Canton to get post office by next year

Canton Township took a giant step forward toward gaining its own identity last week.

Canton now will have its own post office — probably within a year.

James Poole, Canton Township Supervisor, received confirmation late Friday that federal funding was approved for a post office.

"I'm just tickled to death," said Poole. "I think it's a landmark decision. We will have a full-service office. It will do everything a post office should except dispatch drivers. . . . Maybe someday we will have our own dispatch service."

Home delivery service for Canton will continue to come from Westland and Wayne offices, as it has been since January. Before that, Canton postal carriers were dispatched from Plymouth.

Currently, the only postal window service in Canton is at a courtesy desk at Meijer Thrifty Acres on Ford and Canton Center roads. Residents can mail packages and buy stamps at this window.

BECAUSE THE POST office will be a federal facility, Canton won't pay any construction costs. The facility will focus on consumer-oriented services —

selling stamps and postal boxes and mailing packages.

Poole said he was given tentative information that the post office will be located in the more heavily populated center portion of the township, between Joy and Cherry Hill, and Haggerty and Canton Center.

A formal population and needs study, called Retail Analysis Profile (RAP), will determine the location of the post office and the economic feasibility of using an existing facility or construction of a new building. The study should be completed by early 1982, Poole said.

The U.S. Postal Service, with a local main office in Detroit and a regional office in Chicago, has been involved with studies pertaining to the Canton post office.

If an existing site is selected, postal services could begin in six months, Poole said. Construction of a new facility could delay service for about one year.

Poole and grants coordinator Terry Carroll have worked with U.S. Rep. William Ford, D-Taylor, and a Washington, D.C., lobbyist firm Linton, Miels, Reiser & Cotton for a post office since January.

Ford represents the 15th Congressional District, which includes Canton. He also is chairman of the House Post Office and Civil Service Committee.

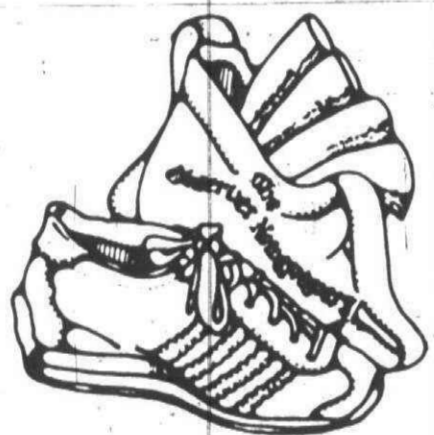
Canton farmers stay busy

Man shot — not seriously hurt

An Inkster man was arrested in Ypsilanti Tuesday after he allegedly abducted a Plymouth machinist at gun point earlier that day. The Plymouth man was shot in the leg, but not seriously hurt, during the incident.

Canton police held the suspect pending his arraignment. He was expected to be charged Wednesday pending identification by the victim.

The incident began about 8:30 a.m. when Michael Kay, 25, of Plymouth stopped at a traffic light at Main and Joy roads. A man in his mid-20s jumped in on the passenger side of the Ford-Ranchero and demanded Kaye

drive him to Ypsilanti, according to Canton police.

Kay was shot a few minutes later in a tussle over the gun at Canton Center near Geddes Road in Canton.

He was treated at Garden City Osteopathic Hospital and released later that morning.

Kay said he was on his way to his second day, at a new job at the Valcon Engineering Co. in Canton when he stopped for a red light at the intersection.

A man in his mid-20s, with short hair and wearing dark glasses, jumped into the truck from an open passenger door, Kay said.

HE JUMPED into my car and said,

"Let's go to Ypsilanti," Kay recounted. "No other words were said."

Kay drove six miles before coming to a stop at another red traffic light on Canton Center near Geddes.

"I almost missed it," Kay said of the light. "I stopped fast and I guess he thought I'd do something there."

The suspect then raised the gun to Kay's head, said Kay.

"That's when I put both feet on the brakes and grabbed his right wrist with my right hand and shoved the gun down."

The 22-caliber handgun went off as it dropped into Kay's lap. The bullet entered the fatty part of his left thigh.

"I had no interest in trying anything," Kay said. "I was hoping he'd let

me off. But when the gun was raised to my head, I figured I'd better do something or I'd be dead later."

After one shot was fired, the suspect jumped out of the truck. He was last seen crossing a field off Canton Center Road.

Kay then drove home quickly.

Police later asked Kay why he didn't drive to the Canton police station, located a half-mile from the incident. He said his only thoughts were of his girlfriend at home. "I was really calm up until the time I got shot. I didn't panic until I got home."

KAY CALLED police from his Plymouth.

Senior-chores plan returns to Canton

After a two-year absence, Canton will rejoin Plymouth and Northville as a partner in a program to provide chores services to senior citizens living in their own homes.

Starting Oct. 1, Canton residents aged 60 or older will be part of the joint project, said Terry Carroll, the township's grants coordinator.

UNDER THE PLAN, young persons are hired and paid to mow lawns and walks of the seniors. Other chores include wall washing, replacing screens and windows and minor repair jobs.

A separate service will be a telephone reassurance system which would provide daily contact with homebound seniors in the participating communities.

There are no income requirements and no charge to seniors.

Canton's Township Board Tuesday adopted a resolution authorizing participation in the program. Other communities taking part are Northville and Plymouth townships, and the cities of Northville and Plymouth.

The city of Plymouth will apply for a \$48,500 federal grant under the Older Americans Act to purchase supplies and equipment for the chores program. A separate grant of \$9,700 will be used for a reassurance program.

Carroll and Clerk John Flodin noted there has been a cutback in federal funds for projects on this type.

"In view of substantial reduction of (federal) funds, it's to our best interests to combine our efforts," commented Flodin.

"There is going to be serious competition for those funds," he added.

Plymouth will administer the program, and Carroll said local administrative costs probably will be split among the communities according to usage. Details haven't been worked out.

Last year, Plymouth applied for a \$25,000 grant — which it had received in past years — but received only \$19,000. This year, the grant request is being expanded to \$48,500 because of Canton's participation.

The other four communities have been operating a chores project for a couple of years. Recently, Flodin has been attending the group's meetings, as it prepared to expand its services.

CANTON earlier had participated in an in-home chores service when it was administered by the Plymouth Family YMCA under the Wayne County Area Agency on Aging.

According to Carroll, Canton officials dropped out of that project in late 1979 because the YMCA was only serving a portion of Canton. Other officials also felt the YMCA was concentrating on servicing the aged in Plymouth and Plymouth Township, at the expense of Canton.

Complicating the services to the elderly was the fact that Canton and other communities were embroiled in a political controversy with the county aging agency, resulting in a splinter group being formed as the Out-Wayne Area Agency on Aging.

The Good Doctor is back! Dennis "Doc" O'Connor was named community editor of the Canton Observer last week.

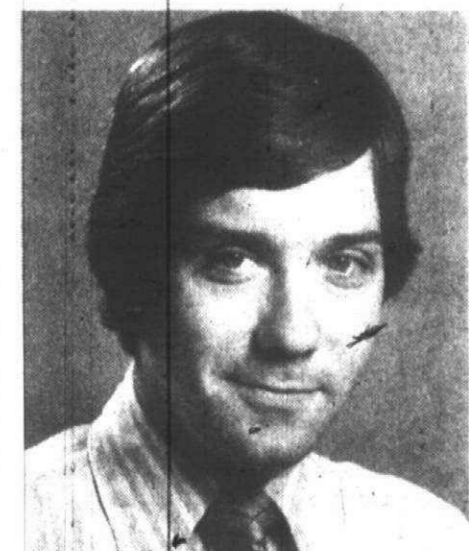
O'Connor, remembered for his weekly column called "Doc's Corner," returns to the Plymouth-Canton community after 2 1/2 years as sports editor of the Birmingham-Bloomfield, Southfield and West Bloomfield editions of The Eccentric, sister publications to the Canton Observer.

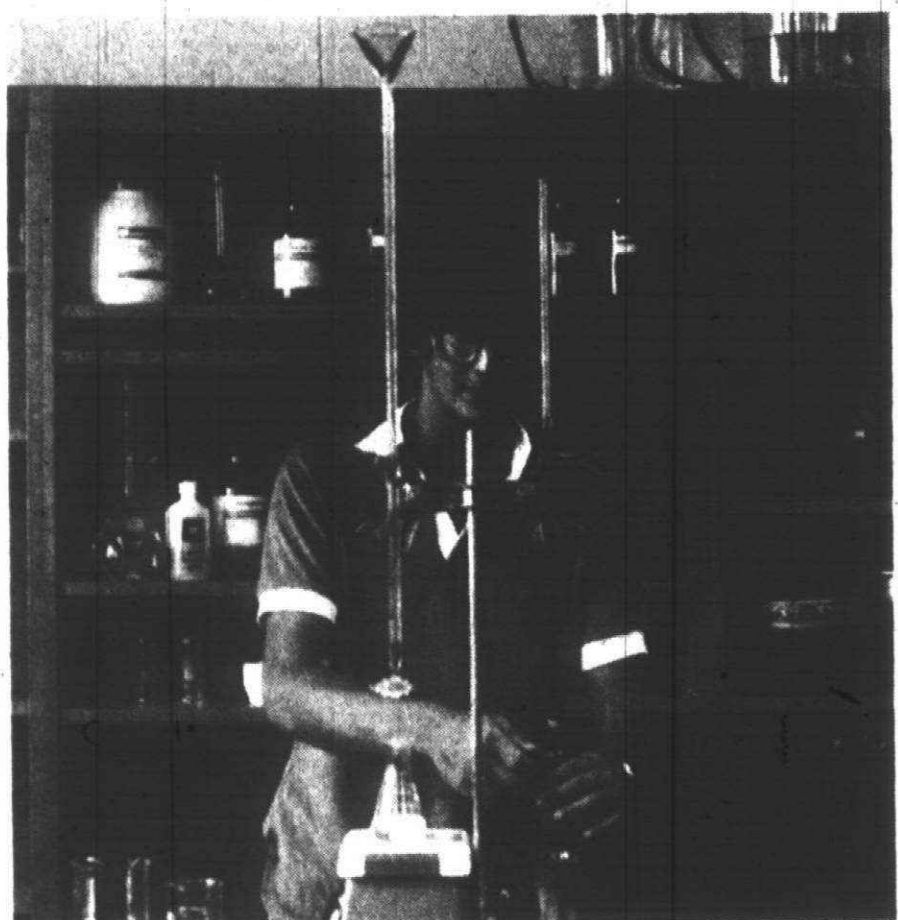

Innovative homeowner tries to save \$\$\$\$

John Corrunker of Canton was fed up with \$500 monthly heating oil bills and \$120 Detroit Edison for the winter months.

Rather than knuckle under to rising energy rates, he decided to harness sun, wind and water, as well as trying conventional options like insulation, fans and a wood stove, to cut his expenses.

"I refuse to give up," he said.

Corrunker estimated his energy-saving measures will bring his oil bill down to \$20-30 in the coldest months and his Edison bill down to \$50-60.

State and federal tax incentives for energy conservation cover more than half the cost of his projects, he said.

Corrunker has been transforming his 3,400-square-foot brick ranch home into a model of energy conservation. The latest innovation is a windmill, making him Edison's first customer to connect a wind-powered generator with Edison electric lines.

SOLAR PANELS in his roof heat all the Corrunkers' water for domestic use, and a wood-burning stove in the family room fireplace provides extra warmth in winter.

A computerized thermostat system regulates temperatures in four sections of the house separately and can automatically alter temperatures at different times of day.

Corrunker installed a 'hothead,' an experimental oil burner, which reduces heating oil to a fine mist, which burns more efficiently. He added a flue device to his chimney, which prevents heat from escaping the boiler through the chimney.

He's also followed more conventional energy-saving tactics, adding extra insulation, attic fans and lined drapes for thermal control. The Corrunkers and their two teenage sons are cutting down on extra lights and

electrical appliances, and cooking on a bottled gas grill outside instead of using the stove in summer, Corrunker said.

HIS MOST INNOVATIVE project, which he plans to complete by this fall, is a method of transferring heat from pond water to heat his home. He dug an 18-foot-deep pond the size of a large swimming pool in his yard.

Water at the pond bottom remains at about 55 degrees year-round, he explained. The water will be pumped through heat transfer pumps that extract the heat and use it to warm a house.

Since Corrunkers keep their thermostat at 55 degrees in winter, spring and fall, the pond should cover most of their heating.

"This system was not designed for ponds; it was designed for deep wells," he said. "If it works, it will be really great."

The windmill generates an average of 20 percent of the electricity the family uses annually, he said.

"It is strictly to assist our electric bills," he said. The windmill can produce up to 2.5 kilowatts of 115-volt alternating current. The most his family would ever use is, eight kilowatt hours in a month, Corrunker estimated.

HIS WINDMILL STANDS atop a 50-foot tower on eight acres of fairly open land on Ridge Road. It starts spinning with nine miles per hour of wind and runs at top output in winds of 14 to 32 mph.

Ten or 11 mph is enough to fully supply a house in the daytime when only a few lights and appliances are in use, he said. Winds are low in summer months, averaging 4.5 to five mph.

"The average windspeeds in this part of Michigan are 14 miles per hour from November to February," he said, adding that March is even windier.

Annual average windspeeds of 10.3 mph mean that Michigan is not well suited to exploitation of wind power, according to John Weil. He is senior vice president and chief technical officer of the Southfield-based Bendix Corp., which develops wind-powered generators.

If Corrunker's windmill generates more electricity than he uses, federal law requires Edison to buy the extra power, but the utility company can set the rate.

But Corrunker said an excess is un-

likely. He has installed a meter, though, that monitors the amount of electricity his windmill produces.

ENERGY CONSERVATION demands some sacrifices, especially in winter, he said.

"You have to change your habits. You have to get used to the cold," said Corrunker, who said he finds 55 degrees rather chilly.

"But that wood stove in the fireplace really helps out." It can heat the 30-by-30-foot room to 65 or 70 degrees, he said.

The computer-controlled thermostat also keeps specific rooms

warmer when they are in use, without heating up the rest of the house, or keeps the whole house warmer for a particular period of time.

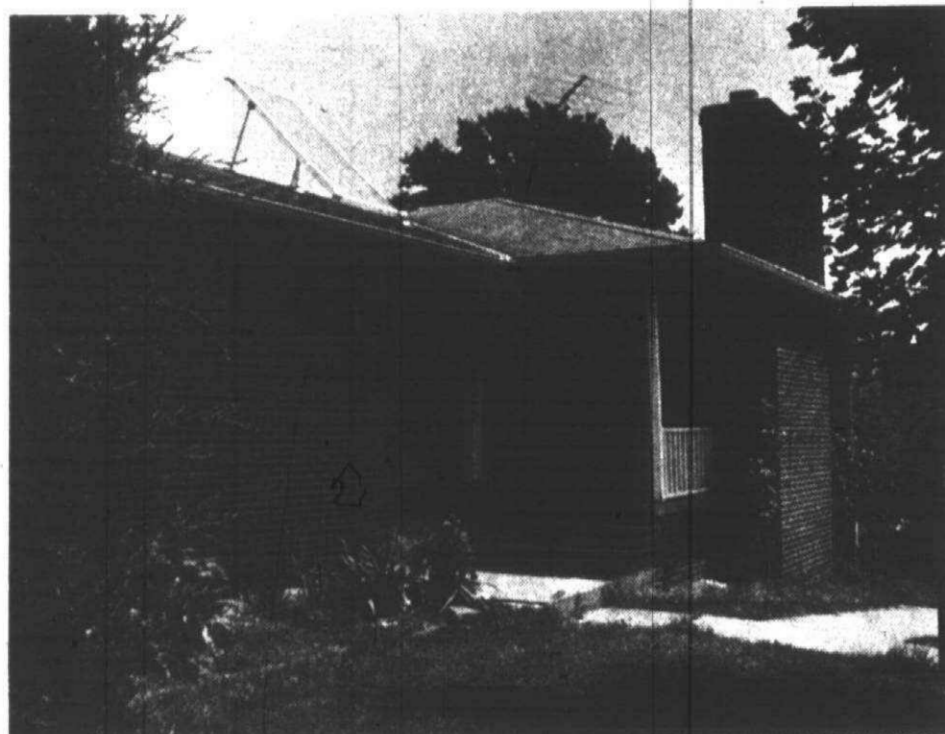
"We can turn the heat down to a base 55 degrees, but, say, I get up at 6 a.m. to get ready for work and I want the house at 65 for that hour. I can set the thermostat to heat the house an extra 10 degrees for that time."

It was the \$500 oil bills for three months in a row last winter - "It's what everyone out here pays" - that motivated Corrunker to take drastic steps to save energy. He said it was "greed" as much as ecological concerns that prompted him to seek out

wind, solar and water alternatives.

CORRUNKER, AN ASSEMBLY manager at Ford Transmission and Chassis plant in Livonia, has studied electrical engineering and business management. He describes himself as "kind of a handyman -- you have to be, or you'd starve to death."

He said he was encouraged by government tax breaks to make the large capital outlay of about \$7,000 for the windmill, \$3,100 for the solar panels, and more for pond, insulation and thermostat system. Combined tax breaks gave him the direct rebate of 55 percent of the money he spent, Corrunker said.

Officials OK lobbying

Canton has joined a newly-formed lobbyist organization which promises to give a louder voice to Michigan's larger townships.

The Township Board recently voted 4-3 to join the Chartered Urban Township Alliance (CUTA). The group, formed in March, is aimed to help townships of at least 5,000 residents and a state equalized property value of at least \$50 million.

Canton has about 48,000 residents and a property value of about \$499 million, according to township officials.

Membership dues for CUTA are \$1,500 a year. Canton also is continuing its membership in the 28-year-old Michigan Townships Association, at a fee of \$1,350 a year.

PROponents of the newer group say larger townships have more complex problems than the mostly rural townships in Michigan -- most of whom belong to the MTA. Bob Edwards, president of the new organization, is a former lobbyist with MTA.

CUTA officials say they plan to work to amend the charter township act for strong protection against annexation by cities; work toward joint services with member townships; and to seek a return

to townships the weight and gas taxes which currently go to the county.

Voting to approve membership in CUTA -- with evaluation after one year -- were Supervisor James Poole, Treasurer Maria Falkiewicz, Clerk John Flodin and trustee Carol Bodenmiller, who made the motion.

Voting no were trustees Robert Padgett, Steve Larson and Loren Bennett.

"THE MTA has been very effective," said Padgett.

Padgett said forming a second group is "somewhat destructive" to the older MTA. He said he would rather see the larger townships form a subgroup within the MTA "to take away that destructive aspect of being a splinter organization."

Larson said he shared some of Padgett's opinions. He also said he isn't convinced there is a need for Canton to join and pay dues to another township lobbying organization.

Flodin said he believes there will be advantages to Canton's joining a group which specializes in larger townships.

"After one year, I think we can make a better evaluation how valuable they (CUTA) are to us," said Flodin.

Nipping bike thefts

Canton finally gets own post office carrier of the month

CANTON OFFICIALS have wanted a post office for a long time, but gaining approval from the federal government is a long process. In fact, there

have been attempts to close down or consolidate existing post offices throughout the country in recent years.

Poole flew to Washington, D.C., in early May, thinking Canton would get its post office then. But, at that time,

federal budget cuts resulted in a proposal to close 10,000 existing post offices, hurting Canton's chance for a facility.

"The 10,000 thing was revised later," Carroll said. "We got word from Washington late Friday (about the post office). Poole and Ford really worked hard on it (to get the facility)."

MEIJER OFFICIALS said Tuesday they knew nothing about the new Canton post office or whether the Meijer postal window will continue servicing customers and residents.

Poole said the RAP study will determine if the Meijer facility will exist with the new post office.

"I, personally, think they can keep this one (the new post office) and the one at Meijer — and still support both," Poole said.

Poole said he plans to suggest to the Township Board that Canton offer the basement of Township Hall for the post office. The basement currently is used by the district court. A new courthouse, to serve Canton, Plymouth, Plymouth Township and Northville, currently is being built in the city of Plymouth. The courthouse should be finished this fall.

Take in a trap shoot or learn to backpack

Draw a bead on Vandalia, Ohio, if you want to take in the 10-day, 21-event, Amateur Trapshooting Association-sponsored 82nd Grand American Handicap tournament next month.

The tournament begins Aug. 13, with preliminary events scheduled through Aug. 16. Singles class champion, a 200-target event at a range of 16 yards, begins Aug. 17. The Doubles Class championship will be Aug. 18. The Clay Target championship, another 200, 16-yard event, will be Aug. 19 on a mile and a quarter firing line. About 500,000 clay targets are expected to bite the dust.

The 100-target preliminary handicap, featuring \$6,000 in added winnings, is Aug. 20. About 3,000 shooters are expected in this event.

The highlight of the tournament is the Grand American Handicap Championship Aug. 21. A championship diamond ring, silver trophies, cash prizes and an \$11,000 Jeep are up for grabs. The handicap draws more entrants than any other competitive shooting event in the world.

SPEAKING OF big competitions, one of the country's largest BMX bicycle races will be Aug. 1-2 at Waterford Oaks Bike Motocross track. The program race is expected to draw some 1,500 entrants for the Great Lakes Bike Motocross Nationals. Waterford is the state's only public BMX track.

The race is expected to prove attractive to pro riders because they can receive double points on the Aug. 1 date and triple points Aug. 2. The American Bicycle Association — all

racers must be ABA members — bestows national championships based on a point system.

A rider clinic will be taught by ABA pros 1-3 p.m. July 31 at the track. Fee is \$5.

Registration fees for ABA members who wish to compete are \$17 for beginner, novice and expert classifications, \$14 for the open class and \$20 for the A-Pro and AA-Pro classes. Spectators can watch free. The track is located behind the wave-action pool on Scott Lake Road in Pontiac. Phone 858-0915 for more information.

BACKPACKING basics will be offered 7:30-9 p.m. July 31 at Independence Oaks County Park. The program is free, but park entrance fees are \$2 for Oakland County residents, \$3 for non-residents. You have to register ahead by calling 625-0877 during regular business hours. The park is on Sashabaw Road in Clarkston.

Some 46 communities will be represented July 30 in the Detroit Metro Area Youth Fitness Meet finals at 9:30 a.m. in the Lower Huron Metropark near Belleville.

Boys and girls will compete in 50-, 60- and 75-yard dashes, softball throw, standing and running broad jumps, running triple jump, shuttle relay and chinning.

"DECADE OF Discovery" is the theme of the Oakland County 4-H Parade to be held prior to the Oakland County Fair, 11 a.m. Aug. 1, in Davisburg. Anyone who wants to take part in the parade may call Beth Bordner at 628-2117 or Leona Hutchings at 627-3889.

Energy-wasting mistakes can be avoided if you consider our climate, local building codes and energy-efficient construction when you build or buy a home.

In either case, the following energy conservation ideas should help you keep down home utility bills.

- Consider a square floor plan. It usually is more energy efficient than a rectangular plan. A round floor plan is even more energy efficient, but not too many people want to live in a round house.

- Insulate walls and roof to at least R-33 for ceilings and R-22 for walls. If you want to use more, you are probably better off putting it in the ceiling rather than the walls.

- Insulate floors, too, especially those over crawl spaces, cold basements and garages: R-22 is recommended.

- Don't ignore any heating or cooling ducts that run through unheated or uncooled areas. A good example is a duct that runs above the ceiling insulation or below the floor insulation.

- If the base of a house is exposed, as in the case of a mobile home, build a "skirt" around it. Be sure to windproof, then insulate around the beam that separates the house wall from the basement wall.

- Install louvered panels or wind-powered roof ventilators rather than motor-driven fans to ventilate the attic. Only use a motor-driven fan if it can be used for whole-house ventilating during cool periods.
 - Consider solar heat gain when you plan your window locations. Install fewer windows in the north wall because there's little solar heat gain there in winter. Put lots of windows with big overhangs on the south wall.
 - Install windows you can open so you can use natural or fan ventilation in good weather.
 - Use double-pane glass throughout the house. Windows with double-pane heat-reflecting or heat-absorbing glass provide additional energy savings, especially in south and west exposures. Three panes work best on the north wall.
 - Place your refrigerator in the coolest part of

the kitchen, well away from the range and oven.

- Install the water heater as close as possible to areas of major use to minimize heat loss through the pipes. Insulate the pipes. You might want to install demand water heaters if you would have a long run from the main hot water heater to a tub or sink.

WHEN BUYING a house:

- Consider all the ideas mentioned for building a house.
- Ask for a description of the insulation and data on the efficiency of space heating, air conditioning and water heating plants or have an independent engineer advise you about the efficiency of the equipment.
- Ask to see the utility bills from the previous year, but remember to adjust them for current utility rates, which will be higher. Even some new houses don't have insulation in the exterior walls. Be sure to check.
- Consider the need for additional insulation or replacement of equipment. If improvements are necessary, you may want to seek an adjustment in the selling price to cover all, or a reasonable share, of the costs.

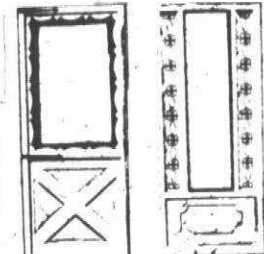

roll call report

Here's how area members of Congress were recorded on major roll call votes July 9-15.

HOUSE

DEFENSE SPENDING: By a vote of 190-194, the House rejected an amendment to make the Pentagon answerable to the same grants and contracts procedures that other departments and agencies must follow. The amendment was offered to the defense authorization bill, which exempts the Pentagon from a law requiring departments to use contracts in acquiring property or services. Because major contracts entail competitive bidding, the law controls the multi-billion dollar federal procurement apparatus. Its exemption permits the Pentagon to substitute grants for competitively bid contracts in obtaining basic research. The bill was headed for final passage.

Sponsor Jack Brooks, D-Tex., said that "given the \$1.635 trillion that will be spent on defense in the next five years," the exemption could result in "a less effective defense and millions of dollars wasted in unrealistic research procurement."

Opponent Melvin Price, D-Ill., said grants are useful in financing research by universities and think tanks and that "this authority should be clearly available to the Department of Defense."

Members voting "nay" wanted to exempt Pentagon research procurement from a federal law governing the award of grants and contracts.

Reps. Carl Pursell, R-Plymouth; David Bonior, D-Mt. Clemens; William Ford, D-Taylor; William Brodhead, D-Detroit; James Blanchard, D-Pleasant Ridge; and William Broomfield, R-Birmingham, voted "yea."

B-1 BOMBER: By a vote of 153-254, the House rejected an amendment that was unfavorable to production of the B-1 as the next-generation U.S. manned bomber. The amendment said that research and development money in fiscal year 1982 defense authorization bill

could be spent for any new bomber the administration chose to build; the radar-resistant Stealth is the main alternative to the B-1. This countered the bill's instructions that the money be spent only on the B-1.

Expressing "serious reservations" about the B-1, sponsor Wyche Fowler, D-Ga., said President Reagan and Congress should not be hamstrung by B-1 advocates as they proceed to make "one of the most important national security decisions for the next 30 years."

Opponent Samuel Stratton, D-N.Y., said the amendment would "take the control of our defense out of the hands of the Congress and have us sit supinely and wait" for President Reagan's decision on whether to build the B-1.

Most members voting "yea" opposed or leaned against production of the B-1 bomber.

Pursell, Bonior, Ford, Brodhead and Blanchard voted "yea."

DRUG ARRESTS: The House adopted, 382-49, an amendment allowing military personnel to make drug arrests outside of the U.S. land mass and military equipment to be used domestically for drug enforcement. This gives the armed services their first major role in helping civilian agencies police drug trafficking.

Supporter Dante Fascell, D-Fla., said: "Frankly, I am so frustrated at the failure of the federal government to come to grips with the crime and drug problem and with the inability to enforce our immigration laws, I am ready to turn it all over to the military."

Opponents argued that military personnel are untrained for making legally sensitive drug arrests that will hold up in court, and that the expanded authority — opposed by the Pentagon — would divert resources from the military's chief mission of defending the country.

Members voting "yea" wanted military personnel to have a limited role in

drug enforcement away from the mainland.

Bonior, Ford, Brodhead, Blanchard and Broomfield, voted "yea." Pursell voted "nay."

SENATE

NOISE CONTROL I: By a vote of 54-32, the Senate failed to achieve the three-fifths majority needed to end a filibuster mounted by liberals during debate on the fiscal year 1982 Justice Department authorization bill. The talkathon sought to prevent action on amendments limiting the role of the Justice Department and the Courts in advocating busing to integrate schools.

Most senators voting "nay" opposed the anti-busing amendments. Democratic Sens. Carl Levin and Donald Riegle voted "nay."

NOISE CONTROL II: The Senate rejected, 40-55, an amendment designed to retain federal noise control regulations in a way that benefits America's only motorcycle manufacturer, the Harley Davidson Motorcycle Co. of Milwaukee, Wisc. The amendment was offered to a bill that returns most authority for controlling noise from Washington to state and local governments. The bill was passed on a non-record vote and sent to the House.

SC trustees begin jobs

Two newly elected Schoolcraft College Board of Trustee members were sworn in and Harry G. Greenleaf was re-elected board chairman recently.

Sworn in were Paul Kadish and Laura Toy. The two were elected last month and replace Mark McQuestion, who retired, and Richard Hayward, who was defeated.

Also re-elected as vice chair was Nancie Blatt. Ms. Blatt was re-elected as trustee director to a state communi-

ty college group. Rosina Raymond and Michael Burley were elected treasurer and secretary. Burley was also reappointed as delegate to SBMCOG.

Joyce Ludwig was named acting associate board secretary.

The year's meeting schedule holds three exceptions to the general board policy of meeting on the fourth Wednesday of each month. Off-time meetings were set for July 15, Nov. 18 and Dec. 9.



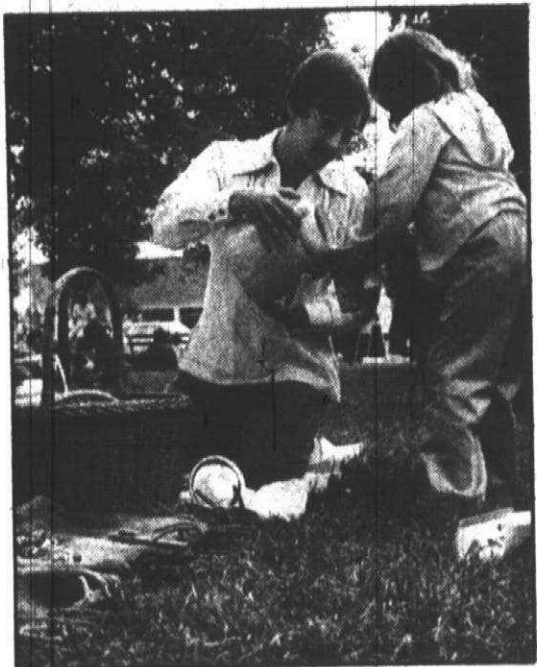

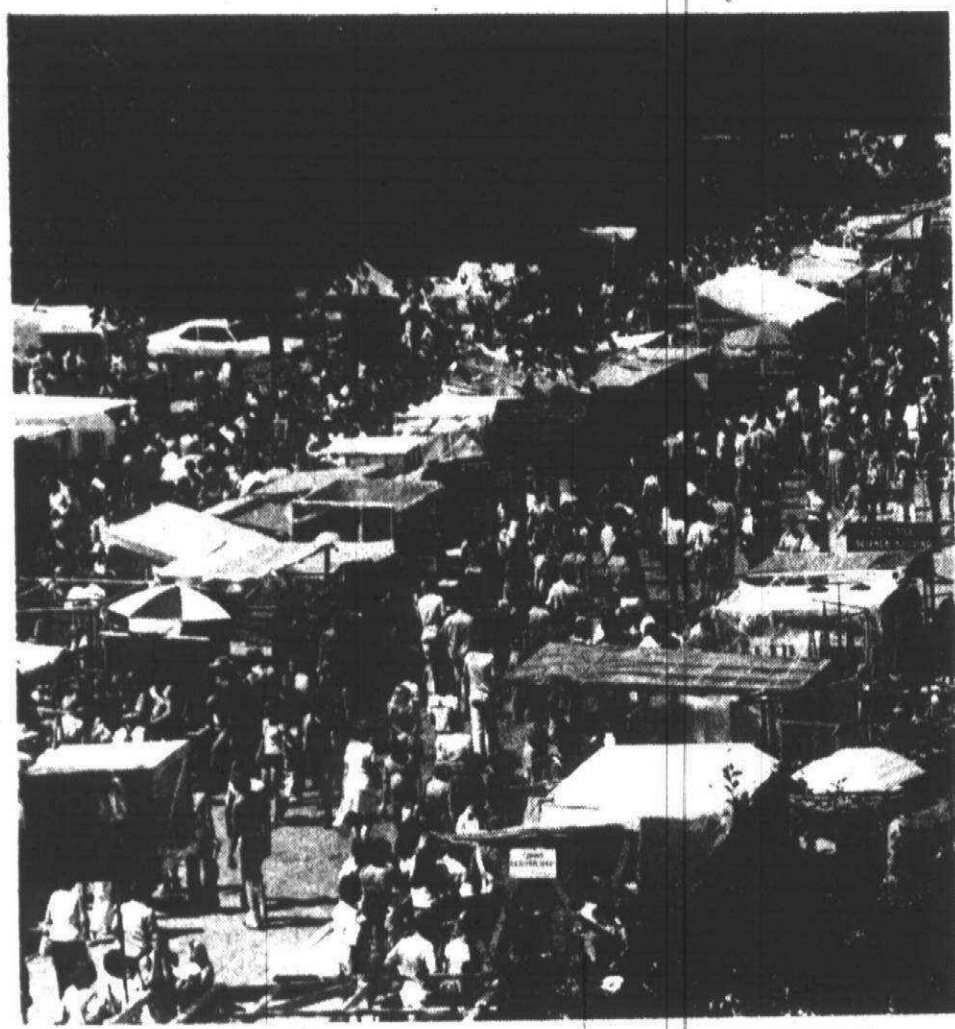

Dangerfield triumphs with rapid-fire humor

After weathering some rude fans and a power failure that left him without lights or a microphone at Meadow Brook last Friday, comedian Rodney Dangerfield snapped back with a rapid-fire comedy set of his best caustic humor.

True to his trademark phrase, "I don't get no respect," Dangerfield didn't get much of it from a few disgruntled fans who kept hollering that he was talking too fast.

He slowed down and so did his jokes. But, eventually, the 60-year-old New Yorker hit his stride and the crowd settled down.

Dangerfield gets the biggest laughs from jokes about his wife and his sex life.

"I asked a cab driver to take me where I could get a little action. . . He took me to my house," he told the overflow crowd.

"I know I'm not a sexy guy. When I

review

put my underwear on, I hear the 'Fruit of the Loom' guys giggling."

Dangerfield paced the stage nervously, wiping his brow, pulling on his tie, and occasionally inviting questions from the audience. Heckling him is risky, as the guy who asked Dangerfield what he did for a living found out.

"I get guys for your sister," Dangerfield shot back.

Meadow Brook is probably too large for Dangerfield. He talks extremely fast and some people out on the hill couldn't pick up his material.

Dennis Blair, a Dangerfield protege, opened the show for him. He bills himself as musical humorist but does excellent impressions as well. "I start filming a television special in August," Dangerfield said in an interview before the show. "I wrote most of the show, and I will star in it as well."

Director Billy Wilder always manages a wonderful blend of comedy and drama in his films. "Stalag 17" and "The Apartment" (1960), for instance, have humorous moments; "Some Like it Hot" (1959) has poignant interludes. Of course, this mixture of elements serves to highlight parts of the whole, develops character, makes us sympathize with characters, and creates a well-balanced, well-paced film. William Holden is the outsider in the P.O.W. camp, Stalag 17. Robert Strauss and Harvey Lembeck provide comedic relief (in the vein of Emmett Kelly's "Weary Willie" clown character). Otto Preminger is excellent as the camp commander. Rating: \$3.60.

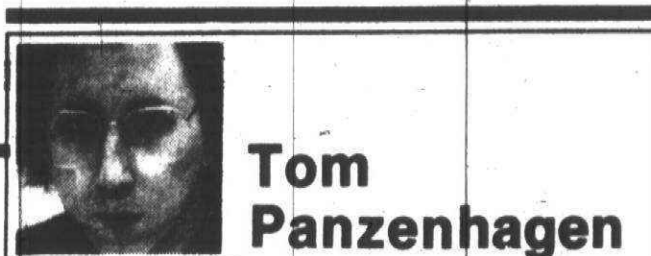
"Rio Grande" (1950), 2:30 p.m. Sunday on Ch. 2. Originally 105 minutes.

The final act of the John Ford/John Wayne western trilogy ("Fort Apache," 1948, "She Wore a Yellow Ribbon," 1949), should have been the second installment. Whereas "Yellow Ribbon" finds Wayne near retirement, in his closing days as a cavalry officer, "Rio

Grande" picks up where "Apache" leaves off. Wayne, formerly second in command to Henry Fonda, is promoted to commandant. "Fort Apache," because of its blunt characterizations and attack on bigotry, is the best of the lot. "Yellow Ribbon" is overly sentimental; again, "Rio Grande" belongs somewhere in the middle. Maureen O'Hara and Ben Johnson co-star. Rating: \$3.15.

"The Naked Runner" (1967), midnight Monday on Ch. 7. Originally 104 minutes.

Frank Sinatra has made plenty of mediocre films, but a few of his pictures have been very good. Among them is "Naked Runner," a spy thriller that has businessman Sinatra pressed into action as an assassin. The question is, which government has drafted the expert marksman into duty? Rating: \$3.10.

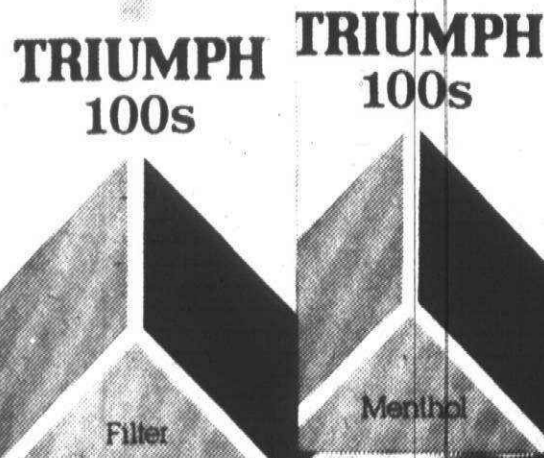
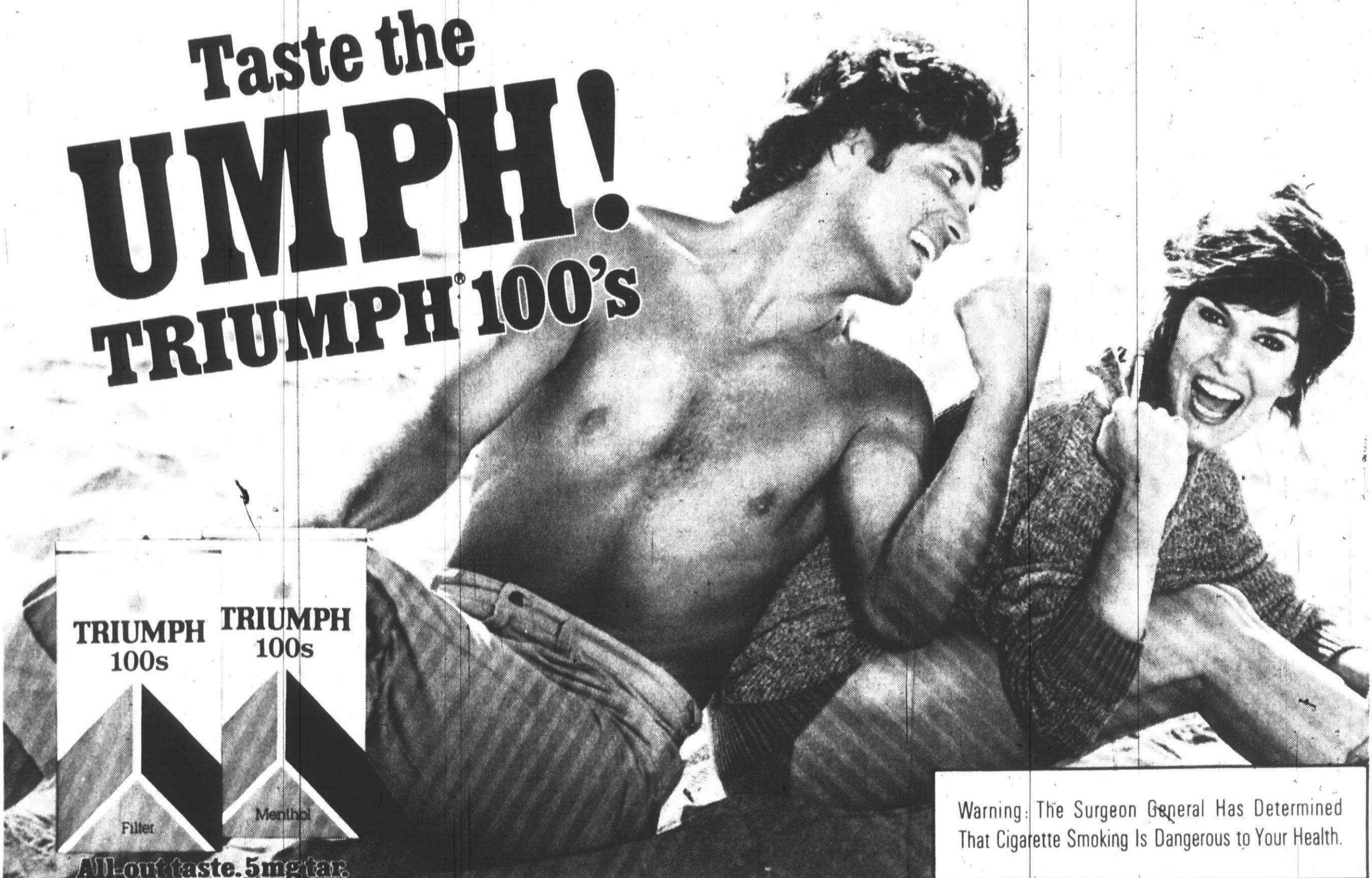

backgammon

● LEAVING YOUR ANCHOR

Todd of Plymouth writes:
I've been following your backgammon column for almost a full year and look forward to reading it every week. Most often I'm able to select a good move by way of analyses and percentage computations. However, the enclosed game situation has puzzled me to no end, which has prompted me to write. With my opponent holding the cube at 2, 1, as white, now roll a 4-1.

I thought it best to leave the black 5 point now, since black could hardly hit with a 3 and cover with a 3, 5, or 6 (five out of 36 chances). My opponent then rolled double 2s — which I never considered. He hit my open blot on the 5 point, covered the blot on the 1 point and split the checkers in my home board.

After I failed to re-enter, the open blot on the 10 point was hit. Unfor-

tunately, I was gammoned. I would like your opinion on the 4-1 move in this position.

There is a proper time to leave your anchor. Sometimes it is forced, but most often it is voluntary. You chose to leave since black had an exposed blot. But did you ask yourself why? If you were hit, would you really want to hit black on the 1 point?

This would be helping black recirculate a checker and preserve his timing. Having a third black checker in white's home board could be dangerous since black will try to capture the 4 point and also have the free runner to do with as he pleases.

One learns through experience never to leave your anchor prematurely (unless absolutely necessary), even if it appears to be somewhat safe. Freak accidents and lucky disaster rolls can be

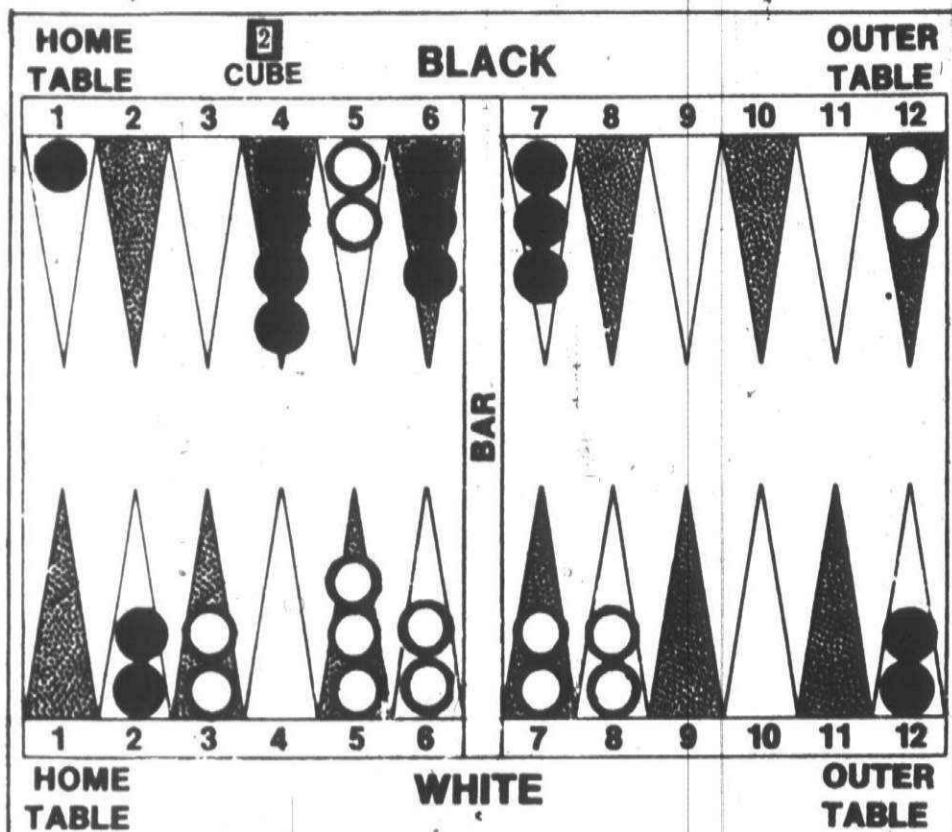
avoided to a degree. Remember, holding means survival.

There are really several good moves. All have merit. For the conservative player, moving both checkers off the 7 point creates two more builders. Should black escape with one checker, four builders aimed at the 2 point give him little hope of surviving. I don't favor this move since black could escape with 5s. But I find little else wrong with it.

An aggressive move that could either cinch the game or lose it would be for white to move a checker from the 8 and 5 point, closing the 4 point. This move duplicates the 6s black needs to hit and cover. Since white could easily cover the 8 point blot on the next roll if not hit, this move could become an instant winner or loser.

The last viable option, which is neither too conservative or aggressive, is to bring a checker down from the 12 point to the 8, leaving a simple direct 1 shot. This move allows white to keep his prime intact, maintain the 5 point anchor, create one builder and still control the outer boards. I prefer this move since it accomplishes much and only leaves black one chance to hit, with 1-1 as the only disaster roll.

Energy credit view is given

To the editor:

Barry Jensen's energy column concerning insulation in the July 9 edition provided some important insights into the costs of energy conservation. However, his summary of the tax credits available for renewable energy source expenditures was inaccurate.

The devices do not need to be passive as suggested by the article. For federal purposes, active and passive solar devices, wind devices and geothermal equipment (but not water energy-conversion systems) qualify for the credit. The credit is not 30 percent of the next \$2,000 but 20 percent of the next \$8,000 as stated in the article, but has been 40 percent of up to \$10,000 in qualifying expenditures since the 1980 tax year. The maximum credit is \$4,000 rather than \$2,600.

Items which qualify for the federal tax credit do not automatically qualify for the state tax credit and exemptions. Conversely, some items and components specifically excluded for federal purposes may qualify under the state program.

The state program covers solar, wind, and water energy conversion systems (not geothermal). Ground-water heat pumps and low-head hydro systems qualify for the state credit but not for the federal credit when used in conjunction with an eligible device but are

specifically excluded for the federal credit. Eligible devices also may be exempted from property, sales, and use taxes.

In order to obtain the state credit and exemptions, a comprehensive application for certification of the system must be submitted to the state Department of Commerce. Application forms and information may be obtained by calling the Energy hotline — 1-800-292-4704.

Our final caution, in order to qualify for the 15-percent federal energy conservation items deditred (insulation, etc.), your principal residence must have been substantially completed before April 20, 1977. Only your principal residence qualifies for the credit.

Club signs need repairs

To the editor:

Our "Welcome to Plymouth" signs at seven entrances to our lovely city were a very important project for our many service clubs a few short years ago.

Milliken now holds key to county charter

A vote on the proposed Wayne County Charter could be delayed a year or more if Gov. William Milliken approves recommendations made last week by an assistant attorney general to require charter revisions.

Milliken can veto the charter proposal, but cannot change it. The assistant attorney general, Roderick T. MacGillis, recommended more than a dozen changes in the document. Milliken may require a second, 45-day session of the charter commission to make the changes.

"I don't think they're very serious (changes)," said George Ward, charter commission president. "I prepared a point-by-point reply to the letter from the assistant attorney general."

"I really don't think the governor will reject it, although that could be famous last words."

The governor has had no public comment on the proposed changes.

Perhaps the most serious objection to the charter proposal is language to cut terms for many elected county officers from four years to two years on a one-time basis. The purpose is to put the county executive, the governor and all elected county officers on the same ballot.

A COMMISSION staffer said a six-hour meeting with Milliken's staff Friday failed to result in immediate agreement.

And the staffer said the charter commission would probably not back off cutting elected terms. "It doesn't make sense to set up a system of government that's got built into it its own time bombs," he said.

If Milliken requires a new session, a public charter vote may not be held until November 1982. "The charter then does not take effect until '83 or '84, by the time you elect the county executive and those people," the staffer said.

School farm must stimulate learning, if saved

A PROPOSAL is being considered by the Rotary Club of Plymouth to undertake the operation of the School Farm, which was closed the first of this month.

The proposal may be voted upon at tomorrow's membership meeting of the club, and then will have to be carried to the Plymouth-Canton Board of Education for consideration.

The plan has some merit because it links citizen and financial support from the Rotarians with the learning expertise of school administrators.

The club has clearly stated that the school district would be responsible for leadership in curriculum development to make sure the farm site becomes an actual learning laboratory.

The club also makes an important distinction in recognizing that the caretaker who lives on the farm to maintain buildings and care for livestock does not have to be trained as a teacher or necessarily participate in educational activities.

The proposal also includes some suggestions to help put the farm on a self-paying basis, such as rental of some of the excess acreage.

The school board recently expressed an interest in developing a program at the farm site to replace sixth grade camp. A program at the farm could include stress on nature, the environment, earth science and biology, and on farming and animal husbandry.

There is sufficient land at the site to run a full camp program, and the wooded area with trails easily lends itself to such a purpose.

Because of its interest in youth and in camp scholarships, Canton Rotary might be interested in cooperating with Plymouth Rotary to make sure that needy children could attend a camp at the farm site.

In earlier statements, the school board has made it clear that opening the farm won't be seriously considered unless some rather solid proposals are

made on making maximum educational use of the site.

The school board also has stated that financial support and broad-based local support would be required. The backing of Plymouth Rotary, if it comes, would provide the latter. The school administrators could come up with a learning program for the farm.

Farmers in the area, 4-H leaders, Rotarians and others do have expertise they could offer voluntarily to turn the farm site into a camp program or some other kind of learning station which would benefit students at all grade levels.

But the curriculum must, and can be, developed by the school district's department of instruction.

If school and civic leadership can form a working partnership, it is possible to run a learning program on the farm site without incurring high labor costs for the school district and its taxpayers.

The farm has value but should not be reopened at the expense of school district operating funds which

otherwise would be used for reading, writing, language, math and other instructional purposes.

But the school board should take a look at reopening the farm with private financial support supplemented by voluntary help.

If Rotary agrees, though, to provide the voluntary help and financial resources, the entire farm program should be revamped. The participation should be broadened to include all ages, and learning experiences broadened to go beyond a petting farm or mini-zoo. If a solid instructional program is offered, then the school board has something which will maintain broad local support.

If Rotary decides to ratify its preliminary offer, the proposal can be an important building block to develop a meaningful program at the farm. In times of financial stress for education, though, let's make sure that learning for all ages is the result.

The high standards of Rotary, the community and the school board call for nothing less.

Even without a game, card fans gather

It may have gone unnoticed by most persons, but perhaps the fastest growing hobby is baseball card collecting. Yes, those cards you kept in a box in your bedroom as a kid now have value.

Collectors turned out by the hundreds recently at the Plymouth Hilton Hotel for the second national baseball card collectors' convention. Dealers paid \$35 per table to display their wares for shoppers interested in buying, selling or trading cards.

Those who participated ranged from amateurs like Dr. Harold Bussey of the Southfield school board to professionals like Jim Kovacs who runs the Baseball Card Store in Lakewood, Ohio. Kovacs said he had sales of \$1,500 one day during the convention.

Dealers set up their tables in straight rows throughout the ballroom at the Hilton. They put their cards in neat stacks or in plastic-covered pages. Especially valuable cards were put in glass-enclosed cases. Prices were neatly affixed to each card. Then dealers waited for their customers.

Shoppers roamed up and down the aisles trying to bargain for the best price. Many carried price guides which told them the value of any card. Dealers spent much of their time debunking the price guides. "They're usually out of date by the time they're published," one dealer said. "They tend to under-value the cards."

But there was more than baseball cards at the convention. Yearbooks, pennants, uniforms and autographed baseballs were prominently displayed. Even the wrappers that contained the baseball cards when they were purchased were being bought and sold.

In addition to the activity in the ballroom at the Hilton, small conference rooms were used for other convention events. In one room, the highlights of the 1968 Detroit Tiger World Series victory were shown. In another, a seminar on baseball card trivia was held. (Typical question: What year were two crossed bats on the front of the cards?) Baseball heroes like Al Kaline even put in an appearance.

All this came for the \$1 admission price. That's not a bad deal.

IT SOON became obvious that for all the talk about the value of old baseball cards, few persons were collecting for investment purposes. "If I had to make a living out of this, I'd starve," one dealer said.

Most dealers were enjoying the fun. They were friendly and eager to discuss their hobby. The serious transactions were not going on among the dealers and shoppers on the ballroom floor. But it was taking place among the dealers in their hotel rooms.

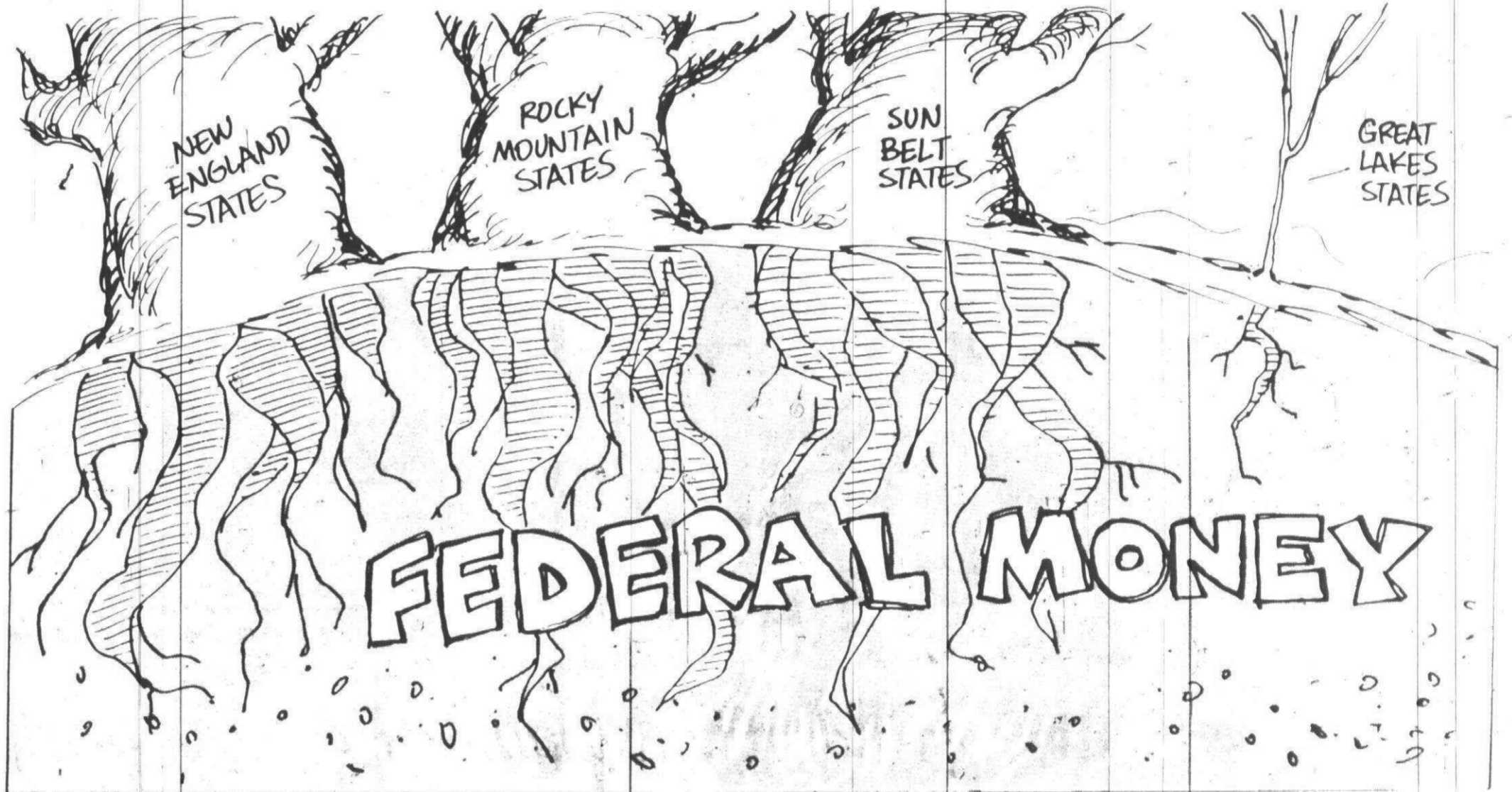
Dealers would leave their own tables for a few minutes and inspect another dealer's cards. "Let's meet up in my room at 2 p.m. and see if we can agree on a price," the first dealer would say.

The environment in the hotel simulated the atmosphere at a ball park. A concession stand sold pop corn and hot dogs in the finest tradition of baseball. Dealers wore uniform shirts of their favorite teams. Tables were decked out with baseball memorabilia.

One man was even going around to each table trying to sell insurance for baseball cards.

DOES IT sound like fun? Well, if you missed the national baseball card collectors' convention, you'll probably have another chance. The Detroit area is the second most rabid part of the country for baseball card collecting; (Los Angeles is first).

Why Lakes states lack political pull

Last week I outlined broadly a proposal from the Greater Cleveland Growth Association that Michigan join in forming a non-profit Great Lakes Economic Policies Council and a companion research institute.

Some of the political details also make fascinating reading.

The proposal was written by Dr. Nicholas P. Thomas, an Oakland County resident who has been through the political and economic wars in Michigan, Ohio and Washington, D.C.

Thomas, 46, has a doctorate in public administration from Syracuse University and other degrees from Wayne State and the University of Detroit.

He not only has academic credentials, he has political insight. Let me share some with you.

WHY PRIVATE sponsorship for the Great Lakes Economic Policies Council? Why not a public-private partnership?

"Past efforts by Great Lakes political leaders to create effective new regional political action entities have failed," he answered, "due to partisanship and petty bickerings." He cited attempts to form a Great Lakes Congressional Caucus and the effort by Ohio Gov. James Rhodes to restructure the Midwest Governors Conference into a smaller Great Lakes Governors Conference.

"Simply put," said Thomas, "the political leadership must get their own house in order and show that they are capable of regional maturity and discipline. An end to inter-state industrial and busi-

ness raiding parties" by the several governors would be a start.

Thomas makes understatement.

He says there are no simple answers to why Great Lakes leaders have lagged behind other parts of the country in creating regional organizations for political action.

"GENERALLY SPEAKING, the inertia can probably be attributed to the pattern of sharp economic rebounds throughout the Great Lakes from cyclical periods of recessionary declines.

"Republican governors of Michigan and New York have seldom shared the same public service views of their Republican counterparts in Ohio and Indiana." (Did you notice last month when the Michigan Legislature directed the Department of Social Services to find out why average welfare checks in Michigan are nearly double those in Indiana?)

"Interstate economic rivalry by political leaders has hindered regional political action," Thomas went on.

"Other parts of the country have benefitted from strong, almost dominant partisanship favoring one part over another."

THE PROPOSAL looks to heads of 300 corporations to provide leadership for the Great Lakes Economic Policies Council.

Is there a role for electric labor? Private sector unions only — not public sector unions, said Thomas.

"Teamster officials have already expressed support for the concept. Cooperative ventures between the United Auto Workers and the AFL-CIO with private interests within southeast Michigan indicate that unified political action can be forged if the issues are carefully drawn."

Thomas is talking about some big-time activity: Issues research, consensus building, political coalition building, cross-regional lobbying, monitoring congressional voting records.

Earlier this year I wrote about how Montana and Wyoming are taxing the living daylight out of coal which we buy for our electric power plants. Thomas notes those states hired a classy consultant to advise them on how to lobby against federal efforts to cut their taxes on energy supplies.

The stakes in this game are high.

Express checkout lines lead to nowhere fast

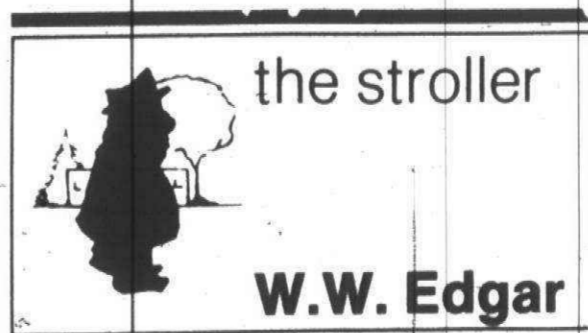
It isn't that he has anything against the young lady at the cash register — The Stroller doesn't want to cost her a job. But after the humiliation and suffering he went through, he is seriously considering leading a move to do away with the express lines in neighborhood supermarkets.

It all started when The Stroller recently took his place at a so-called "express counter." But before he reached the cashier, he already was suffering from fallen arches, high blood pressure, an upset stomach and the loss of appetite for the items in his basket.

And all because the folks ahead of him — all women — had two prices on several items in their baskets checked with the manager. Once the price was settled, they took time to write checks. This was the move that put The Stroller on edge.

Not only did they write checks, they had to have them approved, first by identification cards and then while the cashier checked her list to see if the customer was on the list.

In this case, the purchaser had the wrong number on her check. This took up time. All the while The Stroller, who had only four items in his basket, was fuming.



His ankles suddenly started to feel strange. Then he felt his insteps touching the floor, and he thought he might have to wear steel supports for the rest of his life. Meanwhile, he wanted to get home in a hurry.

The real blow came when his neighbors, with many, many items, smiled as they passed him by in the regular line.

Nervous and upset, he stood there helpless as the woman in front of him with only four items in her basket stopped to have the price checked on one of them. And, then, of all things, she opened her purse and took out a stack of coupons, and checked them to find the right ones, and then dug deeper into her purse to bring out a check book.

Express lines? Who are they kidding? Often times they are the slowest in the market. They are enough to upset the calmest of persons.

In his drive to end the express lines or the introduction of special lines for check writers, The Stroller isn't thinking of suing anyone for his suffering.

But that did happen to him once in his younger days. And he still chuckles about it.

One evening when he left work at the Mack Motor Company back home where he was helping to build the famous trucks, the conductor of the street car mistakingly pushed him and he fell to the brick pavement. He suffered a gashed elbow and his knees burst through his trousers.

That night he joined a group that included the town's top lawyer who smacked their lips at the thought of suing the Transit Company.

He worked up a case that included such things as cash for the gashed elbow, a new suit of clothes, and a lot more.

He went so far as to seek damages for the physical suffering, the sleepless nights and the humiliation of it all.

Would you believe it? The Transit Company settled out of court.

See the world via viewing mask



MONTE NAGLER

Using a viewing mask to zero in on your subject and to eliminate unwanted background results in a picture with strong visual impact.

Two weeks ago, I discussed the necessity of your pictures being more than just random snapshots. Your photographs should portray a calculated effort to express your feelings and share your photographic vision.

Your photos should convey the relationship between you and your subject — the two most important things in photography.

There is a very simple device to help you achieve all of this. It costs mere pennies, can be made in minutes, is easily stored in your camera case, and is an invaluable aid in helping you to "see" through your viewfinder.

It is called a viewing mask and is nothing more than a "window" cut out of a piece of cardboard in the proportions of your negative size.

Sound simple? It is; and you'll be amazed at its benefits.

For 35mm users, cut a 2-inch by 3-inch rectangle using thick cardboard so that your mask will be durable. By using your viewing mask to compose your shot while at the same time isolating your subject, you'll be able to better associate with your subject.

Extraneous, non-important items will not distract you and you'll find yourself being able to zero in on your subject.

Remember, simplicity in your pictures leads to greater impact. Previsualization is enhanced and you will find it much easier to select vertical versus horizontal formats.

Going one step further, viewing masks can help you in selecting a lens with the proper focal length. This avoids numerous time-consuming lens changes. To the left of the "window" place a scale listing distances from your eye in inches and corresponding focal length lenses in millimeters. For 35mm users, the

scale would be as follows:

distance from eye	size of lens
1 1/2 inches	24mm
3 1/2 inches	50mm
9 inches	135mm
13 inches	200mm

When you have a desired composition using your viewing mask, a quick glance to the scale will indicate the focal length lens required to

produce the visual image on film. For example, if your desired composition is attained with the mask 9 inches from your eye, use a 135mm lens.

At first, it may seem difficult to judge the distance from your eye to the viewing mask, but with a little practice you'll be amazed at your accuracy.



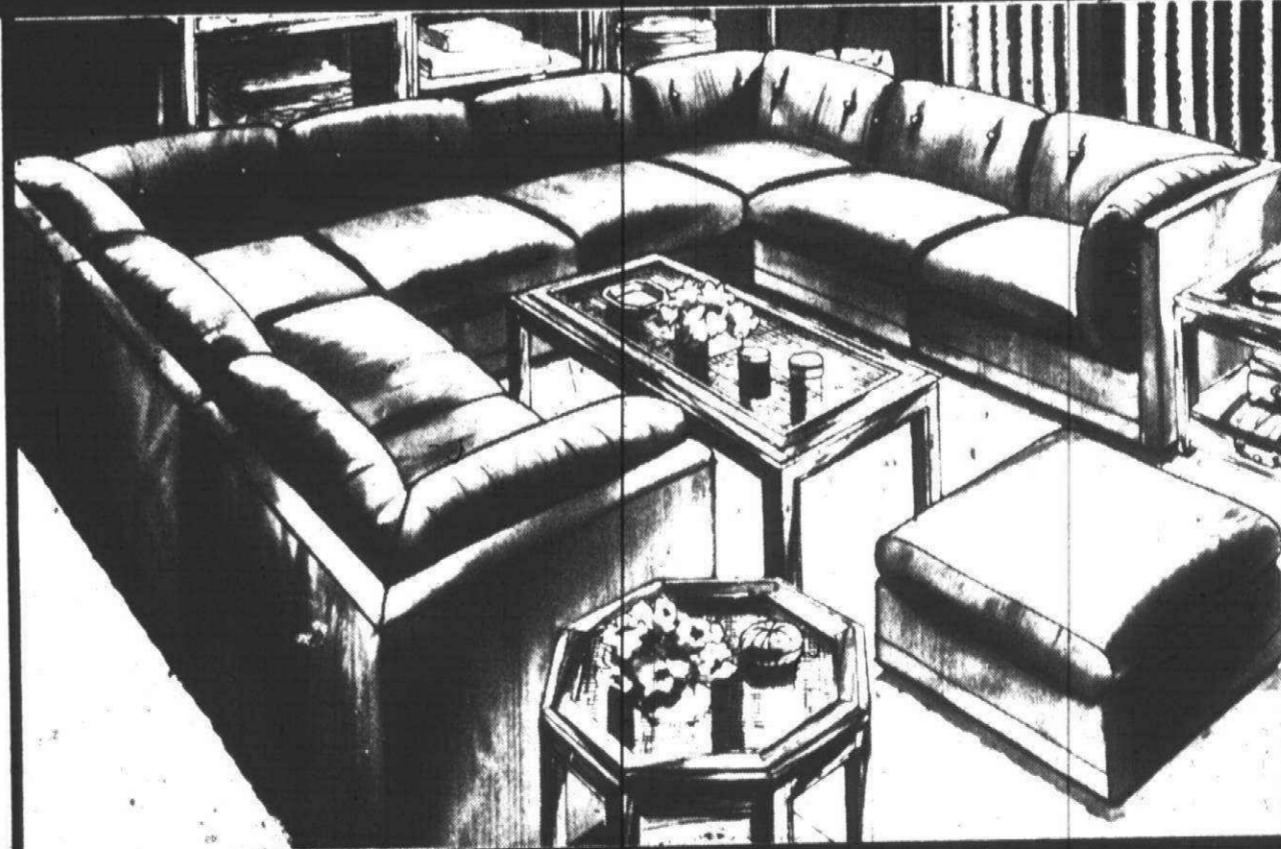

Hot feelings cool as both sides learn

WITH THE Fall Festival in mind, members of the Plymouth Community Chorus have been rehearsing Tuesday evenings over at East Middle School. Two loyal members of the chorus have been Joe and Joyce Hoppersberger of Livonia. Joe attended last week's rehearsal but Joyce didn't make it. She was at home — taking castor oil.

As a storyteller of old would say, "And thereby lies a tale."

The Hoppersbergers were expecting their third child — sons Peter and Josh are 9 and 8 years old — and Joyce was more than three weeks overdue, according to their computations. The doctor had recommended the castor oil. Joe and Joyce were not anticipating a speedy delivery.

It was about 2 a.m., July 15 that Joyce decided the baby was on its way. Shortly thereafter, she announced that there was no way that she could make it to the hospital. Joe called the Emergency Medical Service and prepared to cope.

John David Hoppersberger was born, at home, at 2:47 a.m. He weighed 8 pounds, 10 1/2 ounces. List to complicate matters, it was a breech birth. "The EMS showed up just before the head came," said Joe.

"I dumped everything out of a dresser drawer and we wrapped him up and put him in there for the ride to the hospital in the ambulance.

"It was the first delivery for the firemen, too," he added.

Joyce was taken to surgery and Joe marched up and down the hospital corridor. "The adrenalin was really flowing," he said. "After several trips past the nurses' station, one of them asked, 'Sir? Would you like a sedative?' I said 'No thank you. I have to walk this off.' The baby was fine and Josh slept through the whole thing. Peter was away at camp."

Joe is a mailman and his territory is in the Highland Lakes district of Northville Township. His fellow workers have taken to calling him "Doc." They make statements like "The mailman delivers!"

Joyce and baby John are home from the hospital now and all is well. Joyce may even make it to the chorus' Fall Festival performance.

As is usual, when members of the editorial staff depart, there was a special front page prepared by her compatriots. These one-of-a-kind front pages soundly roast the outgoing writer and are not the type of thing you show to your grandparents.

Darlene, Mike and Tari left for Texas Monday afternoon. Doc (Dennis) O'Connor was here Monday morning to take over as Canton editor — back in his old territory where he grew up, went to school, and broke into newspapering as sports editor.

PAUL Ganansia, 10, is visiting his aunt and uncle, Jeanette and John Hopkins of Plymouth. Paul will be here for six weeks.

He lives in Pornichet, France, a small town about five miles from St.-Nazaire at the mouth of the Loire River.

Paul is having a communications problem with his children his own age but it hasn't deterred him from learning the rudiments of baseball. Paul's sport is soccer and it's too bad the local teams are between soccer seasons.

MIKE WOOTEY of Plymouth and Bob Kiser of Canton Township have been spending as much of their summer vacation as possible at Wilcox Lake.

Mike, 15, is a ninth grader at Plymouth Salem High School; Bob, 16, is a 10th grader at Plymouth Canton High.

The first meeting to oppose the Roundtable group home in Canton took place in the home of Susan Kopinski. Mrs. Kopinski didn't want the group home in her neighborhood, but she found herself pretty upset at the suggestions of violent action she heard at that meeting.

She let it be known she didn't like that kind of talk in her home.

The battle that began that night eventually was lost. But through it both sides learned something.

Those sponsoring group homes found that informing the neighborhood about the arrival of a group home is a must — for both the home owners and the new residents. Those opposing the homes discovered that the development was not the threat they had perceived it to be.

Initially angered, about the casual manner in which they learned about the intended group home, residents of the neighborhood turned out 150 strong to a later public meeting.

It was called to obtain information about the home from representatives of the Michigan Department of Social Services, Northville Residential Training Center and Alternative Services. NRTC would be contracting with the non-profit Alternaernative Services to run the home.

Mrs. Kopinski, now a member of the neighborhood advisory committee that deals with group homes, as well as treasurer of her homeowners' association, said the representatives were called in to answer questions put by group home opponents.

"THE MEETING went well," she said. "We tried to keep it in control. It lasted a long time. The majority attending were against the home. That was very clear. The owner of the house (that was to become the group home) was there, although nobody knew it. He decided because of the resentment displayed not to rent it as a group home."

However, after being unsuccessful in his effort to sell it, the owner later rented it to the state. Six retarded males were moved in.

"I don't live on the street where the home is," continued Mrs. Kopinski. "But I began to hear that people had kind of changed their minds. It never had been personal (against the retarded). There was always concern for the children. They wondered how to explain it to 3-year-old children when they saw six retarded people out walking."

"But everyone said their children reacted favorably. There was no problem that way. One man who had been so against the home told me after the home was in that the residents were out washing the cars of the staff. He seemed really concerned about that."

But the feelings about the home that had begun to change suddenly iced over after a fire broke out at Roundtable.

"THE FIRE changed everything," said Mrs. Kopinski. "People got their old fears back. The fire was in a corner of the building — our houses are on top of each other — and it was a windy night. They feared something would happen to the house next door."

"They were very upset when they

saw a blackened mattress in the garage and learned that the person who set this fire that gutted the second floor had set an earlier one. No one was told.

"That person is no longer there. He's back at NRTC. They tell me he won't ever be placed in a group home. So that part got put to rest."

Not long ago a resident next door wrote a letter to complain about outdoor maintenance at the home. According to Mrs. Kopinski, Tom Kennedy of DSS arrived for a surprise inspection. Soon after that, the problem was corrected.

"The neighbors were really happy at the way the state responded," Mrs. Kopinski said.

"There will always be people opposed to these homes," she added. "I still have mixed emotions. I'm more in favor of them now, but it would be better having the homes in the country, in a farm situation. Not in small lots like this."

"All in all it worked out pretty good. They (the state) have to learn how to live in the community. They now have more educational meetings where people can find out what is going on. We didn't know at first what was going on, and we wanted some kind of letter explaining it."

"And let's face it, the people in the neighborhoods have to learn too. It will take time."

"I think everyone learned a lot from Roundtable."

What about costs?

Do group homes for the developmentally-disabled save tax money?

Figures are available not only for group home, but also for institutional and foster care. But, according to Ken Stockton of the Michigan Department of Mental Health, "the final tally isn't in yet, and the fundamental issue is not cost but humane treatment, appropriate care and full human status for those involved."

The cost per day for each of the six residents in Oak Ridge home in Canton is \$61.77. For another Canton group home, Roundtable, it is \$63.09. At Grantland in Livonia, costs are averaging \$52 a day.

This includes rental, insurance, food,

utilities, use of a van and staff salaries for the two Canton homes and all but rental for Grantland.

At the institutions, the costs are admittedly higher. For residents of the Plymouth Center for Human Development during the 1980-81 period reported, it's \$190 per day, because a federal court order calls for a high staff-to-resident ratio.

The average is reported at \$110 per day per resident of the Northville Residential Training Center.

But the figures do not tell the whole story, everyone involved agrees.

Not factored into these per diem

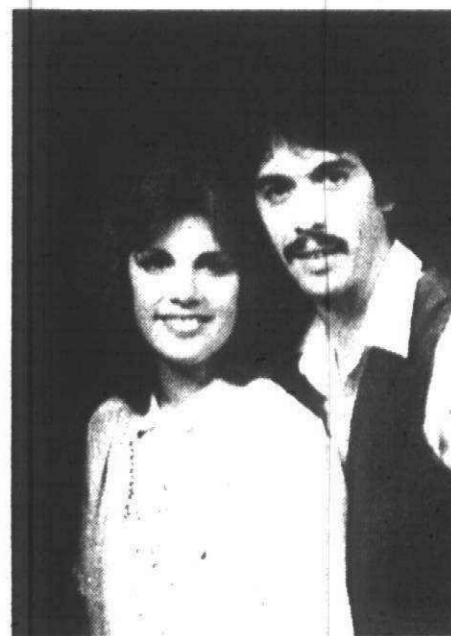

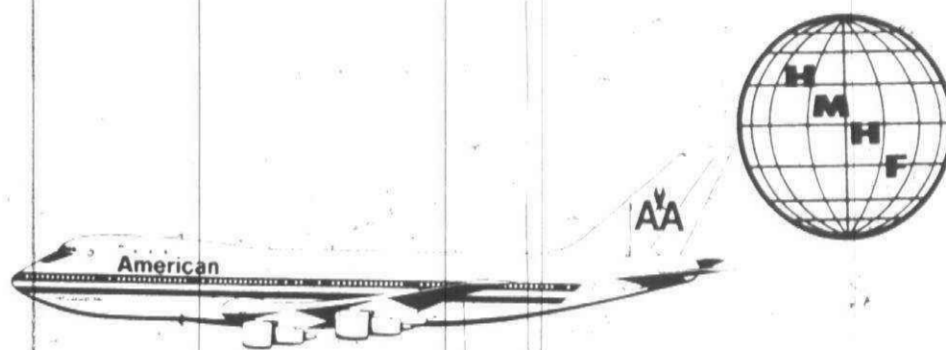

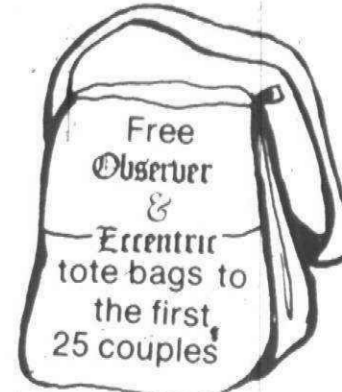

rates for the group homes is the expense of the visits of case managers, speech therapists and other experts from NRTG.

Another means of providing for the developmentally-disabled is through foster care.

There, the cost is \$24.77, said Janet Myers, community education and placement specialist for the Plymouth Center for Human Development.

This, she said, is what is paid per day, per client, to foster parents. They receive \$14.56 from Social Security as supplemental security income, and \$10.21 more from the DDM for training of those they have in their care.

FREQUENTLY AN ISSUE in discussion of group homes is the rental paid to the owner, and the wages paid to direct care workers.

The ceiling on rental fees paid to the owner has just been set at 12 percent of the assessed value of the house. For ex-

ample, the owner of an \$80,000 dwelling would get \$9,600 each year. The state expects to renegotiate leases set before this ceiling was introduced.

Stockton, in charge of regional community relations for the DMH, said 12 percent may be "too restricted."

"Investors could go to the bank and get 16 percent return on their money," he said. "Community placement needs to be competitive with other investments."

Stockton added that in this region 140 small group homes have been opened directly under DMH, "and the large majority are non-profit."

He added that most of the investors are not the operators of the home.

"This is good because not everyone who is primarily an investor is a good administrator or a professionally trained administrator," he said.

State budget guidelines define percentages to be spent on such items as food, clothing, shelter and salary. Providers are paid a monthly sum to spend within budget guidelines.

Christ the King pastor John A. Root retiring

After 13 years as pastor of Christ the King Lutheran Church of Livonia, the Rev. John A. Root will preach his farewell sermon there Sunday.

Root and his wife, Virginia, will at the end of the month leave for Lehigh Acres, Fla., a gulf coast community where they have purchased a home.

During his years with the Livonia parish, his fifth in a pastoral career that spans 37 years, he has supervised a refurbishing of the sanctuary.

His church's population now numbers 750 confirmed members and 450 communing members, he stated. "Membership has held pretty steady during the 13 years," he noted. "Offerings have increased, but that's inflation."

The retiring pastor, now 62, is a native of Toledo and received his early education in public schools there.

After attending Wittenburg University for a year, he graduated from the University of Toledo, where he majored in English, philosophy and psychology.

He earned two degrees from Hamma Divinity School and has taken additional training at the Institute for Advanced Pastoral Studies at Cranbrook and in England and Vienna.

Root came to Christ the King after a stay at St. Andrew Lutheran Church of Birmingham.

Earlier he had served Holy Trinity of Toledo, Christ Lutheran at Carey, Ohio, and Emmanuel Lutheran at Coshocton, Ohio.

In addition to his parish work he has been president of ministerial associations in Toledo, Birmingham and Detroit. During his current pastorate, he held the positions of both secretary and president of the Livonia Ministerial Association.

He was chairman of the Christian education and youth work committee of the Ohio Synod as well as director and counselor at Camp Mowana at Mansfield, Ohio.

With the Michigan Synod he has been chairman of the evangelism, salary study and synod/congregation consultation committees and a member of the conference center and camp committee.

Cambridge diet: some corrections

Nancy Austin's Tipping the Scales column published last Oct. 30 contained misstatements about the Cambridge diet plan. Here are the facts.

• Ms. Austin wrote that the Cambridge Diet formula is "none other than liquid protein, a pre-digested animal protein which was implicated in the deaths of 52 Americans in 1976. It is the same product — only with new packaging."

In fact, the Cambridge Diet formula contains no pre-digested animal protein. It is made from milk-based protein and soya flour enriched with vitamins and minerals. Similarly, the statement that the product was not new was based on the incorrect belief that it was liquid protein.

• Ms. Austin wrote that a diet of pre-digested animal protein, used as the sole nourishment, will

be deficient in complete protein, carbohydrate and fat, causing the body to feed on other parts of its system.

In fact, the statement does not apply to the Cambridge Diet products. For example, its label for the imitation eggnog allotment contains 50 percent of the U.S. recommended daily allowance for adults and children over age 12 and 100 percent of the U.S. RDA for vitamins A, C, D, E and B6, as well as thiamin, riboflavin, niacin, calcium, iron, folic acid, phosphorus, iodine, magnesium, zinc, copper, biotin and pantothenic acid. The label also stated quantities of ingredients for which the U.S. RDA has not been established.

On the Thames

A floating hotel heads from Windsor castle through British history

IT IS EARLY morning on the Thames River in England. The river runs smoothly between silent boats, roars over a weir and moves on, in a shimmer of ducks, toward the lock.

The ducks and coots are busy, as they always are, making glide lines on the water, while smaller birds squawk in the trees above. But there are no morning sounds yet from the nearby village, or from the galley of the Actief.

The Actief is a 100-foot floating hotel barge that carries 12 passengers on one-week trips from Windsor to Oxford, or Oxford to Windsor, with regular stops at historic sites and tiny villages along the way.

YOU HAVE READ about city riots in England, but this is Britain, too: Windsor Castle and Clivedon Reach, the Old Bell Inn and Sonning Bridge, formal flower gardens at ancient river locks; shopping in the royal regatta town of Henley; a visit to Mapleduram (Toad Hall in "Wind in the Willows"); and the green heights of the Goring Gap.

The Actief is an 150-ton converted Dutch Clipper cargo barge, 100 by 16 feet, with six small staterooms, a dining-lounging room, and a cheerful sun deck. It is marketed, primarily to Americans, through an organization called Floating Through Europe, which also represents other luxury hotel barges in England, Holland and France.

I joined the Actief at Windsor, a half-hour drive from London's Heathrow Airport, about \$15 by hired car if you call David Middleton (Windsor 68006), considerably higher if you grab a taxi from the airport curb. Here is my Thames River diary:

SUNDAY: In the dark evening, with the lights of the town reflected gold and white in long glistening bands from the bridge, and shafts of light banding the river from boats on the opposite bank, ducks make wet gleaming lines down the Thames.

Here on the Actief, the white wrought iron tables on the sun deck are silent. Dinner was simple and elegant, cooked by three attractive young women, now asleep in their forward cabin: soup, perfectly cooked lamb chops, cheese, strawberry pavlova and coffee.

Captain Bill Almond, deprecating and charming, but full of the history of the river, has gone to bed. Young Andy, from Arkansas, is throwing darts in the dining-room-cum-lounge.

MONDAY: At the end of the street, only a few hundred yards from our mooring, the town of Windsor bends over the water like a set from a Shakespeare play — peaked roofs, mullioned windows, Tudor fronts and all. A low stone wall follows the river into town, where Windsor Castle rises in gray and glorious profile on the hill.

Queen Victoria, imperiously dressed in bronze, stands above the roar of traffic at the corner of High Street and Castle Hill. Her back is to the castle, and her gaze is down Peascod Street, where people in suits and jeans, skirts and scruffies, move past Elizabethan storefronts.

The crowds thin now, but they moved in rivers moments ago, inside the Henry VIII gate or up to the castle green, where the changing of the guards has just taken place.

At noon, we pull silently away from our mooring, leaving Windsor castle with its crenellated rooftops outlined against the sky. One gliding moment upriver and we are between grass-and-tree banks, with picnickers under striped umbrellas at bankside, other river boats gliding distantly behind us and only the deafening roar of a Concorde out of Heathrow to remind us of the 20th century.

By mid-afternoon, we have passed through Boveney Lock, Bray Lock and Boulter's Lock, each with a neat, red brick lockkeeper's house and a glorious lockside garden. Beyond Maidenhead, we point through a widening river to Clivedon Reach, where we will moor below the handsome Italianate mansion owned by William Waldorf Astor and willed to the National Trust.

Stanford University runs Clivedon now, and as we climb steeply uphill to where the house sits on a plateau of sculpted grass, we meet students arriving for a summer law course.

It's a small world, so I shouldn't be surprised that two of them are Don Frank from Southfield and Susan Little from Grand Rapids.

TUESDAY: The lock and canal to Cookham bypass the natural bend in the river, where a weir dams the water. A weir is a small dam with water rushing over or through sluices a few feet high.

Weirs were built centuries ago to

provide deep water for fishing and flour mills; boats were either pulled upstream over the weir or launched downstream on a jet of water. Locks were eventually built near the weirs for navigation.

The red dingy of the Actief takes us under the Cookham bridge, built at the site where the Romans crossed the river for three centuries, and past the yard of John Turk, boatbuilder and Swan Master to the Queen.

Swans, once prized food, were long ago branded for the royal family or privileged groups; the historic Swan Master still rules the river population from Cookham.

A walk through the stile to Cookham village is a walk through British history. Here, the Romans crossed the river, the Saxons farmed, the Vikings plundered, the Normans recorded the town in their Domesday Book. The streets wind from the squared stone tower of Cookham Church to High Street, where buildings cant and curve through the old village.

There are glorious lunch smells coming out of the galley when we move upriver, past water gazers in folded chairs, a golf course and clusters of fishermen. Our itinerary runs from one glorious eating time to another — hot coffee, breakfast, midmorning coffee, lunch, midafternoon tea and dinner, all home-cooked gourmet meals announced on the chalkboard over the tiny bar.

Julie and Sue are old hands from New Zealand; Katie is a new arrival from the Cotswolds. All three are attractive young women who can move instantly, in a flurry of flying curls, from the kitchen galley to the ropes. The deck and docking crew as well are good cooks.

We usually tie up 100 yards further upstream in Hurley, but today the bank is full of summer picnickers, and Julie doesn't want to disturb them. So she waves Capt. Bill into the bank and ties the boat to a tree. Bill steers the long awkward boat from a high seat at the stern, shouting cheerful orders and making funny comments about his navigational situation as he goes.

The Thames is a do-it-yourself river, and every landing is a new experience. After the gangplank bridges the gap to shore, Bill leads us to the Old Bell Inn, said to be the oldest inn in England — "of which there can't be more than 100," he says cheerfully.

By 10 p.m., back aboard, the misted trees make dark shapes against the gray sky, with identical reflections in the steel-gray water. Only the gray-white hulks of neighboring cruisers break the blue-and-white look, while late night ducks make V-shaped streaks against the steel river.

WEDNESDAY: At 5 a.m., the sound of raindrops outside my porthole are followed by the early morning launching of ducks. We go through Hurley Lock early in the rain. Julie opens the lock, Katie closes it as Sue handles the ropes and the captain steers. The lockkeepers have business hours but the Thames is a 24-hour public waterway, so any licensed boat person can open and close the lock according to instructions on the side of the lock wheel, as

long as she leaves the lock empty and the gates locked.

By midmorning, we hear the sound of the weir ahead before we see the danger sign. It is the week of the Royal Henley Regatta, and the river beyond Hambleton Lock and around Temple Island is alive with racing shells.

The coxswains are small, with insistent chanting voices; the rowers bigger, stronger, pulling, splashing, moving the shells like a knife through the water. The white racing posts make two

straight lines down the Thames, pointing like arms to the square church that dominates the famous river town.

This is the expensive mooring on the river, right in the center of Henley, opposite the old curved streets. But today the reviewing stands are up for the regatta and the tents are full of racing shells, so a man in a gray suit runs out waving his arms: "Actief, Actief, no mooring this week." Bill does a U-turn in the river, blocking its width with our

It's like parking a car on a busy street. The Thames is used now only for pleasure boats, but there lots of them. We find one long parking spot on the north side of the river, and are waved in, while ducks paddle lazily out of our way.

Bill steers with great effort from the bridge, shouting, "Wednesday. We're just going to have to stop all these navi-

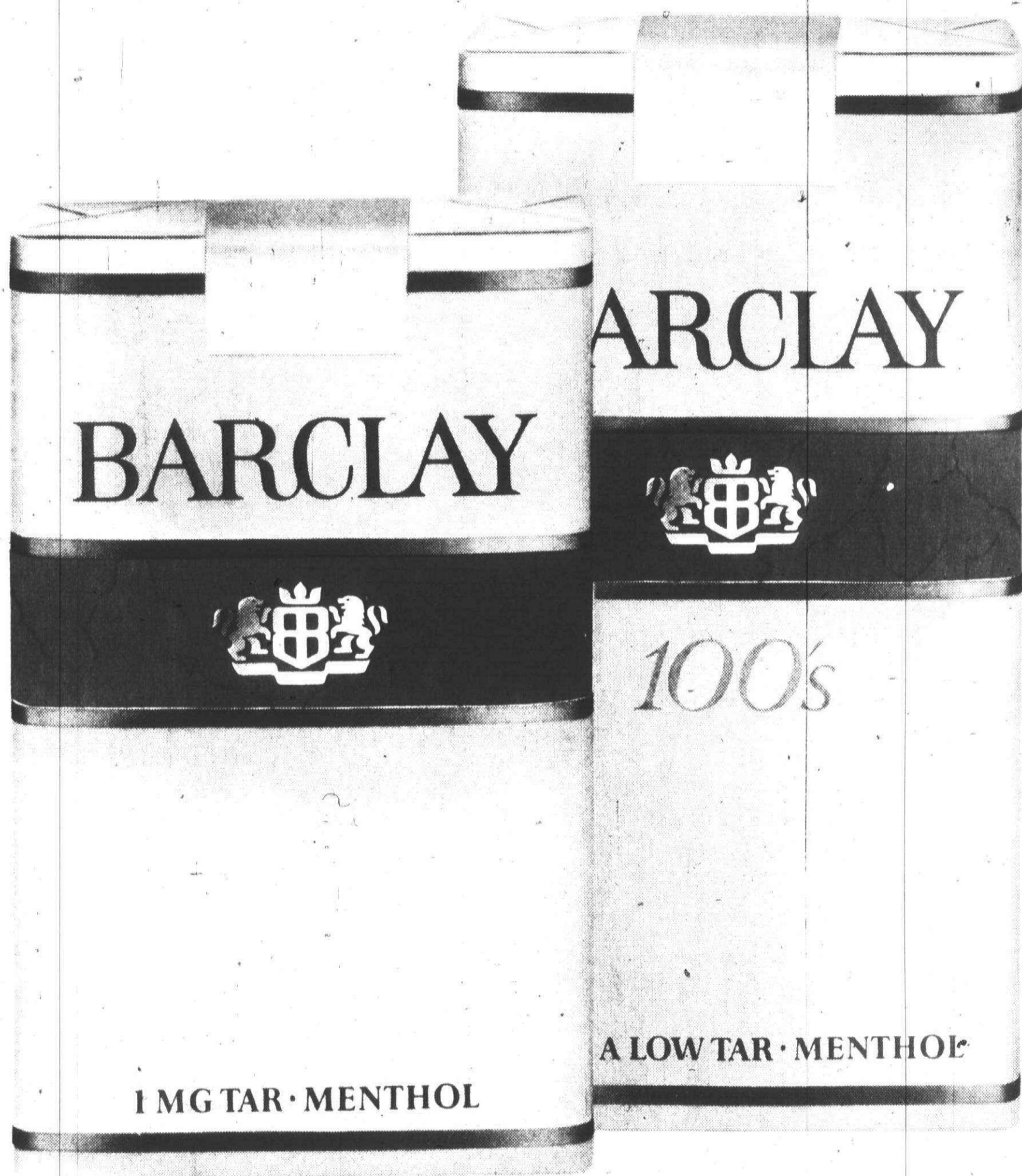

Youngsters set records at Canton fitness event

Sixteen records were shattered Saturday in the third annual Youth Fitness Meet at Centennial Educational Park, sponsored by the Canton Township Parks and Recreation Department.

First-place winners in classes A, B and C advance to next Thursday's state Junior Olympic Youth Fitness Meet at Lower Huron Metro Beach Park. Approximately 3,000 youngsters, ages 10 through 15, will participate.

Canton Parks and Recreation officials estimated that 175 youngsters competed in Saturday's meet.

Breaking Class B (12-13 year-olds) records included Don Howard, boys' chinning, 12; Scott Munro, boys' triple jump, 24-10; Michelle Contini, girls' triple jump, 21-11; Bob Powell, boys' running long jump, 15-3.

Other competitors establishing new marks in Class C included Jeff Powell, boys' chinning, 10; Stephanie Tellier, girls' softball throw, 104-9; Missy Smith, girls' triple jump, 19-6; Kirk Goleniak, boys' running long jump, 12-10; Kevin Ruskin, boys' 50 dash, 7.0; Sue Phalin, girls' 50 dash, 7.6.

GOLENIAK was also second behind Ruskin in the boys' 50 dash with a time of 7.05.

In the mini olympics for youngsters ages 7-9, Ryan Johnson was the big winner with firsts in the softball throw (147-9) and 40 yard dash (6.1).

Mini olympic winners are not eligible for the state olympics at Metro Beach Park.

SHE CONTINUED her attack with a solo round-tripper to deep rightfield in the fifth.

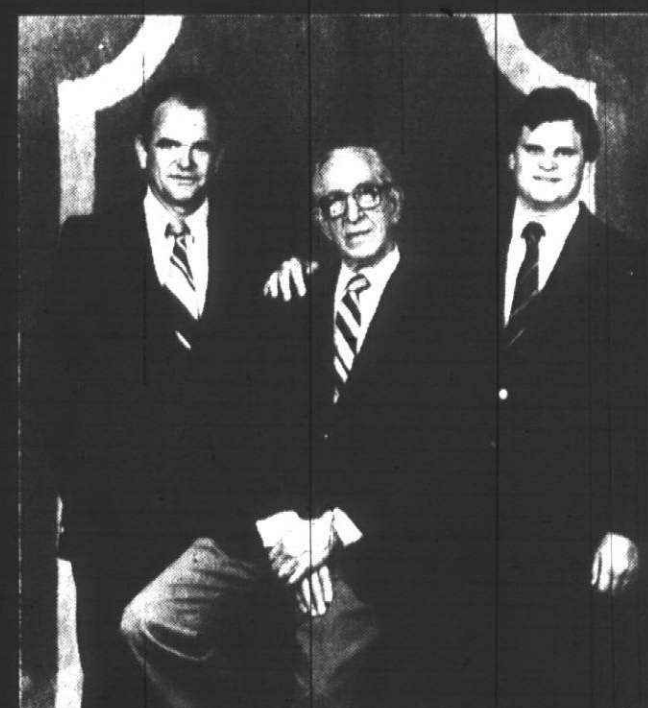
