustive) other helpful tips:

•If postage stamps are stuck together, put them

separated with the glue intact.

•To feed a cat liquid medicine, spill some on its fur and the instinctively clean cat will lick it off instantly. To feed pills to dogs or cats, coat the pills with butter.

•Club soda that has gone flat is good for watering plants.

•To gather shards of broken glass, go over the area with a piece of soft white bread, but wrap the bread tightly when discarding it so animals won't eat it.

•Use a cabbage leaf to clean pewter.

•Make your own confectioner's sugar by pouring granulated sugar slowly into the blender at its highest speed. The longer you blend, the finer the sugar.

•Diminish the speed at which candies burn by putting them in the freezer before using them.

•A piece of chalk kept in a jewelry box keeps the jewelry from tarnishing.

•To remove black shoe marks from floors and linoleum, sprinkle a damp sponge with baking soda and wipe away the marks without scratches.

•A blackboard eraser is useful for removing fog or steam from car windshields.

•Keep the bathroom sink half-full of water when cleaning dentures. If they happen to slip, the water will slow the fall and keep them from breaking.

•Use miniature marshmallows to hold birthday candles on a cake.

Enough useful tips.

AND NOW FOR a few samples for those interested in trivia:

•The Baby Ruth candy bar was named after the first baby girl born in the White House—baby Ruth, daughter of President and Mrs. Grover Cleveland.

•The largest flying bird in the world is the albatross. When fully grown, this bird weighs close to 20 pounds, has a wing spread of 12 feet, and a body four feet long.

•The great flu epidemic of 1917-19 claimed 25 million lives, which was four times the casualties of World War I.

•The four state capitols named after U.S. presidents are Lincoln, Neb.; Jefferson City, Mo.; Madison, Wis.; and Jackson, Miss.

One final bit of information. This is the 187th year the Old-Farmer's Almanac has been published. I look forward to see what's in store for 1980.

tions to table then deny the proposed rezoning failed. Clerk John Flodin, who left the meeting early to honor a dentist appointment, did not vote.

Jabara had unsuccessfully asked the board to approve or deny his firm's requests so he could finalize or abandon plans for the center. J & P Properties holds an option on the land that is owned by Barnes Mortgage Co.

A&P supermarkets, Arbor Drugs and Liberty State Bank have expressed an

interest in leasing the shopping center space, according to Phil McKenna, another representative of the development firm.

Township ordinance officer Bruce Phillips asked the board to consider tabling the requests because of a possible breach of contract in the PUD agreement Barnes Mortgage Co. holds with the township.

Phillips alleges that Barnes has failed to honor a stipulation in the PUD agreement that requires the firm to

construct sidewalks in Forest Trails Subdivision.

Phillips and Trustee Robert Greenstein maintained that Barnes Mortgage Co. would profit by the proposed rezoning and site plan OK because the action would finalize sale of the land to J & P Properties.

BUT OTHER CONCERNS stymied approval of the rezoning request at Tuesday's meeting.

Three residents of Forest Trails Subdivision said they were told that small offices would be built on the land when they purchased their homes. They objected to construction of a shopping center on the site.

Another developer — Richard Lewiston — also attended Tuesday's meeting to voice his objections to the proposed shopping center.

Lewiston owns land on the east and west side of Morton Taylor south of Joy that is zoned for commercial use.

Under terms of a consent judgment binding on Lewiston and the township, small shops must be built on the land west of Morton Taylor and an entertainment complex must be built on the eastern parcel.

The consent judgment was signed in court about three years ago to kill plans of developer Dominic Mocerri to construct a regional shopping center on the acreage that presently includes Mayfair Village Subdivision. Under terms of the consent judgement, Lewiston was given rights to develop the land.

"Our interests (on the commercially-zoned sites) would be adversely affected by a shopping center at Joy and Sheldon," Lewiston told the board.

As part of the consent judgement, Lewiston spent \$500,000 to construct Morton Taylor a half mile south of Joy, donated park land to the township and donated the right-of-way for a widened Sheldon Road.

The final motion to table Jabara's request for the rezoning and site plan approval was approved by a 4-2 vote of the Canton board. Trustee Eugene Daley and deputy treasurer Maria Falkiewicz voted no.

Sheldon widening set for spring of 1980

A nearly \$2 million project to widen Sheldon Road will begin construction in the spring of 1980.

The Wayne County Road Commission's largest upcoming project in this area calls for a five-lane paved highway on Sheldon from Joy north to Ann Arbor Trail, according to Bill Sutherland, assistant director of transportation.

The one-half mile stretch will be similar to Ann Arbor Road upon completion, Sutherland says, and will be the basis for an eventual connection with Canton Center Road.

That project, about five years down the road, Sutherland said, will connect Canton Center to a new connector route across to Sheldon just south of Joy.

Both projects are designed to alleviate traffic problems in the area, although the projected Canton Center bypass should iron out the congestion in front of Plymouth Centennial Education Park (CCEP).

However the Sheldon expansion is the major project in the near future. Bonds for the project were included in a sale last June to fund design work on the project while right-of-way is purchased to accommodate the road widening, Sutherland explains.

WITH CONSTRUCTION costs expected to rise, the project's \$1.7 million cost estimate will probably increase, he predicts.

For Plymouth-Canton Community Schools, which was notified of the widening recently, there are a few problems in front of Gallimore School on Sheldon.

The road commission is asking for a quick-claim deed from the district, while administrators expect the commission to be responsible for providing a fence in front of the elementary school.

According to Supt. John Hoben, the district has several questions for the commission, including what the members expect to pay for the .734 acre of school district land involved in the road widening.

The road's expansion will cause some problems for the district, Hoedel noted, including road crossing for students.

The district will attempt to negotiate with the road commission for an overpass, he told the board Monday.

Other plans by the road commission for the Plymouth area include intersection improvements on Lilley Road at Ann Arbor Road and Plymouth Road.

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The Bottom Line Your nest egg

Most individuals have heard of the highly-advertised IRA, or Individual Retirement Account.

The benefits of investing money into a retirement plan if one is not provided by the employer are widely known.

Under the new Revenue Act of 1978, an employer can elect to make deductible contributions into his employee's IRA. Employers are allowed to contribute up to \$7,500; if only the employer is making contributions, but contributes less than \$1,500, the employee can make deductible contributions to make up the difference.

IRAs ARE AVAILABLE from a number of different sources, which can be divided into two major categories: insurance companies and savings and loan associations.

Many IRA investors choose to purchase an IRA from a bank or savings and loan association, but buying a certificate of deposit. Certificates of deposit are usually issued for IRAs in the maximum length of time for which the bank or savings and loan will issue a certificate.

Some certificates of deposits are offered for as low as \$500 for the IRA funding; others are a minimum of \$1,000. Be aware, however, that if deposits are made on other than an annual basis, each individual deposit has its own maturity date. For instance, if you made two \$500 deposits for a total annual IRA contribution of \$1,000, two separate certificates would be issued.

Although there are no IRS restrictions on withdrawal of deposits after age 59½, there could be a bank penalty for premature withdrawal. Basically, this means losing interest for 90 days on deposits held for less than the length of the certificate. Therefore, individuals who invest IRAs in certificates of deposit should plan a withdrawal schedule based on the maturity dates of the certificates.

Lending institutions indicate that there are generally no commissions for processing the IRA plan. Most contracts with savings institutions, however, require an administrative charge to be assessed when the money is withdrawn. Some charge to be assessed when the money is withdrawn. Some charge seven per cent per year.

ANOTHER POPULAR IRA investment is insurance annuities.

Some policies sold to fund the IRA plan require payments of a fixed amount for the life of a contract. These fixed payments can create difficulties for business owners who might now know how much profit they have to base a contribution on until the end of the year.

Also, cash flow problems might cause hardships in making the set payment in a particular year. If this situation exists, theoretically a new policy must be drawn up and signed each year.

If the investor contributes more to the IRA than allowed by law, the policy may have to be canceled to avoid repeated annual penalties for over-contributions. A portion of the investment might be lost, as some insurance-sponsored programs require assignment of a percentage of the premiums towards sales commissions.

These commissions, which vary depending upon the company, are charged on an annual basis, when each contract must be renewed. Some insurance companies indicate that there is no so-called "front end load," a commission taken from the first premiums paid into the contract.

WHAT SHOULD A prospective IRA investor look for?

First, be aware that if you have no available employer retirement plan, you may invest up to 15 per cent of your earnings to a maximum of \$1,500 per year. The money invested is deductible on an annual basis, and the proceeds are not taxed until retirement when the money is withdrawn.

City sets public hearing on parking credit change

Parking credits will be the subject of discussion at an upcoming public hearing on a new Plymouth city ordinance.

The Plymouth City Commission will hear public comment at 7:30 p.m., Feb. 5, for the new ordinance for off-street parking requirements.

A recent circuit court ruling mandated the commission's enactment of an ordinance reflecting the controversial parking credits allowance approved by resolution by the commission.

The ordinance allows a business establishment to purchase parking credits if physical parking spaces fail to meet city code requirements. Mayflower Hotel owner Ralph Lorenz filed a lawsuit challenging the city's policy,

after Napoleon's cocktail lounge on Main Street purchased the parking credits after opening more than one year ago.

Wayne County Circuit Court failed to rule on the legality of issuing credits in lieu of actual spaces. Instead, the court ruled that the commission had enacted the parking policy illegally.

Now in an attempt to get the policy firmly established, the commission has scheduled the public hearing in accordance with proposed ordinance regulations.

The ordinance calls for specific numbers of off-street parking spaces before the issuance of a certificate of occupancy.

The parking credits allowance resolves that owners of new or expanded use of property may apply to the Zoning Board of Appeals for an exception. For an established fee, the business owner may be granted the exception, if reasonable ability to provide the parking spaces does not exist.

The money paid in lieu of parking spaces is paid into the parking fund of the city, which shall be used for construction or future expansion of parking facilities in the city.

The amount paid into the parking fund for parking spaces shall not apply against any present or future special assessments levied by the city for parking, the ordinance requires.

'Gag rule' is deemed unlawful

A federal judge has ruled unconstitutional a section of Michigan law allowing local judges to issue gag orders in criminal sexual conduct cases.

U.S. District Judge James Churchill this week ruled in the case of Channel 7 (WXYZ) and the Michigan Association of Broadcasters vs. Farmington District Judge Michael Hand.

In September 1977, Hand issued an order against the media suppressing all news in the morals case against the Rev. Gary Berthiaume, assistant pastor of Our Lady of Sorrows Catholic parish.

Six months later, Berthiaume pleaded guilty and received a six-month jail sentence in Oakland Circuit Court. Meanwhile, the argument over the gag order has dragged on for 17 months in federal court.

"UNCONSTITUTIONAL on its face," said Judge Churchill of Sec. 520(k) of the Michigan Criminal Sexual Conduct Act of 1974.

That section requires a judge to suppress the name of the accused, the victim and details of the offense when requested by the accused, the victim or the defense attorney. In this case, the request came from Berthiaume's attorney, James Lawson of Southfield.

Quoting the U.S. Supreme Court in the Nebraska Press Association case of 1976, Churchill said: "Of all possible laws abridging the freedom of speech and the press, 'Prior restraints are the least tolerable infringement.'"

He called the Michigan law section a "classic example of prior restraint," branding it "completely devoid of a single redeeming feature."

CHURCHILL called the law "unique" in a number of negative ways: It granted a "limited right of privacy" in one type of case. The law's plan

was poorly conceived for enforcement. And it gave the magistrate—in this case, the local district judge—no discretion, Churchill said.

The federal judge's opinion was strong in striking down the offending portion of the Michigan statute but did not criticize Hand.

Raymond Morrow, attorney for Channel 7 who reported Churchill's decision, said either losing party had planned to appeal to the U.S. 6th Court of Appeals in Cincinnati.

The evening of Berthiaume's arrest, just before Labor Day in 1977, Judge Hand called newsmen together in his courtroom and issued an oral order suppressing all facts in the case. After conferences with attorneys, many broadcasters and newspapers—including Observer & Eccentric Newspapers—decided to ignore the order.

The broadcasters asked the federal judge for a summary judgment throwing out the law.

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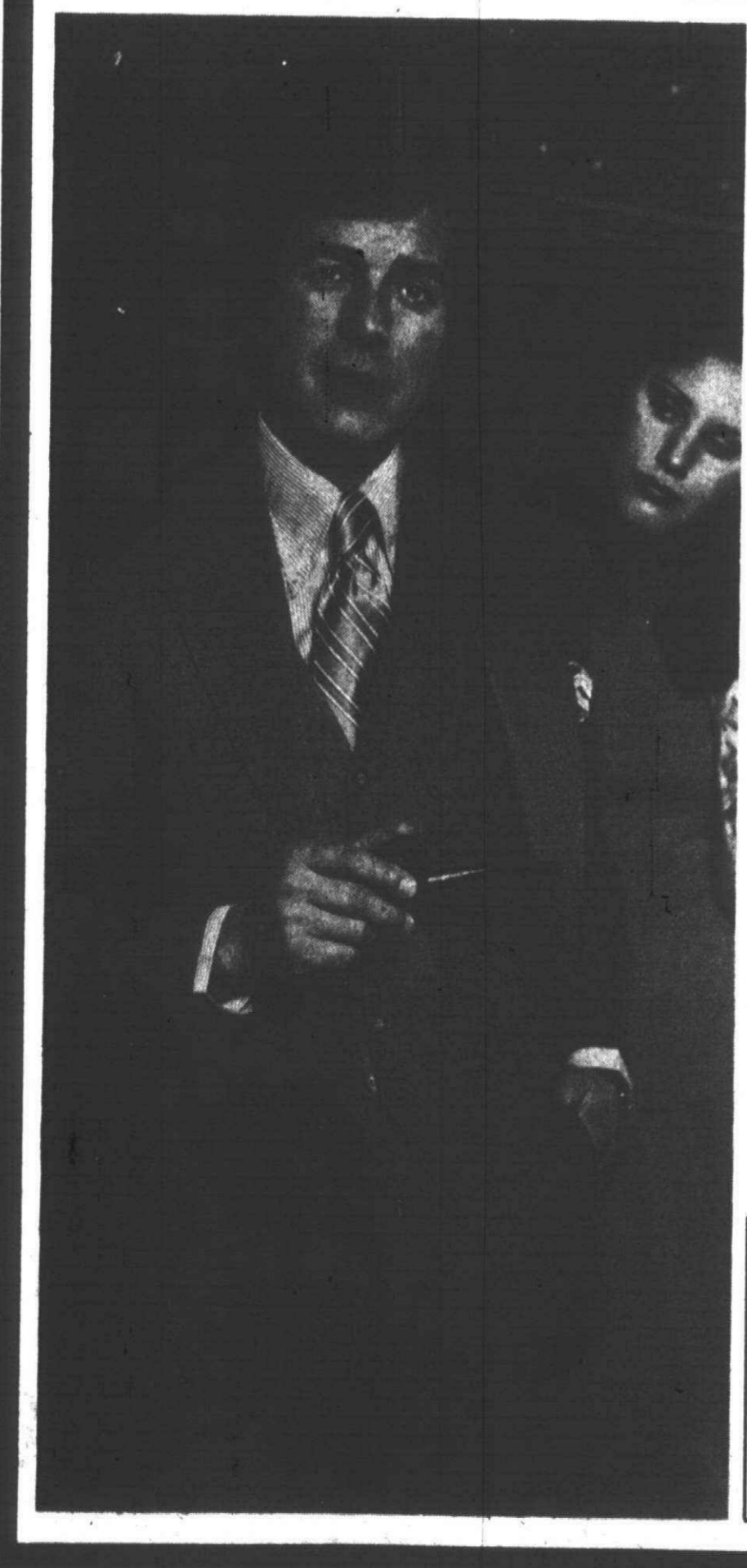
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The Stroller

On answering the critics

Years ago when The Stroller was taking his first steps along the journalistic trail, he was assigned to cover the Lehigh-Lafayette football game in the Lafayette Stadium high up on the hill in Easton, Pa.

This was one of the big games in the East in those days, and The Stroller was quite thrilled that he was eligible to sit with some of the top eastern writers.

But it's what happened after the game that he always will remember. Because his paper didn't go to press until early Sunday morning, he was in no hurry to get back to the office. So he accepted an invitation to have dinner with the officials-including "Tiny" Maxwell who had refereed the game.

AT THE TIME, Tiny, who weighed well over 300 pounds, was sports editor of the Philadelphia Public Ledger and considered one of the top football officials in the land.

The dinner conversation turned to some of the plays, and The Stroller, building up enough nerve to speak his piece, looked across the table and said, "Tiny, I think you missed one out there this afternoon."

The big referee, instead of putting up an argument, just looked at the cub sports writer and in his stuttering man-

ner said, "Well, there were two of two of us guessing out there-you and me-and my guess counted."

The memory of that day came back in the wake of the "phantom" touchdown that beat Michigan in the Rose Bowl on New Year's day. Until the television cameras came on the scene, the critics of the officials had no positive proof that the referee or the linesmen were wrong. It was just as Tiny had told The Stroller: "There were two of us guessing, and my guess counted."

CRITICIZING THE officials has been a pastime for years. Rarely is there a game where there is not a difference of opinion on close plays. But there never was a TV camera on hand in those days to give the critics the ammunition they needed.

Tiny Maxwell was the most popular referee in the East and always was called upon to officiate the championship game in the coal region pro league. Never were there more fanatic fans than those in the stands at those games. But Tiny took no chances. He carried a gun in his hip pocket. Fortunately, he never had to use it.

Well, The Stroller remembers his early days on the major league baseball circuit and a conversation he had one afternoon with Bill Klem, the old

baseball umpire. Chatting with him one afternoon about the critics, he gave this version: "I don't mind them because whatever the play is, it ain't nuthin' until I call it." That makes him the boss and no one can contradict him.

GEORGE MORIARTY, the old Tiger third baseman who umpired in the American League in the closing days of his career, used to have fun with the critics when he spoke at banquets.

He always closed his remarks by offering this play: "What would you call it if the base runner stepped over first base without touching it and the first baseman's foot was off the bag while stretching to get the throw?"

He would wait a moment or two and then say, "What-in-hell is the matter with you? You called it quick enough this afternoon." It never failed to silence the loudest of the critics.

Only once in his long sports writing career can the Stroller remember a baseball official's ruling being reversed. And it came 10 hours after the game.

It happened the 1945 world series when the Tigers engaged the Chicago Cubs on Wrigley Field in Chicago. Late in the game, a Cub batter rifled the ball to left field and it squirted away from Hank Greenberg, who had just come back from military service. Hank was

charged with an error.

He protested loud and long, claiming that the wooden cover of one of the drainage outlets was the spot where the ball landed and that he never had touched it. The argument went on into the night.

Then, after 10 o'clock one of the baseball commissioner's aides came into the press room in the hotel and announced that the officials had agreed to call it a hit and not charge it as an error to Greenberg.

ONE FAVORITE story of criticizing an umpire is told by "Red" Jones, the former umpire, who appeared on the banquet circuit for years. He told of the afternoon in Cleveland when Bob Feller was pitching and had his fastball working well.

"The batter at the plate was a rookie making his first appearance in the big leagues.

"When Feller whistled one past him and I called 'It a strike, the rookie looked back at me and said, 'It SOUNDED kind of high to me.'"

So, you see, criticizing officials is an old pastime that now has furnished new ammunition for the critics.

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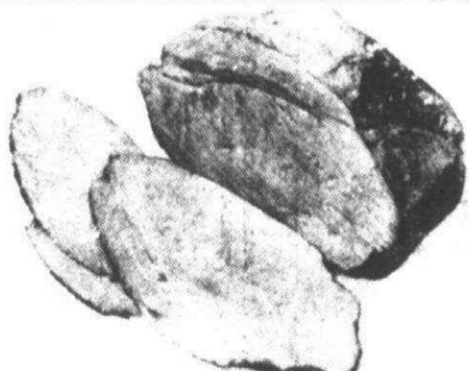
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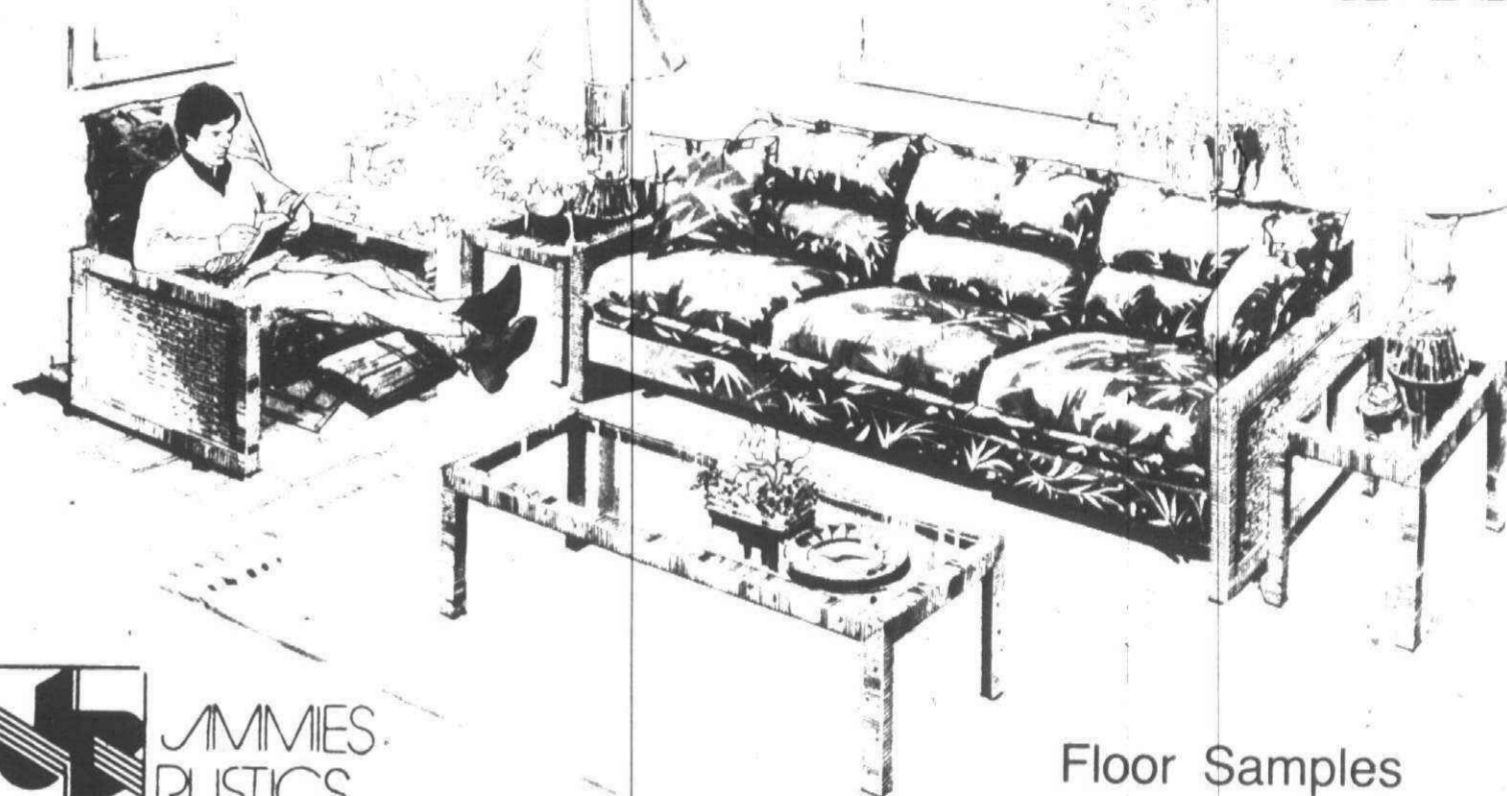
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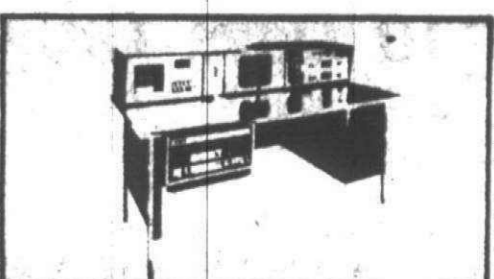
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Foes unite to oppose plan for future sewer expansion

Two old political adversaries have kissed and made up.

Western Oakland County communities are willing to deal with Wayne County's public works department to participate in the so-called Super Sewer project.

The Oakland communities—Commerce Township and the City of Novi—last week told the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency that they oppose expansion of the Walled Lake sewage treatment plant to serve part of their expanding populations.

"Enlargement of the Walled Lake treatment plant is unsound from economic, engineering and environmental standpoints," said Harry D. Mosher, Novi city engineer, summing it up in a public hearing.

TIME WAS when Oakland communities—particularly the City of Walled Lake—were fighting the Super Sewer idea, which then was the baby of Wayne County.

In public hearings in 1976, Oakland forces asked to be dropped from the Super Sewer plan. They saw it as empire-building by the Wayne County Road Commission, which then was in charge of public works.

The original Super Sewer idea was a giant sewage treatment plant at the mouth of the Huron River, 64 miles of interceptor, and a service area that included the western range of Wayne

County townships, Ann Arbor and Ypsilanti in Washtenaw County and a row of townships from White Lake south through Novi in Oakland County.

The Michigan Natural Resources Department split off Ann Arbor and Ypsilanti from the project after their vehement and articulate fight against Super Sewer.

That left the thinly settled but fast growing portions of Wayne and Oakland counties to deal with.

THE CURRENT version of Super Sewer calls for 50 miles of sewer interceptor serving those portions of Wayne and Oakland Counties and a treatment plant at the mouth of the Huron River.

If you want to be technical, call it Alternative A-1. The communities, the Wayne County DPW and the Oakland County DPW now support it.

The EPA came up with an Alternative D. It would serve Wayne County from Canton Township south. It calls for some expansion of the Walled Lake treatment plant. It contemplates continued use of septic tanks by many residences in Plymouth Township, Northville Township and Commerce Township, in particular. It would put western Wayne sewage in the Rouge interceptor, to be treated by Detroit's plant.

EPA says it's in line with the Carter Administration's new urban policy. It would halt out-migration from Detroit by restricting suburban sprawl.

Roads and sewers are two essential factors for suburban growth. Thus, Al-

ternative D and a decision to cancel the M-275 freeway project through western Oakland County seem to dovetail.

THE SUBURBAN alliance gained a new friend when the City of Livonia supported their cause.

Although Livonia isn't part of any alternative, City Engineer Ed Siemert testified, "Our primary concern is the impact of Walled Lake plant expansion on our city."

The Walled Lake plant, Siemert said, discharges into a branch of the Middle Rouge River which eventually flows through Livonia on its way to Dearborn and the Detroit River.

In low flow, if there were a "malfunction" in the Walled Lake plant, nearly half the Middle Rouge could be sewage, he said.

Glenn Brown, director of environmental health for Wayne County, and Plymouth City Engineer Kenneth West echoed that argument. Said West: "Alternative D adversely affects use of Hines Parkway. The Middle Rouge runs right down Hines Parkway."

THE REAL argument, said some local officials, is not whether to permit continued deterioration of Detroit and suburban sprawl.

"The national urban policy won't halt out-migration from Detroit. It will only shift growth to other states, as the the Ford plant case," said Patricia Cullin, supervisor of Van Buren Township.

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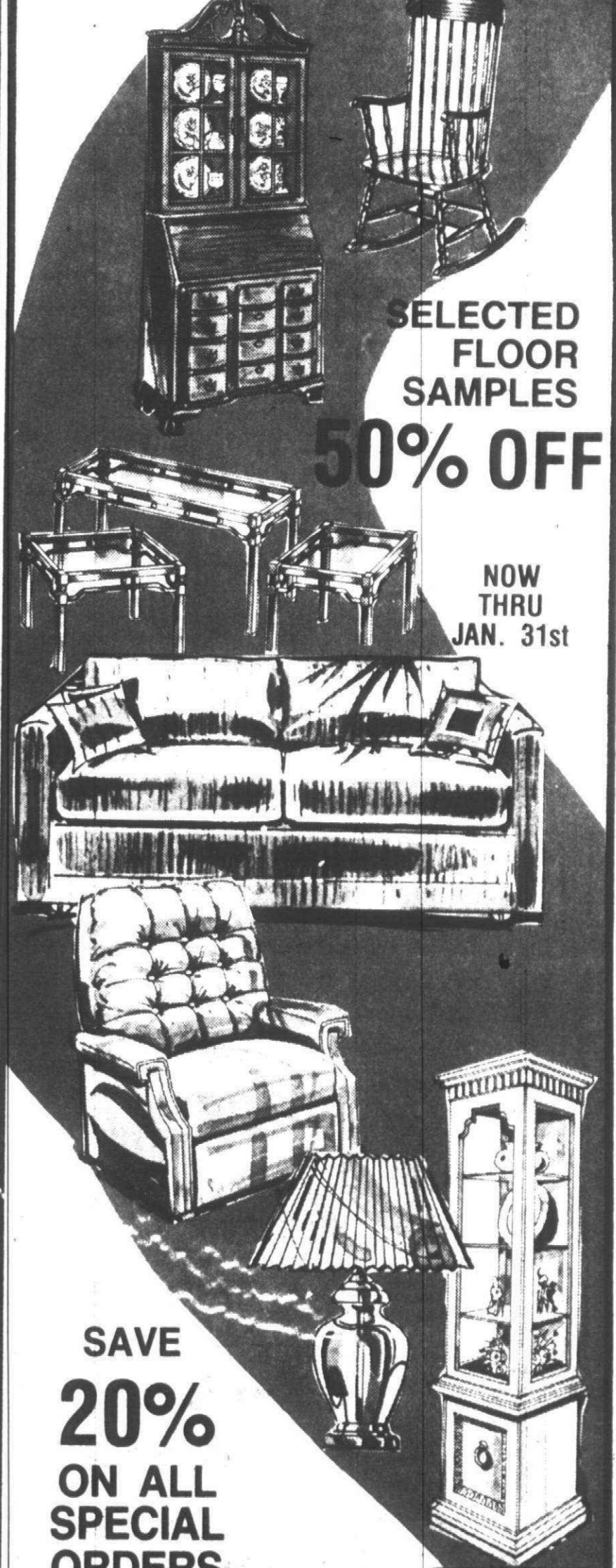


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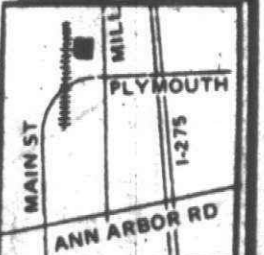
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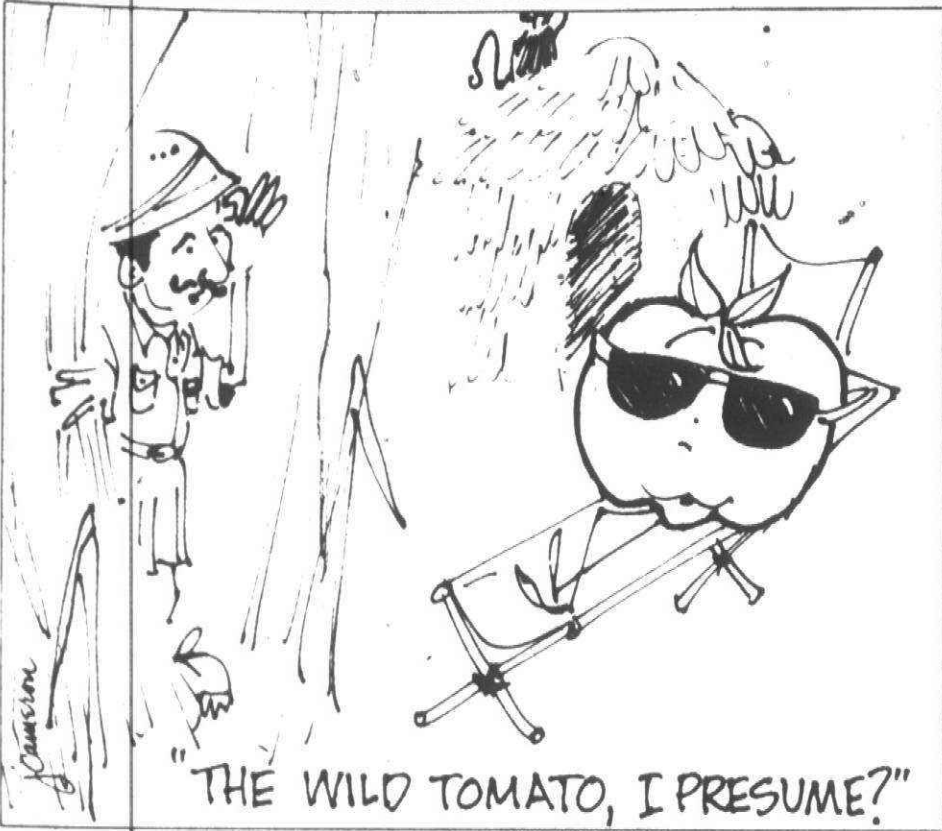
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Peru wilds lure tomato tracker

Jon Fobes is a young man with a dream. To follow that dream, he's willing to endure weeks of roughing it that most of us would rather just read about.

Fobes, 28, a plant geneticist at Michigan State University, leaves next week for two months in the wilds of Peru. For the first month or so, while he's in the Peruvian Andes, he'll have company. The second month, Fobes will travel alone into the Amazon valley in a rented car jolting along primitive dirt roads and inching along the edge of 1,000-foot drops dotted with little white crosses which mark where people have plunged to their death.

He'll probably be sick several times while he's there. During his last trip, contaminated water and unfamiliar food took their toll on his health, landing him in the hospital twice. But he shrugs it off as something that happens.

Why is Fobes going to endure all this?

He wants to collect tomato seeds.

Peru is the original home of the tomato plant, and our cultivated species still has several wild relatives there. Fobes' aim is to collect seeds of these wild tomatoes while they're still available.

"Time is the critical factor," he explains. "Agriculture in Peru is changing — it's becoming more Americanized, and large areas of land are being cleared. The wild tomatoes are being destroyed. In five years, they may be gone."

"These plants are important, he says, because they are hardy and resistant to some diseases and pests that attack cultivated tomato varieties. Because

wild and cultivated tomato varieties can be hybridized — sexually crossed — plant breeders can use the wild species as a kind of gene bank.

Some of the wild species are readily available in this country. Others, particularly the species that Fobes will be looking for, have been collected very rarely.

"Tomatoes are the most important vegetable crop in the United States," Fobes points out. "They provide more nutrition to the human diet than any other vegetable, not because they are so nutritious, but because we eat so many of them."

Five years of working with tomato species and his previous collecting trip have taught Fobes what to look for, when to go, which areas to visit and how many of each species to bring back. He'll gather the fruits of a plant population — all the plants from one area — pick out the seeds and dry them, and then pop them into plastic film canisters fastened to a board, being careful to keep all the seeds from each plant separate from all the rest. This board is his only piece of special equipment.

On his last trip, it may have kept him out of jail.

"I was going north from Peru into Ecuador," he relates. "Usually the only Americans going there from Peru are involved in the drug trade. The border official who took my passport wasn't about to believe that I was collecting tomato seeds. He was sure it was a lie — and a bad lie, at that. After about two hours, I finally showed him the board with the canisters of tomato seeds. Only then did I get my passport back and his OK to be on my way."

New law hikes limit on parents' liability

Persons who can prove in court that their property has been maliciously destroyed by minors may sue the children's parents for damages of up to \$2,500, under a new law sponsored by State Sen. Bob Geake (R-Northville). Gov. Milliken is due to sign it soon.

The law, which won final approval during the last week of the 1978 legislative session, increases from \$1,500 to \$2,500 the maximum liability of parents whose children's actions result in the destruction of other persons' property. Damages could be collected through a civil suit filed in a court of law.

The maximum liability was increased, according to Geake, to reflect the rising costs of repairs.

"The statutory maximum in such cases has remained at \$1,500 for over 10 years," he pointed out. "That amount is simply not enough to begin to recover the cost of repairs in many cases these days."

Geake asserted that malicious and

willful destruction of property by minors has become a "serious problem."

"You read about it in the papers all the time—windows broken, fires set to homes," he noted. "Those whose property has been destroyed often have no recourse but to sue the parents of the children involved."

"Numerous instances have been reported in recent years of children entering schools and other public buildings and causing thousands of dollars worth of damage. Under this law, instead of the taxpayers' having to cover the cost of this destruction, the governmental unit will be able to sue the parents of each child involved, thus reimbursing taxpayers for this cost."

"In addition, churches, which have also experienced destruction of their properties by minors, will be able to utilize this new law to recover damages, thus sparing their congregations the full cost of repairs," he said.

UM pans age fears

Do you dread growing old? A University of Michigan study indicates it probably won't be as bad as you think. "People of all ages told us that they believed the later years are full of problems," reports John E. Tropman, the research scientist who headed the study.

"But when questioned about their own situation, those over 65 claimed that they personally were pretty well off; it was just the rest of their age group that was in trouble."

"While about 10 per cent of those surveyed said that old age was worse than they had expected, 30 percent said it was better than they expected."

"Americans' fear of old age has less to do with years than with powerlessness," Tropman feels. "To many people, 'growing old' means losing control of your life."

The problems that people will face in old age can generally be predicted

by the problems they experience in their youth, Tropman says. "If a person has a low-paying job, for example, he is likely to receive little or no pension and low Social Security benefits and his poverty will be perpetuated. If he has not invested in a home during his early years, he will probably be less able to after retirement."

"Some people feel they cannot afford a medical checkup until they reach the age to be covered by Medicare," Tropman adds. "By this time they may have developed severe or chronic illnesses that could have been avoided through preventive health care."

Tropman said the results of the study show that in general older persons have improved their lot, but he cautions against complacency.

"We must not let this obscure the needs that still exist," he says.

Is new calendar on the horizon?

Since 1923, there has been a movement afoot toward changing to a new calendar.

The Calendar Council of the League of Nations has worked for years on one that could be accepted by all nations of the world.

But custom, tradition and superstition die hard. Our present method of reckoning the passage of time is — except for a few changes — about 2,000 years old.

The Romans of Caesar's time were able to get used to a new calendar, and the British finally gave up their Julian calendar for the Gregorian one, in spite of bitter opposition. And, most likely, by some time in the 21st century, we will have reformed the calendar once more.

WALLACE BARLOW, an industrial engineer, has formulated one that is being recommended by the present Calendar Reform Foundation.

If it is accepted, this calendar will divide the year into 12 equal months, each containing 28 days. The extra days will be spread over holiday periods at the end of each month.

This will require some radical changes in thinking. For instance, the next day after Sunday, Jan. 28, will not be Monday; it will be a holiday, Winter Festival Day. Then the following day will be Feb. 1 and Monday.

The business week and month would be standardized. This would result in efficiency, productivity and a substantial saving, because it now costs an estimated \$1.5 billion each year in extra accounting adjustments due to our present calendar.

UNDER THE suggested plan, the work year would total 240 days. We now have a work year of 255 days. Before World War II, the six-day work week was common, and only six holidays were usually given, making a total of 307 business days a year.

We usually think of ourselves as more fortunate than the overworked serfs of the Middle Ages. However, although they did work longer hours, they observed 115 religious holidays in Europe, plus 52 Sundays, leaving only 198 work days a year.

No matter what the calendar says, witches will undoubtedly go on reckoning the days of their sabbaths in relationship to the vernal and autumnal equinox, and the winter and summer solstices, as they have ever done, and probably ever shall.

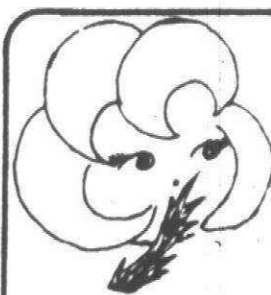

Schools' tax renewal request needs yes vote

Thursday, Jan. 18, residents of Plymouth and Canton will be voting on whether to renew 6.5 mills now being levied by the school district.

The 6.5 mills (\$6.50 per \$1,000 state equalized valuation) would continue to be levied through 1984, if approved by voters.

Passage of the renewal will not result in an increase in the tax rate, but instead will maintain millage at its present level.

Defeat of the renewal would result in a tax reduction of about \$227.50 per year for the owner of a house valued at \$70,000.

THE 6.5 MILLS represents about 13 per cent, or one-seventh, of the total operating budget of Plymouth-Canton Community School District.

Defeat of the renewal, therefore, would mean at least a 13 per cent reduction in program and services. School officials stress, however, that passage of the renewal will not guarantee there will not be program reductions.

The budget makers, school board and citizens' advisory committee now are considering other tax proposals to place on the ballot between now and June. It is expected there will be a request for additional millage and some kind of request for building maintenance.

To approve the renewal is not to preserve programs, but to prevent major cutbacks. Approving the renewal Jan. 18 is best described in this statement from the citizens' election committee: "Renewal alone will not be enough to maintain our present program, but renewal now permits timely planning for next year's budget."

Decisions on additional millage are being delayed by lack of adequate information on the real effect of the Headlee tax limitation amendment, the extent of student growth, the actual size of the tax base, and how the legislature will write the state aid package for the coming year.

Once the schools get more information, voters

will be going to the polls again to decide on a request for additional mills. Right now, the only decision to be made is to renew 6.5 mills.

IT'S REALLY easy to understand why the school district cannot operate at any kind of reasonable level without the 6.5 mills.

With general inflation alone, the district cannot afford a one-seventh cut in its operating budget. Beyond inflation, there are the burgeoning increases in expenses for insurance, utilities and gasoline.

In 1979 the school board also will be negotiating contracts with a number of employee groups, including the teachers' union. Some kind of raises will be agreed upon.

On top of all this, the school district continues to experience a growth in students which means more teachers and other personnel must be hired, and more classroom space must be found.

Decisions about additional taxes can be made later, when specific proposals are decided upon by the

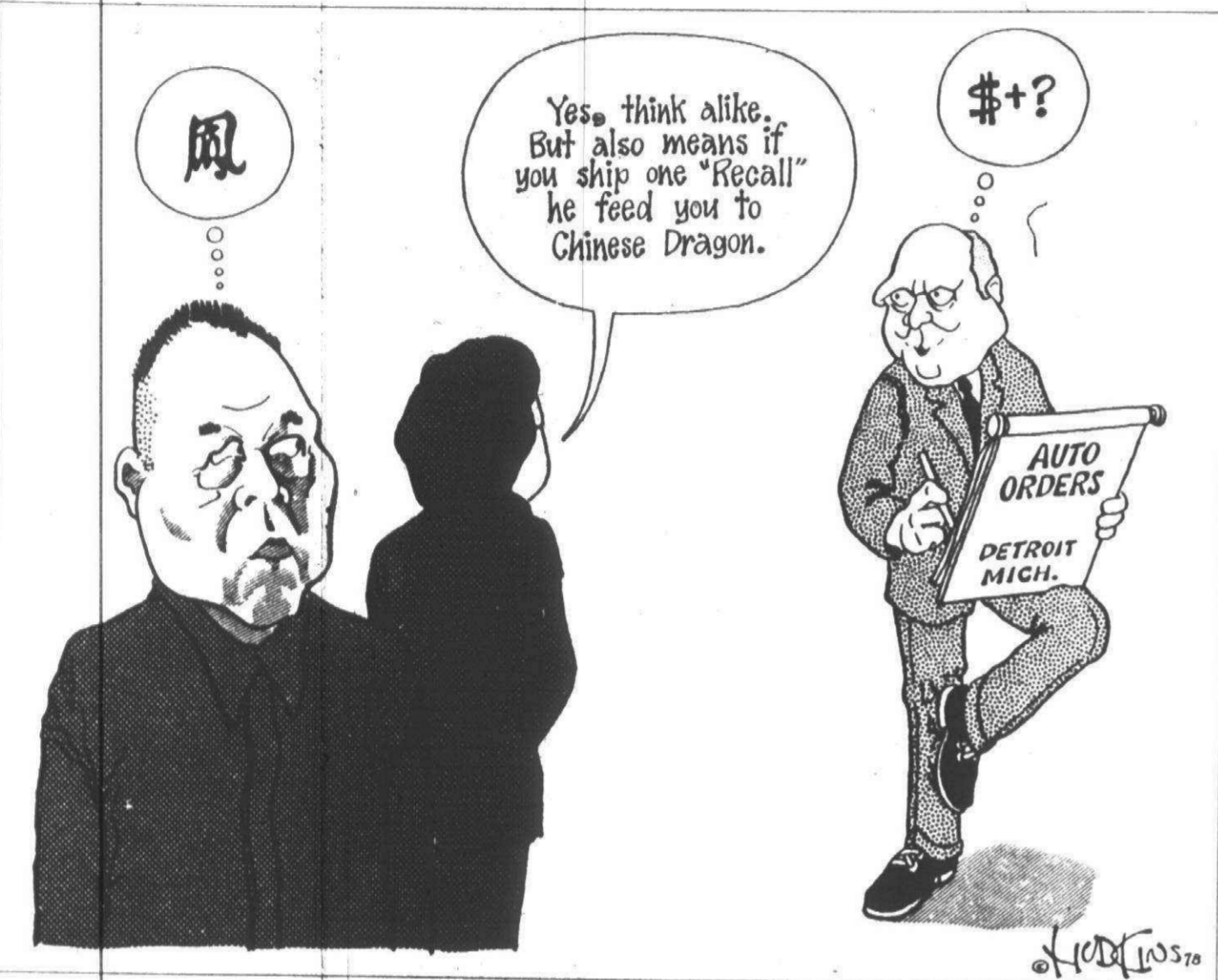
school board. Right now voters must decide whether to renew 6.5 mills on Jan. 18.

The Observer believes the renewal is essential and we urge our readers to vote YES on Thursday. Don't force administrators into crisis planning, but vote "yes" now and allow time for a rational budget process to continue in a timely manner.

We haven't heard a logical reason (or even an illogical one) from anyone to vote against the renewal. So let's get on with it, and pass the renewal the first time around. A "no" vote for emotional reasons is an unnecessary and unwanted disruption.

If you will be out of town or unable to get to the polls, contact the school board offices at 454 S. Harvey, Plymouth, before 2 p.m. Saturday for an absentee ballot.

Whether by absentee or at the polls, however, be sure to join the decision-making process Thursday. It's an important decision—be part of it. Vote "yes" on renewing 6.5 mills on Jan. 18.



Auto show chairman

An optimist about cars

My bookie tells me it's 3-to-1 you have met personally at least one of the 257 new car dealers in the metropolitan area. He makes it even money on your having done business with one or more of their showroom salespersons. They're a fascinating lot, right?

You may be among those who have chortled upon the closing of a deal in the thought that you got the best of it, realizing your trade-in really wasn't worth as much as you were allowed.

Or, you still may be after the salesman's hide, screaming foul epithets because your windows fell out half a mile from the dealership.

Take this as fact: No matter how pious he may be in other directions, the customer looking for a change in automobiles, new or used, can be just as conniving as the horse trader across the desk.

Whoever is the best closer wins. Now comes a nine-day truce. The customers get to share glitter and glamour with the sales folks, from industry moguls on down the line, all putting their best foot forward. The showcase making this possible is the 63rd Detroit Auto Show, opening Saturday at Cobo Hall.

LEO CALHOUN, a Ford dealer who lives and does business in Plymouth, is this year's show chairman on behalf of the sponsoring Detroit Auto Dealers Association.

Like virtually all of his colleagues, Leo is an optimist. He likes to think big, think favorably. I am sure that at birth up in Caseville he already was chalked in on destiny's drawing board as a car salesman.

"The show drew 443,000 people last year, and I think we'll do even better this time—maybe close to half a million," he told me a few days ago. Then he added:

"At our own agency, calendar 1978 was the best sales year in our history. I think '79 will be a good year too. The way the first quarter has started out it may be even better. I'm optimistic."

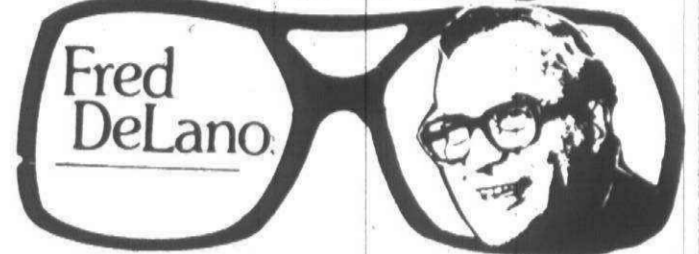
Realize, if you please, the 52-year-old Calhoun is speaking with the background of one who has been in auto sales since 1950, the year he graduated from U-M. After sales and management roles with four different Detroit area dealerships, he bought out Paul Weidman Ford in Plymouth in 1962.

Listen to him again about the Auto Show, which runs through Sunday, Jan. 21.

"IT USED TO BE that the show was held in the fall," he said. "Several years ago we switched it to January to gain sales impetus. Has it paid off? Damn right it has.

"I have had a super committee to work with. Every member has devoted tremendous time to

setting up the plans. We've also had great help from Dan Hayes, executive vice-president of the dealers association.

"Every car dealer knows that the annual show translates itself into increased automotive interest. That means sales. Every dealership of all major American and many foreign manufacturers will have sales personnel on the scene. They'll be taking orders right there as well as building their prospect lists.

"Our theme is 'Best of Everything.' This describes exactly what the public can expect to see."

MOST OF THE TIME, the public sees only the dollar side of the automobile trade. The pressure right from the corporate top makes this necessary.

By the time the demand for results has been relayed from division sales manager to zone manager to field manager to dealer, only sales count.

Many a family can tell you of another, warmer side.

It isn't just of the vehicles dealers have donated to drivers' ed programs in our many high schools. It isn't only of the generosity of auto interests in providing engines and other trifles for students to work on in their shop classes.

The Soap Box Derby was made into a worthy world-wide event for kids by Chevrolet dealers for many years. Punt, Pass & Kick has filled a needed niche for Ford in reaching families through youth.

Plymouth's Trouble Shooter program in which this year alone the representatives of Chrysler-Plymouth are offering \$245,000 in scholarships and other prizes is another example of brilliant marketing and public relations.

At the Auto Show, thank Leo and the dealers of all makes for things like that as well as for showing you pretty cars and pretty girls.

Regional rapid transit: Narrowing the choices

Detroit is the only major metropolitan area that fails to provide public rapid transit for its residents.

It's probably understandable because it is the Motor City, and its economy is dominated by persons who build and sell automobiles.

Michigan as well as Detroit has one of the best freeway systems for moving cars in the nation.

With the questions of availability of fuel in the future and its cost, public transportation is becoming one of the main issues affecting people in Greater Detroit.

Other major metropolitan areas have been working on their public transportation systems for decades. There is no possibility Detroit or Michigan can catch up quickly because there just isn't enough money around to do anything but make a starting gesture.

THE FEDERAL government has granted southeast Michigan \$600 million for a regional transportation system. The problem is that the region must come up with a 20 per cent match—or \$150 million.

While several plans have been considered, there are now really only three on the table.

The first alternative is an all-bus proposal, including increased Dial-A-Ride in Oakland, Macomb and western Wayne counties with the addition of commuter trains from Ann Arbor and Mt. Clemens to Detroit similar to the SEMTA-Grand Trunk line presently serving the Pontiac-Detroit route. It would also include a "people mover" in Detroit which would surround downtown Detroit with a system similar to the people mover that connects Fairlane Shopping Center with the Hyatt Regency Hotel in Dearborn.

This could be accomplished with the funds available.

THE SECOND proposal adds to the first a light rail or streetcar-type of transportation out Woodward Avenue to Eight Mile Road at surface grade except for a small portion underground in the downtown Detroit shopping area.

This would require more than \$900 million from the federal government, which is probably available; but the local match of \$250 million is not presently anywhere to be seen without new taxes.

The third plan would be like the second but would be completely underground from downtown Detroit to Six Mile (McNichols) and at surface grade to Eight Mile.

This would require more than \$1 billion from the federal government and \$290 million in local match.

The subway system, when completed, would cost less to operate than the all-bus system by nearly \$1 million a year.

THE QUESTIONS now are: Should we try to raise the extra money and build the subway and make a start for the future when these lines could be extended farther out Woodward and into Macomb and western Wayne counties?

Or should we live with what can be built with available funds now and probably never have a rapid transit system because escalating costs would make it impossible?

It's not a simple question, but it must be answered in the next six months by the Southeastern Michigan Transportation Authority.

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Those drab, costly plates

Some reflections on the 1979 auto license plates: I don't understand why the incumbent secretary of state must put his name twice on the envelope we receive with the order form for our plates. Every company, every politician, every individual puts his name on the envelope once, if at all.

In this year's packet is a pink slip explaining why license plate fees have gone up. But Richard H. Austin doesn't put his name on that.

Actually, I do understand what he is doing. The incumbent secretary of state seeks free advertising on favorable or neutral material but keeps his name off tax material that might get the voters' sore. It's Austin's way of campaigning at public expense.

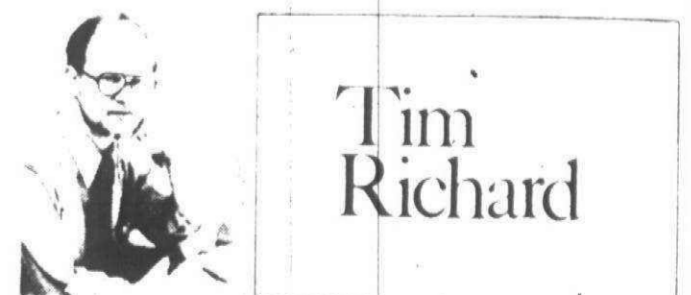
In the 1978 campaign, you hardly ever saw him. The Austin campaign was almost non-existent. The reason is that he had been campaigning with state envelopes and state TV ads for eight years.

By the way, if you have a friend who has received a driver's license suspension notice, ask to look at it and see if you can find Dick Austin's name.

ZOLTON FERENCY, whose chances of being elected to anything are so slim that he can afford to tell the truth, once remarked that the secretary of state's only job is to pick the license plate colors, and he botches even that.

He was talking about James Hare when he said it, but the comment applies to our 1979 black and white plates, the drabest and most unimaginative in anyone's memory.

Austin must be getting some heat for this year's selection, because his public information officer this week sent out a fact sheet on the topic. It says: "Colors are selected based on strong visibility factors of color combinations. In a study conducted



several years ago, the conclusion stated: 'Legibility is best when letters and background have high contrast such as black on white or the reverse.'

The quote is from T.W. Forbes of the psychology department and the Highway Traffic Safety Center at Michigan State University. Austin's name can be found in the letterhead, in very small type. In other words, he's not proud of the 1979 plates.

MICHIGAN'S 1976-8 plates, with their combination of a flag theme and the waves of the Great Lakes, were the most distinguished in the nation, in many folks' views.

Another dandy is Colorado's, with the letters on a silhouette of the Rocky Mountains.

FUNNY THING about the license applications we received in the mail:

There are return envelopes so you can subscribe to the Michigan Natural Resources and Michigan History magazines, but no return envelope to the secretary of state. Dick Austin's oversight.

Just Between Us

We're anxious about normal anxiety

Somewhere, somehow many of us pick up the idea that our behavior should be effortless and perfect.

Coping with life should be easy. We think that we should be able to meet difficulties without difficulty. If we become anxious in facing a new situation, for example, this is upsetting to us.

We assume that others don't experience such anxiety or difficulty. Because we do, we think that something is wrong with us.

Sometimes the problems of coping are compounded for us. A spiral is set off.

Experiencing unexpected difficulty or anxiety causes further feelings of upset. The mere fact that we are anxious causes us to feel even more anxious. Upset feeds off upset.

Occasionally we may be unable to complete the task that we face. If we do manage to get through with it, we expend much more effort and energy than others seem to use in comparable situations. Things are harder for us than is necessary because of the anxiety spiral.

WHAT IS MISSING is a baseline for judging normal behavior. We lack an appropriate gauge for

measuring what is happening to us.

Our ignorance about human behavior comes from many and varied sources. Two can be readily identified.

One is the "assumption of adult omnipotence." As children, we tend to feel that adults are all-powerful. We usually don't see adults experiencing difficulty in doing things. Certainly, by comparison with ourselves when we were children, they do things easily.

As we grow up some of us do not change this attitude toward others. Unwittingly, we continue to view ourselves as childlike and others as "omnipotent adults."

"False reassurance" is another common source of ignorance and confusion for us.

As children we sometimes are told by others that we shouldn't feel uncertain or uncomfortable. "It's all right." "Don't be afraid." "There's nothing to it." "It's easy, give it a try."

Such well-meaning attempts to reassure us may do more harm than good. Many youngsters never learn that the adults are assuming the presence of anxiety and uncertainty.

The unsuspecting adults don't know that they are

heard as calling for effortless behavior. Children have little opportunity to "test reality."

Youngsters may conclude that something is wrong with them because they are afraid. Things don't seem easy. They don't seem all right.

AS ADULTS we can be in a different position.

We can examine our experiences more knowledgeably than children. We have many more external sources against which we can check our perceptions.

A simple baseline for judging normal behavior includes two significant parts. Understanding and accepting them can help us to avoid getting into a spiral.

First, it is normal to feel insecure, uncertain, or frustrated in certain circumstances. Whenever we get into unfamiliar situations, it is normal to feel uncertain.

Starting a new job or learning a new task causes us to feel awkward. Feeling "all thumbs" or as if we have "two left feet" is to be expected.

Typically, such feelings recede as we become more familiar with the new task and role. There are many other situations in which feeling uncomfort-

able is par for the course.

SECOND, WE ARE not alone in our feelings. Others do have the same kinds of feelings that we have in unfamiliar circumstances.

We sometimes feel as if others are "superpersons" who have no difficulties. Seemingly, they do things with ease. We may compare ourselves unfavorably with them.

The truth is that we usually don't know what is happening inside other persons. They may not be having very much trouble in coping with the situation. Or they may be masking their anxiety very well.

The chances are that they also are undergoing difficulty in dealing with the problems in the situation. If there ever were "superpersons" around—which is doubtful—they are a rare, endangered species today. Most of us are "more simply human than otherwise."

Understanding that anxiety is a normal human emotion experienced by others is important in our coping. Such understanding will not help us to avoid normal anxiety or difficulties in living. But it can help us to avoid becoming "anxious because we are anxious."

Ask the Educator

Teacher calls

QUESTION: My 11-year-old sixth grade son is full of life and mischief. His teacher has called me at work three times to talk with me about it.

I don't think these problems are serious enough to interrupt me at my job. Also, it's embarrassing. Teachers are paid good money nowadays and should be able to teach and control small children with out bothering parents at work.

I must work in order to pay the local school tax which pays that teacher's salary. I'm fed up. What with high taxes and lazy teachers who earn more than me, I shouldn't be asked to do their job, too.

How can I keep the school people from hasseling me at work.

ANSWER: I am sorry, Mrs. A. S., but I think you're wrong. You had better pay attention to your son's school behavior before it develops into more serious incidents.

He couldn't be learning optimally if he is a chronic classroom behavior problem. Your son is showing quite

clearly the result of your lack of involvement in his school life.

Thank goodness your son's teacher is persistent. I hope she continues to prod you until you find you can no longer brush off the school's concern.

Teachers work very hard for their pay and deserve every penny they earn. It has only been during the last 10 years or so that teacher salaries have risen to a respectable level.

Teachers, like nurses, have traditionally been expected to minister to us for hardly a thank-you.

SADLY, THERE are increasing numbers of parents who wish to hold schools responsible for child rearing as well as teaching.

There is no denying that schools do teach right and wrong and basic ethics, but we can't expect them to replace the family in moral training.

Please heed your teacher's warning and involve yourself in your son's school life. In just two or three years he will be well into adolescence and less amenable to your influence. You really don't have much time.



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For Wayne County

Commissioners discuss merits of executive plan

Everybody agrees that Wayne County government should be changed, but few agree on what new form it should take.

Supporters of a county executive form of government and persons favoring a county charter had their say Tuesday during a meeting of Wayne's board of commissioners legislative committee. The meeting was called to find out more about the county executive form of government.

Supporters said the governmental change would consolidate power, authority and responsibility in one office. Opponents said it would not have any effects on Wayne County's government and its many problems.

Last year the board killed the attempts of four suburban commission-

ers to put a proposal calling for an elected executive on the ballot.

While the commissioners heard from a number of political, labor and civic association officials, the spotlight fell on Oakland County's Daniel T. Murphy, Michigan's only elected county executive. He will join in the near future by a Bay County executive — a recent decision of that county's voters.

Murphy said the new form of government would mean consolidation, efficiency and, most importantly, a single voice speaking for Wayne County in Lansing and Washington.

"A COUNTY executive would go to Washington representing 2.5 million people. How hard do you think Congress would listen to you?" Murphy asked rhetorically.

"I think they'd listen damn hard," he said.

"It might not be what the mayor of the City of Detroit wants. But you'll get more representation in Lansing and Washington than what you have now without one head," he said.

Murphy admitted he had other motives in favoring a county executive form of government for the state's largest county.

The Oakland executive has tried repeatedly, without success, to convince the state legislature to allow him to incorporate the autonomous Oakland County Road Commission and the county parks and recreation commission into his administration. Amendments to the law allowing counties to adopt an elected county executive or an ap-

pointed administrator form of government are needed to bring the parks and road commissions under the executive's control.

"We've tried to get the changes regarding the road and parks commissions and we're getting no place.

"In order for me to get those changes, I need Wayne County to support those changes," Murphy said.

Murphy advised Wayne County commissioners to push for the change even though state legislation defining the county executive's powers remains imperfect.

"The special interests (in the legislature) pulled out the road commission. They pulled out the parks commission. They worked until we didn't have the bill we really wanted. But," Murphy said, "it's better than no bill at all."

THOSE WHO disagreed said the county executive was not the cure-all

for Wayne County's many fiscal and administrative problems.

State Rep. Claude Trim (D-Detroit), an Oakland County native, said, "Going to a county executive is not a panacea. You're going to have a lot of problems." He did not oppose the plan, though.

Wayne County Commissioner Arthur Carter (D-Detroit) emerged as the plan's most vocal opponent.

Carter called an elected county executive "window dressing." "A county executive would just be one more elected official in Wayne County," he said.

He said the new form of government would result in a "political boss, a dictator who would operate in our community without the appropriate checks and balances."

Moreover, he added, "the racial hostility, which still unfortunately exists, could find itself lodged in the county executive."

Fund's board meets Jan. 16

The annual meeting of the Plymouth Community Fund will begin 8 p.m. Tuesday, Jan. 16, in Plymouth Township Hall at Ann Arbor Road and Lilley.

Among the business of the board of directors will be election of new members to the board. Nominees include Janet Brass, Clarence DuCharme, John Wiltse and James Boyce.

The directors also will receive a verbal report on Big Brothers and Big Sisters, agencies which are being added to those which will receive funds in 1979 from the Plymouth Community Fund.

The president of the fund's board is Fr. Kenneth MacKinnon, pastor of Our Lady of Good Counsel Catholic Church in Plymouth.

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
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

TV crew and Dan Rather visit the Sheehans

Dan Rather, whose probing interviews have made many a public figure squirm, is really a delightful person. This was the assessment of Nancy and Russell Sheehan after Rather and a CBS-TV crew spent about an hour recently at the Sheehans' home on Auburndale in Livonia.

The result of the late November visit was televised Sunday evening as part of CBS's 60-Minutes program. The Sheehans and their son, Rusty, were involved in a segment on Mainstreaming, a program which places special education students in regular classrooms.

Michigan has been a pioneer in Mainstreaming, soon to become, by federal law, a national program. Interviews in Wayne County showed pro and con reactions to mainstreaming. The Sheehans and Rusty, who is almost

blind, had positive things to say about the program.

RATHER, two photographers, the producer and researcher arrived in two cars. They had been staying at the Hyatt Regency in Dearborn while working on the story.

"They all were very professional and very nice," said Nancy Sheehan. They used a 16-millimeter camera and let the two children look through the lens. They set up their lights and talked about their recent job in South America where they had been doing a segment on Howard Hughes.

They had stayed at the hotel where Hughes lived and heard many stories about what a strange person he was.

Jennifer Sheehan had broken her arm and was wearing a cast. "Mr. Rather said, 'Could I sign your cast be-

fore I leave?' It was nice to have him offer soon after his arrival," said Mrs. Sheehan, adding, "We would have asked before he left."

She summed it up: "The interview was a happy big family experience."

MRS. SHEEHAN also praised Brook Janis, the research person who had been working on the story since August and paying the way for the actual interview and shooting.

"She is really a neat person. I can't say enough positive things about the whole group."

The Sheehans were notified that the Mainstreaming story would run Jan. 7. Nancy's partner, Wilma Halliburton, who is co-owner of Folks, a shop in Plymouth, hosted a television viewing party for the occasion.

More than 40 friends, parents, educa-

tors and special education personnel gathered at the Halliburton home in Plymouth to watch 60 Minutes. The discussion that followed was lively.

The Sheehans had wondered how much of the hour-long interview would be cut to become part of a 20-minute segment.

They represented parents who were enthusiastic about the program. The anti-mainstreaming reactions also were presented.

On the whole, the Sheehans were satisfied and pleased with their parts in the news show. Russell taped the sound and on second listening, they understood more clearly why certain parts were used.

"WE ARE VERY lucky here in Livonia to have a teacher consultant. This teacher understands the child and works hand-in-hand with the parents

and the general education teacher," explained Mrs. Sheehan. "Parents, educators and special education personnel all are working together to help the handicapped child grow and find a place in society."

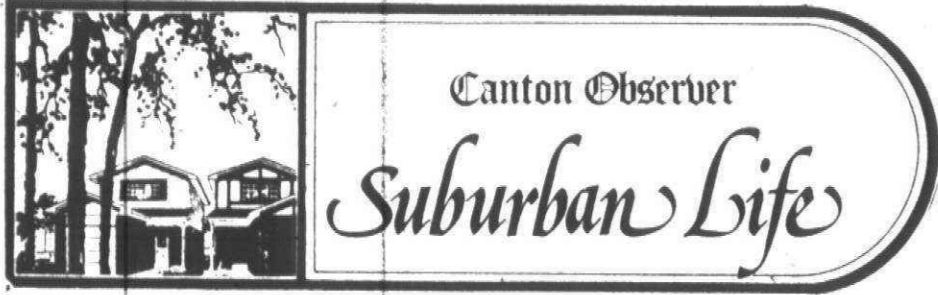
She is a member of the Michigan School for the Blind, the Livonia Parents and the Wayne Parent advisory committees.

"The discussion afterwards was great fun," Nancy said. "We called James Briner to get his reaction."

Health plan

Metro, Ford hospitals to join

A new Detroit area health plan involving cooperation between Metropolitan Hospital and Henry Ford Hospital is now in the final stages of negotiation and is expected to go into effect late in February.

Called the Health Alliance Plan, it will make use of both Detroit based hospitals plus their outlying health centers. Ford Hospital has centers in Dearborn, West Bloomfield and Troy, with the latter offering only limited services. Metropolitan operates Metropolitan West Hospital in Westland plus additional centers in Detroit, Dearborn and Allen Park.

According to a hospital administrator involved in negotiations, the Alliance plan was founded with the cooper-

ation of the Big Three auto companies and the United Auto Workers with the hope of saving money on health care costs.

They also felt that competition provided by the plan might move Michigan Blue Cross and Blue Shield toward better cost containment procedures.

Marketing of the new plan will probably begin in late February, with individuals being invited to participate as well as those who can opt for the plan through their place of employment.

THE MOST NOTABLE feature of the plan is that it will operate as a health maintenance organization (HMO). This means that participants will get more than the hospital care offered by the Blues and other insurance companies. They will also have their day-to-day health care needs met through visits to the various medical centers operated by the two hospital systems.

Since it was founded 19 years ago by UAW president Walter Reuther, Metropolitan has operated as an HMO. But it is a new departure for Ford Hospital, one of the largest in the area, to offer its facilities for an HMO program.

"We spent a lot of time with the medical staff at Ford Hospital reviewing the concept of HMOs and their implications," said Dave Campbell, a Ford Hospital employee who has been given a new assignment under the new system. "It ended with support by the staff for involvement with the HMO."

Ford Hospital expects that only from five to 10 per cent of its patients will be part of the plan. It will continue in its role as a major referral center and as a fee-for-service hospital.

HAP is now going through the final phases of obtaining a state license and federal certification. However, a significant move toward implementation was made last October when Ford Hos-

pital signed a management contract to administer the Metropolitan system. Just prior to that move, it had been administered by its own staff. Before that it was under the auspices of Blue Cross-blue shield.

CAMPBELL, WHO IS the new administrator of the Metropolitan system for Ford, pointed out the cooperation between the two hospitals does not mean there has been a merger.

"Each hospital will maintain its separate identity," he explained, adding that Ford Hospital's involvement in the day to day running of Metropolitan "is limited to me."

Each hospital will continue to have its own board. HAP will also have its own board. James Walworth, president of HAP, pointed out that its board will be made up of representatives of the big three auto companies, other companies, the UAW, the two hospital and consumers.

Under Michigan's HMO law, one-third of the board must be made up of subscribers elected by the other subscribers. "They must be elected within 12 months of the licensing by the state," he added.

It is the hope of the HAP administrator that the plan will have 130,000 members in five years.

For the 75,000 now participating in the Metro Health Plan through Metropolitan Hospital, there will be little visible change. They will, however, receive new membership cards bearing the Alliance name.

It was the Ford Motor Co., searching for a way to reduce the costs of health care for its workers that initiated the plan. It requested representatives from the California HMO, Kaiser-Permanente, to come to the area and do a survey.

"In 1977, Kaiser concluded an HMO

would be feasible," noted Campbell. "A suggestion was made that Ford Hospital be included and provide management of the system."

Contact was made with the other two auto companies. The UAW was put in the picture through the negotiations with Metropolitan Hospital. Vice-president Ken Bannon is president of the Metropolitan board.

"We were pleased with the idea," said Bannon. "We hope it will cause more people to get involved in HMOs. They will get more service, and they are not as costly."

Possibly too, inspiration came from comments made by Joseph Califano made in an address last year to representatives of leading U.S. companies.

"HMOs save money," he told them. "Our best evidence suggests that HMOs can reduce outpatient visits by 15 per cent and hospitalization by 30-60 per cent. A national reduction of only 10 per cent in hospital use would have saved \$3.2 billion last year. With total spending on hospital care at \$64 billion in 1977, the potential impact of HMOs becomes truly impressive."

HMOs save money several ways

"They practice preventive medicine. For a minimum fee a subscriber can see a doctor. Through the MHP a patient can see a doctor for a complete checkup at a Metropolitan health center for from \$3 to \$4, depending on the kind of coverage. A similar fee is charged for needed lab services. This encourages patients to come in vertically instead of horizontally, say HMO administrators. Because costs are low, they seek help before they get so ill they require hospitalization."

"Tests are done on an outpatient basis, whereas in most other plans a patient must be hospitalized to have his tests covered by insurance. With the

No one likes to consider the possibility that some day a pet might be injured in an accident.

Yet given the fact that most dogs and cats are free to roam the house and neighborhood, it's best to be prepared to administer first aid to your pet.

The first step in providing first aid should be to take precautions against being bitten or scratched—even if your pet is normally good-natured. Do not assume that a pet in pain will recognize a familiar voice or face. Use a blanket or jacket to cover the pet's head, or convert a scarf into a temporary muzzle so you can examine the animal safely. To examine a cat, you may need a friend to restrain the cat's feet while you hold its head.

In any accident, the most obvious injuries will be broken bones or heavy bleeding. Broken limbs usually stick out at an unnatural angle and must be immobilized with a temporary splint and some taping. The splint and broken leg should be wrapped firmly together to prevent further movement which may cause additional bleeding or tissue damage.

The easiest method to control heavy bleeding is direct pressure over the wound by applying a clean handkerchief with your fingers. Blood that is bright red and spurting out rhythmically comes from an artery; darker, slower flowing blood comes from a vein. If you are unable to stop the blood in a few minutes using a pressure bandage, you may have to try a tourniquet. A tourniquet is a narrow strip of material (a tie, stocking or belt) tied tightly between the heart and the wound. Tourniquets must be loosened for one minute at 5 to 8 minute intervals so that the tissues below the tourniquet are not completely deprived of oxygen and blood.

If your pet has stopped breathing, you must apply artificial respiration. Lay the pet out on its right side, and gently pull the tongue out of its mouth as far as possible. Apply even steady pressure on the rib cage, with your hands. Press down approximately every five seconds. Do it slowly but with strong pressure to the chest area. The firm pressure also massages the heart. You may have to work on the animal a half hour or

more. There's always the possibility of reviving an animal as long as there is a heartbeat.

Heavy bleeding, trauma, pain and severe fright all contribute to the development of shock, even if major injuries are not present. Major symptoms of shock in animals include pale, grayish gums and lips. Treat shock with warmth and comfort. Cover the animal with blankets and speak soothingly.

If the animal is fully conscious, stimulants such as warm coffee or strong tea may be given by the spoonful into the corner of the mouth. In small doses, they will stimulate the heart and blood circulation, fighting against shock. If the pet is unconscious or semi-conscious, do not give it anything by mouth. Liquids may strangle an unconscious animal by passing into the lungs instead of the stomach.

Even if your pet seems to have no major injuries and is recovering from the shock of the accident, it's best to visit your veterinarian right away. Internal injuries may not show up immediately and delay in treatment may mean permanent damage.

When members of the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints recently decided to expand their education horizons, they decided to draw

upon the creative abilities of their own members. That is why when their creative workshop opens on Saturday, Jan. 13, in

the Westland Stake Center, 7575 N. Hix, Westland, it will be mostly a case of Mormon teaching Mormon.

The public is welcome from 1:30-4 p.m., and no pre-registration is necessary.

Teachers will be coming from all over southeastern Michigan. Jolene Clawson of Taylor will be an instructor in instrumental music writing, and Wanda Lynch, an artist from Monroe, will teach drawing. Painting will have Sandy Earnest of Troy as teacher, and vocal music writing and children's music writing will be explained by Ruth Lehenbauer of Dearborn.

Canton Township's David Draper, an amateur photographer, will help aspiring shutterbugs with composition. In the 2 1/4-hour class, they will also be taught to develop film and make prints.

"I think they will learn to take better pictures," said Draper, who is employed as a manufacturing engineer by the Ford Motor Co. at its transmission plant in Livonia. "They will see how to get a better depth of field, and how to use the camera to avoid including background material."

Draper became interested in photography because of another hobby, astronomy. He wants to work up to taking astronomical pictures through a telescope.

"For the most part, we are using our own members as instructors for this workshop," said Karen Spencer of Taylor, who is in charge of workshop preparations. From Utah, she is new to the area.

"We went outside the church for some," Ms. Spencer said. "We were looking for teachers who understand the churchgoer and what he might want to learn. We like to encourage people to develop the arts in an uplifting manner."

Posters: They've gained popularity and they're keeping us in touch with art

Poster art has reached new heights as an art form in the last two years. It's selling like hotcakes—and its buyers are by no means limited to lofty art collectors with ready cash.

Posters are affordable for all people, whether they're on a budget or not.

Today, art posters and the graphic art of many artists from various media can be seen in local galleries, business and homes.

Consumers are buying posters as art—which wasn't their original purpose—as advertisements for an artist's exhibit or for an entertainment event.

"Posters are developed to serve as a means of drawing attention to a happening, but end up being more than just an advertisement, according to Mary Wright, proprietor of Xochipilli Gallery in Rochester.

"Poster art is its own type of art form," explained Ms. Wright. "It's done for a purpose. Many of the finest posters are done by commissioned artists. The artist conceives the art for the poster differently than he or she would for a painting.

"Of course, some art posters are made for a retrospective exhibit of an artist's work. These usually contain a painting already done by the artist, such as the poster for the Matisse exhibit at the Detroit Institute of Arts. But the ones commissioned—those are representative of poster art," Ms. Wright said.

POSTER ART is believed to have originated from the palette of creative French artists, such as Henri de Toulouse-Latrec and Jules Cheret, in the late 1890s.

Then Art Nouveau, a meshing of fine arts and industrial design, gave thrust to poster art and graphic design as early as 1880. Many of the posters copied those of Cheret and Toulouse-Latrec, in that the artists brought a sense of color and design into their poster work.

Poster collecting in the 1890s reached the proportions of a mania. The printing of extra copies intended for specific advertising campaigns was common in the late 1890s and is common now.

For instance, according to Ms. Wright, posters are also designed to raise money for a specific fund. A good example of this is the poster for the 1972 Munich Olympics.

"The poster was designed for the Olympics in 1972 not so much as an advertisement as much as to raise money for the Olympics Committee," she said. The Detroit Institute of Arts, 5200 Woodward, has been selling posters promoting exhibits at the museum

and at other museums for 10 years. Sales have boomed in the last couple years, according to Robert Scott, manager of the museum's gift shop.

"OUR MATISSE POSTER that we had for the exhibit sold out," said Scott. "Last year was our best year for selling poster art. I can't remember a better year."

Scott also considers poster art an art form.

"Indeed, I do find it a step toward getting interested in, and owning, original art. People buy posters because they like what they see. A poster is a way to remember the exhibit they saw," Scott said.

Posters at the museum range in cost from \$3 to a print to \$25 unframed for an original art poster.

Collecting poster art is, for some people, a way of investing their money. Some posters go out of print. This has an upswing effect on their market value. And if the poster is signed by the artist or designer, its value increases even more.

To reach consumers who want good art at different price levels, Xochipilli at 115 E. Fourth is dedicating its entire second floor to poster art. Posters, sold framed, unframed or museum mounted, are hanging on the walls and are in bins.

One can see posters that range from those commemorating a birthday of symphonies to retrospective exhibit announcements, to others promoting the music of famous composers such as Ira and George Gershwin.

BARBARA TYSON, gallery assistant at Xochipilli, said people are buying poster art not only because it's good art but also because it's moderately priced and decorative.

"Poster art is highly decorative for the price," said Ms. Tyson. "It allows the person on a budget to have something by one of her favorite artists."

Posters aren't just for hanging in houses, however.

They have been used extensively in Great Oaks Mall in Avon Township in such stores as Sperm Becker's Shoes and Heidi's Hair Salon. Win Schuler's Restaurant on Rochester Road has a selection of design posters on its walls.

Ms. Wright recently delivered 47 posters to one law firm.

There are countless collectors of posters. Many of them are individuals one would expect to have only original paintings on their walls.

But posters have a certain touch that paintings can't offer. Posters keep mankind in touch with past events and famous persons while, at the same time, lavishing walls with artistic designs.

After studying at the Art University of Tokyo, where he combined conducting with instrumental studies, he was appointed assistant conductor of the NHK Symphony, one of Japan's leading orchestras. Since 1960 he has led the NHK Symphony on many world tours.

His American debut was with the Detroit Symphony at Meadow Brook in July 1967. This is his seventh appearance with the orchestra. Iwaki was appointed chief conductor of the Melbourne Symphony in 1973 and now divides his time between his post as chief conductor of the NHK Symphony in Tokyo, Melbourne and his home in Europe.

sons" stars Agnes Moorehead and Tim Holt, both of whom won the National Board of Review's Best Acting award for their performances.

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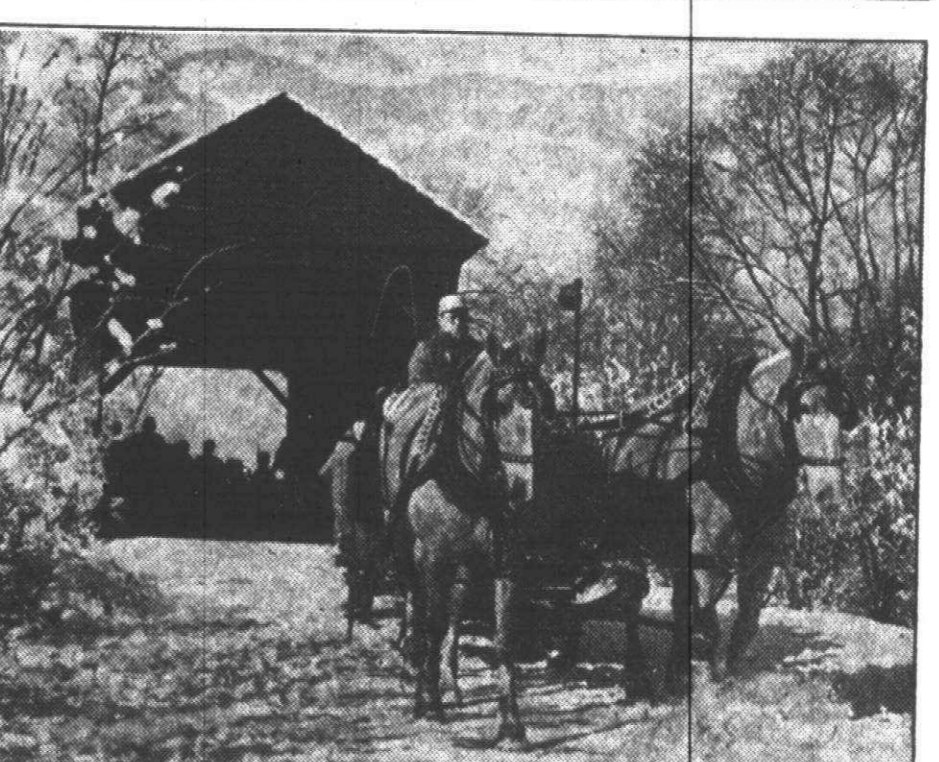
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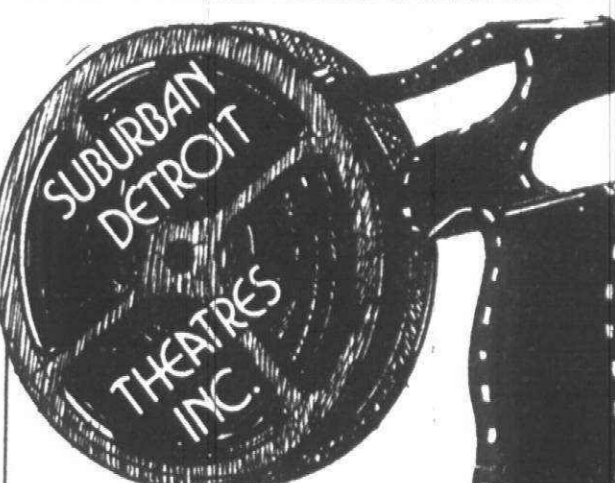
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Memories of past glories

Walled Lake's Casino stepped out in style

When you stepped out to the Walled Lake Casino, you stepped out in style.

Thirteen years ago, the dance hall at the corner of Thirteen Mile and Novi, was destroyed by the second fire in its 48-year history.

While its roots go back to 1917, the casino enjoyed its heyday in the late '40s when big bands led by such greats as Glenn Miller, Tommy Dorsey and Guy Lombardo entertained thousands.

For six nights a week during the summer, couples would dance on the polished maple dance floor with chandeliers dangling from the ceiling and spotlights waving to and fro.

And the men and women came dressed to kill.

"You weren't even allowed in there without a suit and tie," Ed Yerkes, of Northville, recalls. "You had to be dressed properly."

No liquor was served. Coca-Cola was the strongest drink in the house.

The first casino was constructed by Judd Taylor and his sons, Jake and Ernest, in 1917. In the mid-twenties, a fire destroyed the structure and a new, larger building was built by Louis and Leona Tolettene in 1928.

The casino was a pretty rough place in the '20s, according to Yerkes.

"The Oakland County Sheriff's department was always there," he said. "They were running a shuttle service between the casino and the jail."

IN 1946, Leona Tolettene leased the building to her nephews, Albert and Elmer Tolettene. Under the management of the brothers, the casino became an entertainment landmark in the nation. The dance hall rivaled the Glen Island Casino in New York and the Meadowbrook in New Jersey as the most glamorous in the country.

Although the popularity of the big band sound began to wane in the late 1950s, the casino drew large crowds throughout its long history. And during the '6000 boom years, the casino was jammed nightly with headliners like Les Brown, Jan Garber, Wayne King, Sammy Kaye and Ralph Flanagan.

"Ralph Flanagan and his band set

the attendance record at the casino," said Elmer Tolettene, now a supervisor in a tool and die factory in Deckerville. "There were more than 4,000 people there and I remember we had to turn more than 2,000 people away."

With such big-name talent appearing, the Walled Lake Casino became the place to go in the Detroit area.

"When the place was really cleaned up and going, half of Grosse Pointe would turn out," Yerkes said.

Perhaps because of the policy, there were few disorderly conduct incidents during the years the Tolettene brothers were in charge.

Elmer Tolettene says the best years were right after the Second World War.

"That's when everybody came out of the service," he said. "The Big bands were really booming."

BUT IN THE late '50s the big band business began to drop. The brothers decided to close the dance hall in 1960.

A year later, the casino was sold to O. J. Kraemer of Union Lake, who tried in vain to keep the sound of the big bands blasting out, but, like the Tolettene brothers, found it an uphill battle.

"I renovated it, put heat into it, redecorated it and I tried to bring the big band era back," Kraemer said. "I thought the bands could make a comeback, but television kept the people home."

Kraemer finally gave in to the changing times and converted the casino into a teenage rock and roll palace.

Although many of the oldtimers looked on such a transformation as a betrayal of sorts, the casino did enjoy several years in the early '60s catering to the younger set.

Jerry Sutton, now with the Walled Lake Schools recreation department, remembers going to the casino to see famous—or soon to be famous—entertainers such as Dionne Warwick, Stevie Wonder, Chuck Berry, Fabian and Del Shannon.

Sutton recalls wearing pegged pants, points (pointed shoes) and greased back hair when he made the scene at the casino.

"The building was filled just about every night," he said.

Although no liquor was served, Sutton admits the crowd did sneak a goodly amount inside and trouble was more common than uncommon.

Novi Police Chief Lee BeGole says he posted about 30 special officers at the casino every weekend, but sometimes even that number was unable to cope with the crowds.

"I remember when Fabian arrived," BeGole said. "I put 12 officers in the front of the entranceway. Well, those kids swept past those officers like they weren't even there."

"WE GOT Fabian in by way of the back door, but let me tell you, that Fabian disappointed me. He was pantomiming. He wasn't singing his songs."

But Sutton, and about 3,000 other teenagers, didn't notice or seem to mind that the singer was lip-syncing his songs.

A local group, The Barons, was playing on Christmas night, 1965 when the casino burned to the ground shortly after closing time. Firefighters from seven area departments responded to the scene, but not soon enough to save the building.

Two explanations have been given as the cause of the fire: either a careless smoker dropped a cigarette or a rusted out fuel line to an overhead heater ignited the blaze.

Canton kills Farmington

Plymouth Canton, playing with the reckless scoring abandon it showed earlier this season, mounted an unbelievable 88-26 advantage late in the third quarter before breezing to an easy 91-46 victory over non-league foe Farmington High School Tuesday night in Farmington.

And if it wasn't for a nine-point Falcon spree at the start of the fourth quarter against the Canton reserves, things may have been even worse for coach Rich Roy's squad.

Roy admitted this was his club's worse effort of the season, although an impressive outside shooting performance by the visiting Chiefs was the highlight of the Canton massacre.

"It was no contest," the Farmington coach admitted after watching his squad drop to a 2-7 record overall. "They (Canton) set the world on fire, but we are better than that. We didn't move the ball offensively until the fourth period."

Canton coach Craig Bell was understandably happy with his team's effort, as he saw the Chiefs' record raised to 6-2 overall this season.

"We knew we had to have a good one coming off a defeat," the Canton coach said. (Canton fell to arch-rival Plymouth Salem by 18 points before the holiday break). "We wanted to come out and establish tempo, play hard, and work our butts off on defense. We accomplished what we wanted to do."

"They (Farmington) were only 2-6, but we didn't want to come out and have them make us look bad."

Canton looked anything but bad from the very start, taking a 22-8 lead after the first eight minutes of action. The Chiefs then hit their first seven shots from the floor in the second quarter and 12 of 16 in the entire period to take a 52-20 margin at halftime.

The Chiefs hit their first eight of 11 shots in the third quarter as the onslaught continued in the second half. Canton put together a 32-point third quarter scoring spree before the reserves saw action the rest of the way.

Canton's sharp-shooting senior guard Butch King regained the shooting touch

he has lacked in recent games, scoring 29 points to lead all scorers. King finished the night hitting 13 of 20 shots from the floor and added three free throws.

Teammate Rusty Mandle played a sparkling floor game, adding 15 points. Mike Gollnick canned 10 and Scott Adler added eight.

Farmington featured 12 of its 13 players in the scoring column, but no Falcon cager reached double figures. Jim Bobey and Jeff McGrath each tallied eight points for the losers.

Canton had 11 of its 12 players reach the scoring column. Senior third-forward Frank LaSota did not play because of a broken rib suffered last month.

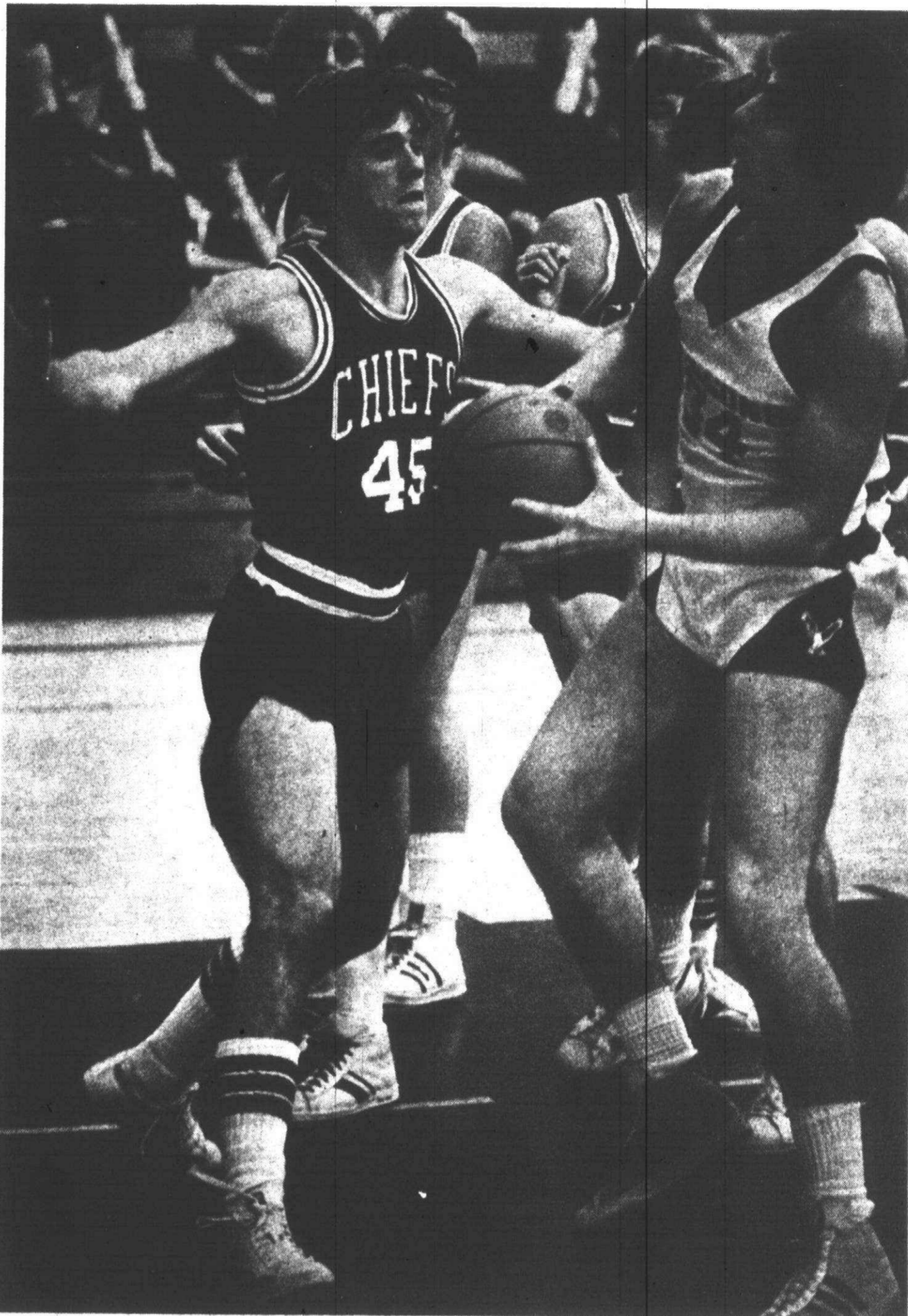

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
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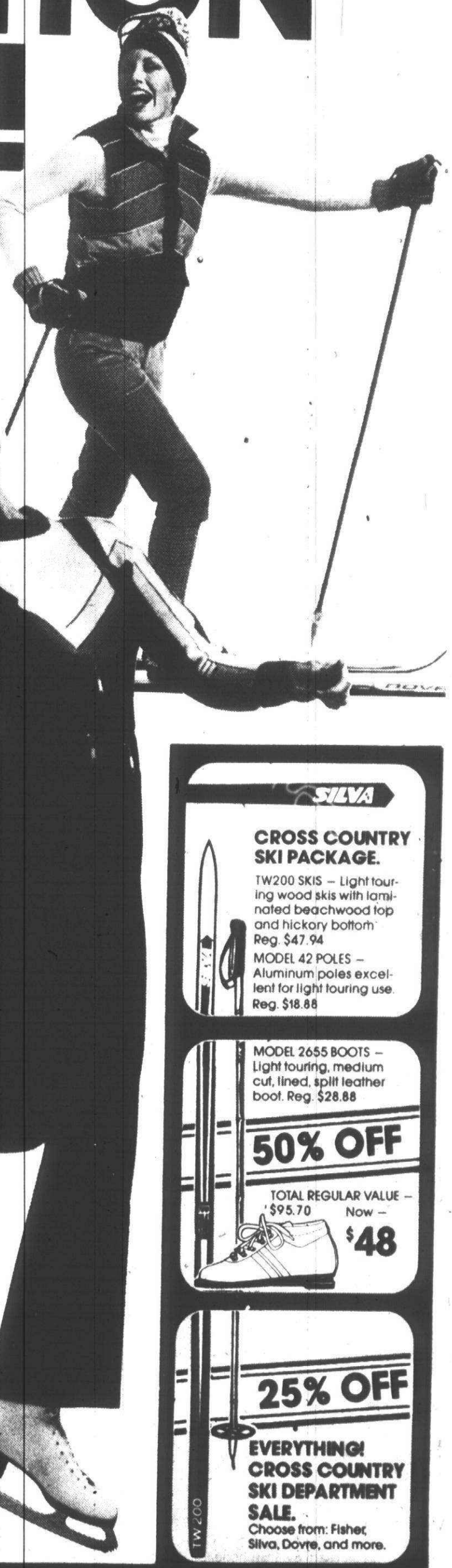
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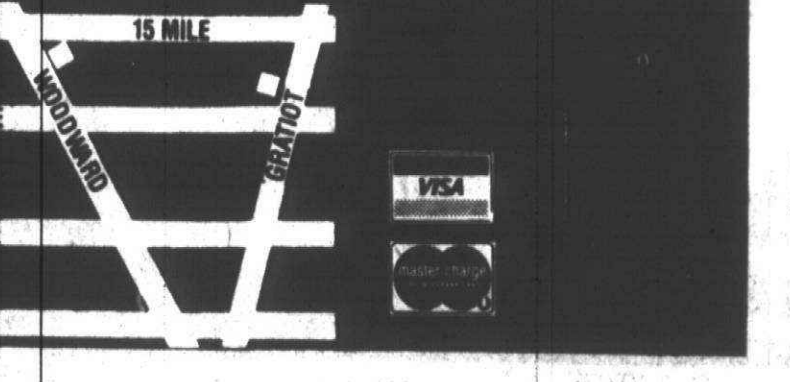
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Crisler celebrates 80th birthday

Former athletic director revolutionizes football

Fritz Crisler, retired athletic director at the University of Michigan and the man who changed the entire concept of intercollegiate football with the introduction of the two platoon system in 1945, has reached another milestone in his colorful life.

Tomorrow (Friday), he is celebrating his 80th birthday. With his usual diplomacy, as he joins the octogenarian club, he looks back over the many gridiron campaigns and says, "I was just lucky to have had so many good players and fine teams."

While the football followers and students of the game claim one of his proteges, Tom Harmon, and his 1947 Michigan team, that went undefeated and conquered Southern California, 49-0, in the 1948 Rose Bowl, were among the finest of their time, Crisler hesitated in ranking them by simply stating, "They were among the many fine athletes that enabled me to be so lucky."

Retired since 1968 when he turned the athletic directorship over to Don Canham, Crisler still follows the Wolverines with keen interest and admits that, like many others, he was shocked at what befell Michigan in the recent Rose Bowl.

Asked about the "phantom" touchdown that was the margin of Southern California's victory, Fritz said, "It was tragic. I can see no good reason for such a call. The worst that should have happened to Michigan was to gain a tie."

As an honorary member of the NCAA Rules Committee, he was asked if there was any chance that the rules would be changed because of that

"phantom." He said that he didn't see any reason for it. "It was just a bad call."

When Crisler came to Michigan from Princeton in 1938, it was the last stop on an amazing career. Crisler continued his fine work by running up a record of 71 victories, 16 defeats and three ties in the 10 years he spent as Wolverine coach.

So great was his impact on Michigan athletics that the basketball arena was named for him and always will stand as a monument to him.

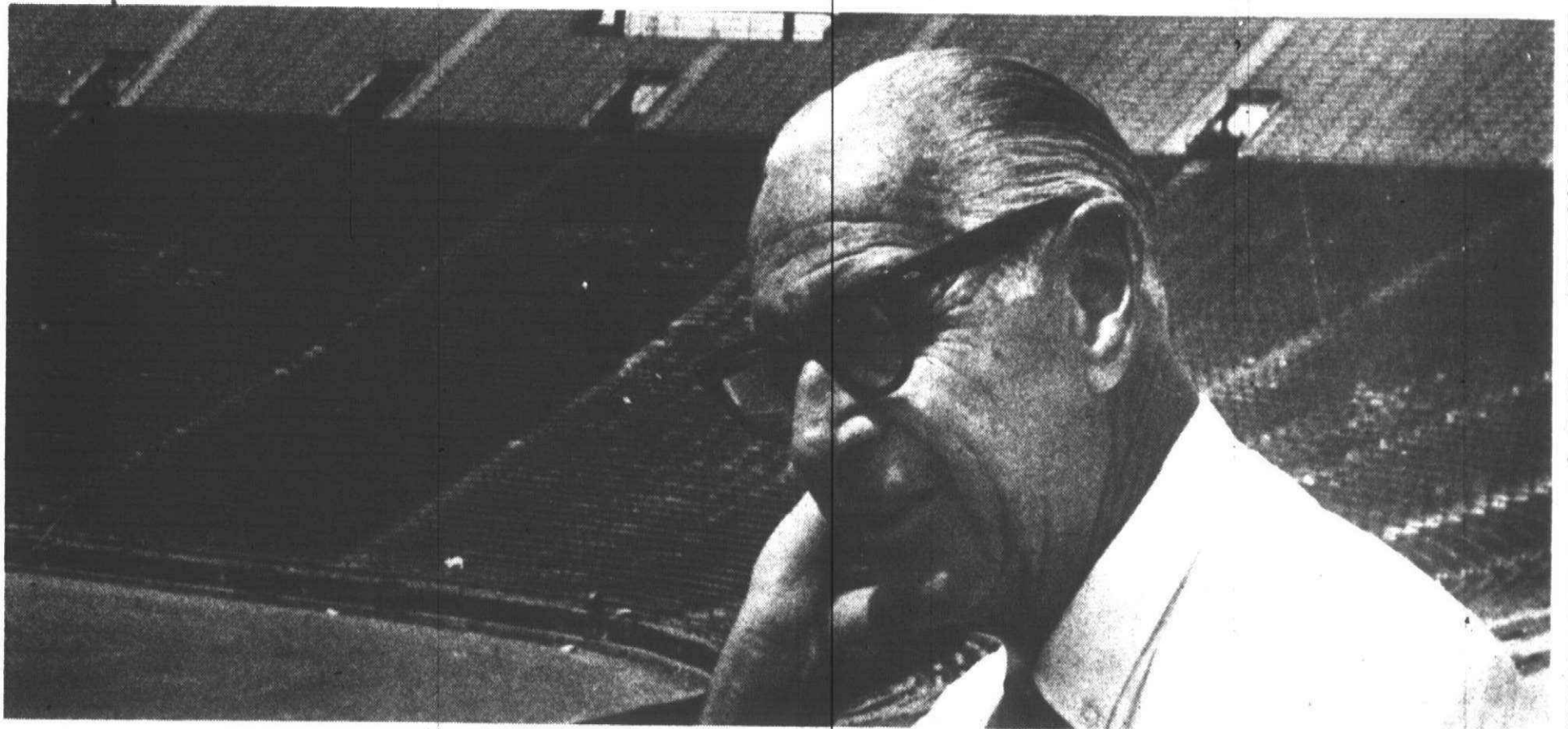
Born in Earlville, Ill. and baptized Herbert Orin Crisler, he starred in high school and then entered the University of Chicago where he profited from the teaching of the legendary Amos Alonzo Stagg.

During his varsity days, he became one of Chicago's few nine lettermen. He starred in baseball, basketball and football where he earned mention on several All-America teams as an end in 1921.

At that time, his career took a strange twist. He had hoped to enter medical school and become a doctor. He was only a few points short of being a Phi Beta Kappa.

There was one drawback to his dream. He lacked the money to join the medical students. When this became known, Stagg offered him a position as an assistant coach. He took it and stayed as a member of the staff for eight years.

At that time, the coaching position opened at the University of Minnesota and Crisler was appointed to take over. He had high hopes for the Gophers, but he was not to stay in the Gopher-country very long.

Officials at Princeton University remembered him for his outstanding play against Stanley Keck, the Tiger 228 pounder, and made him an offer that Crisler claimed he couldn't turn down.

After six years in the Ivy League, Crisler heard the call from Michigan to take over the football coaching duties. He came in 1938. Three years later, he was named athletic director to succeed the legendary Fielding H. (Hurricane) Yost. From then on, he wrote a glowing chapter in Wolverine football history.

By 1939 he developed a great team centered around All-American Tom Harmon, and in 1947 he went undefeated, won the Rose Bowl and the national championship to earn the honor of being named Coach of the Year.

But of all his feats, Crisler will be best remembered as the man who changed the game through the introduction of the two-platoon system.

As he began the celebration of his 80th birthday, he recalled how it came about.

"It was in 1945, the war years, when talent was scarce and we were allowed to play freshmen. We were scheduled to play Army that boasted Davis and Blanchard, the famous Mr. Inside and Mr. Outside.

"Checking the rule, I found that there was no limit on substitutions. We had only a bunch of kids—16 and 17-years-old—so I developed the plan of alternating them."

It is history now that for the first three periods the Michigan "kids" held

the great Army team almost on even terms. But they wilted in the fourth quarter and lost to the Cadets 28-7.

The die had been cast. Coaches from all sections of the country called Crisler and wanted the details. From that day on football has become a much different game.

And while Crisler, in his diplomatic way, claims he was lucky through the years, he has left an imprint on intercollegiate sports that will last to eternity.

So, Happy Birthday Fritz!

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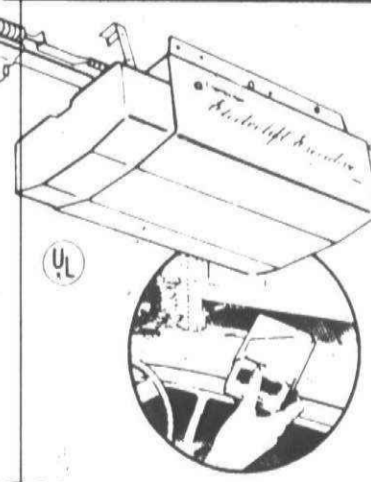
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IN THE POCKET

New and used cars need care

- If you attend the 1979 auto show only to look and not to buy, you should know how to keep your current car in good running condition.
- Check the radiator hoses for cracks and softness. Engine coolant these days is \$4 a gallon in most places, not to mention the road call if one of those hoses should suddenly burst some day.
- Test the radiator cap to make sure it will keep its proper pressure. Your engine could boil if the cap is faulty.
- The outside surface of the radiator should be cleaned of all debris.
- Have your thermostat checked to make sure it's operating properly.
- Listen for noises and look for leaks from the water pump.
- An expansion tank that saves coolant might be worth the investment.
- Batteries need frequent attention, even during the warmer weather. Check the fluid levels in the cells at least once a month or every 2,000 miles.
- Make sure the battery is free of cracks and that it's able to pass a hydrometer test that measures the strength in each cell.
- Keep the battery terminals and the cable clamps that fit on them clean and tight at all times. Coat with petroleum jelly or some other protective substance.
- Check the battery cables to make sure they are free of corrosion at their grounding point or at the starter.
- Get a good tune-up. It will mean three or four more miles a gallon, and that will add up in the long run.

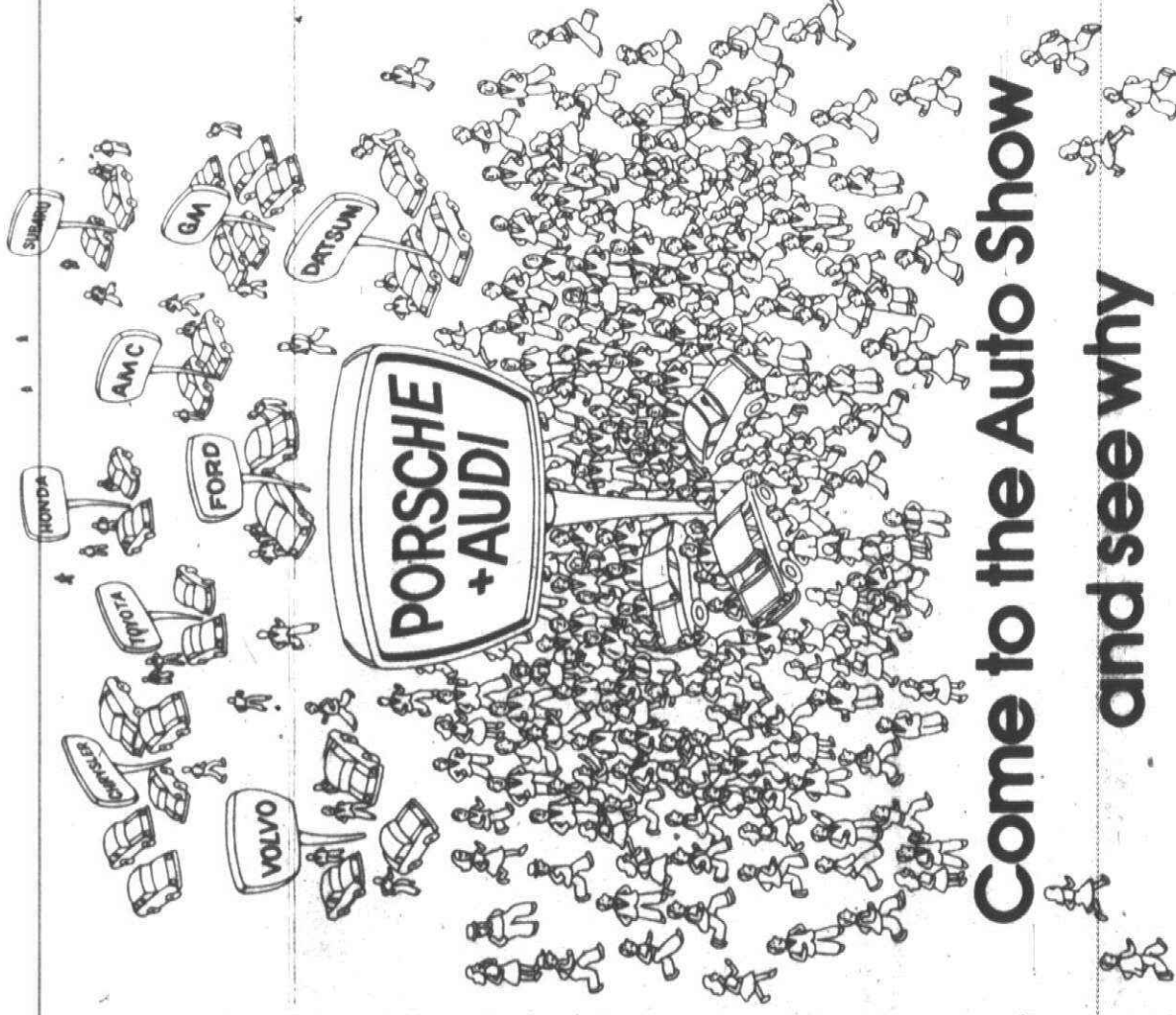

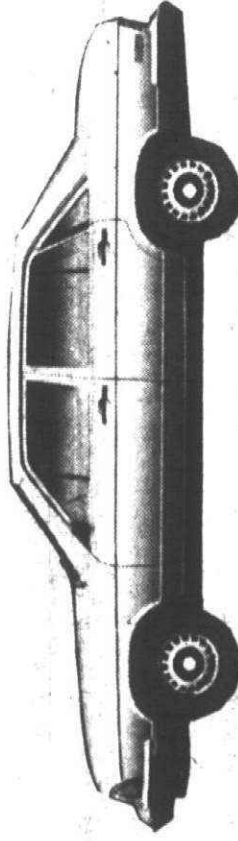

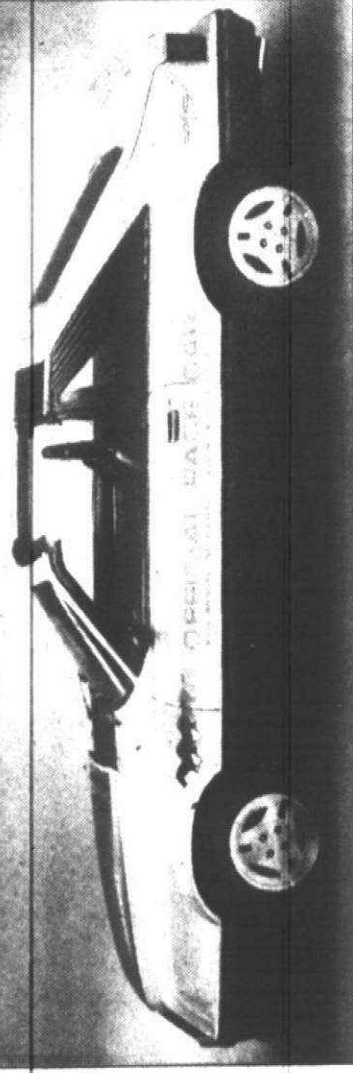

Indy picks '79 Mustang to pace May 500 field

A 1979 Ford Mustang has been selected to pace the 63rd annual running of the Indianapolis 500 next May.

"Mustang paced the Indianapolis 500 just six weeks after its public introduction in 1964, and we're proud that our all-new 1979 Mustang will renew Ford's association with the Indianapolis 500 next spring," W. S. Walla, a Ford Motor Co. vice president and Ford Division general manager, said.

Under development at Ford Motor Co. since last July, the official pace car is equipped with a specially modified 5.0-liter (302-CID) V-8 engine, automatic transmission and Mustang's special handling suspension system.

A three-door hatchback, the black and pewter pace car has a specially designed grill and hood, a non-production T-roof and specially fitted front-and-rear air spoilers. The exterior is accented with orange-

and-red racing stripes and lettering, while the black cloth-and-vinyl interior has special bucket seats.

"Although our plans haven't been finalized, we are planning to build a limited-edition Mustang similar to the pace car for sale at Ford dealerships prior to next year's race," Walla said.

The 1979 Mustang is the 11th Ford-built car picked to pace the 500 classic, and the first Ford product to start the field since 1968.

The company's first pace car was a 1932 Lincoln, followed by a Ford V-8 in 1935, a 1936 Lincoln V-12, a 1960 Mercury, a 1963 Ford, a 1967 Mercury, a 1961 Thunderbird, the original Mustang in 1964, a 1966 Comet Cyclone GT and a 1968 Ford Torino.

Two generations of the Ford family have driven pace cars at the Indianapolis 500, beginning with the late Ezzel Ford in 1932.

In the spring of 1973, Mr. Howe returned to the ice by signing with his two sons, Marty and Mark, to play with the Houston Aeros of the newly formed World Hockey Association.

Incredibly, he was among the top five scorers, was the World Hockey Association's Most Valuable Player of the year and led his team to a league championship. The following season he scored 99 points and again led the Aeros to an Avco Cup championship. In 1974, he led the Aeros working with 102 points.

He still plays right wing for the New England Whalers, which he led in scoring last year with a total of 96 points. Howe reached another milestone in his 31-year playing career when he scored his 1,000th goal on December 7, 1977, in Birmingham, Ala., the first player ever to accomplish the feat.

Jesse Owens, considered by many to be the greatest track and field star in American history, has been a member of the Lincoln-Mercury Sports Panel since 1967.

At the 1936 Olympic games in Berlin, Owens gained international distinction by winning four gold medals in the 100-meters, 200-meters, broad jump and run-

ning on the victorious relay team. Byron Nelson, a member of the Lincoln-Mercury Sports Panel since 1967, played 14 years of tournament golf before retiring shortly after World War II of his career.

He won money in 113 consecutive events, once won 18 tournaments in one season, including a string of 11 straight victories, in one three-year span he won 34 tournaments and in 1945, his greatest year, he averaged 68.3 strokes for 120 rounds.

Lincoln-Mercury completely redesigned two models for 1979, and they will be featured at the show along with the rest of the division's line. The Marquis and Capri mark the second phase of Lincoln-Mercury's re-engineering that started with the 1978 Mercury Zephyr.

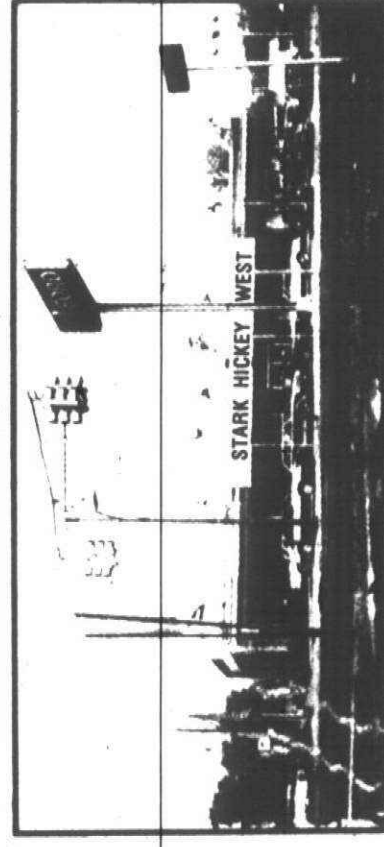
Foremost among the improvements made on the new cars are numerous improvements to the engine offerings — designed to heighten efficiency.

But it wasn't only the engineering aspects of the cars that got attention for 1979. Consumers tastes and demands were also considered.

For example, the AM/FM stereo radio with cassette tape player — offered only on Zephyr and Monarch at the beginning of 1978 — is available on all 1979 models.

Other options are also offered for 1979. These include speed control — now available for the first time with a manual transmission, and a tilt steering wheel.

1979 Toronado gets Oldsmobile's attention

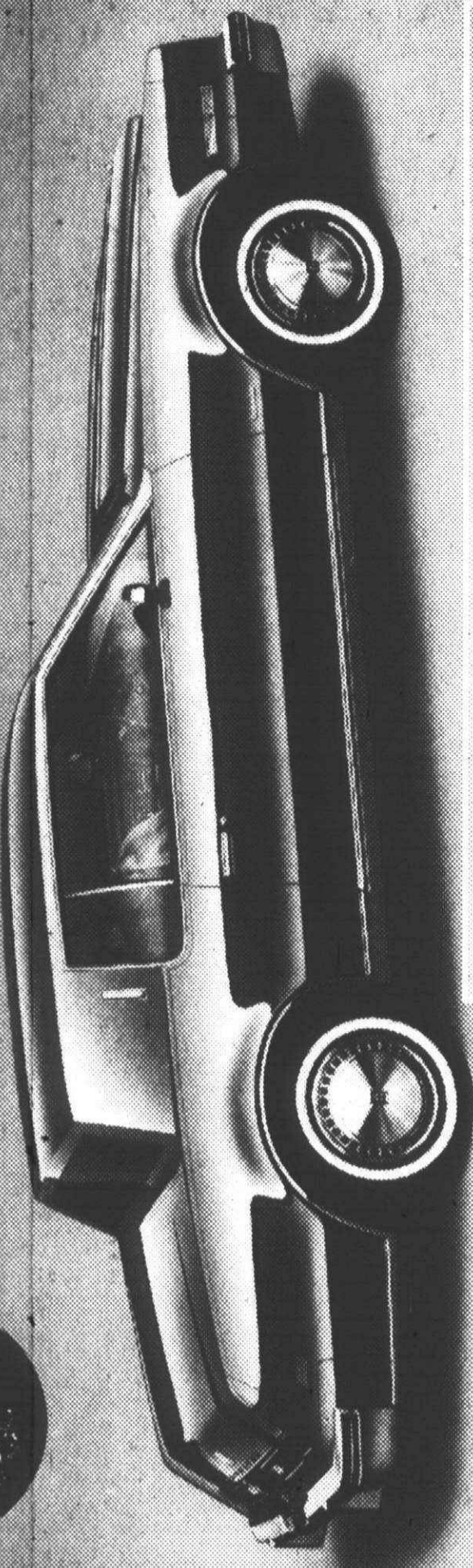
For Oldsmobile Toronado, 1979 is the year the overall size is down, but interior room and fuel economy are up. The Toronado is the latest of Oldsmobile's redesigned cars. The four-passenger coupe is nearly 22 inches shorter than last year's model. Besides the new dimensions, the Toronado will feature an improved diesel engine option. Along with the trimmer appearance, the Toronado is approximately 900 pounds lighter. With the standard 5.7-liter (350-cubic-inch) V-8 gasoline engine, the 1979 Toronado gets 16 miles per gallon in the city and 22 miles per gallon on the highway, according to EPA figures. That is an increase of three miles per gallon over the 1978 Toronado. With the optional 5.7-liter diesel engine, the Toronado fuel economy should be 21 miles per gallon in the city and 29 miles per gallon on the highway, according to EPA figures.

The 5.7-liter diesel engine option in the Toronado will include the newest diesel innovation — the fast-start system. The wait/start time, the diesel engine's biggest drawback, has been nearly eliminated with this system. From the side the luxury Oldsmobile has a formal roof design. A Toronado emblem is on the sail panel unless replaced by optional opera lamps and the small rear quarter windows are stationary. In the rear, long horizontal tail lamps and the back-up lamps extend from the edge of the deck lid to the license plate pocket to complete the styling theme. Indi-

vidual Toronado lettering extends across the deck lid. Toronado's list of standard equipment is long. It includes air conditioning, a divided front seat, six-way power seat on the driver's side, deluxe seat belts, side window defoggers, power windows, remote left hand mirror, deluxe trunk trim, automatic transmission, automatic level control, stowaway spare tire, digital clock, AM/FM stereo radio, power antenna, steelbelted whitewall radial tires, temperature gauge, cornering lamps, power steering and power brakes and door courtesy-warming lights. New optional equipment includes reclining front seats for both the driver and passenger, external opera lamps on the sail panel, illuminated door locks and interior monitors. A fiber optic system lights the center Toronado nameplate, ash tray and lighter, cruise control, rear defogger and light switches. A combination dimmer and turn signal is mounted on the steering column. The redesigned model features a flush mounted windshield for smooth air flow. The rear window is flush-fitted and installed from the inside of the car. This allows use of smaller reveal moldings and eliminates water pockets. An independent-type rear suspension provides excellent ride, handling and quietness. A rear stabilizer bar is standard. The standard automatic leveling system controls the height of the car with the use of an electric compressor and an electronic height sensor controls air pressure in the rear shocks.

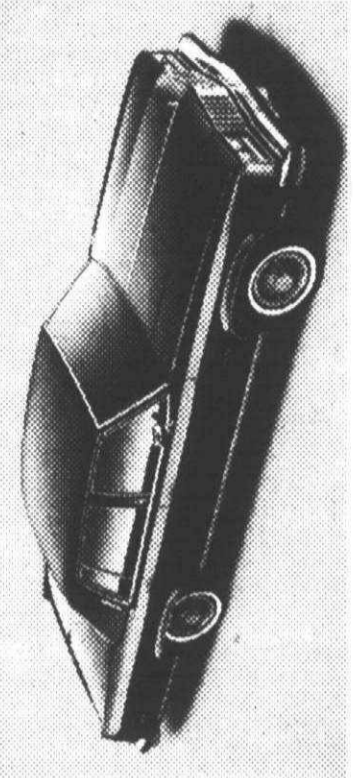
