## Local court operations head for Plymouth

In 1982, Canton Township will move its courtroom from the basement of Township Hall to a new facility in Plymouth.

In voting unanimously Tuesday to join the plan for a regional courthouse, the Township Board overturned a year-old decision of its predecessors to reject the consolidation idea. Last March 25, the previous board threatened to secede from the 35th judicial district rather than move its courtroom to another municipality.

But on Tuesday night, cost estimates compiled by finance director Mike Gorman convinced the board that joining

the consolidation plan would be in Canton's best interests.

Gorman estimated that Canton would receive up to \$80,000 in additional court revenues in 1982 by joining the district's four other municipalities in the regional courthouse now under construction at Plymouth and Haggerty roads.

According to Gorman, Canton would have been obligated to pay off a portion of the \$1.5 million construction debt regardless of a decision to join or reject the consolidation plan.

The decision to move Canton's courtroom to Plymouth was made in approximately 15 minutes Tuesday night. But at least some officials took a deep

swallow before casting their vote in favor of consolidation.

"With the costs and figures, it seems we have no alternative," said second-term Trustee Carol Bodenmiller, who voted against consolidation last year.

"But I'm very saddened by it. We are the largest of all the communities (in the 35th judicial district). Canton has had a hard time in terms of establishing an identity. We should have the courthouse here."

IN REJECTING the regional courthouse plan one year ago, the previous board vehemently objected to construction of the building on city-owned property in Plymouth.

Because Canton finances approximately 42 percent of the district's costs, board members felt that a regional courthouse should be located in the township. But the district's other municipalities — Plymouth, Plymouth Township, Northville and Northville Township — already had opted for the Plymouth site, partly because of its central location in the district.

The consolidation idea was prompted in part by space problems in Plymouth and Northville city halls, where two of the district's three courtrooms are located. At the time, officials of Plymouth Township and Northville Township had indicated a desire for courtrooms in their own municipalities.

The district's two judges said operating a multitude of courtrooms greatly increased the district's costs.

But Canton officials called the proposal "an attempt to bail out other communities."

The Township Board had spent about \$60,000 the previous year to build and

equip a courtroom in the basement of Township Hall. Canton officials said their court facility was experiencing no immediate space problems.

Court costs are distributed to all municipalities in the district according to respective case loads.

## Tally of census falls just short of 50,000 goal

Canton's population will not reach the "magic" plateau of 50,000 as a result of the 1980 census.

Figures released last week by the United States Census Bureau peg Canton's population at 48,636. The final count, to be released later this year, may differ only slightly, according to Henry Smith of the bureau's public information office.

Township officials had hoped to increase the count to 50,000 residents through a challenge of the preliminary results issued last July.

The township could have received an additional \$15-\$20 million in federal monies over the next decade, if those efforts had succeeded. According to grant coordinator Terry Carroll, communities with 50,000 residents receive fatter shares of federal community block grant funds, more federal revenue sharing and increased eligibility for other kinds of grants.

"THAT PROBABLY is the closest we can get (to 50,000)," Carroll said of the census tally released last week. "I think they covered us pretty completely."

A preliminary tally released last July pegged the township's population at 47,977. The latest revised figures

raise that tally by 659 residents.

Carroll said the township may conduct its own census when building records indicate that a 50,000 population has been surpassed.

Although the count quashed hopes to reach the 50,000 plateau this year, the census showed a dramatic 341 percent increase in Canton's population since the last federal census was conducted in 1970.

That count registered a township population of only 11,026. In 1970, there were 3,339 dwelling units in Canton compared to 16,650 in 1980.

Unlike Canton, many communities in the area experienced a population drop during the 1970s. Latest census figures show:

• A population decline for the city of Plymouth — from 11,758 in 1970 to 9,984 in 1980.

• A population increase for Plymouth Township — from 17,497 in 1970 to 23,001 in 1980.

• A slight population decline for Westland — from 86,749 in 1970 to 84,684 in 1980.

## Landfill concerns spur group study

Supervisor James Poole has authorized the establishment of a citizens committee that will study the problems of waste disposal and the impact of a number of state laws on Canton Township.

Planner Jim Kosteva recommended formation of the group after realizing that township officials know little about the ramifications of those laws.

The Hazardous Waste Management Act eliminates local say over the designation of disposal sites for hazardous materials. The Solid Waste Management Act requires counties to formulate plans for the location and operation of future landfills.

"I took a look at these laws, and said, 'Jim, you don't know much about these things,'" said Kosteva.

"Number two, Canton has acres and acres of beautiful thick clay. Beautiful clay is an excellent site for landfills. In my perception, this is something Canton may have to deal with in the future.

"This (the committee) is something like the Boy Scout motto: 'Be prepared.'"

The committee's charge includes a review of those laws; submission of recommendations concerning the State Hazardous Waste Plan to the Michigan Department of Natural Resources (DNR); and a liaison role between the township and DNR concerning hazardous and solid waste issues.

"This is purely an informational-search committee," Kosteva said. "It's just along the lines of let's find out what's going on."

According to the planner, five or six citizens already have expressed an interest in serving on the committee. Interested residents are asked to submit an application for committee membership to the supervisor's office, Canton Township Hall, 1150 S. Canton Center Road, Canton 48188.

Kosteva said a determination still must be made on the committee's size.

## Official taps mom as deputy treasurer

Treasurer Maria Falkiewicz has named her mother to be deputy treasurer of the township.

Ms. Falkiewicz Wednesday named her mother, Athena Sterlini, to the treasurer's slot.

Mrs. Sterlini, 56, of Canton, had been working without pay in the treasurer's office for several weeks after one of the regular staff members went on medical leave.

"Some people (in the clerical union) weren't too happy about having volunteer help," explained Ms. Falkiewicz. "Several people suggested that I deputize her."

Ms. Falkiewicz said Mrs. Sterlini had owned a beauty shop for many years and recently had handled financial affairs for a family auto parts business.

"The appointment is interim right now," added Ms. Falkiewicz. "She may go into (a new) business. I'm concerned about nepotism — that's a big concern."

Although the appointment is her own, the deputy's salary — in the \$14,000-\$18,000 range — requires Township Board approval. The position is non-union.

Specific duties for the deputy job have not been outlined. However, Ms. Falkiewicz said the deputy will act as assistant department head or "leader" in the treasurer's office.

Still undetermined is how many hours per week Mrs. Sterlini will work. Mrs. Falkiewicz has said she wants a full-time employee as her deputy treasurer.

State law requires township treasurers and clerks to appoint a deputy.

Ms. Falkiewicz had not filled the post since taking office Nov. 20. She says that a verbal opinion from the Michigan Township Association (MTA) places no time restrictions on naming the appointee.

Ms. Falkiewicz — Canton's first full-time treasurer — said she needed time to assess her department's need for a deputy.

## The ESY controversy

### Opposition looks to Canton for support

A group of Plymouth parents opposed to planned changes in the school district hope to bring Canton residents into its fold.

The changes — designed to ease crowding at high schools and some elementary school buildings — have been hotly debated. They include some shifts to the Extended School Year (ESY), boundary changes and other adjustments.

"We're trying to expand our base to Canton," said Roland Thomas, spokesman for a group calling itself the Plymouth-Canton Concerned Parents Alliance.

"It's a district-wide problem — a Plymouth-Canton problem," added Thomas, who lives on Woodleigh Way, west of Canton Center and south of Ann Arbor Trail.

The group — which has been most active in Plymouth and Plymouth Township — began to circulate peti-

tions in January against a series of proposals which the Plymouth Plymouth-Canton School Board had announced earlier to ease overcrowding.

CURRENTLY, there are about 8,150 pupils at the elementary level. Middle school attendance accounts for 3,921 students, and there are 4,740 students at the district's two high schools.

Details of the plan now are being revamped, and a final plan will be presented at the March 12 school board

meeting. If approved, the plan would be implemented in the 1981-82 school year.

As the project now stands, Bird and Fiegel elementary schools in Plymouth would be added to the Extended School Year (ESY) plan. Previously, only one elementary school outside Canton has been on ESY.

In addition, ninth-graders would be transferred from the high schools to middle schools.

All elementary schools in the district would house grades K-6 with the exception of Eriksson, Fiegel, Field and Miller. The K-5 plan would remain at those schools.

The plan also shifts school attendance boundaries. About 2,300 pupils in the 17,300-student district would be affected.

Opponents to the proposal have voice concerns that ESY will disrupt family lives. Some said working mothers may be unable to find baby-sitters for periodic three-week periods when their children are out of school.

## Regulations squeeze station

# School radio project faces woes

The continued survival of Michigan's low-powered radio stations, including the FM station operated at Plymouth Centennial Educational Park (CEP), is in doubt.

Such radio stations are facing the dual threat of federal regulation and a statewide economic squeeze.

And that double-edged blade poses a stiff challenge to many low-power stations in Michigan, says Jeff Cardinal of Plymouth.

Cardinal is the administrative coordinator of WSDP (88.1 FM), the student-operated radio station at Plymouth Salem High School in Canton.

Cardinal recently was elected vice-president of the Michigan Association of Educational Broadcasters (MAEB), headquartered in Highland Park. Car-

dinal also has served on the MAEB board for the past four years.

WHILE COMMERCIAL radio eyes the benefits of deregulation, explains Cardinal, low-power stations, especially those in the metropolitan Detroit area, are imperiled by Federal Communications Commission (FCC) action on Docket 20735.

That complex ruling subjects 10-watt FM stations to bumping around or even off the dial unless they undertake often costly power increases and frequency changes, says Cardinal. WSDP already has undergone one frequency change.

"The docket also forces most school stations to bear summer operations,

even if all the station's student staff is out of school for the summer.

"These cost items come at a time when inflation has battered stations and their parent high schools and colleges with relentless fury.

"That's where the other cutting edge looms," added Cardinal. "Budget cuts by the financially-strapped state of Michigan have sent many institutions into a frenzy of cutbacks.

"The radio station often is a victim — in some cases, even a fatality — in a pioneer state which is home to two of the nation's three oldest 10-watt high school stations (at Highland Park and Royal Oak Dondoro."

GREG BYNDRIAN, president of the MAEB, points out that even the association's membership ranks have been undercut by tight school finances — skidding from a peak of 15 stations in 1979 to nine last year.

All of this poses a menace to association members, adds Byndrian, who organized in November 1977 to promote growth, development, and other interests of low-power educational broadcasting.

The association, as it turned out, was born on the eve of crisis, and offered an important forum for the exchange of useful information and ideas and for strategy discussions and coop-

eration on common concerns.

While problems have occupied much of the group's attention, adds Byndrian, its bimonthly meetings are turning to other issues as well.

The MAEB is planning a statement on school cable use, a conference with student projects evaluated by experts, and a series of student-produced announcements for the association.

Cardinal notes that during its first few years of existence the MAEB has given testimony to the state board of education on educational telecommunications, and lobbied with lawmakers at all levels.

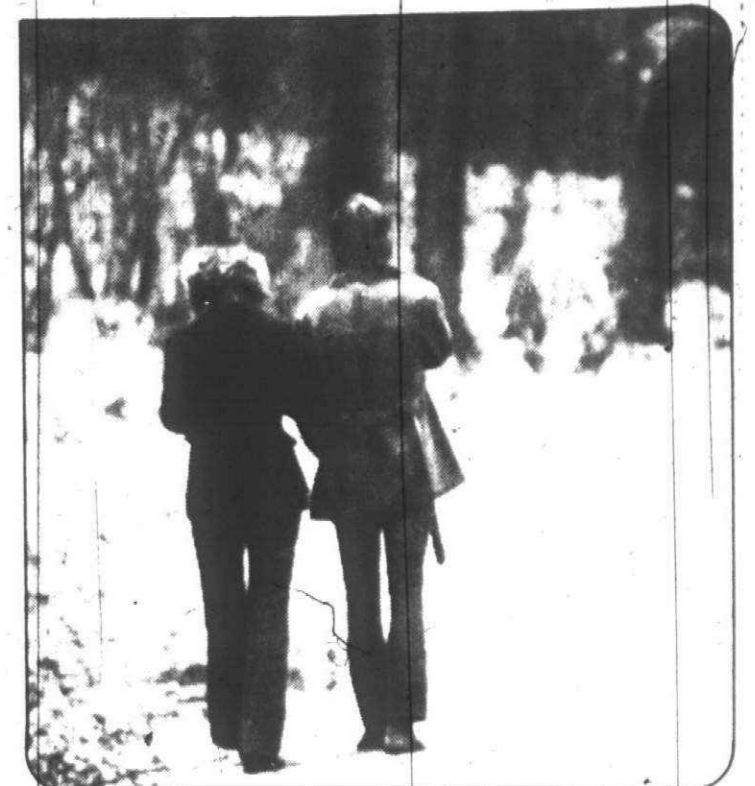
Despite the cloudy dollar picture, member stations have many bright spots to report, Cardinal said.

WSDP at the CEP last May was featured in a segment on "PM Magazine" on WJBK-TV2.

WPHS at Warren Cousino High featured a live broadcast of Vice-President Walter Mondale's fall visit and news conference, and on another occasion did a solid 12.5 hours of no-tape, no-record live broadcasting.

The members of the association include three colleges (Adrian, Spring Arbor, and Henry Ford Community College), and high school stations in Warren Cousino, Novi, West Bloomfield, Bloomfield Hills Andover, and Port Huron Northern plus the CEP.

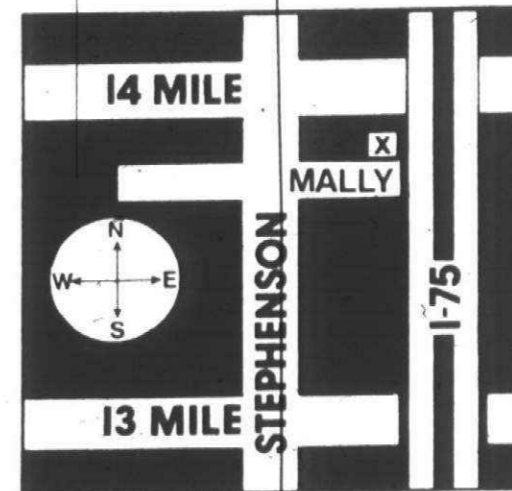

Mrs. Duffy's younger sister, Odelia Beaubien, 90, also was on hand. Some of Canton Township's officials stopped by.

Barbara Austin and Donna Adams, of St. Michael Lutheran Church in Canton, brought a large card from the church members, some of whom play bingo with the nursing home residents each month.

ACTUALLY, there is some question as to Mrs. Duffy's real birthday. The nursing home records show it as March 5.

"But we have always celebrated on March 4," said Eleanor Duffy. "Pat found an old, yellow baptismal record which indicated she was born March 3."

Patrick Duffy said his mother always had "made friends easily," and especially enjoyed playing cards. While she lived with him, she had been a founding member of Our Lady of Lourdes Circle at Our Lady of Loretta Church in Redford.

How did she live to be 100? "I had a nice life — a happy life," said Mrs. Duffy. "I had children."

## Food firm wins help of EDC

A Canton Township food distributor will have its \$500,000 to build a maintenance garage and buy equipment.

The Township Board last week voted to approve a request from Farm House Foods for the money through the Economic Development Corporation (EDC).

That approval means Canton's EDC will help the firm obtain a low-interest loan from banks for business expansion.

The decision, on a 5-2 vote, was clouded by some board members' misgivings over a past billing mixup between the company and the township. It resulted in a flood of bills from Farm House Foods suppliers to Township Hall for payment.

The mixup occurred after Farm House Foods, based in Wisconsin, received township approval three years ago for \$4.7 million in EDC bonds. The money was used to build the firm's warehouse at Van Born and Haggerty in Canton.

Because municipalities hold title to the project until all bonds are paid, a Farm House attorney gave mistaken advice on ways to avoid sales tax payments, said company president John Sweet.

The attorney — who no longer is with the company — told Farm House Foods officials to name Canton as the owner of the warehouse on purchase orders for construction equipment and supplies. Municipalities are exempt from sales tax obligations.

According to Canton officials, the attorney overlooked another Michigan law that requires companies with EDC financing to pay sales tax. The result was a flood of unpaid company bills to the township treasurer's office.

Sweet last week told the Township Board the mixup had been cleared.

## Frustration

### Sleuth knows anxiety of Atlanta cops

State Police Capt. Robert Robertson won't be lending Atlanta police officials his expertise after all.

Robertson, commander of the Michigan State Police criminal investigation section in Livonia, was selected recently by the U.S. Justice Department to be part of a five-man team which would help manage a 35-member Atlanta task force investigating the slaying of 20 black children.

Budget restraints, however, have caused the Justice Department to scrap the plans, at least temporarily and probably for the future, said a spokesman for the Law Enforcement Assistance Administration.

Robertson, 45, a Livonia resident, was chosen for the assignment because of his extensive investigative background, which includes heading the task force which investigated the slaying in 1977-78 of several Oakland County children.

The detective said he is well aware of the frustration police officials are experiencing and the anxiety residents in Atlanta are suffering.

"People know if they don't catch the person responsible there'll be another killing," Robertson said.

Robertson said he doesn't know enough about the case to offer any theories and added that "speculation in these cases is often dangerous."

"Decision making is easy if you're decision doesn't count. When you're in a position where it'll impact, it's always harder," said the veteran officer.

The five-member task force was just part of an aid package offered to Atlanta by federal officials. A federal team is providing support services from the Justice Department, the Health and Human Services Department and the Department of Education. The FBI and LEAA also have offered assistance to Atlanta investigators.

ROBERTSON said the task force investigating the Oakland

County child-killing cases was the first and only ongoing police investigation to receive a federal grant for investigation. The funds were provided by the LEAA and that's what Atlanta wants now, Robertson said.

A by-product of the Oakland County investigation was a team manual compiling organizational charts and techniques on how to manage an investigation of this nature. The Oakland County case was the largest homicide investigation in terms of multi-jurisdictions and manpower involved.

Robertson says that task force, although much smaller, continues to investigate the Oakland killings. Investigators, working out of the Northville State Police Post, receive anywhere from three to nine tips per week, said Robertson.

"The investigation is surely not closed," added Robertson.

No one was ever charged in the four child killings. The body of the last victim, Timothy King of Birmingham, was left in Livonia in April 1978.

Robertson supports the theory that the killer is in "some type of controlled atmosphere" — in a jail or mental institution — or is dead.

"Most psychiatrists familiar with the facts of the case also support that theory. In our society — which is so violent — the possibility of death isn't an original thought," said Robertson.

A 25-year veteran of the state police, Robertson worked as post commander at the Grand River and Seven Mile post, first lieutenant in Negaunee and a plainclothes lieutenant at the 2nd district in Detroit before being promoted to captain and head of the 140-member unit based in what formerly was Madison Elementary School.

The criminal section is responsible for handling investigations involving surveillance, organized crime and narcotics for an 11-county area from Saginaw Bay south. Members are also assigned to other police units to aid in local investigations.

## Board members reverse stand on regional courthouse plan

THAT FACT would obligate township officials to pay at least a portion of the new court facility's construction costs even without joining the consolidation plan, Gorman said.

To finance construction, the city of Plymouth floated bonds and agreed to lease the new building to the 35th judicial district. The \$190,000 annual rent payment will be used in part to pay off those bonds.

"Everyone has to pay for the operation of the court," explained Clerk John Flodin. "We would be obligated to contribute to the 35th district's operation — wherever the court might be."

Gorman believes the township would have negotiated to pay 5-25 percent of the new building's rent payment, if the board had voted to reject the consolidation plan a second time.

That obligation would have diminished the excess court revenues now earned by Canton Township.

Municipalities receive court costs paid by respective residents to the 35th District Court. In 1980, Canton's revenues exceeded expenses by \$110,000.

Gorman estimated, however, that Canton's net court "profits" would dip from the current level to the \$37,000 to \$75,000 next year, if the present courtroom in the basement of Township Hall were retained. He attributed much of the estimated decline to Canton's obligation for paying part of the new building's construction and operating costs.

According to Gorman's estimates, net court "profits" would be \$75,000 a year if efforts to form a separate judicial district in Canton were pursued. However, proposals to split districts must be approved by the Michigan Legislature. Gorman said such approval probably would take five years.

He figures Canton will earn almost \$119,000 in 1982 by joining the consolidation plan.

On Tuesday night, Trustee Bodenmiller urged the Township Board to begin a study regarding use of Canton's present courtroom after it is abandoned. No uses have yet been proposed.

Only three members of the current Township Board participated in last year's board vote on consolidation. Mrs. Bodenmiller and Trustee Stephen Larson had voted against joining the regional courthouse plan. Clerk Flodin had voted in favor of the concept.

# Angry woman rams car of robbery suspects

Geraldine Gottschalk is either one gutsy lady, very angry, or both.

Monday afternoon Mrs. Gottschalk,

52, an employee of the Plymouth-Canton Community Schools, returned home to discover two young men about to pull out of her driveway with a trunk full of her family's personal possessions.

With little time to pause and think, she attempted to stop the culprits, rams her car into the side of their's as it careened out of the driveway.

The suspects, last seen driving south

on Haggerty Road toward Joy Road, have not been found. But, nonetheless, Mrs. Gottschalk says she feels good about trying to stop them.

You see, the Gottschalk's Plymouth Township home on Haggerty has been

burglarized four times in the past 10 years.

"I just didn't want it to happen again," said the mother of three. "I didn't hurt their car very much. I just wanted to leave an impression."

Here's Mrs. Gottschalk's account of Monday's incident:

Mrs. Gottschalk, who works as an education aide at the Centennial Educational Park, had returned home at 2:30 p.m. about 10 minutes later than usual.

As she opened the automatic garage door from within her car, she noticed an unfamiliar car parked in her garage. The car's trunk was "wide open" and full of many of the Gottschalk family possessions.

"I WAS TRYING to decide what to do, and before I had time to think I saw one of the guys walk out of the house with my son's guitar."

The suspect Mrs. Gottschalk spotted was followed by another. When they saw her, both jumped into the car, driving out of the garage and down the driveway.

They did not escape, though, without some effort by Mrs. Gottschalk to stop them.

"There was no time for me to turn my car around so that I could block them," she recalled. "They started to go around me so I thought all that I could do is ram them. So, I just floored it."

Mrs. Gottschalk says she thought she could trap the suspects in the garage, thereby stalling for time while she called the police.

Plymouth police describe the car as a possible Ford make and rusty. It, of course, has a "fresh" dent on its left side.

## Treasurer taps mom for deputy post

If a 40-hour salary is approved by the Township Board, Ms. Falkiewicz's appointee will be the second full-time deputy to work in either the treasurer's or clerk's office. Ms. Falkiewicz served in the first full-time deputy position under former Treasurer Jim Donahue.

The post was eliminated when the treasurer's job changed from a part-time to full-time position last November. Most elected administrators — including Clerk John Flodin — have given their spouses a ceremonial deputy title.

BUT MRS. FALKIEWICZ says she wants no "figurehead" for deputy. According to the treasurer, all township departments except her own employ-

assistant department head or "leader" of clerical workers.

Under state law, the issuance of township checks and other financial matters must be authorized by the treasurer or deputy treasurer.

The treasurer currently is formulating a job description for the deputy post, which she plans to submit to the Township Board.

Ms. Falkiewicz said the deputy will assist only with administrative tasks. She balks at the idea of allowing the deputy to sit on the Township Board in her absence.

Ms. Falkiewicz occasionally sat on the board with full voting power during her tenure as Donahue's deputy.

She said board participation made her feel uncomfortable because many

persons felt a deputy should not be allowed to vote on the Township Board.

"That's my responsibility — the board," said Mrs. Falkiewicz. "I need someone for internal operations. I do not want the deputy involved in the political end of it all. The appointment is yours, because you have to rely 100 percent on this person. I need someone

who will follow my goals and objectives."

Under state law, the deputy treasurer must be a township resident. According to Ms. Falkiewicz, about 20 people had submitted applications for the job. Some unsuccessfully ran for elective township office in the past.

"I think people felt that the (deputy job) helped me get in office," she said.

## Rep. Ford hospitalized

U.S. Rep. William Ford, D-Taylor, was reported "feeling wonderful" Wednesday morning after being hospitalized Tuesday night in Washington.

Ford collapsed while attending a reception at the Library of Congress honoring him as new chairman of the House Post Office and Civil Service Committee. He was taken to the

Bestheda Naval Hospital in Washington.


Ford, whose district includes Westland, Garden City, Canton Township and part of Livonia, is starting his ninth term.

# ESY poses challenges, say area parents

Others said they couldn't afford to hire baby-sitters, while some said the quality of education might suffer with all the upheaval in the district.

"We got organized in January," said Thomas, a supply and distribution manager for a trucking company.

"We were primarily concerned with ESY at Bird. Once we got into this, we realized it was a bigger issue."

Thomas said his group would like to see the school board delay implementation of its plan for one year. He also would like to see a task force of residents, teachers and administrators formed to study the problem and come up with other alternatives.

Thomas suggested extending the school day, portable classrooms or other methods of easing congestion.

He said his group is "open-minded" about a possible solution. He also acknowledges that persons have tended to view the issue in terms of their immediate geographic boundaries.

Thomas said he formerly lived in Pickwick Village subdivision west of Lilley and south of Warren Road in Canton. He said one reason his family moved away in 1976 was dissatisfaction with school boundary changes in that area.

"My wife circulated petitions," said Thomas. "Many of us were carrying the battle then."

"WE CAN live with ESY — other people have lived with it," said Thomas. "It's the whole way the board is responding to the alternatives offered."

"They haven't demonstrated good business judgment in terms of making a decision," he added.

Eva Bell of Plymouth Township supports the alliance. She believes the school board members "have already made up their minds."

"I'm used to change (but) it isn't change for the better for the children," said Mrs. Bell. "I feel they're more concerned about housing students rather than education."

SCHOOL SUPT. John Hoben says the district has been studying the crowding problem for more than

a year. He said the two high schools now are "saturated" and "we have more elementary students than we have room for."

Hoben said ESY has been proven successful since it was instituted at Miller School about five years ago.

"We are a singular district," said Hoben. "We have to reach out where we have the space and that is in Plymouth Township and the City of Plymouth. ESY is the best instructional approach."

Hoben said groups are being set up in which residents can study certain school issues for several weeks and then make a report to the school board.

IN THE MEANTIME, several Canton parents contacted by the Observer said the Extended School Year sometimes creates inconvenience, but the problems aren't insurmountable.

Several said they would prefer a traditional school year. None ever has had serious problems finding recreational activities or baby-sitters when their children are off for three-week periods.

Others accused newspapers of "grabbing hold" of comments which seem to pit Canton against Plymouth.

"The people in Plymouth resent the fact that Canton has grown so much," said Carol Shasko, president of the parent-teacher organization at Miller Elementary School in Canton. "They seem to forget that 10 years ago, Plymouth was growing. It works back and forth."

Mrs. Shasko said she believes her family's unity has been "enhanced" because they often take trips together and visit relatives periodically during the year.

BUT TRUSTEES Stephen Larson and Maria Falkiewicz were unswayed. Both said they support business expansion, but they also were uncomfortable about the billing problems.

"It wasn't a mistake, an oversight,"

said Larson, "but an attempt to circumvent the tax laws. I don't think they acted in good faith."

"It gave them a long time to pay the bills," added Ms. Falkiewicz. "I feel the large corporations have the means and access to find these things (loopholes), but the small businessman doesn't."

A hobby she had as a child in Waco, Texas, is now paying dividends for Ruth Armstrong, a cheerful 82-year-old resident of Tonquish Creek Manor in Plymouth.

"Lisa looked at me and then at the pile of recipes I was sorting and said,

"Come on, let's get going." And by the time the visit was over, I was on the way to having a book.

"LISA, WHO is one of the directors of the cancer society, and Darlene, put their heads together and outlined a program. Darlene said she knew a printer in Wyandotte, so she called on him. The deal was made, and here is the book."

It wasn't all that easy. "Of course, we had to watch the cost of printing, and we were told that if we put the printed pages in order and then got a loose-leaf book, we could save a lot of money."

Here Mrs. Armstrong could not hold back a laugh.

"You should have seen us. We got all the grandchildren and the great-grandchildren together one afternoon here at the manor, and we prepared the entire lot, consisting of 200 books.

"That was last December, and we had them ready just in time for Christmas gifts."

MRS. ARMSTRONG has been a resident of Tonquish Manor for the past nine years, and she loves to tell of her life from childhood in Texas to senior citizen rank in Plymouth.

While living in Waco, she met the man she was to marry, Sgt. Cyril Armstrong, who was serving at Fort McArthur during World War I.

Sgt. Armstrong was discharged at Grayling, and she was there to greet him. They then decided to remain in Michigan. It was during the depression after the war, and jobs were difficult to get. But they succeeded somehow and were the parents of one daughter and three sons. The retired serviceman died 15 years ago.

IT WAS then that she began hoping that her dream of a book would come true. Her son joined American Airlines,

## Self-pump gasoline stations are a rip-off

Editor: Highway robbery... or just another great American rip-off?

Think you're paying a high price for gasoline? Boy, have I got a surprise for you! How do you like paying \$72.00 an hour to the entrepreneur that forgets to replace your gas cap after he's finished pumping that black gold into your guzzler?

On Feb. 24, I decided to buy gasoline for my car. Since I was running on empty and it was convenient, I coasted into the Plymouth Shell service station on the corner of Ann Arbor and Sheldon Roads.

As I was pumping my own gas at the self-service island, I noted that I was paying \$1.40/gallon for unleaded gasoline. I then glanced over, through the menacing light drizzle, at the three cars lined up at the full service island. To my amazement and total disbelief, I noticed that the full-service customers were patiently waiting to pay \$1.58/gallon for the same product I was purchasing.

Well, any second grade elementary school student knows that \$1.58 minus \$1.40 equals 18 cents... right? As-

suming that each customer purchased 20 gallons of gasoline for their automobile, one could deduce that each customer, in the three minutes it took to fill his car, paid \$3.60 for friendly and efficient top quality service... correct?

Next, if one divides three minutes into one hour (60 minutes), one could also assume that each attendant (there were four at this particular station) could service 20 cars per hour.

Now, if you multiply 20 cars an hour by \$3.60/car, you would soon discover that you too should be pumping gas at the corner of Ann Arbor Road and Sheldon. Seventy-two dollars an hour pumping gas is not bad money!

It's truly unfortunate the aged, the handicapped and the American public in general are caught in the financial squeeze created by the OPEC nations and the callous oil companies.

But to be openly gouged by a self-serving local merchant is utterly ludicrous. It appears as though the general public has been mesmerized into allowing someone to fill their tanks and drain their pocketbooks.

Consider child's safety

To the editor:  
This is a personal challenge to each member of the Plymouth-Canton Board of Education.

It is something that you must do before you can finally vote on Ecosystem's Plan III.

On any weekday about 4 or 5 p.m., go down to Main Street. Any intersection south of Wing Street and north of Ann Arbor Road will do.

I suggest this particular time because it is when a teenager or slightly younger child will be returning home from East Middle to home between Main and Sheldon.

This child is a bit late, but has just been to a baseball game or any one of a thousand activities which keep kids this age at school after classes.

Like this child, you must cross Main Street safely on foot. I ask you to do it only once, but the kids will have to do it hundreds of times and sometimes in the dark or when the pavement is slippery. Most of the time they will be in a

hurry or distracted or not be as careful as they should.

But I warn you to be very careful, cautious and alert. The reasons will become apparent at once.

Main Street in Plymouth has changed. It now is a wide traffic artery with four lanes. The speed limit is 25 mph but that is a laugh. There are no traffic lights in this stretch. There are very few signs to remind drivers of the speed limit and our police are hardly ever present.

This situation should never have been allowed to develop, but it exists. Don't stand too close to the curb while you are waiting to cross. Cars come very close to the sidewalk here. They will whistle past you within inches and at speeds that won't give you a chance to make the slightest mistake.

You will have to run when a break in the traffic stream finally does happen, or you won't make it. Look both ways, say a fast prayer, and good luck.

Ecosystems proposes to send about 70 children (who normally walk to West Middle School and have the advantage of the Sheldon Road overhead crossing bridge, traffic lights and crossing guards) to East Middle School.

To get there, they will have to cross Main Street, which is clearly hazardous, and cross Harvey, which is fast becoming a menace. Obviously the safety of children was not considered.

Computers can't handle the relative safety of thoroughfares but parents and school trustees must live with these dangers and must do what they can to protect the safety of the children even if the numbers, so neatly compiled by Ecosystems, don't come out as they would like.

The computer has overlooked the children's safety but you must be responsible for their safety and must supply human judgment and conscience to the plan of the transmitter.

The children of Gallimore School must be bused to a middle school because of the distance involved. The computer has said they will be split and some go to West and others to East. The children and parents object to this splitting up. They know they must be bused, but want the kids to stay together. Why not let them stay together?

They will be safe and warm on buses

and can easily attend East Middle which is a fine, experienced and competent school. Their place at West Middle should be filled by the children living between Sheldon and Main who will then be able to continue to walk the much shorter distance in relative safety.

The necessity to make this change in Plan III seems to obvious and the solution so easy that you probably have already come to this conclusion. Others share this concern and have presented it to you in different forms.

The safety factor is real and I know you don't want to ignore it.

The outside consultants will not know and may not care, but you will have to live with it if anything goes wrong in the middle of Main Street.

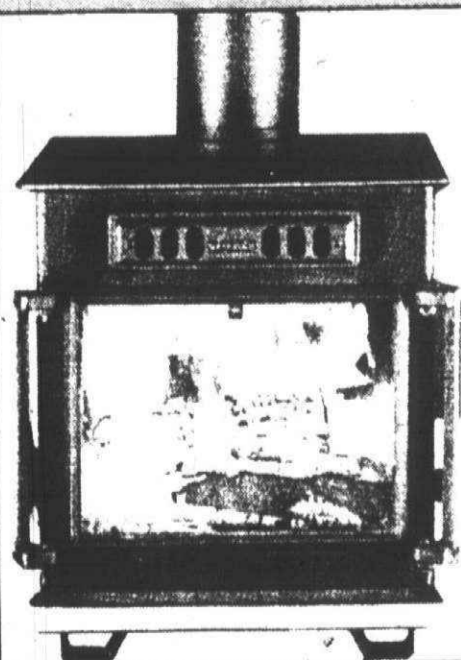

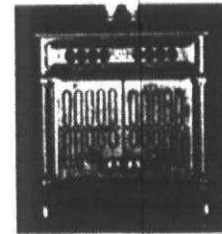

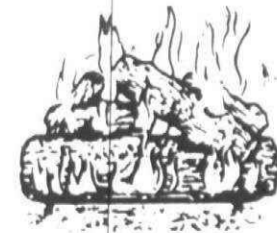

# Trustees deserve pay for every meeting

There's a thin line between job dedication and overexuberance.

One expects elected officials — including Canton Township trustees — to show greater interest in the welfare of the community than the job's promise of financial reward.

At the same time, pay should never dip so low that it discourages qualified candidates from seeking elective office.

A proposal recently submitted by Trustee Robert Padgett for a change in the pay structure of Canton's four trustees could have evolved into that type of deterrent. Fortunately, the proposal — as submitted — was rejected by a 5-2 vote of the Township Board, with only Padgett and Trustee Loren Bennett supporting the concept.

The proposal would have replaced a trustee's

current pay of \$75 a meeting with a \$300 monthly salary. The hitch came in the stipulation that \$75 would be deducted from the check for each meeting missed by a trustee.

That, theoretically, could mean no pay for a trustee during a given month. A trustee, for example, could attend six Township Board meetings to earn the monthly \$300 pay. But if four meetings subsequently were scheduled and a trustee became sick, he or she would lose the entire \$300 salary.

THE PROPOSAL was spawned by Padgett's belief that more in-depth study of issues is needed by Canton Township government. He believes that elimination of the present per-meeting method of paying trustees would encourage more study sessions and special meetings.

In that regard, Padgett was right.

More study of many long-range goals — such as farmland preservation and industrial development — is desperately needed in Canton. There is little time for such study during the three meetings regularly held by the board each month.

But the board could schedule one additional meeting per month without changing the pay system. A trustee's compensation for those four meetings would total \$300 under both the current system and Padgett's salary idea.

What Padgett had hoped to accomplish was the elimination of additional costs for more meetings.

In submitting the salary proposal, Padgett showed a concern for township finances and government efficiency that is rare and commendable among elected officials.

Unfortunately, many residents would be unwilling to serve under conditions which, conceivably, could eliminate all compensation for trustees and create a great number of meetings.

Changing the system now would be unfair to trustees already in office as well. Trustees Carol Bodenmiller and Stephen Larson, who vehemently opposed Padgett's salary idea, dedicate many hours outside board meetings to special committees and other work.

Township property owners are obligated to pay their elected officials a reasonable amount of compensation.

Efforts to cut the costs of township government are well and good. But such ideas must be balanced against the danger of discouraging residents from seeking elective office.

Don't stop sending in those cards and letters. Numbers count in this high-stakes game.

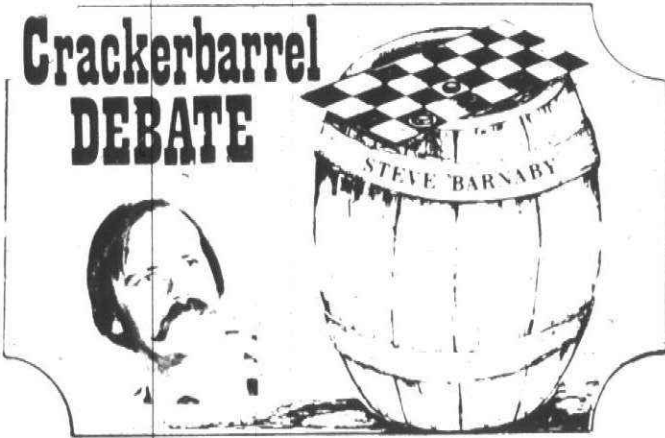
The excerpts you read on this editorial page are only a portion of the letters we are getting. The word is spreading all over southeastern Michigan.

BY 1982, OPEC will have cut off an additional 3.3 million barrels a day, according to the Petroleum Intelligence Weekly.

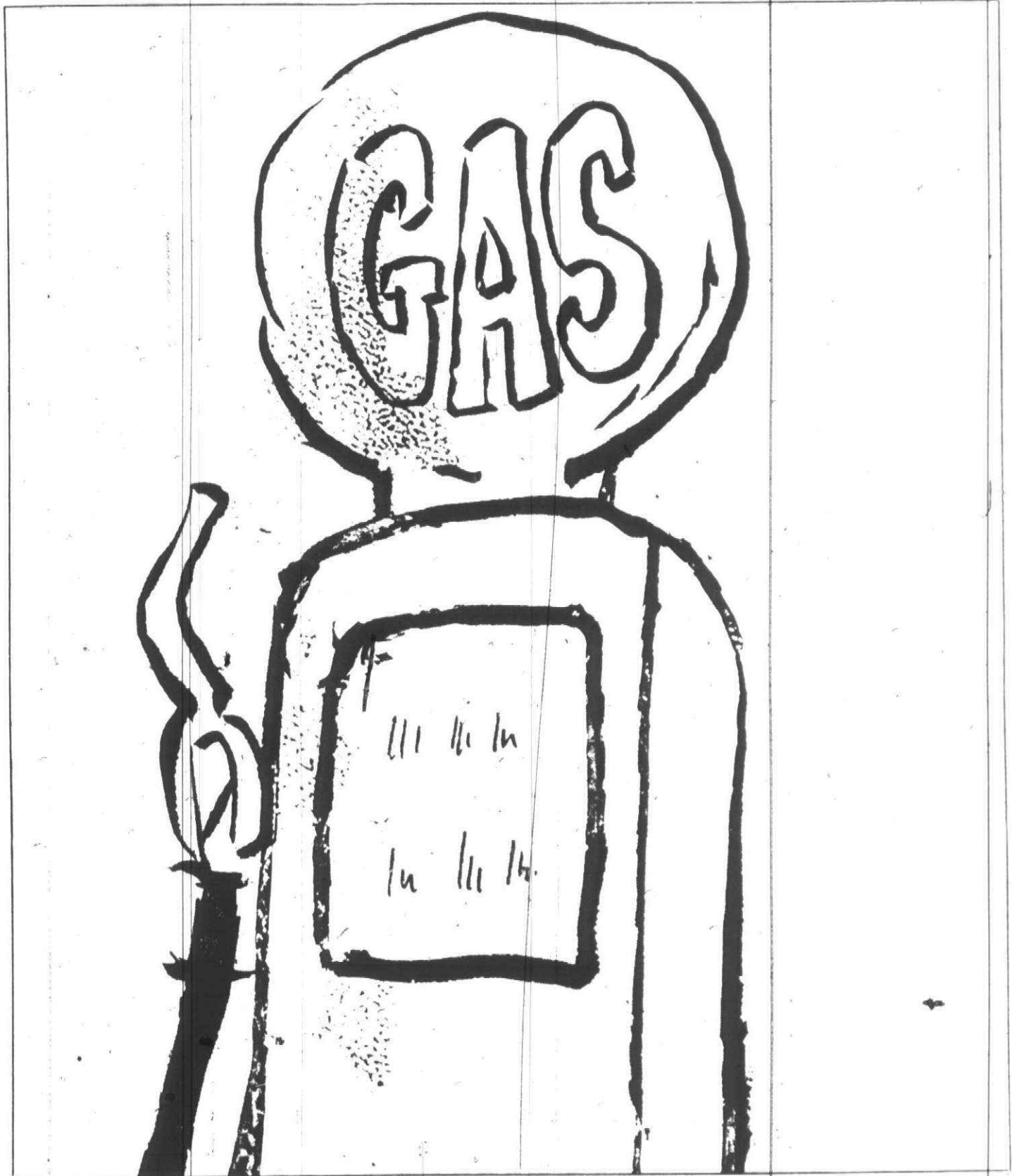
At the same time, OPEC plans on increasing its prices even more, according to the publication.

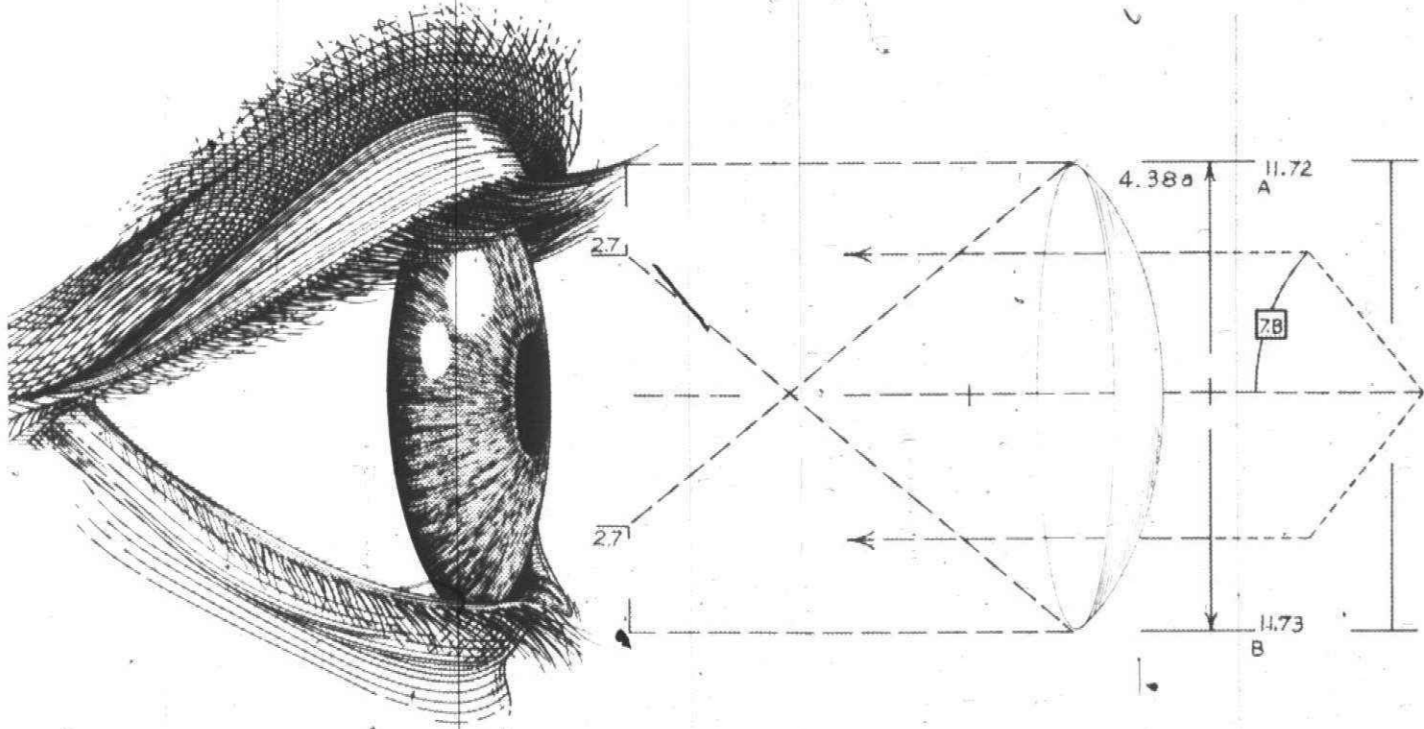

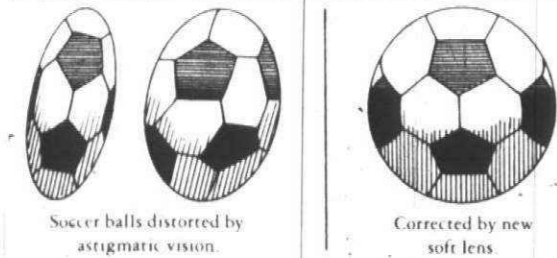

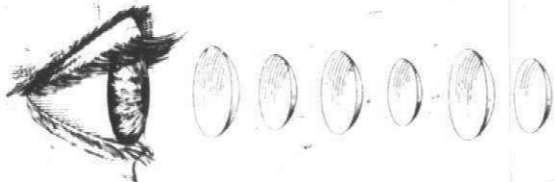

The women use the material to make dolls for the children. They are primitive and the sets of three would make interesting wall decorations. So would the masks, carved of wood and painted.

"You would have to travel a million miles to find all these things," said Bill as he unpacked a tray of carved wooden animals and fish that are actual boxes. (There were two ducks and I bought the best one.)

A Cefini goblet is an exquisite creation, but there's a warmth and wonder about the creations of nature and the hand-carved bird or animal whittled from wood by an untrained craftsman.

The room is complete right down to the

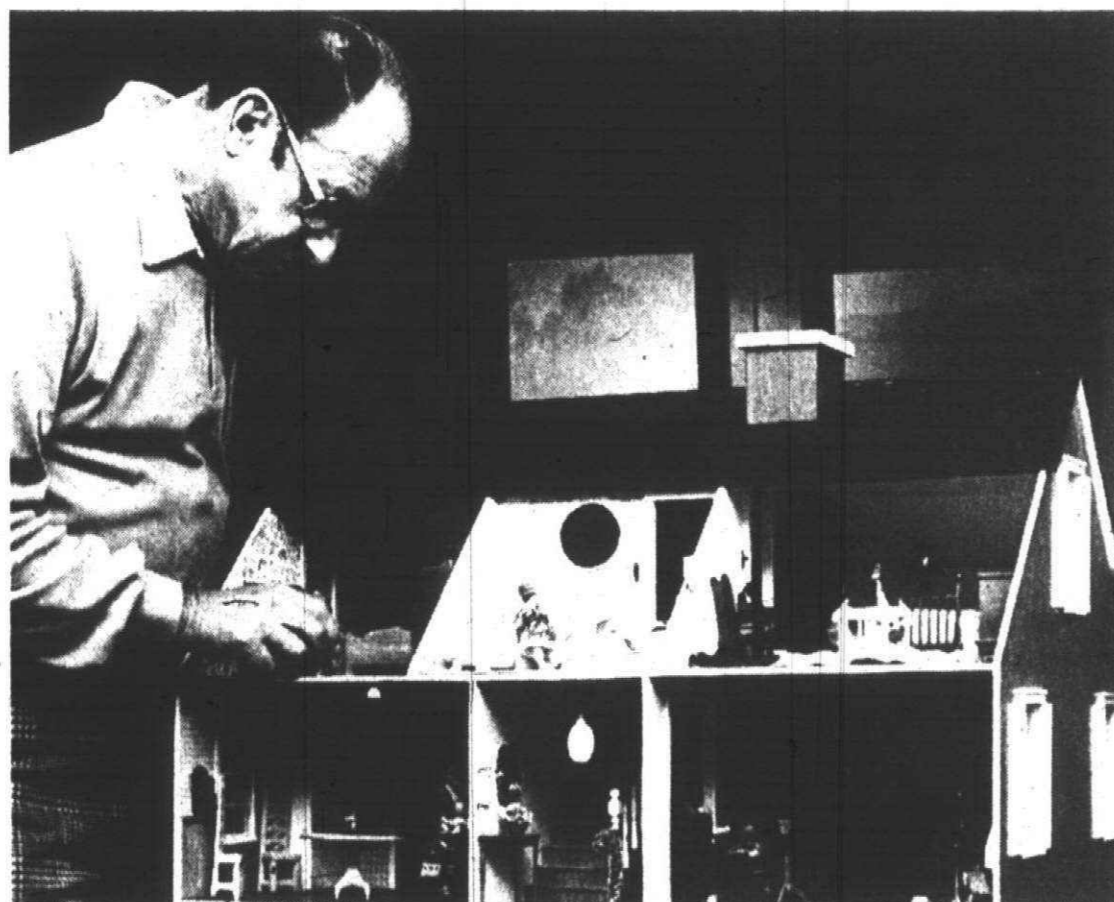

That was more than three years ago and the doll house, built to scale, was his first project. It turned out so well that it was an easy transition to miniature room construction.

While he makes most of the articles for the doll rooms, Stanifer is a frequent visitor to Muriel's Doll House in Plymouth, a shop specializing in supplies for craftsmen of miniatures.

Two different styles of dressers, a canopied bed, a corner chair, a night stand and even a cat's bed — all made by the dentist — are included in the miniature room. The canopy for the bed and the bedspread were hand-sewn by his wife, Evelyn.

Even the flowered wallpaper was applied with such care that it matches perfectly. "My first wallpapering job," Stanifer admits.

THE CLOSET in the corner of the room houses the power supply for the lights, which flick on and off at a touch. The closet door comes equipped with a mirror and even miniature books are displayed in the lower shelf

of the nightstand. Petit-point pillows, made by his sister-in-law, give a decorator touch to the bed.

"I have a lapboard fixed up to work on so that I can watch television while I'm making the furniture. I can just pick it up and set it down whenever I have a few minutes to work," he explained.

"I wish I'd started these long ago, but I didn't have the courage or the time to spend on it," says the dentist, who plans to continue his hobby into retirement.

"SOME DAY, I'll have to try making clothes for the miniature people. I guess I could make the buttons for the shirts out of tooth filling material," he laughed.

Even the drawers in the miniature dresser, his favorite piece of furniture, have dividers for various clothing.

He continues to add pieces of furniture and accessories to the big doll house and says it never may be totally completed as he keeps thinking of new things to put in it.

As for the miniature room, it now is in his daughter's home. After all, it was built just for her.

# Ecumenical workshop explores group homes

Ecumenical endeavor set some speed records to put together the "New Life in Old Neighborhoods" workshop that this Saturday will explore the role of churches with regard to neighborhood group homes for the handicapped.

The United Methodist Detroit Conference, the Lutheran Church in America and the Detroit Archdiocese are joining in the event, scheduled 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. in Divine Child High School in Dearborn.

Two bishops, Thomas J. Gumbleton of the Archdiocese and Edsel A. Ammons of the UMC Detroit Conference, have co-signed a statement urging participation.

And Presbyterians, Episcopalians, Baptists and representatives of Pentecostal churches are among the 150 so far registered.

Robert Perseke, United Methodist minister and internationally prominent authority on developmental disabilities and community placement, will speak on the topics "New Life for Old Neighborhoods" and "New Practices and Policies in Churches, and there will be a buffet lunch, reports on local church projects and regional workshop sessions.

"It has been only seven weeks since we first started talking about this project and only five weeks since the three denominations get together on it," said the Rev. Philip Seymour, minister of Good Shepherd United Methodist Church in Dearborn and workshop chairperson.

"I feel it is an issue whose time has come and it was God's will working through all of us that enabled us to put it together."

"Anytime you can get Lutherans, Methodists and Catholics together in five weeks, it's got to be God's will working."

JOINING in the sponsorship of the workshop are the Lutheran Social Services of Michigan, the metropolitan region of the Michigan Department of Mental Health, and the Michigan Council of Carvans Order of Alhambras.

Participating as planning committee members are Bonnie Chrysler, member of the UMC West District Council on Ministries; Edward Zaorski, pastoral ministry to the handicapped for the Archdiocese; the Rev. Erick Johnson, pastor of Prince of Peace Lutheran Church in Dearborn, and the Rev. John West, assistant pastor of Divine Child Catholic Church, Dearborn.

Others are Carol Park of the Northville Residential Training Center, the Rev. Peter Schweitzer of the Plymouth Center for Human Development, and the Rev. Gary Wheeler, divisional director for services among developmentally disabled for Lutheran Social Services of Michigan.

Bishop Walter J. Schoenherr of the Archdiocese and Dr. Walter Brown, metropolitan region director for the DMH, will participate in opening devotions, and Richard Kwiatkowski, director of the UMS East Side Mission, will make one of the presentations in the afternoon.

# Should we grant the right to die?

Living was, in years past, looked upon as the natural phenomenon largely under the control of Providence and little influence by the actions of man. Dying, except from violence or poisoning, was looked upon also as an inevitable phenomenon, with the time of death beyond the control of man.

These attitudes are now obsolete. Today, man has much more control over the time of dying. This change, produced my medical science, requires that we examine more closely the ethical framework of living and dying.

Death was once an agreed-upon end point. This has ceased to be true. Every day, persons in whom the heartbeat and respiration have stopped are restored to life and return to normal activity.

On the other hand, we all know of people who are still alive because the heart and respiration continue, although the brain has ceased to function. What is, or rather, what should be the definition of death?

WHAT GUIDANCE does our society give to phy-

sicians when they encounter patients who have terminal illnesses? How should the medical team handle these situations? How long should the doctor make a determined all-out effort to maintain life or, rather, existence?

When is the time to determine that comfort and freedom from pain are more important than an extra rasping breath, an additional day or week or month of physical torment? We have not yet formulated meaningful responses to these questions.

The problem needs to be defined in the clearest terms. We are not speaking of so-called euthanasia or "mercy killing." Certainly no one has the right deliberately to take a sick person's life with lethal medication. Nevertheless, it is quite possible to shorten life by withholding certain sophisticated therapy usually available at hospitals.

This withholding of therapy in certain agonizing instances is the problem that our society faces as we move across new frontiers in medical science.

I KNEW A BRILLIANT professional man who

had become severely ill with cancer that had spread throughout his entire body. Full doses of radiation therapy had given only enough relief to make life bearable, provided that he remain perfectly still. The slightest motion precipitated paroxysms of excruciating pain.

Other procedures, including surgery and chemotherapy were of no avail. With intravenous feeding, oxygen therapy, constant nursing care and antibiotics, it was possible to extend his span for two or three months. Was it right to do so?

We have only begun to consider the ethical issues involved in this as in so many other similar cases.

I find a growing concern today that medical science keeps some people alive when they should be permitted to die. But it is not fair to place the entire burden of responsibility on the physician and the medical team.

It is incumbent upon religious institutions to address this problem of defiling living and dying, for these fundamental questions must be answered by our most sacred values and highest ideals.

# Pleasures abound in 'Chapter Two'

The Southfield Civic Theatre continues its trend of producing thoroughly enjoyable shows with its current hit, Neil Simon's "Chapter Two."

Performances continue this weekend at the Southfield Parks and Recreation Building, 26000 Evergreen. The curtain rises at 8 p.m. Thursday-Saturday and at 2 p.m. Sunday.

Autobiographical in nature, Neil Simon's show follows the lives of a recently widowed writer and a newly divorced actress. Through the help of a well-meaning brother and a match-making best friend, the two lonely people meet. A whirlwind courtship ensues, followed by marriage.

The matchmakers, who themselves have gotten involved in a romantic interlude, are amazed and concerned by the sudden turn of events.

The first days of the marriage are rocked by doubts and arguments. The differences, however, are soon settled. The newlyweds begin a new life free from the fears and anxieties of their previous marriages.

SIMON'S WRITING in both the comic and the dramatic scenes is tight, fast-paced and full of insight into the

human experience. Each of his characters is well defined, unique, yet ordinary. Simon's forte is writing about real people. His "Chapter Two" is probably as close to real life as he has come.

Director Barbara Oleszczuk has taken Simon's script and fleshed it out with four highly talented young performers. Each breathes vigorous life into his or her own character. It is obvious that Ms. Oleszczuk has had her performers do their homework on the wide range of emotions they must present. Each handles them with ease.

Though the actual age of the performers vs. the age of the characters they portray is initially hard to accept (George Schneider in the show was to have been married for 12 years, yet the actor playing him can not be a day older than 25), the skills drawn forth by the performers to cover this problem are nothing short of marvelous.

Heading the cast as George Schneider is Michael Dietz. A rather pensive yet expressive young performer, Dietz

is full of energy when needed, and calm and thoughtful as required. He easily handles both the comic and serious sides of his character, both of which are often utilized.

Dietz also has mastered the technique of "talking to someone on the telephone," a bit used often throughout the show. Some of Dietz's best timed and most hilarious moments come when he is on the telephone.

As George's brother Leo, Thomas Zambeck is the antithesis of his brother. Where George is introverted and serious, Leo is jovial and on the make. All is not well in Leo's life, but he decides that George's well-being comes first.

IN THAT, Zambeck succeeds in developing a character who is deeply concerned about the brother he loves. As flashy and daring as Zambeck's portrayal is, he never once loses the care and concern that is always present between the brothers.

Jane Shaffmaster's return to the Civic Theatre's stage is a welcome one. Where her usual roles have been light in nature, Ms. Shaffmaster's portrayal of Jennie Malone, George's new love interest, proves her versatility. Jennie's several monologues offer

Ms. Shaffmaster the opportunity to display a wide variety of emotions, all of which are well done. Initially, her portrayal is almost too much larger than life. Shortly into the show, however, Ms. Shaffmaster's obvious skills and talents take over and the performance she gives is excellent.

Sheer delight on stage is Bev Lloyd. Her portrayal of Fay Medwick, Jennie's best friend, is consistently strong and always delightful.

While the other performers were struggling on stage in the opening scenes, it was Ms. Lloyd's easy-going attitude and professionalism that set the tone for the rest of the show. She appeared at ease from the moment she first walked on stage. The other performers soon followed her lead.

DIRECTOR OLESZCZUK'S cast is an ensemble. Each works well alone, yet together they work even harder. The little nuances that are present throughout the show give added dimensions to the characters that are not in the script.

'Guys and Dolls' needs more pep

"Guys and Dolls," Frank Loesser's musical about the muddled love lives of two street gamblers, has the potential to be either very good or very bad.

Well done, the play is light and amusing, happily carrying the audience from New York to Havana and back again.

It is unfortunate that the Troy Players' production of this play flows more along the latter vein.

The show continues its run Friday-Saturday, March 13-14, at the Troy Community Center.

"Guys and Dolls" revolves around Sky Masterson and Nathan Detroit, two underground gamblers who waver between their love for dice and their love for two women, one a Salvation Army worker and the other a chorus girl.

OF THE FOUR leads, there is not one who is really better than another. None of them are poor at either singing or acting — far from it.

Rod Crawford as Nathan Detroit and Linda Ball as Adelaide, his chorus-girl fiancée of 14 years, are good when they are together and able to play off one another, but Ball wavers toward whiny when she is by herself.

They are also the only two cast members who use accents, but instead of coming off as lower-class New Yorkers, they often sound almost foreign.

As Sky Masterson, Bob Olesinski is certainly a competent actor and singer, but he lacks the sparkle necessary to mold Masterson into the colorful, appealing hero that he should be.

Playing opposite Olesinski is Ceil Wehman as Sarah Brown, Sky's prim,

reluctant girlfriend. In her own right, Wehman could carry the part quite well, but she doesn't appear too at ease with Olesinski.

ALTHOUGH NO ONE is glaringly inept, there is only one cast member who brightens the stage with his presence. He is Jim Moskal as Nicely Johnson.

He alone seems comfortable enough in his role. It is too bad he doesn't have more speaking lines.

Just when this play is supposed to take place is a little confusing. Costume chairman Kathy Goldenbogan has outfitted the cast in some outlandish clothes from several different eras, from the Depression to today.

The script calls for some bizarre costumes, particularly for the gamblers, but they should still be from the same time period. Ms. Goldenbogan has the prim Sarah in too-sexy skirts that twirl up around her thighs during some of the dance routines.

There is also one scene where Nathan is using a very modern Touch-tone telephone while he is dressed in 1950s garb.

These irregularities are as much director Marge Weins' fault as they are anyone else's. Ms. Weins should have decided on one year or decade and seen to it that her backstage crews followed her plans in designing the sets and costumes.

Overall, this is a plodding, slow-moving production that takes more out of an audience than it gives.

Master class critiqued by Broadway producer

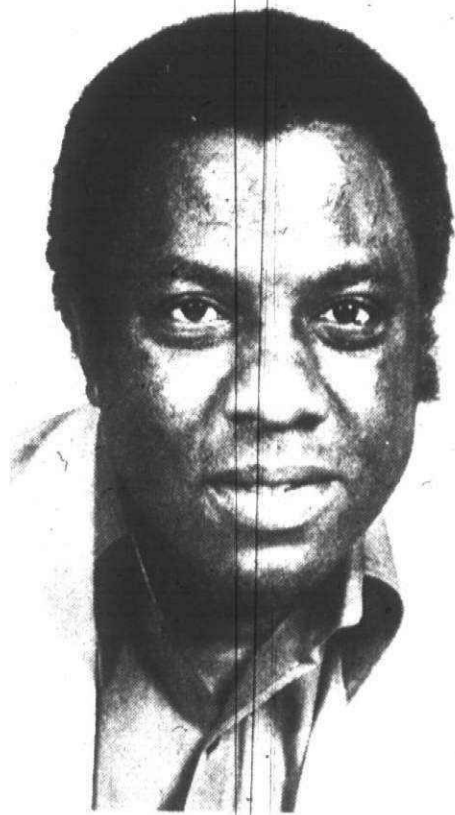

## backgammon

### Michael Kioian

of the American Backgammon Club

#### SAFE OR SORRY?

White is on the bar and rolls a 5-4. How would you play it?

Situations like this will happen on occasion, offering the player a definite choice of critical moves. As we are taught, backgammon is a hitting, running and blocking game (not necessarily in that order) and may the best dice win, it's not necessarily so.

Most players, following that concept of backgammon, would certainly elect to hit black on the 9 point with the 4 (the 5 is a forced play — white re-enters from the bar to the black 5 point). Hitting could be correct, but at what expense?

White has a very weak home board; he could not possibly detain black long enough to establish more points in the home board. White would also leave four exposed blots (checkers).

If black rolled any horror shot, white could easily get gammoned (twice the cube value, or 4 points). Finally, aside from leaving the midpoint (black's 12 point) prematurely, hitting really does nothing for white's game.

White would do best to move the checker off the 1 point to the 5 point for a secure "anchor" in black's home

board. Most often, if there is a similar choice, it is correct to secure a forward point in your opponent's home board — unless, of course, you have closed at least four of your home board points and hold a five-point prime (five points in a row owned by you).

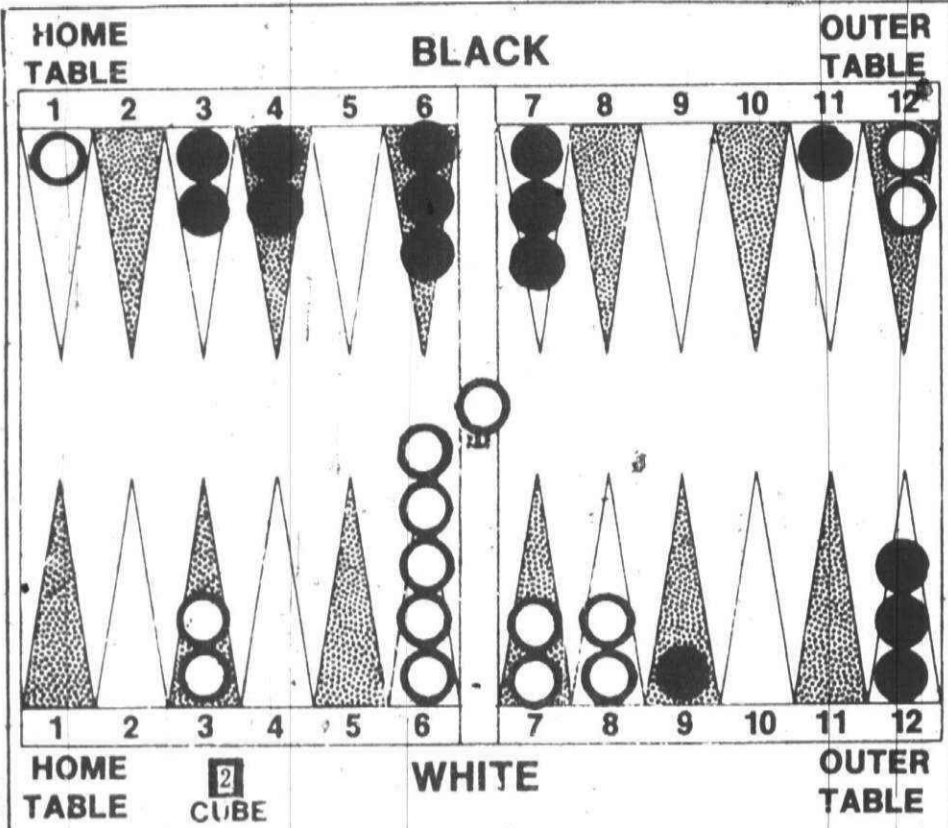
This game is far from over. With white sitting on the 5 point, black must roll perfect numbers to bring all of his checkers home safely, while white has a chance to build his home board unrestricted and wait patiently for a shot.

White could prohibit black from moving around too fast. Then if white rolls a large double, he may be able to steal the game, take the lead and pass the doubling cube to black at the 4 level.

Since white "owns" the cube, he can virtually ride out the entire game or force his opponent to resign if the tide turns.

Again, the importance of securing an anchor (especially the 5 point) in your opponent's home board cannot be stressed enough.

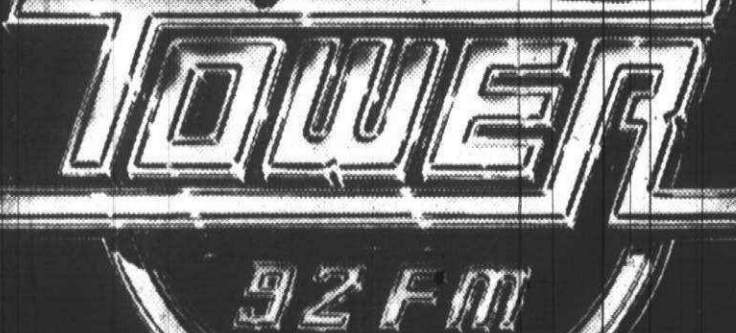

Paul Horton, virtually unnoticed and in-and-out of the lineup most the season, answered a rescue call Tuesday night.

The stringbean 6-foot-9 center keyed a second half rally as Plymouth Salem edged rival Plymouth Canton, 58-53, in the district Class A opener at Salem's gym.

The matchup was billed as a duel between two brothers — Sean Houle of Canton against brother Dave of Salem.

Horton, however, stole the show as he drilled in eight points, all from long range, in the third quarter which helped the Rocks overcome a nine-point halftime deficit.

"Nobody has ever played Paul that open," said Salem coach Fred Thomann. "It was smart on his part. He recognized it and we naturally had to go with the hot hand."

It appeared that the Chiefs would avenge a triple overtime loss suffered against Salem in the Churchill Holiday Classic.

Canton's zone defense bottled up Salem most of the first half. Dave Malek's basket with 2:00 left until half-

mann said, "but it was still a matter of putting the ball in the hole."

BELL AGREED that Horton's unexpected performance was the difference.

"I think it was surprising to everybody that Paul Horton was hitting from 20 feet," he said. "It was the right defense. I'd play it that way again, but one kid got hot and that kind of turned it around."

"That gave them the momentum."

McBride, a junior guard, netted 17 points to tie Malek for game-high scoring honors. Houle, who hit nine of 10 free throws, chipped in with 13. Horton added 12.

On the Canton side, Sean Houle had 14 points, but had just four after intermission as Salem put the clamps on the 6-5 senior. Steve Tuttle added 10.

"They had the flow early and we had it late," said Thomann, whose team meets Wayne Memorial Thursday. "Our three perimeter players — McBride, (Mike) Sharp and David Miller played a good second half I thought."

"The players executed and played well defensively. Our two sophomores

(Houle and John Cohen) handled themselves well in a big game like that."

"It's just one of those things," reasoned Bell. "The shots were going in early and in the second half they weren't."

"We had some inkling that Salem would play some zone. They had to do something to beat us and I think that's a tribute to our team. I can't fault my team. They've played hard all year."

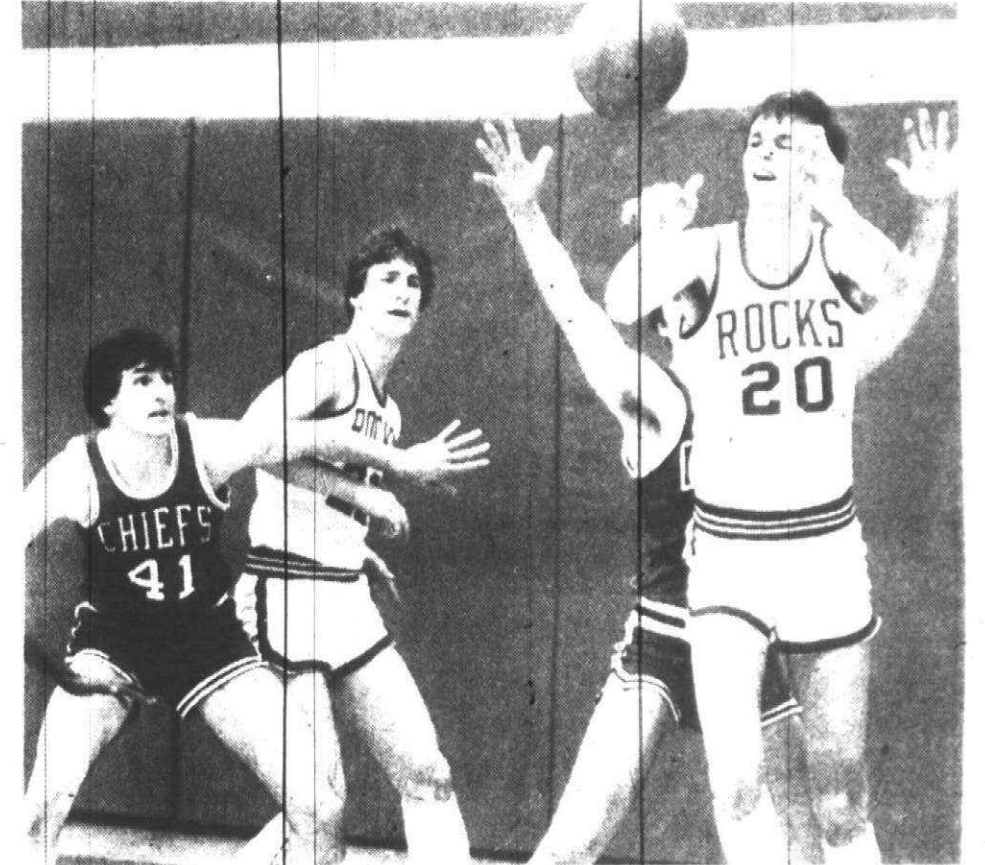
time enabled Canton to build a 10-point advantage.

Plymouth Salem got point production out of its three qualifiers last weekend in the state Class A wrestling tournament at Ann Arbor's Crisler Arena.

Billy Ward (119 pounds), Jeff Vojcek (98) and Marty Piper (unlimited) combined to score 39 points, good enough for a seventh-place team finish.

Davison repeated as the Class A champ, scoring 90 points followed by Temperance-Bedford, second, 68; Belleville, third, 55; Lansing Eastern, fourth, 52½; Trenton, fifth, 49½; East Kentwood, sixth, 46; Salem; Portage Northern, eighth, 36; Farmington, ninth, 29; West Bloomfield, 10th, 26½; and Warren Lincoln, 11th, 26.

"That makes the Suburban Eight (League) look pretty good," said Salem coach Ron Krueger. "Three (Salem, Belleville and Trenton) out of the top 10 is not bad."

"I said all along that we weren't a bad team."

Ward proved Saturday he was no slouch on the mat. The Rock senior went all the way to the 119-pound final before losing to Tony Latora of Portage Northern, 11-2.

Enroute to the championship match, Ward defeated Ralph Alcalá of Redford Catholic Central, 12-11, and Andy Sinadinos of East Lansing, 20-13.

"Ward has only lost one match since he dropped to 119 from 126," said Krueger. "He did a real nice job."

Ward finished the season with a sparkling 30-5 record.

Piper, after losing his first round match to Midland's Matt Rathack (7-7) on a referee's criteria, fought his way back to gain fourth place in the heavy-weight class.

THE SALEM junior then downed Trenton's Joe Hunter, 7-4, avenging two league defeats. He followed with a pin in 5:53 over East Kentwood's Lynn Hawken.

In the consolation final, Daryl Simpson of Pontiac Northern pinned the Salem wrestler in the second period.

Piper broke the school record for most pins in a season (30) with his triumph over Hawken. His season record was 37-7.

Vojcek, a sophomore, made an impressive showing with a fifth-place finish at 98 pounds. He won two of four matches.

He gained fifth with a 37-second pin against Don Van Mourik of Owosso.

In his opener, Vojcek lost to Fred Bunn of Grand Rapids Creston, 7-7, on a referee's judgment. He then beat Walled Lake Central's John Andrews, 33-4, and lost to Bunn again on the wrestle-back, 17-4.

The meet, sponsored by the Michigan High School Athletic Association (MHSAA), was held under one roof for the first time. All four classes (A, B, C and D) converged Friday and Saturday on the University of Michigan complex.


The new format made it possible for the estimated 8,000 fans to see six matches at one time. Many spectators and coaches, including Krueger, however, thought the plan was unreasonable.

"I HAD Vojcek and Piper wrestling at the same time," said Krueger, "but I didn't mind because they were winning."

"There were a lot of good kids there, but it was sort of a distraction. I like a separate site."

"The Grand March (opening ceremony) was nice. I liked that part of it. I think they'll change it. We'll have to wait and see."

The Salem coach was highly critical of the formats used in the district and regional meets as set by the MHSAA. A strict double-elimination format was altered, meaning less wrestlers could qualify for the regional and state meets.

A NEW GIRLS softball program is being offered by the PCJBL at Allen School, on Haggerty Road between Ann Arbor Road and Trail.

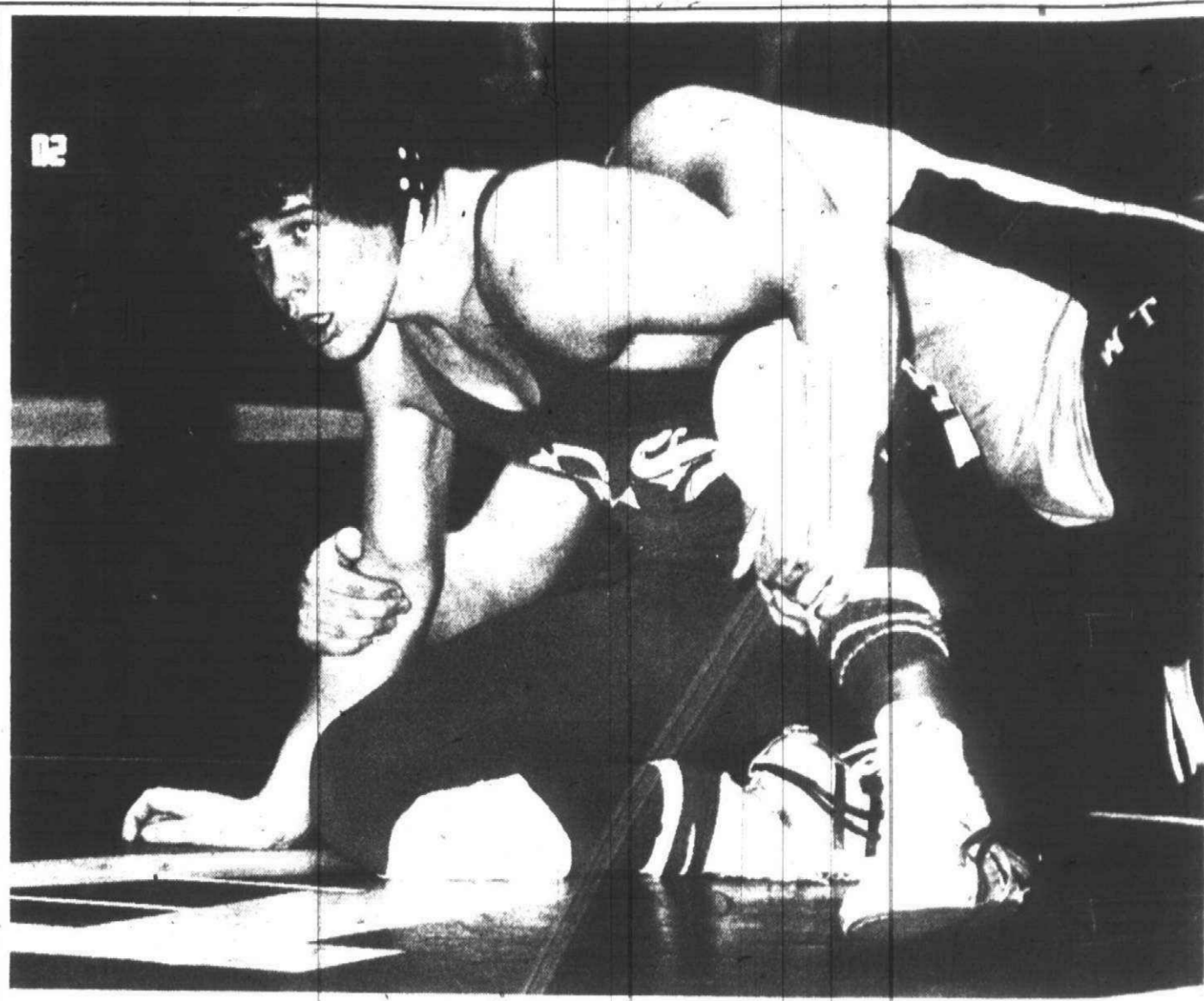
The program is available to youngsters ages 7 to 10, replacing T-Ball.

The championship drive starts Saturday when the Sparks host the Twin City Spinners from Kitchen, Ont.

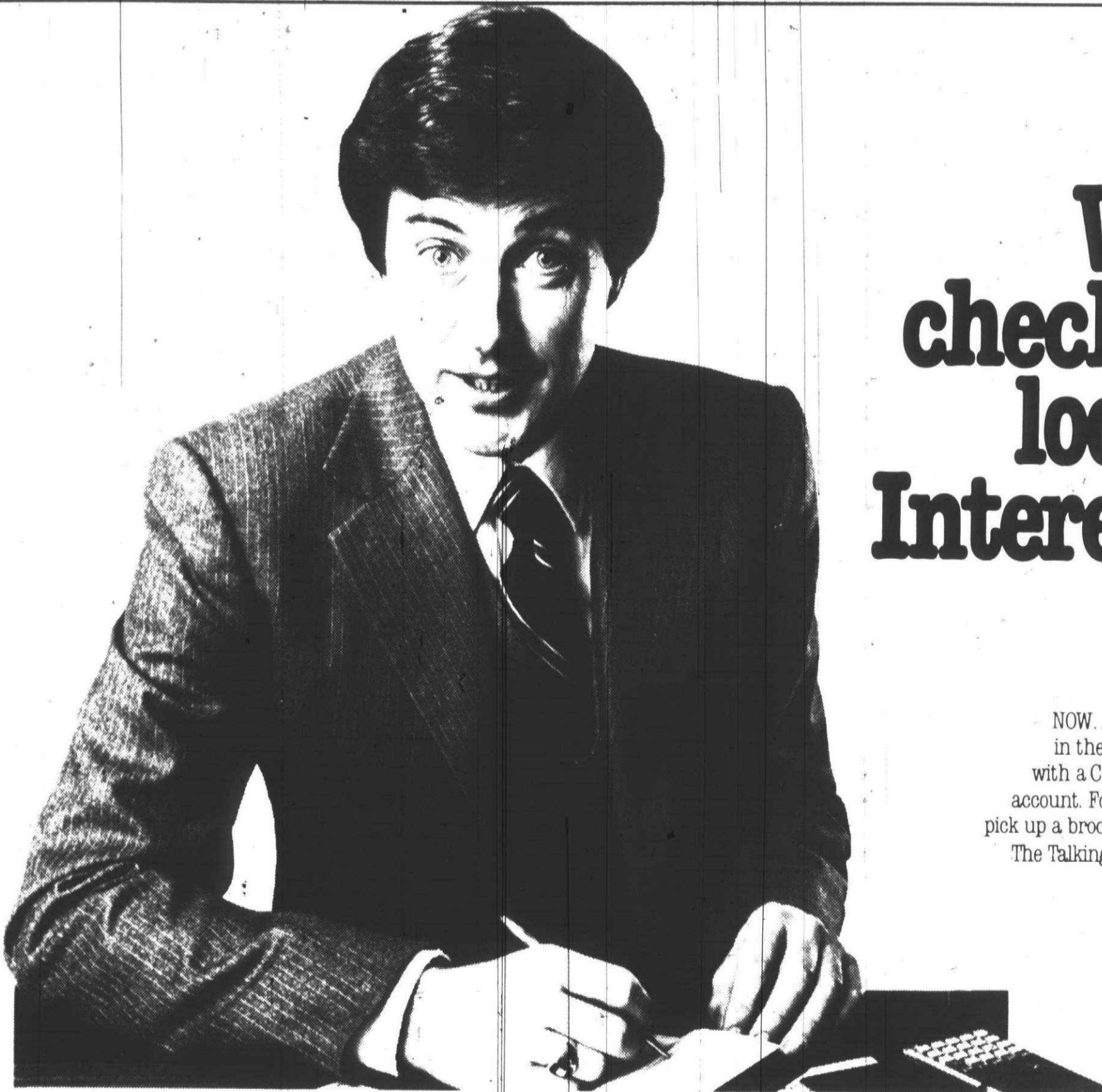
Game time for the regional confrontation is 8 p.m. The site is the Melvin G.

Tickets at \$1 per person will be available at the door. There is no admission charge for wheelchair users.

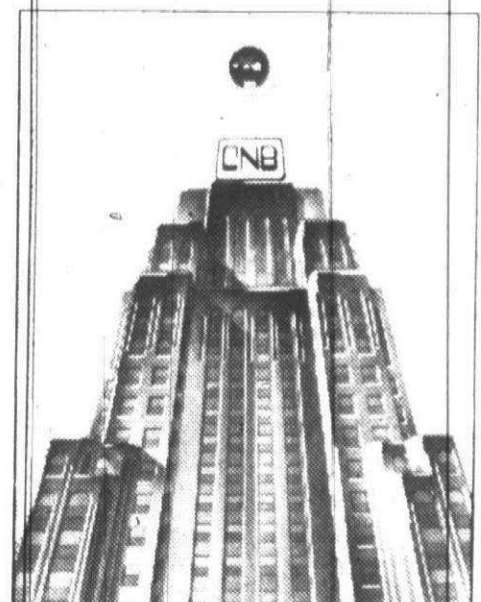
If the Sparks win Saturday, they qualify for the Eastern Sectional, which will be contested in Connecticut.

went in for points, and she didn't have one bad set."

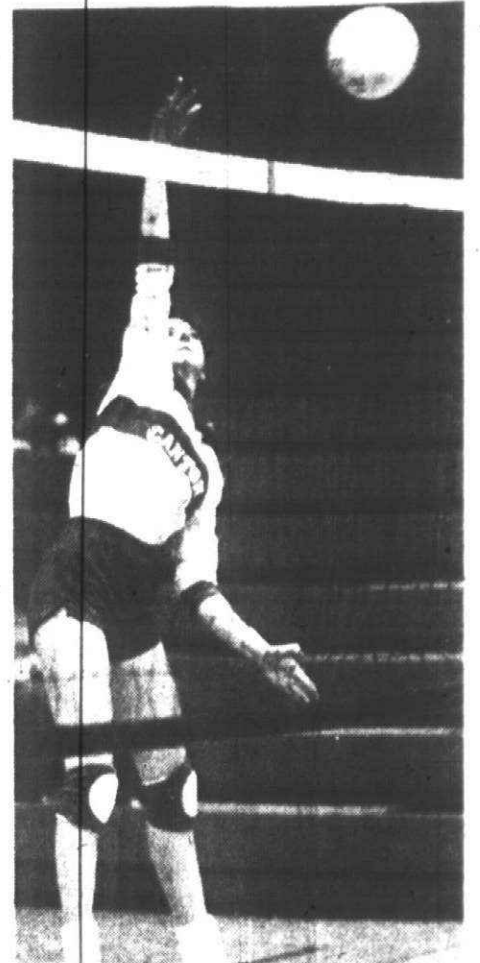
Canton, 8-5 overall, will prepare for Saturday's district opener at Ann Arbor Huron against Ann Arbor Pioneer.

# Monk, Visser form nucleus

Life in the inner city is just fine for a couple of suburban transients.

Howard Monk and Dave Visser, standouts last year at Plymouth Salem and Canton, respectively, have made the transition to college basketball at Wayne State University without a hitch.

As freshmen, both started most of the season for the Tartars on a relatively young team, which finished the year with an 11-16 record.

The 6-foot-6 Monk averaged nearly 13 points per game, while Visser, a 6-5 swing player, led the team in rebounds and scored at a nine point-per-game clip.

"The nucleus is there," said Tartar coach Vern Payne. "We're only two or three players away from competing."

"I've really admired the way this team has worked. We have eight freshmen. I have to keep reminding myself that they're young. They'll make mistakes, but they get better."

Also on the squad are the Thorderson

brothers, Eric and Kurt, former Livonia Bentley standouts.

Payne recruited the two former All-Observer players not only for their basketball ability, but also for their academic qualities.

"I don't have to worry about most of my players," said Payne, a former standout guard at Indiana, "because they're good students."

Visser's improvement from his days at Canton are almost startling.

In a recent game against Great Lakes Conference leader Hillsdale, Visser came out of forest of players to block a critical shot down the stretch.

Hillsdale coach Bill Morse complained about goaltending. The Tartars rallied to upset Hillsdale in that game, 51-49, as Visser played the entire 40 minutes, scoring eight points and grabbing six rebounds.

"DAVE VISSER will do anything you ask him to do," said Payne. "We asked him to help us out rebounding. He's coming as a defensive player and is a tremendous competitor. In time, he'll be a fine shooting forward."

Monk, who was born in England, has also made presence known around the league.

He scored 24 points in a heartbreaking loss earlier in the year at Ball State. He also had 19 points and seven rebounds against Saginaw Valley in a 67-65 triumph.

"Howard will develop into a good power forward," said the WSU coach. "I've changed his game a little bit. He's played with his back to the basket, and I'm asking him to come out to the perimeter and face up, being more of a power threat."

"He's one of the most coachable players I've had. He'll drive over the world if you ask him."

Payne believes WSU's program is on the upswing. He must replace his two senior guards, John Scott and Grady Wicker, and find a much-needed center.

"A good post player will make Monk and Visser that much better," said

Payne.

"I've really enjoyed it," said Visser. "I feel fortunate to get the playing time I did. That's going to help me in the next couple years."

"Before the season started, I was hoping to play maybe half the game, but once I started playing, it went a lot smoother than I thought."

"STARTING WAS important to me," said Monk. "If you don't start, you begin to doubt. The thing I notice most is the game is more physical."

"In the practices you have to perform, because there are people behind you to take your spot. Every player is out there for a reason. It's very competitive."

"Practices in college are so intense," added Visser, "but it really paid off for me. We have four coaches out there. They're watching every move you make. Every block out."

"Coach Payne is very intense on the court. He offers constructive criticism, and is a disciplinarian. I like that style."

Rivals in high school, Monk and Visser share an apartment on the Wayne State campus. They take turns cooking the meals.

Monk would like to major in computer science or business. Visser is interested in business.

The two players concluded their season Wednesday night, losing to NAIA playoff contender Siena Heights, 95-79.

"We have three weeks off and then we'll start lifting weights," Visser said.

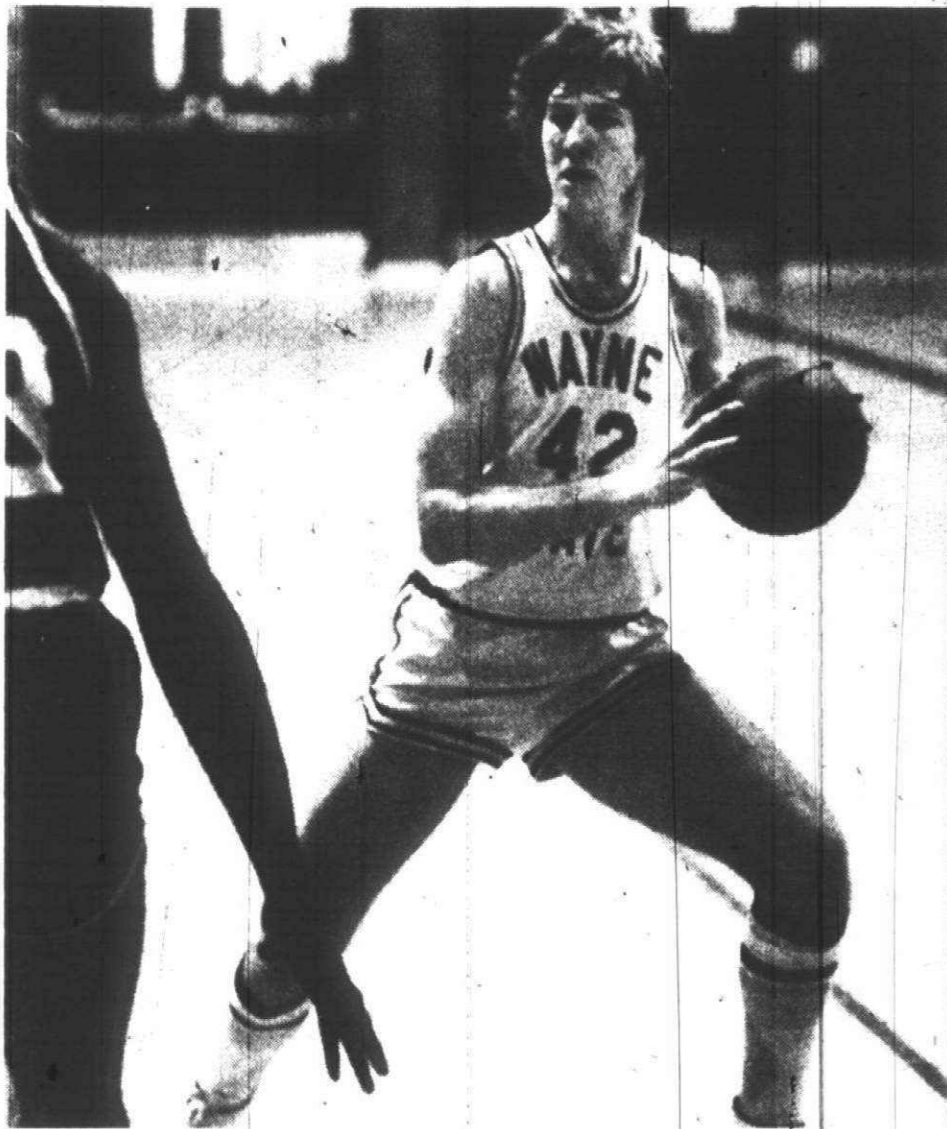
"We have to improve from March 15 to October 15 in order to reach our potential," said Payne.

The WSU coach's work is not done once the season is over. He'll be seen in numerous high school gyms the next few weeks, looking for guards and a center to take his team to the top.

The former Michigan State assistant thought he had a successful recruiting year in 1980. He hopes to do the same in 1981 with a few more players like Monk and Visser.

# Venerable Ming ding

Last summer, a small group of people toured mainland China for two weeks sponsored by Eastern Michigan University.

In the group were mostly students, and a few interested others, who were seeing a country only recently opened to foreigners.

"We saw much more than regular tour groups because we were associated with a university and because I spoke Chinese," Dr. Jiu Hwa Upshur said. Upshur is an EMU associate professor of history and was the group's tour guide.

The 10-member tour visited not only the mandated popular stops, but also unlikely places as a jail, a Beijing (Peking) air raid shelter, a major archaeological excavation near Xi'an and first-century tombs.

It was a successful tour, so much so that Upshur will take another group to China May 25 to June 16. This trip will include additional and different cities from last year's tour. The tour will

land in Manila May 27. From there, three days later, a flight to Beijing. The group will tour seven other Chinese cities including Datong (Tatung), Taiyuan, Shanghai, Hangzhou (Hanchow) and Guangzhou (Kwangchow). A two-day stop over in Hong Kong will be the last stop of the tour.

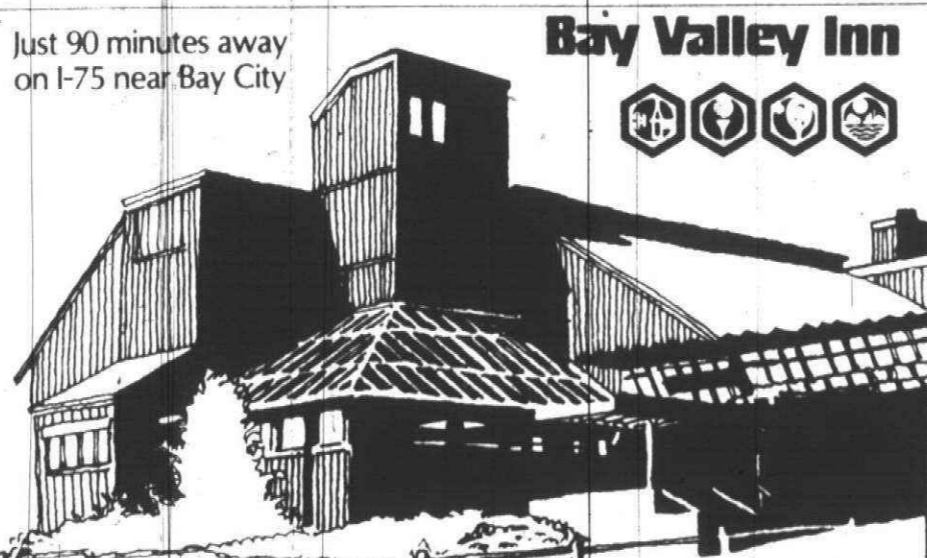

# Getting crazy in Wisconsin

**CEDARBURG, Wis.** — It is exactly what you need when you are crazy with winter. A bed race on ice, with all your weirdly costumed friends cheering you on.

Somewhere in the world, where people are warm and sane, men and women work in the garden, walk to work and expect logical behavior of their neighbors. Here, in the North Temperate Zone, where we spend months defrosting our ears, it is another matter.

Perfectly rational citizens push homemade beds onto an ice rink, race one another around a barrel and then go home, pulling their beds behind them.

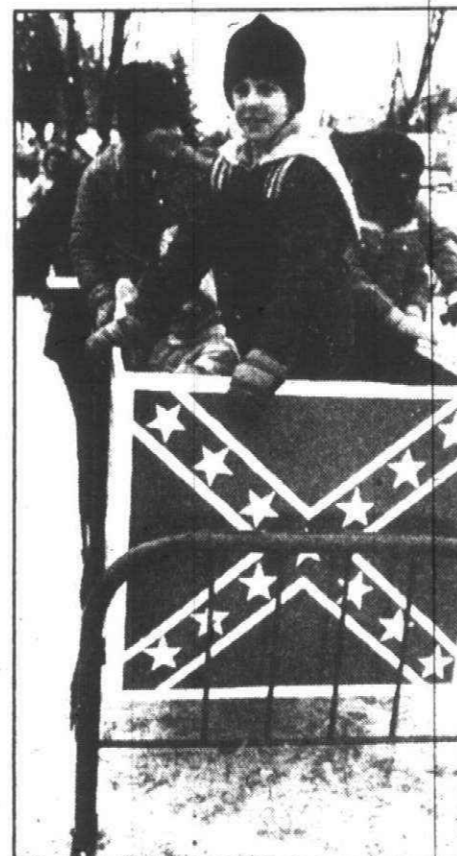
The annual Bed Race, part of the Winter Festival held every year in this historic little town of Cedarburg, has once more returned winter-weary Wisconsinites to sanity. Those who need a little extra help can climb uphill to the tasting room of Stone Mill Winery, in Cedar Creek Settlement.

**THERE ARE HUGE** sculpted blocks of ice on either side of Washington Avenue when you enter Cedarburg, 20 minutes drive north of Milwaukee, where 12,000 people live among 19th-century stone houses and an old woolen mill building listed on the National Register of Historic Buildings.

The Wittenburg Woolen Mill, built in 1864, was destined to be torn down and replaced by a gas station until merchants decided to convert it into an unusual shopping center.

Cedar Creek Settlement, which inhabits the old mill, now has 37 shops, restaurants and artists studios as well as the Stone Mill Winery.

The tour guides at the winery, who are fortunately just as crazy as the rest of the population, will give you a hilarious and informative 45-minute tour any day, along with samples of both natural and spiced wines. The wines are made from juice imported from Pennsylvania.



Even the youngsters get in on the act.

On a cold winter's day, with the wind blowing and the thermometer registering 5 degrees below zero, that hot-mulled wine is just what you need to get in the mood for a Winter Festival.

The Chamber of Commerce provides the huge blocks of ice along Washington Avenue, and the kids sculpt the ice with the basic tools allowed. No fancy welding equipment here.

As things speed up, participants go

from the Snow Goose Hunt to the Barrel Jumping Contest to the ice-cutting contest. But it's all really a warmup for the grand Parade of Beds and the Annual Bed race.

**THE REVOLUTIONARY War** Commander-in-Chief's Guards begin to gather around the Mill Pond in full regalia: coats, cocked hats, and all.

The beds appear, accompanied by their required five-person teams. Four years ago there were only five beds in the first Bed Race, but now there are dozens. Somebody tried to enter a bed plan in which the vehicle was lowered by a jet motor and equipped with a parachute, but that would break the rules.

The teams gather: the Bionic Bed, with four costumed mad scientists behind it and a woman inside to move the giant arms; the bed built around a rebel flag; the Cradle Robbers, full of little kids; the hospital bed, whose participants are wrapped in bandages.

The rules are simple: Five men and/or women to a bed crew, all of them on ice skates. At least one member of the

crew on the bed at all times. Two-by-two, they race one another around the barrels placed on the frozen Mill Pond.

A Revolutionary War soldier shoots a three-quarter-pound pistol, or a small cannon, and everything gets knocked into a cocked hat.

The beds roar around the ice. The crowd screams. Skates fly. Skaters fly. Beds run into barrels. One or more of the beds usually gets to the finish line eventually, whether or not they drag the barrel behind them.

It's the highlight of the festival, with the possible exception of the Alaskan Malamute Weight-Pull Contest.

**ALL OF THIS** may sound strange to people from Florida or Mexico, but it makes perfect sense here in the frozen north, where we are all a little bit crazy with winter. If you can't go south to a nice warm beach, you might as well enjoy the snow, which is sure to fly again before April.

And if you want to be sensible about it, Cedarburg is within easy driving distance of historic Pioneer Village and Wisconsin's only authentic old Covered Bridge.

## Wave of the future Computer banking comes of age

By ALICE COLLINS

Step right up to the money machine. Place your own private plastic access card into the slot and the machine begins "talking" to you via printed words on its video screen. It says, "identify yourself with your PIN (personal identification number)." Punch your four secret numbers on the machine's keyboard. Don't be nervous, even if it's the first time you've handled your financial transactions through a machine instead of a human bank teller.

The machine isn't going to let you make a mistake. It carries on a "conversation" with you, guiding you. It asks you what you want to do and tells you what keys to punch to see that it is done. Do you want to transfer funds from one account to another? Do you want to make a deposit or a withdrawal or something else?

**WHATEVER** it is you want to do with the money in your money accounts, you can do it on the money machine. To complete the procedure, the machine gives you back your receipt and access card. There's been no paper work or people, except you and your receipt, involved. The machine takes only seconds to complete the transfer of your funds. It's done.

"It's simple and convenient for the customer," says Richard Webb, a Detroit bank executive who's been dedicated to bringing electronic banking to full-scale reality for about five years. Webb is executive vice president of Michigan National Bank of Detroit and in charge of electronic fund transfers for the Bloomfield Hills-based Michigan National Corp. Michigan National owns the money machines currently located in off-bank premises in supermarkets, shopping centers and office buildings. "If they try it, they'll like it. All they have to do to make it work is be able to read," says Webb. What electronic banking will do for financial institutions, according to Webb, is to save them "economically and physically from the labor-based paper system that has become staggering."

**YOU MAY** not have used an automated teller machine (ATM) yet, although they've been around for a while. Perhaps you noticed one here or there, in your supermarket, office building, shopping center, or sticking through an outside wall of your bank. If you haven't tried one, you probably will in the near future because electronic banking in Michigan is about to take one giant leap from infancy into adolescence.

About 100 Michigan financial institutions are about to begin sharing each other's automated teller machines, those "in house" as well as those in off-premise locations. Brand new "MAC-link" (Michigan Automated Clearinghouse), the master electronic fund transfer computer switch in Detroit, is having its kinks ironed out.

MAC-link, provided by the association of banks for electronic transfers, will be the clearing house between and among all the financial institutions using the electronic machines hooked into it.

"It's about to go on its maiden voyage," predicts Webb.

"SOON MICHIGAN National will begin sharing its whole system with Manufacturers National Bank," says Webb. He doesn't want to name an exact date because that depends upon final programming and check-outs with MAC-link.

"Next, there are 100 financial institutions signed up to join" the MAC-link computer network, he adds.

## Checkout coding Scanners add new zip

"Ease at the front end" is how one supermarket spokesman describes a major aim that is bit by bit progressing in the game of dispensing our supply of food and other commodities.

Aiding the progress is a system of lines and bars that are becoming a familiar, if little understood, sight in the many-aisled marts. So far, its actual use isn't common enough to have caused much easing in many supermarket front ends.

But it does work to cut waiting time at the checkout counter, report spokesmen for Bormans, Inc., and the Kroger Co. in this area.

The system is Universal Product Code, which puts a coded identification on a myriad of nationally-distributed items and can be adapted to locally-produced ones too.

The codes appear on things that go into grocery baskets in every market in the area. But only in a few, where an expensive scanner has been installed, are the lines and bars utilized as they are meant to be.

Bormans has scanners in Farmer Jack markets in Birmingham and Rochester, as well as one in downtown Detroit. Kroger stores utilizing the system are in Farmington, Canton, Ann Arbor, Flat Rock and Ferndale.

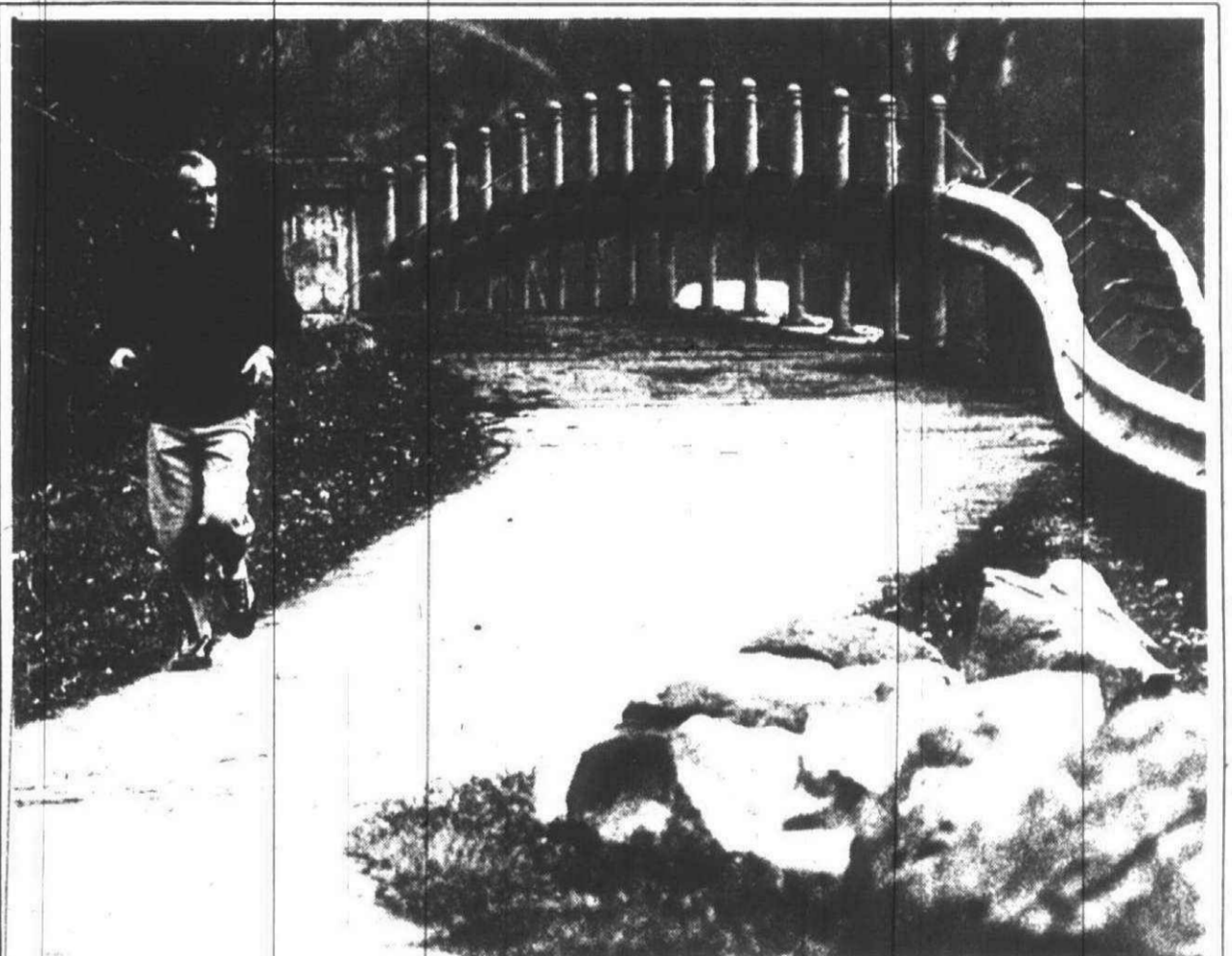
tomers brings a cart of groceries to the checkout counter.

There the cashier passes a beam of light over the black and white code. That records information that is inherent in the code — the type of product, the manufacturer and the size.

"Each part of the code translates into information about the specific item," said Bert Kirschner, director of research at Bormans. "But price is not included in the printed code. That goes on at the store level."

THE SCANNER does its work as the cus-

## Healthier attitudes build strong bodies

When the 1980s come to a close, the population should be much healthier and more physically fit than any preceding generation.

That's because there is a marked trend toward involvement in almost any activity which will result in a healthier, stronger body capable of withstanding the pressures and tensions which lead to high blood pressure, heart disorders and other crippling and fatal maladies.

"Physical conditioning is definitely the 'in' thing as far as what people want to do," says Ruth Duey, branch executive at the Northwest Branch of the YMCA in Redford Township.

"Fitness is the vogue thing today," adds Dave Heiser, director of the Wayne-Westland YMCA. And Dave Heinzman of Schoolcraft College also reports an increased interest in physical fitness and conditioning.

Another related trend is the interest of women in weightlifting — an area of fitness previously considered to be exclusively for males.

Linda Wayne of Silvers Gym in Plymouth confirms that trends in health awareness include an interest by women in working out on weights.

IN 1956, when the Redford YWCA opened its membership was 1,500.

Now the Northwest Branch has a membership roll of 10,000 and has gone through three building expansion programs.

Today, aerobic dance exercise classes are by far the most popular among members, says Ms. Duey, who adds that such classes have waiting lists.

Aerobic exercise is that which aims at toning muscles and also monitors the individual's cardiovascular system.

There also is interest in such specialized exercise classes as aquatic exercise for the handicapped, exercise classes for the back, and "End-core," a rehabilitation exercise class for mastectomy surgical patients.

Right now, she explains, participation is split between physical conditioning offerings and sports-related courses like swimming and volleyball.

Because the branch is a YWCA, most of its classes are geared to women. "For these women the Y is a time for themselves only. They feel

better when they're in good shape. And they come to a Y for the camaraderie. It's a social type of thing."

IN THE PAST two years, Heiser of Wayne-Westland YMCA notes there has been a 200 percent increase in the fitness program.

"We used to get between 75-100 people per session in our classes. Now it's better than 300."

People used to sign up for a 10-week course and then drift away, adds Heiser. "Now they are staying because they realize if they don't continue exercising they will regress."

Greater awareness of one's health in general has fueled the interest in getting in shape and staying there.

As a result, the Y fitness program also includes classes which work on conditioning the heart and lungs as well.

In fact, the Wayne-Westland Y tests heart rates and body fat content and tests blood before applicants are allowed to join classes.

TODAY THE YMCA has a range of courses for people of all ages — beginning with prenatal exercise classes for pregnant women to fitness courses for infants to exercise programs for those in their 60s, 70s and 80s.

In a parent and infant exercise class for youngsters as young as three months, the motto is, "Fitness by five, fitness for life."

Another recent development at this Y is aerobic exercise dance classes, primarily for women. "These have become very popular."

Heiser also notes that many joining the Ys today are "old Silhouette and Vic Tanny people."

"We don't have all those fancy chrome machines Vic Tanny's have but people are impressed with what we offer and they know that it is cheaper than at the commercial places."

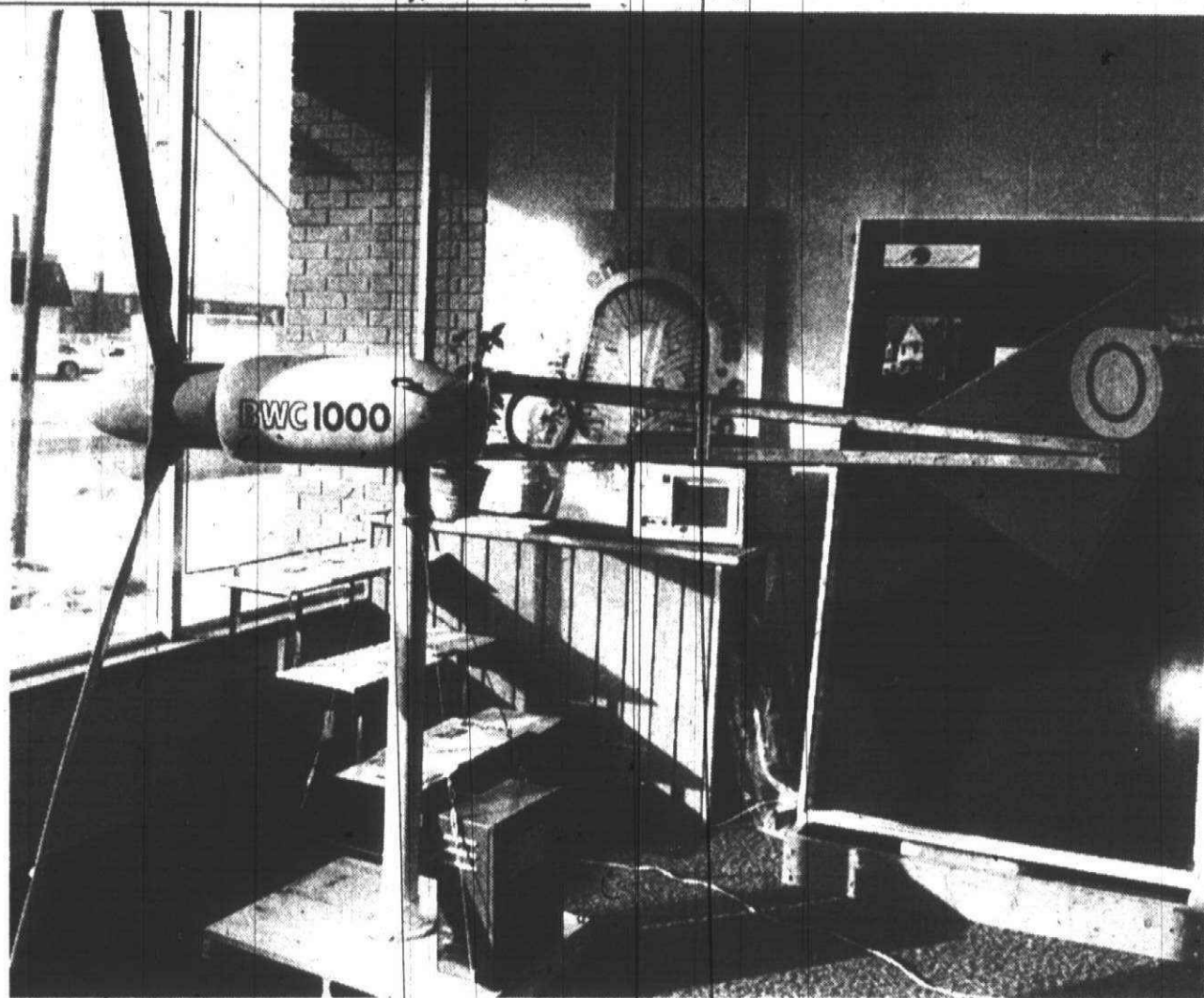
"A lot of those machines too are aimed at building muscles. People realize that just because you have muscles on top of muscles you're not necessarily in shape."

IN SPITE OF this realization, though, many women are joining men in weightlifting.

For women, the purpose and even the philosophy of weightlifting, however, is different.

# Sun power

## Energy for tomorrow?

Those who work closely with the solar industry in this area are optimistic about its future in Michigan. But they do not agree on the most effective way to harness its rays.

David Mitchell of Farmington Hills favors the passive solar idea, saying he could design and build a self-sufficient home with no electric or heating bills. A solar engineer for Sol-con Inc. Energy Systems, he would build the home to take advantage of what the sun provides free, and then equip the home with wind generators to supply its electricity.

On the other hand, Livonian Joe St. Cyr thinks the coming thing is photovoltaics, which change light into electricity by use of solar cells.

But while he is waiting for it to be perfected and become cheaper, his Solar Wind Energy Systems Inc. of Livonia is designing an energy saving system for a large development in Terraceia peninsula in Florida.

It will involve use of solar collectors for water and space heating, wind generators and a system to turn sewage into methane gas. Present state-of-the-art photovoltaic cells will also be included, and swimming pools will have water heating uses.

Another strong believer in the possibilities of photovoltaic cells is Sanford Ovshinsky, whose Energy Conversion Devices Inc. in Troy last year won a \$25 million contract from Atlantic Richfield Oil Co. (ARCO) to work on these solar cells. Back in June 1980 it was regarded as the largest solar investment in a private firm.

The hope in photovoltaic cells is that they will provide electricity without the use of coal, oil or nuclear energy.

Troy, by the way, is also the home of the first Michigan school to use solar heat, Bemis Elementary School.

SEVERAL LOCAL solar businessmen are pinning their hopes mainly on glass collectors placed on the southern side of a home. These are now producing both hot water and space heat.

Veronica Richard at Suntemp Energy Systems of Plymouth, says there are about three dozen space heating collectors already placed in the area. Air is circulated by a fan through these collectors. Then it is heated and brought into the house.

George Reidel of Livonia said such a space heater can also be used as an air conditioner when tied in with an absorption chiller. A partner in Michigan Energy Systems - The Other Utility, of Garden City, he adds that his company is not paying anything for its hot water. Solar panels on the roof are supplying what's needed.

He noted that two solar heating panels costing \$600 apiece can heat 100 percent of an average home (1,000 square feet) when the sun is shining. More than one-third of that cost can be returned through state and federal tax credits.

One of Reidel's solar hot water systems was purchased by Bruce and Linda Cinader of Canton Township in June. It provided 100 percent of their hot water heat until November. "Our gas bill was so low the gas company thought it was not getting the right reading," said Mrs. Cinader.

The system cost \$4,972. But with tax credits it set them back only \$2,171.

Mitchell thinks that some sort of basement area where solar energy could be stored by day and released at night is necessary to make solar space heating viable both day and night.

His greenhouse takes in the sun by day and stores it in the floor for later release. Glass in his windows, an advantage when the sun is shining but a disadvantage when it is not, needed some attention.

Mitchell pulled from memory a picture he had seen of the roof of a 17th century home in Italy. He constructed an insulating lid to cover the roof of his greenhouse when the sun is out of sight. It works automatically, activated by a sensor responsive to temperature.

AS ARE MOST solar enthusiasts, Mitchell is hot on the subject of building insulation, pointing out that heat from the sun goes farther if cold air isn't seeping in through cracks and thin walls.

"Pressure should be brought on the state Construction Code Commission in Lansing to double the R (resistance to heat) value of insulation required in new buildings," he said. "Now the code requires 3 1/2 inches of insulation in walls, an R value of 11. Only six inches is required in ceilings, a R value of 19. Both of these should be doubled for a minimum R value of 23 in walls and 40 in ceilings."

Mitchell is currently involved in the Wayne County Weatherization program funded by the U.S. Department of Energy. Under it, low-income people can have their homes weatherized at no cost to them.

Emotionally as well as professionally, wrapped up in the promise of the sun, Mitchell is troubled by the solar homes built in Northville and Troy by Detroit Edison. In his opinion they are built and designed to fail in order to make people feel solar is too costly a way to go.

The ideal way to go, he feels, is to pick a southern exposure and build passive solar heating aspects, such as a greenhouse, into the house from the start. Insulate thoroughly. Such steps could supply 60 percent of the heat needed, he thinks. The remainder could be gained from burning wood or using a standby natural gas furnace. He also favors using collector panels for heating water.

National Bank of Detroit, for example, is one of several major institutions in the metropolitan area which has not joined the network.

"Eventually we expect there will be other master switches (like MAC-link), and we'll all be talking to each other."

Advancement in technology, the acceptance by the public of computerization, and a new Michigan electronic transfers law paved the way for the major move to full-scale electronic banking.

The law made it possible for financial institutions to place automated teller machines off premises but required that institutions share their equipment.

EARLY IN 1979, Michigan National became a leader in off-premise automated teller operations. "We decided to put in at least 100 ATMs," most off premises, says Webb.

"We're getting ready for more expansion, but we don't know how great it's going to be yet."

"I expected that at least 50 percent of all consumer banking will be done on these machines (automated teller machines) in the '80s," continues Webb.

He doesn't feel there will be a general reduction in the number of branch banks, "but they'll be smaller and offering services they don't offer now — like financial management. Banks may sublet some of their space to other businesses."

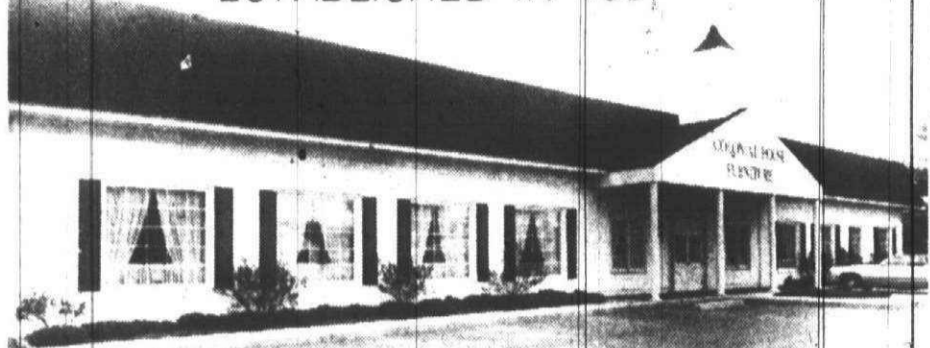
He predicts that one day retail stores will have machines where customers can pay their bills as they check out.

The next big step in electronic banking — perhaps its adult stage — will be home banking.

"I predict we're just five years away from that," concludes Webb. People will have small computers in their homes that they'll be using for many things "and they can just do it all from there."

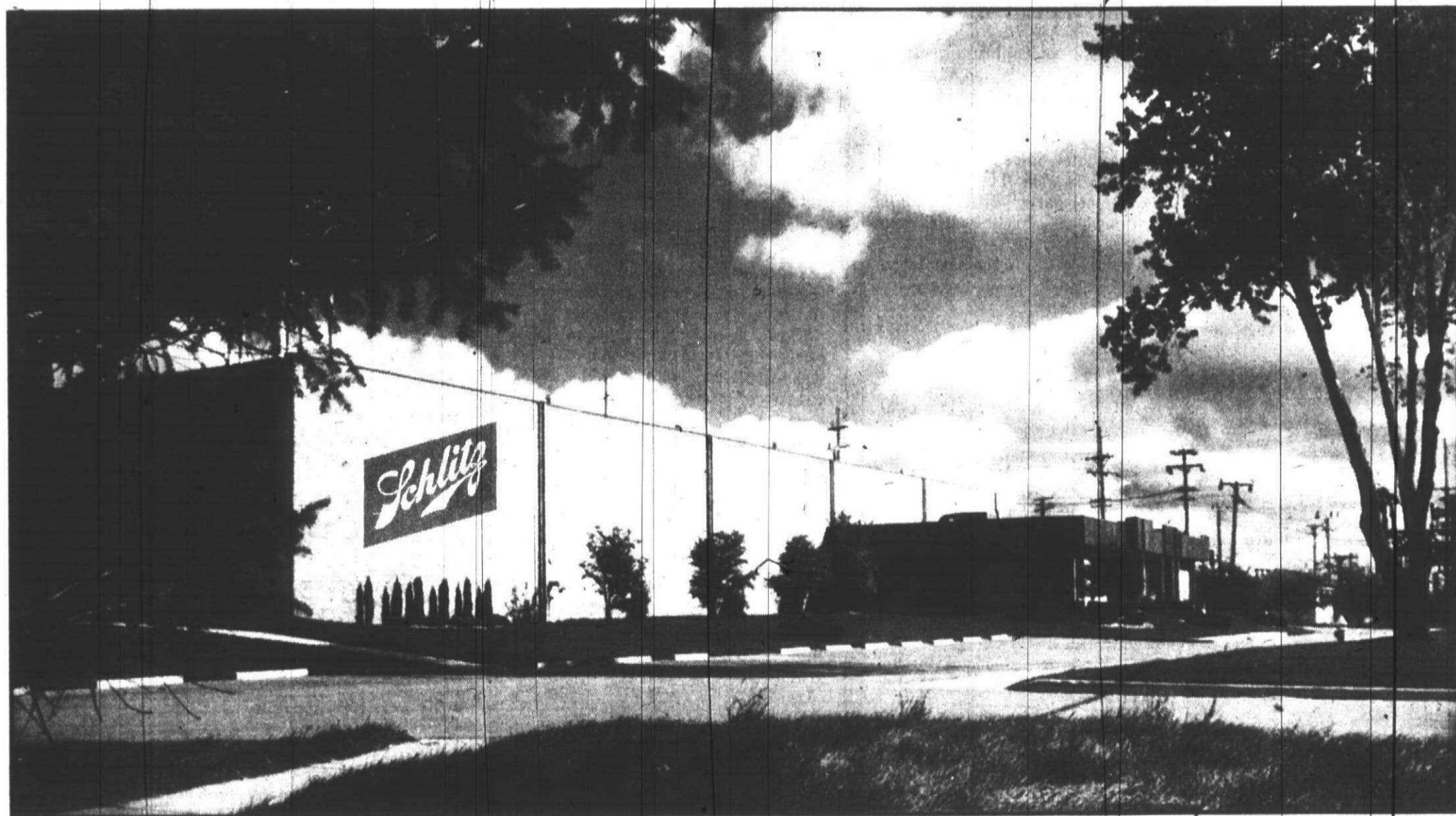

# Creative financing offers alternatives to high interest

There's a new trend for the '80s — called "creative home financing" — with which few will find fault.

Soaring interest rates and housing costs are two frustrating problems that are changing more than our lifestyles.

They have vaulted into the limelight new alternatives in home financing.

These creative financing methods, as tagged by the real estate industry, will allow people to buy or sell homes no matter how severe economic conditions are.

Talk with most real estate agents and they'll say the conventional 20-percent-down mortgage is a thing of the past.

And mortgage companies are continuing to devise new variations of financing as people find it more difficult to buy or sell a home in a period of high interest rates and skyrocketing home prices.

• **RENEGOTIABLE RATE:** This really is a long-term mortgage which is treated like a series of short-term loans with the interest rate being adjusted every three to five years. This loan, often referred to as a rollover mortgage, offers the lender flexibility and doesn't lock the buyer into a high interest rate for the entire term of the loan. The maximum interest rate change is one-half of 1 percent multiplied by the number of years between rate adjustments. In most cases, there is a maximum increase or decrease of 5 percent during the life of the loan.

• **VARIABLE RATE:** This is usually available from federal and some state-chartered savings and loan associations. During the 25- to 30-year mort-

gage, the interest rate can rise or fall depending on the interest rates at a particular time. The increase is limited to one-half of 1 percent per year with a maximum increase during the life of the mortgage set at 2½ percent. Both the renegotiable and variable-rate mortgages are considered gambles because you're betting on interest rates falling in the future. If rates fall, so does interest payment on your loan. But if interest rates increase, you'll reap higher monthly payments.

• **SHARED APPRECIATION:** Under this variation, the lender agrees to lower the prevailing interest rate by one-third or any other agreed percentage in exchange for the same percentage amount of appreciation when the house is sold. This method is not the best bet if you decide to keep a house for a long period. The buyer and seller, or lender and buyer, become partners in the appreciation of the home. So interest rates are less important to the buyer as the monthly mortgage payment is reduced according to the agreement. The plan allows buyers and sellers to negotiate reasonable payment schedules if it is a seller-financed deal. A shared appreciation guide is available for \$2 through T.A. Stevens, Guide M158, Box 39405, Ft. Lauderdale, Fla. 33339.

• **WRAP AROUND:** Under this alternative, the buyer agrees to assume the seller's first mortgage with a lower interest rate, and to piggyback it onto that of a new long-term mortgage at today's higher interest rates. What happens is the newer mortgage wraps around the older one and monthly payments are lower than if you financed the entire purchase price with a new mortgage.

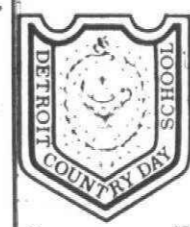
• **GRADUATED PAYMENT:** The graduated pay-

ment mortgage is insured by the Federal Housing Administration with loans made by commercial lending institutions. FHA interest rates usually are lower than existing conventional rates. This plan may fit your needs if your income is growing and you plan to occupy the house for less than 10 years. Interest rates are stable during the entire mortgage term with monthly payments being lower in the earlier years of the loan. Since part of the interest is deferred and added to the principal each year, the outstanding loan balance actually gets larger after the first few years. There are five plans in the FHA 245 loan program.

• **SECOND MORTGAGE:** This plan allows the seller to provide the buyer with a second mortgage (also called an owner carryback) so the seller could buy a larger home. One plan under this method is when the buyer assumes the seller's original loan and the seller lends the buyer the amount of difference between the buyer's downpayment and the equity the seller has in the home. The buyer is then responsible for two monthly payments — one payment to the seller and one to the original lending institution.

• **LAND CONTRACT:** This alternative is a contract between the buyer and seller, not a lending institution and buyer. Unlike the other financing methods, title to the property remains in the hands of the seller until the buyer makes his last payment on the land contract. Since the agreement is really a loan between buyer and seller, the buyer does not have to qualify for a lending institution loan. It also could involve a lower down payment along with a lower interest rate which allows the seller to market his home sooner than if he followed the conventional financing route.

Among YMCA activities offered in school buildings are pre-school fitness, evening aerobic fitness, men's open gym and volleyball, and Slim Living.

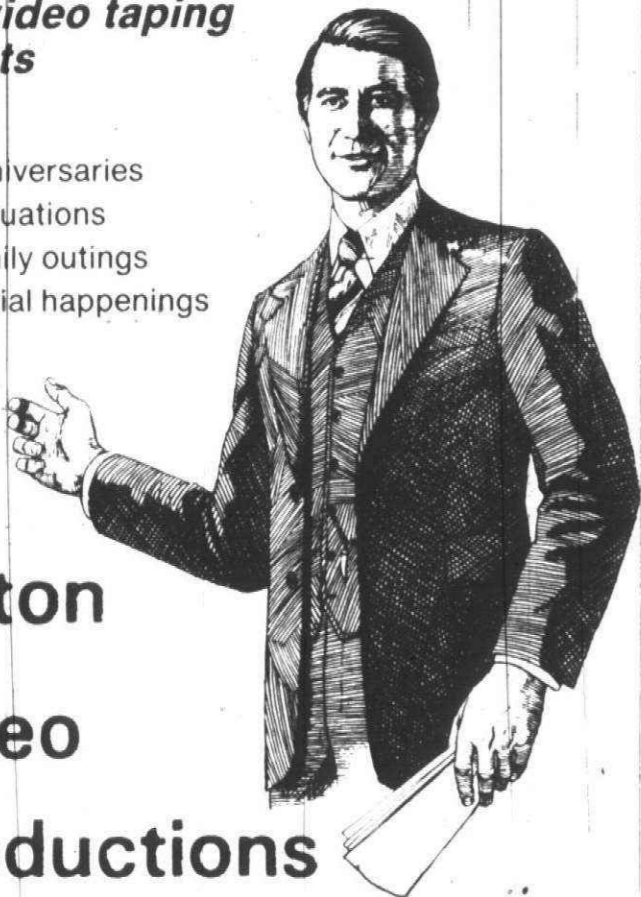

# EDCs aid business

In its two years of operation, the Wayne County Economic Development Corp. has apparently been working hard to keep and develop business in the communities it serves.

According to EDC Executive Director Robert FitzPatrick, progress has been made for the county EDC to become the "single source center for technical and financial assistance to businesses wishing to expand or relocate in Wayne County."

"One of the best indicators is the \$145 million in tax exempt industrial revenue bonds we've issued," FitzPatrick said. The bonds are securities issued to purchase land, to construct and equip commercial and industrial facilities for lease to companies.

Although it has projects underway costing as much as \$10 million, the county EDC formed the Metropolitan Growth and Development Corp. to assist small businesses in creating employment opportunities, with assistance from federal Small Business Administration (SBA) loans.

"Creditworthy small and minority businesses can borrow for construction, conversion or expansion," FitzPatrick said. He added the corporation, which is separate from the EDC, will receive funding through loans and grants, which will help establish a revolving loan fund for small business financial packages.

Commercial property owners in several Wayne County cities and townships may borrow funds for structural rehabilitation for up to \$100,000 at 3 percent interest, payable in a maximum of 20 years, FitzPatrick said.

Those loans are available under Section 312, a program the EDC involved itself in with the Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD), the EDC director said.

Thirty communities have met the criteria for loans under Section 312. These include Canton, Garden City, Wayne, Northville, Northville Township, Plymouth, and Plymouth Township.

Keeping business in Wayne County is foremost with the EDC, FitzPatrick said. A Business Retention Program is now beginning and will continue throughout next year with marketing and advertising campaigns to county businesses.

The program is an effort to not only retain business and tax revenues for the county, but also to increase jobs and taxes by making it attractive financially for businesses to expand, FitzPatrick said.

"This will be the cornerstone of our marketing strategy," he said of the Computer Land Information Bank, a program that will catalog all private and public industrial land sites and buildings throughout the county.

# Scanners add zip to pricing

But price, along with the description, appear in abbreviated form on a display panel on the scanner where customer and clerk can see them. That same information goes on the receipt that is taken home.

"There are major advantages in the system," said Kirschner, "because it does shorten the time it takes for checkout and the customer has an exact description of the purchases made."

"It also gives us a more detailed accounting of stock for inventory purposes."

Chris Beeseler of Krogers noted that "because the scanners work so efficiently, we've added baggers to take full advantage of the system and that definitely cuts time at the checkout."

THE UNIVERSAL Product Code had its beginnings in the early 1970s, and Beeseler noted that Kroger was the first major chain to run tests on it.

"We had early experience with its advantages and limitations," he said.

The advantages have not been exploited as completely as they might be because, both Kirschner and Beeseler noted, the systems are extremely expensive.

Some problems have also been noted in operation.

"But whenever we install a scanner," said Beeseler, "we run a complete scan of every item in the store. Then later we do a scan audit. So far we have had good success in keeping out errors. And if a customer ever does detect an error we are glad to offer the item free of charge."

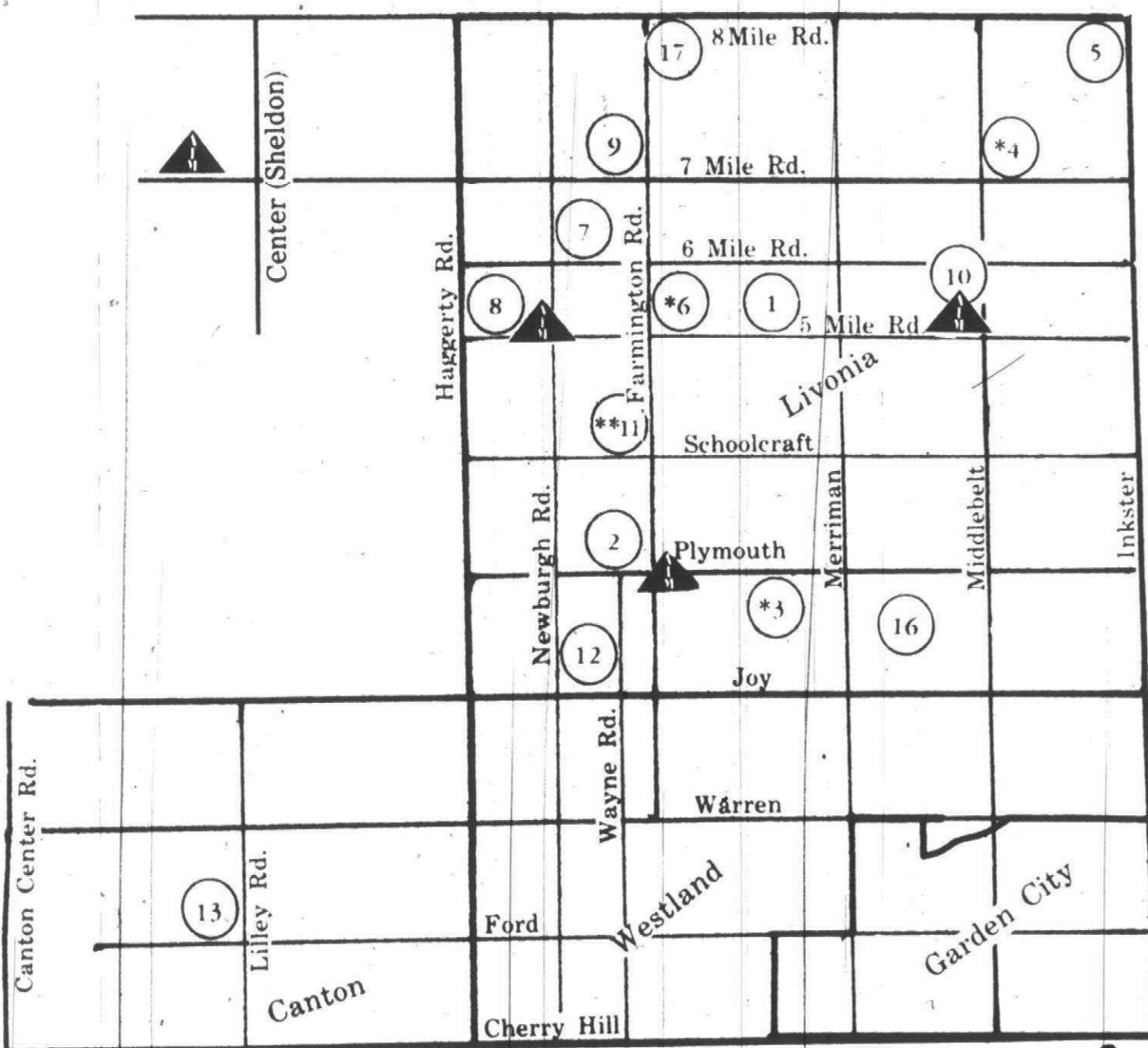
