**MEIJER THRIFTY** Acres, on the corner of Ford and Canton Center, received an award as the chain store with top sales in the state's "instant" lottery game. The Meijer chain was honored as the store with the highest gross sales and highest average weekly lottery sales per store. The awards were given by the Bureau of State Lottery.

**BOOK BOWL** semifinals and finals take place at 7 p.m. Thursday at the Canton Library, on the third floor of Township Hall, at Canton Center south of Cherry Hill. Teams from Tanger, Field, Bird and Fiegel elementary schools will compete. Superintendent John Hoben will moderate the action. The 1982 Book Bowl competition is part of National Library Week.

**CANTON JAYCETTES** will hold an installation party for its new officers at 7 p.m. Friday at the recreation center, on the corner of Michigan and Sheldon. Dinner will be served at 8 p.m.

**DID YOU CHECK** out Omnicon's coverage of the recent public safety hearing at Township Hall. It was some of the worst audio — and video — television coverage around. Be honest, now — have your eyes recovered from watching all that snow and static on the TV screen?

**MEDIC ALERT** pamphlets are available at the Canton police department, fire stations and Township Hall.

Medic Alert emblems — worn on wrist or neck — give vital health information about persons wearing them.

People with certain illnesses — diabetes, heart conditions, severe allergies and epilepsy — must continue to receive medication. The medical condition may not be easily recognizable, and the patient may be unable to communicate.

Public-service agencies can call a toll-free number to obtain medical information about the person wearing an emblem. The service is provided by the charitable, non-profit Medic Alert Foundation, of Turlock, Calif.

**JUDITH PLONKA** of Canton recently was appointed to the township's recreation advisory committee, replacing Tim Orbacki. The term expires Dec. 31, 1983.

Plonka, 35, has lived in Canton 2 1/2 years, and is a part-time accountant. She has coached girls' softball and is active in her children's sports activities.

**TREE SEEDLINGS** will be distributed free of charge by Canton's planning department from 10 a.m. to 1 p.m. Saturday at Township Hall. The seedlings range from 6-12 inches in height and are of several different varieties — a Austrian Pine, Red Pine, Scotch Pine, Norway Spruce, White Spruce, Blue Spruce and Silky Dogwood. Proof of residency is required. Limit will be six seedlings per family.

## Rocky roads could get dustier

Many Canton residents may be eating dust this summer.

The Wayne County Road Commission plans to spread one application of calcium chloride on dirt roads this year, then discontinue the practice because of high costs.

Canton's Township Board decided last week against spending existing money for additional applications of the dust-retarding chemical. A motion by Clerk John Flodin to allocate \$66,000 for two applications died for lack of a second.

"Nobody supported it," said Flodin. "When the roads get dusty — when anybody complains — they should call those other six (board members)," said Flodin, with a laugh.

**TOWNSHIP ROADS** are under the jurisdiction of the Wayne County Road Commission. In previous years, the commission spread liquid chloride on dirt roads about three times during warm months, to cut down on dust.

However, the commission told the township several months ago the practice would be halted because of declining revenues from license-plate fees and gasoline taxes.

Although the road commission is cutting the chloride service, it has offered to obtain a lower rate for townships through a bulk bid for chemicals. The chemical supplier would do the work, with Canton paying the cost, said Flodin.

An estimated 33 miles of dirt road in Canton would be involved, at a projected cost of \$1,000 per mile, said Flodin. The road commission will continue to spread chloride on parts of Warren and Haggerty Roads, which are "primary roads," said Flodin.

"THE PEOPLE of this community have become accustomed to having

their roads chlorided," said Flodin. "I think the pressure on us for calcium chloride will be substantial."

A \$66,000 allocation for two applications of chloride would come from contingency funds set aside for unexpected expenses, said finance director Mike Gorman.

The board members may be waiting to hear comments from a task force of residents who have been researching road issues.

The group, which will report to the board April 27, is expected to recommend asking voters to approve a special millage for road maintenance. Several board members expressed

reluctance to take on the expense — and future responsibility for providing this service.

"Where does the money come from next year?" said Supervisor James Poole. "We cannot absorb all the cost which the county previously did."

"Maybe that's one of the things we should start preparing the people for," added Poole.

CANTON HAS other priorities, said trustee Steve Larson.

## Arcade/restaurant finally opens despite quarrels

The lights flashed, the lasers zapped, Pac Man munched, the aliens invaded and battles were fought as Canton's first restaurant/video arcade recently opened its doors.

Before opening the Canton Wizard at the corner of Ford and Lilley, owners Jamil Akhtar of Plymouth Township and Barbara Baldwin of Livonia had to fight their way through several real life obstacles.

The Canton Board of Trustees gave its conditional approval to the arcade after several meetings, a public hear-

ing and a lawsuit. The board said it was concerned about the safety of the location and operation of the arcade.

Akhtar has met the conditions including: installing a bike rack, improving lighting around the building, constructing a sidewalk, keeping a fire lane clear and hiring a uniformed security guard.

The \$150,000 operation has a restaurant with "old games" decor and an arcade with "new games" decor.

**THE RAGTIME** music, antique games and pop signs that line the walls are part of the "old games" theme of the restaurant. The menu includes pizza, pieta bread sandwiches, submarine sandwiches, soup, salad bar and ice cream sundaes.

The sirens, blasts, squeals, beeps and flashing lights of the video machines are part of the "new games" theme of the arcade. Patrons can choose from games like Pac Man, Centipede and Tempest.

"The restaurant hasn't caught on yet because of the negative press at the beginning," said Akhtar, a 20-year veteran with the Wayne County Sheriff's Department.

"This place is geared for the whole family. We also have a party room where parents can throw birthday parties."

Persons under 17 are barred from playing electronic games by township ordinance, unless they are accompanied by parents.

"I'M GETTING killed because of having to turn the younger kids away," Akhtar said as he sent two younger boys away.

"Do you know where they're going to go now? They're going to go across

the street to the doughnut place and play their games, or down to the bowling alley or the party store and play their games," he said.

"Do you see that bike rack out there?" Akhtar asked, pointing to a new metal rack at the edge of the

parking lot. "I had to pay to put that in for kids who can't even come in this place."

The bike rack was required as part of the board's conditional approval.

"The ordinance assumed young people would be riding their bikes to

arcades. In the interest of good house-keeping and providing a place to lock the bikes, a rack was required," said John Flodin, township clerk.

## Schools to assist proposed discipline group

A concerned parent wants to help improve children's discipline, and Plymouth-Canton Community Schools support her idea.

Barbara Timmerman, of Canton, was invited to a school administrators' meeting last week and received support to start a "Parents Who Care" organization, focusing on discipline problems and how to handle them.

The initial organizational meeting may take place in early May, although definite plans are not completed, ac-

cording to Richard Egli, administrative assistant for the schools' community relations. Meeting plans will be finished within two weeks, Egli says.

**JOHN HOBEN**, schools' superintendent, believes the idea for this group is "long overdue." It should be a total community effort with churches, families and schools all working together, Hoben says.

"We are willing to support her activity in any way possible," Hoben says, "with use of building space for organization meetings and limited communication, possibly with fliers."

Norm Kee, assistant superintendent for personnel, called Timmerman after reading her letter to the editor in the Observer about the discipline issue.

"He (Kee) just asked me if I was serious (about starting a group) or was it just a mood I was in," Timmerman says. "And I said, 'no, this is something I've wanted to do for 15 years.' He said the cabinet board (of administrators) was discussing the letter and wanted to invite me to the next meeting."

"They (the administration) felt a parent group in the community has more clout than the school board (and board policies)."

**TIMMERMAN** IS a mother of three children. One child graduated from Plymouth Salem High School last year. One son currently attends Pioneer Middle School and a daughter goes to Miller Elementary School.

The discipline problems are at all levels of education, Timmerman stresses. She is excited about starting an organization.

"We're trying to bring the group together — parents who care, parents who will do something about their child and work with the schools and all children, parents who will stop being pals

and go back to parenting," Timmerman says.

**THE IDEA** IS interesting and has positive potential, Egli says.

"I think she (Timmerman) has a concern, and if people share the concern then we (the schools) can help provide the resources," Egli says. "Anything we can do to get together to work on the problem (of discipline) can be beneficial."

## Police nab 3 in theft

## Auto supply store robbed

Two Plymouth men and their Canton companion face preliminary examinations April 22 in district court on charges they broke into a Canton auto-supply store last week.

Police say the break-in occurred at an out-of-business Gratiot Auto Supply store on Ford Road east of Lilley. In a related incident, two of the men also will be charged with a Canton house break-in.

Both incidents occurred April 11, according to police. Alfred Pearson, Napier Road, and

Brian Price, Amherst Court, both 17, and both Plymouth residents, were arraigned Tuesday on two counts each of breaking-and-entering.

William Sisco, 18, Honey Lane, Canton, was arraigned on one B&E count.

**JUDGE JAMES** Garber of 35th District Court entered innocent pleas in their behalf. All were released on \$10,000 personal bond.

Canton Police Lt. Larry Stewart said officers were notified by a citizen who reported seeing persons breaking into

the auto-supply store.

Sisco was arrested in a van at Ford and Lilley, said Stewart. Inside the vehicle were assorted auto supplies valued at \$1,350, and \$1,650 worth of carpeting missing from a vacant house on Willow Creek, said Stewart.

Pearson and Price were arrested a few minutes later as they left a field near the Gratiot store.

Breaking-and-entering carries a maximum penalty of 10 years in prison upon conviction.

# After Lawsuit against township Canton Wizard arcade opens

The township game ordinance should be changed to allow middle school students to play the video games, Akhtar said.  
A proposed ordinance, possibly

lowering the age limit, will be before the board in the next month, township officials say.  
"It's baffling. Why hasn't the ordinance been changed? They told me it would be changed a while back," Akhtar said.

"I guess the board is worried about this place becoming a hangout. I don't want the place to be a hangout. I don't want to babysit other people's kids."  
"Do you see this security guard: I'm having to pay \$7 an hour to have a uniformed guard here because the board wants one. It's killing me."  
"I have responsible adults here who could supervise the place. I don't need a security guard," he said.  
The security guard is required by the township game ordinance.  
"The idea behind the guard is to police the activities in general — to make sure there are no unusual things happening and to make sure there are no 'social' problems," Flodin said.

I thought the fee was for what it costs the township to administer the license. You can't tell me it costs \$125 to put a sticker on a machine — and then the stickers fell off," Akhtar said.  
"It's the township's view that's the amount of money needed to issue the license and pay for the time other agencies will put in for policing and checking on the arcade," Flodin said.  
"The other thing I don't understand is why I had to put the sidewalk in (from the parking lot on Lilley to Ford). They're going to build a Marathon station on the corner," Akhtar said.  
A permit is being processed to build a gasoline station on the corner, according to the township building department.  
Starting in May, the Canton Wizard is going to have a magician perform two shows every Tuesday night. Akhtar wants to provide a place for families to come and eat lunch or dinner and have a good time, he said.

# Romney as prophet

## Former governor reflects on state of economy

George Romney said he has been talking about the high cost of Michigan labor for years, but no one listened.

Even before he was elected governor in 1962, he complained that the state was pricing itself out of business. No one listened.

"If you look at the testimony I gave before the old War Committee after World War II, you'll see that I said we were progressively pricing ourselves out of the market," the silver-haired, 74-year-old former governor said.

"We can take a look at any aspect of the state's economic picture, and it's more costly to do business here than in almost any other state in the union. The conditions I've been talking about for the past 35 years are here."

FROM HIS secluded Bloomfield Hills home nestled on a densely treed lot, George Romney — former president of American Motors Corp., governor from 1963-69, secretary of Housing and Urban Development from 1969-72 — talked about Michigan's financial plight and its chances for recovery.

The state needs a leader, a businessman, to pull it out of economic misery, he said. It needs more labor concessions, lower welfare payments, better management and decreased unemployment benefits.

"Michigan has suffered as a result of the shortcomings of the national government. Michigan and the auto industry simultaneously became the focus of the national government and state government's mistakes," he said.

"At the same time, we're suffering from the impact of the Japanese doing things we should have been doing for years. They forged ahead of us in their ability to produce high-quality vehicles economically, while we lagged behind."

WHEN ROMNEY arrived in Lansing as chief executive, he was fresh out of an eight-year presidency at American Motors. He was a respected businessman who made AMC a contender with the "Big 3," when he introduced the first small car of the '50s — the Rambler.

"When we introduced the Rambler, the situation was different than it is now. Back then, the American people generally were of the opinion that only big cars were worth having.

"By the late '50s when a large number of families had more than one car, the economics of small car ownership was more important than what kind of car you had.

"So we were able to convince people that their needs were better met with a small compact car," he said.

ROMNEY HAD BEEN a maverick at AMC, negotiating labor contracts with the same principles being revived today.

"I worked out with American Motors, way back in 1960, a profit sharing program that Walter Reuther described as the most significant contract in the history of collective bargaining," he recalled.

"Now the unions are talking about profit sharing and teamwork instead of class conflict and confrontation. We need more contract concessions and more teamwork like the Japanese have. One reason they're licking us is that they have teamwork, which cuts costs and contributes to quality," he said.

Romney has lived through decades of changes and was instrumental in bringing Michigan to its feet following an economic downturn in the late '50s and early '60s.

AS AN issue-oriented Republican governor, Romney earned a reputation among colleagues and critics as non-partisan. Today Romney said he was always a fiscal conservative.

"The big reason I was labeled a liberal is because I fought hard to shift the Republican Party's position with respect to civil rights. The Republican Party was against civil rights and supported restrictive zoning in Grosse Pointe. As a result of me shifting their lines, people have called me a liberal," he noted.

Romney's life is charted by the books and pictures that line the walls of his small den. Time magazine cover portraits are framed beside family portraits, including one with a dozen of George and Lenore Romney's 22 grandchildren making ice cream.

Its light atmosphere, decorated in blues, yellow and peach, are the colors of the soft-spoken, supportive Lenore. Springtime fills the room despite the bare trees peering in the windows. The fireplace is still covered with cardboard to keep the winter winds out, and unopened mail is piled high after a winter trip to Hawaii.

HE APPEARS relaxed, dressed in a cardigan sweater and gray flannel slacks.

Romney spends most of his time at home, when he's not busy as chairman of a volunteer organization he founded in 1970 — the National Center for Citizen Involvement. He flies frequently to Washington for national meetings.

"It's a network of local volunteer action centers that gives technical assistance to volunteer organizations. By using computers, the people help match collected information about programs on drug abuse or child abuse with local

organizations that need the information," he said.

"I set this program up when I was in the Cabinet and was asked to develop a program to help strengthen American life. I created the National Center for Volunteer Action, and two years ago it merged with the National Information Center on Volunteerism to become what it is today," he added.

Romney also serves as a Wayne State University trustee.

The ex-governor's adventures led him across the country. When he was a young boy, his family was forced to flee a Mexican revolution. They lost their properties, and he watched their status go from substantial to penniless.

"Being poor isn't the worst thing. We got kicked out of Mexico with nothing," he said.

AT 11 YEARS OLD, Romney took his first job as a sugar harvester. From 1922-26 he worked his way through Latter-Day Saints University in Salt Lake City, then served two years in England and Scotland as a Mormon missionary.

From there he studied at the University of Utah in 1929, then went to Washington to finish his education at George Washington University. He studied taxation and tariffs and had his first bout

with politics at 21, when he worked as a stenographer for Sen. David Walsh, D-Mass.

His tax expertise landed him a job as a lobbyist for Aluminum Co. of America (ALCOA).

When he was 32, in 1939, the Automobile Manufacturers Association offered him a manager's position at its Detroit office, earning \$12,000 a year.

HE SERVED on numerous boards and committees involved in auto production. He was also appointed by President Truman as an employer delegate to the Metal Trades Industry Conferences of the International Labor Office in 1946 and '47.

As a result of this experience, he was offered the vice-presidency of Packard as well as post of executive assistant to the president at Nash-Kelvinator. He opted for the job at Nash, eventually merged with Hudson and became American Motors Corp. in 1954. He became chairman of AMC later that year. During his last term as governor in 1968, he made an unsuccessful bid for the Republican presidential nomination but lost to Richard Nixon. President Nixon took Romney to Washington as HUD secretary during his first term, 1969-72.

## Romney: State needs businessman at helm

Michigan needs a businessman with leadership capabilities to pull the state out of its recession, says former Gov. George Romney, who is supporting Richard Headlee for governor during the 1982 Republican primary.

"Headlee is better qualified than any of the other candidates. He straightened out an organization that was in financial difficulty," Romney said of Headlee's job at Morbark Industries, Inc. near Mt. Pleasant, in 1968.

"He took hold of Alexander Hamilton Life Insurance Co. of America and made it into the largest life insurance company domiciled in Michigan," he added.

HEADLEE, 52, of Farmington Hills joins Lt. Gov. James Brickley, Oakland County Prosecutor L. Brooks Patterson and state Sen. Jack Welborn of Kalamazoo in seeking the GOP nomination on Aug. 3.

He has been president of the insurance firm, now a subsidiary of Household International Inc. in Chicago, since 1972. In 1980, Gov. William Milliken appointed Headlee to the governing board of Oakland University — a decision Milliken now calls a mistake.

Romney's endorsement of Headlee, now a darling of conservatives, raised many eyebrows in Republican circles. But Romney insists there's no similarity between the right wing which bedeviled his governorship and the 1982 conservatives Headlee associates with.

"That was the John Birch Society," Romney said of the right-wingers of the 1960s.

Nor is Headlee's being a Mormon a factor, Romney said, explaining that Headlee wasn't a Mormon when they first met and that Mormons are too independent to make a political decision on religious grounds.

"Under Dick Headlee's leadership, at Alexander Hamilton life, jobs in the Farmington Hills headquarters have more

han tripled in 10 years while sales have increased tenfold," Romney said.

Headlee's name became a household word in 1978 when, as chairman of Taxpayers United for Tax Limitation, voters approved one of the earliest tax limitation amendments in the United States.

ROMNEY WAS governor when he first got to know Headlee in 1965. Romney asked Headlee to organize a Christmas gift drive for Michigan soldiers serving in Vietnam.

"It was late October when I asked him to initiate and coordinate a massive program called 'Michigan Christmas in Vietnam,'" Romney recalled.

"Under his direction, volunteers were enlisted, gifts and funding contributions secured, and over 8,100 military personnel from Michigan who were then in Vietnam received gift packages from people in Michigan on Christmas Day," Romney said.

"He's an able man, more able than Brickley," he added.

Romney said he doesn't dislike Brickley. Rather, the lieutenant governor has been in politics and government most of his life and hasn't had Headlee's experience in turning around a sinking organization.

"Michigan is in very serious difficulty and at this time, Headlee, who is a businessman, will be able to straighten things out," Romney added.

"The governor should lean on issues, and Headlee is that sort of man," he said.

And what about Milliken, Romney's former protege as lieutenant governor?

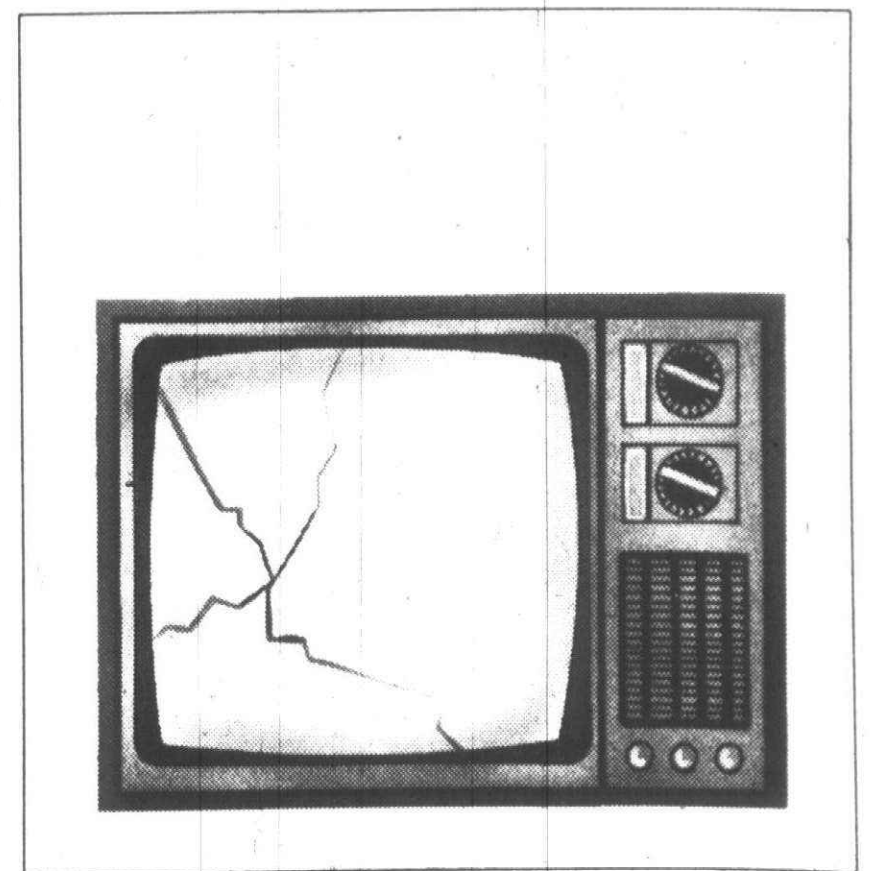
"Milliken was a very popular governor. But you can be popular without doing things that need to be done," Romney said.

"How do you measure things when the state is in a bad situation? By who's been governor. You usually judge people by the bottom line."

"To take money (for chloriding) would be robbing another fund reserve," said Larson. "We are deluding the taxpayers that somehow things are going to work out anyway."

Task force spokeswoman Beverly Sullivan, of Roundtable Drive, said the group believes an additional two or three mills would generate between \$60-\$100 per year per household specifically for road improvements.

That extra revenue would "supplement" the service already provided by the county. In effect, the township would sub-contract with the county to

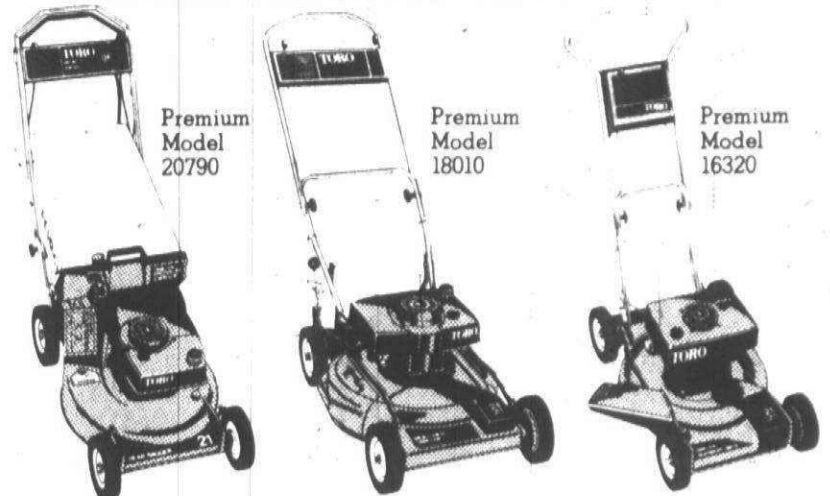
do special jobs such as paving, chloriding, cleaning, maintenance of roads and drains, and snow removal.

"THEY (COUNTY) aren't getting enough (revenue) to give us anything," said Sullivan. "What we raise will be a supplement."

Persons who are opposed to additional taxes should remember one thing, said Sullivan — they are already paying up to \$100 a year to replace mufflers, tie rods, etc., which break on lumpy, chuckhole-filled roads in Canton.

"My biggest fear is that people won't understand (the millage request)," Sullivan added.

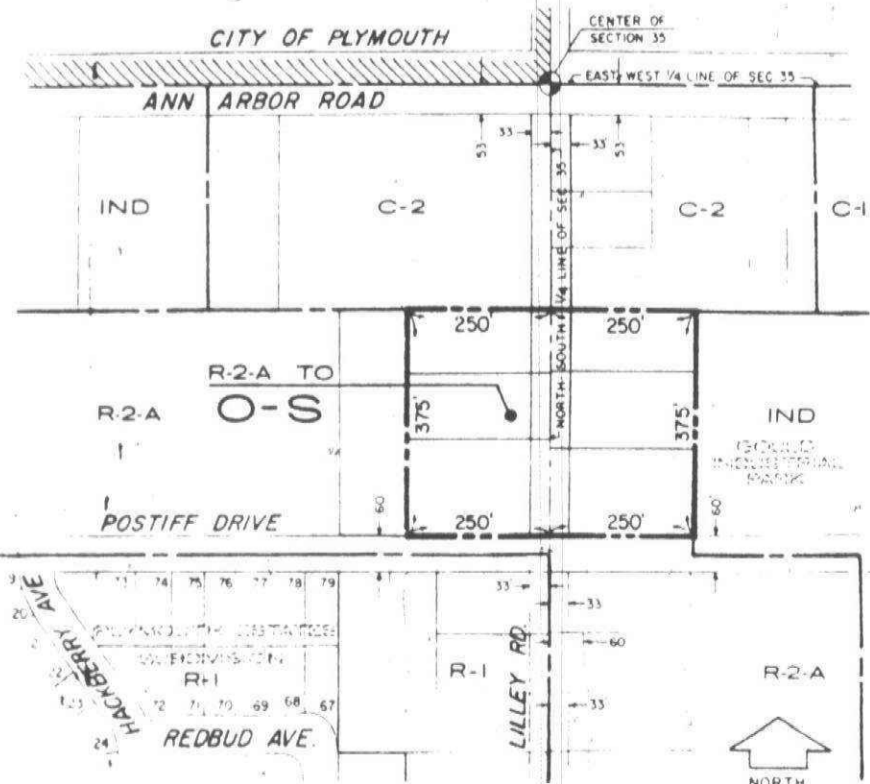

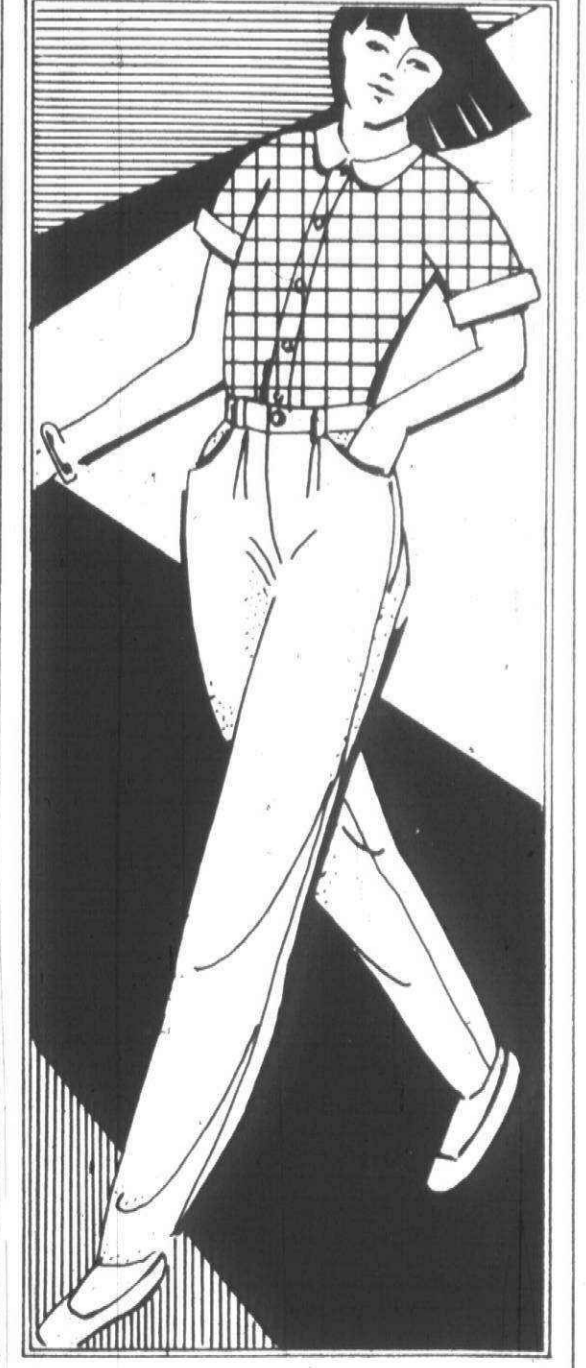

# Church program offers new hope in bad times

Our state's unemployment rate hovers near 17 percent. Interest rates lurk at 18 percent. Most economists admit we are living through a depression.

Those not working worry about unemployment benefits running out. Many working people are unhappy because promotions have vanished, and a move to another company is almost impossible.

It is too much to get anyone down. For most of us, not too enough can be done. But some suburban churches have started a program designed to lift spirits and teach people how to utilize more fully their potentials.

It's called the Fully Alive Experience. Its thesis is that true happiness comes from within — from a sound and healthy set of attitudes. All aspects of our lives are shaped by these attitudes, called a "vision" in the program. These attitudes are the lenses through which we all see "reality."

IN ITS ORGANIZATION, the Fully Alive Experience sounds sterile. A group of people come together usually at someone's home for 10, weekly, two-hour sessions. During that time they listen to tapes, work on some exercises and hold group discussions. Usually, there's some homework to be done between sessions.

A psychologist who is a teacher at Loyola University in Chicago conducts the sessions through tape cassettes.

Perhaps the most important aspect of the classes occurs when individuals attempt to examine their own self-esteem. That is, most people tend to be overly-critical of their own perceived weaknesses. This limits their ability to try new ventures, make new friends — or be fully alive.

Participants are told about the legend of Rapunzel, the young girl imprisoned in a tower with an old witch. Rapunzel is very beautiful, but the old witch

has convinced her that she is ugly. In this way, the witch is able to keep the young girl in the tower with her.

One day, Prince Charming stands at the bottom of the tower. She sees through the mirror of his eyes her own beauty. Rapunzel throws her long and beautiful hair out the tower, and he braids it into a ladder and climbs up to rescue her. Rapunzel's imprisonment was not caused by the tower, but her fear of her own ugliness.

The lesson, according to the Fully Alive Experience, is that we must appreciate our own goodness if we are going to be free. If we are captives of our imagined shortcomings, we will be in a prison like Rapunzel.

THOSE TAKING part in the Fully Alive Experience then learn how to change their visions of themselves through several different techniques.

All of this sounds in part like internal pep talk and in part like "the power of positive thinking." It is all of those. It's also based on the principle that most of us use only about 10-20 percent of our abilities. That can seem corny in a sophisticated time.

But the Fully Alive Experience seems to offer some sound psychological advice. Those taking part are enthusiastic and look at the world in a more optimistic way.

Considering the times, that's not all bad.

After issuing orders for three 10 per cent pay cuts in one week (there was a new notice every other day) it was decided to pay half in cash and half in script with the hope that the script would be negotiable in time. It was.

Along with these notices came two that The Stroller still laughs about.

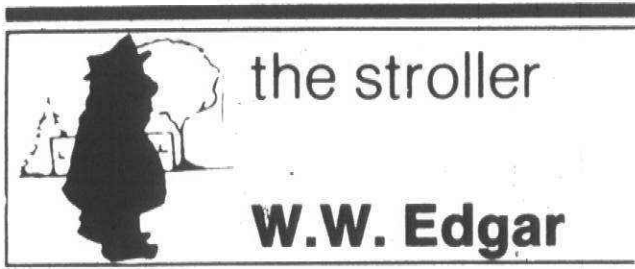
The first was a strict order limiting any gratuities to one dollar a day while traveling. And the other drew nothing but guffaws.

IT WAS an order that no new pencil would be issued until the stub of the old one was turned in. At first this was taken as a joke. But The Stroller found out the seriousness of the case.

Came the day his working pencil was cut down to about two inches. It was rather difficult to work with. So, down the hall he went to the managing editor's office and asked the secretary for a new pencil.

When he held out the old stub, she took one look and said, "I can't give you a new one. The old one isn't short enough."

Can you imagine anything like that?



THINGS WERE so tough in that depression that a pencil stub was not short enough to be traded for a new one so that a fellow could edit copy a bit better.

But he was glad to be getting rent and he said, "Fine, send me what you can afford."

## It's time to curse those nagging potholes

## Court is wrong on group homes

To the editor:

The lead article on Monday, March 22, in the Observer told of Judge Victor Baum's ruling that the residents of two group homes for the mentally ill in Canton Township must be removed.

Judge Baum based his ruling on the semantic argument that emotionally disturbed (the language of the Adult Foster Care and Licensing Act) is not the same as mentally ill (the language of the Mental Health Code). He also said that the legal definition of mental illness implied a tendency toward dangerous behavior. Judge Baum refused to allow the moving of such possibly dangerous persons into a suburban community. The ruling and its reasoning ignore many of the facts.

Mental illness is defined in the Mental Health Code as, "a substantial disorder of thought or mood which significantly impairs judgment, behavior, capacity to recognize reality, or ability to cope with the ordinary demands of life." Violent behavior is not a criterion of the definition itself.

Those persons who are involuntarily committed to a state institution go through a court hearing and are committed on the basis of whether they are dangerous to themselves or others or are unable to care for themselves.

Since only a small percentage of mentally ill people are violent, it is faulty reasoning to assume all persons exiting a psychiatric hospital are violent on the basis of those few.

While most released patients return to their families, a smaller number have no home to provide them with support and encouragement in making the transition to community life. These few are candidates for placement in group homes where they will receive ongoing care and support. However, prior to placement, all candidates are screened by a team comprised of psychiatrists, psychologists and social workers. Only those persons who are assessed to be non-violent and would benefit from a residential setting are placed in a group home.

If a team of mental health professionals has found patients ready for release, how do the courts know better? Judge Baum's decision seeks to permanently brand ex-patients as violent and dangerous and thus unable to move into community living.

This lawsuit and others in the past have fueled the controversy surrounding community placement into an emotionally charged and often confusing issue. The community sues on arguments that mask the ignorance, fears and prejudice which spawned their attitudes.

Many of these legal confrontations could have been avoided through a more concentrated preparation and education of the community and the es-

tablishment of support systems within that community before the patient is released.

Community placement is here to stay. Wouldn't it be more advantageous for local officials, home owners associations, local residents as well as mental health professionals to work together for the smoothest integration possible for both patient and community?

Without this public education, unnecessary court battles like the one currently going on in Canton will continue to occur and the entire program of deinstitutionalization will be set back and receive more bad publicity. Communities will waste money on needless court battles they have little chance of winning. (Most challenges to small group homes have been overruled by the courts).

And while local communities and the Department of Mental Health assume adversarial positions and do legal battle, those who had the most to gain from a well-run and coordinated community placement program silently suffer the consequences.

#### THE ROUNDHOUSE BRIDGE

The roundhouse is one of the most difficult esthetic procedures in dentistry. All of the teeth in one jaw are joined into a fixed bridge. It is generally suggested when the remaining teeth are weak and the best hope for maintaining them (and the replacements for the missing teeth) is to encompass them into one solid unit. "United we stand. Divided we fall."

Like most fixed bridges, the roundhouse is done in either porcelain fused to metal or acrylic veneers. The acrylic veneer is lighter and more flexible, but will abrade and discolor. The porcelain fused to metal will retain its color and texture, but is heavier.

The teeth must be ground parallel to one another so that the fit is passive and true. This is particularly important with porcelain fused to gold, because if the bridge does not fit smoothly, pressure from within the crowns could cause the porcelain to fracture.

A roundhouse can be done in sections, with the individual bridges interlocked, but the greatest support for loose teeth occurs when the bridge is one solid unit.

# WORLD'S FARE

## A SAMPLING OF INTERNATIONAL FOODS

How long does it take to travel around the world? Jules Verne completed the trip in 80 days, but this year it's possible to take in the sights and sounds of the world in record time by attending the 1982 World's Fair in Knoxville, Tennessee. This is the first World's Fair since 1975, and it will remain open to visitors from May through October.

Every World's Fair provides its share of firsts. Superstructures, exciting inventions and memorable foods have made their debut at fairs throughout history. At the Paris Fair in 1889, the Eiffel Tower was unveiled, and the 1939 World's Fair heralded the introduction of television.

This year's theme, "Energy Turns the World," provides the inspiration for the centerpiece of the fair, a 226-foot Sunsphere. Topped by a giant globe made with energy-efficient glass, it provides a golden glow visible for miles.

Each great exposition also contributes something to international gastronomy, or, to put it simply, the "world's fare." The 1904 St. Louis Exposition, for example, introduced a novel dessert idea, the ice cream cone. This year chefs from many foreign countries including one from the Republic of China are preparing food for fair visitors. Food kiosks located around the fairgrounds will enable visitors to sample a variety of international delicacies. An internationally popular ingredient, the peanut, will be featured in many World's Fair foods. Spanish and Portuguese explorers first discovered the peanut in their visits to the New World and carried samples back to Europe with them. The peanut then traveled with the explorers in their voyages to Africa, and other historical evidence points to the use of peanuts in the Orient several centuries before the explorers' discoveries.

Today, good cooks from around the world use peanuts, peanut butter and peanut oil in their main courses, salads, sandwiches, appetizers and desserts. The following recipes provide a sampling of foods similar to those available at this year's fair, including Oriental salad, an Indian appetizer, a Mexican main dish and two all American favorites, ice cream and a peanut snack.



### ORIENTAL CHICKEN SALAD

Place chicken in center of large platter. Surround chicken with watercress. Slice cucumber in half lengthwise. Scoop out seeds. Slice cucumber into 1/4-inch thick slices. Arrange cucumber, red pepper and mushrooms around chicken. Sprinkle peanuts on top of chicken. In a small bowl, stir together soy sauce, scallions, vinegar, sherry, oil, mustard and sugar; mix well. Pour over salad. Makes 4 servings.

Thread chicken and red pepper pieces alternately onto bamboo skewers or toothpicks. Brush with peanut butter mixture. Broil 15 minutes or until chicken is fork tender. Makes 12 appetizer servings.

### MEXICAN PORK WITH PEANUT SAUCE

- 1-1/4 cups unsalted peanuts, very finely ground
- 2 medium tomatoes, seeded and chopped
- 1/3 cup chopped onion
- 1 clove garlic, chopped
- 1 can (4 oz.) green chilies, seeded and chopped
- 1 teaspoon ground coriander
- 1/2 teaspoon cumin
- 1 teaspoon salt
- 1/2 cup water
- 1 pound cooked pork, sliced
- 10 flour tortillas

In food processor bowl or blender container, stir together peanuts, tomatoes, onion, garlic, chilies, coriander, cumin and salt. Blend until thoroughly mixed. Add peanut mixture, water and pork to a large skillet. Heat over medium heat, stirring occasionally for 15 minutes. Wrap tortillas in a damp cloth towel. Heat in a 325° F. oven for 15 minutes. Place pork mixture in center of each tortilla. Roll up. If desired, garnish with tomato wedges and avocado slices. Makes 5-6 servings.

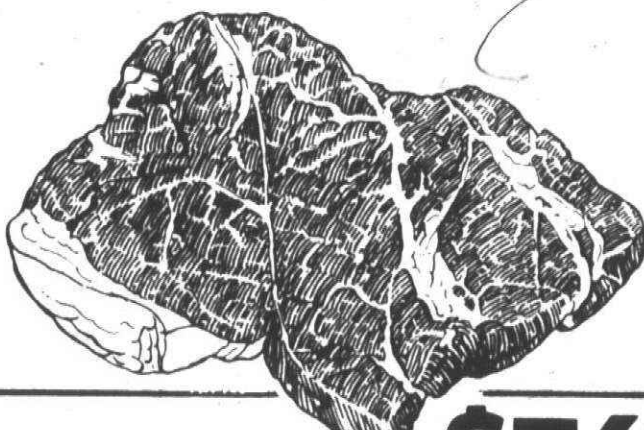

# American food aid

## Who gets it, how much is there, and what good does it all do?

This is the 14th in a series of 15 articles exploring "Food and People." sold — not given away — under long-term, low-interest loans to governments, which are then free to dispose of the food any way they choose. Most governments choose to sell it on the open market. But the hungry are precisely the ones who do not have the money to buy on this market.

In Bangladesh, third largest recipient of U.S. food aid, the food is sold through a ration system to the people whose support the government needs most — civil servants, the police, the military, the urban middle class. "A permanent dole for the relatively wealthy" is how the Wall Street Journal recently described it.

Furthermore, because the food is often sold in recipient nations for less than local farmers could produce it for, food aid helps to drive them out of business. "Lentil production could be stimulated by higher producer prices," the GAO reported recently. "Yet Egyptian farmers receive less than one-third the price paid for imported lentils."

In addition, the availability of food aid means that governments have little incentive to improve farm production or enact genuine land reform.

### TITLE II: DIRECT ASSISTANCE

The other major component of our food aid, Title II, goes largely to private voluntary organizations such as CARE and Catholic Relief Services, which use it for Food for Work, direct feeding and "community development."

Food for Work, intended to get food directly to hungry people in exchange for their labor on roads, canals and other construction projects, sounds great in Washington. But it hasn't worked so well in the field.

Why? First, improvements to the land, such as canals and soil conservation projects, benefit primarily landowners; they do little for the landless or those whose meager plots cannot support them more than half the population in countries such as Bangladesh. With their financial gains from Food for Work projects, landowners can often buy up even more land from debt-ridden small farmers, pushing them into an even worse position.

Second, landowners and government officials often "divert" much of the food for their own uses. In Bangladesh, for example, 30 percent of the Food for Work wheat never reaches the laborers, according to Hjalmar Brundin, a consultant to the U.S. Agency for Inter-

national Development (AID).

Third, peasants working on Food for Work projects often do not have enough additional time to work on the small plots of land some of them are able to own or rent. As a confidential AID report explains, the Food for Work program strengthens "an exploitative semi-feudal system" in the villages and "speeds up the polarization process in the rural areas."

Thus, in Bangladesh, as in Egypt, El Salvador, Haiti and other countries, our food aid strengthens elitist governments and unjust, underproductive land ownership systems in three ways.

Cheap food helps "buy off" the urban middle classes and security forces. Cash from the food sales provides general budgetary support which governments can use as they please. And Food for Work projects increase the power of the large rural landlords over the landless and near-landless in the countryside.

Most Third World countries already produce enough food to feed their people, if it were fairly distributed. The problem is that the majority of the population has neither enough land to grow food on nor jobs providing enough income to buy food. The warehouses "may be full of rice," as an AID official in Bangladesh recently pointed out, "but that doesn't mean that most people can afford to buy enough to meet their needs."

IN THE LAST 25 years, the United States has distributed over \$30 billion worth of food aid to poor countries. Yet very little of this food has reached the hungriest people in the city slums and rural villages of Africa, Asia and Latin America.

Why doesn't our food aid reach — let alone really help — these hungry people? Because, despite the genuine humanitarian intentions of most Americans, feeding the hungry has never been the primary purpose of U.S. food aid.

From its inception in 1954, the food aid program, dubbed Food for Peace, was designed to dispose of U.S. farm surpluses, to create new markets for American farmers and food processors, and above all, to support governments considered vital to U.S. national security.

While U.S. food aid had been distributed to over 130 countries, those considered strategic to American security have always been favored: Israel and Turkey during the 1950s, South Vietnam and Cambodia during the Vietnam War, and South Korea, Taiwan and Pakistan through most of food aid's history. As a recent General Accounting Office (GAO) study concluded, "P.L. 480 (food aid) allocation is based on foreign policy considerations and the importance of food as a determinant of political stability."

Even today, after numerous "reforms" in the program to assure that a larger portion of food aid was sent to the poorer nations, the majority of U.S. food aid goes to just a few countries — not necessarily the hungriest, but the most important to our foreign policy. Thus the Egyptian government, which has already been threatened with riots because of the high cost of food, alone receives 20 percent of total U.S. food aid.

### TITLE I: FOOD FOR SALE

This food aid, however, seldom reaches the people who need it most. Under Title I of the Food for Peace program, more than half our food aid

# Return to the good old days with soup

The "good old days" in grandma's kitchen usually are remembered in one of two ways. Those with an eye for the practical question if the results really merited the long hours of hard work under difficult conditions. But the romantics remember the marvelous aromas, delicious flavors and the loving care that went into the preparation.

### POT O' FLAVOR

- 3 lbs. beef shank cross cuts, cut 1 inch thick
- 1 tsp. salt
- 7 cups water
- 1 pkg. (1 1/2 oz.) onion soup mix
- 1/2 cup regular barley or 3/4 cup quick-cooking barley
- 6 whole peppercorns
- 1/2 tsp. rubbed sage
- 1 1/2 cups thinly sliced carrots
- 1 cup celery pieces
- 4 cups thinly sliced cabbage

Place shanks in water in large Dutch oven or pot. Season with salt and add water. Cover tightly and cook slowly 1 1/2 hours. Add soup mix, barley, peppercorns and sage and continue cooking 40 minutes. Add carrots, celery and cabbage and continue cooking 30-40 minutes or until meat is tender and vegetables are done.

If quick-cooking barley is used, add to soup with the vegetables.

Homemade beef soup is an especially good menu choice on chilly early spring days as it offers a wealth of good eating and good nutrition at minimum expense. Beef shanks, less tender and therefore less in demand, are priced just right for a tight budget. Yet they become tender and delicious when cooked gently in liquid for a long period of time.

The perfect partner for old-fashioned soup is hot-from-the-oven homemade bread. You may want to make the bread from scratch as grandma might have done. Or take a convenient shortcut with a packaged bread mix or a frozen or refrigerated loaf that needs only baking. Just add a crisp green salad and a custard dessert, and the meal is complete. From first bite to last, all are sure to agree that even in the "good old days" dinner could have never tasted better.

**INSPIRED BY** youth hostels and folk schools of Europe, Elderhostels are coming into their own. Elderhostel is a network of more than 500 colleges/universities/independent schools/folk schools in 50 states, Canada, Great Britain, Denmark, Sweden, Finland and Norway.

They offer low-cost, short-term, residential academic programs for older adults.

The topic of Elderhostel came up at a bridge party the other night. The majority of the bridge players were old enough for Elderhostel participation, and the price is certainly right.

We were, as they say, all ears. The maximum weekly tuition rate is \$150. This includes room and board. There is an additional \$10 per week permitted for programs in Hawaii and Alaska.

Dorothy and Larry Becker were considering Elderhostel for the first time. Betty and Bob Webber had attended one last summer at the University of North Carolina, Chapel Hill, and were enthusiastic.

Betty said it was a marvelous experience. The group was limited to 30 persons. Some were retired and some not yet retired.

"And there were two couples in their 80s. One was a former French teacher, and one of the men had visited 108 countries," said Betty. "We met some fascinating people."

About two-thirds of the group were couples, and the rest were singles — alone or with a friend. They turned out to be a very cohesive and companionable congregation. "We had bull sessions every night."

Three courses were offered, and the Webbers decided in advance to sign up for Southern Writers and Political Leadership — Where Have All the Heroes Gone? They wanted to have lots of free time.

As it turned out, they wished they had signed up for all three as the veteran Elderhostelers had. The third course, Changing Weather in the World, was very interesting. And, all three courses are included in the single tuition rate.

She described their professors as dynamic. Evidently they all vie for an opportunity to teach the older students and enjoy the in-class discussions, which become quite heated.

One of the men in their group had been to eight Elderhostels and said they were all marvelous.

Chapel Hill had waiting lists for its summer sessions. More than 37,000 persons participated in Elderhostel in 1981. They live in college dormitories and eat in the cafeterias. Betty said the food was adequate, and there always were the makings for salads. They had considered eating some of their meals off-campus, but they did not want to leave the congenial group.

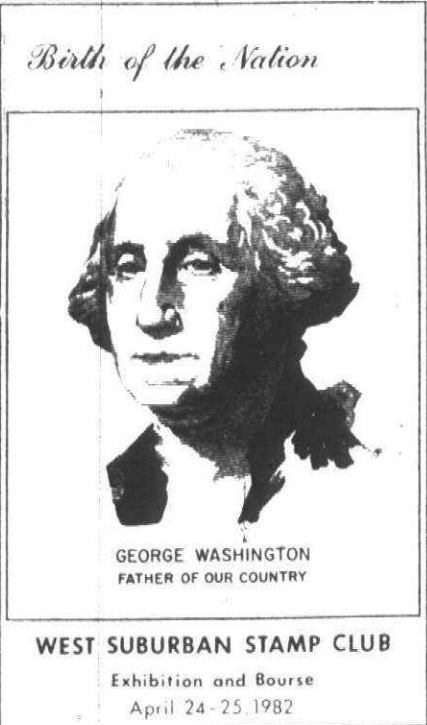
She said that when they received their acceptance, they were given suggestions for advance reading for the courses. This turned out to be worthwhile.

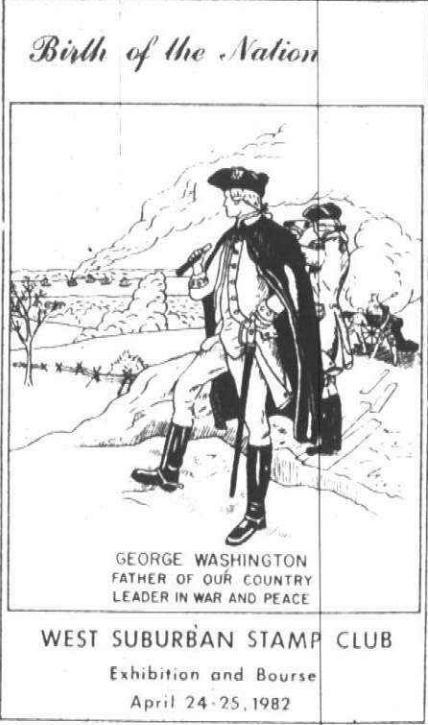

# Club plans state's largest stamp show

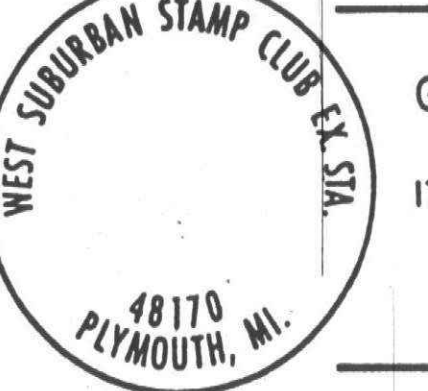
The state's largest stamp show opens Saturday in Central Middle School, Plymouth, and Governor William Milliken has declared April 19-25 Michigan Stamp Week.

"It is now that the seniors must be the ones to decide what services must continue to preserve the security of retirement living which they have rightfully earned."

**SENIORS HAVE** been informed by their state and federal governments that there is not enough money for all the programs funded by the state and federal governments.

Hinchey believes there is enough money to around. She suggests cuts in the costs of distribution — "fewer \$50,000 salaries to the bureaucrats who disperse the funds," and "fewer nutrition sites in affluent Cadillac-Lincoln communities."

John Cahill, assistant to Attorney General Frank Kelley, will discuss Kelley's plans to protect seniors from further increases in the costs of utilities. State representatives will speak about welfare practices and how they affect the senior citizens in Michigan.

"It is very important that seniors meet and be heard," said Hinchey. She added that there will be a large sign "Senior Retirement Must Be Protected" in front of the St. Francis Social Hall.



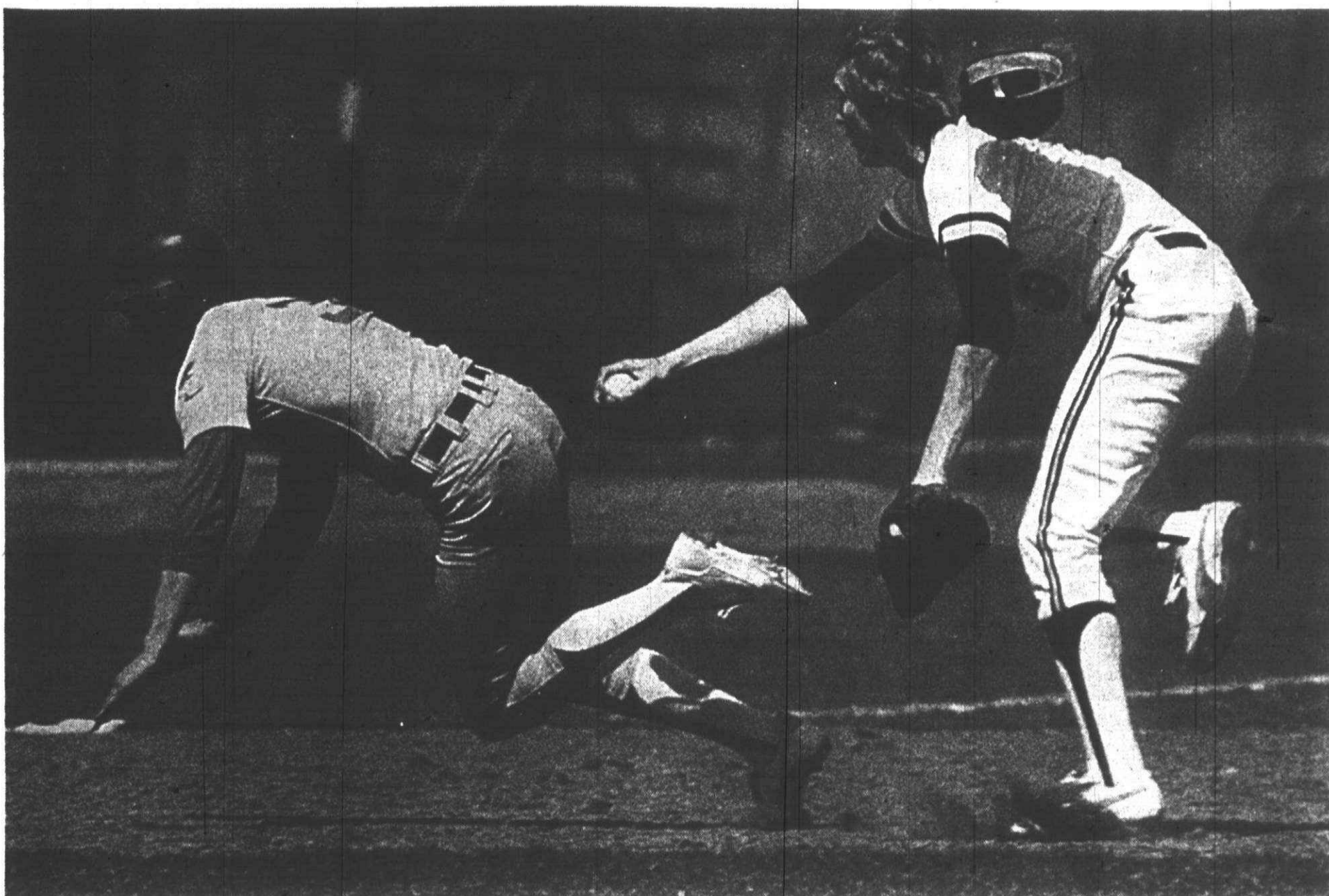
The Rocks started fast in the nightcap, taking a 2-0 lead in the first inning.

# Gallagher trips Chiefs twice

The Plymouth Canton Chiefs opened the 1982 baseball season the same way they finished 1981 — only doubling the output.

Canton, which bowed out to defending state champion Harper Woods Bishop Gallagher in the Class A semifinals a year ago, dropped both ends of a twin bill with Gallagher Thursday afternoon on the Chiefs' home field.

The script, however, was entirely different this time.

The Chiefs displayed one of their worst defensive performances in a while, losing the opener, 8-4. Gallagher

then squeaked by in the nightcap, 8-7.

Canton, with 17 veterans back from last year's 28-3 team, made some uncharacteristic mistakes.

All eight of Gallagher's runs in the first game were unearned.

"I'm disappointed," said Canton coach Fred Crissey, "because I didn't think we got beat in either game — we beat ourselves. We out-hit them in both games."

"I think we have enough experience to execute fundamentally well, and we didn't do that. I never get upset over a physical mistake, but I do get angry when we start making the mental errors."

**IN THE NIGHTCAP**, Gallagher jumped out to a 2-0 lead after two innings against starter Dan Smith, an All-State pitcher who went 13-1 last year.

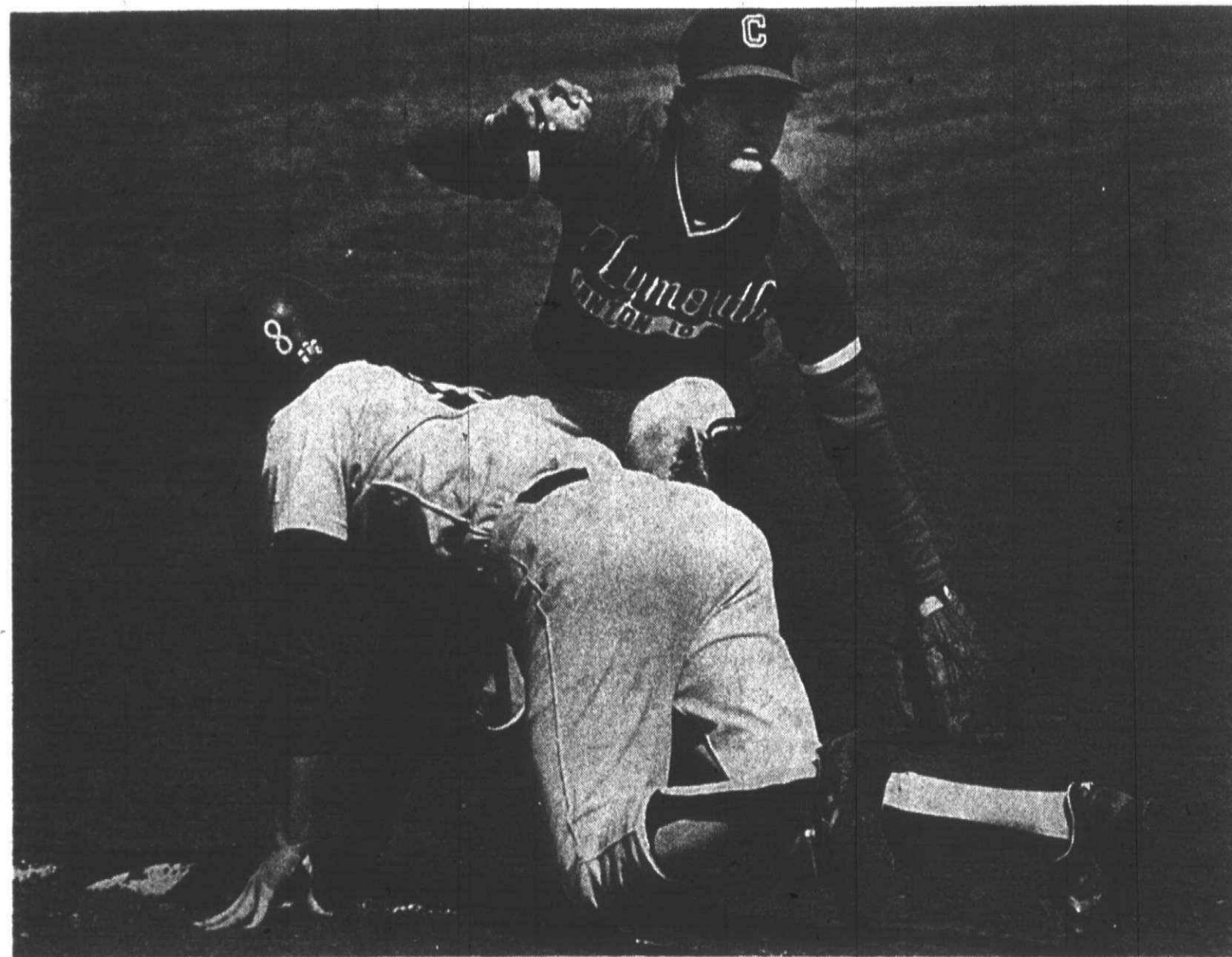
An error at the plate led to the first run. Shawn Hayden's Texas League single scored Paul Aneil with the second.

Canton got the run back when Steve Johnson doubled and later scored on Darren Weise's sacrifice fly.

Gallagher made it 3-1 with the help of a Canton outfield miscue in the third inning.

In the bottom of the third, Canton rallied for three runs on a single by

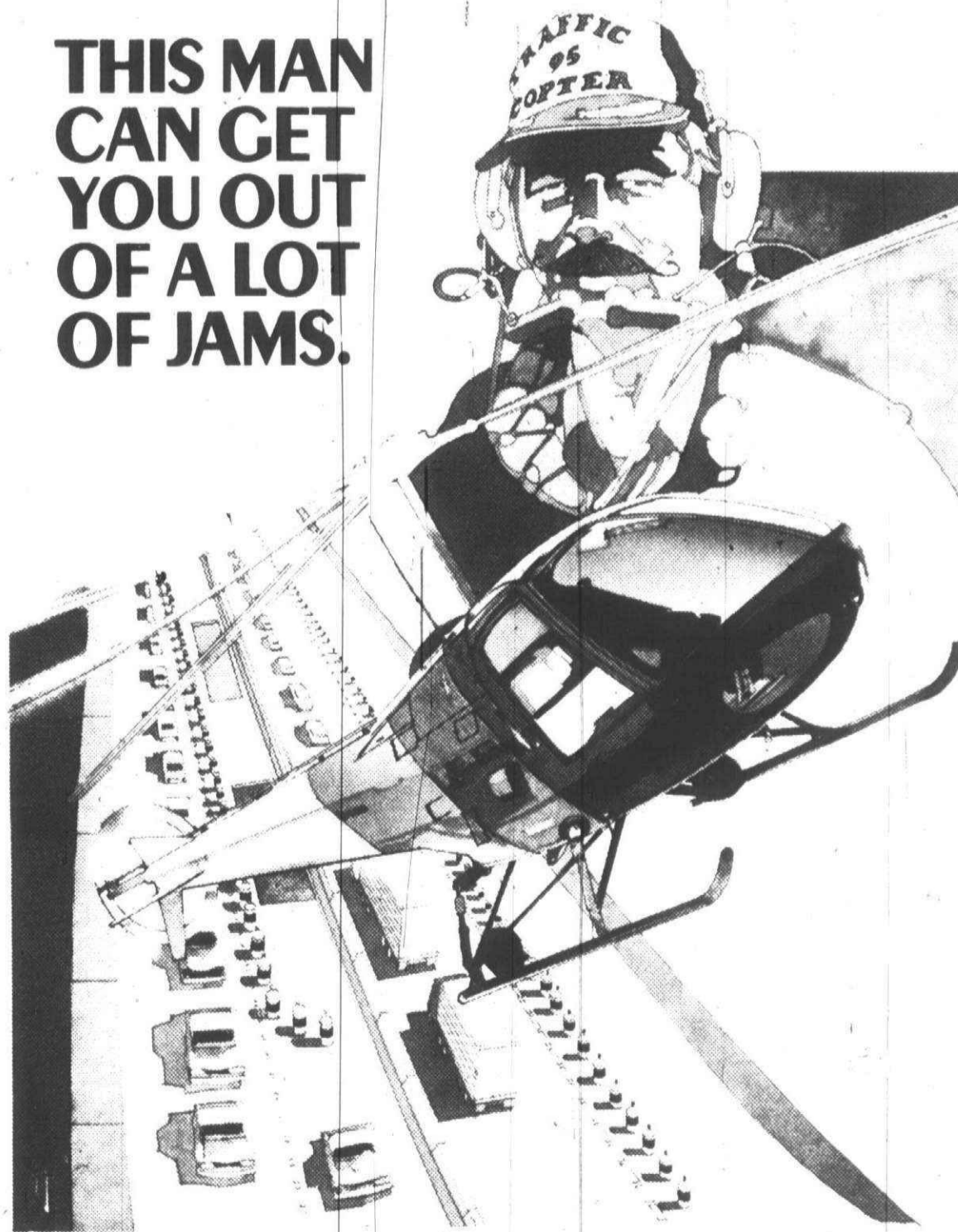

Brian Wolshaiger, who normally catches for the Lancers, set down the Chiefs quietly in the final two innings. He went the distance to take the win.

Weise drove in three runs for the Chiefs while Rumberger and Dombey had two hits each.

**GALLAGHER** struck early in the first game against starting and losing pitcher Jamie Chilcoff.

Greg Hudus put the Lancers up 2-0 with a two-run homer in the first inning. Gallagher added two more runs in the third.

Canton never led, but pulled within one run in the bottom of the sixth when McCarthy drove home a run on a sacrifice fly, cutting the deficit to 4-3.

In the top of the seventh, Gallagher struck for four runs, thanks to some Canton miscues.

Lefty Brian McVoy pitched the first four innings and got credit for the win. Augie Tisco finished up in relief.

Johnson had two of Canton's nine hits, including a solo homer in the seventh. Bricker, a senior second baseman, also added two hits.

"I was pleased that we fought back in the second game," said Crissey. "But when they score a lot of unearned runs, what are you going to do?"

"We were not mentally ready to play 14 innings today."

**THE CANTON COACH** got a good look at his pitching staff. He used eight hurlers.

"This is the time of the year we have seen what kids can do in clutch situations," Crissey said. "You can't find out what someone can do until they cross the white line."

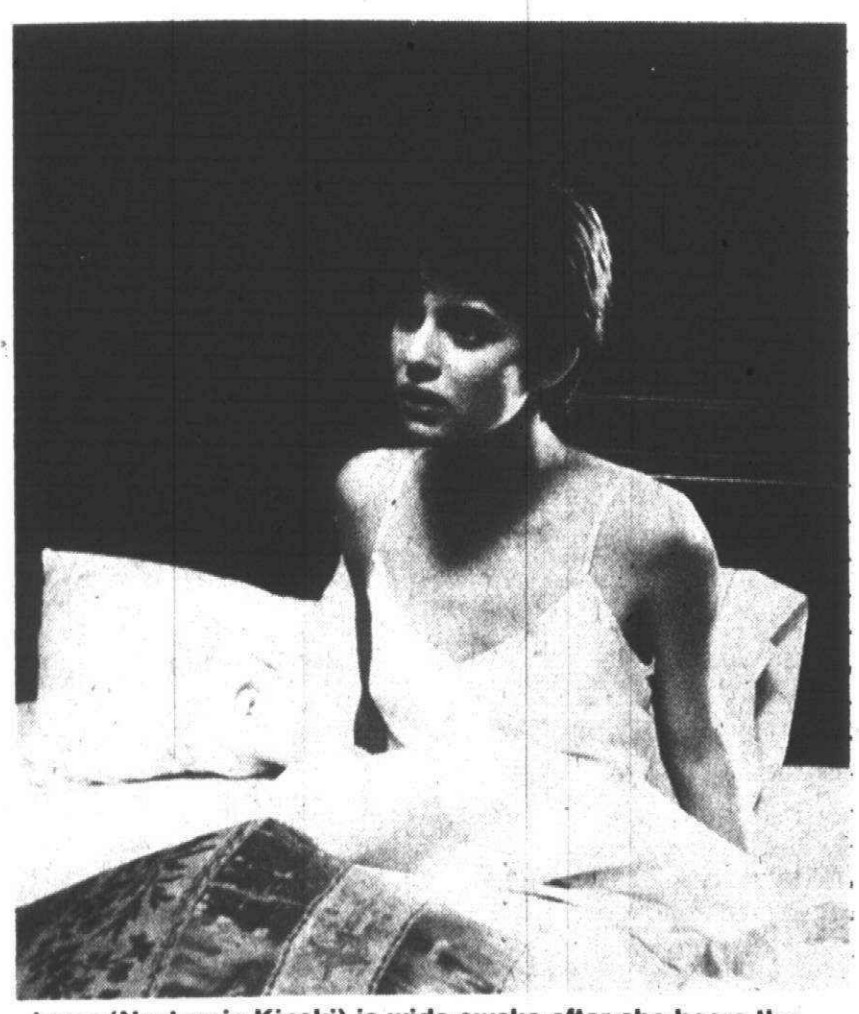
## New 'Cat People' dwells in realm of erotic fantasy

Is it possible to not like a film but still find it fascinating? Certainly. "Cat People" (R) falls into that category for me. I don't care for the grisly scenes. There is one, in particular, in which a man has his arm ripped off. Blood spurts from the torn artery and bare bone protrudes from the socket. There are other repulsive scenes which can best be described as "yech!" This same movie, however, has the compelling quality of a myth that captures the viewer's imagination and doesn't let go. It begins in a myth-like way with hot colors, blowing sands and sensual music. In this timeless, unspecified place, a strange ritual of sacrifice is being conducted.

THE SCENE THEN shifts to New Orleans and the present. Emphasis on the eerie and mysterious qualities of the city and its surroundings make it an ideal site for perpetuating the myth. Paul Schrader, the director of "Cat People," has created an erotic supernatural fantasy that takes place in the real world. The actual story sounds more silly than scary, but by charging it with sexual energy, maintaining a tense atmosphere and incorporating religious references, Schrader creates a powerful cinematic experience. The premise (don't expect a rational explanation) is that in some distant time and place women were sacrificed to leopards, and there developed a strain of leopards with human souls and humans of leopard ancestry. The human can only mate with other "cat people;" otherwise, they turn back into leopards. Irena (Nastassia Kinski), unknown to her, is one of these cat people. She travels to New Orleans to live with her brother Paul (Malcolm McDowell) who has sent for her. They had been separated as children after their parents' deaths. Paul tells Irena of their origins and their sexual need for each other. She runs from him in horror, and he goes on a rampage of lust and killing. McDowell handles his role adeptly. His pleasing, open face changes to a sadistic grin as he make incestuous advances to Kinski.

IN KINSKI, the director has found the perfect actress to convey both innocence and sensuality. Her amazingly mobile face fits the duality of her role as does her body — slim as the young virgin, lithe as the seductress. Annette O'Toole brings a healthy dose of normality to the situation as a zoo employee with a crush on the head curator, Oliver (John Heard). However, she is a bit too normal for him. He finds himself attracted to Irena, perhaps sensing the duality of her being. The New Orleans zoo, where Irena also works, is itself a bleak place where the sleek beauty of a captured panther contrasts with the ugliness of its prison. It reinforces the notion that Schrader uses this fantasy of the cat people as a metaphor for dealing with a variety of sexual attitudes and taboos.

Incest, bondage, virginal sacrifice and promiscuity are some of the themes which occur. The leopards, caged or free, suggest a corollary to sexual drive, shackled or unleashed. The "Cat People" originally was produced in 1942 by horror master Val Lewton and directed by Jacques Tourneur. Alan Ormsby rewrote the script and Schrader infused it with erotic tension borne on a Calvinist conscience. The result is a unique supernatural fantasy, beguiling to view, if far from purr-fect.

# Car OK in lightning but not in a tornado

With Michigan's tornado season approaching, it's time to run over the right and wrong way to behave if you are in a car and sight a twister or how a driver should act during a severe thunderstorm.

A car is a relatively safe place to be during a lightning storm, but it's not a good place if a tornado is approaching. Some believe the rubber tires cause the car to be insulated if struck by lightning, but the National Weather Service says it is the steel of the body that "fights" the lightning. Lightning striking a car usually travels along the outer metal skin of the car and then jumps to the ground, keeping the electricity from the occupants. However, they should not touch interior metal parts during the storm.

that those who are outside should get inside, either into a car or a building. Avoid getting near metal fences and other metal objects, stay away from trees and do not remain in or on the water. For tornadoes, the weather service warns that if you try to outrun one, it could be the last race you'll be in.

FLEEING A tornado in a car could be fatal unless you're in open, flat country, which will permit you to drive in any direction at high speed. But if there's even a slight doubt about the funnel's speed and direction, don't take the chance. Instead, if you're in a car when a tornado approaches, get out and take shelter in a well-constructed building. If none is nearby, lie in a ditch, culvert or other low spot until the twister passes. Avoid small buildings which can get picked up like toys.

CONTACTED ABOUT what to do in the event of severe weather, the weather service also suggested that during a lightning storm
