Canton holds forum on millage

Officials share information on funding for roads

Canton Township residents hungry for information regarding August's roads improvement millage were treated to a buffet of aerial photographs, accessible engineers, board members and detailed charts June 12 during a public

forum held in the administration building's board room.

The forum was the first of three that will be available leading up to the Aug. 7 vote.

"We wanted to bring residents in so they could ask questions about the roads improvement plan," Trustee Sommer Foster said. "By having an open forum like this, we can address their con-

cerns and let them know how the millage is going to break down between main, local and state roads and how much it would cost, if passed, each individual homeowner."

The millage request, which is for 1.45 mills over 20 years, has been a hot topic with residents Foster has spoken to over the past few weeks.

"All of the residents I've talked to want to be assured that the money will go toward roads only, that the money is

going to stay in Canton Township and that Canton Township is going to manage the way the money is spent," Foster said.

The perimeter of the board room was lined with a series of diagrams and maps, with township engineers and board members on hand to answer questions.

"I'm cautiously optimistic the millage

Tractor Supply Co. plows ahead with Canton location

Tractor Supply Co., billed as the nation's largest operator of farm and rural lifestyle retail stores, is expected to break ground in August for its newest store in Canton.

The company, with more than 1,700 stores in 49 states, is ushering in a major renovation of a building formerly occupied by Livonia Magnetics, which has relocated to a site on Industrial Road in Livonia.

Terry Bixler, broker for ROC Real Estate, confirmed the latest developments as Tractor Supply Co. revs up for a store along the Michigan Avenue business corridor, between Sheldon and Morton Taylor.

"There's going to be a pretty extensive facelift for the entire site," Bixler said.

That also includes a new personal storage business on a site that once housed the now-demolished Garland Place motel.

Jeff Goulet, Canton community planner, said the business is expected to have 70,000 square feet of storage space. That includes one 40,000-square-foot facility and several mini-storage units totaling another 30,000 square feet.

Bixler said the Michigan Avenue site was sold by the former property owner to Canton Industrial LLC, which is headed up by Frank Jarbou, president of Symmetry Property Management and Realty Co.

"The deal was contingent on Livonia Magnetics finding a new home," Bixler said. "A lot of pieces had to come together."

Livonia Magnetics was started in Livonia and later relocated to Canton. Now it is back in the city that bears its name.

Goulet said Tractor Supply officials still have to seek site plan approval from the Canton Planning Commission and, ultimately, the Canton

will pass," Trustee John Anthony said as he mingled with residents. "This needs to be done. There's no way around it. I don't like raising taxes, but what's the alternative? If you do nothing, the roads are going to continue to get worse and worse and pretty soon we're going to be driving on gravel and dirt.

"The nice thing about this millage — and the biggest reason why I'm encouraged — is that 100 percent of the money will stay in Canton."

As the homeowners association president of Canton's Pickwick Village for the past 12 years, Jim Leddy is well-schooled on the frustrations involved in

funding road fixes — and he fully endorses the plan the board has developed to enhance the roads.

"I'm a real fan of the millage, because it's a controlled way for the township to collect the money (for roads improvements), otherwise individual subdivisions have to do it ourselves," Leddy said.

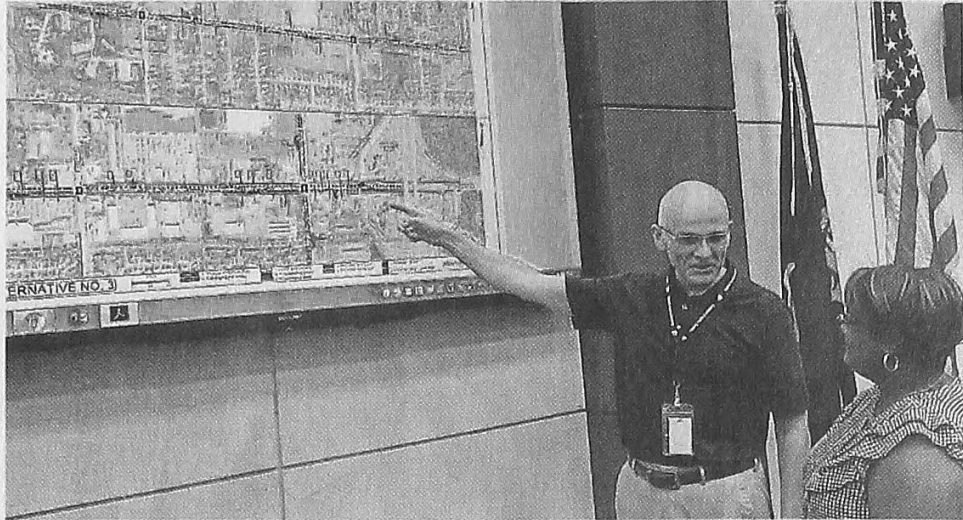
If the millage passes, homeowners associations would be required to pay 20 percent of the cost of a project, while the township would pay 80 percent, Leddy said.

Boulevard project

In addition to upgrading the township's crumbling roads, a successful millage would also set the groundwork for a massive project that engineers ex-

pect to make treacherous Ford Road much safer.

A 2.5-mile stretch of boulevards would separate east- and west-bound Ford Road traffic, eliminating the center turn lane that currently exists. Boulevards would also be installed on Haggerty near the Haggerty-Ford intersec-

tion because of the high volume of traffic in that area, township municipal director Tim Faas explained.

Township Board of Trustees. He has said the redevelopment is an improvement over the old Garland Place motel, which had become an eyesore.

Jarbou said it's "too early" for him to discuss the Tractor Supply project at length.

Founded in 1938, the company began as a mail order tractor parts business, but now has more than 1,700

stores. It is based in Brentwood, Tenn., and has annual revenues of about \$7.2 billion, according to the company website.

The company sought out a niche market of farmers, horse owners, ranchers, part-time and hobby farmers and suburban and rural homeowners, as well as contractors and tradesmen, the website says.

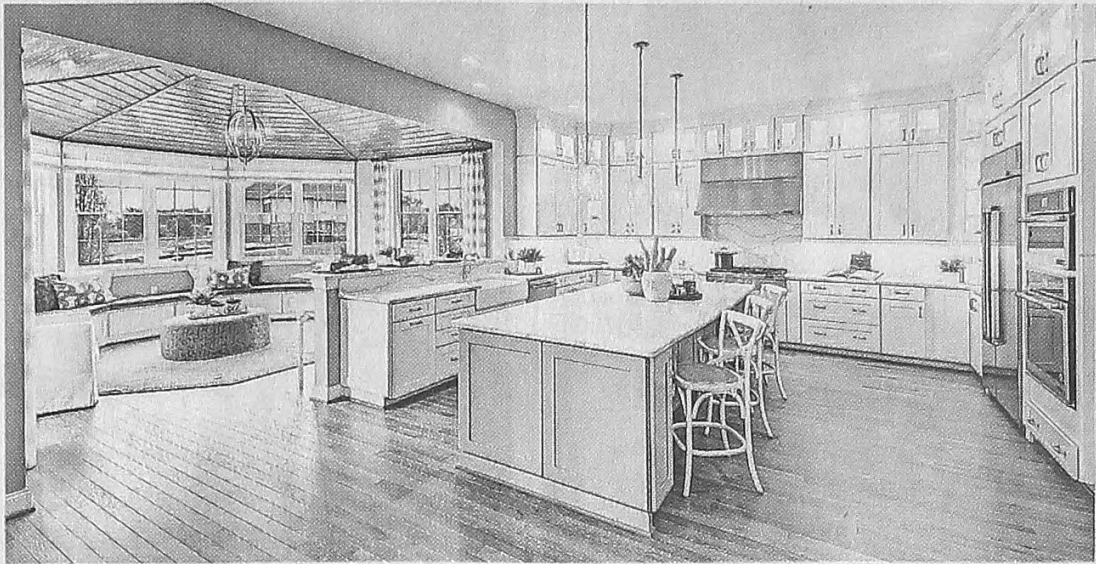

Attempted murder suspect to have psychiatric exam

The Canton Township man facing six charges of attempted murder in the May 25 fire at a Canton mobile home park will undergo a psychiatric examination to determine whether he is fit to stand trial.

Stephen R. Zawodna, 55, who is charged with 19 felonies and a misdemeanor in the May 25 arson fire, is being held without bond in the Wayne County

Jail. He will be examined at the state's Center for Forensic Psychiatry in Ypsilanti.

Judge James Plakas, in 35th District Court, ordered the examination Friday, the day Zawodna was scheduled to have a preliminary hearing.

The fire was reported about 5:30 a.m. May 25 at the Glen Ridge mobile home park in the area of Old Michigan Avenue and Haggerty. The trailer's occupants had been alerted to it by a smoke detector and all six, including three children, escaped unharmed, police said.

One of the victims was a woman with whom Zawodna had a previous relationship, police said.

Township firefighters extinguished blaze and police have not revealed what led investigators to conclude it had been deliberately set. Zawodna was arrested later that morning.

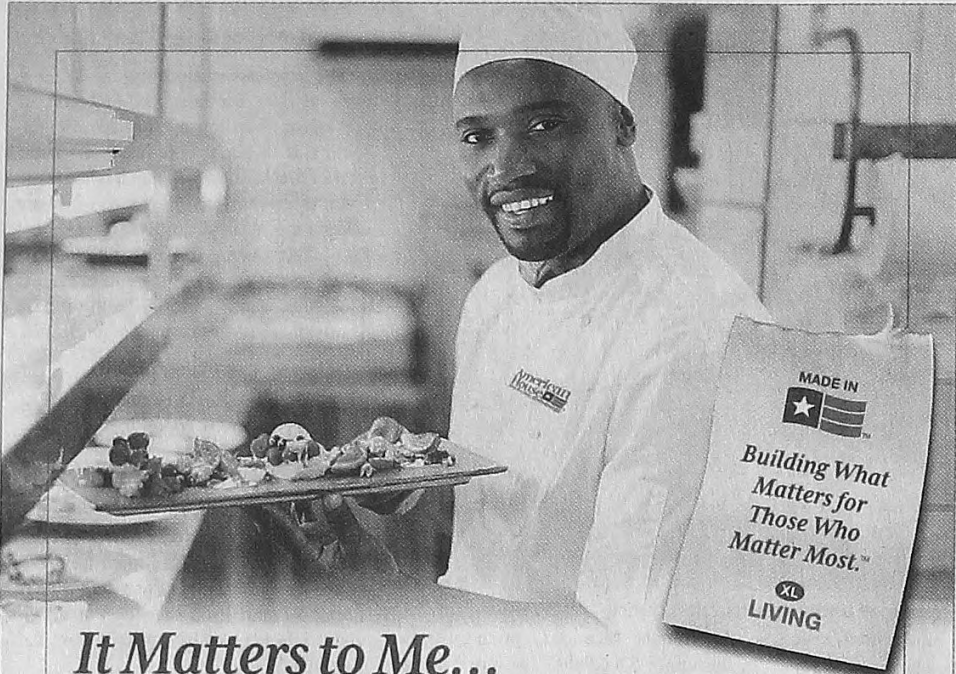
In addition to the six attempted murder charges, Zawodna is charged with six counts of assault with intent to murder, six counts of assault with intent to do great bodily harm, one count of second-degree arson and one count of ag-

gravated domestic violence. All the charges are felonies except the latter, a misdemeanor.

Zawodna is also charged as a habitual offender, which could increase the length of any prison term if he is convicted.

Zawodna will return to district court following the psychiatric examination; a hearing date of Friday, Aug. 17, has been tentatively scheduled.

Cotter's NHL Draft stock on the rise

Paul Cotter has been making the rounds prior to the June 22-23 National Hockey League Draft.

The Canton native, who as a rookie played last season for the USHL's Lincoln (Neb.) Stars, where he had 39 points in 51 games, is gaining momentum and getting more and more interest as the draft approaches.

So far, he's been interviewed by 25 NHL teams.

"The thing I try to get out there the most is just who I am," the 6-foot, 183-pound center said. "I try to maintain the same thing every single time of saying

that my main goal is to be a leader. I expect anybody that they ask, whether it's a coach, scout, teammate, buddy, when they say, 'How's Cotter as a kid?' Without a doubt I want them to say he's a great kid, the hardest worker on and off the ice, great guy and a leader, for sure. That's one of the biggest things and I think my game speaks for itself."

Cotter, who some predict could go as high as the third round, will be in attendance in Dallas for the two-day NHL Draft, which includes seven rounds. He was ranked No. 112 among North American skaters in the final Central Scout-ing Rankings released in April.

Cotter is being represented by Keith McKittrick, an NHLPA-certified player agent with Gold Star Sports Manage-

ment Group.

"To me, as long as it happens, it happens," Cotter said. "And if it doesn't, it's going to be tough. I think my whole life so far has been under the radar. It would be good to get this recognition, but if it doesn't, you go on. At the end of the day, if it doesn't happen, the draft is just a number. But it would be great to have a team I know I can work for toward and pass guys in the future. But I'll be doing the same thing either way. Hopefully, it happens. But if it doesn't, it doesn't."

Last season in Lincoln, Cotter scored 18 goals and added 21 assists with an even plus-minus rating as the Stars finished 35-23-1-1 during the regular sea-


Kneen, a former Michigan Junior Amateur champion who just this spring was the Horizon League Golfer of the Year for Oakland University, be-

1-0 win Friday at Williamston.

The whole sequence of events on the game-winning goal proved to be a bit of a blur for Fenchel, a sophomore forward who had nearly scored with 2:32 left in the first half when her shot was tipped and rang off the crossbar.

But late in the match, Grand Blanc goalkeeper Madison McKay collided with her own defender and the ball squirted loose inside the 18-yard box and onto the foot of Fenchel, who notched her team-best 22nd goal of the year.

"I really don't know, I was just running after it," Fenchel said. "It just went in the back of the goal and that's all that matters at the end of the day. We ran down every ball and it finally paid off at the end of the game. My team played a wonderful game. We left everything on the field. It's so exciting."

It was a great early Father's Day present for Novi coach Todd Pheiffer, who guided Ann Arbor Huron to a Division I state title in 2008.

"We talked at halftime that we played great soccer the first half," Pheiffer said. "The girls kind of had a little chip on their shoulder. The press the entire week said this trophy is Grand Blanc's. The Midland coach said we were going to lose 3-0. Everyone was picking against us. That's kind of how it's been the whole season. I think it's been a year of redemption for these girls."

Novi's back line played a marvelous match, shutting down Grand Blanc's vaunted sister duo of Paige Webber, a junior, and Faith Webber, a sophomore. The Michigan State commits had a combined 58 goals this season.

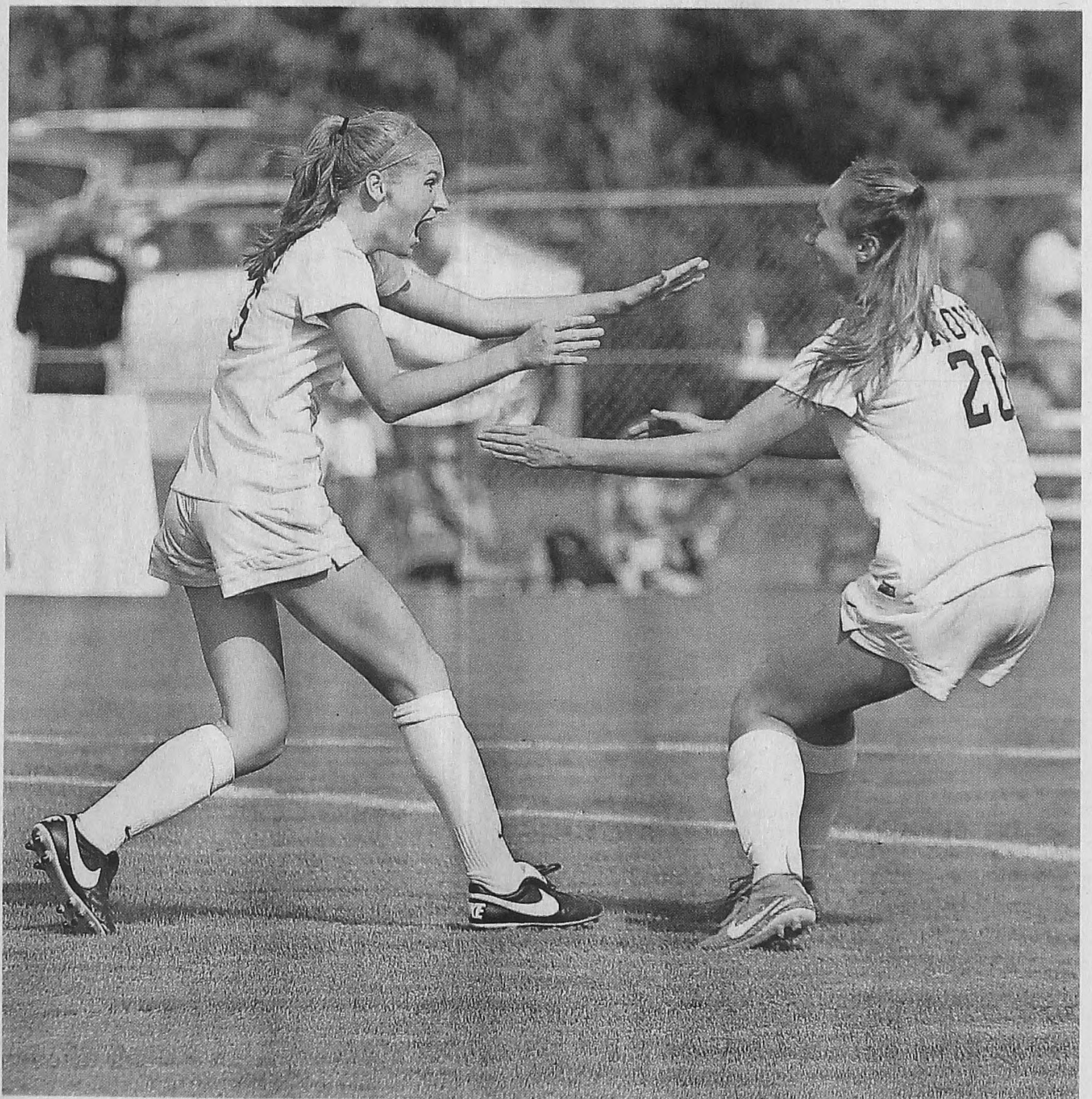
Eva Burns, a freshman, went one-on-one defending Paige Webber, who had 33 goals coming into the state final.

"We just wanted to stay calm and, like, not dive in on them and not let them turn and get opportunities and get behind us, because they're fast," Burns said. "I knew (Paige Webber) was fast, so I tried not to let her turn and, if she did, I let her take a big touch and step in in front of her and not give her the opportunity."

Riely Schultz, four-year captain and sweeper, kept the Wildcats organized on defense.

"As the center back, my job is to clean up anything that gets through and make sure that aren't any shots on goal or stuff," Schultz said. "Our outside backs and midfield did a really great job of not allowing any of those shots, so I didn't have to clean up much at all. Those (Webber) girls are both very skilled, very fast ... amazing players. We just had to keep them in front of us all times or else we knew they'd get the shot."

It was a crushing defeat for the Bobcats (27-2), who had outscored their six state tournament opponents 25-0 entering the final. Grand Blanc was gunning for its first state championship in

school history after coming up short in 2015 and 2003.

"The girls battled, they battled hard all year, got us to this point," Grand Blanc coach Greg Kehler said. "This probably was the most pressure-packed season of all of them. These seniors we had, I thought, did a great job getting us here this year. We were probably one of the favorites to get here and we did. We just couldn't knock in a goal early and they got a late goal, kind of crushed our hopes."

The Bobcats had two golden scoring opportunities in each half, but Jenna Blackburn (17 goals) slipped in the box trying to split two Novi defenders with 28:00 go in the first half, while Faith Webber grazed a shot off the crossbar with 22:18 remaining in regulation and just over the reach of Novi goalie Callie Rich, who notched her fourth postseason shutout.

"We had players like Avery, Jessie

(Bandyk) and Julia step up in this play-offs, but really our unsung heroes are our back line," Pheiffer said. "Lauren Calhoun and Eva Burns played absolutely phenomenal. Eva Burns is a freshman who is going against Paige Webber. Even at halftime, they switched Paige and I said, 'Eva, you're going to come play on the right side where she generally plays.' And she did a phenomenal job - a freshman - playing on the biggest stage of her career so far and just did an awesome job. I thought Lauren and Eva were our unsung heroes and, of course, Jessie at midfield. She just played so well and was a workhorse for us."

And the Wildcats apparently learned from their previous loss late in the season to the Bobcats by playing a near flawless game. They finished the year with seven straight tourney wins and an overall record of 19-5-1.

"We were 12 minutes away from beat-

ing Grand Blanc during the regular season," Pheiffer said. "We let that one slip away. They just played with so much pride today and I'm so proud of them."

Under Brian O'Leary, Novi captured state titles in 2005, 2006, 2007, 2010 and 2011.

"I'm very happy, because it's my first year and it's just really exciting because we worked really hard to get this," Burns said.

And the Wildcats remain perfect in state championship games.

"It's exhilarating, the feeling of the final whistle blowing and knowing your team came out on top," said Schultz, who will play next year at Madonna University. "We worked together and played together throughout the whole 80 minutes and it was an amazing feeling."

son. Cotter made USHL all-rookie team and finished first in rookie scoring during the USHL playoffs with eight points as Lincoln was ousted in the second round of the Clark Cup West semifinals by the Waterloo Black Hawks, 3-2.

One of Cotter's biggest boosters is Lincoln head coach Cody Chupp, a Big Rapids native who played at Ferris State.

"I think the thing he brought was a consistent, professional approach every single day," Chupp said. "He's one of those kids that you don't have to encourage to get better or force to try and get better. He loved getting better. That meant being in the gym, during practice, video ... whatever it was, he was hungry to learn and hungry to get better. Because of that, he was able to adapt and adjust to our league quickly and be an impact guy. I think we were able to see that pay off in playoffs. Those big moments, he stepped up in some big ways and scored some huge goals for us down the stretch and in the playoffs. That's just the type of kid he is. He wants to be on the ice in those situations. He's demanding of himself and it's a daily thing, which allows him to step up in those big moments."

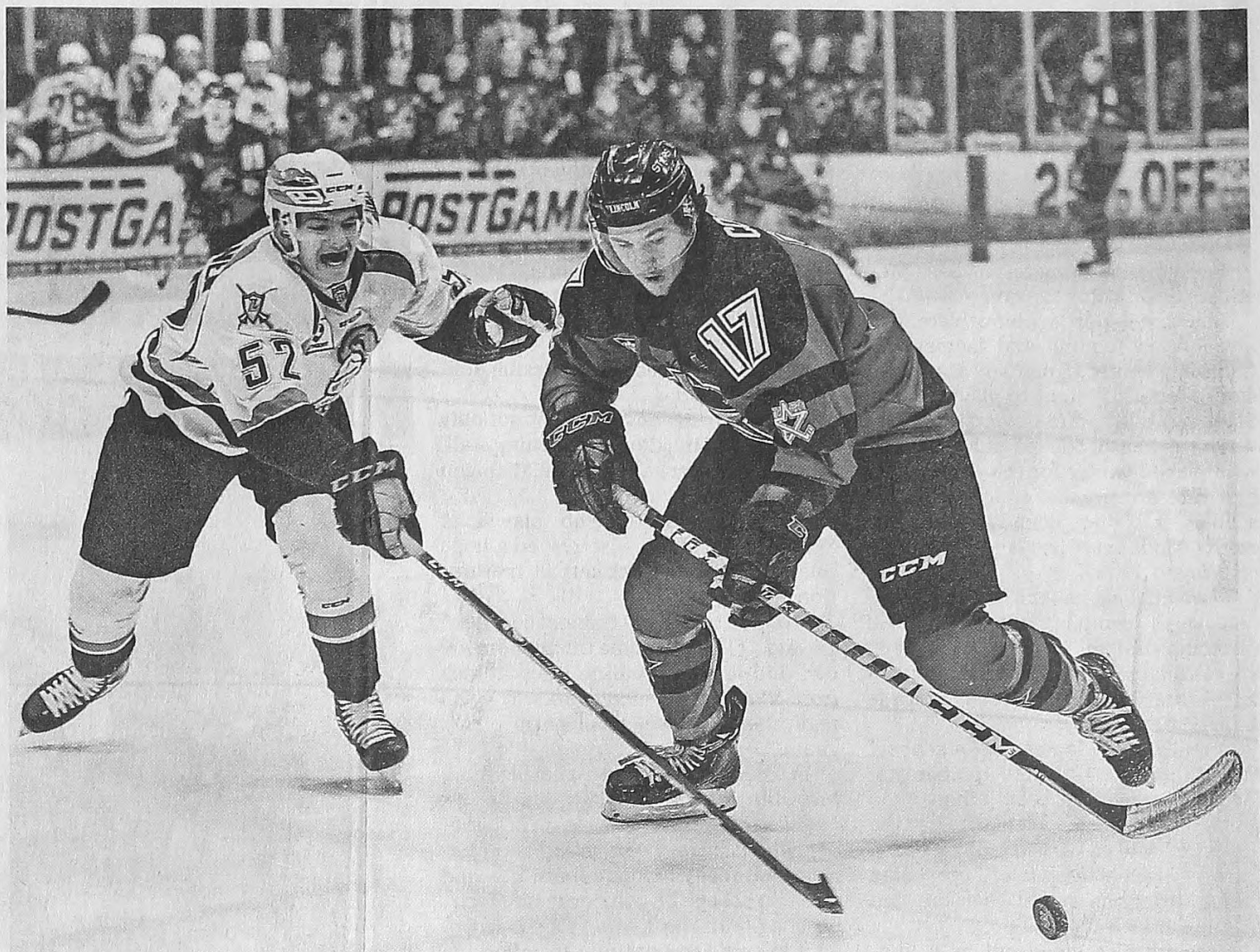
Cotter could be considered a Swiss army knife, capable of playing versatile roles. Chupp said Cotter can also be extremely demanding of himself at times.

"There was never a moment that he sat back and said, 'I'm a first-year guy, maybe this moment or this situation is too much,'" Chupp said. "He always wanted more, he wanted more situations, he wanted more ice time. He wanted to be out there in those pressure situations, whether a big power play or a penalty kill or a face-off in our zone late in the game. He wanted to be a part of those situations right from the get-go."

Despite being way from home and his family, Cotter enjoyed his stint in Lincoln.

"Big city, the fans are a little nuts, it's awesome," he said. "They were a huge part of our success at home. We had such a close-knit team there, it was awesome."

During the 2016-17 season, Cotter made the decision to move his junior career as a 17-year-old to the Brookings (S.D.) Blizzard of the North American Hockey League, where in 59 games he tallied 60 points (28 goals, 32 assists) en route to NAHL Rookie of the Year hon-

ors.

He also made all-NAHL, all-rookie and was the Forward of the Year and MVP in the Central Division of the NAHL.

"It was really cool," said Cotter, who landed in Brookings after playing for the Little Caesars U-16 team the previous year. "It was my first year of juniors. I think just balancing the hockey and school away from home was a little bit of a challenge, but it was fun along the way, too."

Cotter, who attended Salem High School his freshman and sophomore years, finished his high school obligations by taking online classes during his two-year stint away from home.

"It went well," he said. "It was certainly different. You've got to hold yourself a little more accountable than if you're going to regular school. I think it's just making yourself do it and then working on time management. It was

overall pretty beneficial with the schedule we had."

Cotter was courted by several NCAA Division I programs, including Boston University and Harvard, but he ultimately settled on Western Michigan University and head coach Andy Murray.

"I think it took a toll a little bit, being away from home, it was a little tough," Cotter said. "Close to home, college is a huge thing, as well as the coaching staff. Western's staff is just unbelievable. The head coach has so much experience with so many teams it was impossible to pass up the opportunity I have. The staff, the campus, the newer buildings, the older buildings, which has a little character there, was the perfect spot for me."

Beginning in August 2017, Cotter began to catch the eye of NHL scouts when he had one goal in the CCM All American Prospect Game.

In December 2017, he played five games in the Team USA World Junior A Challenge, with two goals and an assist. He also had a goal last January in the USHL/NHL Top Prospects game.

And after productive rookie year in the USHL, his stock continued to rise.

And Chupp believes Cotter has the make-up to be in the NHL some day.

"He's got the talent and skill, it's a big factor," Chupp said. "He has the ability to translate to play in any situation, play a depth role, play a first two-line role. His ability, his body, the way he plays ... it allows him to play in a lot of different situations. So he's a guy, if he buys into it, be on a fourth line, make it faster and maybe more attractive to those NHL teams. And everyone is intrigued by his talent level, that's for sure."

come just the sixth amateur to win the state Open championship and just the second in the last 43 years. Tom Werkmeister of Grandville, who became a professional this year at age 50, broke a streak of 38 wins by professionals in 2013.

"It means a lot and just really validates a lot of the work that I've put in," Kneen said. "This is one of the biggest tournaments of the year for me, personally, and it also validates what I want to do. My dream is to be a pro and me winning a tournament like this shows that it is not outrageous that I want to do that."

As an amateur, Kneen won the maximum allowed of \$750 in a golf shop certificate. The \$8,000 first-place check from the purse of \$55,500 went to runner-up Holley.

"There you go," said Holley, who moved to Michigan four months ago with his fiancé and plans to go to Web.com tour qualifying in the fall. "Not bad. I just had to put an air conditioner in our house last week and it cost a lot of money. This will help with that."

Kneen, who started the day with a three-shot lead on Eric Lilleboe (Okeemos) and five on Holley, had a lead as big as six shots after birdies on Nos. 9 and 10, but Holley said The Bear doesn't lend itself to a golfer pressing the issue.

"The big lead he had at the end of the day helped him," Holley said. "On a course like this, you can't get too aggressive. I had to stick to my game plan and that helped me. He played good golf. He probably wants to forget about hole 16. If he made pars the whole week on 16, he probably would have won by 20."

Kneen, who double-bogeyed 16 during the third round June 13, started it the same way the final day with a drive right into the tall grass that lines the fairway. He had to play out to the fairway, but then missed the back left hole placement with a shot that ended up short and plugged in a deep greenside bunker. He thrashed it out to about 25 feet above the hole and off the green, left a chip on the steep hill halfway to the hole and two-putted from there.

"I made an absolute mess of 16 again," he said. "I hit six poor shots and a good tap-in for triple."

With his lead cut to two shots on Holley, Kneen made a two-putt par on the par-3 No. 17 hole with an 80-foot first putt from the back edge to five feet.

"I absolutely nuked a 4-iron 240 yards, adrenaline I guess, but I made a good par and then, at 18, I striped a drive, hit a good shot on the green and was able to two-putt and win," Kneen said. "I told myself on 17 tee, 'Just make two pars, just keep grinding.'"

Former PGA Tour player Tom Gillis, awaiting age 50 and the PGA Champions Tour in five weeks, closed with 70 for 283 and third place.

Mini-tour player Michael Nagy of Manistique and Andrew Walker of Battle Creek, a Michigan State University golfer, both shot 68 for 284 and a tie for fourth.

Lilleboe, a mini-tour player, carded 77, while Saline amateur Ian Martin, who shot 68, tied at 285.

Kneen, who this week will play in the Michigan Amateur Championship at Country Club of Detroit and turn pro in the fall, reasoned while he had anxious moments coming down the stretch in the final round, he would prefer leading over chasing.

"I mean, if you can make a triple and still lead, that's a good thing," said Kneen, who shot 5-under 67 June 13 after

rounds of 70 and 68.

Kneen, ironically, almost didn't make it to the Michigan Open despite being exempt from qualifying as the low amateur in last year's Tournament of Champions.

He didn't enter, however, and didn't notice until the entry deadline passed. That forced him into the second-chance three-spot qualifier the Michigan PGA hosted June 9 at nearby Traverse City Golf & Country Club. He bested the field with 65.

"My mom is blaming herself, but it was on me, I'm the player and ultimately responsible," Kneen said. "I definitely didn't want to miss this. I've been looking forward to playing it."

"He was one of my original coaches," he said. "I learned some things from my dad and just incorporate a few things from NBA and see what works. They all really helped develop all parts of my game."

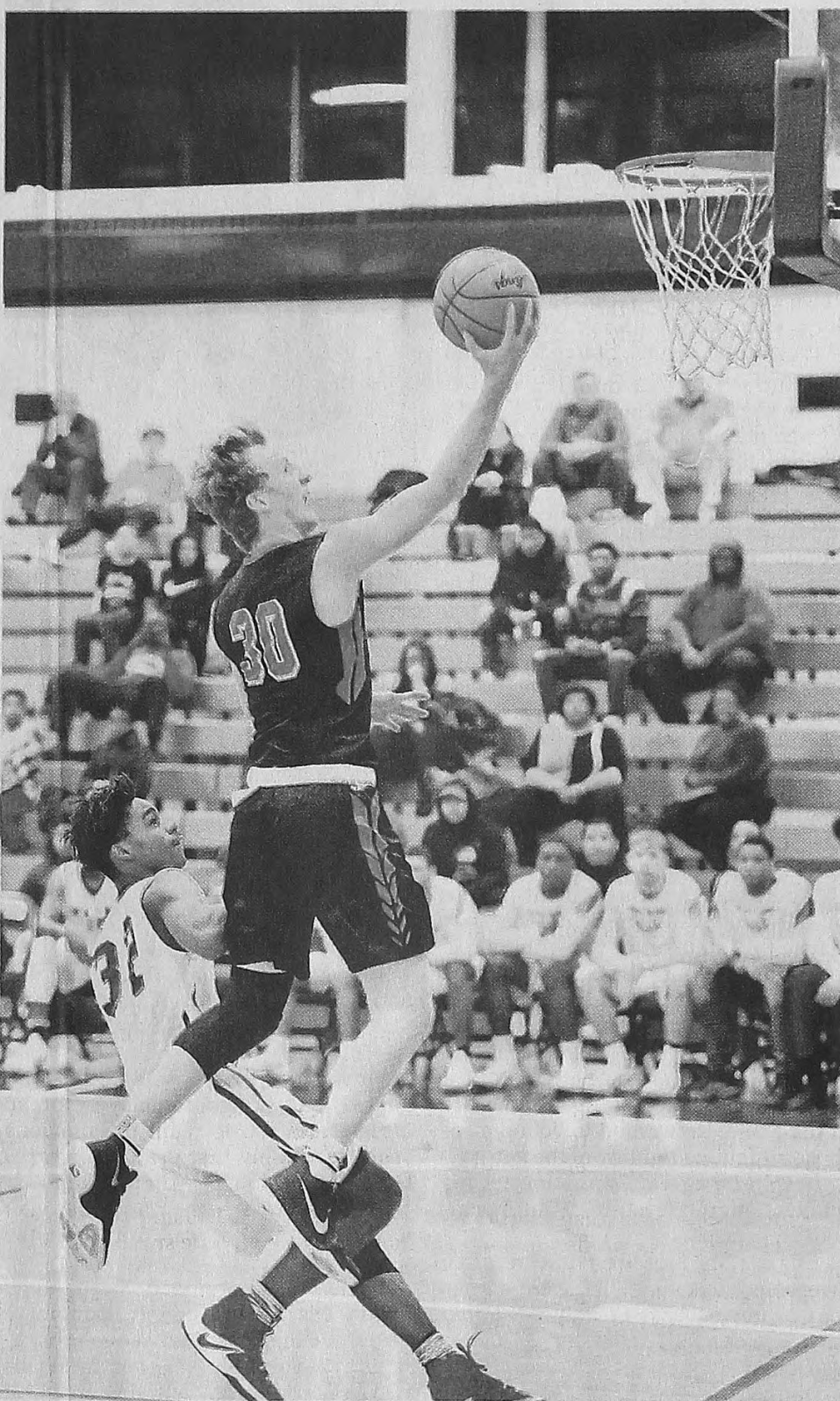
In the age of sport specialization, Meredith is a throwback.
