PLANS FOR THE seventh annual Canton Country Festival, Aug. 6-8, are well under way. Schools plan to cut \$1.6 million

It doesn't look like Plymouth-Canton residents will feel direct effects from projected school budget reductions for the 1982-83 school year.

No programs will be totally eliminated. Some services will be reduced, but not drastically.

School officials unveiled the proposed \$41-million budget at a press conference Thursday. Only about \$1.6 million will be trimmed to balance the budget, although the total deficit is projected at \$2.7 million.

About \$1.1 million will come from the schools' fund balance to cover the deficit. However, this reduces the fund balance to only \$286,000.

Ray Hoedel, assistant superintendent for business, says it costs about \$234,000 per class day to run the school district. The fund balance has provided contingent funding over the years in case of emergencies.

Hoedel is satisfied with this year's budget, despite the low fund balance.

"I think we've done an outstanding job in budget preparation," Hoedel said. "This budget, I don't think, doesn't represent a severe number of cuts in services to the district."

The proposed budget now will be presented to the Board of Education at 7:30 tonight at a public hearing at the school board office, 454 Harvey, Plym-

Officials split on proposed recall changes

Most Canton trustees are unopposed to tightening guidelines on recall campaigns against elected officials.

Proposed state legislation would require county election commissions to review and "evaluate the clarity of wording" on recall petitions. The legislation also would give notice of charges to the official being recalled before petitions are circulated.

Supporters of the bill say many recall petitions are vaguely worded, and that campaigns are used to harass and punish elected officials. Recall threats paralyze governments, split communi-

ties and discourage candidates from seeking office, say proponents of the legislation.

CANTON TRUSTEE Steve Larson failed to convince a majority of the Township Board to go on record opposing the proposed legislation June 8. His motion failed on a 4-3 vote.

"(Proposed) legislation like this irritates me," said Larson. "Recall is my right as a citizen and voter."

Larson's motion was supported by trustees Robert Padgett and Loren Bennett. Voting no were Treasurer Maria Sterlini, Supervisor James Poole, Clerk John Flodin and trustee Carol Bodenmiller.

In the last few years, there has been an increase in attempts to recall — or remove from office — local officials, especially members of school boards, township boards and city councils.

CURRENTLY, THE Wayne-Westland school district, which includes Canton, is embroiled in a recall campaign aimed at four school board members. A recall election is scheduled for Sept. 14.

A citizens' group called Taxpayers United Together (TUT) spearheaded the drive. Issues include early extension of teachers' contract with wage increases, and a proposal for a community-college in the district.

There should be no roadblocks against recall efforts, said Larson.

Padgett agreed that recall campaigns can be a "mean, vicious instrument." But he was disturbed that a review of petition language would give "justification" for a recall effort, and open the door to further restrictions on candidates or elected officials.

OTHER BOARD members disagreed.

Treasurer Maria Sterlini preferred opinions to be expressed individually, rather than as a board. Poole said he views the proposed legislation as a "purification" process.

"I object violently to rabble-rousing,

lying and vague half-truths to remove (officials) from office," added Flodin. "I can see no difficulty to screening."

The proposed legislation is House Bill 5381, which passed the Michigan House in February. The bill now is being reviewed by the Senate Municipalities and Elections Committee.

Copies of the bill were sent to Canton trustees by state Sen. William Faust, D-Westland, whose district includes Canton.

An analysis sheet provided by Faust indicates the Michigan Townships Association favors the proposed legislation, while the Michigan Association of School Boards favors investigation of the issue.

Board restructures TAG student program

Plymouth-Canton Community Schools will switch to a center program next fall for talented and gifted (TAG) students.

The school board Monday night approved spending up to \$20,000 for transportation.

The center program won't involve any added expense for staffing, said Cheryl Johnson, director of TAG programs for the district.

The district plans to establish one or two centers for gifted students. The students would all be in the same classroom at the center and would be bused there from their neighborhood school.

will depend upon the number of TAG students who sign up, said Dr. Michael Homes, assistant superintendent of instruction.

The TAG classes will consist of students in grades four-six who are eligible and volunteer to be attend the center program.

If a student is bused to his/her neighborhood school, said Homes, that student would ride to the local school and then be taken by another bus to the TAG center.

A student who walks will walk to the neighborhood school, then be bused to the TAG center.

Elston back in class

Gerald Elston, the popular principal at Pioneer Middle School, will see his dream come true. He's returning to the classroom next year.

Elston, of Governor Bradford, Plymouth Township, has asked Plymouth-Canton's Board of Education to leave his administrative duties and return to the classroom. Elston says he's approaching his 62nd birthday and doesn't have the physical stamina to perform principal duties up to his standards. He will teach one or two years and then retire.

Although the board has allowed Elston to return to the classroom, it isn't officially known at this time where he will be placed.

Elston, who has worked for Plymouth-Canton Community Schools for 32 years, began his teaching career at Smith Elementary School in September 1950. There has been some talk about Elston returning to Smith, but nothing is official.

"It would be poetic," the soft-spoken Elston says. "That would thrill me more than anything else to go back to where I started teaching."

Schools to trim 59 positions

outh. The public is invited.

The board is expected to adopt the budget at the next regular meeting on June 28. The board must pass a balanced budget by July 1, according to state law.

After tonight's public hearing, the board will recess to East Middle School for a workshop on food service recommendations. The workshop is scheduled to begin about 8:30 p.m. East is west of Lilley and north Ann Arbor Road, Plymouth.

BUDGET REDUCTIONS include the elimination of 59 positions districtwide. Cutbacks total \$1,592,380.

One major variable still exists in this budget, however. Budget figures are based on wage freezes for all school district employees. Incremental increases remain in tact, specified by prior contracts.

School officials currently are negotiating contracts for all seven labor unions in the

district. All contracts expire prior to the beginning of the 1982-83 school year in September.

Some position cutbacks include seven from administration, eight from custodial six special education teachers, six special education aids, four clerical and about 20 certified teachers.

Superintendent John Hoben believed another 10 teaching positions will be eliminated through attrition. The schools originally pink-slipped 113 staffers and 23 administrators.

Most cuts in services represent only a "level 1" or "level 2" reduction, compared to "level 4" or total elimination of a program.

The length of the classroom day and the classroom/teacher ratios will remain the same as this past school year.

MANY UNCERTAINTIES still exist in this budget, according to Hoedel. Estimates in state aid, interest rates, declining enrollment, negotiations and executive order cut-

backs from the governor keep this budget in a state of flux.

"It's been the worst this year in terms of the number of uncertainties," Hoedel said.

Last year, revenues increased 4.6 percent compared to only one-tenth of one percent for 1982-83, Hoedel said. Expenditures increased 7.8 percent in 1981-82, but only 1.5 percent for 1982-83.

Although the projected State Equalization Valuation (SEV) will reach the milestone \$1-billion mark for 1982-83, it only represents a 4.2 percent increase over last year's SEV.

SEV produces the bulk of school district revenue. In the past five years, the Plymouth-Canton community has averaged a 16-percent increase in SEV each year, Hoedel said.

Major expenditure savings reflected in this budget include the reduction of Extended School Year (ESY) buildings from six to two, no wage increases, no grade realignment costs, and a projected enrollment decline of 600 students.

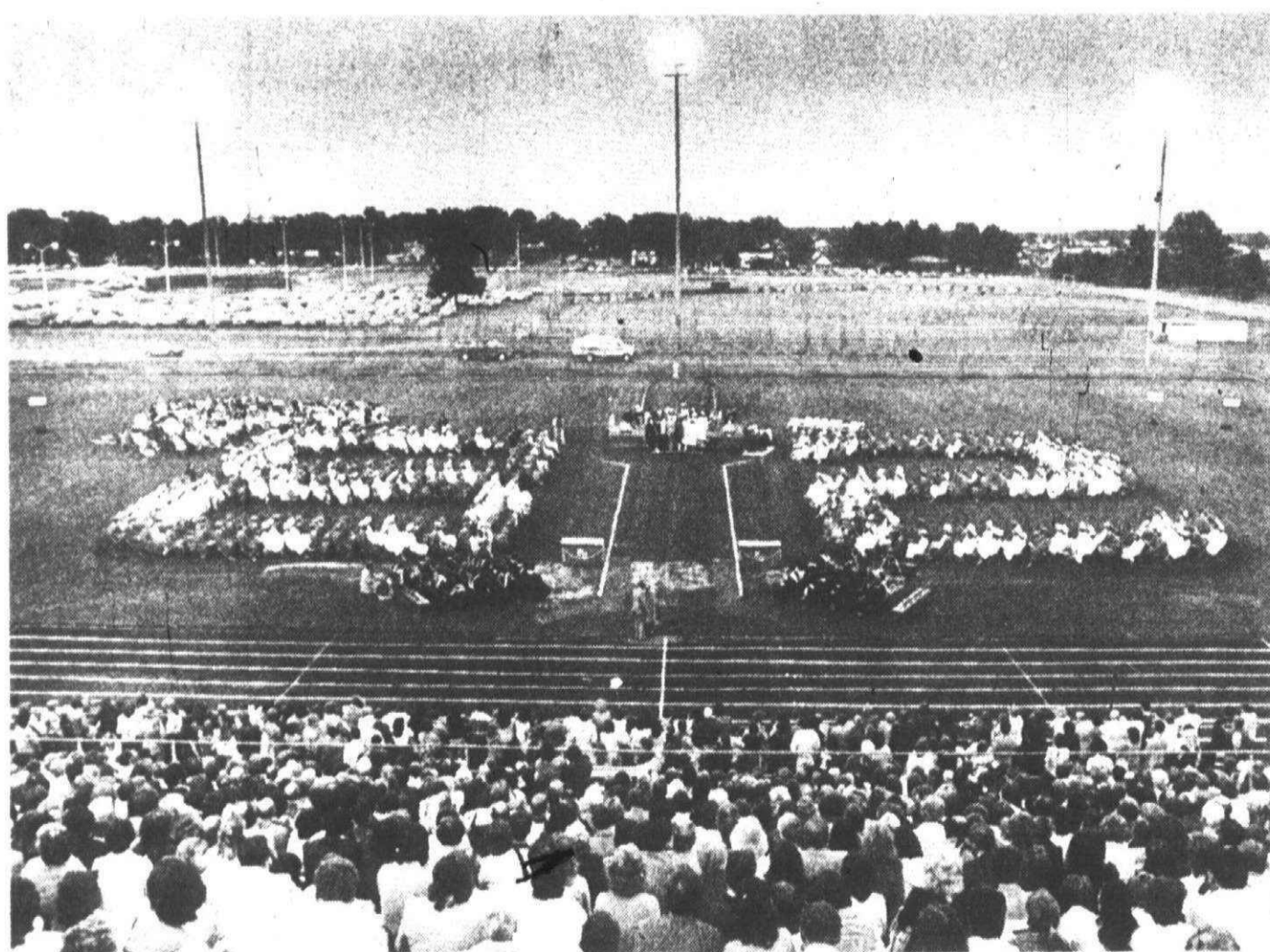
It's graduation time

grant Elston's wish before retirement, a long-standing promise between the late Superintendent Russell Isbister and Elston now is fulfilled.

After six years at Smith, Isbister asked Elston to join the administrative ranks because of the need for elementary principals in the 1950's. Elston says he was reluctant because of his love for the classroom and his lack of experience.

Elston says he told Isbister he didn't feel qualified at the time to become a principal because he was still learn-

ing in the classroom and didn't have all the answers.

But Isbister's advice changed Elston's mind. "He (Isbister) said to me, 'If you teach 50 years, you're still never going to have all the answers,'" Elston recalls.

Elston's move creates a major shuffle of principals and assistant principals at the middle-school level. Elston will be replaced by Carl Taylor, who moves from East to Pioneer.

ONE OF THE MOST well-liked persons in the district, Elston was a friend of many students, parents and

his teachers. In fact, his teachers and other Pioneer staff members prepared a good-bye brunch for him Thursday morning.

There, Elston was presented with a hand-made quilt which was produced by sewing together individual squares given by various staff members and friends.

Elston believes he's succeeded as an administrator because he taught his staff to be sensitive about what they say and do, but not be afraid to challenge and debate any of his decisions.

Elston, who earned his bachelor of arts degree from Eastern Michigan University and a master's degree from the University of Michigan in Ann Arbor, began his administrative duties as principal of five small outlying elementary schools in Canton and assistant to principal William Harding at East 1957.

He assumed duties as principal of Farrand Elementary School in Lakepointe Village subdivision, Plymouth Township, in 1958 before opening the new Pioneer Middle School in 1968. He has been principal at Pioneer all 14 years of the school's existence.

TAG program now centralized

A student who lives near a TAG center will walk to school.

Once the students are signed up, Homes said, a decision will be made on how many TAG centers will be established and where they will be located.

THE TWO instructors now involved in the TAG program would continue next fall at any center, Johnson said.

Trustees wondered Monday night whether students might lose 30-50 minutes of instructional time riding the shuttle buses to the center. That is true, Holmes said, but the state minimum requirement of 900 instructional hours a year still would be met.

The teachers might be persuaded to agree to shorter lunch hours, or the students have shorter recesses, to make up the lost instructional time, Johnson said.

No more than three centers would be established for 1982-83, Holmes said. The centers, which will function as the

students' home school, could be at Allen, Starkweather, Field or Isbister elementaries.

The teacher-student ratio will be the same for regular elementary classrooms (30:1), said Johnson, so there will be no additional teachers salaries.

HOMES HOPES the center approach would last for at least three years so an entire group of students could pass through, he said. That way, the effectiveness of the program could be better measured and evaluated.

If Starkweather, Isbister and Allen are used as the transportation cost would be \$15,970. If Starkweather and Allen were TAG centers the busing cost would be \$21,440, while if Field, Allen and Starkweather were centers, busing costs would be \$16,630.

Students who now attend a year-round Extended School Year building would have to agree to a nine-month school schedule if they enrolled at a TAG center, Homes said.

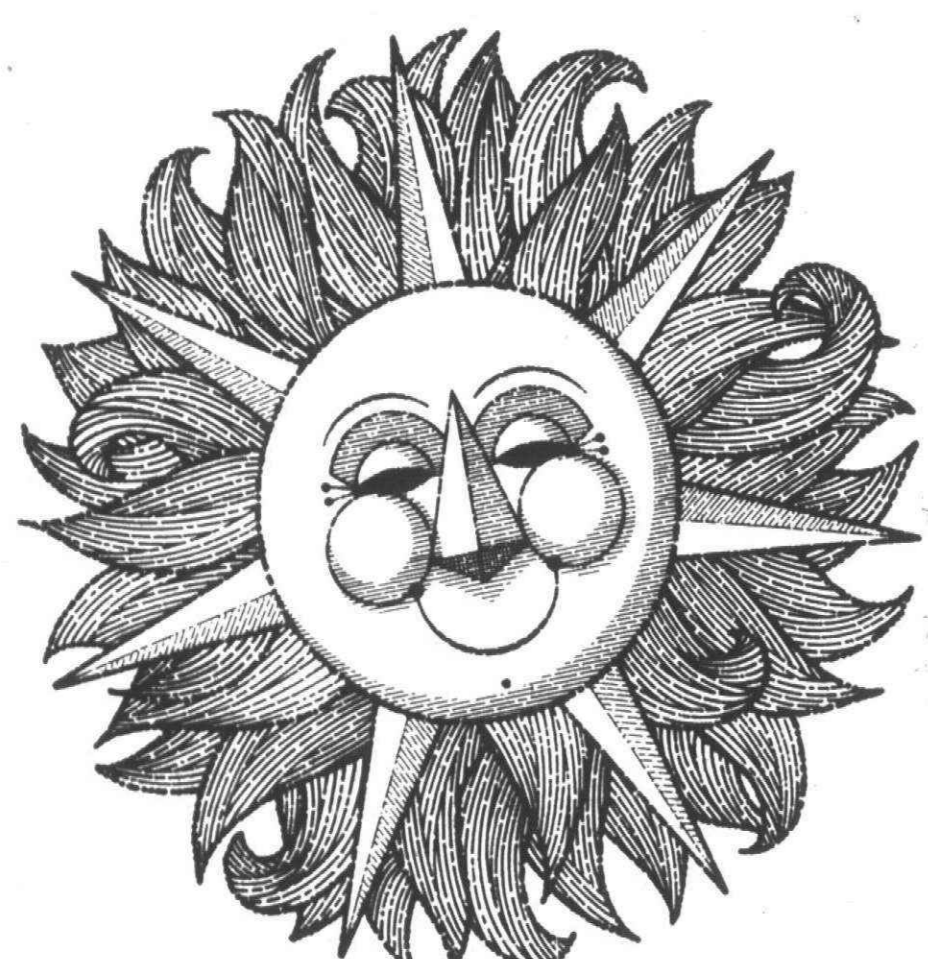

Dollars up, jobs down in new Schoolcraft budget

In dollars, it looks as if the Schoolcraft College budget will be up almost \$600,000 next year.

In real terms, however, the community college's resources will shrink by 6.5 jobs.

That pattern emerged as the board of trustees held a public hearing last week on the \$15.2 million budget it probably will adopt Wednesday.

Only one resident attended the hearing — former trustee Gerald Cox of Garden City. He urged college attention to business education.

FOUR UNIONS that already have contracts and the Faculty Forum, which is negotiating one this summer, will be asked to forego salary increases, said W. Kenneth Lindner, vice president for business affairs.

"There are few, if any, frills. There are few, if any, additional services. There is no long-range planning allocation," said Lindner, summing up expenses.

"We have reduced personnel below authorized levels. There will be one new full-time instructor and one custodian for the new Culinary Arts addition. Four full-time faculty have been replaced with part-time equivalents," Lindner said.

Total college employment will drop from 339.5 to 333. The largest single loss will be suffered by faculty, where full-time posts will drop from 159 to 155. The reduction has been accomplished by attrition (retirements) rather than layoffs.

Because fourth-quarter state aid payments have been held up in the state's budget crisis, Schoolcraft will have to borrow for working capital. The extra \$110,500 interest expense, said Lindner, is the equivalent of three-four faculty jobs.

SCHOOLCRAFT budgets generally have risen 8 to 15 percent a year in

recent years, but only a 4.2-percent increase is projected for the fiscal year beginning July 1, said controller A.H. Raby III.

With inflation at 8 or 9 percent last year, he said, a 4.2-percent budget increase translates into a net loss of real purchasing power.

That comparison, however, was disputed by trustee Len Wozniak, who said the 1982 inflation rate appears to be falling to the 4-percent mark.

Wozniak also disagreed with comparing rising college costs to the consumer price index because the CPI is strongly influenced by new house purchase and mortgage costs, both of which are irrelevant.

Although board approval of the budget is scheduled for this week, the revenue picture is still far from firm. The Michigan Legislature still has not adopted a budget for its new fiscal year, Raby noted. College officials, therefore, projected state aid at \$4.3 million, a 12-percent drop from the current year's \$4.9 million.

WHAT IF the economy improves and state aid is higher than Schoolcraft's pessimistic projections? Lindner said the administration would recommend:

- Paying for \$225,000 in benefits that college unions other than faculty are being asked to give up.
- Granting salary increases in the

faculty contract to be negotiated.

• Increasing some operating outlays such as supplies, equipment and library resources.

In related business, the board held a public hearing, required under the new Truth in Taxation Act, on the administration's proposal to levy the full voted 1.77 mills of property tax instead of reducing the tax rate to 1.697 mills because of property assessment increases. Tax increase was estimated at \$5 on an average residence.

Only Dr. Cox spoke, reminding the board of high unemployment rates and chiding trustees Michael Burley, Rosina Raymond and Laura Toy for arriving a few minutes late.

Bradner became 1st president of Schoolcraft in '62

(Part VII)

The first board members of Schoolcraft Community College, elected Oct. 24, 1961, had impressive credentials.

Harold Fischer, a greenhouse owner in Plymouth, had been president of the Plymouth School Board on which he had served six years. A member of the Executive Committee that founded the college, he had been its chairman since June 1960 when Claude Snarey died.

Jane K. Moehle, a mother of two who also lived in Plymouth, had been assistant dean of women at the University of Illinois and director of residences at Kent State University in Ohio.

Ward McCain, an auditor for the Great Lakes Steel Corp., had been a member of the Livonia school board for 13 years. He had replaced Snarey as Livonia's member of the committee.

CHARLES B. Kirkpatrick was a financial analyst for the Ford Motor Co.

Paul Mutnich, who had 14 years teaching and supervisory experience in

the Clarenceville School District, was principal of the evening and adult education program of the Riverview Schools.

L. Clarke Oldenburg was president of his own company, General Industries Inc. in Garden City.

James O'Neil was planning manager of a division of the Ford Motor Co.

AT THE FIRST meeting of the new board, Nov. 11, 1961, Fischer was elected chairman.

Moehle became vice chairman, McCain secretary and Kirkpatrick treasurer. At the meeting, Esther Hulsing, who had served as secretary-treasurer of the Executive Committee since its founding five years before, tendered her resignation. Hulsing, who has compiled an impressive record of achievements in the Plymouth community, recently was elected to the Plymouth Hall of Fame.

One of the board's first actions was to adopt a resolution stating that the primary purpose of the new college

was to make education beyond the high-school level available to all students interested in and capable of benefiting from such an educational program.

THE RESOLUTION indicated that the goals of the institution included:

- Terminal programs for students not going on to four-year college programs;
- Transfer programs for students who did not wish to complete four-year college programs;
- A technical institution for the community, serving local needs for vocational and semi-professional education.

- Opportunities for interested persons to achieve their vocational and cultural needs through evening classes;
- Cooperation with other departments of the school system, with civic groups, with educational institutions and foundations, and with private individuals and corporations in any proper endeavor likely to result in educational advantage to this community college district.

LATE IN DECEMBER 1961, the board of trustees announced that the college had received its first scholarship money.

Dr. and Mrs. Charles W. Sellers gave \$2,000, and the Garden City Education

Association gave \$100. Both were given to establish scholarships to pay community college tuition for Garden City high school graduates.

On May 9, 1962, the Plymouth Kiwanis Club granted two \$100 scholarships for students of the Plymouth School District.

These were the first of 200 scholarships now available to students in the Schoolcraft College district. These scholarships, awarded primarily on the basis of need, total more than \$55,000.

ON JAN. 17, 1962, after a two-hour interview with Dr. Eric Bradner, the board of trustees offered him the position of president of the college. He accepted on Jan. 24. To understand why he pondered for a week, one must understand the circumstances in which he found himself.

Four years before (in 1958), Bradner had been the executive officer of the

Bay City Junior College, with the title of dean. The college operated under the Bay City Board of Education and the local superintendent of schools.

At the time, Bradner was trying to expand Bay City Junior College into a three-county institution (Saginaw, Bay and Midland counties) of which he hoped to become president.

IN 1958 the residents of the three counties voted to found what became Delta College, but it soon became apparent that the people of Saginaw and Midland counties had their own man in mind for president.

The new president, who was from Ohio, offered Bradner a deanship. He still was considering that offer early in 1961. While attending a junior college convention in Washington, D.C., he received a telephone call from Fischer, who had gotten his name from Dr. Raymond Young of the University of Michigan.

Sheriff's patrol opting to drive law enforcement road alone?

The battle over Wayne County park law enforcement (local police vs. the sheriff's department) continued last week, while hitting a stretch of road with a few unexpected turns.

The sheriff's secondary road patrol has consequently taken a few bumps—and rightly so.

The secondary patrol is operating under a \$885,000 state grant from Jan. 1 through Sept. 30. The Michigan Office of Criminal Justice Programs (OCJP) contracts with the sheriff's department for services in return for the funds.

County Commissioner Bill Joyner threw the first curve at Sheriff Bill Lucas, Joyner, in a letter to Lucas, said Lucas' department is "charged under the contract with providing protection in county parks."

It's an interesting turn because since the contract does call for the sheriff to provide "increased levels of patrol in county and state parks."

HOWEVER, the solution to county park patrol isn't found in the OCJP contract. OCJP director Charles Davoli says the sheriff wouldn't be expected to provide park patrol to receive his state funds.

"There is no way a sheriff can cover the entire county under the program. It is left up to the discretion of the sheriff how the resources are used," says Davoli.

Lucas will be able to collect the state money as long as he lives up to the "general intent of the contract," Davoli says.

Yet, the OCJP had a curve of its own — Lucas hasn't collected any of the state money yet.

To collect the money the sheriff's department must file a quarterly report and the OCJP sends off a check for a portion of the grant.

Bob Reynolds, of the OCJP, says Lucas could still collect the money, even though the first quarterly report wasn't received.

"They would have until the end of the contract to collect the money, otherwise it possibly would revert back to the state," said Reynolds.

The OCJP reports this is the first case of a department not collecting its money at the end of the quarter.

The report was filed with the Wayne County Board of Commissioners according to Patrolman George Supernois, a road patrol spokesperson.

IT APPEARS Lucas' only requirement for the money is the general intent of the contract — traffic enforcement and assisting other departments.

Plymouth Police Chief Carl Berry has offered his breathalyzer, lock-up facilities and cooperation to the sheriff. However, he has not been taken up on it.

Canton Police and the Michigan State Police in Northville both report the same thing.

Yet Sgt. Ron Brown, the secondary patrol supervisor, claims the deputies use the local breathalizers.

Somebody's got some wrong information.

Watching a sheriff's car drive past an accident (with injuries) in Plymouth Township Thursday has to be the clincher.

With traffic drastically affected by the two-car wreck, the deputy simply drove by Berry (trying to direct traffic) and waved. No conversation, no window down and no offer for assistance.

Supernois said the deputy probably thought everything was taken care of. "Normally, if you see two police

cars, you figure they have it taken care of," he said. "Our deputies are supposed to stop and help other departments."

Berry said he could have used a hand with the traffic.

Local police departments have been asking for assistance in Hines Park. Lucas claims it's too dangerous to send his men into Hines Park.

Lucas is expected to answer some questions about the contract and his department at the county commission this week. I, for one, will be interested in hearing his answers — since he gets mighty defensive with my questions.

Hopefully, Lucas will decide to talk at this board meeting.

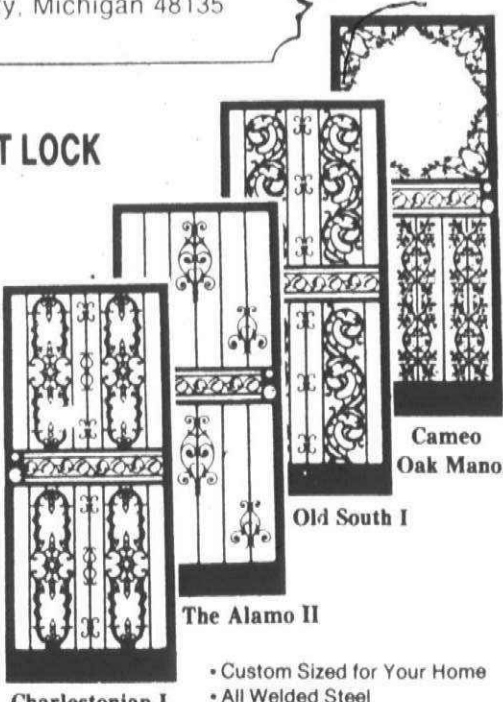

County park fee up to road panel

One commissioner says it won't work. His colleagues say it has to work.

After that exchange, the Wayne County Board of Commissioners voted to ask the Road Commission, which runs county parks, to charge admission.

The board proposed a \$1-a-day, \$10-a-season vehicle admission charge — especially for the E.N. Hines Parkway along the Middle Rouge River in western Wayne County.

"All we have done is shift the problem elsewhere," said Commissioner R. William Joyner, D-Plymouth, referring to efforts by cities to boot out crowds of young people with their alleged beer and drug parties.

"This (fee) will be enforced against 18-20-year-olds rather than senior citizens or my family reunion from the Midwest," said Joyner, as he voted against the plan.

PUSHING THE FEE plan was Commissioner Kay Beard, D-Inkster, whose present district includes Dearborn Heights, whose Mayor Don Bishop shut down Hines Park in Dearborn Heights.

Joyner charged — and fee advocates agreed — that the plan probably couldn't be implemented until fall or next year. But backers wanted to go ahead with it.

"We cannot institute an ordinance. This is a recommendation to the Road Commission," Beard said of Thursday's voice vote. "The Road Commission will have to take action and send it back to us."

She said she had no idea whether the Road Commission would favor it.

Another part of the County Board's action was to ask the Michigan Legislature to channel back to county government some of the \$25 parking fines the county expects to collect from parking violators.

"We've tried to get part of that fine money for years," said Commissioner Mary Dumas, R-Livonia. She seemed pessimistic the Michigan Legislature would vote it but willing to ask.

BUT JOYNER remained firm that the fee plan not only be enforced unfairly against young people, but wouldn't work.

"It's a wonderful idea if it were enforceable," he said. "There are so many ways in and out of that park. I can park on a side street and just walk down."

The commissioners' plan calls for allocating 25 percent of the vehicle fees revenue to the Road Commission for park maintenance and sending the rest to the county general fund, where it could support the sheriff's patrol.

The Sheriff's Department had put a \$400,000 price tag on the cost of policing Hines Park, Joyner noted.

Exec candidates deplore board's millage request

Most leading candidates for Wayne County executive see the Board of Commissioners request for a property-tax increase as madness, arguing that "good management" is the answer to the \$17-million budget deficit.

But one candidate, Republican Harry Stearnes, sees the board's request for one mill on the Aug. 10 ballot as a clever negotiating ploy.

"The commissioners are forced to come up with an answer because the state uniform budget code says they must come up with a plan to balance

the budget within 30 days of learning it will be out of balance," said Stearnes, a public information officer for the board.

The board voted 14-6 June 9 to ask voters for the tax increase. One mill equals \$1 per \$1,000 of state equalized valuation. One mill would raise \$17 million in revenue.

"THE COMMISSIONERS had three options," Stearnes went on.

"One was to ask the unions for concessions — which they couldn't get. The second was layoffs. When they attempted that, two officials (Prosecutor William Cahalan and Sheriff William

Lucas) went to court asking for temporary restraining orders to exempt their departments. So the commissioners couldn't get that.

"The third was to put a millage on the ballot. This one mill is a program to satisfy the state they (commissioners) had a plan to balance the budget. It takes them to Aug. 10. They had an ulterior motive: to waste time until four of the union contracts run out June 30.

"The last time (in recent weeks), the unions had the county by the tail (in rejecting concessions). This time (after the contracts run out), the county will have the unions by the tail.

"The whole thing is a subterfuge to kill time, satisfy the state and eventually put a greater squeeze on the unions for concessions."

How does Stearnes stand on the millage question? "Obviously, you gotta be against it. I'm paying taxes on two houses — our own in Plymouth Township and a farm my wife inherited. I don't want to pay more taxes," he said.

NOR DO any of the other candidates. Sheriff Lucas, whose action in seeking to block layoffs in his department helped set off the millage request, was the first to denounce it.

"Wayne County government needs

proper management of its existing resources before asking for additional money to keep the current methods alive," said Lucas, a candidate for the Democratic nomination in the Aug. 10 primary.

"Before the taxpayers are asked to give more and more, we must first conduct a complete financial and management audit. . . I intend to bring in top professional, independent financial auditors and management experts to bring county government into line. Expenses must not exceed revenue," said Lucas, who has been sheriff since 1969.

LIVONIA MAYOR Edward H. McNamara, seeking the Democratic nod, called the county board's millage request "a cop-out."

"These 27 people ran for cover. They figured this could get them by the primary without facing the (deficit) problem. By mid-August, we're going to have payless paydays. The millage is not going to pass.

"Bill Lucas is a great contributor to the problem. I'm looking at an auditors report now which shows that the average employee in his department draws \$4,000 in overtime each year. That's a \$4,000 average. Some draw \$1,000 in overtime, others as much as \$23,000.

"Another thing: That overtime goes into the average for final computing of their pensions. A deputy who earns \$22,500 and is entitled to a base pension of \$14,000 will actually draw a pension of \$18,000 because of overtime.

"Lucas is letting these people run amok with this overtime BS. The sheriff's people have run up \$2 million in overtime this year that's not even in the budget," said McNamara, who has been mayor since 1970.

ROBERT FITZPATRICK, county economic development director, not only opposed the millage but saw long-range harm coming from even putting the request on the ballot.

"This jeopardizes the one-mill renewal that's scheduled to come up next year," said FitzPatrick, who is running in both the Democratic and Republican primaries.

"Good management can resolve the budget problem. In 1972 (when he was county board chairman), we negotiated the first three-year contract. The unions threatened a strike. We prepared management to perform essential services."

One major change since 1972, he said, is the power of the UAW over county commissioners. "The power of

the union is so great — the board of commissioners is afraid to take them on in an election year. In county government, you have the union negotiating with the unions.

"In 1972 county employment was nearly 10,000. Today it's 4,000. But the budgets are nearly the same. The cost increase has been astronomical. I have an auditors report here that shows the sheriff's department, in 1978, '79 and '80, ran up \$7,526,000 in overtime."

"THERE'S NO chance of its going anywhere," said Detroit Councilman Mel Ravitz, a Democratic contender.

"They (commissioners) are whistling 'Dixie.' They're just postponing a hard decision to after the election. In August, after giving people false hope of a miracle, they then face the fact of no money."

The problem will be aggravated once the millage is defeated in August, said Ravitz, because two more months will have elapsed in the fiscal year, and any layoffs will be all the more severe.

Ravitz deplored the procedure of the sheriff and prosecutor going to court to protect their departments from layoffs. "We must resolve the question of whether they have a right, on a step-around basis, to go around the elected policymakers (commissioners)."

Auditors say tax hike won't correct deficit

Wayne County's three-man Board of Auditors thinks the County Board of Commissioners blew it in asking for a one-mill property tax increase on the Aug. 10 ballot.

The Board of Auditors, which is scheduled to be abolished and replaced by a county executive next Jan. 1, said the 27-member county board's decision won't eliminate the \$17 million budget

deficit, even if voters approve it.

In a letter to County Board Chairman Samuel Turner, Ted Mrozowski, Leonard Proctor and Richard Kelly gave three reasons why the tax hike plan won't work:

- The tax hike won't satisfy the state Uniform Budgeting Act, which requires the county board to amend its

budget "as soon as it becomes apparent that a deviation from the original general appropriations act is necessary and the amount of the deviation can be determined."

- Even if voters approve the tax, it won't generate revenue until the 1982-3 fiscal year and not the current year.
- The board faces the prospect of even more severe layoffs if it waits two


months longer in the fiscal year to lay off 760 county employees.

The auditors urged the board "to reduce expenditures to projected revenue levels so that the current year will not end in deficit."

The Board of Commissioners, meeting last Thursday, did not put the letter on the agenda and made no comment on the budget deficit.

Your general medical history has a lot to do with the type of treatment you will receive at your dentist. For example, if you are taking a drug affecting blood clotting, the dentist should be informed so as to be aware of potential hemorrhaging problems should he have to extract a tooth.

A patient with high blood pressure should certainly inform the dentist. Certain anesthetics and medications should be used in preference to others.

If you have some form of heart condition, the dentist may change his method of working with you. The patient with a cardiac pacemaker should certainly inform his dentist. The dentist might have planned to do electrosurgery, a technique that utilizes high-frequency current to remove gum tissue. If the pacemaker doesn't have proper shields or safeguards, the high frequency current could cause it to stop or become erratic. The dentist can use other means of treatment.

If you are pregnant, diabetic, allergic to certain medication, your dentist must know these things — it's for YOUR benefit.



Wedding Cake

- 1 can (16-1/2 ounces) vanilla frosting
- 1 teaspoon rum flavoring
- 1 to 2 tablespoons milk or cream
- Food coloring
- Fresh flowers

Thaw cakes partially at room temperature or in refrigerator. On a 16-inch square serving platter or other flat surface, place 4 of the cakes to form a square. Place remaining 2 cakes, 1 on top of the other in the center of the cake square. Combine frosting with rum flavoring and just enough milk to attain a good spreading consistency. Similar to the frosting on the cakes. With a spatula, smooth all seams of cake to conceal them, using additional frosting as necessary. Tint remaining frosting with yellow food coloring. Press a pastry bag fitted with a star tip, press rosettes of frosting to form a continuous row along the edge of cake layers and make a border around the bottom of the cake. With leaf tip, make ribbon designs around sides of cake and tier. Decorate the layers with real flowers, as desired. 60 servings.

Bacon-Cheese Ball

- 2 pounds bacon
- 1 package (8 ounces) cream cheese, softened
- 1 cup shredded Cheddar cheese
- 1/4 cup milk
- 2 tablespoons prepared horseradish
- 1 package (6-1/4 ounces) Thin Crackers

Cut strips of bacon crosswise into 1/2-inch pieces. Cook in frying pan, or microwave oven, until crisp; remove to absorbent paper. Combine cream cheese, Cheddar cheese, milk and horseradish. Cut slices of corned beef in half lengthwise. Spread approximately 1/2 teaspoon horseradish sauce on one side of each strip of corned beef around a Snack Stick. Cover loosely and refrigerate. Yield: about 60 appetizers.

Saucy Franks

- 2 packages (16 ounces each) frankfurters
- 1 jar (18 ounces) apricot preserves
- 2 tablespoons lemon juice
- 1/4 teaspoon ground ginger
- 1/4 teaspoon dry mustard

Cut each frankfurter into five 1-inch pieces. Place apricot preserves in blender container and blend until smooth. Combine apricot preserves, lemon juice, ginger and dry mustard; cook slowly 5 minutes. Add pieces of frankfurter and continue cooking 8 to 10 minutes or until meat is heated through. Yield: 100 appetizers.

Layered Sausage Wedges

- 10 slices bologna
- 10 slices New England sausage
- 3 packages (3 ounces each) cream cheese, softened
- 2 tablespoons Dijon mustard
- 2 tablespoons chopped chives
- Parsley sprigs, if desired

Combine cream cheese, mustard and chives, mixing thoroughly. Spread approximately 2 teaspoons of cream cheese mixture on each of 8 slices bologna and 8 slices of New England sausage. - 1 cup (1/2 pint) heavy cream

- 1 teaspoon vanilla
- Strawberries, halved

Thaw puff pastry for 20 minutes and unfold. Cut both sheets in half making four 5 x 10 inch rectangles. On a lightly floured board, roll out each sheet to a 6 x 14 inch rectangle. Want to lose weight? Change your eating habits

Want to look and feel better? Want to have more energy and be more active? Simple — change your eating habits and start exercising.

It's easier said than done. Most of us know that there is no magic formula to lose weight. To succeed, we must burn more calories than we consume.

Yet we still think, hope and pray that some day there will be an overnight secret to shedding those excess pounds.

But let's face it, to lose weight — and most important of all, to keep that weight off — we must change our eating habits, forever.

Fats, sugars and starches are the main source of unneeded calories. When I decided to be serious about losing weight, I analyzed what I was eating. I found hidden calories everywhere — cream in coffee, butter on bread and vegetables, dressings on salads, sautéed foods, red meat and junk food.

Fats have more calories per gram than carbohydrates or proteins, nine calories per gram. No diet should totally eliminate fats because they are an essential nutrient, and the body needs small amounts for good health. But fats can be drastically reduced in most Americans' diet.

For example, use lemon on a salad instead of oil or rich, creamy dressings. Use fresh herbs to add flavor to foods. Try enjoying good bread without butter, with the calories you save on the butter, have a second roll for dessert instead of a high-calorie fattening dessert.

Use lemon or vinegars to flavor fish and vegetables. Use a little bouillon instead of oil or butter when sauteing food. Bake, broil or steam to enjoy the natural goodness of fresh foods.

Eat more chicken and fish instead of red meat. Besides having fewer calories, they also have a lot less cholesterol.

Any diet that is boring or not nutritionally balanced will usually be discarded, and any weight that was lost will usually just reappear.

Just because you want to lose weight, don't deprive yourself. Just be sensible. Be creative when cooking in the kitchen and make healthy, low-calorie meals for your family and friends. Enjoy fresh fruit instead of empty-calorie desserts, like fresh vegetables to nibble on at a party instead of potato chips. Did you know that one potato chip has 10 calories?

When bored or lonely, many of us resort to eating to give us pleasure or comfort. Try instead taking a walk or a bike ride. Go shopping and imagine yourself one size smaller. Remember, you're not the only one in the world who wants to lose a few pounds. There are plenty of organizations and self-help groups that will help you on the way. Ask for the support of friends and family members.

Moderate exercise on a consistent daily basis is an important aid in weight loss. It results in an increased pulmonary and cardiovascular efficiency, better muscle tone and a sense of well being.

A change of food habits is an essential, not just to lose weight but to keep it off for a lifetime.

Hear are some of my favorite re-

cipes for low-calorie and high-nutrition meals.
4 oz. boned and skinned chicken breast, julienned
¼ cup pineapple
¼ cup mushrooms
¼ cup sliced green pepper
salt and pepper to taste
¼ cup chicken broth or bouillon
 Mix all ingredients in a small casserole dish. Cover with foil. Bake at 325 degrees for 1 hour.

4 fillets of sole or any fish you like
4 large packed romaine leaves
1 tsp. tarragon
salt and pepper to taste
¼ cup each of julienned carrots, leeks and celery
 Salt and pepper each fillet. Add tarragon. Roll the fish up in the romaine leaves. Place in low casserole dish. Cover with vegetables. Add ¼ cup white wine and ¼ cup water. Cover with foil and bake at 350 degrees for 20 minutes.

2 chicken breasts, boned and skin removed
1 8-oz. package spinach or green beans
¼ cup fresh basil
¼ tsp. oregano
 Combine diced chicken with soy sauce; set aside. Combine bouillon with hot water in a cup. Cook separately the bamboo shoots, celery and mushrooms

¼ tsp. rosemary
¼ tsp. salt
Small can of tomatoes, blended
 Mix first six ingredients. Cover with tomatoes. Cover with foil. Bake at 375 degrees for 45 minutes.

STIR FRY CHICKEN AND VEGETABLES
10 oz. chicken breasts, skinned, boned and diced
2 tsp. soy sauce
Salt to taste
1 cube chicken bouillon mixed with ¼ cup hot water
4 oz. sliced bamboo shoots
¼ red or green pepper
2 ribs celery
¼ cup quartered mushrooms

Combine diced chicken with soy sauce; set aside. Combine bouillon with hot water in a cup. Cook separately the bamboo shoots, celery and mushrooms

with a small amount of the bouillon in the wok.

Stir fry each vegetable for one minute with a dash of salt. Heat about 2½ Tbsp. bouillon until hot and stir fry chicken quickly over high heat. Serve with rice and sweet and sour sauce.

SWEET AND SOUR SAUCE
¾ cup water
2 Tbsp. tomato paste
2 Tbsp. vinegar
1 Tbsp. green pepper flakes
¼ tsp. ground mustard
¼ tsp. garlic powder
¼ tsp. ginger powder
¼ tsp. salt
Artificial sweetener to equal 3 Tbsp. sugar
½ cup crushed pineapple canned in its own juice
 Place all ingredients in a blender to puree. Heat and serve.

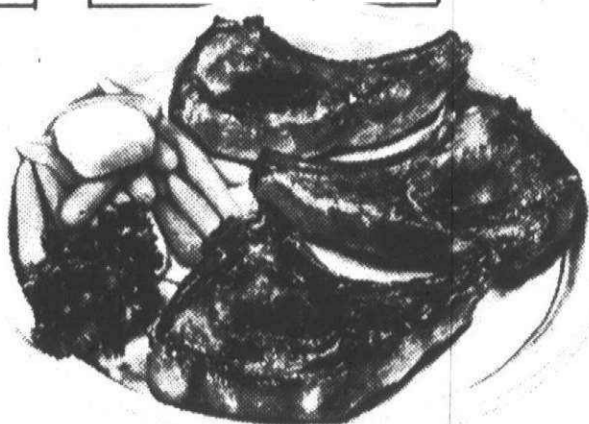

Learning center

SC students who plug in connect to new skills

Dave Rumrill of Redford was a tad nervous about starting college at the age of 25.

Because he had been laid off from his job, he had time to drop by the Learning Assistance Center at Schoolcraft College to get an idea of what academic life is all about.

The center, set up in Room 130 of the liberal arts building and coordinated by Sirkka Gudan, is a way Schoolcraft has found to help the uncertain find out everything they want to know about college without really starting.

Rumrill learned about the center from Gudan during an orientation meeting, the kind of session she will be offering 7:30-8:30 p.m. Thursday in Schoolcraft's physical education building.

"They took me around the room and showed what help they could offer me," he said. "Before school started I went through all their video tapes on memory training, note-taking and test-taking. It helped a lot. The difference between my business notes when I started and when I finished the class was just phenomenal.

"LAST YEAR when I took Business 101, the staff helped me with the accounting part which was hard for me. The volunteers there give you suggestions so you can understand what you are doing and then learn how to do it."

Coordinator Gudan is already gearing for adults starting summer and fall classes. Beyond the June 24 orientation session, there will be similar programs July 22 and Aug. 19 at the same time and location.

"I'll discuss the support services at the center," she explained. "We hope to make adults feel more comfortable about re-entering the education realm by giving them a good understanding of ways to learn."

Much of the resource material, such as videotapes and cassettes, was produced in classes and workshops at the college. "That's so they will be geared to specific Schoolcraft classes," said Gudan.

Helping students to break into academia are three part-time assistants and about 25 volunteers, each donating about three or four hours a week to help students with such courses as math and computer programming.

One of them is 65-year-old Tom Headrick of Redford, who uses his accounting experience "to relieve the anxiety of other people."

He does more than tutor. "Volunteers help conduct school tests used to show students at what level they are," he explained. He also reads chapters of textbooks into-tape recorders for use by students.

HE'S HAD several rewarding moments. One of them came while he was making a telephone survey to students who had not returned to college. "Someone told me that if it hadn't have been for the center, he wouldn't have passed his course, said Headrick."

But returning adults are not the only ones to find value in the center, not more than two years old.

"I've graduated from two colleges and have never been exposed to ways to increase my ability to read," reported Norv Cleveland of Plymouth. The 25-year-old who graduated from Michigan State University and Sacred Heart Seminary in Detroit.

"I wanted to be a priest but didn't like the celibacy part," he said.

Planning to enter Schoolcraft's nursing program in the fall, he has been using tapes containing advice on how to increase his reading speed.

"Some people regard a learning center as beneath them," he said. "I find it very beneficial," he stated.

Grant funds study

Plymouth resident Marcia Andersen, PhD, RN, will continue her study of drug-dependent women. A \$235,935 grant renewal from the U.S. Public Health Service represents the second year of support, totaling \$45,394.

Andersen, one of the first women in Michigan to receive her doctorate in nursing, is an associate professor at the Wayne State University college of nursing and mental health nurse at the Detroit Receiving Hospital health center.

She developed her research study to test an unusual intervention method with drug-dependent women who seek health care at Detroit Receiving Hospital. Those who refuse to participate in traditional follow-up treatment programs are referred to Andersen and a team of nurses.

THE TEAM has initiated a personalized nursing project with 150 addicts.

Treatment takes place in their homes, rather than clinics. They are assisted not only with their addiction, but with all their personal problems in an intense effort to reduce their drug dependency.

The study, which started in May 1981, involves the 150 women undergoing treatment, with 150 more forming an untreated control group, which can be compared with the women undergoing treatment.

The response to her team's unorthodox in-home treatment program has been very encouraging, Andersen said, and she is pleased with the progress of the study and the women addicts who are being helped.

The first person to earn her doctorate in nursing at the University of Michigan, Andersen based her doctoral studies on the health care and problems of drug addicts. She interviewed addicts and examined health records in several areas of the country.

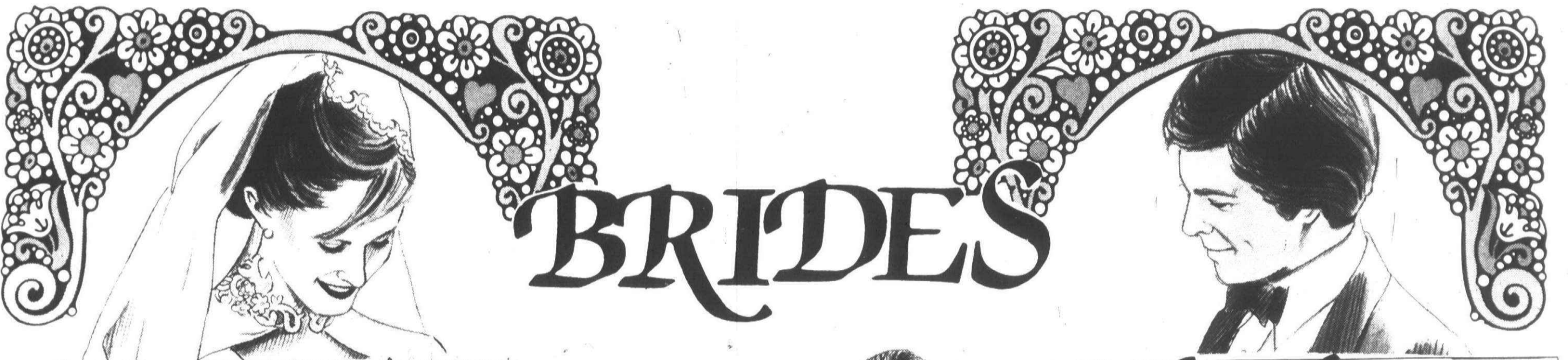

It's a hard-lot life viewing this flashy Hollywood 'Annie'

When a movie is taken from a play or book, I don't expect it to be an identical copy of the original. A work that is adapted to another medium should be different.

It should be changed in ways that take advantage of the medium, but the spirit of the work shouldn't be changed — just the outward form.

That's what bothers me about "Annie" (PG). The movie just doesn't capture the charm that made the Broadway musical so delightful. One of the dramatic highlights of the show isn't even included in the movie.

That was the magic moment shortly after the little orphan and her dog arrived at Daddy Warbucks' mansion. With the help of servants, they were suddenly transformed — via scrubbing, dressing and grooming — into the curly haired Annie with her red dress and her dog Sandy beside her.

The movie doesn't have this kind of appeal. What it has is flash. There is a hard gloss about "Annie" that makes everything too bright, too strident and too mechanical.

The sound quality of the film is actually unpleasant a good part of the time, and the dancing is overly insistent. I get the feeling that the director, John Huston, though he would lose his audience if the music stopped.

ANN REINKING, a sensational dancer (seen in "All That Jazz") is wasted in this movie, in spite of its numerous dance sequences. She plays Daddy Warbucks' prim secretary, Miss Farrell, and her dancing reflects that primness. It might be right for the role, but it's wrong for Reinking.

Albert Finney cuts an imposing figure as Daddy Warbucks. However, the movie never does make a plausible case accounting for the way Annie was able to get him to accept an orphan in his home.

Aileen Quinn is terrific as the feisty, red-haired Annie, always chipper and smiling. Even so, she faces tough competition from a dark-haired, round-cheeked little girl, Toni Ann Gisondi, who plays the orphan Molly. In her own quiet way, she is a real scene-stealer.

Others in the cast include a trio of evil-scheming adults: Bernadette Peters, Tim Curry and Carol Burnett. Peters doesn't have much of a role, and Curry's is only slightly better. As for Burnett, who plays Miss Hannigan, the manager of the orphanage, she merits some discussion.

She plays her role as if Hannigan were soused all the time — stinko, blotto, drunk. I don't think drunk acts are particularly funny, and there was nothing about Burnett's interpretation to make me change my mind.

I might have smiled the first time she appeared on screen. After all, she was wearing clothes so outlandish they make Bette Midler look like a candidate for the best-dressed list. But the novelty wears off after her second, third and fourth appearances with the same old get-a-laugh-by-acting-drunk routine.

Nevertheless, a lot of people in the audience did laugh, and a lot of people will find this movie entertaining.

If I had a couple of children of elementary-school age, I might take them to see "Annie." It is certainly better for children than a lot of other current movies.

It just doesn't have the impact of the stage production.

Farmington Hills girl aims for Olympics

Paula Inman took advantage of a rare break in her increasingly hectic schedule.

The Farmington Hills equestrian was competing at a horse show in King of Prussia, Pa. Just prior to that, she participated in a couple of Florida shows.

But, because of an off day, she found time to fly back to her home state for a few hours.

Inman is not fond of all the travelling, but she's learning that it's as necessary a part of her existence now as a saddle and fashionable riding clothes.

"I'd rather not live out of suitcases, but that's what you have to do to be dedicated," said Inman. She was in town as a guest recently of the Detroit Sports Broadcasters Association and spoke about her role in the upcoming horse show at the Bloomfield Open Hunt Club.

INMAN IS ONLY 18, but the sparkly-eyed brunette is fast becoming one of the top amateur equestrians on the national circuit. One of the highlights of her career thus far was placing second in the national Junior Jumping Division last year.

That's quite an accomplishment, considering she had to schedule most of her practice and show time around going to class at Farmington Our Lady of Mercy High School.

"Fortunately, I carried a high-enough average that I didn't need any special (high school) tutoring," said Inman, who graduated last June.

"At Mercy, we didn't have any school on Fridays from November through April to conserve energy.

"So, when I went to different horse shows, I would fly out of Detroit on Thursday evenings and come back on Sundays. I carried good-enough grades that if I did need a week off, I was able to get it."

Inman won the Winter Equestrian Festival in Florida this past season.

And, she is one of the leading scorers on the International Silver Classics (INSILCO) race circuit.

At the Devon Horse Show in King of Prussia, she enhanced her reputation as one of the top INSILCO amateurs by winning the overall competition. She also won a February show at West Palm Beach and finished third in a show across the state in Tampa.

Inman competes as an amateur in the hunter and jumper divisions of most horse shows. The jumper division, where horses are seen hurdling a series of obstacles along a specially designed course, is the best known to the average observer.

AN OWNER OF three horses, Inman said it takes a special relationship to handle each of them. She is riding "Centrefold" and "One for the Road" in the INSILCO races, and she's breaking a Danish horse, "Everon," for future races.

"It's a challenge riding horses, and there's always a danger involved in it," said Inman, the youngest of June and Paul Inman's five children.

"You can get hurt, but I haven't had any big accidents. I've really had bruises, but I've never really hurt myself."

"It's a challenge working with another mind . . . to try and work together as a team . . . you and the horse."

"If the horse doesn't have the capabilities that some of the other horses have, it's up to you to bring out the best in your horse."

One of Inman's immediate goals is to place well at the Bloomfield Open Hunt's Motor City and Detroit horse shows this week. The Motor City just ended. The Detroit horse show is just beginning.

"My trainer, Katie Monahan (formerly of Bloomfield Hills but now a resident of Virginia), was chosen for the 1980 Olympic team. And, she's hoping to be on the 1984 team."

"I see the dedication and hard work it takes just by watching her."

Dan Smith, the team's No. 1 pitcher, can still go five innings. He gave up just two hits in five innings of relief work in Canton's 10-2 semifinal win Wednesday over Warren Cousino.

State tournament rules allow only 10 innings and a two-game stint (semifinals and finals).

Canton's No. 2 pitcher, senior left-hander Jamie Chilcoff, is available for eight innings.

MIDLAND ADVANCED to the final with a 5-4 victory in the semifinals over Utica Ford. Midland has been ranked among the top five Class A teams by a state coaches poll most of

Canton came on like gangbusters in its semifinal win over Cousino, a team that ousted two Catholic League powers in the regional, Harper Woods Bishop Gallagher and Detroit Catholic Central.

Canton, the host team, selected the University of Michigan as the semifinal site.

"I wanted to make the kids feel important and play on a good field," said Crissey, who shunned playing on his home field.

The Chiefs fell behind 2-0 after two innings at U-M before a thunderstorm halted play Tuesday.

With the Michigan field unavailable Wednesday, the suspended game was shifted back to Canton.

Don Dombey greeted Cousino starter Steve Gomola with a homer in the third inning, his 10th of the year. Canton then sent eight more batters to the plate, scoring four more runs. The Chiefs added two runs in the fourth, one in the fifth and two in the sixth.

State qualifiers abound

Track stars cap shining season

Track is an individual sport.

Ask Kelly Graham. Or Jennifer Rioux. Or Kelly Champagne.

Graham, the magnificent hurdler from Westland John Glenn who won a pair of Class A state titles, scored all of Glenn's points for a sixth-place finish at the state meet. In effect, Graham outscored all but five Class A teams in the state.

Rioux and Champagne combined for two seconds, a third and a fourth to boost Livonia Ladywood to the second in the Class B state meet. Like Graham, the Ladywood duo accounted for all of their team's points.

ALL THREE girls are on the Observerland's All-Area girls' track team, selected by the coaches. Joining them is a group of athletes equally impressive in displaying their extraordinary skills at major track events.

Graham was chosen by the coaches as the top girls' track athlete this season (see story this page). But the list of outstanding performances from this year's All-Area team is deep.

Here's the coaches picks for the 1982 Observerland All-Area girls' track squad.

TRACK EVENTS

Kelly Champagne, Ladywood, 3,200 meter run — Champagne, only a junior, is a distance runner with remarkable ability. At the Class B state meet, she finished second in the 3,200 meter and fourth in the 1,600 meter. She also set Catholic League marks in the mile (5:09.16) and two mile (11:19.2), winning both.

Perhaps the best indication of Champagne's talent came at the Redford Union Invitational. She started with a 5:20 mile in the four-mile relay. Next came a 2:26 880 in the two-mile relay, followed by a 5:26 mile to anchor the distance medley relay. She capped the meet with a 1:04 split in the mile relay.

Jennifer Rioux, Ladywood, 1,600 meter run — A runner with awesome talent, Rioux teamed with Champagne to give Ladywood the best pair of distance runners in the state. A junior, Rioux was saddled with a cold at the Class B state meet but still finished second in the 1,600 and third in the 800.

Rioux was in better form at the regionals, racing to first in the 400, 800 and 1,600. She has broken the five-minute mark twice in the 1,600 and been under 5:10 four times. Rioux won the 440 and 880 in the Catholic League meet and matched Champagne's performance at the RU Invitational.

At RU, Rioux ran a 5:10 mile in the four-mile relay, went a 2:18 880 in the two-mile relay, had a 3:44 clocking for a three-quarter-mile run in the distance medley relay and finished with a 1:01 split to anchor the mile relay.

Angie Mogielski, Redford Union, 800 meter run — Mogielski, another junior, holds both school and Northwest Suburban League records in the 800-(2:22.4) and 1,600-(5:14.2) meter runs.

Hard working and very competitive, Mogielski showed her versatility by winning both the 100-meter dash and 3,200-meter run in a dual meet against Redford Thurston. She was regional champ in the 1,600 and finished eighth at the Class A state meet in that event.

Moe McNabb, Franklin, 400 meter run — McNabb combined versatility with excellence as Franklin's finest female track athlete ever. A senior, McNabb finished behind a string of five school records: long jump (16-7½), 100 (12.4), 200 (25.7), 400 (58.6) and points scored (173½).

She topped the Observerland's track listings in both the 200- and 400-meter runs. McNabb won both events this season at the Livonia city meet and Northwest Suburban League final, setting a league mark in the 400.

Dawn Johnson, Salem, 200 meter run — Johnson repeated as Plymouth Salem's most valuable performer this season, totalling 230 points. What makes that accomplishment remarkable is that Johnson is just finishing her sophomore season.

Voted MVP at the Tiger Relays earlier in the season (a meet Salem won), Johnson had personal bests of 25.8 in the 200 and 12.5 in the 100. She was regional champ in the 200 and narrowly missed qualifying at the state finals. She also leaped 17-1½ in the long jump.

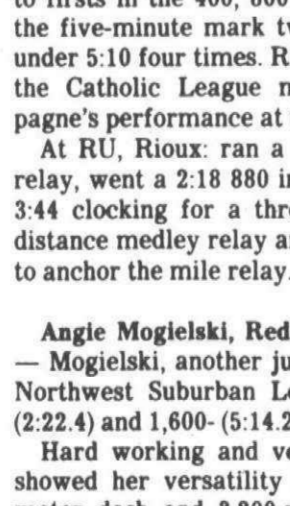

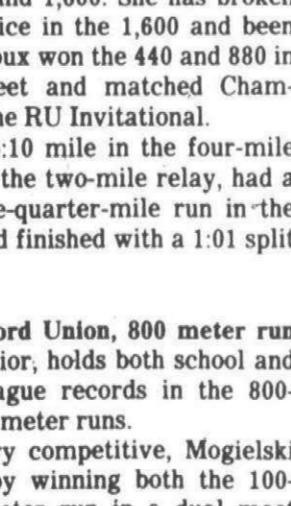

A year ago, the Westland John Glenn hurdler finished first in the state in the 100-meter hurdles and was fifth in the nation in the event — as a junior.

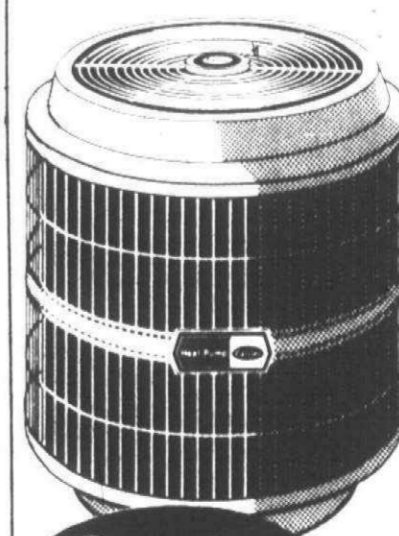

Mary Dazer, Salem, 100 meter run — Dazer, a junior, had a best time of 12.6 in the 100 and proved invaluable to Salem on both the 400- and 800-meter relays.

An excellent student, Dazer was extremely coachable and performed well for her first season on the track team.

Sandy Martinez, John Glenn, 200 meter hurdles — Running in the shadow of Graham, Martinez, a senior, nevertheless showed she was a talented hurdler in her own right.

Martinez won the 100-meter hurdles at the Redford Union Invitational and finished second to Graham in both the 100 and 200 hurdles in the Northwest Suburban League meet. She was third in both at the regionals. Martinez also topped Glenn in the shot put and discus and ran 2:35 in the 800. An honor student, she will attend Michigan State University in the fall.

FIELD EVENTS

Kathy Finn, Stevenson, long jump — 1982 marks the third straight year Finn has been chosen to the All-Observer squad. The Spartans' MVP for the last three seasons, Finn holds four school records, including a leap of 17-9 in the long jump.

In long jump competition this season, Finn finished first at the West Bloomfield Invitational, won the Inter-Lakes League title, was tops at the regional meet and had the best individual jumps at the Stevenson Invitational and Redford Union Relays.

Cathy McBride, Clarenceville, high jump — McBride, a junior, has been among the top five high jumpers at the Class B state meet for the past two seasons. In 1981, she was second at the regionals (5-3) and third at state (5-5). This season, McBride cleared 5-4 at both the regionals and state, finishing first in the region and fifth at state.

An All-Metro West Conference choice the past two seasons, McBride is undefeated in dual meet competition during that span. She also ran the 200-meter low hurdles (32.4) for Clarenceville.

Cheri Muneio, Salem, discus — Muneio set a school record in the discus as a sophomore (102-11) and shattered that mark this season (113-9) in helping her team win at the Redford Union Relays.

Muneio also put the shot 31-4 for the Rocks and scored 78 points in field events during the season, more than anyone else has at Salem.

Nahed Awad, Franklin, shot put — Awad qualified for the state meet in each of the past three seasons and placed ninth in this year's Class A finals. A senior and team co-captain, Awad had a best of 39-11 in the shot and threw the discus 113-5.

She won both events at the Northwest Suburban League meet and Livonia city championships and was the regional titlist in the discus. Awad will attend Michigan State University in the fall.

RELAYS

Salem, 400-meter and 800-meter relays — The same foursome — Dawn Johnson, Kelly Bemiss, Mary Dazer and Ann Glomski — proved to be the fastest in both the 400- and 800-meter relay events.

Johnson and Dazer were among the top sprinters in the area, both in the top four in the 100-meter dash. Bemiss was clocked at 12.2 in the 100-yard dash, and Glomski leaped 17-1/4 in the long jump to finish third in the regionals.

The Salem quartet had best times of 50.7 in the 400-meter relay and 1:47.8 in the 800-meter event. Those marks may crumble fast, since all four girls are underclassmen — Johnson and Bemiss are sophomores, and Dazer and Glomski are juniors.

John Glenn, 1,600 meter relay — This all-senior team of Donna Cook, Lynda Carlson, Teri Hobbins and Cheryl Cook captured first place in three invitational and at the Northwest Suburban League meet. Their best time was 4:06.3.

Carlson was a third-team choice in the 200-meter hurdles and ranked seventh in the area in the long jump; Hobbins consistently ran sub-60-second 400 meters in the 1,600 relay; Cheryl Cook was third in the area in the 440-yard dash (59.4); and Donna Cook was a versatile sprinter.
