

Forecast pulls brake on area population boom

Canton officials are not impressed with a prediction that the township's growth will slow to a trickle in the next 10 years.

U.S. Census figures show that Canton's population mushroomed from 11,206 in 1970 to 48,636 in 1980. That caused a strain on services, police and fire protection and gobbled up acreage which previously had been farmland.

But a study released last month by the Southeast Michigan Council of Governments (SEMCOG) projects a growth in Canton population of only 3,000 per-

sons over the next 10 years.

Other areas which will continue to show growth include Plymouth, Northville and Van Buren and Sumpter townships.

Despite the SEMCOG prediction, Supervisor James Poole said he plans to propose an ordinance which would map procedures to control Canton's growth.

"Projections are projections," added Township Clerk John Flodin. "The facts and problems of the day will affect you more than guesses."

SEMCOG is a regional planning agency which covers Wayne, Oakland, Macomb, St. Clair, Livingston, Wash-

tenaw and Monroe counties. Currently, 135 governmental units — including Canton — are members of the agency.

Every 2-3 years, SEMCOG updates its predictions. The information is used for long-range planning in such areas as land use, sewers and roads. In some cases, federal funding for projects is based on participation in a regional plan, explained SEMCOG director Michael Glusac.

"IT'S (the prediction) the best judgment of technical people and local officials — recognizing that nobody has a crystal ball," added Glusac.

"It's a better guide for local officials to make planning," he continued. "It's the only way to bring sense to urban sprawl. In the final analysis, it's the taxpayer who is going to pay for it."

The SEMCOG forecast predicts 1980-90 growth for communities such as Canton, Plymouth Township and Northville. Others may show small population increases, while some decline.

Glusac said the predictions often reflect a shift of population from one community to another within the region.

A sampling of the forecasts shows:

- Canton's projected population for 1990 will be 51,448, compared to 48,360 for 1980.

- Plymouth Township shows an estimated figure of 30,469 for 1990, compared to 23,001 for the earlier period.

- Northville Township is predicted to have a population of 19,658 in 10 years, versus 12,970 for 1980.

- Van Buren Township's projected population for 1990 is 33,829, compared to 18,918 for the previous period.

- Livonia's population is estimated to be 98,611 for 1990, compared to 104,660 in 1980.

Glusac believes most local governmental units tend to be overly optimistic when predicting their own future growth.

"YOU BUILD today for tomorrow's population," said Glusac. "It's then (that) they have to answer the hard question, 'Is it needed — is it justified?'"

"The fact of the matter is, the development of the community can affect another community," added Glusac.

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Foster home numbers evoke public outcry

One woman fears that a new state law could turn Canton into "a giant mental institution."

A Mayfair man has organized a March 23 meeting at Plymouth Canton High School to increase community awareness of the foster care home issue.

Supervisor James Poole has asked the Michigan Department of Social Services (DSS) to pull together its files and come up with some real answers on the number and types of group homes planned for Canton.

THE CONCERNS are sparked by a 1977 state law which mandates the placement of many mentally retarded and mentally ill citizens in residential neighborhoods.

At present, at least 11 homes for the retarded and the mentally ill are approved or pending in a number of Canton neighborhoods.

Spokespersons for the DSS and other state agencies insist that present institution residents will be transferred to communities across the state in order to meet the mandate of PA 28.

Despite assurances from the DSS, a gnawing concern still plagues many homeowners and officials over the number of group homes which eventually will locate in the township.

At the current time, only one group home application is pending before DSS for both the city of Plymouth and Plymouth Township. At a recent Township Board meeting, state workers estimated that six group homes have been approved for Livonia and one has been approved for Garden City among other communities.

Township officials fear that Canton is receiving more than its fair share of the homes.

Marge Murrell, an adult foster care licensing consultant for DSS, says many communities, such as Romulus, Inkster and Detroit, have a far higher number of group homes than Canton.

But Ms. Murrell and other state workers admit that more group homes are locating in Canton than many western Wayne County communities.

"There are lovely big homes out there that aren't selling," said Judith Shelden, director of community placement for the Northville Regional Psychiatric Hospital. "They're just sitting

there waiting for our investors to pick them off."

Laima Starwas, director of community placement for the Northville Residential Training Center (NRTC), said many home sellers in Canton actually have called her agency with proposals for home sales.

"BECAUSE OF THE public outcry, I

will not open any more homes in Canton," said Ms. Shelden in reference to applications already pending for homes for the mentally ill. "I have no desire to upset a community inordinately."

Her agency — the Northville Regional Psychiatric Hospital — is one of three state institutions which are placing homes in Canton. Spokespersons for the two others — the NRTC and the

Plymouth Center for Human Development — said no additional applications for Canton homes are planned at the current time.

"We're moving in the direction of going to some communities in our service area that don't have as many homes," said Ms. Starwas.

But Canton Supervisor Poole is unwilling to accept their words at face

value. "I feel confident that we're getting more," said Poole. "And that bothers me. What bothers me too is all the rumors and innuendos."

Rumor has it that plans are being formulated to locate at least 30 group homes in Canton.

Man organizes town meeting on foster homes

The president of the Mayfair Homeowners Association has organized a March 23 meeting on the foster care home issue.

"If nothing else, I want as many people as possible to attend," said Paul Black. "I want people to get informed."

The meeting is scheduled to begin at 7 p.m. Monday, March 23, at Plymouth Canton High School.

Black has formally invited homeowner association officials, a number of township officials, State Rep. Tom Brown, D-Westland, and representatives of a number of state agencies which deal with the foster care home issue.

Applications for foster care homes in Black's neighborhood prompted efforts to organize the meeting. One of those applications — for a home at 8503 Manington — was withdrawn this week after a state inspection showed a need for an additional exit, according to Marge Murrell, an adult foster care licensing consultant for the Michigan Department of Social Services. The home would have been used as a foster care facility for mentally ill adults.

Black believes that a number of group home applications for other Canton sites makes the meeting necessary.

CANTON SUPERVISOR James Poole already has promised to attend. He plans to bring along other township staff members, including attorney Jud Hemming.

Poole and other township officials have voiced concern about the number of group homes proposed for Canton. They fear that this community may be getting a higher share of the homes than surrounding areas.

Poole is considering a letter-writing campaign to Canton's state legislators to push for introduction of a bill that would limit the number of group homes that could be placed in any given community.

He called the group home issue "the township's number-one legal priority."

"But I've never committed funds for lawsuits that are lost causes," added Poole, who has talked to a number of attorneys on the group home issue. "They all say that you're wasting your time (to try to stop the homes)."

All the homes proposed or approved for Canton will house the mentally retarded or the mentally ill.

Neighborhood fears concerning both types of homes have surfaced. In recent weeks, however, homeowners have directed many of their concerns toward proposed homes for the mentally ill.

"I HAVE HEARD all the concerns," said Judith Shelden, director of community placement for the Northville Regional Psychiatric Hospital. "But none of these fears are based on fact."

'A monkey-napping'

Pet shop owner offers reward to get Bobo back

The thief who broke into Pets "R" Us on Ford Road early this week may be feeling like a monkey's uncle.

Canton police investigating the break-in at the store about 3:37 a.m. Sunday reported the only thing taken was owner Dan Daniels' pet squirrel monkey, Bobo.

Daniels said the monkey — imported from South America — might die if it doesn't receive proper care and food. "If they don't take care of him

(Bobo), he won't make it," said Daniels. "You have to know something about the monkey. Table scraps would kill the monkey. Chips or salty food (would be bad)."

Daniels has offered a \$100 reward for information leading to the return of Bobo.

"Whoever did it didn't want anything else," said Daniels on Tuesday. "People keep coming in and asking, 'Where is your monkey?'"

"It was more or less a drawing card," added Daniels. "He'd jump

around teasing the (other) animals."

POLICE Lt. Larry Stewart said police went to the store early Sunday morning, moments after a citizen phoned to report the sound of breaking glass nearby. The shop is in the New Towne Plaza shopping center, near Ford and Sheldon.

Investigation showed the burglar had used a chunk of rock to break a hole in the glass door.

The monkey's food and water dish were found outside the doorway, according to the police report. The cage

— also found outdoors — was at the rear of the store.

Bobo is valued at about \$500. Damage to the door is estimated at \$300.

According to Daniels, the squirrel monkey is about 1 foot long and weighs about three pounds.

Daniels usually fed Bobo small insects — such as crickets and meal worms — bananas, apples, nuts and seeds.

Anyone who has information about the monkey should call Daniels at 455-7480.

Schools hold last boundary hearing

The modified Plan III likely will be changed a bit more before Plymouth-Canton Community Schools comes up with a final boundary, calendar and grade alignment plan for the coming school year.

Monday night, school board members indicated they would seriously consider at least two, and possibly three, changes in boundaries involving elementary and middle school attendance areas.

The school board is holding its final public hearing tonight on modified Plan III beginning at 7:30 p.m. in the gym of the athletic and music facility

(Canton Phase III) which is located between Plymouth Salem and Plymouth Canton high schools at Joy and Canton Center roads.

The fifth and final public hearing on redistricting will be broadcast live by WSDP-FM (88.1), the student-operated radio station at the Plymouth Centennial Educational Park (CEP).

The board is expected to make a final decision on the redistricting plan at a special meeting for Monday, March 16, in the board of education building in Plymouth.

Board President Carol Davis says a decision

must be made soon on redistricting so the administration and board can make decisions on hiring staff, bus routes, class schedules and curriculum.

Residents wanting to know about the changes being considered from the modified Plan III, or about the changes made from the original Plan III, may call the community relations office of the school district at 453-0200.

Among the staffing decisions to be made yet is the hiring of a new principal at Lowell Middle School, which is expected to be made in two or three weeks.

District eyes bus options

Board filing deadline approaches

A decision was made Monday night by the Plymouth-Canton Board of Education to approve a contract costing about \$44,000 for a computer service firm to handle the bus routes for the coming school year.

The contract was approved with Ecosystems Inc. of Cleveland, which has been doing the bus routes for the school district since 1977.

The firm also is being used currently for introducing computer simulation plans for redistricting options for the coming school year.

Ray Hoedel, assistant superintendent for business, says Ecosystems' services are very much needed this year because of the many changes in school attendance boundaries, the addition of a fifth middle school in Lowell, partial grade realignment, and expansion of Extended School Year (ESY).

The information obtained from Ecosystems will

be stored into the computer operated by the Wayne County Intermediate School District, Hoedel added.

If there are fewer changes next year, he said, then the district might be able to take the information stored in the intermediate district's computers and devise a bus routing plan in-house without having to rely on Ecosystems.

Hoedel also suggested the administration might try a bus routing pilot program in '81-82 using the intermediate computers with the idea of doing the work in-house for school year '82-83.

Right now, said Hoedel, the county computers are unable to handle bus routing, but they do have the storage capacity to retain the bus routing program developed by Ecosystems.

In other action, the school board also approved a contract with Westinghouse to produce class schedules next year at the Centennial Educational Park (CEP).

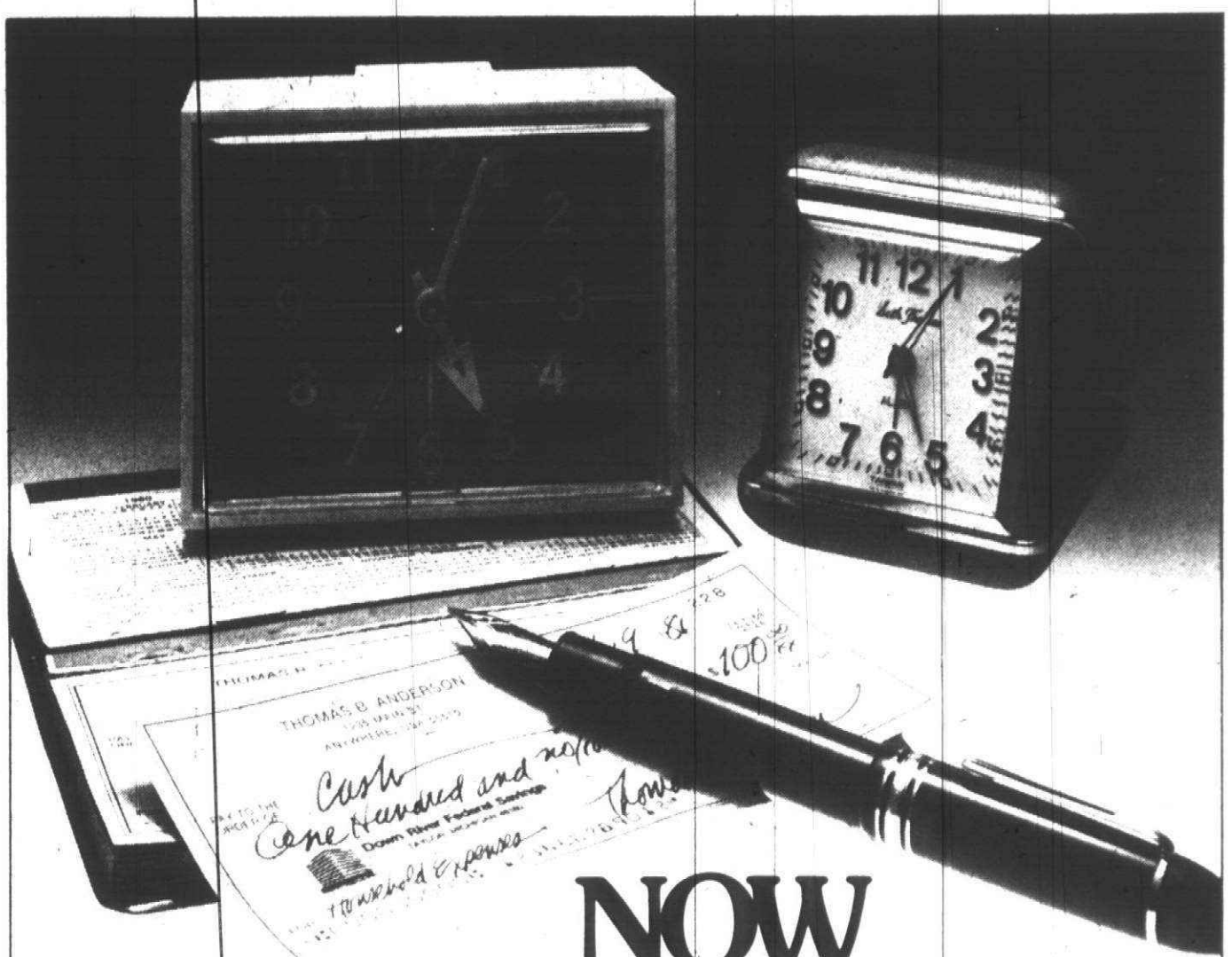
Mrs. Joseph, who died March 9, was a member of the Central Christian Church. She resided in Plym-

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In early morning hours, and then later in the day, commuters heading to downtown Detroit offices are found congregating in shopping centers, places of industry and even church parking lots.

There they wait, with coffee cups in hand, and sleep in their eyes, for the near one-hour bus ride to the city.

Not since the days of train travel have suburban commuters seen such hassle-free traveling.

The trains heading into and from the Plymouth-Canton community are gone now and have been replaced by the silver bus fleet of the Southeastern Michigan Transportation Authority (SEM-TA).

A survey of park & ride lots in the area found most commuters using the SEMTA system are satisfied with it as an economical means of getting around. Some, reminiscent of commuter trains, relish the comforts of "leaving the driving" to someone else.

In the Plymouth-Canton community, there are three park & ride lots where residents can leave their cars until their return at the end of the day.

Some 30 miles from Detroit, this is SEMTA's furthest western point.

According to SEMTA figures, park & ride lots, which have been used for four years, last year had a 70 percent increase in users.

ONE PLYMOUTH commuter who has been taking the SEMTA bus downtown from the Sheldon Road Ford Plant is Paul Toth, a federal government employee.

Toth, a former train traveler, esti-

mates a yearly cost savings of \$10,000 in taking a bus instead of his personal car. The 50-minute trip from that site to downtown Detroit is 60 miles round-trip.

"When I first started taking the bus three years ago they had three buses leaving this site — now it's up to 11," he said.

Aside from the gasoline savings, Toth notes a "break" on his car insurance as well as his policy now lists his car for "pleasure" use alone.

One of the benefits of commuting by bus, he says, is "you don't have to be concerned about road conditions. You just read a little, snooze and relax."

One of the most heavily used lots, averaging some 500 morning travelers, is in the Ford-Sheldon Road parking lot. It's in the center's southeast corner and is designated by a red and white SEM-TA sign.

The only other park & ride lot in Plymouth Township is found in the Church of Christ parking lot on Sheldon Road, a few blocks south of Ann Arbor Road. This lot is not readily visible as it's directly behind the church building on Sheldon. The newest lot opened by SEMTA in this area, it averages some 150 morning travelers.

IN CANTON TOWNSHIP, commuters heading east can pick up any of several buses in the parking lot of the Meijer's Thrifty Acres site on Ford Road near Canton Center Road.

For \$48 a month, one can purchase a SEMTA pass which allows use of any bus in the system, said SEMTA spokesperson Gerald Zahler. A one-way

fare from most locations in this area is \$1.60.

"It's like a steal, it's so cheap," added another SEMTA bus user, Andrew Telek, an assistant Wayne County prosecutor.

"I can now keep this another couple of years now," he adds pointing to a rusted-out older model car.

Taking a bus as opposed to using one's personal car also requires some planning in studying bus schedules and departure times.

But even this extra-planning does not turn some commuters off.

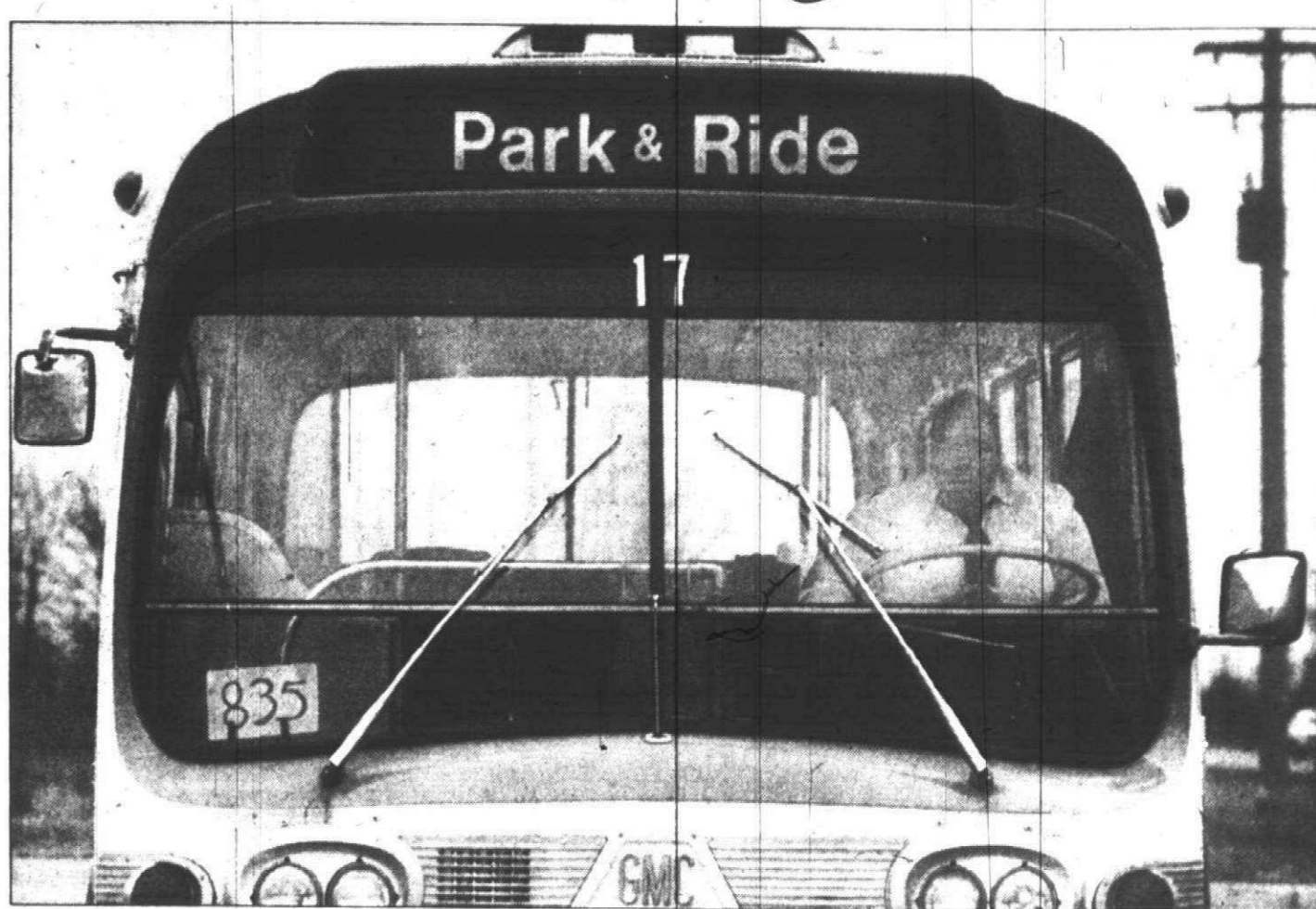
"It's no problem at all," said commuter Ed Schneider of Plymouth Township, a Blue Cross-Blue Shield employee. "I just work my schedule around the time the bus leaves."

As an added bonus for Canton residents, SEMTA cards also are honored by the Nankin Transit Commission, a small bus service operating in Canton, Westland, Wayne, Garden City and Inkster.

SEM-TA cardholders are eligible for daily dial-a-ride pick-up from their doorsteps by Nankin buses to park & ride lots operated by SEMTA. In Canton Township, this service is not heavily used, averaging some nine residents daily.

HERE'S A rundown of the number of stops made at each park & ride lot in the Plymouth-Canton community. More scheduling information is available by calling SEMTA at its suburban number, 1-800-462-5161.

• Ford-Sheldon: Eleven buses leave between 5:50 and 8:10 a.m. In the even-

ings, buses return from downtown Detroit between 5:10 and 6:54 p.m. The ride from the lot takes about 50 minutes and entails three stops before arriving in Detroit.

Church of Christ: Three buses leave every 25 minutes at 6:24, 6:51 and 7:19

a.m. Buses return between 5:42 and 6:50 p.m. The ride lasts about 55 minutes before reaching several stops in downtown Detroit. The buses from this lot make three stops along Plymouth Road and Telegraph before taking I-96 east.

• Meijer's: Six buses leave between 5:55 and 7:20 a.m. Seven buses return between 5:25 and 6:45 p.m. The trip to Detroit is estimated at 55 minutes long and involves three stops along Ford Road before picking up I-94 at the Wyoming Street exit.

Dittiliemania

Rock group tunes in to nostalgia

Nonsense and nostalgia rock to the solid beat of the '60s wherever the Dittilies go.

Right now, they're a going thing at Center Stage in Canton Township, where they've set a couple of attendance records since becoming the official house band for the arena-like music hall a year ago.

That setting is a far cry from the Livonia Bentley High School auditorium where it all began nine years ago. They were called the "Bo Diddlys" then — five seniors who did a mimicry of the Presley era as part of the school's concert choir's annual variety show.

They stole the show then, and they're still doing it — only now it's a full-time business with all the ups and downs that are part of the glitzy world of show business.

Only two of the original members of the group have hung in there — Steve "Buddy Love" King and Kim "Moon" Stewart. But while the other three bowed out right after high school, the present six-man group still has five Bentley graduates wailing away, with the sixth man — Dave "Doctor Z" Danielle a native of New Jersey.

CURRENTLY MIXING it up on drums is Bob "Bongo Bob" Cicotte, Jim "Captain J.J." Jones, guitar, and Kyle "Kool Kat" Olson, bass. Even the sound man, Bob Garcia, is a Bentley graduate. King and Stewart do the vocals.

All of them go back to "High School" just about once every weekend with their rendition of the stock favorite by the MC-5. Part of the fun is donning green-and-white tasseled mortarboards and the humorous references to former principal Al Zack, who was principal at Bentley at the time the group formed, but who is now at Franklin High School.

Along the way, the group dropped "Bo" and changed the d's to t's from their name when they found that occasionally people were mistaking them for the legendary black rhythm and blues singer.

Turning pro actually didn't happen until all five of the original group had graduated in 1972.

"IT WAS REALLY flukey," recalls King, who acts as the group's manager. "We had started to go our separate ways and we'd run into old classmates who never seemed to forget what we had done in that show, and they'd say, 'Hey, why don't you do it professionally?' After a year of working and fooling around, we were bored and thought we'd give it a whirl."

The '50s fad was big then, King said. They put together an act and began playing at junior and senior high school dances. Then it was clubs and lounges — including a long run during the Driftwood Lounge's raucous heyday as a rock and roll circus — before the Center Stage gig. They also make frequent appearances at the Second Chance in Ann Arbor.

They're also the only live band to play Oscar's, a Southfield discotheque.

THE GROUP likes the vastness of Center Stage, because it's a "concert situation," even though it's basically a bar. It fits the Dittilies' needs for space "to really wail and jump around in," and at the same time has helped Center Stage management keep going in a highly competitive field.

Center Stage was in a tight money bind until a new manager was named last June and he brought in the Dittilies. Now, the management is doing better financially with a mix of area talent and some name stars.

"The Center Stage operation is too small to pay for the really big stars like the ones that come to Pine Knob, but it's too big for most local bands. We fill the gap," King said.

Filling the gap means drawing upwards of 1,000 rock and roll fans every Thursday, Friday and Saturday to the cavernous Ford Road music hall that has a 1,400 capacity. Last November, the group set an all-time attendance record of 1,472. That was better than any big name act that CS management has booked in its two years of operation.

THEY ALMOST did again several weeks ago, when WJBK-TV's "PM Magazine" filmed the Dittilies in action during a Thursday Ladies Night show. A thousand screaming females set the tone for the Dittilies' zany antics that included making their stage entrance in the miniest of the minis — King's restored 1972 four-door Honda auto.

The TV cameras ground away as the group went through its routine of comedy skits and prop changes.

That show and an interview with King will be aired on TV-2 on March 29.

The group shifted from the '50s to the '60s music because, King said, "no was doing it, and I happen to think that was the era the greatest songs were written."

Consequently, the Dittilies do a lot of songs by the Beatles, Beach Boys, Ted Nugent, Bob Seger, The Who and the Rolling Stones. They change the material frequently and work hard on the comedy sketches.

"WE DO SOME blue — or slightly objectionable — material, but we never try to offend anyone," said King, who was extremely active in drama during his high school days.

"Music is a business, and you have to treat it as such," he said. King is the group's business agent and sees to it that the bills are paid. That includes paying off \$40,000 they have invested in sound equipment.

He admits he's "big on gimmicks" like T-shirts and buttons, and even passes out ballpoint pens with a Dittilie message on it. Fans are kept apprised of the latest Dittilies shenanigans by a special hotline that King updates every week.

Cable advisory group looks for program ideas

Canton's cable TV advisory committee is looking for some good ideas from civic groups.

Charles Miller, committee chairman, said four slots from the civic groups category must be filled.

The purpose of the group is to promote and coordinate programming on local access channels for a cable TV system which is being installed in Canton. The system is supposed to broadcast government news, public affairs programs, sports and others.

Prospective members may apply by attending the next regular meeting of the committee, at 7:30 p.m. March 17, in the library meeting room in Township Hall.

"OUR COMMITTEE is advisory," explained Miller. "Participation is strictly voluntary."

"I would expect some interest might be cyclical," he added. "They (may) want to be on the committee at a certain part of the year."

According to the committee bylaws, the 17-member advisory group is to be composed of nine residents (called community representatives) and one member each from eight civic groups.

All the community representatives' positions have been filled, said Miller. Some of the groups already represented are Schoolcraft College, League of Women Voters, Canton Library Board, Plymouth-Canton Schools and Chamber of Commerce.

Members who miss three consecutive regular monthly meetings will be dropped from the committee, according to the bylaws.

Miller said the advisory committee is interested in helping groups promote special events and activities.

"THAT'S WHAT we would just love to help them

out with," said Miller. "We want to be a common voice of the community — to provide a sounding board."

"We don't want people to think we're trying to control them," he added.

Another important function of the committee is to be a liaison between the groups and the cable TV company for scheduling on the local access channel. And a special committee will make sure that groups and individuals are trained on how to use the equipment.

Holding the franchise rights for Canton's cable TV system is Omnicom of Plymouth.

Peter Newell, president of Omnicom, said the advisory committee concept is fairly common in the cable TV industry.

"(These people) work and live in the community," explained Newell. "They understand what its needs and problems are."

"We aren't trying to compete against Channel 4 and Channel 7," added Newell. "But we can do things in this area that nobody has been able to see on TV before."

ACCORDING TO Newell, only about 12 homes in Canton already have been wired for the cable TV system.

Construction of underground wiring in the township — halted by winter weather — is expected to resume after the spring thaw, said Newell.

As the wiring moves forward, more homes will be added. Completion is targeted for the end of this year.

Canton awarded the franchise bid to Omnicom in December 1979.

Board members felt Omnicom could offer better services to the entire Plymouth-Canton area.

Hundreds of people packed the Livonia City Hall auditorium last Saturday to vent their frustrations and question U.S. Sen. Carl Levin about a host of issues ranging from rising taxes and energy costs to federal budget cuts and state unemployment.

Residents, local and state officials from throughout western Wayne County, and representatives of several special interest groups and organizations were on hand for the 90-minute question-and-answer session hosted by the Michigan Democrat. Among those represented were We The People Act, an organization which believes the federal tax on wages is unconstitutional; Equal Rights for Fathers; Conservative Caucus; American Council for the Blind

and several white-supremacist groups. A majority of those attending the meeting were senior citizens and disabled persons concerned that proposed federal budget cuts would spell the end of Dial-a-ride, a subsidized transportation program.

But they were relieved to hear from Levin that the program would be continued.

In a meeting with Livonia Mayor Edward McNamara earlier in the day, Levin learned of the Michigan Court of Appeals ruling last week that special driver's license and title transfer fees charged motorists in Wayne, Oakland and Macomb counties are legal. McNamara is a member of the Southeastern Michigan Transportation Authority. The license fees help fund Dial-a-ride programs.

Reagan's proposed budget cuts, taxes and defense spending dominated most of the discussion.

LEVIN TOLD the audience he supports spending cuts but not "in the same mix as the administration."

"The President has proposed cuts that are useful but others are terribly disproportionate. Michigan's unemployment rate is the highest in the nation and he (Reagan) has asked for cuts in four major unemployment programs. At the same time he leaves the tobacco farmers' subsidy untouched. And he's asking for only an 11 percent cut in water projects that benefit the southwest."

"I can't in good conscience say these cuts are equitable for people in Michigan. I want everyone to tighten their

belts — fairly," Levin said. Levin said although he endorses tax cuts, he doesn't support Reagan's program because it is "unfairly skewed" to give high-income persons a disproportionate tax break.

AFTER ACCEPTING hundreds of letters from readers who wrote to this newspaper in support of Observer & Eccentric columnist Steve Barnaby's oil boycott, Levin told audience members he opposes decontrol of natural gas and oil.

He said oil prices have been artificially created and have resulted in "trillions of dollars in windfall profits" for oil companies.

On the auto industry, Levin said he favors temporary measures to curb imports.

ple of years, as inflation, high interest rates and a poor economy have taken their toll.

For example, there were only 50 housing starts in Canton during 1980, compared to 1,577 in 1978.

So far this year, Canton's building department has received only one request for a permit to build a single-family home.

Other factors which will could affect Canton's growth are several unresolved issues, including the economy, the resolution of the farmland preservation is-

sue and availability of sewer and water lines.

MEANWHILE, several Canton officials point out that the projection is just that — a projection.

"The economy can have a tremendous impact," said Flodin. "I think it (the study) will impact on some. Farmland preservation — it isn't necessarily the preservation of open space, but the preservation of food."

Township Planner James Kosteva said he hasn't had a chance to read the report. But he added that the prediction doesn't erase the need for long-range

planning. "Their prediction doesn't inherently reduce the need for Canton to plan for the future in a variety of land uses," said Kosteva.

Supervisor James Poole termed the prediction "presumptuous."

"They don't know if there is going to be an economic recovery or not," said Poole.

"The economists say it will take a

long time for the economy to turn around," said Trustee Carol Bodenmiller, the township's delegate to SEMCOG who also serves on the farmland preservation committee.

Mrs. Bodenmiller said the slowdown in Canton's growth could take pressure off the farmland preservation issue, "which would be good."

"If we could get industry going, we could bring more jobs," she added.

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Resident is amongst our newest citizens

On her first day as an American citizen, Carrie Maier found it easier to tell what she didn't like about Colombia than what she liked about the United States.

Miss Maier, 9, of Farmington Hills, took the oath Monday afternoon in the Federal Building in downtown Detroit along with 48 other former foreigners.

A TV news crew and reporters and photographers from two newspapers were there to record the event and ask Carrie what she liked about her new nationality.

"They can't tell me to go back to Colombia," Miss Maier said. "I want to be a United States citizen. I don't want to be a Colombian citizen. I don't like it there. They were mean to me. Every day they made me clean the room, wash dishes and cook. I had to take care of the whole house."

"You see I was adopted twice and I'm glad I got the mom and dad I got now."

Her parents, Alan and Maureen Maier, are pretty pleased with the arrangement too. The Maiers confirm Carrie's tale of a history of hardship in South America.

Carrie lived in an orphanage from the age of 1 until she was adopted by a Colombian family when she was 5. But it was back to the orphanage when a social worker found the family was using Carrie to do domestic work both at home and at their store.

After completing an extensive screening process, the Maiers flew to Bogota in October 1979 to accompany their daughter home for good.

THAT'S WHY the concept of "home" is so important to Carrie. Today, less than two years later, Carrie speaks English effortlessly and is even having trouble communicating in Spanish with a classmate, Gabriel Borda, who hails from Argentina.

All 28 of Carrie's classmates were on hand Monday for the swearing-in ceremony in the courtroom of U.S. District Judge Patricia Boyle. The students waved tiny flags, furnished by the Daughters of the American Revolution Chapter and 17 of the students even got to sit in the jury box during the proceedings.

The verdict from Jennie Fitzgerald, a classmate of Carrie's at Larkshire Elementary, was that the experience

was worthwhile. Before the citizenship ceremony, Jennie said Carrie was just another kid in class. Now she's something special.

"I learned that some things are important to know instead of just thinking about yourself," Miss Fitzgerald said. "Like how Carrie became an American citizen."

Sharing her big day with 28 classmates was the nicest part about becoming a citizen, Carrie said. Of course being on TV didn't hurt either.

Also in the contingent was Carrie's brother, Ted, 14, and Victoria, 13, Car-

rie's third-grade teacher, Ariene Schieber, the school principal and two bilingual teachers from the Farmington School District.

WITH ALL the spectators there to see Carrie, there almost wasn't room for the 48 other new citizens.

The breakdown, by country, of the other 48 immigrants was eight from Yemen, six from India, four from Poland, four from Iraq, three from Great Britain, three from Korea, two from Jordan, two from Lebanon, two from Jamaica, and two from Germany and

one each from Colombia, Brazil, Canada, Czechoslovakia, Hong Kong, Japan, Palestine, the Netherlands, Romania and Syria.

Eight of the 49 new citizens were children.

Richie LaBret, 6, who was born in Seoul, Korea, had a tough time repeating words like "sovereignty" in the oath. Richie is the adopted son of Gary and Carol LaBret of Plymouth. Mr. LaBret works as a Wayne County Prosecutor and since adopting Richie the couple had two other children.

Because he knew Judge Boyle, the proud father was able to pose his son behind the judge's bench for pictures. The judge gladly complied, but Richie was a little bewildered about the whole business.

Richie was tight-lipped about what he would do now that he's an American citizen. But, with his mother's prodding, let on that he wanted to be a policeman and "get robbers."

The judge departed from the official text to tell the new citizens that this country welcomes them by "celebrating your diversity and our oneness."

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Group home numbers spark controversy

According to Poole, the flood of calls which have been pouring into Township Hall has kept employees busy for at least eight hours each day. "Everyone who lives in Canton has called," said Clerk John Flodin. Township officials say they lack information to give to residents.

POOLE HAS ASKED DSS, which has responsibility for screening applications and licensing homes, to submit detailed information on the types and numbers of homes planned for Canton. "It's totally disorganized," Poole said of the state's record-keeping on

group homes. "I don't think anyone is trying to cover up. Everyone has been extremely helpful in their own limited responsibilities."

Potential group homes are identified by either a state institution or private investor. The home is then purchased and then leased to the state. The institution contracts with a private corporation for day-to-day operations in the home.

DSS screens the application and gives final licensing approval.

Poole points to a bureaucratic record-keeping system that makes getting information on group homes a time-consuming task. Consider the fol-

lowing:

- The township clerk's office receives notice of a group home application shortly after it has been submitted. But Flodin said the notice does not include the home's type — mentally retarded, mentally ill, etc. The township usually receives notice of an application withdrawal after a time lag of about four weeks. Flodin has received no notification of application approvals.

- At DSS, the most recent computer printout list of approved homes is dated January. A variety of licensing consultants, who screen proposed Canton homes, know individually about

their own pending cases.

Two divisions within DSS license homes for adults and mentally retarded children.

- The three institutions which place residents in Canton know individually about their own proposed homes.

TO PIECE TOGETHER a list of approved and pending homes in Canton, the Observer contacted the township, DSS and all three institutions. That list includes:

- An approved and functioning home for the mentally retarded at 2337 Roundtable. Sponsoring institution is NRTC.

- An approved home for the mentally retarded at 1675 Haggerty. Sponsoring institution is NRTC.

- An approved home for the mentally retarded at 41600 Warren. Sponsoring institution is NRTC.

- A functioning home for mentally retarded children on Maben. Sponsoring institution is Plymouth Center for Human Development.

According to Ms. Sheldon, mentally ill clients who are placed in community homes have no criminal records or no history of violence.

"The people we're placing are no longer actively mentally ill," she said. "They need supervision and re-training in survival skills, such as shopping. They are real human beings."

According to experts in the field, residents of homes for the retarded and mentally ill are carefully screened pri-

or to placement in residential communities.

Ms. Murrell said DSS approves group home applications only for one specific use. Approval of a home for the mentally retarded, for example, precludes use of the home for the mentally ill.

She also assures residents that the DSS program is not connected in any way with a program of the Michigan Department of Corrections for neighborhood half-way houses for parolees.

None of those type homes have been proposed for Canton.

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The President's fast cuts won't halt inflation—Shapiro

President Reagan's proposed tax cuts "are too large and come too soon" to give the United States a credible anti-inflation policy, according to Harold Shapiro's economic forecast.

Shapiro, one of the nation's best known economic forecasters and since 1980 president of the University of Michigan, told a Schoolcraft College audience "Reagan may not have gone far enough," however, in making spending cuts.

Shapiro saw the three main components of Reagan's policy as spending cuts, tax cuts and defense boosts and called each component acceptable. All are due for implementation Oct. 1.

"But if you don't time them somewhat differently," he warned, "they will not achieve the desired results — reviving the economy in the most beneficial way."

Space out tax cuts

THE 10th president of the University of Michigan, Shapiro, 45, has been on a fast track since he joined the economics department faculty in 1964.

He became department chairman in 1976, dean of the liberal arts school in 1978 and president last year. Meanwhile, his work in economic forecasting has brought him national attention.

He spoke without fee to an audience of 200 in Schoolcraft's cultural and public affairs series.

"Inflation is our most important problem, in the sense that we're not going to solve unemployment until we solve the inflation problem," he said.

"Continuing inflation comes from

only one source... federal government deficits. OPEC (oil price increases) cannot cause continuing inflation. It can cause a once-and-for-all inflation."

Shapiro said he would have exempted no area of federal spending in looking for ways to cut expenses, even social security.

BUT BEFORE instituting three personal income tax cuts of 10 percent a year beginning with fiscal 1982 on Oct. 1, he would prefer to "see if Congress has the will to control the budget."

"Inflation is an economic symptom of something else. Continuing inflation is a political problem. Congress hasn't

had the will to increase taxes and decide which of the conflicting (spending) interests will be denied."

Assuring Congress has the courage to hold down the budget deficits should take only 12-15 months, Shapiro said. He cited eastern European economies which, after World War I, suffered from inflations of 12 percent a month compared to the United States' 12 percent a year.

"I've studied those economies. Those inflations came to a stop within a year when it became apparent someone was making (fighting) inflation a priority."

"I think we can get it down (to 5 or 6 percent) only if we can get people to believe it's a priority... to wind down people's expectations. It's critically important that we adopt an anti-inflation program."

He would start tax cuts in the business sector because American savings and investment have been so low.

Without addressing the need for defense increases, Shapiro urged a slower approach to boosting that share of the budget. "Even if one is a hawk on defense, there are other things besides hardware you need — a strong economy and social solidarity."

MICHIGAN'S economic future is hard to forecast in the next 10 years, he said.

"The auto industry will revive. The

auto companies will not move away. But the auto industry won't provide increased employment in this state."

Growth will come from small- to medium-sized companies which are labor intensive and employ high technology.

Despite much talk about diversifying Michigan's economy since 1953, "nothing has been galvanized."

In answer to a question, Shapiro said Reagan's move to deregulate natural gas will help Michigan, which must import most of its energy. Deregulation will assure Michigan ample supplies and follows the principle that "he who has the money gets the energy."

On the University of Michigan's own future, Shapiro predicted a shrinkage of enrollment on the Ann Arbor campus from the current 35,000 to perhaps 30,000, adding, "That's not all bad... Programs where we don't do well, we'll just get out. Inside every crisis there's an opportunity."

While the shrinkage in the number of 18-22-year-olds during the 1980s will hurt colleges, Shapiro said the decade ahead will also see a great growth in the 25-40 prime working age group. He called that age group, along with "the capacity of the American economy to adapt to change," two of the nation's most important strengths in the decade ahead.

Headlee says quitting fine for lawmakers

Insurance executive Richard Headlee, in a talk to the area chambers of commerce in Plymouth, says it might be best if State Reps. Bobby Crim and William Ryan made good on their threats to quit their legislative jobs.

While speaking at the Plymouth Hilton Inn, Headlee told the gathering that it would be best if House Speaker Crimm, D-Davison, and Ryan, D-Detroit, "go ahead and quit."

Headlee is chairman of the board of Alexander Hamilton Insurance Corp. in Farmington Hills and author of the tax limitation amendment now part of the Michigan Constitution.

"In the same week Reps. Crim and Ryan have threatened to quit unless the State Chamber of Commerce stops urging them to cut taxes and control state spending," Headlee told a regional meeting of chambers of commerce in Plymouth last Friday. "The state chamber has been urging state government to get off the back of business so we can create jobs."

For 14 years, former Speaker Ryan has been leading the UAW and AFL-

CIO charge in Lansing toward state bankruptcy, claimed Headlee, and for 10 years Crim has been trying to change Michigan into a protectorate for the Michigan Education Association (teachers union) and other free-spending special interest groups prospering at the public trough.

"Also during the same period, taxes in Michigan from all sources have increased at record levels to support the outlandish growth of state government. Today there are more than 159,000 people drawing salaries and fringe benefits from state taxpayers."

"And today Michigan's business climate ranks dead last in comparison to every other state in the continental U.S."

THE ANTI-BUSINESS attitude and free spending practices of certain leaders of the Michigan Legislature are two of the main reasons why Michigan has the highest unemployment rate in the U.S. today, Headlee said.

"What kind of quality of life can we have when we are driving people out of the state by the thousands?"

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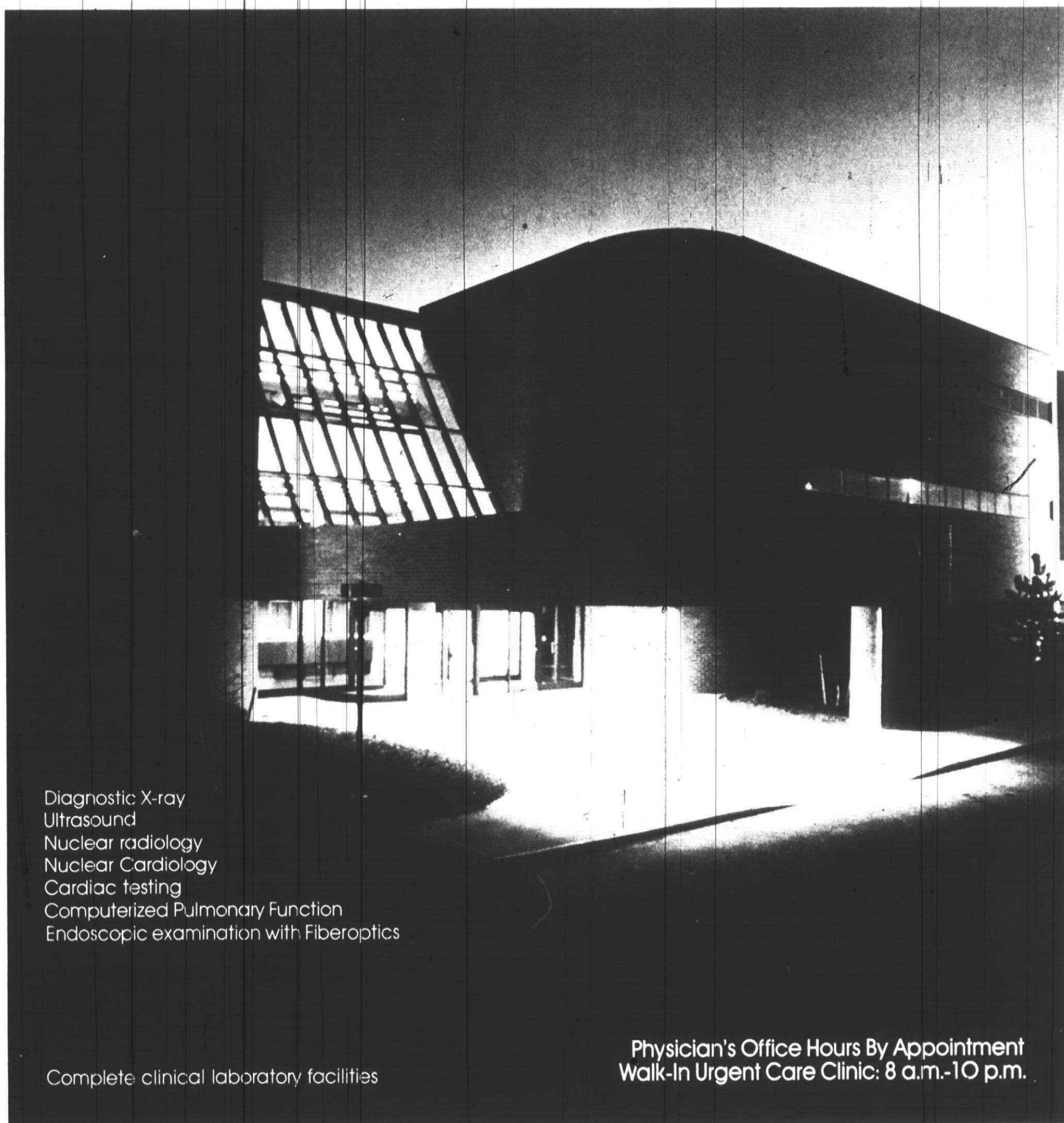
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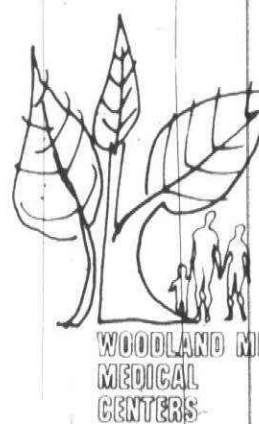
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Little progress on county charter

The Wayne County Charter Commission, elected in November to fashion a new county charter by June 15, has a long way to go if its public meeting held Tuesday is any indication.

Although the 27 charter commissioners have been meeting since Nov. 28, they have yet to make a decision as to the kind of county government that will be called for under a new charter.

The most-debated question Tuesday was whether the commissioners would open their public meetings with 1) a prayer, 2) the Pledge of Allegiance or 3) 30 seconds of silence.

THE ISSUE, postponed from previous meetings, sparked the most spirited debate of the day.

During 30 minutes of discussion about the wisdom of each of the alternatives and the parliamentary procedure that should have, or should not have, been followed, the commission voted to postpone consideration of the

alternatives indefinitely. The meetings will start with prayer, pledge or period of silence.

Tracy Salisbury, a commissioner from downriver communities, invoked four separate passages from the Bible in an effort to persuade fellow commissioners that the meetings should start with an invocation.

Ramon Tefelski Jr., who represents several western Wayne County communities, spoke on behalf of the Pledge of Allegiance, which, he said, includes the statement "one nation under God."

Commissioner Michael Einheuser of Detroit objected to Salisbury's statement that the charter commissioners should reflect the nation's Christian heritage. Einheuser said this did not take into account the religious beliefs of Jews and other non-Christians.

Several rulings by Chairman George Ward, a Detroit attorney, and the commission's parliamentarian failed to convince the entire commission that the matter could be decided by voice vote.

IN OTHER MATTERS the commission heard:

Wayne County Prosecutor William Cahalan speak in favor of an elected executive to head Wayne County.

Self-styled gadfly Bradford White criticize the commissioners for setting up a committee structure which includes eight subcommittees. White claimed that the charter commission has 51 sub-committee posts, 10 more than the number of sub-committee posts created by the "much criticized" county board of commissioners.

Charter Commissioner William Copeland — a former political power broker as a state legislator and now a commissioner from Wyandotte — urged out-county charter commissioners to get together to work for a big suburban vote for an elected county executive in the Nov. 4 election. Commissioners estimate this will be the date voters will be asked to approve a new county charter.

Copeland claimed that a Detroit faction would be utilizing the November mayoral election of Coleman Young to

influence voters to approve an appointed county manager over an elected executive.

Cahalan said he was convinced that an elected executive is absolutely necessary to improve Wayne County government. He said that unless the public approves such an executive, the fragmented Wayne County government will not be improved to the extent that conditions demand.

THE COMMISSIONERS have been holding two full meetings and eight subcommittee meetings every week since January.

Commissioners said most of the meetings have been spent looking at the way county government now operates.

They aren't expected to start making decisions on the new charter until some time in April.

Several said they were satisfied with the progress the commission has been making.

The series will end on June 4 with a reading and lecture entitled "Some Thoughts from Life" by Jim Burnstein, a freelance writer for newspapers and television shows.

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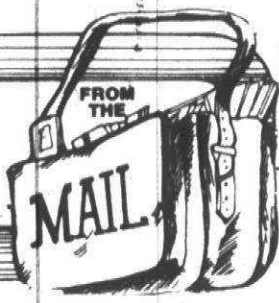

Let's rescind the reprimand

Editor:

An article concerning the reprimands issued to Bob Smith, principal of West Middle School, was given front-page coverage by your newspaper. A short statement correcting your original article was buried in your obituary section. A letter from Smith with additional corrections was placed on a back page.

I strongly object to the minimal coverage given to the other side of the story. I was present, as were many other residents, at both meetings where Smith made the comments that Dr. John Telford considered not only objectionable but reprimandable.

Bob Smith spoke forcefully and straight-forwardly about the advantages that he believed inherent to the West Plan. He also stated clearly his disagreement with the board/central administration grade re-alignment plan. At no time did I hear him make a comment that I would consider offensive in any way.

Because only Smith's reprimand has been discussed publicly, it is impossible to know what reprimands were issued to the other administrators present at those meetings. But I do wish to state clearly that if by the district's standards, Mr. Smith deserved reprimanding, then several other participants were equally deserving.

My personal opinion is that no reprimands should have been issued. How can this community expect to have free and open discussion or debate when employees who hold minority views have to watch and measure every comment in order to avoid "nitpicking" reprimands?

I urge the school board to take immediate action to rescind the reprimands given Smith by Dr. Telford in order to reassure the community that staff input of the freest sort is welcomed and encouraged.

I urge the Observer newspaper, in the interest of fair play and objective reporting, to continue to follow this story and to give Bob Smith an equal chance to vindicate himself and clear his record with the public by placing additional information and articles on the front page of your paper.

Is the board representative?

Editor: We have arrived at a point that is both unsettling and downright dangerous. To illustrate, I'll use two points:

1. Dr. John Telford is quoted in reference to West Principal Bob Smith, his position (the P/C schools) is as a line officer. He provides input at the proper time, but the supervisor and the board make policy. It's a philosophical argument. He perceives himself as a policy maker, when he is a policy implementer.

2. At the Feb. 26 PCSC meeting, Tom Yack made an admittedly biased presentation on the negative effects of split sessions at the CEP. His rationale for not studying split sessions is that there are too many unknowns.

Looking at point one, certain words come to mind:

a. Democracy - From the Greek words "people plus to be strong to rule." Government by the people; Government in which the supreme power is retained by the people and exercised by representation as in a republic.

b. Repress - to check; curb, press or crush back down or out; quell, suppress; subdue.

Is the board of education representative when they refuse consideration of new ideas? The board of education is the ultimate policy maker, and I believe that if we get down to brass tacks, Mr. Smith is a policy implementer — right along with Dr. Telford, Dr. Homes, Shirley Spaniel and Dr. John Hoben who are hired by the board of education. Are we to believe that as concerned parents, teachers and building administrators we are denied the right to express our concerns openly and forthrightly? And who decides what time is proper and what remarks are appropriate?

Regarding point two, Mr. Yack has displayed the attitude which pervades most of the board — put on the blinders and shove ESY down the throats of a community that may no longer be able to afford it, and by all means, don't study any alternatives.

Dr. Hoben has suggested forming a 12x12x12 committee, i.e.: 12 committees studying 12 district problems for

12 weeks. I ask where was this when we needed it last year? The board has had a year to study ESY vs. split sessions vs. extended day. There may be other possibilities to be explored, who knows?

We are not the first district to be faced with overcrowding, and I doubt that ESY has been found to be the only or the best solution. Several districts have chosen split sessions as an alternative to overcrowding — if there are unknowns, let's find out what their answers are.

So board of education, where are your facts, figures and comparative studies? I'm getting a sickening feeling that the changes will be made, two more schools on ESY, a total of \$800,000 (or more) per year in operating expense alone for eight ESY schools, questionable curriculum changes, budget cuts and after a disastrous, disrupted, topsy-turvy '81-82. School year the beneficent board will offer the citizens the chance of a lifetime — nine bond issues. And we'll bite like starved dogs.

It is becoming more evident to me that there are people in positions of power who are so impressed with the judgment of a few, that they willingly relinquish their own power. At the same time, there are those who are so impressed with their own self-appointed power that they intimidate or deny the rights of others.

Have we gotten to the point where, when told to jump, we ask only "How High?" or do we have the courage to say, "No — you jump, in the lake!"

Yes, some behavior may seem a little different, immature or bizarre at first, but give these people a chance to learn, develop and grow away from the confines of an institution.

I have seen for myself how the foster facility becomes in fact a "home" in the truest sense — the residents "brothers and sisters in spirit."

Please give the Beech Court house the same chance to meet challenges as Plymouth Opportunity House. We will be a "richer" community because of it.

Where's the heroism in Flint tax rebellion?

The tax rebels in Flint are making national news for their supposedly heroic stand in refusing to pay federal income taxes.

Ironically, many of the tax rebels are auto workers. One wonders where they were when Congress was approving billions of dollars in Trade Readjustment Act money for their co-workers who were laid off in the last two years.

Their anti-tax thinking suits the conservatives in D.C. just fine. They want to cut the budget, and they want state and local governments to start paying what the feds have paid for previously.

Fiscal conservatives argue that we pay too high a price to have a federal bureaucracy siphon money from income tax to send back to the states in revenue sharing.

It's hard to argue with that kind of logic but — not impossible.

THE RESULT of their thinking would emphasize regressive taxation.

Let's take it down to the local level.

Canton's budget for 1981 includes \$306,000 in federal shared revenue and \$195,000 in other federal aid. State shared revenue includes \$1.3 million from sales tax, \$310,000 from the state income tax and \$20,000 from the single business tax. That adds up to \$2 million.

Locally, the township expects to collect \$1.04 million in property taxes and \$201,000 from a variety of license and permit fees.

The bulk of taxes paid by township residents and businesses go to the schools.

In 1980-81, the Plymouth-Canton Community Schools expect to pull in \$30.6 million in local tax revenues. Canton pays a higher percentage of taxes to the Plymouth-Canton Schools than any of the districts' four other municipalities.

The school district expects \$6.1 million in state aid this year and \$400,000 in federal assistance.

Canton residents, who are already screaming

about high property taxes, now pay more in local taxes to support the township and schools than they receive from the state and federal government.

INCOME TAX FOES argue that cutting federal and state aid to local units of government would allow more direct taxation at the local level, where you can see what you get.

Unfortunately, it doesn't work that way for a very simple reason.

Police officers, firefighters, teachers and clerical employees expect to be paid fairly equal wages. That is, most police officers don't expect to be paid substantially less if they work in Canton than if they work in Bloomfield Hills.

That's a fairly natural assumption, as the cost of living does not vary markedly from Canton to Bloomfield Hills.

The theory of a graduated income tax is that everyone pays — and at an increasingly higher rate as

income rises. Then the federal administration divides the money. The federal revenue sharing is based on per-capita income. The more income per person, the less money back from the feds.

GETTING BACK to our tax rebels in Flint: With the highest level of unemployment in the state, how would Flint residents pay for police, firefighters, teachers and the other necessary services of a community without some help from the state and federal government?

Ironically, the tax rebels are helping the Reagan Administration sell an economic program that will put more of the burden of community services on the individual communities with regressive and painful property taxes.

Unlike those tax rebels of the Boston Tea Party fame, the Flint rebels are inciting a rebellion that only will result in more of a tax burden on those who can least afford to pay.

If committees could cure our economy

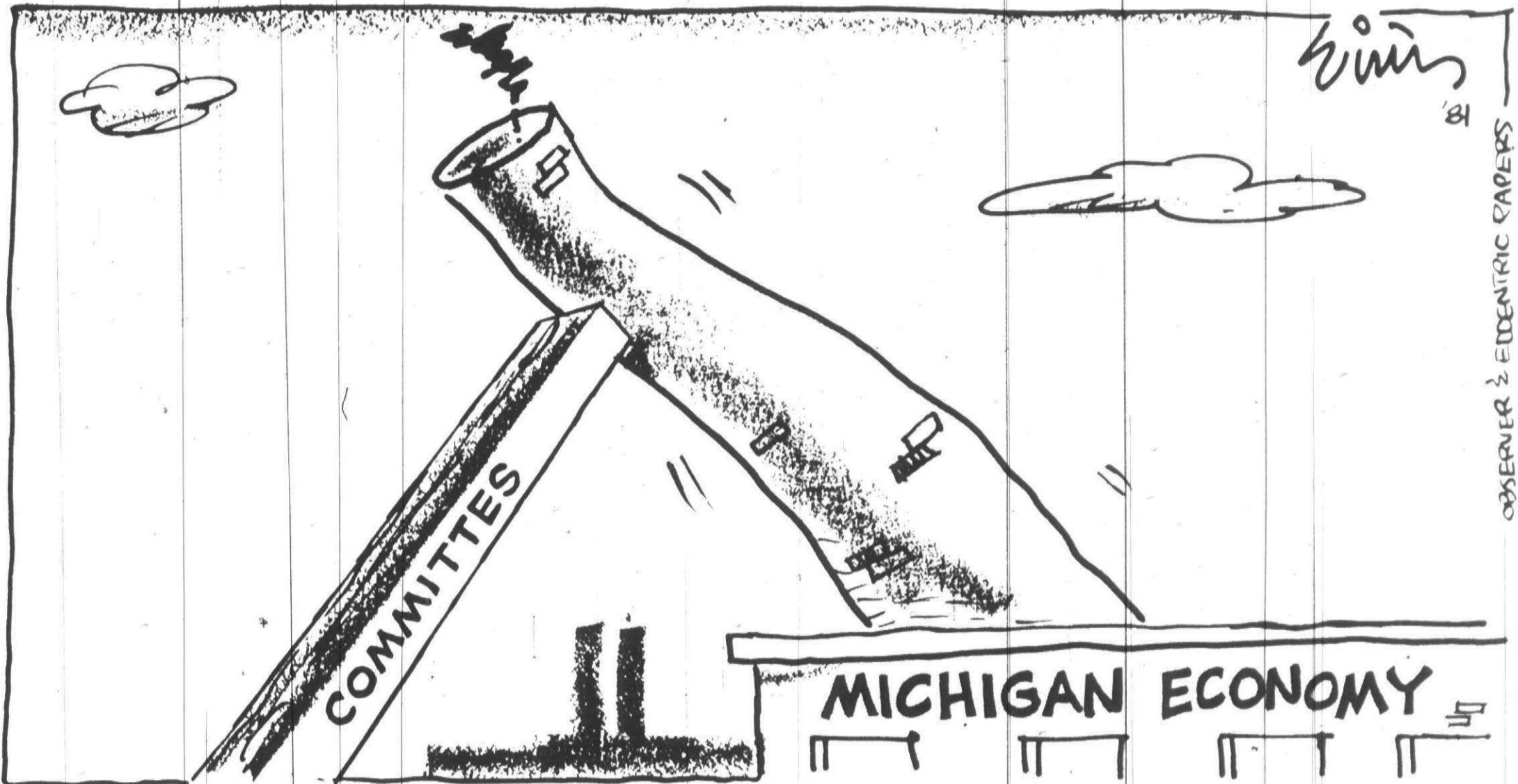
Back in the gala Eisenhower days of the 1950s, I kept hearing that "when the rest of the nation gets an economic cold, Michigan gets pneumonia." The moral of the story was that Michigan was too dependent on the highly cyclical auto industry.

In 1975, a 24-member Michigan Economic Action Council headed by then-Bendix Chairman W. Michael Blumenthal, opened its recommendations for long-term action by noting:

"However, over time, two undesirable characteristics have come to plague the Michigan economy: 1) an unemployment rate that has remained well above the national average even in boom times during recent years; and 2) a concentration of employment in the durable goods manufacturing industries that contributes to the extreme cyclical fluctuations in the state's economy."

In other words, when the rest of the nation was well, Michigan had a cold; and when the rest of the nation had a cold, Michigan had double pneumonia.

During his final week in office this year, then-Transportation Secretary Neil Goldschmidt sounded a warning that the American auto industry might be reduced to one company, General Motors. Clearly, for Michigan such a prospect would mean permanent triple pneumonia, if there can be such a thing.



IF STARTING new organizations were the answer, the Great Lake State and Water-Winter Wonderland would be booming like Arizona or California.

I mentioned the Michigan Economic Action Council (MEAC). It recommended creation of a Business-Development Authority, which has been done.

It recommended creation of a permanent Michigan Economic Advisory Council and an Institute for Economic Development. The legislature so acted, but the governor vetoed them during the crunch of things.

MEAC recommended formation of local economic development corporations. That process is going like Gang Busters:

Wayne County has an economic development corporation.

Oakland County has an economic development corporation.

Many suburban cities have economic development corporations or authorities.

Detroit has a downtown development authority and I-don't-know-how-many other such agencies.

THERE IS more.

In SEMscope, the publication of the Southeast Michigan Council of Governments, I read that SEMCOG itself, the Greater Detroit Chamber of Commerce, Detroit Edison Co. and Michigan Department of Commerce have formed a Greater Detroit/Southeast Michigan Economic Development Council.

It sees its first tasks as forming "a policy advisory committee of local elected officials and a technical advisory committee of local economic development specialists."

All of this gives you the impression we're in the process of curing our unemployment problems by putting everyone to work on economic action groups.

But it's not my purpose to be derogatory about economic action groups. Nor is it my purpose to call for still another economic action group to coordinate all the other economic action groups.

A lot is going on. It will be a long time before much of it pays off in big numbers of jobs.

Meanwhile, some attitudes within Michigan will have to be changed.

You've made the oil giant sit up and take notice

Cynics and naysayers, repent. The people are speaking, and the world is listening.

Recall, for a moment, the story of the sergeant and the stubborn mule.

After others fruitlessly tried to get the mule to do their bidding through pulling, tugging and persuasion, the wise old soldier got up off his stoop, picked up a two-by-four and smacked that ornery critter up-side the head.

Well, you've smacked the oil interests up side the head with an overwhelming response of nearly 600 letters in favor of a selective oil boycott. And they're listening with more than a little consternation.

Let me tell you a little about what has happened since the last time we were together.

First, the Shell answer man — you remember him — has volunteered to give his side of the story. You'll read that on these pages in next week's edition. Fair is fair.

Secondly, your effort has gained national attention — from the halls of Congress to the oil capital of America, Houston, Tex.

That's right. The word has spread that citizens in America's heartland are sick and tired of the great American oil ripoff.

THIS SMALL TOWN weekly columnist has spent endless hours on the phone responding to the likes of legislators, oil lobbyists, gas station operator representatives, daily newspapers and oil trade journalists.

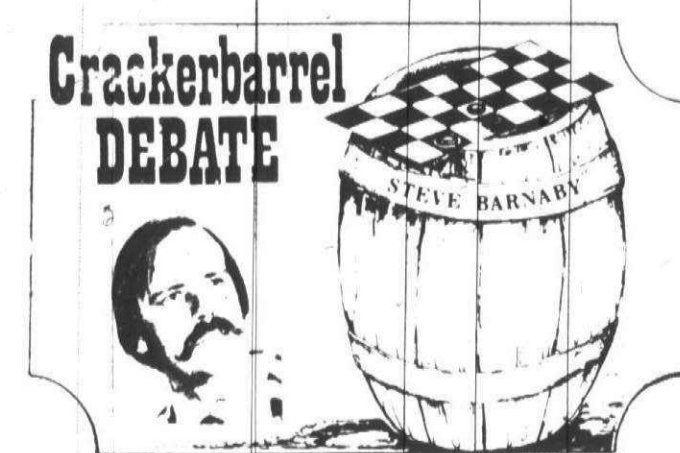
Last weekend, I presented more than 200 of your letters to U.S. Sen. Carl Levin.

They all want to know if it's true you're going to fight back.

Like I said, numbers count in this game. Politicians listen when their constituents are unhappy. Oil barons respond when they fear their profits are threatened.

Sure, there is a lot of bravado being bandied about — the I-dare-you-to-boycott-it-won't-do-any-good-kind-of rhetoric.

But one can only ask: If a boycott won't do any good, why does anyone from the oil community take



time away from making money to respond?

Oh, we do have detractors. Out of the nearly 600 responses submitted, I received one, under mysterious circumstances, whose author thinks this whole matter is "quite silly."

Personally, whenever so many persons have spoken in unison, I tend to think it is quite unsilly.

Our detractor, who wishes to remain anonymous (again the only one of nearly 600), believes that you and I are talking off the tops of our heads.

WELL, WHOEVER put this guy up to this letter doesn't know me very well — or understand the needs of the American people. He tries to punch holes in arguments of those who object to the present world oil operation.

Suffice it to say I can cite as many experts as the next guy and have just as much documentation from credible sources. Next week I'll do a little hole punching myself.

Besides, it is important that everyone understand just exactly what is going on in the old industry.

But the real question at hand today is what is going to happen with this oil boycott idea?

After all, this situation is tantamount to a battle between David and Goliath.

The truth is that nothing will happen unless you who have expressed an interest do something about

it. As a newspaper columnist, I can make appeals, share ideas and pass on the sentiments of the people to their political and industrial leaders.

But it is the people, en masse, who must take action. And I see real potential of that happening — if you want to do it.

Organization is the key. And from the many letters it is obvious that organization is possible.

Many persons responding are senior citizens, a group whose plight is growing everyday because of the economic hardship thrust upon them.

COUNTLESS senior citizen organizations exist which could back such an effort.

I also received letters from trucking companies which have been wounded by the oil price increases. Remember we're all affected when truckers, who get about three miles to the gallon with their vehicles, have to pass that increased cost of diesel fuel on to us in shipping costs and delivered products.

Union members also responded in great numbers. Well, how about it, UAW, AFL-CIO and Teamsters? These are your members who feel they are getting the economic screws put to them.

So you see many organizations exist which could take up the cause. But you're going to have to get on them about it. Any organization, no matter how much it purports to work for the benefit of its members, must be prodded into action.

Even more important are your neighbors, friends and relatives. Through your letter writing efforts, you have shown that support is deep.

Now the real work begins.

The life of a boycotter can be frustrating and a lot of hard work. But when you think about it, paying \$2 or \$3 a gallon for gasoline can be even more painful.

Those who want to see this boycott idea succeed, go out and knock on your neighbor's door. Organize meetings. Plan a strategy. Set a timetable.

IF ORGANIZATION work is done correctly, the necessary funds will evolve to fight the oil interests. The price of a tank of gas from each member, or even half a tank, would do the job to print bumper

stickers, buttons and the necessary literature to spread the word.

Encourage your legislators to take action. Perhaps the government controls were too much for oil companies to bear and did have a negative impact on oil prices.

Some very reputable persons believe that if the U.S. government did the negotiating with the OPEC nations, instead of each company cutting its own deal, the price could be brought down.

One big problem in this oil crisis is that it flies in the face of our free enterprise, free market system. The OPEC cartel has us on the ropes and it knows it.

Of course, the domestic oil companies aren't exactly squeaky clean either. In their vertically structured industry, competition is nearly impossible.

Vertical structure means that oil companies, mostly the majors, control the product from the well head to the gasoline pump through subsidiaries.

It sort of keeps the money all in the family.

Tell your legislators you're tired of that kind of nonsense and want a change.

BUT, MOST IMPORTANTLY, if you believe in this effort, don't give it up. Keep the letters rolling in and tell the world the good old-fashioned American spirit is alive and well and willing to do the job at hand.

Remember, if you don't do anything about it, nobody else will.

Let feds negotiate with OPEC

The United States could work itself out from under the economic strain of spiraling oil prices and uncertain supplies if the federal government were allowed to negotiate with foreign oil interests, according to Robert Amori, an oil jobber for Barnosky Oil, Wyandotte.

But members of the American oil family find themselves working at odds with each other rather than in unity, according to the Farmington Hills resident.

Battle lines are drawn between the major oil companies, station operators, independent oil companies and the jobbers who find themselves in the middle of the fray.

OIL JOBBERS buy surpluses from the major companies (Exxon, Shell, Gulf, etc.) and sell to independents. But Amori said the majors now are putting the squeeze on jobbers.

"The majors are trying to commit us to buy surpluses, but they don't want a contractual relationship," said Amori.

"The refiner doesn't want to move products to the independent when he doesn't have to."

"They'll sell to us, but they don't allow enough margin to pay our bills."

Amori said major oil companies claim they must sell their gasoline for five cents more a gallon than independents because of the majors offer such extras as service bays and credit cards.

"But when I go to them and want to buy it for a nickel less, they won't do it," he said.

INSTEAD, the majors will sell jobbers gasoline for only 1/4 of a cent less.

"But it costs me three cents to get it out on the street and make some profit," said Amori, meaning that independent self-serve stations are forced to raise their prices. The higher price inhibits competition and costs the consumer more.

The result, Amori said, is that independents are losing their spot in the marketplace.

Jobbers have a significant role on

the American oil scene, because they sell 80 percent of fuel oil and 35 percent of gasoline in the nation, according to Amori.

ALTHOUGH HE favored federal deregulation of the oil industry, Amori does see a role for the national government in the oil business.

He supported a bill introduced two years ago by U.S. Rep. William Brodhead, D-Detroit, which would have had the federal government negotiate for overseas crude oil.

In that way, American oil companies would avoid the practice of individually negotiating with the OPEC nations and making separate deals.

"That way we could establish some kind of balance of trade in which we could barter with foreign nations for what they needed," he said.

BUT THAT BILL went by the way-side when the Carter Administration opposed it. And Brodhead sees little hope of reviving such a concept under the present Reagan Administration.

"There is a feeling in Washington that regulation is unsound," said the 17th District congressman. "The price is going to continue to go up. The doctrine of the (Reagan) administration is that it is good that it is going up."

But Brodhead believes his concept was in step with the free market philosophy.

"What I was thinking was that it isn't inconsistent for the government to be the purchaser in the free market. The government could negotiate for a lower price," he said.

Amori believes this concept to be sound.

"You can't divorce the government from a resource that is so important to the nation. But we've got to find a way to counter the (OPEC) cartel," he said.

Even that could be difficult, he added.

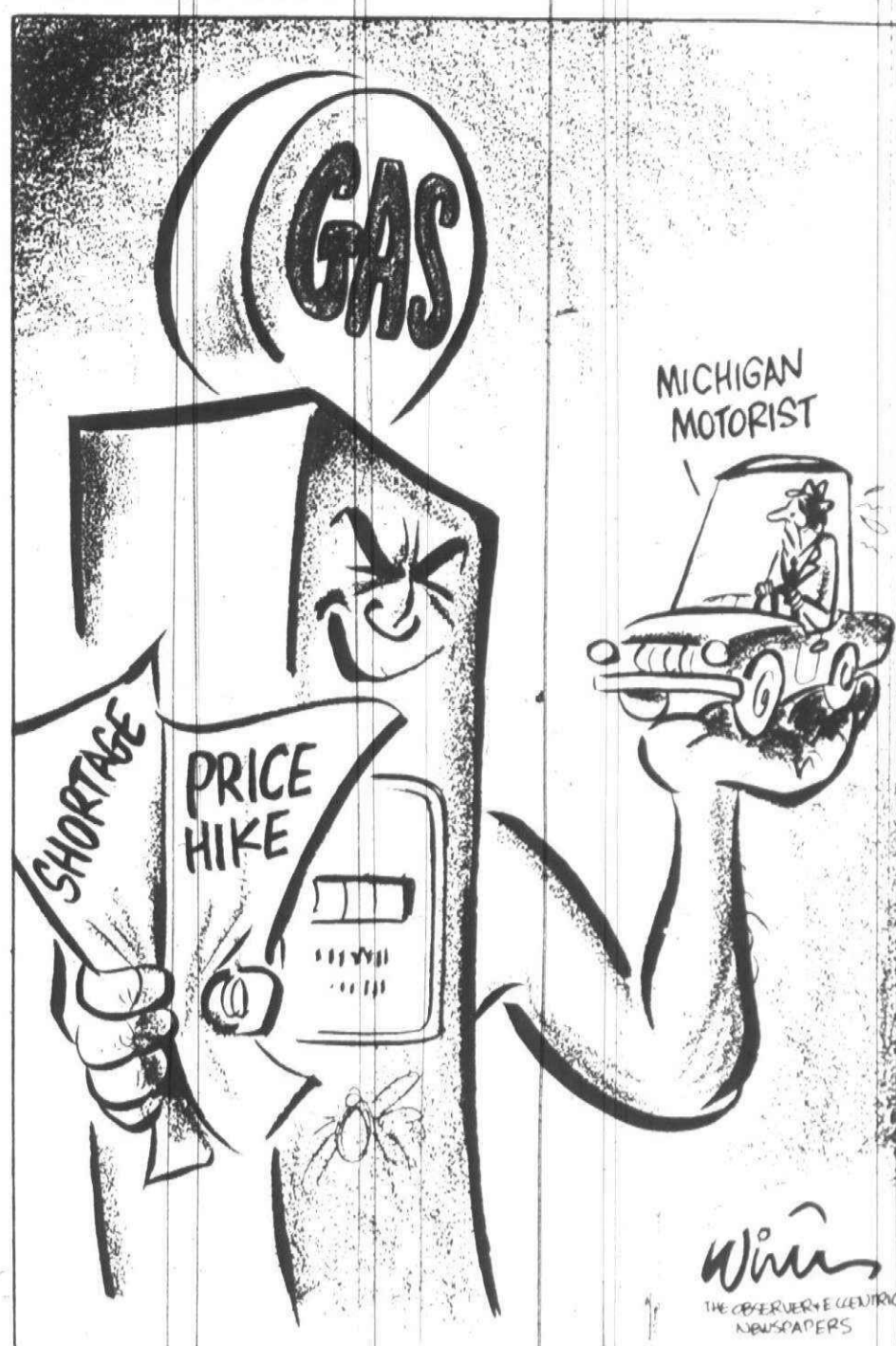
The move toward energy independence could backfire.

"BECAUSE OF the cartel, we're not working in a free enterprise system," he said.

Amori explained that if domestic oil companies invest money to develop shale oil — an expensive process — it would have to be sold at today's going OPEC rate — between \$37 and \$40 a barrel.

But OPEC at present is able to produce its oil at \$1 1/2 to \$4 a barrel. The rest is profit. That leaves open the possibility of OPEC's reducing the price of their oil in the future, leaving American domestic producers out in the cold — and the U.S. forced to go back to OPEC.

Boycott would rip dealers, not big oil firms — Shipley

The only persons harmed by a selective boycott of an oil company would be gasoline station owners.

That's the word from Charles Shipley, who heads the Retail Gasoline Dealers of Michigan. The major oil companies' profits, \$30 billion in 1980, virtually would be unaffected by a local effort, he said.

"If this boycott was 100 percent successful, it would destroy 30 or 40 small businessmen," said Shipley in reaction to a reader response to an Observer & Eccentric survey. That survey revealed that a majority of respondents who wish to boycott an oil company would prefer it be Shell Oil.

ALTHOUGH DEFENDING station operators, Shipley admitted there is no love lost between him and the major oil companies.

"I've been fighting with them for years. Every year oil executives get up on the Fourth of July and talk about the free enterprise system, and then the rest of the 364 days they don't participate in it," he said.

The real profit from oil goes to the major oil companies. Station operators earn about five cents a gallon, Shipley said. Out of that the operator must pay his employees, the utilities and rent, which can range anywhere from \$2,500 to \$3,000 monthly.

"They (station operators) provide a valuable service to the community. If their business is reduced for 30 days, they would go broke," he said.

WHILE STATION operators of major brand names are theoretically independent, said Shipley, they are actually at the mercy of the company whose sign they display.

"In reality, he can't shop around for a product. If he does look elsewhere, he can be shut down," he says.

"An operator could cover up the brand name and buy an unbranded product. But even most of those are produced by the majors," said Shipley.

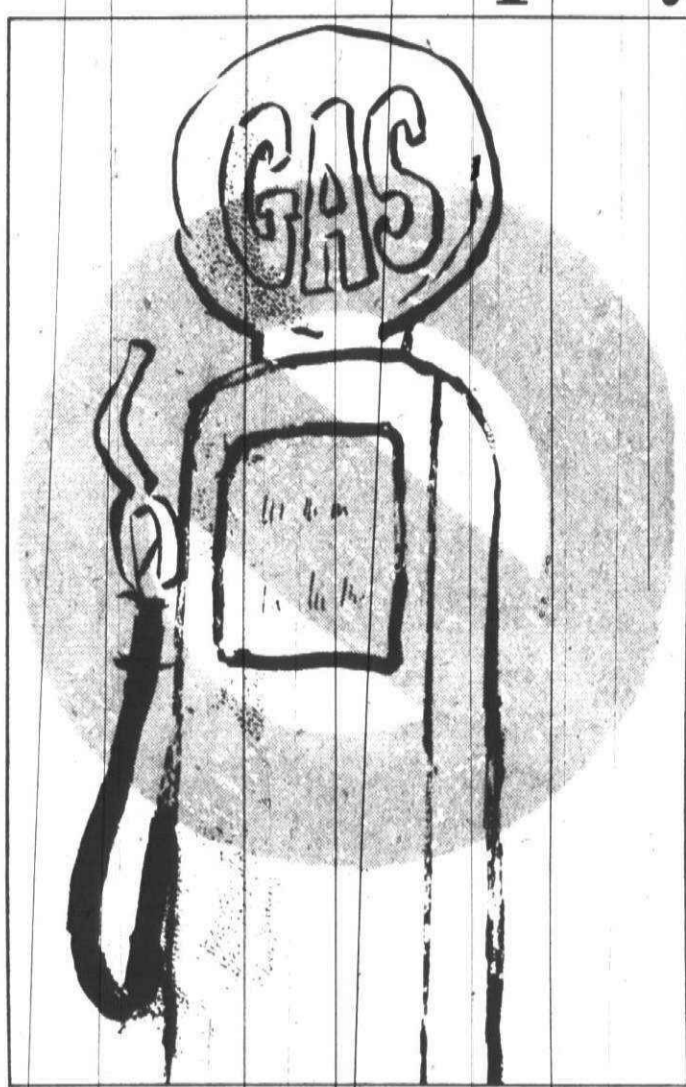
"He (the operator) would lose his lease, and Shell wouldn't take his credit cards," he says.

THE REAL problem with oil prices today, Shipley said, is that the American consumer was spoiled by the "cheap" oil of previous years.

"They should get rid of their gas hogs and drive fuel-efficient cars," he said.

If consumers would drive more fuel-efficient cars at today's oil prices, he says, they actually would be paying less a mile to drive than when gas cost 70 cents a gallon.

Shipley also blamed America's gasoline problems on the attitudes of the American auto industry.



"The handwriting was on the wall. But big cars were making them money even in 1974 and 1975," said Shipley.

Woe at the pump

Prices up 10% in '80, 12% in '81

We all know we're paying more, driving less and cringing every time we see the new numbers posted on the gasoline station tote boards.

It may not be in the \$2.50-to-\$3 range that Europeans are currently paying for petrol, but in the last year, the average price of a gallon of no-lead gasoline in the metropolitan area has risen from a little over the \$1.30 mark to pretty close to \$1.50.

Each week the Automobile Club of Michigan gathers figures from stations along major highways outstate and from many outlets in metropolitan Detroit to compute its average gas prices.

THE FIGURES aren't surprising. According to AAA, the average price of no-lead gasoline in Detroit in 1980 rose by 12.5 cents per gallon, or more than 10 percent. That left the average price on Dec. 31, 1980 at \$1.339.

In the first nine weeks of 1981, however, the rise has been even more dramatic. From Dec. 31 through March 4, the price of no-lead in the Detroit area has risen by almost 16 cents to \$1.496. That increase represents a 11.7 percent hike.

Figures for regular gasoline are similar: On Dec. 31 the average price in Detroit for a gallon of regular gas was \$1.286, and on March 4 it was \$1.445. That's a 15.9-cent increase, or 12.4 percent.

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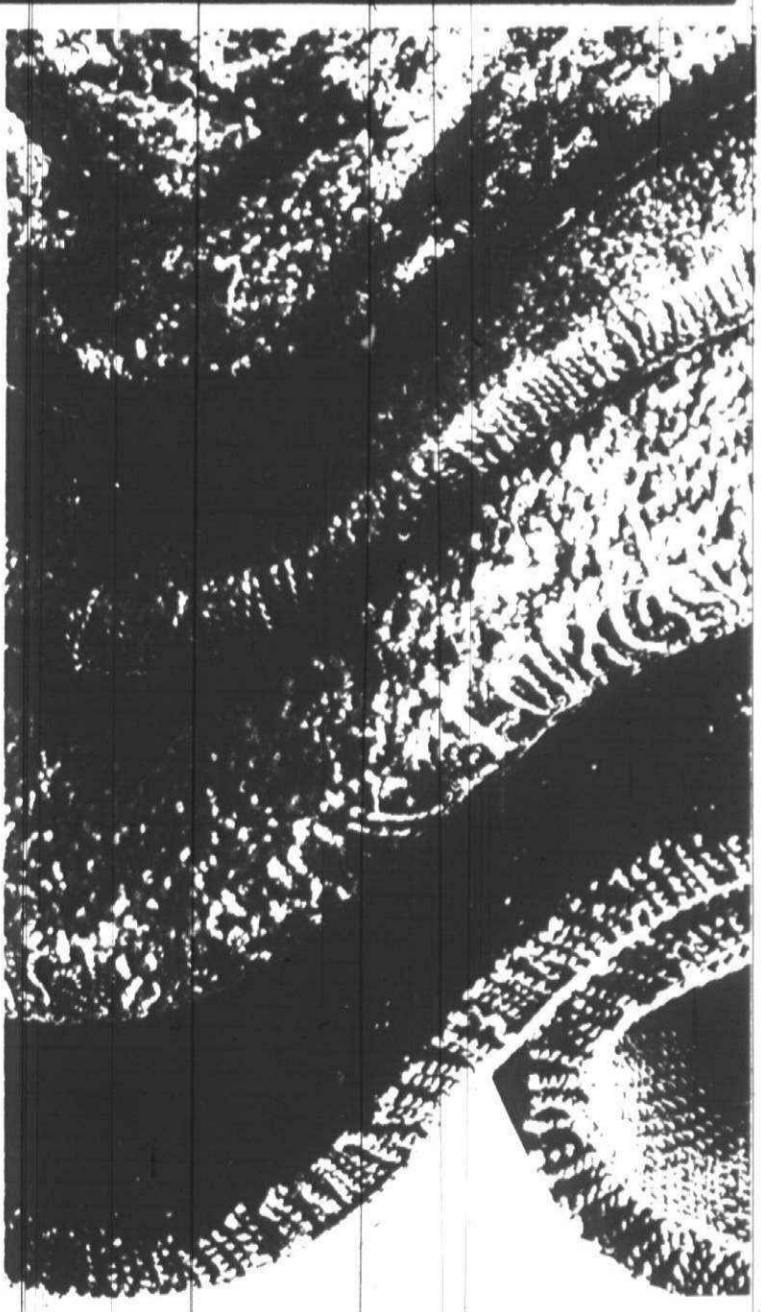

Since winning the 1980 Newbery Medal and the American Book Award, Joan Bloss has traveled extensively throughout the state speaking at libraries, schools and conferences.

It was her "A Gathering of Days, A New England Girl's Journal, 1830-1832," that earned the Newbery medal which is given annually by the American Library Association for the year's most distinguished contribution to children's literature, and the American Book Award.

Bloss, an Ann Arbor resident, said the increased recognition as a result of the awards has given her more opportunities to speak out and say things she really cares about. She takes children and children's books very seriously, although she is never pretentious. For most of her career, she says she has considered herself as a teacher, one who imparts her love and understanding of books to her children.

But even before she taught, Joan Bloss wrote. Her first poem was published when she was 10. She graduated to plays in high school, then, after earning a bachelor's degree at Vassar and a master's degree at the College of New

York City, she joined the staff of the Bank Street College of Education. The latter is a pioneering institution for the study of child development and education.

AT BANK Street, Bloss was an instructor in children's literature, a member of the Writer's Laboratory, and an associate editor of the Bank Street Readers. Early in her career,

she wrote stories for educational readers published by Bank Street as well as the texts for two preschool picture books, one with a co-author.

From 1970-80, she taught children's literature at the University of Michigan, focusing on books for the pre-reading child. She is U.S. editor of the quarterly, Children's Literature in Education, and writes frequently for other publications.

The author contributed her \$1,000 cash prize from the American Book Award to a group dedicated to the advancement of children's literature and says she is grateful to have the chance to "convert the award into an opportunity to say things I care about."

Bloss spoke last fall to the Plymouth Study Group. Her talk was opened to the public and attracted a SRO audience.

Donation for the concert will be \$2 for adults and \$1 for children.

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
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

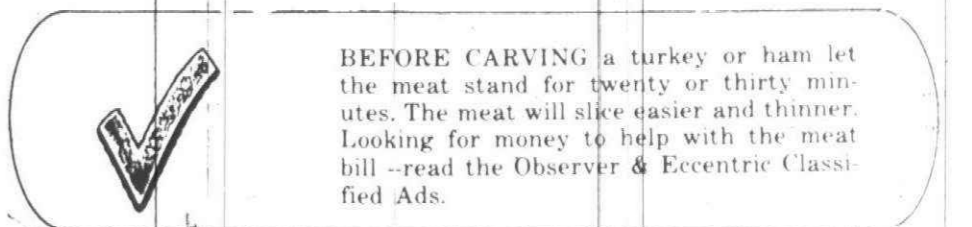

Volunteer has listings

She'll help you find a nursery

By MARGARET MILLER

Some parents look for a nursery school to aid their preschoolers in physical, mental and social development.

Some need a child care center to fill in the hours when both parents are working.

Some have children with special needs and need a school to match.

And all who belong to the growing group of parents choosing some kind of preschool experience for their youngsters want some kind of guidance and some information on how to make their selection.

For all of them, Lindsay Cantoni of Livonia has a file box full of answers.

Mrs. Cantoni is a substitute teacher and a volunteer at the Women's Resource Center at Schoolcraft College and has taken over and updated a service initiated three years ago by the center. The service involves making as complete as possible a listing of child care facilities and nursery school programs available in this area and then making it available to parents who call her Wednesday afternoons.

"Right now I have 65 facilities listed," she said. "I keep records on cooperative nurseries, non-profit nursery school programs, day care centers and regular nursery schools."

"I would like to add information on others in the area, which covers Wayne County and adjoining portions of Oakland County."

Mrs. Cantoni said she tries to keep detailed information on each listing — what age groups are accepted, what hours the school or center is open,

whether snacks or meals are served, whether handicapped children and newborn babies are accepted, what the charges are.

"I do not try to visit them," she added, "and I do not try to evaluate."

"When parents call me, I have answers to their initial questions. I usually give two or three choices and the parents can go from there."

A LISTING of charges is always included in the initial report, she said.

"This is a very real consideration," she added. "If a woman is going back into the job market, she wants to be able to take home more than a few pennies."

The Resource Center's volunteer with the title of Child Care Referral Service Coordinator picked up some knowledge of child care facilities because of her connection with Mother Hubbard Nursery. Her son, Brian, 10, attended that school, and now it is home-away-from-home for 5-year-old daughter Kara.

"Last year a friend of mine was working on the child care listings at the resource center and she asked me if I'd be interested in doing it this year," Mrs. Cantoni said. "I began the updating by sending out a mailing requesting information to 200 schools and centers in the area. The ones that returned answers to questions are now listed, and I hope others will add their names."

She fits in office hours at the Resource Center, 1-2:30 p.m. Wednesdays, between substituting assignments in the Livonia School District. Certified to teach kindergarten through eighth grades, she admitted that "I prefer the little ones."

Mrs. Cantoni said she also has a master's degree in guidance and counseling and "eventually I'll put it back in use."

Meanwhile, she is anxious to supply names of nurseries to parents wanting a choice. Those who could use her help may call her at 591-6400, ext. 431.

"And I like feedback," she said. "I want to know how the recommended nursery is working out. If there is a complaint about the facility, I want to hear about that, too."

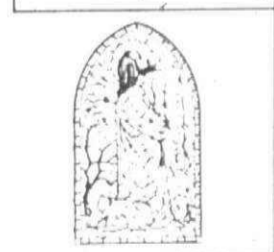

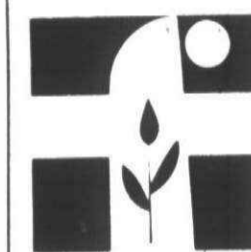

Hong Kong trip keeps a mission

When Grace Van Dyke and her daughter flew west across the Pacific in December, their luggage contained 200 packages of pipe cleaners and 2,000 popsicle sticks.

They also took along bags of alphabet macaroni, glue, transparent tape, plastic berry baskets and a big supply of zip-lock bags. That last item was described by the Plymouth traveler as "the most wonderful things you could imagine."

Mrs. Van Dyke and daughter Lynn, a Pan American Airlines employee based in San Francisco, were not making a standard tourist trip as they flew to

Hong Kong. They were part of PAVE, or Pan American Volunteer Effort, a program for helping in one of several schools for Vietnamese refugees in the oriental city.

She told about her experiences this week in a talk before the United Methodist Women of Newburg UM in Livonia.

In an earlier interview, she explained that the program began because an airline official became acquainted with Sr. Anne Reusch, a Maryknoll nun who was in charge of the school known as Kai Tak in the city's east compound.

"He asked her how the airline could help," said Mrs. Van Dyke, "and they

worked out a way for Pan Am employees and their relatives to serve at the Hong Kong school between trips and on vacations.

"This was the third time my daughter has gone."

HER OWN INVOLVEMENT, said Mrs. Van Dyke, involved a fascinating nine days during which "we worked our tails off."

"We were assigned to help with crafts and do some tutoring in the school that had 500 children, aged 7 to 13. When we weren't teaching the crafts, we were tutoring the children. Because they were refugees, they had moved around a lot and were at various levels. One day I spent working with some recently-arrived children, giving them little math tests to find out where they should be placed in the school. Some could understand some English, some needed interpreters."

The school where she worked was part of a camp which housed some 6,000 refugees, said Mrs. Van Dyke.

Part of the great wave of "boat people" coming out of Vietnam, they were about 80 percent Chinese and the rest Vietnamese, she noted. They stay in various camps in Hong Kong while waiting the opportunity to seek a new life elsewhere in the world — Australia, France, Canada or the United States.

"This country takes the largest number," she noted.

The camp contained 20 buildings made of corrugated metal, said Mrs. Van Dyke. "Three hundred were housed in each room. They slept in triple bunks, three to a layer."

But it was a clean camp, she added, and the people there did their best to keep some pattern to their lives. "They washed their clothes and hung them up there, and each family cooked its meals outside on the grounds."

THE SCHOOL where she offered her services is led by Sr. Anne, described by Mrs. Van Dyke as "a dynamite person" and four paid teachers, three Chinese and one Vietnamese.

"With such a small staff, they could only touch on the basics," said Mrs. Van Dyke, "so the crafts we brought, the kind of things our children would be exposed to at nursery school were new to them there."

"In a school with 500 children there were 12 pairs of scissors and just one box of crayon stubs."

The plastic bags were invaluable, she added, because each day's project could be individually packaged for each child.

One memorable event was a weekend excursion she and her daughter took into downtown Hong Kong with 10 children from the school.

"It was their first subway ride, their first time to use an escalator, their first time in a department store. We bought each of them a notebook, and we took them all to MacDonalds to wind up the day."

But one of the little girls was pretty worried about getting back to the camp, Mrs. Van Dyke said.

"She was a little afraid to get on the ferry boat," she explained. "I guess that was natural after all the time she and her family had spent on a boat."

We could learn from cults' methods

When the rebellion and the needs of youth are coupled with the systematic recruitment procedures of many cultic groups, the results are often predictable — membership in the cultic beliefs and lifestyle increases.

Rabbi A. James Rudin and his wife Marcia, who have recently published "Prison or Paradise? The New Religious Cults," estimate there are 3 million past and present cult members in this country.

It has not been that long since parents and traditional religion were wondering how to involve young people in faith-centered concerns. And now the same folks are asking what the drawing card is in this religious phenomenon. One might argue that the phenomenon is not as religious as it is psychological.

In a telephone interview, Rabbi Rudin suggested that some of the ingredients include the age-old rebellion of youth, a degree of ignorance, and a need for identity, friendship and community. He also suggested that the systematic recruitment tactics of many cultic groups play directly into these needs.

WE MIGHT ATTEMPT to dissuade youthful adherents with logical arguments. We may even try to frighten them with stories of the Jonestown trag-

edy. However, logic is not the basis of their attraction.

Young people need to feel important. They need to feel wanted, and they need a sense of direction. In their extreme, they would even like someone else to make their decisions. Perhaps the cults are more aware of this than is traditional religion.

The cultic recruiters seem to fill the bill on a variety of counts. For one, they offer a sense of importance — the prospective convert is made to feel important from the first contact.

One young person who was recently recruited told me that he never felt so much like he belonged. I wonder how many young adults have that kind of feeling about their churches and synagogues. Running a young adult program and inviting young adults to be an essential and on-going part of a faith community are not necessarily the same thing.

WE MAY scream that young people do not come flocking to our churches and our synagogues. But reaching out and touching them where they are may prove to be far more effective.

The cults do not grow by putting advertisements in the yellow pages and then waiting for young people to show up at their programs. Somehow, the

yellow pages approach does not create the same sense of importance that comes with a personal approach coupled with on-going contact.

A community of believers who have little more than a catechism or Sunday school understanding of the faith they profess do not have much to offer in this regard.

I find most young adults embarrassed when asked questions about their faith. They are able to label it, but are very inept at explaining it. Perhaps we who are called to be the explainers had better do some homework on what to give and how to give it.

THE APPEAL to a sense of direction is another area at which we might take a harder look. Granted, young people need to make their own decisions and their own faith commitments.

However, we who claim to have a viable faith might well make a more serious effort to give them a basis for making those decisions.

It is always easier to criticize those who march to the tune of a different drummer than it is to consider beating our own drums in a different fashion.

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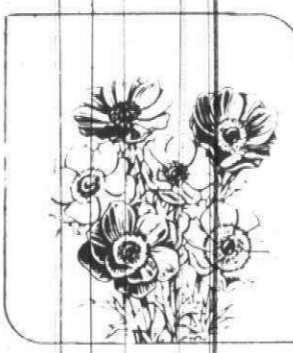
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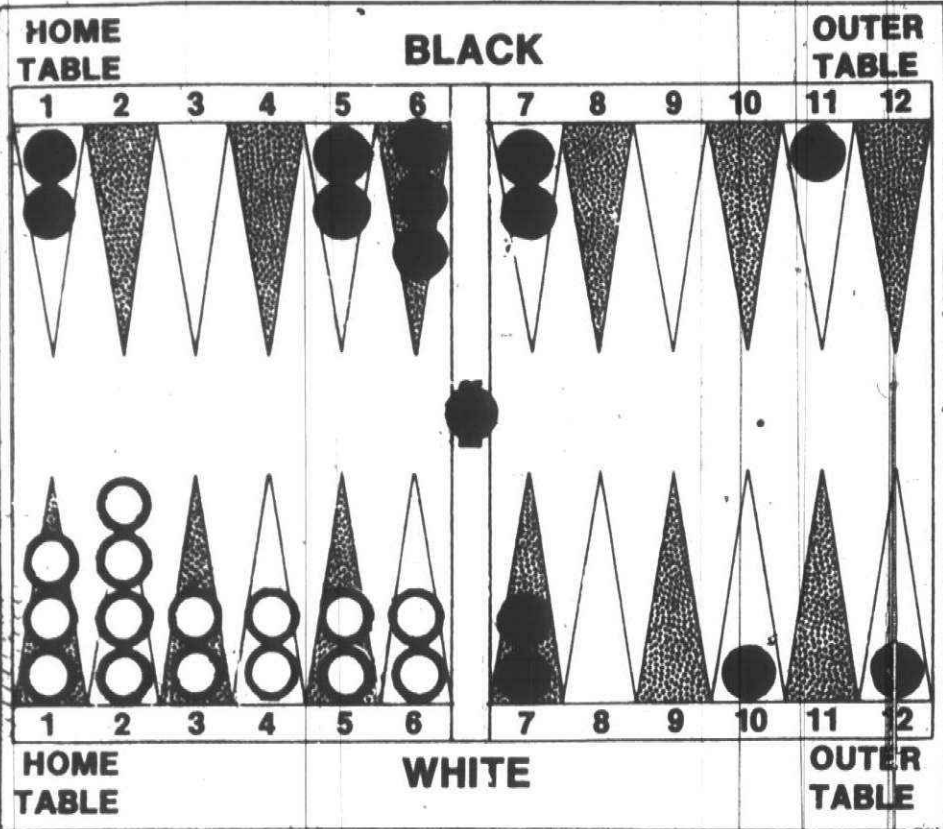

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THE POWERLESS DOUBLING CUBE Open backgammon tournament. Having reached the finals and a score of 12-11 in a 13-point match, I arrived at this



position playing white. With one point needed to win the match, the Crawford Rule applied, preventing either player from using the cube for this game only. Once the cube loses its power, it is important that each move be executed with caution. With the cube in play in this position, I could have easily forced my opponent out of the game. White rolls a 5-1. What is your suggested move? I moved a checker off the 5 point and moved up to the 4 point, leaving the 5 point open — in almost every position a correct play. Having moved too fast, however, I did not contemplate the repercussions should my opponent remain on the bar and should I roll a 5-1, 6-1, 6-6; 5-5 or 4-4 (seven out of 36 possibilities). Needless to say, he stayed on the bar and I rolled double fives, leaving a checker exposed on the 4 point. Naturally, he rolled a four and continued to roll perfectly until the game was won. Having lost the game and the match, I placed second. Analyzing this position, there was a definite error. Moving a checker to the 1 and 5 point from the 6 point would have been best for one reason. By leaving the 6 point open, you allow black to escape behind you, thus getting him out of your hair. If black does not roll a six, white would be hard-pressed to roll perfectly to avoid leaving a shot. Since black had only one checker on the bar, this would have been a wise play. With two checkers on the bar, the first move would then have been proper. Also, it is important to note that while moving to the 5 and 1 point gives white several more bad rolls — 6-6, 5-5, 4-4, 6-3, 5-3, 6-5, 5-4, 6-4, or 13 out of 36 rather than 7 out of 36 combinations — it is theoretically correct with one checker on the bar. Canton also was plagued by poor service.

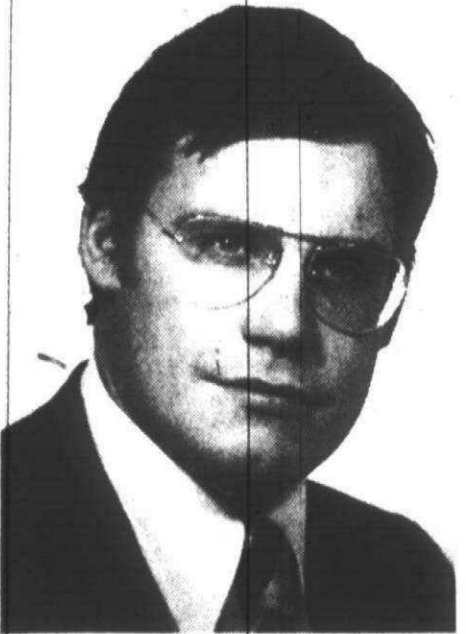
"We had a lot of problems," said the Canton coach. "We had five bad serves in the second game. We don't usually do that."

U-M grid coach airs enthusiasm

You hear only the horror stories about college coaches recruiting high school athletes.

It usually crops up when somebody gets caught with their hand in the cookie jar. The allegations and punishments handed down by the NCAA against four PAC-10 football schools come most recent to mind.

Recruiting, however, is downright enjoyable and a challenge to University of Michigan's Bob Thornbladh, an assistant coach.

The former Plymouth High School star, who later played a year for the Kansas City Chiefs, packs his bags frequently and travels by plane around the country, seeking talented football players and good students.

"I like to meet different people," he said. "The kids are refreshing and they're all different."

"I don't mind the challenge. I feel strongly about Michigan and Bo (Schembechler)."

Thornbladh's primary responsibility is to coach the receivers on the Michigan team, guys like Anthony Carter.

But he also spends a great deal of his time in airports, high schools and the homes of prospective student-athletes. He is in charge of recruiting players from the Chicago area, northern Indiana and New England (mainly New Jersey).

Most of his recruiting efforts for this season are over. Athletes were first able to sign a letter-of-intent on Feb. 18.

The former Wolverine fullback agrees with the NCAA on recruiting.

"I THINK they have good rules," he said, "although some schools and kids don't always act with integrity and in an honest fashion."

"It's fairly equitable. The kids most vulnerable to illegal things are the disadvantaged."

"I follow the rules religiously. Abuses do exist, but most of the people I recruit against are quality people."

Thornbladh, 28, said football should be a primary consideration, but not foremost.

"You should choose a school if it meets your needs," he said. "When I get a kid, it's got to be mutual satisfaction. I want good students with some character. We want Michigan to be conducive to their achievement and to have some fun."

Recruiting against the likes of Notre Dame, Ohio State and Michigan State, Thornbladh has had some disappointments.

"Sometimes you take it personally when you don't get a kid," he said. "But the competition is keen and you're not going to get everyone."

"To have some say no, it's difficult. It's hard."

What keeps Thornbladh highly enthusiastic is his constant interaction with the athletes, students and the coaching staff at Michigan.

"I like my association with young people," Thornbladh said. "I feel strongly about my product. Bo is the perfect boss. He's stimulating and challenging."

NOW THAT the recruiting season is over, Bo and his staff are preparing for spring practice, which begins next week. NCAA Division I-A schools such as Michigan are allowed five weeks, four practices per week.

"We're breaking down the films and evaluating our football team for spring," said Thornbladh. "We meet every day, talking about new ideas."

The spring season will culminate April 18 with the annual Blue-White scrimmage.

Bob Thornbladh believes the high school student-athlete is protected a lot better today, as opposed to 10 years ago, when he was being recruited.

"Back then they had unlimited visitation," he said. "They allow only six official visits. I was sure of what I wanted to do. I was recruited by some fine schools, but I always wanted to go to Michigan."

"The rules have evolved. Things are better now."



"We mixed up our presses and it kind of confused them," said Bauslaugh.

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


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


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
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
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
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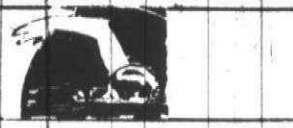

Have all the facts before foot surgery

The purpose of any surgery is to alleviate an existing problem. When performed by a competent surgeon under the right circumstances, success is highly likely.

However, unlike aluminum-siding guarantees on television, surgery has its problems. No warranties on parts and labor can be issued by the doctor. The full ramifications of surgery should be well-understood prior to its undertaking.

When necessary, foot surgery can be a wonderful solution to a painful condition. It is not, however, a substitute for good conservative care.

Certain types of foot problems lend themselves to a non-surgical approach while others respond poorly.

With few exceptions, foot surgery on the athlete is not unlike surgery upon any other type of patient.

TO THE PHYSICIAN, surgery represents a corrective procedure to alleviate an annoying problem. To the patient, the very thought of surgery involves all sorts of anxieties and fears.

Through confidence in your doctor, and a good understanding of the problem, you can deal with many apprehensions.

If a particular foot procedure is considered the correct approach, several factors should be considered.

First, and most importantly, you should feel confident that foot surgery is necessary. Potential gains and the possible complications of the procedures also should be considered.

Are you better off to wait?

Has a conservative approach been attempted? Will the problem worsen and interrupt your function if not corrected? What are the success rates and benefits of the procedure?

Your foot specialist should answer these questions.

In turn, you will gain confidence in the upcoming procedure.

OPERATIVE PROCEDURES can be scheduled to fit the patient's activity schedule. Usually, we try to perform the foot surgery off-season, thus allowing the athlete time to complete the involved season.

The merits of this become increasingly obvious as we move into the scholarship, collegiate and professional realms.

Most importantly, the patient's health and welfare should be maintained. It must be felt that continued athletic participation will not cause permanent disability. Otherwise, the delay is foolish and possibly hazardous.

Foot surgery should be performed with an emphasis upon functional gains and stability. The involved part should be able to move, carry weight and function as normally as possible.

Depending upon the extent of the involvement, this is not always a reality. Nevertheless, it is the surgical goal.

The patient should be well-informed as to the realistic expectations of undergoing the procedure.

A well-informed patient is better able and more willing to cooperate during the post-operative period — and therefore more likely to reach certain plateaus. Such a patient often will exceed the doctor's expectations through sincere effort and sound attitude.

ANY DISCUSSION of foot surgery would be incomplete without mentioning proper rehabilitation.

Techniques may vary from office to office, but the operative foot must be restrained, exercised and built-up prior to returning to athletic participation.

Southfield battles courageously

Tall cagers win regional test

It was a classic struggle — size, strength and talent vs. pure emotion. In the end, the talent prevailed.

Southfield High played with all its heart, and actually threatened the giants from Birmingham Brother Rice in the third quarter.

But the Warriors regrouped in time for a 66-55 regional basketball victory before an overflow crowd of 2,200 Tuesday night at Southfield-Lathrup. Rice, the No. 1-ranked team by the

Observer & Eccentric, takes its 20-3 record into the regional championship game at 7:30 p.m. tomorrow at Lathrup.

The Warriors face the winner of Wednesday's Ferndale-Center Line contest.

The Blue Jays, ignoring an "intimidating" 37-27 Warrior halftime lead, came out and scored the first six points of the second half and controlled the tempo with their run-and-gun, transition game. Southfield forced numerous turnovers in that period, pulling within

two points on two different occasions.

But Southfield could never get over the hump, failing to avenge last year's 60-57 regional-final defeat to the Warriors.

LES DAGGS, Rice's senior guard who finished with 18 points and four assists, sank a 22-foot at the buzzer to give Rice a 47-43 lead after three quarters. Daggs opened with two more baskets in the fourth quarter to stake Rice to an eight-point margin.

Southfield, relying all night on its perimeter shooting over the tall Rice front line, hit only two of 18 shots in the first five minutes of the fourth quarter — both baskets by Ed Murden.

The Blue Jays never got closer than six points in the final quarter, and Rice settled into a 2-3 zone defense in the final three minutes to protect its victory.

"We just couldn't put it down when we had to," said Southfield coach Greg Sliwka. "We shot 36 percent as a team (25 of 70), and we've relied on transition (and good shooting) all year long."

"Like Darryl (Darden, a senior forward) said, everything just seemed to go their (Rice's) way — a violation here, a turnover there. But when you play catch-up that's what happens."

JUNIOR PAUL JOKISCH, the strongest player in the area, led Rice's with 19 points. And that 6-foot-7 frame pulled down 12 rebounds in helping the Warriors to a 40-30 advantage in that category.

Junior center John Shasky, standing 6-foot-10, added 12 points and 13 rebounds. And the 6-foot-6 junior forward added 11 points.

Dingens and Jokisch each scored nine points in the first half and Shasky added eight to stake Rice to a 10-point halftime margin. The Warriors led 18-8 after the first quarter.

"They (Rice) are so big," Sliwka said. "The kids just didn't quite expect it — their size intimidated us so much."

And Sliwka equally was impressed with Rice's quickness — especially in the third quarter when the Warriors refused to slow things down.

"I give them (Rice) all the credit for running the ball up and down the court with us," The Southfield coach said.

ALTHOUGH RICE COACH Bill Norton uncharacteristically switched to the zone defense late in the game, he said he wasn't concerned about controlling the tempo of the game.

"We not big on controlling tempo with this team as we've been in the past two years," Norton said. "We look for the holes (in the opponents' attack) and go after it. But we let down (in the third quarter)."

"We strive for consistency. That's why if we ever go with a surge, then we can bury somebody."

Southfield, a young team which featured only one experienced player in Darden, was led by Rick Ziegler's 14 points. Darden, Murden and junior Ralph Walker added eight points each.

Rice's victory over the Blue Jays breaks a 1-1 career record between these two cage squads. Rice has won both regional battles in the last two years, but Southfield won the first game, 59-46, way back in the 1964-65 season.

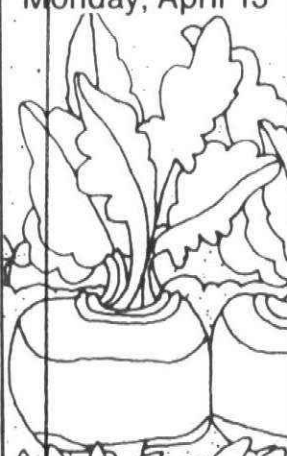

Cookin' vacations north on the range

Doris Scharfenberg's story about horseback riding in Arizona which is featured on this page, reminds me of another ranch experience, in what people have called the Texas of the North Alberta, Canada.

Alberta joins the prairies to the Rocky Mountains, so its foothill country is perfect for raising cattle. Fur trading was at the beginning of its history, and oil is its current crop, but ranching has been important in Alberta for 100 years.

A growing number of ranches are both working ranches and guest ranches, especially in the country between Rocky Mountain House, where the fur trade began, and Drumheller, where a large number of dinosaur skeletons have been found.

WE ARRIVE at Rocky Mountain House on a modern highway, but the film by Parks Canada shows graphically how the voyagers and the fur traders had to move across this land centuries ago.

It was the fur traders who opened up all this western land by canoe in an effort to provide beaver skins for the European market.

There is not much left of this important fur-trading post now, but it is one of several forts in the area being excavated and restored.

Southwest, at Drumheller, we are taken well before the fur-trading era to the era of dinosaurs. This is the land that yields dinosaur bones, which can be seen in museums all over the world.

A beautifully restored dinosaur skeleton, the Edmontosaurus, is on permanent loan as the centerpiece of the Drumheller Dinosaur Museum. A few miles away, where the soft soil has been washed away to form dry spires of land, called Hoodoos, we look across Horseshoe Canyon to the Red River Badlands.

IN BETWEEN Rocky Mountain House and Drumheller, and in foothill country all around Alberta, are a growing number of small guest ranches for one, two or a dozen travelers.

We stopped at the T and L Ranch, owned by the Lynch family, out there are many such ranches here in dinosaur country.

Another, Green's Farm, takes 10 guests at rates of \$200 a couple per week, including meals, entertainment, horseback riding and riverboating. The A&H Farm of Amos and Heather Neufeld of Elnora, offers all of the above as well as pack trips and hayrides.

George and Esther Vermillion run the Diamond 4 Guest Ranch 18 miles away, 800 acres for \$20 a day or \$125 a week.

The Lynch family houses guests in their own ranch house or adjacent cabin. They also provide camping space for people who want to stay overnight or by the week and either cook their own meals or eat with the family at the house.

ONE OF THE unusual features of a ranch vacation in this area is fossil hunting on the nearby hill. So far there is no law against removing small fossils from these unprotected areas, and it is easy to find them.

Travel Alberta offers a brochure called "Ranch Vacations in Alberta." Ranch vacations have become so popular they are offered by some travel agents as an air tour adventure package. Many of these ranches offer both summer and winter vacations.

TUSCON, Ariz. — I was standing in the most unlikely international rendezvous on earth, a pungent corral on the edge of a cactus-filled desert, about to do something I never do — ride a horse.

The voices around me, giggling and joking, were Japanese, German, French, New York and probably mid-town Flint. We were guests at the Tanque Verde Ranch, one of Tucson's many posh and popular western resorts, about to ride out into the sage and saguaro for a chuckwagon breakfast.

"How did you happen to come here?" I asked a tiny Japanese woman who rode like a veteran.

"My husband is bird-watcher," she said. "He found desert birds most interesting and once, while driving through, decided to come on vacations."

The Germans came because they loved horses, and it was so different. "No scenery like this in the Rhineland," they said laughing.

"Besides, wait til you get to the breakfast! Worth coming 6,000 miles for."

THE AIR WAS clear as crystal. The landscape of saguaro cactus standing tall against a background of angular mountains reflecting morning sun was beautiful.

My unaccustomed bones survived the ride, and the breakfast — sausages, pancakes, biscuits and the general works — was supreme.

Although missing such events because of horse-shyness would be too bad, you don't have to get into a saddle when you vacation in Tucson. The old-time ranches have evolved into glamour spas with swimming pools and tennis courts as standard equipment.

Skin care clinics and art classes are tucked into daily routines, along with trips to a dozen points of interest around Tucson.

The city spreads across the heart of southern Arizona's cactus country, a swift-growing urbana of gleaming towers and low earth-hugging Spanish architecture. Constituting an inner city of its own, the University of Arizona is a 30,000-student complex with all the lively goings-on of a campus that size.

TUCSON MIXES the old with the new like crossed threads of the same cloth. The visitor with the untrained eye sometimes needs a little help sorting out authentic Tucson. Authentic-looking duplicates of old inns, and well-kept but ancient structures stand side by side.

When you are in front of the San Xavier Mission, however, there is no doubt. One of the finest examples of mission design in the United States, San Xavier is still in daily use after 200 years.

One gleaming white tower remains incomplete as a tribute to the worker who fell to his death during construction.

The Arizona-Sonora Desert Museum in Tucson Mountain Park presides over a magnificent forest of saguaro, a tall cactus that doesn't sprout arms for the first 80 years of life, then assumes a humanistic silhouette. It is forbidden to cut one down or even move one without permission.

The sleek, imaginative museum has everything from wildcats to scorpions, and yes they're real. Now switch back to doubt. Down the road from the museum is a make-believe Old Tucson, originally a movie set built for the filming of "Arizona."

The dusty streets and false-front saloons are still used by Hollywood and TV film makers. But now the riders in stage coaches are likely to be visiting Iowans.

REALITY STRIKES again in the person of Arizona artist Ted DeGrazia. DeGrazia sells more prints, plates and cards of his own work than any other person alive.

He hand-built his studio and museum to vaguely resemble the mines he worked while struggling to become an artist.

The University of Arizona has published huge volumes of his work, and DeGrazia's card "Los Ninos" was one of the most popular ever sold by UNICEF. On a lucky day, you might find him in his patio-garden or in the small chapel he built next door.

Colossal Cave, the Kitt Peak National Observatory, the Pima Air Museum (largest collection of vin-

tage aircraft in the West). The desert is blooming and so is Tucson.

You can get there by air (Frontier, for example, now has direct Detroit-Tucson flights), Amtrak, bus or highway. The favorite way, however, to get around and see the desert at its best is by horse. For that, a galaxy of resorts are ready to put you into a saddle.

TANQUE VERDE RANCH — High in the foothills, the Tanque Verde borders the million-acre Coronado National Forest. It offers a textbook example of wide open spaces. Two heated pools, health club and classy dining room aside, horses are still the main attraction at the 130-year-old establishment with one of the largest guest stables in Arizona. Route 8, P.O. WESTWARD LOOK — A short ride from downtown Tucson, the Westward boasts elegant rooms, balconies, paths, flowers and super scenery. CANYON RANCH — This multi-million dollar vacation fitness resort, is part of a condominium community where overnight guests are welcome.
