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Board lowers boom on Canton builders

Builders have been given 30 days to clean up a stack of Canton homeowners' complaints or face passage of a strict ordinance that could put many of them out of business.

The township board of trustees issued that ultimatum after dozens of disgruntled homeowners aired their complaints at a special Monday night hearing.

Representatives from building concerns who also attended the meeting sat scribbling notes or impassively staring straight ahead as homeowners listed problem after problem with what they had hoped would be a dream home.

The tales of woe ranged from basements that flooded after every rain to homes that had progressed no further than a foundation after nearly a year of waiting.

Board members were clearly on the side of the homeowners as they chastized builders and the township's own building department for a host of unresolved frustrations.

The long list of complaints culminated in a showdown with Irvin H. Yackness, representative for the Southeastern Michigan Builders' Association, who promised that builders would take care of their "outstanding" complaints within a month if "at all possible."

Supervisor Noel Culbert told Yackness the alternative would be disastrous to builders.

"In 30 days, if things are not taken care of, the toughest ordinance I believe that has ever governed builders will be drawn up and submitted to this board," Culbert said.

That ordinance, he said, would probably require builders to put up a hefty bond prior to issuance of a building permit for a new house. If the eventual homeowner could not get repairs and corrections done to that house within a reasonable length of time, he or she would have the right to hire an independent contractor to take care of the problem who would be paid from the bond held by the township.

"If we have to do it, that's exactly

what we will do, and it will probably bankrupt the entire building industry," Culbert said.

The board also promised homeowners that if the township's own building department had not been effective in resolving complaints in the past, it would certainly become so in the future.

The building department got a large share of the flak from homeowners who told of their problems and accused department members of lying and incompetence.

Residents questioned building inspectors' failure to use checklists so that houses would be uniformly inspected.

SEVERAL HOMEOWNERS said the lack of response to their complaints was almost as frustrating as the original complaint.

Larry McEwen, owner of a home in the Sunflower subdivision, said he had accumulated a mass of paperwork

from his complaints during the four years he has lived in his house.

"I have three pounds of complete waste here—122 forms in one pad that are letters to the township and to the state and to Crescendo (the company that built his house)," McEwen said.

"It seems to me the builders should be required to do something like post a bond. I want the damn thing done now."

McEwen continued, "Prior to the primary, all hell broke loose with the homeowners. Everyone promised to take care of these problems. It happens every time with an election."

"You've got to have someone working on this constantly."

Other homeowners said they didn't know the procedure for filing complaints, or what to do if their problems weren't resolved.

George Ellis, who said he has had a problem with his basement leaking ever since he bought his house, told the board building inspectors who came

out to the house would never tell him if his complaint was a legitimate violation of an ordinance.

"They just say they'll look into it," Ellis said.

AARON MACHNIK, deputy building official, was on hand to take most of the grilling from audience and board members.

He agreed that some of the suggestions of homeowners, such as a checklist for building inspectors, were good ideas.

But, Machnik told the board, the main problems with the building department were insufficient staffing, low pay and employee morale.

He said building inspectors worked for the "spectacular salary" of \$14,000 per year and handle an extremely high caseload.

Machnik denied charges made by some residents that the building department was corrupt, saying he would fire any inspector of whom he has proof was taking money, and would turn in his own resignation immediately if anyone had facts that he was taking money.

During the last administration, Supervisor Harold Stein had asked the

Michigan State Police to conduct an investigation of the building department, but that investigation was dropped because of lack of evidence.

Only one representative from a building company (other than Yack-

ness) commented on the charges made by homeowners.

David Ducharme, a representative of Pilch Builders, told the audience, "From a businessman's point of view, 350,000 parts go into a home. They can't be all right."

Ducharme called the homeowners a "reactionary population."

"I don't want to be boxed into a legislative hole," he said.

"If a competitor doesn't do a good job, stop his building permit. I run this business on my belly. Honest businessmen are getting hammered."

Trustee Robert Greenstein told Du-

charme the bad ones," Greenstein added. "And if you can't control them, by God, we will," Greenstein said.

Yackness, who served as spokesman for the builders, said the group will establish weekly meetings between trustees, builders and members of the building department to deal with complaints during the next month.

"You've made it amply clear," he told the board, "unless we produce, the industry faces the prospect of being shut down."

The board has agreed to meet again March 5 to check the builder's progress.

HOW DOES YOUR BUILDER RATE?

HUD block grant fund creates tangled strings

A Wayne County directive to select a site for the construction of low- or moderate-income housing has been attached to a federal program that is funding conversion of Canton's Dye Brothers Subdivision into an industrial park.

But the order that was issued by the Wayne County Planning Commission last month is not being swallowed by the Canton board, even though town-

ship grant coordinator Terry Carroll says the new requirements do not bring a radical change.

Board members are angrily questioning the county's authority to require the site selection as part of the guidelines governing administration of the federal community block grant program.

On Tuesday, the board unanimously voted to table the site selection even if it means that Wayne County will choose the location itself.

The county planning commission administers the block grant program of the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) for 32 Wayne County communities.

THE NEW GUIDELINES require each community to choose a site for the construction of housing for low-income, moderate-income or senior citizen groups.

According to Carroll, the county will incorporate the sites in a booklet it is preparing of low- and moderate-income housing sites in the area.

Carroll said the county has pledged to select the sites itself if communities do not submit their own selections by next week.

Although board members vehemently opposed the requirement at Tuesday's meeting, Carroll said Wednesday morning that the new requirements are not a radical departure from former policy.

He said the county selected a tentative low-income housing site last year near the Canton Commons apartment complex on Haggerty south of Cherry Hill. This year, the county is asking communities to select alternative locations themselves for a county shopping list of low-income sites.

Carroll adds that the township board reserves the power to approve or deny site plans for proposed low-income developments.

On Tuesday, township planner Jim Kosteva recommended a 10-acre site on the south side of Warren east of Lilley for a future low- or moderate-income development. The land is zoned for multiple residential use.

BUT THE CANTON board refused to designate any land for low- or moderate-income housing.

Township officials maintain that Canton already contains 12 times the low-income units reported by nearby communities with populations above 25,000.

They say a township program that awards grants to low-income families for housing rehabilitation complies with the county's housing assistance plan. The rehabilitation program is also funded with HUD dollars.

Township board members say they resent the county's attempt to intrude on the planning of their community.

Trustee Robert Greenstein, who served as Canton's supervisor from 1974 to 1976, said he met with HUD officials in Washington some years ago to discuss the type of strings that Wayne County has placed on the community block grant program.

"We were promised by the federal government that this type of thing would never happen," Greenstein insisted. "I'll be damned if I'm going to let anyone plan this community except this board."

"Where does their authority come from?" Greenstein asked in reference to the Wayne County Planning Commission.

Greenstein and the more militant members of the board favored the drafting of a resolution that would forbid the county to select a low-income housing site in Canton and demand to know the source of the county's authority.

But Trustee Lynne Goldsmith feared the consequences of that action.

"If we deny this, I think our block grant funds will be cut off," she said.

The conversion of Dye Brothers Subdivision near Michigan and Sheldon into an industrial park will be partially financed by block grant funds. Canton has already received \$80,500 for the project and expect to receive an additional \$350,000 over the next three years.

In the end, the board voted to table the matter and investigate the county's authority to mandate selection of a low-income housing site.

New plant gets taxes reduced

A division of Diamond International Corp. has received the first tax exemption certificate ever awarded to a company under Michigan Act 198 by the Canton board.

The certificate will reduce the taxes on Diamond Automation's new Canton plant and equipment by 50 percent for a 12-year period.

The company, which manufactures egg packaging equipment, is planning to move its research and development operations from Redford Township to a new facility on Ronda Drive in Canton.

According to township Clerk John Flodin, the company would pay \$22,000 in annual taxes without the tax exemption. The certificate will reduce the

company's tax bill to approximately \$11,000.

Under terms of the 1974 Michigan law, Canton officials are not obligated to award the maximum 50 percent tax reduction for a maximum 12-year period.

But Ben Robertson of the Michigan Office of Economic Development recommended that the maximum tax exemption be granted because of the stiff competition for industry.

Canton officials have made a commitment to draw more industry into the township because of a high tax burden on residents.

According to a spokesperson for Diamond Automation, the new Canton plant will employ 27 workers.

Salvation Army celebrates 50th

Young in heart. Old in Service. Friend to all.

That describes the community service arm of Plymouth which has been functioning here for 50 years.

And the record of 50 years to Plymouth people explains why the Mayflower Meeting House was jam-packed with residents who wanted to be a part of the golden anniversary commemoration of the Plymouth Salvation Army.

The celebration started with Sunday morning's worship service at the Corps headquarters, 290 Fairground, and continued into the afternoon with a Golden Jubilee Concert by the Dearborn Heights Corps Brass Band in the Plymouth Church of the Nazarene.

Sunday evening an anniversary dinner and celebration service was held at the Plymouth Corps headquarters and then Monday night the celebration was capped with the annual appreciation dinner in the Meeting House.

FEB. 17, 1929: A young couple by the name of Frank and Florence Wright arrived in Plymouth with instructions from Detroit headquarters to begin the work of the Salvation Army here.

Mrs. Wright, now in her 80s, recalls those early beginnings:

"We had nine children in our first

Sunday School (which met in an upstairs room in a building which stood where the present First Federal Savings and Loan now is located) but we soon outgrew this building, so we had to look for another."

Sunday School, however, was not the only program or service in which the Army people became involved. Programs to develop character and encourage personal growth were added and are continuing today.

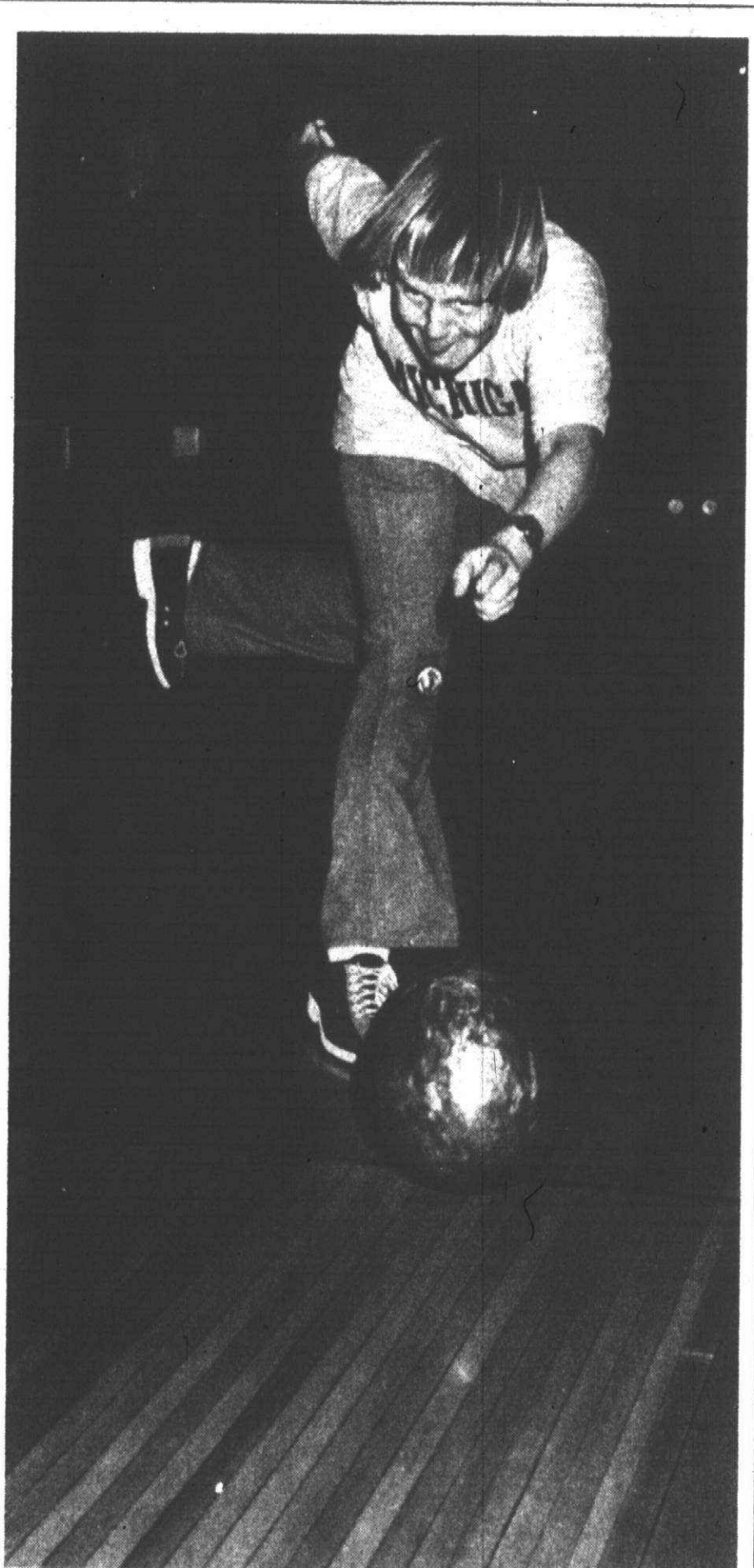
Today young people and adults still find worthwhile activities at the Plymouth Corps, adds Commander Lt. William Harfoot. "Individual, family and community crisis have all been included in the Army's history of service."

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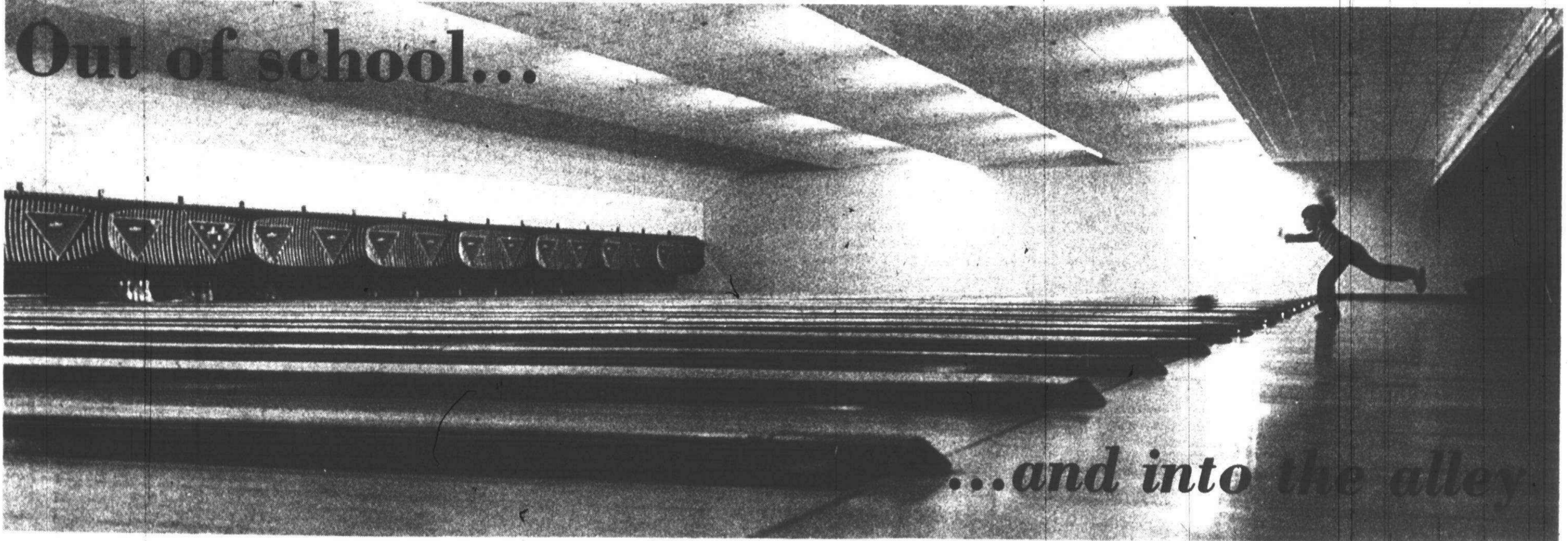

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Community planning Why zoning?

Zoning and the master plan are the tools that shape the Canton community.

Canton Township has changed from a rural community of a few thousand people to one of the most rapidly growing areas in southeast Michigan. Since 1968, 29 subdivisions with a total of 7,972 lots have been built. Many more are slated to be built in the coming years.

With this growth in housing comes a boom in commercial and industrial development. Examples of this type of growth can be seen along Ford Road. More can be expected.

The major tools available for regulating growth and assuring that standards of quality are maintained are the zoning ordinance and master plan.

The zoning ordinance divides the township into districts. Each district allows only certain kinds of use for the land in the district. For example, in the R-1 district only single family homes may be built.

In the C-1 district, local businesses such as a party store may be built.

The zoning districts also regulate the height and size of buildings as well as things such as parking spaces and number of people allowed per acre.

ALL LAND in Canton Township is zoned. Current land use does not always reflect the potential development permitted by virtue of its zoning.

The purpose of the zoning ordinance is to protect residents from

undesirable or conflicting land uses. A conflicting land use would be a noisy factory in an area of single family homes.

The ordinance attempts to protect the health, safety and welfare of Canton's residents. This means that fire protection, automobile traffic, parking, water and sewer lines and related matters are all affected by the ordinance.

Zoning is a powerful tool and has a high impact on the quality of life in Canton. Copies of the zoning ordinance are available at the township clerk's office. Get to know the zoning and restrictions of your property as well as the area around you.

The master plan guides the future development of the township. The plan sets down in writing and in maps specific goals for Canton's future. Various needs and problems are identified and alternative solutions are proposed in the plan. All land use decisions made within the township must correspond to these goals. An example of a goal of the current master plan is to preserve agricultural land in Canton. Another goal is to involve residents in the land use decision process.

This article is the first of a series that will provide a basic background in how and why development is managed in Canton Township. If you would like to know more about these types of concerns, classes will be held at township hall prior to planning commission meetings.

Army's mission also was stressed by Lt. Col. William Roberts, keynote speaker at Monday night's appreciation dinner.

Roberts, who has been an Army officer for 36 years now, spent six years as commander of the Plymouth Corps. Roberts now is in charge of all Army personnel in an 11-state area and his wife directs the League of Mercy work in the same region.

"The same tenants which moved William Booth (national founder of the Salvation Army) in 1855 still motivates the Army in 1979.

"Above all else, we are concerned with people with spiritual, social and material needs.

"If the Salvation Army ever loses its vision for people of all kinds then I hope God will bring the curtains down upon us.

"After 50 years in Plymouth we still try to affirm daily that the Salvation

Army and helping people are synonymous.

"We hope that everything we do is because every man is our brother and worthy of our compassion."

THE STATISTICAL side of that mission was presented by Lt. Harfoot in the 1978 service report.

Last year the Corps conducted 293 activities attended by 5,176 youngsters age 3-18 including day camp, resident camp, Sunbeams, Girl Guards, Boy's Club, Teen Club, Nursery School and music programs.

The local League of Mercy visited 68 institutions and 37 individual homes to touch the lives of 1,760 persons.

The family services branch held 105 interviews, visited 73 homes, assisted in 99 cases plus another 30 transient cases.

During the Christmas season, the Army interviewed 75 families and as-

sisted a total of 298 people plus visiting another 1,988 in institutions.

The Army's 1978 income of \$81,472 included a \$23,000 allocation from the Plymouth Community Fund and another \$39,936 in other local public support.

In presenting that report, Lt. Harfoot stressed: "Every statistic represents a service to individuals with special needs. This is an accounting of our service to people in Plymouth and surrounding communities."

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Water quality board to influence more than effluence

The newly formed Areawide Water Quality Board is emerging as a new battleground where land use policies and suburban and industrial development will be determined.

The board, in the eyes of the federal government and the Southeast Michigan Council of Governments (SEMCOG), is the watchdog agency for water pollution control programs in the seven-county region.

The 27-member board will be able to extend its influence over just about every area of urban, suburban and rural life in the region.

"SOME 240 governmental units have an impact on water quality—from street sweeping programs to zoning," said the board's newly elected chairman, James Seeterlin, supervisor of Oakland County's Waterford Township.

Seeterlin was elected at the AWQB's first meeting in Southfield last week.

"We'll be looking at everything from septic tanks and farmland runoff to the construction of major shopping centers and urban street pollution caused by grease and oil from motor vehicles," he said.

"In essence, we'll be investigating anything that impacts our water quality."

Seeterlin was elected to the board from SEMCOG. Wayne County members include: Arthur Wiitala, Westland superintendent of public works; River-view Councilmember Honor Shoemaker; Conrad Mallett, director of Detroit's bus system; John Kanters, director of Detroit's water and sewerage department; and County Commissioner Edward Michalski (D-Detroit).

BECAUSE OF THE board's broad interests, many of the region's conservative politicians and officials have opposed the board.

"The board will be huge, monolithic," Commissioner

Henry Hoot (R-Troy), the most conservative member of Oakland County's board, said in an interview. "It will develop into a huge regional agency. It'll be bigger than SEMCOG and SEMTA (the Southeastern Michigan Transportation Authority)," said Hoot, who as a SEMCOG delegate last year opposed organizing the AWQB.

"It'll be getting its nose into everything that has to do with water—(road) salting, parks, zoning," Hoot said. "It has the potential of reaching in and grabbing every aspect of life. It's scary," he said.

Because the water quality board must approve plans for projects qualifying for future federal aid, conservatives, such as Hoot, are taking an interest in it.

Instead, according to Hoot, Oakland County Drain Commissioner George Kuhn and SEMCOG officials, a bloc of conservatives will be formed within the regional quality board. Because the

board is only in its infancy, the effect of a conservative bloc cannot be determined.

"We need a watchdog (on the board), not somebody who's going to gloss over everything it does and acts as a rubber stamp," said Kuhn.

"Some (local officials) are afraid that we might do something bad," confirmed SEMCOG staff member Ed Hustoles, who headed much of the AWQB planning. "They're going to be on the board. It'll be like they're watching the fox in the chicken coop."

SOME CALL it "creeping regionalism," but to SEMCOG officials it is the only practical way to meet the provisions of the federal Clean Water Act amendments of 1972.

According to the federal legislation and the regional water quality plan, which was developed by SEMCOG under a \$5.1 million grant from the United States Environmental Protection Agency, water pollution is to be checked so that all lakes, ponds, rivers and streams are to be "swimmable and fishable" by 1983. Moreover, by 1985,

water pollution is to be eliminated.

Seeterlin said southeastern Michigan may have a tough time meeting those goals. "The southeast Michigan region has more than 4,000 inland lakes and ponds to maintain and Lake Erie, which has suffered extensive pollution damage. Our job is bigger than most areas of the nation."

SEMCOG officials privately label those goals "Mission Impossible."

"There's no way than can be zero (pollution) discharge (into the region's bodies of water)," said one SEMCOG staff member. "But the federal government hasn't backed off, so neither have we."

INSPIRE OF THE seeming impossibility of meeting the standards and prospects of facing a hostile, anti-regional bloc of delegates, SEMCOG and water quality board officials defend their plan and their standing as the regional watchdog.

"We can't afford a scattered, shotgun approach in this mammoth clean-up campaign because, in the long run, everybody's pollution drains into Lake

Erie," Seeterlin said.

SEMCOG officials view the water quality board as a clearing house for information, a mediator in local water quality disputes, a regional forum and an ombudsman going to bat for local communities in Lansing and Washington. "One of the key things this board will be able to do," Seeterlin said, "is help resolve conflicts between the public and private sector, and between local governmental agencies."

OPPONENTS, HOWEVER, see the board as a group of non-elected watchdogs who are out of touch with local needs and are not accountable to the voters for their actions.

"It means the erosion of local home rule. It means that the people living in the community will not be able to decide what they want to do with their community," Hoot said.

In the face of those claims, SEMCOG officials maintain that the water quality board cannot stop future land development or order policy changes, but can suggest changes in building plans and policies.

SC administrator leaving

It's rare that the two most important instructional posts open up almost simultaneously at a college.

"It gives me an unusual chance to re-think the administration of Schoolcraft College," said President C. Nelson Grote as he made two major announcements last week.

Grote will be seeking a person whose newly created title will be "provost and vice president of academic affairs."

The provost—Latin for "placed before (others)"—will often be in charge of day-to-day administration of the two-year college. Grote has

sought more time for long-range planning.

Fred Stefanski, coordinator of the office of instructional affairs, plans to retire soon, Grote told the board of trustees.

Grote made permanent the appointment of Thad E. Diebel as dean of the college's Garden City Center.

Diebel had been acting dean there since the retirement last November of Robert Keene. Diebel's move opens up his post on the main campus as dean of applied science.

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Senior van delivered

The new van to transport senior citizens was delivered to the City of Plymouth Monday and taken to the DPW yard for inspection before being put to use. The van, purchased with federal Community Development Act funds, will be used to transport Plymouth residents to the nutrition site

Port authority idea is promoted to boost shipping through Detroit

Wayne County Commissioner Edgar L. Harris and Richard E. Manning hailed passage of the state port authority act and declared they would urge creation of a Detroit-Wayne County port authority as soon as the measure becomes law.

They said the act opens the way for a "vast improvement" in worldwide promotional efforts to increase shipping through the port of Detroit, thus producing "millions" in economic benefits plus more jobs in this area.

The act provides for 50 per cent state funding of the staff costs of the port authority, with the city and county sharing the balance of the costs.

The county-financed port commission has been operating on a shoe-string budget with only an office manager in recent years because of the county's tight financial situation.

"This is what we've been working toward for nearly four years. I believe it will enable the port of Detroit to join the top ranks of the world's ports," said Harris (D-Taylor), a member of the state-county-city riverfront task

force which recommended creation of port authority.

Manning (D-Redford), who had joined Harris in testifying in favor of the port authority bill before the State Legislature, predicted creation of the authority "will give business and employment in Wayne County a real shot in the arm."

The legislature adopted the port authority bill Dec. 13, giving it immediate effect upon its signing by Gov. William Milliken whose administration supported the measure.

"As soon as the act becomes effective, Commissioner Manning and I will propose that the county board of commissioners and the Detroit City Council adopt joint resolutions setting up the port authority," Harris said. He said the authority could be in operation in about six months.

The authority would have the ability to issue revenue bonds to finance development of port facilities, which could be leased to private operators with their revenues paying off the bonds, Harris said.

The authority would be governed by

a five-member unpaid board, with the county and city council each appointing two members and the governor appointing one.

Harris said the report of the riverfront task force estimated the improved port could generate an additional \$500 million in annual income benefits and create 5,000 new jobs in Wayne County by 1985.

Manning said a 1973 study by the U.S. Chamber of Commerce concluded that an increase of 100 jobs in a metropolitan area meant an increase of \$872,000 in personal income, two more retail establishments, a \$395,000 annual increase in retail sales and a \$481,000 rise in bank deposits.

"The port authority bill gives us the tools we need to create more jobs for our citizens and to make the Detroit-Wayne County waterfront one of the finest and busiest ports in the world," Harris stated.

Manning described the 3 1/2 miles of riverfront in Wayne County as a "vast reservoir of untapped economic potential in terms of jobs and commercial development."

Harris said the port authority act came about through the "total cooperation" of the Milliken administration, the state legislature, Detroit Mayor Coleman Young, the county board of commissioners and the private sector.

Turner names EDC members

Plymouth Mayor Tom Turner appointed Dr. William Covington and Fred Gruhler to two vacancies on the Economic Development Corporation board Monday night.

Dr. Covington, a dentist, of 417 N. Evergreen, has been a city resident

since 1954. Gruhler, an account executive, of 232 Dewar, moved to Plymouth in 1966.

The EDC board oversees commercial and industrial development in the city. One function of the board involves consideration of approval for lower-interest loans to business ventures.

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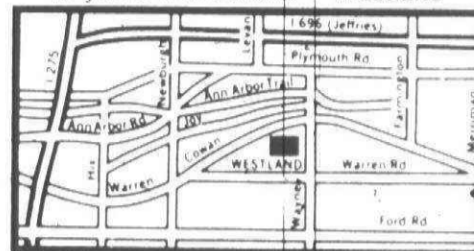
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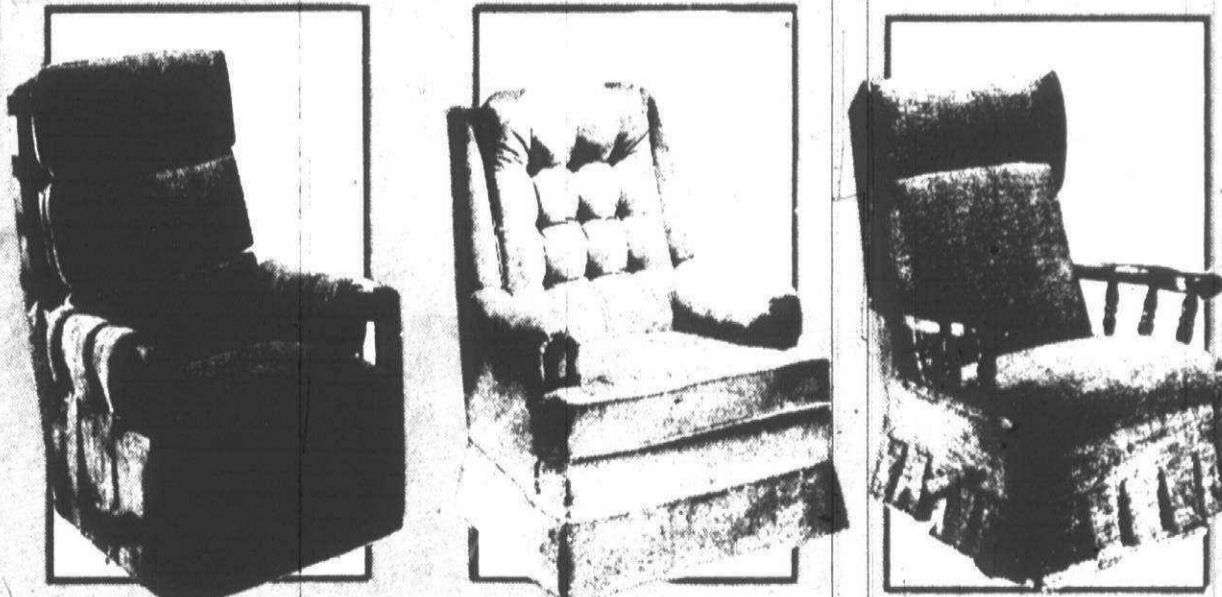
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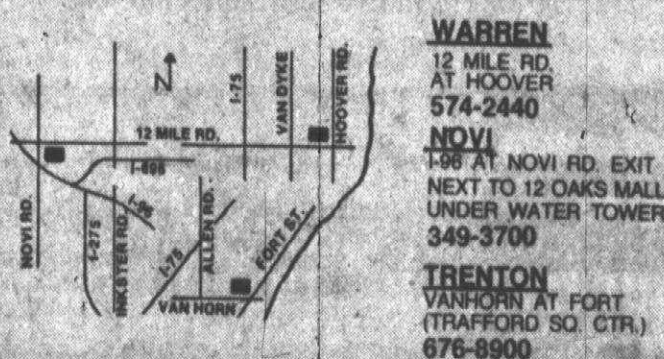
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Royce Smith earns sewer sales credit

Two political leaders were given much credit last week as the Wayne County Board of Commissioners added its voice to those of western suburbs opposing a "slow growth" sewage disposal plan advocated by the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency.

Commissioners last week endorsed the county's own Super Sewer plan, 20 years in the making by first the road commission and now the new department of public works.

Board Chairman Richard Manning (D-Redford) and public works committee chairman William Sullivan (D-Wyandotte) praised DPW leaders Royce Smith and Chester Wozniak for lining up support from 20 of the 22 affected communities in western Wayne and Oakland counties.

Manning praised the "vital leadership they have given to out-county communities" in supporting Super Sewer. Three years ago, when the DPW was under the road commission, communities gave Super Sewer only lackluster support.

SMITH AND Wozniak were county commissioners before being appointed director and assistant director, respectively, of the DPW. Smith had represented a western suburban district that included the Plymouth-Canton community.

Manning called their work "comforting evidence" supporting the board's controversial decision last year to remove DPW functions from the road commission and establish a separate county department directly under the county board.

Sullivan added, "This has not been easy to arrange. It is very hard to get this many elected officials to agree on a project of this importance with so many political ramifications."

Supporting Super Sewer are: Commerce and Novi townships in Oakland County; and the townships of Northville, Plymouth, Canton, Van Buren, Sumpter, Huron and Brownstown and the cities of Northville, Romulus, Flat Rock, Rockwood, Gibraltar and Woodhaven in Wayne County.

The cities of Belleville and Plymouth have endorsed the plan but have not yet signed contracts. Others which have endorsed but not signed contracts include Trenton, Walled Lake and South Rockwood.

The only two communities of the 22 involved directly which are uncommitted are White Lake Township and Wolverine village in Oakland County.

SUPER SEWER is the nickname given the Wayne County plan for a single sewage treatment plant at the mouth of the Huron River on Lake Erie. It would be served by a large sewer interceptor in roughly the Haggerty Road corridor of western Wayne and Oakland counties.

At a cost of \$207 million, it would include a 50-mile interceptor and a treatment plant with a capacity of 49 million gallons a day.

The Super Sewer plan would serve far more persons and allow somewhat more suburban growth than the EPA's alternative.

EPA proposes a smaller sewage treatment plant at the mouth of the Huron River with an interceptor reaching only to Canton Township. EPA proposes that the middle communities — part of Canton, Plymouth, Northville and Novi — be served by the Rouge interceptor and the Detroit treatment plant.

The northern communities, under the EPA plan, would be served by an expanded Walled Lake treatment plant. Because the Walled Lake plant flows into a northern branch of the Middle Rouge river, its treatment capacity would be limited — and so would suburban growth. Communities downstream fear a malfunction of the Walled Lake plant could turn the Middle Rouge literally into 50 per cent raw sewage.

EPA cites the Carter Administration's policy of restricting suburban sprawl and serving central cities in support of its plan. The EPA plan would also be cheaper — \$132 million.

MISSING FROM both the Wayne County and EPA plans are the Washtenaw County communities of Ann Arbor and Ypsilanti. They resisted Super Sewer successfully and were allowed by the Michigan Department of Natural Resources to upgrade the Ypsilanti Township treatment plant.

Commissioner Sullivan said EPA is reluctant to approve Super Sewer because it wants more documentation on the need for the sewer to extend as far north as proposed.

A study to provide this and other information requested by EPA would take three years, cost a lot of money — and possibly lead to disintegration of Wayne County's political coalition.

Agreements between the county and the communities, Sullivan said, would "fall apart like dominoes" during the months it would take to do the federal study. Meanwhile, the communities would fail to get sewage treatment service they need, he said.

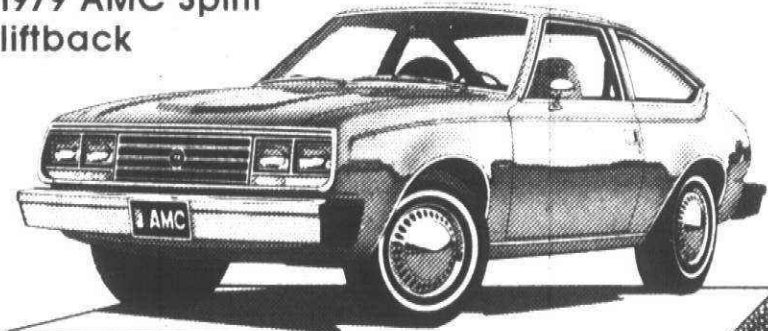

Rouge logjam dilemma: Who is responsible?

Two resolutions to produce action on the logjam of a Middle Rouge River tributary in Dearborn Heights were passed by the Rouge Watershed Council meeting recently in Livonia.

The council is an advisory governmental unit, made up of representatives of communities touched by the Rouge River.

To the meeting came a distressed Eugene Weddle, superintendent of the water sewer division of Dearborn Heights. His was a tale of frustration in regard to the blockage formed when four large trees fell into the river, causing all kinds of debris to collect behind them.

Officials of Dearborn Heights are especially troubled by the problem because its sewer pipes lie about eight feet from the logjam. If the jam breaks those pipes, raw sewage would be on its way downstream toward such cities as Dearborn, Melvindale, River Rouge and Allen Park.

Not sure of who has jurisdiction over problems on this natural waterway, Dearborn Heights has been reluctant to shoulder the expense of hauling the troublesome trees and debris out.

And the community has not had much luck in finding a county department to volunteer to do the work.

Because of a possible threat to health and safety to area residents, the watershed council voted to join with the cities of Detroit, Dearborn and Dearborn Heights to appeal to Gov. William Milliken to declare the situation an emergency and involve the U.S. Corps of Engineers in removing the log jam.

THE COUNCIL ALSO voted unanimously to request a legal opinion from the attorney general as to which governmental body is responsible for

maintaining a waterway such as this.

There has been more than an eight-week delay in breaking up the jam because of the jurisdiction problem. Mayor Frank Swapka of Dearborn Heights is eager that work begin while the track leading into the area is frozen hard enough to bear the weight of heavy machinery such as large bulldozers and cranes.

Weddle, who discovered the jam, told council members his city does not own that kind of equipment. He said that estimates of repair costs run from \$70,000 to \$300,000.

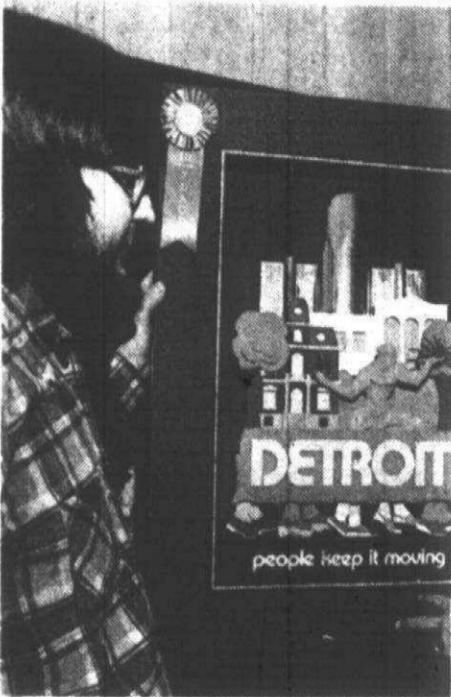
IN OTHER ACTION taken by the watershed council, Nancy Donaldson of Franklin was named the new council chairman; Ed Siemert, city engineer of Livonia, was voted vice-chairman and Carol Steinger of Southfield was named treasurer.

The executive secretary of the council is Molly Cowan of Redford Township, appointed last year.

The council also deliberated on the two sewer plans that have been introduced to handle wastewater problems of Oakland and western Wayne counties. Both plans call for a treatment plant at the point where the Huron River flows into Lake Erie.

The so-called Super Sewer, advocated by the Wayne County Department of Public Works, would close all treatment plants in the area except for the one at the mouth of the Huron. It would include a 50-mile interceptor of enclosed pipes and the 49-million gallon per day treatment plant. Its official name is Alternative A-1.

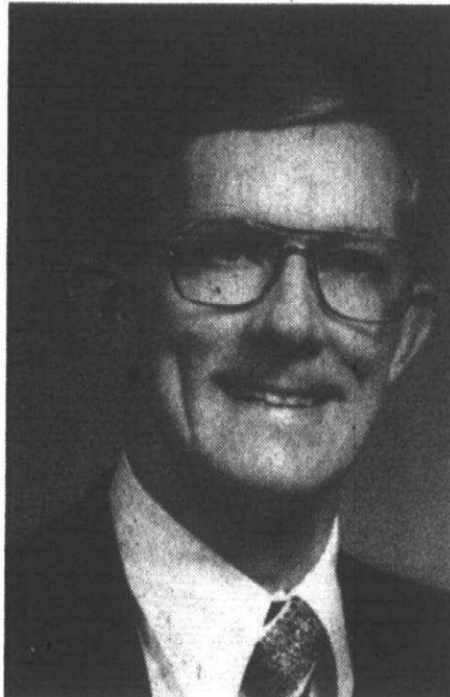
Alternative D is the plan advocated by the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency. Under it, northern areas would be served by a treatment plant in Walled Lake, while the center region would join the Rouge interceptor. Those south of Canton Township would be served by the plant at the Huron mouth.



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This plumber's no longer in fix

When Richard Yorch, the well known Plymouth plumber, opened the Family Bath Boutique at 875 Wing Street recently, he satisfied a secret desire he has nursed for more than 20 years.

From the day he left school to start his plumbing career Yorch longed for the day when he could have his own showroom with all the latest fixtures and bath accessories.

Standing amidst the multi-colored tubs and basins he recalled the many hours he spent during the past two decades working for others. "And now," he said, "I am realizing the dream I have had."

RECALLING HIS plumbing career, Yorch broke into a smile and related how when he was 17 years of age his father, who also was a plumber, came to him and asked: "Do you want to be a plumber?"

He agreed, went to work as an apprentice, and worked his way up the rating of a journeyman plumber. Then, still carrying the great desire, he went on to gain the master's license.

Finally, tired a bit of working for others at their call, he set up his own business and called it Pride Plumbing. This was just a step toward the goal he wanted.

"I was my own boss all right, but I had to do the plumbing work for others. As the years went by my secret desire became much stronger.

"Then this chance came—to open my

own showroom—and it is the realization of a desire that has been with me all the while I was wiping joints and carrying the blow torch as a plumber."

WHILE THE grand opening of the boutique is not scheduled until late spring, the showroom shows how far tastes and customs have changed since the days of the Saturday night bath in the old wooden tub in front of the kitchen stove.

There was a time when the bath room virtually was hidden in the average home. It was a small room shoved off in a corner. But times and tastes have changed.

For instance, Yorch pointed out, the trend is to many colors. There are black tubs and accessories, and even a modern tub, walls and shelves all done in a single piece of fiber glass. He showed this piece with great pride as the latest thing in home construction.

The home whirlpool bath he showed is another modern trend. A large tub is modelled after the tubs used in the health spas and are coming into home use as the latest "in" thing.

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Growth bloc seeks clout on water board

The newly formed Areawide Water Quality Board is emerging as a new battleground where land use policies and suburban and industrial development will be determined.

The board, in the eyes of the federal government and the Southeast Michigan Council of Governments (SEMCOG), is the watchdog agency for water pollution control programs in the seven-county region.

The 27-member board will be able to extend its influence over just about every area of urban, suburban and rural life in the region.

"SOME 240 governmental units have an impact on water quality—from street sweeping programs to zoning," said the board's newly elected chairman, James Seeterlin, supervisor of Oakland County's Waterford Township. Seeterlin was elected at the AWQB's first meeting in Southfield last week.

"We'll be looking at everything from septic tanks and farmland runoff to the

construction of major shopping centers and urban street pollution caused by grease and oil from motor vehicles," he said.

"In essence, we'll be investigating anything that impacts our water quality."

Seeterlin was elected to the board from SEMCOG. Wayne County members include: Arthur Wiitala, Westland superintendent of public works; River-view Councilmember Honor Shoemaker; Conrad Mallett, director of Detroit's bus system; John Kanters, director of Detroit's water and sewerage department; and County Commissioner Edward Michalski (D-Detroit).

BECAUSE OF THE board's broad interests, many of the region's conservative politicians and officials have opposed the board.

"The board will be huge, monolithic," Commissioner Henry Hoot (R-Troy), the most conservative member of Oakland County's board, said in an interview. "It will develop into a huge regional

agency. It'll be bigger than SEMCOG and SEMTA (the Southeastern Michigan Transportation Authority)," said Hoot, who as a SEMCOG delegate last year opposed organizing the AWQB.

"It'll be getting its nose into everything that has to do with water—(road) salting, parks, zoning," Hoot said. "It has the potential of reaching in and grabbing every aspect of life. It's scary," he said.

Because the water quality board must approve plans for projects qualifying for future federal aid, conservatives, such as Hoot, are taking an interest in it.

Instead, according to Hoot, Oakland County Drain Commissioner George Kuhn and SEMCOG officials, a bloc of conservatives will be formed within the regional quality board. Because the board is only in its infancy, the effect of a conservative bloc cannot be determined.

"We need a watchdog (on the board), not somebody who's going to gloss over everything it does and acts as a rubber stamp," said Kuhn.

"Some (local officials) are afraid that we might do something bad," confirmed SEMCOG staff member Ed Hustoles, who headed much of the AWQB planning. "They're going to be on the board. It'll be like they're watching the fox in the chicken coop."

SOME CALL it "creeping regionalism," but to SEMCOG officials it is the only practical way to meet the provisions of the federal Clean Water Act amendments of 1972.

According to the federal legislation and the regional water quality plan, which was developed by SEMCOG under a \$5.1 million grant from the United States Environmental Protection Agency, water pollution is to be checked so that all lakes, ponds, rivers

and streams are to be "swimmable and fishable" by 1983. Moreover, by 1985, water pollution is to be eliminated.

Seeterlin said southeastern Michigan may have a tough time meeting those goals. "The southeast Michigan region has more than 4,000 inland lakes and ponds to maintain and Lake Erie, which has suffered extensive pollution damage. Our job is bigger than most areas of the nation."

SEMCOG officials privately label those goals "Mission Impossible."

"There's no way than can be zero (pollution) discharge (into the region's bodies of water)," said one SEMCOG staff member. "But the federal government hasn't backed off, so neither have we."

IN SPITE OF THE seeming impossibility of meeting the standards and

prospects of facing a hostile, anti-regional bloc of delegates, SEMCOG and water quality board officials defend their plan and their standing as the regional watchdog.

"We can't afford a scattered, shotgun approach in this mammoth clean-up campaign because, in the long run, everybody's pollution drains into Lake Erie," Seeterlin said.

SEMCOG officials view the water quality board as a clearing house for information, a mediator in local water quality disputes, a regional forum and an ombudsman going to bat for local communities in Lansing and Washington. "One of the key things this board will be able to do," Seeterlin said, "is help resolve conflicts between the public and private sector, and between local governmental agencies."

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

Donahue defends his record

Editor:
In a recent letter to the editor, Gary Roberts, a Canton resident and former Trustee candidate, raises certain questions which I would like to take an opportunity to answer.

These facts come from the legal records of the Township Board minutes which are kept by the clerk.

A request for dictation equipment for the Police Department was brought to us, not by me, but rather by the Police Department itself. As Mr. Roberts outlines, we did, indeed, buy 10 dictation units plus a main station for the Police Department. The total cost, however, was just slightly over \$6,000.

The estimated savings per year in direct payroll costs is slightly over \$70,000. In my opinion, no matter how you look at it, that is money saved.

Mr. Roberts indicates that I introduced raising trustee salaries 200 per cent. In reality, that figure is low. My recommendation for an upper limit was a 233 per cent increase. In actuality, the Board passed an 88 per cent increase which still left our trustees far below the average stipend paid by communities in our region.

The question of where is it going to come from was very clearly answered before the increase was approved. Provisions had been made in our budget to

hire an accountant at a salary of approximately \$20,000 a year because, now that we have an administration and trustees who are working harder and putting in more time, we have found that we do not need this proposed accountant. The total annual cost of these trustee raises to the Township will be \$7,200. Once again, no matter how you look at it, that appears to me to be an annual savings of almost \$13,000 over having an additional employee. The only control the Township has over whether or not a trustee does their homework to earn this raise is the best control. Simply, they must face re-election in two years. The vot-

ers' wisdom will be unparalleled in gleaming out those people who are doing their job properly.

Relative to the subject of Deputy Treasurer, Mr. Roberts quotes a statement made by Ms. Goldsmith. However, I must assume that Mr. Roberts' tape recorder had a power failure right in the middle of the statement. Indeed, Ms. Goldsmith did say, "I voted for one Treasurer, not two," but that was only half the statement. The entire statement was, "I voted for one Treasurer, not two, but the law says we must have a Deputy Treasurer. Neither we, or Mr. Donahue, have any choice in the matter. We must have a Deputy Treasurer. Our only point of control is how much we should pay that person." The ultimate rate of pay was determined by a Board of seven—not one. The fact that Previous Deputy Treasurers were either unwilling to work, or unwanted, has no bearing on this case.

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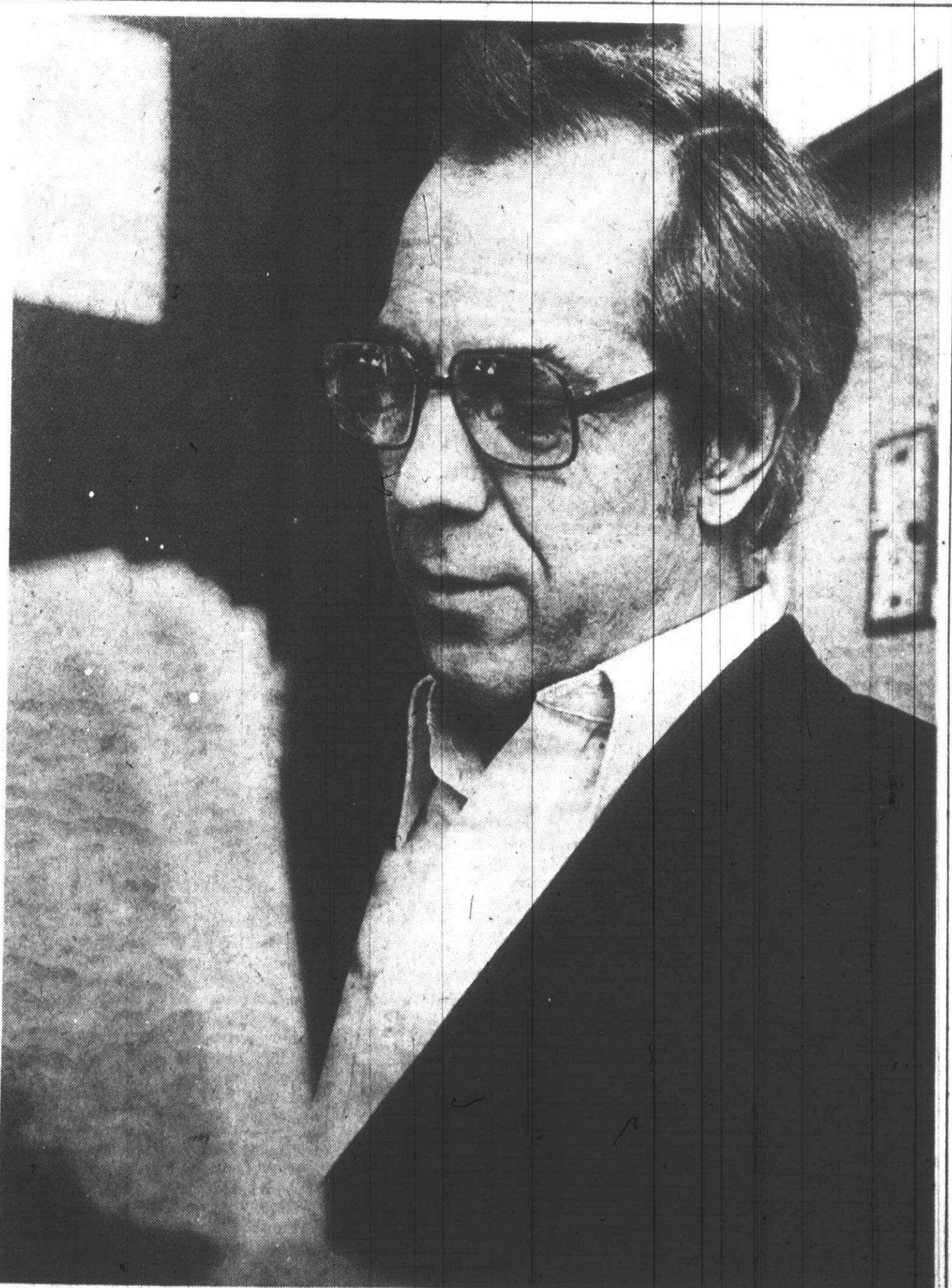

It's a pretty big job for such a little ad, but we can handle it. We have confidence because we know that we help thousands of people each week. We want you to be aware of that and let us help you, too.

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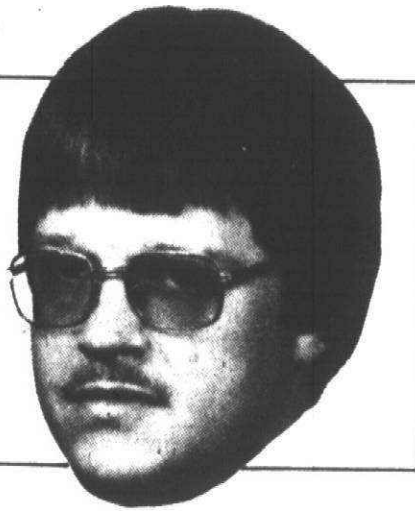

Outlining tax changes

The following is a summary of major provisions of the Revenue Act of 1978 effective Jan. 1, 1979.

CORPORATE TAXES- One significant change in the tax law is the reduction in corporate tax rates. For tax years beginning in 1979, the corporate tax rates are: 17 per cent on the first \$25,000 of taxable income, 20 per cent on the second \$25,000, 30 per cent on the third \$25,000, 40 per cent on the fourth \$25,000 and 46 per cent on taxable income over \$100,000.

SUB-S CORPORATIONS- Major changes affecting Sub-S corporations also have been approved. Sub-S corporations are no longer limited to ten shareholders, but may have as many as 15. A corporation may now change to Sub-S status any time during the preceding tax year or during the first 75 days of its current tax year. Rules for revoking Sub-S status remain the same.

JOBS TAX CREDIT- The Jobs Tax Credit in effect for 1977 and 1978 is not available for employees hired after

Dec. 31, 1978. For tax years beginning after Dec. 31, 1978, a credit is available only for workers hired from specified groups of employees, such as: certain welfare recipients; handicapped individuals; and members of economically disadvantaged families who are also age 18-24, or Vietnam-era veterans, or ex-convicts. The credit can be as much as \$3,000 per employee in the first year of employment and \$1,500 in the second year.

EMPLOYER CONTRIBUTIONS TO EMPLOYEE'S IRA- In lieu of establishing a pension plan, an employer can make contributions, which are tax deductible, to an employee's Individual Retirement Account (IRA) for 1979. The maximum deduction for employer contributions is 15 per cent of the employee's compensation up to a \$7,500 maximum, rather than the usual \$1,500 maximum. If employer contributions are less than the \$1,500/15 per cent amount, the employee can contribute to the account to make up the difference.

OTHER CHANGES- The following are other changes in the tax law effective in 1979:

1. The personal exemption is increased to \$1,000, but the general tax credit has been eliminated;
2. The zero bracket amount (formerly the standard deduction) has been raised to \$2,300 for single individuals and to \$3,400 for married couples filing jointly;
3. Earned income credit is increased to a maximum of ten per cent of the first \$5,000 of earned income;
4. The credit for political contributions has been raised to \$50 (\$100 on joint returns) and the alternative political contribution deduction has been eliminated;
5. The child care credit is available for payments to grandparents;
6. No business deduction can be claimed for entertainment facilities such as yachts; and
7. A restaurant owner is no longer required to report employees' tips which have been entered on charge accounts.

In 1979, as in the past, the County of Wayne approved a contract for the removal of dead and undesirable trees in Edward Hines Park. This wood was to be cut and hauled to a location where the public would have access to it.

On a number of occasions my father was there to haul some of this wood for use in our home fireplace. My father said this wood usually consisted of mostly willow and elm trees.

What we cannot understand is, if this was public wood, then why the hell did the public have to line up behind some bureaucrats to get some of it?

We wonder if the commissioners are aware of what's going on in Hines Park. We bet they do, and don't care, or this larceny would come to a abrupt halt.

My father said, "I look at my county tax assessments and wonder how many trees of those are already mine." "I've lived in Plymouth for 26 years, I wonder how many of those trees I have paid for through my county taxes." "It makes me mad as hell."

My father says with the amount of wood that is cut from Hines from year to year, there is enough to go around for everyone if a select few are not allowed to "hog" it all. Just how much damned wood does the county need?

How can a whole crew of county workers stand around to watch a few trees being felled and cut? Don't these guys have anything else to do? I say we find them a job. That's what I call having a cake and burning it, too.

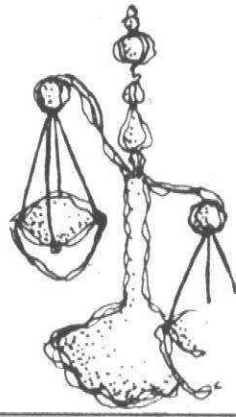
If Carter weren't applying his pleas to our friends, we wouldn't have been caught with our pants down in the Mideast, Kissinger said.

Winter hips need work

A chart suddenly appeared on the wall outside our executive editor's office last week. It is a vacation scheduling chart for 1979.

Thoughts of a vacation right now seem so dreamy with the sub-zero weather we are having, the four foot pile of snow next to our driveway, and boots, mittens, hats and scarves scattered around our mud room in the back of our house.

But that same chart really jolted me. I am sure I am no different than you, in that a couple of pounds have accumulated on my hips during the winter months. It's so easy to not think about it, while wearing heavy coats, and all the other apparel that tends to hide a small weight gain.

BUT, I'M AFRAID if I don't do something about those couple of pounds right now, I will be in a state of panic when the weather warms up, the coats

come off, and I find myself wanting to wear shorts and bathing suits.

I decided I'd rather get rid of the weight right now than waiting until it's critical. So it's back to a concentrated effort in eating salads (more of them), keeping the carrots and celery cleaned and ready for eating.

I also have decided to exercise more. I took my children ice-skating for the first time in years. Up till now it has been easier to drop them off at the ice rink. I decided to join them.

Not only was the exercise good for me, but the children were thrilled to see Mom skate. "And she didn't even fall once!" they told their Dad at day's end.

I have decided to go swimming at the local high school pool next Sunday. That will make me get into my bathing suit and really face the truth. In addition, the activity level, when sustained, is more vigorous than skating (at the

speed I skate). I really enjoy swimming more. It's just psychologically difficult to think about swimming when it's so cold outside.

What I'll do is swim with my eyes closed most of the time, pretending I'm in the tropics. The problem I'll have with that is that reality will hit me as soon as I leave the pool to go home.

Anyway, I figure an hour of swimming will burn off more calories than skating and certainly more than reading recipes. The sustained activity level of swimming is almost the equivalent of jogging.

I ALSO WILL start stepping on the scales daily.

I have a tendency to sort of "forget" about the scales when I get rather lackadaisical about my eating habits. I am one of those people who benefits from a daily weighing. Some people find it works against them. For me, it's one of the only things that keeps me on my toes and out of the refrigerator.

Finally, back to counting calories. As has so often been said before, there is no substitute for the equation: The number of calories eaten cannot be greater than the number burned or it will result in a weight gain.

There is no such thing as a diet without counting calories. No matter what anyone tells you, it isn't true. If this is what the fad diet claims, then they have already counted the calories for you somewhere along the way. I prefer to do it my own way with the foods I like.

Charting every single bite, too, is the only way of seeing exactly where one has slipped up. Even if you stir the spaghetti sauce, then taste it for flavoring, that taste counts. You must write it down. I am a great taster!

I think my biggest problem is keeping myself from eating second portions of meat at dinner. I don't need it, and if I would chew it more slowly and enjoy the flavor, I probably wouldn't be tempted to do so. Again, counting calories will help control this problem.

"Goodness," you say. "Sounds like she has more than just a couple of pounds to lose."

No! It truly is just about three pounds. But, if I don't go through this entire routine that I have just outlined, those three pounds will turn into four, five, maybe even twenty-five.

Job satisfaction down

Do you ever wonder how people feel about their jobs, their opportunities for promotion, the quality of supervision or about their work environment—is it safe, secure and friendly? Well, the pollsters are back at work and their findings are somewhat alarming.

Survey results indicate that job satisfaction is lower today than at any time since 1950 for clerical and hourly workers, but the satisfaction level of managers is about the same.

The rate of decline for clerical workers exceeds that of hourly workers and it would appear that they (clericals) view their jobs as "paper pushing" and not too dissimilar from factory workers.

YET THE DATA has a number of anomalies:

1. Managers, clericals and hourly employees prefer their current employers to other company's they know or have heard about.
2. Better than half of these same groups believe their company's pay rates are "good" or "very good" and the trend has been steadily rising since 1974. So even in light of inflation, the pay scale doesn't seem to be the source or underlying cause of job dissatisfaction.
3. Managers, clericals and hourly workers feel the quality of supervision is getting better but opportunities for promotion are growing scarcer.
4. The trends are decidedly downward when it comes to: (a) the willingness of the company to listen to problems and complaints, (b) doing something about employee's problems and complaints, and (c) fairness in dealing with employees.
5. In each work criteria surveyed

managers were more satisfied than were clerical and hourly workers. This consistent difference is being referred to as the "hierarchy gap" by social scientists.

WHAT DOES THE data portend for the future in labor management negotiations?

I would suggest that the issues which will separate labor and management in the future won't be economic so much as they will be matters which deal with the intrinsic satisfaction of work itself: involvement in decisions which affect job roles, fair treatment and equity, more promotional opportunities, respect for the individual, listening to employee problems and complaints and other self-esteem related factors.

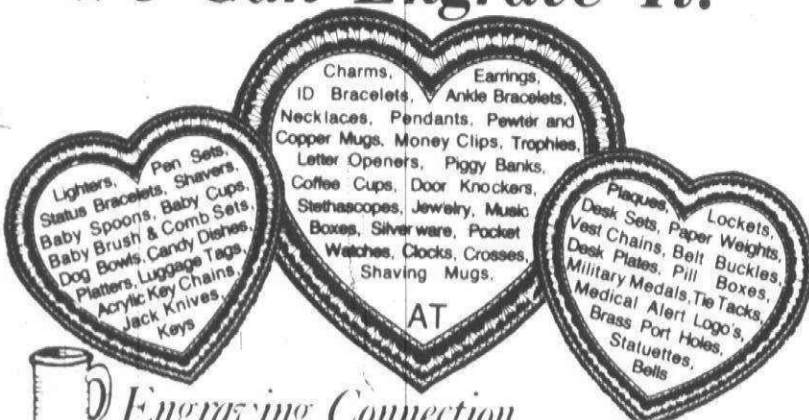
Pay raises and human relations training for supervisors won't produce lasting satisfaction for the working classes in the future. We may even hear some workers say, "the pay isn't much but..."

Ultimatum socks builders where it counts

It's about time someone told the builders in Canton to shape up or ship out.

This week, the Canton Board of Trustees made it clear that something had better be done about homeowner complaints or something would be done about the builders who caused those complaints.

That took guts.

It's not easy for a politician to look a powerful force like Canton's builders right in the eye and issue an ultimatum.

Owners and managers of these development firms can contribute the big bucks to support political campaigns.

The people who own the houses with massive repair problems may vote for a politician, but they can only be counted on for small, sporadic contributions.

This time around, the board realized full well that

its purpose is to represent the people of Canton, not just the companies who shell out the most money.

There's real muscle behind the demand to get homeowners' complaints cleared up. Supervisor Noel Culbert has promised to have an ordinance prepared that would require builders to post a substantial bond on each building permit issued. If the builder doesn't make good on a homeowner's complaint, the bond could be used to pay for corrections.

Builders may be powerful, but few of them have the resources to put a large bond behind each house

they build.

We expect to hear many cries of "Unfair!" from builders in response to the board's resolution. But there will also be a lot more attention paid to the man whose family room is flooded and the woman who discovered portions of her house aren't insulated.

We find it difficult to feel much sympathy for the companies who say there's no way a new house can be absolutely perfect.

Those new houses may not be perfect, but anyone shelling out \$80,000 for a home has a right to expect

problems to be corrected with a minimum of fuss.

The board has made a strong stand. If trustees maintain that stand, it seems likely homeowners will have an easier time of it in the future.

That stand must be coupled with more cooperation by the township's building department and careful policing of the builders' actions.

It would be a great disappointment to discover the township allowing all concerned to slip back to their old ways after this initial confrontation.

We applaud the courage of the people who sit on the board. We support the effort to clear up homeowner complaints even if it means putting builders out of business.

We also realize that the promises made at this point are just promises.

We'll save the medals until those promises become reality.

Teng teaches buyers lesson

When Chinese Vice Premier Teng Hsiao-ping refused to use the chopsticks provided him at the recent White House state dinner, presumably because they were made in Taiwan, he raised a lot of questions around the luncheon tables of the land. As he read the piece in the morning paper, The Stroller wondered what would happen if the people in this country refused to use anything made abroad.

Long before the Chinese vice premier set the example in so lofty a place as the White House, The Stroller has been amazed by the preponderance of foreign-made goods on the shelves of our leading marketplaces.

This amazement reached its peak during the recent holiday season when a lady of our acquaintance placed an order for a souvenir Currier and Ives plate from a mail order house and on its arrival found it tagged "Made in Japan."

Imagine that, she said. You can't duck foreign-made goods even for Christmas gifts in our country. She was even more surprised when many other gifts were stamped with the names of foreign countries.

IT HAS BEEN a known fact for quite a while that many of the toys displayed during the Yuletide have been made in Japan, but from all evidence at hand the foreign made goods sold here have gone far beyond toys.

Just the other day as he was strolling through one of our local malls, The Stroller's eyes focused on an unusual pair of shoes just outside the window.

Being curious, he picked them up and, lo and behold, there was a tag: "Made in Taiwan."

As he placed the shoes back on the shelf, The Stroller couldn't help asking himself, "Aren't there any goods being made in this country?"

IF HE WAS surprised at the shoe store, he was shocked a few moments later in one of the larger haberdasheries. Walking down the aisle, he came to a special sale on shirts. Always being difficult to fit, The Stroller picked up one of the shirts and was just about shocked when he saw the tag "Made in Taiwan."

Later on, he called on a chap in a new leather store in Plymouth. You can imagine the surprise when he was told that much of the leather from which he makes wallets and handbags comes from an eastern company that imports the cowhides from France. Imagine that—with all the cattle raised in America.

Mentioning this to Ray Lech, executive secretary of the Livonia Chamber of Commerce, he laughed and then said, "You were not any more shocked than I was some time ago when on a vacation trip to Alaska."

"I wanted a keepsake from the Arctic regions, and when I purchased it there was a tag, 'Made in Hong Kong.'"

So, maybe the Chinese vice premier gave us something to think about.

Why can't we purchase only things made in America? It sure would help remove the disparity in our trade relations that leaves the United States on the losing end every year.



How much for free air?

"Every service station should be required to provide free pressurized air for tires."

So read the opening sentence of an editorial in the February issue of the official magazine of the Automobile Club of Michigan, an organization of more than 1.2 million members. Circulation of the magazine, Michigan Living—Motor News, is nearly 800,000.

Basically, I agree with Editor Len Barnes' assertion, but are there two sides to the coin?

It's ridiculous to find, when a tire goes soft—just soft, not flat—that one must drive with fingers crossed to as many as five stations before finding an available, workable air hose.

But that was exactly my experience recently. A noon luncheon appointment waited by necessity while I nursed my car at a cautious gait through January slop to the closest oasis.

When I got there, I made a bad mistake.

BROUGHT UP in the days of true SERVICE stations, I asked for the location of the air hose. I was told it was broken. I am not a regular customer there. I had no need to ask for gasoline, for the tank was full.

Four stations and two miles later, smoldering in high dudgeon and far off my intended route, I found that Fred Frady of a Sunoco station at Plymouth Road and Laurel believes in the AAA theory that "Proper air pressure is as important to a tire as oil is to an engine."

He pulled a long snake of a hose from within his heated repair area, put air into that suffering right front oval which holds to this day, and didn't even ask about the petrol.

The gracious deed seemed so much Frady's nature that I doubt he even remembered face or vehicle when I drove in some days later just for gasoline.

MY-EXAMPLE is a case of extremes, but it did happen.

I can change a flat if I must, and have a number of times over the years, but damned if I enjoy the bloody knuckles that inevitably result.

Just offhand, there seems to be a growing minority who either ignore one's need, or point to the

device at the edge of the property where four minutes of pressurized air become available upon deposit of 25 cents.

Contrary to your expectations, I don't complain about the latter a whit.

Somewhere I once was taught that repeat business is a necessity for economic survival in many lines of endeavor. The keynote is spelled s-e-r-v-i-c-e. Whether it's with a smile or a growl really isn't the point.

If Fred Frady never turned away a tire begging for infusion, neither did Elton McAllister nor so many other SERVICE station operators whom I know only by first names—Jack, Ray, Don, Paul, Cal et al. No doubt you can add dozens more of your own ken. More power to 'em.

CHARLES SHIPLEY, executive director of the Service Station Dealers of Michigan, now rises to be heard, and deservedly so. Shipley does so at my request, for this is the other side of the coin.

All we discussed was Len Barnes' line: "Every service station should be required to provide free pressurized air for tires."

Not unreasonably, Shipley shifts some of the responsibility for the growing concerns of tire inflation safety to the customers.

He feels keenly about, and not friendly toward, motorists who fill their tanks at self-serve stations and then tap the nice traditionalists down the street for extras without putting any nickels on the drum.

"Would you ask a restaurant for a napkin and glass of water and then eat your lunch out of a brown paper bag in their parking lot?" Shipley has a point.

"AIR IS FREE, but compressed air takes effort or money," he continued. "It costs more for a service station to maintain an air compressor than it does to operate all the appliances in your home."

"Yes, this thing is a problem and we have become deeply involved in it. Gasoline now is being sold by many outlets which, in fact, are not service stations. Their reduced prices attract many customers."

"There is no obligation to non-customers. No one has an inherent 'right' to free service. But where you are a customer, I don't know of a single station that wouldn't put in air for you."

My conclusion:

Where you're not known, where you don't drive in regularly, perhaps the best answer is always to need at least a dollar's worth of gasoline for air, two for a clean windshield, and three if the rest room calls.

Governor prods county reform

From here, it's difficult to read the mind of Gov. William G. Milliken and determine how serious he is about massive reorganization of Wayne County government.

The governor's fairly radical proposals weren't contained in his state of the state message, nor even in the text of a formal speech. Rather, they were revealed in a briefing on the 1979-80 state budget by his budget director, Gerald Miller.

Milliken is dangling the bait of several millions in bailout money before the red-ink-stained county in return for the county's agreement to changes in its governmental pattern.

To understand the situation, you need some history.

IN 1908 MICHIGAN adopted a constitution allowing city home rule. The constitution and its model enabling act allowed cities a tremendous measure of freedom in designing their own formats.

No longer did cities have to have wards. No longer did they have to elect mayors, clerks and treasurers. No longer did they have to have partisan government.

They could switch to at-large council elections, hire city managers as chief administrators, have nonpartisan government, appoint clerks and treasurers and write charters with property tax limits of up to 20 mills.

In 1963, Michigan adopted a constitution allowing county home rule. But the enabling legislation gave little latitude to county charter commissions.

Even if we were to elect a charter commission, we'd be stuck with partisan elections; taxing powers would be little affected; we'd still have to elect most such officers as the clerk, treasurer, sheriff (the reeve of the shire, in medieval England), and so on.

Not surprisingly, no counties have elected to go the charter route.

In 1973, then State Sen. Carl Pursell (R-Plymouth) maneuvered through the legislature Act 139, under which counties could choose to have either an elected executive (such as a mayor) or an appointed manager (such as a city manager). Oakland, Bay and Grand Traverse counties have used the act in one way or another. Act 139 adds one good office but stops short of a general cleanup.

So much for history.

AS I GET the picture, Milliken would ask the legislature to amend the county home rule act so that Wayne County could have something resembling a city charter.

Milliken visualizes abolishing the clerk, treasurer, drain commissioner, sheriff and register of deeds—but not the prosecutor—as elective offices, though certainly their work would not be abolished. Coming in would be an elected executive.

How could an executive help? In the last round of budget cuts, the five elected department heads went to court to force restoration of their funds. They didn't care whether the money was there or not. The suit was expensive and time-consuming.

A single executive, bossing all or most of the department heads, could have made intelligent budget cuts, and would have had the clout to prevent those lawsuits. That's just one reason why Wayne needs a county executive.

ONE PROBLEM is that the county needs to close a \$13 million budget gap right away, but writing a reform charter could take two to four years.

Some commissioners object to Milliken's inserting himself into Wayne County affairs by insisting on such reforms. They have a point.

But look at it from the governor's point of view: Why should he pour millions of state funds into one county without demanding some kind of major changes to keep it from happening again?

If Republican Gov. George Romney couldn't get a worthwhile county home rule act through a Republican legislature in 1968, is there any reason to believe Republican Gov. Milliken can get one passed by a Democratic legislature in 1979?

That question makes me wonder how serious Milliken is about Wayne County reorganization.

The bottom line is this: If Wayne County politicians don't want the Milliken floor plan but do want state aid, what are they going to give Milliken in return? There's no such thing as a free lunch.

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Just Between Us

Are you ready for remarriage?

Some 80 per cent of the divorced in our society remarry. Marriage apparently has never been more popular than it is today. The divorce rate is high. So is the remarriage rate.

Persons become disillusioned with a particular marriage. But they do try again.

Recently, people have been remarrying more quickly than in the past. The statistically "average" person who divorces remarries in about three years.

Also statistically, the younger you are, the greater the chances that you will remarry. Those least likely to enter a second marriage are women in the higher age ranges.

QUESTIONS THAT people ask about remarriage include, "What are the odds on my succeeding in another marriage?"

If the question is whether one will divorce again, the statistical chances are greater that he or she will not. Most persons divorce only once.

For the remarriages that do last, the partners generally indicate to researchers that they are happier than they were in the first marriage. That's logical, because many persons who are not satisfied in their second marriage tend to get out of it.

Measuring oneself against statistics, however, is not very helpful. There are unique features to each of us and our situation.

Statistics don't marry. People do.

A BETTER question is, "Am I ready for remarriage?"

Along with that may go the question, "Is my intended spouse ready for remarriage?" because many remarriages are a second time around for both partners.

Presumably neither you nor your intended spouse wishes to marry a bigamist, neither a legal nor an emotional bigamist. It is not very satisfying to be married to someone who is still psychologically married to another person.

Time is one of the major factors in dissolving old ties. Experts give the advice, "Take your time in remarrying." That makes sense.

Being in a hurry to remarry interferes with the completion of important tasks. One of these is the task of getting rid of the residue of the first marriage, "clearing out the ghosts" of that relationship.

We need time to work through the effects of ending the old relationship. Bereavement and grief reactions are normal and it takes time to work through such feelings.

Along with the sense of loss that needs to be dealt with, one also has other feelings. Anger and guilt are commonly felt. These need to be understood and worked through as well as possible.

ONE NEEDS to resolve at least the major parts of the disillusionment that goes with ending a marriage.

Getting over the loss of the spouse as a person may be completed—and typically is—long before we feel ready to risk committing ourselves in another marriage. The sense of being betrayed and sometimes of having failed shakes one's confidence and sense of security.

Time alone does not resolve such feelings and doubts, but it does help in healing. And it allows opportunity for sorting out issues and feelings and making sensible decisions.

Most persons seem to need time to try life on their own before being ready to tie themselves into a new marital commitment. Some may wish to try associating with a variety of members of the opposite sex before "settling down."

That is not necessarily the same as giving ourselves the opportunity to see how we fare totally on our own for a time.

For most persons it is quite important to learn that we can "survive" alone if we have to do so. As lonely and painful as such a process may be, it gives us the security of knowing that if a second marriage does not work out, we will not have to stay in it because emotionally we cannot bear to live alone.

We will not have to live scared.

JUMPING INTO a new relationship, without allowing time to sort things out and understand what happened in the old, deters one from resolving conflicts associated with the former marriage.

For example, we need to reach a stage of indifference toward the former spouse, rather than continuing to be angry or vindictive.

Impulsiveness seems to be related significantly to getting into an inappropriate first marriage. Jumping quickly into a second relationship may be essentially a continuation of the same personality tendencies.

Or it may be something else, such as an unconscious attempt to deny and avoid pain connected with the first spouse or marriage. Either way, it is not helpful.

It is possible to learn from our mistakes. We can learn and mature through experience. Both clinical observation and research support the idea that many persons do make better choices and fare better in a remarriage.

These are people who are able to give themselves adequate opportunity to learn.

Hearings probe abuse of adults

The Michigan Department of Social Services has added another hearing as it solicits public comment on a program to protect the elderly, physically handicapped and other adults who may be in danger of abuse or exploitation.

The additional hearing was scheduled because of strong interest in metropolitan Detroit on adult protective services. It will run from 9:30 a.m. to noon Tuesday, Feb. 20 in Barth Hall of St. Paul Cathedral, 4800 Woodward, Detroit.

Individuals, agencies and advocacy groups who wish to be heard should register beginning at 9 a.m.

Ted deWolf, program director for state adult community services, said these questions will be raised:

- "What problems do local citizens face in having access to existing service and in learning about available services that could prevent possible neglect, abuse or exploitation?"
- "Should specific legislation be enacted to provide immunity from liability for adult protective services workers who are acting within the scope of the employment?"
- "Should local Social Services offices have authority to protect adults who refuse help when confronted with dangers affecting their well-being?"
- "What can be done to enhance cooperation among the agencies involved?"

Several state agencies will be working on the plan, said deWolf. They include the Department of Mental Health, Department of Public Health, Department of Education and Office of Services to the Aging.

Ask the Educator

Mainstream the retarded?

QUESTION: I teach 15 educable mentally impaired students (mildly retarded) in an elementary school. I believe that almost every one of my students could successfully take art, music and gym with the normal children.

My principal disagrees with me. He doesn't feel that most of the regular teachers are ready yet for a mainstreaming experience with my students.

I disagree. Some of my kids could almost keep up with grade level in selected academic areas. Some of the other teachers in my building even tell me they'd be willing to pioneer if I would like.

How can I persuade my principal to help rather than hinder me in mainstreaming?

ANSWER: You are on the right track. Don't lose heart. Your principal is among a dwindling minority of administrators. And thank goodness for that.

I am not surprised that some of your fellow teachers tell you privately that they are ready to try mainstreaming. After all, the educational literature repeatedly has shown the benefit of educating handicapped and normal children together repeatedly.

It isn't just the handicapped child who benefits from being with his normal age mates. The normal student learns to appreciate and tolerate human differences if proper and wise examples are set by the teaching staff.

The achievement of the handicapped student can be expected to be enhanced by mainstreaming. It is believed that this effect may be due to the improved self image which results from being part of the normal school environment rather than being totally isolated in a special education room.

CONTINUE YOUR conversations with your principal. Reassure him that you will follow up on

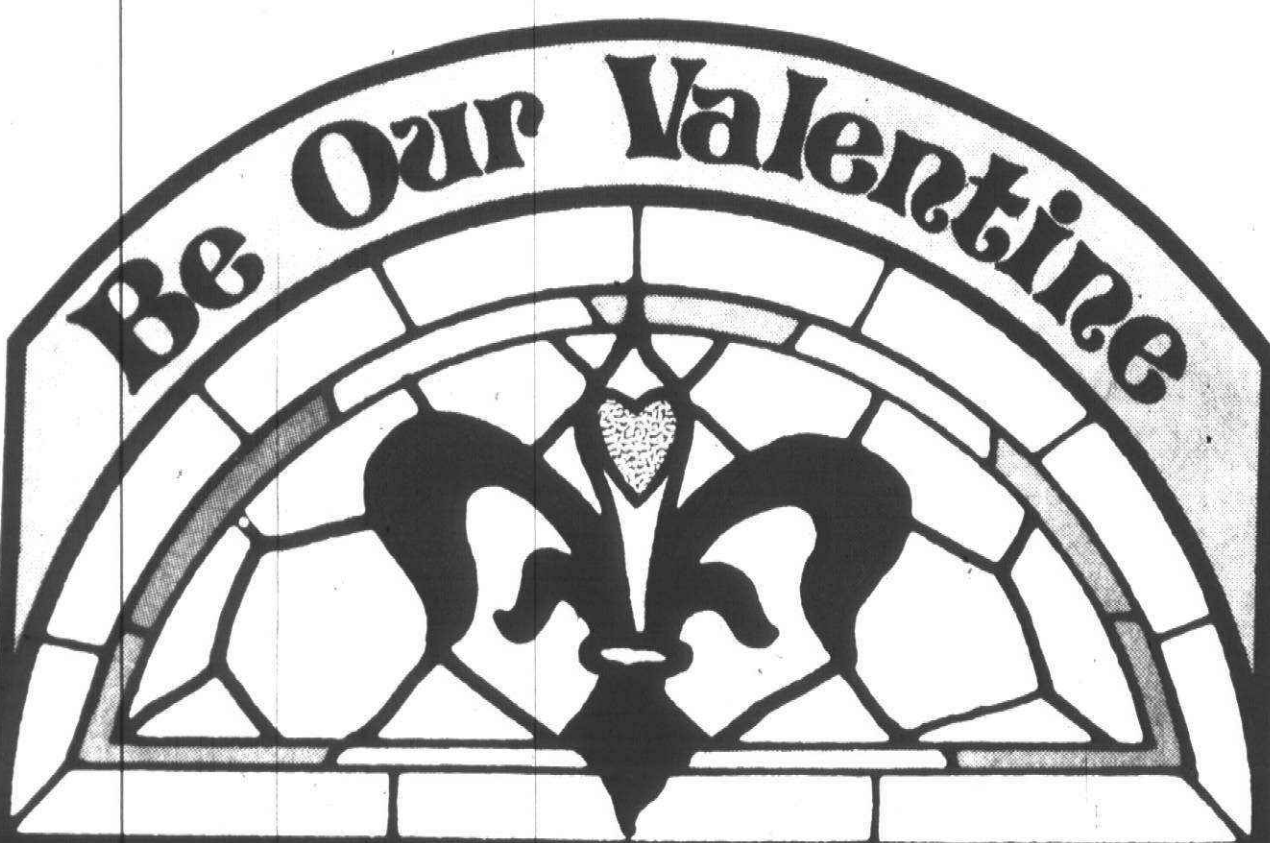
your students and offer advice and materials to willing regular education teachers.

Seek out your director of special education and ask his advice. Perhaps he would be willing to do some in-service training with his fellow administrator. He should be providing you with close support in this matter.

Also, remind your principal that Public Law 94-142, of 1975, the Education of the Handicapped Act, clearly mandates education in the "least restrictive environment." This means substantial mainstreaming for all of your students unless it can be shown that it would be damaging experience for the children in question.

And finally, I'm surprised that your special student's parents have not spoken up on this issue. If they do and your administrator maintains his position, he is likely to be embarrassed.

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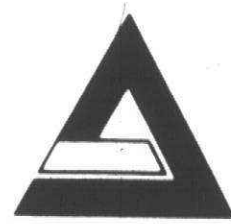

Schoolcraft program responds

Oil industry needs technicians

John Bedford, who heads Schoolcraft College's petroleum technology program, is a man with two messages.

The bad news, he said after attending an energy conference in Washington, D.C., is that "it was rather depressing—a bleak picture."

The good news is that the oil industry will be hiring great numbers of technical people, both additional and replacement, in the next 10 years, and at excellent salaries.

Schoolcraft's program has six students in the first year and eight in the second. "We could take 25," said Bedford, who has begun intensive recruiting.

AMERICA WILL continue to depend heavily on oil, Bedford concluded after attending a recent National Energy Education, Business and Labor Conference sponsored by the U.S. Department of Energy.

"We need some technical breakthroughs," he said of the overall situation.

Every alternative system was shown to have some faults. Nuclear energy plants may have contaminants, and the wastes are tempting to terrorists who might use them in a low-level bomb. Coal is dirty, its production is low and

subject to labor disruption. "Some 60,000 persons die early every year because of coal dust pollution," Bedford reported.

"Windmills are eyesores to some people, are subject to bird strikes in migrations, and in some places disrupt TV reception. Nuclear fusion? The chances of development are 50-50, but that's down the road," he went on.

Conservation? The public isn't convinced the energy situation is serious. "Nobody seems to know if it's lack of communication or selfishness by the public," he said.

"THERE ARE jobs in two areas in the oil industry," Bedford said, turning to the good news.

"They're planning to expand production 33 per cent in the next five years. So employment will have to go up 33 per cent in most phases of the petroleum industry, including natural gas."

"And the natural attrition in the oil business is rather severe. The average age (of technical and managerial people) is 47 or 48. In the next 10 years, they'll have to replace one-third of them. They tend to retire at about 61 in the oil industry."

If you're quick at math, you have already figured out that in a decade half the faces in the technical and manage-

rial end of the industry will be new. People with degrees from two-year colleges will be in great demand.

You should expect, however, to move to another state. Michigan ranks 39th or so among oil producing states, Bedford said.

WHAT CAN a person with an associate degree in petroleum technology expect to do?

"You could be a right-hand man to a petroleum geologist—in exploration or drilling or enhanced recovery methods," Bedford began.

"You could work for a service company which assists oil companies by supplying drilling mud," he said, explaining that the mud is pumped through the drill and carries rock chips back to the surface.

"You could work in mud logging—catch the drill cuttings as they come to the surface, analyze and describe them, or evaluate the formations to see if hydrocarbons are present."

Specialized warehousing and selling are other possibilities.

One campus recruiter is the State of Michigan. It's seeking persons for regulatory jobs—environmental studies, granting permits, inspecting drilling practices for safety.

OF EIGHT persons who graduated last spring in petroleum technology, Bedford said, two went on to four-year universities—one to study geology at Michigan State, the other geological engineering at Michigan Tech.

"I've got two people working for the research division of Phillips Petroleum. One is working for Dresser Industries in drilling muds. One is working in drilling for Cleary Oil," said Bedford, adding he had lost track of two.

Bedford and William (Rocky) Ryan handle the geology courses at Schoolcraft. Bedford warns frankly. "It's not easy. The hours are long."

A petroleum tech student needs to know math through trigonometry, basic geology and such technical things as drilling and formation evaluation, conservation, economic geography and production methods.

He said Schoolcraft got into the petroleum technology field in 1974, when it looked as if Michigan would be producing more. At the time, there were only six such programs in the country.

Bedford said the college received a grant of \$110,000 from the National Science Foundation to develop the program. "Part of it went to educate me," he laughed.

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Work includes building a laundry-room, replacing frames, doors & storm-doors front and rear, for 20 units, replacing sidewalks, etc.

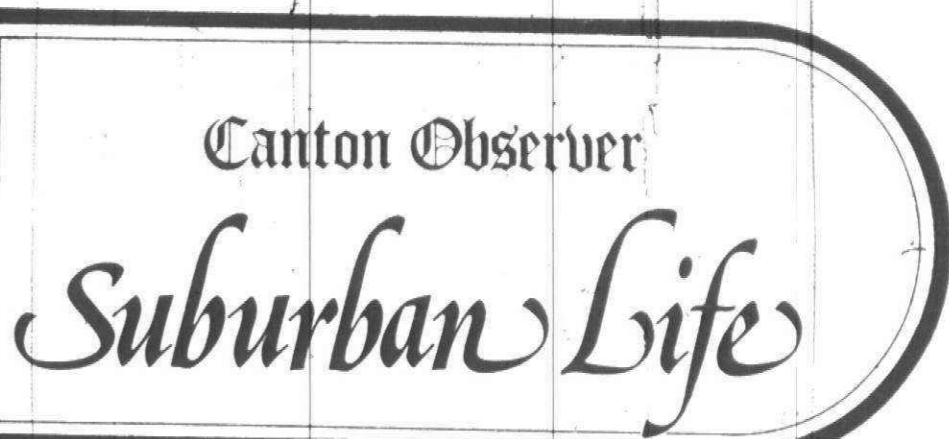

At museum

Early American lighting is theme

The early American lighting exhibit at the Plymouth Historical Museum ranges from very primitive devices that burned hot grease or fat to the elegance of the kerosene and whale oil era.

There is a double crusie. Made of wrought iron, it could be suspended by an attached hook. It was made about 1750 and differed from the Betty lamp in that it had no wick support. The Betty lamp also was a hanging lamp providing the convenience of elevated light.

Among the exhibits is a rush light which burned common, soft meadow rush saturated in hot grease or fat. These were used as a last resort when no candles were available.

There is a bird cage holder that dates back to the 18th century, a 19th century iron dowsler; a 19th century miner's pewter lamp; and a 17th century rush light with candle holder.

AN OLD TINDER box from the 1800s contains the original srike, matches, flint and snuffer. There also is a lard lamp from the 1850s. Many railroad lamps are on display as well as

18th century English brass candle holders. Among the fairy lamps is a very unusual pink and crystal Clarke lamp on a cut glass pedestal.

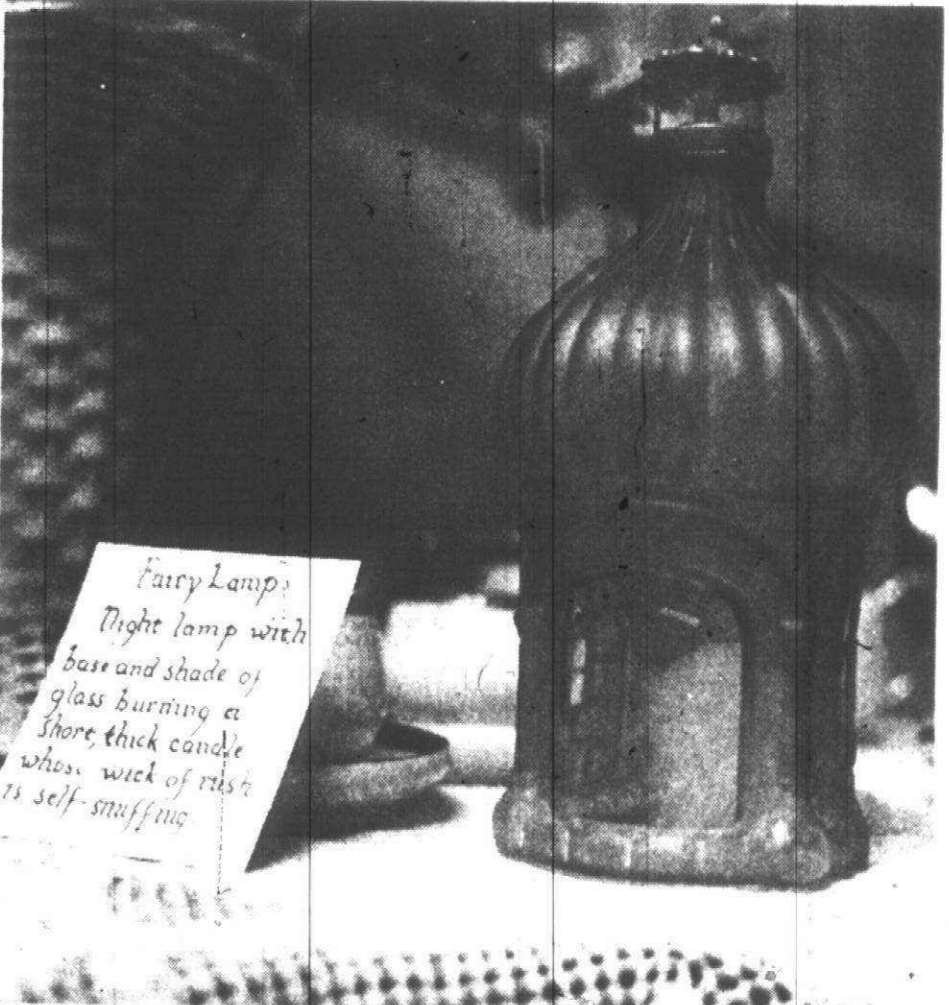
The collection of kerosene lamps includes the sweetheart pattern, sixteen panel, plain Moore, peacock feathers, blackberry and ribbed band from the 1800s.

Whale oil lamps made by the Boston and Sandwich Company include the Sandwich loop, three printie block, six-paneled flutes in color, eyes and scales, bull's eye and fleur de lis.

There is a lamp with a blown font and a waterfall base. The lace-maker lamps of the Steigel type are unusual.

The lighting exhibit will be featured at the museum until the end of March. The building at 155 S. Main Street, Plymouth is open Thursday, Friday and Saturday from 1-4 p.m. Admission is \$1 for adults, 50 cents for ages 12-17, and 25 cents for children 5-11.

Special educational tours can be arranged in advance by calling the museum, 455-8940.

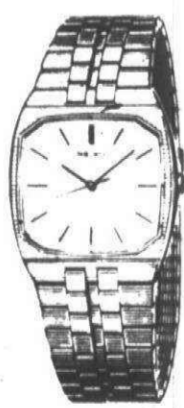

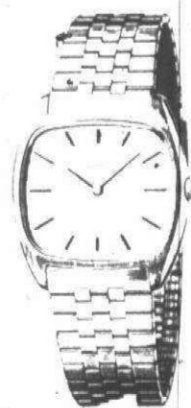

Radio-thon auction St. Joe fundraiser

Plymouth will be included in this year's radio-thon auction sponsored by St. Joseph Mercy Hospital in cooperation with WAAM radio station.

The actual auction will be April 6-8, but Plymouth team captains Nan Cooper and Wilma Newton will contact local merchants before Feb. 15 for auction donations.

The Radio-thon involves auctioning merchandise and services over WAAM, 1600 on the AM dial. The items and services are donated by area businesses and prominent community residents.

Last year's auction raised \$18,750 which purchased two anesthesia machines (\$11,000) and an electronystagmographic unit for testing the ear system balance (\$7,100).

GOALS FOR the 1979 radio-thon are a Stryker frame bed, \$4,500; surgery table for out-patient surgery, \$12,000; 6 blood-fluid warmers for surgery, \$2,280; infusion pump to administer IV fluids, \$1,000 each; portable patient monitor, \$1,950; and an external

pacemaker, \$1,500.

Last year, merchants donated such items as a New England clam bake, sports club memberships, paintings, helicopter ride and an airline ticket to Las Vegas.

Services which were auctioned included a chauffeured Rolls Royce, a pizza party, and a ride in Ann Arbor's old No. 5 fire truck.

Merchandise donated by area businesses must have a retail value of \$50 or more.

"FOR THEIR donations, merchants will receive business promotion, free air time, newspaper advertising and a tax benefit," said J. Parke Malcolm, chairman of this year's radio-thon committee.

In addition, items to be auctioned off will be displayed in the windows of area stores.

Kiss test for cystic fibrosis

"Kiss your baby" is the message the Detroit Chapter of the Cystic Fibrosis Foundation is stressing for a special week Feb. 11-18.

Dr. Robert Gregg, president of Children's Hospital of Michigan, and chairman of "Kiss Your Baby" Week, said a salty-tasting baby may be one who has the serious lung-damaging disease.

"Asking parents to kiss their babies is our way of alerting parents to the symptoms of CF," said Dr. Gregg, former director of respiratory diseases at Children's and an authority on CF.

CF is an inherited disease in which abnormally thick mucus clogs the lungs and airways, causing breathing problems, frequent infections and lung damage. The mucus may also clog the flow of digestive juices from the pancreas, preventing food

from being fully absorbed.

"So far, there's no cure for CF but early diagnosis can prolong life," Dr. Gregg added. Today 50 per cent of CF patients can be expected to live past age 19. Only a few years ago, most children didn't survive to kindergarten age.

Other signs of CF include persistent coughing, recurrent wheezing, pneumonia and excessive appetite with poor weight gain.

About one in every 1600 babies is born with CF. Early diagnosis and treatment are necessary to prevent lung damage and lengthens the lives of CF children.

A brief and painless "sweat test" can be performed at Children's Hospital, which has been designated a teaching and resource center by the Cystic Fibrosis Foundation, as well as other hospitals.

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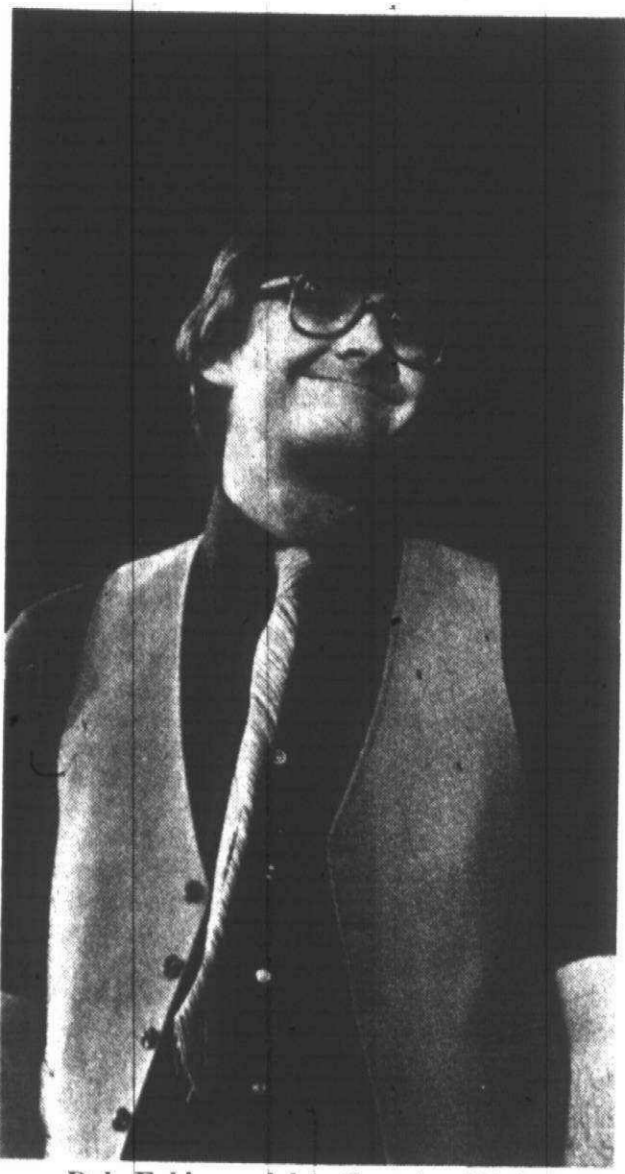

Meadow Brook's new director learned music from Flash Gordon

"Since I turned 30 in June, everything's turned my way."

That's how Stuart Hyke sums up the last several months of his life.

Prior to Dec. 18, Hyke was director of development for WDET-FM at Wayne State University. He began with WDET in the early 1970s as a volunteer working in the record library and later hosting his own radio shows.

Now Hyke is managing director of the Meadow Brook Music Festival. The position became vacant when Leon Petrus, the former director, left to take another position in Texas.

Hyke's move along the musical scale was no childhood dream, however.

"When I was 17 or 18, Frank Sinatra and Tony Bennett were my biggest interests musically," he said.

His musical career began because of his interest—believe it or not—in Flash Gordon.

"I only really got interested in classical music in 1969 or 1970. I went with a friend to see the movie 'Flash Gordon' that was being shown at Wayne State University. I always remembered the theme of the movie and told my friend I liked it. She told me what the music was—'Les Preludes' by Franz Liszt. I bought the record and started buying other things I knew and liked."

THE PURCHASE of this record led to the purchase of another—and another—until Hyke can now say he has 2,500 albums and 3,000 78 rpm records.

Music became Hyke's pastime at a period in his life when, with only one credit lacking to graduate from WSU with a degree in sociology and anthropology, he was managing a Farmer Jack's store in Trenton.

"I learned about music on my own, studying and listening when I came home from work. This was during a five-year period when I was working 60 hours a week," Hyke said.

Making his musical knowledge pay off with more than hours filled with pleasure came with the encouragement of two friends, Orin Hood, music director of WDET-FM and Lee Maschmeyer, host of the radio station's program on 78 rpm recordings.

"I met my friend Lee at a party. I began helping him do research for his radio program, and I eventually started helping to organize the station's record library."

"Then I ended up on the air," Hyke said.

After continuously suggesting program ideas to Hood, he was finally told to turn one of his suggestions into a program.

Hyke did, recalling that his first program in October 1973 "was awful."

BUT ONCE HE GAINED confidence on the air, Hyke became the host of the Saturday morning program, "The Maestro." And he still hosts "The Maestro." He is known for his friendly voice and for enunciating distinctly while filling sentences with quips of humor.

He plays historical recordings by great conductors.

Hyke also does a taped 1 a.m. Monday morning show with Hood, titled "Nacht Musik." They also do a program reading Sherlock Holmes mysteries on a closed radio circuit for the blind. Hood reads the part of Holmes. Hyke reads all the other characters.

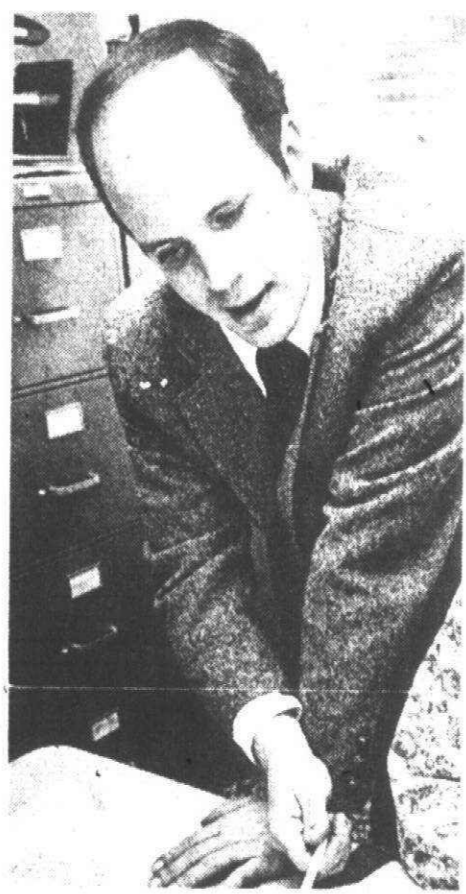
Because of his radio work, Hyke's voice is easily recognized.

"I'm not used to dealing directly with the public in person. I'm used to talking over the radio."

Hyke loses this shyness quickly, however, when he begins discussing his new role as managing director for the 16th outdoor music festival that the Detroit Symphony calls its home during the summer months.

"Hyke dresses in a three-piece wool suit, a contrast to the casual clothes he's used to wearing around the Wayne State campus where he finally finished his degree. Hyke said he has no qualms about working with famous people in the world of music.

"I FEEL very comfortable working with the artists," he said. "They feel comfortable talking to someone with a musical background, even though it's self-taught," he said.

"I don't play an instrument. I can't read a music score. But I've done a lot of studying."

Hyke's job from his office on the Oakland University campus in Avon Township is to direct every aspect of the summer music festival, which opens June 21, including the different series offered.

"I'll be involved with the day-to-day operations and doing the bookings for each series," said Hyke, who was born in Peoria, Ill.

He'll also work closely with Neville Marriner, the new music director of the festival's Thursday and Saturday night Detroit Symphony series.

Maestro Marriner, Hyke said, has planned the programs for the classical music symphony series. It's Hyke's responsibility to plan the rest.

"We'll try something innovation this year, but I hate to say what yet until things are definite," he said.

Hyke also has no qualms about the challenges of his new job, which include traveling. Although he had never been to Europe, he recently returned from visiting Maestro Marriner in London.

And he doesn't think the transition from raising money, like he did successfully for the radio station, and spending it will be a problem either.

"I THINK it will be a lot easier to spend money sensibly than to raise it," he said.

Though Hyke seems to have settled comfortably into his work, his enthusiasm hasn't diminished. His eyes glow when he talks about the upcoming festival season.

"I'm very tickled to be at Oakland University with the Meadow Brook Music Festival," said the Detroit resident. "It's an exciting job, and I feel up to it."

There's an area of concern that's bothering Hyke, besides his desire to move closer to the festival.

"My concern is my ability to enjoy the concerts as much as the patrons do. My first love is symphonic music."

"I go to the symphony almost constantly and have attended Meadow Brook Music Festival every summer."

His concern is a plus for patrons, however. Those planning on going to Meadow Brook this summer can rest assured that the man in charge of it will do all he can to make the concerts the best possible.

He's got quite a critic to please—himself.

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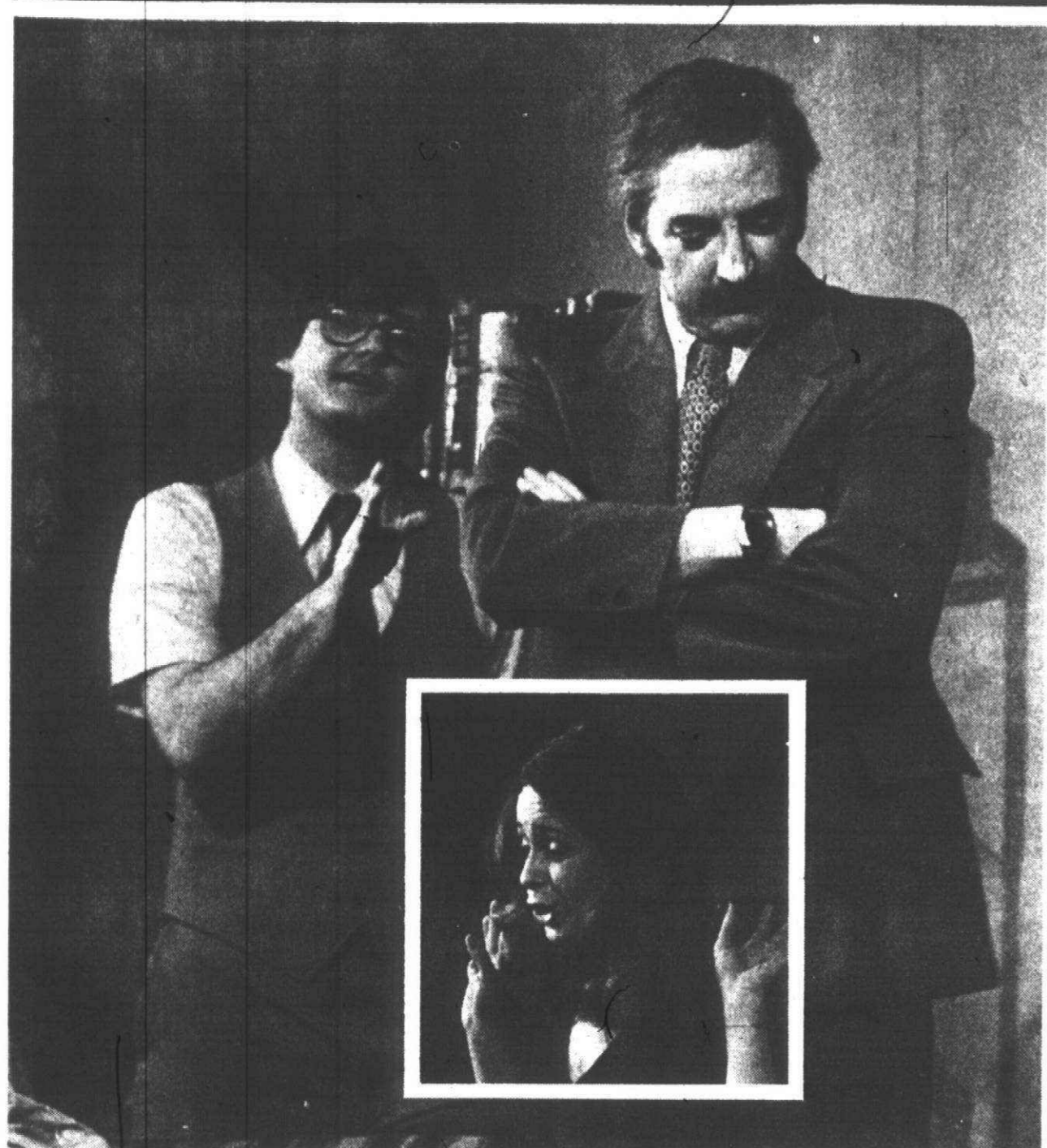

'Wedding Bells'

The wedding business is music to his ears

Music to get married by is what Lawrence W. Balog offers through his company, Wedding Bells, which provides live background music for weddings and receptions.

Wedding Bells furnishes chamber music for small weddings and ones with upwards of 300-400 guests.

"We throw in classical and light jazz," Balog said, explaining the musical programs each group may play. He put a cassette on the tape recorder, and elegant strains of a string quartet were heard.

The recording includes samples of music for the reception on one side, and a dozen organ selections for the processional and recessional, as choices for the wedding itself.

CLASSICAL MUSIC may be played by a string quartet, but there are also guitars, flute and pianos among instruments available for the wedding day.

"It's a lot easier to let the music speak for itself," Balog said, while groups played samplings for the reception. "If you like what you hear, that's what you get."

According to Balog, musicians who play for Wedding Bells are all well-trained, with music degrees. "My flute player has filled in (with) the Detroit Symphony, and the string player is a graduate of Juilliard."

Balog said trios work out best at a wedding for 75-200 people and beyond. He recalled a wedding with 14 couples as guests, at the Botsford Inn, with Wedding Bells providing the intimate sound of a

solo guitar.

A piano, violin and cello was a combination that played for 200 guests at a wedding at Kirk in the Hills.

"YOU CAN CONVERSE over it," he said, about the background music supplied by Wedding Bells groups. "You hate to say fine music just for background music," Balog said. He pointed out, "Haydn would write a symphony a day for his patrons."

Background music is stressed because you can't demand full attention of wedding guests — some of whom may be drinking too much, for example.

A guitar and two flutes is a trio that provides a fuller sound that is closer to a band sound but still chamber music, he said.

In getting together with the client to discuss music, Balog said, "We prefer to go to the home." However, they will mail out a cassette, with brochures, and the client may keep the cassette. "We consider it good advertising."

The price for a trio for two hours is \$160, for three hours, \$220, and four hours, \$280.

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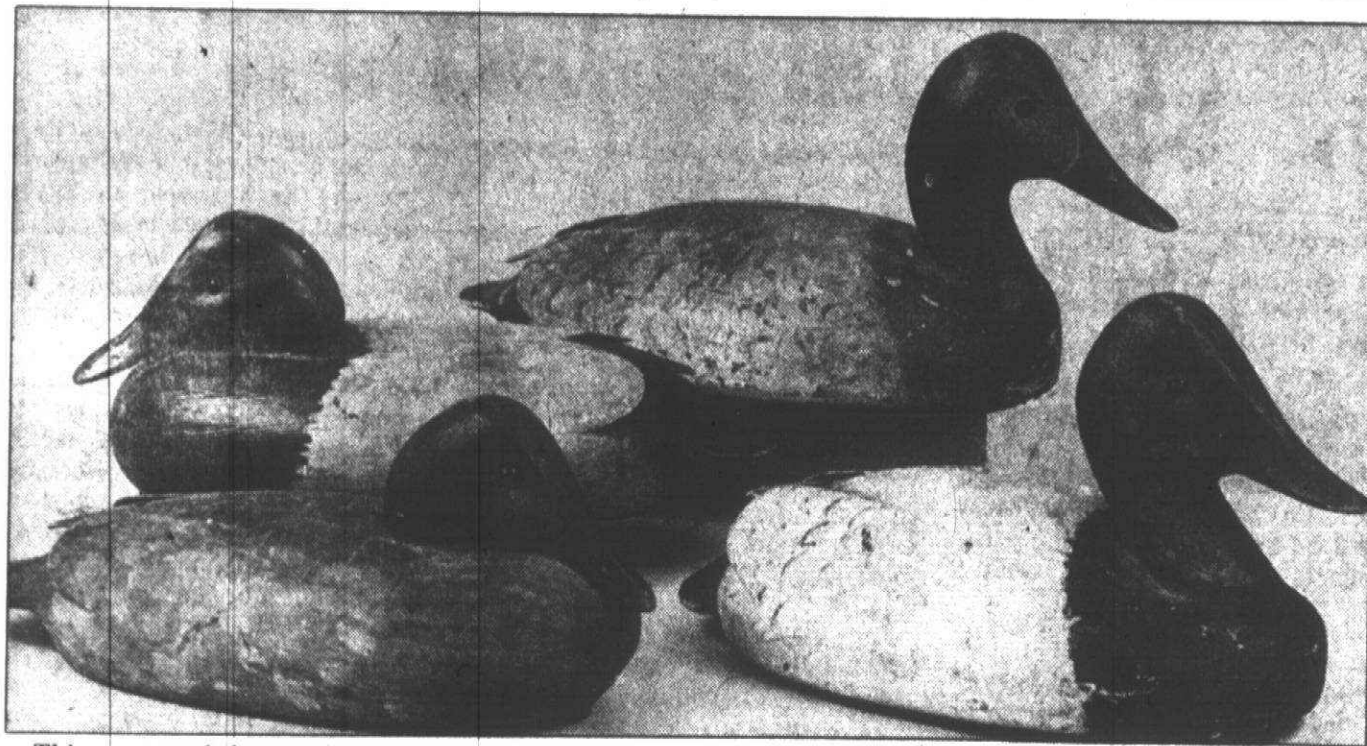

Class at Cranbrook

Decoy carving—a 'great relaxing hobby'

Whenever Kingswood School headmaster William Prescott has some free time with nothing to do (not often), he can usually be found in his wood working studio.

A decoy carver who insists the word "amateur" be attached to this description, Prescott, a longtime duck hunter, has found making decoys a captivating hobby. It's just the kind of change he needs to balance his demanding daily schedule.

He's presently teaching his first class for beginning decoy carvers in the Cranbrook PM series and was oversubscribed before the course was underway two weeks ago.

His interest developed when his wife gave him a book for his birthday about five years ago, Bruce Burk's "Game Bird Carving."

"I followed what Burk said to do and it worked. It's a great relaxing hobby."

PRESCOTT IS STARTING his students out just as Burk does in the book—making a half size, half body mallard.

Prescott has his first try on the shelf of his home study along with others he has done since.

Seemingly ignoring that it was his first attempt, he picked up the little mallard with one side completed and said simply, "This isn't really very good."

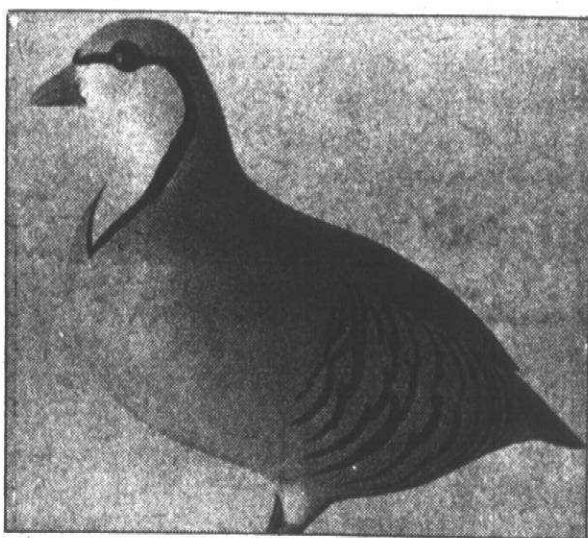
And he wasn't very complimentary about his second and third attempts either.

However, when he took a delicately painted partridge, his expression changed. "I like this one," he said.

And then, as if saving the best for last, he took hold of a green winged teal which had a very professional quality to it. The back tail feathers were clearly defined. The underfeathers along the rib

cage are carefully painted in, a technique which Prescott called vermiculation.

IN HIS WORKSHOP, Prescott has a drawing of a green winged teal in flight. One wing is partially done with more on the underside to be hollowed out.



The partridge above was about the fourth carving project Prescott tried and its delicately painted form shows his improvement.

The body is roughed out in wood and the head in the beginning stage. It is his most ambitious undertaking and he's not sure it can be pulled off. But what is completed so far is impressive.

All of these stages indicate steady progress in this art which has captured his interest.

In several ways, Prescott had a head start. As a duck hunter, he knows how decoys are used and how they should act—which is to say balance properly in the water, not list or tilt.

And while the decoys now being carved by hobby-

ists such as Prescott usually fall into the classification of decorative rather than working, they still carry many of the attributes of the original function.

Many of the antique decoys now considered collectables were made to be working decoys. Now, they are a thing of the past.

"Commercial decoys are vastly improved," Prescott said speaking of those used by duck hunters. People just don't spend the time and effort to make them by hand anymore. Working decoys take a beating and you can't have museum pieces thrown together in a bag," he said.

"IF YOU'RE OUT on a lake shooting over diving ducks, you may use as many as 100 in a set. Sometimes 200 or 300 in a set."

Because of the expanses of water, Michigan has always been prominent in the decoy carving world—first as a center for working decoys and later for decorative ones.

"This particular area is among the richest in wild fowl lore of any place in the country," said Prescott who is also an amateur ornithologist.

Happily the headmaster's home is located on a bluff just above Kingswood School and a few feet from the front door there's a stream and pond. So Prescott, his wife and small children can watch the migration of mallards, Canada geese and other birds.

"Mostly we can see mallards," Prescott said. "Occasionally we'll see a few black ducks and wood ducks."

Carving fits beautifully into his appreciation of birds and his love of duck hunting.

"You learn a lot about bird anatomy," he said adding that to achieve the desired effects with painting and carving requires study of both the media and the subject.

High fire stoneware is the specialty of Vigland who returned to Northern Michigan to establish a year-round studio and summer shop in Benzonia with his wife. His pieces are distinguished by sensuous glazes and unusually

bright colors which are very difficult to achieve in the 2,300-degree firing.

Jaris, a Grand Valley State College ceramics instructor, maintains a Grand Rapids studio where slab-built and salt-glazed pots are his forte. The orange-peel texture of the glazes on these less traditional shapes creates a feeling that is uniquely his.

4-H seeks to make biking safer way to go

State Police records show 45 people were killed and 3,710 injured in bicycle accidents in Michigan during 1977.

To try to make this popular sport safer, the Michigan 4-H Foundation has been granted \$78,746 for the second phase of a three-year bicycle care and safety program.

The program is funded by the Office of Highway Safety Planning and the U.S. Department of Transportation, National Highway Traffic Safety Administration. It is designed to reduce bicycle fatalities and injuries through local comprehensive bicycle safety program.

Last year, 4-H provided bicycle education to more than 11,000 young people in the 10 counties involved in the pilot phase of the program.

"That's an increase of 1,500 per cent over the previous year," said Bonita Neff, state 4-H bicycle specialist at Michigan State University.

"In this second phase of the program, we hope to duplicate this success throughout the state. We will also develop a national bicycle education

model through evaluations of the approaches being tested in Michigan."

During the first year in the pilot counties, 272 volunteer leaders and 4-H staff were trained in 15 bicycle education workshops (each 27 hours long), and two statewide conferences, Neff reports.

A variety of methods of involving young people in bicycle learning activities were tested in the pilot counties. These included day camps, workshops, bike clinics, programs through schools and joint efforts with other agencies.

To promote community involvement, a number of programs were tested, including bicycle peer courts, bike-athons for charity, bicycle safety checks and community bicycle days.

"During our pilot testing, we found that the most learning occurred when programs were of a continuing nature rather than a one-time exposure," Neff notes.

Any persons interested in getting assistance to develop a local bicycle education program should contact their county Extension Service office.

Plymouth Canton's dual-meet swim win streak stretched to 15 straight Tuesday night after the Chiefs handily defeated Redford Thurston, 113-60, in non-league action at the Eagles' pool.

The Chiefs, coached by Bill Faunce, raised their overall record to 8-0. The win streak extends over two seasons. 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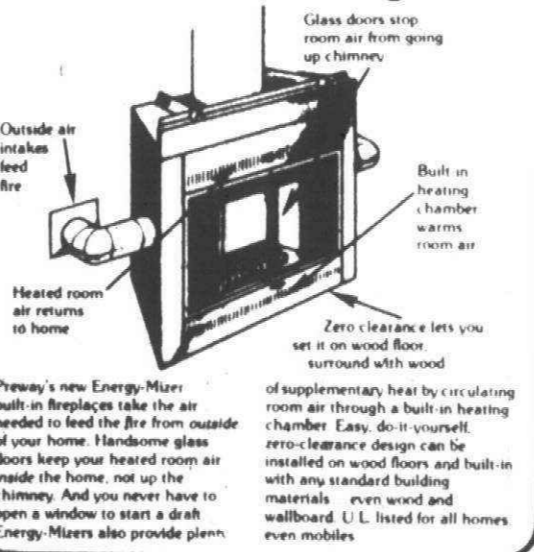
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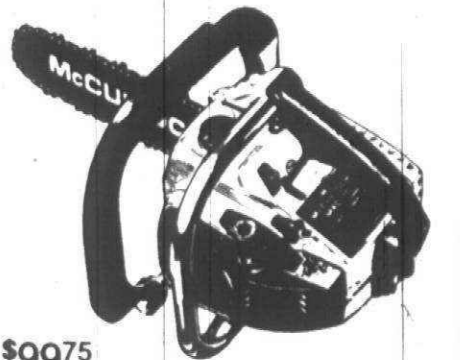
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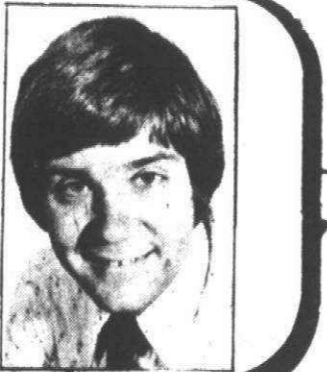
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Doc's Corner

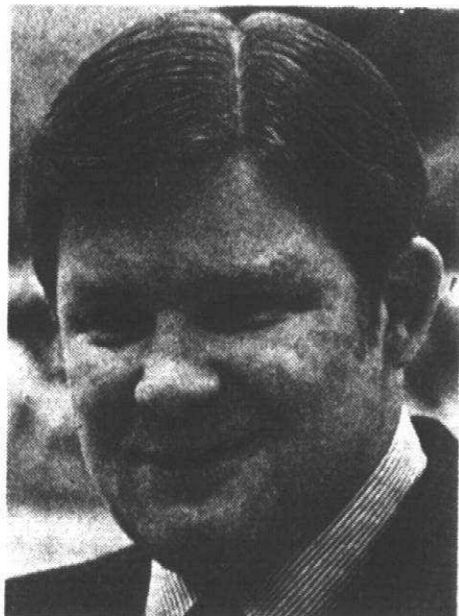
It's hard, however, to knock a man like Sinclair, who has given a part of his life, and his family's life, to such a huge organization.

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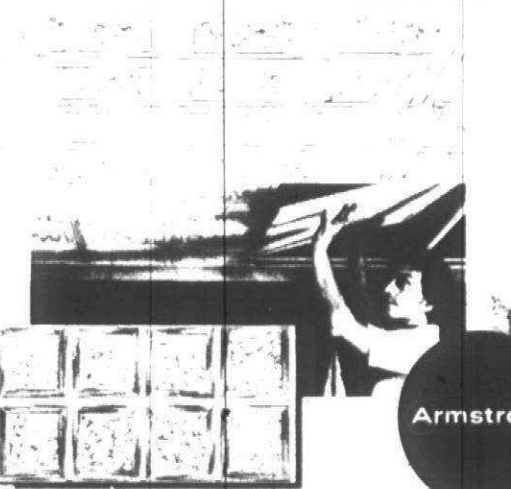
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Dearborn tips Rock spikers

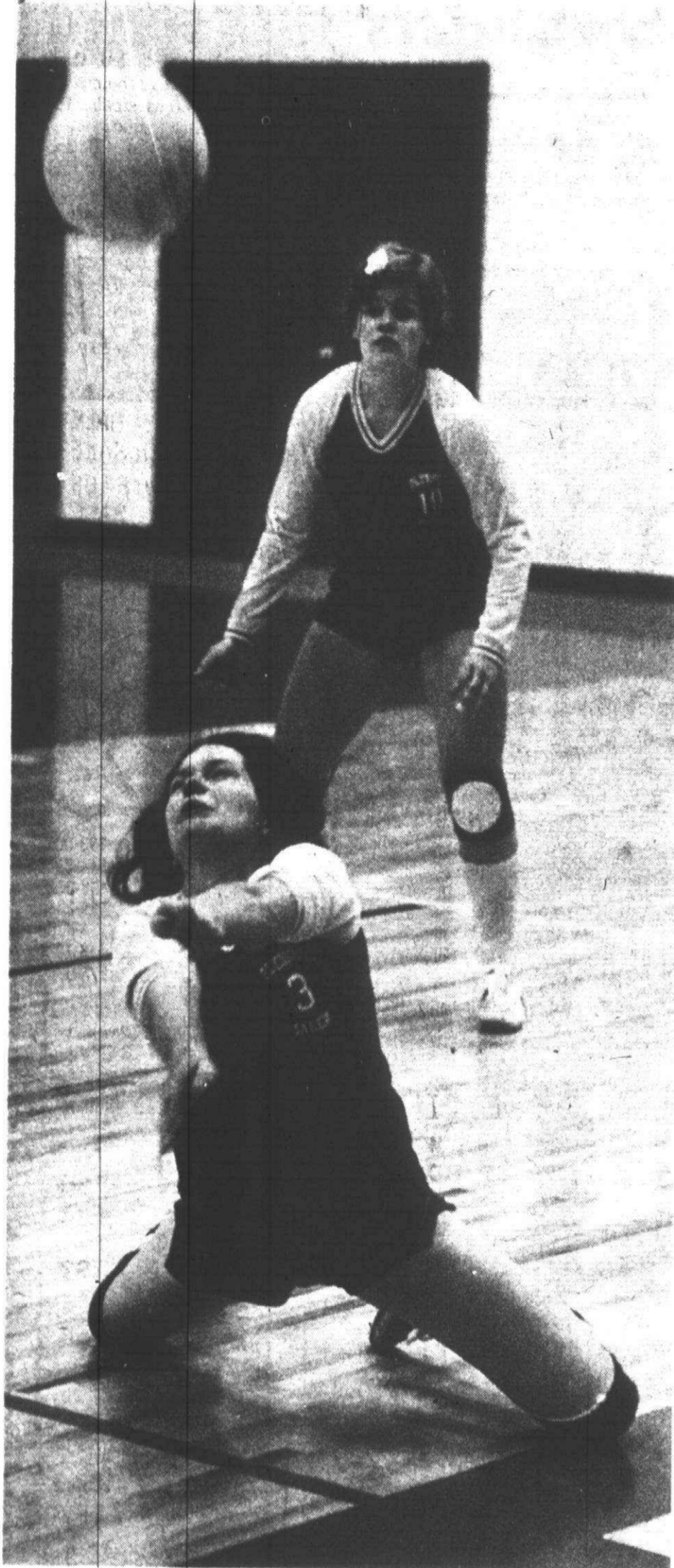
